A reported incident of Arbitron diary tampering in Denver has mushroomed into a major investigation covering almost two years and numerous instances of alleged misconduct involving a number of local stations. Denver District Attorney **Date Tooley**, who is conducting the investigation, described it as involving "felony-level activity," among "various suspects."

FRIDAY, JANUARY 13, 1978

The catalyst for the investigation was apparently a tip to Tooley from a local broadcast figure about diary tampering at one specific station, at which an employee allegedly bought Arbitron diaries from recipients and distorted or filled out the contents. Arbitron was also reported to be investigating diary misconduct in Denver.

From that point, Tooley told R&R, the investigation "broadened

Klein Sentenced To Sixty Days

Former WHBQ Program Director George Klein was sentenced to sixty days in federal prison by a U.S. District Court Judge Friday (1-6) on his conviction for conspiracy to steal Arbitron diaries from the mails. Klein had been convicted on the one conspiracy count by a Memphis jury in December, but was acquitted on three counts of mail fraud.

Klein was reported as visibly shaken as the sentence was handed down, and his 78-year-old mother rushed before the bench to plead with the judge, "Have mercy on my son!" Klein announced later that he would appeal the conviction. He remains free on his own recognizance and is not required to begin serving his sentence until all appeal options are exhausted.

FCC Questions New Mexico Stations' License Renewals

The FCC will hold hearings on the license renewal applications of E. Boyd Whitney, owner of KRZE and KRAZ-FM/Farmington, New Mexico, citing "serious questions as to Whitney's qualifications to remain a Commission licensee" which rendered the Commission "unable to find that a grant of renewal would serve the public interest." Among the questions listed were inquiries regarding alleged incidents involving threats "not to play the records of artists whose agents booked them with promoters other than the licensee;" misrepresentations and a lack of "candor" in connection with the sale of air time to other area entertainment promoters; and problems regarding disc jockey on-air ad libs and failure to log commercials accurately. The FCC added that it would determine

The FCC originally cited seven "patently offensive" words in the Carlin routine, titled "Seven Dirty Words" and referring to terms Carlin believed "you couldn't say on the public...airwaves." The Commission then issued a ban against the broadcasting of words depicting sexual or excretory activities and organs.

Major Market PD Migration Begins

Sebastian, Driscoll, Fox, Garcia, Thomas, Peterson, Thomson In Changes

A number of Program Director changes in major markets transpired recently, in a seasonal pattern that often coincides with the release of the latest Arbitron ratings. At KHJ/Los Angeles, following the November departure of Operations Director Michael Spears, John Sebastian has been appointed Program Director. Sebastian had been Program Director of KDWB-AM-FM/Minneapolis for some time, and is well-known in the industry as an early proponent of passive research techniques.

Driscoll Replaces Fox At TEN-Q

John M. Driscoll, morning man at TEN-Q/Los Angeles, has been appointed Program Director of the station, following the departure of Jimi Fox for "personal career" reasons. Driscoll, who will continue his morning show, was formerly Program Director at WCFL/Chicago during its Top 40 days, and also served as PD at WMYQ/Miami.

Thomas Interim PD At 99X As Garcia Exits

99X/New York morning man Jay Thomas has been appointed Program Director on an interim basis. after PD Bill Garcia exited. Vice President/General Manager Erica Farber told R&R: "I'm going to take my time in searching for just the right programmer."

Peterson Resigns From KCBQ

Gerry Peterson, Program Director at KCBQ/San Diego, has resigned that position. No replacement has been named as yet, with Bartell **Broadcasting** National Program Director Charlie Lake programming the station for the present time. Peterson told R&R that he

Justice Dept. Brief Holds Court Cross-Ownership Ruling Went Too Far

The Justice Department, in a brief filed with the Supreme Court, maintained that the U.S. Court Of Appeaks' decision last March ordering divestiture of most newspaperbroadcast same-market crossownerships went too far in overturning an FCC ruling. The Department, which will present oral arguments to the Supreme Court Monday (1-16), asked for a reversal of the decision.

The FCC had originally ruled that future cross-ownerships would be banned while existing combinations for the most part need not be divested. The Justice Department agreed that the FCC was in error with that ruling, but stated that the Appeals Court decision, which called for the divestiture of all cross-ownerships in the same

Lipson Leaves KZEW

Ira Lipson, Operations Manager of KZEW/Dallas for the past five years, has resigned the position over what station owners Belo Broadcasting apparently viewed as a conflict of interests situation. Lipson, in addition to his duties at AOR-formatted KZEW, had been consulting KATT/Oklahoma City (also an AOR station) since its inception slightly more than a year ago.

KZEW Station Manager Iven Breiker told R&R: "Ira has resigned because of a policy set up by Mike Shapiro, President of Belo Broadcasting, which states that no employee shall hold any outside con sultancies. Ira was given the opportunity to resign his consultancy of KATT and he declined. Also at issue was a four-week leave of absence which Ira had requested." Braiker added that John Tyler, who recently became acting General Manager of KLIF/Dallas, assumed the ownership of KATT three weeks ago, a situation which Belo apparently considered a potential conflict of interests for Lipson. A "very big" bolt of lightning scored a "direct hit" on KFI/Los Angeles' transmitter early Tuesday (1-10) morning, forcing the station off the air for most of the day. According to Program Director John Rook, the multi-volt bolt "totally burned out everything," including the station's back-up generator. As for the state of the transmitter, Rook said it was "not

Two important station transactions took place last week, as K100/Los Angeles and WWSH-FM/ Philadelphia were sold. Cosmic Comsold K100 (KIQQ-FM), to Outlet Co. of Providence, RI for \$4.5 million. The sale is subject to a definitive agreement and FCC approval. Outlet Broadcast Division President David Henderson stated that the company had no plans to change the station's Top 40 format.

Cax Broadcasting Corporation purchased WWSH for \$4.2 million from United Artists Broadcasting. The acquisition was completed in New York last week.

Radio On The Rise

Radio appears to be on a prosperous upward trend, according to forecasts and figures from a number of sources. A survey of favorite leisure activities among Americans, conducted by the Commerce Department and printed in U.S. News & World Report, shows impressive longterm gains for radio. In 1960 radio did not even show up in the poll, while in 1966 it scored a 2% rating as favorite leisure activity; in 1974, 5% listed radio as their favorite, placing the medium fairly close to movies, which also registered strong gains. Television remained the big winner, but with a stabilized figure of 46%. More significant for radio, however, is a Report figure appearing in a related article on "Radio's Renaissance" (U.S. News & World Report, January 16)-the average listener hears radio almost 3 1/2 hours a day, compared to 3 3/4 hours daily for TV.

Concurrently, various financial predictions for the radio industry in 1978 have been issued, with a singularly rosy outlook in common, Blair Radio, a New York rep firm, forecasts an 8-10% increase in national radio spot revenues for 1978, coming on top of an estimated 11-12% gain in 1977. RAB President Miles David predicts that 1978 will be "the third straight year in which total radio advertiser expenditures increased by more than 10%." And the Commerce Department predicts a 9% rise in radio revenues to \$2.4 billion for 1978. One sour note: the government organization believes that rising radio costs will offset the revenue gain, causing a 7% drop in pre-tax income—but it should be remembered that 1978 follows an exceptionally prolitable year for radio. All in all, the outlook seems bright.

Sentry Purchases Eau Claire Stations

Sentry Broadcasting has purchased WBIZ-AM-FM/Eau Claire. Wisconsin from owners Howard G. Bill and Lou Kassera for an unspecified price. The FCC has approved the sale. Wayne Phillips has been appointed General Manager of the stations, which are currently Pop/Adult on the AM and Oldies-slanted on the FM. Sentry also operates WRJN/Racine, Wisconsin, and through its subsidiary, Stevens Point Broadcasting, operates WSPT/WXYQ in that city.

BBC Gives Viewers Reading Options

Hot on the heels of Warner Cable's viewer-feedback "Q" TV system (R&R 12-16), the BBC has introduced another viewer-option technological TV innovation, the "Teletext Magazine." A small attachment to the TV set allows viewers to punch buttons and request specific

information in a magazine format, including latest news, weather, stock quotations, and even recipes. The information is then printed out on the TV screen, with only one drawback so far: information on any given subject must go out in sequence, meaning that viewers are sometimes forced to watch a considerable amount of irrelevant data before getting to the information in which they're actually interested. The Teletext Magazine attachments sell for several hundred dollars, but the BBC claims 50,000 customers and predicts a decrease in price as the market expands. And the communications industry takes another step toward the future.

NAB Praises, Instructs FCC

The FCC, starting the New Year, received both compliments and reminders from its old acquaintance the NAB recently The praise was for an FCC proposal for a dual radio license structure, which would establish separate licenses for those actively involved in servicing, installing, and maintaining transmitter equipment, as opposed to persons involved in the routine operation of a station. The NAB applauded the idea, but warned that present testing procedures should be tightened up. The organization also registered its opposition to any plan that would not grandfather the rights of present first-class license holders.

At the same time, NAB President Vincent Wasilewski sent a letter to FCC Chairman Charles Ferris outlining a number of issues on which the NAB would like prompt action from the Commission. Among those were refunds of fees to stations ordered by the Court of Appeals in 1975, a radio allocations policy for the 1979 World Administrative Radio Conference, and, once again, the NAB's recommendation for tax credits to broadcasters selling their properties to minority buyers. The letter called these matters "ripe for action."

John Crichton, 4A President, Dies

John Crichton. President of the American Association of Advertising Agencies (4A) for almost 16 years, died of a heart attack at his desk December 27. He was 58. Crichton, a former editor of the advertising trade publication Advertising Age, was credited with major contributions to the growth of the industry, as well as for helping to steer advertising toward a more sympathetic attitude towards creating job opportunities for young people and minorities. Crichton is survived by his wife and four children.

Aubrey Singer To Head BBC Radio

Aubrey Singer has been appointed Managing Director of the British Broadcasting Corporation's Radio Division. Singer was most recently head of the BBC's second TV channel, and has been involved with BBC-TV for some 27 years. In June he will take charge of the BBC's four national radio networks and 20 local AM stations, still the most important force in British radio broadcasting

NAB Names Sheehan VP, Public Affairs

Shaun Sheehan has been appointed Vice President of Public Affairs for the National Association of Broadcasters. He was Vice President of Daniel Edelman Inc. a Washington D.C.based public relations company.

Dot Identity Dissolved By ABC

ABC Records' Country label, ABC/Dot, will be incorporated into the parent label's identity, with all future Country records appearing on ABC Records. ABC President Steve Diener added that ABC/Dot President Jim Fogelsong will assume the title of President of ABC Records, Nashville Division. Diener cited ABC's "aim to become one strong cohesive company" as a reason for the change. Dot Records had been in existence since the early 50's as an independent, mostly Pop-oriented label, before becoming part of Gulf/Western's Paramount operation at the end of the 60's and shifting toward Country. ABC bought out Dot and Paramount in 1974.

Elvis National Holiday Sought

The Elvis Petition organization hopes to gather enough signatures nationwide to demonstrate to Congress that a substantial number of citizens would like to see Elvis Presley's birthday, January 8, declared a national holiday. The group, based in Maryland, has received air time from WCBM/Owings Mills in that state, and hopes to enlist stations around the nation in the cause. Music Awards Season Winds Up

A television season featuring much more music awards presentations wraps up with two of the bigger shows, the American Music Awards and the NARAS Grammy Awards. The A.M.A. show airs on ABC Monday January 16, with the Dick Clark production starring Glen Campbell. Natalie Cole and David Soul as cohost/performers. Also performing are the Commodores, Andy Gibb, Kiss and Loretta Lynn...The Grammys celebrate their 20th anniversary February 23 (Thursday) on CBS. Nominations in all categories have just been selected, with further announcements to follow.

SIGNED, SEALED, DELIVERED—Johnny Carson has signed a new agreement with NBC for the Tonight Show, arranging his schedule so that he'll actually host the late-night institution even less frequently than at present. Some weeks Carson will host four days, others three days, with "The Best Of Carson" featured on the three-day weeks and a guest host sitting in every Monday...Gerald Ford's deal with NBC has been amended; the former President was originally set for a commentator-type role, but will now present a series of memoir programs as NBC specials. Two to four specials before 1980 are specified in the contract...Still on NBC, an exceptionally busy network at the moment, Steve Martin has been signed to an exclusive longterm specials deal, calling for one special this season and another during the 1978-79 season...Barry Manilow has a busy TV schedule, having completed "Variety 77" for CBS, with an "American Music Awards" appearance, a spot on ABC's Silver Anniversary Celebration February 5, and his second special, cleverly titled "The Second Barry Manilow Special," (ABC, February 24) all ahead of him...And finally, the Doobie Brothers star in a special two-part episode of ABC's "What's Happening" in late February.

Football Gives CBS Big Ratings Gains, Victory

CBS piled up enough football ratings yardage to take the week ending January 1 for its first victory of the season. Only games which lasted into prime time were counted, and even those inclusions were disputed by the other networks, but even without football, CBS would have taken the week. Counting the Los Angeles/Minnesota and Dallas/Minnesota contests, CBS scored a 20.7 rating to ABC's 18.6 and NBC's 15.5 (NBC's AFC playoff telecasts did not extend into prime time).

The Dallas/Minnesota NFL championship match topped all comers with a 36 rating. Following were 2) "Laverne & Shirley" (ABC) 3) "Happy Days" (ABC) 4) Dallas/Minnesota postgame show (CBS) 5) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 6) Los Angeles/Minnesota game 7) "Three's Company" (ABC) 8) "Alice" (CBS) 9) "One Day At A Time" (CBS) and 10) "Barney Miller" (ABC). CBS has now entrenched itself fairly securely as the number two network for this season, though still far behind ABC.

Arbitron's estimates for the week ending December 30 showed some unusual results. New York's rankings began in a commonplace enough fashion, with "Laverne & Shirley" and "Happy Days" on top. 3) was "What's Happening" (ABC) 4) "Three's Company" 5) a tie between "Welcome Back Kotter" (ABC), "Barney Miller" (ABC), and in a bit of a surprise, NBC's "Quincy" 8) "Soap" (ABC) and 9) a tie between ABC's "Carter Country" and NBC's "Rocklord Files," neither of which have been distinguished by frequent Top 10 appearances. CBS was shut out in New York.

CBS was also shut out in Los Angeles, as ABC dominated the market. "Laverne & Shirley," "Happy Days," and "Three's Company" performed their familiar 1-2-3 parlay. 4) was "Barney Miller" and "Soap" tied, for two more ABC triumphs. Then came 6) a baffling tie between "CHiPs" (NBC) and "Lucan" (ABC), the latter a special and the former a lethargic-rated series in the past. 8) featured a four-way tie between the resurgent "Quincy," "Kotter," "What's Happening," and NBC's AFC playoff (which took place in the morning, but Arbitron counts such contests).



Mel Brooks Film Music On E/A; Promotion By Radio

Met Brooks has signed with Elektra/Asylum Records for the release of a double album, one record of which will contain the music to his current film "High Anxiety," the other featuring musical excerpts from his past movies. Brooks and E/A Chairman of the Board Joe Smith will collaborate on an open-end radio ad campaign. Arriving at E/A headquarters to sign the pact, Brooks found every office record player in the building blaring the theme from "High Anxiety," as arranged painstakingly by Smith. Above, Brooks and Smith discuss the comic film maker's plans for a follow-up album of "deskotheque" music.

The Eyes Of Taxes Are Upon You

Some dates and reminders for income tax planning (use as they apply to your case):

January 16: Final installment of estimated 1977 tax should be paid. This installment can be skipped if 1977 return is filed and paid by January 31.

January 31: Employees should receive their W-2 forms showing wages paid and withheld taxes in 1977.

April 17: 1977 income tax returns should be filed and tax due paid. Those with individual retirement savings programs should include form 5329 with returns.

April 17: Declarations of estimated income tax for 1978 should be filed, with at least 25% of the estimated tax paid second installment due June 15, third is September 15.



Happy New Year and welcome to another twelve months in the never ending drama of radio. As the Arbitrons come in, the ritual migration of personalities begins. Why is it that Top 40, as a format, seems to be so much more "volatile" than the other formats? The documented stories of Program Director and air personality mortality have to give you pause to wonder.

Part of the problem may be "the image" that Top 40 projects to those who sell it (salesmen) and those who buy it (advertisers and agencies). Of all the formats Top 40 presents the fuzziest image. Gone are the days of the "Silver Dollar Survey," "Boss Jocks" and "Theme Songs," but what has evolved in their place is difficult to define clearly. There are many variations on the so-called "Top 40 format," as a quick dial twist in any major market will graphically demonstrate. So the general image of the format is somewhat unclear. What Top 40 means to you may differ from what Top 40 means to the people who are "on the street" representing your call letters, namely your sales people. And that is really where the image clarification must begin. As the Program Director

for a Top 40 station it is imperative for you to clarify the direction of your station with those who guarantee its financial well being...the sales staff and management. It's important to sit down and agree on the definition of the station and further make certain that all parties are clear in their understanding of that definition. It is also important to establish a realistic time frame for completion of that definition, Can what you propose be accomplished in one book, two, or will it take longer? Do all concerned parties agree and understand this?

With a few simple items like those understood by you and your superiors perhaps 1978 can be a year of image clarification for Top 40 in general and all of us specifically Then when the next major Arbitron results arrive the moving companies will have a little less to do. What do you think? Let me know!

I received a copy of a letter from WXKX/Pittsburgh Program Director Bobby Christian regarding the performance royalty legislation that has been issued by the United States Copyright Office. The original letter was sent to Ms. Barbara Ringer, the Registrar of Copyrights in Washington D.C. and it contains some very important points and questions we should all be aware of, since this bill relates directly to the revenues of radio stations everywhere

'Dear Ms. Ringer

I have read with much interest and concern the U.S. Copyright Office report on HR 6063, the performance royalty legislation. Several important questions were left unanswered or unaddressed by your report...

Who would be responsible for monitoring the thousands of stations nationwide on an ongoing basis to determine airplay and frequency?.

On what basis would the amount per song be determined?

Would all songs earn the same amount, or would a longer song which takes up more time (and probably required more work on the part of the performer) earn a higher rate than a shorter song?..

Your report concludes that stations "Can and do pass along costs to their advertisers without loss of business and revenues." Does it not follow that advertisers will also pass these cost increases along to their customers, meaning that the public will wind up paying the bill without receiving any improvement in the quality of radio or music in return? And does it not follow that, when the public in general and advertisers in particular are charged more without getting more, business and revenues must suffer as a direct result?..

The letter concludes, "Wouldn't the overall effect be of insignificant benefit to few at a significant cost to many?" This is a sensitive issue to broadcasters, artists and record companies alike. Thanks to Bobby Christian for sharing his thoughts on HR 6063. He brings up some very interesting points

therefore carrying the FCC "beyond protection of the public interest into the forbidden realm of censorship." The Court added that it was not deciding "the perplexing question of whether the FCC, because of the unique characteristics of radio and television, may prohibit nonobscene speech or speech that would otherwise be constitutionally protected." The Federal Communications Act permits the Commission to act against stations airing "obscene, indecent or protane language," but the Act tails to define those terms and also torbids FCC censorship.

The FCC, citing the "pervasive and intrusive" nature of broadcasting, telt that "indecent" should be defined more broadly than "obscene " WBAL a **Pacifica** station, defended its broadcast of the Carlin monologue as part of a serious discussion of attitudes toward language, and maintained that the FCC definition of indecent was far too broad and it carried out to the letter would ban the airing of works by **Shaksipears**, **Hemingway**, and sections of the **Bbis**.

He said he would not be acquainted with the specific incidents on which the Commission based its questions until the hearing itself, which, he added, could be months away. Whitney stated that he had "no idea" what the Commission "was talking about," and added: "It's hard after 17 years in radio in Farmington to hear. that you're not operating in the public interest.

KERN Clarifies Bakersfield Wind Storm Situation

Deer R&R:

I felt it very important to correct something in your headline erticle of December 23rd ("Bakersfield Stations Blown Off Air"). The statement was made that station KAFY was the only station on the eir "most of the day." In fact we were not only on the eir all day, but never hed to resort to generator power, es did KAFY.

I am making this known to you because of the efforts of our news department during that storm. Harold Robinson, News Director, was on the air for 14 hours providing pertinent information on road and business closures et 10-minute intervals He was then relieved by the News Director from KLYD Radio. Together these two worked off and on around the-clock. We never left the air. More then just "station pride," I was upset at the way the article hurt these two gentlemen, considering their efforts above and beyond routine duties.

I thoroughly enjoy your newspaper and understand the implications with checking accuracy on every gainst the four Zeppelin figures resulted, which will be tried in Oakland shortly, and the three Graham employees, Jim Matzourkia, Jim Downey, and Bob Barsotti, sued for \$2 million.

In the latest developments, the three plaintiffs were apparently offered a \$37,500 out-of-court settlement by the group and management to which they agreed. Then Grant's organization stipulated further terms, as detailed in a letter from Grant to the plaintiffs published in the Chronicle. Each plaintiff would receive \$500 cash, with the remaining \$36,000 held in a "trust account." In exchange, they were to sign a letter stating in part: "We have now had an opportunity to reflect upon the occurrences...We have also had the benefit of being informed about your side of the matter and now have information that was not known to us at the time...As we now think back upon the events of the day and its high level of confusion, we cannot now state with certainty that the events occurred as previously stated by us..." The letter, in addition to declaring, effectively, that the original altercation did not take place, also contained a section which had the plaintiffs stating that they "deeply regret the entire episode" and hoping that it would not deter the group from returning to San Francisco.

Bill Graham commented to a Daily Variety reporter that the Zeppelin action was "vile...beyond my belief" and characterized "the kind of intimidation that has worked for them for years." Further developments are expected.





The Planet is a syndicated radio feature that has been heard for the past three months on AOR and other 18-to35 oriented stations in approximately 150 markets. The show is produced by the same creative team who did the Daily Planet for 14 months, but now we've evolved and grown.

Highlights from in-depth, informal interviews are edited into short, tight monologues, then produced with music—both lines from songs and appropriate instrumental beds. The feature comes on more like an album cut than a news interview. Each feature is four minutes in length and our announcer Norman Davis is heard only in the first 30 seconds, setting the listener up for the guest who is to follow.

Twelve different intriguing personalities are featured each week on the Planet, and about a third are music related. In the course of a week you may hear shows as varied as Randy Newman on Southerners and short people, George Carlin on why he still has faith in America, Bette Midler on art versus show business, bestselling author Jessica Mitford on what it was like being a communist in the Fifties, spiritual teacher Baba Ram Dass on politicians and their attachment to power and the women who taught Buddhist monks how to tap dance. Other guests of the Planet in the last three months have included Frank Zappa, Huey Néwton, Phoebe Snow, Robert Ringer, Bev Bevan, Bob Welch, Daniel Schorr, John McLaughlin, Harold Robbins, Betty Friedan, Martin Mull, Queen, Gahan Wilson, Paul Krassner, Peter Allen and Billy Joel.

Most stations log us as "news," some as "other," and we now indicate on our weekly lead-sheet those features with clearly public affairs content. The Planet is available exclusively to one station in each market on a barter basis. National spots are supplied under separate cover, giving stations the choice of either airing spots within the show or run of schedule (ROS).




Chart Summary







Monte McBride now does the evening shift...Duke Hamilton (formerly Duke Anthony, from KXLR/Little Rock) is the new MD at WUBE/Cincinnati...Shelley Harper has been promoted from Programming Assistant to Promotion Director...Congratulations to KRAM/Las Vegas General Manager Bob Jackson on being selected Disc Jockey of the Year by the Las Vegas Entertainment Awards...Also, our best wishes to Ed Chandler and his new bride, Francine, who were married New Year's Eve in San Diego. Observations

It was forbidden, within the memories of many of us, for an artist to perform a song on the Grand Ole Opry which mentioned beer or any indulgence of like kind. There were many songs about cocaine during the twenties and thirties but they were "underground" ditties, never performed in public and seldom recorded. Hank Thompson included "Cocaine Blues" in an early sixties album but the track was never played on the air. Cash summoned a chorus of protests from Country programmers for the inclusion of "Cocaine Blues" in his "Folsom Prison" album ten years ago because the song eliminated unedited presentation of the album on-air. In the mid-sixties, "Puff, The Magic Dragon" was banned by some stations because it was rumored that Off On You" makes open reference to "weed, cocaine, pills and whiskey" (albeit, the relinquishment of same) and is being aired by an increasing number of Country stations. Kristofferson opened the lyrical door to sexual reference ("Help Me Make It Through The Night") in '70. Will Willie and Waylon's efforts open the door to unveiled reference to dope in Country lyrics now??






