

OR two decades the Three Suns have been delighting dancing and listening America four seasons each year.

Their latest and what should easily become their all-time best-selling album is called **TWILIGHT MEMORIES**. In it are smartly updated versions of their twelve biggest hits, newly recorded in high fidelity.

The Suns' basic combination of accordion, guitar and Hammond organ (and, in recent years on records, bass and drums) produces one of the most original and popular sounds in American popular music. In TWILIGHT MEMORIES arranger Charlie (DANCING WITH THE BLUES, LOVE IN THE AFTERNOON) Albertine has enhanced its superb danceability and listenability by framing the selections with several different instrumental backdrops, a tasteful variety of dance tempos and many colorful sonic surprises.

Those melodic, floating ballads on which the Suns have long shone brightest – Twilight Time (the group's first million-seller), Don't Take Your Love from Me and Peg o' My Heart—are mellowly redone here, with celeste and vibes making pretty contributions. In the waltz department, sparkling twin pianos add a rakish continental twist to Under Paris Skies and The Petite Waltz.

With an ear to the current Latin craze, the Suns round out the balance of this all-hit program in a sunlit survey of Latin-American rhythms. *Jalousie* (with twin pianos and castanets) is a sprightly tango, *Anna* and *Delicado* (with harpsichord and bass guitar) are churning merengues, and *Jet* and *Arrivederci Roma* register solidly as suave rumbas. *Moonlight and Roses* is played as a driving guaracha in a particularly striking Albertine arrangement which has the melody played slowly against double-time castanets, maracas, triangle and Latin drums.

For you dancers, mood-music fans and seekers for adventurous sounds who may not yet be familiar with the artistry of the Three Suns, we thoroughly recommend **TWILIGHT MEMORIES**. For you whose support has made and kept the Suns America's No. 1 pop instrumental group for twenty years, **TWILIGHT MEMORIES** is, of course, indispensable.

N the wake of numerous productions of the Gilbert and Sullivan operas, from Singapore to Syracuse, by groups ranging from the D'Oyly Carte Opera Company to the Women's Guild of Council Bluffs, lies a trail of frustrated Savoyards.

Would-be Ko-Kos, Yum-Yums, Little Buttercups and Major-General Stanleys who had to settle for chorus work, as well as those singers who couldn't quite make even that, are all over the landscape. Frustrated they may be, but still hopeful that some time, somewhere, they will have a chance to sing their roles.

Well, here's their chance, in this, the most unexpected of all community-sing recordings.

Here are eighteen members from the almost complete Gilbert and Sullivan repertoire, excellently arranged for orchestra and mixed choir by Ralph Hunter. Mr. Hunter has slightly refurbished the original Sullivan orchestration (and for the better), but kept the Gilbertian lyrics intact. His vocal arrangements are in the very best of taste, and his choir is notable for its well-balanced tone, its clarity of diction and its complete responsiveness to the conductor's demands.

There are a few of Gilbert's tough tongue twisters in the program, but even these are as clear as a bell, and sung with quite extraordinary precision, though taken at a faster clip than usual. Only a dyed-in-the-wool G&S purist could object to these solos being arranged for full chorus, but some of the results are certainly startling: to hear *I'm Called Little Buttercup* sung by so many voices conjured up, in my mind, a whole field of yellow flowers; and then there's the moment when the Women's Auxiliary Police seems to join forces with the Constabulary in A *Policeman's Lot Is Not a Happy One.*

RCA Victor has given the disc a double-fold album, with no fewer than eight de luxe songbooks, each one containing the complete lyrics of all the songs. Unless I miss my guess, this should prove to be one of the most successful issues of its kind.

The nation's best-loved corn-fed comics present an entire night-club act recorded on location. It's one of the funniest albums of the year.

ADIES AND GENTLEMEN, we are Homer and Jethro, the Everly Brothers of the Stone Age."

This is only one of the autobiographical admissions made by the mountain madmen in the course of this outrageous recording. One of the boys delves further into their history, and comes up with the fact that he has spent the last twentyeight years "workin' with an idiot." His partner consoles him with this reassurance: "You'll get used to it. I did."

But the best insults are reserved for the audience. One lady patron (probably a relative!) has the temerity to applaud at the mention of band leader Boots Randolph, who happens to back up the boys in this live-recorded show. She promptly gets withered with a skein of corn-fed quips that have the folks rolling on the floor.

This latest album by the barefoot, beer-faced boys ("I'd stop drinkin' if I could find some better way to git it down") is a recording of an actual night-club show. In fact, it was taped last year at the Hillwood Country Club in Nashville, Tennessee, during the annual convention of country disc jockeys, recording artists and other music-trade people. Barnet and His Orchestra

The original Barnet versions of Cherokee, Redskin Rumba, Pompton Turnpike and nine more 1939-40 Swing classics by the best band Charlie ever had

N July 17, 1939, the Charlie Barnet band recorded Billy May's arrangement of Ray Noble's *Cherokee* for RCA Victor's Bluebird label. The extraordinary overnight success of the record crashed Barnet & Co. into Swingdom's elite. To stay.

Cherokee and eleven subsequent Barnet classics, including *Redskin Rumba* and *Pompton Turnpike*, are included in this by-request collection of original recordings by the best band Charlie ever had, a young and driving crew peppered with such brilliant soloists as trumpeters Billy May, Bobby Burnet and Bernie Privin; trombonist Ford Leary; guitarist Bus Etri; pianist Bill Miller; and, of course, Barnet—the Mad Mab himself—on alto, tenor and soprano saxophone.

More 1939 ideas. On September 10, 1939, the group cut two free-wheeling Barnet originals dedicated to the two major influences on the sound of the band—*The Count's Idea* (for Basie) and *The Duke's Idea* (for Ellington). A month later the "Idea" was taken a step sideways with a hilarious satire by Billy May on the overstylized "schmaltz" bands of the day. The label read "*The Wrong Idea*, Swing and Sweat with Charlie Barnet"!


New year, new successes. 1940 was Barnet's top year and his Bluebird recordings dotted the popularity charts. On April 16 the high-flying Barnet men recorded another rocking Barnet original called Afternoon of a Moax ("moax" in 1940 slang meant "nitwit"—remember?), sparked by tasty Miller piano and booting Barnet tenor. A May 8 recording date gave wing to three more Bluebirds of happiness for Swing fans: the lovely Lament for May, with some striking plunger mute-trumpet work by Billy May; the good-natured Six Lessons from Madame La Zonga, recorded in deference to the conga craze then sweeping the country and sung by Mary Ann McCall; and Flying Home (the same flag waver still featured by the Lionel Hampton band), which sparkles with stunning section work.


Pompton Turnpike, another of Barnet's biggest sides, was etched on July 19. The record co-stars Barnet's wailing soprano sax and Bernie Privin's blistering plunger-muted trumpet. (The tune was written in honor of Frank Dailey's Meadowbrook, (Continued on page 19)





Ein, Zwei, Drei – Cha Cha

by FRANK JACOBS

... this being a brief, insane but fancifully documented history of the current dance craze. Mr. Jacobs, as you might suspect, is a frequent contributor to Mad magazine.

NTIL recently, no one had ever attempted to trace the history of the cha cha. Why this should be puzzles us, because the dance actually has a noble heritage. Recently, however, the Co-operative Historical Association for Concerted Hip Action (known as CHA CHA)¹ completed its long-awaited definitive twelvevolume study. This mammoth twenty-four-page work, unfortunately, was never published because the president of the association absconded with the Magic-Step diagrams.

Luckily for future historians, we managed to have a peek at the original manuscript. What we saw convinced us that few modern cultural move-

ments have enjoyed a more glorious development.

The birth of the cha cha, it would seem, dates back to 1834 and the sleepy Austrian village of Schlafen. The town butcher, Klaus Grösrötvönstörzönen, was at work in his shop, slicing a rush order of pigs knuckles with his new Schmidt KötKlïn cleaver.² Suddenly, the cleaver slipped, and the butcher discovered that the last knuckle he had sliced was his own.

Klaus jumped wildly around his shop, all the time shouting, "Ach! Ach!" A village socialite in the shop, one Freda Münchkin, thought that the butcher was demonstrating a new dance (the local festival was just two days off). She watched his movements with envy, then ran off to tell her friends. Oddly, she misinterpreted the "Ach! Ach!" as "Cha! Cha!" which she thought was the title of the new dance. But in any case, it caught on and became the rage of the Bavarian Alps.³

The new dance remained popular in the area for thirty-two years until 1866, when the Bavarian monarch, Wilhelm the Obscure, banned all musical entertainments. His proclamation, now known as the famed Edict of Schlafen,⁴ divided the populace into two camps – the Schwingers and the Anti-Schwingers. A bloody civil war broke out, and when peace was restored the map of Europe had to be completely redrawn.

As for the cha cha, it had almost been lost in the rising tide of nationalism.⁵ As the years drifted by, memories dimmed, and only occasionally would one hear a pair of white-haired *Burgomeisters* reminisce about the times they shouted "ein, zwei, drei—cha cha cha" in the old *Brauhaus* many years ago.

Then, in 1947, one of those strokes of fate oc-

curred that sometimes alter the course of history. Emil Schleppe, an anglicized beer importer in East St. Louis, had placed a sizable order for 500 cases of Höchbrau Ale with the firm of Umlaut & Sons, in Schlafen, West Germany. When his order arrived, Schleppe discovered that one of the bottles was wrapped in an ancient, yellowed manuscript, on which were inscribed a series of



notes and a faded title, Die Meistersinger Cha Cha Cha.

That night, Schleppe took the piece of music home with him. He dusted off his alto tuba, which he had not played for twenty years, and began to pick out the long-neglected melody. It was a hot summer's night,⁶ and the sounds of Schleppe's tuba drifted through many an open window in the neighborhood. Soon a sizable crowd gathered outside the Schleppe house.

"That's a fine song to be playing," remarked one neighbor, "at 2 A.M. in the morning." Schleppe responded with a mighty blast, hitting G below high C, a note which he never before could remember reaching. The music was temporarily forgotten during the ensuing riot.⁷

When quiet was restored, a newspaper reporter interviewed Schleppe. It was then that the news of the "new music" was first made public.⁸ Interest in the cha cha soared. Soon people began dancing to it, and within a few weeks it had swept America off its feet. The rest is legend.

ing board for the duo's zany patter and parodies, its earthy, bucolic bombardment of Tin Pan Alley's sacred cows and such.

Some of the parodies were familiar to the fans that night through previously released recordings by Homer and Jethro, but this night the boys made some changes that were particularly funny to those who knew the originals. Also spicing the act were a number of unexplained instrumental interludes featuring Jethro's truly remarkable mandolin (not that Homer ever lets him carry his serious virtuosity too far!).

We don't want to give away any of the gags, but we should say a few words about the songs. The boys' biggest hit is here—Battle of Kookamonga, which you will recognize as a parody of Jimmie Driftwood's Battle of New Orleans, written in this case by Driftwood himself. Sixteen Tons contains some jibes at their old buddy, Tennessee Ernie Ford, who had the big hit version of the tune in its original, unviolated form. Hart Brake Motel is mainly a springboard for some lively talk which hints at the boys' extracurricular pursuits, with barely a nod at "that young Confederate soldier, Elvis Presley."

HOMER AND JETHRO AT THE COUNTRY CLUB is one of the best party records to come along in ages. It is unabashed hick humor that's outlandish enough and up-to-date enough in its targets to get laughs from city sophisticates as well as from the *Grand Ole Opry* addicts. Try some and you'll soon be hollerin' fer more of the same.
