The Summer Arbitrons: The Early Returns Crossover Radio Burns Up The Coasts, Chicago

They may not be the format flavor of the month, but Crossover stations in New York, Los Angeles, Chicago and San Diego clearly enjoyed the summer Arbitrons the most. For the first time ever, Hot 97 won the New York 12+ battle, while B96 Chicago and Z90 San Diego enjoyed substantial ratings bumps.

Hot's success has been positively jaw-dropping, as its last three quarterlies went 5.4, 6.1 and, most recently, 6.6. It replaces sister station WRKS, which fell 6.7-6.1. Also in New York, Z100 fell 4.6-4.2 and WPLJ inched up 3.6-3.7. Hot was also #1 in 18-34 with a massive 12 share, while Kiss held onto the 25-54 crown with an 8. In mornings, Howard Stern led the way again with a 7.0. Hot 97's Dr. Dre and Ed Lover tied for third at 5.5.

In Los Angeles, Power 106 held strong atop the 12+ mountain, going 5.2-5.3 and maintaining a half-share lead over Spanish KLVE. KROQ grabbed third by inching up 4.4-4.5, while KIIS dropped to fourth (4.5-4.2) and KKBT held steady at 4.2. KROQ saw its market-leading 18-34 audience increase to 7.9, although Power was right there with a 7.8. In mornings, Howard Stern reclaimed the top spot for KLSX, soaring 4.6-5.4. Despite enjoying the largest cume, KHS' Rick Dees dipped 4.9-4.1, good for fourth. KKBT's "House Party" grew 3.6-4.0, Power's Tha Baka Boyz fell 4.4-4.0 and KROQ's Kevin & Bean stumbled 4.0-3.9.

In San Diego, Z90 had a scorching summer, burning 5.1-6.8, good for second place to A/C KYXY. It also aced the 18-34s with a 10.3. However, Mainstream Top 40 Q106 has plenty of reasons to cheer, including a 4.7-5.6 bump (good for fourth overall), a second-place finish in 18-34s with an 8.0 and a third in 25-54s with a 6.3. In the Alternative turf war, 91X fell 4.1-3.6 while XHRM rose 2.5-3.2.

Elsewhere, Urban WGCI held onto the top spot 12+ in Chicago, but B96 enjoyed a hefty 3.9-4.5 increase, good for third place. Alternative Q101 fell 3.8-3.4. In Riverside, KGGI fell 6,4-5.8, KIIS rose 3.2-3.6 and KROQ dipped 3.1-2.9. In Nassau-Suffolk, Z100 inched up 5.1-5.2, Hot 97 rose 3.8-4.3 and WPLJ fell 4.4-3.4.

Tiffany Eason Named Network 40's A/C Editor Promotion Part of A/C, Alternative Dept. Reorganization

To continue and enhance its close, extensive commitments to both the Hot A/C and Commercial Alternative radio formats, *Network* 40 VP/GM Gerry Cagle announced the promotion of Tiffany Eason to A/C Editor.

Eason came to the publication as Associate Editor after working at KROQ. "*Network 40* remains firmly committed to the growth and devel-

opment of the Hot A/C radio community," Cagle states. "Tiffany is the perfect choice to serve as A/C Editor and underscore our commitment to serving the format. She's energetic, forward thinking and willing and able to be the conduit for networking between the format's leading programmers."

"I'm thrilled and honored to be offered this position," Eason says. "The Hot A/C format is comprised of some of the savviest and most successful programmers in the country. It will be a great challenge and opportunity to network with them and help everyone in this format fulfill their goals."

The move frees up Managing Editor Kristen Guarino to concentrate on the Commercial Alternative section of the magazine.

Priority Decides To Walk Tha Dogg Pound Will Distribute Interscope's Controversial Rap Release

Interscope/Death Row Records catching fla has agreed to let Priority Records linterscope distribute the upcoming album from uct. When Tha Dogg Pound, entitled *Dogg* Chairman

Food. The controversial Rap release was the lightning rod that led to the breakup of the Warner Music Group/Interscope relationship.

The deal covers just the one album, which is set for release on October 31. The first single, "Respect," was shipped to radio Oct. 10. A second single is reported to be ready to go as well: "Let's Play House," which features a video with singer Michel'le.

The debut album from rappers Ricardo (Karupt) Brown and Delmar (Daz) Arnaud has been on hold since August, when Time Warner started catching flack for its relationship with Interscope and its hardcore Rap product. When Warner Music Group Chairman Michael Fuchs realized that he couldn't exert lyrical content control over Interscope product, he released the label from its distribution deal.

Priority is well versed in selling and distributing Rap product, having broken albums by Ice Cube, Mack 10 and the *Friday* soundtrack. Ironically, they also put out the N.W.A album., which basically launched the Gangsta Rap phenomenon almost 10 years ago.

The *Dogg Food* album is widely expected to hit the top of the charts in its first week of release. The duo have already made appearances on multi-Platinum albums by Snoop Doggy Dogg's

Doggystyle, Dr. Dre's *The Chronic* and the *Above The Rim* soundtrack. Even so, Death Row is not solely relying on their controversial rep to alert consumers to the release. They will market the album using a series of 30-second TV spots they filmed last July.

Meanwhile, Interscope will no doubt be courting offers to distribute the label's entire product line that currently includes Bush, Nine Inch Nails, Primus, 2 Pac, Dr. Dre and Snoop Doggy Dogg, among others. Although Warner Music Group has agreed to distribute the less controversial Interscope releases for the next six months, industry pundits expect Ted Fields and Jimmy Iovine's successful label to find a new distributor before then.

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Sony Launches Two Labels With Brendan O'Brien Pearl Jam/Stone Temple Pilots Producer Inks Novel Deal

Sony Music and Alternative superstar producer Brendan O'Brien have joined in a unique label and production agreement. O'Brien, the producer for acts such as Pearl Jam, Stone Temple Pilots and Neil Young, plans to debut two record labels, 57 Records and Shotput Records, through Sony Music. He will be in charge of A&R, production and recording activities for both labels, and will produce new and developing artists exclusively for Sony Music and his two labels.



"Brendan is one of those rare combinations of musicianship, artistic integrity and commercial instinct," comments Columbia Records Group Chairman Don Ienner. "Every project he becomes involved with benefits from his extraordinary gifts. He truly takes talented artists to another creative level, and we're greatly looking forward to a long, rewarding partnership at Columbia and WORK."

"All of us are very excited about having Brendan work closely with our artists and labels," states Epic Records President Richard Griffiths. "He's always been a great producer, and is now extending his abilities to signing artists and working with them at every level."

57 Records will reflect O'Brien's musical tastes while being artist-oriented and music-driven. The label will be distributed by Sony Music and its releases marketed and promoted through Sony Music's Epic Records Group and Columbia Records Group labels. Its first release will be the Atlanta-based band 3 lb. thrill, whose album, *Vulture*, will hit the streets Oct. 17. The record will be marketed and promoted through 550 Music. "We're happy to have the debut release of 57 Records on 550 Music," declares Sony 550 Music President Polly Anthony. "Our entire staff is excited about working with Brendan to introduce 3 lb. thrill."

Shotput Records will sign and record regional Southeast artists and grassroots artists as well as release reissues deserving greater recognition. It will be distributed primarily through the independent RED. Glenn Phillips,



and original member of The Hampton Grease Band, and The Sight-seers are Shotput's first signings.



WALLS AND BRIDGES

Commentary by Gerry Cagle



t was 20 years ago today... Sgt. Pepper taught the band to play...

More like 25, I guess, but time flies when you're having fun.

In the space of a few short weeks, Sgt. Pepper's

Lonely Heart's Club Band, or as some know them, The Beatles, will have a revival. Not that their music ever died. The remaining Beatles are releasing a new album on Capitol next month in conjunction with a television special. The anticipation has already begun and will build to a fever pitch by showtime.

Who would have thought it when they were first signed? A four-piece band playing pubs in Liverpool would become the greatest musical event ever. Nearly 30 years after their first release, The Beatles still rock. Several of their albums go Gold every year. Their catalogue accounts for a huge percentage of Capitol's yearly sales. All of this from a group that stopped recording together in 1969.

Together, John Lennon and Paul McCartney formed the most prolific songwriting team in the history of music. Not only did they write hits, but their songs changed the face of music. The same guys who wrote "I Want To Hold Your Hand" also wrote "A Day In The Life." They wrote "I Saw Her Standing There" and "Eleanor Rigby." Go figure.

Their recording techniques were way past the cutting edge. They introduced feedback, overdubbing, backward masking and a ton of other recording innovations long before anyone else ever thought about them. Today, studios routinely use 48-track machines. The Beatles did all their creating on four.

Amazing.

I first heard The Beatles when I was in junior high school. When I saw them on *The Ed Sullivan Show*, I was done. I bought a guitar, grew my hair long and was first accused of being, what they called in the South, a juvenile delinquent. My father called me a reprobate. I didn't know what it meant, but it sounded cool.

I got to meet my favorite Beatle (everyone had a favorite) some years later. I was, coincidently, in New York at a *Billboard* convention. It was about midnight and I was in bed in my room when the phone rang. Al Coury, then VP Promotion for Capitol Records, was on the line, inviting me to the lobby for a drink. I was programming KHJ Los Angeles at the time and I figured Al was all revved up to hammer me on the latest Anne Murray cover. I quickly refused, citing exhaustion as a lame excuse.

Al said, "Aw, that's too bad, Gerry. I was going to take you over to the Record Plant and introduce you to John Lennon."

I was in the lobby in three minutes.

John Lennon, my favorite Beatle (did 1 already say that?), was deep, deep undercover at the time. He was dodging extradition from the U.S. and had been hiding out in New York City. Few had seen him in the previous years.

Standing in the lobby, waiting for a cab, I was as nervous as a schoolboy on his first date. My breath was shallow, my heart was pounding in my chest, my face was flushed and I was using all my energy to pretend I didn't really care. Those emotions were minor compared to what was coming.

Al introduced me to an agitated John Lennon in the studio where they were mixing the *Walls Aud Bridges* album. Lennon shook my hand quickly and told me to have a seat on the couch. Al stepped outside and I sat there in a coma, listening to John argue with the engineer about how the sax should be mixed. He wanted it high, the engineer wanted it low. I was in heaven.

Suddenly, Lennon swung around toward me and said, "What do you think, Gerry?"

I almost wet my pants. "Loud," I managed. Like I was going to disagree with John Lennon.

He clapped his hands and shouted. "Fine, we'll let you mix it."

It was the start of a long friendship.

Several months later, Paul Drew and I were discussing who would fill in for the KHJ morning man while he was on vacation. Drew suggested asking recording stars to host. This was long before acts appeared on Top 40 stations. It had never been done before.

I called record companies and managers for days. No luck. Nobody wanted to do it.

So I called John...not to ask him. Certainly John Lennon wouldn't want to be a deejay, but to get his advice.

He said, "I'd love to do it."

We spread the word that John Lennon (who hadn't done a public appearance in years) would be on the station and everyone who had said no originally quickly changed their minds. I had to give the morning man an extra week off to accommodate all of them. The tapes of John's show are unbelievable. His appearance made national news. Coury never forgave me for wearing a Warner Bros. jacket when NBC televised it.

The unique thing about this was that John didn't do it for publicity or for a hidden agenda. He did it to help a friend.

Before going on the air, he wrote me a letter listing his favorite records of all time, asking if he could play some of them. (Like I'm going to disagree with John Lennon!) I still have the letter. Some people say it's worth a lot of money. To me, it's priceless.

I spent a lot of time with John after that. I was in the booth when he did his famous *Monday Night Football* interview with Howard Cosell, was thrown out of the Troubadour with him when he put a Kotex on his head, listened for hours as he worked with Phil Spector on the *Shaved Fish* album and was there the night "someone" went berserk and shot up the A&M studio. I drove him home after the incident.

It was the last time I saw him.

There are other stories to tell, but we've got time for that later.

This week, Hollywood Records released a tribute album of John Lennon songs entitled *Working Class Hero.* It's featured on our cover. There's also an interview with Lindy Goetz, the executive producer.

The album, and the season, have made me more than a little nostalgic. Maybe it's the full moon. Maybe it's the *Billboard* convention. I haven't been to one since I met John Lennon.

A PET PROJECT

ALL-STAR JOHN LENNON TRIBUTE RAISES FUNDS TO COMBAT DOG/CAT OVERPOPULATION



John Lennon at age 10

It's not as if Lindy Goetz had a lot of time on his hands at the beginning of 1995. After all, both of the bands he manages, the Red Hot Chili Peppers and Candlebox, were in the process of recording followups to multi-Platinum records.

Then his wife, Cristin Allen Goetz, alerted him to the magnitude of the companion animal overpopulation crises. "They say on the low end, 10 million cats and dogs are put to sleep each year," he explains. "There are so many of them out there, and many people either don't have the money to spay their pets or, like myself, weren't aware of the enormity of the problem. It's truly an epidemic. We really wanted to do something to educate people to the situation and to raise funds to combat the problem."

That inspired Goetz's drive to conceive of and produce a tribute album to raise those funds. The theme: a multi-artist compilation of their versions of classic music composed by the late John Lennon. The album, *Working Class Hero* on Hollywood Records, was released on October 10, one day after what would've been his 55th birthday.

With a talent lineup that runs the gamut from the Chili Peppers and Sponge to Blues Traveler, Collective Soul, Candlebox, George Clinton and Mary Chapin Carpenter, you'd expect a lot of labels to be interested. But Goetz didn't really do much label shopping. "[Hollywood Records President] Bob Pfeifer is a good friend of mine, so when I brought the idea to him and he loved it, that's where it went."

Once that was finalized, Goetz "got on the phone and started calling people," he says. "It wasn't a tough sell to those who were interested in the cause—trying to help stop the suffering of animals being put down—and obviously, their

love of Lennon. "A lot of groups

wanted to do it, but were unavailable because of touring, recording or other prior commitments," he continues. "Even so, we got a lot of great bands committing to the project."

After confirming the talent lineup, Goetz faced the potentially dicey situation of which artist does what

song. "We left it up to the bands and asked them to pick their three favorite Lennon songs," he says. "We matched the songs to the artists on a first-come, first-serve basis; that was the easiest and most diplomatic way to do it. Interestingly enough, there really wasn't much of an overlap where more than one band wanted to do the same song, so it worked out fairly well."

As Executive Producer, Goetz decided to take a hands-off philosophy in terms of overseeing the respective (continued on page 14)


recording sessions. "I just basically told them to go at it, so they'd have total freedom to interpret the songs as they felt best. I tried to explain

to everyone, 'Don't go in and try to duplicate the original. It's your interpretation, do it according to how you feel.' No one was looking over anyone's shoulder."

Of course, the evolution from choosing the bands and their respective songs and getting them all out of the studio wasn't as easy as it seems. "It did take a while," Goetz admits. "This was a new thing for me to do. Once I got everyone's commitment, it took a good seven months between getting the first artist into the studio and us getting last track. In that time, the artists had to work the recording sessions around their other deadlines, such as tours, videos and other things."



Once they got the album in the can, the ball was handed off to the Hollywood Promotion department, headed up by John Fagot. "John's taking this to radio to see what consensus they come back to him with," Goetz says. "There's just so much to choose from. Fortunately, there are

a lot of different ways we can go. You have Cheap Trick's 'Cold Turkey' for an AOR audience, while Alternative radio can choose between the Peppers, Screaming Trees, The Magnificent Bastards [Stone Temple Pilot singer Scott Weiland's side project] and The Minus 5 [REM's Peter Buck, Sonic Youth's Lee Reynoldo and others]. All these groups' songs cross into AOR and many of them cross into Top 40 as well."

Ideal Top 40 songs out-of-the-box include Blues Traveler's "Imagine" and Mary Chapin Carpenter's sensitive rendition of "Grow Old With Me." "We're already getting a lot of response to Mary's song at AAA and Top 40,"



Goetz says. "She did an absolutely beautiful job; she could go right across the board. For the others, it's still too early to tell. Soon we'll key into the songs that are making the biggest impression in the respective formats."

Label politics might play a role in single selection as well, as Blues Traveler, Candlebox, The Flaming Lips and Toad The Wet Sprocket are among those who already have new music on the radio. "It's difficult because a lot of these acts have new singles out," he notes. "Once we find out just what radio likes, then we'll go back to their labels. Obviously, it'd be great for the Screaming Trees because they have no new product out...the same could be said for The Magnificent Bastards, too. But when it comes down to it, I'll leave that choice up to John, who knows more about radio than anyone."


Although both of his bands also have new singles out, Goetz wouldn't mind

if their contributions on the Lennon album are worked as well. "I don't think [having two tracks being worked to radio simultaneously] conflicts at all. A lot of stations have been going three or four cuts deep on the Chili Peppers' new album already. Obviously, radio is largely keyed into the single, 'My Friend,' yet a lot of stations could have room to play 'I Found Out.' The more people hear the Chili Peppers on the radio, the more credibility the band gets, so I don't think it hurts at all."

For obvious reasons, Goetz refrains from picking a favorite song. "It'd be unfair to answer that question," he states. "I think they're all great; how can you go wrong with that material? I don't want to play favorites.

Collective Soul's take on 'Jealous Guy' is awesome. Cheap Trick ripped a new hole in 'Cold Turkey.' The Chili Peppers did 'I Found Out' live, in one take, with no overdubs. If one thing surprised me, I'd say The Minus 5's 'Power To The People,' which came off sounding like The Who. Their rendition surprised me because they took it someplace wild."

which cost about \$25,000 each. Again, our goal is to educate people and make them aware that their animals need to be spayed and neutered. Tons of dogs and cats are being put down because of overpopulation. This means a lot to my wife and I. Hopefully, this project will help build that awareness.

"I had great time doing this," Goetz concludes. "In a sense, I wish I could start over today because I learned so much in putting this album together. If I ever did something like this again, it would be a lot simpler. I know what it takes to get rights and clearances for everything. Even though it was quite time-consuming, the artists were more than willing to help, which made it very satisfying." &

A New Dream Team Gets To Work

Mo, Lenny And Michael Are Back In Business

As expected, former Warner Bros. Records chieftains Mo Ostin, Lenny Waronker and Michael Ostin have signed long-term deals to lead DreamWorks Records. Although terms of the agreements were not specified, they were reported to have made the trio partners in DreamWorks/SKG Music and shareholders in DreamWorks, the multifaceted media company founded by Steven Spielberg, Jeffrey Katzenberg and David Geffen.

The elder Ostin and Waronker are widely credited with building Warner Bros. Records into one of the most prestigious and popular record companies in the world. By emphasizing artist development over hit singles and encouraging an incredible in-house camaraderie, they and Ostin's son, Michael, created an aura where WB not only became known as an "artist's label," but one where those in the business side wanted to work.

However, a power struggle at the parent Warner Music Group led to the resignation of several high-level WEA executives, including Bob Krasnow and, in July of '94, Mo Ostin. After originally accepting a promotion at the label, Waronker reconsidered and left the company late last year. Michael Ostin just recently left Warner Bros. as an A&R exec.

Since then, their next move has been topic A in almost every industry discussion. While Sony, PolyGram and, reportedly, even Time Warner made offers to Ostin and Waronker to start their own label with them, the clear favorite from day one was DreamWorks, as it's partially run by David Geffen, a long-time close friend and associate.

What took them so long to consummate the deal? "We were actually under restrictions because we had a covenant not to compete," states Mo Ostin. "We couldn't get into any negotiations until that expired, and that ran through August. We've had the ability to observe and discuss things with different companies over the last four to six months, but we never got into any serious discussions until we were free to do so. It's really been over the last couple of months or so that we've really focused on (a) our choice and (b) the kind of arrangement we wanted to make, contractually." Under the new agreement, Geffen Records will supply the promotion, marketing, sales and back office muscle, since it signed a distribution deal with DreamWorks last June. "They will do so until we get ourselves staffed," Mo Ostin says. "Even then, we'll always have the availability of their services, because this is a partnership venture and part of what they're contributing to the partnership is services from Geffen Records."

"Having a relationship with Geffen was one of the things that was very attractive to us," adds Lenny Waronker. "There are people there who used to work at Warner Bros. and are old friends. Eddie Rosenblatt is a very close friend of mine, Mo's and Michael's, and the idea of working with these people is really exciting to us."

Unlike their duties at Warner Bros., Mo Ostin notes that their responsibilities at the new label will not be specifically delineated. "Our roles are going to be much more broad because we're all partners," he explains. "We're going to overlap and flow into one another's areas, especially given the fact that we're a small company and we don't have the kind of structure and organizational charts that one has to abide by. We don't have to worry about jurisdiction; we just have to worry about getting the job done. Each of us has certain strengths, and we're going to apply our efforts to those strengths. But we'll also be involved in every aspect of the company."

The three will now embark in staffing the new imprint, which will initially start modestly. "We're going to try to build as strong an organization as we possibly can," Mo Ostin states. "It'll be in a time frame which is consistent with our growth, not unlike what happened at Geffen Records or even when we started Reprise with Warner Bros. It depends on the size of the roster, the number of releases and what our responsibilities—and the extent of those responsibilities will be. But it will be done in a timely and orderly fashion, and ultimately, our objective is to be a full-blown record company."

Industry speculation now turns to exactly who they'll be hiring. Naturally, the logical candidates would be those who have worked with or under the three. When it comes to current and/or past Warner Bros. executives, "We have some contractual restrictions there, but we will certainly be able to speak to anybody who is interested in coming to us and anybody who is free of contract," Mo Ostin says.

Of course, the trio's unparalleled reputations help DreamWorks rise to the top of any artist's list of prospective labels. With their legacy, one could only wonder what would stop a major act from coming aboard. "Well, things like contracts... catalog...some people have an aversion to change," Mo Ostin refive, 10 or 15 in a year; you never know how it's going to work. So rather than get caught up in numbers, it's best to go by our instincts and allow things to happen in a realistic way. I know it sounds somewhat evasive, but we're trying to be as realistic as possible."

That's a daunting task, since expectations for the label's success are now sky-high. "Thanks for putting the pressure on and increasing it!" Mo Ostin declares. "We don't like this level of expectation. We'd rather downplay it, but we're going to do the best we can...what else can we say?"

"We're going to make mistakes and we're going to take some chances, and I'm sure things will be okay," Waronker adds. "It's going to take some time. As far as all the expecgo. We've had the opportunity of over a yearand-a-half to sort of let go, and it wasn't easy. There are a lot of friends there who I really like, and in terms of talented executives, Warner Bros. is loaded. It's been a long time and so many things have transpired that it's hard to hang onto any of that stuff. For whatever reason, I don't have any negative feelings. I had 28 years at that company and that is a miracle in this business. One bad year, but the rest were great."

The remaining question is, after all of his legendary success, just what makes Mo Ostin run...what keeps him going as a driving force in the music industry? "Just the love of this business, the fun of being involved in it, the attraction I have to the music of the artists, and

sponds. "Who knows? It's very hard to get into the psyche of any artist. But we would *certainly* be happy to have any of those artists if they're interested in us."

The three claim not to have any specific release goal. "We're not hung up on numbers," Mo Ostin notes. "We're just going to take it as it comes. If we could find a bunch of great artists who could make records and allow us to release them in our first year, of course we'd do it. If there are two or three, then that's all we'll release. It just depends on what falls our way. Obviously, our objective is to try to get the best artists we can; you just can't predict what that number will be."

"It's really about quality over quantity," Michael Ostin asserts. "It's a cliché, but it's the truth, and the fact is we're going to take our time and make sure we're out there and in business with artists we really feel great about."

"It's important that we focus on the thing that's most important to all of us, and that is dealing with artists who we feel take us on a good journey," Waronker says. "What you find is that most artists, or at least the artists who seem to attract us, are the ones who you can't really predict what they're doing. It doesn't come tations are concerned, at some point you just have to put blinders on and not pay attention to it, or it will drive you crazy."

"We consider ourselves fortunate that the three of us, combined with Geffen, Katzenberg and Spielberg — and you know what David Geffen can bring to the equation combined with Geffen Records, will be a formidable force," Michael Ostin says.

Even though DreamWorks will now be the focus of their attention, one still wonders whether the three harbor any hard feelings over the Warner Music experience over the past two years. Mo Ostin categorically denies any hard feelings, while Michael notes, "So much has transpired that at a certain point, you let it go, get beyond it and look toward the future. With respect to Warner Bros. Records, I left behind a lot of very close friends...people I respect and admire who are close friends and were close business associates. Now, under Russ Thyret's leadership, I only wish them well, and I think they're on the road to recovery. There's a great company there with very talented people and an amazing artist roster."

"I second what Michael said," Waronker continues. "It has been difficult for me to let the idea of starting something new from scratch and building it," he replies. "I feel great, I'm motivated and I'm still excited. Plus, I *want* to do it! I don't want to kick up my heels, lay on the beach and get a suntan. I want to continue to work, and for me, it's an important thing to do. It's part of my essence."

Greg Williams loves his job...and a challenge. He had a big one right off the bat when he had to virtually hire an entirely new air staff. Not only did he fill the vacancies in a flash, but the station's ratings went up from 3.3 to 5.9 in one book. They are also #1 with women 18-34. That's because Williams makes

sure KDLE is full of character and energy that can't be denied. Here's how he does it:

"We are a Rhythm Crossover radio station with an Urban music drive. This is the heart and soul of our station. When I took this job, KDLE had an Urban/Adult/Contemporary format; we then changed to Rhythm Crossover. Our target demo is 18-44 year-old women. Although we share some of the same audience with the local Top 40, we really have our target all to ourselves. We are the only game in town when it comes to having energy. It just cooks.

"We are heavily dayparted. From 10:00 am to 3:00 pm, we have our 'At-Work Network.' Everyday at 5:00, we do a feature called 'Power Play of the Day.' At night we will open up a little more and play Rap, Techno and Dance music; it's one hell of a mix. I do the morning show; the 'Hit Man' in the morning. I do the show solo, so it can be difficult at times. I do *a lot* of phone bits and interaction with the listeners. It almost feels

like a Talk show. We have a different focus every morning, but Thursday is 'Kiss And Make Up Day,' which is absolutely hilarious. We have listeners call and apologize to their mates, but we make them tell us what the fight was about. Some of the fights are so funny, it makes great radio. At 9:00 am, we kick off our '10 Jams-In-A-Row' that lasts until 6:00 am the next day. Our weekends are filled with various shows that add to our

enormous energy. We have great liners such as, 'Imagine Wichita as a big piece of toast, and Power 93.9 is spreading jams all over it.'

"I have a very simple philosophy on promotions. I like doing promotions that impact people's lives with instant gratification. For instance, we give away \$100 grocery shopping sprees. I believe contests should be as simple as possible and sound fun on the air. We are now doing a Pepsi-Cola promotion by sending our jocks into the city, where they give away various merchandise, as well as free Pepsi. I feel that if I hand a listener \$20 and tell him/her to go put gas in the car, buy a pack of cigarettes, a six-pack of Pepsi and have a great day, I've made someone happy. People will walk away with a smile and tell their friends. We do so many different fun things because we really get the listeners involved. With my limited budget, I'm doing the best that I can. It's exciting, that's for sure."



The best news for Rap and House music fans there is that the station has started doing mix shows Saturday from noon to 8 p.m. and Sunday from noon to 6 p.m., where 50% of each hour is dedicated to Rap, Hip-Hop and House....KXTZ Las Vegas APD/MD MC Scrappy has set music call times for Mondays 9 am-2 pm. MUSIC-PALOOZA: Can Boyz II Men be any more successful? Their duer with Mariah Carey on "One Sweet Day" (Columbia/CRG) is all over radio without even being officially released. Next you'll hear them featured with LL Cool J on a supercool record called "Hey Lover" (Def Jam/Island). And now there's an early buzz on their remake of Marvin Gaye's "Let's Get It On" (Motown), which was produced by Keith Crouch of Brandy fame. "Let's Get It On" is part of a Motown tribute to the music of Marvin Gaye featuring tracks from Neneh Cherry, Digable Planets, Nona Gave. Speech, Madonna with Massive Attack and Stevie Wonder, among others, produced by the likes of Me' Shell Ndege Ocello, Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis, Keith Crouch and Nellee Hooper. Check for the first track, a remake of "Trouble Man" from Neneh Cherry Whatever that nebulous quality is that makes an artist a superstar, EMI recording artist D'Angelo has got it. He was incredible in two live, sold-out shows at LA's House Of Blues. Although typecast as an Urban artist, crowds at the shows were surprisingly mixed, and a cover of Earth, Wind and Fire had the crowd going crazy....Warner Bros. is going from zero to 60 in about one second flat with all the new product coming your way. The Alternative Angle by Bill Richards

While the Alternative music bandwagon barrels down radio full bore, many Top programmers are still wondering:

What's it all about? How long will it last? Who's driving it? Is Top 40 overreacting...again? I believe in the Scale of 10. That is, if you place Top 40 on the end of a scale, representing one, and Alternative at the other end, representing 10, you would have polar opposites. Alternative has recently enjoyed the luxury of being a hot musical force. As Top 40 reacts to the popularity of Alternative, thereby increasing the percentage of that style of music it plays,

it will force Alternative to find songs that are exclusive to their core. Thus, it's important to keep two things in mind: 1. Top 40 must avoid the "Rubber Band Syndrome. "It must be careful to not move too far towards the "10" on the

scale. If it does, then it will lose its mass-appeal attraction. Top 40 must maintain its balance. 2. If Alternative reacts by digging deeper into tracks to sound more unique, it could benefit Top 40s by becoming more

So you see, both could win, both could lose, or one could win and the other could fail. Just like many other formats, Alternative also needs to be careful to avoid a sameness of sound. This is what crippled Top 40s in the past few years, when they over-reunfamiliar. acted to Urban/Dance/Rap product. Already, the Alternative musical spectrum is being inundated with sound-alike bands.

As I travel across the country listening to radio stations, I find it difficult, at times, to distinguish one Alternative band from another. I realize that a real hardcore fan will discern more titles and be more familiar, but since I'm musically literate and I

have difficulty recognizing songs, sooner or later, it will catch up with Alternative. Especially if Top 40 does their job right. What if you're a struggling Top 40 looking to turn around your fortunes? Is Alternative the answer? Could be. It depends, of course, on the market conditions. I've been in situations where we wished we could have switched. But switching means elimi-

nating call letters (most probably), heritage and everything that goes with it. If that's not a concern, you might want to go for it. My concern is if Top 40s keep the same identity and call letters, yet start playing a ton of Alternative, they'll leave them-

selves vulnerable to both fronts mentioned above. If they're a struggling Top 40 that switches to Alternative without changing call letters, they'll cause confusion in the marketplace. They'll move too far away from listener expectations. If, in the meantime, another station comes on with a fresh set of calls, playing nothing but Alternative, the newcomer will probably annihilate them. Most importantly, by moving away from their heritage, they'll leave a hole for what they were doing in the first place. I believe Alternative is simply a rediscovered music form, one that has always been there. AORs used to play passionate

music that mattered. Remember The Cars, Boston, Journey, Kansas, Pat Benatar and countless other Rock-slanted acts? They were played as currents and were staples of AOR back then. Top 40 survived by playing the best of the lot. It should be no different now. Alternative is simply exciting music that will eat away at Top 40's audience just like Urban, A/C,

As Fred Jacobs of Jacobs Media pointed out three years ago, "There will eventually be an Alternative outlet in almost Country, Oldies and AOR does. every major market." I would just add that it could replace the AORs that are stuck between Classic Rock and Alternative formats. It depends on how they do it. Today's AORs are having trouble trying to compete with Classic Rock and Alternative by playing Alice Cooper next to Stone Temple Pilots. However, just like Top 40, AORs can survive if they program in-

When I was at KIIS in L.A., we saw the explosion of Alternative on the horizon. Our research showed an unbelievable telligently and not get too wide. passion for it. This was before KROQ moved up to the levels they're at now. Not to take anything away from the job that has been done there, but looking at the research, it would've been pretty hard to screw it up. I mean, the potential was huge. This is what makes the job of being a Top 40 PD so difficult. Should KIIS have tried to become KROQ, to try and beat

them to the punch? Yes and no. Yes, if it wanted to change call letters, forsake heritage, Rick Dees, etc. And no, because no one in their right mind would ever do it. It took Kevin Weatherly only 18 months to capitalize on what we saw in the research. His timing was great. (By the way, that's not to belittle the job Kevin's done. KROQ is one of the best programmed

Alternative is going to be around for quite some time. Record companies are rushing to capitalize on this just like every stations in the country.) other musical form that has come along. (Remember Disco?) How saturated the market becomes and how long it will last remains to be seen. I predict it will last its usual three-to-five-year cycle, only to be replaced by a tougher, more exciting musical trend that Top 40 can...and should...reflect.

This great uptempo song from a few decades ago sounds like it could have been written for Alan yesterday! He's been in a can't-miss for five years and his appeal to radio's mass audience is evident. Here's an independent label single that's getting a good bit of radio action in both the Midwest and Southwest. Do yourself a favor and give this record a listen.

"Field Of Dreams" (Сикв)



Boasting legendary production by Jimmy Bowen, this should become another #1 record for both of them.


