"PRIVATE PARTS" GOES PUBLIC

To plug his new book, "Private Parts," morning mope Howard Stern has been a veritable anti-Barney in terms of media saturation. Besides same-day appearances on Dateline NBC and The Late Show With David Letterman, Stern was seen on CBS' morning show and his puss was on the cover of Entertainment Weekly. One wonders whether the blitz was even needed; the book sold anywhere from 50,000-75,000 copies in its first day, prompting publisher Simon & Schuster to replete the soon-to-be-exhausted initial order of 250,000 copies with a record reprint run of 500,000 copies. KIIS Keeps Rick Dees For Three More Years

New Pact Includes Joint Syndication Venture

Longtime morning star Rick Dees will continue to reign in Los Angeles, as well as spread his word across the country. He recently agreed to a three-year deal with KIIS-FM that includes a joint partnership venture to syndicate his morning show across the country.

Neither party would comment on the exact dollar figure on the deal, although Dees told *The Network Forty* that he was "extremely happy" with the new deal. "The key point was the ability to syndicate the show from KIIS," he notes. "I would like to be able to say I signed a contract for \$30 billion, but it was only for \$20 billion, so I can't."

On a more serious note, KIIS President/GM Marc Kaye states that "KIIS-FM and Gannett Co. are extremely pleased at Rick Dees' commitment to the ongoing success of KIIS-FM. Rick has consistently delivered a morning audience among the largest in the nation. His continued position at the top of the ratings is assured by his exceptional talent and by the loyal listeners he has cultivated at KIIS-FM."

Dees joined KIIS in 1981. Since then, he has been honored as a Top 40 "Personality Of The Year" 11 times and he has hosted the TV shows Solid Gold and Into The Night. Dees has been seen in numerous acting roles in TV series such as Roseanne and will be soon be seen in animated form as "Rock Dees" in the upcoming film, The Flintstones.

Mel's New Toy: Westwood One

Infinity Pays \$101 Million For Control

Infinity Broadcasting Corp. agreed to purchase a controlling interest in Westwood One, Inc. in a \$101.3 million deal that merges WW1 with Unistar Radio Networks to create a radio programming entity second in scope to only Cap Cities/ABC.

Once the deal is consummated in the first quarter of 1994, Infinity CEO Mel Karmazin will also assume the same post at Westwood One, while Westwood One founder/Chairman/CEO Norm Pattiz will relinquish CEO duties. All told, Infinity will have the opportunity to possess 25% of Westwood One's common shares.

If it all goes through, the Inifinity station group will have a wealth of syndicated radio programming at its disposal, much like TV station chains that launch syndicated series. It will combine the talents of Unistar personalities Larry King, G. Gordon Liddy, Don Imus, Casey Kasem and Pat Buchanan as well as CNN's radio operations with Westwood One's Mutual Broadcasting System, NBC

Radio Networks and the Source, on top of Infinity's syndications of "The Howard Stern Show" and the Greaseman for its chain of 25 stations in 13 markets, including WXRK New York, KROQ/KRTH Los Angeles and its latest acquisition, WPGC Washington, D.C.

Investors in both companies welcomed news of the merger. Infinity stock has risen from \$45.50 to \$51.25, up 13% in just 48 hours, while Westwood One rocketed from \$3.50 to almost \$5.50, up 54 percent.

RCA Elevates Promotion Staff

Anzaldo, Kemp And Nicosia Upped



Melon, Joel Break Carey's #1 PPW Reign

Janet Jackson #1 Most Requested "Again"

It had to happen: Mariah Carey's coast-to-coast domination of *The Network Forty*'s Plays-Per-Week regional breakouts came to an end this week, as Blind Melon and Billy Joel claimed the top spot in three of the six regions.

Carey (whose "Dreamlover" still held on as the most-played single nationally for the sixth week in a row) still reigned in the South, Great Lakes and West regions. However, Blind Melon and Billy Joel finished one-two in the Midwest and Northwest, with the order reversed in the Northeast. Other acts showing up in the Top 3 were Meat Loaf (#3 Northeast), Def Leppard (#3 South), Toni Braxton (#3 Great Lakes and Northwest), SWV (#2 West) and Ace Of Base (#3 West).

It didn't take long for Janet Jackson to reclaim the top spot in the Mainstream Most Requested Charts. In its second "official" week of release, "Again" rocketed from #4 to #1. Last week's Top-3 records – Meat

Loaf's "I'd Do Anything For Love (But I Won't Do That)," Ace Of Base's "All That She Wants" and Blind Melon's "No Rain" all moved down one notch on the totem pole.

Filling out the Top 10 were something old (Aerosmith's "Cryin'," Def Leppard's "Two Steps Ahead" and Inner Circle's "Sweat (A La La La La Long)," something new

Was it a River of Dreams or a Ship of Fools at Billy Joel's sold out Madison Square Garden concert last week? In front of 20,000 people, including many PDs brought in for the occassion, the Sony promotion team that included Jerry Blair, Jerry Lembo, Jim Burruss, Charlie Walk, Robin Cecola and directed by Sr. VP Burt Baumgartner sang back-up vocals on "Goodnight Siagon." They swear the mics were turned on, although Billy's sound engineer has a different story. The group has not been asked to perform on Steve Kingston's Morning Zoo and reportedly, Columbia President Don Ienner flatly refused to sign the "sick-tet" to a record deal. Don't you just love show biz?

Elvis Sighting

The best billboard of the year goes to Oldies-formatted KFRC San Francisco with a campaign slogan, "Elvis ain't dead 'til we say so!" And while we're on KFRC, with all of the talent at the station, including Top 40 programmer Brian White, is it possible the legendary KFRC will rise from the "dead" playlist to something more current?

Mega-Deal

KIIS Los Angeles solidified their morning grip by signing super-talent Rick Dees to a long-term contract. (See News section for details.) A consummate professional who's been able to adapt to the various subtle shifts in the format, Rick still runs the best-prepared Top 40 morning show in the country. Many "flashes" come and go, but day-in and day-out, Dees' consistency wins out in the long run.

Worst To First?

KMXZ debuted Top 40 early this year in Monterey/Salinas with only dreams of catching long-dominant KDON. It didn't take PD Christopher Lance and the staff long to turn the dream into reality. For the first time in almost 20 years, KDON was beaten by a format competitor. The summer Arbitron moved KMXZ 3.6 to 4.8, while KDON fell 6.4 to 4.4. Our congratulations to Christopher, GM Gary Weinstein and the rest of the gang.

Other Smiling Faces

Top 40s showed strong in major markets and the trend continues elsewhere. (See Editorial) In Atlanta, both Top 40s posted gains, WSTR up to 6.3 and WNNX 4.1 to 4.9. KDWB in

Minneapolis rose 6.8 to 7.3. In Providence, WPRO moved 7.7 to 7.9 while WWKX held at 3.5 and KHKS Dallas went 4.1 to 4.4. In Cleveland, WJMO rose 4.7 to 5.2 and Alternative-leaning WENZ inched up 2.7 to 3.0. WTIC-FM Hartford had a super book, moving 5.9 to 7.6; ditto KRBE in Houston, up 3.8 to 5.2. Others quite satisfied with their performances include KQKS Denver (4.7), WKRQ Cincinnati (6.3), WDJX Louisville (7.6), KUBE (6.2) and KPLZ (3.1) Seattle, WLUM Milwaukee (7.5), WNTQ Syracuse (10.9), WKBQ St. Louis (4.1), WBZZ Pittsburg (6.2), Baltimore's 92Q (4.6) and WMTX (6.8) and Power Pig (6.7) Tampa.



Special congratulations to PD Mike Morgan and the staff at Fly92 Albany. The station moved to #1 in the market by passing Country WGNA! And OM Chuck Field and PD Dave Ferguson kept it going up to a 9.4 at KSFM Sacramento.





I heard that they've finally got the bugs out of the tic-tac-toe game, but the connect-the-dots program is giving them fits. By the way, Bernie, my bookie, had put the odds of a September delivery at 8-to-5, but after paying off my rather substantial wager, the odds are now off the boards.

With the Spring Arbitron ratings showing substantial gains for many Top 40 stations, (see Page 6) what's going to happen to those who were singing the format's death knell just a few months ago? (They'll probably apply for jobs at R&R.) Ain't it amazing what a few superstar releases will do for the format? For Top 40 to prosper, Mainstream artists have to release records. Well, they're back. Billy Joel, Mariah Carey, Janet Jackson, Rod Stewart, Aerosmith, En Vogue, Madonna, Tears For Fears and Duran Duran are just a few with formidable track records who are currently on the charts. Add to those dependables Blind Melon, Toni Braxton, Haddaway, Lisa Keith, Ace of Base, Taylor Dayne and some others and you have the basis of the "resurrection." The return of Meat Loaf, Earth, Wind & Fire and the Bee Gees are the icing on the cake. Top 40 always grows when radio just plays the hits. It's nice to have hits to play.

Has anyone ever seen the head of Arbitron and Don King in the same room at the same time? With the recent problems of the WBC- sanctioned title fights that mysteriously ended in draws followed by weak explanations, it's more than a lit-

tle reminiscent of the continuing problems between R and R... radio and ratings. When will radio stop letting the tail wag the dog as far as ratings are concerned? Arbitron's methodology is worse than R&R's... and that's really out of line. Sooner or later, radio must take control of its own destiny and demand a better ratings tool or our industry will continue to fall behind in the race for the advertising dollars.

Is it my imagination or is our industry, both on the radio and record sides, becoming more fun lately? Increased advertising dollars and better ratings are probably the reason in radio. And the success of carefully planned projects like Meat Loaf, U2, Mariah Carey, Billy Joel, Earth, Wind & Fire, Toni Braxton, Janet Jackson, John Mellencamp, Blind Melon and some others put smiles on the faces of most of those in the record business. Damned if it doesn't seem like we know what we're doing! It probably is a product of my highly colored imagination, but it seems like everyone's enjoying themselves more in the latter part of the year than in the earlier part. *R&R* is, of course, the obvious exception.

perfect example of how to create excitement and set up a promotion that will make your radio station stand out from others. Conceived and produced by Jack McCoy, "The Last Contest" is something you should share with those in your programming and promotion departments.

Since *R&R* has canceled their convention plans for 1994, the big rumor is that *The Network Forty* will step in with an unusual concept next year. (Editor's note: It's more than a rumor; Bernie has it at even money.)

Was I the only one who didn't know they found the Mars orbiter?






MAKING OKLAHOMA BETTER THAN JUST OK

Oklahoma City is a challenging market of just under one million people. Program Director Mike McCoy has guided his station to the top in this diverse community. "This is the state capital and the city really grew during the oil boom. People may be surprised to find out that this is more a blue collar, midwest-type city than say, southwestern, although those influences are here as well.

McCoy has been at the station "for four years now. Prior to this, I programmed in Alburquerque and Youngstown. I also worked at B94 Pittsburgh, WNCI Columbus and KLUC Las Vegas. What really brought me to Oklahoma City, though, was the opportunity to join Clear Channel Communications. They're just great to work for. This market also has a great history of radio, with people such as Machine Gun Kelly and Charlie Tuna having worked here."

Who's the typical KJ103 listener? "Frankly, I want them all," says McCoy, "although we're targeting the typical 18-34 cell that most Top 40s go after. During the day, we'll skew much older than that. This station has significant 25-54 numbers."

Those listeners are drawn in by a music mix that's described as "simply the Top 40 hits for Oklahoma City. That may sound like a pat answer, but it's the truth. If my audience is hummin' it, then we're thumpin' it - come to think of it, that may be a great new sweeper! Seriously, all kinds of music works here. It's simply a matter of playing the right song at the right time. We can plug Bon Jovi, Dr. Dre or Michael Bolton in, for that matter. It depends mostly on the daypart."



Mike McCoy

McCoy points to a recent promotion as typical of KJYO's on-air antics. "We just finished a contest we called 'The B.O. Geo.' We had a '93 Geo Metro out at the state fair and gave listeners who qualified on the air a chance to win the car by staying in it the longest. We ended up with four qualifiers who lived in the car for quite some time. They had to stay in there 24 hours a day. They had to eat and sleep in pretty tight quarters, hence the name 'B.O. Geo.' We had two women go for 17 days in there without a bath, shower or change of clothes. The contest gave us a lot of visibility, both at the fair (which had a lot of traffic) and on all three local network TV stations that covered the event. It was the most talked-about event in town!







CONFERENCE CALL

ANALYSIS

In the 100-plus conversations on music scheduling *The Network Forty* had with programmers over the past few weeks, there have been many recurring comments about why music is scheduled one day at a time at so many radio stations. Several major-market programmers discussed some of those reasons in Issue #182 (10/1). Other programmers have contacted *The Network Forty* soon after that column was published and they offered their insight as well. Their perspectives:

WEEKEND WATCH

Most programmers don't even like scheduling music over the weekend because things like drastic changes in weather, record leaks and market events might occur on a Saturday or Sunday. Many programmers note that they initially scheduled weekend logs ahead of time, but because of the aforementioned variables, they found themselves going in on the weekends and tweaking the music logs to adapt to the unforeseen events.

A key word at Top 40 radio stations is *spontaneity*. Good radio always reacts to what is happening. Radio stations along coastal areas constantly have to deal with sudden changes in weather; a tropical storm or even heavy surf conditions can warrant an instant change in programming. The same applies to radio stations in the tornado belt or those in areas prone to heavy snow, flooding... the list goes on.

LIVING WITH LATE RESEARCH

In most of the conversations we've had, programmers continually state, "there are too many outside influences or variables to schedule music more than two days in advance." Many programmers noted that their music research arrives late in the week. Even though current industry habits have programmers reporting airplay on Tuesdays,

adjustments in rotations are made later in the week because of late research.

DAYPART DILEMMAS

Internally, programming philosophies change with each programmer. Programmers have been known to schedule music according to tempo, type, style, feel, lyrics, instruments used in specific songs, artists, specific sound, rhythm, timbre... again, the list goes on and on.

Most programmers daypart records, while some don't. Daypart restrictions have no set parameters. While one programmer may change daypart restrictions weekly, another may do it twice a week, while yet another may change them daily.

OVERNIGHT MOVES

The request information of the 150 radio stations that send *The Network Forty* overnight request information illustrates another element to consider. Requests change day to day and from market to market. While Blind Melon's "No Rain" may request in the "Top-5 at 10" one night at a particular radio station, on the following night it might not show up in the Top 5 at all. There is no way to know ahead of time which songs may appear in specialty situations, where programming is based solely on requests generated in a 24-hour period.

The Network Forty will continue to provide a forum for programmers to discuss this situation and every issue that faces Top 40 radio in the '90s... and beyond. When it comes to PPW forecasts, however, the consensus remains the same. There is no way more than a very small percentage of programmers, let alone a representative and significant sample, will ever program music more than a couple of days out. It simply will not happen.

This jam was written and produced by Jermaine Dupri and boasts numerous samples from Rick James' "Mary Jane," Dr. Dre's "The Day The Niggaz Took Over" and Grover Washington, Jr.'s "Mr. Magic."

H-Town

"Keepin' My Composure" (Luke)

The three-man team of H-Town – Dino Conner, Shazam Conner and Darryl Jackson – stormed onto the scene earlier this year with one of Luke Records' biggest hits, "Knockin' Da Boots." Keeping with the formula that took them to the top, H-Town belts out the mellowest of lyrics over a downtempo beat. This song has a very familiar '70s groove with just a touch of Funk.

EAZY-E

"Real Compton City G's" (RUTHLESS/RELATIVITY)

The mastermind behind Rap's most controversial group – N.W.A. – and President of Ruthless Records, Eazy-E lays it on the line and holds nothing back on this slammin' jam. There's nothing new about Rappers dissin' each other, but no one hits below the belt quite like Eazy. From the start, he dishes up some of the hardest-hitting lyrics to be pressed on wax. The beats he chooses to sling his attitudenal shit over are too cool. One thing's for sure, Rap is getting a lot more interesting.

ZAPP & ROGER

"Slow & Easy"

(REPRISE)

Southern Cali has always been hip to this 11-man entourage. Low-riders around the world celebrated Zapp's return with the "Mega Medley" and the best-of collection that followed. But a completely new song? And it's not even Christmas! We certainly must be good boys and girls. Even behind the tightest security, the Reprise staff couldn't keep eager programmers from leaking this Funkdrenched jam. Illegal airplay at KKBT, KPWR, KWIN, KGGI, KUBE, KBXX and XHTZ.

JOSE AND LUIS

"Queen's English" (SIRE/WB)

You may recognize these guys... they were Madonna's dancers on the *Truth Or Dare* tour. Campy House to the end, the vinyl 12-inch sports six different mixes; take note of "The Factory Mix" – clocking in at 14:10, you may want to dig out your razor blade – and "The Queen's Spanish." Programmers will appreciate the single remix on the Pro-CD, which has even more vocals by the Ambitious Blonde, Madonna. Production by Shep Pettibone.

A BEAT AHEAD

RHYTHM IS TRANCER... A few months ago, Big Beat Records shipped a double 12-inch of Echora's "Love Is Blind" that was received with open arms by the clubs. Now, this rhythmic groover is available on CD, with radio-accesible edits of the remixes. The Austin Edit by Austin Reynolds is just the deal!! The bass line pulses under trance-inducing synth stabs coupled with scorching female vocals, this mix screams "get the hell up!" For something a little different,

give a spin to the Blind Mix by Nixon Rosembert & Fidel Rosales. This mix combines an uptempo House bass line with lilting vocals, ethereal piano lines and sax riffs – it is truly exquisite! We're talking a must-listen for anyone looking for Dance music.

BOOGIE OOGIE OOGIE... Look for House records from two unexpected sources. Jon Secada's "Do You Really Want Me" (SBK/ERG) comes with remixes by West End and Todd Terry, while En Vogue's "What Is Love" (EastWest) features backing vocals by Michael Watford with remixes by Mentalinstrum... Tunes starting to break out of the clubs include Haddaway's "Life" (Coconut-UK), Beat System's "To A Brighter Day" (ffrr-UK) and Bless This House's "I Can See Clearly" (Moonshine Music)... A previous Club smash, Dajae's "You Got Me Up" (Cajual/Emotive) gets the remix treatment by E-Smoove and Danny Tenaglia. Like all good remixes, it comes on a double-spinner... Breaking the 140 bpm barrier, Hardfloor's "Acperience" (Moonshine Music) is a glossy number with great production and separation that will leave you sweaty.



H-Town

RAPTIVITY ... Recently at the Congressional Black Caucus, Hip-Hop artist Tragedy the Intelligent Hoodlum spoke on Capitol Hill. He addressed the attacks that have been waged by politicians against both Rap music and the rappers themselves. 

Assessing the Hawaiian market, Gray notes, "This is a great area for entertainment. Honolulu is made up of great restaurants and live entertainment. Professional people hang on restaurant row, a progressive and hip area. It's not a campy Bourbon Street atmosphere. Honolulu isn't one of those cities where residents move out to the 'burbs and ignore downtown entertainment."

But there's a hefty price for paradise. "The cost of living is so obnoxious, a majority of residents have two jobs," Gray explains. "At 7:00 am, people are off to work. By 11:00 pm, they return home from their second job. This lifestyle exposes people to the radio. They're in their cars and out at the beach. It's a "radio city;" that's the beauty of it. After learning this, I stopped myself from saying 'oh my God, this isn't going to work,' because it's not like any other medium-market station.

The audience, the marketplace and the economy are all totally different.

"Yesterday, I was at Tower Records and I didn't see one picture of Garth Brooks," he adds. "Out of the three Tower locations in Honolulu, not one had a Country music section! This isn't America; it's Mars! Albany is market #54 with five Album Rock stations. Heritage radio is so thick there, the #1 Rock station could turn off its transmitter and still get a 30 share.

"This market is different," he asserts. "Alternative hits sell here without receiving airplay. I know this station can move records because they're currently buying music they have to go out of their way to know. Album Rock is a proven failure here, so I'm taking a Top 40 approach to my programming. I don't care about going eight cuts deep into a record. I'm going to play the hits – singles, singles, singles! Fortunately, I don't have a core audience to piss off."

KPOI has gone through many changes over the past few months. Most of the air staff has been on air for less than

five months; the station has been running without a PD for the past two months. Nevertheless, Gray believes the current staff can make it work. MD Ted Taylor was an in-house find. Originally from San Francisco, Taylor grew up in a progressive hotbed, listening to KSAN and pulling a part-time shift at Live 105, so he's worked within the format and lived the lifestyle. Between the Bay Area and Hawaii, Taylor road-managed Camper Van Beethoven. "Ted was managing Camper between '88 and '89," Gray says. "My target audience now are the people who would probably have seen Camper during that period. At his age, Taylor is a part of the audience I want to attract. He isn't a music geek, but he knows the market and he knows what people want.

"Quite frankly, the station has a consultant, me as the PD and a conservative 30-song playlist. The programming goes as follows: We play about four currents an hour, two recurrents and a 50/50 mix of oldies and new stuff. It's hit radio – an Alternative Top 40."

MUDHONEY "No Song III" (REPRISE)

The acclaimed Seattle band Mudhoney's timely release falls right around the releases of their most ardent supporters, Pearl Jam and Nirvana. The early Punk-influenced grungesters headed up the Seattle scene in 1988 (then on Sub Pop Records), offering refreshing little ditties like "Touch Me, I'm Sick," Over the years, the members have fallen in and out of the band, working on never-ending side projects with other local Seattle bands. Assembled once again, Mudhoney's sevensong release, Five Dollar Bob's Mock Cooter Stew debuts the first single "No Song III." With catchy venom-filled spitfire lyrics, the Postpunk flavor follows the sound Nirvana has worked so hard to perfect. Mudhoney will support one leg of Pearl Jam's upcoming tour.

TAD


"Grease Box" (Mechanic/Giant)

Absolute reactionary record! TAD pulls out all the stops, captivating you within the first 10 seconds. Their hard-driving sonic sound delivers "Grease Box" with metallic force. Thick bass lines surround rich guitar licks and wicked vocals. HAZE AND SHUFFLE "Whatch 'Ya Do With Me" (ARISTA)

Rounding out the list of guitar-ridden releases is Montreal's Haze And Shuffle. With the fervor of one obsessed and the chemistry of diverse influences, Haze and Shuffle serve up a delicious platter of powerchords. Sounding slightly demented, "Whatch 'Ya Do With Me" delivers a devilish sound from their debut release *Get Your Haze*. Sharing a style compared to

The Cult, Haze credits their cryptic sound to the studio they recorded the album in – a former morgue filled with med school cadavers for McGill University.
