

WWL Fined \$5000

The FCC has notified Loyola University of the South, licensee of WWL/New Orleans that it has incurred en apparent liability for forfeiture of \$5000 by mislogging the duration of commercial matter broadcast on 13 days in 1975. The fine is a result of incorrect logging of commercial matter for a 90 minute show called "Ernie's Country Show." After the first inquiry by the Commission, the station changed the way it logged the program and began to log the whole show as commercial. The FCC pointed out that in WWL's last license renewal application they indicated that no more than 18 minutes of cm per hour would be broadcast, and that the altered logging also appears to be in violation



In Contemporary radio here, WRKO (R) held strong 9.6 to 9.0, third in Adults 18-49 and number one teens. WVBF (R) increased 4.6 to 5.7. WBCN (AOR) also up 1.7 to 3.6. WCOZ (AOR) 2.9 to 2.8. In POP/Adult WBZ dipped a bit 11.6 to 10.0, WHDH up 8.6 to 11.0, WJIB down 10.2 to 8.9. WBZ tops them in Adults 18-49 for first place in the market with 9.9. WHDH 9.7, WRKO 8.8. Clocks Ahead In April

A fairly confusing situation has come about because of legislation passed in the Senate changing the starting date of daylight saving time to March 14. The House has yet to make a decision on the bill, therefore delaying the projected new date. Current law sets April 25 as the date. For this year, Washington speculators can only say that sometime during April we'll have to set our clocks ahead.

Arbitron Expands ADI Reports

Beginning with the 1976 Spring survey, Arbitron Radio will measure and report radio listening in the ADI each time one of the Top 50 ADI markets is measured, according to William McClenaghan, VP and GM, Arbitron Radio. The only exception will be for the ADI markets of Grand Rapids-Kalamazoo and Sacramento-Stockton. Grand Rapids and Sacramento are measured twice each year, but Kalamazoo and Stockton are measured only once. Therefore, the ADI will be measured only in the Spring survey for these two ADI's.

Suzuki Starts Multi-Media Push

U.S. Suzuki's 1976 advertising effort was kicked off this week, with major market spot radio backing up network and spot TV buys. Spots feature the classic "Get Happy" music while the theme of Suzuki reliability and the fun consumers can have on a motorcycle fit into the new commercials.

Continental Expands Ads

A multi-media promotion will be kicked off by Continental Airlines in April. Some of Continental's exclusive service features, such as their "Pub in the Sky" will be featured in the ads. The commercials zero in on leisure and pleasure travelers, along with Continental's "Visit Friends and Relatives" theme. Thirty second radio spots are included in the buys, which will run through the summer months.

FCC Kills Hearings On KROQ

The FCC has abandoned plans to hold hearings on the renewal application of KROQ/Burbank and KROQ-FM/Pasadena. The Commission had originally ordered hearings to be scheduled, but had ruled in a public notice on the case that the hearings would be cancelled because it had been unable to contact the licensees of both outlets by either telephone or mail, and that "the renewal application which had been prepared for submission to the FCC had been intercepted and altered." In addition to hearings on renewal of KROQ-AM to George E. Cameron Jr. Communications and KROQ-FM to Burbank Broadcasting, the application of San Marco Broadcasting Co. to take over the Pasadena signal was also dismissed.

RCA May Close L.A. Plant

RCA Records has confirmed that a recommendation has been made to close their Hollywood manufacturing plant. No specific comments have been made by RCA execs on the move, but one New York spokesman told Daily Variety that a study had been made which recommended that manufacturing be consolidated to their Indianapolis branch only.

New Pan Am Superflight

Pan American World Airways will inaugurate the fastest daily Los Angeles-Tokyo nonstop service in history next month. The new Boeing 747 SP (Special Performance) jet will enable travelers to cut their in air flight time by 3½ hours over any other regularly scheduled airline's time.

FCC Drops Hypoing Ban Plans

The Federal Communications Commission has voted six to one to withdraw a proposed ruling which would be special promotions on radio and TV during rating periods. The FCC cited the fact that such a rule would be virtually impossible to police, and also that a significant segment of the public may like promotional activities. Under Federal Trade Commission guidelines set up in 1965, the Commission will continue to answer and investigate complaints filed on hypoing issues.

FCC Asked To Give Break To Poor

The many expenses involved in dealings with FCC proceedings were the subject of a petition by the Federal Communications Bar Association. The FCBA noted that many costly items; such as witness fees, distribution of proceedings transcripts and deposition costs were strain to poor people and small organizations when involved with FCC matters. The Bar Association suggested that the Commission adopt guidelines to defray such costs when dealing with lower income individuals or groups.

U.S. Population Changes

Major shifts in age groups of the American population may bring on changes which affect all groups' lives. Projections for the increases or decreases of certain age groups are: Children under the age of 15 should increase by 11.1% by the year 2000, a slower growth pattern than in the past. The effect of this slow increase may be less pressure for building new schools, while smaller families may be less centered around children. The dominance of the teen-age and young adult (ages 15 through 29) will slip during the remainder of this century, with a 5.6% projected drop in population. Besides the obvious lifestyle changes that may occur because of this, crime may decrease as this catagory is the most crime-prone of all. Adults 30-64 will raise the most dramatically, up 45.7%. Job and housing competition may be in store as more and more Americans reach this age level. Senior citizens will jump in number 34.4%, with more opportunities for travel and leisure expenditures due to improving health and retirement income for most: Female senior citizens are growing even more rapidly in number.

Trolleys On Comeback With A New Name

Trolley cars are enjoying the first resurgence of use in decades, under the new-fashioned name of light rail transit. In Boston, 175 new trolleys are soon to arrive on that city's streets, with San Francisco also ordering 100 new cars. Rochester has decided to initiate a light rail transit system in a nearly 20 mile section of the city. Dayton, Ohio also has plans in the making for a similar system. Trolley lovers cite a number of factors in the cities' decision, including construction costs which are much lower than other forms of mass transit. Operating costs are also lower for the cars, since they can be hooked together during peak rush hours and run by one person, and electricity-using cars cause little pollution.

Nationwide Movie Push

More than 200 major markets will be used for Intercontinental Releasing Corp.'s ads for 'Call of the Wild" and "Chino" movies. The one week promotions will start on varying dates of the release of the movies. Radio, TV and newspapers are included in the package.

Sardines Are Good For You

Network radio forms the major part of a new advertising push by King Oscar Sardines, backed up by spot radio in selected markets. The humorous 60 second spots point out the high nutritional value of the field

ASCAP Files Action

The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers has filed against WNHC/New Heven, claiming that 16 of ASCAP's copyrighted songs were performed on the station without authorization. The copyright infringement action seeks statutory damages and asks that WNHC no longer air the material.

Radio On Cable TV

Virginia based National Cable Radio Network will begin radio programming on a cable TV system this month. The system, which will be displayed at the National Cable Television Association convention in April features announcers and current records on the audio portion of the programming, with visual displays of artist, label, album and liner notes on the TV screen. The format is designed to include paid drop-in spots by record companies during the album featured.

FCC Backs Ford's Media Blitz

President Ford's 1976 re-election campaign is getting a helping hand from the Federal Communications Commission. The Commission's repeal of equal time regulations acted to allow Ford to hold press conferences and other "news worthy" interviews without broadcasters worrying about equal time allotments. Ford's campaign has made good use of these factors, holding news conferences and personal interviews with broadcasters in states just prior to their primary elections. Democrats have challenged the FCC's retraction of the ban of news conferences by candidates, and a U.S. Court of Appeals is expected to hand down a decision on the issue imminently.

NBC Logo Sparks New Game

Some Miami advertising execs have taken advantage of NBC's recent logo-designing problem by marketing a new game "The Million Dollar Logo-The Great American Game." Geometrically shaped pieces allow people to design their own logos.

RSO/Polygram Merger?

Negotiations are now taking place between Robert Stigwood's RSO Records and Polygram Inc. on a possible merger of the label. A spokesman for the Stigwood Organization cited British economic and tax problems as the reason for the interest in joining in with a larger company. Polygram already owns nearly ¼ of the stock in RSO. RSO had been holding merger talks with Warner Communications previously.

McCartney Vetos Reunion Plans

Lee Eastman, attorney for Paul McCartney has virtually killed the possibility of the Bill Sargent promoted Beatles reunion. Eastman further stated that any get togethers by the 4 Beatles was not even being discussed. John Lennon's attorney Harold Sider backed up McCartney's statement by saying that he knew nothing about the Sargent deal.

Orange Juice A Drink Hit

Ever since the sugar shortage of the last 2 years, orange juice consumption in the U.S. has grown dramatically. Concentrated OJ leads the way with consumers, with 2% more concentrate being shipped from Florida during the first months of 1976 than the peak of 1974-1975 period. Supplies of concentrate are still big enough to keep prices down.

New Arbitron Radio Product Manager

Arbitron Radio has announced the appointment of James C. Mullen as Product Manager for Arbitron. Mullen will be based at the Beltsville Research and Production Center.

FCC Denies WLIR Review

Stereo Broadcasters, licensee of WLIR/Garden City N.Y. has been denied the opportunity to see certain documents surrounding hearings on their license renewal. Some of the documents which Stereo wanted to see include correspondence between prospective witnesses for the hearing, and some intra-agency memos.

Beef Prices To Rise

The current lower beef prices may soon move upward as production falls back after peak spring and summer activity. Record buying by American consumers will probably help the raise in prices, as more people have started buying beef in greater quantities than during the past 2 inflationary years.







JERRY BOULDING:

Research—How Much Is Necessary?

The question of how much research is necessary for radio is one on which there will be almost as many varying opinions as there are stations. There are some I'm certain that will feel that research applies only to music and that research is simply calling stores and assembling a list. This report will attempt to answer some of the basic questions and differences on re-

search and explain why it is necessary.

The difference is simple. It is a matter of asking yourself, "Do I Want To Guess?" or "Do I Want To Know?" The answers will determine what kind of program-director music director or air-personality YOU are!

Now, we don't want to indicate that research alone can solve your

ratings problems, but we do want to tell you that the right kind of continuing research will definately let you know who you lost and where they went and why. We do want to tell you that format changes and suggestions based on the right kind of research can make a big difference in your audience, your approach and even your job security. Everyone wants to hire a winner.

Finally, we want to point out that no amount of research can transcend the refusals of the owners, for whatever reasons, to implement the proved methods needed to make a station successful.

In the past we touched lightly on how the ratings services measure the Black audience and the difference in that audience. Now, we want to look at the kind of re-

Finally, we want to point out search that must be done to detertation amount of research can trancend the refusals of the owners, changes, if any, should be made.

One, of course, is demographic, ascertaining just where the majority of people with the most buying power are located age-wise in your market. For most, it is largely within the 18-49 age group; with more 18s than 49s: There are, of course, exceptions and you must be certain of delineating your target audience accurately before you begin.

Then, having done this, you should survey to determine whether there is a void in programming formats that would reach the target audience, and wheter there is a format presently in your market designed to reach the majority of that audience. A study of the ratings services' results in your market is a must here.

If you accept objectivity in determining the demographics and the void, you can then be highly selective in your target audience and format. For example, if you're the only "game" in town, how well do you do what you do? Could you do better if you were to implement or improve on your format? The answer to these questions almost always is "yes." Now comes the questions of what music to play, what rotation of the music would achieve the best results? We will cover music blend later in a separate section devoted entirely to music selection.

Let's talk about the air personalities. They should be convincing communicators capable of absolutely flawless on the air production during the entire time they are on the air. In addition, they should be warm, believeable and able to "sell!"

Next, you must blend the nonmusic ingredients equally as well as the musical ones. A system should be set up for the amount of news, public affairs and other material you feel is important to your community. Once, selected, it too, must be implemented properly and consistently.

Promotion is a large part of any successful radio station today. It has to be done both on and off the air. Something exciting should be happening on your radio station all the time you are in your normal music format. This can help to build new listeners for you who will want to continue listening to see what happens next. This is good for both quarter hour maintenance and

Finally, consistentcy must be maintained. The implementation of the research (two steps), assembling the music and rotation, placing the right people in the right time slots and assembling the promotion and other non-musical ingredients, all must happen day after day without error. Add to this blend support from management and time and you have the ingredients of a successful radio station. How much time? In very competitive situations it could take years. I've seen it start to happen, on the other hand, in just a matter of a few short weeks. The nature of the competition, their power, promotional budget, staff, etc, as well as how hard they fight back, often determines how much time before you start to see proven measurable results.

I'm told last year was the most successful thus far, but this year is going to be even bigger.

Basically invitational, the Hall-Bethel Tournament consists primarily of celebrities from the sports world and from the world of entertainment, mostly Nashville-based singers and musicians.




