The Summer Arbs, '95

More Good News Than Bad For Hit Radio

Results from the third week of Summer Arbitrons were predictably mixed, but overall, the three niches of contemporary hit radio enjoyed similar success. Of the 56 reporters, 31 stations had a better book, 22 had down books and three stayed about the same. The percentage of stations that improved themselves (58%) were similar to the percentages of improving Mainstream Top 40s (59%), Alternatives (58%) and Crossovers (57%).

Six stations came out of the book as market leaders: WDCG (8.8), WNTQ

(10.3), KIKI (12.4) and KBFM (12.6) saw their numbers increase, while WKRZ and WNNK retained their market crowns despite off books. A very close second goes to KTFM; its 9.9 was .1 shy of a Tejano station.

Of 28 Mainstream Top 40s, 16 had up books, 11 went down and one stayed the same. The winners were KJYO (10.1), KKRZ (7.0), WYHY (7.0), WEDJ (5.1), KHFI (9.9), KHTT (7.5), WSSX (4.7), WFMF (7.4), WBHT (4.2), WSNX (5.6), WYCR (6.0), WFBC (5.4)

and WVKS (10.1).

Eleven Alternatives had up books, eight took a hit and two held steady. Enjoying the book were KWOD (5.2), WVIC (7.2), KROX (2.9), WNVE (6.8), WTGE (5.8), KXRK (4.0), WNFZ (2.5), KFRR (3.4), WEND (3.1), WQXA (3.9) and WQBJ (5.0).

Four of seven Crossover stations had good books. Besides KTFM and KIKI, doing well were KZHT (3.8) and KSFM (8.4).

[Correction: KSTP Minneapolis actually enjoyed a 5.9-6.6 Summer book.]

Country Arbs: Half-&-Half

The Summer Arbitron results of 39 Country radio stations in the Top 25 markets showed a 50% success rate. Fifteen stations enjoyed the Summer book, 15 stations saw their ratings fall and nine stayed about the same.

The mixed results increased the competitive scenes in several markets. In Phoenix, KNIX's 7.3-7.4 passed KMLE (7.5-6.2). KNIX also rose 7.1-8.3 in 25-54s. Detroit's WWW (4.3-4.9) overtook WYCD (4.9-4.5). In Minneapolis, KEEY's 5.8-6.3 jump closed in on WBOB's 6.1-6.4. Houston's KILT rose 5.1-5.8 to pass KKBQ (5.3-4.5), while KIKK held at 3.4.

Market leaders also include KYGO Denver (9.1-9.7 in 12+ and #1 in 25-54) and KWJJ Portland (#1 in both 12+ and 25-54). Other happy campers: KSAN San Francisco (1.7-2.4), WIL St. Louis (8.1-8.8), WDSY Pittsburgh (6.3-6.9) and WUBE Cincinnati (8.9-9.5).

Island Ups Hooman Majd To Executive VP

Will Oversee All Creative Areas Of The Company

Hooman Majd was appointed to the newly created position of Executive VP of Island Records. Based at the label's New York City headquarters, Majd will oversee all creative areas of the company which include A&R, Art, Production, Video Production, Publicity, Marketing and Artist Development.

"To say that Hooman has played a vital role in the success that we are currently enjoying at Island would be a gross understatement," explains Island Records President/CEO John Barbis. "His artistic vision and his unshakable determination have impacted every level of this company. I'm glad to be able to expand his role here at Island."

Majd was promoted from his position as Sr. VP of Island. He came to the label in June of '94 from Polydor Records, where he served as Vice President/General Manager.

Shannon Hoon Apparent Victim Of Overdose


Blind Melon Singer Loses Battle Against Drugs

Shannon Hoon, singer of Blind Melon, died of an apparent accidental overdose on Saturday, October 21 in New Orleans. He was 28. Results of an autopsy were pending at presstime.

Hoon was found dead on his tour bus at about 1:30 pm CDT. He was found by the band's sound engineer, who called the police after he couldn't wake him. There was no sign of trauma.

The band was in New Orleans to play at the legendary Tipitina's club. The current tour was to promote their most recent album, *Soup*, which was recorded in the Crescent City. Their last performance was in Houston on Friday, October 20.

Hoon, whose high, distinctive voice helped break the song, "No Rain," had battled heroin over the past few years. His turmoil also spilled over on stage. In October of

'93, he was arrested on nudity and indecent exposure charges after he allegedly stripped on stage during a concert in Vancouver, British Columbia. He was also charged with attacking a security guard during the

taping of The American Music Awards in February, 1994. However, friends of the singer noted that Hoon had tried to cleaned up his act after the birth of his daughter, Nico Blue, who is now three months old.

Born Richard Shannon Hoon in Lafayette, IN, he became friends with fellow Lafayette resident Axl Rose and later sang backup vocals on the Guns 'N' Roses song, "Don't Cry." He formed Blind Melon with bassist Brad Smith, guitarists Christopher Thorn and Roger Stevens and drummer Glen Graham. The band's name came from the Mississippi neighbors of Smith—unemployed hippies who called themselves "blind melons."

In a recent interview, the surviving band members were quoted as saying that they'll continue to play together, but not as Blind Melon.

Paul Cartellone Named Editor Of Yellow Pages Of Rock

Paul Cartellone was appointed Editor of *The Yellow Pages Of Rock*, the annual directory of the radio and record industries published by The Network Group.

Cartellone is a 13-year veteran of the radio industry. He has been an air personality for WFLZ Tampa and WHTQ Orlando, and he programmed for WOAY Beckley and WDCQ Ft. Myers. Cartellone also spent time as producer for *The Morton Downey Show*.

"Having just gotten married, I thought things couldn't get any better," he states. "Now, as Editor of *The Yellow Pages Of Rock*, I can look forward to the opportunity of networking with the entire radio and record industries. My goal is to solidify and improve *The Yellow Pages Of Rock's* stature as the most comprehensive and informative trade directory for our industries."

Danny Goldberg President Of Mercury Records

Ed Eckstine Starts His Own Label For PolyGram

PolyGram officials have confirmed that Danny Goldberg will become President/CEO of Mercury Records. The former Warner Bros. Records Chairman succeeds Ed Eckstine, who will stay on at PolyGram as the head of his own boutique label.

Goldberg brings a high-integrity, artist-friendly reputation to Mercury. Originally a music journalist, Goldberg headed up Stevie Nicks' Modern Records before starting up Gold Mountain Entertainment, a management firm that represented Nirvana, Hole, Sonic Youth and Bonnie Raitt, among many others. He returned to the record side as President of Atlantic Records, where he was instrumental in signing and breaking acts such as Hootie & The Blowfish, Juliana Hatfield, Stone Temple Pilots, Bad Religion and Liz Phair.

In January of this year, after several tumultuous high-level executive changes at the Warner Music Group, he was named Chairman/CEO of Warner Bros. Records. However, by August, when a new regime at Time Warner replaced the regime that sent him to WB, he decided to resign. Since then, he has been the center of

considerable speculation as to his next move. Reports had Sony and MCA's Rising Tide Entertainment, headed up by former Warner Music head Doug Morris, offering him a custom label. Apparently, he chose Mercury's established presence to getting a start-up off the ground in an arena that's brimming with new start-ups.

"Danny Goldberg has a great track record as an artist-friendly music executive with a keen feel for trends in the marketplace," states PolyGram chief Alain Levy. "I'm sure he'll fit well with other label Presidents. I look forward to having him rebuild the existing artist roster and have him discover and nurture new talent."

In early press reports, Goldberg expressed his excitement about taking on this opportunity, citing the new breakthroughs by Rusted Root and Joan Osborne, as signs of the label's rejuvenation.

His predecessor, Ed Eckstine, had more success breaking R&B-oriented talent such as Vanessa Williams, Brian McKnight and Toni! Tony! Tone! It's highly likely that Eckstine's new imprint will have a decided R&B direction. "I loved working at Mercury and I'll miss the people here," Eckstine says. "I'm very proud of our company and artists. However, I will look forward to getting back to what I love best—working in the studio in a hands-on, creative manner, directing a small number of artists. I appreciate Alain Levy's support in helping me realize that dream."

"I'd like to thank Ed for his contribution to Mercury," Levy says. "I'm thrilled he will continue working with us. He's an important executive in the PolyGram family whose creativity and insight I greatly value."

Leaves National Director Promotion Post At MCA Records

Mercury Nashville has appointed Larry Hughes as VP Promotion. Hughes, who previously was National Director Promotion for MCA Records, will oversee all aspects of radio promotion for the label.

Hughes, who also worked on the road with the Oak Ridge Boys and Kenny Rogers, is the third generation of his family to work in the music business. His father, Randy Hughes, managed Patsy Cline and his grandfather was Cowboy Copas, a recording artist for Starday Records. His stepfather, Marvin Hughes, ran Capitol Nashville and produced a variety of artists, including Sonny James.

Larry got into the business in 1978 at ABC Records and moved to

Ariola Records soon thereafter. He joined MCA Records in 1982 before being promoted to National Director Promotion in 1994. "We are extremely fortunate to have someone of Larry's experience and

Dude retransformed into a freak. "Now do you believe me?"


"You can get me that job?"

I Want To Bite Your Wallet

INTERVIEW BY GERRY CAGLE

stood on the creaking porch of the old, well-kept mansion, watching what could've been my last sunrise. Shafts of sunlight filtered through the thick moss that hung like tendrils of some giant, land-living octopus from the huge oak and cedar trees, their limbs straining against the weight as they reached their fingers of foilage toward the sky.

The heavens began the daily change. With the sunlight came the color, painting everything in faded pastels, breathing life and light into the darkness. The sun peeked over the horizon, creating brilliant laser spears when it managed to find a fit between the leaves. A pungent, moist odor filled the air as the sunlight mixed with the mist of the swamp, evaporating the moisture to create a humid, hot-house environment.

I was deep in the bayous of Louisiana, at the home offices of Fang Broadcasting. Twelve hours later I would interview the CEO. I prayed it wouldn't be my last.

I want to thank you for granting Network 40 your first interview.

You are quite welcome. (His lips almost parted in a smile.) There is no need to be nervous. I don't bite. (With this, he did smile. His teeth, although perfectly white, seemed normal in appearance. No pointed tips emerged from around the pale lips.) I haven't avoided interviews. Quite frankly, you were the first to request an audience and I was more than happy to oblige.

What made you decide to get into the broadcasting business?

I come from a long line of communicators. Radio is in my...uh...my family has been exploring innovative ways of getting into the bloodstream, I mean, mainstream, for centuries. Modern technology has opened doors that we are moving through into a new era. It was only unnatural that this evolution would occur.

With all of the other avenues available to you, why did you choose radio?

It was a no-brainer. In looking at all of the industries my family could become involved in, what better than radio and records? It's full of blood-suckers already. Besides, there are enough attorneys in this world. I hope to be able to bring my own brand of expertise into the flow. Trust me, I can suck blood with the best of them.

Also, the nature of the music business is to find young, innocent acts and suck the creativity from them until they are lifeless. Who better to do this than an accomplished professional such as I?

You've chosen New Orleans as the first city to debut your new format. Why?

It's my home. I know the swamps and the city better than anyone. My family has lived here forever...and that's not an exaggeration. This may sound vein, but I know the market will welcome our special brand of programming with open arms. Let me put it this way: I feel comfortable in beginning this new venture in New Orleans. I won't be sticking my neck out, if you know what I mean.

How will your format differ from those already on the air?

The first, and easily the most distiguishable feature of our format, is the broadcast time. We're on the air from sundown to sunrise, the exact opposite of most of our other competitors. And the music will be a special blend that won't be heard anywhere else.

How would you describe your music mix?

Oh, it's definitely Alternative. Those who have been trying to define the Alternative format need look no further than our playlist as the true definition. Alternative music for the Alternative

lifestyle. We won't be confused with other stations, of that I can assure you.

Can you give me some examples of your proposed playlist?

I'd like to keep that close to the vest...I've too much at stake. But I'll give you a few hints. Our theme song, the song which will begin and end each evening of our on-air braodcasts, will be Oingo Boingo's "Dead Man's Party." This, I think you'll agree, will set the tone for our audience. We'll intersperse newer releases with a sprinkling of juicy Oldies, including Michael Jackson's "Thriller," which is also my all-time favorite video, "Witchy Woman" by The Eagles, "Spirits In The Material World," "Werewolves Of London," "Sympathy For The Devil" and "Black Magic Woman." Of course, my favorite song will be played a lot.

What song is that?

The Eagles' "Hotel California."



I hear it playing in the background during this interview. Is there any special significance to that?

No. (He laughs, and the dim light from the chandeliers glances off two teeth on either side of his mouth that seem to be growing longer.) You can check out any time you like.

But can I ever leave?

Of course.

I'm a little thirsty. Can I trouble you for a glass of wine?

Red or white?

I didn't think you had that here.

What, since 1969? I told you to relax. And you can stop fingering that ridiculous crucifix you're wearing underneath your shirt. It's a nice piece of jewelry, but it's worthless as protection. It's just another old wives' tale dreamed up centuries ago by the church...as if a symbol could protect one from a real vampire. It's not my cross to bear.

Are you a real vampire?

The same old wives say the proof is in the tasting, don't they? (He lets out a short laugh.) But that stuff about not being seen in mirrors...I don't even want to reflect on that.

Have you read any of the Anne Rice novels?

A waste of time. I did see the movie, however. I must tell you, that boy, Brad Pitt, was rather tasty in his part. Wouldn't you agree?

I would choose another adjective.

Of course you would.

Back to business. How are you going to attract an audience to your radio station?

Oh, we have a built-in audience already. We've done the research. But I assume you mean outside our core listeners? **Yes.**

We plan to be very promotion-oriented and become involved with the community. I'm sure we'll be heading up all of the blood drives in the city. My family has extraordinary experience in finding qualified donors.

Halloween will be a special time; it will be our Christmas. That's why we're debuting our station on Halloween. It will be a party unlike anything New Orleans, or anywhere else, for that matter, has ever seen. There will be special costumes, rides in carriages through dark alleys and, for sure, a midnight vigil at the local cemetaries.

I'll provide you with special laminants if you want to attend the concert. Everyone wearing a cape will be allowed free admittance.

Your station will be known as "The Bat?"

Yes. We've already produced special stagers. "Hang upside down and let the blood rush to your neck," "Music so righteous you can feel your teeth grow," our special brand of talk show, "Bloodlines" hosted by Barry D'Alive, who really knows how to go for the jugular.

What, no Bat Man?

You make me laugh. Bat Man is just a cheap, Hollywood gimmic. (He looks into the distance and strokes his chin.) Of course, Jack Nicholson would be perfect, but unfortunately, he's still alive. Maybe after he passes on...

What about sales? What kind of clientele do you expect to attract with this format?

"From the cave to the grave," "Songs from the biting edge," "Blood curdling music," "Feel the music throbbing in your veins" and "I want to bite your neck." The top-of-the-hour I.D. will be, "We only come out at night." Mark Driscoll (who else?) is the station production voice. Would you like to hear some of the cuts?

I think I'll pass, for now. Who is your program director?

I'll be programming the station myself. Vampira is the Music Director. We've also hired "Scary" Scott Shannon as our consultant. After I saw those billboards when he did Pirate Radio in Los Angeles, I knew he was the right person for the job.

Do you have air talent already lined up?

Yes. We've resurrected a lot of old dee jays. Dr. Frankenstein will do early evenings, Wolfman Jack comes on at midnight...

But isn't he...

Doing the graveyard shift? Yes, well, I rescued him from that. We'll also have

We'll cross all demographics. This format is a lifestyle. Our listeners are very educated...they're all well-red. I see a lot of after-hours places, bars, liquors, trinket shops, lawyers, palm readers, witchcraft products, mortuaries, cemetary plots and the like from a local level.

Nationally, I expect some large buys. We're already in negotiations with Nike. They want to design a special sneaker that will "get you away from anything." As for their advertising slogan, "Just Do It" would take on a whole new meaning.

Gatoraid is already on board. They're producing a new product that gets into the bloodstream even faster. It's dark red. The slogan? "The Bat is a lifestyle...drink it up."

Insurance companies are lining up to advertise. Special double indemnity clauses are being prepared. If you own one of these policies and die from a loss of blood, your beneficiaries get paid double.

Truly, advertising doesn't worry me

in the least. I'm sure we'll have no problem selling out all the available time. Besides, who's going to say no to one of our sales people?

When are you going to take record calls?

Beginning at the stroke of midnight, Monday night. We don't want to take them too early so we can get all the promotions that are offered.

Do you anticipate any problems in dealing with record promotion people?

On the contrary. They're already a bunch of blood-sucking vampires. They'll fit right in with the rest of our staff.

The promotions might be a little tricky, however. I don't see us jumping for joy to get trips to Hawaii. Neither our staff or our potential audience is all that interested in laying in the sun.

That reminds me of another potential advertiser. Can you imagine the campaign we could do for a company that produces sun block? I'm telling you, our future is unlimited.

Are you expecting any problems from any relegious or organized civic groups?

Of course, but these demonstrations will be short-lived. Religious groups have been protesting our existance since time began. It hasn't stopped us so far. I see no reason for it to stop us now.

As far as civic groups are concerned, I see no problem. We are an equal opportunity organization. We don't judge any person on his race, creed or color, only on what's inside. I speak for generations of research when I tell you that we're all red on the inside.

Would you care to participate in any of this research?

I'll take that as a compliment and change the subject. Who are your favorite artists?

Almost all of the Alternative artists. They remind me of myself: talented, pale, withdrawn, tormented. And they work mostly at night.

Your station debuts this week. Do you have any special contest planned for the kick-off?

The greatest contest in the history of radio. The 666th caller gets to live forever. That should pull great 25-54s and beyond!

MASTERS OF THE MIX

Conference Conducted By Mike Marino

Crossover Radio employs some of the most passionate music lovers in the radio and record industries. Hood-rats and club mixers have become a major part of the music decision-making process at their respective radio stations. In case you're wondering, we're not discussing Music Directors. This week's Hotline gives love to four musicologists who want to share their insight on what's really going on in their world. On the "one's" and "two's..."

The Mix Masters

DJ MYSTRO

DJ ENRIE

You have a stack of 12-inch records in front of you. What's your mission as you dig through it?

MYSTRO: First and foremost, I'm looking for songs that'll give my mix show and the radio station a fresh sound, as well as an edge over our competition...records on the cutting edge, that have a new sound or an old sound reborn, such as "Danger" from Blahzay Blahzay. I also look for R&B jams that appeal to my female audience like Groove Theory and Faith.

ENRIE: I go through it and make a new stack *on the real*, the good songs to play.

LYNNWOOD: I look for hits. Fortunately, I have the opportunity to sit down once a week with my PD and MD to hear new music . Finding hit records for the radio station, as well as my mix show, is my first priority.

JAZZY: I'm looking for that one song that will make my target audience go crazy...the Hip-Hop or Dance record that will make them want to get up and dance.

On the local tip, how involved are you in trying to find new cuts from new acts?

MYSTRO: I'm always on the lookout for up-and-coming hometown acts. One act that recently broke out of the D.C. area, Questionmark Asylum, is now on RCA Records. Another is Pure Soul, who's signed to Interscope. It's important to support local talent and not be closed-minded when you play just the big artists on the major labels.

ENRIE: I'm always in touch with most local labels trying to come up, like Aqua Boogie and Groove Nation. Los Angeles still needs some recognition; if I can do something to represent the city, I will. Don't tell my boys in Queens, New York.

LYNNWOOD: New acts from Riverside? What a concept! The Inland Empire local scene doesn't really support new artists in any visible capacity. I get a few demos each month, but most are too narrow or amateur to get behind. We are working with a local club on a showcase to be held in '96, which will primarily feature vocalists and rappers. Getting airplay for new local acts from here to L.A., with record deals and a good product, will always get first attention.

– DJ Mystro WPGC Washington, D.C. JAZZY: I'm constantly in touch with many local labels and artists trying to find the next "bomb from the Bay." When I hear a hit, I do my best to get it on the radio. I personally get a lot of early indicators on local music from college radio.

How does the club scene affect your mix show?

MYSTRO: I go to clubs and listen for something phat that's working well in the room. I'll definitely bring it to the attention of my Music Director; I may even test it in my mix show for response. But in this area, more of my new music comes from the streets rather than the club scene.

ENRIE: First of all, I'd go crazy if I didn't work at the clubs. No matter how many hours I work at the station, I need to feel the vibe of bodies dancing in front of me. I like to see the reaction on the new records I'm banging on the radio. If the response is only so-so, I know the vibe on that record isn't there yet. I like to hear other DJs spin because I I don't get every record that comes out. Sometimes they can educate me on new songs. I also check out local retail stores to see what's hot.

LYNNWOOD: I've been a club jock for 15 years and a radio jock for 10. The club scene has been a part of my life for so long, it has to be a key factor in programming my shows. Records reacting strongly in the clubs almost always end up on the air, either here or in L.A. You can't program a radio show like you do a club, but being a part of the club scene is a crucial, indispensable tool.

JAZZY: The San Francisco Bay club scene is one of the most influential in the nation. Wild 107 has every major club in the area so we're spinning nightly. This is also where I get most of my initial vibe on songs. When you combine the club vibe with the hood rat vibe, you get the Wild 107 vibe, which works out to about 60% club and 40% hood and video play.

After you've found the phat-tracks, how do you bring them up in your music meeting?

MYSTRO: First, I'll give them to my MD and PD. Then, I'll play them for everyone at the meeting to get an overall vibe. Depending on the amount of on-air slots and if the consensus is good, our PD might test it for a couple of weeks. We'll look at requests and sales to determine if it should be added to our playlist. As a mixer, my job is to generate reaction for a song through my mix show. I need to build a vibe on a song so my PD can make the proper decision.

ENRIE: Basically, I tell Bruce St. James and Charlie Huero in my music department that I've been banging a cut out in the clubs and there's a buzz on the street.

LYNNWOOD: The no-sell approach works best with my PD and MD. They both have a hip ear and can listen to a club or Hip-Hop track with an open mind. I try not to bang them on dozens of cool records, only those that show honest potential for rotation. The meeting is kept clutterfree; no time is wasted and the strongest mix show records end up on the air.

JAZZY: If there's a real phat jam I'll walk straight into Michael Martin's office and start bumpin' it. If it's phat, but the world won't end if we don't play it today, I'll usually start playing it for everyone in our office. I'll even play it outside of the station, in my neighborhood and at local hang-outs like the mall and record stores. If the feedback is good I'll relay the information to my street coordinator, DJ Mein, and we'll make our report to our PD.

Describe your relationship with record companies?

MYSTRO: I have mixed feelings on this topic. I speak to most promo people, but only have a good relationship with four or five of them. I see most of them working us on "wack" records and weak remixes from producers who have no idea what PDs and MDs listen for in a hit record. Most record companies need to wake up and smell the coffee. They need to listen to feedback from radio mixers and give them a shot at actually producing remixes. We are on the streets and we know what PDs, MDs and the public wants to hear.

ENRIE: My relationships are all different. There are some people I talk to as if we're homies. The others, well, it's just business.

LYNNWOOD: I speak to record execs on a weekly basis. I give priority to those with projects I am heavily considering for mix show airplay. I also work closely with masters of record promotion, like George Hess, Izzy Sanchez, Richie Rich, Michael Futigaki, as well as some others. These guys give me the inside dirt on future hits,

– DJ Lynnwood KGGI Riverside not to mention support and insight. I admire and respect with empathy all the promoters I deal with; there's no way in hell I'd ever do it.

JAZZY: Exceptional!

Peep out your Technics crystal ball. What does the future hold for up-and-comers who want to spin and make a difference at a radio station?


MYSTRO: The future is bright. Mixers are beginning to get overdue respect from our colleagues inside the radio industry. There are more opportunities for us on the air and in programming. Some records companies are recognizing the important role we play in breaking new records. Some mixers even venture off into production, like myself. This is the best time for a mixer to get into radio.

ENRIE: I see future MDs, PDs, remixers and producers. Communication at your radio station is key. Mixers are a dime a dozen, so you must become an asset to your station. Always keep an open mind and remember you're on the radio, not in a club. Follow the rules and the future will be bright.

LYNNWOOD: Radio mixmasters-to-be should recognize the relentless commitment, ethic and talent required to be, and stay, in radio. It's a bitch, but worth every minute. Be humble, stay visible, mix your ass off and you could be the next DJ Enrie, Jimmy Kim, Richard "Humpty" Vision, God forbid, DJ Lynnwood. Thanks to all the PDs and MDs who are open-minded enough to allow mixers to be progressive and develop them into influential components of the radio station. Thanks to Mike Marino and *Network 40* for giving us the respect and recognition we've more than earned.

JAZZY: The door is wide open for enthusiastic and young DJs ready to make that move. The best way to make your impact at radio is to keep your ear to the street and be very patient and deliberate when choosing new music to play. Get to know the philosophy of your station, then begin to implement it on your show. The result will speak for itself.

THE HITS IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

Nashua, New Hampshire Arbitron Market #183 Population: 100,000

For a radio station that's only been in existence for eight years, WHOB has a music mix that's definitely different from any mix you'll hear in the area. WHOB, "B106," located in Nashua, New Hampshire, boasts a strong and dedicated staff, a vital mix of music and PD Paula Stone, a three-year veteran who is organized, direct and definitely one step ahead of the game.

"B106 serves Southern New Hampshire and Northern Massachusetts. Stations from Boston come in loud and clear in this area, including the two major Top 40s (WXKS and WJMN). Musically, we exclude all Dance and Rap music; we fill in our currents with Alternative music that we can jump on early. Many of these songs will eventually cross over to Mainstream; since we jump on these songs early, I would consider B106 to be a Pop Alternative station. Our Gold fill songs are mostly taken from the '80s, to appeal to our target audience of 25-34 year olds.

"The thing to keep in mind, promotionally, is that we're competing with much larger stations that are able to give away elaborate, expensive prizes. We know that people love to win, so we keep it very easy and make it fun. The morning show delivers a game called 'The Wacky Scrambler.' Sean McCarthy mixes up a song backwards, slowed down or sped up and the caller who identifies the song wins a variety of prizes. On Friday,

the caller who correctly identifies all five 'Wacky Scrambler' songs of the week wins a remote car starter installed! It's perfect for the upcoming New England winter. That's just the start; for middays, I host a 'Free Lunch.' Each week, a new song is featured as the 'Free Lunch Song Of The Week.' When the song is played between 10 am and 2 pm, the listeners call to identify it. The correct guesser wins a free lunch.

"Our bumper sticker promotion is on-going. By having a

B106 bumper sticker on your car, you can win some awesome prizes. We read license plate numbers over the air and the person who calls in within 10 minutes and 6 seconds wins prizes instantly and goes into a drawing every month for grand prizes such as trips, cruises, a new car stereo CD player with new speakers and an A-to-Z CD library, a home security system and more!

"On Sunday evenings, our 'Flashback to the '80s' is a great feature for our target audience. It's request-oriented and you can hear anything from Toni Basil and Wall Of Voodoo to Thomas Dolby. We conclude with 'Unsigned Heroes,' a local music show hosted by Jeff Stevenson. Every summer we have a free 'Unsigned Heroes' concert for the prevention of drug abuse. It's an all-day affair featuring bands that are played on the show. People can come and enjoy a free concert without drugs or alcohol and have a great time. The concert is simulcast on the air."





- Selena's "Dreaming Of You" (EMI Records) continues not only to push sales through the roof nationally, but also is picking up airplay in major mar-





BREATHE DEEPLY: Arista President Clive Davis unveiled the latest project from Babyface and Whitney Houston, the soundtrack to Waiting To Exhale. Without a doubt, this is one of the most inspiring projects to come around in years. Babyface wrote or cowrote and produced every single song on the album except for one, a remake of "My Funny Valentine," sung by Chaka Khan. The soundtrack contains songs from Aretha Franklin, Patti LaBelle, Chanté Moore, Mary J. Blige, Faith, Brandy, TLC, SWV, Toni Braxton, CeCe Winans, For Real and new artists Shanna and Sonja Marie—and every single one is incredible! It could rival The Bodyguard as one of the best selling records of all time. The first single. "Exhale (Shoop, Shoop)," was this week's most added record at Crossover radio, and Arista is following right away with the second single, "Let It Go," from Toni Braxton. The album hits stores Nov. 14, with pre-orders from retail already over two million.

EAZY DID IT: Ruthless/Relativity is preparing to release a collection of 12 new tracks from the late, great Eazy-E entitled Str8 Off The Streets Of Muthaph ***in' Compton. The first single, "Just To Let You Know," comes your way in November and is rumored to be incredible....Meanwhile, Eazy-E protegés Bone Thugs-N-Harmony have already attained double-Platinum status on E. 1999 Eternal. Keep an eye out for the title cut which is coming your way soon....Absolute favorite CD right now: the entire Dead Presidents soundtrack. Check out the first single, a remake of "Where Is The Love" by Jesse & Trina.







MELISSA ETHERIDGE (ISLAND)

- Melissa Etheridge taught herself to sing while growing up in her hometown of Leavenworth, Kansas.
- She got her first guitar at age 8 and wrote her first song, "Lonely as a Child" (about a kid in a war-torn land whose mother had been killed), at age 11.
- Soon after, she began performing at nursing homes, the state prison and Elks Clubs.
- After high school, she briefly went to Boston's Berklee
 College of Music and worked as a hospital security guard.
- In 1982, on her 21st birthday, Melissa moved to Los Angeles. Four years later, Island founder Chris Blackwell saw her perform...and the rest is history.
- Her debut album, Melissa Etheridge, with its single "Bring Me Some Water," earned a Grammy nomination.
- She won a Best Female Rock Performance Grammy for "Ain't It Heavy," from 1992's Never Enough.
- The 1993 five-time Platinum smash, Yes I Am, boasted three top-10 hits.
- The title track to Melissa's follow-up album, Your Little Secret, is quickly climbing the charts.



SELENA (EMI RECORDS)

- A native of Lake Jackson, TX, Selena Quintanilla began her rise to the top of the Latino market as the 10 yearold lead singer of Selena y Los Dinos.
- With brother Abraham III on bass, sister Suzette on drums and father Abraham managing the band, they performed at bars and clubs.
- After cutting several albums with Texas indies, Selena Y Los Dinos signed with EMI Latin. Her hits were rotated heavily on Latino radio stations of every format.
- Her Grammy-nominated '94 release, *Amor Prohibido*, went Platinum. Her '93 Grammy-winning album, *Livel*, and her '92 album, *Entre A Mi Mundo*, struck Gold.
- At the time of her death, she had cut four English-language tracks for *Dreaming Of You*.
- Last April, she became the first artist to place five Spanish-language albums simultaneously on the *Billboard* Top 200 sales chart.
- Her latest single is the title track off Dreaming Of You.







"Secret Weapon" Exposed

Radio Programmers Force Atlantic To Re-Release A Year-Old Song

After its initial release in November of 1994, the single "Missing" by EVERYTHING BUT THE GIRL may be one of the most talked about records currently on Top 40's agenda. Recently, when an onslaught of radio programmers including Steve Perun (KIIS), Mike Preston (WPLJ), Todd Cavanah (B96), Ed Lambert (KHKS), Glen Kalina (WIOQ), Adam Cook (XL 106.7), Don Parker (KKFR), Tom Poleman (KRBE) and Rich Anhorn (KHMX) began enjoying huge success with this track, Atlantic finally responded and decided to re-issue the single to Top 40.

The controversy over re-releasing the single began when the DPRO of "Missing" (containing a remix version of the song not available on the album), began receiving substantial airplay at WIOQ Philadelphia, KMXV Kansas City, KTFM San Antonio, KBZR Phoenix, WOVV West Palm Beach, KLRZ New Orleans, POWER 96 Miami and Y100 Miami, where Program Director Casey Keating comments "...this is a perfect record for my station...it has hip adult appeal with a beat...has been in "A" rotation through September."

"...all radio stations play the obvious Top 10 hits...it's finding the hits that no one else knows about...SECRET WEAPON RECORDS. "Missing" is our secret weapon record of 1995...probably our biggest adult record of the year."



Unfortunately for the consumer, however, this popular version of the track was not available on the album, which went on to spark an incredible debate inside the halls of Atlantic as to whether or not to add this upbeat mix on the full CD. (Atlantic has since stripped this version onto the album.)


Todd Cavanah, Program Director of B96 Chicago who is very enthusiastic about this project, explains that "Missing is a smash...one of the biggest surprise hits of the year...it's a song our listeners have demonstrated tremendous passion for!" John Rogers, Music Director of POWER 96 Miami, who initially began playing the record in February, goes on to add, "...not too many records last for 8 months, this one did #1 callout and #1 adult phones with huge sales." But John Dimick (KPLZ) seems to share the opinion of most by simply stating, "...it's about time Atlantic has gone after this."



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




MUSIC MEETING



James Bonamy steps up to the plate for the first time with this fun, uptempo, rockin' single that's certain to claim a lot of radio friends very early. Already





Holly has always had one of the purest voices in Country music. She





PROBLEM SOLVING

Commentary by Gerry Cagle



f you were at last weekend's CRS Southeast Conference in Charlotte, you can bear witness to the continuing agitation between radio stations and record companies regarding appearances and concerts. The loudest panel

discussion focused on this problem, which is not only not going away, but is getting worse. The never-ending scenario of who gets the "presents" when an act comes to town, who gets the artist, who gets the promotion from the record company, who gets the big spot buy from the promoter and whose records come off the air when the heat rises beyond control continues with no end or solution in sight.

In the past year, there have been meetings of management organizations, radio conference "Breakout Sessions" and articles in various trade publications addressing these issues. Everyone wants to solve the problems, but only on their own terms. Without making some real, hard choices and agreeing to specific criteria, any solution is impossible. If you program in a market with two or more other Country signals, you want to have your cake and eat it, too. If your record company has an axe (or CD) to grind, you can try your best to smooth the issue at the cost of your nerves, integrity and budget. If you're the manager, your artist suffers and (as everyone knows) doesn't want to return to the market, making the unknowing listeners and record buyers the ultimate losers.

As most of you know, a Country Commentary several weeks ago in *Network 40* dealt with the same subject. Over and over, various people have identified the problems, but few offer solutions. We offered a set of solutions before and we offer it here again, taken from the last Country Commentary on this subject.

It is a fact that record companies are constantly behind the 8-ball as more and more radio stations demand more and more promotions. This reality is compounded in the Country world because, unlike most formats, artist involvement with radio is a staple in Country.

But times have changed.

We owe all of these "problems" to one, undeniable fact: success. The Country music industry has never been healthier. Profits have soared beyond dreams. But as the pie has gotten larger, more people want a slice and everyone wants a bigger piece.

The success of Country music and the acceptance of the genre by a wider audience has spawned much tougher competition. Yesterday, there were a handful of record companies in Nashville. Now, you need fingers, toes and some other appendages to keep count. Few years ago, there was only one Country station in most markets. Today, there are two, three and sometimes four stations battling each other for the available audience.

Tougher competition has bred tougher programmers. Yesterday's programmer could afford to be lax, laid back and convenient for record companies. Today, a programmer's job often

depends on immediate success. Today's programmers haven't got the time to hang with Willie... they're too busy working to keep their gigs.

The volume is turned up much louder...the pressure is a lot heavier and promotion people, programmers and artists are all paying a price. Pressure makes diamonds...or dust. It ain't where you've been, but where you're going that's important. We should not look at problems as obstacles, but instead welcome them as challenges.

Promotion people who feel pushed and pulled by PDs should accept that reality as part of their job. Programmers who ask for everything should continue. It's part of their job. But artists who feel they are caught in the middle shouldn't be.

Starting tomorrow, let's put a ban on any radio station being allowed to "present" a concert in a market where there are two or more stations. As a favor to all, the artist should offer (if they so

desire) to be interviewed by each station. Who gets the artist first? The station that has given the artist the most support. If it's a new artist, the station that played the record first. Record companies should offer each station an identical number of tickets to give away and an identical number of backstage passes. Any other promotional goodies should be offered equally to all.

All a really good PD wants is a level playing field. Then, better programming wins.

A good programmer will put people in lines or on the phones to get extra tickets; use the station as a tool to take over the concert; find ways to make the concert personal to the station.

Then, everybody wins. The artist hasn't angered anyone because the artist is neutral. The record company may have a programmer pissed off (because one will get out-programmed), but will have a leg to stand on...the record company offered each station an equal promotion. The concert and artist will get twice the publicity because each station will pull out all the stops to take the credit with the audience.

What about a new artist coming to the market for a small showcase? Record companies should again remain neutral, or bring the artist in for two shows on different nights and let each station have a night. The one that does the best job will be given priority the next time.

But with all these good intentions, problems will still arise. Promotion executives will have to take the heat. You must wrestle with those monster egos and appease hurt feelings. If you treat all stations fairly, the programmers, in the long run, will respond in kind. But if you show favoritism to one, which is your prerogative, don't complain if the other programmer retaliates with threats and actions. It's part of the package.

And programmers, if you do want a level playing field...if you want only to be given an equal chance to show how good you are...don't complain if the other station out-programs you. Stop whining. Work harder. Program better. It's your expertise in programming and promoting that will separate you from the rest.

These are our suggested solutions. At the very least, this is a starting point. Not that we think our way is the only way, but it is imperative that those of us involved in the radio and music industries begin to offer solutions, rather than continue to constantly redefine the problem. If you disagree with our ideas, please offer your own. If you can't offer a solution, you shouldn't bitch about the problem.

Together, maybe we can find an answer.


