



Quickies:

Lee Abrams, of Kent Burkhart and Associates has renewed WGRQ, KYYS, and WDVE of the Taft Broadcasting chain for additional consulting work. All three stations carry Abram's Superstars format.

Todd Wallace announced a self imposed moratorium on accepting new clients for his Radio Index firm. Wallace explained the move would prevent expansion from being accompanied by diluted quality. The company is currently serving 55 radio stations.

KRIZ/Phoenix has kicked off their monstrous \$25,000 cash and Datsun 280Z giveaways in their "Happy Honker" promotion. Anyone with a "KRIZ Ball" (sticker) on their car is eligible to be pulled over by the Honker to score the prizes.

Joe Persek has been appointed assistant music director of 99X/New York. Persek comes from ABC Radio. Atlantic Records is releasing The Stones single "Fool To Cry." Rushing copies out April 8th.

WIBG Changes Format

For the nine days leading up to April1, WIBG/Philadelphia segued music with no major announcements of their upcoming change. On April first, the station premiered its new upper demographic contemporary format.

On the air were several jocks from other Fairbanks stations, and a few new staffers. The debut weekend had the Magic Christian from WVBF, Bill Gardner, formerly of KDWB, Larry Dixon from KVIL, Chuck Riley the powerhouse from WIBC and Chuck Knapp, formerly mornings at KSTP. Several of the airmen were in for the kickoff only, with no firm air schedule, other than Knapp and Gardner set. Phillies baseball will continue at night.

Jim Hilliard is acting general manager, and George Johns is handling the PD position. Johns is also national PD for Fairbanks.

WIBG began with the "Peoples' Choice" promotion, which is almost a cash call contest with prizes rather than a jackpot. Callouts are made each hour and the person called must know the prize of the hour to win it. Prizes vary from a safari for two to Africa to interest on a million dollars for a full year. The station is not playing teen oriented music and seems to be gearing for an 18 plus audience.

Robert Stigwood hosted an elaborate party in Los Angeles last Monday (5) night to announce that Al Coury has been named President of RSO Records. Coury recently resigned as Senior VP of A&R at Capitol Records and has turned down several offers before accepting this position.

5 State Conclave A Success



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RADIO NEWS

STATION BURGLARIZED

WHHY/Montgomery was robbed by three gun-weilding bandits last Monday morning (3/29). An undetermined amount of cashwas taken from the station.

STATION HELPS RUNAWAY

KKXL/Grand Forks helped one young runaway girl from Winnipeg, Canada recently. Their afternoon drive jock received a phone call from a young lady who threatened suicide. The jock talked her into coming to the station, and notified authorities who determined that the girl was a runaway that had an all-points bulletin out on her. Local service agencies helped the station talk to the girl for numerous hours after she arrived at the station. About 9pm that night, a much happier runaway was taken home by the authorities.

NATIONWIDE CHARITY DRIVES Last week saw numerous stations participating in national efforts to

raise funds for charity organizations. **WIXY/Cleveland's Brother John** joined the American cancer Society in 240 continuous hours of underwater Monopoly. Pledges were made to a team of 50 divers who kept up the Monopoly game at the local Convention Center.

In San Francisco, KYA's Steve Jordan, Michael O'Conner, Mark Taylor and Gary Cocker participated in the local Easter Seals drive, manning the "fishbowl" located outside the studios where the local outlet for the national telethon was held. In years past, the cash-contribution fishbowl had netted less than \$1000. This year, because of KYA's efforts, total contributions to the "fishbowl" came to \$3000.

KFRC/San Francisco's Chuck Buell and KSFO's Jim Lange teamed up to co-host the 20 hour Bay Area Easter Seal telethon, The \$200,000



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total raised was one of the most successful figures from any area of the country during the national event.

KEZY/Anaheim raised \$250,000 for Orange County's March of Dimes campaign with a 20 mile Walk-A Thon. More than 15,000 people walked, ran and skate-boarded to the finish line for pledge money.

The entire air personality staff of Q102/Cincinnati hosted the local Easter Seals telethon from the city's Convention Center. Nearly \$100,000 was raised during the effort.

KING/Seattle is planning their March of Dimes "Walk-A-Lot" for later this month. Night jock Andy Barber is inviting listeners to be the first 300 to send in their sponsor sheets with 11 or more sponsors, qualifying them to be in the "Barber Brigade" with Andy. Walk-A-Lot shirts will be given to all the participants.

BRING BACK BOWIE

WBBF/Rochester recently ran a "Bring Back Bowie" weekend, after Bowie's arrest for marijuana possession in that city. At the sound of the cell door slamming, listeners called in to win Bowie's latest "Station To Station" LP. All listeners were invited to the station to sign a petition "reaffirming Rochester's faith in David Bowie." Brief interviews with Bowie were run during the weekend.

98Q's APRIL FOOLS

980/Vidalia pulled an April Fool's joke on their listeners last week. Promos on the air stated that "according to new 'equal speed rules, all records will now be run at 78 rpm, and that all radio stations would have to abide by that ruling." Listeners were so distraught by the supposed ruling, that some claimed to be forming a group to lobby against the new law. According to the station's PD Ken Curtis, many listeners were indeed fooled by the promos, while others picked up on it quickly. 98Q finally "came clean" and announced that it was only in jest and closed with playing "Everybody Plays The Fool.

CASH FLOWS IN NEW ORLEANS WNOE/New Orleans has given away a grand total of over \$9000 within a matter of days in their 'Free Money Calls" promotion. Amounts of \$2,000 to \$10,000 are offered to callers who have to guess the exact amount of cash on a rotating cart. One prize of \$4.011 was given away during the 3rd week of the contest, and three days later another listeners ripped off \$5,020. WNOE's championship basketball team "The WNOE Radio Ducks" report a number of wins in their recent battles with local groups and organizations. Coach of the team is AM drive man Michael Henry Martin.

BENEFIT BASKETBALL WLPL/Baltimore personnel will

take on the 1960's championship Baltimore Colts players in a basketball game to benefit the local Jaycees. WLPL personalities Brother Lou Kreiger, Jay Cleaver, Jefferson Keyes, Michael St. John and others will take on such greats as Johnny Unitas in the game.

WASHINGTON WINNERS

WPGC/Washington D.C. reports great audience response to their current "10 Second Showdown" contest. The Hi-Lo game awards listeners prizes from \$1 to \$500. The station also celebrated Elton John's recent birthday by inviting listeners to call in to sing their own personal tribute to E.J.'s birth date. Complete Elton libraries were given away.

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WPGC PD Jim Collins MC'd the recent Helen Reddy concert benefiting the Equal Rights Amendment, getting a chance to see friend Helen and Betty Ford, an attendee at the affair.

SOUTHERN ARTISTS PAID TRIBUTE

WAAY/Huntsville paid tribute to recording artists from the South recently. High point of the special was a sold out concert by Charlie Daniels and Marshall Tucker, along with giveaways of T-Shirts, albums, and an interview with Daniels on the air.

KYNO/Fresno is giving one lucky winner a chance to beat the upcoming summer heat in their "\$6000 Sunny Side Summertime Pool" contest. Hourly qualifiers are taken on the phone, and by postcard entries, to enter in a drawing for the winner of a \$6000 custom built pool. RETURN OF BLUE WINNER CARDS



Both Pepsi-Cola and Coca Cola have entered into comparative advertising schemes, claiming victories in taste tests. Pepsi has enlarged its "Pepsi challenge" ad campaign after successful gains in the Dallas/ Ft. Worth market. The ads specifically name Coca Cola. Coke has responded by planning a similar campaign. These spots highlight Goca Cola's Fresca brand, with such statements as "If you're a Pepsi drinker, Fresca has a surprise for you."

According to a CBS study taken from the Fall 1975 RADAR survey, radio may be nearly as strong with total women 18 plus as day-time TV. 57% of all women do not watch TV during the supposed 'housewife" time, but nearly half of them listen to the radio for an average of more than half of the 10am-3pm hours. Additionally, half of the 33 million women who do watch TV, also listen to the radio for an average of 2 hours daily.

Rich Pitches Fix It Yourself

Charlie Rich is singing for the Fram Corp., makers of car parts for the do-it-yourself car mechanics. An 8 week radio buy starts this month featuring Rich's spots, emphasized in drive times and "trucker" late night hours. Ad placment stresses the 18 to 34 year old demographics.

FM May Be Hazardous To Your Health

The Environmental Protection Agency has started a 2 year study into the possibility of hazards of broadcast radiation from TV and FM radio signals. Testing will establish radiation levels in major cities and what the possible health effects are.

Chiquita Goes Back To Advertising After a two year cutback of advertising, **Chiquita** brand bananas is planning a \$2 million push, including radio in 19 markets. Buys will be for fifty 60 second spots per week.

Fotomat Pushes Processing Quality

The biggest budget ever has been alloted by Fotomat for a radio and TV ad campaign to sell the quality photo processing done by the chain. Radio buys are scheduled for 250 stations in 65 different markets. Spots will run through the summer, with additional plans for buys during fall holiday time periods.

Mr. Steak Offers Combination Plates

Radio, newspaper and spot TV buys are slated for Mr. Steak restaurants upcoming advertising schedule. Most radio buys will be in markets with light concentration of the restaurants. Theme for the spots will be the combination plates offered in all branches.

NBC Technicians' Strike Continues

Nearly 1700 technicians and newswriters for NBC radio and TV are still out on strike after NBC refused to let them return to work without a contract. On Monday (5), the workers had agreed to return to their jobs, but NBC cited earlier sabetage of their New York equipment in their decision. Striking personnel include studio engineers, programming staff, newswriters and equipment operators. Management will continue to handle these jobs until a new contract is signed. Negotiations are scheduled to resume between the union and NBC Thursday (8).

Casual Dress The Norm For Business

The Dartnell Institute of Business Research has come up with figures that show only 2% of U.S. and Canadian companies require male employees to wear "traditional business suits." Banks and insurance companies lead the way in adhering to old dress codes, while nearly 80% of all businesses now confirm that it's ok to wear leisure suits on the job. Only 35% now require ties. For female employees, 75% still reject blue jeans in the office, while mini-skirts now hold the majority of approval.

El Paso ARB Part II

Arbitron has released the October/November '75 survey in a revised form. The new book now lists XHEM/Juarez, Mexico, and has deleted KGRD/Las Cruces, New Mexico. Both these stations had used similar call letter slogans, XHEM calling themselves M104, while KGRD used its dial position to call themselves 104. ARB reviewed all diaries, and the revised edition shows XHEM with a 3.7 AQH share total persons 12 plus, Monday-Sunday 6am-12mid. Interesting to note that the new book also shows slight changes in total shares for some other El Paso stations, although none significant enough to change rankings.

AFTRA/SAG Contract Increases 20%

A three year contract calling for 20% increases for spots and programs both on and off camera, has been negotiated by the American Federation of TV and Radio Artists and Screen Actors Guild for six San Diego radio and TV stations. KGB, KOGO, KGTV, KFMB, KSDO, and KCBQ all entered the agreement.

Women's Businesses Flourish

According to the Small Business Administration, female owned business accounted for \$102 million in loans in fiscal 1975. This figure represents approximately 9% of all loans made by the Administration. The first period of the current year shows even greater gains by companies with women majority owners, with 10.4% of all small business loans made to these businesses.

Commission Won't Divulge Complainants

The Federal Communications Commission has refused a request by WQIZ-WPWR/St. George, South Carolina to find out the name of a person who filed a complaint against the stations. It also would not allow the stations to have access to the FCC's investigative file in the case. The station had filed the request under the Freedom of Information Act. The Commission stated that possible harrassn might make it impossible to complete the case.

Postal Workers Won't Take The Blame

The American Postal Workers Union has undertaken a campaign to tell the American people that the current Postal Service problems are not their fault. The half million dollar multi-media effort includes an ad which proclaims "Grown men are playing 'Post Office' in Washington."

Clients Take Blame For Attorneys' Lack Of Action

The National Labor Relations Board has ruled that lawyers' clients are responsible for failing to answer unfair labor practice complaints in designated time periods. Although companies often put such cases entirely in their attorney's hands, the NLRB nevertheless says that not responding to the complaints automatically makes the client guilty of the unfair labor practice.

Coke Tests New Coffee

A new "partially decaffeinated" coffee is being test marketed in Tucson by the Coca Cola Co. The new concept coffee joins the Coke owned Butternut and Maryland Club brands, which currently hold 4% of the market.

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THE FCC [So You Can Understand It]

FCC ADOPTS SHORTER COMMERCIAL RADIO RENEWAL

APPLICATION FORM

The Commission has adopted a shorter license renewal application form (FCC Form 303-R) for commercial radio broadcast stations, designed to improve the FCC's information base and to expedite the renewal process.

Form 303-R will take the place of FCC Form 303, which has been amended for use by commercial television renewal applicants only, and revised to reflect uniform Commission policy and practice with respect to consideration common to both the commercial radio and television license renewal application forms.

The action was the result of the termination of an inquiry and rulemaking proceeding initiated last April 1.

New Form 303-R consists of five parts: Part I, General Information; Part II, Legal; Part III, Engineering; Part IV, Programming; and Part V, Equal Employment Opportunity. It includes 24 questions, some of which are optional and need not be answered by all applicants.

FCC PROPOSES RULES TO ACCOMMODATE AUTOMATIC BROADCAST TRANSMISSION SYSTEMS (ATS)

The Commission adopted a Notice of Proposed Rule Making in Docket 20403 looking toward Automatic Transmission Systems (ATS) for the broadcast services subject to the review of the final document. The Commission has confirmed its commitment to permit broadcast licensees to use the most advanced technology available and envisions as an ultimate goal the use of completely automated transmission systems. Such systems, the Commission said, could provide a more reliable and satisfactory broadcast service to the public while relieving the licensees of outmoded operational and equipment rule requirements.

As envisioned by the Commission, the ultimate devlopment in broadcast technology would be a self-monitoring and self-adjusting transmission system that would permit operation within established standards for the service and would not require constant surveillance by transmitter duty operators. Although the Commission intends the final rules adopted to encourage the use of ATS its recognizes that full ATS operation may not be practicable for some licensees. However, as stations incorporate components of ATS into their operation, they will be relieved of related operational requirements contained in the existing rules.

The proposed rules would permit all AM, FM and TV stations to utilize ATS at their option. Station licensees may use their existing transmitters by adding ATS control capability, either commercially available or of their own design and construction. With the use of ATS that will automatcally switch and maintain the operating parameters according to the station authorization and rule requirments, many operating log entry requirements and daily or weekly transmitter inspections would not be necessary.

FCC ANNOUNCES NEW CONSUMER ASISTANCE OFFICE

The Comission on March 19 announced the formation of a new Consumer Assistance Office.

This office will provide a central location or coordinating point within the Commission for members of the public, citizens groups and FCC licensees who seek information or assistance.

The consumer Assistance Office will be located conveniently for the public on the second floor of the FCC Building at 1919 M Street, N.W., and easly accesible during the Commission's normal business hours of 8 A.M. to 4:30 P.M.

Any person or group wishing information about the Commission's rules, matters pending or material explaining FCC policies and regulations may contact one of the full-time staff members of the Office.

FCC SAYS "PACIFICA" INDENCENCY STANDARD INAPPLICABLE TO LIVE NEWS EVENTS

The Commission has partially granted a petition for clarification or reconsideration filed by the Radio Television News Directors Assocation (RTNDA), of its February 12, 1975, ruling that language broadcast by WBAI (FM), New York City, in a recorded comedy monologue was 'indecent.'

WBAI (FM) is licensed to the Pacifica Foundation. In its February 12 ruling, the Commission stated that:

The concept of "indecent" is intimately connected with the exposure children to language that describes, in terms patently offensive as measured by contemporary community standards for the broadcast medium, sexual or excretory activities and organs, at times of the day when there is a reasonable risk that children may be in the audience.

The FCC said the "Pacifica" standard would not be applied to live on-the-spot broadcasts of bona fide news events, because licensees lose their ability to edit the contents of such broadcasts. The Commission concluded that it would be inequitable to hold a broadcaster responsible for indecent language broadcast under these circumstances.

RTNDA sought a ruling that the FCC did "not intend to apply its definition of indecent language so as to prohibit the broadcasting of indecent words which might otherwise be reported as part of a bona fide news or public affairs program."

RTNDA said the "Pacifica" ruling would cause licensees to censor programming and this would "not only have a deleterious impact on accurate and insifhtful reporting in sporadic incidents, but would tend Continued on Page 8

to impact over the long run most heavily on news coverage of those persons who, for whatever reason...,regularly and publicly use language which a majority of the public considers to be indecent..."

Accordingly, RTNDA asserted that the Commission probably did not intend that its standard be applied in such situations, and requested appropriate clarification. Alternatively, if the FCC did intend such an application, it asked that the Commission reconsider.

The Commission said its "Pacifica" order was issued in a specific factual context. It aid it shared RTNDA's concern that no action be taken that would inhibit broadcast journalism.

However, the Commission said, it differed with RTNDA's view that the 'Pacifica'' ruling would have such an effect, since the protection of young children from sexually explicit language was the primary purpose of that ruling.

The commission noted that in "Pacifica" it had intimated that such language could be broadcast—in a news or public affairs program or otherwise—when the number of children in the audience was reduced to a minimum, if sufficient warnings were given to unconsenting adults and if in the context used the language had serious literary, artistic, political or scientific value. "Having said this" the Commission stated it would "not comment on the various hypothetical situations posed by RTNDA."

RECORD INDUSTRY NOTES

Eric Clapton interrupted his recording sessions last Tuesday night to celebrate his birthday at The Band's Robbie Robertson's home in L.A. Well wishers who gathered for the occassion were Rolling Stone, Ron Wood, Chris Jagger (Mick's brother) RSO's Robert Stigwood and his singer/wife Yvonne Elliman, Kevin McCormick (Stigwood's Exec. Asst.) and RSO promo rep Russ Palmer who presented Clapton with a cake in the shape of a guitar. When the revelers strolled into Robertson's living room, they happened to turn on KMET radio just in time to hear DJ Jim Ladd wish Clapton a happy birthday over the air. Bob Dylan dropped by in the early morning hours to give his regards and found the party still in progress...And happy birthday to Tony Orlando who had his day while in concert at Boston Gardens. Chelsea Record's head, Buck Reingold, was also surprised last weekend by a host of friends and blew out his candles on a cake shaped in the numbers of the year he just turned...29, of course)!

Although a recent scientific report stated that plants die when exposed to Rock 'N Roll music, reports from New Zealand claim their cows thrive on it. Farmers in that country say their cows won't produce milk without music and bowed to bovine demands by installing radios in their cow sheds. Rock music increases milk production and current top artist on the cattle charts are Neil Diamond and Cat Stevens who get more quarts to the note than any other performer. Wait until they hear the new Led Zeppelin...instant whipped cream?...The English band, Dr. Feelgood made their debut appearance in L.A. recently. Cheering the boys on in the audience were the Who's Peter Townshend and John Entwhistle, Ron & Russell Mael of Sparks, Steve Gibbons and member of Ace who joined the band after for a celebration toast backstage...

Currently in rush release is the new Rolling Stones single "Fool To Cry" (edited down to 3:59 by Mick Jagger) from the new album "Black & Blue." The single is a ballad similar to "Angie." ...Rod Stewart, who's finalizing his new album, is planning a major solo tour this Fall as soon as he scouts up a new back up band...Top recording star of the sixties, Roy Orbison, who enjoyed a string of eighteen top ten singles' between 1957 and 1965 is coming back. Orbison will record a new album in Nashville on his original label, Monument Records, and will undertake a major tour of this country later in the year...Another comeback artist is Leslie Gore who just completed a new album with her original producer, Quincy Jones...John Denver is back home again on April 23rd when he launches his major tour, his first since last Spring, in concerts to last over two hours with no opening acts...

Although the **Tubes** has considered entitling their new album "Stevie Stardust And The Kittens From Mars," the actual title will be "Young And Rich."...European music fans who consider J.J. Cale a cult figure, will finally get a chance to see the artist in his first appearance there in a nineteen show tour coinciding with the release of his new album "Troubadour."...The **Doobie Brothers** were originally scheduled by Bill Graham to headline the Arizona concert for use in the movie "A Star. Is Born," but cancelled out a week before the event. Promoter **Bill Graham** calmly called long time friend, manager **Dee Anthony**, and **Peter Frampton** graciously beadlined the event at the last minute...

ABC TV has six one-hour music specials on their drawing boards and just retained Barry Manilow for the first show to air near the end of this year...The Carpenters, who are in the midst of their one millionplus SRO Japanese concerts, spend their time in between appearances viewing American TV shows. The twosome hauled over two video tape machines and more than 150 cassettes of U.S. TV programs they missed in the last two months while recording their new album, "A Kind Of Hush," coming May 7th...Bonnie Bramlet is near conclusion of her new album "Lady's Choice" with Wet Willie's lead vocalist, Jimmy Hall, backing Bonnie and other guests Bobby Whitlock and Dobie Gray...

Flash Cadillac and The Continental Kids leave for Manilla this month to appear in a coming movie "Apocalypse Now" being filmed by "Godfather" Francis Ford Coppola. The boys play the part of a bar band set in Viet Nam in the late sixties. The band reportedly had to get to the airport two hours early because the studs on their leather jackets give the metal detectors hysterics...Lee Oskar, who can duplicate the sounds of almost any instrument on his harmonicas, stopped by to talk about his self-titled new album, which is the first solo effort by any member of War. One of the founding fathers of War, Lee said "Sunshine Keri" (a song he wrote about his wife) and "Down & Out" look like possible single candidates, but radio feedback will be the determining factor. Lee has over a thousand harmonicas in his personal collection and started playing when he was six years old. Lee will probably be featured as a soloist in War's upcoming Eastern tour if "itfeels right."...

April 7th is the kick-off for **Slade's** giant U.S tour with the band set to play large concert halls and augment those rather impersonal outlets by appearing in those city's small clubs in a specific aim to get closer to their audiences.

The "Lisa Hartman" debut album, produced by Jeff Barry for CBS-distributed Kirshner Records, won resounding praise on the *Billboard* review page only

last week so, since it is obviously too soon for Hartman to draw as a club headliner, the lady's management team put her on March 15 before an audience of press, TV bookers and the like.

As can be imagined, this would not exactly be the warmest possible audience to play to. Yet Hartman had little trouble winning them over with her solid, versatile voice and engaging Texas stage presence. The 19-year-old Houstonite clearly has the natural equipment to eventually sell records on the level of an Anne Murray, Olivia Newton-John or any major female star.

The projected first single, "Pickin' Up the Pieces" (not the AWB tune) cleverly shows off both her belting and ballad styles within the same song.

Hartman comes across as a warmer and more open version of the Texas teen belle played by Cybil Sheperd in "The Last Picture Show" film. And she sure does sing pop ballads pretty.







Early Believers Coast-to-Coast Are Helping To Break The Earl Slick Band!!

Heavy Airplay—what a new act needs more than anything else has already developed in many cities and on many stations.

In Cleveland, where The Earl Slick Band album broke, WMMS' sales survey showed a 29 to 19 jump last week and hard-to-get M-105 has supported the LP since its release last month. In New York, home of Earl Slick, early believers include WNEW-FM, WLIR and WBAB on Long Island, and WRNW in Westchester where the album has been picked as a "predicted hit". In Chicago, WXFM/ TRIAD began to report The Earl Slick Band album "hot" after its second week! In Detroit, where rock'n roll is really appreciated, W-4 and WABX are into Slick. In St. Louis, where many acts have been broken, KSHE led the way and KADI has jumped to "heavy' airplay in two weeks. In Florida, Miami (Zeta 4/WINZ), Jacksonville (WAIV), and Orlando (WORJ) have all reported the album. In Seattle, KZOK/OK-1021/2 was an early believer and KISW has now gone with Slick. The same pattern occurred in Philadelphia, where WMMR-FM and WYSP have both reported having added Slick. In Northern California, San Francisco's KSAN and San Jose's KOME have led the way, and Sacramento's KZAP has reported The Earl Slick Band "hot". In Los Angeles, airplay is growing with KMET, KWST and KEZY-FM (Orange County) reporting the Slick album. Denver looks like a lock at this point, with KBPI, KFML and KLZ-FM all cooking with Slick.

Among the many other "early believers" are WAAF-FM in Worcester, Mass., where Slick was reported "hot" in its second week; WCUE-FM, Akron, which, like Cleveland, is sharing in the breaking of The Earl Slick Band album; upstate New York's WCMF, WOUR and WSAY; Columbus's WCOL-FM; Milwaukee's WZMF and WQFM; Allentown, Pa's, WSAM (which is presenting a Slick concert on April 19), and Nashville's WKDA....

There are many "early believers" of The Earl Slick Band album —many, undoubtedly, whose call letters have been missed.



may be at a loss to determine why they appeal to Blacks. If Black stations were to play all of this blue eyed soul that's coming out now, musically they'd be about 25 per cent white. I predict that one day in the not so distant future you won't be able to tell whether a station is white or Black by its music. The only way you'll be able to make that determination will be by how that station addresses itself in the areas of news and public affairs.

What about right now? Can you and should you play white product? If you do, how much should you play? What has been your listener response when you have? Were those calls positive or negative? If they were negative, what percentage of your listening audience do they represent? (same question if they were positive). The negative calls... are they because your black audience doesn't like white product, or is it because they feel that your station (because it is Black) should remain all Black? If you are playing white product, why are you playing it? What do you hope to gain? Is it white audience you'd like to attract? Are you trying to attract a portion of the Black audience which you don't now have? Or, are you playing white product because you feel your existing audience will appreciate it? If your existing audience goes for the idea, at what point must you draw the line? At what point are they likely to say "Too much?" You might just conclude that the whole thing is just too risky..but what'll happen if you don't. There What you do ory that hurt you"...but that's only true to a point. After that point what you don't play will catch up with you and it may hurt you when it does.

So when considering what white product to play, if any, ask yourself the same questions we've just looking into, plus a few more, because there is a risk. In fact, some of the same Blacks who listen to white radio may put you down for playing white product...they've come to expect a certain thing from you. Your answer as to whether you play white product and how much to play lies within your listening community because only they can tell you. If they tell you no, try and determine why they've said no. It may be that they really don't want to hear white product or it may be that they as Black people are "supposed" to say no.

Let's not forget that many blacks, after having dealt with white racism and the Black power thing which followed, have either become racist themselves or have felt compelled at least, to talk as if they have become a part of the so-called Black experience..in which case they wouldn't admit to liking anything white even if they did. In visiting the homes of Blacks whom I don't know well, I've found that they'll gladly play some Marvin Gaye and Earth, Wind & Fire...but in going through their record collections you'll find a lot of strange stuff at times. Their collections might include the Carpenters, C.W. McCall (Convoy), Andy Williams and who knows what else...but they won't play these for you and if you mention those songs they just might tell you that some other member of their family is into that.

So what do you do? Play the white product and gamble... or stick your head in the sand and gamble? If you play white product you may lose your black audience to the other radio stations or even eight track car stereos. If you don't play it, you just might lose your Black audience to the white stations who play Black product in addition to some of that good white stuff you won't play. At any rate the time has come for you to make a decision, you can't ignore it because the issue will not dry up and go away.

Black Radio: Top 40 With Black Music?

There are many people who feel that today's Black radio is, at best just attempting to copy its Top-40 counterpart. They claim that many well-run Black stations simply copy the contests, the news presentations and many of the ideas prevalent for some time in Top-40 radio. When we speak of "Crossover" should we include radio itself?

Let's question some of the facts surrounding today's contemporary Black radio stations and see what answers we come up with. First of all, Top-40 was itself a copy of ideas that many early contributors made. Imitation is now, and has been, a fairly common characteristic of all American business. Many successful innovations in electronic, food and beverage packaging, high finance, automobile merchandising and computers all are speedily copied by competitors. The same thing is true in broadcasting. And, inasmuch as Black-radio is apart of broadcasting, we too, are guilty of some duplication of successful systems which have proven themselves over and over.

It should not be so surprising that in radio, imitators are found both black and white. This is particularly true today, when Country AOR and other stations readily copy the successful ideas, often even in the same market. The original Top-40 format was so widely and successfully copied, many years ago, that nearly ever since, broadcasters have been monitoring and air-checking for new and different ideas on other stations and trying to reproduce, often without change, except for call-letters, what they think they've learned...occasionally they're disappointed that their imitation does not bring the ratings success enjoyed by the original. It should surprise no one that a radio station, regardless of its musical format, should seek to profit by the example of another station in another city. It does seem odd, however, when you see this kind of thing happening in the same market.

In most cases the station that tries to imitate the competition by copying its contests, promotions and playlists winds up on the short end...in the ratings book.

So the answer to the question, "Is black Radio Copying It's Top-40 Competition?" is a qualified, 'Yes''...and the reason for this apparent copying is obvious. First of all, the closest thing to the energy

level of most Black radio stations would be the Rock Station whose playlist often contains up to 70% of the same music in all three categories, current, re-current and gold.

Secondly, many of the early programmers of Black radio were ex-Top-40 PDs and jocks who applied this technique to Black radio stations. Finally, now that we understand the similarity in music and energy, the approach that the jocks must take to a high energy situation is to match the flow and the pace which is set and dictated by the music's energy level. The audience, very often, given two stations playing similar music tends to stay with the one with the lowest commercial load, the strongest signal and the most consistency.

When we speak of "Crossover" we almost now have to speak of radio itself. Black stations are now opening up their lists to essentially non-Black music that fits and does not offend. The same Black stations continue to play the music that eventually finds its way onto the playlists of other stations in their markets, often occupying a major portion of rock and AOR playlists.

What is discouraging about being' called the imitator, is that it is often said without giving credit to just how well some original things are being done along with the imitations. And, what is also discouraging is that often the sales staff of many black radio stations want to see them duplicate everything. Everything, that is, but the number commercials they can run per hour. In other words, imitation can't stop with "the ideas for contests, pro-, motions, music rotation, etc, it must continue right through tot he research that will tell you how much commercial time your format will sustain without overloading. How many Black radio stations could fare far better if they could just eliminate the commerical overload and the clutter.

In conclusion, there are no real secrets in the highly competitive radio programming business today. The reason more stations do not turn themselves around from "alsorans" tô top audience positions is often, their simple refusal of the owners for whatever reasons to implement the proved methods needed to make a leader in any. market.



Johnnie Taylor's "Disco Lady" which is now well over 1.5 million in sales just picked up night play at WCBM in Baltimore.


