Radio Responds To 'Billion Dollar Blizzard'

As most of the country suffers through the worst weather in recorded history, radio stations in the afflicted areas are acting to serve their hard-hit communities. In Buffalo, one of the most severely affected cities, WKBW was quick to offer its services. "We turned this radio station over to the people of Buffalo last week," said PD Bob Harper. "WKBW has become a clearinghouse for information...It's the most exciting use of radio I've ever seen."

Most of the staff have been sleeping at the station for the duration, and are broadcasting crisis information (people stranded without food, emergency medical calls) and general news. The situation in Buffalo is so drastic that federal troops have been called in (to clear snow) and it's now against the law (\$500 fine) to drive a car unless on official business. Schools and businesses have been closed for three weeks, and Harper predicts "The storm will end up costing Buffalo billions of dollars."

In less drastically affected Cleveland, WGCL PD T.J. Lambert is maintaining the regular format, but broadcasting all important weather information immediately. Lambert said, "It's my opinion that bad weather is a negative, so therefore we try to present positive programming as much as possible while still keeping people informed of all crucial news." But in St. Cloud, Minnesota, WWJO has had to run spots alerting people, that the wind-chill factor reached 72 below zero, and that skin freezes at 74 below.

Record traffic in afflicted areas has been reported drastically slow, owing to weather conditions which has in turn slowed down local radio chart action and airplay patterns. But during this worst of winters, stations all over the country are acting to help out. With its immense potential as a communications center in times of disaster, it's cheering to observe radio reacting to a crisis more severe than frozen playlists.

Plough Makes Changes In Chicago

Plough Broadcasting has announced several changes which mostly affect their Chicago operation. Craig Scott, who had been National Promotion Director of the chain, is now the Vice President in charge of Programming. Scott will move to Memphis, Tennessee, from Chicago, at the end of March and will be based at Plough's main offices.

New call letters for WJJD-FM, as well as a new format for the station, which had been simulcasting the AM's Country format, has also been announced. The calls are WJEZ and the station will be using the logo line "Beautiful Country." (Theformat will be very similar to the sound used on Plough's FM facility in Atlanta, which was then WPLO-FM. The station recently changed to a disco-soul format using the logo FM-100). Scott told R&R: "WJJD-FM changed formats and call letters overnight. We are working with syndicator Daryl Peters of Chicago on the structuring of the new format. All music will be aired in quarter hour sets. There will be only four breaks an hour. The music will be Country-oriented, but not

necessarily hit-Country. All mu sic aired will be determined by its tolerance level, as any Beau tiful Music station does. We will incorporate, plush instrumental versions of Country songs, as well as Pop artists singing Country songs. Most songs we play by the better known Country artists will be easy-listening album cuts." Scott said he was optimistic that the station's new format will at least double their current share of the audience. The station is using a new automation unit to air the music and commercials. Scott said, "Right now we are using live announcers along with the automation.

The music is really the star. The announcers don't even use their names because we are not trying to develop air personalities, rather a new and unique sound to this market."

Other changes, with Scott's move to Memphis, have **Bill Hart**, who is one of WJJD's air personalities and Music Director named as Operations Director of WJJD and WJEZ-FM. Mark Edwards will be Program Director of the FM station.

Grand Jury Probe Of Record Business

While the eastern third of the nation was struggling with snow and cold and East Coast record record stores were noting lost sales because of no customers, the Los Angeles based record companies and chain rack jobbers found themselves snowed under a stack of subpoenas ordering them to testify in a grand jury probe which will cover practically every facet of the sale and manufacture of records in the past five years.

Scope of the anti-trust investigation is to include prices, terms and conditions of sales; the integrity and depth of competitive practices in the industry, possible monopolistic implications in distribution methods, discounts and credit terms, market share, multiple pricing mechanisms, advertising practices, the possible relationship to artists' royaities, the handling of supply problems and the degree to which free merchandise is factored into advertising allowances. ~

While the probe is being entrusted to the federal grand jury in Los Angeles, the reach is national. It has been indicated that all executives from Sales Manager up are subject to grand jury call.

Among areas covered in grand jury requests for documentation are structuring of marketing and distribution operations, practices followed in the wholesale and retail distribution of records and tapes, means of enforcing pricing above the minimum retail level, correspondence between distributors and retailers on that subject, circumstances of price cutting by distributors end/or sellers.

R&R PROGRAMMERS RESEARCH: **'To Edit Or Not To Edit'**

As' noted in last week's issue, Radio & Records is now working in conjunction with Mediastat on a continuous research project for programmers. Our first question regarded the playing of edited songs on the radio. The survey was conducted in Los Angeles, New York and Chicago. Over 2600 people were surveyed by Mediastat. The question "Are you aware that certain radio stations play shorter versions of records than on the original album" (Q1) was asked of listeners of selected AM and FM stations that were either Top 40 or AOR formatted. After we received a response to that question we checked the awareness level by asking "Which would you prefer on the radio." (Q2) The purpose of this research project is to tackle timely problems affecting radio stations, as we have here regarding the editing of long records. We wish to point out that we draw no conclusions, only offer the responses by those surveyed.



Heavy Radio Buys For Visa Approximately one fourth of the \$8.2 million ad budget set by National BankAmericard Inc. for their new "Visa" card push will go into radio time. The company has already started a campaign to educate member banks and their employees of the switch from BankAmericard to Visa, with the main consumer advertising slated to start in April. Batk parts and with the main consumer advertising slated to start in April. Both network and spot radio will be used. Spots will zero in on the design of the new card and telling consumers of the worldwide acceptance of Visa.

Broadcast Minorities Up

Over 4000 women and minorities joined the broadcast field in 1976, according to statistics released by the FCC recently. Black, Orientals, American Indians, Spanish surnamed Americans and women held down 150, 783 positions in the industry last year.

NBC Pres. Calls For Equal Time Repeal

National Broadcasting Company President Herbert Schlosser has called for a repeal of equal time rules in a recent speech. In comments to the Georgia Association of Broadcasters, Schlosser noted that equal time requirements, the campaign financing act, and regulations making broadcasters give access to federal candidates forces the industry to restrict their coverage of Presidential debates and issues. He also voiced his full support of future commitment to public Presidential debates starting in 1980.

NAB Against FTC Drug Rule

The National Association of Broadcasters has spoken out sharply against a proposed rule by the Federal Trade Commission that would regulate radio and TV advertising of non-prescription drugs. The rule would limit terms used to describe drugs in ads and force spots to include label information that the FTC now requires on drug packages. The NAB said that the proposal wou'd be a disservice to the public's right to protection.

Award To Plough Chairman

Harold R. Krelstein, Chairman of Plough Broadcasting, has received the National Association of Broadcasters' Distinguished Service Award. Krelstein has been with Plough since 1939.

Ferris May Head FCC

Government speculators in Washington are currently placing their bets on Democratic Policy Committee staff director **Charles Ferris** as the next Chairman of the FCC. Ferris, who has worked on Senate committee TV coverage negotiations, and equal time topics, had earlier attempted to become Deputy Attorney General.

Heavy FCC Agenda

The Federal Communications Commission has released their agenda for this month, and looks to keep quite busy. Among the topics to be discussed by the Commission are; regional concentration of broadcast ownership, cable radio rulemaking, fee refunds, renewal policy, and Public Broadcasting Service satellites.

Combined's Profits Double

Profit returns for Combined Communications Corp. in 1976 more than doubled their 1975 earnings, up to \$16.3 million from '75's \$7.7 million. CCC President Karl Eller noted the acquisition of the Cincinnati Enquirer as one factor that increased last year's profits.

Record Biz News

Former ATV Records' President Marvin Schlachter has formed Prelude Records, to be based in New York. Schlachter announced that many of the artists on the now-defunct ATV would be included in the Prelude roster. The company plans to manufacture and distribute through independent labels in the U.S. Stan Hoffman will serve as VP of Prelude.

Magnet Records has announced that their product will be distributed in the U.S. by United Artists. UA also announced that they have acquired foreign rights to Electric Light Orchestra product via Jet Records.

NARAS has named four new nominees for its Hall of Fame awards. Two classical selections, Edward R. Murrow's recorded broadcasts, and the original cast album of "My Fair Lady" join 23 other nominees. Winners will be announced at this month's Grammy Awards.

RCA Records will keep its huge New York recording studio open, after reaching an agreement with NABET on engineers' contract terms. The company had earlier announced that all three of their studios in Los Angeles, Nashville and New York would close.

John Reid Enterprises' President John Reid announces the formation of Jodrell Music Inc., which will act as the United States and Canadian sub-publisher for the Big Pig Music Ltd. catalogue, owners of copyright on Elton John and Bernie Taupin's music. Leeds Levy has been named Professional Manager of Jodrell, which is based in New York City.

Daniel Skouras has been named Vice President and Executive Assistant to Motown Industries Vice Chairman Michael Roshkind. Skouras moves from Motown's London offices to their headquarters in Los Angeles.

Big Movie Budgets On Radio

Columbia Pictures' "Fun With Dick & Jane" will have a huge \$2.5 million ad budget during its first run. Two radio flights are included in the overall budget, with a series of spots set to start on February 16th, voiced by Ed McMahon, who co-stars in the film.

Radio buys on Country stations in the Southwest will kick off **20th Century-Fox**'s mid-March release of "Mr. Billion," with 30 and 60 second spots placed in Texas and Oklahoma.

MCA Backs "Evita" Rock Opera LP MCA will use an extensive radio campaign to push their "Evita" rock opera album, which will be supported by co-op retail ads. Exact ad plans are still to be announced, after the company receives feedback from the premiere of the LP, broadcast nationwide last month. MCA feels that "Evita's" appeal will be widespread enough that spot buys will be placed on Rock, Pop/Adult and Beautiful Music stations.

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"Roots" One Of The Biggest Shows Ever ABC is practically assured of the year's rating crown because of the spectacular showing that their "Roots" novel for TV had for the week ending January 23rd. Only "Gone With The Wind" and three football Super Bowl games rival the ratings held by the special, which had a 40.5 rating for the first installment. An estimated 75 million viewed the premiere episode. After "Roots," ABC scored again with "Laverne & Shirley" second, followed by "Happy Days," "Six Million Dollar Man," "Charlie's Angels," "Baretta," NBC's "Bob Hope Special," "MASH," NBC Movie "The Man In The Iron Mask," and "One Day At A Time." and "One Day At A Time.

Overnight Noilson ratings taken in New York, Los Angeles and Chicago reaffirmed "Roots" strength. Part three of the series overcame the Super Bowl games' ratings, and came in just slightly behind "Gone With The Wind.



CHICAGO BACKLASH: It seems that Bob Pittman and the new Windy City AOR outlet WKQX have been getting a bit too much trade publicity and street talk to suit the tastes of WDAI/Chicago Program Director Bill Todd. I'm certainly not trying to instigate an off-the-air war between the stations (the on-the-air battlefront should provide more than enough activity to keep them busy), but considering the long and successful record of the ABC-FM O&O. Bill definitely deserves his say. It goes like this: "I would like the industry to know that we (WDAI) are THE AOR station in Chicago. For the mostpart, Bob Pittman has been copying what we have been doing here for years. I guess we should take that as a compliment. I see it, I know it, and I refuse to let anything be said that denies it."

CHALK IT UP TO THE GROWTH OF AOR RADIO: The widespread growth of the genre has now reached a new plateau. First, there were a handful of Progressives scattered about in the nation's leading cultural centers. Then, they started to spread to the secondaries. Then, a few cities actually had more than one AOR. both usually guite different in methodology, philosophy, and sound. Then many cities had more than one AOR. Now it's reached the point that there are more than one of the same type of AOR stations in a good number of cities. I think at this point, it is important for the industry to get excited about the influx of new AOR outlets, especially in situations where the broadcasters involved have superb track records elsewhere. However, it is a fickle industry that does not maintain respect and a healthy level of support for those who've "been at it awhile" because it has been the hard work and dedication of AOR's established participants that paved the way and opened the door to create a fertile environment for the numerous newcomers and countless joiners yet to appear on the scene. *****

HUNGATE EXPRESSES HIMSELF: Program Director Dick Hungate of WKQQ/ Lexington, one of Kentucky's newest AOR stations, spent quite some time as a Top 40 PD, most recently at WCHL/Chapel Hill. I asked him how it feels to suddenly be in AOR. His response was, "I feel like an artist, a painter, who's been using only a few colors on his palet for years, suddenly getting to work with an unlimited amount of colors. I feel free."

THERE'S AN AWFULLY GOOD MUSIC DIRECTOR ON THE LOOSE by the name of "Country" Paul Peyton. Paul came to a mutual agreement with WHCN/Hartford management to terminate his MD position and airwork at the station. As you know, the station's programming direction has been recharted in a series of moves starting with the recent departure of PD Mike Shallit, Newsman Jim Cameron, and now Paul Peyton. If you recall, I think enough of Paul to have invited him to write the "AOR Music Director" article in the recent AOR Special edition of Radio & Records. On the same day that WWWW/Detroit Music Director Greg Gillespie severely sliced his finger (three stitches worth) on the station's production room tape deck, he was informed that he was severed from the station's staff. AS WE APPROACH THE CONVENTION, the editors of the other formats represented in R&R asked me to invite AOR broadcasters to feel free and stop by some of their Friday night one-to-one sessions, if they can squeeze in the time. Of course, the same invitation applies to non-AOR broadcasters to stop by and share ideas at the AOR sessions...Casablanca Record and FilmWorks Executive Vice President Larry Harris (a veteran of AOR promotion) is so upset that business will prevent him from attending the Friday night encounters (I think he'll be out on the road with the Demons of Rock and Roll) than he is arranging to have a life size, full length, stand-up photograph of himself placed in the room so he can be there in spirit.

Ellen Robertson is the new Promotion Manager at M105/Cleveland... Jay Duncanson has joined WIBA-FM/Madison from KGB/San Diego to do the all-night shift...Jeff Pollack, Music Coordinator of KBPI/Denver, has returned from his six week interview tour of Europe ... Rick Lofgren, Music Director of KIOZ (K102)/Laramie, informed me that the station is actively in the process of switching over from automation to become "more of a live AOR station." 





WONDER is hanging in there. **BROWNE and STEWART inch**ed up. QUEEN is hanging on. ZZ TOP continues to move up at the rate of one chart position per week. GENESIS nudged up a point. SANTANA had a very good week. KAN-SAS took a healthy jump, BOWIE made positive progress. BOSTON was stable. STARCASTLE leaned forward. HARRISON resurged a bit. EMMYLOU maintained. JOURNEY was the week's highest debut, followed closely by RENAISSANCE. CITY and HAGAR are holding. **RUFUS** debuted. AWB maintained. TAJ took a strong jump. QUATEMAN, BABYS, and **BENSON** debuted. **BREAD** bounced back onto the chart. WINTERS also returned to the airplay top 40. FRANKS and GIANT debuted. ACE and JOAN ARMA-TRADING almost made the chart, in that order.

This chart is based solely on airplay and does not attempt to fabricate a trend. The artists in Italics are those receiving the most rapid gain in airplay.

Now it's your turn to feel what they've already felt. Bill Quateman's just-released album "Night After Night" is available now. And it's one of the most attractive recording propositions of the year.




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Editor's Note: The following is an interview transcribed from a recent broadcast over KCKC in San Bernardino, California. Bob Mitchall. who is the General Manager of the station, and also the midday air personality, has a regular feature on his show titled "Who's Calling." The show features a different Country artist each day. During a recent week, Mitchell interviewed different record producers. R&R felt the interview with Billy Sherrill was of interest to you. Our sincere thanks to Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Sherrill for the permission to reprint their conversation.

MITCHELL: To these of you who are listening, if I should mention "Stand By Your Man" by Tammy Wynette, "Behind Closed Doors," by Charlie Rich, I think you would probably recognize those songs and both of those songs were produced by the gentleman I'm talking to now, and that is Billy Sherrill. Billy, I think that as far as publicity is concerned, the most under rated and under publicized people in the world are record producers and I just wanted you to know that.

SHERRILL: Well, I don't think a producer, the producers I know, go after publicity all that much. I think the gratification is in hearing your product on the air. You really get a kick out of that.

MITCHELL: That's a funny thing, for many, many years I've always made it a policy whenever I played a song to try to point out the producer of a particular record, especially if it's really a giant, really a monster and also the guy who wrote the song, because there's so many things that go into production. Let's go back, I had a call from a guy when I first came on the air this morning and he asked me a question and I'm going to ask you the question, because, frankly I don't know. In 1961, did you have an instrumental out that was a big hit?

SHERRILL: I had one, it was a kind of Southern regional hit called "Tipsy." It was a very cheap session because I played all the instruments. I released it to ABC/Paramount, It did real good, it was number one in Atlanta, Nashville, Birmingham and a few places, and that was the beginning and end of my record artist career.

MITCHELL: You don't get started in a successful career of producing by all of a sudden being launched into the world of producers, how did it start for you, engineering?

SHERRILL: I was a record engineer, well engineer very loosely, I mixed records for Sam Phillips here in Nashville and Sam is one of the greatest record people and one of my best fans in the whole world. I worked for Sam two or three years and I began to make some independent records, independent productions, instrumentals and things, and some of the people at CBS heard some of them and asked me if I'd like a job. I said, "Yea, here I am.'

MITCHELL: Simple as that. An overnight success.

SHERRILL: Yes, overnight in about 10 years. MITCHELL: Who are the people you

are currently active in producing? SHERRILL Charlie Rich, Tammy Wynette, George Jones, Freddy Weller, Marty Robbins, Barbara Fairchild, Johnny Paycheck.

MITCHELL: I want to congratulate you on behalf of KCKC and everybody who is listening for having the number one song of 1976 here on KCKC and that is a song called "Stranger" by Johnny Duncan. SHERRILL: Oh, Johnny, I forgot him,

I produce him too. That was fun. MITCHELL: That was seven weeks number one.

SHERRILL: Usually records are produced by a series of musical tracks, you overdub the artist and if you need violins, you overdub the violins, if you need a harmonica or a set of bells you overdub them. That is

the first record in eight years that did the old fashioned way. We had everybody there, I mean it was a big party, there was no overdubbing we had the violin section there, we did it all at once, and the playback was the record.

MITCHELL: As a producer, when you are responsible for putting out or putting together hit songs for artists that have been placed under your care to produce, what is the most important thing that you look for?

SHERRILL: Well, the most important thing of all, naturally, I've always believed this, is the material, the song itself. If you have a great song, you can get by on a less than great performance, a less than great studio, or less than great musicians. If it's a great song, you're just about 90 percent home.

MITCHELL: There are some people who have disagreed with you and I believe there have been some performers and some musicians and artists who have disagreed with you to the extent of almost being irreverent about the whole thing, but I think your record of success in the past has been kind of a testimony to the fact that your philosophy is right.

SHERRILL: Well, there are so many, many great singers that, for the past decade, have not even remotely approached a hit record and they have the same facilities to record as the people that are making hit records and they have good voices and they can afford to get studios and good musicians, so naturally the only thing that's lacking there would be a great song

MITCHELL: / take it you spend a lot of time listening to songs, is thet true?

SHERRILL: Just about all the time, most of my time is spent listening to new material here

MITCHELL: Do you ever find yourself in a position of becoming cal-

lous or cold? SHERRILL: Of course, once you listen to 50 or 60 songs, your head begins to spin a little bit and you kind of live in fear of turning down a great piece of material. I never get tired of listening, I listen to just about everything that comes in. There's a whole lot of unsolicited stuff that comes in and you couldn't spend 24 hours a day listening, but there's enough stuff coming in from publishers and known writers that it pretty well fills up your time. MITCHELL: Is there a danger to lis-

tening to too much product from one or two sources and maybe ianorina other sources?

SHERRILL: If you have success with

a certain writer or a certain publishing company, and if they give you good stuff, naturally their material is going to be on the top of the stack. If someone gives you two or three hit songs, you'll listen to that quicker than you would a certain publishing company or a certain writer that's been playing you songs for five years and they've never played you one that became successful.

MITCHELL: In other words, the key to success is going with the winners. SHERRILL: Go with the winners. MITCHELL: You're a good writer

vourself. SHERRILL: Well, it comes and goes. MITCHELL: / don't know how many people knew that you helped to write the hit song "Stand By Your Man"

by Tammy Wynette. SHERRILL: Yes, that was a lot of fun. MITCHELL: And you also helped to

write the latest for Tammy "You And Me. SHERRILL: George Richie and I wrote

'You And Me.' MITCHELL: / think most of us at

one time in our lives have wanted to be songwriters and one of the most frequently asked questions of me is, 'How do I get my material to the ears of the people that really matter?" What is your suggestion to people like that, to get this accomplished?

SHERRILL: It's a very simple thing, Bob. First of all, and this is more important than anything, people should search their own heart and be honest with themselves and say, 'Now am I just doing this because it's pretty good. I know it's not great but maybe somebody will like it somewhere down the line." That's not right. You should not send a song to anybody unless you think it is a very exceptional piece of material. The old idea of "you can't get your song heard in Nashville," is baloney. Most people that are not on the scene here do not realize the town. If you have a song, or a couple of songs that you really think are great and can stack them up against the best songs in the country, the top 10 or the top 20, then you should send them out. Don't send somebody everything you ever wrote in your whole life, like 25 songs or even 10, or even five. Make a halfway decent 7½ IPS tape of one or two songs and the songs will be evaluated and listened to. I get tapes in and they have 30 songs on it and it's impossible. I wouldn't listen to 30 songs from Burt Bacharach. It's impossible for anybody

to have 30 hits on a tape. But if people used a little bit of discretion and just sent one or two songs, anybody will listen to a couple of songs

MITCHELL: That is really very good and I think what you have just said really bears repeating and should be typed out and be published somewhere, because that is such good advice.

SHERRILL: But it stems back to the very first thing that I said, Bob, if you're not really flipped and if you don't really, really in your heart think it's exceptional, leave it in the bedroom drawer. Don't send it to a record company, because they're not going to like it. If you don't think it's exceptional, the guy that has got to continue the career of an artist with it, he won't think it's exceptional either.

MITCHELL: That's one of the reasons that you have been so successful, and that is you have never compromised yourself, you have always, when you've listened to material, chosen to select the best. As you reflect back in your career, a little hindsight, is there anything that really peaks out; awards, experiences, recording sessions, artists you have dealt with, is there anything that really picks you up and stands out as being a very great thrill in your life so far?

SHERRILL: One time ligot a copy of a Presbyterian monthly magazine, and it said from the Pastor, of this particular article, to the wives of all the other Pastors and his message for that day was the lyrics of "Stand By Your Man," and that stood out a little. In my mind, it's been about four or five years, but I enjoyed that more than my awards, or Grammys or CMA awards. That was a highpoint, and I'm a Baptist.

MITCHELL: Well, I get the feeling that one of the reasons that you were successful is the fact that you are honest with yourself, you are honest in the conclusions that you form as far as the music that you select for the artists and I would venture to say that you're very honest with the artists themselves. Do you ever find it necessary when you get an artist into a recording session to say "Hey, I don't think you're doing your best?"

SHERRILL: Of course. You've got to be honest, or it'll come back to haunt you, I guess I'm honest to a fault. but I cannot work with an artist that does not believe as I do, that the song is bigger than both of us.

MITCHELL: And they understand

that when they go into the session? SHERRILL: They understand that long before they go into a session. MITCHELL: Do you make that a stipulation before you will take on a new act, that they realize that I have chosen a song which I feel is going to be a hit and if you will give it your best shot, it will be a hit song because the song is a hit song and not because you sang it? SHERRILL: Well, it's not 100 per-

cent that way, and no percent the other, of course they've got to sing it, they've got to make the song believable. A good song could be murdered by an artist and then picked up by someone else and successfully performed. I was about the fourth person that recorded "The Most Beautiful Girl" and about the eighth person that recorded "Delta Dawn." People can record what are proven hit songs and still not get the point across, but that's where the producer comes in, if a producer is worth his salt, he can get the performance out of the artist.

MITCHELL: Do you ever find, is it possible to get into a rut with an artist, say somebody like a Charlie Rich, where he begins to sound too much like himself every time out?

SHERRILL: Yes, you have a tendency to do that, I've been guilty of it. You have a good record with a certain field and you come out with another record the same way and after about three or four times you look back and say, "What have I done, I'm boring everybody to death. I've got to stimulate this career of this artist by a different direction or better songs or different type material." Of course, you get into ruts.

MITCHELL: As you look to the future, what do you think is the future of country music?

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SHERRILL: I think the future would be a wider demographic appeal, like to try to appeal to someone other than people between 20 and 35. which is the bulk of Country music now. We must get into some sounds and some lyrics that are really not offensive lyrics, but lyrics that will bite into the whole current Top 40 Rock appeal, to people on down as young as 10 years old and really make some things that will appeal to a wider range of people. I hear a lot of Country stations, and I love Country music, but a lot of stations put me to sleep listening because there's really nothing there with the exception of half a dozen songs that are really good, I don't really know. there's an old argument about" Hey, let's don't do this because we're

going to lose our image, it's not Country, let's keep the Country image sacred" and all that, and I understand why people say that. They said that about using drums on the Grand Ole Opry and they said it about using vocal groups behind records and then they started adding violins behind records. I think Country music has got to expand lyrically, melodically, and soundwise in order to appeal to a wide range of people. That's where I see it going, if it doesn't go that way, we're all in trouble.

MITCHELL: / think if we're going to expand our horizons, somebody once told me that you must make haste slowly. In other words, if you're going to make some changes, do it gradually, I think it's going to be an educational process.

SHERRILL: When I hear records like . 'Afternoon Delight" by the Starland Vocal Band, that's a very beautiful, appealing record, "Somebody To Love" by the group Queen, I think is probably the best record in the United States right now. They're the kind of records that, for the life of me, I can't see how anybody can dislike. I think Country music needs better record producers to begin with. Rather than just saying, 'l've got four songs, start it off with the steel, fill the bridge with a plano and come back in with an "ooh" on the last verse. You've got to get in there and dig and come up with some sounds that appeal to people, or they're going to punch a button

and be listening to a public broadcast station or a Top 40 station somewhere, and you can't blame them.

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MITCHELL: / made the prediction to somebody that 1977 will be the year that radio stations and people who listen to radio stations will not be satisfied to just hear a followup by a major artist, just because it is a follow up song, it must be an exceptional song or they will rejectit.

SHERRILL: Exactly.

MITCHELL: And I think that's the way we're headed. Billy Sherrill. I won't take up any more of your time, do you have any sessions scheduled today?

SHERRILL: No, too cold. Recorders frozeup.

MITCHELL: Thank you so much for calling today. I really appreciate it a whole bunch. I was trying to figure out what we were going to do after our conversation was all over, and I decided that to take Tammy's "Stand By Your Man" and just play it over the air and reflect upon the fact that the gentleman we just talked to wrote the song and he also produced the song. Billy Sherrill, we wish you much success in 1977 and the only thing that we can ask of you is that you continue your honesty and that you bring to us many, many good songs in 1977, because we want them.

SHERRILL: I will continue my honesty, I'm not too sure about the good songs, but I'll try.
