

Congress Passes, Clinton Signs Telecom Bill

In swift, decisive action, both the U.S. House of Representatives and the Senate approved the most wide-ranging telecommunications bill in over 60 years. President Bill Clinton signed the legislation into law on Thursday, February 8.

The bill, approved 414 to 16 in the House and, less than one hour later, 91 to five in the Senate, eliminates all national caps on station ownership. In markets with over 44 stations, a radio group can own up to eight stations total, with a maximum of five AMs or FMs. With markets having 30 to 44 stations, the limits are seven stations total and no more than four in one service. With 15 to 29 stations, the limits are six stations and four in one service. In markets with less than 15 stations, no more than half of the market's stations can be owned by one company, with three in one service. What's more, licenses will now last for eight years and comparative hearings on license removal have been eliminated.

To say the least, the reaction of corporate radio has been ecstatic. Evergreen Media's Scott Ginsburg described the bill's passage as creating "the bluest sky and the most sunshine the industry has ever seen." Not coincidentally, the bill frees Evergreen from selling off two of its five Chicago properties, which it would have had to do once its waiver ended in April.

"About 60 percent of radio stations in the country lose money right now," Constantine Consulting head Dennis Constantine was quoted as saying. "It's possible that the radio companies

will be able to operate stations at a more reasonable cost."

KHOW-AM Denver VP/GM David Baronfeld, whose station was one of several just acquired by Jacor Communications (see accompanying story), stated, "We're seeing an industrial revolution going on. This is so new [that] broadcasters are feeling their way through."

Among the questions now looming on the horizon: Exactly when will it take effect? Officially, the FCC must modify its rules to relax local limits and eliminate the national ones. And how long will that take? That's not known, either, although it probably won't come too quickly. The FCC is already backlogged with work held up during the two governmental shutdowns.

Jacor Buys Noble For \$152 Million

Now The Fifth Largest Radio Group In The Country

The dawning of a deregulated radio age was christened with Jacor Communications' acquisition of the Noble Radio group. The new corporate powerhouse is now comprised of 35 stations, making it the fifth largest radio conglomerate in the country. Jacor officials confirm that a name change is in the works, which will recast the image and stature of the powerful new radio group.

The timing of the purchase is especially appropriate, since the new group will have eight stations in Denver-the exact limit of the new telecom bill that was just signed by President Clinton (see story above). In the Mile High City, Jacor's KOA-AM, KRFX-FM, KBPI-FM and KTLK-AM welcomes Noble's KBCO-AM/FM, KHOW-AM and KHIH-FM. Jacor's Denver domain now includes four News/Talk AMs and one AOR, Alternative, Classic Rock and Jazz station each. Also part of the deal: KTCL Ft. Collins, which will force Jacor to sell off one property.

Elsewhere, Jacor complements its new San Diego purchase, KHTS FM, with Noble's powerful San Diego duct, XTRA-AM/FM. Its two stations in Atlanta, five stations in Jacksonville,

four each in Cincinnati and Tampa and two stations in Knoxville are bolstered by Noble's three-station presence in St. Louis and Toledo.

Officials of both parties have assured the local media that no format flips are in the works at any of the stations, but they wouldn't discount the possibility of off-air job consolidation.


Reaction, especially in Denver, has been strong and swift. "This should be good news for people at both companies, with opportunities to create synergy," Jacor VP Lee Larson states.

"You find that all the major radio stations in Denver will be bought up...probably by the end of the year," Constantine Consulting head Dennis Constantine predicted in the local media. "All the big signals will likely be owned by four companies."

"It's inevitable that you'll see more deals like this," SBR Radio VP Dave Rahn adds. "Large operators like Jacor have always been in the position [of], if they could own more stations in a market, they would. I don't know if listeners [will] notice a whole lot of difference...I like to think all this evolution is moving us toward something. Ultimately, the listeners will decide."

Alan Burns Hires Dave Shakes

Alan Burns and Associates named Dave Shakes as VP Consulting.



Shakes helmed WBBM Chicago, KMEL/KIOI San Francisco, WTIC FM Hartford and stations in Eugene and Reno. "Dave has won everywhere he's programmed," states AB&A Pres. Alan Burns. "He stopped KMEL's erosion to Wild 107 and returned KIOI to the top tier of 25-54 performers. In Chicago, Dave led B96 to the best ratings in its history. In fact, B96 scored the highest shares of any Chicago Top 40 since the legendary WLS. I'm glad I convinced Dave that he really wants to live on an airplane now."

"My goal is to be the best, and I wanted to work with the best," Shakes says. "Having been one of their clients, I know why Burns & Associates keep winning those 'best consultant' polls among A/C and Top 40 PDs and GMs."

Atlantic: Danny Buch Sr. VP Promotion

17-Year Label Vet Moves Up Yet Again

Danny Buch was promoted to Sr. VP Promotion for Atlantic Records. It's the latest in a long line of promotions for the 17-year label ace.

Buch came to the company in 1979 from WEA, where he served as a Field Merchandiser. He quickly moved up Atlantic's ladder, starting as a Local Pop Promotion Rep out of New York, then moving into a succession of Album Promotion jobs before being upped to VP National Album Promotion in 1988. Four years later, he was promoted yet again, this time to VP Promotion.

"Danny and I have worked togeth-



Murdoch Debuts Rawkus Records

Son Of Media Mogul Leads Cutting Edge Indie Label

Steve Forbes, son of a billionaire media mogul, has decided to run for President. James Murdoch, son of billionaire News Corp. head Rupert Murdoch, has a better idea: He's heading up an independent cutting edge label.

Murdoch, 22, quit Harvard to head up Rawkus Records with partners Jaret Myer and Brian Brater. "I was at school but I was itching to go [independent]," he was quoted as saying. "I was living in Boston and listening to the thriving Rock scene there. I got to thinking about making and releasing music. It was an itch that had

to be scratched full-time."

Rawkus' roster will be distributed by Chicago-based MD Distribution. The first release of the Murdoch regime will be by Glam Rock band Whorgasm. Other acts on the New York City-based label are Rag-core band Plastique (who put out an EP last year), Alternative group Motorbaby, Hip-Hop crew 7Universal and Jamaican Dancehall artist Poppa Bear Cool Breeze.

"The revolution is on in '96 and we've taken our positions," states GM Nelson Rodriguez. "We are a tight-knit team with everyone at the label sharing

involvement in all stages."

"By using alternative marketing tactics as well as the streets, we hope to be able to compete with any label by targeting the consumers exactly where they are," Murdoch states. "The schools, the clubs, the streets and so on. We're young, we go where they go and do what they do. Rawkus is new blood."

Although his father's conglomerate, News Corp., owns a number of music businesses, including Fox Records, "At this point, I wanted to break out on my own," the young Murdoch says. "This is something I can prove myself with."



in Atlanta. I don't know, call me crazy, but somehow it just doesn't ring true. I'm the last person to hold on to the past and talk about "the good old days," but somehow, a *Gavin* convention outside of San Francisco just doesn't hold the same excitement and romance of San Francisco.

That's even stranger coming from me, because I'm one of the few people in the civilized world who doesn't list The City By The Bay as one of their favorites. Too windy...too cold and too hard to figure just who's what for my lifestyle, I guess.

But a *Gavin* convention anywhere except San Francisco seems like a blind duck in a goldfish pond. Literally speaking, it fits...but it just doesn't feel right.




Enjoy the Southern hospitality. Drink a mint julep, order plenty of fried chicken and mashed potatoes and don't forget to smile when they say:

For whatever reason, the average career lifespan of a Rap artist seems to be shorter than it is for an artist in any other genre. In fact, the number of rappers who've been able to sustain their popularity past their third albums can be counted with one hand.

Which makes the success of LL Cool J all the more imposing. Over a career that's now entering its 12th year, LL is the first Rap artist to score five consecutive Platinum-plus albums, four Gold singles and worldwide sales of over 13 million. Then there's a budding acting career that features roles in several movies and the current TV series, In The House. His hot streak continues with his latest Def Jam/Island album, Mr. Smith, which boasts the Boyz II Men collaboration, "Hey Lover," and the current single, "Doin' It."

Why the album title, Mr. Smith?

"That's my name," he says. "I've reached a point in my life where I felt like I had been through a lot of things. I'm basically in charge of my business, so I felt it should be called *Mr Smith*. Of course, I had teamwork around me; I didn't do this album alone. I had a good team—the Trackmasters, Rashad Smith, Chris Lightly and the rest of the cast of characters. But at the same time, I've been through a lot of things in my career, so this felt like the right time to be called, 'Mr. Smith.'"

With a regular role in a weekly TV series, LL only had six weeks to work on the new album. Nevertheless, "My main objective was to make an album that was undeniable," he states. "I wanted to be able to say that I liked every song, so I had to feel really good about everything we cut."

To be sure, LL cut no corners to ensure that quality. For the vocal harmonies on "Hey Lover," he went for the best—Boyz II Men. "After I made that song, I needed a group to sing it who could really make people care. It had to be special, so I went after the most popular R&B group in the world."

For the new single, the sultry "Doin' It," LL composed new lyrics to complement the melodic base of Grace Jones' hit, "My Jamaican Guy." "I don't have a problem with adding other elements of music because I write all the lyrics," he says. "The producers wrote me the track that had the melody of 'My Jamaican Guy,' but all the lyrics in that song are mine."

Tracks like that are what have kept LL Cool J on the forefront of Rap, which seems to change its hip street edge overnight. "The reason guys end up getting out of here in two albums is because they start worrying about where Rap is going, so they try to stay ahead of it," he explains. "You just have to pay attention to yourself and evolve naturally. Michael Jordan doesn't have to go on a diet so he can look as lean as Penny Hardaway. He's been through that before.

"I'm just thankful to God that I have the opportunity to move forward," LL continues. "At the same time, you have to pay attention to stay away from drugs and not believe in your hype. You've got to understand that whether the record's good or bad, this, too, shall pass. I've learned that a hot record doesn't make me shake your hand any differently than a cold record. I have to be me and continue to be on my game and live up to the challenge."

With 12 years of rapping under his belt, LL offers a long-range view on the growth of the genre. "I've been rapping at parties for over 17 years, and I've seen different generations of rappers," he says. "There's a generation who grew up on Rap only from listening to it at Rap parties. Then there's a generation who grew up listening to Rap on records and their raps got real combative and competitive. They were performing in different situations; but [doing it in the studio] is like going from playing college ball to turning pro."

LL uses that experienced perspective when discussing the current competitive situation between the East and West Coast rappers. "I have no reason to disrespect the West Coast," he says. "My second album was produced by West Coast

producers (the original L.A. posse including Bobby "Bobcat" Errin, Dwayne Simon and Darryle Pierce); I took a West Coast producer and DI team all over the world with me. That was real early in the game, but at the same time, I am from New York and I don't mind representing where I'm from. I definitely think the competition is good for everyone. It's just like athletics. There's no question that competition breeds champions."


You can catch LL Cool J on the road this summer; he starts off with a bang, touring with R. Kelly. "I try to deliver the best show I can, one that's as meaningful to me as it is to the audience," he says. "I'm not saying I'm the


best guy out there, but I am saying that I come to deliver everything I have to give."

The length of the tour is as yet undetermined. A lot will depend on the fate of *In The House*. If it's renewed for the Fall, LL will be back as Marian Hill, sidelined football player-turned-landlord. It's not his first foray into acting; he also had roles in the films *The Hard Way* (with Michael J. Fox and James Woods) and *Toys* (with Robin Williams).

"It's fun, but it's hard work," he says of his acting career. "There's nothing easy about it, but I would love to continue doing it."

"It's tough doing both," LL says of his career juggling. "But my main concern and focus is music. I have a tremendous amount of respect for the music industry because it's a powerful animal. I love the music first and foremost. I have to do what's right for me. I'm not going to jump on the first thing that comes along; whatever's the right step will be my next step."

NEIL HARRISON

ATLANTIC PROMOTION MANAGER HOUSTON

Neil is as low-key as they come, yet he still can't hide his passion for the artists and his mission to get them played on radio. This articulate professional has music running through his veins and coming out of the following words:

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

I dropped out of college (the first time) to play music professionally. After two years, I got my first job in a radio station because I thought it was more stable (a momentary lapse of reason) and I wanted to be close to the music. I had a great time in radio, but after programming in one capacity or another for 10 years, I found myself lost in too many details not related to the music. I made the jump from radio to records because I wanted to keep the music as the focal point of my life. That was five years ago and I've never looked back.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

In a word...diverse! My territory is a part of the deep South, from Mississippi through New Orleans, Houston, San Antonio and all of South Texas. I have quality, leader-of-the-pack stations across the entire spectrum of musical formats, from Crossover (KTFM and KBXX) to Modern Rock (KTBZ and WZRH). I also have the nation's premiere Modern Rock/Top 40 hybrid, KRBE, as well as the original "Mix 96.5," developed by Guy Zapoleon and the blueprint for countless contemporary Hot A/Cs. I'm extremely fortunate that the stations in my territory, no matter what the format, break a lot of new and developing artists!

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

No. Every song and every group is different. In the '90s, it's imperative not to think in terms of format when breaking a new artist, but rather get it played at the appropriate stations.

What is the wildest promotion you've ever done for airplay?

There was the time I had 150 couples married on a Ferris wheel in Pensacola, Florida. That one made the AP and CNN. Then there was the time I pumped free gasoline for an hour... or when I bungee-jumped for an add. While those crazy kinds of promotions will always be around, I think promotion in the '90s is becoming increasingly qualitative. Programmers want to know the benefits of playing a song, pure and simple.

How easy is it to promote records you don't especially like or think are hits?

It's analogous to programming a radio station for a target demo outside of your own. One tries to play the music that most appeals to a target demographic. Any piece of music appeals to someone somewhere; my job is to make sure that person has a chance to hear it.

How do you deal with direct-format competition as far as exclusive releases?

Houston is one of the most competitive markets in the country right now, and competition over some artists have been pretty rough. In the case of a superstar artist, we try to make sure that everyone is included. We welcome, and try hard to support, all airplay. At Atlantic, we are most fortunate to have great artists like Jewel, The Corrs, Collective Soul, 7 Mary 3, Edwin McCain and many others who understand the importance of promotion and like to interface with radio and their audiences. At a Hootie & The Blowfish show this past summer, we did an in-station visit with a catered lunch for winners, a soundcheck party for another station's winners, an interview at the venue for a third station and an exclusive after-show meet-and-greet for a fourth station.

What do you like best about your job?

I love Atlantic, its heritage and the people with whom I work, both inside the company and at the stations that I deal with on a daily basis, and I love the opportunity to bring music to the masses.



TASHA MACK

HOLLYWOOD REGIONAL DIRECTOR, PROMOTION DALLAS

Tasha has been working for Hollywood since September 1995, but she certainly isn't a rookie. She has spent years in the biz, working with some of the biggest names on the charts. Settling in Dallas, a city she loves, Tasha is busy breaking new bands and showing her stations that Hollywood is stronger than ever.

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

I started at KUPD in 1978. In 1983, I went to work for TBA Media/Avalon Attractions. In 1985 working a Duran Duran show, I worked closely with Judy Kerr at Capitol Records. So I got a job there in Artist Relations. I moved to the Promotion department and in the end was the National Director of Rock Promotion. I moved around a lot. I'm a professional re-locator. I am happy to be in Dallas now: I really like this city.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

I work every format—Top 40, A/C, Crossover, Alternative and AOR. I work in eight states—Colorado, New Mexico, Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, Arkansas and Louisiana

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

Organization. I work with wide array of stations, so it's important to be organized. Working for Hollywood, there is only five regional people in the country. It would be impossible to call every one of my radio stations every week. I prioritize my travel plans and calls, depending on the kinds of records we release. I'm on the road every week, and it helps to visit my cities and hear what my stations sound like.

What is the wildest promotion you've ever done for airplay?

When I was working a Tina Turner record, I camped out in front of KZZP Phoenix when Bob Case was PD. They put up with me for a few days, but then they got tired of me and asked me to leave by threatening to call the police. I didn't even get the add. For Tom Cochrane's "Life Is A Highway," I traveled to all my stations and took a picture with all my PDs with the day and time. I got a big United States road map and attached our pictures in the correct location and sent it to my national office, where they printed it in some national magazine or newspaper. It was fun.

What is the best excuse for a drop or not adding a record you've ever heard? Hundreds. My favorite is, "I didn't get it in the mail" or "I didn't know you guys were going for adds this week." For a drop, they just never take your phone call.

How do you deal with rejection...in terms of not getting your records added?


For all promotional people, our lives every week are an emotional roller-coaster. I try to remember—and John Fagot is really good at reminding me—to not take it personally. That's easier to do now than it was 10 years ago, but I still get upset. This job is greatly based on relationships, which can put things on a personal level. It's important not to go into a radio station with a defeated attitude; any PD could see that a mile away.

How easy is it to promote records you don't especially like or think are hits?

There are times when I first hear a song and I don't get it, but I can't let my personal preference affect my job. It's never hard for me to work records because I know my stations and I know what songs will fit. It's not that difficult if you have complete knowledge of your stations.

What do you like best about your job?

I love the music and the people I work with. I've had the privilege of working with John Fagot for a number of years now, and I truly believe he is one of the true professionals in this business. He really takes the time and cares about his staff. Working for Hollywood is exciting, especially right now because it is a whole new era for us. It's a small label and that makes it a challenge. We are breaking new bands that are starting to make impact, like Seaweed, and it is really fun and very satisfying. Most of the bands we work with are young, energetic and have such a great attitude.







FORWARD MOTION

- ON THE EDGE: Check out Everclear's debut release, "Santa Monica" (Capitol), which is crossing successfully from the Alternative circuit. Already in the top 10 on *Network 40's* Commercial Alternative chart, "Santa Monica" is approaching 700 Plays Per Week, has tallied over 3,300 total BDS spins and is in the sixth week on MTV's Buzz Bin.
- Also laying a solid foundation is the cutting edge track from No Doubt called "Just A Girl" (Trauma/Interscope/AG). A former #1 Heatseeker, this tune is spinning over 20 times per week at Z100, KRBE, Q99, WPST and more. A top-10 Commercial Alternative song with MTV exposure, this release will work very well at Mainstream radio.
- · A very accessible track that's about to explode at Top 40 is 7 Mary 3's debut tune, "Cumbersome" (Mammoth/Atlantic/AG). The tune is in Heavy rotation at MTV, top 20 in SoundScan and has rocketed into the top 10 on Network 40's Commercial Alternative chart. If your station gets an opportunity to see these guys in concert, then by all means, tie your station in with the show. A top-notch live act (as personally witnessed last week at Los Angeles' Whiskey), you can easily understand why the album, American Standard, is Gold and is ranked in the top 25 on Network 40's Sales Chart.
- Speaking of huge sales, the latest release from Ace Of Base, called "Lucky Love" (Arista), is another trademark smash for this quartet that has scored past Platinum status for their album, *The Bridge*.
- The Presidents Of The United States Of America has reeled off an absolute cutting edge hit in "Peaches" (Popllama/Columbia/CRG). Not only a smash on the Alternative circuit, this tune easily crosses into the Mainstream with already nearly 500 plays per week. The self-titled debut LP continues to

scan big numbers at retail; it's still in the top 15 on *Network 40's* Sales Chart.

- "Collective Soul's 'The World I Know' (Atlantic/AG) is showing big call-out numbers for us," says WKBQ MD Tommy Mattern. The song continues to place in the top 20 of *Network 40's* Plays Per Week Chart, spinning nearly 5,000 Plays Per Week.
- KIOK MD Michael Dean says, "The Smashing Pumpkins' smash, '1979' (Virgin), is one of our best-testing tunes." Already #1 on the Commercial Alternative chart, this track is taking off on the Plays Per Week Chart, collecting over 3,000 weekly spins. WRHT PD J.T. Bosch also says, "This song is really taking off for us."
- A couple of tunes that are proving to be solid hits include Diana King's "Ain't Nobody" (WORK/CRG) and Melissa Etheridge's "I Want To Come Over" (Island). A great remake of a song that performed very well on the Pop circuit by Chaka Khan, King appears to have brought this song back at the perfect time. Following on the heels of "Shy Guy," which is a huge call-out song, major-market airplay increases weekly as more stations come to the party. Melissa's latest smash continues to be a big influence on nationwide airplay, adding VH1 and MTV rotations.
- Also watch for the groover from Lina Santiago, called "Feel So Good (Show Me Your Love)" (Universal Records). A solid base has already developed as the high-energy track moves in the Top 40 circuit.
- The research doesn't get much better than La Bouche's Dance tune, "Be My Lover" (RCA). A top-10 smash from *Network 40's* Street Chart, many majors have this song in heavy rotation. KCDD PD Trace Michaels claims, "This song just won't go away; one of our top requesting songs." Heavy rotations are also reported at KIIS FM, B96, WIOQ, KHKS, KDWB and many more. Video play is also being stacked

- up at MTV, VH1 and The BOX, making it a well-rounded hit.
- A hit we'll be hearing for a long time is the Gin Blossoms' brilliant song, "Follow You Down" (A&M). This song is poised to blow up at Album, Commercial Alternative and was last week's Most Added at Top 40. Watch the Midwest and Southern regions quickly embrace this song as other regions follow. "This is definitely a favorite here," adds KISR MD Scott Kramer.
- WNVZ MD Sean Sellers remarks, "Groove Theory's release, 'Keep Tryin' (Epic) and Shawn Stockman's hit 'Visions Of A Sunset' (Polydor/ Atlas/A&M) are two great call-out numbers here." "Visions Of A Sunset" debuted on *Network 40's* Street Chart last week and continues to increase in spins.
- Don't miss out on Terry Ellis' hit, "Where Ever You Are" (Eastwest/EEG). Listen to what they're saying: "I'm sure this will kick in this time," says WWKX PD Joe Dawson. "Sales are strong here and it's showing good early call-out," adds WNVZ PD Don London. WPGC is spinning this tune in excess of 30 times per week and KWIN rotates this number over 70 Plays Per Week.
- D'Angelo has an across-the-board smash with "Lady" (EMI Records). Debuting on *Network 40's* Street Chart at #37, watch this song zoom up the charts at Crossover and Top 40. MTV Active rotation, as well as airplay at WPGC, 92Q, KUBE and more, help bolster this song. Check out D'Angelo at The Grammys on Feb. 28; he's nominated for three awards.
- From *Network 40's* CD Sampler #86 comes Enya's "Anywhere Is" (Reprise). The album, *The Memory Of Trees*, is selling at a phenomenal clip of over 58,000 pieces per week—now many Top 40 stations are spinning this upper-demo smash.







California Boys Choir, The Metropolitan Opera and recorded with Zubin Mehta.

- He was an unsigned musician who called himself Romeo Blue when he first met *The Cosby Show* star Lisa Bonet at a New Edition concert. They would soon marry.
- Let Love Rule is said to be a celebration of their love (Bonet wrote two of the songs on the album), and Mama Said, the "soundtrack of their breakup."
- He rented and renovated a French castle to record his latest album, *Circus*.
- He wrote a movie that goes with the album, about "a Rock star who ends up going on a spiritual journey."
- "Can't Get You Off My Mind" is the current release off his fourth album.



JEWEL (ATLANTIC/AG)

- 20 year-old Jewel Kilcher was raised outside the town of Homer, Alaska, on her immigrant Swiss grandfather's homestead.
- Despite the lack of luxuries (no shower or TV), Jewel's parents, an Alaskan singer/song-writer duo, made sure there was always music in the house.
- At age six, Jewel joined her parents onstage and on the road. Soon her yodeling routine was a regular feature of the show.
- Her parents divorced and she continued to tour with her father, singing in bars and restaurants for most of the next seven years.
- Jewel spent her junior and senior years of high school at Michigan's Interlochen Fine Arts Academy on a vocal scholarship.
- She studied everything from drama and dance to sculpture and music. As a senior, she took up the guitar and first began to write songs.
- After graduation, Jewel moved in with her mother in San Diego, and after a number of dead-end jobs, she gave up the idea of fulltime work and lived in her van.
- She surfed, wrote poetry and hung out in coffee shops writing songs and playing with local musicians until she was offered a weekly gig.
- "Who Will Save Your Soul" is the first single from her album, *Pieces Of You*.

- Matt Mahaffey, lead vocals/samples. Mike Mahaffey, guitar. • Tim Nobles, bass. • Jason Rawlings, drums. • Chris James, keyboards.


