KMPC/Los Angeles all-night personality Sonny Melendrez is one of the subjects of a 30 minute television special to be aired in Japan. Melendrez was the only disc jockey in the U.S. chosen for a segment of an eight part series entitled "Earth Is Music." Film crews captured everything Melendrez did on the air at KMPC, and also were at the home of a regular all night show listener, drove with a truck driver who was listening to Sonny, showed up at a restaurant where the cook had KMPC on, and later at breakfast with Melendrez and another listener who had won a contest on his show.

Cash Clearance

WDAK/Columbus, Georgia held one of their biggest cash giveaways during the Christmas holidays. The "Cash Clearance" promotion featured hourly winners of \$10 to \$100 bills for nearly three weeks. To top off the cash offerings, the station has also offered hourly giveaways of hit albums each and every weekend.

KHJ Charities

The second annual KHJ/Los Angeles Christmas Cavalcade of Stars charity concert raised \$180,000 for the California Hospital Medical Center and two other organizations. Over 18,000 KHJ listeners packed the L.A. Forum to see Chicago, Tony Orlando & Dewn, The Sylvers, Sonny & Cher, Engelbert Humperdinck, Gabe Kaplan, TV's "Wonder Woman," Lynda Carter and Ringo Starr, who made a special appearance as Santa Claus. California Governor Jerry Brown made a surprise visit to the show to personally congratulate KHJ and all the celebrities who made the concert possible.

KHJ has also announced plans for another charity drive, the March of Dimes Superwalk, to be held this month. Walkathon Chairman is KHJ's Dr. John, who will fead listeners along the 20 mile walk. The Sylvers and Donny & Marie Osmond will officially start the walk with a ribbon cutting ceremony.

KRNT/Des Moines morning man Ray Dennis "gets some tail" from the Pink Panther. In a week long promotion, the station gave away more than \$600 worth of tickets for the movie "The Pink Panther Strikes Again." Listeners were given times and locations where they could find the Pink Panther in the Des Moines area and simply ask for the free tickets.

"Superbowl Of Rock & Roll"

WSGA/Savannah tied in with last weekend's football Superbowl with their "Superbowl of Rock & Roll" contest. Listeners called in to vote for their favorite of two records, with the winning, hit challenging another record the next hour. The afternoon of the Superbowl, the top 10 challenge winners battled against each other, with the final hit declared the "Superbowl winner."

"Kiss" Promotions

WFIL/Philadelphia's "Kissmass Concert" raised \$21,000 for WFIL Charities Inc., benefiting several local charitable organizations. Kiss and Bob Seger headlined the sold outshow.

KSLY/San Luis Obispo gave away Kiss albums and posters during their "Kissmass" celebration.

WSAR/Fall River had two weeks of promotion leading up to Kiss' Providence concert. The group's "Rock & Roll Over" albums, posters, stickers and special edition albums were given away.

"Smashed" On The Air

To remind listeners to be careful of their drinking during the holidays, several stations performed 'on air drinking sprees." WDRO/ Detroit afternoon man Tom Jeffries consumed nearly two pints of scotch while on the air before Christmas, a feat which made a feature story in the "Detroit Free Press." A Michigan State police Sgt. was on hand during the drinking, as well as a member of the Auto Club of Michigan. Both tested Jeffries periodically, and finally pronounced him drunk enough to be considered to be a driving hazard.

At WGUY/Bangor, both Jay Michaels and Mike O'Hara sacrificed themselves by drinking as much as they could, while being monitored by a registered nurse, who took their blood pressure and performed other tests to measure their degree of drunkeness. Local police officers were also in the studio to remind listeners of the dangers of drinking before driving.

Other Promotions

WRNR/Martinsburg gave away 10 \$100 bills to brighten their listeners' Christmas, as well as offering a complete stereo system and cassettes of the year's biggest hits to call in listeners. The station is planning a Jamaican trip giveaway in the near future.

WJON/St. Cloud's current car sticker campaign is called "Radio 12 Bump." Listeners who display stickers on their autos win 8-packs of Coca Cola. All winners of the Coke qualify for weekly drawings for 3 minute "record runs" in local record stores.

Dan Clayton, President and General Manager of WBBF/WNWZ-FM/ Rochester has announced plans to change format of WNWZ to an "adult album" format effective February 1st. WNWZ has filed for new call letters, WJMQ, known as "Magic 92" on the air. Limits On Non-Commercial FM's

The National Association of Broadcasters has told the FCC that non-commercial FM stations need more technical regulations. The NAB says that the first priority should be to prevent these signals from interfering with television signals. Also mentioned by the Association was the need for limitations on power, and transmitter location of these stations. 1

November Complaints Up

The FCC had a flood of complaints during November, up to 3,976, an increase of 1080 over October. Comments and inquiries increased by 388, and the Commission sent 1222 letters in reply to the public's questions.

ABKCO/Beatles Settle For \$5 Million

The ABKCO/Apple/Beatles group of companies have settled their long-term disputes, with the announcement that Apple will pay ABKCO slightly over \$5 million. All litigation in U.S. and English courts has been dropped. AKBCO Industries President Allen Klein was quoted "This egreement would not have been realized without the tireless efforts and Kissinger-like negotiating brilliance of Yoko Ono Lennon."

RIAA Goes For Upper Demo Buyers

The Recording Industry Association of America has outlined plans to increase record sales to the over 30 age bracket. A research operation is planned to examine consumer motivation and the industry's current functions. Interviews with radio people, wholesalers, record company execs, retailers and the press will be held, and an independent research firm will conduct talks with consumer groups. The study program will also enable the RIAA to determine how they can keep hold on current record buyers, as well as expand to older age groups.

Carter Asked To Investigate Racism

Several groups and civic leaders, including the Coalition Against Racism and Sexism and the Group for Advertising Progress, have asked the incoming Carter administration and other agencies to investigate possible discrimination against minority groups and women in the advertising and communications fields. The groups feel that there is an absence of these people in decision making capacities in broadcasting, print media and in advertising agencies. In a more direct move, the Coalition is calling for a boycott of products sponsoring the "Tonight Show," claiming that Johnny Carson regularly uses language offensive to Blacks and women.

Fawcett Sale To CBS Goes Through

Fawcett Publications Inc., publishers of Woman's Day, Mechanics Illustrated and Rudder magazines, has been sold to CBS Inc. for \$50 million cash. Fawcett also owns paperback book rights, a printing company and book and magazine distribution company.

RCA Closes Studios

RCA has announced that it will close down its Nashville and Hollywood recording studios. The Nashville outlet was scheduled to close down today (14), and the Hollywood studios on January 21. The National Association of Broadcast Employees and Technicians voiced their complaints on the closing, which would put close to 80 engineers under NABET contracts out of work.

Broadcast Management Changes

King Broadcasting Co. has appointed Jim Kime to the newly created post of Director of Operations and Development, moving from the Station Manager position at KING/Seattle. Kime's replacement at KING is former KGW/Portlend Manager Keith Lollis.

Frank Celebre is the new General Manager at WDAE-WAVV/Tampa, replacing Jerry Norman, who left that position to go into his own advertising business. Celebre was the former Sales Manager for the Tampa stations. Frank N. Magid Associates has named Bill Moyes as Vice President of the company. Moyes retains his Director of Radio Services title, and will take on the responsibilities of supervision of all radio accounts.

NBC Settles Part Of Copyright Music Suit

A class action anti-trust suit brought by the Composers and Lyricists Guld of America has been partially 51 settled with the NBC network. NBC agreed to return copyright ownership of music composed directly for that network to the writer. The settlement stipulates that copyright can be returned to composers retroactive to 1968 if a formal demand is made. Although NBC made an out-of-court settlement, the original suit also named the other two major networks and the Association of Motion Picture & TV Producers, none of which agreed with the NBC proposal. The trial for the remainder of the suit is still pending in U.S. District Court in New York. Continued on page 12

The FCC [So You Can Understand It]

FCC SUSPENDS COLLECTION OF ANY AND ALL FEES FROM EVERYONE

As an immediate FCC follow-up to those recently-announced Court of Appeals (D.C.) Decisions that reversed the FCC's past and present Fee Schedules and returned the entire matter for FCC consideration, including possible refunds of past Fee payments to all parties wherever indicated, the FCC has now taken the extraordinary step of suspending its collection of all Fees for whatever purpose, and by all parties. The suspension became effective on January 1, 1977.

In the absence of some Congressional action authorizing the FCC's later collection of any Fees based upon some rational standards, it is now problematic whether FCC will ever reverse this suspension, and begin again to charge Fees from most parties before it and for a veriety of applications or licenses as it has on various bases since its first Fee Schedule back in 1970.

The FCC's just-announced reaction goes much further than that to suspend all Fees of every kind starting in 1977. Moreover, it admits that without some appropriate Legislative authorization and guidance, it would "now be extremely difficult to adopt a fee schedule that will successfully withstand judicial scrutiny." This seems to mean that ebsent some such explicit Congressional actions, that FCC will not hereinafter seek to collect any Fees, from anyone, for any purpose. Whether Congress will so act remains to be seen.

The FCC Notice goes on to announce its immediate undertaking of Continued on page 12

CBS scored a 20.7 average in the Nielsen's to take top place for the week ending January 2. Season to date leader ABC held down second place, with a close 20.4. NBC trailed with 15.7. Top ten shows for the week were; "Happy Days," ABC movie "W.W. and the Dixie Danckings," "Laverne & Shirley," CBS special "The Secret Life of John Chapman," "Six Million Dollar Man," "MASH," "Maude," CBS movie "Smile," "Welcome Back Kotter," and "Starsky & Hutch."


FCC Chairman Richard Wiley has called for a complete investigation of the big three TV networks. Wiley said that he will present the proposal to the full Commission this week and ask for public comments. The investigation would focus on network-affiliated station relationships. The network probe was recently requested by Westinghouse Broadcasting, which feels that the networks exert a great deal of control over their affiliate stations. The Department of Justice has also supported Westinghouse's request.



a "study of the legal and administrative implications of refunding fees in order to determine the extent and nature of any refunds that might be necessary." It asserts that all proper refunds will be made as soon as practicable within the limitations of its Staff and resources. It makes no mention, however, of pending Court cases to recover these and/or other Fees.

In other words, the FCC's Notice appears to announce a flat and unqualified suspension of all Fee collection for the indeterminate future, while promising to review the matter of possible, if not likely, refunds of past Fees paid to be reimbursed as soon as it can. This is, needless to say, an even greater victory for the entire Communications Industry over the FCC, than had initially appeared to be the case. Not only is there a question as to whether any more FCC Fees will ever be collected, absent some proper Congressional action. But some refunds, perhaps substantial, may well be due to almost every licensee or other regulated entity that has paid Fees for doing FCC business over the past 6 years.

Legal Fringe Benefits Not Taxable

A new tax law enables employees to take part in plans which would cover legal expenses, tax free. Employers can cover all or part of such expenses only if the plan is funded through an insurance company, similar to medical plans offered to workers. The employer cannot reimburse the worker directly.

RIAA Against Promo **Packages**

RIAA President Stanley Gortikov has said that "promotional only" records distributed to radio stations could increase bootlegging of material not available to the public. Gortikov noted some recent releases of live for-airplay-only albums that could fail into the wrong hands and be pirated to the public. On the other side of the spectrum, many record execs feel that releases such as the ones the RIAA is questioning can in fact restrict other lowerquality records from getting on the bootleg market.

First Artists Records Introduced

The newly created First Artists Records has signed a manufacturing and distribution pact with Phonogram/Mercury. The label plans to release product in Rock, Country and various other fields. One of parent company First Artists Production's chief investor is Barbra Streisand. `

Cosell To Pitch For GE

Howard Cosell will be the pitchman for General Electric's audio electronics products' new 40 channel CB radios. Network radio will be used for the CB campaign, themed, "GE...That's more than you can say about any other CB."

200 Market Push For A&W





Warner Bros. Records Cooked (literally and figuratively) under the hot sun of Acapulco last week. The Southern Mexico resort city was the scene of the company's national gathering which included people from just about every department along with artists, radio programmers and trade publication representatives. In addition to a successful product presentation, awards dinner, and some stimulating hallway philosophy sessions, there were meaningful and productive industry panel conferences.

I had the pleasure of sharing the panel of the AOR session with Lee Abrams of Burkhart/Abrams and Bob Burch, National Program Director for Century Broadcasting (WABX/Detroit, KSHE/St. Louis, KWST/ Los Angeles). Among the topics discussed were the individuality of AOR radio stations, the effects of record advertising on AOR radio, AOR radio and the trades, record giveaways, and promotions in general. Among the key statements were Abrams' mentioning that his particular service works best in "soft, vulnerable" markets where a competitive AOR radio scene has yet to develop; Burch indicating that even though he personally encourages record advertising on his stations, he discourages record companies from advertising records that are not being played; and my pointing out that one of the major mistakes Promotion People can make in promoting AOR stations is to assume that they are, in fact, all similar in methodology, philosophy, taste, and goals. In the case of AOR, it's just as important to be educated to the details of each station contacted as it is to know about the genre as a whole. Although the session bore little in the revelation department, it was interesting and well moderated by WB National Director of AOR Promotion, John Montgomery.

Radio & Records' Publisher Bob Wilson shared the trade publication panel with our Top 40 Editor J.J. Jordan, Record World's VP Spence Berland, and Billboard's Bill Wardlow and Nat Freedland. Each described the basic methods used in putting together their respective charts. The topics of "picks" and reviews (of which R&R has none) was covered and each representative fielded questions from the audience. The panel was moderated by WB Vice President of Promotion, Russ Thyret.

Everyone had a good time and seemed to enjoy the opportunity to get together in such a pleasant environment. Chairman of the Board Mo Ostin was an extremely cordial host and displayed a marvelous rapport with the individual members of his company. Congratulations to Warner Bros. for a tremendously successful gathering.

Good Point: WEBN/Cincinnati General Manager Frank Wood told me that in spite of the station's strong showings in recent Arbitrons, they do not use the book (or any other rating service) to sell locally. The reason for this, according to Wood, is that a station should be able to sell locally based on image and concept. "I can understand a busy agency buyer out of town having to rely upon ratings to have an idea of what's going on out there in radio, but locally, it is foolish to educate the buying market to the ratings because all that can accomplish is to create a situation in which radio is totally at their mercy on that level too." Here you have a case of somebody resisting the old "this industry creates its own monsters" syndrome.




