

# WZPL Names Gary Hoffmann PD...Again

Heritage Station "Downsizes," Raises The Tempo

INDIANAPOLIS-In moves that accomplish two goals, WZPL replaced PD Don London with Gary Hoffmann and made other cutbacks to "downsize" the cost of operations.

The effect of the PD switch can already be heard on the air, as WZPL is sounding more uptempo and currents-based under Hoffmann, who was PD there two times before. "He has been consulting the station and he was here back in the days when we had a 14-15 share, so he's no stranger to Indianapolis," notes GM Roger Ingram. "He made himself available, so now he's here on a full-time basis."

"We have picked up the tempo a bit," he adds. "We had more of a bright AC sound than a Top 40. Were we missing the runway? Possibly. So now we're a little more on target. We're in a situation where we feel like we're fulfilling the Top 40 role of Indianapolis."

That role has been, at the very least, shared with Hoosier 96, the Crossover station that has built a considerable audience in its two-year existence. "They've always been a serious competitor," Ingram asserts. "Perhaps some people have taken them lightly, but I haven't. Now we'll be able to keep them a little more honest in the market-place. They've gained a couple of share points that perhaps might have been ours."

WZPL also cut back its staff size, including one night air personality. "We're just basically downsizing a bit to preserve our independent status," Ingram explains. "We want to stay in a profitable situation, so that's part of our direction. Now we've got a great staff from the morning show throughout the dayparts. We've been working to be a little more responsive and efficient."

The goal of the moves is to return WZPL to their double-digit glory days. "They're available to us if we do our job properly," he says. "My goal is to create a great product and run a very efficient company free of communication roadblocks. I felt like we had a couple of communication roadblocks and we were getting a little bit overstaffed. Hopefully, now we'll have something more useful than just a smaller company. I think it will be very productive."

# Don London: "I'll Be Back"

Former WZPL Indianapolis PD Don London takes his departure with characteristic grace. "I'm proud to have programmed one of America's highest-rated Top 40s in the Top-50 markets for the last three-and-a-half years," he says. "It was also great to contribute to two consecutive record-billing years."

Although he had been cut loose for just two days, London notes that he has already received "an overwhelming amount of phone calls of support. I'm looking forward to a speedy re-entry into programming or another related position in the business. Most likely, it'll be in programming, but I'm keeping my options open."

# **Summer Tours Run Leaner**

# Most Big Names Forgo Ballparks For Arenas

Concerned with a less-thanbullish economic outlook, concert promoters will be booking more big-name tours into arenas and less into stadiums. Although summers are typically rife with megastar showcases, only Paul McCartney and possibly Depeche Mode in early Fall will be playing to ballparksized audiences. The rest prefer the outdoor amphitheatres and large indoor arenas, where it's easier to sell out.

To be sure, there ought to be plenty of packed arenas this summer, as several heavyweight artists will be making the rounds. Surefire SRO's include tours by Aerosmith, Van Halen, Vince Neil, Rod Stewart, Elton



John, Peter Gabriel, Poison, Damn Yankees, Robert Plant and Jimmy Page (individually), Nirvana and Tina Turner. Although the smaller-sized venues may not generate the revenue of a ballpark tour, artists point out that it enables them to get closer to the fans, who generally wit-

ness the performance in a better environment.

Another repercussion of the tenuous economic climate is the growing number of packaged tours, the most renowned and successful being Lollapalooza. The success of the Alternative music Woodstock/ sideshow has spawned a couple of imitators. MTV is presenting an Alternative tour featuring Spin Doctors, Soul Asylum and Screaming Trees, while the most intriguing package will be the "Barbecue Mitzvah" tour featuring Stone Temple Pilots, the Butthole Surfers and Basehead. This tour will play drivein theatres and fans will reportedly be charged by the carload.

# Odds and Ends Industry Eyes Geffen/Henley Dispute

The legal battle between Geffen Records and former Eagle Don Henley has aroused the interest of far more than the two litigating parties. The precedence set by the outcome of Henley's attempt to free himself from a Geffen Records recording contract could have repercussions throughout the industry.

The story so far: Henley first signed a solo contract with Geffen in 1984, which was amended four years later. At that time, Henley promised to deliver three studio albums and a greatest-hits package for a higher royalty rate, recording advances and a one-time upfront payment. According to the label, Henley still owes Geffen two more studio releases and the greatest-hits collection. Henley contends that the 1984 agreement sets the precedence and since a 50-year-old California law enables "performers" to negotiate in the open market every seven years, the '84 contract has expired.

If Henley wins the suit, it could possibly turn superstar



artists, who signed longterm deals to one label, into veritable free agents who could go to the highest bidder. Naturally, Geffen will seek an injunction to deny Henley the freedom to negotiate until the matter is settled in the courts. A lengthy court battle is expected; Henley is about to sell his publishing to create a multi-million dollar war chest to pay for legal fees.

Sony Music is about to open a state-of-the-art multi-

use recording arts complex on the West side of Manhattan. The complex, located at 460 W. 54th St., is set in an historic building that once served as movie soundstages for Fox.

Sony Music Studios was created exclusively for use by artists on Sony Music labels such as Columbia, Epic and TriStar Records Group. "Sony Music's dedication to support the creative process is reflected in the development of our artists," states Sony Music President Tommy Mottola. "This center is the first creative complex of its kind anywhere in the world. It provides our artists with the opportunity to create in an environment that nurtures the artistic process."

The five-floor, 25-room complex is designed for recording, mixing, mastering and editing of audio, video and film. It will also serve as the company's center of archival work, including the digital conversion of a 450,000-record library.



Fly 92 announced names at 10 minutes before every hour, between 7:50 am and 3:50 pm, Monday through Friday. When the station called a listener's name, that person had 10 minutes to "punch the clock" by calling WFLY. That listener "earned" a salary of \$92 an hour until the next person's name was announced, and he/she called the station within 10 minutes. If the second listener failed to do so, the first winner earned another \$92 and stayed "on the clock." The 3:50 pm winner continued over to the 7:50 am announcement the next workday morning, making \$92 per hour until the listener was replaced. The station even placed an official want ad in the local newspaper. There were 120 winners; the longest "employee" stayed on the clock for four hours.



# SHAKEDOWN AT B96

B96 (WBBM FM Chicago) PD Dave Shakes sums up his station's programming direction as being "positioned as Chicago's youth culture radio station. We take pride in our ability to deliver 18-plus demos to national and local advertisers," he says. "We're a very focused station with all of our departments - particularly programming, marketing and sales - centered on the philosophy of serving our two customers. Those two customers are our listeners and advertisers." The audience mix is "a synthesis that's unique in Chicago" in that both adults and teens listen to the station on a regular basis.

Musically the station is simply described as a Dance radio station. "We play the hits that fit. We're rhythmic in nature, but you'll also hear a lot of killer ballads. The bottom line is, if you look at the top SoundScan singles in Chicago each week, B96 is usually playing the top 15 out of 20." Often when a station is Dance-oriented, clubs factor heavily into airplay. At B96, "clubs are important to us in that they break new music, but we're by no means a club radio station." In fact, many clubs in Chicago wait to see what music B96 plays before including it in their mix.

Speaking of mixes, Shakes points out that the station is currently busy marketing some of the standout features that air daily on B96. "We've introduced mixes middays, in afternoon drive and at night," he notes. "Those are the B96 Lunch Party at noon, the 5:00

Traffic Jam and the 10:00 Remix. Those are in addition to our Friday and Saturday night Street Mix programs." Night jock Alan Kabel also hosts an all-request and dedication party weeknights at 8:00 pm. B96's big marketing promotion this spring and summer is a heavy billboard campaign, supplemented with a bumper sticker contest. The bumper stickers have the same design as the billboards (and are seen for the first time here in The Network Forty). The stickers are available at over 300 local White Hen stores in the Chicagoland area. White Hen is a local convenience store. The onair payoff is \$1,000 if you hear your license number called out over the air.



caught up in that and keep their mindset on being focused on the format. What can go wrong? Simple things – like keeping your head on so the music doesn't run out, mentioning the old format slogans because you're not keyed in and concentrating, or getting caught up in the early hype from a start-up situation. Keeping the talent from the old format motivated was a problem because we didn't know who was going to fit and who wasn't.

Bill: My big problem has been with people in promotion, marketing and programming as far as suppliers not delivering on the dates they promised. My jingles were a little late getting here; I still don't have them all. We're doing our music manually. We had a computer program designed to print the intros, but that screwed up. We had problems with the music computer; we're still getting that handled. Other people affecting my timetable has really screwed me up. I'm dealing with different people here than when I signed on WZZR in Port St. Lucie. As far as everthing else is concerened, we had a total team effort in getting everything labeled and organized in the control room. My staff did a great job helping me out.

J.J.: Here at KISS-FM, we were about 10 minutes away from going on the air when we looked at each other and asked, "What's the first song?" That was pretty funny. KODZ (the old Y95-turned-Gold) had the most terriffic sign-on I ever witnessed. Phil Hall was the PD; we had one jock meeting before the sign-on and everything went perfect. Well...except that I was running the board and was the only one who didn't have a set of headphones, so the first 10 minutes was done by just watching the meters.

THE NETWORK FORTY: What was the best signon situation you have ever been involved with and why?

Christopher: No question about it, Hot 97.7, San Jose. It was really weird because my two very best friends in radio – Steve Smith and Michael Newman – were given the opportunity to sign on Hot 97.7 in January of 1989. We came on at 100

miles per hour and never let up. Our music and audience wouldn't let us because hot energy jams were really hot at that time. What more could you ask for? We put away the monster competition, which was KWSS at the time, in two books. We stayed focused and intense and questioned each other constantly. We screamed and yelled at each other, but we made history. Isn't that what it's all about? We worked hard and contributed to the industry.

Bill: I can't choose between WZZR and WBHT. At WZZR, I learned a lot – how to manage people and deal with adversity as well as the philosophy of Top 40 and being the best. WZZR is also where I made some mistakes. Here at WBHT, I have a great staff and it's a great company. The ego is being satisfied by coming back to the market and doing some damage to the old station. That's why my own drive and desire is so high. Not that I hate anyone at WKRZ; they're all really cool and nice to me. But it's a business thing and an ego thing. I wanted to go away from the market, come back and kick ass. Have them take note and have everybody else in the industry take note for my own personal satisfaction. We're not looking to put them out of business – just steal as much business from them as possible. Susquehanna does new stuff that I never knew of and there are different avenues to pursue. It's fun to continue to learn.

J.J.: Here at KISS-FM, it was, as Gerry De-Francesco (President of Gannett Radio Division) said, "The smoothest sign-on I had ever seen." The reasoning was that we had all of KIIS in L.A.'s music and Selector info. So when we signed on, it already sounded like KIIS-FM. Couple that with the fact that I was auditioning jocks who were already familiar with the market and the comfort zone was truly there. The comment around the market was, "They sound like they've been on for a year instead of a day!"

"Can't Help Falling In Love" is getting a head start at KROQ and Power 106 L.A., Q106 San Diego, The Power Pig Tampa, KRBE Houston, B97 New Orleans and too many more stations to mention. This is one of those songs that sounds better on the air, so give it a few test spins and see what happens.

# Goo Goo Dolls

"We Are The Normal" (METAL BLADE/WB)

First, a look at a little history. R.E.M., U2, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Toad The Wet Sprocket and many of today's biggest recording acts began as Alternative acts. What do they all have in common? Number-one records, for one thing. Fast forward to the present. The Goo Goo Dolls have the image and name of yet another Alternative band, but its sound is that of a Mainstream act with #1 in its future. "We Are The Normal" is already a success at Alternative radio; perceptive programmers at stations like 99X and WENZ are giving it early airplay. Watch this trio from Buffalo closely, because if we've learned anything from the past, it's that your listeners are going to eat this kind of music up.

# STING

"Fields Of Gold"

Do you get the feeling that wherever you go, Sting has already been there? Leave it to the former Gordon Sumner to call his latest album Ten Summoner's Tales and put 11 cuts on it. "Fields Of Gold" is the second cut from the Top-10 album and it follows in the footsteps of "If I Ever Lose My Faith In You." There's something about Sting's music that's soothing and provocative all at once. When Sting set out to record his latest effort, he experienced a severe case of writer's block. Some artists would simply recycle




add to his college fund and maybe even get to stay up late now and then.







Out in a few weeks are Sound Factory's "Do It To The Rhythm" (RCA), Midi Rain's "Shine" (Vinyl Solution/Columbia) - check out "Pierre's Chicago House Mix" by DJ Pierre, it's all the rage and Book Of Love's "Boy Pop" (Sire/WB)... 



You've seen us before – we're hard to miss. In the early '80s we wore smudged eyeliner, had lethal spikes sprouting from our scalps (before we shaved our heads), dark lips and the blackest wear we could find. Today, sporting various flannel assortments and the grungiest gear from our local Goodwill, we and the Godheads of music are *your* radio revolution. The current boom in "Alternative" music has taken at least 10 years to evolve into a movement that is now marketable to all genres. Mainstream radio, you have heard the Alternative... and it is us.

This column, heretofore known as "Gen X," will be your pilot and comrade to *The Network Forty's* own Alternative chart (appearing to the left). This long-awaited appearance will keep you up-to-date on the hip shots of today's Alternative music that is raising levels of exasperation everywhere, including your own music meetings! We will be here to separate the whear from chaff and the meat from the bone to create a generous potluck pie that's filling enough for Generation X and digestible enough for radioland.

From the Masters of Alternative talent, recent releases have been burned into Alternative radio playlists worldwide. Already a couple weeks into the release factor are Depeche Mode's salute to bowling alleys, "Walking In My Shoes" (Sire/Reprise), Soul Asylum's grunge look and Petty-ish sound for the '90s, "Runaway Train" (Columbia) and the globe's greatest cover band, UB40, doing its Elvis impersonation, "Can't Help Falling In Love" (Virgin). And new this week is Billy Idol's raving Techno-scrooge rip of The Velvet Underground's "Heroin," which stands firm on familiar ground.

Hoarding in on the Gen X Star Search movement, we will showcase important bands who have yet to gain radio recognition or who have been out of the Alter-loop for a period. For instance, take Aimee Mann...pardon? Years ago, she had an across-the-board smash with 'Til Tuesday called "Voices Carry." After doing a disappearing act that would do Houdini proud, she's back with "I Should've Known" (Imago), a hot cider, guitar-crunch Pop concoction that sips from the inside. The Posies' "Dream All Day" (DGC/Geffen) overwhelms us with a Pop/Rock gem that won't go unnoticed for its filling energy and nostalgic melody. Get ready to hear power chords in overdrive with the grungier side of the pit; take an ear to Heatmiser's first single, "Still" (Frontier/BMG). A single that was never intended to settle your nerves.

Novel bands of today and those who aren't as fresh to our palates are continually serving us "top dishes" ready to be chosen, chewed and digested. Take the latest single from Matt Johnson's The The, "Love Is Stronger Than Death" (Epic), in whole. The climaxing growl of Matt's low, growling vocals, the piqued guitar and heart-pounding drum beats quench investigating appetites. PJ Harvey's second Island/PLG album is out, led by "50 Ft. Queenie," a hard-edged search into the taffeta closets of a transvestite's reality. Tanya Donnely graduated from Throwing Muses with honors via Belly's "Feed The Tree." The follow-up single, "Slow Dog," will solidify their appeal... The Goo Goo Dolls' "We Are The Normal" (Metal Blade/WB) is just the first hit from an album that's strong all the way through.

Not hard to calculate for newcomers is The Cranberries, who first single, "Dreams" (Island/PLG) boasts clever variations on The Sundays and Sinead-esque vocal inflections. It's a relationship song, but this one won't give you a bellyache. Perry Farrell's puppy, Porno For Pyros, smacked us a couple weeks back with "Cursed Female" (WB), a self-serving arrangement of echoed vocals and tribal-Funk drum beats. Don't judge the single too harshly; there's a male version on the album as well. After that, expect to be confronted with "Pets." Fresh from the Pixies, Frank Black first gave us the hard-driving and intoxicating "Los Angeles;" next up is "Hang On To Your Ego" (4AD/Elektra). Probably the most-requested Alternative cut is Radiohead's "Creep," a perfect yank of guitar riffs and alarming lyrics.

And this is just the beginning. Join us next week in Gen X!



Each week, no more than one record will be the "Consensus Pick;" it's the single that we feel has the greatest potential to be a hit on *The Network Forty* chart. The entire staff must to agree on the "Consensus Pick" or there will not be one for that week.

"Best Bets" (maximum of three records, no minimum) are new releases that we believe have great potential to be across-the-board hits. The difference here is that only a majority of *The Network Forty* staffers – and *not* everyone – needs to endorse the record.

The "Handicapper's Pick" (maximum of one record) is one staff member stepping out and picking one new record that they think has the potential to be a hit. We'll print the handicapper's name, so if you don't agree, you'll know who to call.

The "Test Tube Baby" (maximum of one) is a record that will be released in the future, but one that the staff agrees will be a hit.

The "Guest Handicapper" is a programmer from Radioland. The "Guest Handicapper" picks a maximum of three records that they believe has the greatest hit potential. If you want to be a "Guest Handicapper," just let us know and we'll work you in.

The "Past Performance" side of this page is our way of telling you how we're doing. Not only will we blow our own horn when we're right, but we'll admit it when we're wrong. We don't claim to have the right answers *all* the time, but with the collective radio experience of *The Network Forty* staff, we think we'll do just fine.

Finally, "The Morning Line" is done without any outside influence. The records we pick are the records we believe in, without regard to hype or artist affiliation. If we think a record is a hit, you'll see it here.
