


No Safe Harbor?

A U.S. Court of Appeals ruling blew a hole in the FCC's midnight-to-6:00 am "safe harbor" indecency policy by declaring it was constitutionally restrictive. Not only does it seem to restrict indecency enforcement to the "seven dirty words," it also questions the FCC's contention that indecent programming can harm children. If the Commission can't convince the Courts that it does, then the million-plus in fines of Howard Stern's show are history. So far, acting-FCC Chairman James Quello's only move was to shorten the indecency enforcement hours from 6:00 am till midnight to 6:00 am till 8:00 pm

LET'S MAKE A DEAL

Pyramid Broadcasting is about to consummate Buffalo's first owned duopoly by purchasing Soft Rock-WBUF-FM to go along with its already-owned Oldies station WHTT. With the addition of WAQQ and WAQS in Charlotte, the radio group - best known for WXKS-FM Boston - will now have an even dozen stations in its stable. In other buyout news, Par Broadcasting President Stephen O. Jacobs announced the purchase of KKLQ AM/FM San Diego, making Par the first duopoly owner in the market. (It already owns KIOZ and KGMG-AM.)

Power To Bleep Rappers?

Anti-Violence Group Threatens Power 106 Boycott

Leaders of a local anti-violence group have threatened to boycott advertisers of KPWR "Power 106" Los Angeles if the station doesn't censor certain lyrics from Rap songs. They believe the airing of songs that contain the words "nigger," "bitch" and "ho's" are offensive and contributes to violence against Blacks in general and women specifically.

KPWR management met with 20 concerned listeners who were members of the Inglewood, CAbased Stop The Violence Increase The Peace Foundation, who expressed their concerns and threatened the boycott. Station executives sympathized with their sentiments,

then promised to take their requests under advisement and respond in a few days (they should have an answer by the time you read this). PD Rick Cummings and Pres./GM Doyle Rose acknowledged that they found the use of certain lyrics to be uncomfortable, yet they were skeptical whether the offensive words contributes to violence.

"It's fundamentally distasteful for me to have these words on the radio station and what you're asking is well thought-out and not unreasonable," Cummings told them. "But just bleeping a word out isn't going to do a damn thing. If I thought for minute that one record we played was causing violence, I'd

quit and go home."

KPWR executives then made plans to set up a telephone poll to gauge their listeners' sentiments on the issue. Nevertheless, the coalition is going ahead with its boycott of KPWR advertisers.

KSFM Rebuts Drug Allegations GM Calls Ex-Jock's Claims "Extortion"

Air personality Chris Collins' wrongful termination suit against KSFM Sacramento, where he alleges being fired in 1992 because he objected to the use of illegal drugs at the station, was explicitly debunked by KSFM officials.

Collins claims that he was fired after he complained about drug use by station staffers and management, which created "intolerable and oppressive" working conditions. He seeks \$350,000 to compensate loss of income and "injury to reputation."

However, KSFM GM Jerry McKenna wasted no time in denying the charges. "The entire action is based on untrue and unfounded allegations," he declares. "Collins was terminated because, frankly, his substantial salary couldn't be justified in light of his declining ratings. His termination was, in fact, consistent with the terms of his agreement. I can only speculate that this lawsuit is an attempt by Collins to create publicity and to extort the company."

McKenna cites the suspicious timing of the lawsuit as another reason for its lack of merit. "I think the timing on this whole issue has a lot to do with the announced merger of Booth American and Broadcast Alchemy two weeks ago," he says. "As I told someone else, just connect the dots here."

News Briefs

WATCHOUT RECORDS DEBUTS

Veteran record producer Nick Martinelli has formed Watchout Records, a small Santa Monica, CA label that will be marketed and distributed by Mercury Records. Martinelli will operate under the MNM Music Group, Inc. umbrella with partner Herb Moelis.

The first release from Watchout will come from Long Island Funk group Shabazz. Regarding future talent, Martinelli says, "I'll produce or write for a few of the acts on the label, but we're looking for selfcontained live acts, powerful vocalists and songwriters." Martinelli has produced and written songs for Diana Ross, Regina Belle, Robin S and Jomanda.

Joining Martinelli in the Santa Monica headquarters will be A&R Rep Antoine Shamlee and Mark Freidman, Creative Director of the label's publishing arm.

JACKSON TAKES ATV TO EMI

Michael Jackson is moving his music publishing operation, ATV Music, to EMI Music Publishing in what Jackson's attorney John Branca describes as "the largest music publishing deal in history." The 4,000plus song catalog, that includes the bulk of the Lennon/McCartney Beatle hits, fetched Jackson in excess of \$100 million; the total deal is worth in excess of \$200 million.

As part of the agreement, ATV and EMI will join forces in acquiring other song catalogs. Also currently part of ATV's library are hits by Kenny Rogers, UB40, Elvis Presley and Little Richard. Jackson's total publishing worth is now approximately \$500 million. By comparison, the Elton John/Bernie Taupin catalog recently fetched \$39 million and Prince's catalog went for over \$20 million.

Guns N' Roses: In The Eye Of A Storm

Furor Pushes Group To Drop Manson Song From New Album

News reports indicate that Guns N' Roses might – if they haven't already decided to – remove a song written by mass murderer Charles Manson from future copies of its new *The Spaghetti Incident*? album.

Manson's composition, "Look At Your Game, Girl," while not listed on the album cover, is the last track on the release. Once word got out on its inclusion on the album, law enforcement and victims rights groups raised hell about the ethics of Manson profiting from royalties of the album sales. It's believed that he might make as much as \$62,000 for every one million albums sold. About a million records have already been pressed and shipped to retailers.

Also echoing that outrage is the head of the band's label, David Geffen, who claims in *The Los Angeles Times* that he first learned of the existence of the Manson-written album track from a CNN broadcast

on the previous Monday (11/29). "I would hope that if Axl Rose had realized how offensive people would find this, he wouldn't have ever recorded the song in the first place. The issue is not the song itself. The fact that Charles Manson would be earning money based on the fame he derived from committing one of the most horrific crimes of the 20th Century is unthinkable to me." Geffen knew two of the six victims in the Aug. 9, 1969, Benedict Canyon murder rampage masterminded by Manson.

The final decision about removing the song from future album copies rests with Rose. Sources near the group believe that a majority of the five band members already want to drop the song. In a forthcoming Geffen Records press release, Rose – who refrained from committing to the song's inclusion or removal from future pressings – states that "Personally, I liked the lyrics and the melody. Hearing it shocked me and I thought there might be other people who would like to hear it.

"The song talks about how the girl is insane and playing a mad game," he continues. "It was ironic that such a song was recorded by Charles Manson, someone who should know the inner intricacies of madness." Rose pledged to donate all performance royalties from the song to a nonprofit environmental organization, while the label will donate proceeds from the song to the Doris Tate Crime Victims Bureau, named for the mother of actress Sharon Tate, one of the Benedict Canyon murder victims.

20-Year Industry Vet Moves From RCA





LOOKING FOR JACK

atherings of our clan are unique occurrences. Is there any group quite as adept as those in the entertainment business at making small talk about absolutely nothing?

Let's face it. The useless infor-

mation quotient redlines after five minutes with any select few.

It's a product of our environment, I assume. Most really don't have a choice except to babble on in a group. It wasn't long ago that our jobs were part and parcel of meeting and eating with our counterparts, whether record or radio. Now, it's hard to take a phone call, much less schedule a face-to-face conversation. There are too many other meetings inside the building.

What's going on here?

Last week's Editorial struck a chord with many about the relationships between programmers and record promotion people. Many programmers said they would value establishing relationships, but they never get the chance. More often than not, their contact with record company representatives comes through a phone call. Or fax.

What happened to the personal appearance? The job has changed. And the people.

At KHJ Los Angeles in the mid-'70s, there would be 60 record people in the lobby on music day. And lunches and dinners throughout the week. In the early '80s at KFRC, San Francisco, 30 would be lined up. And a couple of lunches and dinners would be scheduled each week. In the mid-'80s at WAPP New York, maybe 10 would be there. There weren't any lunches. Maybe one dinner. And in 1990 at KWOD Sacramento, we were lucky if we saw one a month. Dinners? Forget about it.

In three years at KWOD, I never met half of the record company representatives who were based in San Francisco, less than 90 miles away. Boys and girls, personal contact isn't an option, it's mandatory. And should be consistent. Whatever happened to road trips?

Get out of the office. Make more visits and

fewer telephone calls. Every promotion person should have a calender with *consistent* personal appointments with those in the assigned territory. And heads of promotion should study those calenders and make LPMs accountable. You can't develop relationships if they don't know who you are.

What if the programmer refuses to meet with you? What if you can't get in to see him? Then you should resign. Or be fired. You're paid to develop relationships. Find a way.

From the penthouse to the outhouse in less than a minute.

It's really simple. If you aren't meeting with your radio contacts on a consistent basis, you aren't doing your job.

So it all boils down to group meetings at conventions. Or parties. Or other record companies' functions. I swear, at most record company showcases, you see more employees of other record companies than you do radio people. And it becomes a feeding frenzy.

When did you get in? Where are you staying? I've been trying to call you for weeks. I've been meaning to talk with you for a while. What are you

doing afterwards? Do you want to grab a quick drink somewhere quiet where we can talk?

And all of this without eye contact. Because the gazes are over shoulders, checking the room to see if there's someone more important. It's all bullshit. And easy to see through. Plastic meetings in plastic places always melt in the heat of the real world.

Nowhere is this trait more prevalent than in Los Angeles, the land of shallow waters... and people. Even outside the finite world of radio and records, it exists in spades. Only in El Lay is the act less important than the people who might be present. Nobody watches the stage. They check out the audience to see who's there.

And even the audience is reduced to the parallel system. Lesser-known stars or bit players aren't important. You must spot larger and larger players as you move up the food chain.

And, of course, you're always out to bag the big one. It ain't a great party unless "he's" there. And it doesn't count if you don't see "him."

Who is "he?"

It depends on where you are. In New York, it's Donald. In Miami, Gloria. In Minneapolis, it's Prince.

But in L.A. and everywhere else, for that matter, it's not leff or Rick or Keith or Kevin, it's lack.

Jack Nicholson.

Everyone's always looking for Jack. For star gazers, it's a full-time occupation. For all of us at concerts or parties, it's at least part-time work. Colin Hay, former lead singer of Men At Work, even wrote a song about it. (He never saw Jack, either.)

Not long ago, I caught him. Nailed the bastard in the Monkey Bar in Beverly Hills. The thrill of a lifetime for a Mississippi-born hillbilly. The sheer excitement of it all made me temporarily insane enough to walk right up to him.

"I've been looking for you, Jack," I said, grinning like a mule eating briars.

He flashed a smile back. "Hey, and I've been looking for you."

Jack Nicholson looking for me? I was stunned. But only for a moment. Until he slapped me gently on the cheek and said, "Get me a white wine, will you?"

From the penthouse to the outhouse in less than a minute.

Don't you just love L.A?

TOASTED IN THE NEW YEAR!

It's The Network Forty's conceptually-reclusive New Year's Eve/Day promotions!

"NEW YEAR'S EVE AROUND THE WORLD"

At a club, throw a New Year's Eve Parry and have a countdown and celebration for every time zone around the world. Play music and serve food from a country in each time zone (ethnic restaurants should help here). By the time the umpteenth and final time zone countdown is complete, it could be January 4.

COST: MINIMAL, IF PRIZES AND PARTY COSTS ARE TRADED OUT WITH CLIENTS.

RETURN: SHOULD GENERATE LOCAL MEDIA COVERAGE AS THE ALL-TIME MARATHON NEW YEAR'S EVE PARTY.

"CORK GAMES"

At a weather/stain-proofed remote, have listeners participate in cork games, where they aim and "fire" champagne corks at targets for prizes. The rest of the bubbly is put into vats for "Bobbing For Avocadoes" (they're messier than apples – especially if they're ripe).

COST: Prizes traded out; about 100 bottles at \$3 per for the cheapest champagne = \$300.

RETURN: ENTERTAINING REMOTE FOR ACTIVE AUDIENCE SHOULD ATTRACT LOCAL TV COVERAGE.

"NOON YEAR'S EVE" PARTY

For those who can't stay up until midnight, throw a party where people count down to the New Year at noon and exclaim, "Happy Noon Year!" Instead of champagne, give out sparkling apple cider, have a new "Auld Lang Syne" to sing, etc. (Originally run in December Promo Planner.)

COST: MINIMAL, IF PRIZES AND REFRESHMENTS ARE TRADED OUT WITH CLIENTS.

RETURN: Appeals to parents who want to celebrate holiday with their young children. Could generate media exposure.

HANGOVER KITS

In a station call-lettered pillow case, put some Alka Seltzer, quality coffee, earmuffs, aspirin, coupons for services such as a late breakfast at a local eaterie, a limo driver/taxi for the (next) day, a one-hour massage, etc. and give away packages to lucky listeners

COST: PRODUCTS IN KITS SHOULD BE FREE FROM CLIENTS SUCH AS PHARMACIES, CLOTHING STORES, RESTAURANTS, ETC.

RETURN: SHOULD GET AD BUYS FROM PARTICIPATING CLIENTS, TOO.

"FOOTBALL WIDOW" WAKE

On New Year's Day, all "grieving" football widows are invited to a local club for cheap refreshments, a fashion show, a video screening of *Ghost* and jocks spinning Michael Bolton and Luther Vandross tunes throughout the day. Gift certificates to clothing store and *Ghost* videos are sporadically given away.

COST: MINIMAL; EVERYTHING TRADED OUT.

RETURN: SHOULD GET AD BUYS FROM CLOTHING STORE (THAT PUTS ON FASHION SHOW), CLUB (THAT'S FULL OF LISTENERS), VIDEO STORE (FOR TAPES) ETC.

NEW YEAR BABY LOOKALIKE CONTEST

Invite listeners to send in pictures of their infants dressed like the New Year baby. Invite finalists to client (baby clothing) store, where air staff chooses the winner (who gets client store products). Winner's picture is used in stage Rock 'n Roll poses such as holding a guitar, with oversized sunglasses, etc. All finalists' pictures could be used in calendars to be given away during middays.

COST: PRIZES TRADED OUT WITH CLIENT.

RETURN: GREAT ATTRACTION AND PRIZE FOR BABY BOOMER LISTENERS LASTS BEYOND NEW YEAR.

PERVERTED NEW YEAR BABY LOOKALIKE CONTEST

Invite male listeners to club dressed like New Year's Baby (wearing Depends) and have other clubgoers vote for Cutest New Year Baby, Most Spoiled New Year Baby, Baby We'd Least/Most Like to Change Its Diapers, and Cutest New Year Baby For The Armageddon.

COST: PRIZES TRADED OUT.

RETURN: ENTERTAINING NEW YEAR KICK-OFF FOR ACTIVE LISTENERS OF BOTH GENDERS.

"BOWL-O-SPHERE"

In a client location, construct a glass or see-through room where listeners are locked in with nothing but food, drinks and a wall o' TVs – all turned to bowl games. They can only leave the "Bowl-o-Sphere" for one-minute intervals each quarter of a game to relieve themselves. They must watch all the games from beginning to end. Anyone who looks anywhere else but at the wall of TVs or who nods off loses chance to win a big prize.

COST: COSTS TO BUILD ENVIRONMENT AND MERCHANDISE TRADED FOR MENTIONS.

"Lucky" listeners get to "star" in their own New Year's Day parade (that'll go down their driveway or sidewalk) that will feature a baton twirler, a high-stepping musician "playing" a boom box, a beauty queen (such as "Miss Tundra") holding a float (the root beer kind), few guys holding strings tied to helium balloons, (preferably of the station's call letters), the listener being "driven" on a red wagon full of flower petals (courtesy of a local florist's garbage) and, of course, someone named Rose spraying rose-scented air freshener into the air while being wheeled on a dolly. (Originally run in Christmas Day promotions.)

COST: POCKET CHANGE.

RETURN: OUGHT TO DRAW A LOT OF MEDIA ATTENTION.


"REMOTE WARS"

Do a remote at a TV/appliance store, where listeners can watch all the bowl games at once on the wall of TV screens. Give remotes to a couple dozen "selected" viewers. However, only one has a remote with batteries that can actually change channels. So when people change channels from one bowl game to another and avoid commercials (which they all have to do together), only one person is actually changing the channels.

If viewer says his is the working one (and it isn't), he loses and is out. If it is, he becomes a finalist to win a TV. This "game" can be done with a new batch of viewers every hour (or less). By the end of the day, all the finalists compete to win a TV set.

COST: TV set should be traded out.

RETURN: MAJOR AD BUY FROM



K-LIVE AND WELL

Very few Top 40 stations across America had a better 1993 than KLYV. Corporate PD Joe Dawson describes his Dubuque station as "a station focused on playing the music of today's youth and providing personality for people 25 to 54. I believe heavily in personality and we have that in each one of our shifts." That philosophy came to Dawson early in life. "I grew up listening to Larry Lujack on WCFL and I'm a firm believer that the big adult numbers that he had in the afternoon came not from people in search of the latest Bay City Rollers record, but from adults in search of a personality to entertain them."

Dubuque is located in northeast Iowa, near the Wisconsin and Illinois border. "This is a very spreadout market of 122,000 people. Major employers include John Deere and FDL Food Processing, so it's a pretty blue-collar town. There are lots of white-collar jobs, though, many of which surround the three local colleges and universities located in Dubuque. The area is almost 90% Catholic and because of that, it's actually a very young market. Many of the baby boomers who came from large families are now having large families themselves."

The primary target audience for the station is 18 to 49, but "that shifts during the day according to available audience. We play to the 25-plus audience during the day and slide to a 12-to-34 focus by night-time." All that targeting is done with an aggressive music policy. "I believe in finding out what the public wants and then playing it back to them. If I thought banjo and Chinese gong music was what's happening locally, then that's what we'd play." One of the ways Dawson determines his playlist is through sales research. "It's important in this market to read Sound-Scan info with the knowledge that it also contains data from Waterloo and Cedar Rapids, two towns

with little in common with Dubuque musically.

Promotionally, K-Live is currently involved in a promotion called "Santa On The Spot. We've acquired about \$4,000 worth of toys that we'll give away between now and Christmas. We're doing this in a series of remotes where we'll give away up to \$300 in toys at each appearance. All these toys are the hottest ones out there, the ones that the kids want and more importantly, the ones that the parent want to get for them. To be able to offer these items, at this time of year, has really sparked a lot of interest in the station. It also keeps us visible during the holiday season. The jocks are out in the public where they can really use their personalities to bond with the audience."







Weather Watch!

In the past couple of weeks, much of the nation was blasted by either thunderstorms or snowstorms, causing radio stations to whip out the procedure book for inclement weather. In many smaller markets, radio is often the only outlet for immediate information on inclement conditions and emergency measures. Exactly when does a music outlet become more of a full-service news/weather/information outlet? On this week's Programmer's Conference Call, we discuss the circumstances surrounding the switch from entertainment to information programming.

What is your operating procedure when bad weather hits your area?

MIKE: Call in sick? Stay home for the day and watch *Oprah*? Seriously, the people who live and work in this area of the country are used to

inclement weather. In larger cities I'm sure there are more problems, but in this area everyone is always prepared. When it snows, people here get in their four-wheel vehicles and go. The first couple of times it snows each year, people are obviously more cautious and hesitant, but after that it's no big deal. We have a four-wheel drive station vehicle for bad weather.

BRENT: This is an extremely important time because even more people are sampling us and checking us out. We take it very seriously. We have a thing called "Operation Snowdesk" that we roll out. It's a produced piece that sounds real official with a bed behind it. We do all the school cancellations and whatnot, and our morning show team works to get those on every 15 minutes during the course of their shift.

JACK: We have some real strange weather in this part of the country in that it can be snowing like hell in the Black Hills and on the edge of the hills, out on the plains, it can be a lot warmer and real nice at the same time. We make a concerted effort to get information on the air as soon as possible. If it's a tornado or something like that, we'll stop down everything and get the information out there. People have come to depend on this station for accurate weather information, so we attempt to give it to them.

What changes in programming occur?

MIKE: Nothing really. It's been so long since there's been a really bad storm here. Last year was probably the worst we've had for snow in quite some time, but it really wasn't that bad. We don't get the Midwest four-foot-deep snows in this area. Outside of the obvious, we really don't alter our programming when the weather changes.

BRENT: Basically, I would say weather takes priority. We put contesting and other things aside, because the most important thing is to get the cancellations out, current road conditions and weather conditions. We put everything else on the back burner during times of inclement weather because the dispensation of information is extremely important to listeners.

JACK: It depends on the situation. Just a few days ago, we had five or six inches of snow and it was really cold at the same time. The roads were pretty slippery, too, so we went on the air with the information as soon as we got it. We don't interrupt the songs or anything like that, but we do have a tendency to get the information in there quickly and frequently.

How much time do you spend airing weather information and what type of information do you dispense?

MIKE: A couple of years ago we had a week of 25-below weather. That's out of the ordinary and it was during Christmas as well. When things like that happen, then the news tends to be more focused on weather and how to deal with it specifically. We get into the lifestyle stuff like how to deal with frozen pipes and other helpful hints. Obviously in those situations, we delve into school closures as well. We have a system worked out with all the schools – much like other stations, I'm sure – where bogus calls can't get through. It's one of those situations where they have to give a code name for verification.

BRENT: We do news, but in these situations, the weather becomes the news... it kind of blurs together. We do our information updates during the



morning twice an hour. In times of bad weather, I wouldn't say we do more news, but we continue the news profile with a concentration on existing weather conditions.

JACK: Again, it's situational. If we've got an asskickin' storm out there, we're going to be talking weather and cancellations, postponements and all that type of information. It's really important to disseminate information as soon as you get it; the staff here is professional enough to execute the process correctly and accurately.

What's the worst weather situation you've been involved with in your career?

MIKE: It wasn't at this station but it was in this market. It was a situation where it got so cold outside, the toilets and all running water in the radio station froze for about a month. The station was in the middle of nowhere and the closest service station — or closest anything — was about four miles away. It was a huge pain to deal with... literally.

BRENT: That's easy. A couple of years ago on Halloween, we had a really bad ice storm in which everybody's tower froze up or in some cases, fell over. The TV stations were off the air, the telephones were down and we were the only station on the air in the tri-state area. Through police scanners and other sources, we became the information outlet in the whole area with 100% listening. This situation went on for about 24 hours. There was no music; it was all information.

JACK: I was programming a Country station up in Grand Forks, North Dakota and just a hellacious blizzard came through. My night guy had been on the air since 7:00 the previous evening and by 4:00 in the afternoon the next day, the poor guy was so tired he was playing the night jingles during the day... he was just wasted. I was trying to figure out how to get to the station and finally got in touch with one of the sales people who had one of those huge four-by-fours. We're tooling along, attempting to get to the station and this four-by-four stalls in

the middle of nowhere during the middle of this blizzard. The two of us had to walk about a quarter of a mile to this farmhouse to get a ride to the station, which was in the middle of nowhere as well. It was tough going; visibility was zero, but eventually we got to the station.

Any advice you would give to a programmer about dealing with bad weather situations?

MIKE: Come prepared. Most of the things are based on common sense. It helps to find a part-timer or fill-in person who lives extremely close to the radio station. It's good to have a plan for the situations where everyone is snowed in and can't get to the radio station for one reason or another.

BRENT: Have a plan and be ready to go. Know exactly what you're going to do. Don't worry about contesting or what's in power rotation. This is when you can prove to your community you're there when they really need you. They could care less if you're playing a hit. They want information and they want it now. There are no formats involved when certain situations evolve. It shows a lot to your audience when an entertainment outlet can switch gears and inform just as effectively. You can really score points.

JACK: It's really important that your audience knows they can trust and rely on you to get information – sometimes life-saving information – on the air as soon as possible. It goes along as one of your responsibilities as a broadcaster. It's first and foremost to get the information across the airwaves, as you may be saving someone's life out there. I'm sure fellow programmers like Bob Beck up in Bismark can tell you, when the weather gets rough in this part of the country, it's not a time to mess around. If you get the information out quickly and with authority, your audience is going to know they can count on you in future situations. In heavy-duty storms, to hell with the format, get the information on the air.







Channel X has become very popular and recently, INXS' Kirk and Tim Farris called WJMO the "coolest station in Cleveland."

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A WEEKEND OVERNIGHTER... I don't know if it's a Southern California thang or simply due to the format, but why is it that all the people who call in with dedications at KKXX have such unusual names? No easy-to-pronounce mono-syllables like Jack or Jill or Jane – more like Tulawanda, Kutetia and Shauniqua – you know, names that just roll off your tongue... And it seems like only yesterday that Alternative Editor Karen Holmes and I were discussing the bleak dating scene hete in Los Angeles. Maybe we were just looking in the wrong city – I was amazed by the number of males who called me at the station asking if I was married (I'm only taking serious inquiries from men named Darrin or Dr. Bombay). The most interesting call was from a (obviously) young girl who asked me if I was a boy. Thankfully, I am secure with my sexuality, so this didn't bother me.

IN DA HOOD... In my never-ending quest to broaden my horizons and increase my knowledge of this format (and burden my mother with worry), I just moved to the heart of downtown Los Angeles so I could be closer to the homies in the gangsta lean. No worry about crime – there's a police precinct a few blocks away. And on those nights that I don't feel like cooking, the LA Mission is at the end of the block. I'll be having a "House Arming" party later this month – it's B.Y.O.W. (Bring Your Own Weapons – i.e. magnums, six-shooters and 12-gauges).

'TIS THE SEASON... Not too long ago (more precisely, two weeks *before* Thanksgiving), a friend and I went to the mall to see a movie. The entire place was already decorated for Christmas. Excuse me, but isn't this pushing the commercial hype of the holiday season just a little too far? Tis the season to be jolly? More like the season to be broke!



We do know that Doubleplusgood is highly regarded in the clubs, not only here in the U.S. but in the U.K. as well. Boasting production by Ted Ottaviano, there are several groovy remixes to choose from by Mood II Swing and DJ EFX & DJ Digit.

POSITIVE K

"Carhoppers" (Island/PLG)

Cashing in on the success of "I Got A Man," Positive K delivers a new single in the same vein. The Radio version samples the Emotions' "Best Of My Love" and features back-and-forth dialogue with a female. The Street version is completely original with low production and the sound of a bad rest-pressing sampled in. Both tracks were remixed by Shawn Thomas AKA Easy LG and Big Daddy Kane.

KING JAY

"Lick Me"

(Profile)

There's an interesting story behind this track. Last week when Jefferson Ward, Glenn Kalina and Maurice DeVoe of WIOQ called in the add to Profile, the promoter thought they were joking. Why? He thought that the lyrical content might be offensive to female listeners. Au contraire! The women at WIOQ loved this song so much that it got 30 spins over the weekend. KUBE also put it in the mix, giving it 15 plays over the holidays. Down-tempo and very smooth, even the the hardcore Mainstream staffers of *The N40* got into it.

NEMESIS

A BEAT AHEAD







Perfectly Frank: Growth of a Mini-Radio Empire

First of Two Parts



Entrepreneur, self-made millionaire, shrewd businessman and humanitarian are just a few ways to describe the witty WCHZ Augusta and KTOZ Springfield owner/programmer Frank Copsidas. He started his first venture at the ripe old age of 12, selling the best "icys" in New York, according to *The New York Times*. The former club jock once known as "Groupie The Greek," now known as "Super Frank," is building a radio empire.

"I started small, underestimating myself which I usually do," he explains. "I bought the Top 40 WSKS in Millageville, Georgia. I did the morning show and in two months we had turned that town upside down. It's an unrated market. So, we tested through Auditaire and got a 25 share. It was too easy. Then, I heard about an opportunity at WCHZ Augusta, a rated market, which I still own."

Copsidas first thought about making radio a career when he was in high school, where he was very active in the American Red Cross. "As part of my volunteer work, I worked with the employees of 99X New York to promote their community affairs pro-

motions," he says. That was his first taste of radio promotion. "While still in school, I put a station together in Portland, Maine with a partner. I sat down with road maps and did my own separation engineering of stations and figured out there was an open frequency." He was 21. "I did 100 community leader surveys and 300 telephone interviews; I worked with a bank for our first year of financing, which you had to do for the FCC. I had it all lined up to go. Then, I flew to Portland with my partner, who was a trust fund baby. He talked of hiring our friends as DJs, playing any music we wanted and having a great time

with the station, but I suddenly was nervous about his attitude. This was a business for me to make a living with or, at worst, to survive. Soon after we landed, I got on the next flight back. We sold the plans to another party. That's when I decided to go back to radio with my own money."

In 1974, while still in his teens, he got his first taste of broadcasting. He co-produced Election '74 Manhattan with new WNYW Fox-TV New York's Eric Shawn, providing a cable access coverage of the election. The cable company estimated that the show attracted 15,000 viewers that night and the show was hailed as the "freshest new thing" on TV by the New York press. From there, he got a job at WBTB-TV channel 68 in Newark, doing financial news and serving as their UN corespondent before he was "promoted" to sales. From there, he went to News Radio WCBS as assistant to the VP Operations. "A great job," he adds. "I almost got my first break at getting on the air. The engineers went on strike and the news readers talked about going on a sympathy strike for them. So, my manager told me to get ready in case they put me on the air. I was determined

to get on. I would hang out in the crew room, asking the jocks what kind of union they were in. I asked them why they weren't supporting their brothers, but it never happened."

After that, it was time to earn some real money. Frank credits his father, a real estate broker, who dragged him to every business meeting he could go to. "I learned about the business world and the art of making a deal very early on. I was probably the most bored elementary student!"

"In '78, a partner and I stumbled on a fledgling school bus company with three vans. By 1990, we were up to 270 vehicles. We took on many challenges and became a role model company in that industry. By '91, I got bored with the business," so he moved on. This is when he invested in WSKS Millageville with his own money.

From WSKS, it's been a steady climb up including acquisitions of WCHZ in Augusta, KTOZ in Springfield and the buyout of Z Estate, its corporate headquarters in Atlanta.

(Next week, Copsidas' radio conglomerate continues to grow along with side ventures such as a concert promotion company and a band management firm.)

Uptempo guitar Pop riffs strengthen the feeling. Keyboardist Michael Hart officially joins the band after being a part of the trio's stage shows for years. One of my most favored bands in concert, don't miss any opportunity to see them live.



the quiet revolution, the second release from the uniquely talented Ronny Jordan, brings up many intriguing thoughts. When you have a highly gifted musician creating in a truly undefined genre of music (Jazz), you're bound to come out of each project having evolved the very art form itself. That brings us back to Contemporary Jazz and the quiet revolution. Ronny Jordan took his love of the techniques of artists such as Wes Montgomery and his "feel" for the R&B, Hip-Hop, Acid-Jazz beats that he couldn't suppress and did what his heart told him to do - he made a quiet revolution. This album has the definite markings of influence from Hip-Hop and poetry to spiritual inspiration. Starting with the opening track "Season For Change" (were Guru lays down his vocal stylings) to "The Jackal" (which weaves a musical web for the poetry of Dana Bryant) and winding around to Jordan's version of Wes Montgomery's "Mr. Walker," you'll feel it all. R&B, Jazz and Adult Alternative radio have all quickly picked up on it. This is not a one-track listen; it's an entire project and should be experienced as such... you must hear the revolution fully to appreciate it. -Holly Sharpe
