
KLIF Program Director Todd Wallace was fired Monday morning (4-7) (3 days before the start of the spring ARB sweep) for, as it was explained to him "placing station management in an embarrassing situation on a national level.'When contacted R&R Wallace explained by

"General Manager Klee Dobra alleged, both to me personally and at a general staff meeting that he had it on good authority that I had expressed negative opinions about KLIF and the competence of its management, at the recent R&R Convention in Atlanta. Needless to say this is an untrue statement as anyone who knows me or who spoke to me at the Convention can confirm. It is unfortunate that Mr. Dobra has chosen to base his action on this hearsay rather than giving me the opportunity to confirm or deny the rumor before dismissal, but it is his decision to make, and I most certainly respect his position of authority. On a personal level, the action is doubly disappointing; first that I was not given the opportunity to program KLIF through a rating period that was, and still is, the culmination of one hell of a lot of love and caring, and 100 hour work weeks. Second, over the past month I've turned down 3 very good offers on the basis that I felt a conmitment to KLIF until at least July 1, the end of the ARB and Pulse sweep in Dallas-Ft. Worth. Obviously the station did not feel the same commitment to me. KLIF's General Manager Klee Dobra commenfied: "Several factors entered in management's final decision to relieve Todd Wallace of his responsibilities at KLIF, but the most significant influence was Wallace's opposition to station objectives. Todd's public expression of his opposition created severe credibility problems within the marketplace, embarrassing KLIF to the extent that the station's interests were placed in jeopardy. To have ignored the problem would not have served the best interests of KLIF."

The March 1975 Hooper for allas was released The aay Wallace was terminated, showing KLIF with an average guarter hour share of 23.2 percent in total rated time periods, to their closest competitor's 9.8 percent share (which compares to KLIF's 6.5 Hooper share prior to Wallace's arrival in Dallas) Wallace plans to examine several options before making the final decision and will announce his future plans on May 1. THE FCC (So You Can Understand It)

Most Violated FCC Rules:

The FCC has just recently issued an interesting digest of the Rules most frequently violated by broadcast stations. I think this should serve as a good checklist for you and your engineers as concerns technical operations.

RULES FREQUENTLY VIOLATED BY BROADCAST STATIONS

In response to many requests, the Field Operations Bureau has prepared an anlysis of violation notices (FCC Form 793-A) issued to Broadcast Stations after station inspection and-or measurements by field personnel of the Bureau during Fiscal Year 1974. The list should not be construed to be a tabulation of all. violations observed or those leading to serious consequences. There is no particular significance to the placement of an item in the list, e.g., Section 73.93 is not necessarily the most frequently observed discrepancy. For further information call 202-632-7090 or write to Enforcement Division, File 1100, Washington, D.C. 20554.

OPERATORS REQUIREMENTS

Includes employments of operators with Third Class permits NOT endorsed for broadcast station operation, or AM - 73.93 operators with expired licenses or permits. Also includes FM - 73.265 failure to provide the operators with adequate visibility and accessibility to metering and control equipment from their places of duty.



EBS RADIO MONITORING

EBS monitor receiver was defective or not utilized during AM - 73.932, 73.961 hours of station operation. Failure to transmit weekly off-FM - 73.932, 73.961 the-air monitor tests.

MODULATION LEVELS (AURAL)

Levels consistently in excess of 100 percent on peaks (AM-AM - 73.55 negative peaks) of frequent recurrence. FM - 73.268

Deficiencies include lack of calibration and defective peak indicating device.

REMOTE CONTROL OPERATION

AM - 73.67 FM - 73.275

Operation with defective power adjustment control circuits, or uncalibrated indicating instruments. Failure to terminate operation by remote control when malfunctions cause improper control or inaccurate meter readings. Also for TV, failure to generate, insert, or properly utilize the required test signals (VITS).

REMOTE READING ANTENNA AMMETERS

AM - 73.39 (d) Instruments not calibrated to indicate within 2 percent of main meter for each power mode of operation.

OPERATING POWER

• .	AM - 73.52 _FM - 73.267	Operation for extended periods with power levels greatly in excess of authorized tolerances. Also for certain AM stations, operating pre-sunrise and-or nighttime with full daytime power. In addition for TV, failure to calibrate output power indicators over the tolerance range at six- month intervals.

OTHER GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

AM - Various

Failure to check the antenna lights for proper operation on a daily basis and failure to inspect the lighting system and control circuits at three-month intervals.

Failure to record the results of equipment inspections, adjustments, calibrations, and repairs as well as operations during experimental periods.

OTHER TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

FM - 73.317

Failure to maintain transmitter and associated equipment such that noise and frequency response requirements are met. Failure to install equipment and associated wiring in accordance with pertinent standards and practices.

FM - 73.322

Failure to maintain the 19KHz pilot subcarrier injection (modulation) level within tolerances.

KCBQ PROMOTIONS

Broadcasting executives from around the country, serving as judges, unanimously selected the WASH entry to receive top honors from among entries from 38 states and the District of Columbia. 

FM Rock Radio

Album Oriented Rock radio stations seem extremely concerned and anxious about the upcoming Spring ARB. That's the impression my staff and I got having talked to the Program Directors and Music Directors of 73 AOR's across the country this past week. This coming book is of significance because many stations are finding themselves rapidly losing Progressive exclusivity in their markets, Others are engaged in do or die battles against AM and FM Top 40s.

Many Progressives (and this was stated most vehemently at the convention) are resigned to the allegation that ARB does not give the format it's fair share. Pulses and Hoopers are presented to show the other side of the coin. Other AOR's who do well in the ARB claim that Progressive Radio can be geared to take advantage of the diary survey method.

Two ways that this is tackled is expanded program demographic focus and disciplined format structure mechanics. An example of the former being, "We can pick up morning ratings by giving more information and playing a wider variety of popular music." The latter, "We can raise the ratings by playing the same music, however, putting our breaks in the middle of the quarter hour so as to increase the potential of guarter hour duplication and by saying the call letters more often to enhance the station's identity." Those are simple, common examples, I could go on and on. But I won't, because if you've followed the trades over the past few years, you've seen them all.

I'm not putting down the benefits that research and structured methodology can contribute toward the pursuit of ratings, as a matter of fact | personally have long been one of "research's" loudest supporters. We should be aware, though, that unlike most of the world's recognized "legitimate" sciences, the science of radio research and its effect upon radio programming and mechanics are predicated upon facts, or rather, notions which have never been proven. It's kind of like being told that you're going to live long because the line in your hand runs across your palm and all the way down to your poopik.

Take record sales alone. It is the one person out of every two hundred or more living in this country who buys a particular single giving it gold status who justifies that record being played every two hours on every Top 40 station coast to coast.

Take telephones. It is a small franchise of social misfits who would stand in the rain and cold for seven hours to get two free tickets to a midnight shit pulling exhibition, who make your phones "ring off the Continued on page 35





REGORDS

R&R: Was your first introduction to the record business with your hit single "Everyone's Gone To The Moon?"

KING: Yes, that was the first thing I did. I was eighteen, innocent, sweet and lovely attending Cambridge t'niversity. I was studying English Literature and my hit came at the end of my first year there. It was on Parrot and it was a big hit. They said to me "now you've got to leave the University and start building a career for yourself."

R&R: But how did it all come about? How did you happen to record the song?

KING: Well I had been trying to get into the industry for three years with absolutely no success. I felt that in the early sixties the big thing was going to come through and out of Britain; a really strong musical force. And I was convinced it was me, unfortunately it wasn't. It was those bums Lennon, McCartney, Harrison and Starr -- none of which has done anything. Mick Jagger, all that crowd, those talentless morons! Put that in print! How dare they steal my crowd! But I managed to struggle through sort of like a weasel, like a maggot, amongst all the other things. But I refused to leave the University because I'm a great believer in education. So I stuck on for another two years, which was a strange way to pursue a career. But I always knew that I was never going to be a great singer. My attitude was that I was interested in Pop music... love all music as a whole and was fascinated by the world of entertainment, but I did love, most of all, Literature and 1 wanted to keep my mind sharp and life at the University sharpened the mind. So I stayed on.

R&R: What happened when you got out of school?

KING: Well, after "Everyone's Gone To The Moon," I immediately turned around and started getting into production. I think that's when people like Bob (Wilson) first became aware of me because I wrote and produced a record by the Hedgehoppers Anonymous called "It's Good News Week." It was a very interesting record as it was protest record in an era when protest wasn't really coming through. Around that same time, P.F. Sloane started emerging with the "Eve of Destruction" song. But when I did my "Good News" record, it was banned from most of the stations. It was a huge hit in about ten of the fifty states and as a result it charted on Billboard in the forties. It was a reasonable hit and sold about seventy thousand. It's most noticed on those collections of golden oldies albums where it tends to emerge next to "Everyone's Gone To The Moon." It was a fairly significant step in my career because immediately from being a singer, I got behind the scenes in the industry. I had always wanted to be a producer and I was then successful because it was a top three record in England. So I was happening as a producer and writer as well as just being a performer. Because I never really saw myself as a sex symbol. As I have matured, however, I have become a sex symbol!

R&R: As a mental sex symbol? **KING:** No, no. A physical sex symbol. Ask any of your radio PD's and MD's. I have no mind you see; my mind is buried deep in my groin. See if you publish that!

R&R: You might be surprised! So what happened after "Good News" became a big hit?

KING: I still went to the University and started doing a few rather strange things. I began writing a column for one of the An Interview With

music papers in England. It was then called "Music-Atco" and then it amalgamated with Disc and it became "Disc & Music-Atco." It was a regular weekly column which was a gas because I used to tell people about things I was hearing, good things actually, before they happened and also occasionally criticized them. One of my more noteworthy columns was when I described Tom Jones as sonified underarm body odor." And later that night, in a club called The Cromwell Inn, he came running across the club trying to smash my face in. He had to be torn away from me by Gordon Mills and Tanny Hall who was a promotion man in England. I was saying "hold the front pages. Photographers where are you!?" Great publicity you know. But the column was a fairly interesting thing to do.

R&R: What was the name of the

column? KING: It was just my column. We never called it anything. It had a picture of me with a crown on my head, which is what really should have happened... but perhaps something went wrong in my early background. But 1 just signed it Jonathan King and it became interesting and very well read.

R&R: So you were writing your column and you were still in school? KING: Right. After I finished the University I was immediately off T٧ chat own my nationally networked... Johnny Carson type thing. I was then twenty-two and very naive and innocent and thought "oh television! What a marvelous medium, must go on it." It was opposite the Simon Dees Show and The Monkees were on the other channel, who were actually good friends of mine. R&R What was the name of your

R&R What was the name of you show?

KING: It was called "Good Evening, I'm Jonathan King." That one did have a title. I remember it distinctly. We used to have a lot of Pop things and we broke several pop

records on there as well. The rest was general talk thing. I used to have people on talking about the Vietnam War, politics, films, books, etc. It was very general, but it was really different than chat shows (i.e. Johnny Carson) because the only constant in the show was myself and the audience. We would have various people on to talk about certain topics and we would have a discussion with say three people on say the Vietnam War and their opinions and after five to ten minutes, after I thought we'd said anything new that had to be said, I'd stand up and say "thank you" and walk out of the set linking into the next topic that we'd be going into which might be a musical number or whatever. I would walk into a new set where there might be two or three other people like Julie Christie or Carl Forman, or something, talking about a new movie they'd made and I'd sit down and say ''now let's look at a clip from this film," and that made the show flow better

than the way it usually happens. R&R: That's a good concept.

There is no awkwardness then. KING: Right. Now what you have

at the end of a chat show is seventeen guests all sitting around. R&R: So how long did the show

run? KING: It was originally booked for six weeks and ran for twenty-six weeks. The way it finished was interesting because I began to find the world of television like taking a morning dip in a tank of piranha

fish. I mean, you think there are sharks in this industry... no way, compared to television. The politics and the backbifing and everything going on was actually staggering R&R: So you got out of it?

KING: Well, you know, the Beatles used to be good fans of the show and they had a record called "Hello Goodbye" and they wanted to give us a world exclusive on it. They'd done a film clip and they wanted us to have the world exclusive on it. Tony Bramble at Apple rang me up and asked if I would like the exclusive. So I said "I'd love it, thanks." i rushed along the corridors to the guy that was in charge of the department and said "Look what we've got an exclusive on The Beatles!" And the guy says "Ah, the Beatles are finished. They've gone over the hill. They're not of interest to the wide audiences we're trying to appeal to anymore, Jonathan.'' Anyway the long and short of it was that he told me to turn it down. So I went back and put one call in to Tony and said we can't do it. And then the next six calls I madewere to all the national newspapers, and the television company was ATV, very big television company. And every front page of every paper the next day carried the headline ATV SAYS BEATLES ARE FINISHED. And later that day I was called along the corridors and informed that my TV show would finish at the end of the current six week series. And it did. And I was delighted. I went to bed with an ulcer after it. It gave me a duodenal ulcer at age twenty-two!

R&R: That took a lot of guts.

KING: I was fed up with it anyway. I didn't want to do a bloody TV show. I was spending each week learning about boring things I didn't want to know about because you really had to know a lot about those subjects, but only superficially. I'm fairly superficial anyway, and that was just destroying me because I was becoming so superficial that 1 didn't know if there was anything underneath. But I definitely saw a lot of talent emerging and cherish that as a memory of which I am very fond. But artists have changed. Artists now are cunts! (excuse me! | didn't really say that Candy!)

R&R: In what way? Do you mean they are temperamental?

KING: If we could have a business without artists and musicians, this business would really be great. We could have great records and great fun and everything would be marvelous. We would all make a lot of money Artists tend, generally, to have extremely small brains and an even lower moral capacity. I've known them. I used to be an artist. They're dreadful at the current moment and they're really shifting on people. If you tell them that they're talented, they believe you for a start, and then start thinking that not only are they talented, but they are one hundred percent the sole and only reason for their success. They forget all those great writers of three hundred years ago later who died penniless and those great painters who needed posterity hundred years later to bring them

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through. They feel the record company bullshit and the radio. stations bullshit are all totally unnecessary and that it's their talent that brings them through. And they also have no regard for contracts. In all that great, grand signings of contracts, in an artist's mind, that is nothing more than signing an autograph. Now we as record companies and radio people look ahead. We anticipate the profits and losses we're going to make. We spend a million dollars this year to build these four artists in four years time and in the last year of their contract we'll make a lot of money where we needn't be spending, so much. That's the way we work and that's the way we think.

R&R: And then artist splits?

KING: The artists split at about year two or three just as they've broken. And I think what's going to happen soon is that a lot of the record companies are going to put their backs against ali simultaneous wall and we're all going to say "no!" And when the artists say "what do you mean no?" we're going to say, "we mean, no, we're not signing you while you're under contract to another label even if you feel you have a genuine reason for being out of that contract. We are putting our backs against the wall to make contracts legitimate and legal." My contracts now have a lot of clauses added which I don't think the other record companies have, excluding certain previous court proceedings and precedents. And I say to my artists "before you sign this, check with your lawyer to see what these clauses mean so that you'll know."

R&R: So getting back to your earlier life, what happened after the TV Show was cancelled?

KING: Well I sort of laid back a bit. I became disallusioned with the business when I had an anti-drug single out called "Round, Round" whichwas a hit incertain parts of the states thanks to Bill Drake and Bill Gavin. But it was banned in England because they said I shouldn't talk about drugs, period, even though the song was against drugs, it made people think about drugs. So I thought, they're all balmy. That's it. I can't take it' anymore. So for about two years I completely dropped out, but I still was doing very well because the column was still roaring on and I was doing some disc jockey shows and various bits and pieces of money was rolling in. But I began to sort of look around and even though I wasn't making record, I still was looking at the industry objectively and felt that it needed a bit of sharpening up. I'd always been fond of Decca which is London Records where I had been with in the early days. The Chairman of The Board of Decca was a guy called Sir Edward Lewis, who is one of the great old men of the record industry. He's in his early seventles now, and has a wealth of experience behind him you wouldn't believe. I kept pestering him to ta ake me o and troubleshooter and he finally did.

R&R: Were you based in London and cover the continent?

KING: It was international. I was coming over to the States a lot. I was beavering around. I had no official position, but I was like his right hand man on my levels. I was responsible only to him, yet I didn't really have anything to do. We put out a lot of oldies and I started the revived oldie trend in England in 1968-699. This started happening and it was a gas. I learned incredible things from him and from working for him. I had

gone in there thinking "I'm gonna teach this old guy how the new young people are thinking" and I learned more and more from him ... much more than he did from melBut then! decided that I live very comfortably. I have to have several thousand dollars a year to live in the style to which I am accustomed. I thought this really isn't the way to live. I wasn't really being paid huge amounts. So at the end of snuggy '70, i turned to Lewis and said "look I'm goingto go back to making records." And I split; I gave it all up. My Mother, who handles my financial affairs, called and said I was getting a bit in the red. So I said ''fine, I'll quit my job.'' She said ''that's certainly a strange reaction!" But I said "No, I'll make records and produce and make money that way." When you're young, you've got a lot of confidence!

R&R: How old are you now Johnathan?

KING: Twenty-eight. So I came running forward with all these hits and they came bubbling through. It was fantastic. In the year 1971, I'd stolen Mickey Most's crown as top producer of the year. I think I had fifteen top ten records in England and started a whole new trend.

R&R: Which ones? KING: Well I did weird things. I

sang on most of my records as a session singer by twisting my voice around and stuck myself under various names. So three times that year there were three records in the Top Twenty all of which featured me as a lead singer. It was a gassy thing to do because we have a TV show in England called Top Of The Pops which features the records each week plus a photograph of the star. So there I was three times and they had to run my picture three times and they didn't know what to do because it was always under another name. The first big hit I had was a revised version of "The Same Old Song" which was a Four Tops song, which I did with one violin ... very strange. I was trying to think of a name for the group when Phil Ochs, an old friend, was in London at the time and he was then associated with a group of anarchists called The Weathermen. Right? But he was never really serious. Deep down inside he's a very soft muddly reactionary. So we were walking around Dicken's house. You know these Americans come to England and must see that house. And he was saying "gee--- is that the bed Dickens slept in?" And I said "Yes, Phil, but this is all very boring and I must think of a name for the group. I've got to get this record out!" And he was saying "Is that really the chair Dickens sat on?" And I said "I'm sure it is, Phil, absolutely guaranteed. But what can I call this bloody group?!" And he said "The Weathermen." And I thought it was a gas. It was so serious, but the song was a light bubblegum record. And it was a smash and once more the Top Of The Pops wanted a photograph and I thought 'I just can't send them another one of me!" So I sent them a picture of my car which was a long white . Daimler, with a TV aerial and black windows. For twelve weeks it went up the charts, stopped at the Top 5 with a picture of this car. I could image all the people at home, you know, seeing all those people smilling into the camera looking like superstars and suddenly this car would come on. It really freaked them out. But it was a great year for me. I came out with a load of hits. R&R: What was the situation with

"Hooked On A Feeling." KING: Well I made that record in

KING: Well I made that record in 1971 as Jonathan King, `actually; it,

was one of the ones I didn't put a false name on. It turned out to be a reasonably sized Top 20 hit in England and a very big hit in some other territories including the Netherlands where it was number one. And was it. It never happened in America. Anyway, two years later in 1973 I got a cablegram from Sweden sent by a guy who was a producer with EMI in Sweden. It read "you'll be interested to know that I've done a note for note exact copy cover version of your "Hooked On A Feeling" record and it's number one here in Sweden." Well I thought "that's cheeky" but I also thought it was quite amusing because how many records can you sell in Sweden with a number one record ... 5,000? But I wasn't so amused when about three months later Bhaskar Menon and his crowd at Capitol, who are very good workers and pretty shrewd, picked up the Swedish record, stuck it out there and within three days it was on the charts. Within six weeks, it was number one. And it's an identical record to mine. But not one radio station in the States played my version. It's a 'situation you don't know; the timing might have been better. I've been told I've always been ahead of my time, which sounds super, but is the most frustrating thing in the world. Not only do you make no money, but you die of frustration when you see people have success with things you started. The great thing about the record is that at least it's a hell of a well made record. You really resent it if they do a bad job of your record. But it was a good one, I felt that at least the guy had taken my ideas and done them well. So actually deep down I didn't resent it that much. And then they had a couple of other hits and I was pleased because they obviously did have talent and so did the producer. So all I did was send him lots of letters saying please bring your records to me instead of Capitol.

S. ECORDS

R&R: So at that point what did you do?

KING: Well I'm very much a man of the present and not the past. I had lots of hits in England and Europe and was top producer in 1971, but I decided to go zooming around the States. I've got a lot of friends over here that are nice, shrewd, intelligent people like Jerry Moss, Mo Ostin, Bill & Janet Gavin. I found out that basically the record industry had a totally different philosophy to the one I had about records and there was very little humor in the record industry. And I had the most massive quantities of that. I just didn't have any talent, but I had lots of humor. But the one thing that convinced me was a long chat I had with Clive Davis when he was up at CBS who I'd not met before. Al Gallico, who is a lovely guy and my publisher, took me up to meet Clive and I sat with Clive for a long while and all we did the entire time, as Clive well remembers, was argue. He told me that I was mad; that my whole approach to groups and artists was up the wall; that I was. never going to be a success. I told him that he was a bore; that he was an executive using the record industry to climb up the ladder of administration... we just argued and argued. At the end of that, I thought to myself "there's only one way to get a crack here, King, start your own label." Well, what I thought was an easy little thing turned out to be a monster. In England it was a huge success, in Europe as well. We did massive sales. We chocked up twenty or thirty Top thirty records in England since we started.

R&R: Which groups were you breaking then?

KING: Well we had four 10CC Records, "Beach Baby" by The First Class. We've picked up a lot of American product like "I Love You To Want Me" by Lobo, The Kevin Johnson "Rock 'N Roll" which was Top 20 for us in England, because we'rê stronger than anyone else in England. I had a couple myself. But my philosophy in those early days with the label was all wrong. I thought you took a good promotion man and stuck him in an office and it's all fine. I hadn't worked out the idea that you've got to have the man working closely with a field team and he's got to do all the rest of the things. So I brought in Don Wardell, who had been head of promotion in England for Decca. I was then going with the philosophy that if you've got a good executive that you believe in, in any kind of territory; he'll pull throught I mean take an Al Coury and stick him Thailand he'll have the Thai scene sewn up within three weeks and he'll be publishing their charts within six months. A good record executive who knows his stuff will dominate any market he goes into on whatever level he's good at. R&R: So what happened with Don and U.K. in the States?

KING: Well I brought Don in and he spent a lot of money and he ran like mad and really got to learn the industry. He found out how you break records and how you get exposure and get people started on things. There are a lot of people out there who helped. Some very nice gassy people out there in radioland who have really helped us get on our feet and give us shots on records. I am beginning to feel stronger and stronger that the radio people are the nicest as a bunch The nicest crowd of people that I've ever come across. The other day I was in San Francisco with John Barbis who's our promotion man up there and at the end of the day we sat down and said "do you know we spent the entire day with people we like? It's absolutely fantastic. Now how many people can say that?" We saw Bill & Janet, Gary Taylor; we had lunch with John Bettencourt at KLIV, dinner with Dave Sholin and they're all groovy people. I thought to myself "King, it's not that bad. At least you're involved with a really nice lot of people." Mind you, they all thought I was a shit. For them it was miserable!

R&R: So tell me how you got involved with The Rocky Horror Show?

KING: Well it's an amusing story. was lying in bed one morning, a thing I very rarely do, drinking my coffee, Maxwell instant, because l'm a loner, a bachelor; so you don't go around making your own coffee! I read this review of a repertory thing which had opened in what they call the "Theatre Upstairs" at the Royal Court in Sloan Square in London. The Royal, Court is a very prestigious theatre, but the Theatre Upstairs is where they stick things that really don't stand a chance. It's equivalent to night-time play on radio. If you really want to do John Barbis a favor, you'll stick his record on night-time play, which means he gets rotation on two plays at twelve and four in the morning heard by three lorrie drivers. So when he calls three weeks later, you can say "John, I tested it on nighttime play and It's a stiff!" So the Theatre Upstairs is much like that; just a little fifty seat affair in the attic of The Royal Court. When it rains, it's got a tin roof and you can't hear the words; all you can hear is BANG, BANG, BANG. Anyway I read the review by Jack Tinker who had gone the night before and he didn't even say it was a musical; he just said "this is a gas!" So I im-

mediately got turned on to see the show. If anyone wants to read that review, it's on the back of all our albums. So I rang up to see if they had seats and they had all fifty available Nobody was going to that thing. So I went and it was a musical and not only was it a musical, but it was fabulous! It was innocent and naive in the filthiest way. For all intents and purposes, it was fiithy! But it was a gas; it was fun; it was magic. All in all, I just enjoyed it. And I thought to myself as I was watching it "well, this is a musical and I am a record company" so that night I was in their dressing rooms and I said "I want this, please." And they said "you want it? Nobody picks up the soundtrack record of a show in repertory; it's just not done." I had it signed three nights later. Two weeks later, every record company in town heard about it and went running for it, but I got the rights to the original London cast. It earns money from performances all over the world and everythingelse that happens to come in including other soundtrack albums, etc.

R&R: What was the association of Ode Records with the play?

KING: Well we were going to open in America, obviously and the one who was running hardest for it was Lou Adler, who was another record man who owned The Roxy/Theatre. And I thought The Roxy was the gassiest place to put it on. So he has the soundtrack to that show and I have the original London soundtrack. In fact I'm spreading the word "UK Records' Rocky Horror Show's Parents Thank Ode Records For Doing Such A Fine Job of Looking After Our Baby!"

R&R: Who will be doing the movie?

KING: I think it's 20th Century Fox.

R&R: Will you have anything to do with it?

KING: I'll just get a chunk of the profits. But Lou, of course, is coproducer of the movie and everything as well, I mean, he's also aot the publishing in America. We've imported 10,000 of our albums for the New York opening. When it comes to "Rocky" I wanted to be involved with it. I wanted the image of my label to range from "Beach Baby" to a Rocky Horror Show right across the board. I don't want anyone saying ''we can't take that record to Jonathan; it's Country & Western; or Jonathan isn't ininterested in R&B." Even though we're small and véry, very choosy, l want the whole scale of things. I want to be associated with the very

best in every sphere of the industry. R&R: Where do you see U.K. Records going and where do you see the music going?

KING: Well I never look at trends. Trends are of total lack of interest to me because any trend I look at is something which is past and has bloomed. It's rather like collecting flowers with all the petals dropping off. I mean if you and I are going in for fads; if we've got any sense we'll go in for seeds. If we've not got that much sense, we'll go in fo And if we got any bit of sense at all, we'll go in for flowers that are just beginning to bloom. But there's no way we're going to pick up flowers that have completely bloomed and are beginning to die. And for me, as soon as you know a trend, it's over. But I have a suspicion, a horrible feeling, that that's the part of the reason why we have all our problems -- why we have our "Hooked On A Feeling" problems and our Mac David problems with "Rock 'N Roll." I suspect that some of my problems are created by the fact that I'm not interested in Continued on page 35



Bootleg tapes cost you, your listeners, your customers, everybody money. Bootleg tapes are any tapes which contain masters of music which contains the voice or instrumental impressions of artists contracted to record labels whose logo (trademark) does not appear on the cartridge or cassette. When you see uncopyrighted tapes by an obvious artist, call MCA's office in Nashville, (615) 244-2840, or the National Promotion Director for any major record label in Nashville, collect, and give the details. This is one definite way you and your listener can be helfpul in arrest and prosecution of tape pirates. Post this on your bulletin board or control room wall.

The new Elton John album originally set for release this month, will probably be held back until the middle of May.

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

hook" and "light up like a Christmas tree" for "Don't Eat Yellow Snow." This is not really meant to be cute. Just think back to how many times you've read in the trades elaborate spreads in which various programming geniuses, who can intimidate the hell out of you with their elaborate discertations on extraordinary rating getting techniques, go on to get fired when their stations fall out of the ARB six months later.

So if you want to get a good ARB follow this simple step by step method:

1. Get sales tabulations on every record that was ever sold in your market including the age and sex of every person who bought them. This can easily be obtained from the freak who answers the phone at your local record store.

2. Conduct an in-depth interview with every resident in your market and try to convince each one to listen to your radio station between 6AM and Midnight. This will obviously increase the probability of diaries falling into the right hands.

3. Attach electrodes to the nipples of a few of your "typical" listeners and get readings on their autonomic biological processes when you play various records for them.

.4. Be impressed by everything you read and tell other people in the business that you do it too.

5. Spread good vibes among your station's staff and have a real family type operation.

Then take all the information that you've compiled and decide exactly how you will apply it to the sound of your station. That's the only slightly difficult part.

Seriously, the really smart programmers know that science and research are excellent tools and aids to justify and back up objectivity, gut reaction, creativity, and common sense.

For this Spring ARB, I wish you good luck and good magic.

R&R: Which Kung Fu was that? tunny record was a record I put out under my own name. Strangely enough, it was about a year and a half ago called "The Kung Fu Anthem." A lot of people have told me that they were influenced by that record. I've read quite a few interviews with people associated with that type of record who said they were highly influenced by my record. It was a record that got good airplay, but it was very much a record that had no success at the time. I think we were, again, ahead of our time. Sometimes it's disturbing to know you're so offen ahead, but generally it's satisfying.
