

The company currently owns WYSP/Philadelphia, WKLS/Atlanta, WKTU and WJIT/ New York, WKAO/Cleveland, WJMD and WUSF/Washington, and WTMI/ Miami.

Josephson Associates To Buy WNIC/Detroit

Marvin Josephson Associates, one of the nation's largest talent agencies, has agreed in principle to purchase WNIC-AM & FM/Detroit. The purchase is the first move into broadcasting for the agency (whose clients include Barbra Strei sand and Henry Kissinger, among others). MJA plans no management or format changes for the stations, which are currently Pop/ Adult (AM) and Rock (FM).

RSO, Island Consolidate Field Promotion Force

RSO and Island Records are jointly instituting a consolidated field promotion force to work releases from both labels. Island founder Chris Blackwell and RSO Chairman Robert Stigwood announced that the new combined promotion organization is called RSO/Island Promotion. Rich Fitzgerald will be supervising 24 promotion specialists in the capacity of National Promotion Director. Working with him on the management end are Bobby Applegate from Island and Bob Smith from RSO. All will be based in Los Angeles, reporting to RSO President Al Coury, who developed the concept along with Island's President Charley Nuccio.

Coury, discussing the radical combination, said "Looking at this **RSO/Island Promotion concept**

strictly from the street level, the two companies will have a staff of the size and force to compete on equal footing with any major label...Both Charley Nuccio and I are confident that once this pioneering effort is proven successful, other labels of comparative size will be obliged to evaluate this type of union in terms of their own field promotion needs.

Nuccio stressed that both labels will retain total autonomy in all areas of operation except promotion. "It's not a merger, a joint venture or anything similar," he said. "It's a new idea predicated on the oldest of virtues-common sense. More is better." The efficiency of the new combination will be smoothed by Island's recent move to Polygram distribution, which also handles RSO. The joint promotion team will be working important new releases from both companies upcoming shortly.

Peter Gabriel **Roxy Performance Beamed Via Satellite**

Atlantic recording artist Peter Gabriel's Saturday evening (4/9) concert at the Roxy in Los Angeles was beamed via communications satellite to 15 major AOR stations across the nation. According to Atlantic's Senior Vice President of Promotion Dick Kline, "This is the first time that a program of this kind has been broadcast by satellite to this many radio stations." Richard Palmese has been appointed to the position of Vice President of National AM Promotion at Arista Records. Palmese, formerly Director of National Promotion at the company, will be in charge of Top 40 singles promotion across the country. He will report directly to the label President Clive Davis, who made the announcement. citing an exceptionally high level of sales and airplay activity which he termed

BILLBOARDS: BOMBARDED IN MEMPHIS, IDENTICAL IN BAKERSFIELD



WHBQ/Memphis tossed a new wrinkle into their current billboard campaign. After saturating the city with the glant-size images of morning man Rick Dees and afternoon drive jock Bob Landree, they moved onto TV for the next stage. Televised spots depicted the rest of the station's air personalities walking down the street, spotting the billboard, and registering annoyance at not getting boards of their own. The jocks then proceeded to bombard the offending biliboards with tomatoes, eggs, mud and other attractive artifacts. To top it all off, WHBQ modified their actual billboards to display the new decorations, as pictured.



It was a new "age" in advertising in Bakersfield starting April 1 (appropriately enough), as both KUZZ (Country) and KERN (Rock) inadvertently advertised near-identical contests via billboard. On learning of this Program Director's night-



mare, KERN immediately took decisive action and upped their ante to 100 times your age, while KUZZ stuck to their frequency of 97 for a multiplying factor. Amazingly enough, the same billboard compony put up the artwork for both station promotions—obviously being firm believers in the value of direct competition.

Cross-Ownership Appeal To Supreme Court

The Federal Communications Commission has said that they will appeal a lower court decision that overruled the FCC's newspaper-broadcast cross-ownership stand. The appeals court said that all cross ownership situations should be immediately divested, contradicting the Commission's ruling that current common ownerships could stay intact, but barred formations of new affiliations. The Supreme Court will now decide the issue.

High-Pay Jobs To Women, Minorities

Women and minorities continue their climb into management positions in broadcasting, according to the **FCC**'s most recent statistics. In 1976, a total of 34,324 women were employed in the industry full time, 44% of those were in management, technician, sales and skilled craftsman positions. In 1975, 40% of women employees were in these high-pay jobs. Minority group members totaled 15,962, with 65% in upper level positions, a 1% gain over 1975.

Beatles Lose Appeal To Stop LP

A London court has ruled against the individual **Beatles** and their **Apple Corps.**, making it possible for English label Lingasong Records to immediately distribute a Beatles' album recorded in Germany in the early 60's. John, Paul, George and Ringo had claimed that the original tapes were of poor quality, and could damage their reputations. The group had been offered the tapes twice in the past 10 years, but had not reached agreement with the owners to purchase them.

First Freight Co. To Use Radio Spots

Aiming their campaign at infrequent business shippers, **Airborne Freight Corp**. is the first such company to utilize radio buys on a national level. Airborne kicked off their radio push last year with network buys, and later spot buys in 17 markets. Response from the intial effort proved that spot buys were more effective, and they plan to use the majority of their \$1.5 million ad budget on radio this year. The local-station basis buys will hit morning and afternoon drive periods.

AMC Tries Freebies To Spark Sales

With the major sales of American cars now showing a trend toward larger models, small-car maker American Motors is trying a new "giveaway" approach to urge sales. The "All American Giveaway" offers buyers of air conditioned models air travel valued at \$400, hotel accomodations, or luggage. A heavy \$4 million ad campaign, using radio, TV and newspapers will back up the "giveaway," which runs through June 10th.

Increase Of Unmarried Couples Changes Ad Approach

The number of households made up of unmarried couples has surged more than 50% since 1970, and is now closing in on the million mark. More than 57% of these households are headed by 35 year olds or younger, and while the exact spending power of them is unknown, most businesses agree that it is more than significant. Many major advertisers are zooming in on the group, making ad adjustments, such as omitting wedding rings on TV models, and not using such terms as wife, husband, or spouse.



"Laverne & Shirley" Tops "Happy Days"

ABC kept its Nielsen rating lead for the week ending April 3, with a total 19.9 rating, compared to **CBS**' 18.7 and **NBC**'s 15.8. "Laverne & Shirley" pulled to the top of the heap, replacing the recent ruler "Happy Days." which came in third. Part one of "Jesus of Nazareth" on NBC was in second place. The Academy Awards presentation was fourth, followed by "Barney Miller." "MASH." "Three's Company," "Hawaii Five-O." "Barnaby Jones." and "Welcome Back Kotter." Interesting to note that the week was ABC's 13th consecutive to come out on top, the biggest total for a network in a decade.

Arbitron's TV meter service demonstrated that Los Angeles and New York audiences are somewhat starstruck, the Academy Awards came in first by far in both markets. FCC [So You Can Understand It]

WXPN (FM-ED), Philadelphia, License Renewal Denied FCC Administrative Law Judge Walter C. Miller has denied the renewal application of The Trustees

of the University of Pennsylvania for its noncommercial educational FM station WXPN, Philadelphia. Judge Miller found the Trustees failed to exercise adequate control and supervision over WXPN's

operations in a manner consistent with a licensee's responsibilities and, therefore, did not possess the requisite qualifications to remain a Commission licensee.

The WXPN renewal application was designated for hearing by the Commission January 7, 1976, to determine whether the licensee had exercised adequate control or supervision of the station's operation, whether it possessed the qualifications necessary to be or remain an FCC licensee and whether grant of the application would serve the public interest, convenience and necessity.

Subsequently, at the Trustee's request, the FCC Review Board enlarged the issues to determine whether the programming of WXPN had been meritorious, particularly with regard to public service programs.

Hearings were held in Philadelphia last September 20-21 and in Washington October 7-8. The record was closed December 10, 1976.

Initially. Judge Miller outlined the organizational structue of the Trustees and the way the licensee had delegated, subdelegated and sub-subdelegated its control and supervision over WXPN.

The Trustees are a multi-member body involving 42 Trustees and three ex officio Trustees, who, in reviewing University affairs, operate through various committees. (Continued on page 10)

"Kiss Birth Defects Goodbye" was the theme, raising thousands of dollars for the charity. At the site of the activity, an auction of gifts donated by local merchants added to the dollars raised. Candy and Klaus were given five minute breaks to eat, sign autographs and sneak in some relaxation before climbing back into a room-sized modular sofa to continue their smooching.

Newspaper ads backed up the promotion, containing coupon to make entering easier. Over \$1200 was given away in the three-week run of the contest

Tying in with national American Cancer Month, the station staffers on location handed out information pamphlets on the disease. 





Kline told **R&R**: "The program which started in L.A. at 9:30pm (PST) was beamed by AT&T via satellite to each of the cities. At that point it was translated in each market by special receiving/encoding devices to 15kc stereo lines and carried to the stations for broadcast. Because AT&T has a limited number of these devices, we had to limit the number of participating stations to 15."

The Trustees placed their control and supervisory powers over WXPN's operations in the hands of the President of the University, who, because of his many duties, ostensibly redelegated that authority to the Dean of Students. The Dean of Students, in turn, subdelegated authority over the station to the Director of Student Activities, who delegated the control and supervision of WXPN to the students.

Judge Miller said the problem of tracing control and supervisory responsibility does not end here, since within the student body there are six student organizations who directly and indirectly exercise control over WXPN's operations.

This complex maze of delegations, subdelegations and sub-subdelegations, the judge said, made it simple for any one individual or group to avoid making unpopular but necessary decisions—the control and supervision of station programming. With supervision and control spread so widely, he said, it was easy "to pass the buck" and let some other group or individual make the unpopular decision.

Judge Miller pointed out that the Commission long has held that commercial licensees must adequately control and supervise the operations of stations entrusted to them. He said noncommercial licensees are equally obligated to reasonably assure responsible station control and management.

Simply because an educational licensee does not operate for profit, the judge said, does not mean it is discharged from its duty to provide an acceptable program schedule consonant with operating in the public interest. Nor should it be relieved of its paramount obligation to apply effective measures to forestall violations and prevent recurrences, Judge Miller stated.

The judge found that between November 29, 1972, and March 5, 1975, the Trustees evidenced a total lack of supervision and control over WXPN's operations.

During this period, Judge Miller said the Trustees permitted a group of students to seize control of the station's operation. These students, he said, were not interested in running a responsible broadcast operation and they had no desire to maintain the integrity of the station license. Not only did these students act irresponsibly, they openly challenged responsible University officials to do anything about it, sensing the responsible University officials were unwilling to institute adequate control measures, Judge Millerfound.

Further, he found, that even after the Trustees declared certain materials unsuitable for public broadcast, these students deliberately continued to broadcast them.

Judge Miller described these materials as "licentious slime and nauseating verbiage...sordid utterances of the most vile type." Judge Miller said the University's position that such material was not suitable for public broadcast was eminently reasonable. However, he said, it was unfortunate that the Trustees waited over two years to do anything about that position.



R&R: When you came to the Omaha market in 1972 KOIL was the number one Rocker in that town, and had been for some time. WOW was like chicken Rock or whatever you want to call it...Pop/Adult Rock. When you came in you headed the station in a different direction. How does one go into a market with a very dominant AM Rocker, and go up against it with another AM station which is basically known as an Adult station?

BARSANTI: To begin with, everybody worries about labels. Talking about Rockers and Adult Rockers and chicken Rockers and all that sort of thing. We felt that at that point there was a vast opening in the market, a vast need in the market that was not being served. There's a very very giant powerful radio station in Omaha, KFAB, which was, at that time, what we would think of as an old line traditional middle of the road kind of station, and KOIL of course was rocking. We felt that their appeal was very young. That left an awful lot of stuff in the middle to cover. So we went in with a core target audience of 18 to 34, that's what we shot at, hoping to later spread it in both directions. We wanted to be a really mass appeal radio station. I guess if we had to label ourselves as anything, that would be the best label I could think of. We're not really a Rock and Roll radio station, certainly aren't a Pop/Adult station, I don't know what we are, except we think a damned good radio station

R&R: Back in the days when KOIL was rocking very hard, during the last few years of its existence, Don Burdon was a man who spent a lot of money to come out on top. Was your budget in those days as extravagant as that of KOIL's?

BARSANTI: Absolutely not, not anywhere even close.

R&R: How did you counteract a large budgeted station? BARSANTI: With programming. I guess one of the most

important things that I attribute in terms of our success has been the management at that radio station. Steve Shannon, who's now at KCMO, and now Jim Edens both of whom believed that programming must come first, before sales or anything else. That if your product is not right, for any reason, or if you prostitute your product for any reason, that you'll suffer for it. Fortunately, both of those gentlemen believed that that was the way to run a radio station. And we were able to say no when clients came in wanting to sponsor five minute shows in the afternoon drive, which made no sense for a contemporary radio station. Those things then, many of them, ended up on KOIL for example. And sure they meant dollars initially, but in the long run we felt that we'd recoup those dollars and many more by the improved programming and ultimately the improved ratings, and that's what's happened.

RER: You said when you started out you went after an 18-34 base, and you were hoping at a later date to spread both ways. Tell me a little bit about your original programming ideas when KOIL was number one in teens and 18-34 demographics. What was your programming like then compared to now?

BARSANTI: It was different, I think it's always different. I think if we looked at it 6 months ago or six months from now it would be different, because you've always got to fine tune. Initially we felt we had to get some attention for ourselves. So we did that by playing a very heavy oldie rotation and promoting with strange kinds of things. We originated the banana promotion, which since then a lot of other stations have done, but it started there, the "gone bananas" thing. We actually built the 40 foot banana and did the whole thing. And it got some attention for us, it worked. There was no way people could not know we were in the market with a 40 foot banana hanging over their head. We were different enough at that point that we got some attention. Then after we got people's attention, we began changing our programming into what we ultimately have at this point. Of course we're never really gonna be there, it will continue to change, to mold itself to our market.

R&R: Going back to promotions, what is your promotion philosophy?

BARSANTI: I think of promotions just as you would think about putting a newscast together. That's like saying, you absolutely have to have 17 actualities in a newscast. Hey, if nobody says anything that hour, and you have to go out and manufacture things to put in there, they're not going to work for you anyway. It's the same thing for promotions, if the promotions are there for the sake of having a promotion as opposed to it being a good promotion, then I don't think it's going to do you any good. I think promotions are great. If you could have an effective promotion every weekend, and every Columbus Day and the 4th of July or whatever, fine, but I don't think very many radio stations really do. I think a lot of them have promotions because they feel like they ought to. I think that's a mistake, I think you ought to

promote when you've got something to promote, and when you have an effective way of doing it, that's going to be meaningful to your particular audience. You mentioned earlier about fighting the big budgets. Every station in every market runs into this at one time or another, and we ran into a point where we had literally a quarter of a million dollars being thrown against us at one point, in prizes and cash and merchandise and so forth. There was no way that I was going to come up with \$250,000, or half a million dollars, in other words to do better, so we pulled everything off the air. We just pulled every promotion in the world off the air, cut back on everything and just played the hell out of the right music, during that period, and went up even more. The station with the quarter million dollar promotion went down. The money isn't all of it, they had gotten so cluttered, and they had traded out for so much of that quarter million dollars

BARSANTI: No actually there are four or five. There are three that really have 80% of the jukebox market. But we watch them very closely.

RER: Do you get actual tabulation on records, how many spins they've received all week from them, or what?

BARSANTI: We do that only on a spot basis, we can do that, but normally we've been working with these people long enough that we've built up a rapport with them, we know who they are, and they know who we are. We know when they give us a number, we tell them, you rate this on a one through whatever, and when they give us that number, we know approximately what that means, or how many records that means were sold, or how many spins or whatever.

R&R: Do you think there's any difference in programming to mid-America than there is to the South, or to the Northeast, or to the West?

DAYPARTING: "If your 35 year old listener decides to turn on your station at night for the first time in his life, he ought to still know he's listening to the same station..."

worth of stuff that their spot load was just horrendous, and all of those things combined to make them a very cluttered radio station, so we just cleaned up. It worked.

R&R: What's your spot load now?

BARSANTI: It varies. It never goes higher than 14 and a half minutes in the morning, and it drops after that, in other dayparts to as low as 10.

R&R: You were talking about playing the right music. What do you think is the right music? How do you sit down every week and decide upon what are exactly the right records to play?

BARSANTI: I feel that there are two methods of programming, there's the gut feel programmer, and there's the mathematics whiz who is all strictly numbers and research. I think they're both great, but I don't think either one really works in the long run exclusively. I think it's a combination of those two things that is magical. And I think when you look at the stations or the chains that have been very successful, it's because they've had, maybe it's been two or three different people, maybe they've had a research guy and a gut feel programmer who work together, whatever. Or one guy who can do both. But I think that's what works, and I think that's what we try to do, we certainly do research. We pay a lot of attention to the raw numbers and in fact initially we have a mathematical system that goes through the music and pulls out, you know, here it is, 1 through 47 or whatever it's going to be. But then at that point, you've looked at the research, you've looked at how the mathematics have worked out, then you've got to sit down, and you've got to let your stomach and your ear tell you a few things, you've got to say, wait a minute that may be the number one record in the nation, but I'm sorry it does not sound like this radio station. And if it doesn't sound like your radio station, it doesn't belong on your station. And vice versa. So that has to play a part, you have to say no, you have to say I don't care if it's number one or number fifty or whatever, it isn't right for my station, or it is right. I think every programmer walks around, he can be 1000 miles away, but ring his station in his head. record, if it doesn't fit with the rest of what's in your head, then it doesn't belong on your station.

R&R: What kind of research are you doing, for music? BARSANTI: We research, of course the local sales, the phone requests, jukebox play.

R&R: How many stores are you calling weekly? BARSANTI: Not a lot in Omaha, Nebraska, simply because

there aren't a lot. Omaha is very heavily racked, much more so than many areas of the country. Probably 10 in that area, per week. Additionally we use **R&R** and we use **Record** World as sources of what's happening nationally with the charts. We do monitor jukebox play, very closely.

R&R: Are there one or two people who control the jukeboxes?

BARSANTI: Oh sure. There are differences everywhere. Anywhere you program is going to be different, even different places in the midwest are going to be different. I think that people are people, and people are the same everywhere, it's just, the broad strokes are going to be the same. It's the nuances that will be really different. Maybe you would find that people in mid-America will be more easily offended at an off-color remark than people in New York for example. But they still like a dirty joke. So if you're going to do a dirty joke you've got to find a way to do it but do it less blatantly. Here they are less quick to react to a fad, which in a way, may be an advantage. Because if the fad is really and truly going to make it, by the time it gets to us in the midwest, and we start seeing it happen, then we figure it's for real. Most of them die out long before they ever get to us, so we don't have to worry about them. I guess it's a little slower, the pace is perhaps a little slower. People sometimes make a mistake though about the midwest, particularly because of its agricultural background, they think the people may be stupid or backwards, or hicks. That's a real mistake, because they are perhaps not quite as sophisticated, but they're every bit as sharp as the people everywhere else.

R&R: WOW has a vast signal coverage area. How many states do you get into?

BARSANTI: Our signal goes in to six states. – R&R: Taking that six, do you pay any attention at all to anything beyond Omaha?

BARSANTI: Oh absolutely. We have to, we're a regional radio station. There's no doubt about it. Of course, Omaha is our main center of concern, that's our metro market, that's our city of license. That has to be our primary concern, but if you see the literally stacks of mail that come in every week from Niola, Nebraska, and Red Oak and Shenandoah, and the little communities which add up, even the larger ones like the Lincolns and the Sioux Falls, South Dakota's, and those kinds of places, we just have so many listeners there that we can't ignore them, it would be criminal. So we do think about them, and we do pay attention to what they're interested in.

R&R: Does the pay scale in Omaha allow you to continually have the top talent you need?

BARSANTI: My morning guy's out of New York, my afternoon guy is lately out of Pittsburgh. We're finding that people, more and more, are becoming less concerned with the gross dollars and more concerned with the quality of life. And guys are saying, you know I'm sick of Pittsburgh, and I am sick of Cleveland, and I am sick of wherever, and driving an hour and a half to work and the smog and the crime and I can't let my kids play in the streets. They're finding out that WOW in Omaha, Nebraska pays damn good money.

R&R: Give me a ballpark figure of what the everage pay may be for a jock who's working in Omeha?

BARSANTI: I've got to talk about my radio station which I think is considerably higher than the rest of the market. But I guess if you put them all together and average them and divided it by 5 or whatever, you'd probably come up somewhere around \$18,000 or \$19,000 to start, in that area. I'm not talking about an all night guy obviously.

R&R: That's good money.

BARSANTI: You bet it is. And compared to the cost of living in that part of the country, and so forth, it makes it very attractive. A guy can live 10 minutes from work easily.

R&R: Almost every programmer has had a parsonality who works for him, who is older. How do you work with a jock that has much mora experience than you?

BARSANTI: When I first got to WOW and we were changing the station, there were and still are some guys around who, God, they were in radio before I was born. Johnny Carson started working at our radio station, and we still had people who had announced for him and been his engineers and all that sort of thing.

R&R: You're kidding me.

BARSANTI: For sure, yeah, in fact this past year a couple of them retired, who go back that far, we've still got some around who were there when he was there, and so forth. All of a sudden here comes this punk kid in, and how do you deal with that? I think very simply, what we're talking about here is respect, if people respect you then you don't have any problem dealing with them. I think the only way you get that is to earn that. You don't come in balls-out, you have to come in quietly. And you have to show these guys, who are pros, that you really do know what you're doing, and I think you maybe have to take a little extra time to sit down with them and say, here's why we have a playlist of this length, and here's why this works, and here's why that doesn't work. And I think you know they're bright guys or they wouldn't have lasted this long in the business, so you sit around and you explain the logic of what you're doing and how you're doing it, and all of a sudden they have to sit back and say, yeah, that makes sense. You get them on your team that way, and then things go much more smoothly

Ref. Let's go back to music for a second. Whan doing your research let's take for an example when Stavia Wonder's album came out, and at the tima there was no particular single off the album, but let's say that in your research it was coming in at numbar one, how would you look upon that, would you say, well wa should be programming something from that album, or would you hold back and say no there's nothing out yat, let's wait and see what the company's ... going to do?

BARSANTI: Normally, we play only singles, we do not play album cuts.

R&R: Why?

BARSANTI: Quite a few reasons to begin with, I don't have enough research or good enough research systems to know for example when somebody goes into a store and buys an album, why they're buying it, what on it they like. A guy is an Eagles' fan, so the Eagles come out with a new album, he runs in there and buys it. He may get it home and not like any of it, or he may like only one cut, and hate the rest of the album. If I don't know what that one cut is, and I'm just randomly playing a bunch of stuff, unless, again, unless that gut feel comes back in and tells you this is it, and you believe that and you go, which is just that I think you have to do, then I think you're wrong. I think you're making a mistake by playing the wrong thing. I firmly believe that playing the wrong records can be devastating to a radio station. I believe that with all my heart. If you stop and think about it, we're all very keen to a commercial. Let's say you get some guy on that screams and hollers and does an absolutely horrendous 60 second commercial, and you know that nobody in the world is going to sit through that without punching the button on the radio. To begin with, it should never be on your radio station if there's one like that, but we've all seen them come and go. OK, if you're playing the wrong record, that's like three or four of those in a row. And how many times a day does that record get played. Maybe 5 times a day, all right that's like how many of those horrendous commercials running? And if you've got 2 wrong records, or 3 or 4, 4 wrong records out of a large playlist isn't very many, but if you add up the cumulative time that...how many rotten commercials is that? If you translate it like that, it could be devastating to you. So I think you've got to be very careful, in the case of the Wonder, where you've got an artist of that stature, with an album that is that long waited for and that publicized, and all of the excitement and so forth, I think you've got to be able to make an exception to the rule, and we did. In fact, at our station we played 2 cuts, and they're the same two cuts that I think everybody else got on. So I think we do make exceptions to that rule, in a case of something really special, like that Stevie Wonder album.

R&R: At this time when this interview is taking place, "Hotel California" by the Eagles is one of the most added

songs, or one of the biggest jumpers on most stations and my question is, as a programmer, if that record is so great, right now, and people are saying wow, what a fantastic song that is, why waran't they playing it the same time they ware playing "New Kid in Town?"

BARSANTI: Well probably, because if you're only playing 20 records, and 3 of them or 4 of them are off the Eagles' latest album, that's all you're playing. What happens to the other artists? I think that's probably it, I think you've only got room for so much product by a particular artist at a particular time and with the kind of rotations you have, and the way people listen to the radio. Now if you're playing two or three Eagles' songs at once it will sound like that's all you're playing.

R&R: Without gatting down to nitty gritty basics and tall ing secrets, how do you break down your actual in studio rotation playlist. Do you have "hots," atc.

BARSANTI: Oh absolutely. We have a power rotation, and we have a secondary rotation for current records. And then we have 5 categories of oldies.

R&R: How often do they turn over?

BARSANTI: Well it varies by daypart, as often as 2 hours, and as far apart as every 2 and a half hours, so your average would probably be 2 and a quarter hours.

R&R: So, you've just answered my next question, you do beliave in dayparting?

BARSANTI: Absolutely. But again, I don't think we do anything to great lengths. I daypart, but very carefully, and not a whole lot because again I think that your radio station has to be the same station all the time. Let's say at night you're heading for the teens a little more, because

that's the available audience, but all of a sudden you're 35 year. old guy decides to turn your radio station on at night for the first time in his life, he ought to still know that he's still listening to your radio station. It shouldn't sound like "what is this?" Or I can't find WOW on the dial, did they go off or what? If I feel like I've got to daypert it, that it can only be played between these two hours and never again, or whatever, we probably won't play it at all.

R&R: What about dayparting contests, do you ever do that? BARSANTI: We daypart anything that we feel we have to, whether it's a promo, or a contest. Absolutely, we do contests that are run only a night, or they're run in a particular show, or the emphasis...we may just daypart by emphasis. We may run it 24 hours, but put the emphasis in a specific area.

R&R: What do you think the role of a Program Director Is, in conjunction with the Manager, the Sales Manager, etc.? Yaers ago, we all saw the Program Director as the guy with the long hair, non-managamant.

BARSANTI: I think that's all over. I think more and more it's coming around, I don't know that it ever really left, but I think some stations went through a phase of the George Carlin characterization of the radio DJ or the Program Director, the hippy dippy weather man, whatever. I think the really successful programmers in our country, and you know who they are, we all know who they are, are businessmen, or they're business people. I shouldn't say men anymore, because there are some very fine women in this business. They're business people, they understand that it doesn't matter what you're ratings are, you know being number one, but losing money ain't gonna cut it. You've got to understand the sales angles, you've got to'understand the Federal regulations, you've got to understand Equal Employment regulations, you've got to understand the corporate structure if you're in a corporation. All of these things are an every day part of life, and I think more and more the really successful Program Directors have been and will continue to be even more so, the people who understand all these facets of radio, not only which is the right record to play, and how to best give away \$10,000 In six weeks. They're going to have to understand all the aspects of radio, or promotions, of sales, of management, of news, all of these things are important. The Program Director that doesn't really understand all these things is not going to succeed.

Before we begin, I'd like to take a moment to offer my personal congratulations to Mike Klenfner upon his appointment as Senior Vice President and Executive Assistant to the President of Atlantic Records. I knew Mike way back in the "old days" when we both worked behind the microphone of WNEW-FM/New York. Mike was a part time air personality (who couldn't pronounce his own name correctly...it's Klen-fner, Mike, not Kleff-nor) and Music Director. From there he became Columbia's first National Album Promotion Director; then on to Arista with Clive Davis as Vice President of Promotion and Artist Management; and now...well you know the rest. Mike is a shining example of an AOR broadcaster who made the transition from radio to records, taking his knowledge of AOR with him.

WBCN Enters Federal Mediation

The management of WBCN/Boston and representatives of the United Electrical Workers Union have been in Federal mediation since Tuesday of last week (4/5) in an attempt to settle a labor dispute between the station and the union. According to station sources, the primary issue in the dispute centers around the amount of financial compensation management will agree to pay staff members who are being asked to increase their work week from five to six days. WBCN is one of the few stations in the Northeast covered by a contract with the UEW as opposed to AFTRA. Union members include all air personalities, news people, front office personnel, and some of the station's sales staff.

WBCN's recently appointed Program Director Bob Shannon asked me to pass the word along that as soon as this problem is worked out, hopefully very soon, the station will resume reporting music information to **R&R**. In the meantime, the union negotiations coupled with a new Programming Department administration are taking up their share of valuable time.

We'll be writing about WBCN's new programming directions in this column, as soon as they're able to get cookin' again.

Promotions

Superbowl Of Rock: That's what WDAI/Chicago Program Director Bill Todd calls his station's planned series of outdoor concerts to be held at Soldier Field (that's where the Bears play). The first installment will feature ELP with a 70 piece orchestra and the quadrophonic sound system that was used at the Montreal Olympics.

DC101/Washington D.C.: presented Nite City at the Warner Theatre for the admission price of \$1.01. Also, every Sunday night the station presents a two hour music special tracing the history and music of an outstanding act. This week, Bed Company was featured.

Secret Phrase: WQCN/Hagerstown has been giving their listeners a word a day. At the end of the week, the listeners have to put the words together to make the secret phrase. The first person to correctly do so wins a motorized Honda bicycle. For each hour that the phrase goes unguessed they add on another free gallon of gasoline.

Free Concert Series: WAAL/Binghampton is setting up a showcase for recording acts and invites interested record companies to get involved. Contact MD Steve Becker at (607) 772-8850. Hard Hitters: WOUR/Utica has announced that their staff softball team is ready to stumble onto the field. They call themselves the "Celler Dwellers."

Phony Commercials: WBLM/Maine celebrated April Fools Day by running insane commercials actually bought by their regular clients.

Take The Music And Run: That's the name of WZZQ/Jackson's latest contest. To qualify, listeners call in and randomly get their names on the list. Then the big drawing is held and the winner gets 102 seconds to run through a local record store and grab as many goodies (records) as possible. Other prizes include albums, T-shirts, tickets, etc.

Tubes World Premiere: Fee Waybill visited his old buddy, KZEW/Dallas MD Charlie Kendall, and presented the world premiere of the group's new album, "New," The album was played in its entirety and audience comment was solicited. Out of the 30 calls taken, all were positive.

Go Fly A Kite: WLAV-FM/Grand Rapids is holding their "Second Annual LAV-FM Kite Fly." The station invites listeners to join them in a day of kite flying. The station hands out albums, button's, and other desireable items at the yearly Spring event.

Poster Contest WGVL/Gainesville is holding their "Third Annual Poster Contest." Listeners are invited to submit their original artwork using their variations of the WGVL logo "The Quad Ship." The winner gets a Yamaha 350 as well as the honor of getting the artwork into printads and billboards around town.

Design The Sign: KWST/Los Angeles has whitewashed their giant billboard above Gazzari's Night Club on the Sunset Strip and are running a promotion inviting listeners to design the next station display to grace it's very obvious face. The billboard's dimensions are given out over the air and the winner gets to have his/her artwork blown up and put on the billboard for all of LA, (including some very heavy art directors) to gaze upon. In addition, the winner will receive a complete home stereo system.

The presentation was conceived and organized by A&M's National AOR Director Rich Totoian and WYSP/Philadelphia Program Director Sonny Fox.

AOR Marches On

KSJO/San Jose is yet another AOR station to reach their tenth year of broadcasting variations of Progressive Rock music. According to Music Director Paul "Lobster" Wella, the station will be getting involved with audience participation specials featuring the music played on the station since 1967, year by year. Old classics like Sgt. Pepper and Cream albums will be given away on the air. Lobster and I discussed how he is one of the veterans of the station although 2 1/2 of his years during KSJO's history were, in fact, spent at competitor KOME. He puts it this way, "I never intended to leave" but if you recall, KSJO spent a year (circa 1974) playing with a Top 40 format, and Lobster went across the street. When the station went back to AOR, he eventually went back to KSJO. A Little Side Note: Lobster told me that for the year preceding his departure from the station, he was the station's restaurant critic and did about two reviews a week. That's how he became such a local heavyl

Happy Birthday KZAM: The Seattle AOR outlet just celebrated their second anniversary on April 1st and used variations of "Ship Of Fools" and "Voyage of the KZAMMED" in promoting it. They invited listeners to join them on the "super ferry" to cruise Puget Sound. Approximately 900 listeners showed up to enjoy a 350 pound cake and the music of local bands, the New Deal Rhythm Band and Junior Cadillac.

Shavelson To Mercury AOR/Bone To Artist Development

David Carrico, Vice President of Promotion for Phonogram Inc./Mercury Records has announced the appointment of Mike Shavelson to the position of National Album Promotion Director, replacing Mike Bone. Catch A Rising Star (And Only Charge \$1 For A Listen)

KISW (FM100)/Seattle General Manager Bob Bingham informed us of the station's "Rising Star" concerts held periodically at that city's Paramount N.W. Theatre. Admission to the concerts, which consist of such acts as Robert Palmer, SB&Q, John Miles, Walter Egan, and 38 Special, is a mere "one hundred cents." The concerts are a co-production of the radio station, the theatre, and the John Bauer Concert Company. According to Bingham, "No one makes any money on these concerts. The low admission barely covers the expenses. The theatre lends its facilities, the concert company lends its organization, the record companies lend their support, and the radio station provides advertising and promotion, all for free. Our purpose is to provide artists exposure that are on the way up, but that our audience might otherwise not see if they were to play in town at five or six dollars a ticket."


More and more AOR stations are getting into the "Cheapie Concert" type promotions. This is very healthy to the music scene in general, because the club circuit seems to be falling victim, too, to the rising costs of concert tickets. Consumers, undoubtedly, will show renewed interest in checking out up and coming acts if performances were more financially accessible.

....The Concept Is Spreading

KISW isn't the only station entertaining their listeners with reasonably priced activities. WMMS/Cleveland Music Director Shelly Stile told us about the Midwest AOR stronghold's "One-O-One Days of Spring" promotion. According to Shelly, "This is one of the station's biggest promotions ever." First of all, the station has begun a \$1.01 concert series which was kicked off with Angei and Sammy Hagar. The concert was held at Public Hall and drew approximately 10,000 people. Casablanca Record and FilmWorks were there with cameras and filmed the entire event for a possible forthcoming full length motion picture. Upcoming concerts in the series will feature Chilliwack, Steve Gibbons, and the Babys at the Agora. The station also featured a \$1.01 Lasarium show and three consecutive \$1.01 Sundays of drag racing at a local car racing strip.

The station is also going into their sixth year of "Coffee Break Concerts" which feature live local and national talent playing acoustic music on the air between 11am and 12 noon each weekday. The program which is hosted by Matt The Cat will be featuring such artists as Martin Mull, Elliot Murphy, Tim Moore, Walter Egan, and Pousette-Dart.





Presley Single Not A Single?

From coast-to-coast, rumors have stirred the Industry about an RCA single (JH-10951), Elvis Presley, "Let Me Be There." This is to set the record straight regarding the song:

Publisher AL GALLICO, who owns the publishing rights for "Let Me Be There," had 2000 promotional copies of an Elvis Presley version of the song pressed through RCA Records in New York. The cut was from the "Elvis As Recorded Live On Stage in Memphis" album.

The first major rumor surrounding the release was of an 8 million suit against Gallico by Presley. This has been proven to be totally false. R&R contacted ED HOOKSTATEN, Mr. Presley's attorney, and according to his office no suit has been filed.

After talking with Gallico, he referred us to MEL ILBERMAN, Division Vice-President of Domestic Operations for RCA Records. According to Gallico, Ilberman told him, if he had enough action on the cut, RCA would release it as a single. Ilberman told R&R, "I talked with Gallico a couple months ago and may have said that in a conversation. But in my latest conversation with Gallico, last week, I told him we couldn't do it now, because we have plans for a new Elvis release in a few weeks." Gallico says this method of presenting a cut has been done many times before. R&R talked with MEL FOREE of Acuff-Rose Publishing. He backed up Mr. Gallico's statement.

R&R reached JOE GALANTE, Director, Nashville Operations, RCA Records, he said. "We are not going after the record. There is going to be no record product available. There will be no stock on the record. I guess this is the biggest fluke in the record industry. It is not an official RCA record." Galante also stated another Elvis Presley single is scheduled for release in about three weeks.

R&R's policy regarding the tracking of the song: We plan to reflect airplay as we do normally. It will be graphed and listed weekly as would any other song.
