ARBITRON HOLDS PHILLY BOOK

As we reported last week in R&R, Arbitron put a hold on the July/August 1975 Philadelphia book. A revised report is scheduled to be mailed on November 7. All work by one Metro interviewer whose work had been questioned has been thoroughly checked by the company. The revised report will delete 65 diaries (4.2% of the original survey).

WDRQ CRYSTAL BALL

WDRQ/Detroit has placed a great sum of money in their "Q Crystal Ball." The see-through ball is being displayed all over town for listeners to check out. Clues are given out on the air to hint at the 9 digit combination to the ball, first correct listener with all 9 digits gets the cash.

CASH COUNTDOWN

WSGA/Savannah is in the midst of their "Cash Countdown" promotion, using the Hi-Lo procedure, with call in listeners getting 10 seconds to guess a cash amount from 10¢ to \$140. Losers rip off any survey record of their choice.

CASH CALL TWIST

WHBQ/Memphis is using a special twist on their current "Cash Call" promotion. The hourly jackpot has varying amounts, anywhere from \$2000 to \$10,000. The prize does not build up, but is always changing making it doubly interesting for listeners to keep track of. Hourly call-outs are made, within the hour when the cash amount was aired.

JOCKS IN WOMEN'S WORK

Z93/Atlanta's morning team, Barry Chase and Scott Woodside, celebrated last Wednesday's "Alice Doesn't" national women's strike day, by offering to take over a lady listener's job for that day. With only

a couple of days of promos, nearly 1000 postcard entries were received by the station. When Wednesday dawned, Chase and Woodside joined an office full of women to take over the winner's job as a legal secretary in a bottling plant.

DAY OFF FOR LADIES

WHNC/New Haven also joined in the women's day last week, following the lead of the National Organization of Women by giving ladies the day off. Afternoon drive personality Alan Colmes refrained from playing any female vocalists' records for his entire show.

SALT LAKE CITY FIGHTS INFLATION

KCPX/Salt Lake City has split their "Inflation/Deflation" promotion into 2 phases. Phase 1 saw \$1000 dropped from a hot air bal-

loon into the biggest crowd of listeners the station has ever seen gathered. Phase II is entitled "The Bread Line" with prizes of "relief checks" in varying amounts, totaling \$400 to \$500 per day. Hourly callers have to guess the missing letter in K-C-P-X, with a rotating cart punched up to see if they're right.

SUPERSTAR WEEKEND

13Q/Pittsburgh continues to have "Superstar Weekends," featuring special artists each week. One of their most recent was Beatles weekend, with record shattering response reported. New special phone equipment, which was labeled "unbeatable" collapsed under the strain of callers vying for LP libraries by all the Beatles, individually and col-

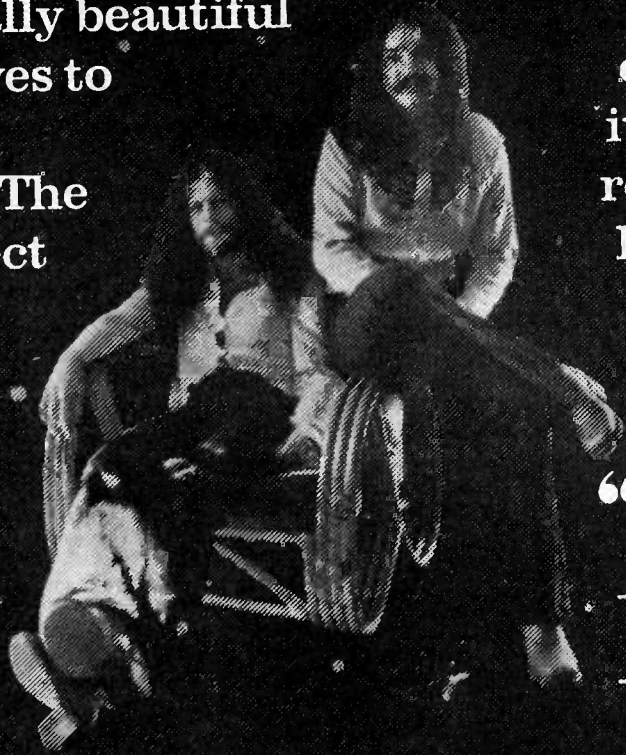

FTC CHAIRMAN DISPUTES FAIRNESS DOCTRINE

In a speech to UCLA law students, Federal Trade Commission chairman Lewis Engman appealed to Congress to abolish the Fairness Doctrine. Engman took the stand that the Doctrine tends to restrict broadcasters from reporting news thoroughly, as broadcasters must weigh the risks of airing certain newsworthy items that may come under the Doctrine.

BROADCAST CO'S INCOMES

The first nine months of the year showed revenue increases for Capital Cities Communications, with more than \$25 million in gains. The acquisition of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, WBAP and KSCS were partly responsible for the gains.

Cox Broadcasting Co. also reported dollar revenue increases for the third quarter of this year, from \$24,533,000 to \$26,670,000. Broadcasting revenues were noted as a strong influence in the upward trend.

Starr Broadcasting reports a fiscal 1975 loss of slightly over \$2 million, which is a turnaround from last year's profit of about the same \$2 million figure.

ADVERTISING SPENDING DROPS BEHIND NATIONAL ECONOMY

Although the country is basically on an upward financial trend, advertising so far this year has not shown any of the gains that other industries have. Hopefully, the past trend of advertising running about 6 months behind the national economy will again hold true, with advertising picking up again at the end of the year. Newspaper and magazine advertising has been hardest hit by the financial situation, with total space for both media way off.

STRIKING WORKERS OUT LONGER

Strikes by American workers in 1975 have last longer, on the average, than for any other period since 1959. The average strike lasted 20.1 days. Less strikes occurred during the first nine months of this year than for the same period in 1974.

HOW TO LIVE LONGER

A study by an agency of the California Health Department, using 7000 residents of a Northern California county as a sample base, has shown that the well known, simple health and clean principals do help people live longer. Among the rules of thumb for a long life are: eight hours of sleep for men, 7 for women, 3 meals a day with no snacks; exercise; weight watching; non-cigarette smoking and regular breakfasts. An interesting sidelight learned from the research is that moderate drinking of alcoholic beverages, 1 or 2 drinks per day, may be good for you.

SOCIAL SECURITY TAKES A BIGGER BITE

Wage earners that earn more than \$14,000 per year will have to pay more Social Security taxes starting in 1976. Up through 1975, the first \$14,100 in wages was taxed, while next year the basis will be a \$15,300 salary. The rate of 5.85% will remain the same, with the maximum Social Security tax set at \$895.05, and \$1,208.70 for self-employed people. Semi-retired wage earners will get a small break with no Social Security benefit payments withheld unless other earnings are above \$2,760.

NEW HEALTH PROGRAMS FOR WORKERS

Under new rulings by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, employers of 25 or more employees must offer a choice of health plans, starting November 27. Workers will have a choice of the employer instigating their own plans, or membership in health-maintenance organizations.

CHRISTMAS MAILING DEADLINE

The U.S. Postal Service has released deadlines for mailing for holiday delivery. The following are suggested for U.S. destination mail: November 30 for surface packages to Alaska and Hawaii; December 10 for surface packages to the other 48 states, along with air mail Alaska and Hawaii packages; December 21 for all other air mail parcels. Overseas mailing schedules should be checked out with local post offices.

COFFEE BREAKS MAY BE HAZARDOUS TO YOUR HEALTH

A study by General Foods Inc. has shown that there may be detrimental substances in coffee other than just caffeine. The experiments by the company showed that acid secretions from the stomach lining, often the cause of peptic ulcers, are caused by decaffeinated coffee as well as regular coffee. The study did not pinpoint the substance that causes the acid secretions.

MYTHICAL AIRLINE MAIL ORDER PUSH

Sense of humor is alive and well in the business world, as witnesses by a recent mail order drive by the mythical "Fudpucker World Airlines." The airline has been canvassing people "... possessed of a well refined sense of humor." in an attempt to drum up business for the airline that promises to deliver anything from cigarette lighters to sweatshirts all over the world. The airline uses the slogan "Navigators of the World, since it was square." On a more down to earth basis, the creative agency behind the whole thing, Lyn Sherwood Advertising/PR, also retains the creative services for college newspapers, in-flight magazines, and other ventures.

DIGESTIVE AID IN MILK

A natural culture which aids the digestive system is being used by dairies in 6 states, as a milk additive. The new product is called Nu-Trish. Up until now, the decidedly strong taste of the culture has prohibited American dairies from using the substance, but extensive research has produced a strain of the culture which has no great taste.

BREWERS SPENT LESS FOR ADVERTISING

The nation's beer makers spent much less money on advertising in 1974, with all media feeling the reduction. 12 of the top 18 brewers dropped their advertising dollar spending, with the most dramatic drop made by Carlin Brewing Co., whose spending in 1973 approached \$7 million, and only spent \$383,000 in 1974.

LOCAL APPROACH FOR EASTERN AIRLINES

Eastern Airlines has started an advertising campaign using local weather-casters or actors in a TV weather backdrop. This attempt to localize ads will hopefully create greater local acceptance of Eastern's local destination information. Printed media and radio buys will back up the airline's TV push, using the slogan "We've got the right time and the right place for you."

DEODORANT SWITCH TO NON-AEROSOL

Consumers are starting to switch from aerosol deodorants to the new push of the industry, roll-ons. Two reasons were cited for the shift in buying habits, the concern over aerosol side effects on the atmosphere, and the consumer's realization that roll-ons were more economical. Interesting to note that the switch to roll-ons is at the expense of aerosol powder sprays and deodorants, not anti-persperants.

FIRST ADVERTISING FOR NEW PONTIAC

The first major advertising push for Pontiac's small car entry, the Sunbird, begins this month, using the slogan "Another great small car from the Wide Track people." A factory strike has held up advertising until now. Network TV and radio buys, along with print advertising is planned.

UNITED'S FREEDOM FARE

Featuring airline fares cut down to the maximum of 30%, United Airlines will go full bore on advertising for their "Freedom Fare." Tickets for the special rate go on sale in early January, with flights scheduled to start in February. Both local as well as national spots are planned for the push.

FTC TANGLES WITH WARRANTY

Although the actual Federal Warranty Act has already cleared Congress the Federal Trade Commission is still holding hearings to come up with specific guidelines based on broad rules set up in the Congressional bill. The bill was set up in order to protect consumers from misleading or confusing product warranties. Most manufacturers are totally confused on the issue, with some labeling their product warranties "Limited" instead of "full," until they know what specifics have to be met.

NEW FOOD LABELING POSSIBLE

The Food & Drug Administration has proposed new rulings on food label information. The total weight of solid food, drained of liquids, may have to be listed on cans, in order for consumers to make value comparisons.

CANADIAN POSTAL STRIKE HITS MAIL HOUSES

Direct mailing companies, distributing magazines and such mail clients as Book of the Month Club, have been hard hit by the current Canadian mail strike. Millions of dollars of business have been lost, with one major mailing house already laying off 100 of their 270 employees. Some companies have taken post office boxes in border U.S. cities, anticipating a long strike.

RURAL AREAS LOSE BILLBOARDS

Ten years after the Highway Beautification Act, the Outdoor Advertising Association noted that over 360,000 outdoor signs have been removed, mostly in rural and scenic areas. On the whole, however, dollar volume for outdoor advertising is still on the rise.

NEW MASSACHUSETTS LIQUOR REGULATIONS

Massachusetts' liquor dealers are now able to advertise prices of their products, as well as offer prizes as a buying stimulus. Dealers in the state have complained about former regulations restricting price advertising, because of heavy competition from neighboring New Hampshire, where liquor stores are state owned and operated.

MOTORCYCLE TO REDUCE EMISSIONS

The Environmental Protection Agency has proposed new guidelines for reducing air polluting emissions from motorcycles by 1978. By that time, the EPA suggests, if motorcycle's emissions are not reduced they would be equal to the 1978 rules for automobiles. Comments on the possible regulations are now being considered by the agency.

GOVERNMENT SELECTS AD AGENCY

The Federal Energy Administration has selected Grey Advertising to handle a possibly multi-million dollar media project on energy conservation. Although total advertising money has not been appropriated by Congress, the FEA announced that Grey would at least handle a one year public service ads campaign, and a 3 year marketing plan.

Jim DeCaro, president and general manager of WFIL/Philadelphia, announced Monday (3) that they have purchased, subject to FCC approval, WPBS-FM. WPBS is owned by the Philadelphia Bulletin, sale price was \$1.4 million, cash. WFIL is owned by Lin Broadcasting. No definite programming plans were announced.

ST. JOHN INJURED IN BIRMINGHAM

WERC's Michael St. John and his wife Lisa were hit by a car as they were getting into their automobile over this past weekend. Both sustained light injuries from the hit and run accident.

MANLOW ON NEW YORK

Barry Manilow recorded a song in his new album which is about New York, the song is "New York City Rhythm." WXLO (99X), RKO's rocker in NY began heavy play on the song Monday, to bring the spirit of the city back to the city during its financial crisis. The station is playing it several times an hour and reaction has been tremendous.

WLS GETS WOMEN'S AWARD

For the second year in a row the Chicago Women in Broadcasting awarded WLS for their contributions to the advancement of women in broadcasting. The station was cited for having a high percentage of women employees and women in management as well as offering tuition reimbursement and internship programs.

Album Oriented Rock Radio is the vehicle of contemporary mainstream music. The form that started out as an alternative has become the reflection of the establishment. These statements, of course, are highly controversial. However, they are only controversial because so many people in radio and records (whose power and influence have yet to be eroded away by the sands of time) think that where they're at is where it's at. Be that as it may, the statements are true and those who resist their reality are wrong and out of it.

When I say "out of it", I mean being in something other than the mainstream establishment. Now, there's nothing terribly wrong with being out of it. As a matter of fact, it can be a very healthy state... if you are aware of it. After all, during the early days of AOR, when it was commonly referred to as Progressive (because an adjective made for more dramatic description than a noun), AOR broadcasters admitted that they served something other than the masses. For a while in the mid-early 70's, AOR Radio had a difficult time in recognizing its own growth and success. The problems, however, were overcome when logic dictated that any movement that starts underground to promote positive social or artistic change must eventually come out into the sunshine and claim the new establishment that it is rightfully due. It should be pointed out that unless it is assertively claimed, the old guard will be slow in giving it up.

The key to AOR's mainstream appeal is the fact that above and beyond its superior structural sophistication, it is the only contemporary music format that recognizes the simple fact that today the masses have a universality of taste. The average AOR station plays Top 40 singles, Country, Soul, Jazz, Folk, hard and soft Rock album cuts and gets good ratings when executed properly!

You see, the only difference between the single and the album really is the different states of mind that they represent. That's all. In an effort to wind their methods down to the simple unintelligent capacities of the public, old line radio programmers have, in fact winded down their creative and communicative abilities. Now that the public has grown up, the teacher can only talk baby talk.

It is absolutely baffling to the old-line singles oriented programmers how anyone can deal with all the albums and cuts that blow through this section each week, put them all together with research, organization, and continuity and go on to pull big numbers. Without betraying any confidences, I would like to point out that many of the sharp younger Top 40 guys have admitted to me that they use the information in this section to their advantage and would like to learn more about AOR Radio so that they can employ some of its techniques in their format or be able to jump into it should the bottom ever fall out of Top 40. They are smart.

Save your charts for future reference. You'll be amazed to see how many of the big Top 40, Pop, Soul, and Country singles were once AOR stand-out cuts.

AOR Radio has the unique distinction of being both mainstream and Progressive. After all, all things are relative. When surrounded by obsolescence, anything current must be considered "ahead."

When the term AOR (Album Oriented Rock) was first introduced to an industry that looked upon Progressive Rock Radio as a bastard child, many observers laughed and called it "all over the road." Well, there are all kinds of roads. Everything from unpaved trails to two lane highways to super freeways. I wonder what road they're on. Be careful changing lanes folks.

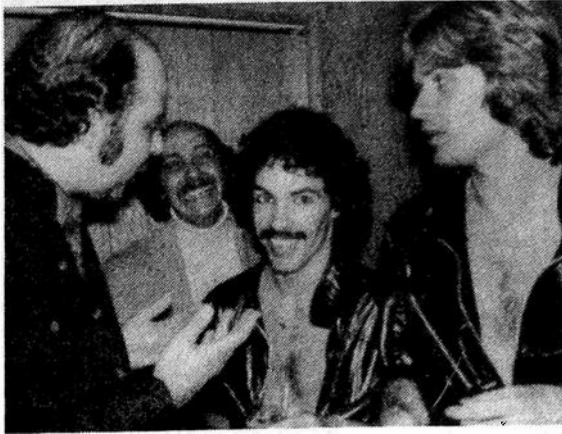
Ringo Starr, has signed an exclusive recording contract with ABC Records for a reported healthy price with ABC beating out several other labels in the bidding. The fate of Ringo's own label Ringo-O-Records is unknown at this time, but most likely will not be distributed by Capitol. However, Ringo's new album, which is a collection of his solo oldies such as "The No No Song," will be coming out on Capitol Records and is tentatively titled "A Blast From Your Past"... If you've been wondering about the title of John Lennon's new album (also a collection of oldies) "Shaved Fish," it's Japanese for "top of the line" or "best of" due to the fact that shaved fish are a delicacy in that country, which was probably an inside tip from Yoko Ono... Word is that the next Elton John album will probably be a live recording featuring the highlights of his just completed "Rock Of The Westies" tour... Contrary to flying reports, Shelter is not closing its doors. In speaking to the label, they report that Leon Russell wants a release from his liabilities with the label and will probably sell his half interest to his partner, Denny Cordell. The label was emphatic that they will continue to operate and their doors will stay open... Led Zeppelin have cancelled their planned January tour due to Robert Plant's ankle (broken in six places in a recent car accident) refusing to heal as expected. Mick Jagger is all but set to play Paul Newman's son in the movie version of best seller "Ragtime"...

The Allmans are keeping it all in the family with the Allman Brothers set to tape a segment with Cher for her show to air sometime after the first of the year. Gregg will take a ten day break on the current Allman tour to begin recording a solo album tentatively titled "Played Up A Storm" which Gregg and Johnny Sandlin will produce in Macon. Cher and Martin Mull do a hilarious spoof of country music on her November 9th show with Cher all dolled up ala Dolly Parton with Mull looking like Henry Gibson out of "Nashville." 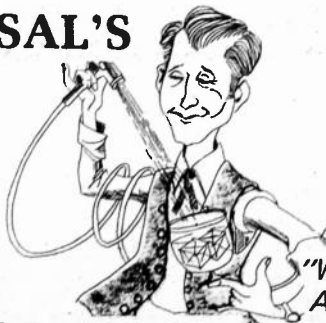
