

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
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Chancellor Reigns In Florida Buys OmniAmerica's Tampa And Orlando Properties

Chancellor Broadcasting's aggressive acquisition policy took them into central Florida as they purchased eight Orlando and Tampa stations from OmniAmerica for \$178 million.

The Dallas-based company picks up WXXL, WIHM and WOMX to complement the station it already has in Orlando, WOCL. It also snares WAPE and WFYV Jacksonville and WEAT-AM/FM and WOLL-FM West Palm Beach. "This acquisition is an exciting step in solidifying our position as the leading radio broadcaster in Orlando, one of the country's top-five fastestgrowing markets," states Chancellor Pres./CEO Steven Dinetz. "Overall, this reflects our strategy of developing leading station clusters in attractive, rapidly growing markets and improving their operating results."

Hirsch will join Chancellor's Board of Directors. For 13 years, as President/COO of Malrite, he operated several stations that Chancellor recently acquired when it purchased Shamrock Broadcasting. "I'm extremely honored and look forward to joining Chancellor's Board and working with Steve Dinetz and his management team," states Hirsch. "My partners and I will obtain a \$15 million equity participation in Chancellor and have great confidence in the Company's future."

Chancellor's domain now encompasses 43 stations in 16 markets. "This acquisition continues Chancellor's proactive strategy of building a major position in the consolidating radio industry," Dinetz adds. "In addition to the completion of our initial public offering and the acquisition of Shamrock Broadcasting in February, we have entered into a swap agreement to acquire the assets of WKYN-AM serving the Cincinnati market. We will seek to aggressively improve the results of these [OmniAmerica] stations as we have done with the Shamrock stations.'

OmniAmerica co-owner Carl

Clear Channel And Cox Eat; Radio Equity And NewCity Eaten About A Half-Billion Dollars Later, Four Radio Groups Become Two

The superpowers of corporate radio continue to grow as Clear Channel acquired Radio Equity Partners for \$235 million and Cox Broadcasting purchased New City Communications for \$250 million.

Clear Channel's latest prize, Radio Equity's 19 stations in eight markets, gives the San Antonio-based conglomerate a total of 92 radio stations in 26 markets. RED's group beefs up Clear Channel's cluster in three markets: New Orleans (where its five station now attract 36% of the market billing), Memphis (same number of stations and about the same market share percentage) and Oklahoma City (where its five stations generate 54.7% of the revenue).

"We are excited to join forces with a company like Radio Equity Partners, which has a proven track record of excellence in all facets of the broadcasting business," states Clear Channel President/CEO Lowry Mays. "The employees throughout the organization should be commended for their excellent performance and we look forward to having them be a part of the Clear Channel family.

"We view Radio Equity Partners as an excellent complement to our existing station group," he adds. "It will add to our presence in some markets and give the company excellent strategic positions in other markets from which it can continue to grow."

Clear Channel also just picked up WTFC-FM and WWKY-AM Louisville from SFX for \$6.9 million. SFX also sold WVEZ Louisville to Regent Communications for \$12.6 million.

Meanwhile, Cox's purchase of New City's seven-market, 18-station group gave the Atlanta-based group 37 stations in 13 markets. Like the Clear Channel deal, Cox moves into five new markets while building up two others—Atlanta (three stations that attract 17% of the market's billing) and Syracuse (four stations that generate over 52% of the market's revenue).

"This is a great marriage of two companies that share the same vision of service to our listeners, customers and employees. I'm looking forward to having Dick Ferguson, Jim Morley, Rich Reis and the entire group of great NewCity employees join our team," states Cox Exec. VP Radio Robert F. Neil. "We intend to be major players in the exciting environment that surrounds radio after the recent telecommunications deregulation. This combination of resources, stations and people will create an incredible company."

This consolidation trend should continue at an even more frenzied pace for the foreseeable future, according to the panelists at a Kagan Seminar conference held last week. The basic consensus foresaw the top-10 conglomerates owning 75% of radio interests through deals totaling approximately \$15 billion.


To accomplish that, Alex Brown & Sons Managing Director/Sr. Media Analyst Drew Marcus estimated that it would take at least two years for the industry to reach that point—an 80% consolidation of the total market. In other words, there will be far more major radio group acquisitions in the future than what has transpired up to now.

CRG Names Tim Devine Sr. VP A&R Brings Multi-Label Experience To Columbia Labels

Tim Devine was named Sr. VP A&R for Columbia Records Group. He will be responsible for signing and developing artists, as well as being one of the Group's primary liaisons for the West Coast-based music community.

Devine comes to Columbia from Capitol Records, where he signed multi-Platinum Grammy-winner Bonnie Raitt, Blind Melon, Mazzy Star, John Hiatt, Luscious Jackson, Lloyd Cole and Concrete Blonde. He also handled A&R responsibilities for Beastie Boys, Butthole Surfers, Paul McCartney, Richard Thompson and Cocteau Twins. As director of A&R, he also produced or supervised soundtracks for film and television, including *Rainman*, *John Lennon: Imagine, The Decline of Western Civilization Part II* and *Clueless*.

Prior to Capitol, Devine held various positions at A&M, MCA and

Warner Bros., where he was a Product Manager for U2, Prince, Van Morrison, Bob Marley, Pat Metheny, Gang Of Four, Was (Not Was) and Devo.

"There are few executives who have the creative insight, musical taste and marketing expertise that Tim has demonstrated throughout his career," states Columbia President Don Ienner. "He's always taken chances on true artists, enabled them to explore and grow, and helped them achieve success with integrity. I'm very pleased that he's here and I'm certain he will prove to be an important asset to our artists and labels."

"I am thrilled to be joining Don Ienner and his outstanding team at Columbia Records Group," says Devine. "Clearly one of the great labels in the history of recorded music, Columbia is also home to a new generation of artists who continue the tradition of making music that matters. I look forward to working with Donnie, Michele Anthony, John Ingrassia, Jordan Harris, Jeff Ayeroff and the entire team to expand Columbia's artistic strength and vision."

Columbia Records Signs Offspring Multi-Platinum Indie Band Enters The Majors

Offspring signed with Columbia Records. The deal will commence with the band's next album, scheduled for a Fall release. Columbia will release the album worldwide, with the exception of Europe, where it will be released on Epitaph Records.

Borne from the skateboard/surfer scene in Orange County, the quartet put out a few releases on independent Epitaph Records, including Spring of

'94s, *Smash.* It featured tracks such as "Come Out And Play" and "Self Esteem," which became Alternative classics and spurred album sales to approximately nine million.

It was inevitable that major labels would come calling, but Epitaph stood its ground and the band, for the time, decided to stay independent. However, under the guidance of manager (and former A&M Records exec.) Jim Guerinot, the group eventually decided that it was time to play in the major leagues. To get this deal done, arrangements undoubtedly were made to accommodate Epitaph's interests in the band.

"When Michele Anthony and I found out that Offspring expressed interest in coming to Columbia, we were both excited at the prospect," states Columbia President Don Ienner. "Offspring are one of those rare bands that manages to attract millions of fans while maintaining their honesty and creativity. They refuse to be exploited or undermined in the process. I'm thrilled that Offspring have chosen Columbia as their home, and can't wait to begin working with them and Jim Guerinot as they continue what will surely be a long and successful career."

Deals! Deals! Deals!

• Tichenor confirmed rumors that it will pay \$40 million for KSOL/ KYLZ San Francisco/San Jose. Tichenor is a Spanish radio specialist.

• Jefferson-Pilot paid \$30 million for its third San Diego FM—KBZT. It will complement KSON-AM/FM.

• Saga builds its radio cluster in Springfield, IL to six with the purchase of WDBR-FM, WWTE-FM, WTAX-AM and WPRC-AM.

• Osborn Communcations paid \$7 million to acquire KNAX-FM/KRBT-AM Fresno from EBE Communications.

• Sundance Broadcasting is about to acquire KRGO Salt Lake City. The LMA began May 19.

• Pinnacle Broadcasting bought WRRF-AM and WDLX-FM Washington, NC for \$3.5 million.

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








TOP 40

Commentary by Gerry Cagle



ho knows what tomorrow may bring?

With all due respect to whoever did that song, none of us has a clue. If anyone did, that person would immediately be declared Queen or King and would

be living in Maui. And I wouldn't have a thing to write about.

In the past few weeks, a couple of trade magazines have written articles about the future of music and radio. I thought perhaps I should bring up the subject so the industry as a whole would be aware of it.

The number of Top 40 stations has been in a free-fall comparable to a Value Jet flight. In the past decade, that number has gone from over 1,000 to just over 300. Figures don't lie. The Top 40 format doesn't seem to be the darling of the '90s...at least not so far. But before we hoist up the white flag and completely abandon ship, maybe we should look inside those numbers for the real story.

Quite simply, a lot of Top 40 radio stations are doing really well. There are few examples of formats that can generate the numbers and dollars that a successful Mainstream Top 40 station can do. When done well, and without a splintering from competing formats focusing on a piece of the pie, Top 40 out-performs most others.

It is, however, an expensive format to run. Just like being half-pregnant, one can't operate a half-assed Mainstream Top 40 station. You either do it well or run the risk of getting buried.

Unfortunately, some other factors influence the success of Mainstream Top 40. Advertising agencies and station sales forces are not forcing cume numbers into the mix. Although cume is a consideration in most buys, it isn't the main consideration. In the case of Mainstream Top 40 stations, cume should be. For the future of radio in general, and Mainstream Top 40 in particular, we should all begin to trumpet the glory of using and buying the big cume...especially when we have it.

Quarter-hour numbers are certainly important, but bringing more of the spotlight on those heavy cume numbers and how they can influence advertisers by generating sales is something we all need to concentrate on.

With the extreme examples of music being sampled by the Mainstream audience of today,

Top 40 is sure to grow. Different formats have narrowcast specific slices of the American pie into portions not big enough to eat. In the past, songs were capable of jumping across formats because the fences were so low. Those barriers have been raised much higher.

There was a time when songs zoomed across those barriers like bats flying through a chainlength fence. AC/DC and Guns 'N ' Roses could have huge records in Rock and Top 40. Michael Bolton could score big in Urban, Top 40 and A/C. The artist formerly and currently known as Prince hit all of them.

What happened?

I don't know exactly, but it has a lot to do with too many signals, too many stations slicing a piece of the pie, too many programmers finding a

niche that would last a second and too many other choices for the radio audience.

The music certainly had something to do with it. Music always opens the doors for new formats. Radio doesn't create the music...it takes advantage. Album Rock was created by musicians in spite of there being no radio outlet. So radio created a format. Disco was a child of the same invention...and the Disco format was born. The latest on the family tree is Alternative. And there's another incubating even as you read this.

That's the great thing about music. It can't read. It doesn't know about format restrictions and available airplay. It doesn't know from promotions and double-bonuses. It doesn't know it can't possibly fit. Music doesn't know it is a part of a corporate entity. It doesn't know it's expected to generate a certain percentage of a return for the stockholders. Nobody ever asks music's opinion. Music never graduated from college. Music didn't even take the SATs. Music doesn't know any of this.

Neither does the audience. We make a lot of decisions about our audience. We put names on formats and restrictions on who will like what simply because we know what it is...or at least we believe we have correctly identified it. The audience doesn't know. They only know if they like a song or not. That's it.

Music dictates new formats, but we dictate the decay of the old. Because as soon as we are completely surprised by a musical shift, we suddenly become experts at identifying and copying the original concept. Then, we beat it to death.

Of course, the audience becomes bored with specific formats after a while, because (with the exception of Top 40) it all begins to sound alike.

In the beginning, Rock was on the cutting edge. You heard things on Album radio you couldn't hear anywhere else. Then we refined the process to include the obligatory Rock ballad to try and cross formats and bring on the really big sales and it all began to run together. Disco was the same. In the beginning it was bright, exciting and pumped full of energy...totally off the wall. Then we dissected the sound...determined the exact number of BPMs that would coordinate with the heart, mixed and remixed until it all began to sound the same. Alternative was true cutting edge. The very name implied it. However, as soon as Alternative began to gain mass acceptance, it wasn't Alternative any more. Instead of creating something different, record companies began to sign bands that "sounded like" Pearl Jam rather than acts that broke new ground like Pearl Jam. And now Alternative songs are beginning to sound alarmingly similar.

Which brings us full-circle as Mainstream Top 40 is now the only format with the capability of generating airplay for acts that don't fit a specific mode. Today's audience seems to want to hear Celine Dion, Tracy Chapman, The Fugees, Hootie & The Blowfish, The Philosopher Kings, Garbage, Coolio, The Nixons, Bone Thugs-N-Harmony and Oasis in the same break. Like the music, the audience doesn't know that maybe these songs *don't* fit the same format.

Isn't it odd that a format that doesn't target a *specific* audience is the one that might again provide the perfect forum for Mainstream music?

Just like music, Mainstream Top 40 doesn't know any better.

THE NETWORK 40 INTERVIEW

John Dimick Successful As A Successor

ete Myers can empathize with John Dimick. Who the hell is Pete Myers? He was the starting shooting guard for the Chicago Bulls—the year after Michael Jordan retired.

John Dimick also had some huge shoes to fill when he was chosen to succeed one of this industry's best programmers, Dave

Robbins, at WNCI Columbus. Fortunately, Dimick brought a lot more to the table than the lonely Bull. He already was experienced in this situation, as he succeeded another established, highly-regarded programmer, Casey Keating, at KPLZ Seattle. Of course, Robbins is still down the hall in Nationwide's corporate suite. Nonetheless, Dimick is firmly manning the controls with considerable energy and enthusiasm.

In a remarkably candid interview, Dimick offered astute and unflinching insight into the opportunity of programming one of the format's most well-known and popular heritage stations.

As a PD in a variety of formats, do you agree that, regardless of format, good programming is good programming?

Programming is programming, but that makes it sound easier than it is. Programming means you learn as much as you can about your audience...and then you service them. If that's what you mean by "programming is programming," then, yeah, if you've got a good research department and MD, you can put good music on the air. Your job is to study what the audience wants and make sure it comes through the speakers at them.

Are the geographical differences overrated in their importance to programming?

I should paraphrase this interview by noting that everything I say here is just my opinion and not gospel. I hate it when PDs come across with "this is the only way to do it"---because it's not.

That said, I've found that you need to keep your mind open and realize that you have to re-learn every time you go into a market. You can't go in with set beliefs such as, "This is how it worked in Seattle; this is how it'll work in Columbus." Certainly there are operational efficiencies, staff management and motivational things that you can pick up from one company to the next. That will make you a better manager.

But as far as being a program director, you have to go back to square one. Even if the statistics are the same, you should re-learn what your audience is after. You'll find out new subtleties that can make a big difference. The geographic contrast is no big deal if you look at it from a fresh perspective. After landing your first majormarket PD gig at KISN, how long did it take for you to feel comfortable?

I never feel comfortable. I live my life in a constant state of paranoia, where someone knows more than I. It charges me up; I make damn sure that I go through all the articles, the trades, the local stuff...to make sure I know as much or more than anyone else in the market. Being in a constant state of paranoia is what makes it work.

In that light, how do you feel when the Arbitron quarterlies are about to hit?

The book is going to do what the book is going to do. I have been very fortunate, for the most part, to work for companies that aren't book-to-book or trend-to-trend crazy. I don't look at what I do as a quarterly sort of thing. Every day, when I go home, I ask myself how the station sounded that day. I look back ar what we accomplished every week. That goes for the end of every month and the end of every year.

If I got three down books in a row, I'd be lying if I said that wouldn't bother me. It does indicate I may have missed something and I have to go back and find out what that was. There's a solution for every problem; you just have to find it. When you succeed a Casey Keating, who spent years running KPLZ, is it tough to re-orient the staff to your command?

No. To Casey's credit, a lot of it has to do with the peo-



ple he put in place. From the morning show on down, the staff was fantastic. I never got the feeling like I was being examined. It was, "Okay, you're the new guy, let's run with it." Besides Casey, credit also has to go to GM Shannon Sweatte and OM Rob Dunlap.

Granted, it was a bit intimidating filling his shoes, as it was when I came here to fill Dave Robbins' shoes. But the staff in Seattle was fantastic and made me feel like they wouldn't allow me to fail.

How did the WNCI gig come about?

I had been trying to get into Nationwide for years; I had identified it early on as a company I'd really like to work for. I had talked to Pat Paxton about a couple of opportunities at the company, but for whatever reason, it didn't pan out. Dave Robbins and I met at the NAB last year; we started talking at a dinner and just hit it off. In late November, he called and asked if I'd be interested in having dinner with him and talk about programming W/NCI.

Did the fact that you'd succeed a nationally known

figure like Dave Robbins play into your decision?

Dave is certainly a high-profile individual who is a marketing and promotions genius. That's one thing that made this position very exciting; I could learn a lot from him. Dave could take me to places I didn't even know existed. I've learned so much already; it has been great.

I absolutely love filling his shoes, but you're right, it *was* a bit intimidating. You almost ask yourself, "Who do you think you are, tossing your name into the hat to program WNCI?" This station has been around for years with a sterling reputation and, all of a sudden, you find yourself sitting in the hot seat. But, again, thanks to a great staff, things have been going pretty well.

What went through your mind when all these big names were bandied about in the trade press as successors to Robbins?

First of all, in every job l've gotten, my name has *never* been mentioned...and I like it that way. I like being in the background. Secondly, whatever happens, happens. I just give it my best shot, be very direct and honest with what I'm looking for in a company, and if it doesn't fit, it doesn't fit.

When all the names were coming out, it was really cool that a lot of people, who I look up to in this industry, were mentioned as candidates for this job. To be even considered among them was very flattering.

Did it take long before you really felt that you were running WNCI?

I felt comfortable on the very first day. The thing is, you don't have to feel "in control" at a station like this. There was no question, from the first day, that I was the PD...and Dave was very helpful in that. Naturally, after eight years, there were times when the staff would walk down to his office to talk about things. He had to make a conscious effort not to answer them and send people back to me.

But I never felt the need to come in and put my mark on a radio station, whether it was doing good or bad. Granted, every PD is compelled to come in and analyze the situation, find out where it's strong and weak, and use his or her strengths to bolster the weak areas.

Specifically, what areas did you initially lend your talents to at WNCI?

I just focused on what made the station tick. It has been successful for so long. Remember, I hit the ground about seven weeks before the book started. I had to find out where we were, what was going on, what we already had planned and who everyone was. Basically, I just watched how everyone did things.

Now I'm at a point where we're making adjustments based on information I've gathered. It's nice to walk into a #1 station and be able to tweak here or there...and not have to fix anything.

Speaking of being #1, 'NCI seems to bounce on and off the top spot on a regular basis....

Every Winter, it falls from the #1 12+ perch. Why? It's no secret that we're a heavily marketed station in the Spring and Fall. By the very nature of Top 40, we hold our own in the summer. In all honesty, Winter is a sore spot with me; it's the one area where I'd like to make immediate improvement. Come late next Fall, we may have a surprise or two in store.

The bottom line is the station is very profitable. Yet that certainly doesn't negate the pressure for me to be #1. I don't want to go down in history as the PD who tubed 'NCI...God, talk about a career burner! Fortunately, one of the reasons I took this job is because the guy who got them

to #1 is right down the hall. The people who know what it takes to win are right upstairs...and they're gung-ho. If I came in here and they cut the promotion budget in half, I'd be sweating bullets. But Nationwide has a winning mentality; they're in this for the long haul. When Dave had some soft books, Nationwide gave him the opportunity to fix it. They gave the guy the room and security to know that they'll support him. And he brought them back up to #1.

Not to sound cocky, but I have confidence in my abilities. Sure, we're going to get beat up on occasion. Will I slit my wrists if we're not #1 in the Spring book? No. Will I investigate to see what happened? Sure. I have a saying, "Defeat is not an option," and I seriously mean it. I am not a poor loser; I'm a *godawful* loser...and I never quit trying to win.

Yet how can you compete against a News/Talk station that shares no audience with you?

We all go out and do a "Non-snow" dance in January, because if it doesn't snow, the News/Talker doesn't win. If it does...and it was a very cold winter here this year...the News/Talker will win. Plus, the Country station will get its audience, no matter what we do.

I look at it this way: We did a 7.8 this Winter and a 7.9 last Winter. You have to compare apples to apples, Winters to Winters...not Fall to Winter. That's not comparing reality; then you're playing the ad agency game, not the programming game.

Your top-rated morning show has been successful despite personnel changes. How do you keep that chemistry?

I'm trying to figure that one out myself. I believe that the morning show wins because they're a focused team. There's a concept here. It's not a bunch of people going willy-nilly; each one has a different style and character. When one of those characters leaves, you find someone else to fit that character. The style or humor may change a bit, but the concept remains the same.

No one member is bigger than the show, which is one reason why the Zoo has been successful for so long, with a variety of people. But they're all very committed to winning.

How do you keep a competitive intensity when there isn't a close format rival?

People forget that this station has been attacked several times. Power 107 and 92X have put us through some bloody battles. But I believe anyone with a signal on the air is a competitor...and we're not winning until we get a 100 share. Dave Robbins has instilled that in everybody.

Sometimes you have to be careful not to get complacent. That's when you get your butt whacked. But this staff has a unique element in that it continually looks to improve itself. When I aircheck the jocks, even the midday and afternoon guys are looking for ways to improve.

This staff has never allowed itself to be a liner-driven station. There was always personalities and entertainment... and the promotions were always fun. If you work for 'NCI in this town, you're a celebrity. Trying to live up to listener expectations has helped make this station what it is. They expect a lot out of 'NCI...

and this very dedicated staff delivers it. Finally, has the current radio group buying frenzy altered your career goals?

Yeah. I'd love the challenge of keeping a group of stations at peak performance. I'd be lying if I told you I didn't have that in mind when I


took this job. What Nationwide has planned for me, and for what I can make happen myself, is yet to be seen, but my eyes are certainly on that prize.

JOHN IVEY AND THE MOTHER OF ALL RADIO CONCERTS



If ABC-TV football announcer Keith Jackson was the emcee for The Kiss Concert, to be held June 1 at the Great Woods Center for Performing Arts outside of Boston, he would describe the extravaganza as "The Grandaddy of radio concerts."

WXKS' 17th annual concert features over 20 acts in a variety of musical genres, including headliners Bryan Adams, Seal, Melissa Etheridge, Harry Connick, Jr. and Gloria Estefan. Proceeds from the mega-show will go to a variety of non-profit organizations; it should increase the total contribution to charity groups over the years to \$500,000. What's it like to put together such a massive undertaking? Kiss 108 PD John Ivey describes the year-long effort that goes into making The Kiss Concert an unforgettable concert experience year after year.

How many years have you been involved with The Kiss Concert?

This will be my second concert as PD, but I've actually seen six. So I was able to experience four others before taking over, which was helpful.

When did you first start putting this year's affair together?

I know it sounds dramatic, but this is the truth: The day after last year's concert, we immediately started talking about it in regards to what we'd do differently this year. I started serious discussions about acts in November.

Specifically, what did you want to change from last year's concert?

The first meeting we had, we decided that it would be nice to have the bigger acts play longer sets. We felt that if we did that, it would be a little more advantageous. That was the biggest thing. The rest of the changes were tiny operational things.

It's really helpful to hold it at the same venue every year. When you know the set-up of the place and the people there, you know what to expect, what you can do...and there are fewer opportunities for an unpleasant surprise to occur.

When live tours are usually based around a

new album, considering how often release dates are changed, is it difficult to land big talent months in advance?

Not really. The process starts early in the year, when we make a long laundry list of acts to approach. When we approach the labels, they come to the party and tell us who they've got coming up. Bryan Adams' name came up after we approached A&M about Gin Blossoms and Sting.

All I want is to know, from the get-go, who is available and who is not. I say, "Please be honest with me, no BS, is this act in the realm of possibility and, if so, can we discuss it." The worst thing is to expect that you can get Billy Joel, then find out months later he's not available.

Last year, the first act we signed was Tom Jones, who actually committed in February. Rich Balsbaugh, Steve Rivers, Matt Mills and I met him for dinner at The Four Seasons; he just finished *Late Night with David Letterman* earlier that day. We just hit him up. He wondered why he'd do the concert, we showed him the advantage—great exposure, a lot of fun and all the perks—and he agreed to do it that night.

When you have over two dozen acts and you want to lengthen the sets of big artists, where do you cut?

This year, rather than having 34 acts, our talent lineup is in the 20s. We're not talking about doubling the length of their sets. This year, Melissa Etheridge and Bryan Adams will play for 45 minutes. Other acts, such as Harry Connick. Jr. and Gloria Estefan, will play a half-hour to 35 minutes.

As a Mainstream station, you have your choice of artists in a variety of genres. Do you strive to offer an equal balance of styles?

It's different from year to year. The Kiss Concerts have always been known for odd acts and odd combinations of people. Last year, we had Tom Jones and Carly Simon performing together. One of the first years I went to The Kiss Concert, Michael Bolton did a set and he had Carly Simon and Amy

Grant as background singers. The Kiss Concert is the one Mainstream radio concert in the country with a certain reputation among the record industry. We don't have to explain The Kiss Concert to them. Even the artists know what it is. Gloria Estefan was easy to get this year because she did this concert 10 years ago. They know what it is, they know it's for charity, they know how the sets run and they know there's a ton of press.

With several big names on the bill, you inevitably must deal with fairly enormous egos when it comes to who performs when and who comes after who....

Of course...and we try to help them through it, judge their priorities and tell them when they have legitimate concerns and when they don't. There have been cases when people have tried to demand things that can't be asked for in the company they're keeping. In those cases, we politely say, "Look, you're going to have to do it this way, or it just won't work out."

When you've got 20-something acts, a smaller or medium-level act can't really get uppity because, to be honest, I don't need the grief. You get to a point where you wonder whether they're worth the trouble. You don't want to bump an act that's offering its services, but we can only do so much before it becomes too much of a problem.

The bigger acts are a different story...and we try to accommodate them as much as possible. Fortunately, a lot of the bigger acts know each other, which makes it easier to work things out. Melissa and Bryan are touring Europe together, which made their sets easy to work out. Melissa wants to play first and Bryan wants to play last...no big deal. Both of them are very easy to work with in that aspect.

Are you concerned about acts playing The Kiss Concert that are also playing other radio station benefits in the same region of the country?

"When you've got 20-something acts, a smaller or medium-level act can't get uppity because, to be honest, I don't need the grief."

No. The Kiss Concert is the mother of all concerts. It's the starting point. I'm sure a few are held before ours, but not many. I'm sure the labels are aware of this; they want to make sure their acts are as fresh as possible because it's a great opportunity for exposure.

Last year, we got coverage from USA Today, MTV, VH1, Entertainment Tonight, E!, CNN, Rolling Stone and ABC, filming an In Concert special. They've rerun clips from that concert all year long. I've seen Blues Traveler do "Run Around" about 100 times this year, which is great because I also see our logo in the background every time. And they'll be back this year to do another special.

What's more, The Kiss Concert always sells out. This year, we did it in six days. Once we're sold out, we're the only source for tickets for a full month.


What's your state of mind on the day of the show—total nervousness or beyond that, watching things run like clockwork?

You always have concerns, but we've got the best staff possible, and these people have been doing it a lot longer than I have. We probably have 50 people there on the day of the show, and they all have their own specific job. Their professionalism makes my job easier. At that point, I'm standing around, getting my picture taken and just making sure no one blows a gasket on something.

Last year, our concert went off without one major incident. There was a minor thing with one artist—every once in a while you'll have that but it didn't affect the show in any negative way.

There must be some legendary behind-thescenes incidents that your staff "fondly" recalls....

There are a couple of big Kiss Concert stories that always crop up. One was the concert where Boy George locked himself in the ladies' room and wouldn't come out. Another one was a battle between Cher and Rod Stewart on positioning in the show. This was during Cher's last comeback tour. Rod ended up being the only artist announced for The Kiss Concert who didn't perform. He was upset and left. Luckily, I haven't had anything like that happen.


The "Biz" Is Good In Eau Claire

Eau Claire, WI Arbitron Market #226 Population: 365,000

WBIZ's PD Dave Daniels recently returned to Z100 as PD after starting there as an intern. From there, he occasionally donned the station's mascot cat costume, took on the responsibility of night personality for two years and, at one time, literally mowed the lawn in front of the station. We think he likes his current position a tad better.

"Z100 Radio has been a heritage Top 40 station in the frequently changing Eau Claire Market. The market has seen a new Hot Country, two new Classic Rocks and various attempts at Oldies and A/C in the past five years. In total, there are over 17 stations in this market. It's a constantly mobile market, so maintaining a format image works favorably for this station. We currently could be catagorized as a Hot A/C looking for the 25-54 audience, although we're not afraid to appeal to the 18-34s and break some new music every once in a while. We don't try to be one of the Top 40 stations; we try to be *the* top 40 station.

"Our on-air belief can be described in four words: real, exciting, professional and fun. Every promotion we do, every word that comes out of our jocks' mouths and every contest on the air encompasses these four words. In fact, you can basically say our station focus is to "be real." TV commercials feature our jocks—not produced voices. We get our jocks into the community as much as we can. We don't give people \$1,000 cash over the phone; we go to their houses and put it in their hands. We emphasize the phones a great deal be-



cause that's our link with the listener. Familiarity can be an incredible advantage in this market and we want the listener to know and be comfortable with our jocks. In fact, morning newsman Mike Sullivan was awarded a Reader's Choice Award by local newspaper subscribers.

"Our on-air lineup is experienced and talented, beginning with Beau, Mike & Wendy in the morning. They're about as diverse a group as you can get with their ages ranging from the 20s to 40s. Beau does an incred-

ible job with the music and has an excellent ear for the hits. Wendy jumps on the middays and I follow up on afternoons. Danno moves in on nights, followed by Greg Moore on overnights. Danno is a production nut and makes our station sound outrageous and flaming.

"Promotions have always been extremely important here and our name has been synonymous with charity. Normally, we're doing three or four charity promotions a month, including The Relay For Life and Christmas Is For Children-two events that are well known in the valley. We're currently involved in two book promotions. One of them, called 'Funmobile,' is a contest where listeners come out and sign their name on a Pontiac Sunbird convertible. At the end of the promotion, a magnet decides who gets the car. It's a great promotion since we take the car to various remotes. It gets the listeners out to the businesses and it gets us out in the community on a frequent basis during the book."

The least-correct contestant gets the phone number of a good attorney.

COST: PRIZES CAN BE TRADED OUT. RETURN: VERY ENTERTAINING ON-AIR CONTEST.

"TIE AND SOCKS BUY-BACK"

At a local mall or, better yet, a local bar, set up a stand where you give free concert tickets, CDs and other music stuff to fathers in exchange for the ties or socks they got for Father's Day.

- COST: MUSIC STUFF SHOULD BE LYING AROUND THE STATION.
- RETURN: TIMELY AND ALL TOO TRUE. Should generate some media attention.

"REMOTE TV CONCENTRATION"

MASS PREGNANCY TEST

Invite "hopefully" expectant mothers and their husbands to a remote (one that has a lot of bathrooms). Give out free pregnancy tests to wives; they take the test and if "the rabbit croaks," they get gift baskets of pickles, whipped cream and chocolates; imminent "fathers" get call-lettered cigars. Those not pregnant get free adult video rental.

COST: PRIZES CAN EASILY BE TRADED OUT. RETURN: SHOULD GENERATE PLENTY OF

COVERAGE WHEN THE RABBIT DIES. Excellent on-air warm-and-fuzzy op.

"CHEF DAD-AR-DEE"

Families submit the recipe for their dads' specialty, be it a barbecue or a mixed cocktail. Choose a handful of winners and, at an outdoor park, have cooks and/or bartenders make their concoctions for all—and award prizes in various categories for the best recipes.

COST: MINIMAL IF PRIZES ARE TRADED OUT.

RETURN: STATION CREATES ITS OWN HIGH-PROFILE ANNUAL MARKET "EVENT."

DELIVERY ROOM DADS

Jocks go to the delivery room

with expectant parents. They help talk them through the delivery, keying in on dad once the baby's out, then provide emotional commentary, basking in the afterglow. Later, they interview family members at hospital to "argue" over who the baby looks more like.

COST: SHOULD BE ABLE TO GET BABY NEEDS FOR MENTIONS.

RETURN: TEARJEARKER-QUALITY WARM-AND-FUZZY.

"MOCK DAD OF THE YEAR"

Same basic jist as "Divorced Dad Day" promo, except the nominees are single mothers.

COST: PRIZES SUCH AS FREE BABYSITTING AND OTHER PAMPERING SERVICES CAN BE TRADED OUT.

RETURN: A GOOD WARM-AND-FUZZY.

"BABIED-SITTER"

Listeners send in 100-word essays on how great their dads are. Read a few on-air and make them "babied-sitters"—take their kids out of the house for a few hours, while they have servants come in to give them a razor shave, a massage, a gourmet meal and, what the hey, some time alone with their wives, until the kids come back later. COST: Services could be traded for mentions.

RETURN: SOUNDS LIKE A LOT OF FUN.

"THAT'S MY BOY/GIRL!"

Kids call station and without giving their names, list their accomplishments (ie: winning a Little League game, making own bed, eating vegetables at the request of parents, getting an "A" on a test). Fathers have to call and proudly yell, "That's my boy/girl!" to win.

RETURN: NICE, ENTERTAINING WARM-AND-FUZZY.
