RADIO

NEW MORNINGS IN CHI

Chicago's morning radio wars will be hearing up big-time, as KSOL (now called WYLD) Dan Fran morning loon Mancow Muller will take his act to Hard Rocker WWBZ "The Blaze" in mid-July. (It's certainly a heads-up move by Blaze owner Evergreen. Not only do they get a certified rising star in its Chicago outlet, but they rid themselves of a major thorn to KMEL's morning show. Also in Chi, Alternative WKQX replaced Mark Goodman with market vet Bobby Skafish. In his 20 years there, Skafish has worked at WLUP and heritage AAA station (and #1 competitor) WXRT.

COMING & GOING

Mark Bradley was named PD at WA1A Jacksonville... Lisa Rodman has resigned as PD of WRQK Canton; she'll be replaced by Ruby Cheeks... Rib "The Wagman" Wagman left WNTQ Syracuse to become Marketing Director at Brian James Productions... KHTN Modesto MD/afternoons Allen Chase addded APD stripes to his business card... George McFly was hired to do nights at WBBM-FM Chicago.

STROM CLOUDS AHEAD

The National Association of Broadcasters are putting on a full-court press to quash an alcohol labeling bill sponsored by Sen. Strom Thurmond (R-SC). The proposal is about to be heard in committee and Thurmond, whose daughter died at the hands of an allegedly drunk driver, is already doing some heavy lobbying. Alcohol interests have threatened to pull all of its radio advertising if they're required to "label" warnings of the dangers of booze in their spots.

ITALIAN STERN WAR

The war of words about the evils of Howard Stern took an unusual ethnic rurn last week. After Sen. Alfonse D'Amato (R-NY) defended Stern in the Congressional Record - in effect, denigrating the FCC's million-dollar crusade against him and Infinity Broadcasting - FCC Commissioner James Quello ripped into the Senator, offering transcripts of Stern's show and wondering aloud how D'Amato could defend it. He then took an "All In The Family" tack by noting, "It would embarrass any responsible adult, let alone we Catholic Italian-Americans, to condone the egregious Stern broadcasts.

Arbitron's Big Bumps

Top 40 Winners Slam Dunk Winter Book

If any generality can be made for Top 40's fate in the Winter Arbitrons, it's that the stations that improved did so in spades. In the 41 markets, 16 Top 40s saw their numbers increase by at least one point, with a 17th gaining .9. What's more, the number of market-leading Top 40s increased by two to make a grand total of six for the past week. Best news of all: A variety of Top 40 niches did well.

Market leaders. KTFM San Antonio led the market kingpins. Although its book only saw a .1 nudge, it's 9.4 was almost two points better than the run-

ner-up. WKRZ Wilkes-Barre and WNNK Harrisburg (13.8-14.6) strengthened their holds on the top spot, while KQKQ Omaha (11.1-11.7) and KPRR El Paso (12.5-12.8) moved from second to first in their respective markets. WZEE Madison, this week's Station Spotlight (page 12), enjoyed a massive 9.2-12.2 bump to claim market supremacy.

Mega-Bumps. There were plenty of eye-raising increases to go around. Leading the way were WYHY Nashville, which zoomed 5.4-7.8;

KPOI Honolulu, which rocketed 3.0-5.3; and KHFI Austin, which shot up 9.1-11.0. Other big winners included WBZZ Pittsburgh (5.9-7.7), WFMF Baton Rouge (4.6-6.2), WDCG Raleigh (6.5-8.2), WNOK Charleston (6.3-7.9), KHTT Tulsa (5.0-6.4), The Edge Charlotte (3.1-4.4), WNTQ Syracuse (9.0-10.2), KWOD Sacramento (3.3-4.5), WRHT Greenville (3.0-4.2), WNVZ Norfolk (4.3-5.4), KGMZ (1.8-2.9) and accepting "just" a .9 boost was KJYO Oklahoma City (7.9-8.8).

Radio Consultants To Rep... Consultants

Services of 12 Renown Consultants Offered To GMs


The Radio Consultants, a Minneapolis-based management consulting firm, has expanded its services by offering 12 nationally known programming consultants to station executives. TRC President/CEO David Martin instituted this new referral service after a national study of over 400 radio executives found considerable dissatisfaction with their programming consultants.

"We knew there were certainly good consultants, but we wanted to find out those who station people and groups thought were the best," Martin notes. "We were surprised to learn that many of those consultants named as best (and most effective) weren't listed in trade directories and didn't advertise."

Martin and TRC VP Gary Swartz then conferred with dozens of consultants before settling on representation for 12. Although their names have not been publicly announced, in order to give them the opportunity to advise their clients of TRC's representation, sources indicate that four of the consultants are Jerry Clifton, Bill Richards, Bob Henabery and Dennis Constantine.

"This is a brand new service we're offering to the industry – access to the best and brightest programming consultants," Martin tells *The Network Forty*. "We've got a really good cross-section, the top one percent of all those doing program consultation. That way, GM, PDs and group people

can make informed decisions for the first time ever."

A typical M.O. for TRC would go something like this: "Once we're contacted by a station executive or group, we ask them what their expectations are and to describe the ideal programming consultant," Martin explains. "Once we find out what they're looking for, we match up our resources to their needs. Consulting, like any other personal service, is a very subjective decision. One person may get along with one consultant but not with another. So we send our referral to the station

for a first-time get-together. If the GM doesn't hit it off with that person, we find out why it didn't work, then use that information to refer someone else to him – and it could be a consultant we don't even represent. Our goal is to give a station the advantage of having outside counsel on their side."

Martin believes his service will be in even more demand with the increasing number of LMAs and buy-outs. "Duopoly has created an enormous burden on station executives," he says. "Today, they have the following choice: They can either have two PDs doing one station apiece or - and this is happening more and more - have one OM with an outside consultant to complement a talented PD. Because it's cost-prohibitive, owners don't buy a competing station and keep its staff intact. They consolidate, but can one programmer do twice the work? I dare say you won't find many PDs who'd say they'd be up for simultaneously programming two stations full-time.

"The truth is, duopoly is creating an enormous burden on station people and there is a very real need for an efficient resource that can help them take full advantage of the situation," he continues. "Outside, objective counsel in the form of programing consultants is an excellent way to provide the resource PDs need when programming more than one station."



JUST THE FAX

Commentary by Gerry Cagle



elcome to the Hotel PPW.

Now that R&R has finally come to the party, (invitations were sent out over two years

ago... it took them that long to RSVP) Plays Per Week have become the standard throughout the industry.

All the charts that matter (*The Network Forty, Billboard* and *R&R*) use actual airplay for calculation. However, *The Network Forty's* Plays Per Week charts are the best in the business. Bar none.

Why? It's simple, really.

Billboard uses BDS to determine their charts. While BDS is recognized by many as the ultimate measure of airplay, it is a fact that BDS does not monitor many radio stations that are extremely important in determining the success of a record. Billboard misses many stations that impact record sales. Their chart is incomplete.

R&R's charts have inherent problems. The weighting system is totally out of whack. (That's another Editorial by itself.) R&R has already dropped the weighting system used on the Alternative chart and most in the industry believe the weighting will soon be dropped from the Top 40 charts as well. R&R's reporting universe is only slightly larger than BDS and creates the same limited picture. But R&R's major problems exist because of the way information is gathered. R&R does not accept faxed PPW information. R&R depends upon phone calls from reporters to determine Plays Per Week. That practice opens a window of opportunity for easy alteration by those who would report inaccurate airplay.

The Network Forty has the most accurate and most complete Plays Per Week information available. The Network Forty has the most complete universe of radio stations available. BDS monitors only the larger

markets. *R&R* "allows" only 170 reporters. *The Network Forty* gathers reports from over 250 radio stations across the country. And it isn't just the number of reporters that makes *The Network Forty* PPW system the most accurate, it's the methodology.



DOMINANCE IN MADTOWN

With an incredible THURSDA 12+ jump of 9.2 to 12.2 in the latest Arbitrons, WZEE Madison (Z104) is once again among the nation's highest-rated Top 40 stations. PD John Michaels, who joined the outlet just over three months ago from KZIO Duluth, is ecstatic over his latest numbers. "In addition to those 12-plus numbers, we jumped 8.4 to 16.0 in 18-to-34 yearolds, and 13.5 to 20.8 in women 18-to-34. We

couldn't be happier! I inherited a very solid operation from Mr. Ed (Ed Lambert, the previous PD, now at KHKS Dallas). All it took was a little additional tweaking to take it to the next level."

Those adjustments were minimal. "We didn't want to fix what wasn't broken. We just wanted to keep building those upper demos, which we did by playing off our heritage in the market. Z104 has been at it for 20 years now. Listeners who were 18 when they started listening are 38 now. It's amazing how many of those people grew up and stayed with the station. This can be a unique market because it has the appearance of being a very hip little city, but underlying it all is that it's still in the midwest and still quite conservative. Our GM, Dave Graupner, pointed that out right away. There are two faces to this market and it's important to recognize them both.

That conservative underpinning is mirrored in Z104's musical posture. "The heritage of this station has been to be very conservative. I slowed down some of the rotations on the music to help increase the TSL, and that paid off. We're playing powers way less than we were before." With no direct Top 40 competition, Z104 shares audience with WIBA (AOR) and WMAD (Alternative) more than any other stations. "There's also a Hot AC that

we'll have to watch. Musically we're having success with Counting Crows, Crash Test Dummies, Whitney Houston, Mariah Carey and Bruce Springsteen to name a few. We're also spiking some early '80s Oldies throughout the day as 'flashbacks.' There are about 100 songs in that category that play off the history of the station and work very well in keeping those upper demos happy."

One of the changes instituted by Michaels at the stations has been a "cleaning house" of promotions. "Although we're still active by anyone's standards, we're not in a rush to get things on the air anymore just to have something to talk about. I don't think that's necessary at this point in time. There's still promos on the air and we still do major contesting, but we've backed away from a lot of the little things and the weekend things to clean up the presentation."





AIDS,

teenage pregnancy, gangrelated violence, unemployment... these are just a few of the issues that plague not just one ethnic demographic, but the entire population as a whole. For Crossover and Urban radio stations, generally referred to as "Street" stations, relating to the street lifestyle is imperative. To survive and prosper in a culturally diverse market, it has to be in touch with its audience.

"Some stations think that by playing some music off the Urban chart, along with the best of the Top 40 chart, they will get this Crossover success. That is not the case at all," states WPGC Washington, D.C. PD Jay Stevens. "Our listeners are loyal because they see that we care and we're out in the community. That is so important for a radio station. If you show that you care, your listeners will defend you at all costs and listen to you all day long. That's where you get your TSL. But it's got to be real and from the heart. The listeners will know if it's not."

Besides the increased loyalty from the listeners, there is another important reason for being on the street: peer status. "We are one of the few credible voices in our audience's lives," according to KPWR Los Angeles MD Michelle Mercer. "This generation is very troubled and these kids our audience - don't neccesarily have a role model in their lives at all times. We've found that we are in a unique position to pass along positive messages, where they may not take that advice from a parent or a teacher."

Involvement with the community can be accomplished through a variety of promotions. "We are always looking for topical things to do in the community," Stevens recalls. "Recently, there was a shooting in a very rough high school in southeast D.C, so we brought Tevin Campbell to that school to do a 'Stay In School / Stop The Violence' rally along with all of our jocks. All the TV stations and newspapers were there. We got

massive press coverage, as well as touching the 1,500 students at the rally."

KUBE Seattle recently celebrated its 13th

birthday with a benefit concert for the Seattle Center Academy for Positive Expression Through the Arts. "[The Center] gets a group of high-risk kids together to refocus them on what [they] can do with their own creativity. It's a fund that Pearl Jam launched and we joined in to help support it. We wanted to take some real action instead of just talking about the problems in the community," says PD Bob Case.

"Last fall, we sponsored a haunted house and generated a \$100,000 donation to the children's hospital," he continues. "We also held a 'Knowledge Is Power' jam, where high schools competed against each other in categories such as the student body with the best attendance record, highest grade point average, largest canned food donation and least number of violent acts and/or confiscated weapons."

For a music-intensive radio station, tying a promotion in with the music seems only natural. At KPWR, MD Michelle Mercer recalls how the Straight From Da Street charity compilation CD came about. "We were looking for a way to stop talking and do something. The Department of Parks and Recreation came to us to help them build a Performing Arts Center. [PD] Rick [Cummings] came up with the idea to do a compilation album and have artists donate tracks for charity.

"It was six months of hard work, trying to get the tracks secured and the agreements signed," she adds. "Then [we had] to get the retailers to agree to carry a charity album from which they could take no proceeds. Everybody has been tremendously helpful with this project." Since the January 17th in-store date, Straight From Da Street has sold more than 45,000 copies.

Even though Urban stations face the same problems as Crossovers, they tend to have an older audience and therefore address the issues in a slightly different manner. "With a lot of the Rhythm Crossovers, their audience is younger and they address things like teen pregnancy and gang violence," WGCI Chicago MD Vic

Clemons. "But sometimes the issues are deeper than that and they affect more than just the younger populatio. With the Black population, one thing will usually affect the entire demographic. If it's gang violence, then the parents and everyone in the community will have to deal with it, not just the kids.

"Recently, 19 children were found on the West Side in a home in totally inhumane conditions," Clemons recalls. "The parents hadn't been there for quite a while. The Department of Children and Family Services took the kids to several different housing facilities. These facilities house so many children that they don't have enough government funding to supply adequate food and clothing. So, we immediately initiated 'Operation Push.' We solicited our listeners to donate clothing, nonperishable food and linens. A fund was set up for donations. The response was overwhelming. Nearly two semi-trailers were filled with goods and \$8,000 was raised.

"If our listeners really care about something, we try to jump on it and do something to make a difference. When things change, they are quick to respond. If our audience wants to discuss something, they are free to call," Clemons continues. "If something happens and you're not talking about it or giving the community a voice to vent their frustrations and suggestions, then you're not really serving the purpose of a full-service Black radio station."

In the city of Los Angeles, where carjackings and drive-by shootings have become almost trendy, KKBT "The Beat" has taken community involvement one step further. "We formed an entire department to actually cater to this full-time," APD Michelle Santosuosso explains. "It's called the Community Action Department because actions speak louder than words. It is headed by Dominique DiPrima, an investigative TV reporter from KRON San Francisco.

"She does a million things," continues Santosuosso. "Every Sunday, she hosts a live call-in show called 'Street Science.' The show deals with everything from Black/Latino tensions and AIDS to prejudice in an honest, straightforward way. Experts and various Hip-Hop artists contribute to the weekly panel. It gives the audience an outlet to air frustrations and it opens up dialogue, which is crucial.

"Also, Dominique produces promos-called 'Word On The Street.' She takes our promotion



crew, a group of young kids zalled 'The Street Team,' on different van hits and records people speaking their minds. The collage of responses is edited into a mini-promo. This gives people the chance to hear others speak about things that wouldn't ordinarily be in their direct experience. It s sharing information."

In addition, each full-time air personality is responsible for a certain type of PSA. Santosuosso explains: "The House Farty is prceducation and anti-racism. The topic of our afternoon-drive personality, Theo, is women's issues. The jocks are encouraged to become crusaders for individual causes. They go out into the community and get involved personally. The Community Action Department was formed to make this happen.'

To some, KKBT's ccmmunity involvement may seem excessive. In fact a PD once told his staff that they were doing too many charity promotions. Jav Stevens agrees, but only to a point. "Whoever said that their station was not a charity organization is very smart and right on. We are nct a social service agercy or a charity organization. We are a forprofit radio station worth \$50 million First and foremost, we are a station that plays the hits Music is the star here at WPGC. Making sure that the product is right comes before anything else.

"Secondarily to the product is serving our community, and there are a lot of ways to do that It doesn't have to be negative or serious; it can be done in a fun way, too. We held a 'Charles Barkley / Shave Your Head contest for tickets to the Suns/Bullets basketba I game. It was very topical, but light. You don't always have to take yoursel seriously."

Bob Case also believes in balanced involvement. "We can get so caught up in trying to stop the violence and ease the racial tension, that the station becomes very heavy to listen to. You have to offer the other side of that, which is pure fun, exciting entertainment."

Urban stations are usually typecast as African-Anaerican, Mainstreams tend to e Caucasian and Crossover stations are somewhere in between.

Because the issues at Crossover are neither Black nor White, their roles are sometimes hard to define. "[KKET FD] Neith Naftalv] and L who are formerly from Crossover rad o, cian't realize the impact a Crossover station has an the Black and Latino markers they appeal to," SantosLosso motes. "It's really important to be an extension of the community that you are targeting musically. Some Crossover stations need to realize that. The pottom line is, if you're going to play the music with a presentation that's affiliated with those artists, then you better have a responsibility to the community. A large segment of your audience is n the hood and needs help."

Crossover radio is on the streets, but there's always room for improvement. "A couple of years ago, we were not as good at supporting the ethnic demographic as we are now," says Case. "We've learned a let in the precess and are much more aware of all the ethnic groups in our community today than we were before.

The reason for this is simple. "We've seen so many things recently where this multi-ethnic coalition suddenly agrees on a lot of things." Mercer explains "For the most pat, they agree on the type of music they like. Their lifestyles are much more similar than they used to be, so it's much easier to be a multi-ethnic station now than it ever has been.

Not only coes it make good pusiness sense, in terms of a more loval listenership, but supporting the community also provides personal job satisfaction. "The best I've felt at this job was the day we had Straight From Da Street in our nands. sarinkwrapped, and we were able to stand in Font of the staff and say, We did this," Mencer says 'Or maybe it was the day the album debut at #. In Soundscan.

"We all get so bogged cown in the business and we take it so seriously - we have But when you can do something that really makes a difference and helps people, it makes it all worthwhile."

KUBE MD Shellie Hart sums it up: "I want us to be as pass onate with our market as our market is with us. It is a one-on-one relationship with our listeners.

Riding The Contemporary Music Waves!

INTERVIEW BY DWAYNE WARD

n the past several years, Seattle has become one of the nation's premiere cities of choice. What's more, the Pacific Northwest has proven to be a well-spring for the cutting edge in contemporary Rock. The suicide of Nirvana frontman Kurt Cobain has only spurred the media explosion around the city of Seattle even further. In the last month, KUBE, the market's dominant contemporary music radio station, has begun integrating the homegrown Grunge into its classic Crossover pallette, which has industry ears buzzing. In a recent conversation with Radio Editor Dwayne Ward, KUBE PD Bob Case discussed this shift in music direction and why he continues to call Seattle home.

Let's begin with the new music position of KUBE. You've been making adjustments in the sound of the station over the last couple of weeks.

Let's backtrack first. Two-and-a-half years ago, Top 40 in Seattle was Boyz II Men, TLC, Janet Jackson and began to include Silk, Dr. Dre and Naughty By Nature. That was the happening, cutting edge, trendy, Top 40 sound for Seattle. Left behind were Richard Marx, Michael Bolton, Wilson Phillips and those type of records. The happening, cutting edge sound became all-consuming to the typical mass-appeal Top 40 listener. At that point, KUBE, with the help of Jerry Clifton, recognized the trend, jumped on it and committed to be a 17-30-year-old radio station. And that has been our commitment ever since. KUBE wants to follow the trends of the Seattle market for the 17-30-yearold contemporary music listener.

About six months ago, the cutting edge music went from the fun, happy TLC, Boyz II Men, Silk, Shai, SWV sound to the 2Pac, Ice Cube, Snoop Dog sound... for the same audience. When this began developing, we and the whole street feel started to become more polarized. The Wilson Phillips fans, who made the segue to Boyz II Men and TLC, were having a tough time segueing into the 2Pac sound. At the same time, Pearl Jam came along with The Cranberries, Blind Melon and Nirvana. They were also creating a mass appeal 17-30-year-old cutting edge sound. You started to see even further fragmentation. Album sales began changing. Whereas all of the Hip-Hop Top 40 stuff had been dominating the album sales for a long time, Pearl Jam, Smashing Pumpkins and Nirvana began taking over the sales picture.

KUBE S JAMS

Can you pinpoint when this shift in the music mainstream occured?

Probably about a year-and-a-half ago. Given the fact that a lot of the music being sold today is from Seattle-area bands, should KUBE have moved toward this music earlier?

That's the \$64,000 question. I'm not sure I can answer that. Timing is very critical. Probably, the real question is, when did this music become mass appeal to Seattle? When did it become widely accepted? The answer is somewhere between six and nine months ago. I think 2Pac and Ice Cube became the fringe instead of the mass appeal and Toad The Wet Sprocket, Nirvana and Pearl Jam started to become part of the mass appeal. Do you see what I'm saying? One kind of left and the other moved in. How do you track it? I don't know. You have to feel it. And right now it feels correct for KUBE.

How do you schedule the blend of Hip-Hop and Alternative?

It's tricky. You have to use transition sounds to make the segues correct. You have to pick the right records. An example would be Stone Temple Pilots "Plush" and Snoop Dog "Gin And Juice." They sound great together. Conversely, "Plush" and SWV "I'm So Into You" doesn't work together for us. You have to listen to it. You have to feel the sound of it and talk to people about how they hear it, how they feel it.

Did you discuss this move with Jerry Clifton first? Is this something he's looking to do with other stations he consults?

We definitely discussed it; you would have to ask him about doing it at other radio stations. Exactly when it would be appropriate for us to do this in Seattle had been disscussed for a month. We knew it was

developing; there was a bridge we were going to have to cross at some point. All we've been doing is working on playlists, going, "How does this look," "What about this," "What if we take this out and put this in," making tapes and talking about it, trying to develop a sound that will be compelling to the young adult, current popular music fan of the day.

Is partisan listenership forming between KUBE and the Alternative station in the market?

I don't rhink so. I don't think Alternative fans can stand Hip-Hop, but Hip-Hop fans are beginning to warm up to Alternative. But when you say Alternative; if you go into a record store and ask the person behind the counter to take you to the Alternative section, he or she will introduce you to the Meat Puppets. If you ask for the Top 40 section, he or she is going to show you the Counting Crows. Alternative music is just that... an Alternative to the Mainstream. We're talking about the Mainstream.

As a Top 40 station in Seattle, how did you guys deal with Kurt Cobain's suicide?

[pause] It was a real benchmark. In our recent history, there have been two benchmarks: The release of "Baby Got Back" by Sir Mix-A-Lot, a local artist who kicked things off and really launched KUBE into the stratosphere; and the untimely suicide of Kurt Cobain, which put Nirvana into the Mainstream. My mom knows who Kurt Cobain is. I'm sure it wasn't Kurt's intention, but it was a very newsworthy event in this market. In these situations, your audience shows you the way. If you're open enough, they will lead you to the answer or to the trends. I think it played a part in it, I really do.

In the last several years, Seattle has become one of the nation's premiere cities. What are your thoughts on how the city has evolved?

Boeing and airplanes have always been the heart and soul of this town. That puts us on the cutting edge of technology. That has now dovetailed into Microsoft, which has again put us on the cutting edge of technology. We have Nintendo here, which also puts us on the edge. You've got a city of pretty free-

thinking individuals. This is the home of Nordstrom's, universally accepted as the finest department store there is. It's very top drawer and that's the vibe of this city. Starbucks coffee is popping up across the country. It's becoming the trendy thing in other areas of the country. Coffee works because it's a little colder and damper here than in other areas. It fits nicely with the trend of a decrease in alcohol consumption

Then you have this huge music scene. That isn't the way Kurt Cobain wanted it. And I don't think it's the way Eddy Vedder wanted it. It just so happened these guys make incredible records. You have to put Sir Mix-A-Lot in the same sentence because he created so much breakthrough music. "Posse On

creates a lot of passion and your radio station has to have and reflect that passion in everything it does.

After it rains 30 days in a row, then becomes sunny, is that the day the troops go out to meet the people?

No, no, no! You work full-time, rain or shine. We just don't plan a lot of out-door things in any month other than maybe August.

Shifting gears, what are your thoughts on Top 40 as the primary medium for selling records?

It depends on the Top 40 station you're talking about. A lot of Top 40 stations that have identified the mass-appeal Top 40 sound for their market sell a lot of product. A Top 40 that is really disguised as a Hot AC probably doesn't

From a programming standpoint it's the man I work for, who will shortly be the owner of this radio station. Michael O'Shea has taught me the basics and ground rules and represents a good part of what I stand for today. Jerry Clifton has been an incredible inspiration to me. He's really taught me what programming in the '90s is all about, to be your own person and apply your skills to your situation with passion. I can't say enough about Jerry. I'm a huge, huge fan and we work very well together. Gary Bryan, who's now the morning guy at KFRC in San Francisco, has been inspirational. He was the PD at KUBE after I left the first time and was a competing PD in this market at one point. I have tremendous respect for him and learned a lot by just watching him. And I have a tremendous respect for Mike Joseph and what he has to say.

Which radio stations inspired you when you were growing up?

KFRC and KJR here in Seattle were clearly my inspirations. I absolutely loved KFRC.

Let's talk about your future. Is Seattle home forever?

I really love being in Seattle. I have a wonderful wife who has been with me through thick and thin, up trends and down trends and is willing to go anywhere. If you asked her to move, she would probably say, "Sure, what the heck," but I think we'd like to be here as long as they'll have us. I would like to be a General Manager in the company that Michael O'Shea, George Christy and Lance Anderson have created and called New Century. If it works out in Seattle, it would be a dream come true for me.

Where do you see Top 40 radio in 10 years?

If you play music that people get passionate about, you do things that are compelling and you ride the wave, whatever that wave of contemporary music is, it will be successful in the market. It will be Top Five or Top Three in the market and be very sellable, as it has always been. Top 40 is in great shape now and can be 10 years from now. You have to have realistic goals and ownership with realistic expectations. You have to operate properties sensibly and you'll succeed. I'm excited about Top 40 now and excited about Top 40's future as a format.

Broadway" was one of the original Hip-Hop sounds. He's got a new album out, which will be very cutting edge and another breakthrough that will be perfect with what we're trying to do. Seattle has tried to be on the cutting edge and fortunately, a lot of it has just happened. I don't think anyone tried to put Seattle on the map. It just worked out that way. How does KUBE stay on the pulse of Seattle outside of the music?

As with most major cities, you have to have a heart. You have to be honest with your audience. You need to be straightforward. They don't buy into the hype, the plastic or anything pretentious. There isn't a lot of middle ground in Seattle. You either love it or hate it. The people who live here, for the most part, love it. They go through the 30 grey, rainy days in a row to get to the one spectacular sunny day. Other people who come here go, "I can't stand it, I don't care how many trends come out of here, I hate the weather." [laughs] This

sell much product. The answer would be different in each market. This station seems to sell a few copies of things because we play music rhat's compelling and gets people excited. We don't just play music because it tests!

What's the wackiest way a promotion person ever got you to to then play a record?

[pauses] The only thing that comes to mind is when, naah, I won't say who it was, bur they set up a tent and camped outside of KZZP until we would play the record. They were there for days! It was really rough for them and that was a hell of a commitment to get a message across.

Did you hold out just to torture them?

No, we dealt with it. It turned out to be a hit record, so it was worth it. As was their effort in camping out to get us to play it.

Let's discuss some of the influences on your career. Who inspired you and whom have you emulated?





ENIGMA (CHARISMA/VIRGIN)

- The main creative force of Enigma is Michael Cretu, who was born in Bucharest, Romania on May 18, 1957.
- Cretu studied Classical music in Germany and France in his early goal of becoming a concert pianist.
- However, as soon as he gave up that dream and sold his piano, he started writing hits. He picked up Gold albums for producing albums by European chanteuse Sandra and composer/multi-instrumentalist Michael Oldfield.



- He began mixing Gregorian chants and Dance rhythms on his debut solo album, *MCMXC a.D*, which featured the hit single, "Sadeness Part 1." The album went double-Platinum in America and sold 12 million copies worldwide.
- Other tracks from his debur album were used in movies such as *Single White Female* and *Boxing Helena*.
- On his new album, *The Cross of Changes*, Cretu added exotic instruments and other ethnic musical textures to his Dance rhythms and Gregorian chanting. All female vocals on the album were provided by Sandra.
- The debut single is "Return To Innocence," which features German singer Angel on vocals.

- Of Merican-Irish heritage, Quino grew up in San Diego in a family that consisted of several accomplished Mariachi musicians.
- At 13, he saw a 60 Minutes piece on Bob Marley and the Rastafarian movement and was instantly hooked.
- He started singing in a string of garage Reggae bands until he was spotted by more experienced outfits. He was offered a gig with the band Shiloh in 1986. They cut an album in 1989 and toured incessantly, solidifying its position in the small yet devoted American Reggae community.
 - Within a few years, they changed their name to Big



Mountain to honor Native Americans and draw attention to their struggle.

- Their 1992 independently released debut album, *Wake Up*, was a very popular world music hit and featured the single, "Touch My Light," which came very close to breaking on the Top 40 chart.
- They continued to perform on major Reggae tours and shows, such as the Reggae Sunsplash World Tour, the Reggae Summerfest in Tulsa and the nation's premiere Reggae festival, the 10th annual Reggae on the River
- They cut a Reggae-fied version of Peter Frampton's "Baby I Love Your Way" for the *Reality Bites* sound-track and it has worked its way up to the top of the charts. Giant Records has since signed the band.

PRIMAL SCREAM (SIRE/WB)

• Borne from the bustling Glasgow, Scotland music scene, Bobby Gillespie took time off from the influential Alternative group, Jesus & Mary Chain, to join forces with guitarists Andrew Innes and Robert Young to begin Primal Scream.



- Although Gillespie continued to tour with the Chain, he and the Scream co-horts cut the singles, "All Fall Down" and "Crystal Crescent" in 1986.
- The singles did so well that it led to their debut album, *Sonic Flower Groove*, which featured the single "Loaded," a remix of which became a Top-20 U.S. Club hit.
- A 1990 EP, *Come Together*, was the first official American release, which led to the quasi-compilation album, *Screamadelica*.
- Their latest album, *Give Out But Don't Give Up*, dabble in a variety of musical genres and features the debut single, "Rocks."
