Eaton Defends WOOK


Richard Eaton, Chairman of the Board and President of United Broadcasting Co., released the following comments regarding last week's license revocation of United's WOOK/ Washington D.C. "... We were, of course, shocked and believe the Commission's action to be grossly inequitable and unwarranted ... " Eaton told of the Commission's principle witness against WOOK being a disgruntled former employee and a convicted felon, who allegedly furnished the FCC with false information. Eaton stated, "...We believe that this man's testimony so poisoned the record as to make it impossible for the Commission to arrive at a fair decision based on the record. We had planned to ask the Commission to reopen the hearing to investigate this matter and to take the necessary action to assure WOOK a fair hearing." Eaton teels confident that if there is a new hearing United will remain the licensee of WOOK.

WAKY/Louisville's afternoon drive jock Tom Dooley was the honorary chairman for this year's St. Jude Radiothon benefiting the St. Jude Hospital. Over \$26,000 was raised in pledges and cash contributions, with Tom spending 72 sleepless hours to promote the benefit.

MAKING A HIT

WEEO/Waynesboro renamed their jocks to help expose their latest "Count the Hits" promotion. Contest centers around a Mafia theme, with jocks dubbed "Greg Hot Shot Scott," "Ed Vito The Musico Alexander" and various other pseudonyms. MAJOR RETAILERS HIT

SEARS ATTACKED ON SALES ADVERTISING

The Chicago Bureau of Weights and Measures has charged Sears Roebuck & Co. with false advertising, stemming from spot inspections which produced evidence that advertised sales merchandise was not available, and that sales advertising did not list termination dates of the sales.

SAFEWAY ACCUSED BY FTC

The Federal Trade Comission has accused the Safeway grocery store chain of not selling items to customers at advertised prices. Price problems stemmed from shelf items not being lowered to advertised figures. The FTC did not point out any specific locations where the pricing was incorrect, and Safeway countered the accusation by saying that the mis-priced items were due to human error. The company plans to contest the Commission's allegations.

FAST FOOD CHANGES

MCDONALDS TO TEST NEW MCPRODUCTS

McDonalds Restaurants will test market two new products in undisclosed locations. The "McFeast," a large hamburger with tomatoe and lettuce, would compete with Burger King's "Whopper." The second product is the "McSundae," an ice cream dessert.

NEW KENTUCKY FRIED CHICKEN CAMPAIGN

For the second time in 6 months, Kentucky Fried Chicken will embark on a new advertising theme, replacing the "Hey, it's a Kentucky Fried Chicken Day" with the new logo "Real Goodness from Kentucky Fried Chicken." The new objectives for the campaign center around increasing awareness of the complete line of foods available from the chain, and possible special promotions by the company.

CAR MAKERS RESHAPE FOR '76

CHEVY'S SMALL CARS WILL BE BIG

The introduction of Chevrolet's latest small car, the Chevette, will mark the beginning of the company's campaign to become the largest manufacturer of small cars in the world. Advertising for the full line of compact Chevys will encompass almost two thirds of the ads introducing the fall lineup.

Listeners could call in to make up a song title with Tush in it. Imagination ran rampant as callers came in with such titles as "Colour My Tush." "Wasted Days & Wasted Tush," "Out Of Tush," and the celebrated hit "Best Of My Tush."



WCOL/Columbus' Super COL Spirit Makers are all "shirted" up to prepare to call on the station's clients to herald the beginning of their Bicentennial push. September has been an active month at the station, with many promotions begun and in the planning stages. Their "Phrase That Pays" contest features callouts by jocks, with almost 20% of those called knowing the phrase, "Keep The Spirit On WCOL." A 1975 Pontiac was recently awarded a lucky listener, one of over 12,000 entries in the "Spirit On WCOL" car giveaway.



JUDGE RECOMMENDS TERMINATION OF WTIX(AM) HEARING

FCC Administrative Law Judge Arthur A. Gladstone has concluded an investigation into allegations by a New Orleans listener that WTIX [AM], licensed to Storz Broadcasting Co., had broadcast an announcement urging armed citizens to assist city police in apprehending a sniper in the New Orleans Howard Johnson Motel January 7, 1973.

Judge Gladstone said there was no sufficient substantial basis to warrant an evidentiary hearing on the matter with respect to WTIX or any other FCC licensee in New Orleans. He recommended the hearing be terminated and that no further proceedings be instituted on the matter.

The judge concluded that there was a very strong probability that the alleged broadcast requesting assistance from armed civilians did not occur.

"Instead," he said, "something which one or more announcers said, on different stations at different times, was probably misunderstood by some few members of the public. In retrospect, it is difficult to say whether what was misunderstood was an interview with the police at the scene, a description of the movement of police marksmen from one vantage point to another, a monitored report from the police radio, or even the announcement that the police were not in need of assistance from armed citizens."

The judge said while one and perhaps four armed citizens did arrive at the scene and offer their service to police, "If the broadcast media did make the claimed broadcast announcement over one or more radio and TV stations, as claimed by the witnesses so testifying, the public response was remarkably ineffectual and miniscule. That fact tends to belie the proposition that such a broadcast did, in fact, occur."

On May 1, 1973, the FCC received a petition to deny the renewal applications of WTIX and a number of other New Orleans radio stations. The basis for the petition, filed by Johnny Jackson, Jr. and Bill Rouselle, individually, and on behalf of the Southern Media Coalition, was an allegation by a New Orleans listener [Linda G. Rousseve] that she had heard WTIX and possibly other New Orleans radio stations, broadcast the following announcement on the afternoon of January 7, 1973:

"We gotten word that the New Orleans Police Department are in need of help from private citizens to catch the sniper. Private citizens with guns will be allowed to pass [sic] behind the lines or barricade to assist the police in their efforts."

The petitioners alleged that the quoted announcement was not anthorized by the city police and that it not only endangered the public, but also nearly incited a riot, and that such irresponsible conduct was unbecoming of a Commission licensee.

In a subsequent letter, Jackson and Rouselle told the Commission that they wished to withdraw the petition insofar as it related to WGSO, WQUE-FM, WYLD, WBOK and WNPS, other New Orleans stations.


On September 25, 1974, the FCC denied the petition to deny the licensees for all the New Orleans stations, other than WTIX, on the ground of lack of specificity. At the same time, the Commission set the Storz application for hearing on issues to determine whether the licensee willfully broadcast an unauthorized and unsolicited request for armed citizens, whether Storz or its employees misrepresented to the FCC material facts concerning the alleged broadcast, and whether in light of all the evidence addnced, grant of the renewal application would serve the public interest.

Although Storz vigorously denied that such a broadcast took place on its facilities, the Commission, in an order released March 6, 1975, instituted the investigation stating that the licensee's petition for reconsideration raised "substantial questions which warrant a departure from our standard practice of not entertaining petitions for reconsideration of a designation order... we believe sufficiently serious questions have been raised to justify inquiry into whether a hearing is actually warranted."

The purpose of the investigation was to determine whether a sufficiently substantial basis existed warranting a hearing on the matter with respect to WTIX or any other FCC licensee.







Highlights Of NAFMB

The National Association Of FM Broadcasters held their National Radio Broadcasters Conference & Exposition September 17-20 in Atlanta. Attendance was estimated at over 1200 broadcasters, mostly station general managers, sales managers, as well as the various exhibitors. The exhibitions included everything from T-Shirts to the latest equipment designs, including control boards, automation computers and transmitters.

The biggest news of the four day event was the NAFMB's decision, at the Saturday membership meeting, to

change the organizations name to the National Radio Broadcasters Association, NRBA. The name change met no opposition among the members. NRBA President James Gabbert, of K-101, San Francisco, and the Chairman of the Board Robert Herpe, of WPOR New Haven, were very

pleased with the new name. The main reason for the change was to bring into the fold AM radio broadcasters as well as FM. An underlying reason was to make the organization total radio and not to include the Television media as does the National Association of Broadcasters.

The opening keynote speaker was Jack Thaver, President


of NBC Radio, New York. The Mayor of Atlanta, Maynard lackson, was in attendance and welcomed all broadcasters to Atlanta. Jackson was followed at the opening day luncheon by Republican congressman Louis Frey from Florida who talked on radio station license renewal.

Richard E. Wiley, Chairman of the FCC in Washington. spoke at the Friday luncheon about the shorter license renewal form. Wiley also gave some encouragement to FM

broadcasters by saying the FCC hopes to, in the future, cutback on simulcast programming

Matthew Coffey, President of the Association of public Radio Stations gave the Saturday keynote speech. Noted civil rights and political leader Julian Bond talked about black radio programming and about the responsibility of Blacks in radio broadcasting.

There were many interesting panels and exhibits that kept the convention-goers busy



The final event of the conference was the Golden Radio Awards Banquet. Only two awards were given to outstanding persons in the broadcast industry. The awards are for persons who have given

outstanding service to the industry. This year's awards went to Hal Kassens, an engineering consultant with A.D. Ring and Associates in Washington, D.C. Kassens was a former assistant FCC chief and was one of the early pioneers of FM broadcasting. He also helped set many of the standards of stereo broadcasting. The other was to Sol Taishoff. Editor of Broadcasting Magazine.



RECORD INDUSTRY NOTES

Wings kicked off their worldwide tour last week in Paul McCartney's home town of Liverpool, England, performing a two hour non-stop show featuring twenty-eight songs. The former Beatle appeared in a black and white kimono in a stage show that was noticeably absent of glitter and gimmickry. Three hand-painted backdrops provided the only "color." According to one reporter, "it was 'Beatlemania' all over again. The entire crowd (3,500) stood on their seats throughout the show and 500 of them rushed the stage." McCartney opened the show with his 'Venus & Mars'' album including "Rock Show" and "Spirits of Ancient Egypt" segueing into several old Beatle songs such as "Lady Madonna" and "The Long And Winding Road." The highlight of the evening came when McCartney appeared alone in a single spotlight playing acoustic guitar and singing his "Yesterday" and "Blackbyrd." "You could hear a pin drop;" said one attendee. "The charisma and magnetism of McCartney was absolutely incredible. He was in complete control of the audience. After the solo the band was brought back, rocking into "Magneto & Titanium Man," "Junior's Farm," "Call Me Back Again," "My Love," and closing the concert with "Band On The Run." The crowd literally wouldn't let McCartney off the stage, giving him rounds of standing ovations earning them two encores. The group left for a London performance to be followed by a tour in Australia and Japan. 


ALBUM ORIENTED ROCK

With the advent of "scientific" programming of music came the struggle to label songs according to their demographic appeal. This song appeals to women, this one to men. Age, economic status, race, and on and on. Programmers determine these lables by either gut findings and/or opinions of other programmers. This is all quite valid a consideration, however, the old "mis-application of a theory" concept can sometimes lead you astray. When you stop to think that mass tastes are really a fuzzy blend of numerous individual (as relating to one person) variations, too much can be taken for granted and, worse, too much can be overlooked.

Very few human responses are based upon one single motivation. There is that subtle level of conciousness, that people are hesitant to talk about, that causes them to do the things they do and "like" the things they like. I would venture to put forth the theory that this factor is as, if not more, important for programmers to get a handle on, than the obvious "young men like hard rock" and "middle aged women like soft music" type generalizations. Who knows, maybe there are pattersn and generalizations that could be drawn from individual subtle levels of conciousness, if the truths were known.

The point is (and you can check this out by observing your own thoughts and responses) every piece of music a built in "Fantasy Potential." That is something intangable about the song that appeals to the listener on a covert non-musical level. People actually use music as a soundtrack to catalyze mental movies. Some are replays of memories, some total make



believe, and, if you search your own soul, you'll find some are quite bizarre. This is the kind of information that is definately difficult to extract from a casual interviewee.

People do strange things when they listen to music in private. Have you ever walked in on a jock in the control room and take him by surprise? Has anyone ever walked in on you? On, perhaps, a less extreme level, have you ever watched the person in the car next to you listening to the radio? What's going on in that bouncing head?

When I was teaching music at N.Y.U., I invited Kip Cohen to speak to the class and share his then fresh Filmore experiences. He said something then that I've never forgotten. He described music as being broken down into three categories of listener appeal: Cardiac, Cerebral, and Testicular. If music does, indeed, touch those "parts" of the anatomy, just think of the multitude of fantasies that could be spawned.

R&R: Call it the "winning factor," whatever?


CLIFTON: I just call it magic. When I hear a station that KCKC/SAN BERNARDINO SOUNDS magical.

CLIFTON: I can hear it all the time. I don't know what it is either, but there's something there. Maybe it has to do with the sound of the station. In New York at 99X, we were dealing with not only the normal situation in a radio station where you have 7 disc jockeys and 4 newspeople, we had, besides your sales people and all the other people in the radio station, management and all. In that radio station, because it is in a major market and because it deals with double union situation, we had board operators. We had several engineers who did maintenance, worked on the transmitter, came up with creative ways to make the station sound better. What I'm trying to get at is there were over a hundred people who worked at that radio station and every single one of them was aiming at the same thing, and every single one of them was as involved as everybody else. That's what made it sound good. The board op's took pride in making the way that they operated the board sound better than anybody else had ever done it. The disc jockeys took pride in what they did and made sure that everything they did was the best they could possibly do all the time. vemen and people and the general manager and the girl that answered the switchboard and the request line people, everybody felt the same way about it. It was the most fun place to walk into that you could every go in your life, cause it was so loose and yet so tight, if you know what I'm talking about. **R&R:** How many hours a day would you say you work?

R&R: What about talent today? They have been replaceable in the style of radio that we are talking about, the old style of radio, where they were just a voice being able to say the call letters and shotgun style over the end of a record, and push a button.

CLIFTON: They were pretty replaceable, you're right, it wasn't hard to find a guy who could do the time and all that crap. Anyway, where is the motivation for somebody to get into radio? Can you honestly say to a young kid who walks into the station, "Listen, if you do a real good job and work yourself to death, and all of that, you can make \$50,000 a Vear.

R&R:More important, where is the reason for a young kid who listens to the radio to want to idantify with the person on the air and say "hey, I'd like to be like him." Forget the money, all he's doing is just giving the time and pushing buttons. What do you think the results of that aro going to be? I mean we've already gone through 5 years of that now. Probably even more than that because the end of Boss Radio or the copies of Boss Radio, were all mechanical, where they didn't realize that Sebastian Stone had a damn good staff where he was, and that Ron Jacobs had a damn good personality staff here in L.A.

CLIFTON: Yeah, I was listening to this California Special that Ron put together. He played an aircheck on the thing, like one of the 15 minute segments

R&R: Robert W.?

CLIFTON: Robert W. Morgan. R&R: Followed by Wolfman lack

CLIFTON: Right. When I was just getting going in this busi-ness, you know KHJ was the station that was the greatest in the country, and we all listened to it and drooled. I hadn't really heard KHJ like it was then, for a long time, and then hearing it on the radio, it just makes it a lot more realistic. It was an incredible radio station when Ron Jacobs had it, just listening to that 15 minute aircheck, Robert W. Morgan was real, he talked a lot, he had things to say, he had very good momentum, everything was right. It sounded good. KHJ the way it sounded then would be a killer radio station today.

R&R: I don't know if it was you or not that said it once before when we talked, but it stayed with me, the idea that if you take somebody's aircheck, and you clip out the call letters and the time, and any reference to city, and then play it back for the jock you airchecked, if it could then be played anywhere else in the country, with new call letters, the obviously the man was not contributing a bit to the community.

That's the first thing they have to learn. They have to learn how to be a disc jockey first of all. As soon as they learn that, and that doesn't take very long. If you're willing to take the time out and teach them how to do this stuff, a guy can learn how to be very very good at the basics in say 3 months. Then, after he's learned that, after he's comfortable sitting in the chair behind the microphone. then you start. Then you get him to try to do one or two bits an hour that will relate to the community. They can take records in, the disco guys are happy to play them one time. As long as they have a good beat, the people still dance to them. Might make radio just a little bit better. The only real statement that I can make is that everytime you turn around you hear somebody saying, and I've said the same thing from time to time and everybody relates to it is, "Is Top 40 dead," or whatever, are the days of Top 40 radio limited. I would have to say that based on the original philosophy of Top 40 radio, that it is impossible for Top 40 radio to be anything but the controlling kind of radio station in any market

where it is done well. It's impossible.

RAR: If they're reflecting the top... if they're reflecting the audience correctly. CLIFTON: That's right.

R&R: Maybe it will take new research methods other than calling stores and getting fair, medium and good, or excellent on record surveys.

CLIFTON: It takes more than that cartainly to program a good radio station. Earlier in the interview you made a statement that the MOR stations were heavy on news, and that's how they controlled a certain amount of people, and you asked me how I did the same thing, and I started, I got partially through the answer, but I don't think I completed it.

R&R: Good, tack in on now, I know KCBQ happens to have a

dynamite news team. CLIFTON: That's right. Since we are after, at KCBQ, our target audience at KCBQ is 12 to 49, we want to be number one in every demographic 12 to 49. We missed 2 of them this time. That ein't bad, but it isn't perfect, we can do a little better. So how do you get 12 to 49 year olds? Well, you have to do everything you do, you've got to do it the best. So we've got the best news department in town, we've got the best personalities in town, we spend all the money we need to on promotion. Everything that needs to be done, we cover it, we make sure that we do it better than anybody else is doing it. That way we can't help but win.

R&R: That's a good way to summarize the whole thing. Is there anything else?

CLIFTON: The one thing that I wanted to, that I really wanted to get across more than anything else is the people thing. R&R: I tried to get that out of

you, you never got specific. I'm trying to get out of you, what do you look for? What is Jay Stone? What is Chuck Roberts? What special quality did you find in those people above and beyond the norm? CLIFTON: Let me take a backwards direction. It has been my experience in my career in radio that, except for a few situations, most radio stations hire people that they don't even know anything about except how they sound on a tape. They plug them into their radio station, they expect these people to move clear across the country, sometimes, relocate themselves. relocate themselves, plug themselves into the radio and if they don't sound like killer disc jockeys in three months, or 2 months or 6 weeks or whatever it is, they throw them out and bring somebody else in. There seems to be no human relationship between these people. I worked for, as a jock I worked for one radio station in my career where the people who were in management positions cared about me, asked me how my old lady was doing, or if I was over my cold or if I needed money I could go to him and say, "hey can I borrow \$500," or they'd set me up with a deal so I could buy a new car, whatever it was. I worked for one radio station out of, I think I was a jock at 13 stations or 12, or some ridiculous num-

ber. **R&R:** Which one was that?

CLIFTON: That was KAFY. You and Ron Ruth and whoever else was involved in it, seemed to really care about what was happening with the people. I remember when I first went there, you fired 4000 people the first two months I was there. We had a graveyard. Jocks put up a graveyard in the control room and everytime somebody died, you got a cross on the grave-

yard. At a certain point in time, I think you tore the graveyard off the wall, and everybody's walking around going "ooo what's the deal?" And I think that was at the point when there was never another change, or hardly another change made after that. You were obviously looking for the people that you could work with, that could contribute the right things to the radio station and you put together a team. When you got to that point, all of a sudden, as you got the people that appeared that you liked then you were good to those people. I was one of the first ones in, when everybody else is running around saying Bob Wilson is an asshole, I was going gee he's not an asshole to ma, I can't understand it. But anyway, when you got the teem together, then we all stayed there. There weren't any changes. For a long time until you left. That's the only time that I ever dealt with that situation as a disc jockey. R&R: Are you dealing with it now, are you showing that ... I remember you did the exact same thing when you went to Palm Springs, you became the maniac where you fired 2000 people.

CLIFTON: That's right. You have to get a team, my whole concept of radio.

R&R: I think maybe your first real true team came at KSEA. CLIFTON: It was, no doubt about that. Now that I understand the business of running radio stations, I parallel it to a football team, or a baseball team. I went to the Milwaukee Brewers' game last week when I was in Milwaukee, sat there and watched the people on the field protect each other from the mistakes that could be made. I watched the right fielder rifle a shot at the plate to get the runner out at the plate, and miss it by a thousand miles it seemed like. and there was the pitcher, standing back there, caught the ball and kept anybody from getting, you know, being charged with an error. In the game I watched there were maybe 7 or 8 times where people made mistakes, that somebody else was behind them to keep them from being charged with that mistake in the record books, or in reality to keep the team from suffering a loss . That's teamwork.

R&R: I once made the statement to you when I went to New York, when you were at 99X, and this really may sound strange to some people who have never experienced it, but I know you and I both have, and few other people in radio have, I could turn on 99X, and in the middle of a record, know that radio station was different. I don't want to get into reasons, I don't want to sit here and analyze why subconsciously. or any other possible way, brainwaves, electronic waves through the air from the disc jockey to you, I don't want to go into that stuff. What I'm saving is, there is some kind of electronic feeling, X factor to a radio stations when it's clicking perfectly. You could have, almost like a blindfold test, you could sit there and say don't look at the dial, all l t to do is play mus I tried that once, as a matter of fact, with 99X, and I could always pick out 99X, maybe it was the sound, maybe you had a better sound, or a different sound, but there was some-thing unique at 99X, and you've attained that a couple of other radio stations. WDRQ was another one. Let's call it the X factor. I talked to Gerry Peterson about it,he save that in his career, he had it 2 times, for a very long time at Continued on page 31



but I am involved in radio, that's my whole life, so whatever. It's got to be every waking and most sleeping hours are involved in something. Everything that I do in my life is involved with broadcasting. My personal life svolves around radio.

R&R: it's almost non-existent, right?

CLIFTON: Yeah, My greatest brain storms come when I'm walking down the beach at night, or laying on the beach, or whatever, If you're really into it, just like probably every career is like that, I don't know, but if you're really into it, you can't stop yourself from coming up with a crazy idea of

how to reach people when you're standing on the beach, looking at people. We did this, these people would really get off on it. So you make a mental note, when you get back to the radio station you begin putting a promotion together.

R&R: I think we've got dynamite interview.

CLIFTON: The one major thing, and you'll probably take phrases out, the one thing that I really want to get across is that... what I was getting at when we were talking about people. Our whole company, my concept of the Bartell company thing is the same concept that I had when I was at WDRQ, and when I was at KSEA, and when I was at 99X, and that is that it is a one big

family kind of thing. Everybody has their part, and their part is very very important. Our people, people call me all the time and they say I'm calling you from Bakersfield, or I'm calling you from so and so, and I'd like to work at KCBQ. I always say to them, there's a pre-requisite to that, you have to work at one of our other stations first. Because, KCBQ is where everybody wants to work. I just feel like you kind of have to earn your way to KCBQ.

R&R: That is a great radio station in a great city, that's for sure.

CLIFTON: It's one of the ultimate places to live in the world, and because of it, well KCBQ just became a great radio station for a lot of reasons, it isn't necessarily the best station we've got, it's as good as any, I'm not putting it down, it's one of the greatest radio stations in America. What I'm trying to say is that people move up within our chain. I'm planning on taking these kids that we're teaching how to be disc jockeys on the all night shows and weekends shows right now, eventually those guys will have first shot at coming and doing afternoon drive at KCBQ if there's ever an opening, or whatever opening there is. I always feel that if I hire someone, first of all I'm very careful of who I hire, but it's our responsibility to make them good. To give them every chance in the world to succeed with us. Thinking that way, most of them do succeed. A very high percentage succeed.

Therefore, when you try to categorize music and stick labels on records that will give you a thumbnail indication of demographic appeal, it might be wise to go beyond the obvious production, instrumentation, and other "musicological" elements that we sometimes become obsessed with and think a little bit about "Fantasy Potential." Use yourself as the first subject. After all, the radio and record industries can't possibly be totally made up of atypical listeners.
