

Becomes Sr. Director National Promotion



COMMERCIAL ALTERNATIVE

Commentary by Gerry Cagle



ong, long ago in a land far, far away, I was a program director. Okay, it wasn't that long ago and it wasn't that far away in distance, though an argument could be made that Sacramento is as long ago and far away

as you can get.

The last station I programmed was KWOD. For many reasons, KWOD wasn't competing well in the Mainstream Top 40 arena. Maybe it was because the station had been buried long before I got there; maybe it was because promotional budgetary constraints made the playing field uneven; maybe it was because I did a poor job programming in the face of outstanding competition. (No, that couldn't have been it!) Maybe I was out of my mind. (A strong case could be made for this...after all, I did pose for a *Hitmakers* cover!)

Whatever the reasons, we had to find another way to increase our audience. After much soulsearching and a lot of research, we decided to adjust the format.

Live 105 reached into the outlying areas of the Sacramento metro and was exposing Alternative music to an increasingly loyal audience. On my many trips to Los Angeles, I heard more and more people listening to KROQ. It was hard to ignore KROQ's success since KWOD's owner also owned KROQ-AM, even though it was off the air.

Based on all of these factors and more, KWOD became one of the first Top 40 stations to weave Alternative music into the mix. (Hey, I invented that format!) It was easy to decide that KWOD should take a more Alternative approach. It wasn't nearly so easy to define the parameters that would establish the music inclusions and rotations.

The same is true today...maybe even more so.

If you program a strictly Alternative station, it isn't difficult to determine the music mix. Alternative promotion people keep you aware of what music is available and what is hot. There are many other radio stations with which you can compare your playlist. The main decisions faced by most Alternative programmers are: (A) How Alternative do you want to go, and (B) how deep into the catalogue do you want to delve?

The Alternative format is basically artist dri-

ven. Those programming in this format can define the music without a lot of effort. This is not to say that it is easy to find the Alternative hits, but within the definition of the format, choosing the right music mix is more a matter of selecting the right songs from the Alternative pile rather than making distinctions about what is and what isn't Alternative.

The task facing Mainstream Top 40 programmers is not so easy.

As Alternative music has gained more and more support from the Mainstream, Top 40 stations have reacted. Many have no choice.

Alternative music isn't a fad (at least not today...maybe tomorrow). It is a fact that a large percentage of the Mainstream audience wants to hear a certain percentage of the Alternative pie.

How much and which cuts? Those are the big questions.

An increasing amount of my time, and that of the rest of the staff at *Network 40*, has been taken up with this discussion. Programmers across the country are searching for the right answers...and the right questions. How Alternative should we lean? What Alternative songs will cross all the way into the Mainstream? How many Alternative songs should I include in my music mix? Is this song the right one?

Programming a Mainstream Top 40 station with an Alternative lean is one of the toughest jobs in the business. There is no consensus with which you can compare your station. Each situation is different. Is your market already served by a successful Alternative station? Do market

demographics offer you a broad or restrictive target? Are you the only Mainstream Top 40 game in town? Does an advertising base exist to mirror programming performance? Do you have the expertise?

In the final outcome, it is the music that matters. That is why *Network 40* has debuted the only chart exclusive to Mainstream Top 40 stations that lean Alternative. We call it "Commercial Alternative." Why? Because that's what it is. The CA chart lists the cream of the Alternative music crop. Those songs high on the CA chart have the best chance of advancing and doing well in the Mainstream.

Our data base for this chart is small. We took the most aggressive Alternative stations and those Top 40's with an Alternative lean and made them a part of the mix. Market size wasn't considered, only a station's musical stance and commitment.

If you are a cutting edge Alternative programmer, this chart will serve as a guide to let you know what "smash" Alternative songs you might be missing. If you're an Alternative programmer with a Top 40 lean or presentation, the CA chart will show you the right songs to play. It will give you a great comparison.

If you're a Mainstream Top 40 programmer with an Alternative lean, say "Hallelujah!" Help has arrived. The CA chart will give you a clear picture of Alternative songs with a track record and potential to cross into the Mainstream.

It took *Network 40* a long time to compile the data and produce a Commercial Alternative chart. It was no easy decision. Our industry doesn't need another chart just to satisfy the needs and wants of a trade magazine. And although my experience with KWOD made me sympathetic to the plights of programmers, this was by no means my idea. The CA chart is truly a reflection of the needs of our industry. After just one week, it's already a success. Nothing *Network 40* did before has stimulated such positive response.

Record companies and radio programmers were instrumental in helping to determine the stations included in the data base and with the definition of the chart. Record companies now have a concise chart with which to prove which records are really crossing into the Mainstream. Programmers can compare their selections with those of other stations in similar formats.

My thanks to those of you in both radio and records for helping to make Commercial Alternative a reality.

It's about time.

First they freaked you. Now they're gonna hook you up.

Jerry Moss

Return Of A Record Man

INTERVIEW BY JEFF SILBERMAN

elieve it or not, it has been 33 years since Jerry Moss and Herb Alpert put out Alpert's record, "The Lonely Bull," on their own label, A&M Records. The song became a Top-10 hit and the two spent almost three decades building one of the most influential and successful independent labels in the country.

As the record industry became more corporate and the means of doing business as an independent became more difficult, the two sold their label to PolyGram. However, after three years, that situation became untenable for the two and they left.

After a brief respite, Moss and Alpert have re-entered the business, rejuvenated with a new small label, Almo Sounds. And they've already started to build a foundation with the breaking success of the Alternative band, Garbage. In an exclusive interview, Jerry Moss describes the new label and how the business has changed over the years.

Why did you decide to give up the A&M lot, so to speak?

It just wasn't working for me. It was a general feeling. I wasn't effective and it was just time to move on.

Did you have any specific plans once you sold the label to PolyGram?

No, I really didn't know what I wanted to do. My whole professional life was basically A&M. It took me some time to think about it.

Was there a specific point in time when you decided to get back into the business?

Well, I just decided I missed it. I was out of it for a while. I got sick and needed to have some surgery. While I was recovering, I realized that I missed the music. Did Herb share your feelings during


Herb and I have been partners for more than 33 years. The great thing about our partnership is that it has allowed us to do what we wanted. I would say I'm a little more passionate about this re-entry than he is, but he is my partner and has been totally supportive.

Once you decided to re-enter the business, you must've fielded a lot of offers from the majors. What made you link Almo up with Geffen?

It was, in fact, David [Geffen] saying, "You'd be stupid if you don't come with us." It basically took that one line, then I went in and talked with him and Eddie [Rosenblatt]. These guys are old friends, and they were genuinely interested in what I was going to do. I felt David was absolutely right; I would've been stupid not to go there.

After starting A&M from scratch, did you do anything different this time around with Almo Sounds?

I've always just wanted to be



A lot of things have changed; it all stems from the fact that it's a lot bigger now. The major corporations really have tremendous control, but the way we do business-that hasn't changed a whole lot. As far as trying to sign a band, it's as competitive as ever. You find yourself competing mostly against the same people all the time. What you present to an artist on these occasions has to be convincing and sincere enough for him or her to want to come with you.


changed over the years?

Was it your intent from the outset to build the label with young, new talent?

Yes, I wanted to go with new situations. Basically, I didn't want to have to be judgmental about people I've worked with in the past. I wanted to keep the past where it was and enjoy it, have pride in it and not have to keep dragging it out. This is a new start for me and I thought it best that we start with all new people.

Did you go out to personally scout talent, or have others brought the bands to you?

I was very, very lucky that early on, in September of '93, we were able to attract Howard Thompson to work with us out of New York. He's an absolutely superb A&R person with great experience. He hired Bob Bortnick, who brought us Garbage. Through Bob, I met Paul Kremen, who's now our GM in Los Angeles. So, through Howard, we've been able to form the beginning of a small, but I think a very exciting, staff. In Nashville, for another example, we were able to get Garth Fundis.



Inevitably, you'll be going up against Geffen in the pursuit of the same talent. How will you handle it?

It will be difficult and, quite frankly, if we were after the same band as Geffen, we'd probably have to think twice about proceeding. If Geffen Records was truly interested in the band, it would be very difficult under any circumstances to compete against them. But Eddie has assured me that he would assist us in signing bands if he felt it was in the artist's best interests. In fact, in one situation, he did get on the phone and tried to help.

Considering all you've accomplished, why don't you use your rep to attract unsigned talent?

Sometimes, you feel a bit like a dinosaur. I don't really go through the story of my whole life, unless someone's really interested. I think I come across as someone with experience and an understanding of the business. The fact that I've worked with some pretty substantial and sensational artists in the past gives me a bit of a glow going in, but basically it's, "What can you do for me today?" And, to be honest, I prefer that to standing on some old, boring record.

Have you and your A&R staff had to re-orient your ears to the "hit sound" on the radio in the '90s?

A good song is always going to work, no matter what the hot genre is. I'm always going to look for good songs and a certain energy in the recording. Music has become a little more attitudinal, and I like that. I like where the music business is today; I think we can do very well in this atmosphere.

Did it take long to get into the competitive scene, with the big conglomerates and the new small labels?

It's tough to get rolling in general. I'd say that the process with Garbage, however, has been such a pleasure in the sense that they actually signed with us a couple of days before Christmas last year. We released their record August 15. That's a very short period of time. They had everything ready to roll; they were quite together and very professional.

Most of the time, it takes a bit longer than that. To get a label going, with six to eight releases a year, will take us a couple years. To answer your question, we're not signing that much to begin with. It's not that easy to start up.

It does look like you've got a hit out-of-the-box with Garbage.

It's fun. The album is a great piece of work. It's very deep with some wonderful songs. I'm knocked out to have something this good to work with this early on. How important is it to break Garbage's new single, "Queer," to Mainstream radio?

We think once we can get her on the radio, she can be very successful in a very commercial sense. You can see that we're very diverse...and that's quite exciting.

How will you promote your product to radio?

In our current deal with Geffen, we're allowed the opportunity to work with Bill Bennett and his staff. I've worked with some amazing teams of people in my lifetime, but I don't think think we can succeed with Alternative, Rock, R&B and Country.

Is it important for a smaller label like Almo to develop its own personality?

It's very important. Different labels have always had different personalities. Those images have been blurred, in a sense, by the corporate landscape. However, we're trying to carve out our own individual style. What that is right now, I can't tell you...but we are trying to be different. We have to create that difference in a sensible, yet artistic way.

Speaking of the corporate landscape, what should radio make of the recent high-level executive changes?

Companies are making moves that people don't understand...that are made for corporate reasons. If you look in the press, there are obviously two sides to every story. Yet music is coming out, people are doing their jobs, replacements are filling in and companies are still flourishing.

Radio should realize that, in a certain way, the personalities who ruled the record business in the past are being somewhat quelled. The corporations remain powerful because they've got the acts, the music and the catalogs, so they'll persevere. These moves, in my opinion, aren't going to adversely affect radio.

Are companies like Almo Sounds the last bastion for "personality" labels?

I see it this way: We own our own label, so we can do what we like. That's what I like about it; that's how I always functioned in the music world, except for the three-year period when I was running A&M for the corporation.

Almo has an advantage. I can answer a question in 30 seconds. I've just got a partner to talk to if something requires a major expenditure. That's a definite advantage in today's business.

Besides sales success, do you have other goals for Almo Sounds?

I'd like the company to be a success on the charts. I always believed that one plus one equals nine. I always wanted us to be a success in a lot of other areas, and that involves the community, the environment and the planet we're living on. If we can do things along the way to be helpful in those areas as well, I'll be very happy.

THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD JERRY MOSS A&M Records The "M"

It's very important to the band that "Queer" is as successful as possible. First of all, it helps to form an image, which is very important. Then, of course, we'll go to other tracks on the album, but it's important that the imaging of this band proceeds at the level that we've all decided on. I believe we'll be working "Queer" into the new year and the entire album for the next year-and-a-half because I truly believe it is a very special record.

Almo Sounds

How will aggressive Alternatives that leave "Queer" early for another track affect your plans?

The most important thing is timing; we all have to work together and give the broadcasters what they think they need. If they want to play a different Garbage track, we'll try to help. But in that case, I'll need to go to the experts—Bill Bennett and the band themselves—to see what we do next.

Who else have you lined up?

We've got a project by Tim Wheater, who's a New Age artist. He's a Classical flautist who also played keyboards for the Eurythmics. He has a very interesting record that's in four different movements. It'll be a tremendous marketing challenge, but we think it's an exceptional recording.

After that, early next year, we'll release an album by a great new R&B singer, Sherree Ford-Payne. There has already been a great response to her music. I've worked with anyone better than these Geffen people. What they've done with this Garbage record has been absolutely sensational. As far as radio is concerned, they're our arms and legs.

The "Mo"

They're so enthusiastic about music over there—and I mean all kinds of music. As I've mentioned, we have a diversity of artists on Almo because Herb and I have always been interested in all kinds of music. We have different kinds of artists coming, yet their enthusiasm is so genuine and exhilarating. With that kind of enthusiasm, you want to bring them your records.

Have you adjusted your costs so that your new talent can profit with lessthan-Gold sales, or will you work every record with a goal of breaking every act Gold or Platinum?

Let me put it this way: I'm pleased if the record gets a response from the public. If certain records sell 100,000, I'm not at all disappointed—if that's what the range of the record is and we were successful in exposing the nature of this record to the audience.

But at the same time, I can't help but aim for the seats every time. I like hitting home runs. It's fun and very exciting. The artists like it; everybody likes it. You can strike out once in a while; you can hit doubles once in a while. Triples and singles aren't bad either—as long as you get a good swing at the ball. That's what we're trying to do here. That's why we

REBOUNDING AFTER A BAD BOOK

It's a nightmare to some radio programmers. Living in the Arbitron world can lead to many sleepless nights and massive amounts of stress. For instance, say your station just suffered a bad book. (C'mon, every PD has at least one down book!) The question is: What are you going to do about it? Your owner, GM and sales department want answers. This week's Hotline rings up three successful programmers for their words of wisdom. It's all about turning a negative into a positive...and not over-reacting.

The Players:

JOHN IVEY

PD, WXKS Boston

CHUCK GEIGER

PD, KISF Kansas City

MARK FEATHER

PD, KQKS Denver

You've just received the infamous "down book." Tell us your first course of action... your first step in the recovery process.

IVEY: This is purely speculative (since I've never had a down book). I guess I would take a deep breath and think for a day or two before sitting down with the facts and figures. I'd go back and look at Selector flow for proper music rotations. I'd look over my promotional schedule during the past book...tear apart the station bit by bit and make a list of things that may have been problem areas.

GEIGER: First, I blame it on Arbitron. Second, I wait until I get the hard copy and start looking at diary placement in the marketplace. I look at the In-Tab percentage to find out where the diaries went. The drop may not be our fault.

FEATHER: The first thing you don't do is

knee-jerk react. Analyze why the book went down, via Maximiser from Arbitron or however else you choose. If it's one down book, I'm not sure you do anything. You are dealing with a service that has a ridiculous margin of error and you don't make a million adjustments after one down survey. Give yourself at least two books to see if it's for real.

You decide to re-analyze the music. What musical problems do you correct from the get-go?

IVEY: I'd look at horizontals to make sure the same songs aren't playing the same day all week. I make sure all rotations (including Gold) honestly rotated the way they were intended to and that the station balance was proper. Then I'd look back and make sure research was interpreted correctly. I'd take auditorium tests and weekly callout to see if there are any other ways they can be looked at to get a different result.

GEIGER: Hypothetically, we would look to make sure the music wasn't off track. We'd go through Selector and take off the records that shouldn't be on; we'd look at call-out on currents, Oldies and recurrents. A title-by-title evaluation will see if songs fit our demo, and in which dayparts.

FEATHER: Analyze your position in the market, in regards to other radio stations. Find out if your audience went directly to them. Find out who shares the most cume with you, then find those common records between you and your competitor and look to blur the line between the both of you. Be as "in the center" as you can be for your format in the market. Often, we get caught up in call-out, sales and requests and we forget to see how we stack up in the marketplace.

How 'bout marketing...what strategies can be used so you come back strong?

IVEY: It depends on the problem. If it's a minor adjustment like bad promotions or the morning show being off, marketing adjustments aren't needed. If the Arbitrons show three or four down months and vast changes are needed, then re-marketing the station may be important. Before you can make a decision, you have to give yourself enough time in the Arbitron world.

GEIGER: Lots of prayer. Seriously, if cume is down, I'd look for cume-building promotions such as a bumper sticker campaign. If TSL is down, we may need to create TSL cash contests or trips around the world.

FEATHER: Again, find out why you went down. If your cume is wobbling, maybe it's

time to do some TV or outdoor to stabilize the phantom cume that shifts in and out. Bring some new bodies in the mix. If you have a TSL problem, it may not be a marketing thing. Maybe it's time for a reexamination of your product to make sure jocks are focused on the target audience. Make sure your music flow is correct and indicative of your radio station every 20 minutes. The marketing strategies depend on your problem.

What do you do about rebuilding staff morale?

IVEY: Some staff members are into numbers. Others have been around a while and have seen up and down books. If the staff is really bummed out, get them together and talk about it. Explain to them what you think could have happened, what you can do to change it and how they can help. Ask them if they've noticed anything lately. Have they received anything on the phones? Walk around the halls; talk to your entire staff. It's interesting what the receptionist or the office staff will say because they listen more like a listener, more casually.

GEIGER: We're in market #27. It's Arbitron and we live with it all year long. If

diaries go to your listeners, you do well. If they don't, the other stations do well. Nobody gets fired over one bad book. You should, however, explain the Arbitron methodology to your staff after every book.

FEATHER: The most important thing you can do for your staff is be 100 percent honest and up front about everything. The last thing they want is a snow job.

How honest are you with your staff in regards to actual daypart numbers?

IVEY: I'm honest but I don't think it's productive to give them copies to dwell on. Around here, everyone wants to know what's going on. A lot of times they have a feeling on how the trend is going to go anyway. My staff is really in touch with their audience.

GEIGER: I'll let them know, but it's not their fault. Unless you're Howard Stern or Rick Dees, people don't write names down in diaries. Specific dayparts are up and down due to the fact that listening changes from book to book, daypart to daypart. If they are up, we say, "Good job." If they're down, no big deal...with the exception of mornings.

FEATHER: If you've had a down book and you avoid folks in the hallway, what kind of message does that send? Conversely, you should tackle it head on and explain, "Here's what happened and here's why, according to Arbitron. Now here is how we are going to address these issues."

All in all, is this the perfect time to reevaluate management goals and priorities, as well as programming focus?

IVEY: If there are actual problems and we're off target, it's probably time to order up a perceptual. We need to see exactly where we stand to make the proper adjustments. Sometimes the down book is just a wobble. In that case, you just have to stick through

it, admit your mistakes and correct them on your own. That's part of being a good manager. You have to know when it's a minor or major problem. You need to have foresight.

GEIGER: Definitely. For example, I'm expecting our summer book to be down, so I'm already planning for fall and spring. Our revenue is up, but we are looking to do more marketing to help bring back our Arbitron numbers.

FEATHER: I think so. I don't think it's a bad thing to do after every book, up or down. Re-examine your position in the market, your realistic goals and station focus. A down book can sometimes be the motivation to spend money and fix the situation, especially in this day and age of budget cuts, duopolies and triopolies. With an entire plan of action you can say, "Boss, here's why we're down, here's what we need to correct it and here's how much it'll cost." Quite often, the down book will provide the stimulus to make this a possibility.

GEORGE STONE

WARNER BROS. PROMOTION MARKETING MANAGER PHILADELPHIA

"The human door stop" is what his friends call George Stone at Warner Bros. Records. He earned this nickname a few years ago when friends claimed he couldn't close a door, much less close out an add. But that's not what they're saying now. After 20 years in promotion, George Stone's name is highly regarded in the industry as one of the most respected, hardest working promotion managers in the business. Here's how he does it:

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

The music. I worked the WEA warehouse and watched as all the new music came out. It was really interesting to hear those singles on the radio months later. I was then hired as a promotion assistant and here I am.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

Top 40, Alternative, AAA, A/C and Rock. I not only work the Philadelphia area, I work Baltimore and Washington.

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

I try to bring as much artention to a release as possible. Focus, determination and enthusiasm are obviously very important. I bring the right music to the right radio station. I want to get the records on the air, whether it's in a test rotation or a specialty program to get audience reaction, to pass on to the next radio station.

What is the wildest promotion you've ever done for airplay?

I was doing a promotion for Stephen Bishop and I dressed up like Dustin Hoffman in the movie *Tootsie* and toured my radio stations. The best part was that I fooled my own receptionist! It was great...except my feet were killing me at the end of the day.

What is the best excuse for a drop or not adding a record you've ever heard?

"I thought you guys were off that record."

How do you deal with rejection...in terms of not getting your records added?

I try not to take it personally, but it's very difficult. Even though I've been in this business for 20 years, there are times when it's really hard to understand why a station won't give a great song a chance.

How easy is it to promote records you don't especially like or ones that you think are hits?

It's not my job to decide what is a hit and what's not. I know my radio stations and what they need and I bring them what will work on that station.

What do you like best about your job?

To watch a brand new artist develop from ground zero to *somewhere* is the greatest thrill in the world. Equally rewarding is watching an already established artist reach the next plateau. It's what I love the most. Warner Bros. has an unbelievable roster and is an unbelievable company.



GREG PHIFER

COLUMBIA LOCAL PROMOTION MANAGER LOS ANGELES

It's hard to find anyone in the Los Angeles record business who doesn't smile at the sound of Greg Phifer's name. A personal friend of Network 40, Greg tried to answer some of these questions seriously. It only half-worked. Actually, we all know the truth; he only agreed to this interview for brownie points from Gerry Cagle. Well, Greg, it worked.

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

Back in 1975, I was an inventory specialist for CBS Records (counting records on my knees). I had an opportunity to continue counting records standing up (sales) or hang out backstage with Aerosmith, completely wasted, with a beautiful woman. I chose record promotion.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

Los Angeles is a veritable hotbed of new artist-breaking stations such as KIIS-FM, KOST and KBIG. It's really a promotion person's dream come true. By the way, I have this bridge for sale....

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

I used to. I combine local sales, surrounding airplay, upcoming artist appearances and promotions and similar demo research along with a successful artist track record at that station. I appeal to the PD's sense of logic and eventually get airplay. If that doesn't work, I just beg their consultant and hold my breath. I look good in blue.

What is the wildest promotion you've ever done for airplay?

Over the years, I've done all the old standards of camping out overnight at a station to dressing up in stupid outfits to bringing around boxing kangaroos. But the ultimate one has to go to starving myself for seven days (my blood pressure rose to stroke levels) to get Terence Trent D'Arby on KIIS-FM. I got the add.

What is the best excuse for a drop or not adding a record you've ever heard?

The best excuse for a drop is when I heard the PD's secretary started disliking it. The best excuse for not adding a record was when I slept with a PD's wife. They were separated and had already filed, so give me a break.

How do you deal with rejection...in terms of not getting your records added?

If I know, in my heart of hearts, I have a song that would work at a particular station, the rejection just kills me...especially if it's because their prior airplay call-out research says no or their consultant who lives 3,000 miles away doesn't like it.

How do you deal with direct-format competition as far as exclusive releases?

I'm a pretty fair straight-shooter and do not give exclusives to anyone on superstar product. My stations know it, too. Whenever there's a leak from elsewhere, I always wind up being the plumber, which is probably the biggest headache of being a local.

What's the best way to get into a station that has a PD change?

I find out who the new PD is and I'm at the airport when his/her plane lands.

What do you like best about your job?

I love being involved firsthand with artists that really inspire you. This would personally include Pink Floyd, Springsteen, Midnight Oil and the Stones. Also, I really enjoy breaking new acts and hearing them on the radio for the first time. To this day, it's still a thrill.

Few artists can claim the worldwide superstar status of Simply Red. Over the course of nine years and only four albums, the band has sold 25 million records, charted dozens of hit singles—including the U.S. #1's "Holding Back The Years" and "If You Don't Know Me By Now"—and packed arenas in both hemispheres.



Some of the early believers include WHHY PD Jimmy Steele, who calls it a terrific song. Other programmers nationwide are comparing this to Cochrane's breakthrough, "Life Is A Highway."

- The Presidents Of The United States Of America's cutting edge hit, "Lump" (Popllama/Columbia/CRG), continues to gain momentum and develop into a Top 40 mainstay. WBSS PD Jay Towers is one of the more recent believers, citing its great call-out in Atlantic City; WAPE also checks in with Top 10 phones. Network 40's new Commercial Alternative chart places "Lump" inside the Top 3 and gaining strength as it crosses into the Mainstream.
- Many Southwestern stations are experiencing huge success with Sarah McLachlan's latest release, "I Will Remember You" (Arista). Watch this song take off nationwide as McLachlan spreads her magic again. The Corrs' debut track, "Runaway," (143/Lava/Atlantic/AG) is working everywhere it's being played. Moving into the Top 40 ring after building a solid A/C base by collecting over 800 Plays Per Week on Network

40's A/C chart, this smooth melodic masterpiece is for real. KCDD PD Trace Michaels is one of many who claims early positive response on this track.

- Spin Jon B's "Pretty Girl" (Yab Yum/550 Music) and it will pay dividends. Following up his debut song, "Someone To Love," most programmers agree this release is even stronger. After rocketing into the Top 10 on Network 40's Crossover chart, this emotional epic is working very well with the female demos.
- TRIBUTES: A couple of tribute albums have Top 40 radio buzzing. The *Tapestry Revisited* album of Carole King remakes contains fantastic renditions from Amy Grant, Celine Dion, Rod Stewart, Blessid Union Of Souls and many more.
- Working Class Hero is a tribute to John Lennon featuring superb remakes by the Red Hot Chili Peppers, Blues Traveler, Toad The Wet Sprocket and more superstars performing the Beatle's solo hits.
- Jon Secada is gearing up to perform for Pope John Paul II in Central Park this week. Right before the Great Lawn Mass is celebrated by the Pope on October 7th, Secada will preview two new songs from his forthcoming album AMOR.
- STILL HOT: Deep Blue Something continues to build

momentum months after "Breakfast At Tiffanys" (Interscope/AG) was released. Check out these stats: new spins on KYSR, WTMX, KHMX, WKEE and more. The album is #1 on the SoundScan Alternative New Artist Chart, in the Top 40 on the current Alternative album chart and rotating on MTV, VH1 and The BOX.

• Network 40's CD Sampler contains all of the hottest upcoming hits, including a tune that is laying a tremendous foundation at A/C radio. The Blenders' remake of "Jive Talkin'" (Orange Grove

Records) by the Bee Gees is poised to take off on the Mainstream circuit. Also, check out the soon-to-be-released track, "Let It Fall," as the song works at several formats.

- THE LOAF: Kudos to Meat Loaf and his latest song, "I'd Lie For You (And That's The Truth)" (MCA), which collected over 125 out-of-the-box adds. The Loaf stopped by the posh Network 40 offices and previewed his action-packed video that's already rotating on MTV, VH1 and The BOX. For more video info, check out the Plugged In page in this issue.
- THIS JUST IN: Props to Booker Madison, who couldn't be our homedawg if he was laying in Kahuna's cut.

COMMERCIAL ALTERNATIVE: Not unlike "military intelligence," Commercial Alternative (or as it will be known, CA) is an oxymoron. How can something allegedly Alternative to the Mainstream be commercial? When the Alternative is the Mainstream, and that's what this new section is about.

JUST THE FACTS, MAN...At the beginning of this year, there were 40-something commercial stations that called themselves Alternative. By the end of August, there were over 100. In Pittsburgh, two Alternative stations cropped up within 72 hours. Can you say, "bandwagon?"

WHAT NOW? Okay, Alternative is the format flavor of the month. Where do we go from here? This section has been created not just to report on what's happening with Alternative music, but what Alternative stations can do to survive and prosper when something else becomes the hot format. Face it, AORs are already copping a healthy chunk of your popular Alternative records. What you do between the tunes will play a significant part in your future success. Expect to find the influential programmers discuss production, air talent, promotions and other keys that make Alternative stations unique.

BUT FIRST AND FOREMOST...of course, is the music. The purpose of this section is to create a bridge between the two formats. This new chart and the input from the most influential PDs and MDs in the format will shed light on the strongest tunes ready to make the jump from cutting edge Alternative to the Top 40 Mainstream. Our reporter base is a core group of radio stations—Top 40s that lean Alternative and Alternatives that are programmed aggressively like Top 40s. The CA chart represents a true hybrid of Alternative and Top 40 to create a clear perspective of music that has proven itself in one niche and is about to spread its popularity into the mainstream.

NOT SET IN STONE: One thing that will constantly change is our list of reporter stations. As other Top 40 stations play more Alternative music, or Alternative stations become so popular in their market that they indeed are the "hit music" stations in town, they will be brought into the fold. That will keep the chart and the CA section as a whole viable, on the move and always ahead of the pack.




Don't be surprised by O.J.'s inclusion on that list. He got a very high percentage of the convict vote.










