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Randy Lane Teams Up With Pollack Media


Brings Modern A/C, Top 40 Experience To The Consultancy

Veteran programmer-turned-consultant Randy Lane has formed an alliance with the Pollack Media Group. Lane will bring his expertise of Top 40 and A/C to the Pollack table, as well as the to-be-announced stations that have already signed up for Lane's consulting services.

Most recently, Lane programmed KYSR Los Angeles; before that he programmed WRQX Washington, D.C. and WKQX Chicago. He also spent time as a GM and as a consultant for Vallie-Gallup and Morningmasters.

"I am very excited about joining forces with a programmer as talented as Randy Lane," declares Pollack Media Group Chairman Jeff Pollack. "This allows a natural growth opportunity for both companies to take advantage of the new Telecom Bill changes. As

the architect of the Modern A/C format, which he launched with great success at Star 98.7 Los Angeles, as well as his extensive experience in Top 40, Randy Lane brings additional depth to the Pollack Media Group." Originally focused on AOR consulting, the Pollack Media Group has expanded into Alternative and other formats. It now consults over 100 stations worldwide, including outlets in Germany, New Zealand, Poland, Czech Republic, Canada, Ireland, etc., as well as MTV networks here and in Europe and other international video services.

"It's been clear to me that the number-one company for Alternative and Rock is the Pollack Media Group," notes Lane. "That's why I felt my particular strengths would complement the Pollack Media Group, especially in the areas of Top 40 and Modern A/C. As the format lines become increasingly blurred in the '90s, an alliance like this is beneficial for both companies."

WXRK Names Sam Milkman Operations Director Ex-Z100 APD Rejoins Steve Kingston At K-Rock

WXRK New York officially announced the hiring of Sam Milkman as Operations Director. Milkman, who resigned from WHTZ last week, rejoins former Z100 PD Steve Kingston at the recently-flipped Alternative station.

Previously, Milkman had been APD at WHTZ since 1992. Before that, the Univ. of Pennsylvania and Cornell University Law School grad served in a similar capacity at WEGX Philadelphia. "It's the opportunity of a lifetime to be working with 'The New 92.3 K-Rock' team," Milkman states. "I'm excited about helping to build something as compelling after 10 am as Howard Stern is in the morning."

"I was impressed with Sam the

minute I met him," notes WXRK GM Tom Chiusano. "He's a terrific addition to the management team of the station."

At Z100, several sources indicate that PD Tom Poleman's old MD at KRBE Houston, Paul "Cubby" Bryant, has been all but officially announced as the new MD. For info on the KRBE PD opening, please see Page 6.

Commodore Commandeers Huntington, WV Eight-Station Acquisition Gives Them 10 In Market

Commodore Media, Inc. took veritable control of the Huntington, WV/Ashland, OH airwaves by purchasing eight stations from two different radio groups. The simultaneous double-play cost Commodore \$12 million and beefed up its presence in the market to 10 stations.

Adventure Communications sold WKEE-AM/FM Huntington, WZZW-AM Milton, WV; WBVB Coral Grove, OH and WIRO-AM Ironton, OH to Commodore. Coming from Simmons Broadcasting are WHRD-AM Huntington, WFXN- FM Milton and WMLV Ironton. On top of the two stations it already owned in the area, WTCR-AM/FM, Commodore now controls two Country stations, one Classic Country, two Classic Rockers, two Sports/ Talk, one A/C, one Easy Listening and one Travel. It'll be interesting to see what format changes, if any, will take place. Despite the sheer number of stations, there are market pundits who believe that almost all of the signals don't overlap.

Overseeing the new bounty will be WJBR Wilmington VP/GM Jay Sterin, who has been promoted to Regional Vice President. Sterin, who joined Commodore in 1993 and has over 15 years of radio experience, will also retain oversight of the Wilmington properties as well.

Commodore's radio group now increases to 31 stations—18 FMs and 13 AMs—as well as two others in Fairfield County, CT that are pending FCC approval. Besides Huntington and Wilmington, Commodore owns signals in Allentown (including market leader WAEB), Westchester/Putnam counties, NY and Treasure Coast, FL.

Tommy Boy And Warner Music Form New Venture

Tommy Boy Music's long-standing relationship with the Warner Music Group will continue, thanks to the formation of a joint venture agreement between the two parties. "What has been a close and fruitful relationship between our two companies now holds even more promise for the future. Hootie's Latest Breaks Accelerated Airplay Record

"Old Man & Me (When I Get To Heaven)" Gains Over 3,600 Spins In One Week

So much for any notion of a sophomore slump: "Old Man & Me (When I Get To Heaven)," the debut single from Hootie & The Blowfish's upcoming album, *Fairweather Johnson*, blew away the record for the largest increase in plays in *Network 40* PPW history. The massive 3,642-spin jump (no other record has even gained 3,000 spins) enables the single to debut on the Mainstream Chart at the record-high of #18.

In other chart news, Mariah Carey is now three-for-three in having #1 singles off her latest album, as "Always Be My Baby" passes Alanis Morissette's "Ironic" to take the PPW crown for the week. 



tions, you could provide the answers. Then again, maybe not...but it's worth a try.

Why is it that promotion people never take "no" for an answer?

Why is it that no matter how hard I try and how many times I read the instructions, every VCR in my house and office flashes "12:00?"

Why is it that in the few instances when I manage to set the time on all of my VCRs, within 48 hours, the power goes out and they're all flashing "12:00" again?

Why is it that when DJs are feeling sick, they have to share their illness with the listeners?

Why is it that every DJ in America thinks he/she has something to say?

Why is it that 100% of the population of the United States bitches about politicians, yet less than 40% of us vote?

Why is it that after purchasing a house, everything that goes wrong costs \$1,000?

Don Parker

Programming From Both Sides... Then And Now

INTERVIEW BY JEFF SILBERMAN

udging by his resume, Don Parker is something of a "specialist" programmer. His career has seen him venture back and forth between Crossover and Alternative stations. He left heritage Crossover KBOS Fresno for Alternative KEDG Las Vegas. He then returned to Fresno to man Alternative KKDJ, but

eventually crossed the street back to KBOS. Next, he was off to Houston to get Alternative KTBZ off the ground. Most recently, he headed to Phoenix to help put heritage Crossover KKFR back on track.

Yet Parker's perspective goes beyond successfully programming two niche formats. In Houston, he basically had to start up a station in a market where there was a powerful heritage format competitor. Now, in Phoenix, he's manning a powerful heritage Top 40, yet one...and maybe two...stations are about to take him on. In a recent interview, Parker offers insight into niche hit radio and engaging in radio combat from a position of strength and weakness.

Was it, at first, difficult to make the transition from Alternative to Crossover?

It was. Initially, the big thing was getting familiar with an entire new library. All I was familiar with were the Alternative hits, which, as it turned out, was good for me. So, I wasn't trying to go too deep with the music by playing obscure songs that I didn't have a clue about, or a lot of album tracks. We were so focused and hit-oriented that a lot of people called the station to complain that we sucked because we played the same songs over and over. Yet within six months, we were #1 18-34, so it was obvious that what we did was working. Crossover PDs, unless they're direct competitors, seem to be a very close lot when it comes to sharing info. Are Alternative PDs like that as well?

They are...at least they've become that way. It's partly because a lot of Top 40 PDs have gotten into Alternative and could all relate to the same things. I've talked with Joel Folger of the Edge in Dallas and we saw a lot of the same conditions. That was pretty helpful, too, because you can see how the things relate.

For instance, in Alternative, the core will call you up just to tell you how bad you are, when the majority of the audience loves what you're doing. It's helpful to have networking going on to make sure you're on the right track. It's good to know that happens everywhere because, boy, the first time you get into Alternative, you'll be taken aback at how often your core will tell you how bad your station is.

The Crossover audience is similar, but not as passionate about their music. They just seem to be happier about what you play. What's really ironic is that your Alternative core is *not* what makes your station successful. You're successful by programming to the mass-appeal audience who *do* like to hear the same songs. **Did your programming style change at**



all when you moved up to stations in much bigger markets?

I wouldn't say, "significantly," but the one thing that has been tremendously beneficial for me is going from Crossover to Alternative and back in a lot of different markets. I've learned to not react too quickly and try and put "my formula" in progress. You have to basically figure out what the market wants, and spend some time learning what works for the market. *Then* you plan your programming strategy. If you just put your "one formula" in place wherever you go, the results won't be the same.

It's been very valuable for me to spend time in clubs, records stores and on the streets, finding out what the people are into. I dig deep into research to find out what that city and that particular audience wants. In Houston, you programmed a new Alternative station against heritage KRBE. Did you initially go after them, or

was there a big enough fan base for both?

Yes, there was a big enough base, but it was a weird situation. I don't think anyone realized how entrenched KRBE was in the Alternative scene. I got there seven weeks after the station flipped formats and it was another six weeks before we got jocks on the air. So we probably went a bit too long doing a similar thing as KRBE—without some stationality.

Even so, I believed there was enough of an audience for us, because KRBE is clearly more known for the Pop side of Alternative, and our mission was to establish us as a Rock Alternative station. It helped that the music was leaning in that direction, with Stone Temple Pilots and Pearl Jam. Yet KRBE did "Rock up" its music mix once you signed on.

Yes, they did...and to be honest, I didn't expect that, either. I figured they would defend the Pop end. They've continued to make it a competitive battle.

Once you realized how KRBE was playing it, how did you respond?

First and foremost, we had to establish ourselves as *the* Rock Alternative station because that was the only position we could take. We really tried to emphasize the Rock aspects, from the concerts to the clubs we aligned with. We just wanted to be consistent throughout...and it was difficult. We went through consultant and GM changes, then Shamrock was sold. All that slowed us down as we made changes. **Did you also go after the AOR in town?**

Yes, and we did it even more when we hired a GM who spent 25 years at KLOL. We clamped down even harder on the Rock side, which is evident in the numbers. It wasn't just a battle between The Buzz and KRBE; we were right in the middle between KRBE and KLOL. We hit both stations, which made it even more competitive.

Why did you leave for KKFR?

It was a very tough decision, let me tell you. I initially wasn't sure that I wanted to, but there are times in your career when you just feel that it's time to move on, and that was one of them. I had known Steve Smith, who consults KKFR, for many years. He and GM Fred Weber were convinced that I could do the job. As a West Coast guy, it's nice to be closer to California. And Phoenix offers a great quality of life.

When you went in, had Smith altered its sound from Mainstream to Crossover?

The station itself had gotten off-track. Steve moved it back to the Rhythmic side, but it still wasn't focused. A lot still needed to be done.

It was nice to come into a station that already had a great staff. Bruce Kelly has been doing mornings here for four years, SuperSnake has been here for five and Jackie West has been here for four. So there was a lot to build on. You don't get many opportunities like that. Plus, the timing was right. If we had still been as broad as we were, trying to be an "all things for everybody" Mainstream, we would've gotten killed when KZZP came back ... and there's another contender in the offing! I'm glad we had the time to get focused before this. When you say "focus," was it a matter of refocusing the staff or making changes behind the scenes?

It wasn't so much the people; it had to do with going so broad musically. I personally don't think you can do that anymore and be very successful over the long haul. Only a very few Mainstream stations can get away with playing everything from Dance to Alternative and A/C. With many signals in a market, the stations can become so niched that the audience can get more of what they want from one station—and if they want something else, they know where to get a lot of that, too. So, you've got to pick what you want to be—and simply be true to it.

town must've raised a lot of eyebrows.

Sure. The thing is, there's not much you can do about it. If he puts on a direct competitor, what can we do? My mission, as it has been since I got here, is to be totally focused on *my* audience. Steve and I don't react to our competition. We won't change to reflect what the competition is doing. As long as you're totally focused on your audience, it doesn't matter if anyone else comes in.

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How much of a makeover did you have?

We brought a new station voice in. We dumped the Mainstream jingle packages; I put new jingles together that are totally tailored to this station. The whole packaging became hipper. Features changed a bit; the music became tighter and more focused. We did some perceptuals and tested the music to make sure we knew the audience and were giving them exactly what they wanted.

Now, even with KZZP coming on, I believe that if someone's really happy with Power 92, they won't listen to KZZP. We are focused enough on our audience to know what they want. I'm not going to fret over the cume that samples KZZP. If they like them better, they're probably not one of our P-1 listeners.

Did you do any major marketing on the "New" or "Renewed" Power 92?

After I was here for a couple of months and we felt the music was focused, we did go up with a lot of outdoor to reinforce the call letters. But the key is anyone who tunes in can definitely feel a vibe on the station that wasn't there before. The news of Jerry Clifton coming into Even as focused as we are, Jerry could come into the market with something in a Hip-Hop vein and steal some 12+ numbers from us. But 1 don't think he'll affect our 18-34s, because the people who listen to Power 92 do so because they love the station—not because there's nothing else to listen to. That was the case for a while, but now that we're back on track, the cume and TSL indicate that they really like us now. **Unlike KTBZ Houston, here the heritage and cume is on** *your* side. Have you considered ways to use them if a direct competitor comes aboard?

It's a matter of making sure things are as strong as possible. That's why competition breeds better radio. You make sure everything you do is *absolutely* the right thing. You make sure you're playing *absolutely* the right music. You go over things two or three times to make sure they're right.

I've worked with Jerry Clifton before; he was our consultant at KBOS. I know his tendencies...and I have a lot of respect for him. It'll be interesting to see if he does decide to take us on. In making sure everything's right, is there

a danger of being too cautious musically?

I like to program a station as if I have competition—even if I don't. I like to be careful on new music; the rotations should always be tight. You can't play 3,000 records. I probably overuse the word "focus," but that's what it's all about. Every successful station goes for the throat of its audience. You want them to be firmly entrenched in your station.

Alternative is the same way. Kevin Weatherly did a great job of getting KROQ totally into the lifestyle of its listeners. That way, no matter how many people come after them, KROQ remains strong and dominant. The same can be said for Steve Smith in New York and Power in L.A. So there's no danger of microprogramming the station?

The only way to prevent that is to always be on top of the trends—stay in the clubs, stay *everywhere*. You need to know when the next big thing is coming. Even at the end of last year, when Deep House was becoming so big, if you weren't paying attention, that would've passed you right by. In fact, there are a lot of markets where stations should've owned records like "Planet Soul," but they didn't because they weren't on top of the trends. In last week's Interview, Steve Leeds

predicted a rise in Dance music. Agree?

Dance is certainly in a very good state. It's riding a wave and doing very well. How long will that last...who knows? Past experience has shown that Dance does become quite popular, but it doesn't last forever. You have to keep a close tab on it and be very responsive to what the listeners are telling you. Part of it is gut, too. Two stations can have the same research, but whoever has the best gut, wins.

Sometimes, stations can get too hung up with research. You're a fool if you don't use research, but if you're basically putting all your research on the air, you're an even bigger fool. You have to know how to read it.

What kind of future goals do you have?

Programming is certainly what I want to be doing right now. I am a realist in the sense that I realize when you get far enough out of the Top 40 demo, you shouldn't be programming it anymore. For me, that's probably five or seven years down the road. At that time, I could be a Group PD, consultant or even a manager. But I'm very happy doing what I'm doing right now.

The Art Of Radio War

An Analysis Of Sun Tzu's "The Art Of War" As It Applies To Competitive Radio Programming

While battlefields are strewn with stories of conquest and division, our on-again/off-again romance with the art of war never completely dies. Ries and Trout, The Research Group and others have done their best to bring that art to our attention, but many of us continue to attack the enemy like kids on a playground, hoping that brawn overcomes savvy.

James Clavell ("Shogun," "Noble House") recently edited "The Art Of War," a 2,500-year-old text by Chinese philosopher Sun Tzu. "The Art Of War" has become commonplace in many management circles, heralded in *Rolling Stone* as a marketing necessity and in the film *Wall Street* as a guide to those who strive for success.

"The Art Of War" also has relevance in Radio. As our industry becomes increasingly more cunning, more deft in its approach, here are some things to keep in mind as you continue to "sharpen your sword."

Laying Plans

Tzu theorizes that "all warfare is based on deception," an effective trait for radio. After laying plans for attack on another station, you should maintain a weak, inactive appearance. Try baiting your competitor with shabby positioners, songs, etc. that give them false security that you're digging an even deeper hole for yourself. The trick is to make your competitor feel like you are as far away from their position as possible.

On the other hand, if they are superior in strength and secure at all points—music, talent, promotion, resources—be prepared for a retaliatory act or evade them altogether. This is the single most important point broadcasters fail to take into consideration when considering engaging another station in battle.

If your opponents are easily angered, take steps to irritate them. Play like you're weak so they'll get arrogant and gain false security. If their jock staff is unified, separate them. Attack the other station where they are unprepared, have limited resources and little chance of defense. Appear where you are not expected: advertise your station in new, awe-inspiring ways; use positioning that takes advantage of their weaknesses and dethrones one of their positions. Waging War

PROGR MMER'S

Many broadcasters see Radio War as a swift series of actions, but history shows most battles take a year or so before victory is secure. Case-in-point: While the Power Pig in Tampa may have won several of the initial skirmishes over Q105, the war was far from over. The Edens troops may have looked upon Jacor's Tampa operations and saw dulled weapons, their allegiance worn down, their strength exhausted and their treasure spent. All that, along with the fresh troops Edens brought in, gave them a new chance to take advantage of Jacor's potential extremities.

Once you declare war on another station, you must make sure you have sufficient reinforcements, charge across all of the enemy's fronts without delay-and you don't stop until victory has been consummated. "The skillful general does not raise a second levy; neither are his supply wagons loaded more than twice."

The pay-off to the troops is of utmost importance. Many stations wage war with no rewards for victory and, unless your air staff sees value in defeating the enemy, they're likely to just go through the motions of appearing to fight. The great commanders (GMs) will bonus their foot soldiers (jocks) based on performance.

The Sheathed Sword

Contrary to some traditional leadership roles, Tzu straps the Program Director or GM (the "generals") with the task of subduing the enemy without any fighting at all. It's better to capture a dominant format position than to completely force the enemy out of the format. That's the stratagem of using the "sheathed sword."

The text reads, "It is the rule in war: If our forces are 10 to the enemy's one, to surround him; if five to one, to attack him; if twice as numerous, to divide our army into two, one to meet the enemy in front, and one to fall upon his rear; if he replies to the frontal attack, he many be crushed from behind; if to the rearward attack, he may be crushed in front. If equally matched, we can offer battle; if slightly inferior in numbers, we can avoid the enemy; if quite unequal in every way, we can flee from him."

With that, comes counsel in the three ways radio generals can ruin their attempts. First, if you don't know that your talent is weak and can't match up to your expectations when you need them to. Second, by trying to run your "army" the same way you would a kingdom...opportunism and flexibility must take precedence over humanity and justice. And, thirdly, by putting people in charge who have no experience on radio's battlefield and have trouble adapting to certain situations. This can only lower the troops' confidence.

"If you know the enemy and know yourself, you need not fear the result of 100 battles. If you know yourself but not the enemy, then for every victory gained you will suffer a defeat. If you know neither the enemy nor yourself, you will succumb in every battle."

When Eul- Bracley started as an intern at lis first radio station, he decided immediatelhe was going to work 12 hours instead of his scheduled three. "I started in Charlotte with K.ss 102 as an intern/re earch/screener/board op/whatever," he recalls. "I was there everydag, al day, because I was so infatuated with this business. Through a lot of hard work, dedication and ave for radio, I became AMD. I became ME a year-and-a-nalf ater. I moved to Chicage in Catober of 1998."

Er k has a great artitude regarding work. "Every day is a learning experience. There are things I do that are consistent throughout my week, such as the music log. As every MD knows, little fires come up all the time. Currently, we're in our sun mer bash mode for a huge summer concert. Organization is the key in putting together something this big, but it's a true logistical nightmare. It's all worth it when you see 30,000 screaning fars iving for that show. *That* is unating."

O her than a Christmas holiday scheduling mix-up, Erik doesn't work on the air. "I used to be on the air from time to time in Charlotte, but never on a regukar bass. I feel really lucky because so many M-Ds are forced to be on the air which could really take away time Form working with the music.

Not a lot of things bother Erik. Actually, le's one of the more easygping and friendly people in the business. But he does admit, "One of the hardest things to do is listen to tapes by easer local artists...and tell them to their faces that they don't quite hare what it takes to be on our station. I just try to give them advice on where to go from there."

Al record companies know the scoop for B9C's music schedule. "We don't have appointments for record rens. They rome in on Monday afternoons and most of them know when the down times are. That time is for locals from all the labels or local artists from the area to come in and play us what they have. I'm pretty accessible because a lot of the time I talk to people on the phone." What does Erik want ic hear? "It's really a research environment right now. I' a record person has research from a station that is pertinent to what we're doing, that is really hepfull Someone who comes in here, bombarding me with facts, can only help the record. It gives the song—and the promotion person—credibility. Eur when all is sa d and lone, we are always going to lock for the record that most suits our city and station."

Accessible maybe, but Erk has secrets. "We have a music meeting every week, but I don't want to divulge the time because Todd Cavanah and I are very secretive about it. We sit down with all the research—requeste, sales, lotal record store results that aren't or SoundSour—and our new music. We figure all of our rotations and see if there is any soom for new music. If there is, we select the one that fits our station the best. Some people think these music meetings are this long, drawn-out, scientific process. This is the music balances, not rocket science."

When Eil-likes a song and wants to onwhee Todd to play it, "Every now and then, I will make a cape for him of songs I want him to listen to in the car or on an airplane I'l put the song I want him to listen to the most on the tape several times. I have a pretty good track record for picking the songs that will work for this station. Todd has been avesome with me as fat as letting me do my job. Hes totally open to any ideas I have.

After Erik stopped repeating the question a few times, awed by the fact 1 d even ask such a thing as who's his favorite Bee-Gee, he sincerely replied, "Can I be nonest with you? I'm not a Bee-Gee person. When I was growing up they were already even. Bat cz* I tell you my favorite NKDTB?" With excitement, he answers, "Definitely Donry Wahlberg." Being a military wife is what landed Roxi Lennox in Alaska. "I've been here for about nine years new," she says. "I used to work mornings in New Hampshire before moving here. Aside from some part-time work in Beston on the air₂ that is pretty much my experience before coming to Alaska. I was originally hired here to be a midday ock and Production Director and when I asked for a raise three years ago, they gave me music duties instead. It's exactle what I wanted to do." Roxi s week is as full as it can be. Her PD, Mark

Then 10% of the time, they wonder where the heck I'm coming from. There are times when an outside influence, such as a promotion person, a concert or a video could get to me personally. But that personal attraction of getting off the beaten path razzly happens. I pride myself on being on target a bt of the time."


Obviously, working in Anchorage adds a unique twist to certain everyday, run-5£the-mill procedures. "Being on the ais in the middle of the day really helps me in being a good MD. During the day, most of my listeners are adult females at work or at home. The active listeners help me out as far as what they want to hear. For instance, I previewed the new Tracy Chapman on my midday show and the phones immediately went crazy. We knew right away we had a strash on our hands."

There is one thing that Rox feels is definitely consistent with her market. "There's a heck of a lot of talk about the weather here because, of course, it's such a pain in the neck." But aside from that, she thinks only one thing is actually difficult about her job. "It takes me all day to edit the music log. I start to get bug-eyed. It's not really difficult; it's just tedious. Those are the two most important things that I want to hear. Sometimes video acds can make a difference. I've never hac any goofy things done for me, such as a promotion person dressing up like a checken for an adc. But I do get some funny pictures and underwear sent to me once in a while."

After the hearty laughter stooped, Roxi began to second-guess whether doing this interview was a good idea in the first place. "Maurce, Barry or Robin? All of them are my favorite. I love them !!"





The Story

Soraya's musical career was practically ordained when she displayed very strong instincts at a young age. "I remember being five years old and hearing my unce play a traditional Columbian song. I knew from that moment I was going to sing and play guitar." That same day, the budding singer/songwriter asked her father to buy her a guitar. Within a year of this self-revelation, she decided that following her own musical tastes would be the road to her future.

While living her early years between the U.S. and Columbia, Soraya was able to absorb a great variety of cultural and musical influences. Although her guitar training had been an independent venture, she spent years formally studying the classical violin—which she eventually played from the stage of Carnegie Hall. "When I was about nine, my dream was to be a classical violinist," she says. "My parents often had to ask me to stop practicing so we could eat dinner! I would lose myself for hours in the music."

Soraya's musical drive eventually led her to explore the styles of contemporary singer/songwriters such as Joni Mitchell and Rickie Lee Jones. During her numerous trips to Columbia, she continued to study the colors of the local traditional music. "From my earliest writing efforts, I realized that all of these influences were coming through," she explains. Soraya was initially signed to Polygram Latino (which has a Spanish version of *On Nights Like This*). She attracted the attention of Island Records because of her ability to convey her passion in both English and Spanish. This led her to England, where she recorded her Island debut album, *On Nights Like This*.

Leaving behind her home in Miami, she spent several months at the Red House Studio in the English countryside and at the famed Abbey Road Studio in London. "It all happened pretty quickly. I'd spent so many years working on my craft and, finally, through a stroke of good luck, I was able to recreate my songs the way I'd heard them in my head."

Her production team consists of Peter Van Hook and Rod Argent, who add percussion and keyboard elements to the album to help maintain its musical honesty. "We could have built a huge wall of sound," she admits, "but that would have covered up the true nature of the songs."

Distinct elements of Soraya's debut effort are evident in the stylistic variety of the album's tracks. Pop songs such as "Stay Awhile" and "Need To Know" complement the compelling string orchestration of "Calm Before The Storm" and the pan flute-tinged title track, on which she comes to grips with her mother's passing.



"When I first started writing lyrics, I was afraid to reach deep inside of myself, but over time I've found that writing honestly simply creates a better song," she says. "But not all of my songs are autobiographical. I was an English literature major in college, so I know the value of a good story! Sometimes I'm inspired by others' lives or by imagined situations. I become that reality, then write the song."

Soraya's stories are bound with memorable images, shown through literate lyrics that steer clear from cliches. She has a storytelling style that presents her songs in a manner that befits her emotional openness.

Her current single impacting radio is "Suddenly." She wrote this song for her husband. "Every time I sing it, it rekindles the emotions I felt when I realized he was the one."

RETURN: WARM-AND-FUZZY STUNT BUILDS CUME AND TSL ALL WEEKEND.

ADOPT-A-MOM

Jocks recruit listeners to become "adopted" children for elderly women in nursing homes, or for mothers raising kids on their own or whose kids are out of town. Station gives listeners presents to give moms when they visit them on Mother's Day. The jocks should go along for the ride, too.

COST: PRESENTS COULD EASILY BE TRADED OUT WITH CLIENTS.

RETURN: IDEAL WARM-AND-FUZZY FOR LOCAL TV STATIONS.

"PRETTY AS A PICTURE"

Two weeks before the holiday, bring a quality portrait photographer to a different client store each day for a week. Offer to have him/her shoot listeners for free. One pose will be developed and given away to the participants one week later. (They have to return to the same client stores to pick them up.) The photos come with customized Mother's Day cards that have the station's calls and photographer info on them. Voila! Instant, high-quality personalized Mother's Day cards!

COST: PHOTO COSTS PAID BY CLIENT STORES (FOR BUILDING FOOT TRAFFIC TWICE) AND BY PHOTOGRAPHER (WHO CHARGES CUSTOMERS IF THEY WANT DUPLICATES OR OTHER POSES).

RETURN: GREAT WAY TO THE THE STATION INTO A HIGH-PROFILE, MEMORABLE FAMILY EVENT.

MOTHER'S DAY PRIZES

- The following are appropriate prizes to give mothers on their special day:
- Facial makeovers.
- Gift certificates to fancy-ass clothing stores.
- A month of free cleaning service.
- · Gourmet caterers who deliver breakfast in bed.
- Weekend trip to a spa.
- Pay the phone bill for a month.
- Free airline tickets to see out-of-state children.
- Free dinners in fancy restaurants.
- Free photo shoot of children/grandchildren.

"TIME OUT!"

Record "anonymous" listeners who call in and confide things they were able to get away with when they were younger. Mothers who call in and identify their sons/daughters by their transgressions and yell, "Time out!" win a prize.

COST: PRIZES TRADED OUT. RETURN: GREAT THEATRE-OF-THE-MIND RADIO BUILDS TSL.

"QUEEN MOTHER FOR A DAY"

Ask listeners to fill out "Oueen Mother" cards at client stores, which ask what their mother's favorite stores, restaurants/food, entertainment, etc. are. Choose five winners and for one entire day, a jock comes to winner's house, drives her kids to school, provides her with catered food from her favorite restaurant, drives her to her favorite store for some shopping, to the beauty parlor for a make- over, then home to feed the kids and bring in a babysitter so he/she can drive the mom and her sig-other to a night at the opera, theatre, etc. Occasionally do cut-ins of her "dream day."

COST: LIMO, PRIZES AND EVENT'S TRADED FOR MENTIONS OR OFFSET BY CLIENT SPONSORSHIP.

RETURN: WEEK-LONG HIGH-PROFILE PRIZE SHOULD ATTRACT PLENTY OF LOCAL PRESS COVERAGE.

COST: LUNCH SHOULD BE TRADED FOR MENTIONS.






