

## NAB Requests Immediate FCC Fee Refunds

The National Association of Broadcasters has asked the FCC for an immediate refund of all fees illegally assessed to broadcast licensees. NAB's statement to the FCC stressed the point that the U.S. Court of Appeals verdict which voided the FCC's fee schedule is now final, as no Supreme Court appeal was filed before the deadline. NAB stated that "expeditious action is mandated in view of the fact that the government has been the beneficiary of millions of dollars in interest gained from the fees illegally collected under the 1970 and 1975 fee schedules."

## Arbitron Protests Pyramid Promotion

Arbitron has registered a stern protest against Pyramid Records President Dennis Ganim's promotional mailing campaign for the label's Andy Adams & Egg Cream single, "Can I Stay." The mailing's outer envelope was stamped "Important ARB Information Inside," with the letters ARB arranged to closely resemble the Arbitron symbol. Inside, Pyramid explained that ARB meant "Automatic Rating Booster" and followed by plugging their single.

The label recently received a letter from Arbitron's legal representatives demanding that Pyramid "cease all use of Arbitron's trade name, symbol and any other representation...." The letter threatened legal action if Pyramid did not immediately desist.

Arbitron contended, through the law firm, that Pyramid's "ARB" use "suggests a deliberate attempt

...to associate its promotional material with Arbitron," and that such use "threaten(s) the reputation of Arbitron's name and its radio audience rating service...Damage to Arbitron's reputation among its customers could well result in many thousands of dollars in lost

revenues for a substantial period of time until Arbitron's reputation could be fully re-established." The letter went on to suggest that Pyramid was in violation of the Federal Trade Commission Act and several provisions of New York law.

## Mariner Buys KBEQ

Mariner Communications of Cincinnati has agreed to purchase KBEQ/Kansas City for what present owners Mark and Connie Wodlinger term the highest price ever paid for an FM station in broadcast history. Mariner President L. Joe Scallan stated, "After careful analysis of many stations, we feel extremely fortunate to be able to acquire what we consider to be the finest FM property in the country, with a proven successful format, a topnotch professional staff, and optimum facilities in a solid

and growing market. It is our intention to continue operation of this highly successful station exactly as it is today."

KBEQ has been consistently top-rated in its teen/young adult target audience since switching to a Top 40 format in August 1973 (when call letters were changed from KBEY). The Wodlingers will remain at KBEQ as consultants. The sale is still subject to FCC approval. The exact purchase price was not disclosed.

## HOFF Launches 'Manipulations'

Gerry Hoff, President of Threshold Records for the past six and one half years, has resigned his position. He will be returning to the West Coast to operate his own company, Manipulations, representing artists, music, film projects, and working as liaison be-

tween artists, managers, and record and film companies. Threshold the label owned by the Moody Blues, has been inactive recently, with solo records by the currently-disbanded group appearing on the London label or its Deram subsidiary.

The Task Force sponsoring the new system includes Duncan, Harold R. Krelstein (Board Chairman of Plough Broadcasting, the original Task Force Chairman until recent illness prevented his fulfilling these duties), Sal Agovino (Katz Radio), James P. Arcara (Capital Cities Communication), Arthur W. Carlson (Susquehanna Broadcasting), Dwight Case (RKO General); Sam Cook Digges (CBS Radio), Ralph Guild (McGavren-Guild Inc.), L.G. Jones (Southern Broadcasting), Harold L. Neal, Jr. (ABC Radio), Philip H. Roberts (Greater Media), Lester M. Smith (Kaye-Smith Enterprises), Jack G. Thayer (NBC Radio Division), and Carl J. Wagner (Taft Broadcast-

ing). The pilot system test is being funded through an assessment of the RAB's board members, with additional funding from the NAB research budget. An RAB Technical Committee featuring key RAB and NAB members is providing technical back-up for the Task Force.

## Bennett Buys Hi Records

Al Bennett, head of Cream Records, has purchased Hi Records. The Memphis-based label will become a subsidiary of Cream, with Willie Mitchell, Hi executive and producer, staying on as Vice President. The Hi roster includes Al Green, Ann Peebles, Jerry Jaye,

and Ace Cannon, among others. Bennett's purchase follows his acquisition of East/Memphis Music, the publishing wing of now-defunct Stax Records which retains the rights to a number of contemporary R&B classic songs.

## FCC Appeals KCBS And KONO Rulings

The FCC has appealed federal rulings striking down the Commission's renewal of broadcast licenses for KCBS/San Francisco and KONO-AM/San Antonio. A three-judge panel had ruled that the FCC had not permitted citizens' groups, out to prove employment bias on the part of the stations,

sufficient time or opportunity to investigate their case.

The FCC's appeal contends that the court overstepped its bounds in making the decision, and that under the Communications Act the burden of proof is on opposing parties to prove their cases without invoking FCC processes.

## SEVEN 'DIRTY WORDS' STILL OK

### No Rehearing For Obscenity Case

The FCC was denied a retrial in the WBAI/New York case which resulted in a U.S. Court of Appeals decision striking down the Commission's obscenity regulations.

The original case, as reported in R&R, concerned the George Carlin comedy routine about seven words unsuitable for airplay, which as it stands at present, are now suitable.

# Business News

## More Frequencies For CB?

A report on new sources of "personal use" radio frequencies has been prepared by the FCC's Office of Plans and Policy. The study outlines three possible frequency categories currently not used for broadcasting. The frequencies that could be reallocated to citizen band use and other personal uses include bands now used for government, amateur, land mobile and international communications. Further research will be required, according to the Commission office, before a final decision is made, although they feel that interference to regular frequencies and television service is not expected.

## AFTRA-Record Industry Talks Break Down

Since the last negotiation meeting between AFTRA and the recording industry were held in April, no new discussions have been set and the two bodies are in the midst of some severe differences of opinion. One of the main arguments is AFTRA's demand that the contingency pay ceiling be reduced below the current \$160,000. Over 32,000 union members are affected by the new contract, which will run through the spring of 1980.

## 1/2 Million More Youths Looking For Work

Statistics released by the Labor Department show the the number of 16 to 24 year olds out searching for summer work will increase significantly this year. An estimated 582,000 more young people may push the nation's unemployment rate sky-high by July. Total youths in the job market will hit 26,648,000 including over 4 million who specifically work only during summer months.

## Utah Ads Seek To Stop Youth Shoplifting

A unique media advertising campaign is underway in the state of Utah to help stop the flood of juvenile shoplifting incidents. Commercials on radio and TV, as well as outdoor billboards and newspaper ads, carry the message "Shoplifting doesn't pay...you do." The state passed a strict shoplifting law in 1975. The campaign, which was sponsored by the Utah Council of Retailers & Wholesalers along with the Utah Council on Criminal Justice Administration, so far has raised juvenile awareness of the shoplifting penalties from 13.4% to 47.8% of the population. As much as 80% of shoplifting by juveniles has been stopped since the program's inception.

## Airmail Rates Fly Away

The U.S. Postal Service's plan to completely discontinue airmail has come to pass, the Service has announced. First class letters now travel to their destinations by the fastest transportation possible. Airmail stamps can still be used for first class letters, however. The only other thing your left-over airmail stamps are good for are overseas mail, where those rates are almost always necessary. Regular 13c first class stamps can be used on mail to Canada and Mexico.

## At The Sound Of The Tone: "The Young & The Restless"

New Jersey residents will now be able to find out if "General Hospital" character Audrey has committed suicide by picking up the phone. New Jersey Bell Telephone has started an information service that offers callers capsule reports on 16 major daytime TV soap operas. Helping to promote the service is a series of radio spots, voiced by Louis Nye.

## \$287 Million In GM Ads Last Year

At General Motors Corp.'s annual meeting, the company's chairman Thomas Murphy revealed that GM's ad budget in 1976 was \$287 million, up nearly \$17 million from the previous year. \$204 million of that figure was spent in media ads. Murphy also told the gathering that he disagreed with the possible small car rebate proposal, stating that imports would benefit rather than domestic car makers.

## Re-Birth Of Trading Stamps

Detroit supermarket chain Great Scott! has become the first major chain to bring back trading stamps, after their agreement to use S&H Green Stamps. Since the energy crisis and rising food price period, stamps of all kinds have hit the bottom in distribution, but the S&H people now feel that the market is perfect to re-introduce stamps to the consumer. Great Scott! will launch a major radio and TV campaign to draw attention to their new program.

## Coke Laughs At Pepsi's Taste Test

The 1977 version of the battle of the soft drinks is now off and running, with Coca-Cola commercials zeroing in on Pepsi Cola's huge "Pepsi Challenge" taste test campaign. Coke's new spots feature a taste-tester telling the interviewer that "you can't tell nothin from no test like this," and that he would prefer a Coca-Cola. The scene is set up with bottles labeled "L" and "S," the same labeling that Pepsi uses in their TV challenge spots. Last year, Coke had also run similar spots, but had discontinued the campaign when they determined that "subjective comparative advertising" was not in the best interests of the industry.

## Western Summer Push For Bud

Using the theme "When Do You Say Budweiser," Anheuser-Busch has kicked off a network and local radio buy push for that beer. The campaign's major demo target is 18-24 males, utilizing 30 and 60 second spots in Los Angeles, San Francisco, Seattle, Tucson, Denver and Phoenix. (Continued on page 14)

# The FCC

## Report On Recent Developments At FCC

### Annual Employment Reports Due By June 1

The FCC's Annual Employment Report, on FCC Form 395, is due to be filed by all broadcast stations on or before June 1, 1977. In light of the FCC's recent emphasis on EEO matters, every effort should be made for a timely filing of the Form 395 and any questions promptly referred to the appropriate office for resolution.

### Court Reverses And Remands Cases To FCC On EEO

The U.S. Court of Appeals (D.C. Circuit) has reversed the FCC's action renewing the licenses of stations WTVR-AM-FM-TV in Richmond, and remanded the matter back to FCC for a hearing on protests by a local Black Coalition. The Court ruled that a hearing was required in light of un rebutted allegations of overt racial discrimination and that FCC could not lawfully adopt a "neutral stance in favor of the licensee," in passing on EEO protests.

In another Court reversal of FCC Renewals in San Antonio and San Francisco on EEO issues, it held the objecting parties had a right to seek employment data from "discovery" in the form of "written interrogatories" from the station before FCC could properly consider and rule on EEO protests from another local Coalition.

### Other EEO Rulings

FCC granted a limited and conditional renewal to WHK (Cleveland) which—even though the station's total employment fell within an overall "zone of reasonableness," held that it nonetheless had to submit periodic EEO data, including a list of all persons hired in the next year, particularly in the highest 4 job categories which were not proportionately represented by minorities/women.

The FCC has denied an NAACP requested reconsideration of its renewal to WRAW, Reading, on the basis that the station's employment reasonably met the minority/women workforce levels of Reading as its license community, and its EEO program did not have to comply with the population characteristics of Philadelphia about 60 miles away.

Although ABC garnered the top 2 rated shows, NBC took the overall lead in primetime Nielsen ratings for the week ending May 15. Helping push NBC to the top for the second week in a row was their special "Father Knows Best Reunion," which came in third. The rest of the top 10 shows were: ABC Sunday Night Movie "High Plains Drifter," "Laverne & Shirley," NBC Monday Movie "The Eiger Sanction," CBS' "America's Junior Miss Pageant," CBS pilot "Handle With Care," "Miss U.S.A. Beauty Pageant," "Happy Days," and NBC's pro boxing special.

## NBC's Chancellor On Carter Use Of TV

At the annual gathering of NBC-TV network affiliated stations, news anchorman John Chancellor spoke out on his feelings of President Carter's current use of the medium. Chancellor stated that Carter is the first American President that truly can use the TV set as a real image builder, and that he will use it to a great extent to work up to his 1980 re-election bid. He warned that "we will be manipulated by the Administration for the next 3 1/2 years, whether we like it or not..."

## 65 Hour Broadcast

To kick off a major promotion and introduce their new "14 Machine" van to the public, 14RKO/Everett, Washington's night jock Jim Brady and a local waterbed outlet started a "Sleep Show" at a local shopping mall. Brady broadcast live from the van for over 65 hours, non-stop, doing his show live with 2 on-air reports per hour for the remainder of the marathon. The listeners that correctly guessed the number of days, hours and minutes he stayed awake won a king size waterbed. Second place winner scored a color TV set.



## Take The Money And Run

A clear head and steady hands were necessary for this KLWW/Cedar Rapids listener who won the station's "Run For The Money" contest. To be eligible for the drawing for the money run, listeners had to obtain KLWW's bumpersticker and hope to be seen by a sticker spotter. The winner then had one minute and forty-five seconds in the doorway of a bank vault to plan his attack on \$10,000 in currency and coins strewn on the floor of the vault. Total winnings were \$2,359.

KOMA/Oklahoma City PD Tom Birch recently gave R&R the run-down on their multi-phased "Fantasy" contest series. During February and early March, Phase I of the "KOMA Fantasies" solicited thousands of prize suggestions from listeners, ranging from cash to cars and dream vacations. 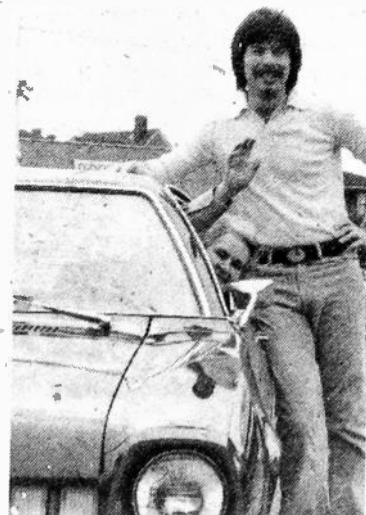
end offered listeners six packs of beer and "Redneck Lobbyist" T-shirts. On the streets of the city, WMEE's "Magic Van" and "Hit

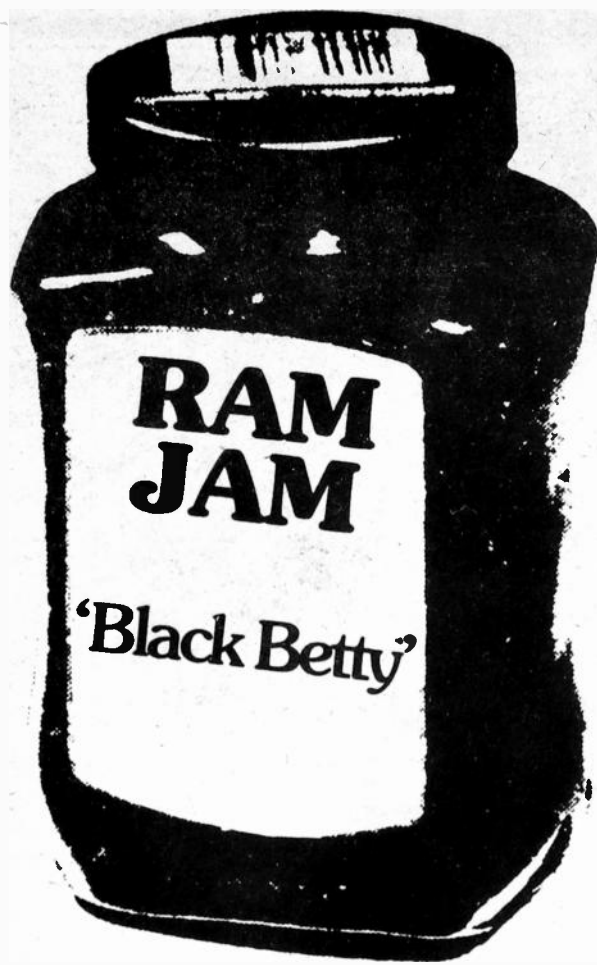

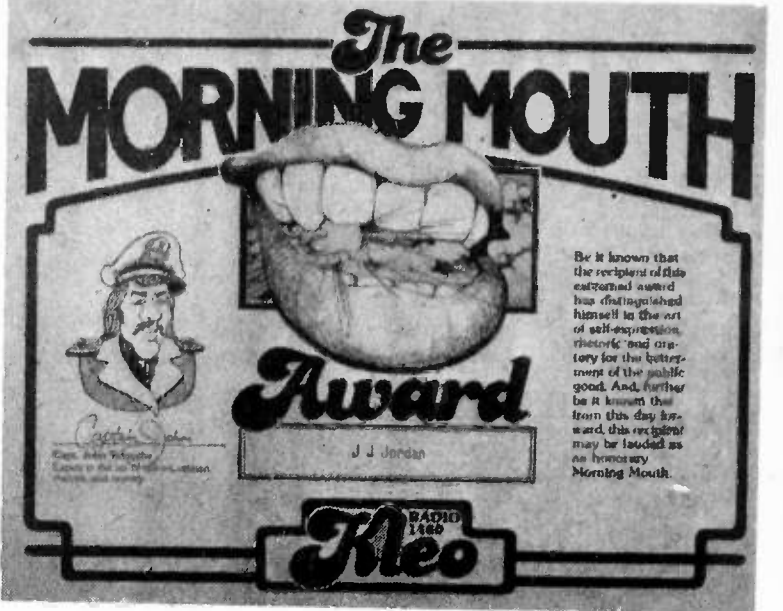

### Short-Term Renewal For Misleading Contests

The FCC has admonished and granted a short-term renewal to WZYQ (Frederick, Md.) for broadcasting misleading information regarding the cash contents of prizes in a station contest. Since the contest promo referred to "winning a prize package of dollars" and "cash jackpot," FCC held that winners could reasonably expect to win cash, which was not in fact the case, so that the contest was false, misleading and deceptive with respect to a material term.

### FCC Stays And Perhaps Withdraws Rule Concerning "Terrain Roughness Factor" In Coverage Calculations

The FCC has stayed until further Order the effective date of its new Rule requiring the use of a Terrain Roughness Factor in predicting FM and TV stations field strength contours. In issuing an indefinite stay past a projected May 1, 1977 effective date, FCC indicated the need for further study of ways to deal with atypical terrain configurations, so that further Rulemaking on the issue (with unknown results) was required.

### FCC Denies Attack On "Happy Talk" News Report

FCC has denied a local Coalition's requested reconsideration of its denial of renewal to WDIA (Memphis) on the basis that the station's news reports ignored local problems and reflected a "Happy Talk" manner. FCC disavowed any proper role in determining a station's News format.

### Chevy Fights Small Car Slump

Small cars from nearly all U.S. automakers are in the midst of a genuine sales slump. All four of **Chevrolet's** compact and sub-compact models have shown overall decreases in sales over the last year, so that company is beefing up their advertising schedules for all of them. Chevette spots are running in 17 of the best small car sales markets, and the soon-to-be-defunct Vega has ads that stress the model's durability. Both Monza and Nova are also getting their slice of the advertising pie, including a campaign for Nova's "Concours" luxury compact. Additionally, larger model sales increases have made Chevrolet increase their ad budgets for full sized Monte Carlo's and Camaro's.

### American Motors' Rebate Ads Questioned

The Detroit consumer affairs department has accused **American Motors Corp.** of deceptive advertising in its campaign for proposed rebates on fuel efficient autos. The consumer group claims that since Congress has not yet passed Carter's energy rebate plan, the ad copy falsely gave the impression that car buyers would obtain the rebate. Under the Consumer Protection Act, advertising of rebates that are contingent on future actions is banned, AMC claims that their advertising stated that the rebate plan was a "proposal," and therefore not misleading.

### Anheuser-Busch's "Light" To Bow

Following the lead of other major brewers, the nation's number one beer maker **Anheuser-Busch** will introduce their "Natural Light" low-calorie beer nationally in June. Natural Light has been test marketed in 25 markets this year, and all tests have been termed "excellent." The national marketing will use heavy radio, print and TV support, although no exact dollar budget has been set. The new beer will be available in bottles, cans and on draft, with distribution set for June 6.

### Grape Puts The Hurt On Spirits

Sales of hard liquor dropped 2.1% in 1976, and the blame has been put on the rising popularity of white wine sales. Rum showed the biggest percentage increase of distilled spirits, up 17% from the year prior. Domestic bourbon and imported Scotch whiskies took the biggest fall, while the number one hard liquor, vodka, rose a slight 2%.

### Get Your Kicks On Highway 55?

The romantic calling of "Route 66" is about to become a thing of the past, at least for part of that notorious highway. Illinois is the first state to drop the Route 66 name, replacing it with Interstate Highway 55. Nostalgia buffs are able to obtain a memento of the highway, the state is selling replicas of the road signs at \$3 each.

### Ups And Downs Of 4 Day Work Week

There are both negatives and positives to the four day work week, according to a study done on companies with that policy. Most found that the reduced work week improved job satisfaction and productivity, but absenteeism from the job and employee turnover wasn't distinctly effected by the plan.

### Phoenix AOR

For approximately 6½ years, there was only one AOR radio station in Phoenix, KDKB-FM-AM. For most of that period, the station was a rather free-form facility enjoying the luxury of exclusivity in regard to the adding and playing of records. The arrival of "Mellow-AOR" KBBC has prompted KDKB to re-evaluate their market posture, but according to Program Director **Hank Cookenboo**, not as much as people might think. Cookenboo told R&R, "We are definitely still an AOR station, we still break artists. However, there is more of a consistency in our 24 hour a day sound than there was before. It's no secret that we've become tighter in the 'adds' department, but it's not a hard-nose situation. Every record is judged individually, some unknown artists like **Bruce Foster**, for example, are being added right out of the box." Cookenboo went on to mention, "We are taking the responsibility not to play our listeners mediocre records."

In regard to any talk generated by KDKB's relatively recent turnover in the PD and MD positions, Cookenboo assures us that all is still quite stable. "Most of the airstaff is the original one. Our newest employee has been here for over three years." There is a current opening for a Music Director to replace **Linda Thompson**. Until one is found, Cookenboo will be handling music chores.

**J.D. Freeman** is Program Director of Phoenix's AOR newcomer KBBC. The station began programming a "Mellow" brand of AOR in late December of last year. The station is consulted by **Tom McKay** of **Windchime Communications**, but does not utilize that company's pre-taped service. All music originates locally and the airstaff is live. The station's current format has yet to receive an Arbitron rating (this book will tell the story), but according to Freeman they've been receiving "great audience reaction." This just completed book and the station's entry into the market was marked by a sizeable billboard campaign. Freeman told R&R, "Other than the outside advertising, we have no on-the-air promotions, no giveaways. We have a low-keyed approach." On the subject of "degrees of softness" his comment was, "We are not that soft. For example, we are playing things like 'Lido Shuffle.' We also play artists like **Ben Sidran**. We play **Waylon Jennings** and **Emmylou Harris** because Country is big in this market." In conclusion, Freeman stated, "We're the best 'Mellow' I've ever heard and I've heard them all."

Phoenix has a third FM AOR-type station, **KIOG**, which began programming a "Soft-Rock" format on January 1st of this year. Both Cookenboo and Freeman consider them to be competition although both agree that the station isn't "really AOR" because many of their selections lean in more of a Pop/Adult direction. Interestingly, as AOR radio grows laterally, as well as vertically, it is beginning to share a common border with Pop/Adult radio as well as Top 40 and the differentiation can be confusing.

**KIOG** Program Director **Barb Nelson** told R&R, "We are more consistently soft than KBBC. They, compared to us, are more underground-progressive. We play the popular, as well as the obscure."

It's amazing how subjective such terms as "popular" and "obscure" are as evidenced by talking to all three of these Program Directors. This, of course, is not unusual and is one of the primary reasons for AOR radio's national diversity.

Phoenix has long been known as a fiercely competitive market, particularly in the area of Top 40 radio. Now, that competition has extended to AOR radio and with the results of this recent Arbitron, but several weeks away, it'll be interesting to see just how it will be shaping up when the listeners have their say.

### Evolution

**AOR comes to Las Vegas:** Lotus Broadcasting, owners of **KENO-AM/Las Vegas**, recently purchased **KTRI** in that city and converted it to **KENO-FM**. Using the logo **K-92**, the station is a brand new "all-purpose" AOR. According to PD **Scott Gentry**, "About the closest thing to AOR radio in this town, until we came, was **KFMS**. They're a Soft-Rocker, but they aren't really AOR because they play many non-AOR artists. This is the first time the city has had this kind of radio and until they get used to it, we'll be playing it safely familiar." The station is in the process of setting up numerous research systems including the card-listener feedback one. The station will be focusing its programming upon the city's residents as opposed to the many transients. **Richard Clear** is Music Director and **Dave Gordon** (formerly **KWFM/Tucson**) is Assistant MD. The station can be reached at (702) 876-1460... **Garrett Lambert** is the new afternoon drive jock on **KXFM/Santa Maria**... **Keith Allen** has resigned the Program Directorship of **KPRI/San Diego**. He can be reached at (714) 224-7786. Until a new PD is named, **Jesse Bullet** will be acting PD. In a related move, **Arlene Berke** has resigned the Music Directorship of **KPRI**. She can be reached at (714) 462-9390... **Judy McNutt**, former Program Director of **KMYR/Albuquerque**, has joined **KAWY/Casper** in the position of Advertising Consultant, sales, and part time air work... **Wolf Schneider** is the new MD of **KKTX/Kilgore, Tx**. Service is needed. (214) 984-2001.

### Timothy Leary Ain't Dead...

...he's alive and well and in AOR radio. **Timothy Leary** since his release from prison in Southern California has teamed up with **KGB/San Diego** air personality (and resident

"cosmos-ologist") **Gabriel Wisdom** for a one hour a week show entitled "The Joyful Wisdom Program." **KGB** has been the pilot station for the program for quite some time now, but the addition of **Leary** as co-host has brought much national attention and the entity is in the beginning stages of coast-to-coast syndication.

**Leary** and **Wisdom** deal with such topics as space-migration, conventional and non-conventional religion, parapsychology, telepathy, the occult, astronomy, science, and various off-beat probings into the miraculous world of consciousness. Well-known Rock personalities as well as notable spokespersons for the aforementioned subjects are interviewed. The program includes some musical selections too.

Thus far, the program, which according to **Wisdom** and **Leary** can be used for a radio station's Public Affairs/Religion requirements, is being carried on California's "Newspace" radio network stations as well as **KGB/San Diego**, **KYA-FM/San Francisco**, and **WIBA-FM/Madison**.

The plan now is to make it available free (on a barter basis) to 50 AOR stations, coast to coast. Interested stations should contact Program Manager **Daniel Gilbertson** at (213) 876-2756.

### Color

**Je Veux Aller A' Montreal...Y'All:** **WCAS/Cambridge** is giving away a trip to Montreal in conjunction with the **Jesse Colin Young** concert there. The station also presented an outdoor concert along Waterfront Park featuring **NRBQ** and local bands.

**WKDF/Nashville** presented the Tennessee State Frisbee Tournament. 2,000 spectators and 250 participants enjoyed a great day in the park. The station also presented a "Ten Most Famous Outlaws" contest. The promotion consisted of on-the-air clues with winning entrants qualifying for a drawing in which the grand winner received 3 minutes to grab all the albums they could from a local record store.

**Beans:** **WGRQ/Buffalo** gave away "50 lbs. of Columbian." Coffee, that is.

**Beatles:** **KMET/Los Angeles** presented an entire day in which 4 **Beatles** cuts were played per hour with a copy of the **Hollywood Bowl** album given away to the correct number caller each time.

**KZOZ/San Luis Obispo** gave away **Marshall Tucker**, **Sea Level**, and **Sons** albums.

**Bikes:** **KRST/Albuquerque** presented the 11th annual "Sandia Crest Bicycle Race" which is a bike run of 40 miles from the bottom to the top of a mountain.

**WKDD/Akron** (the home of **Greg Gillespie**) tied in with the **MCA** recording group **Alexis**. Members of the band along with station staff members have been driving around town in a large mobile-home presenting an audio/visual presentation of the act at local record stores. Albums and T-shirts were given away, too.

**KOME/San Jose** co-sponsored an all night **Marx Brothers** movie marathon on a local TV station. **Supertramp Weekend:** **WAAF/Worcester** gave away the group's albums and featured their music.

**Inner-Station Balling:** **Anaheim's KEZY-AM** (Top 40) Challenged **KEZY-FM** (AOR) to a game of softball. The extravaganza was umpired by the Mayor of Anaheim. In spite of the fact that **KEZY-AM** plays the hits, they obviously didn't get that many because the **FM** gang won by the close score of 50-4.

### Henson Ups Masters/Brings In Littrel

**WLRS/Louisville** General Manager **Louisa Henson** has promoted Program Director **Lee Masters** to the position of Station Manager, effective immediately. **Masters** will continue to direct all station programming operations, but will begin to get involved in all other aspects of the station's management. **Masters** told R&R, "LRS is a family operation. The Hensons are extremely good, moral people and I plan to be with them for a long time to come."

In addition, **Dave Littrel** has been appointed General Sales Manager of **WLRS**. He comes from television station **WDRB/Louisville** (channel 41) where he was an Account Executive.

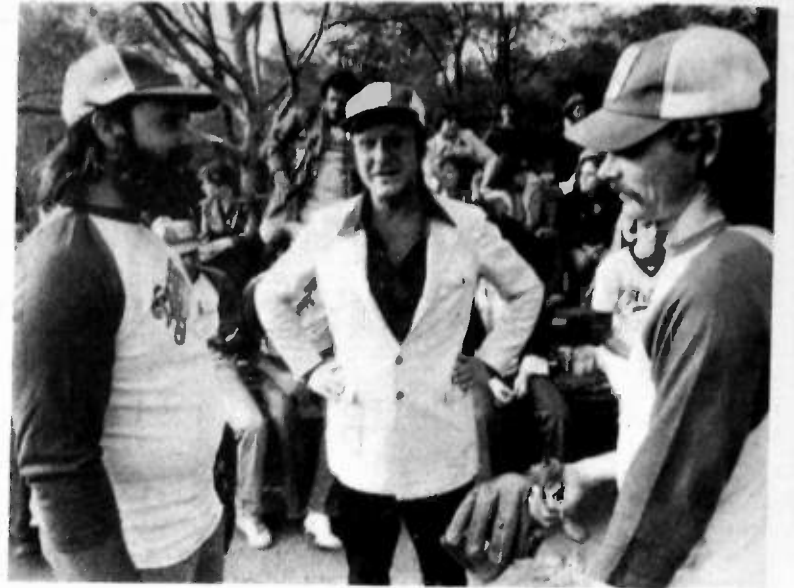

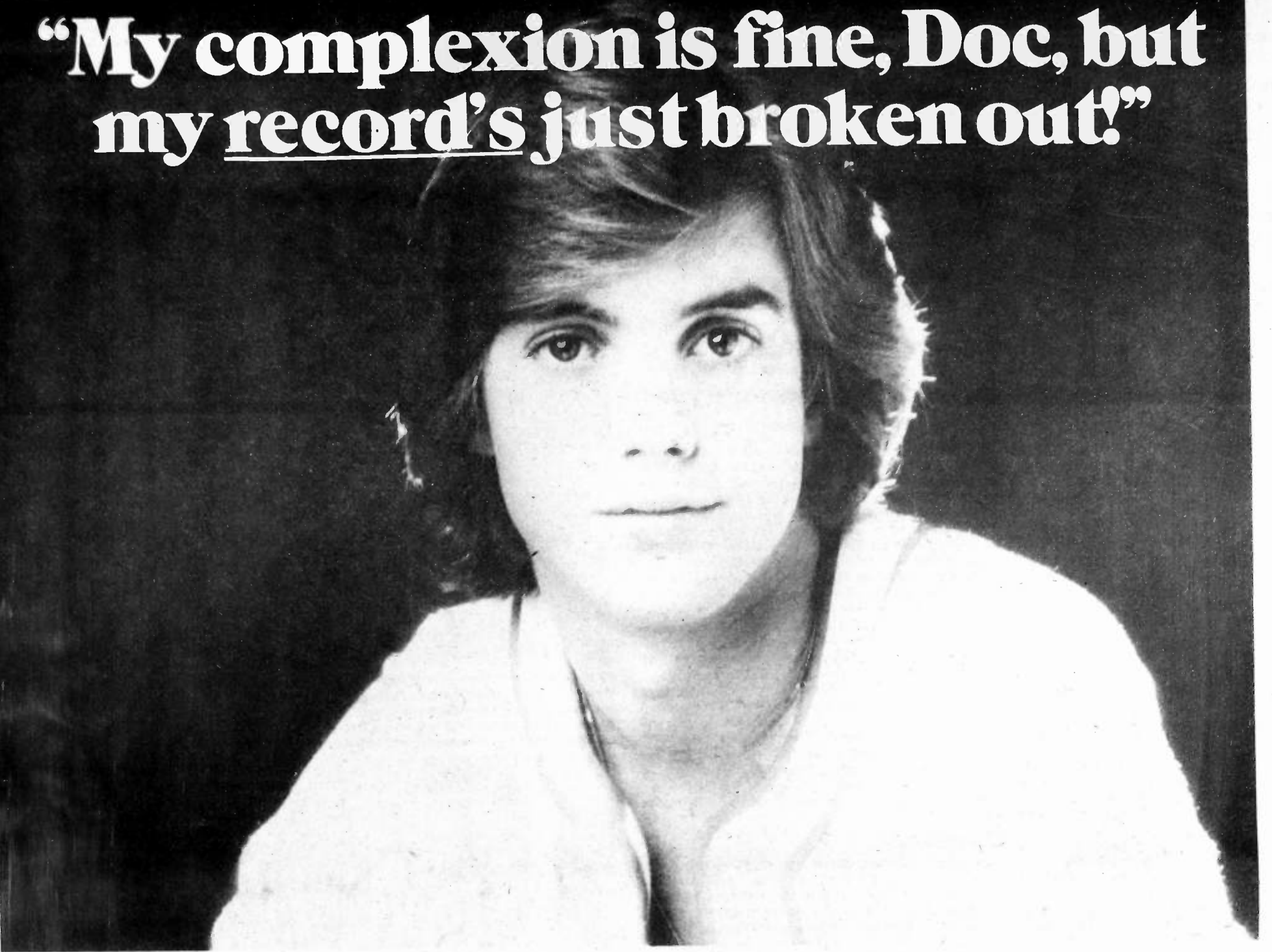

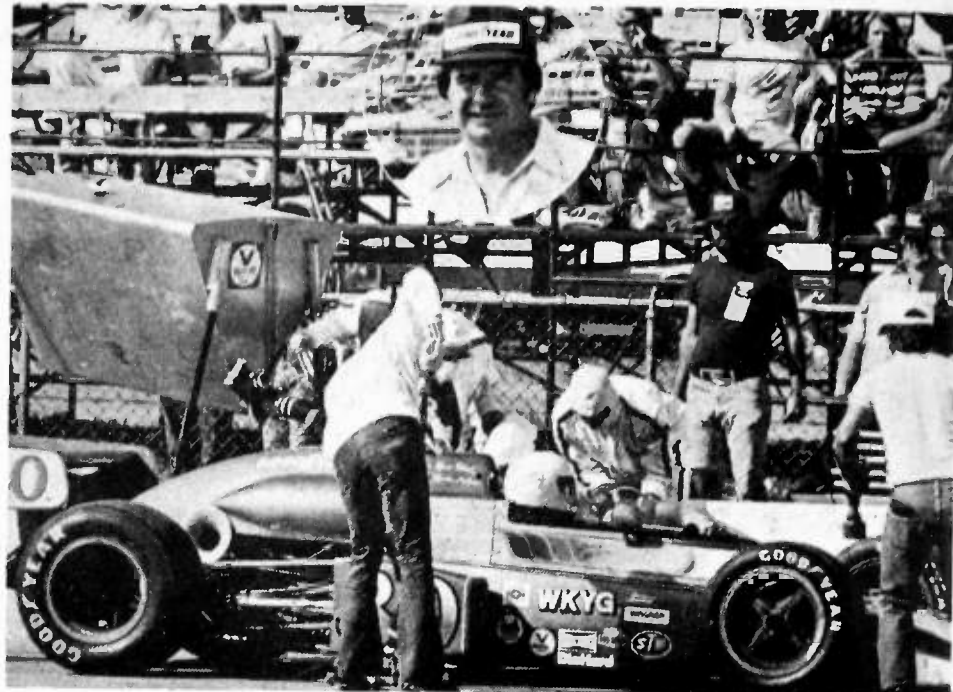
### Promotions
