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BET Strikes ABC

The National Association of Broadcast Employees and Technicians (NABET) struck nationwide against ABC television and radio stations Monday night (5/16). According to NABET, ABC had locked itself into unacceptable positions, refusing to change their offer on delayed meal periods, daily hires, combination operations, pool lighting, and separate

According to the network, the union caused the strike by refusing to concede ABC's demands for "certain relief from restrictive provisions...similar to the relief secured by its competition" (apparently referring to NBC's settlement with NABET last year after a strike). The network affirmed that the strike revolved chiefly around the "area of electronic journalism," basically jurisdiction over minicams and other elec-

Although the strike is largely concerned with a television dispute, it is affecting ABC radio outlets. AFTRA has not at this time honored the NABET picket lines, and management personnel were assuming engineering duties. At WABC/New York, Program Director Glenn Morgan engineered the morning show Tuesday (5/17). and management will continue to fill in, with, according to an ABC spokesperson, "operations running

Utah Stymies KSL Contests

Two contests staged by KSLI Salt Lake City have been halted by the station after station manager Dean Lindsay learned of a probable discontinuation order from the Utah Trade Commission. The promotions were held to be in violation of Utah's laws against lotteries, meaning they contained the three elements of a lottery, chance, prize and consideration. In previous cases in this state, it has been maintained that if entrants merely fill out applications. they have given consideration, so that even contests which do not require a purchase may still violate the Utah regulations.

In one of the contests, the "KSL Blue Chip" promotion, regularly running on the station, listeners were able to acquire numbered chips from vans parked outside KSL advertisers. Then they could win prizes if their chip's numbers were within an indicated range of numbers and they called in to the station immediately. The other

contest had not yet gone into full swing; it was slated to offer weekly prize drawings, with a trip to Disneyland awarded each week. Sears was to co-sponsor the contest and provide a place for entrants to

Court Overrules FCC On KDI A Ownershin

The United States Court of Appeals in Washington has overturned the FCC's 1973 awarding of the KRLA/Los Angeles facility to Western Broadcasting, a group that includes Bob Hope. The court, which has overruled the commission on a number of matters of late, stated that the FCC had departed from its own procedures in turning down six other applicants for the KRLA

license and then accepting Western's application.

KRLA's ownership status has been in limbo since 1962, when Eleven Ten Broadcasting's license was revoked for various misdeeds. The situation, which has often been held largely responsible for the station's past problems, is now likely to persist for an undetermined time.


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Radio Uses Newspaper For Audience Research

WEAQ/Eau Claire ran a full-page newspaper questionnaire recently as part of their "Greatest Musical Minutes Of Your Life" promotion. 79 returned questionnaires were drawn for prizes, and over 1800 entries were received. The questionnaire was in two parts, the first asking listeners to rate 100 individual records in five categories of relative approval: (1) Play this song a lot more often; (2) This song is played about as often as I'd like it to be; (3) Play this song a lot less often; (4) I really dislike this song and don't care to hear it at all; and (5) I am not familiar with this song.

Among the 100 records to be rated were a high percentage of novelty gold and other records generating highly opinionated responses.

The second part of the questionnaire asked respondents to rate 50 artists from "One of the best" to "Pretty bad." WEAQ Music Director Scott Christenson feels that the promotion "reached hundreds of people who would never have expressed their musical preferences to us in any other form." The station is tabulating the returned questionnaires, which Christenson hopes will provide some provocative and intriguing



New 15 Hour Beatles' Special Offered

The special was premiered recently on most of the RKO stations, as well as CHUM/Toronto. Harry O'Connor President of O'Connor Creative Services, projects "an on some 500 U.S., Canadian, and the end of the year.

The Beatles Special runs 15 hours, expanded from RKO's original 14hour feature by O'Connor to include the newly-released "Live In Hamburg" tapes and the Capitol Hollywood Bowl concert LP. The special is to be supplied in disc form with stations receiving special programming and promotional materials and tools. Projected delivery date is July 1.

Business News

The Life Of Leisure-America's Number One Business

A survey compiled by U.S. News & World Report's Economic Unit shows that American's leisure activities have now reached the top industry position in the country, with expenditures for leisure reaching a projected \$160 billion in 1977. The phenomenon reaches to all levels of pleasurable activities, from stamp collecting to sports participation. TV and movie viewing are on a dramatic rise, the average televison set in the home is on 6 hours and 8 minutes per day, and over 1 billion motion picture tickets were sold in 1976. Practically every professional sport has seen an increase in spectators in the past 10 years. The 1976 top 10 attendance sports were, in order; thoroughbred racing, auto racing, major league baseball, college football, harness racing, college basketball, greyhound racing, professional football, major league hockey, and minor league baseball. Major league hockey has had the most rapid growth in the last decade, with attendance up 365%. Swimming remains the sport with the most active participants. and tennis and snow skiing are the fastest growing. The survey speculates that the trend toward "the good life" will continue at a rapid rate, with a possible \$300 billion industry by 1985.

"Tuning Out" Unbelievable Ads

The creative forces of the advertising industry may be spinning their wheels with their ads depicting unreal beautiful people and unbelievable ideas. Ad industry notable Patrick Ross, President of the B.F. Goodrich tire division, was quoted in Advertising Age as saying "It has reached the point where these 'bionic' de-tuners affect the marketing community. We too often paint a Kodacolor-Reynolds wrapped world of Xeroxed beautiful people frolicking." Ross notes that real people may respond to "editorial" type advertising more positively, ads that educate and inform rather than paint a pretty picture. Goodrich's recent campaign to clear up name confusion with Goodyear was highly successful. Consumer awareness of Goodrich rose 122% from '75 to '76, and preference for its product rose 85%.

Youth Trends: More Spending, Less Impulsiveness
Dollars spent by youth and their lifestyles are showing changing trends. Since the 1950's, spending

by teens has increased from \$5 billion to \$26.1 billion last year, according to the Rand Youth Poll. This younger generation is coming closer to accepting the behavior and attitudes of older age groups, and is now closer to their parent's generation in appearance wants. A survey by ad agency Doyle Dane Bembach states that 14-25 year olds still want to look young and healthy, but are more willing to spend money on artificial means to keep that look. The group is also more likely now to buy products in a rational manner, comparing prices and brands before purchasing. Brand preferences are set for life during this period, and the young generation spends a greater proportion of their incomes than older financially responsible generations. They are also more likely to be single than in past years, and more married females are childless than a decade ago.

RKO Transfer Stopped By FCC

The FCC has placed a temporary halt on the announced plan for General Tire and Rubber Co. to transfer ownership of RKO General Corp. to RKO's stockholders. The Commission voted 4 to 3 to stop the proposal pending the outcome of its hearings against RKO's WNAC-TV/Boston.

Combined Expands Publishing Holdings

After the recent announcement of Combined Communication Corp.'s deal to purchase Globe Broadcasting, the company is expanding their holdings again with plans announced to acquire Tribune Publishing Co., publisher of the Oakland, California Tribune newspaper. Purchase price is \$4.3 million cash and 405,000 common shares. Boards of Directors of both companies must approve the sale.

Top Advertisers Spend \$5 Billion In '76
The top 100 advertisers in the U.S. increased their spending by 25% last year, bringing the multi-media ad total to \$4.7 billion. The advertising leader, Proctor & Gamble, tallied up \$357 million in billing, up 30% from 1975. Second place spender General Foods Corp. spending was up a dramatic 47%. The top 10 spent a total of \$8.7 million on network radio. Biggest advertising gainer of the year was Avon, increasing 166%.

Cox Properties To Merge

The Boards Of Directors of Cox Broadcasting Corp. and Cox Cable Communications Inc. have agreed to a previously announced merger plan. Shareholders from both companies will vote on the issue next month. Cox Broadcasting currently owns 56% of the Cox Cable shares, the majority of the remainder of the Cable shareholders must approve the merger before action takes place.

Zenith Unveils Video System

At a recent distributors meeting held in Las Vegas, Zenith Radio Corp. introduced their VCR Betasystem videotape recorder. The nation's number one TV manufacturer made an agreement with Sony Corp. to make the system incorporating Sony's Betamax function. The VCR will be available as components or in a cabinet console which includes a 25 inch picture tube. A black and white TV camera and tapes will also be available through Zenith. Prices, marketing and advertising plans are to be announced at a later date.

NBC Jumps Into The Lead

In a week filled with the networks' pilots for future programming, NBC beat out the other two biggies with their highly rated Monday Movie "In Search of Noah's Ark" and the "Chevy Chase Show." ABC did garner the top rated show however, "Laverne & Shirley" kept up the pace for the number 1 spot, helping put that network in second place, with CBS trailing. Other top 10 shows nationwide for the week ending May 8; "Noah's Ark," "Happy Days," "Eight Is Enough," "Charlie's Angels," "Chevy Chase Show," CBS special movie "White Lightning," pilot "Love Boat III," "Family," and "MASH." Richard Pryor's NBC special came in 29th.

Arbitron's meter service rankings for the week of April 30-May 6 in New York and Los Angeles were similar to Nielsen's although





question fellow passengers as to their opinion of local radio. The bus that picked me up provided my first clue to the pandemonium that radio has created here. In most cities, if you want a directory of radio stations, you turn to the TV-Radio section of the daily newspaper. In San Diego, you check out the buses. The one that picked me up had Rocker KCBQ's logo on one side, their arch-rival B-100's on the other, Beautiful Music KEZL's on the front, Pop/Adult KFMB on the back, and AOR KPRI's inside!

The ride to my hotel provided no relief, either. At every intersection, we were visually assaulted with no less than four to five radio billboards, all attempting to outdo the others. It was so intense out there on the streets, I halfway expected to find someone's call letters secretly hidden in my hotel room! A quick check under the mattress, behind the paintings, and in a few other likely spots turned up nothing promotional, so I felt safe enough to turn on the radio.

My first impression was that more than any other city I've ever visited since I've been doing this job - San Diego stations are much more than willing, they're actually eager to get rid of the money they're making. What other conclusion could you arrive at after hearing on B100 that they're giving away \$1000 during one day? Not to mention Magic 91 (Rocker KMJC) and their "Money Man," whose job it is to award money to anyone he finds listening to his station. And let's not forget KCBQ's "Money Machine," cruising San Diego streets in search of listeners willing to take excess cash off their hands.

But lest you think that only those on the streets are eligible for this massive cash giveaway, consider those poor San Diegans who must surely have writer's cramp by now, after KPRI's "Fill In To Win" contest, Magic 91's "Write It Down" promo, and those tallying the amount in KCBQ's \$10,000 cash call, or B100's "Last Contest," (where listeners are required to know all 100 prize packages that the station is offering).

Thanks to Magic 91 and B100, San Diegans -unlike those in most cities-tell time in "quarter-hours." On B100's second birthday, there was a winner every 15 minutes, and Magic 91 offered a "blindcall-in-and-win" every 15 minutes, as well

San Diego radio also has a unique code that apparently is only understood by the residents. Practically every station reads a mysterious combination of three letters and three numbers at regular intervals (like "MGS 224") and awards cash and prizes to those claiming such bizarre combinations as their own. Possibly it's nothing but a bunch of bumpersticker license plate contests, but I had to leave town before I could find out for sure.

All this madness isn't limited to the Rockers, either. Country **Z104** is offering a Datsun 280-Z (get it?) while competitor **KSON** is willing to part with any number of prizes via their "Free Goods" booklet.

Also, at virtually every stop on the dial, stations are offering their exclusive "limited edition" T-shirts. I wasn't able to determine what the difference between a normal T-shirt and one of the "limited edition" variety was. I can only assume that "limited edition" means the shirts don't last too long (probably run in the wash, fall apart after one wearing—you know the kind).

With all this commotion, I figured I'd take a little TV break. But it only got worse. Several stations are running saturation spots for their contests (some even featuring every single jock on the

staff in their own 10 seconds!)

There appeared to be no relief in sight, so I shut off the TV and ran across the street for a newspaper. Returning, I plopped down on the bed, opened up the paper only to be assaulted with an offer to "Win The Trip Of Your Drams On KEMB."

That did it. I grabbed my clothes, toothbrush, and radio, tossed them all in my suitcase and got the hell out of San Diego with what little remaining sanity I had left....All in all, a pleasant, relaxing, rewarding little trip. Thanks, San Diego radio!

Phoenix Broadcaster Comments on Arbitron

In recent weeks national attention has been drawn to the Phoenix market over Arbitron's concern with some Phoenix radio stations' contests. Many industry reports have unjustly centered on Arbitron's "pressure tactics" to force KRIZ and KUPD to drop their respective contests. True, Arbitron was instrumental in arranging a meeting among Phoenix broadcasters, but it was KRIZ GM Neil Sargent and myself, PD Alan McLaughlin who lead the way in that meeting for all stations involved to come to an agreement to police themselves regarding diary type promotions. It should be understood that without the cooperation of the attending broadcasters Arbitron would still be faced with the dilemma of diary hyping. The real winner in this so-called "battle" is not Arbitron but the responsible broadcasters in this, probably the nation's most competitive contemporary market.

ciation members ran the following announcement on the air: "At this time of year a company known as Arbitron is conducting a survey of radio listening habits in this area. The outcome of the survey, which should accurately reflect the real popularity of the station through the real listening habits of the listening audience of Greater Cleveland, is critical to every radio station here. We and all other members of the Greater Cleveland Radio Broadcast Association are running this announcement to ask you to be careful. If you have received Arbitron diaries in the mail, be sure to fill them out correctly and to ignore any appeal by broadcasters to write their call letters or do anything that would otherwise make your reporting inaccurate. The Greater Cleveland Radio Broadcasters Association urges you to describe your actual listening habits in order to preserve the integrity of this great Cleveland industry." No additional comments were made by station personnel, frequency of running the announcement was left up to the individual stations, and at no time were stations' call letters broadcast directly before or after the announcement. The eight Association members who broadcast the announcement were WGAR, WJW,

The Association notified Arbitron of their intention to run the announcement, which ran only during the last week of the ratings period. According to Caruso, Arbitron at first was skeptical about the Association's response, but after he gave them his reasons, the company told him that

WWWE, WWWM-FM, WERE, WGCL,

WKSW and WMMS.

the announcement was a reasonable solution to a sticky situation and would probably not result in Arbitron's stickering the book.

However, Arbitron, when contacted by R&R, stated that the Cleveland book would be stickered because of the announcement run by the eight stations, as their action met "the requirements of a sticker because the announcements mentioned Arbitron and ratings during the rating period."





Jerry Rogers

R&R: How long have you been in radio?

ROGERS: Time flies when you're having fun, I'd say now it's been 12 years.

R&R: How did you get your start in the broadcast field?

ROGERS: I guess I did what a lot of guys from big cities have to do, you know, go to a broadcast school cause you don't have the opportunity of going to WABC or WMCA, at that time, and getting a job as a weekend lock. I just went to a broadcasting school after I'd gone to college, and started sending out tapes and received a position that I was very happy with at \$65.00 a week in Christensburg Virginia, at WJJJ.

R&R: How long have you been at WSGA?

ROGERS: I've been here now almost 8 years. I came as Music Director and afternoon drive jock and now I'm Vice President and Station Manager of the AM and ZAT FM.

R&R: That's kind of a different story from most guys in radio because of the lack of jumping around from station to station. What makes WSGA so different, to the point where you have been there for so long?

ROGERS: Well, actually I realized a long time ago that I wasn't any good and I couldn't get a job anywhere else. But really the main difference is this, we've been through two ownership situations here and I just have a lot of freedom. Even when I was just Program Director and not Manager too, I was really left alone and as long as the numbers were good, the billing was good, I was left to do what I thought was necessary to make the station sound good. That's one of the fears that I have about going somewhere else. I've talked to different people about doing different things, but I've never been convinced that I would have the kind of autonomy and freedom that I think I need to get the job done.

R&R: As Station Manager, run down a little bit about your responsibilities, both air sound and also the business side.

ROGERS: Basically I am directly responsible for everything that goes on at the station, except the sales. Sales, I'm indirectly responsible for. That's kind of a cross relationship between sales and myself. Everything that goes out of the radio station, the sound, the traffic, the copy, paying the bills, and worrying about the FCC. The main responsibility though, is still the sound.

R&R: Do you have somebody on the premises that's directly overyou?

ROGERS: The owner. He is not involved in the day to day operation of the radio station. We're owned by a theater group and the gentleman that owns the station, Albert Weis, is a theater person. He owns about 40 theaters throughout the state of Georgia. These are his only broadcast properties and he has been kind enough to leave me alone.

R&R: So basically, you are the General Manager of the radio station.

ROGERS: Yes. We don't really have the title here, my title is Station Manager, Vice President & Station Manager, but I function as a General Manager. We do have a Sales Manager who is responsible for sales.


R&R: Well, with your different positions at the station, how do you schedule your week to do programming, music and also function as the Station Manager?

ROGERS: Well, the thing I've always believed in, I was blessed with a lack of talent and ability so I had to put in a few more hours than most people. An average work week is 60 hours. I just try to do a lot of stuff at home, a lot of reading at home, and still spend some time with my family. My kid is 2 years old and he knows what R&R is already cause there's so many things that you have to do at home. Inat's the way I do it. I'm blessed with some very very talented people who are able to do things on their own. One of the good things in our situation is that we've had a staff with a lot of continuity. Like for example, Mac King, the Music Director, has been here about 4 years. Brady McGraw, the Assistant PD, has been here 2 years. My 9-1 guy Mike Allen who is also the Assistant PD at ZAT, the FM, has been with me 6 years. So that helps a lot, when you have people who know your systems and know what to do.

R&R: What format are you running on your FM station?

ROGERS: We have a live personality who's been in the

market for 20 years called Burl Lomack. The show is called "Breakfast with Burl" and I think you can get the idea from the title what kind of format he's running. The rest of the day we use a syndication service. We use Century 21's Rock package with a great amount of input. We do almost as much promoting and contest things on the FM as we do on the AM and you know it is automated and the reason we have the syndication is to kind of keep things in line budgetwise. We have a very very high priced morning man. He's really one of the highest paid jocks in the state. In order to keep things in line we automate the rest of the day and it's worked out fairly well. What we try to do is go for the FM in the TSA and the AM in the Metro.

R&R: Let's talk a little bit about Savannah, Georgia. Tell us about the city.

ROGERS: Well, it's different radio-wise in the respect that we have probably too many radio stations. The last census showed Savannah with 120,000 people. We're 139th overall, and we have 13 radio stations. It's very difficult. A lot of radio station operators are not making money.

R&R: What's the average pay for a disc jockey in Savannah? ROGERS: I imagine, you have people in this town paying disc jockeys, \$2.30 an hour at some stations and you have disc jockeys making up to \$25,000 a year. I would say the average probably is about \$175.00 a week.

R&R: Do you remember what you started at?

ROGERS: \$120.00 a week. No, I'm sorry, it was \$125.00. I was making \$120.00 at my previous station. I started here 8 years ago at \$125.00.

R&R: Let's talk about WSGA. What would you coin the formatas?

ROGERS: I just call it Rock 'n Roll really. We play a 30 list. We play about 40% oldies, and we've also called ourself a Rock radio station. We've never been ashamed of doing that, I think probably the reason we've done well is that we have been doing what we've been doing for a very long time and we just work hard at it. All of our people get out in the community. We're always doing something or other, that's not necessarily a contest, but a community function, whether it's for the March Of Dimes, Cancer Society, Muscular Dystrophy, or whatever the case may be. I really feel that things like this do return dividends to you.

R&R: How many other Top 40 stations are there in your

ROGERS: WTOC, which went Top 40 about 2 years ago, WSGF which interesting enough used to be our FM station, but we were bought out by the people that own WZAT, so ZAT is our FM station, and I guess ZAT is a Top 40 station aside from the morning. In a manner of speaking, 3 others.

R&R: In running your station, do you feel that in a market your size, community involvement is absolutely necessary, or do you think a station can get away with being so-called "major market slick sounding?"

ROGERS: Well, I feel that the only way a medium market station can do that is if the other stations are doing it. But if you have a station in a medium market that is involved with the community, they'll win every time.

R&R: Run down some of your community involvement

ROGERS: Well, we do the March Of Dimes Walkathon. The jocks actually walk in the walkathon, and we do a live broadcast all day long. We're in to our 5th year of the Great Savannah Raft Race. We're into our 4th year of doing a promotion at the Coastal Empire Fair where we raise money for the Cancer Society. One year we had a jock suspended in a camper 100 feet over the fair. He couldn't come down until we got \$2,000. Another thing, to show you the dedication of the jocks, a jock went out there every night for 5 hours, and it happened to be a very cold week, in the 30's, which is very cold for here, and we got pies in the face at \$1.00 a throw for 5 hours for the Cancer Society. This year we buried Brady in a trailer covered by records which we sold for 50¢ each for the Cancer Society and he couldn't come out until all the records were gone to uncover his trailer. We do the Haunted House project with the JayCees each year. I'm the carnival chairman for the Muscular Dystrophy Association. We work with kids who put on backyard carnivals for Muscular Dystrophy throughout the summer to raise money for MD. We also have a program whereby our jocks are available to go to any school or business organization or private home within our listening area to talk about radio. We give out albums, etc., and that's free. We don't charge listeners for that. We promote very heavily the fact that we encourage tours of the radio station. We usually have 2 or 3 a week. It's very important. It's one of the advantages in a small market over a medium market. Once a listener meets you, unless the air personality really is not a positive type person, you should have, a listener. He should stick with you, because you're now a face. You're now somebody to him, not just a name on the radio and that's something we've always tried to do. Have our guys meet as much of their

R&R: How do you get your jocks, especially somebody whose coming new into the station, to get out there in the

ROGERS: We do a couple of things. First of all we try to do as much of it during their regular work week as possible. If that's not possible when we do major station promotions, even though they're for charity, if we broadcast it on the air, the jocks are paid for their time. There are times, and there are guys at the station who are willing to do a little extra and they don't get paid specifically for that thing, but at the end of the year when we sit down and talk money they do get paid for it.

R&R: Well, you do a lot off of the air, out in the public eye, what do you do promotion-wise on the air?

ROGERS: I guess we do your standard things, but I think for a market this size we just do a whole lot more.

R&R: What kind of contests do you run?

ROGERS: Well I try not to do too many weekend things because at least in a market like this, I've found that our weekend audience, we're a warm winter town and we're right on the ocean, our audience is out on the weekend. So, for me to gear a major promotion just to have people calling in on the weekend does not really work. We would prefer on the weekends to do things like beach patrol. We go out to the beach and anybody listening to the station, we give a prize, and things like that. We did do some weekend promotions, but I like to have our things just a little bit bigger. St. Patricks Day is a big holiday here so we just gave away

an all expense paid trip to Ireland, Our promotion now, and this is the 5th year we've done it during the book, is something called the "Great Savannah Flood," and it's been very successful for us. The key-line is "raining prizes for 40 days and nights." We have a winner every hour for 40 days, ranging from record albums to TV sets to motorcycles, to Sony Betamax Video home recorder, and it's a very simple correct number caller. Every hour we take a call, if you're the correct caller you won a TV set, or you won a complete stereo system. The only thing we put in there to kind of increase listening is, every once in a while we'll ask them to give us the last three records we played, and they'll win \$20.00. But our promotion budget last year, including cash and trade-in mentions, was well over \$100,000. So, for a station in a market like this, that's a lot of money to be giving away on the air.

R&R: Let's get into your News Department. Are there any All-News stations in your market?

ROGERS: No. Little too small for that,

R&R: Alright, so WSGA is a Rock 'n Roll station, what kind of news do you have, and where do you target your news?

ROGERS: We have a 2 1/2 person News Department. Our News Director, Dave Brannan, has been with us for about five years now. We run 10 minutes of news in morning drive. We run another newscast at noon. We run newscasts in afternoon drive for 3 hours, 5 minutes an hour. We run some in the all night, but that's all we'do. What we do, every hour we have something we do ourselves called "Earth News." Dave will gather information from the "Earth News" service, from R&R, from Billboard and other sources and prepare a 60 minute vignette or capsule on music, counter-culture, alternative news, and we deliver that once an hour. We also carry the syndicated "Earth News" program, the 5 minute show twice a night, we also carry "Hot News" and the "Daily Planet" midnight to 6, so we try to heavily target our news to our audience, especially in afternoon drive and at night. We do not really have a news image in town, I don't know how important it is for a Top 40 station, we've always been pretty dominant 18-49, but we have 3 radio stations in town with TV stations and they really kind of have, I would think, because of their facilities, and capabilities, more of a news image. We also carry ABC/Contemporary at infrequent times of the day to augment our local news.

R&R: Let's talk about music. You said you're playing a playlist of 30 records. Of those 30 songs, are there any album cuts involved?

.. ROGERS: 30 singles and we play 5 or 6 album cuts a

R&R: At nights only?

ROGERS: Yes, and on the weekends we'll play them after noon on Saturday and on Sunday. The feeling is, although there is not an AOR station in town, I think basically people listen to an AM Top 40 station to hear familiar things and familiar tunes by familiar artists. I think playing album cuts other than at night, which our night we consider to be 7pm-5am, which is basically when you don't have a whole bunch of folks over 25 listening, would really kind of defeat what we're trying to do.

R&R: Those album cuts you do play at night, are they from familiar artists, or do you delve into breaking artists?

ROGERS: No, it's got to be familiar. It's got to be a Stevie Wonder, a Steve Miller, or an image artist in our part of the country, which would be a Jimmy Buffett, or somebody

R&R: What kind of music research are you doing now, compared to the music research that you were doing when you first went in as Music Director.

ROGERS: Not a whole lot of different things for this reason: The fact that I've been in the market for so long gives me a very big advantage. I think I really know the pulse of the community. We still have to do our homework, but you just get to know what's happening in a town. What we're doing now, the only thing that we're doing differently, is we're probably being a little more careful talking to our store reporters. We're being a lot more careful in tallying request line information, and we also do a survey mail-out to all our contest winners, as to what are their favorite artists, what are their favorite songs, are there any songs that they dislike, and I think this maximizes the efficiency of the people who are listening to your station.

R&R: What's the percentage of returns on those mail-outs? ROGERS: Well, it depends on how we do them. When we were doing them just mailing them out asking them to

send them back we got about 10% back. But we went to a stamped self-addressed envelope, it's well over 50% now.

R&R: Does that utilize both new and old records?

ROGERS: Yes. It's both currents and oldies and artists and contests, what would you like to win in a contest, do you like news, do you like this syndicated feature or that syndicated feature, and other questions.

R&R: How do you tabulate your requests? Do you have request people, do your disc jockeys do it, and how many hours a day are they doing it?

ROGERS: Unfortunately we do it ourselves and we do it 24 hours a day.

R&R: On every call?

ROGERS: Well, we take every call, whether the jock writes down every call is another matter. I know I don't. Sometimes you just don't have time to do it. But what we try to do is write down as many as we can. We have a sheet listing the current records we're playing, listing the Mothers, the 70 or 80 hot oldies, and this is all alphabetized and then next to that is a form for the ages, we do 6-11, 12-17, 18-24, and 25 plus female, male. So, really all the jock has to do is put a mark next to it, and each jock gets a sheet for a week, At the end of the week they're turned in and tabulated.

R&R: How do you categorize your music?

ROGERS: We just use an ABCD for currents. A is the

R&R: Approximately how many powers are there?

ROGERS: Nine. You see it's a pretty slow rotation because our powers come up once every 3 hours, that's it.

R&R: And how often would the rest of the list rotate?

ROGERS: The B's which are the stuff that's just outside the power is about every 3 1/2 hours, the C's which is the hot stuff which is about to fall off the chart is every 4 hours, and the D's which is the new stuff is about every 4 hours.

R&R: What about your golds? Do you categorize them in any special way?

ROGERS: Yeah, we have 4 categories, including LP gold.

R&R: What's I P Gold?

ROGERS: Again it's a night time category, it would be things like "Bitch" by the Rolling Stones, the Ten Years After song "I'd Love To Change The World," things that didn't quite make it, super hit singles, or maybe were never singles, but we deem necessary for air-play for an image, "Black Dog" and "Rock & Roll" by Led Zeppelin are other examples

R&R: Does R&B take up a good portion of your playlist because of your geographic location?

ROGERS: Yes, especially at night, because we're a Class 4 station, so you know, at night that's what we have to do, well with the Black audience to do well overall, because it's basically who can hear us the best.

R&R: Is there a Black formatted station in Savannah?

ROGERS: Yes, there are two of them and they do very well. It's usually between us and the Black format stations for the number one position, and we've been very fortunate in four of the last five years to be number one, but the Black stations are always contenders.

R&R: What factors go into making up your weekly playlist? ROGERS: Well, we use of course the telephone request, sales, the survey research...

R&R: How about music stores.

ROGERS: Well, that's the sales, and that's basically what we use for the numerical listing because once we start playing a record, we tend not to watch national action on it because it really doesn't matter at that point, unless it's a record we're really having trouble getting a reading on, and then we'll go and see what other people are doing with it.

R&R: About how many record stores on an average do you

ROGERS: Between five and seven stores a week.

R&R: Do you, or does another member of your staff do the research?

ROGERS: Mac does, our Music Director, handles all the

R&R: Does the station have a close rapport with the personnel at the record stores?

ROGERS: You known when you're dealing with as few stores as we are, you do have a rapport, but the problem is, and I guess everybody has this problem, it's just a high turnover position, as far as the record stores is concerned. When you build up a rapport with somebody, well, then they're gone, so it just takes a while to do it again, so you just carefully try to weigh things and it's very difficult to curate reports. We try to get people to give us the exact amount of stock sold, but we still have stores who will only give us an 'excellent' 'good' 'fair' 'poor' situation which isn't totally what we're after.

R&R: When your Music Director calls stores, do you only look for the singles, or do you also tabulate the albums.

ROGERS: Album sales and we also check singles we're not

R&R: You mentioned earlier that you also do an airshift. Is that 5 days a week?

ROGERS: Yeah.





R&R: That intrigues me, because you told us your work week is 60 hours, but I find it hard for anybody to be able to watch over the music, watch over the programming, be Station Manager, and at the same time handle a 3 hour airshift everyday.

ROGERS: Well, plus we also work with the FM station. I'll tell you what, I think it's just like any other radio junkie, it's not really work. It is sometimes, you know, but it's not really work and I have a very very good staff. People who really don't get the credit, but they just do a lot of work.

R&R: You mentioned earlier that a lot of your people have been there for some time. What do you attribute that to.

ROGERS: We don't let them leave. I don't know. I think for a market this size we're a good radio station. I really believe that. I think we pay our people well, they get paid fairly. When we get the book in we sit down with people, they know going in what they have to do to get a certain raise. In other words it's laid out for them. If you're number one you get this much money, if you increase your AQH by this many points you get this much money, etc. I think, I guess the Heftel people do that and it's a very fair way of doing things. I think they like that,

R&R: What do you look for when you receive a jock's audition tape? What are you really looking for on that tape?

ROGERS: First thing I do is the resume. The first thing I look for is somebody who is not a floater. I won't even listen to a tape, you know a guy who has been at a station 6 months, another station 6 months, I believe there is a place for people like that in the industry, but not at our radio station, because I'm interested in people who are interested in being at a station. Then we go to the tape and it's really hard to put your finger on it, I don't know if you ever had a set of rules of what I want, and what I don't want, but I just look for a guy who can move a show along, who sounds happy, and sounds like there's no place else he would rather be than playing Rock 'n Roll music at that particular radio station. I think that's the most important thing, because you can teach a guy a format and you can teach a guy how to run records, and how to talk over records, whatever, but one thing I find it hard to teach people is 'Hey, I like what I'm doing and I'm happy doing what I'm doing.' I think the station that I heard that best exemplifies

this was Y100 a couple of years ago, when they were really cooking, before Mr. Heftel was selling the station, but Bill Tanner just did such an incredible job in doing that. His guys just sounded like there was nothing else they wanted to do more than be right there, and that's what we try to do. It's not always possible, but that's what I look for in a tape.

R&R: Do you think the voice is half of the battle?

ROGERS: Well, you know, obviously, not having a very big voice myself, I hope it's not that important, but I think an irritating voice can blow everything else. I don't think you have to have a super voice, but I think you have to have a pleasant voice, and a pleasant delivery, but a big voice is not important to me.

R&R: What type of market on the average does the talent come from that work at WSGA and other stations in your

ROGERS: I can only say, for me, I don't really pay a whole lot of attention to where the other guys get their talent, I try as hard as I can to hire guys almost exclusively from smaller markets. I have found that normally when you get somebody from a big market to come to a smaller market, even if you're paying him more money, they tend not to be happy, because you cannot do some things as well as it might have been done at a bigger station they were at. Just like I never like to hire somebody, if possible, and it's not always possible, for less than they were making at their previous job, I try to hire people from smaller markets so it's a step up for them. I feel you always get a better attitude and a happier guy, cause he's really happy to be there.

R&R: I once worked for a man, in the South, who told me that during our initial interview that he would prefer a Southerner to program his station. Do you go along with people who grow up in a geographic area are better equipped to handle that area in radio?

ROGERS: Definitely. We have some Yankees, and I'm of them, working here, but I've been here for a while so I'm kind of a native. I always prefer not only to get somebody from the South, and not only to get somebody from the state, but if at all possible get somebody local. Get somebody who was born and bred here, and right now we have four gentlemen working with us that were brought up within 100 miles of Savannah. That's just a tremendous tremendous advantage. They know the people, they know what's out there. It can be done the other way, but I think it's a lot easier to do it this way.

R&R: Where does Jerry Rogers want to be five years from now in this business?

ROGERS: Retired and out of this rat race. Actually I have one of two goals. I would either like to own my own radio station, and that's probably what I'm going to wipd up doing, or I might like to go to a bigger market.

R&R: Why are you still on the air?

ROGERS: I've often asked myself that because there are days when your 3 hour airshift actually just runs into a business meeting, copy has a problem, sales has a problem, an account has a problem, and you say, hey this just isn't getting it done, but then I realize that that's what I like to do. I thoroughly enjoy being on the air and I thoroughly enjoy doing my program.

R&R: To finish this up, I was going to say to you, that you have to be one of the perfect examples of something that's been very rare in our end of the business, and that is somebody, first of all staying at a radio station this long, secondly somebody who goes in as a Music Director and afternoon jock and keeps his same shift over the years, and also builds himself up into a management position. As we have seen in the past, most Managers are brought into the ranks from the Sales Department. Do you foresee more Programmers and more disc jockeys and so forth are going to make their way up to Managers in this day and age?

ROGERS: I think it has to happen. I believe truly that you put two stations against each other, and at one station the General Manager comes from Programming, and at the other station the General Manager comes from Sales, the station operated by the Programmer is going to win every single time, and I also believe they'll beat them bottom line very single time. I think there are some excellent sales people in the business and we sure have them here, both our local Sales Manager and national Sales Manager are young guys who know what it's about and we work together beautifully. I don't think that's the case at a majority of radio stations. I think most times the salesmen makes more than the announcer and the Sales Manager makes more than the Program Director. The times have got to change. It's just an absurd situation and radio people have just got to stop prostituting themselves and just stand up for what should be theirs. We haven't changed in over nine years, but it's getting there, where the Programming people and the talent people are getting to be making just about as much as the Sales people and some of the Sales Management people.

THE R&R COUNTRY INTERVIEW

JIM WALTON



JIM WALTON, Program Director of WITL AM & FM in Lansing, Michigan, started in radio in Cumberland, Kentucky, at WCPM. He followed the footsteps of CRAIG SCOTT, who is currently Vice President of Programming for Plough, Inc., and BOB BERRY, Music Director of WMVA, Wheeling. For the first few months of his career, Walton worked at various stations in Kentucky. After a short time, he moved to Michigan and got out of the radio business. He worked at a factory for a while, then decided radio was really the profession he wanted to pursue. Walton then took on a position with KTRM, Beaumont, Texas, where he worked both the morning and afternoon shows for a while. One day, while he was on the air, he received a call for a job from DAVE DONAHUE, then Program Director for WITL, Lansing. Walton savs he learned a great deal from Donahue, who is now Operations Director of KHAK, Cedar Rapids, Iowa. After a time Walton was promoted to Music Director, then in 1975 he took over as Program Director. This was his first position as PD. JIM WALTON has proven he is a winner.

R&R: You obviously in the last couple of books, proved your success as a Programmer. What would you consider your basic programming philosophy?

WALTON: Basic programming philosophy, that's interesting. Play the hits, past and present, that's really all you can do. Keep it tight. Have adult communicators, who provide one to one radio. People talking to people.

R&R: Explain the difference between the programming of your AM and FM.

WALTON: Well, the AM is Country Gold. We figure the market was big enough for two Country stations and we wanted both of them. The AM allows us to specialize in our field with the older songs. The FM, is more into current music. Our charts lean toward a Pop sound.

R&R: Your FM right now, according to the latest ratings is outrating your AM two to one. Is there any particular

WALTON: Well, the reason is the FM penetration in this market is unbelievable. We have had various studies through the years. One thing that was done on the campus of MSU, a little while ago, proved that 50% of the automobiles in Lansing have FM radios. Signal is much better of course, but now we haven't had a rating since the switch, with the AM and FM, so hopefully the AM will gain some of that

R&R: How do you approach music research for both?

WALTON: We rely on requests a great deal. We do check local sales. We have seven retail outlets in the market, one as far as sixty miles away that we check on a weekly basis. We check a one-stop that is 100 miles away, and we try to cover the entire area with sales. We check the trade papers, of course, and without those, I don't think we could make it. The sales, local sales, local requests, and call in research, instead of call out research, and we're currently considering that. Our sister station up in Madison

Wisconsin, WISM, is doing that, and they've had tremendous response with the call out research, so I'm going to try to find out as much as I can about that, and hopefully get into it. We check jukeboxes with the local bands to find out what's requested in the bars.

R&R: As far as your FM, which is more of a contemporary sounding Country station, what percentage of current oldies are you using right now.

WALTON: On the FM we play four oldies an hour.

R&R: Any particular sound that you shy away from

WALTON: We use one album cut per hour and call it the Spotlight Album. We have eight albums in that category and that allows us to expose the new albums that come out. We select the cuts on it, laminate them, and grease pencil the cuts we play. If I play one cut today, I wouldn't play it again for five days, that way we expose all the cuts we've marked on the album. It's a pretty good control of them.

R&R: Is there any particular source or research you use to determine when a particular current record has burned out?

R&R: Are you using jingles now?

WALTON: Yes.

R&R: On your AM & FM?

WALTON: Yes. We use the Country Music Radio jingle package from TM.

R&R: What do you feel is a jingle's primary function?

WALTON: I go along with what they say on the jingle packages when they're trying to sell them. 'to increase program flow'. That pretty well says it. It enhances the station and adds a sparkle to it. It makes the station alive. If you use them right, you're going to sound great. If you use them wrong you're going to sound like some mickey mouse station.

R&R: What would be your philosophy on using jingles properly?

WALTON: Match the tempo of the jingle with the record. We drop them in, drop the record in and that's it. It gives the call letters time to really soak in. Even if there's a 12 second intro on the record, my rule is no talk after the jingle.

R&R: How often do you use jingles?

WALTON: I guess its just sort of a feel. If the requests die down and sales die down, that's usually a good indication. Some records never quit selling, so we play those, I guess you could call those recurrent. We play them as oldies. If they fall off the chart we keep them off the chart for 60 to 90 days, and them move them back into the oldie rotation.

R&R: So you actually do use some sort of recurrent formula for your format?

WALTON: The top 15 come up every 8 hours. We open the hour with a Top 15 song.

R&R: Where do you run your news in a particular hour for

WALTON: In the drives. We do news in morning drive & afternoon drive. We do it at the top and the bottom of the hour. Total time is 4 minutes.

R&R: Is this all locally produced?

WALTON: Yesitis. We have no network.

R&R: What kind of staff do you have in your News Department?

WALTON: We have two full timers and two part timers. R&R: How do you approach the news? Is it traditional?

WALTON: Yes, traditional. It's just flat out news. It's very little feature, just hardcore news. We try to relate to the local community.

WALTON: We use four an hour in drive times. In the middays, all night and 7-12 we use 5 because we use a jingle to sweep the half hour.

R&R: What do you feel has been your best type of

Walton; Small contests. Fun contests. A lot of prizes to a lot of people rather than one big prize.

R&R: Let's talk about air personalities. What difference do you project in the AM and FM personalities you use?

WALTON: Well, the AM is automated. We have "That Was Conway Twitty" just the basic announce.

R&R: Is it self-produced automation/

WALTON: Right. We produce it here. We have one live segment on the AM. We're live 10-2.

R&R: How about the FM?

WALTON: We have on the morning show a guy named Charlie Fredricks who came to us two years ago. The guy is the best one-to-one man I've ever heard in my life. There's no doubt about it. He's funny. He's a genuine one-to-one man. He's the personality in this market. I do the 9-11 show. I'm basically an announcer; I'm no big personality. I think if you ask half the people in the area "who's Jim Walton?" they'd

answer he's one of the Walton's on TV. I follow all the basics and get all the information out and try to project warmth, but I don't really get into personality. I'm not a funny man so I don't do humor. The afternoons we have a strong personality with a strong voice. I think you need different personalities. Every shift is different. The 7-12 midnight guy has a Rock & Roll backround. In fact, I'm the only jock at the station who's had a Country background. For all the rest of the announcers, this is their first Country experience.

R&R: Any particular direction in community involvement that you push your personalities?


WALTON: That's probably our strongest point of really being visible in the community. Like everybody else, we do

set or 2½ minute, I think we could tack a 30 second promotion on if the production is right.

R&R: How often do you run promotional spots during the hour?

WALTON: In the drives we run spots during each half hour. The maximum drive in our market is 15-20 minutes. It doesn't matter where you live, it's 15 or 20 minutes. So if we don't get them in that 15 or 20 minutes, we'll miss them. Also I rely on a lot of one line drop-ins from the announcers.

R&R: Do you have a fairly good working relationshop with your Sales Department? I have found a lot of stations, no matter what format, it seems like the Sales Department, after a period of time, ends up running the station.

have to do the best job with it we can. Let me just give you an example of a few things we've done in the past 6 years. We raise money for the St. Jude Research Hospital Radiothon, something we've done for 6 years. We raise money for the St. Jude Hospital in Memphis. It's a successful project. We have people on the Easter Seals Telethon. We have a remote wagon out for that. We have people that appear on the MS Telethon. We did a Toys-For-Tots show in December. We did the WITL Benefit Show. Each year we have a benefit show taking all the proceeds after the expenses are paid, and give the money to the St. Vincent's Children's Home, the City Rescue Mission, Boy Scouts, and other local charities. We have the WITL Softball Team and they'll play for fund raising projects. So I feel we are very much involved with the community.

R&R: What do you feel is a good limit on commercials per hour?

WALTON: That's hard to say. Do you want my opinion or my manager's opinion?

R&R: Let's get yours and then find out what you're actually doing.

WALTON: We're doing 18. That's our max. I think we can live with 18 minutes an hour. I've heard people say so many times, 'we've got to have 12 minutes, we've got to have 14 minutes.' I guess in a lot of markets, maybe that's true, but right here in Lansing, we can get by with 18 minuter per hour. I don't feel that it's too much. It really works well for us.

R&R: Any limit that you have, as far as the number of commercials, or the actual length of commercials during a particular stop set?

WALTON: In extreme conditions 2½ is the extreme. Usually 2 minutes handles it ok.

R&R: Now if you run 2 minutes, where would you put a promotional spot?

WALTON: If I was running a full load, I'd probably tack the promotional spot on the end of the shortest set and use it like a jingle. I try to maybe have a 2 minute spot WALTON: Yes it does, doesn't it? It's been a problem in a lot of stations. I've read interviews before and the people say 'but at our station it's different- we have a good working relationship.' We do have a good working relationship, but sometimes you have to yell. I try to attend one sales meeting a week. I go in, we talk about any problems. Sometimes I get mad and sometimes they get mad, but we really do have a good working relationship.

R&R: How about remotes? Are you into using commercial remotes, or just for public service things?

WALTON: We do public service remotes, but this market is really heavy with location broadcasting. The Rockers do it, everybody does it, so I'd say we average one to two a week.

R&R: Do you change your programming or music at all during the evening?

WALTON: We add a couple more oldies 7-12 because we run a heavy spot load during the day and have time to play more music at night.

R&R: Any sort of limit that you have on talk? How much rope do you give them?

WALTON: I give the morning man 20 seconds because he knows how to handle it. He's a pro and has been around and knows how to handle 20 seconds. He knows when to use a punch line. At night I don't give him as much leeway because he isn't developed yet, that's why he's doing 7-12 midnight, 20 seconds is max for anybody.

R&R: How about your thoughts on the trend of the music today?

WALTON: I knew you'd ask that. That's interesting. I was trying to think of some big prepared statement to come up with, and couldn't come up with one. We try to play what we feel, from our research, is the music of today. If we take a chance and play a bad record, the audience will let us know. That's why I feel a station must have a good line of communication with the people in their market. They will help set the trend.




R&R: OK, to summarize, what do you feel is the reason you've been so successful, and secondly, what are your goals for the future?

WALTON: Number 1, the reason I've been successful here, in all honesty, I inherited a good station. There were two super people here before me and they did a good job, set up a good format, a good station. I came in not as a surgeon to operate and change it, but just as a repairman to keep things running smoothly, and to continue a sound that had been set up. We've made some changes through the years. Part of my success is because I've got a General Manager who was a Program Director and has good programming background. That's important, to have the General Manager on the Programming Department's side. It is scary to think of the competition because everyone else is working for the same basic thing as you. So I try to stay ahead of the game by working harder and more hours than they do. As far as the future goes, right now I'm learning here. I have dreams like everyone to program a major market station. I've started to consult some of our company's stations. I enjoy that and hope to involve myself in that even more in the future. I just enjoy my job and enjoy working in radio. I hope to get into management sometime in my career. But for now I want to do the best I can to be a great Program Director.
