

Jay Boberg New MCA Music Publishing President

Leaves I.R.S. Records After 15-Plus Years

Jay Boberg has just been appointed president of MCA Music Publishing worldwide. Boberg, the co-founder and President of I.R.S. Records, will be responsible for all aspects of music publishing operations.

As a 20-year-old college rep for A&M Records, Boberg founded I.R.S. Records with Miles Copeland, then manager of the band, The Police, over 15 years ago. He became President of the label five years later. During his tenure, Boberg was instrumental in the success of some of the most influential Alternative bands of the '80s and '90s, including R.E.M., the Go-Go's, Fine Young Cannibals, Oingo Boingo, English Beat, dada, Concrete Blonde and Wall Of Voodoo.

Boberg and Copeland also cofounded I.R.S. Music Publishing in L.A., which eventually spread to London, Paris and Nashville. From there, the two formed I.R.S. Media, a film production company. It is Boberg's publishing and international experience that aroused the interest of the MCA Music Entertainment Group.

MCA Music Entertainment Group Chairman/CEO Al Teller is delighted to recruit Boberg at "this exciting period in our group's history. With Jay's entrepreneurial skills and network of relationships, we expect him to be a major resource for the entire Group."

Putting the entire record industry on hold is a well-timed tradition for radio. Who's gonna miss Cagle's Editorial with the cards and presents floating in from all across our great nation? We'll all be far too busy, drumstick in hand and reaching for the gravy, to concentrate on Dwayne's riveting Conference Call. Is there life without Leah's Station Spotlight? Who'll think of it while watching a Twilight Zone marathon? We will have to learn to deal without Rhythm Nation for a short while. Have a cookie, console yourself. Let's face it, after the Bob Hamilton-to-KYLD news, nothing shocks us anymore. The Chrome Lizard Awards are your signal to put down your pencils and close your notebooks for another yeat. Bring your seat backs into a full and upright position. Let the games begin.

THE GREAT PERSPECTIVE: With all this time on your hands, what do you do? We're still weeks away from the beginning of the O.J. trial. Colorized Jimmy Stewart, a new Miracle on 34th Street, Peanuts, The Grinch, etc., while traditional, are just not terribly exciting. The Kathie Lee Christmas special never got off the ground. Why is it the sales people are so damn happy all the time? How jealous are you that anyone working on the record side tells you about their vacation plans? It may be best not to contact anyone with a job outside of our industry; it may push you further towards the edge.

YOU ARE NOT ALONE: This time of year we can sympathize with our brothers and sisters in law enforcement, hospital and postal work. This is nothing new to the folks at NASA; the mission is more important than the calendar. Many tremendous scientific discoveries have been made this time of year. Did Einstein ever rest? Many great football games have been played. Do we ever take time to think of Joe Montana's wife and kids, or is it hard to work up pity for a guy pulling down \$3 million a year? Perhaps he's the wrong example. Radio is like a steam engine; you gotta keep shoveling the coal. No matter what the time of year, the work will always be there. At least we hope so... Talk to you after the results of the Fall book. Happy holidays.





COUNTRY COMMENTARY

What I've Learned

commentary by Jamie Matteson

When production of the final issue of 1994 got into gear, I asked VP/GM Gerry Cagle for the honor and privilege of writing the last commentary for the new Country Section. Gerry smiled wickedly and replied, "Go for it!"

Which immediately created my first challenge: How do I follow his act? What do I write about? First off, I must admit that after just two full weeks here (flu and all), I still love my job. It's wonderful that I'm getting paid to talk with radio programmers about the music that I love.

In two short weeks, I've had the privilege to speak with hundreds of programmers and music directors, all of whom were eager to offer their insight and perspective not just on what they'd like to see in our new Country Section, but on Country radio as a whole. Here's some of what they've told me:

Regarding radio's decision-makers, WYRK Buffalo PD Ken Johnson noted that most radio programmers are in this format because they love the music. Many have been programming Country since the '70s and early '80s. From KQFC Boise PD Paul Wilson and KEBC Oklahoma City PD Mike McCoy, I've learned that lots of Country programmers have come from a Top 40 background. I remember them from my past careers.

On the music side, KWEN Tulsa PD Dave Block says that some programmers have added more Gold to their scheduling due to vast information provided by consultants and research companies. Concurrently, WWYZ Hartford PD Dale Carter believes there's an abundance of new artists who can't always get the airplay they may deserve.

On the numbers side, KOLT/KRST Albuquerque PDs Brad Barrett and Bruce Agler pointed out that a lot of programmers are worried about the future of Country music and a possible ratings pleateau for the format in the near future. WIL St. Louis PD Ray Massie was kind enough to inform me that out of over two million people in St. Louis, only 2,200 or so fill out Arbitron diaries, so positioning and familiarity are crucial. KPLX Dallas MD Chris Huff offered new insight for the term, "three-way dogfight."

Elsewhere, KZLA Los Angeles PD R.J. Curtis gave me the V.I.P. tour of their new state-of-the-art studios that could make even me sound great. KYNG Dallas PD Dan Pearman noted that every time a station wants to use the slogan "Young Country," it must get permission and pay KYNG. (This could be the best lesson yet!)

On a more personal level, I've discovered that just seven voice mail messages will get you a return call from KNCI Sacramento PD Larry Pareigis' mobile phone. KSCS Dallas PD Dean James saw my picture in the magazine, which enabled me to get a return phone call from him after only one message! WXTU Philadelphia PD John Hart said that since I am not clearing syndication anymore, he will actually look forward to my calls!

But the one sentiment that was shared by a vast majority of the programmers was that Country radio is very disenchanted with the current chart and weighting system as dictated by $R \not \sim R$. Which is where we come in.



Step posse and recorded a track called "Empire State," which experienced a buzz that traveled all the way to Europe.


- One Blood recently finished his first movie, *The Professional*, in which he plays a corrupt DEA agent.




