Taking a giant jump from fourth to first place in the market is **KBPI** (A) which was recently purchased by **RKO**. The station has been showing a steady growth trend for several years. KBPI moved 6.8 to 10.0. KOA (PA) also did well 7.4 to 9.8, KHOW (PA) 7.7 to 7.3. Atlanta WSB Incurs Big Drop Atlanta Turning To FM Country WPLO Moves Into Top 5

This survey period may be remembered as the one that flipped the market. If the trend continues, FM will take over in Atlanta. Four of the top six stations are FM, and for the first time, an AM station only leads an FM by a bit under 3 shares. WSB (PA), for years the giant, with 20 plus shares, fell to 13.3 from 20.9. Listeners were lost in all dayparts. WOXI-AM (R) dropped 5.9 to 4.4, as the Southern Rocker hit its lowest low. WOXI-FM (R), which is programmed by Don Benson in direct competition, jumped 6.3 to 7.3. WZGC (293) (R) a bit off their best book 12.4 to 10.7, but still second in the (Continued on page 28)

Controversy Expected: FCC Sets New Fee Refund Plans

The FCC has set in motion plans to refund fees collected from the public and the broadcasting industry from 1970 to 1976, but a new interpretation of the amount to be returned may stir further controversy. In 1976 the U.S. Court of Appeals ruled that the FCC's previous fee schedules were unlawful, at which time the Commission suspended its fee schedule operation. The understanding of a significant part of the broadcast industry was that the FCC would then refund all the money it had collected during the six-year period. However, last week the FCC di-

rected its staff to develop a new fee schedule, as well as to estimate the amount that it could have imposed from 1970-1976, with the intention of paying back the difference between the estimate and the total amount actually collected, obviously a drastically smaller amount. Communications law sources indicated that the FCC's decision to develop a new fee schedule could encounter opposition from court actions.

The FCC also announced that it would require additional funds and staff to develop and compute the new fee systems, with the necessity of actually acquiring such funds regarded as likely to delay repayment further. In addition, approximately 10.5 million licensees of the 11 million eligible for refunds are citizen's band operators who originally paid \$20 fees. The FCC said a separate organization would have to supervise those small-amount refunds. The refund issue has been a source of much litigation, and the forecast is for more of the same becoming likely, and a date for the actual refunds (May 1978 is the FCC's target date) being quite uncertain.

Three Major Market PD Changes

Garcia Appointed **KNUS PD**

Bill Garcia has been appointed Program Director at KNUS/Dallas. Station Vice President/General Manager Bart McLendon told R&R: "We feel real fortunate to have him. We polled a number of Program Directors and his name was far and away the most frequently brought up as among the finest Program Directors in the country." McLendon, commenting on KNUS' recent moves away from a strict Top 40 format, added "If I thought Bill's only talent was in Top 40 radio I never would have hired him. It's possible that we might go back in that direction but it's not probable. He's a man with enough talent to take us anywhere we want to go in the contemporary market." Garcia comes to KNUS

PD Position

Jim Harper resigned as Program Director of WDRQ/Detroit to accept the morning man position at WNIC-FM in the same city. Harper, who had not been on the air for the last six months at WDRQ, commented to R&R about his return: "I feel pretty good about it. It's always been a lot of fun for me to go on the air. I'll be able to do a lot of things with a free hand. The opportunities over there," he continued, "for growth in programming just seem immense." Harper said his departure from WDRQ was "mostly based on an inability to get local control. which I thought was necessary to he competitive here in town, es-

pecially against people like WNIC." WNIC-FM (FM100) is a "Soft-Rock" station with what Harper termed the "flexibility" of an AOR approach. No replacement for Harpper at WDRQ has been named.

Brown Exits WOKY

Jim Brown, Program Director at WOKY/Milwaukee, has been "asked to leave" the Top 40 station. Vice President/General Manager William S. Jaeger told R&R: "Jim And I came to an agreement that he would leave the station." WOKY was the top-rated Top 40 station in the city in the last Arbitron book, with an increase in ratings, but still trailed two AM Pop/ Adult outlets, WTMJ and WISN. On the topic of a replacement for Brown, Jaeger said, "We haven't anyone in mind ... We have not hired anyone at this moment.





In other arguments, the FCC defended its original actions banning only future cross-ownership situations, while Deputy Solicitor General Lawrence Wallace maintained that the Appeals Court overruling of the FCC went too far in ordering widespread divestitures. Communications attorney Charles Firestone, representing citizen's groups, asked the Court to uphold the Appeals Court decision.

CMA Holds Board Meeting In Acapulco

Blue skies and warm temperatures in Acapulco, Mexico, greeted the 1978 Country Music Association's officers and Board of Directors at their first quarterly meeting.

As the CMA formulated plans for the new year, plans for the CMA's 20th anniversary this year were of prime importance. Committees were selected and met on January 9, with the actual board meeting being held the following twodays.

Among the business covered at the meeting was the review and approval of the 1978 budget. Plans for CMA's Fan Fair 1978 and proposed changes in the annual Talent Buyers Seminar were discussed, as well as plans for the annual banquet and awards show. Denver Industry Figures Go Before Grand Jury

A number of Denver area broadcasting figures, including the former secretary of KHOW Program Manager Harold Moore, appeared before a Grand Jury Thursday (1-19) as part of District Attorney Dele Tooley's investigation into reported Arbitron diary tampering (R&R 1-13). Several Denver stations and individuals are under investigation as the case continues to build to substantial proportions.

Fan Fair.

It was announced that in May of 1978 the U.S. Postal Service will issue a Jimmie Rodgers commemorative stamp. This will be the first time a Country artist/composer has been so honored. The CMA will participate in the event to be held in Mississippi.

The CMA's audio-visual presentations have now been completed and are ready for use. They are geared toward three areas of the industry, including the radio and record industries. They have been shown at various regional meetings in the past month. The Country Radio presentation will be previewed in Dallas during the Country session of this year's R&R Convention 78 in six weeks' time. The record merchandisers' presentation will be seen at the NARM Convention in New Orleans, March 18-22. Other groups interested in using the presentations should contact the CMA in Nashville.

The date of the 1978 CMA Awards Show is tentatively set for October 16. This year's banquet will be held once again in Nashville's Municipal Auditorium on Friday, October 20.

R&R's Country Editor, Jim Duncan, who is Chairman of the CMA's Radio Committee for 1978, reported to the board on plans to consider updating the CMA's Broadcasting Kit.



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Complaints To FCC Drop Sharply

The listening public seemed to be in a more peaceful frame of mind in November, as the FCC's Broadcast Bureau reports that complaints received dropped from 7931 in October to 4054, slightly more than half the previous month's total. Other comments and inquiries were up over 25% over the same period.

Public, Media Differ On News Coverage Desires

A Louis Harris poll covering a cross-section of the public as well as a group of newspaper and broadcast news editors and reporters revealed substantial discrepancies in the attitudes of the two groups toward the news. The professionals felt that only 34% of the public would be strongly interested in hard national news, whereas 60% of the public sample said they were. The same general pattern showed up in most other hard news areas. For international news, 41% of the public expressed a strong interest compared to a 5% guess from the news media. The state news figures were 62% vs. a 27% estimate, energy news was 57% to 35%, government and political news 42% to 13%, science news 31% to 7%, and business/ financial news was 26% to 4%. Local news was, as predicted by the media participants, the greatest interest of the public, with 74% of that group expressing a strong interest compared to an 88% estimate from the news people. But the news group overestimated the public's appetite for sports and entertainment/cultural news; they guessed 75% for sports while only 35% of the public sample admitted being very interested, while just 29% of the public went for entertainment news as opposed to a 45% estimate from the media personnel. In conclusion it appears that either a lot of people are claiming a much greater interest in hard news than they really maintain, or else the news media have badly misgauged the public's interest in hard news vs. lighter topics.



Album-Oriented Television?

AOR comes to television when WNBC-TV/New York unveils a new twice-weekly music program called "Album Tracks" February 1. The show, co-hosted by WNBC-AM Program Director Bob Pittman (who also serves as Executive Producer) and WNBC air personality Lee Masters. follows "Midnight Special" on Friday nights and "Saturday Night Live" the following evening. Content includes details of upcoming album releases, artist profiles, and the listing of the top five albums across the nation in both sales (as determined by the Record World charts) and airplay (from R&R's Album Airplay/40). Pittman told R&R: "We will be approaching music from a serious angle. It will be like a news show that deals with music exclusively. It's sort of AOT-Album-Oriented Television."

Cadillac Finds Fountain Of Youth

Cadillac will concentrate much of its advertising on its newly-discovered "youth market," otherwise known at the company as the "young Cadillac couple." Cadillac sees a growing number of working couples in their 30's making \$40-50,000 as prime prospects for the car, and will promote Cadillacs with the theme "Haven't you promised yourself a Cadillac long enough?" Radio ads will also play a part in Cadillac's first quarter 1978 advertising campaigns

Warner Lambert Renews Star Trak

Warner Lambert, maker of Certs, Trident gum, and many more, has renewed its sponsorship of Westwood One's "Star Trak" syndicated program for 1978. The 90-second Rock news and personality interview series, hosted by Candy Tusken. is aired weekly in over 130 markets, according to Westwood One.


GM Bolsters Ad Support Of Sluggish Intermediates

General Motors, faced with a 20% drop in sales for intermediate auto lines in 1978, is planning to sustain its heavy introductory ad campaigns for those models for a longer time than usual. Concentration on Chevrolet's Monte Carlo and Malibu, the Pontiac Grand Prix and LeMans, Buick's Regal and Century, and Oldsmobile's Cutlass Supreme and Cutlass Salon will continue as GM hopes for an improvement. The sales dropoff has been attributed to high prices combined with reduced size, with some observers citing styling problems as well

Improvised Radio Comedy "From Studio B"

A novel approach to radio comedy has paid off for the creators of the syndicated "From Studio B" program with over 200 stations signed up, according to the company Hosts Alan Barzmann, a veteran of countless ad campaigns, and Pat McCormick, well-known as a comedian and comedy writer, avoid rehearsing their 75-90 second installments, with Barzmann announcing the subject and playing interviewer, with McCormick playing the comic role Barzmann has introduced. TV News

New Frontiers In TV Explored

It's not all situation comedies and pseudo-dramatic big events and specials in television these days. Around the world and here as well, the potentials of TV are being explored in a number of interesting and sometimes quite eccentric ways. For instance, an American hypnotist is working on a pilot which would show mesmerized participants on screen discussing their past lives and other bizarre features. The Broadcasting Code forbids showing people actually being hypnotized, so the susceptible subjects would be hypnotized offstage. So far, participants have described past lives as soldiers in the Middle Ages or ancient Minoan exotic bull dancers in "minute detail," and even hypnotist **Elroy Schwartz** reports being "scared."

In American television, "strip shows" mean syndicated programs broadcast five days a week, but in Italy they mean exactly what you might think. There's a late-night strip/quiz show during which a young lady removes an article of clothing every time a home viewer calls up with a correct answer to a quiz question. Meanwhile, on private TV stations across the country, "yoga exercise" programs, amateur striptease shows featuring housewives, secretaries, and the like, and X-rated films are shown. Negative reactions are reported from the Catholic Church, feminist organizations, and some businesses, which are developing increased absentee rates on days following sexy late-night broadcasts. Viewer reaction, however, seems quite positive.

Finally, an enterprising young British broadcaster found a timely way to exploit the medium of television, interrupting a Saturday night news show with a warning from an extraterrestrial being. "This is the voice of Asteron," a mysterious voice intoned, while the TV picture blacked out. "You have only a short time to learn to live together in peace. All your weapons must be destroyed." Hundreds of alarmed calls flooded the Southern England station, who finally determined that a skilled broadcast technician with a private radio transmitter was responsible for the hoax, but were unable to trace the actual perpetrator.

ABC Vaults Back Into First In Good TV Week

ABC regained its customary top spot among the three networks in the Nielsen week ending January 8. All three networks did relatively well, with ABC racking up a 21.7 rating compared to CBS' 20.1 and NBC's 19.1, all scoring higher than their season averages. "Happy Days" took first place among the week's presentations, with "Fish" (pre-empting "Laverne & Shirley" for one week following "Happy Days") finishing second, a striking contrast to its usual placings in the fifties and sixties.

Following were 3) "Three's Company" (ABC) 4) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 5) "Breaking Up" (ABC special theatre presentation) 6) the Orange Bowl game (NBC) 7) "Alice" (CBS) 8) "All Ir The Family" (CBS) 9) NBC's Bob Hope special, and 10) "One Day At A Time" (CBS). Two music-related specials were up against each other on Sunday (1-8) night, with NBC's "Nashville Remembers Elvis On His Birthday" finishing 18th and ABC's movie premiere of "Nashville" ending up in 45th place. Both, however, were beaten by CBS' Sunday comedy lineup.

Football dominated **Arbitron**'s ratings for the week ending January 6 in Los Angeles, with four games in the Top 10, while in New York no grid contests showed at all. New York's standings showed "Fish" and "Happy Days" tying for the top, with 3) "Charlie's Angels" 4) "Breaking Up," "Three's Company," and "Soap" tied 7) "Barney Miller" and "What's Hap pening" tied 9) "Welcome Back Kotter" and 10) ABC's Sunday Night Movie. ABC scored a clean sweep of the Top 10 in the market.

In L.A., the Rose Bowl contest took top honors by a substantial margin, giving NBC the nod. 2) was another NBC football presentation, on Sunday at 11am. 3) was a tie between "Breaking Up," "Fish," and "Happy Days" (all ABC) 6) the Orange Bowl 7) the Dallas/ Minnesota game (CBS) 8) "Soap" and "Three's Company" (ABC) and 10) "Barney Miller." Aside from football, ABC swept Los Angeles as well, making a very good week for the network.



Finnish Call-Ins Finish Father's Phone Budget

A late-night British radio program proved to be an irresistible temptation to a girl in Ostrobothnia, Finland. She called the station on a number of occasions and ran up a \$2500 phone bill, which her surprised father reluctantly paid. Another Finnish teenager recently racked up \$4000 in phone charges calling the same program. Perhaps the BBC should consider installing a toll-free Finnish request line.

New Trial For Brunswick President

Nat Tarnopol. President of Brunswick Records. will face a new trial on charges of income tax evasion and withholding royalties. No date for the trial has yet been set. The order for a new trial, issued by a U.S. District Court judge in Newark, marks yet another turn of events in an already complex case. Tarnopol and other Brunswick executives had originally been charged in 1976 with 28 counts relating to payola, conspiracy and mail fraud, and withholding royalties. They were found guilty by a Newark court of making cash payments to radio stations to obtain airplay, and also on certain counts of mail fraud and conspiracy. Last August a U.S. Appeals Court reversed the convictions of mail fraud and conspiracy, while leaving the opportunity open for the government to move for a new trial on the royalty and payola matters. The tax evasion issue, not originally scheduled to be tried with the other counts, has now been added by the Court; but there was no word as to whether Tarnopol would also be retried on the payola count.

Radio City Music Hall To Close

Radio City Music Hall, one of New York's foremost cultural landmarks, will close April 12 after over 45 years in operation. Rockefeller Center President and Board Chairman Alton G. Marshall announced the closing, stating "we're an anachronism in the entertainment field." Attendance had declined from 5 million in 1967 to under 2 million in 1977, with a projected loss of \$3.5 million anticipated for 1978. Marshall blamed population migration to the suburbs, the effect of television, and an inability to attract movies for the Hall, as distributors apparently preferred smaller theaters for longer runs. The closing will also affect the famed dancing troupe, the Rockettes, who along with musicians and other employees had agreed to personnel cutbacks and a 14-week annual closing of the theatre in an attempt to stem the theater's decline.


The Hall may be converted to a shopping mall or a concert hall, or possibly a tennis facility. However, talks with New York Mayor Edward Koch are still going on in search of an eleventh hour solution to the Hall's problems.

WCI Record/Tape Sales Hit Half Billion Mark

Preliminary estimates from Warner Communications indicate that the total worldwide sales figure for records and tapes exceeded \$500 million in 1977. Domestic sales from Warner Bros., Elektra/Asylum, and Atlantic Records accounted for almost 75% of the total, with a 30% increase from 1976, but international sales registered a sharper increase (about 42%). The WCI group also collected 71 gold and platinum awards globally (54 gold, 17 platinum).

What's New?

FTC Green Light For Video Games

The FTC has issued a statement on electronic video games following a year's investigation, declaring that "reasonable use" of the games should cause no damage to TV screens. The Commission did warn that prolonged use of some games could imprint the game pattern onto the screen, and added that at this time it had no evidence on the frequency of game use by consumers.

FDA Lays It On The Line For Lasers

The Food & Drug Administration will be taking a hard line against Rock bands and discos using laser beam light displays that exceed FDA safety limits. According to the agency, no matter what the medium, laser beams must not shine into the human eye if they exceed one milliwatt per square centimeter. The FDA will issue warning letters to laser users, with copies to the press, and then plans to dispatch inspectors to check up, with offenders facing court battles and confiscation of equipment. The FDA strongly suggested observing the agency's safety standard or else throwing laser patterns onto ceilings or walls where no direct eye contact with the beams transpires.

Cream Acquires Xanadu Jazz Label

Cream Records, continuing an expansion drive, has purchased the Xanadu Records label, which features albums by a number of top-flight Jazz stars. Cream previously bought Hi Records in Memphis and East Memphis Music, the publishing apparatus of Stax Records. Some 50 albums in the Xanadu catalog will be absorbed by Cream.

Redford, Streisand Named Reuters Film Favorites

Robert Redford and Barbra Streisand have been chosen World Film Favorites in an annual survey by Reuters News Bureau. The survey covers 60 countries all over the world, excluding North America. The victory was Redford's third consecutive win, while Streisand won for the fourth time, having been chosen in 1970, 1971, and 1975.

Tobacco Road Getting Rougher

Tobacco-smoking is reported on the decline among college students, while the practice is about to come under further attack from the **Department of Health**. Education and Welfare. The student smoking decline is far from insignificant, at least according to results from a **Princeton University** survey of its undergraduates. 45% of the Princetonians smoked in 1969, but the percentage today took a significant drop—to 7% of the students. In other Ivy League nonsmoking action, Harvard, with 1624 students, reported that only 27 smoked.

A survey of high school smokers during the 1969-75 period showed mixed results, with smoking by boys dropping a hair to 30% from 31%, while girls registered an increase from 22% to 27%. However, the new HEW anti-smoking campaign set for 1978 is aimed at teenagers in particular, with a slogan comparing cigarette smoking to "slow motion suicide." HEW may also ask for a higher federal tax on cigarettes, another less-than-cheering prospect for tobacco manufacturers.

However, the tobacco people keep plugging, and at the moment they're promoting plugs of chewing tobacco. The theory is that increased leisure time in America and the resultant boom in outdoor activities which require two hands (hunting, fishing, gardening, etc.) should spur the use of chewing tobacco as opposed to pipes or cigarettes. **R.J. Reynolds** has introduced a new brand of chaw called **Work Horse**, and both Reynolds and established companies like **Liggett** & **Myers** and **P. Lorillard** are hoping their leisure theory is valid, and that they haven't bitten off more than they (or consumers) can chew.

Waterbed Industry Securely Afloat

Ten years after the general introduction of waterbeds, the industry is gaining both respectability and sales, a **Wall Street Journal** report indicates. Major companies, including J.C. Penney and **Singer**, are involved, and the industry claims a \$234 million annual sales volume (including accessories). Coming on strong are more conventionally-designed beds that use less water; one on the market is actually 75% foam. Leading market for waterbeds is still the West Coast, the industry's original beachhead—it's claimed that one in every ten families has one.

Columbia In Pact With Jon Peters Organization

Columbia Records has signed an exclusive production and talent acquisition deal with the Ion Peters Organisation. Peters will be bringing new talent to Columbia, according to CBS Records Division President Bruce Lundvall. Peters has produced several Barbra Stretsand albums, as well as the film "A Star Is Born"; he is currently engaged in the planning and production of several new film projects.

Jocular Jock Catalog Bows

The Whole O Catalog, compiled by Dan O'Day of O'Liners fame, is a listing/order form booklet providing a convenient method for air personalities and other interested industry types to acquire collections of jokes, trivia, information, statistics, and background radio material. It's been centralized by O'Day with radio needs in mind, and the catalog is available free from O'Liners, 366 West Bullard Ave., Fresno, CA 93704.

Mississippi Salutes Record, Film Industries

The state of **Mississippi** declared December 20 an official salute to its local record and film industries, with a reception at the Governor's mansion, a dinner hosted by the Governor, a concert and parties. Representatives from a number of prominent record companies attended the ceremonies, sponsored by the state, the city of Jackson, and members of the Jackson entertainment community. According to Governor **Cliff Finch**, the event marked "the first time a state has made his type of initiative to attract industry attention."

Opera Has Grand Old Year; Record Co's Gain Interest

Classical opera appears to be expanding at its healthiest rate in years. The Central Opera Service of New York reports that audiences for opera last year totalled 9.2 million, double the 1973 figure; while 914 groups are performing operas with continued growth evident. A number of record companies, including RCA. Columbia Masterworks, and Capitol's Angel line, are planning increased activity in the field as well, as industry diversity continues to grow.

MCA/Philips Double Videodisc Viewing Time

North American Philips and MCA have modified their upcoming videodiscs to match the total playing time of RCA's disks. The two systems are incompatible, and the impending competition between the two will be watched closely by the entertainment industry. Originally the Philips/MCA disk was slated to provide 30 minutes of programming on a one-sided disk. Recently it was shifted to two sides and now the two companies have announced that each side will play 60 minutes, the same playing time provided by RCA's disk. Philips and MCA plan to test market their disks and player systems regionally this fall; RCA has not announced adate of introduction for its system.

Chudnoff Appointed VP Creative Services At RCA

Jack Chudnoff has been promoted to Division Vice President, Creative Services at RCA Records. He takes charge of advertising, album design, and editorial/literacy services, among other duties. Chudnoff, formerly Director of Creative Services, joined RCA in 1974 in that position. In announcing the promotion, Division Vice President, Marketing Operations Robert Summer, to whom Chudnoff reports, commented: "The promotion reflects recognition of Jack's contribution to RCA advertising and album art, and a commitment to the development of a unique capability in these fields."



FCC Update

Revised Multiple Ownership Rules Affirmed And Clarified

The Commission has affirmed its recently revised multiple ownership rules providing fixed standards by which to measure, and thus disallow, regional concentrations of broadcast media. The amendments, adopted last March 9 and effective April 22, prohibit the common owner-

ship, operation or control of three broadcast stations, where any two are within 100 miles of the third (measured city to city), if there is primary service contour overlap of any of the stations.

Previously, the Commission considered all applications involving potential concentrations of control on a case-by-case basis.

Reconsideration was sought by Surburban Radio Group, Inc., Town and Country Radio, Inc., and Lares Broadcasters.

Prior to adoption of the new rules, each of the petitioners had filed an application seeking to acquire or construct a new station. However, since grant of those applications now would result in a regional concentration of control under the revised standards, they are not permitted.

Therefore, the petitioners asked for exemptions from compliance for their respective applications. The Commission said that new rules must become effective on a specified date, and where a rulemaking proceeding has matured into an effective new rule, compliance was required.

Noting that none of the parties had alleged any irregularity in the rulemaking process, the FCC pointed out that the mere filing of an application conferred no rights and vested no interests in a party and such applications must conform in all respects to the rules in effect at the time of the grant.

Accordingly, it concluded it would be inappropriate to consider the merits of any application within the context of this rulemaking proceeding, adding that any equitable arguments such applicants might wish to make or any requests for waivers should be made within the context of a hearing proceeding.

In denying reconsideration, however, the Commission noted there were two matters that needed clarification.

First, it said, in adopting the regional concentration of control fixed standards, it failed to distinguish between UHF and VHF television broadcast stations. Such a distinction should be drawn, it said, to continue fostering the development and growth of UHF stations.

Therefore, the Commission said, an application raising a regional concentration question under the new criteria, involving primary service overlap of one or more UHF stations, would be treated on a case-by-case basis.

Next, the FCC said it previously had determined that for purposes of this proceeding, AM-FM combinations in the same market would be counted as one station. However, it found the term "market" had caused considerable difficulty, with some potential applicants attempting to convince the Commission that guite clearly distant cities were within the same market.

Thus, the Commission decided that in the case of urbanized areas an AM-FM combination would be counted as one station if they are both licensed to communities within the same urbanized area as defined and mapped by the U.S. Bureau of the Census. In the case of both urbanized and nonurbanized areas, it said an AM-FM combination would be counted as one station if the communities of license are within 15 miles of each other (city reference point to reference point).

In examining the overlap criterion of the regional concentration rule, the Commission said it would not consider primary service overlap between AM-FM combinations. However, it said, it would not allow an applicant to add an FM station to its AM station, or vice versa, if such addition would either create new primary service contour overlap or aggravate existing primary service contour overlap with an applicant's other stations.

These modifications to Sections 73.35, 73.240 and 73.636 of the rules become effective January 16, 1978.

Welcome To L.A.

The interest in radio changes never dies and things are always changing...Los Angeles seems to be going through yet another period of readjustment with the recent P.D. shifts at both KHJ and TEN-Q.

So what's happening in L.A.? John Sebastian comes to KHJ with a well-known background in research. When John was at KDWB/Minneapolis, the station ran a tight list, Icw news profile and a somewhat "less-talk" jock approach. The immediate changes John has made at KHJ seem to be following his successful formula at KDWB. Several records vanished from the KHJ playlist immediately. John is currently doing his first organized research of the Los Angeles market which will help him determine just what music KHJ will and will not play in the future. The traditional music department of KHJ has been terminated with the departure of Debbie Avison, Music Director.

The jocks already are "talking" less. Charlie Tuna is no longer doing "phone bits" and to my ears sounds very much like the Charlie Tuna of the great KCBQ days. Charlie is one of the best quick-wits in radio and seems to be handling the changes very well. The most obvious effect of the less-talk change at KHJ is the station sounds much less cluttered.

'Position 93, KHJ, it's simple...we want to be your radio station." That phrase is heard at the end of live Public Service spots and as a tag line for recorded promos, as a further indication of ongoing changes at KHJ.

The speculation regarding personnel changes at KHJ have calmed down with the departure of night jock Don Cox last week. John told me, "As far as I'm concerned, everyone who is currently at the station is good enough and professional enough that I would certainly want them to stay. I think everyone here is basically doing what I want them to do. They're having normal problems dealing with this big of a change, but their heads are in the right place.

The current line-up at KHJ is: Charlie Tuna 6-10am, Bobby Ocean 10am-2pm, M.G. Kelly 2-6pm, Bob Anthony 6-10pm, Shana 10pm-2am and Mucho Morales 2am-6am. Chuck Martin will handle weekends

Dallas Doings

Hopefully by now you have made your plans to attend R&R Convention '78 in Dallas. As you have been reading, the convention this year will be taking a slightly different direction than past gatherings. In keeping with that difference the Thursday evening Top 40 session will be getting into some relatively new areas.

Part of our discussion on Thursday night will center on one of the most misunderstood areas in all of radio...namely "Passive Research." The present practitioners of "Passive Research" in its many forms will be there for your questions and to have what I know will be a lively discussion. The misconceptions surrounding this type of research are many and I hope this portion of the Thursday Top 40 session will be very enlightening.

Another part of the program will include a few sage words on "Taking Over A New Staff." For those of us who have made changes in our careers from one station to another and encountered difficulties, this should be a great help.

Also, I am putting together a video presentation of some of the best television commercials run by radio stations all over the country in the last year. We have some great examples of promotional spots done on a budget and can demonstrate ways to get into television without blowing your entire yearly promotional outlay. The effective use of television has really helped many Top 40 stations fight off the competition and if you have been considering the use of the tube to promote your station, this portion of the Thursday night session will be a

Most of the commercials we have assembled for viewing are from West Coast stations because our access to those has been the easiest. If you have run any television spots in the past year and would like to be included in the presentation, I would appreciate hearing from you. 


A Reminder

(Continued from page 3) at the station, sleeping Tuesday night on the floor, in several inches of dirt. Windows in the sales office were blown out by the force of the winds and the interior of the building was covered by the dust that blew in. (We also lost a tower, but that's another story).

Mr. Gerber further states in his letter that another radio station heloed KERN deliver storm information. He neglected to mention all the stations that pitched in to help KAFY when their own stations went off the air. These stations include KGEE. KLYD, KUZZ, KWSO and K-106, along with television stations KBAK and KERO.

Now that the situation has truly been "clarified"...Let me ask: If KERN did such an outstanding job covering the storm, why weren't their efforts even mentioned in the newspaper, when every other station was listed? I think the answer is obvious.

One last item...During the storm, when many phone lines were down, and hundreds, if not thousands of people were without phone service, KERN was running a call-in-to-win contest, "Christmas Wish." KAFY, on the other hand, suspended all contest activities, for several days, until we were confident phone service was back to normal.

crowd, however, seemed to be hurling various objects at the band at maximum possible velocity and accuracy. An inventory of articles thrown included such items as tennis shoes, sweaters, cigarette lighters, socks, windbreakers, mufflers (the garment, not the automotive accessory), rolls of toilet paper (used by Pistols lead singer Johnny Rotten for handkerchiefs), umbrellas, paper cups, and considerable spittle, as certain audience members, having apparently viewed the practice on television coverage of past Sex Pistols concerts. climbed to the shoulders of willing collaborators and showered the stage with saliva. The band's reaction to the barrage was more amused than outraged, as Rotten occasionally poked through the pile of objects during instrumental breaks, examining the more interesting ones; and later addressed the crowd: "Got any cameras? I could get rich this way!" Towards the end of the concert, however, the group's tolerance waned, and guitarist Steve Jones and bassist Sid Vicious spat back at the audience on occasion.

Aside from the element of target practice and a few attempts to clumb up to the stage by overenthusiastic patrons, the show was free from unusual events. Reaction from journalists present (many from Los Angeles, a city purposely avoided by the Sex Pistols for their first tour) was highly favorable, while comments from the general run of concertgoers ranged from amazement to indifference, with many regarding it more as a historic event than a musical concert highlight. Taking this view, one bystander summed up: "Interesting. I'm glad I was there



Local AOR stations KSAN and KSJO/San Jose devoted considerable air time to discussing the event beforehand and playing Sex Pistols records, with KSAN broadcasting the concert via tape-delay an hour after the show concluded. KSAN Program Director Bonnie Simmons also conducted an interview with Pistols Rotten and Vicious, who sounded notably uninterested throughout. The station also interviewed audience members before airing the concert tape. -Ken Barnes

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

Observations

As time diminishes the ranks of old friends, survivors are wont to recall occasions when they sat and talked with those who are gone. We try to recall the words of those who are no longer here. I'm the only survivor of one such conversation, thirty years ago in Nashville's old Andrew Jackson hotel. Paul Ackerman, in his quiet way, remarked that, one day, Country music would be one of the dominant musical influences in American culture. He also predicted that the history, sociological and philosophical significant of Country music would be studied by the great universities of the land. There were some scoffers in that small group, thirty years ago. They're all gone now and so is Paul Ackerman. As Editor Emeritus of Billboard, Paul was a pillar of the music business. He is gone now but there is satisfaction for those of us who knew him that he lived long enough to see his predictions about Country music come true. Paul Ackerman was eclectic, equally at home with Jazz, Blues, Classical, Rock and Country. We are all richer for his contributions to the music business.


