D.C. Stations Fined Over Lottery Spots

Seven Washington D.C. area radio stations were fined last week by the FCC for broadcasting lottery information, which is a violation of the U.S. Code. The lottery was part of a local pant store promotion which was advertised on the seven stations. The commercials that were broadcast explained that when a person bought a pair of slacks (consideration) he could then spin a roulette type wheel (chance) that contained various dollar amounts which would be deducted from the total purchase price (prize). All three elements of a lottery seemed to be apparent and the Commission moved in with the fines

Fined were WASH-FM, WEEL, WHFS-FM, WMAL-FM. These four stations were ordered to forfeit \$3000 each. The other three stations, WEAM, WPGC and WPGC-FM were fined \$2000 each.

R&R learned that WMAL-FM attorneys had called to clear the spot with the local FCC office and received clearance from a staff advisor. The clearance was informal and in no way can be used in defense by the station. The interesting part is that when the FCC did decide to fully investigate the commercial and made the decision that the advertisement was of a lottery, the station was never advised by the field staff


RSO Expands







Being Relatable To Your Audience

From Mike Butts In The A.M.-

What are the most important ingredients in preparing a morning show...playing music that's right on target...a great voice...information...funny bits? The first two items are certainly important, but as an air personality, these shouldn't be the top priorities in your mind. The Program Director does his job...and the music is right...in the pipes department, that's out of your hands too, you got what you were born with and short of being contrived, there's nothing you can do to change that. Information is naturally expected, but the way you do creative bits...one liners, etc...anything over and above the basics will help you win or drag you down.

Please allow me to share with you what most pros have known for years, and what my dearest friend taught me years ago. Don Barrett, now with Columbia Pictures, was my G.M. at KIOO/LA, WWWW/Detroit, and National Program Director when we both worked for the McLendon Corporation. His thoughts were, "If you can't do anything else...at least be sure you do what's important to a morning show or any airshift...be relatable." Be relatable to your audience...relatable to what's happening where you're at It's been of great help to me...it's a tool of success, and if nothing else, it's a great crutch.

Maybe you don't have the best voice in the business... join the club! There's only one Charlie Van Dyke..maybe you don't have a one liner ready for every situation..so what... I've never heard anybody more polished with that style than Dr. Don Rose. So it's important that the things you say, and do, make it.

I always write my own material..ego is one reason, and I love to create bits and perform them. The alternative to this, of course, is subscribing to a joke service. Great for stand-up comedians..good for, stimulating my mind with fresh input so I can write more of my own stuff, but basically those bits will be done by thousands of jocks all over the country... same bits...same days..bits of jokes that were written "in general"...and not for my market. You can get closer than that.

A legal pad in your car will help you to remember to jot down "relatables" as you see or think of them. Something visible that has some humor in it that you can print here, but you could point out that huge, but concealed chunk out of the road at the intersection of and that you discovered. It relates first of all...provides a service in some cases... makes you sound on top of things, and then if some of your relatables can be made into comfortable humerous bits, well that's even better. Just keep your eyes and ears open and a pad and pencil ready to write 'em down so you don't forget. Be on the outlook for "hooks" or "tie-ins" with local TV personalities, sports figures, newspaper columnists. You can do it with the music in some cases...here in the Twin Cities, of Minneapolis/St. Paul. from time to time..it's Lovin' You by Minne-Apolis Ripperton..or Silly Love Songs by St. Paul Mc-Cartney..or Chicago with Saturday in____ Park.

How about being relatable in the weather forecasts...On a humid day, it could be as sticky as the "Stadium Issue" is...or something making headlines locally...the skies could be as grey as_____'s hair! ______being the anchorman on Channel 4 or whatever...there was sooo much ice on my car this morning that Garry Unger could've scored a hat trick on my windshield.

Hopefully you won't think I'm trying to come off as an expert ...I'm not, and furthermore, I'm not even a Program Director. The intention is simply to make a contribution to those who can use it, and to add some fresh input for you if it fits.

Being relatable will set you apart from the others, because believe me, not everybody does it. Some jocks may have a great voice, be technically perfect and have many other qualities, but you'd never know they live where they do-by listening to their shows. It takes more than just three or four hours a day...it takes extra work, knowing where you're at, being visible from time to time to those who might be listening... it's a knowledge you have and a feeling that you get. It's recruiting new listeners, self-promotion and establishing yourself as a real, live member of the community. Here are some ideas on what I mean:

Rather than have your programming secretary or anyone answer your mail for you...and certainly before you'd mail out a form letter, answer your own fan mail, personally. It's worth it in the long run even if it is a lot of extra work. People really appreciate it, and it's good PR for you and the station.

Don't just wait to get it...solicit it. For instance, when you give away a prize on your show...get all the info, and send out thank you notes to people who have won on your show. It will be appreciated by the person who received your letter... they are sure to tell someone else, and if by some chance your station takes a long time to mail out prizes, your letter could buy some time to keep the winner from getting upset. Survey Pictures

Each day on your way to work, carry along a supply of survey pictures...stop at different newspaper boxes..buy a paper, and then insert a survey picture inside each one of the newspapers...you should have reached somebody with that trick. Jukebox Numbers

Talking about relating right? Go to a popular spot where they have big crowds..you must select a good relatable place everybody is aware of..copy down the numbers on the jukebox... to be used on the air in such a way, i.e., Elton and Kiki Dee..all over the country that song is Number 1...and number S-5 on the jukebox at Henry's Place, or whatever,

You can help promote your show by establishing a "regular" spot in all areas that you trade and do business with..such as the gasoline attendant where you get gas...the waitress at the same place where you have your meals or coffee before work...the clerk at the dry cleaners and so on. Be their friend... offer them a T-shirt or something from the station...be glad to give them an autograph for their kids, and for no reason at all, drop off an album that you thought they might enjoy... they'll appreciate it, talk about, and all of a sudden, you're no longer just somebody on the radio...you've become a personal friend, and to them, a very special member of the community.

A couple of rating periods ago, from the time I got off the air at 9AM until sometimes as late as 8 at night, I would just go out all over my cities and create situations that would enable me to meet people, introduce myself in a way that wasn't obvious hype, and do something nice for the people I did come in contact with. Try it..load up your car with station prizes..shirts, key chains, bumper stickers, patches, albums, station paraphernalia, survey pictures of yourself, etc. Pull in a gas station to get a dollars worth of gas that you really don't need...so you can ask directions to a place that you may already know how to get to...just so you can say, "Thanks...

HI NIGHTFALL . I'M LOOKING FOR THE NEW RESEARCH QUESTIONNAIRE I really appreciate your help...what's your name...Oh Bob, Well Sue, it's nice to meet you...I'm Mike Butts, I do the morning show on KDWB...thanks again for your time and help." Drop a Beach Boys' album or T-shirt in their hand, and be out the driveway or door in seconds flat. It's a lot of extra work... granted, but it just can't do anything but huge positives for yourself and the station...those people that you came in touch with will check your show out at least once...Be Great!

Even though I have been fortunate to always have worked in major markets at great stations with good numbers, it isn't surprising that you don't know me and may be asking yourself, where does this Butts guy get off giving advice? True, I don't write articles very often...I don't send my picture in everytime I'm at an industry party, or when an artist comes by the station to say hello and promote his product ... and if my dog had puppies, Claude Hall would be the last to know. Industry publicity is great.don't get me wrong, and maybe I don't promote myself that way enough. It's great for the ego, nice for your friends, you can send five copies to your mother, BUT...the bottom line on publicity for me is this ... will my article in R&R reach an 18-34 male in my market will it increase my teens or help my adult women numbers? Will that energy I'm spending on my ego relate to where I'm at and help make me successful? The next time I get a shot in the trades, that'll be nice, and I'll be grateful but it won't mean as much as a local story that my audience can see that might help me win. Winning and being number one is all that matters to me...and I'm not where I want to be yet, but being relatable has gotten me this far....THANKS DON!!!

Senate Passes Anti-Trust Bill

A Senate Bill which would affect sale of broadcast properties has passed the house of Congress by a wide margin. The anti-trust legislation has been lobbied against by many broadcasters and other industries. Also included in the bill is an anti-price fixing clause. A compromise bill is being readied for discussion by the House of Representatives. Many experts expect **President Ford** to veto the bill when it reaches his office.

3 Way Station Selling In S.F.

CBS has completed negotiations to purchase KEAR-FM/San Francisco in a three way exchange of properties. CBS' KCBS-FM would be sold to Golden Gate Radio, KMPX sold to Family Stations, and KEAR would be bought from Family by CBS.

White OK'd for FCC Spot

The Senate Commerce Committee has approved **President Ford's** nomination of **Margita White** to the FCC. White takes over a 2 year term left vacant by **Charlotte Reid**.

EEOC Cuts Down Backlog

In an effort to take care of nearly 120,000 job discrimination complaints, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission has initiated new procedures to speed up action on the complaints. Charges by complaintants who cannot now be located will be dropped, and cases found to have no base will be dropped as soon as possible. In addition, the EEOC will attempt to make settlements between employer and complaintant before the cases are put on the books.

Station Renewal Denied

The Federal Communications Commission has turned down the license renewal application of WBRL/Berlin, New Hampshire because of false billing practices covering a three year period.

Record Budget For Lincoln-Mercury

An increase of 15% for Lincoln-Mercury's advertising budget for the first quarter is projected for introduction of their new models. The Ford Motor Co. division says that their ad schedule is based directly on consumer research. Lincoln-Mercury's full sized cars will be pitted against General Motors new cut-down sized models in ads. Television is scheduled to take up nearly 70% of the ad budget. The Continental Mark V commercials will be placed in radio and TV.

Big Budget For New Soup

In direct competition with Lipton's "Cup-A-Soup," Nestle's will introduce their new "Souptime" soups with a huge advertising budget. The ad plans, expected to be in the multi-million dollar range, will follow the initial introduction in West Coast cities, after test-marketing in Buffalo and Portland, Oregon. Celebrity Peg Bracken will be featured in the commercials.

Anti-Freeze Companies Pray For Bad Weather

Big inventories of anti-freeze from last winter have urged manufacturers to start their advertising campaigns early this year. **Dowguard** brand will use local radio and TV spots to drum up business. The nation's leader in anti-freeze, **Prestone II**, will place up to \$3 million worth of advertising during the cold weather season.

Mars Ad Tie-Ins

The recent Viking exploration of Mars has led some American companies to use the "red planet' in advertising. Radio spots for TRW, Inc. tell listeners about the role the company's equipment plays in the Viking's search for life on Mars. Rockwell International's advertising salutes the Viking's research, and reminds Americans that they are working hard on upcoming Space Shuttles.

Football Star Buys Into Radio

KAGB/Los Angeles has been bought by former football star Willie Davis for \$225,000. The sale is still subject to FCC approval. The outlet has been off the air and bankrupt since last December. New call letters will be requested by Davis' new company, All Pro Broadcasting Inc.

New Computer For ARB

Arbitron has installed new advanced computers in their Beltsville research center. The new system is scheduled to be in operation for the October/November 1976 Radio survey. It is expected that the new computers will speed the processing of market and special reports.

How Much Does Your Car Cost

The cost of using a new car is \$7.44 per day this year for standard sized autos, \$4.83 for compact and \$3.95 for sub-compact models. Costs continue to decline with each year of use, and the margin of difference between the costs of each size of car decreases.

Skateboard Parks

A San Francisco company is betting on the continuation of skateboard popularity. They plan to open 100 custom skateboarding parks within the next year. The full acre parks will feature slopes designed for varying skills, and shops selling equipment and service on boards.

THE FCC [So You Can Understand It]

This column, from an issue of R&R two years ago, is being printed again as an information service to our subscribers because of the recent FCC action against seven Washington D.C. area radio stations for broadcasting lottery information within a paid commercial.

LOTTERIES

It is generally agreed that in order for a particular contest and/or promotion to be labeled a "lottery" it must contain three elements prize, chance and consideration. For purposes of general guidance, a lottery is generally understood to comprise a game of chance for the purpose of raising funds, attracting customers, increasing product sales, and so on. Thus, a prize must be offered; chance must be involved; and the participants must have been required to pay money or give some other vaulable consideration in order to be eligible to win. As set forth above, all three elements must be present for any particular scheme to be classified as a lottery.

CLIENT LOTTERIES

In many instances station advertisers hold prize drawings to increase their business and announce that the chances are "free," when in fact some type of merchandise **must be purchased** or a **payment made before a customer receives his chance.** Such a situation constitutes a lottery despite the absence of an extra charge for the chance, the consideration being the necessity for making a payment to the store or making a purchase in order to become eligible for a prize. Admission to a night club or dance with a door prize drawing being held is advertising a lottery if you advertise the door prize on the air.

EVERYBODY WINS


Moreover, where all participants who buy a chance or make a purchase win something, but the value of the prize depends on chance, or where ona may participate in a drawing without payment or purchase, but payment or purchase makes one eligible for a larger or "bonus" prize —in both cases all of the three necessary elements are present for the particular scheme to constitute a lottery.


PUBLIC SERVICE ADS

Many questions confront a broadcaster on a daily basis concerning events such as church carnivals, state fairs and other local activities where lotteries (bingos, door prizes, games of chance, etc.) are featured. The broadcast of announcements concerning such a carnival and/or state fair or any other event will appear to be proper so long as the announcements make no reference to any game or promotion which is a lottery, and so long as the carnival and/or event includes other activities which are not lotteries and to which the announcements can reasonably be said to refer.

CONSIDERATION?

The most difficult element to define is obviously consideration. The FCC has held that consideration is present if an automobile dealer requires a customer to take a demonstration ride in a new automobile in order to win a prize. While a mere trip to a store and/or any other place of business to obtain a "free" chance is acceptable, particular care must be taken that the "free" chance is readily available to the members of the public in a convenient and conspicuous place.
