AN ORIGINAL COMPOSITION FOR JAZZ ORCHESTRA

EVERAL years ago RCA Victor released THE DRUM SUITE,* composed by Manny Albam and Ernie Wilkins, featuring drummers Don Lamond, Osie Johnson, Teddy Sommer and Gus Johnson. It was hailed by the critics and more than 100,000 delighted buyers of the album as a masterful blend of peerless sound and purposeful music.

Recently RCA Victor decided that a sequel to THE DRUM SUITE was warranted, one that would take full advantage of the enormous strides that had been made in recording techniques since the earlier recording was made. Al Cohn, the widely respected jazz tenor saxophonist and composerarranger, was commissioned to write it. Al headed his scoring sheets "Son of Drum Suite" and began writing parts for five drummers and a nineteenpiece jazz orchestra.

THE DRUMMERS used to supply the basic thrust for the new suite had to combine superior reading ability with a fully developed jazz sense. Each of Cohn's choices for the demanding assignment is best known for the quality musical company he's kept in the past—Don Lamond (Woody Herman), Mel Lewis (Stan Kenton), Jimmy Cobb (Miles Davis), Charlie Persip (Dizzy Gillespie) and Louis Hayes (Cannonball Adderley) or Gus Johnson (Count Basie).

THE DRUM SOLOS give each drummer virtuosic workouts on snare and bass drum, tom-toms and cymbals with brushes, sticks and mallets. Each is heard alone, with the other drummers and with sections and soloists of the orchestra. Sometimes five separate and distinct drum lines are heard simultaneously, each meshed perfectly into the

over-all rhythmic pattern. Detailed program notes by Dom Cerulli, co-producer (with Jack Lewis) of the album, provide a helpful blow-by-blow description.

THE DREAM ORCHESTRA assembled by Colm includes a virtual "Who's Who" of the modern-jazz elite (see personnel listing on next page). Besides the crackling brass and reed ensemble sounds it delivers, there are many clean-swinging solos by Clark Terry and Nick Travis, trumpets; Bob Brookmeyer and Frank Rehak, trombones; Gene Quill, alto sax; and Zoot Sims, tenor sax.

PERCUSSION, YES . . . BUT this is far more than just a percussion album. It is a brilliantly con-

ceived, performed and recorded suite of wide musical content, into the fabric of which the bright strings of percussion have been woven by expert hands. Like its parent album, **SON OF DRUM SUITE** is not just a spectacular sound triumph but a spectacularly sound *musical* triumph.

NEVER NO MO' BLUES

IMMIE RODGERS died of tuberculosis in 1933 at the age of 36. He started out as a railroad bum. He sang and played guitar and wrote his own songs. Most of these songs talked about traveling—catching a train and going far away, or riding home to the Southland; some of them talked about women—the fickle kind that makes men wander, or sometimes the ideal romantic sort. Jimmie's songs, and the way he sang them, somehow hit a common chord with the frustrations and desires of the common people. His recordings sold in the millions, and they have a fantastically large audience even today.

Much of what we hear in our popular music of today would never have been possible if there had been no Jimmie Rodgers. He has been called the "Father of the Country Music Field," and he is the revered patron saint of all our top country singers. (Hank Snow's son is named Jimmie Rodgers Snow.) And yet his music is not strictly country music, nor is it "western," in the sense that it never deals with life on the range, punching cattle and such. One might call it "railroad music," but the railroad is just a symbol in Rodgers' plaintive expressions of universal yearnings—the train was the handy vehicle to convey his restless spirit.

Rodgers was the first and maybe the best of America's folk singers to acquire a nation-wide reputation. Most of his songs were blues—closely related to the folk blues of poor southern Negroes. His sound and style were unique. One feature was his yodel, which was clear and high pitched, and which earned him the title of The Blue Yodeler, along with his earlier show-business billing as The Singing Brakeman.

This particular album, offered in the Club for the first time, actually was the first Jimmie Rodgers Memorial Album to be released as a twelve-inch L. P. It contains much of his most typical material and some of his very greatest performances, waxed between June 11, 1928, and May 20, 1933. All but one of the twelve songs list Jimmie as author or co-author, and on most of the tracks the accompaniment is provided by the singer himself on guitar. On several a small ensemble is added, with Hawaiian guitar predominating. (Continued on page 19)



comedy albums, while DO RE MI and WILDCAT are registering strongly in the Broadway Original Cast category and on the over-all pop chart.

RED SEALS IN THE SUM SET. Of the country's top twentyeight classical and semiclassi-

cal best-sellers, seventeen are RCA Victor Red Seal recordings. Included among these are Sviatoslav Richter's interpretation of the Brahms Second Piano Concerto, the best-selling classical record in America, and three concertos by Van Cliburn (his first three recordings). There are three others by the late Mario Lanza, two by

PREFERENCES, PRICES AND PERENNIALS. Some hit RCA Victor albums have crossed the boundaries

of musical preference. The Richter recording of the Brahms Second Piano Concerto appears, amazingly, on the pop as well as the classical chart! Jim Reeves's HE'LL HAVE TO GO holds a commanding position on both the pop and country-and-western album charts. A pair of two-record







sets, BELAFONTE AT CARNEGIE HALL and BELAFONTE RETURNS TO CARNEGIE HALL, rate among the bestselling *single-record* pop vocal L.P.s! Belafonte's CALYPSO, released in 1956, and the film soundtrack recording of south PACIFIC, released in 1958, have stayed high on the best-seller charts almost from the beginning.

NEW ARTISTS. Via their TONIGHT, IN PERSON debut album, the sensational Limeliters were introduced to you in last month's *News*. This month's Selection (see pages 2-5) introduces the Norman Luboff Choir, another marvelous new addition to the RCA Victor label.

If you watch the Perry Como or Dinah Shore TV shows, you've probably heard a big, bearded and brilliant trumpet virtuoso named Al Hirt,



whose first album just *had* to be called THE GREATEST HORN IN THE WORLD. You will soon be hearing on RCA Victor the distinctive mood music of Ray Ellis, one of the most creative and esteemed arranger-conductors in the record field. And keep an ear open for Peter Nero, a young pianist whose style might best be described as a combination of Roger Williams, Carmen Cavallaro and Andre Previn.

Another imminent RCA Victor

debut is that of a bright new comedian named Harrison Baker, found (and recorded) at the hungry i, the San

Watch also for the Keith Textor Singers, until now pioneers in the "new wave" of quality musical TV commercials, and Andy and the Bey Sisters, a trio of youngsters who have taken Europe by storm and, according to everyone who has heard them, should prove that it can happen here.

"BY REQUEST." Certain strikingly successful items in the RCA Victor catalog shouted (as did those who bought them) for sequels. Thus the Melachrino Orchestra has recorded MORE MUSIC FOR RELAXATION as a followup to RCA Vic-

tor's most successful mood set of all time, as well as more lush instrumental tributes to the great composers of popular music. More thrilling operetta scores sung by the late Mario Lanza are in the offing, and you can look forward to the long-anticipated Volume 3 of Victory at Sea. Enthusiasts of RCA Victor's reissue program should relish upcoming collector's specials by Glenn Miller, Artie Shaw, Bix Beiderbecke, Lionel Hampton, Dizzy Gillespie and many others. And also on tap are the original soundtrack recordings from several of the year's biggest films.

There is one track that will send the discographers scrambling. It's known that on several occasions Rodgers recorded with groups of top jazz musicians of the day. (In the album MY ROUGH AND ROWDY WAYS, for example, his backing for one track included Louis Armstrong.) In *Jimmie's Mean Mama Blues*, recorded on July 10, 1930, the backing contains topflight jazzmen on clarinet, trumpet and piano. The only clarinetist with that sound and style in 1930 was Benny Goodman. And around that period Benny was making quite a few studio recordings in the company of trumpeter Manny Klein and pianist Rube Bloom.


