The more toys that are donated, the more votes a person has. The winning band collects \$1000, with cash prizes also going to 2nd and 3rd place entries. Great way to get school support and gain attention for the station!

### 99X OFFERS SCHOLARSHIP

99X/New York is giving away a scholarship to St. Johns University in New York that is valued at over \$10,000. The scholarship is good until 1999. In order to win, listeners are asked to write an essay on why they want to go to college in New York City, and what's great about the currently financially troubled metropolis. A panel of judges that will select the winning essay will be scholars from the university, and 99X management.

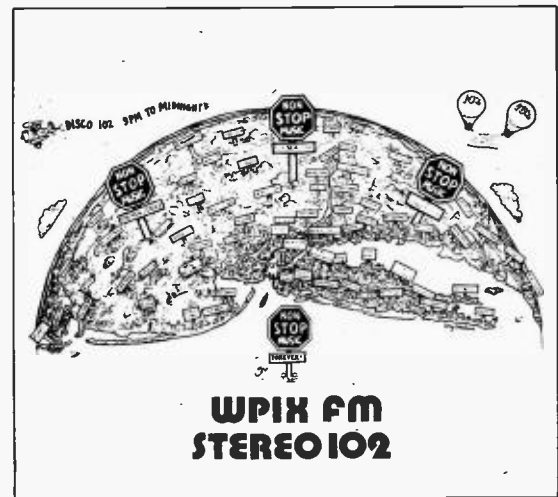

KING's promotion director, Sharon Craig, told R&R that the process is not copyrighted by any particular company, and that a lot of legwork on the station's part was necessary to carry off the super promotion. The transfer was originally run for Budweiser beer in the Chicago Sun Times. Stations interested in more information on the process may contact the Sun Times, and the Sun Chemical Corp. in Seattle, who helped the Northwest stations in developing the ink for their ads. Ms. Craig warns that cotton-polyester blend T-Shirts are the only ones that can be used with the transfer.

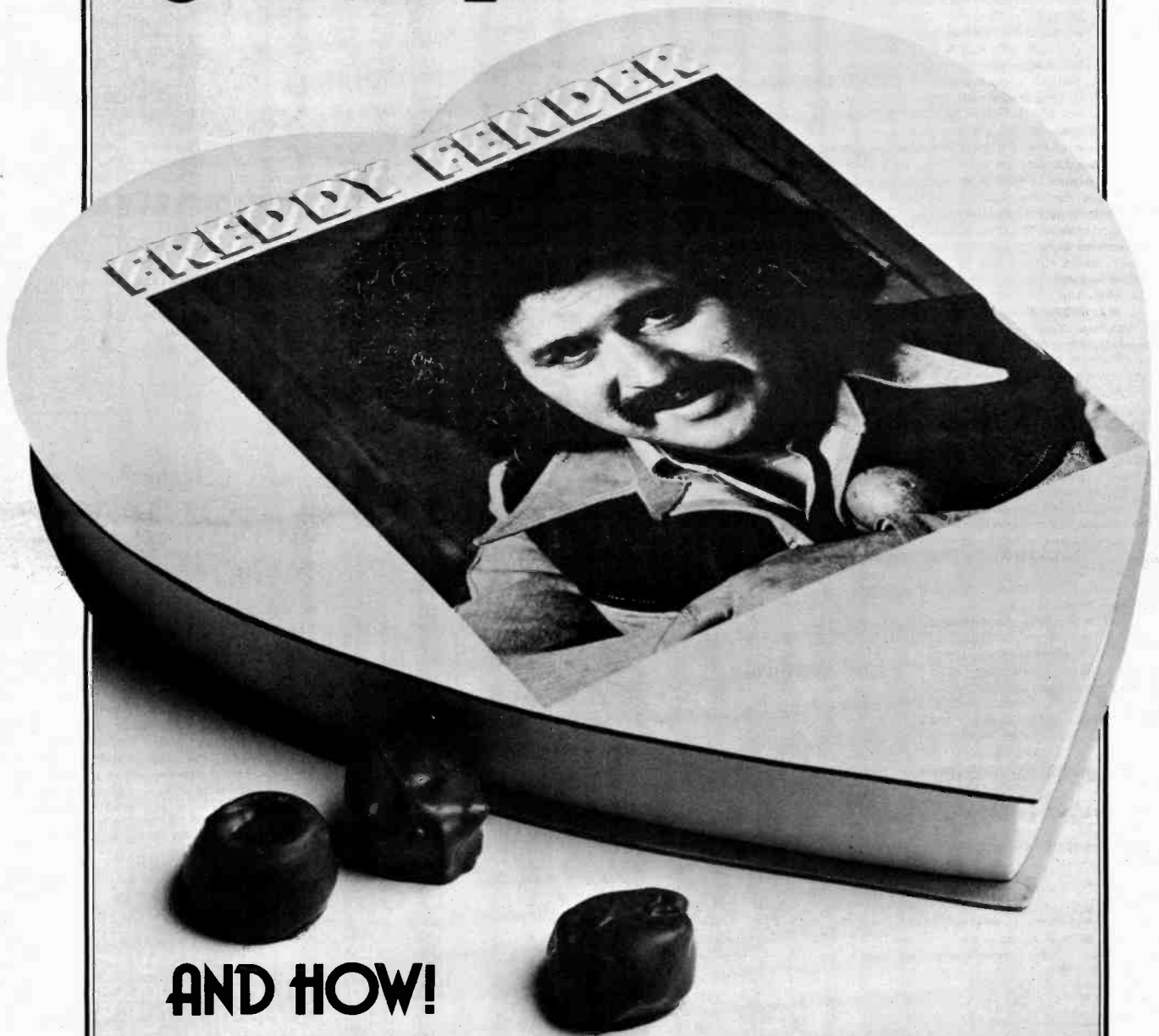

## BUSINESS NEWS

### GEORGE STORER DIES

The founder of Storer Broadcasting, George B. Storer died last Tuesday (4), after suffering heart trouble for several years. Storer served as President of the company from 1927 to 1957.

### COMBINED COMM. REVENUES RISE

An 18% increase in gross revenues for the first nine months of this year were reported by Combined Communications. Increase was partly due to purchase of Pacific & Southern Broadcasting last year.

### STATUS QUO OUTLOOK FOR '76 ADVERTISING

In a poll taken by Sales & Marketing Executives International, their studies showed that marketing executives intend to keep their ad budgets much the same as this year for 1976. All companies surveyed contend that ad budgets will not exceed more than 10% over this year's. On top of these projections 64% of the respondents plan to introduce new products on the market, making total spending for products now available way down.

### SENATE HEARINGS ON FCC START WITH A BLAST

The Senate subcommittee on communications hearings on the FCC started out last week with many religious and citizen's groups airing complaints about recent FCC actions. Of the many actions that were criticized, the United Church of Christ complained about the closed door policies of the Commission. The same group challenged the FCC's recent ruling on equal time requirements. Community ascertainment, the television "Family Hour" decision, and other beefs were heard during the first of the Senate's hearings.

### FCC NOW CRITICIZED BY HOUSE

On top of the Senate's subcommittee on communications hearings, the FCC also received a reprimand from the subcommittee of the same name in the House of Representatives. The committee cited that the FCC has not kept up on new technology in the common carrier field. On a broader basis, the committee also commented that the Commission ruled on case by case issues, rather than effectively keeping up on emerging issues. The committee stated in the release of their study that the Commission should be overseen by Congress more completely.

### FCC FACES THE PUBLIC

The Senate has passed and forwarded to the House a bill which would open up meetings of government agencies, including the Federal Communications Commission, to the public. Rulemaking and agenda sessions would be opened up, with the bill leaving certain stipulations on closing sessions when trade secrets, invasion of individuals privacy, or national defense issues were to be brought up. The FCC has been quarrelling with the Senate about opening up meetings, recently voting to close their sessions.

### EXPENSES WIPE OUT RADIO'S GAINS

Although the radio industry on the whole gained in gross revenues in 1974, a 9.1% increase in expenses created a 23.6% drop in pre-tax profits, according to the FCC. Over \$1.7 billion was spent on radio advertising last year, a total which showed a 6.6% rise. Networks showed a decline in gross revenues, down \$6 million. Owned and Operated Network stations increased revenues by 3.9%.

### CHANGES IN COX HIGHER ECHELON

Cox Broadcasting has announced that Stanley G. Mouse, VP AND GM of Miami Valley Broadcasting, has been named President of the Cox organization. Miami Valley includes WHIO-AM-FM-TV/Dayton. Mouse will replace Jim Rupp, who will assume other duties in the Cox organization. Two men will take over Mouse's duties, new WHIO-TV head is Jack McCarthy, Ron Kempff will head up WHIO-AM-FM.

### FORD ON AD BUSINESS

In a press conference for business press, President Ford stated that he didn't feel that the possible default of New York City would hurt the advertising business, according to Advertising Age. His comments also reflected his feelings on business as a whole, not restricted to advertising alone. Economic advisor to Ford, Alan Greenspan, was the only voice of the administration who said that business problems were possible as a result of the default.

### RADIO RATES HIGH WITH COLLEGIANS

According to a study by CASS Student Advertising, 92% of college students listen to radio. Other media used by students the most include: 87.6% reading their college newspaper, 83.8% watching TV, 58.1% read local daily newspapers. Among must read publications, Time came in with 36%, Playboy with 33.6%, 31% for Newsweek, 28.5% read Readers' digest, and 26.9% Rolling Stone.

### FCC STANDS FIRM ON AT&T HIKES

A petition from news wire services asking the FCC to delay the start date for new rates for special AT&T lines was turned down by the Commission last week. Reasoning for the petition surrounded another possible rate increase that the Commission has not yet ruled on.

### CONSUMER CREDIT UP IN SEPTEMBER

The largest monthly consumer credit hike since August of last year was noted in September '75. Over 1 billion dollars in credit was extended to consumers during the month. Active buying of new cars and other goods was cited for the rise. Americans now have over \$190 billion in credit outstanding.

### AIRLINE RATES UP AGAIN

The Civil Aeronautics Board, acting because of warnings of financial trouble possibilities by some airlines, have approved a 3% boost in domestic airline travel fares. The Board cited increased costs for labor and fuel for the hike.

### ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP AGAINST FDA

The Natural Resources Defense Council has filed a civil complaint against the Food & Drug Administration, claiming that a recent FDA approval of plastic containers for beverages overlooked the fact that the containers were dangerous to the environment. The suit also claimed that the plastic throw-away bottles may contaminate the drinks in them.

### TWO DOLLAR BILL REVIVED

Beginning in April of next year, \$2 bills will again be distributed by the Federal Reserve Board. Plans include distribution of nearly as many of the new bills as \$1 bills. Inflation was noted as the main reason for the reissue of the bills, which were discontinued in 1966. The value of the older \$2 bills will not be affected by the new issue, according to the government.

### CIGARETTE PRICES UP

For the first time in over a year, two major cigarette makers have upped their list prices for cigarettes. The Lorillard division of Loews Corp. said that they would increase their prices by 70¢ per 1000 cigarettes for all brands except their new 120mm Cigarette. Liggett & Meyers Inc. also indicated that they would raise their base prices by the same amount, although their customers have not been notified of the increase as yet. Other major manufacturers have not yet made any commitments on further price increases for their brands.

### SHOE SHORTAGE

While most shoe manufacturers were faced with production cutbacks earlier in the year, demand for new shoes has increased so much recently that many of the companies have found themselves without enough product to meet the demand. Production for the first half of the year was down 19%. Most retailers are now having a hard time keeping stock on many items in their stores.

### LEVI'S FOR FEET

Under a licensing agreement with Levi Strauss & Co. the Brown Shoe Co. has begun marketing "Levi's For Feet" in West Coast markets, as well as St. Louis. Plans for expanding distribution of the new 12 style line of shoes will encompass the entire West Coast and Midwest soon. Target market for the new lines is 14 to 34 males, with styles from desert boots to sandals, and a Levi's blue denim style.

### RETURN OF THE "GREAT RACE"

Currently in the works is a re-creation of the famous 1908 New York to Paris around the world car race. Scheduled to start on May 28, 1976 at Paris' Eiffel Tower, the 60 day event may reach Americans on network television. Bruce Cohn Productions has retained the worldwide TV and movie rights to the event.

### DER WIENERSCHNITZEL UPS

#### AD BUDGET

The fast food chain, Der Wiener-schnitzel, has announced that their 1976 advertising campaigns will

reach the \$2 million figure for ad buys. All media will be involved in the new schedules, which will not kick off a new direction until next March. A big TV Guide push, along with special Christmas promotions will round off this year's advertising. New 30 second spots will feature "Der WienerDog," carrying the Bicentennial theme of "Great Hot Dogs in History."

### COLOR TV MAKERS HOPE FOR BRIGHTER '76

With a downward trend in color TV sales since 1974, most manufacturer are not expecting this year to come out any better when all sales figures are tallied up, but most look to 1976 as the year for the industry to come back. Sales throughout this year have been very erratic, with January starting out as the worst sales month since 1967. Although manufacturers are trying to look at next year in a good light, most experts agree that at the end of this year the bulk of the industry will be in the red.

it was a management decision. Martin said, "Rabbit's acceptance was phenomenal. We will continue to program Progressive Country music in the evening slot. In a couple of months we'll be able to find out if the response was for Rabbit or the progressive country sound." R&R talked with Rabbit who stated, "It was lack of communication on all levels. I can understand their decision. I'm very flamboyant on the air, you have to be in this market with so many stations, and I think they were afraid of what I might do. Plus I feel they wanted to test the appeal of Progressive Country music." Michael Hunter, former program director of KNEW/Oakland, will take over the evening slot for Rabbit.

Dennis Constantine left his music director/jock position at KTLK/Denver last Thursday (6). Constantine told R&R that "The management of KTLK and myself had opposing views of our purpose and goals."

After two years with WYRE/Annapolis, Ed Gursky has resigned his program director duties at the station. Gursky stressed to R&R that the reasons for leaving stemmed from "inability to communicate with new ownership."

Because radio (especially AOR) is a delicate combination of art and science, broadcasters sometimes fall into an obvious trap. That is when they become overly subjective about their objectivity.

Quite often, we tend to overreact to our own observations, discoveries, and philosophies and eventually reach our resultant "potential stagnation" level. It is a human defense mechanism that compels us to stick with any methodology that we believe to be responsible for our success. Unfortunately, it is that determined "stick-to-it-iveness" to what starts to become the gospel, that brings us closer to obsolescence.

I am by no means suggesting that programmers should flounder from one principal to another leaving tried and true methods to reckless experimental abandon. However, extreme black or white thinking can also be ultimately negative.

For example, if a station thinks of itself as being "loose listed" and/or freely structured, it would not be in contradiction with their ideals to employ a degree of research and disciplined structure to their overall sound control to achieve certain goals. On the other hand AOR stations that are admittedly, "numbers" oriented can bend their formulas and requirements that look so impressive on paper, once in awhile, to achieve an even better (or more potent) sound.

You see, listeners only perceive the ends. The means have little significance to them. Broadcasters, though, are often preoccupied with the means, thinking that listeners are involved in radio the way they are. Or worse, they actually program to other radio people. That is ridiculous but prevalent.

It's interesting to hear the criticisms that radio people have about each other. Generally, the structured stations say that the less structured ones are sloppy and unprofessional. The loose ones think that the structured ones are sterile and boring. Sometimes, though, it is simply having a knowledge of the other guy's behind the scenes methodology that leads them to an inaccurate biased opinion. Sometimes, they are all correct in their opinions, though. That is truly ironic. After all, to an extremist, anyone subscribing to the opposite extreme is 100% off base. Not 50%.

There is a fine art attached to walking the line between both extremes and still making a meaningful statement.

Good freeform, gut level programmers have a natural ability to put together radio that listeners want to hear. Good research oriented programmers are able to gather the right information and add a touch of humanity in applying it to the kind of radio that listeners want to hear.

Both types of programmers can in fact come up with the same thing.

Common sense is the best formula.

Taking it all out of the land of hypotheticals, don't get hung up on your mechanics. Use your mechanics as a tool to express what's in your head and other parts.

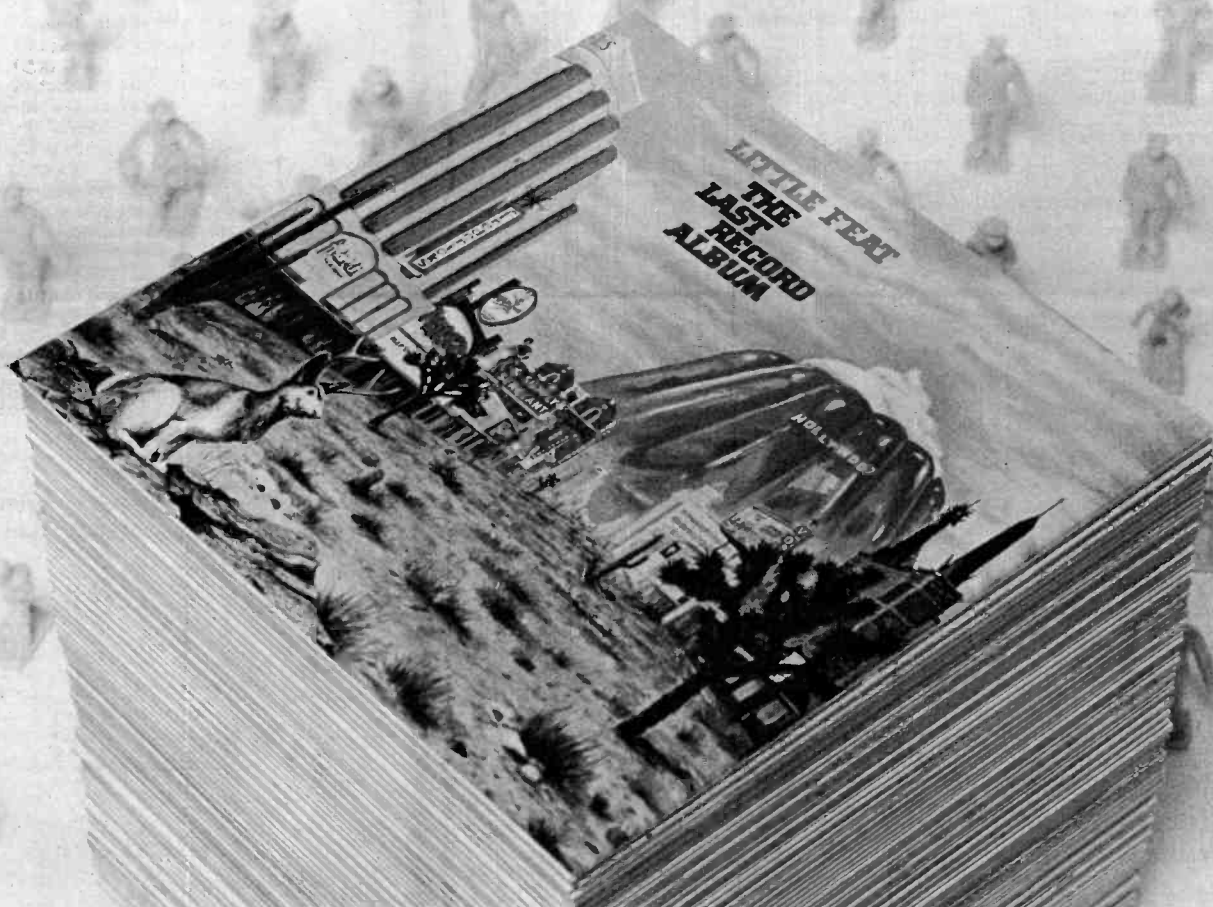

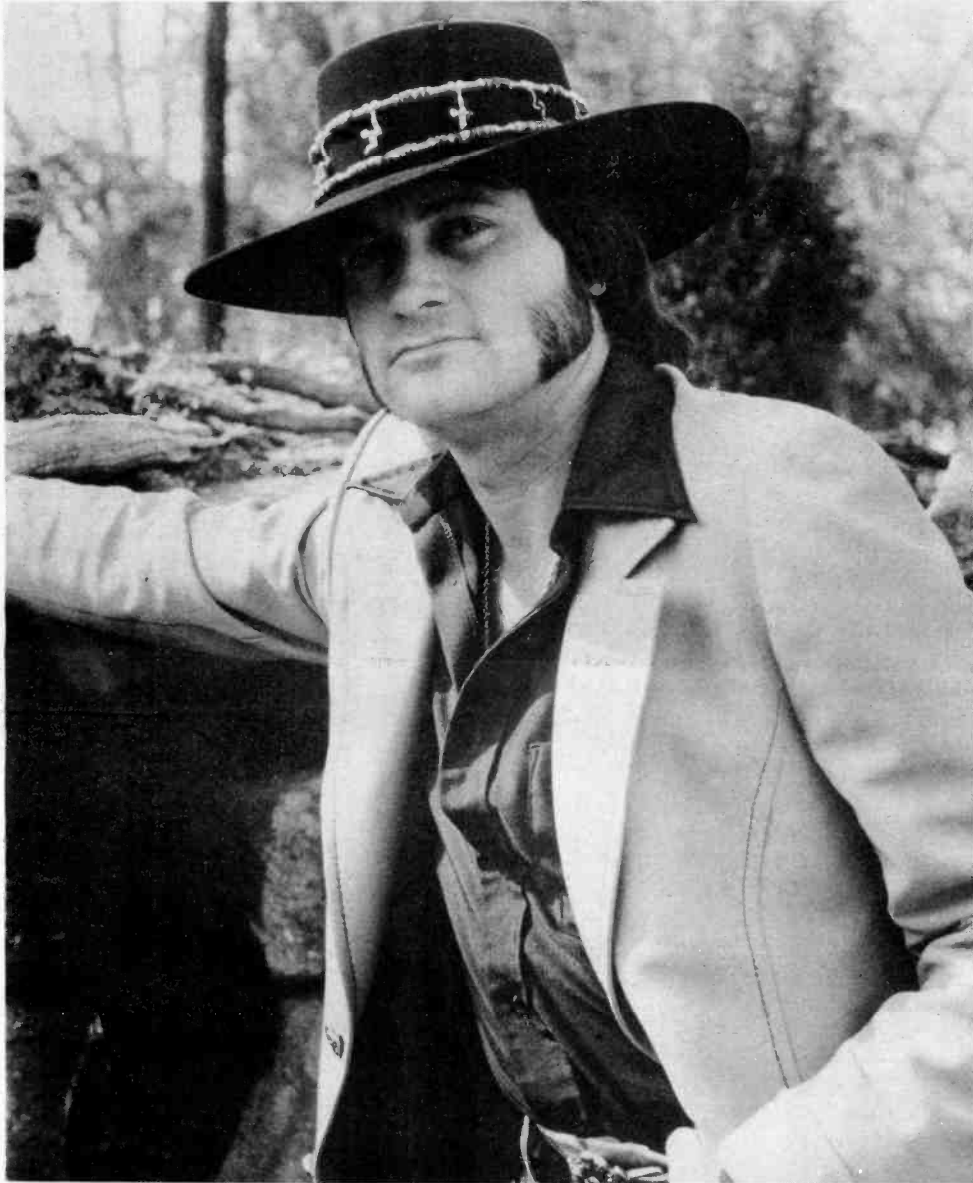

DAVE JEFFRIES, former national P.D. for RKO has joined the staff of KMAK, Fresno to do afternoon drive... WPOC, Baltimore has just added a regular racing program to its format called "The Checkered Flag Report." The daily broadcasts will feature WPOC News and Sports Director, TOM CHECHE... ROBERT MARTIN has returned to WESC, Greenville, S.C. as afternoon jock, as well as Director of Promotions and Production... Also from Greenville, S.C. comes the new morning jock on WUNI, Mobile, Alabama. CURBIE STEVENS comes from WQOK in Greenville...

BROTHER J.J., who runs a top 40 show, got on-the-air last week to blast Country artists who take already established rock songs and cut them country. When he mentioned that Kenny had done the same thing with "Blind Man In The Bleachers," re-cutting DAVID GEDDES single of the same song, it hit a nerve. For the record, Kenny has his release 10 days before Geddes had even cut his version of the song. So Kenny went to the station and told Brother J.J. the truth of the matter. After an on-the-air apology, J.J. decided to have a "battle of the records" contest, where he played both records back to back and let the listeners decide which was better. Starr's version won by a 3 to 1 vote. (Yeah Country!!!)... RCAer DOTTSY performed recently at the "World Chili Cookoff" in Terlingua, Texas. Dottsyt reported to R&R: "Oh beans! It was a GAS!!!"

## Biff Collie INSIDE NASHVILLE

TANYA THROWS A SEVEN: TANYA TUCKER's lucky! She flipped her little sports car three times on a dark country road outside ASHLAND CITY, where the family farm is located, at 3:30am and doctors say she came out with only minor abrasions and bruises...

THE END OF AN ERA: AUDREY WILLIAMS was undoubtedly the driving force behind the productive creativity of the man who has been called "The STEPHEN FOSTER of this century." She pushed Hank, into FRED ROSE's office, and almost literally on the stage. The week she died at age 52 at the family home on Franklin Road in South Nashville, the internal revenue had put parcels of the estate up for sale for back payments. She had come on financially bad times of late. She died only 12 days after U.S. District Judge L. CLURE MORTON's ruling that BILLIE JEAN BERLIN was the late singer's common-law wife when he died January 1, 1953 and directed that Mrs. Berlin share in copyright renewals on all of Hank's songs. It's odd, unusual and frighteningly coincidental that, on the day Audrey died here, a one-time protegee who she helped in his early years as an entertainer was here, in town, for the first time in years! His name: rock star JOHNNY RIVERS. He lived here for some time and worked under the guidance of Audrey. Rivers arrived the day before her death to perform at Nashville's EXIT-INN. The second hard-to-believe coincidence involved the actor who Audrey personally hand-picked to portray the role of Hank Williams in the biographical movie of his life, Hollywood actor GEORGE HAMILTON was in town for, of all things, a fashion show. She was a proud, beautiful woman, for years a fashion plate in dress and good looks. She had not been in good health in recent years, and spent much of her time in bed, according to her longtime housekeeper.

FOOTNOTES: Tuesday was the second anniversary of the death of DAVID "STRING-BEAN" AKEMAN and his wife ESTELLE. The convicted murderers of the Opry-Hee Haw humorist are serving life terms at Tennessee State Penitentiary in Nashville... BARBARA MANDRELL's ABC/DOT signing re-
