MORNING HANGOVER

Morning air talent/sitcom srar Jay Thomas served his former employer, KPWR Los Angeles, with a breach of contract suit seeking a minimum of \$900,000 in damages. Thomas, who was suspended on May 10 and terminated two days later, claims that KPWR didn't give him notice of any alleged wrongdoing, thus they're still obligated to pay him of the rest of his contract, which ran through March 31, 1994.

Industry Mourns Pat Norman's Passing

Longtime KFRC San Francisco and KRTH Los Angeles VP/GM Pat Norman passed away Monday (6/1) after a lengthy battle with cancer. Norman was 60 years old.

Under Pat Norman's guidance, KFRC attained a "legendary" status in the industry. The station was the Bav Area's number one Top 40 station for over a decade. He was most respected for his ability to pick out strong programming minds and allowing them room to grow. "He was the GM I respected most," Paul Drew says. "Pat left programming - 100% of it - to the program director. Those fortunate PDs who made great radio together with Pat became the best I know." Program directors he hired at KFRC included Michael Spears, Les Garland, Gerry Cagle and Dave Sholin. Pat was also responsible for bringing Dr. Don Rose to San Francisco.

Norman also set the standard by which all other station client parties would be judged. The epitome of his "bigger and better" crusade at KFRC came when he flew clients and friends on a private 747 to Las Vegas, where they were met on the tarmac by the University of South-

ern California Marching Band.

"I was fortunate enough to be master of ceremonies at Pat's 60th birthday party a couple of months ago," *The Network Forty* VP/GM Gerry Cagle recalls. "Typically, Pat – as sick as he was at the time – was still primarily concerned with how I was doing. He was a business partner, a mentor and a friend. I will miss him, but will continue his legacy by passing along to my peers the wisdom he shared

with me."

Funeral services will be held Saturday, June 5, at the Good Shephard Church in Beverly Hills at 9:30 am. A memorial service will be held June 12 at the old St. Hillary Church in Tiburon, CA at 3:00 pm. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the Patrick W. Gary Gersh Named Capitol Pres./CEO

Geffen A&R Ace To "Infuse Creative Energy" Into Label

As expected, Gary Gersh was named the new President/CEO of Capitol Records. Gersh officially takes the reins on July 1, replacing Hale Milgrim, who resigned because of "creative and philosophical differences." Gersh will oversee a talent roster that includes Bonnie Raitt, Hammer, Richard Marx, Charles and Eddie, Portrait and its hottest current act, Duran Duran.

The 37-year-old Gersh is well known for his keen eye for talent. Previously, he was Sr. VP A&R at Geffen, where he signed acts such as Nirvana, Peter Gabriel, Robbie Robertson, the Stone Roses and Arc Angels. Before that, he did A&R at EMI America, where he signed David Bowie, the Stray Cats, J. Geils Band, Ziggy Marley and Kim Carnes. Coincidentally, Gersh entered the music business in Capitol Records' mailroom. From there, he worked his way up the ranks into customer service, radio promotion and A&R.

"Gary is an extraordinarily talented executive whose experience and creative vision will help lead Capitol into the next century," states ERG Chairman/CEO Charles Koppelman. "We expect that Gary will infuse Capitol with a new creative energy, one that will compliment the company's extraordinary artist roster, catalog and strong executive team."

One of Gersh's most daunting challenges at the Tower will be to

revamp the label's image and make it more artist-friendly for prospective talent. "My mandate will be to work with Charles Koppelman to build a shared vision of an artist-driven company that will be an exciting and creative place to work," Gersh notes. "We'll be seeking a broad range of talent from all genres of music to create an environment where artists feel comfortable. Capitol has a great history and I'm excited about the opportunity to broaden its luster and help re-establish it as the premiere record company in the business."

Apparently, Gersh's abilities were extremely coveted by Capitol since, according to press reports, they paid a hefty price to offer him the post. Milgrim had signed a multi-year extension to his deal just a few months back; one source speculated that buying him out of his contract would run into the millions of dollars.

Savage Records, R.I.P.

Fate of Bowie, Others Up In The Air

The independent boutique label Savage Records ceased operations last week after just two years of (apparently poor) business. Eighteen label employees were laid off, while the fate of David Bowie, Gene Loves Jezebel and three smaller Savage acts remain unresolved as of press time.

Savage, started in 1991 by 24-year-old racing car magnate David Minran and superstar manager Frank DiLeo, signed a distribution deal with BMG last year. Unfortunately, rumors abounded about a shortage of funding for projects and when things didn't go well with its initial releases, DiLeo decided to spend more time on his

management company. He officially left two months ago, right before the label's biggest release, David Bowie's *Black Tie*, *White Noise*. Although critically acclaimed, the Bowie album has not

sold up to expectations.

That lack of success fueled rumors that major cutbacks were on the way, yet several label staffers were reportedly surprised by the wholesale shutdown. Among those pounding the pavement are GM/VP Promotion Gordon Anderson, National Alternative Promotion Manager Joel Kalman, National Promotion Director Walter Winnick and Special Project Director Ron Resnick.

Meanwhile, Bowie's solo album is apparently up for grabs. An RCA Records spokesperson noted that Nipper doesn't automatically inherit the rights to the album. Gene Loves Jezebel should also attract other label interest as well.





COLUMBIA

DIGITIZED!

Editorial by **Dwayne Ward/Tom Poleman**

n August, 1991, *The Network Forty* published an article heralding the arrival of "digital cable radio." At that time, 1,000 people in southern California were given digital cable radio on a test basis. A spokesperson for the company predicted that 90 percent of those people would pay to retain the digital radio service through their cable companies.

Fast forward to today. One of the new companies profiled in that article, Digital Music Express, now has over 200,000 subscribers nationwide.

A recent issue of *New Media*, a new computer/multi-media magazine, featured a cover of a virtually naked woman with the words "Digital Sex" emblazoned across her nether regions. In reading this magazine, I ran across the following paragraph: (What follows is not for the weak of mind.)

"The 500-channel digital cable network that Time-Warner plans to offer 4,000 of its Orlando, Florida subscribers in early 1994 will be cobbled together from a variety of advanced technologies, including asynchronous transfer mode (ATM). The full-service network will include a high-speed fiber backbone network to the curb, coaxial cable into the home and local decompression, intelligence and buffer storage. ATM is a high bandwidth digital switching technology designed to handle multiple data types. Piping digital data at up to gigabit-persecond rates, it will enable a wide range of services such as pay-per-view video, database access, long distance phone access, games and interactive shopping."

If all that rigmarole baffles human comprehension, put that into context with a 1992 Forbes magazine article about HDTV, multi-media screens and a new consolidation of the two simply known as the "Box." (For the record, HDTV is a digital transmission system that will enable TV sets to display sharp, movie-like images with compact disc quality sound.

Although the FCC hasn't reached a universal standard for high-definition TV, the alliance formed on May 25th of three former competing HDTV systems could speed up the process. The three companies will present the FCC with a single standard HDTV system in the near future.

As the FCC nears its decision and as Time-Warner begins to unveil its new digital network in Orlando, radio owners and operators need to consider the implications of these technologies. First, the retention rate of digital cable radio has been higher than expected. For about \$10 a month, cable subscribers receive niche radio programming with digital clarity and absolutely no commercials or announcers. As HDTV and the "Box" become available, additional and similar technology will infiltrate the consumers' home entertainment centers.

Obviously, governmental regulation (read: control) over fiber optic delivery systems, cable compa-

nies and binary coding of the country could slow things down a bit. Nevertheless, commercial radio needs to be aware of what they'll soon be up against. Consider this: In the very near future, fiber delivery systems begin penetrating most... then all metropolitan areas. Digital data will be delivered through phone lines, fax lines and, of course, the eventual successor to the conventional TV set. Enter... the new "Box." So, while you watch Seinfeld master his domain, your wife or girlfriend can access a screen within a screen to write a letter, while the kids can do their homework or download the latest video games that are also digitally stored in the "box." With multimedia hardware, according to the aforementioned Forbes article, as many as six different things can be going on simultaneously on one screen.

This will happen here: Dial a number on your telephone, punch in a retail number and, boom, here

comes the latest Ethyl Meatplow album through the phone line. Then, through the use of binary coding, it's digitally stored for later listening pleasure. Record companies will save a fortune in production and distribution costs by directly sending new singles and albums through the phone lines – to be digitally stored and retrieved at will by the consumer.

What will happen when fiber optics become the preferred vehicle to access everything from films and TV to records, radio and interactive activities? Will record stores go the way of the 8-track, closely followed by CDs and the briefly-available MiniDiscs? And say goodbye to MTV's near-monopoly on music videos. We'll be able to access videos directly from the suppliers, then digitally store them for later viewing, commercial-free and "Duff"-less! Libraries will become literary Edsels when entire encyclopedias of information can be stored digitally.

Don't underestimate how soon digital technology will sweep this country – and then the planet. The European marketplace is screaming for high technology, since governmental control has suppressed the development of "radio." Soon enough, some company will establish a ground-based digital antenna array that will cover the entire European continent. When AT&T chips in with a fiber optic system, global digitization will become virtual reality.

The recent announcement of the installation of 60 digital satellites signals an imminent revolution in mobile telephone technology. Cells will be completely replaced with satellite delivery systems and digital mobile telephones or DMT's will become the norm.

For those of you doubting the immediacy of this technology, remember: In 1976, the American public had an average of 12 television channels; today they have 33. Digital telecommunications will increase this average exponentially.

So what does all this mean for commercial radio frequencies? There are still too many unanswered questions to draw any concrete conclusions, but one absolute remains: Digital telecommunications is in the house. The current technology is just the binary tip of the digital iceberg and whatever the format, it's clear the new world of broadcasting will indeed be... digitized!



THE KISS THAT NEVER STOPS

Charlotte is one of the most competitive markets in America. With basically the same number of stations as Atlanta, the Queen City boasts a Top 40 battle between Mainstream WAQQ and Dance 40 WCKZ, Kiss 102. Kiss 102 PD Bob Sweeten describes his market as "one of the fastest growing areas of the country. I've been in this market for about five-and-a-half years and in that time, the change in the complexion of the city has been phenomenal. Everything from the population growth and the new BMW plant being built here to the national attention we've received because of the Charlotte Hornets has helped up our profile."

Kiss 102 shares audience "primarily with WPEG, the Urban station" adds Sweeten, as well as Top 40 WAQQ. To differentiate his station, Sweeten relies "on things that the listener can look forward to, things that continually make them want to listen to the radio. Anyone can come into a market and play the right songs. The excitement that you create between the songs is really the meat of any station. Right now we're not spending a lot of money on outside promotions, yet our cume is increasing. We've also gone from a 3.7 to a 5.7 since the end of November. Most of that is attributable to some of the great features of the station."

Those features include "an Old School weekend," not unlike a number of other

Dance-leaning stations across the country. "We've been doing something called 'Flush The Format,' which was the predecessor of Old School, for a number of years. On Friday mornings we'll play some of the music that Kiss 102 was playing five years ago — songs that people connect to the station. Tone Loc would be an example of something that spikes nicely, but you wouldn't want to hear it too often. We mix those in with classic Dance tunes and Disco. We also have a no-repeat work day from 9 am to 3 pm. Features like these are important to our identity."

The bottom line for a station like Kiss 102 is "to keep the music tight and keep the station on target. We're focused on a core audience like any other good station, but frankly we want everyone." One key element in attracting that broad-based audience is the station's use of one floating stopset an hour. "We only break the music once an hour and you never know where that break will happen. That keeps the sound fresh." However, the station is running upwards of 10 spots in that lone stopset. "Ten is the max and although that would seem like an awfully long break, we're finding that the audience is into it. We're one of the first stations in the country, along with WIOQ Philadelphia and 92Q Baltimore, to try it and the numbers were up in the first month we had it on the air."



"PUTTING YOUR PHILOSOPHY ON PAPER"

What's your programming philosophy? Programmers hear this question often, whether it's coming from a potential employer, an employee or a new GM in the building. Programming philosophies vary with each programmer, but articulating your philosophy to someone else can be a problem. The reason is simple – and it's the same reason that keeps radio exciting and interesting. It's impossible to predict what the next day will bring or what adjustments you'll have to make to your philosophy. Still, is it possible to put your programming philosophy on paper so others can understand why you make your decisions?

The Network Forty: Have you developed a philosophy that you subscribe to... and what would be the central theme of that philosophy?

MIKE: You have to give people a reason to listen to radio. It sounds basic, but most of the theories I subscribe to are very basic. Just signing on the air, playing music and having good jocks aren't enough. You have to give the audience a reason to listen to your station. I really can't be more specific, but giving them a reason to listen would be a central theme. Around this, I would say it's extremely important to have a team that understands the ultimate goals of the station and are willing to do what it takes to get them done.

CHRIS: My philosophy isn't really a formula; it's more of a flow chart. It's like a customized blueprint based on the idea that individual radio stations are just that - individual. There's no one way to approach a programming job or task at a particular radio station, so you can't make too many assumptions based on what your experiences were at other stations. My philosophy is more of what a military general might say - you can learn from the past. It gives you some idea of what your course of action would be in a larger sense. You discern the specific goals of a radio station after you arrive and sit down with management. You can't create a philosophy that says rigidly, "this is how I will program." You have to program for the battle what's the goal and what resources do you have - and if you take those logistical concerns, then you're on your way to achieving a specific goal for that radio station.

LISA: The central portion of my programming philosophy is to fully utilize research, to dissect each and every element

of individual radio stations. Get the results of the research, keep the elements that work, then carefully use the positive aspects to build a framework targeted at attracting and keeping specific portions of the audience. At the same time, another central theme is having daily sessions with others involved in crucial departments to maintain the focus of the station after the goals have been established.

The Network Forty: If someone asks you to explain your programming philosophy in writing, what do you include in your presentation?

MIKE: I try not to put anything in writing. Nationwide asked me to do it, but I don't approach it that way. They sent me a 20-page questionnaire that asked everything possible, almost to the point of being ridiculous. Being of a competitive nature, I looked at it as though I would be giving them a tremendous amount of information in a very competitive situation with Clear Channel [KJYO's owner]. After I refused to fill it out and send it back, I contacted them and told them I would rather discuss anything in the questionnaire in person. Just a few weeks after this transpired, Guy Zapoleon, who designed Nationwide's questionnaire, was in this market conducting a special research project for KYIS - a competitor. This scenario explains why I'd rather discuss my philosophies in person as opposed to writing them down and sending them off.

CHRIS: I might be more qualified than a lot of guys right now because I obviously was just out there doing that. I got some advice from several people when I was sending my package out. I didn't include a programming philosophy because I didn't know if I could explain [it] and I didn't want to be pigeonholed as well. "He's this or that kind of programmer." If you write down your programming philosophy, you

tend to say things like, "I believe in exploiting the active core to get this sort of cume in a quarter-hour situation. Maybe the perspective manager or consultant will look at that and say, "Well, he's not the kind of guy we're looking for." One of the real important things in radio is adaptability. You need to look at a particular task and say, "Here's the shell of a game plan. It's like a flow chart; if you get to here and this sort of situation hasn't developed, maybe you have to go there."

LISA: I'd say things like it used to be possible for Top 40 to own the streets; now it's a matter of identifying the correct streets. I use the word streets both figuratively and literally. You have to focus on both the zip codes as well as the lifestyles of the target audience and any specific demographics you may be after. Morning shows are another thing I discuss in full detail. In most situations mornings are the cornerstone of the radio station. They must be topical, outrageous, unpredictable and still be customer and client-friendly. Mornings should be the talk of the office.

The Network Forty: Programming isn't an exact science. How do you explain your philosophy to cover the unexpected or unpredictable?

MIKE: Again, you have to know, understand and execute the goals of the radio station. The science part of it is the people, the music, the positioning... those type of things. The other things make it interesting and fun. Being spontaneous and recognizing the show business aspects are the elements of radio which keep it interesting. I've always loved art and design, so I look at radio as balancing the science with the art of programming.

CHRIS: It's funny because Jeff Salgo advised me to include a programming philosophy in my package when I was out of

work. He said that any programming philosophy needs to be a shell. So many eccentric, kinetic, crazy and reactionary things can happen. One thing happens, which causes another thing to happen, which sets off a chain of events. It's like a nuclear meltdown that you didn't intend to happen. Your programming philosophy needs to be adaptable. You need to say "Okay, it is chaotic, but we still need to make some sense out of it." It's like a general in a battlefield who explains the plan to his various lieutenants; then they have to go out and say, "The general said, in this situation, we have to do this and this. However, that's not what's happening here." Then you have to improvise. Part of programming is to think - with the goal in mind - on your feet and quickly be able to come up with a decision that makes sense. You may make mistakes; that just happens. There's no programming philosophy or explanation of what you're trying to do that can cover every potential eventuality.

LISA: The science of programming, as it applies to this format, comes down to things as its strengths: energy, presentation and interaction. Energy and excitement tie in to the focus of the music and presentation. As with all sciences, there are many theories, but as Mark Twain in "Tom Sawyer" once said, "The trouble about arguments is, they ain't nothing but theories, after all, and theories don't prove nothing. They only give you a place to rest on, a spell when you are tuckered out, butting around and around, trying to find something there ain't no way to find out. There's another trouble about theories: there's always a hole in them somewheres, sure if you look close enough."






Bill Richards

From The Frying Pan...Into The Fire?

INTERVIEW BY GERRY CAGLE

ill Richards grew up in a small town (Sioux Falls, SD) in a family of six. When he was 10, he visited a shopping center with his mom and twin sister. A jock from a local radio station was doing a remote and for once, a radio remote worked. Bill Richards got hooked. (His twin sister, by the way, didn't.) The next year he built a station in his basement and kept broadcasting until he began doing overnights at KISD when he was 15. He hasn't stopped working since. Now he faces his biggest challenge as he begins consulting with Guy Zapoleon. Bill is known as one of the most meticulous programmers in the business, taking time off only to hang out with his wife and daughter when he isn't on the golf course. The Network Forty VP/GM Gerry Cagle caught him lining up a putt at the recent T.J. Martell tournament (he's also meticulous at golf) and got him to break his concentration long enough to do the following interview. Amazingly, he still sank the putt.



What were the most influential radio stations you listened to when you were growing up?

WKS, KAAY and tapes of other great stations, including KCBQ, KFRC and WABC.

When you first began your career, what goals did you set for yourself?

I had different goals in different stages of my career. When I was really young, I just wanted to be on the air. Then I wanted to be a PD so I could control my own destiny. I programmed my first station at 21. I wanted to be the best in the business so I was determined to learn everything I could. I read interviews, publications, made phone calls... you name it. I was dedicated to being one of the best PDs in the business. I had a lot — and I mean a lot—

of help from many people. Plus, I was given the chance to prove myself by a gentleman named Larry Lakoduk (who's now working with George Burns). He was a tremendous influence on me. My next goal was to program in a Top-10 market. When I was at WNCI, Nationwide had no interest in being in a Top-10 market at that time. When KKBQ Houston called, I accepted. Then, I set my sights on KIIS FM. I wanted to program the station and program it successfully. That was accomplished. Now, I want to control my own destiny. After you program a KIIS FM, where can you go? Consulting more than one station was the only answer for me.

You rose from obscurity in a small market to fame programming one of the

best radio stations in the country. Since every program director would like to make the same jump, tell them how to do it.

It's a lot harder now than when I did it. The duopolies, LMAs and ownership changes associated with the economy have shrunk the job opportunities. However, there are some things those wishing to get ahead should do:

- Get noticed. Work the trade magazines and conventions.
- 2. Send out philosophies to people you respect.
- 3. Make phone calls. You can never be too persistent. You may not be able to get major programmers on the phone in the beginning, but start somewhere.
- 4. Be positive. Don't waste time feeling sorry for yourself.

- 5. Do things professionally. It does matter. Make your resume shine. If you're sending airchecks, use professionally produced labels.
- Don't be afraid to invest in yourself. Make sacrifices to make your presentations look better.

In a nutshell, what's the biggest difference between programming in a small and large market?

The basics are the same. Of course, the budget at KIIS is larger, but stations across the street have larger budgets as well. Promotion is not about money. It's about creativity, persistence and will. Programming is tougher because you're under a microscope in larger markets, particularly at KIIS FM. Everybody has an opinion of everything you do.

What were your biggest accomplishments at KIIS FM?

My years there were very rewarding and also disappointing. My proudest moments were probably when KIIS went #1 for the first time in five vears and the "KIIS and Unite" show that I started. I also take pride for even trying. I could've stayed comfortable in a smaller market (even Houston), but the challenge was there. Other guys might have crumbled or never even attempted to do it, but I did it successfully, so I'll never have to wonder what it would've been like.

And disappointments?

Nah, that's negative thinking. I know what kind of PD I am. I accomplished a lot in the face of a format that was having bigass problems across the country. I will say that KIIS needs to be a *Top 40*. It needs to maintain a direction and not waver. It can't play "what's selling in town" one minute and play "Chicago oldies" the next. A lack of consistency hurts KIIS. Let Dees be Dees and let the station be itself.

How about the most embarrassing moment of your career?

Probably choking up at the "KIIS And Unite" press conference. After all the hard work we put in, to have it actually come together as we dreamed was more than I could verbalize.

What was the motivating factor in your becoming a consultant?

I feel that I need to continue to grow. I needed a challenge. I love this business. I want to give back to it and, at the same time, get more from it.

What's the biggest difference between consulting and hands-on programming?

You don't have the togetherness of people. You can't take total credit for a station's success. Now, I'll just be happy helping someone experience those moments — and know that I played a part in it. It's also different to work with a bunch of stations instead of just one. The best thing an owner or GM can do for his PD is to let him get experience working

with more than just one station. You grow a lot as a PD if you can see it from more than one perspective.

How does your consulting philosophy differ from others?

Radio has changed tremendously. The format niches and nuances are so varied from just a few short years ago that you need to have been through it. Zapoleon and I have been there. Not to take anything away from any of the other consultants, but some of them have been away from the day-to-day programming challenges for a long, long time.

grammers. We've programmed successfully in small, medium and large markets. Guy and I are the perfect combination.

With all of the doom-andgloom prophets orchestrating the death of Top 40, how do you predict the future of the format?

The format is just in a more competitive arena than before. You can't just give away money and expect it to affect the book in a big way. In the past, Top 40 has attracted more creative programmers and performers. People outside the format have gotten better. Experienced Top

I disagreed with Burns and Kabrich when they came in to KIIS FM and still do. For KIIS FM not to play Boys II Men or En Vogue was suicide. Top 40 means Top, The Best, What's Hot.

You and Guy Zapoleon are partners. Are you both involved with individual stations? How does that work?

We work together, but there will be one point man. For example, Guy is the point man in Phoenix and I'll be there to assist whenever asked. All the client stations will be on our weekly conference calls (which we'll do together) and be privy to all our other material. We're both available to whoever needs us.

Where do you see yourself in five years?

I would like to write a book, but other than that, I want to continue my involvement with radio.

If you hadn't chosen radio as a career, what would you be doing?

Playing rhythm guitar for Paul McCartney? Playing in the Masters golf tournament? I really believe that a person can achieve whatever they conceive and believe. Say it's conceit and I'll say it's belief.

Who were your early mentors? Who did you learn from?

Besides you? There's Jay Cook. He's fair, patient and a people person as well as a businessman. Steve Berger is a tremendous inspiration. Also Rivers, Shannon, Van Stone, Kingston, Zapoleon, Al Law. I consider myself lucky to have been able to call on these and many more. And there are some brilliant programming people who I haven't met yet. I can't wait to rub elbows with them.

Is there someone in the business you haven't met?

Yeah, Bud Paxon because he won't return phone calls.

What's the worst line someone has used to get you to play a record?

"Just play it once and I guarantee it will happen."

Tell us something no one has ever heard you say.
"It's an add."

Guy and I are not cookie-cutters. Each market is different and needs to be approached that way. I have a whole list of questions upon starting a station so I can better understand and execute the strategy. To sum it up, we're modern-day pro-

40 programmers have ventured outside the format with big success.

The music is also changing. Rap music is evolving to incorporate the masses. It *had* to. Arrested Development is a perfect example. But it still depends on your market. Washington DC is just a different animal from Madison. It's a matter of *balance*. Top 40 is always changing – always adapting. It's up to us to see it through; that's the real challenge.

"Killer/Papa Was A Rolling Stone"



Swirling movement of spiritual melodies empowers the debut effort from Verve (Vernon Yard/Virgin). The first single, "Slide Away," conveys a strong vocal presence, but the rest of the album offers an ambient, trance-like vocal tranquility. So, Phillips invited all the retail help up to their hotel room for a second live performance that included the omitted faves! Radio should not ignore "Jupiter And Teardrop" or the title track..... Speaking of R.E.M.(WB), a new album is rumored to be out before the end of the year and (Saints be praised!) possibly a tour to support it!

Is Anybody Happy? The latest darlings of England, Suede (Columbia) offer a vengeful look at an abusive parent in "Animal Nitrate." Ziggy Stardust-like vocals, a perfect blend of instrumentation and synthesized sound get this song's point across in record time. The accessibility of Suede's music should generate plenty of airplay on Alternative stations... Eddie Vedder lends his pipes out once again, this time to L.A. Punkers Bad Religion (Epitaph). Johnette Napolitano of Concrete Blonde also contributes to the band's seventh release, Recipe For Hate, due out this month.

Spliff off the Ol' Block: Ziggy Marley And The Melody Makers are back, faithfully recalling their legendary father on their upcoming release *Joy And Blues* (Virgin). Their first single, "Brothers And Sisters," displays an infectious groove with sweet harmonies. The album is loaded with perfect summer tunes... Golden Earring, a staple back in their "Radar Love" glory days, head straight for Alternative radio this week with an unplugged version of "Twilight Zone" (First Quake). Three versions of the acoustic set offer new life to this recurrent favorite... Due in stores June 15th is the debut Paul Westerberg solo album *14 Songs* (Sire/Reprise). The first single, "World Class Fad," is a hit you don't want to miss.

Odd Rockfellows: Judgment Night (Immortal/Epic), an upcoming movie soundtrack due out in September, pairs these odd combos for "little ditty duets:" Faith No More and Boo-Yaa Tribe; Helmet, House Of Pain and Therapy?, Rage Against The Machine and Tool; and – no kidding – Cypress Hill and Stone Temple Pilots! This will be worth waiting for... Welcome home, KKDG "The Edge" Fresno MD Sat Bisla, who had to prove his American residence to Tijuana border authorities this past weekend with just his "British" accent! His green card "safely" at home and a cash machine not in arms reach, it was up to Sat's friends on the other side to vouch for him. They were asked by the thick-accented Federales, "Are you looking for Sex?" Fortunately for "Sat," they were!

BOY KRAZY (NEXT PLATEAU/LONDON/PLG)

- Boy Krazy is a quartet comprised of singers Kimberly Blake, Johnna Lee Cummings, Josselyne Jones and Ruth Ann Roberts.
- The group, who came together three years ago, ranges in age from 17 to early 20s.
- All of the members have appeared in various TV and radio commercials.



- Ruth Ann, the youngest, is a former Miss Junior America.
- Kimberly roured in a dance and musical troupe and also appeared in the stage play, "Starlight Express"
- Josselyne plays guitar, has a home studio and previously fronted her own band.
- Johnna's theatrical career includes the live production of "The Music Man."
- "That's What Love Can Do" was originally released in England in the summer of '91. Someone at KS104 Denver heard the song, put it on the air and it soon became a Top-5 request. It led to the recording of their debut album.
- Their debut album was produced by the British team Stock Aitken Waterman, who previously broke Bananarama.
- Following up their chart-topping first single is "Good Times With Bad Boys."

SOUL ASYLUM (COLUMBIA)

Dave Pirner, lead vocals, guitar.

Karl Mueller, bass.

Dan Murphy, lead guitar.

Grant Young, drums.

- High school pals Dan and Karl recruited Dave and started a band called Loud Fast Rules out of Minneapolis in 1981.
- They changed their name to Soul Asylum and cut the debut EP, Say What You Will, on the independent Twin Tone Records.
- Soul Asylum is a product of the same Minneapolis Punk scene that begat the Replacements (with Paul Westerberg) and Husker Du (which has evolved into Sugar).
- After their original drummer left, Grant Young joined the band in 1985, in time for their first full-length album, *Made To Be Broken*.
- The band slowly developed a grassroots following

through constant low-budget touring and a series of independant label releases.

• In 1987, they landed their first major label deal with A&M Records, making the highly underrated *Hang Time* and *Soul Asylum And The Horse They Rode In On.*



- Soul Asylum signed to Columbia in 1991; their first album is *Grave Dancers Union*, which was produced by Michael Beinhorn.
 - Booker T (of the MG's) plays organ on six of the 12 songs.
- "Somebody To Shove" and "Black Gold" have become heavy Alternative radio favorites; the new single is "Runaway Train."
- The video of "Train" contains pictures of missing children. Viewers who recognize anyone in the video can call the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children Hotline at 800-843-5678.
- Soul Asylum will soon hit the road on MTV's Alternative Nation tour with Spin Doctors and Screaming Trees.

KENNY G (ARISTA)

- Kenny Gorelick was raised in Seattle and started playing the saxophone as a child.
- Graduated Magna Cum Lauda and Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Washington in..... accounting!
- While in college, he performed in bands of Johnny Mathis, The Spinners, Diahann Carroll, Liberace and Ginger Rogers.
- After college, Kenny joined the Jeff Lorber Fusion. He spent four years with them before embarking on a solo career.
- He has put out seven albums: Kenny G, G Force, Gravity, Duotones (featuring the Pop hit, "Songbird"), Silhouette, Kenny G Live and the latest release, Breathless.
- Honors: *Billboard*'s Jazz Artist Of The Decade, *Rolling Stone* Readers Poll as the #1 Instrumentalist.
- All told, Kenny G has sold over 10 million records.
- Breathless features 14 songs, including the hits, "Forever In Love" and the current smash, "By The Time The Night Is Over," featuring singer Peabo Bryson.

Perry Farrell, vocals.

Stephen Perkins, drums.

- Perry Farrell and Stephen Perkins were one-half of Jane's Addiction, a highly-touted L.A. Glam/Punk cult band that was just about to explode onto the Mainstream Rock scene when they broke up after the first Lollapalooza tour in 1991. Their third album, *Ritual De Lo Habitual*, had just gone Platinum.
- Farrell conceived of the Lollapalooza Festival, the Alternative Woodstock/sideshow that's widely acknowledged as the most popular package tour on the road.
- Farrell also produced a semi-autobiographical lowbudget art film, *The Gift*, which has been shown at selected theatres across the country.
- In January of 1992, Farrell and Perkins recruit friend/surfer guitarist Peter DiStefano, who played in the L.A.-area surf band K-38. DiStefano brings bassist LeNoble, who was playing for the band Thelonious Monster, into the group.
- When immigration officials tried to fingerprint the Dutch bassist to renew his Green Card, they discovered that LeNoble's constant playing had rubbed all traces of prints from his left hand. They had to use a print of his left toe.



- The band name comes from a fireworks flyer found inside a magazine advertising X-rated S&M videos.
- On the day the band announced its new name, the first Rodney King trial verdict was announced and L.A. went up in flames.
- After several unannounced gigs, the band plays its first official show in July of '92 at Castaic Lake in L.A. It was reviewed in *Rolling Stone*. Two weeks later, it performed on the opening day show of Lollapalooza '92. They only performed twice more during the tour.
- After recording their debut album, they release one song, "Orgasm," only to strip clubs throughout the U.S.
- The self-titled album has since been released nationwide. "Cursed Female" was the first track released to Alternative, although the follow-up, "Pets" shows more promise for Mainstream crossover.



When The Waterboys came onto the scene eight years ago, Mike Scott and band met with little fanfare because Alternative Rock didn't have the outlets it has today. Even so, "Whole Of The Moon" received enough play at Rock Radio to earn a spot on the Top 40 charts. Following the success of *This Is The Sea* (at which time Karl Wallinger left to form World Party), The Waterboys released a couple of traditional/acoustic Folk exploratory records, which brings us to the question everyone asks with each new Waterboys release: Does it rock? The answer with *Dream Harder* is an emphatic YES! "Extremely intelligent" and "beautifully produced" are good ways to describe the band's first album for Geffen Records and seventh overall. From the powerful first chords of "The New Life" to "Preparing To Fly" (a song about being in love with life... you'll feel it, too, after a listen) to "The Return Of Pan" (the first of many singles to be released) and "The Return Of Jimi Hendrix," this album excels. There will be a video for "The Return Of Pan" and, most importantly, there will also be a tour. *Dream Harder* reaches deep into your psyche, albeit with many subtleties.






