

Although he admits to being vaguely familiar with the Seattle market, "I have been up there enough to know it's a fantastic place to live and that the station really has its act together. The people there seem to be very open to ideas and suggestions. They have a definite path plotted out for KPLZ and we'll see what we can do.

Warner Bros. Records' Changing Of The Guard

CEO Mo Ostin Moves On...

A true music industry legend, Mo Ostin, will leave Warner Bros. Records at the end of the year. Ostin spent 31 years at the label, 25 as CEO, and helped make it become one of the most successful record companies in the history of the music business. He'll move over to Time Warner Inc. as a consultant for Chairman Gerald Levin and other top executives.

To many in the music industry, Mo Ostin practically was Warner Bros. Records. Joining the company in 1963 to head the Frank Sinatra-owned label, Reprise Records, when it was acquired by WB, he rose to President, CEO and Board Chairman. He was at the helm as Warners became known as the artist label, signing and breaking the likes of Jimi Hendrix, The Grateful Dead, Duke Ellington, Neil Young, The Band, Bonnie Raitt, Prince, Talking Heads, Eric Clapton, R.E.M., Madonna, Van Halen and far too many more acts to mention.

He also brought several smaller, boutique labels into the family, including Geffen Records, Sire, Slash, Tommy Boy, Island, American Recordings and Maverick. He developed a sterling reputation that rivaled no other. Even though his label left the WB fold years ago, David Geffen called him "the most successful, most emulated record executive in the world today" upon hearing of his retirement.

"Mo Ostin's achievements over the years have established him as an institu-

tion in this company and in the music industry," states Warner Music Group Chairman/CEO Robert J. Morgado. "Certainly his contribution to the sustained success of Warner Bros. Records is the bedrock that has anchored the growth of Warner Music. Warner Music Group will be a different place without him and we will all miss his dedication, his wisdom and his creativity."

Ostin spoke of his new position at Time Warner, noting, "Jerry Levin is a gifted leader whose vision for the future of Time Warner makes the prospect of working with him and others in the company an exciting one indeed. I'd also like to extend my best wishes to Doug Morris in his new role at Warner Music Group. I look forward to continuing my long and cordial relationship with him there."

It appears likely that Ostin will be leave the company in great shape, as the label is set to release new product by a slew of superstar acts such as R.E.M., Eric Clapton, Rod Stewart and the Red Hot Chili Peppers.

When Mo Ostin leaves Warner Bros. Records, his CEO position will be filled by label President Lenny Waronker. Waronker, 52, has spent 28 years at Warner Bros. and has worked very closely under Ostin during that time.

"There is simply no one in whom I have more confidence than Lenny Waronker in matters of music and the business of music," exclaims Mo Ostin. "His instincts are unerring, his rapport with artists unparalleled and his industry acumen a matter of record. Lenny will continue to provide the leadership that has already distinguished his tenure as company President, while positioning Warner Bros. Records for new growth into the next century."

"The opportunity to continue the tradition of artistic excellence and cor-

porate integrity established by Mo Ostin is one I approach with pride and humility," Waronker remarks. "Proud, because of the unique opportunity I have been offered; humble because, let's face it, these are big shoes to fill."

Son of Liberty Records founder Si Waronker, Lenny Waronker began in the music business while still a student at the University of Southern California. He joined the Warner Bros. A&R staff in 1966 and moved up the ladder in A&R until he was named label President in 1982. During his tenure, Waronker has worked closely with artists such as R.E.M., Seal, Neil Young, Prince and Los Lobos, among others.

"I couldn't be happier to have an executive of Lenny's wealth of talents succeed Mo Ostin," states Warner Music-U.S. President/COO Doug Morris. "Lenny and I have grown up together in this business and I've come to admire and respect him as the consummate music man. I look forward to working closely with him as he expands on Mo's legacy of success."

Holy Cow!

1994 has been a year of unbelievable changes in our industries, in both records and radio. Last week was radio's turn to take the headlines with the changes at KIIS and the Zapoleon/Richards split. This week, it's the record industry's time at bat with monumental moves that will be felt for months to come. Mo Ostin's resignation from Warner Bros. Records (see News section) shook the industry. For more than 30 years, Mo has been Warner Bros. Records and his departure, effective January 1, 1995, signals a true end to an era. With that end comes a new beginning. Although Warner Bros. President Lenny Waronker will assume Mo's title, will the record company structure remain the same? Already there is industry speculation that the first move will be to separate Reprise into a more stand-alone label with its own President and A&R department. Fotmer Virgin leaders Jeff Ayeroff and Jordan Harris are considered by many to be the prime candidates. What, if anything, will happen will be the talk of the industry throughout the fall.



And if Mo's departure isn't enough, could Joe Galante possibly be leaving RCA? Rumors were flying at press time that Joe might be considering a move back to Nashville. One of the considerations fueling such talk was mega-manager Allen Kovac's upcoming relocation to New York. Allen announced recently that he was heading for the Big Apple and to many, the timing seems to coincide with a possible connection with RCA. However, Allen tells us that he isn't going to RCA in any capacity and the rumors are just that...rumors.



We ain't done yet. Supposedly, heavy meetings in England have taken place regarding sweeping changes at a major East Coast label. Could an Englishman be planning a trip across the pond to take a leading role in the New World?



And what about Virgin's Phil Quartararo? Is he about to move East in another monumental move?



Will Giant's Irving Azoff play a part in any or all of the above?

BY THE TIME I GOT TO...

oodstock '94 started out a little different from the original. I was booked on that special United flight into New York...the one full of industry people wanting to be hippies just one more time. The flight

was delayed, so I sat down in the padded chair in that fancy room they reserve for first class passengers. That's when it all went to hell.

A buttoned-steward (certainly not sporting the Woodstock look) approached me with a frown. It seems I was the only passenger in first class who hadn't ordered the special vegetarian plate and he was worried that others might be offended at the smell of my well-done steak. I flipped him half the peace sign, closed my eyes and thought back to 25 years ago.

It started out as just another balmy, breezy morning in Coconut Grove. A bunch of us were living in the park. On the beach. A stone's throw from downtown Miami.

In between my regular job as a deejay on WFUN, I told fortunes in the park. I can still read a palm with the best of them.

I was also partly responsible for cooking the evening meal we all shared. I say partly responsible because none of us was really responsible.

Anyhow, one of my brothers (we called all of our friends brothers or sisters in those days) named John Joseph Henry Billygoat Night-timer Sweetdaddy Fox approached me grinning like a mule eating briars.

"Pete," he says (everyone called me Pete in those days because...aw, hell, just accept it without an explanation), "how'd you like to go to Woodstock?"

I had no money. I had to work that evening. I had absolutely no idea where Woodstock was or why we should be going, so I had only one answer: "Of course."

He waved over a thin, tender looking guy with long, stringy, blonde hair who was wearing bell-bottoms, a tie-dyed shirt, love beads and a headband with a peace sign in the middle. (Weren't we all?)

"This is Electric Brian," Sweetdaddy said.

I gave him half-a-dozen of the handshakes that were in vogue at the time, finishing with the two-palmed clasp that showed I really meant it.

"Hey, man," I asked, "where's Woodstock?"

In those days I wasn't afraid to make a fool out of myself by not knowing everything.

Electric Brian gave me a thousand-mile stare. "It's where Bob Dylan lives, man."

I said, "Far out."

I chugged the cup of herbal tea Sweetdaddy offered and asked, "Who's going?"

"Me, you and Gappy Lucy. Brian's paying for all of us."

"Far out."

Gappy Lucy got her nickname because one of her front teeth was false. When she got stoned, she would take the tooth out and put a cigarette in its place. It was the grooviest thing I'd ever seen.

When Sweetdaddy asked me how I liked the tea, I should have known things were about to get really twisted. You see, in those days, I was determined to keep my body and mind pure and clean and refused to do any drugs. My brothers and sisters were constantly trying to get me high and I should have heard a warning signal. But I didn't.

We jumped into Gappy's VW van and headed for the airport. About half-way there, we ran out of gas. I'm pretty sure we became the first people attending Woodstock to abandon a vehicle on the side of the road and continue walking.

Inside the terminal, Electric Brian asked us what airline we'd like to fly, but I couldn't answer. I was too busy dodging the giant bats that materialized out of nowhere and were divebombing my head.

I started to ask Sweetdaddy if he saw the bats, but he looked too peaceful. I decided to wait. I knew he would see them soon enough.

When Electric Brian got us four seats on

Bahamian Airlines, I should have said something. I had found out that Woodstock was in New York and I was pretty sure that New York wasn't in the Bahamas, but I was too busy trying not to step on the snakes that were gathering at my feet. At least the bats had disappeared.

The flight seemed to take only a few minutes, but I really can't be sure as I was definitely not into space and time. I managed to gulp another cup of herbal tea and stepped down the stairs into a tropical paradise.

"I didn't know Woodstock was this beautiful," Gappy said.

Sweetdaddy told her Bob Dylan lived there. I didn't know what that had to do with anything and didn't care. The bats were back and they had turned nasty.

Somehow we made it to the hotel, though I never remembered the room. Electric Brian kept pulling out his credit card to pay for everything. I spent two days and nights in a hammock by the pool, drinking rum and pineapple juice...and more herbal tea. I really couldn't leave the pool area. I was the only one who could see the giant octopus and keep it away from the children, though as time went on, the tourist families began to give us a wide berth.

I met John and Yoko. I asked him how he liked Woodstock. He said he didn't really know and I thought that was cool. What was cooler was that he also saw the bats.

By midnight of the second day, I began to wonder where all the bands were, but it really didn't matter by then. Gappy Lucy had scared some children when she accidentally dropped her tooth off the diving board. Sweetdaddy took one of those kerosene tiki torches to try and illuminate the bottom. He lost his footing, fell in and set the pool on fire.

Electric Brian thought it was really cool, but hotel security didn't. At least we got a police escort to the plane. As we got off in Miami, someone from Elektra Records grabbed Electric Brian and took away his credit card. That's when I figured out how he got his name.

It wasn't until a year later when I saw the movie that I realized I never quite made it to Woodstock. Or maybe I did. That special herbal tea was a bitch.

The steward tapped me on the shoulder and brought me back to the present. He said it was time for boarding and offered me some herbal tea. I took the next flight to Hawaii.

Woodstock '94? Just like the original, baby. Far out. ☑

A STAR OVER THE BEACH

West Palm Beach has grown dramatically over the past few years. It's home to close to one million people - all potential listeners of WOVV (Star 95.5). PD Neil Sullivan describes his station as "a Mainstream, high-profile Top 40. We're music-intensive, topical and fun to listen to. We're also in touch with the community and we're not afraid to address important issues. One example was when

an 11-year-old was shot on a local playground. Star 95.5 brought together teachers and students in an on-air morning show forum. One of the participants was actually at the scene when the shooting occurred. Reacting quickly to the community's response and participation, we were able to get Donnie Wahlberg of NKOTB on the station that night with our personality, Dr. Mix. The local ABC and CBS TV stations sent camera crews to film this interactive program."

Competition is fierce in South Florida radio. "We share audience with Power 96 Miami, yet the stations are very different. Power is more Miami-focused and in touch with that area's Hispanic population. We also compete with WRMF, a Hot AC in West Palm Beach for 25-34 female demos."

Sullivan makes musical choices based on "call-out research, SoundScan, BDS

and instinct to decide which songs are right for West Palm Beach. Surprisingly, Alternative Rock leaning songs by Collective Soul and Counting Crows are testing very well here. The Crossover product is selling well, so our Mainstream approach is to some extent a balancing act. Our philosophy, though, is to play the hits and have fun!" The library is spiced with "a

lot of '80s Gold right now, and the audience is reacting favorably. Artists such as the Go-Go's, the Romantics, Shiela E, Lisa Lisa and Frankie Goes To Hollywood are included in that category."

The station's current promotion is "the 'Coca-Cola Red Hot Summer.' We qualify listeners with the sound of a Coke bottle opening and they win prizes like beach towels, basketballs, T-shirts, Sega game gear and more, and go into drawings for two Ford Mustang GT convertibles. We've displayed the vehicles all over the Palm Beaches and the response has been excellent. In addition, we also do Prize Patrol, having distributed over 300,000 bumper stickers through Burger King. We spot winners for prizes like CD players, Walkmen, boomboxes and concert tickets. We also do at least one movie premiere per month."





CONFERENCE CALL

ANALYZING AIRCHECKS!

An aircheck session usually can go one of two ways. It can either be a constructive meeting between employee and employer or it can be a session where the employee walks away feeling lower than pond scum. We have all been the victims of warranted sessions in the PD's office where our work has been described as "inadequate," "incompetent," "unprofessional" or simply "idiotic." Then there are those PDs who take the time to make notes and in episodic fashion help develop their airstaff with each aircheck session. On this week's Programmers Conference Call, we asked PDs how they deal with incoming airchecks from jocks wanting jobs and how they deal with their current staff in aircheck sessions.

What are the essential elements of a good aircheck?

MIKE: I look for two different things. If it's someone looking for a job, it's a completely different situation than sitting down with someone and conducting an aircheck session. When it's someone applying for a job, obviously I want to hear their best stuff – at least on the initial tape. If they grab my attention within the first 60 seconds, I may call them back and ask for another scoped hour along with an unscoped hour, so I can ascertain their flow within the other programming elements.

DAN: If it's a tape I got to fill a position, the essentials are the first two or three breaks. If they haven't sold me in the first two or three breaks, so long... I've got 50 more to listen to. It's a weeding-out process. I really try to go through and listen to each tape I get and if it's one with some potential, I usually stack it in the listen-to-the-whole-thing pile. Nowadays, if it's a looking-to-hire situation, I always call back and ask for a second tape.

ADAM: I like to check the basics. What's important to a radio station from daypart to daypart with different personalities is to make sure there's a common thread, so I like to make sure the calls, the promotions and all station activities are being sold correctly. After that, you can get into what is actually being said – the topicality, the relatability and the relevance of what the personalities are discussing. These are important things. Each jock needs to ask him or herself before they open the mike if anyone cares what they're about to say, and if they do care, can they make a statement monumental enough to impact their listeners?

JOHN: Number one is that they're doing the clock

correctly. They need to be doing one thought per break and expressing themselves in a way appealing to 18-34 female listeners.

When you listen to your on-air talent's tapes, what do you look for?

MIKE: First and foremost is to make sure they're doing the format. I want to make sure they're working on the specifics of previous sessions where I may have pointed out some things for them to work on. In most of my aircheck sessions, I never have them work on more than one item at a time. Each session is a bit episodic, with one item leading to the next, to ensure they're working on the changes we previously discussed.


DAN: I'm making sure they're giving an accurate representation of the radio station and what we do in 29-minute segments. I listen to make sure they're hitting the main promotions, among other things. Rarely do I stop a tape and comment on an individual break. I like to let it roll, make notes and talk about it after the tape has ended. I'm fortunate to have a great airstaff here, so I really concentrate on the little things-making sure the content is right and that they're talking about what's going on in the community.

ADAM: I'm listening to make sure they sound believable and that they're having fun on the radio. Or are they being mechanical and just going through the motions? It's easy to tell if someone is into their show by their presentation and enthusiasm. I listen for those things first. Most of the time, the air talent themselves will tell you whether or not they had a good or bad show. If your staff is experienced, as mine is, they will tell you when they're having an off day. You don't really have to point it out. They already know it. This staff is harder on themselves than I could ever be. I'm less into tearing down things than suggesting other ways to convey particular messages or retargeting their message to women a little better than they did. I probably allow more levity with my staff than most programmers. I really do believe personalities can make the difference because everyone has access to the same music and it's real easy to play the right music. It's hard to copy unique personalities.

JOHN: I look for them to do the basics very well and to highlight the music properly. We have positioning elements that have to be done. But I really look for them to highlight the music we're playing. I consider this to be

and I'm not going back again."

ultra-important. I want them to be concise in their delivery but really sound like a personality in a very, very short period of time. Proper use of the calls is important instead of sliding by them, like a lot of jocks like to do, to get to something they consider important, like their...name. [laughs] It's really just dealing with the basics.

What are some of the more common mistakes made on airchecks?

MIKE: The most common mistakes are usually the basics. Somebody will forget them. It's usually resolved with a reminder because they already know the basics. They just forget to execute them. They get into a bad habit. Probably the biggest problem I have to deal with is brevity...where someone could take half the amount of time to say the same thing. I want them to use one idea per break and I stress this to them. This is a really simple thing. If it's more than one idea per break, usually this break will go on too long when they execute it. Again, it's being aware of the basics.

DAN: I think, especially in dealing with young talent, that they're so interested in getting a thought out, they don't remember to sell the calls correctly. The one thing we have to sell in each break is the call letters, because that's the one thing they need to write down. I really work on having my staff sell the calls in a fashion where they work them into a thought instead of just tossing them in at the end of a break. I believe in one thought per break. Sometimes the tirle and artist aren't a thought, but they should be... especially with all the new music we play.

ADAM: Normally, they're not too off-base. The basic stuff that's missed is usually formatical. I have to beat over their heads that I want "Today's Hits, XL 106.7" instead of "Today's Hits On XL 106.7. I find myself getting pissed off about little things like this. I beat them over this so much that eventually they surrender and begin doing it. [laughs] Generic shows bother me and I question them. People are at different stages in their careers and this is something I keep in mind during aircheck sessions. While one person might have more creativity than another, you have to provide them with the tools and suggestions to develop their own style of creativity. One thing I stress is knowledge... a lot of it about the music we're playing.

JOHN: Blowing by the calls without selling them as the important thing to sell. Conversely, trying to get too many calls in one break is a problem when they end up rushing through the calls. A lot of jocks think you have to hit the post every single time; that's just not what you look for anymore. I want them to sound natural in their presentation.

When you listen to airchecks for potential job openings, what has to be on an aircheck to tweak your interest?

MIKE: When you hear something you like, you keep listening. And it could be something non-specific that I didn't hear in the previous 15 tapes. It could be this person was really smooth or was talking to me instead of at me. It usually is a situation where the person who keeps your interest has something, and it's usually more than one thing, that sets him apart from the rest of the pack.

DAN: You better have a good positive tempo on the air. We're not an AC station, nor are we attempting to even remotely sound like one. Tempo is important. You need to be local to the point where there are things on the tape I don't understand. Anyone can read liner cards. We're not real structured and I don't think you can be anymore. Make sure you have the tools to entertain and inform when you go in to do your shift.

ADAM: I want someone to sound like he or she is having fun and is very comfortable and at ease. I like to hear the whole thing, the presentation, the delivery the style, how they sell the call letters, all these...basics. In listening, you can see beyond the basics and through to the real talent. The radio I grew up with featured people who could be personalities with 15-second intros, and I find myself looking for that today. I don't think you have to take 30 seconds to do a bit. Some of the best stuff ever done has been done in 15 seconds.

JOHN: A good hour of a show...unscoped. I don't want a best-of package. I would rather have a good hour of a show where I can see the flaws and potential for growth. I don't mind working with someone who needs some polish. I just want to hear people who can do the basics well and have raw talent that I can hear in their package. A quick programming note: I do have a tool for my aircheck sessions. I have a vice on my desk.

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


The Mainstream In Middle America

INTERVIEW BY JEFF SILBERMAN

es, Virginia, there are still successful Mainstream Top 40s in America. One, in particular, is smack dab in the middle of the country - KQKQ in Omaha,

Nebraska. "Sweet 98," as it is called, succeeds the old fashioned way - featuring a savvy mix of only the best of a variety of genres, an entertaining and often controversial morning show and an aggressive promotional stance. It has led to a string of double-digit ratings and the market-leader crown.

Programming this well-oiled machine is Top 40's version of a professional wrestling tag team - major-market veteran PD Dan Kieley and his protege of sorts, APD Michael Steele. Together, they knocked around a few of their better ideas for Editor Jeff Silberman. In two out of three falls.



DAN: Ken Benson and Tom Gjerdrum had done a great job with KQKQ, so when I got here, it just needed to be focused a bit more on women. After we had a little downturn, we've done an 11 share or better for six or seven books in a row and have been #1 for the last five out of six books.

Michael, did you follow Dan to Omaha?

MICHAEL: Actually, it was the other way around. I came here first; Ken Benson hired me to come here from Rapid City. I've been here for over two years.

DAN: Michael actually interned for me at Sioux Falls when he was a teenager. We've been working together since... well, for-

ever. He was in Rapid City first, then he came here first. I just follow Michael wherever he goes.

MICHAEL: It's twisted and sick, but I like it.

Michael, how long did it take you to familiarize yourself with Omaha's tastes?

MICHAEL: It took about four or five months. We were doing a Hot AC/Rock-thing in Rapid City. Here, it's a bit more Alternative. It's really a hip musical town; people are really into buying records. There's a pretty good local music scene that also leans Alternative.

DAN: KQKQ is probably as Mainstream as you can get; we can go from Aerosmith to Warren G. and everything in between. Rapid City, on the other hand, is totally cowboy country.



MICHAEL: Amy Grant is considered to be a Dance record in Rapid City, where here it's more Mainstream. Omaha has a bigger base of people more into the music.

Michael, after Tom Gierdrum

Michael, after Tom Gjerdrum left for San Diego, did you go after the PD gig?

MICHAEL: No. Coming in as MD and doing nights, I thought it'd be too hard to make a transition to management and get respect from the sales and air staffs.

Were you at all nervous as to who your next superior was going to be?

MICHAEL: No. The GM, Marty Riemenschneider, was really cool about it. I sat in on a lot of interviews. I kept wishing I could work with Dan again, so I kept asking him to send down a package. He wanted to stay in Rapid City for a while.

DAN: I felt the honorable thing to do was to stay in Rapid City for a while. Then I finally realized that since I didn't have a contract, I could go.

MICHAEL: Meanwhile, they went through about 60 people and management asked me what I thought of everybody. Fortunately, Dan decided to come down.

Dan, it must be nice to walk into a new PD situation with an MD you totally trust.

DAN: Michael and I have known each for a long time. I have a really good feel for how I want the station to sound. I can convey that to Michael, who does a great job of putting it down on paper. It's great to not have to spend four to five hours a day on music logs. I can look at the overall picture of the sta-

tion, the creative, and not be burdened by the log. Michael can take care of business.

Dan, after programming in Milwaukee and marketing in Chicago, does it take a different mindset to program in Omaha?

I'm not sure if it's a different mindset. The great thing about doing Top 40 radio is that if you do it right, you can be #1. The thing that changes the most is the decimal point. But it's as competitive here as it is in Milwaukee. I've still got to make sure that KQKQ is AC and Album Rock listeners' second-favorite station. If we do that, we'll be #1.

Does MTV play affect your programming?

DAN: Not that much. If MTV played music, they'd probably sound more like us.

MICHAEL: Sometimes you can get a feel for what the next big record coming off the streets will be from MTV. A Coolio record will start there; we'll get some phones, sales will happen, they make it familiar and then we'll pop it in. The Offspring record happened like that.

DAN: The BOX is on in limited hours here and we get more buzz on Urban records from them than MTV. We get huge phones for "Put'em On The Glass," even though we're not playing it.

Are you wary of relying too much on active-listener research?

DAN: Absolutely. We take every piece of information we get and balance it out. Nothing's gospel, but if we do our homework and know what's out on the street, after being here for at least two years, we have a pretty good feel for what they want to hear and how they want it mixed. You just go out there and talk to 26-and 27-year-old females. And Michael does a real good job of talking to as many 26- and 27-year-old females as possible!

Describe KQKQ's promotional

DAN: We try to stay active, hip and on the street and our Promotion Director, Karen Menke, does a great job. She's young and aggressive and it's important to hire the demographic to promote to the demographic. When you got two dorky white guys programming to women, you need to surround yourselves with people in the demo.

As the #1 station in Omaha, do you play it safe musically or do you still push the envelope in breaking new hits?

DAN: Michael and I have done enough cluster analysis to know

MICHAEL: The big Rap records are played at night, but there's not a lot of dayparting. Hits are hits. The "Channel X" thing isn't really new. We've been doing that the whole time and it doesn't sound bad if you've got the right records.

DAN: Mike Joseph was doing it 25 years ago. Just play the hits in the market that are selling.

We use Alternative songs as a buffer between them. I have no

what the mix has got to be. We're not trying to push the envelope; we just want to give them a real good mix of music.

KQKQ, Omaha

MICHAEL: We've got the station sounding really good, so there are places to challenge the listeners a little bit.

DAN: If we're aggressive at all, it's on the Alternative stuff. The people who like Alternative are really into it, so if we're not on those records fast enough, they stop being hip.

MICHAEL: This station is based around a Depeche Mode/ Culture Beat/Snap! sound, although the Soundgarden and Aerosmith still work for us. The Aerosmith is the extreme of one end; the Warren G is the other extreme. If we're playing two or three Urban hits, we'll play the same number of Rock hits.

problem putting Culture Beat after Aerosmith and before Warren G. Duran Duran makes good Pop records that will transition into anything. Very rarely will we go from Warren G. to Aerosmith.

Program Director

Being the #1 station also means that everyome's gunning for you. Do you set your sights on any one or more rivals?

DAN: We know who's out there and doing a good job, but you get in trouble with this format if you program on the defensive. You have to be pro-active and if we're not out there, trying to be as good as we can be every day, someone's going to catch us. If you start thinking about "maintaining those numbers," you start looking backwards and that's not what a forward-thinking radio station is supposed to do.

Is your top-rated morning show

controversial or does its appeal rely more on the music?

DAN: Rockett In The Morning is most definitely the most controversial show in town. Some days, it almost seems like a talk show. It's listener-driven that's compelling to listen to. It's on the edge; if i'm not getting complaints three or four days a week, maybe Rockett's on vacation.

Can you get too many complaints to the point where the show has gone too far?

DAN: A lesbian kissing bit may have gone too far, but it was playing off the lesbian kiss on *Roseanne*. You have to mirror what goes on out there, then give your own twist to it. Sometimes, he'll cross the line. So you slap his hand and we go back at it the next day.

If you have thoroughbreds, you have to let them run. If you have to worry about how your air talent runs, then you don't have good air talent. Just know when to pull in the reins.

When jocks become successful, they often move to major-market gigs. Do you prepare for that inevitability?

DAN: Sooner or later, they'll probably go and I want them to improve and move on. But nowadays, if you have a good job, be it in Omaha or L.A., why leave? We have a very stable airstaff. I'm the only change we've had in the last three years. There are people on this staff who've had offers from bigger markets - but they were offered less money! Something's the matter with this business. Major-market stations want smallmarket talent because they think they can get them cheaper. That's why we keep people around here so long.

So where do you guys wanna go in your future?

MICHAEL: I've never done a major market, so I'd like to take on that challenge and see what that's all about.

DAN: Where's my next challenge? Michael and I would like to continue to work together. We've had a good, successful run and we're going to stay here until something better comes along. ... Can I leave my home phone number?

A few years back, the music awards shows were calling C&C Music Factory to the podium to accept awards right and left, as its debut, Gonna Make You Sweat, ended up selling over six million copies worldwide, spawning three #1 hits.

Although the C&C has always stood for Clivillés and Cole, the Music Factory was always supposed to be a free-form collection of talent. On Anything Goes! Zelma Davis and Martha Wash return, and the group gains new members from Trilogy, an NYC-based Hip-Hop trio. Getting things started is the single, "Do You Wanna Get Funky"; it's Top 15 at Urban Radio, receiving 1,594 Plays Per Week, and it's gaining momentum each week at Top 40, where it's getting 1,250 PPWs. The video is in Active rotation on MTV. Anything Goes! hits the Retail Chart at #49*.







- Changing Faces is Charisse Rose and Cassandra Lucas, who hail from the Bronx and Manhattan, respectively.
- The very first time they entered the studio, Spoiled Rotten Records Pres. Kenny "Smoove" Kornegay asked them to come up with a song. They not only did in less than an hour, but it became the song that got them signed.
- The duo has a strong respect for classic love songs and tries to convey a positive attitude about today's relationships.
- Their style represents a new breed of R&B groups that not only attempt to convey sexuality and sensitivity, but also intelligence and self-assuredness.



- Many well-known artists, including Heavy D, Jodeci's Devante Swing and Dave "Jam" Hall (Mary J. Blige, Mariah Carey), contributed to the making of their debut album.
- When R&B sensation R. Kelly first heard them, he expressed a strong interest in working with the duo because he believes they have a unique style and a different sound.
- Kelly wrote and produced their first single, "Stroke You Up."

PRINCE (WB)

- Born June 7, 1958 and raised in Minneapolis, Prince Rogers Nelson was named after the Prince Rogers Trio, led by his father.
- He taught himself to play piano at the age of seven. By the time he was 12, he had mastered 20 instruments. The first band he formed was called Grand Central.
- His first album, For You, was released when he was only 19 years old. He wrote, produced and performed every song on it.
- Firsts: hit single "I Wanna Be Your Lover" (1979); hit album 1999 (1982); hit movie *and* album *Purple Rain*, with four Top-10 singles; two of those went to #1.
- Prince had fronted two bands over his prolific career
 The Revolution and New Power Generation.
- Outside of *Purple Rain*, Prince's other movies didn't do well at the box office *Under The Cherry Moon* and



the live concert film, *Sign O' The Times.* Yet he always managed to put out hit singles like "Kiss," "U Got The Look," "Batdance" and "The Most Beautiful Girl In The World."

- Prince has also written hit songs for several other well-known artists which include Sheena Easton, Sinead O'Connor ("Nothing Compares 2 U"), The Bangles ("Manic Monday") and Chaka Kahn.
- Last year, he retired from the music business and renounced his name. He became that symbol.

His current single, "Letitgo," is culled from his extensive unreleased catalog and is credited to his old name.

SOPHIE B. HAWKINS (COLUMBIA)

- Hawkins was raised by a lawyer father and a mother writer on Manhattan's Upper West Side. She is the second of three children.
- Her early musical influences included a variety of artists and styles from David Bowie to John Coltrane.
- By the time she entered high school, Hawkins had decided to pursue a career as a musician and began studying as a percussionist.
- While studying at the Manhattan School of Arts, she formed several bands and began performing in NY clubs like CBGB's and The Bitter End.
- Her career finally began to pay off in 1991 when after producing her own demo tapes, a guy walked in to her coat-check job in Midtown and, after saying she had a great speaking voice, gave her a job doing jingles.
- Her first album, *Tongues*, contained the hit single, "Damn I Wish I Was Your Lover."
- Her current single, "Right Beside You," is off her second album entitled Whaler.

Gump-Mania!

With almost \$200 million being forked over at the box office (and showing no signs of slowing down), the film, Forrest Gump, is the baby-boomer phenomenon of the summer, if not the entire year. Gump's catch-phrases are being bandied about and fashion designers are already showing off the nerdy "Gump" look for men.



- Go to a chocolatier and have large plastic capsules covered with chocolate. Inside the capsules are notes listing prizes like free CDs, a trip, etc. Give qualified winners a chance to choose one out of a box cuz, "Life is like a box of chocolates; you never know what you're gonna get."
- Stage a Forrest Gump fashion show. Listeners wear their nerdiest outfits at a remote for prizes. Give Gump haircuts to interested patrons. Get life-sized cut-outs of celebs and Presidents, so listeners (dressed as Gump) can have their pictures taken next to them.
- Send station interns, looking like Forrest Gump, out to sit on park benches around town. The first listener to spot them and yell out station's calls wins something from the box of chocolate prizes.

The Ice Cream Alibi!

One of the more unusual pieces of evidence coming from the O.J. Simpson murder trial: a cup of ice cream, left at the scene of the crime, wasn't completely melted. The defense reportedly will contend that if O.J. was the murderer and left the cup, it would've totally liquefied. Thus, the ice creamcrazed assailant must've committed the crime later that evening. It's O.J.'s "Magic Loogie" theory.

 "Guess The Meltdown" - stick a spoon in a cup of ice cream. Offer free CDs/prizes to the listener who calls in at the exact time it melts to the point where the spoon touches the side of the cup. Have them guess how many songs in a row you can play before it melts.

• Do a remote at a frozen yogurt place; give away free "Guilty As Sin" shakes, made of frozen yogurt and O.J. or hold a frozen yogurt carving contest.

Strike Three, Yer Out!

The baseball strike is underway and looks like it'll go on at least through mid-September, leaving millions of baseball fans totally pissed off and looking for other diversions.

- "Strike Busters!" Stage a celebrity softball game, where qualified listeners get to play as well. Hire the out-of-work concessionaires to sell station T-shirts, hats, etc. at the game.
- Have jocks intro songs like a public address announcer: "Next up, hit #32, playing Alternative Rock, Erasure!" For a ticket giveaway, sing "Take Me Out To The Concert" with lyrics like, "and it's one, two, third caller wins at the ol'..."
- Go to a TV/video store, pop in baseball video games for each monitor on the wall and let listeners pluy games for free. Store will sell TVs, video players and monitors at a discount, of course.

Michael & Lisa Marie?

Two of the biggest names in music business history have married and are rumored to have, shall we say, "merged" their gene pools. Considering the "peculiarities" with their blood lines... may God save us all.



- At a remote, hold an "Elvis Jackson" impersonation contest. Elvis impersonators must sing Michael Jackson songs and viceversa. Extra credit for merging their music to create "Hunk Hunka Burnin' Glove," "We Own The World" and "Bad Hound Dog."
- Hold a Michael Jackson "Stag Party" (saluting him in absentia) at a local club. Have a chimp jump out of a cake,

screen "dirty" love scenes from Elvis films, with Virgin Marys on the house.

• Throw Lisa Marie a baby shower (also in absentia). Give prizes to listeners who come with the most imaginative gifts: solid gold pacifiers, a tiny white glove, homemade banana/peanut butter/marshmallow baby food, etc.

Wood\$tock, Inc.!

Twenty-five years after the neardisaster of a Rock festival instantly became a mythic legend, a sequel to Woodstock has become an instant mud-caked legend unto itself. The buzz from the fest should last at least another week or two, so jump on these now:

- Go to a natural childbirth center, offer free mud baths or facials to expecting women, play soothing music while they do their breathing exercises, and give out maternity prizes. Call it "Woodstork."
- A karaoke Woodstock outdoors, where listeners can "perform" to their favorite artist's Woodstock performance, waddle in a man-made mudslide, compete in a sleeping hag marathon (the couple who stays in the longest, wins), etc.
- Play on-air Woodstock Trivial Corporate Pursuits. Ask "Who is the sole soft drink sponsor?" "What label will release the soundtrack album?" "When will it be released?" "What computer company is a co-sponsor?" "What's the interactive exhibit about?" etc.
- Do a remote from a high school Industrial Arts class. Offer prizes for students who carve or build the coolest looking call letters, hammer in rhythm to the music, etc. It's the "Woodshop Festival."

The Female Condom!

The Real World?

It's one of the hottest cult shows and guiltiest pleasures for TV junkies nationwide: MTV's quasi-Generation X melo-documentary, *The Real World*. A handful of distinctly different demo'ed kids are thrown together in a deluxe, state-of-the-trendoid apartment. Yeah, *real* world, alright. Somewhere, Albert Brooks is looking for a way to get back a piece of this action.



- Recruit your own handful (three or four) of colorful, yet different listeners for instance, an attractive single, heterosexual man; a single, gay woman; another one with a job; a fourth without one. Stick them in a multi-room suite at a client hotel. Assign jocks (in shifts) to stay with them and record almost everything. They'll accompany one on a date; another on a job interview. If one of them engages in a tryst, get their reactions afterward. Edit the highlights for the next day's morning show.
- Do the same with a married couple. Record everything from kissing to spats just be sure to use a seven-second delay.
- Send some listeners out on the road as roadies for a big Rock band. A jock joins them to record their observations as they talk to the band, set up and tear down the stage, talk about the tedium of driving from one city to the next, their quest to pick up a groupie or two, etc.
