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Citicasters Inc. Merges With OmniAmerica

New 28-Station Combo Creates A Corporate Powerhouse

The Reds aren't the only winning powerhouse in Cincinnati. Citicasters Inc. and OmniAmerica have joined forces to create a powerful new radio group in the rapidly shrinking high-roller corporate climate. The combined entity will consist of two TV stations and 28 radio stations in 12 markets, with a total estimated worth of \$1 billion.

The new executive lineup will have OmniAmerica President Carl E. Hirsch serving as Chairman of the potent combo, with Citicasters' Dave Crowl continuing as Radio President.

"We are very excited about the extraordinary opportunities this combination creates," states Citicasters CEO John P. Zanotti. "Both the assets and the management of our companies complement each other in a very positive fashion."

"This is clearly an excellent merger fit," adds Carl E. Hirsch. "John, my partners and I share a common vision of how to enhance shareholder value by participating in the future of a deregulated telecommunications landscape. The opportunity to grow with our people and their careers through our new extended Citicasters family, and the opportunity to work with John Zanotti, Dave Crowl and their team, is compelling. Opportunities like these probably come around once in a lifetime."

The new conglomerate overlaps only in the Columbus market, where it will have five radio stations. It brings together outlets in a large number of markets that play a wide variety of formats, including A/C, Top 40, AOR, Classic Rock, Country and News/Talk. Included in the new group are an impressive quartet of heritage Top 40s: WKRQ Cincinnati, WAPE Jacksonville, WXXL Orlando and KKRZ Portland. Other notable sticks include Alternative WMMS Cleveland; AOR WKLS Atlanta, WFYV Jacksonville, WXTB Tampa, KYYS Kansas City

and WKVQ Columbus; A/C WWNK Cincinnati and KKCW Portland; and Country WHOK Columbus and WDAF Kansas City.

"Regionally, it's a good fit because they have excellent properties in Cleveland, which will complement our Columbus and Cincinnati presence," Crowl explains. "The state of Ohio is a nice region for us from an operational standpoint. The same goes for Florida. We have excellent TV and radio properties in Tampa. They have very good facilities in Jacksonville, Orlando and West Palm Beach. Outside of Miami, we have the whole state covered."

Crowl told *Network 40* that discussions regarding the merger began around the end of 1994; the pace picked up considerably five months ago. The imminent easing, if not outright elimination of, station ownership limits was a big factor. "Obviously, a lot of this is contingent on regulatory

issues, but we're confident that the rules will change," Crowl says. "This deal is timed for the new rules."

He also notes that Citicasters (or whatever name they'll decide to use for the new combo) has yet to abandon their aggressive acquisition posture. "We'll look at other opportunities where we can establish a good investment for our shareholders," he says. "If it makes sense economically, we'll move in. We have more capacity to grow, with a credit facility that allows us to still be aggressive if we need to be. We'll carefully assess each opportunity that comes along. If it's the right situation, we'll certainly pursue it."

When asked to assess the future playing field for radio groups, he responded, "A few years ago, some experts said there would be anywhere from 10 to 20 major groups left. I think you'll see further consolidation, but I expect 15-20 good radio groups to be around."

While Steve Perun Named Gannett's National PD

Most recently, he was VP/Station Manager. Perun, whose programming credits include stints at WZOU Boston, WBSB Baltimore, WHYI Miami, KBEQ Kansas City and WLS AM/FM Chicago, left his own consulting firm to become PD at KIIS in 1994.

"Roy has done a tremendous job as Station Manager at KIIS," states Gannett Radio President Gerry De Francesco. "Under his leadership, the radio station has demonstrated solid improvement in all areas. We are confident this trend will continue. Steve's performance at KIIS is superb. He has already been working with several of our radio stations. This title acknowledges Steve's contributions to the growth of Gannett radio. We look forward to a successful future together."

Alternative Bandwagon Rolls On

New Rock in Pittsburgh, Richmond, Des Moines

The Alternative radio bandwagon continued to pick up steam as the sound debuted in four more markets in the last two weeks.

Most recently, WXRB Pittsburgh flipped its direction from Country "Rebel" to the Alternative "Revolution 104.7" on Tuesday, August 29. "Pittsburgh was one of the last radio markets not to have a New Rock station," explains VP/GM Joseph Armao. It was an obvious hole that we filled."

With core artists consisting of Stone Temple Pilots, Smashing Pumpkins, Soundgarden, Natalie Merchant, Live and so on, "The Revolution is playing music no one else in town is playing," claims Tommy Nyce. "We're building the most exciting radio station in town."

On Wednesday, August 23, Country WKIK FM Richmond also flipped to Alternative as WBZU "The Buzz." The reason for the flip, according to the station's press release, was to "satisfy the musical wanderlust of the booming 18-34-year-old market...WBZU's tightly focused, New Music-intense approach locks on target with the young adult lifestyle." Program Director J.J. Quest is currently looking for air talent to fill out the staff.

Also on an air talent hunt is J. Michael McCoy, GM of KKDM Des Moines, which signed on as Alternative on the 22nd. Its direction is more of an Alternative Top 40 hybrid. The 100,000-watt KKDM is currently broadcasting jock-less and PD-less, but McCoy has indicated that he intends to have a full staff in place by the time the Fall book starts.

Also on the Alternative front, WRVF Dayton, which flipped from Country the week before, named Mike Stern PD, Sandy Collins APD and Jeff Stevens interim AMD. A station spokesperson says to expect a call letter change in the near future.










DEALING WITH PEOPLE YOU HATE

Commentary by Gerry Cagle



saw a book this week titled "Dealing With People You Can't Stand." I immediately couldn't stand the author.

I didn't read the book, but I could tell by the title that it skirted the issue, par-

ticularly in our business. "Dealing With People You Can't Stand" won't cut it in our industry. It's not strong enough. That's why this Editorial is called "Dealing With People You Hate."

Because of the nature of our business, we have to deal with people we hate every day. More often than not, the ones we hate the most are the ones we have to deal with the most. Maybe that's why we hate them. I don't necessarily mean that we hate the people. It's that we hate to deal with the personalities of the people we encounter. We don't have the time to develop relationships with many of those with whom we must do business. To truly hate someone, it is necessary to get to know them. However, hatred for particular attitudes, personalities or acts doesn't take nearly so long.

So I guess this Editorial should be called "People Whose Attitudes, Personalities Or Acts We Hate." But that would be too ambiguous and if that was the title, I would hate myself.

This Editorial identifies those we hate and gives you some pointers on how you can deal with them more effectively. I've divided the particulars into four broad categories. You might have more or less, but you aren't writing the Editorial. Don't you hate that? For me, these categories work. Hopefully, they will work for you. If not, you can hate me.

"Carson Confrontation." Carson is the guy who approaches each conversation like a war. He doesn't just want to argue his point, he also wants to argue yours. He wants not only to prove he's right, he wants to prove you're wrong...and ignorant to boot. Carson doesn't speak, he screams. Carson believes volume will outweigh his lack of facts. Carson very seldom has facts. He picks a position that fits his mood and runs with it...usually over the person in front of him. Carson throws his arms, stands with his feet apart and moves into the space occupied by the person he's confronting.

How do you get along with Carson? By confronting him. Do not run away from his bluster.

If the facts are in your favor...argue them...loudly. Imitate his body language. Stand your ground. You might not win the battle, but you can win the war. Confrontationists expect to run over people. They developed their personality for a reason. They grudgingly respect someone who fights back. Also, the confrontationist likes to win every argument. If he knows you will argue back, he will choose another target. Just make sure you have your facts totally correct. If you're wrong on one tiny thing, he will harp on it forever.

"Kristi Know-It-All." Kristi has all the answers. You have none. She's sure of it and will make you aware of it early in any discussion. Kristi will interrupt any explanation on your part and say, "I know that won't work." You can

explain all you want, but it does no good. She's quick to point out all of her experience, her education and her intelligence in killing your ideas with a broad stroke, never getting around to specifics. You can't argue with her because she's unwilling to listen. She's the program director who tells you a record won't work on her radio station. Period. If you're foolish enough to ask why, she'll tell you it's because she knows how to program her radio station and you know nothing about it.

How do you crack this nut? By carefully doing your homework. Find out what Kristi wants and provide accurate information that will lead her to her own conclusions. Deal with her by letters and memos. Kristi reads more than the average person. This is one of the reasons she thinks she knows it all. She hates confrontation.

Outline, in writing, how your proposal will lead her to the decision she wants to make. Then she'll believe you're almost as well-read and intelligent as her. This is a double-edged sword, for she might make you a compatriot. Then you'll have to sit through long discussions while she tries to prove how smart she is.

"Annette Agreeable." Annette agrees with almost everything anyone says. Annette doesn't often offer an opinion of her own. Annette hasn't heard a record she doesn't like. Ask her about one of yours and she'll probably answer in the positive. She's quick to let you pay for dinner or trips or anything else. She hugs you when you meet because you're one of her close friends. She's the epitome of the phrase, "It looks good for next week." It's easy for Annette to forget about your record or your request as soon as you've left her because it's a pretty good bet that Annette hasn't listened to a word you said. Annette also has another person to see right after you. It's impossible to pressure Annette into a decision on the spot. You wind up feeling so positive about your proposition that you're astounded when what you've proposed doesn't happen. If you confront her on your confusion, she'll probably just smile and say, "We'll take care of it next time."

Annette is a tough one. Your best bet is to schedule your meeting or call with her as close to her decision time as possible. If you're the last one giving her advice, she's more apt to remember a little of what you said. If you're trying to get a record played, call her often and at the last minute. If you get her just before she does the list, you've got a shot.

"Andy Avoid-And-Deny." Andy is the worst. He's quick to pick up on something you supposedly said or did and hold it against you. For no reason that you know of, Andy will refuse your calls. He will put you off forever and then when you finally get the opportunity to talk, he will deny that anything was ever wrong. He has every excuse for not taking your calls, none of which are the real reason. When you see him, he'll act like one of your closest friends...then not take your calls again for days or weeks at a time.

How do you deal with him? You don't. He has a small group of support people who feel the same way. They would rather talk among themselves and criticize others rather than work productively. Get someone else to pitch your case. It's the only way. And when he finally comes around...suck up.

Then go home and hate yourself. It's part of your job! ■

It Always Comes Down To The Songs

INTERVIEW BY JEFF SILBERMAN

t's a classic plot line for these times. Scott Hendricks, whose absolute belief in the quality of the songs have helped him become of the most successful young producers in Nashville, is offered the chance to head a major label.

You can see the inherent conflict from the upper deck—the creative perspective of the artist/producer versus the commercial demands of the bean counters. They want "product" that's in tune with the tastes of mainstream Country radio...and maximum airplay equals maximum sales. Granted, sometimes the two "sides" coincide, but as a label head, Hendricks is now on both sides.

And if that's not enough, he's had to oversee the consolidation of two companies, Liberty and Patriot, into one, under its original name, Capitol Nashville. Welcome to the business, Scott....

Nevertheless, as this Interview illustrates, Hendricks continues to stand firm on the quality of the song above all else.

It seems that Oklahoma State would be an unlikely site for Tim DuBois, Greg Jennings and yourself to simultaneously start your careers.

Not really, since we were all involved with music. I got a job at a recording studio while I was a student, and every songwriter wannabe who went to school came by to do their songs. My boss told me about a songwriter who used to work in the audio/visual part of the studio. Naturally, I was skeptical, but it turned out to be Tim, and we clicked.

We started writing songs together, then demoed some of them at his house. My brother played bass and I played acoustic guitar. About the same time, I joined a band to help pay my way through college. We played a lot of frat and sorority parties. Through the group I met Greg Jennings. When I heard him play, I decided it would be best for me to stay on this side of the glass. I could practice for the rest of my

life and not be as good as he was then. We asked Greg to play on our demos.

Tim and I made numerous trips to Nashville to peddle our songs, only to get knocked down—but they were encouraging knock-downs. Tim moved to Nashville a year before I did. Greg and I moved moved in a few days after I graduated. We shared a duplex. He worked at Opryland and I was an acoustical consultant at a place that designed and implemented studios.

During your early trips to Nashville, did you learn more about songwriting or the *business* of songwriting?

Obviously, you learn a little bit about both. You learn just a bit about how the business works, and more about the craft itself. All songwriters think their songs are great at the time they write them. Then, when you go back and look at them a few years later, hopefully you'll go, "Boy that was terrible! I really improved a lot!"

When we came to Nashville,



Tim's goal was to be a songwriter and I wanted to make records. That happened, in a way, with Restless Heart. Tim demoed his songs; some of the guys playing on the demos formed Restless Heart.

Were you confident in your producing abilities when you were hired by Glaser Bros. studio?

No. I didn't really even know what producing involved when I moved here. Working as an engineer at Glaser Bros., I stepped out of a four-track studio in Oklahoma into a professionally-equipped 24-track facility. I was on Cloud Nine; going from a Piper Cub to a real jet was quite a leap.

Can you cite a specific point when you became comfortable behind the glass?

I always felt comfortable in an engineering capacity. Producing was different. As an engineer, there are a lot of times when you have an idea of something you'd like to hear on a record, but you're not in a position to say so. As a producer, if you think the guitar lick should be turned up or down, you do it.

When did you feel it was the right time to go independent—and why?

I actually went independent twice. The first time, Nashville was moving towards independent engineers, so the studio decided they didn't need anybody on the staff. After a year on my own, I became Chief Engineer of a studio that was 10 years ahead of its time, Bullet Recording. That lasted about three years.

Right about then, we started Restless Heart. I engineered a session for Jim Ed Norman—some pre-production work on a Gary Morris record. Jim Ed really liked what I did; he told me that if I went independent, he'd take care of me. That's what I did, and Jim Ed introduced me to Barry Beckett.

From that point on, Barry and I spent countless years in the studio together. I owe a lot to Barry for teach-

ing me about certain elements of musicality. I had some of them in me, but he brought them out and I'll be forever grateful to him for that.

Do you look back at your early productions and think you could've done them better?

Not really. My intention on any record is to do the very best you can do at that given moment...and not look back with any regrets. I'm still very proud of my accomplishments with Restless Heart. Of course, I do things differently now: I've learned a lot since then and technology has come a long way. But were I doing those records today, I wouldn't be surprised if they sounded the same.

Do you feel you have developed a "Scott Hendricks sound?"

Some people may think so, but I don't. Each record is unique. Each artist and each song dictates the sound of the record. Case-in-point: Alan Jackson did not sound anything like Restless Heart. The differences were dictated by the artists, the songs they performed and how they performed them.

When you were producing all those #1 singles, did you get more involved in the business side of things?

No. In terms of producing, I stayed 100% on the creative side. In general, I've known all along that the creative goes hand-in-hand with the business. Developing an interest in the business side is necessary to survive creatively. Owning studios taught me a lot about business. Yet to this day, I don't pretend to be a business wizard. That's why I brought Walt Wilson over to Capitol/Nashville. He and the others are much better in that area than I am.

Did you learn from Tim DuBois' experience about the transition from producer to label head?

Yes, Tim is a great example. Besides being one of my very best friends, I've leaned on him heavily at times for advice. I've been very fortunate to have him there and, in some ways, I've patterned my career after his experience.

You turned down three label offers before accepting Capitol's. Why?

A lot of it was timing. Originally, when EMI first approached me, I told them I wasn't interested. I thought, "I had my meeting with them, now onward to the next record." But they pursued me and I started to think that the time might be right for a change. I'd already made hit records; the challenge of coming in and getting this

company going was an important factor in my decision.

Was it difficult, in human terms, to consolidate Liberty and Patriot into Capitol Nashville?

Incredibly so. Coming from being independent to suddenly having the responsibility of a large number of people was huge in itself. Knowing that I had to make changes to get the company where it needs to go—and them putting those changes into effect—was one of the most difficult

long as they're great, we'll sign them. Artists don't have to fall right down the center of the pike. Again, the key is to create quality product.

I almost wish that we could change the category "New Country" radio stations to just "Good Country," stations that would play the music just because it's good, regardless of the artists' age or how long they've been around. If it's good, if it's competitive, play it...because the audience will probably like it.

things I've ever done. I knew that these changes would affect people's lives and I didn't take that lightly. I hope I never will. It's *real* tough. You can ask anybody in the room when that had to happen what that did to me.

Now that the consolidation is done, do you foresee any other staffing moves?

No. Our staff is in great shape right now. I'm so proud of our team. Walt has played a huge part of assembling these people. We're looking forward to getting the wheels turning and to show what we can do. Of course, you're always looking at ways to improve things, but for now, we're set.

What's your take on the Country music scene—is it more, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it," or could the scene use a good kick in the pants?

We're always looking for something new and exciting, not necessarily because the Country audience needs a good kick in the pants, but because that's good business. As long as we find great artists and songs, we'll be fine. It always boils down to a great song and a recording that supports it. It's a simple, but elusive, formula.

Have the trends in Country radio changed the type of acts you look for?

No. I want our label to have a broad and diverse talent base. As

Unfortunately, a lot of "New Country" listeners probably don't even realize where most of today's Country entertainers got their inspiration. They were influenced by Merle Haggard, Buck Owens and so on. Radio listeners don't really get a chance to hear those legends anymore.

Do budgetary concerns affect your creative decisions?

I haven't run into that yet. I'm a pretty frugal person. Things have to make sense to me from a business standpoint, but hopefully the artistic expression will drive the business decision.

Will being a label head change the way you produce—in terms of consciously recording in the most accessible way?

No. This isn't nuclear science; it's really pretty simple. You find a great artist, a great song, put together a plan and go for it. That's it. My focus is to find the right song and record it the way it needs to be recorded. Everything else takes place after that's done. Marketing and promotion are not a factor in how I'm making the record.

Has your new perspective given you

Has your new perspective given you insight into how some songs break and others fall though the cracks?

Yes. Everybody in this business has been left scratching their heads a time

or two, when they have the right kind of bait to make the fish bite—but the fish don't bite.

I've got some of the best teachers in the business on my team now, people who know certain aspects of the business much better than I do. I'm going to let them do what they do best. I didn't hire them to dictate my will; if they don't like something about the production, they tell me. If I have an idea about marketing, they'll obviously entertain my ideas as well.

John Berry got off to a great start

John Berry got off to a great start on his last album. Do you expect him to take more chances the next time out, or basically play to his strengths?

We have yet to determine the direction of his next album, song-wise. I feel he will stretch the boundaries some to satisfy his creative appetite, but I'm sure John will play to his strengths regardless.

Considering the deluge of new talent out now, how can you make your new talent stand out?

I picked up some words of wisdom on that from David Geffen—words I'll never forget. We were talking about the oversaturation of the market. He got up in my face and said, "Listen, it doesn't matter how many people are out there or what they're doing. All that matters is what you do. If you do what you do well enough, you'll be fine."

That says it all to me. I cannot worry about what so-and-so's doing across town. All I need to worry about is making what we do the best it can be. Hopefully, that will be good enough to compete with what they put out across town.

What current projects are you really high on?

We have a great new project from Emilio. He's been the king of Tejano music for the last four or five years, which means he has a huge fan base already. It has been his dream to make a Country record and we've fulfilled that dream. It's a great record.

That's certainly not a sure bet in terms of commercial accessibility...

We're going by talent. Emilio is a proven artist. The challenge is to get Country music people to listen. Once they do, they'll be pleasantly surprised. Our goal is to get Emilio off the ground; we've just put our plans into action. We'll follow it through and see what happens.


FORWARD MOTION

This is the hottest time of the year with the hottest artists pumping out great tracks. It might be tough to find room for unproven tunes when Mariah Carey, Janet Jackson, Paula Abdul, Michael Bolton, Michael Jackson and Hootie & The Blowfish spin off phenomenal hits. Maybe the following info from the industry's best will help out with some borderline calls.

- MoKenStef's debut release, 'He's Mine' (Outburst/ral/Island) is working great for us here," WNVZ MD Sean Sellers says. "Not only does it fit great into the music mix, but it's top-five call-out and top-10 phones." Even though 'NVZ is a Rhythmic station, Alanis Morissette's release, "You Oughta Know" (Maverick/Reprise), is buzzing at the Norfolk outlet.
- KIIS FM is one of Top 40's early believers in Coolio's infectious groover, "Gangsta's Paradise" (MCA Soundtracks). This smash is already smokin' hot at Crossover radio (Top 10 on Network 40's Street chart) and WKBQ MD Kenny Knight tells us, "We tested it once and it's #1 phones! Even stations that don't play Rap can play this song." The movie soundtrack Dangerous Minds took only three weeks to rocket up to #1 on Network 40's sales chart, which equals the sales position of Coolio's single.
- Deep Blue Something's first hit, "Breakfast At Tiffanys" (Rainmaker/Interscope/AG), is exploding everywhere. The cutting edge track continues to pick up new airplay, adding WKSE, WZEE, WXLK, 93Q and more to the long list of stations spinning the track. Cox is also giving thumbs-up to the debut release from newcomer Edwin McCain, called "Solitude" (Lava/Atlantic/

AG). Hootie & The Blowfish's lead vocalist Darius Rucker is featured on the song that females will quickly embrace. It's already spin-

• The Rembrandts follow up to their #1 smash, "I'll Be There For You (Theme From Friends)" (Eastwest/EEG) will prove to be another great track.







The Hutchens

Three For The Road

INTERVIEW BY JEFF SILBERMAN

on't give up your day job!"

It's a refrain every up-and-coming Country artist or band hears in their struggle to make it in the music business. For the North Carolina trio The Hutchens, day jobs have been a reality—even though they signed to Atlantic Records three years ago. But now, with their debut single,

"Knock Knock," just days away, Bill, Barry and Bryan Hutchens have finally given up their day jobs for a shot at the big time.

"Anytime you make a big change in your life, you get a little anxious, nervous and unsure," Barry Hutchens says. "Our goal is to make the smoothest transition possible. Waiting three years [between getting signed and the debut album release] helped us a lot. I don't know what would've happened if we were just thrown out there three months after we signed."

It's been quite a ride for the trio, who started singing and playing Bluegrass music when Bill was nine, Barry was six and Bryan was three. As a trio, they would perform at Bluegrass festivals throughout the Southeast. They actually learned about three-part harmonies around a campfire at one particular Bluegrass festival.

"I sing lead, Bill sings tenor above lead and Bryan sings baritone," Barry explains. "We pretty much stick to the stacking of the harmonies. We were influenced by Ricky Skaggs and Keith Whitley, who at one time played with J.D. Crowe and the New South and the Country Gentlemen. We were encouraged when they made a name for themselves in the Country arena."

What really got their ball rolling was a 1992 trip to Nashville. Ironically, what they were trying to roll was Barry's solo career. "I sent a demo tape of about 12 of my songs to Nashville," Barry recalls. "Neal Fagan at the Bluebird Cafe liked my songs and wanted me to play there. I got Bill and Bryan to go with me. We rehearsed and worked up a show, then booked a whole week at the clubs down there."

It may not have been the Grand Ole Opry, but their debut performance in Nashville was a night to remember. "We've played to much larger audiences, but the psychological thing about playing in Nashville made us nervous," Bill says.

"We've heard stories about 'You never

know who's going to be in the audience,"
Barry continues. "The excitement about being in Nashville, performing in these clubs, was a big rush. The whole week was a blur. Once we got there and everyone was so enthused, it really pumped us up."

During that week, Barry also took his demo tape to different publishers. Acuff-Rose showed interest, which "jump-started the whole thing," he notes. "I then hooked up with managers Frank Leffel and Bobby Yarbrough, who had us do a new demo in Nashville of a couple of my songs."

Now the story *really* gets interesting. Barry brought the new demo back home and took it to a radio friend, Dale Mitchell, in Winston-Salem. Dale took it back to Nashville the next day and brought it to Rick Blackburn at Atlantic. He liked it enough to go to Winston-Salem in October of '92 for a showcase. "Bill and Bryan played with me at the show. When Rick heard the three of us together, he liked us as a trio. We were all fired up about it; that's how it became The Hutchens."

The sheer suddenness of their good fortune was almost unnerving. "Everyone's heard stories of people selling everything they have to move to Nashville, then waiting tables and sleeping on bare mattresses to try and get a break," Bryan says. "And it seems like we just stumbled into this. Obviously, we've played all our lives and worked hard. Even so, to be of-

fered a record deal within six months of our first trip to Nashville blew us away."

If getting a deal happened all too quickly, then the time between signing the contract and getting their debut album released seemed like a lifetime. "The whole thing was a big learning process," Barry says. "When we signed the deal, we thought it would take a few months to cut a record, then hit the road...but it took practically three years. Luckily, Rick led us along stage by stage. He didn't try to present the whole picture all at once."

It became a matter of small, logical steps. It took a few weeks to audition for a producer, which ended up being James Stroud. Then came song selection. "That was another learning process," Bryan says. "It took a few months to live with songs before deciding what went on the album. We played some of them live in Virginia and North Carolina to get an audience feel."

"We had a lot of help choosing songs," Bill adds. "Rick, James Stroud and Al Cooley, who's also with Atlantic, helped us a lot. We had some input, but we tried to follow their advice."

Although the trio played with some of Nashville's finest session players, they still made sure their Bluegrass roots came through. "We always played 'Wait A Minute,' which we learned off a Bluegrass album about 20 years ago, with acoustic Bluegrass instrumentation," Barry says.

"James added drums, steel and electric guitar, and the musicians added their own touch. It ended up sounding contemporary, but there's still a Bluegrass edge in the vocals and instrumentation—the dobro, fiddle and mandolin."

"Knock Knock" was the obvious single from the get-go. "When we played it at shows before we went in the studio, everyone liked it," Barry says. "Bill and I each have a son, and they could sing the chorus of it when they were two. Its familiarity factor catches on. Then, when we played the demo in the studio for the musicians, one said, 'That's your basic hit Country song."

Now, with the single out September 11, three years after a whirlwind "courtship" and a meticulous recording process, The Hutchens feel they're finally ready to get in gear and head on down the road.

"Looking back, it's almost a blessing that it turned out this way," Bill says. "It has given us time to learn about the business. Each step has had a life of its own."

The whole experience hasn't done anything to alter their special relationship with each other. "Each of us brings something special the others don't have," Barry says. "The combination of all of our strengths makes us better. There's no rivalry. We've had music as a common thread for our entire lives. We're best friends as well as brothers, which makes it neat to be involved in something like this."




