The management, soon after Salamon's departure, changed the format on the AM and FM to all talk and news, which proved not to be as successful as when the station was Country.

WABC Bicentennial Celebration

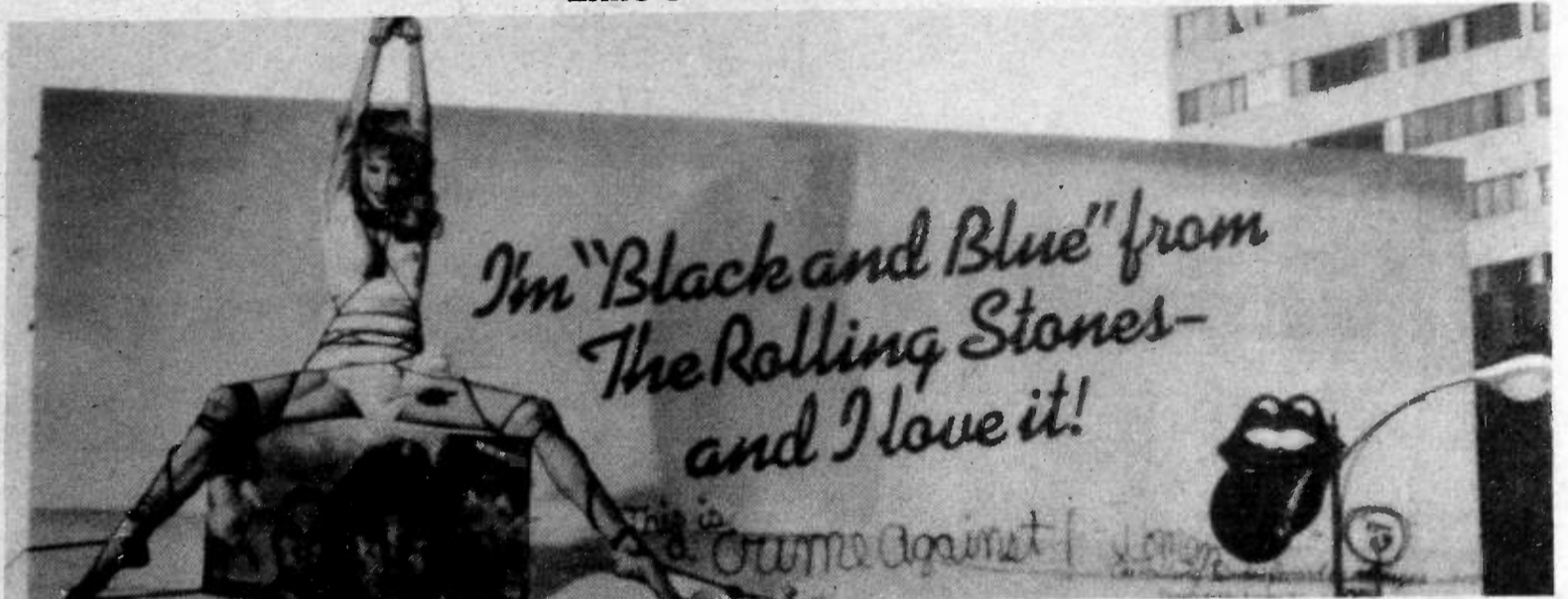

SIMULCAST-BLAST

One of the largest Bicentennial 4th of July fireworks display will be held in **Portland, Oregon**. The area's display will be unique this year because it incorporates a musical script/sound track broadcast on **KGW** and synchronized to bursts of fireworks shells. The musical "simulcast-blast" features a script charting the development of the U.S.A., written and produced by the station. The fireworks will be set to music using a programmed tape to coordinate the bursts of shells to music sequences.

BICENTENNIAL DISCO

WSAR/Fall River will kick off July 4th with their "Last Bicentennial Celebration." The disco party, held on July 3rd eve, will be broadcast live, featuring giveaways of Elton John tickets for the Boston 4th of July show, plus America's "History" LPs.

AMERICAN BIRTHDAY HOLIDAY

The sound of the Liberty Bell ringing is the cue for **WLOF/Orlando** listeners to call in to qualify for the station's Bicentennial holiday. Callers win various prizes and qualify for the seven-day trip to **New York City** and their choice of **Philadelphia, Washington D.C.** or **Boston**, along with \$100 spending money, hotel accommodations, plane fare and rental car.

WFIL'S BASEBALL NIGHT

WFIL/Philadelphia recently gave away hundreds of tickets to the station's special "WFIL Night at the Phillies" game. The station's pre-game show featured a concert by **Pratt & McClain**, camel and ostrich races with the WFIL jocks mounted up, a Foriz look-a-like contest and Fonz T-Shirt giveaways.

WEMP SEMI-AUTOMATED

WEMP/Milwaukee, who switched to a Top 40 format in February, has reduced its live programming to morning and afternoon drive shifts only, according to program director **Roger St. John**.

ISLAND PARADISE TRIPS

KEZY/Anaheim is giving away two trips to Hawaii. In order to qualify for the trips, listeners have to know which of the Hawaiian islands the station personalities are "visiting." Each hour callers guess which island one of the jocks is on. If

correct, they win a current hit LP and qualify for the drawing. Second prize in the promotion is 5 minutes in a local record store, where the listeners can gather up as many albums as they can.

GRADUATION HONORS

WMEL/Melbourne, Florida recently saluted top graduating high school seniors with their "Today's The Day" promotion. Station personalities traveled to area high schools during special assemblies, giving away America LPs and WMEL T-Shirts to the outstanding seniors in the graduating class.

KSTP'S FASTEST NIGHT

A jet plane to Las Vegas will carry one **KSTP/Minneapolis** listener to the "Fastest Night Of Your Life." The trip will be awarded to one caller who is drawn as the winner of the flight to see the **Carpenters** opening show at a Vegas club.

HIDDEN CASH

WAZY/Lafayette's Pat Leahy reports on their recent "Take The Money & Run" contest. The WAZY personalities give clues on the air to where on their person the sum of cash is hidden, listeners call in to guess which part of the anatomy it is hidden in to win it.

ELTON CONCERT FEVER

98Q/Vidalia is giving one of their listeners a chance to win coveted Elton John concert tickets. Station personality **Scott Kerr's** car is approaching the 98,000 mile mark, coincidental with the station call slogan. Listeners are asked to mail in post-cards estimating what date Kerr's car will pass that mark. Earliest post-card with the correct date will win that listener a pair of tickets to

Elton's Atlanta performance.

All past contest winners at **Q102/Cincinnati** have a chance to win Elton tickets from the station. Jocks announce former winners' names on the air, they have 5 minutes to call in to claim the tickets.

ELEPHANT JOKES

WNOE/New Orleans is giving a way passes to the circus. In order to score the tickets, listeners have to call the jock on the air, and tell him an elephant joke. If the story forces the jock to laugh, the listener's entire family gets treated to a circus performance.

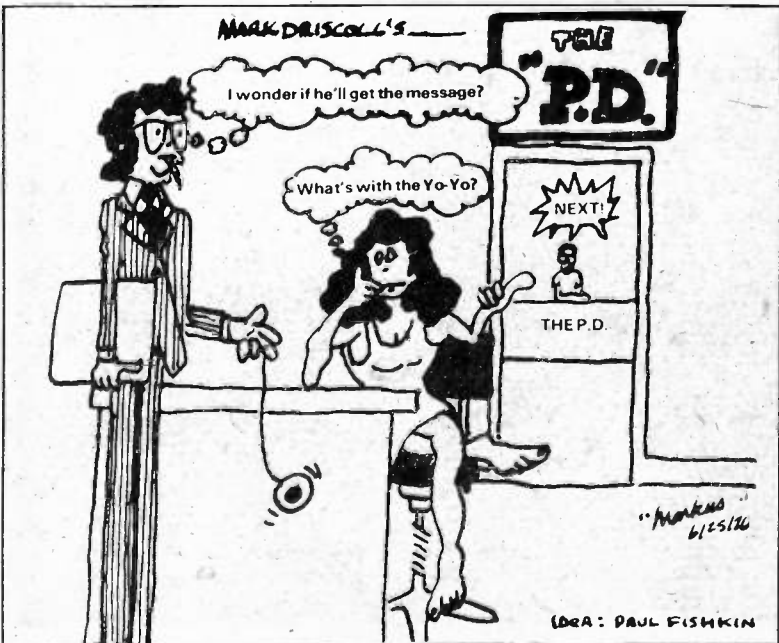

EMI Buys Screen Gems—Columbia

British based EMI Ltd. and Columbia Pictures Industries have reached an agreement for EMI to buy Screen Gems—Columbia Music and Colgems Music for \$23.5 million. Columbia Pictures will retain its ownership of Arista Records and Columbia Pictures Publications.

WSAI-AM-FM To Affiliated Publications

An agreement in principle has been reached by Combined Communications Corp. and Affiliated Publications Inc. for Affiliated to purchase WSAI-AM-FM/Cincinnati for \$6.3 million cash. Combined had earlier announced that Broad Street Communications Inc. would purchase the stations, but the deal fell through at the last minute. Affiliated Publications is owner of the Boston Globe. Sale is still subject to approval by CCC's board, lenders and the FCC.

NAB Against FCC Order

The National Association of Broadcasters has taken a stand against the Federal Communications Commission on the FCC's crackdown on 13 California radio stations. The Commission had cited the stations for not complying with the Fairness Doctrine when they ran paid advertising by the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. promoting a state proposition which would approve nuclear power plant construction without broadcasting opposing views. The FCC said that the issue was a controversial one and of public importance. The NAB is asking the Commission to reconsider the order.

Katz Sees Radio Rates Rise

Radio spots rates are expected to rise in all dayparts, according to Katz Radio's recently released "Spot Radio Planning Guide." The study shows that in the top 100 markets, rates have gone up in all dayparts, and price rises are noted by all stations ranked 1 through 4 in ratings in these markets.

KACY To CTW Communications

KACY-AM/Ventura, California has been sold to CTW Communications by Dellar Broadcasting. CTW is a subsidiary of the Children's Television Workshop. KACY's staff and two Dellar board members will remain with the station.

Drug Price Ads OK In Texas

Citing a recent U.S. Supreme Court ruling for the state of Virginia, a Texas district court judge has ruled that advertising containing pricing for prescription drugs is legal. The Texas state board of pharmacy had earlier received a temporary injunction against two drug store chains who had been advertising prices, and the board has stated that they will most likely appeal the judge's decision.

Justice Dept. Sues ABA

In an effort to overrule the American Bar Association's code against advertising prices, the U.S. Justice Department has filed an anti-trust suit against the ABA. The suit states that the ban on ads is a restraint of trade violation. Although the Bar Association has relaxed some of their guidelines on publishing lists of services available to potential clients, it has been standing firm against media ads.

How To Fly Your Flag

Congress has recently passed a new law revising rules on how the American flag can be used. You can now fly a flag at night, but only if it is lighted. When displaying the banner on a wall, the blue should be uppermost and to the observer's left. Flags on cars should always be attached to the right fender. The Star & Stripes should be hung upside down only as a distress signal, and it is still a no-no to wear the flag as clothing.

CB News

American CB'ers should know that permits are required when CBs are used in Canada and Mexico. If the permits are not obtained, the equipment could be confiscated. Border officials can be asked to seal the CB's so they can't be operated.

The FCC has asked Congress to allot over \$3 million to help them handle the CB epidemic. In March, the Commission received 600,000 requests for licenses, compared to 50,000 a year ago. The craze appears to be leveling off and the FCC expects to receive 500,000 per month now that the popularity is stabilizing.

Canadian Ad Restrictions

The Canadian government is asking for voluntary compliance to proposed regulations on advertising for alcohol. The proposals would restrict ads to between 9pm and 7am, and limit the total hours of commercials broadcast. Plans are also in the works to require ads to have health warnings. The regulations would also freeze dollar spending on beer, wine and liquor ads.

Clairol Gets Skating Star

Olympic gold medal winner Dorothy Hamill will be the spokesperson for Clairol's "Short & Sassy" hair conditioner. Besides appearing on the product's ads, Hamill will appear in two Clairol-sponsored TV specials during the next year.

Del Monte Radio Campaign

A six week radio ad campaign in over 60 markets is scheduled by Del Monte Foods, promoting their catsup, tomato sauce and canned vegetables. Bill Cosby and Tom Smothers voice the spots, with tags telling shoppers to look for "Good Old American Value" displays in stores. An additional campaign in California and Arizona features a promotion for Del Monte pickles.

Product Tie-In Ads

Two companies are going in together on a radio supported promotion for Hunt's Manwich, Sloppy Joe Sauce, and Wonder Bread's hamburger buns. Coupons for free packages of the buns are offered with proof of purchase for the products.

Savings & Loan's Olympic Push

Over 30 California radio stations will support Citizen's Savings & Loan's promotional program on the '76 Olympics. The Guinness Book of Olympic Records will be offered free at the company's outlets, and displays of Olympic souvenir items will be in all offices.

THE FCC [So You Can Understand It]

NEW BROADCAST EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY GUIDELINES ADOPTED BY THE FCC

The FCC has adopted new equal employment opportunity guidelines designed to reaffirm the Commission's commitment to genuine equal employment opportunities, strengthen the elements of an equal employment opportunity program and provide an opportunity for self-evaluation of the effectiveness of such programs by broadcast licensees.

This action was the result of a notice of inquiry and rulemaking released on July 25, 1975, which asked for comments on certain changes in the existing EEO guidelines including a model EEO program, new enforcement procedures including the imposition of goals and timetables and raising the threshold for filing a written EEO program from five or more full-time employees to more than ten full-time employees.

Under the new guidelines, the Commission adopted, with minor modifications, the model EEO program proposed in the notice of inquiry. The model program, which is designed to serve as a sample program, contains ten elements including sections devoted to a licensee's recruitment techniques and sources, training efforts, the availability of women and minorities in the applicable workforce, a job structure analysis of all job hires during the 12 months preceding the filing of a license renewal application, an analysis of the licensee's promotions during the past year and an analysis of the licensee's reasons for disparities which may exist between minorities and women on the station's staff and their presence in the community.

The Commission also amended its EEO rules to provide for a new filing threshold for those stations required to file written EEO Programs from the present five or more full-time employees to more than ten full-time employees. The Commission noted that written EEO Programs were of questionable value in the smaller broadcast stations and that under the new threshold, 91, 889 full-time employees representing 84.9 percent of the broadcast industry's total full-time workforce would still be covered by a written EEO program. The Commission noted that, while it requested comments on an exemption of up to 15 full-time employees, the more than ten filing threshold represented a more reasonable standard.

The Commission affirmed its use of the current "zone of reasonableness" standard in contested cases and indicated that it was in the process of developing a new processing standard for use in contested cases which would be "more in line" with the standard used in contested cases. The Commission also noted that it would continue to use reporting requirements and conditional renewals where it appeared that a licensee's EEO program was passive or not achieving desired results. In addition, the Commission indicated that it may require that a licensee set forth goals and timetables to "demonstrate the applicants good faith intention to increase minority and female utilization." The Commission emphasized, however, that it would not "require goals and timetables routinely from licensees who have demonstrated a result-oriented EEO program." The Commission also stated that in appropriate cases it may consider the use of on-site investigations.

Regarding specific complaints of employment discrimination, the Commission stated that it would continue to refer these complaints to the appropriate federal, state or local agency for their determination but where complaints were filed with the Commission they should contain specific details including the name of the complainant, the name and address of the licensee, a description of the alleged discriminatory acts and any other pertinent information. The Commission declined to adopt a proposed rule which would require that complaints be filed within 180 days of their occurrence and that the specific information contained above be mandatory.

The Commission also decided that changes in the Commission's Annual Employment Report (FCC Form 395) were not necessary because of the more detailed information called for by the newly adopted model program and because the instructions to the form were "sufficiently detailed to provide each licensee with adequate information to determine the appropriate job classifications at a particular station."

In reaffirming its commitment to nondiscrimination and affirmative action, the Commission noted that it has never sought to duplicate the efforts of specialized agencies such as the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. "Instead," the Commission stated, "we have sought to limit our role to that of assuring on an overall basis that stations are engaging in employment practices which are compatible with their responsibilities in the field of public service programming."

This action will be effective for those stations whose licenses expire on April 1, 1977, filing renewal applications December 1, 1976.

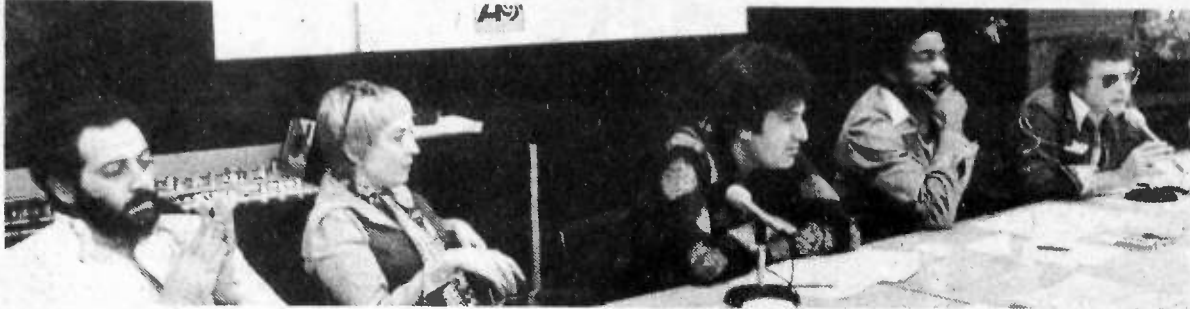

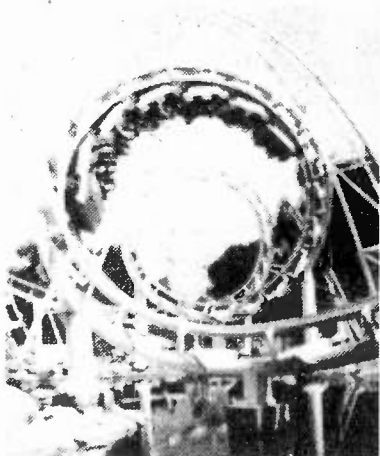

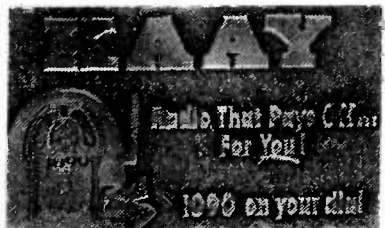

WEAQ/Eau Claire has recently started using these album research call-back cards. They are given to purchasers of album product at selected local music stores. If the buyers wants to cooperate, they fill out the card and send it back to the station. Two weeks after receiving the card, WEAQ telephones these individuals and asks a series of questions to determine the original motivation for buying the album and to pinpoint the most popular cuts. A number of other questions regarding radio listening habits are also asked. This research method enables them to get a more accurate picture of the popularity of a single, when it is suspected that album sales are hurting single sales, and may prompt the station to add well-reported album tracks in the future.

Registration forms are printed in this issue of **R&R**. Be sure to register now so as not to miss out of a hotel room.

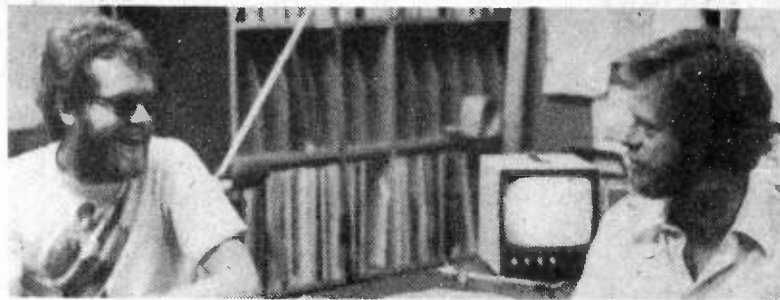

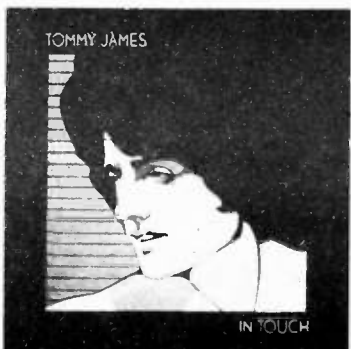
ALICE COOPER

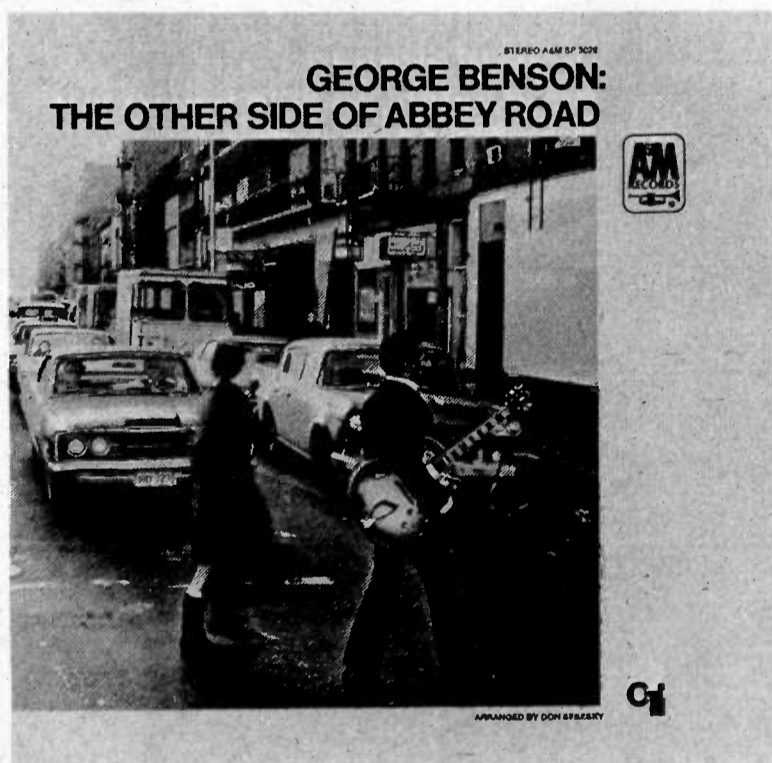

Also, a special thank you to DON WITT, ace NBC engineer, who worked more than an hour past his regular shift to help me put together a special report from WMAQ's studios for KLAC in Los Angeles.

Now the news: DALE EICHOR has been named Operations Director of KWMT, Fort Dodge, Iowa. SKIP NELSON, who was PD, resigned for personal reasons. Eichor will continue to handle the music directions... WEEP AM & FM will be returning to a Country format, after a year as an all-talk station. LARRY CLARK will direct the programming. (The story is in R&R's late news this week). Needless to say, they need Country product now. Send to Clark at WEEP, 107 6th Street, Pittsburgh, Pa. 15222...WUNI, Mobile, has a new mailing address: P.O. Box 1806, Mobile, Alabama 36601...JIM CHRISTOFERSON, PD of KFOX, Long Beach, is now doing 1-3pm on-the-air. He can be reached for music calls in the morning now.

I'm sure by now you have heard the news about the first International Radio & Records AOR Radio Convention, to be held September 17-19 in Cincinnati, Ohio at the Netherland Hilton Hotel. AOR Editor MIKE HARRISON and I, along with CHUCK FLOOD of Capitol Records in Nashville, have talked about having a "progressive country" or Album Oriented Country (AOC) section added to the agenda. Since most of the stations using this type of format use the same approach as many AOR stations, we thought it would be a natural to include an AOC in the total game plan for the convention. What with the new ruling cutting back simulcast time for AM & FM combined facilities, your station might be looking for an alternate format. It might be to your advantage, even if you are not going to make any format adjustments, to be there to know your competition better. I have been assured this will be a total learning experience, rather than the party atmosphere found at most conventions. If you think someone from your station might be interested in attending some meetings on AOC (Album Oriented Country), as well as the others, please let me know. It was interesting to note that more than fifty percent of our reporting stations had no plans to do anything for the upcoming Fourth of July Bicentennial Weekend. Many felt that the Bicentennial was a big "rip-off" and was so overcommercialized that their station did not want to have anything to do with it at all. "Threads of Glory" will run noon to 4pm Sunday. WISZ listeners are also invited to call in and say what they think about America. Each caller wins a single of one of the current patriotic songs...The famed Freedom Train will be in Charleston, West Virginia, and WCAW will be giving away tickets and Haggard singles...KWMT, Fort Dodge, will be playing flag and patriotic songs once per hour on the Fourth...KENR, Houston, will take part in a rodeo and fireworks show...WHOK-FM, Lancaster, Ohio has asked listeners to send in their vote for their favorite record and the station will run a countdown of the favorites during the weekend... "American Country" will be the title of the weekend special on WITL, Lansing, Michigan. The program will highlight the lives of many Country music greats...WLOL, Minneapolis, has been running Bicentennial minutes since last Fourth of July. The plan to run the best feature minutes and they have invited their audience to call in to wish America "happy birthday"...WSM, Nashville, will hold a picnic on Sunday at Centennial Park for their "friends and neighbors"...WHN, New York, is giving away "a share of America" to listeners who call in birthday greetings for America. Their share is a \$25 savings bond...WWJO, St. Cloud, Minnesota, will have some of their jocks out at the local parks to do reports on the fireworks and other related festivities...WIL, St. Louis, will give away hot dogs and chicken during the weekend. It is just a "call-in-to-win" contest...Food, such as hot dogs, cokes, etc., will be free at a birthday celebration put on by KRMD, Shreveport. Epic artist DAVID HOUSTON will entertain the troops at the benefit show, where they are asking for a one dollar donation for a local boys club...KCKC, San Bernardino, and KFGO, Fargo, North Dakota, will run the 35 four minute specials from the CBS radio network...KSO, Des Moines, and KSOP, Salt Lake City, will air the American Country Countdown special with host DON BOWMAN, from Watermark Company...
