George Taylor Morris To Program WPIX-FM

George Taylor Morris has been named to succeed Neil McIntyre as Program Director of AOR-formatted WPIX-FM/New York. Taylor, an AOR veteran, leaves the Program Directorship of WCOZ/Boston to assume his new position.

WPIX General Manager John Catlett told R&R: "I feel very positive about this move. I have considered the possibility of changing to a different Program Director for some time. I think Neil's done a pretty good job of turning this station into something it never was before, of creating a format in which he didn't have any particular background. I think he's made a laudable adaptation. But I think George has an opportunity to do a stronger job, which I felt the station needed at this time." McIntyre, who pro-grammed WPIX as a Top 40 station before its recent conversion to AOR, was on vacation and unavailable for comment.

Morris told R&R: "There's some tightening up that has to be done at WPIX, some real direction, some excitement that has to be put there. I think that's why I took the job. I don't know anyone there," he continued, "but I'll certainly give everyone a fair



deal and see what happens. I have some plans in mind that will make the station a lot more exciting, and if that involves putting in more people, we will."

Morris, a former New York area programmer at WLIR/Long Island as PD, said of his return to the city: "I've worked and lived around New York for quite a while, and have gone back from time to time to listen to what's going on, and I think there's room to do something there. I think there's a gray area that somebody should paint red and make it hot and smoking in the middle of the city. I'm excited about it."

No replacement for Morris has been selected at WCOZ. "They understand it," he said, speaking of his decision to take the WPIX job. "It was a situation where it was an offer I couldn't refuse. I mean, there's only one New York City. You can't turn it down."

Smith Named "Acting Head" Of Downe Group

Robert J. Smith has been offically appointed acting head of the Downe Communications Broadcasting Group (formerly known as Bartell Broadcasting). Official announcement of Smith's promotion had awaited the final decision of Downe Communications President Fred Danneman (R&R 2-3).

Downe's official statement reads: "Robert J. Smith has been named acting head of the Downe Communications Broadcasting Group, it was announced by Fred C. Danneman, President of Downe Communications, Inc...Mr. Smith replaces George Wilson, who resign-

ed to become a program consultant with his own company." Details of Wilson's consultancy plans were not forthcoming.

The former Bartell chain, now

known as the Downe Group, encompasses WADO/New York, KCBQ/San Diego, WOKY/Milwaukee, WMJX-FM (96X)/Miami, WDRQ-FM/Detroit, and KSLQ-FM/St. Louis. Smith had served as Station Manager of WADO from 1972 to 1974, and was most recently Vice President/Treasurer of the Downe Broadcasting Group. He has been with Bartell and then Downe since 1960.

Doubleday Promotes Goodman; Parris New KHOW/KXKX GM

Alan Goodman has been appointed Corporate Director of Sales at Doubleday Broadcasting, R&R has learned. Goodman was most recently General Manager of KHOW/KXKX/Denver. Replacing

him as GM for the two stations (KHOW is Pop/Adult, KXKX Top 40) is Joe Parrish. Parrish was most recently Sales Manager of WLS/Chicago.

WABC Victimized By Telephone Contest Impostors

A WABC/New York call-in contest was marred by technically sophisticated impostors who intercepted calls going through the station's specially-designed telephone "choke system" and promised callers thousands of dollars worth of cash and prizes. Complaints from victims of the hoax and local newspaper coverage impelled WABC to clarify the matter via newspaper ads and on-air announcements last week.

According to WABC Creative Services Director Pat Pantonini, the station has been using the choke system, "designed by the phone company for mass calls," since April 1975. The system automatically turns the mass of calls back to ten local offices, where a busy signal is then generated. WABC began receiving complaints about undelivered prizes in late January, Pantonini said, and soon became aware that a problem existed when callers mentioned that the people who had told them they'd won prizes had not taken down addresses or phone numbers. Furthermore, the station's computerized records revealed that callers claiming to be prize winners had not actually been recorded as winners by WABC. Finally a caller supplied information which enabled the phone company to get a line on the impostors, and a reportedly successful investigation was launched. The impostors, none of whom have been identified by the New York Telephone Company, apparently bypassed switches in the choke system that set off busy signals, and impersonated station contest staffers. The Manhattan District Attorney is reportedly investigating the matter and contemplating harassment charges.

Pantonini told R&R that WABC has a rigorous "series of steps" followed in all contests. However, he speculated that if a caller "hadn't won before, he wouldn't be aware" of the procedures. In addition, the impostors were highly knowledgeable about the "\$500,000 WABC Game," the callin contest which has run on the station since December 19, and even mentioned actual WABC contest section employees while telling callers they'd won cash, albums, Caribbean vacations, bicycles, and videotape recorders.

In order to resolve the potentially damaging matter, WABC immediately broadcast an explanation and placed ads in the New

York Times and Daily News. The newspaper ad read: "Recently WABC received a number of complaints from listeners indicating that when they tried to phone the station to participate in the WABC Game, their calls were answered by individuals who have no connection whatsoever with WABC, but nonetheless awarded prizes in our name. A failure in telephone company communication equipment made it possible for contest calls that never reached WABC to be answered by people who pretended to be station employees and pretended to award the prizes being offered by WABC. We apologize to any listeners who were tricked by these individuals. The New York Telephone Company

has now assured us that the problem has been corrected.

"In an effort to reduce the confusion as much as we can, WABC will by the end of this week mail to authentic past WABC contest winners whose prizes have not been sent official verification of their prize awards. We again apologize to any listener who was misled." The message was signed "WABC Music Radio 78."

Pantonini told R&R: "We don't know the scope of this matter at this point." He added, however, "We're no longer experiencing any of those problems...The phone company was very cooperative and quickly solved that problem." WABC is continuing to run its "WABC Game" contest.

WHK's Jones To Convert KLZ/Denver To Country

KLZ/Denver will change forniats from Pop/Adult to Country in March, with former WHK/ Cleveland Program Director Ron Jones assuming the PD position at the station. KLZ Vice President/General Manager Sam Yacovazzi told R&R: "We have set a target date of sometime in March to change our format from Pop/ Adult to full-time modern Country. We will be personality-oriented with a great emphasis on a community involvement. I am confident that Ron Jones is the Program Director who will make this a top-rated station in the market." Group One, which owns KLZ, already maintains Country stations in Dallas (KBOX) and Dayton (WONE).

In the wake of Jones' departure, WHK has announced the appointment of John Webster to take over the Program Director position, according to Malrite Broadcasting Vice President of Programming John Chafey. Webster was most recently afternoon an-



WERE in Cleveland, and until 1977 had been Program/Operations Manager of the station. He was also programming the morn, ing show of highly-rated WHK air personality Gary Dees. Evening personality Terry Stevens has been named Music Director at WHK, and will switch shifts to mid-afternoon. In a final gesture of goodwill towards Jones, WHK threw him a going-away party, presenting him with a Denver Broncos pennant.



FCC Reopens Inquiry Into Fairness Doctrine Issues

The FCC has reopened public inquiries into two proposals on its fairness doctrine regulations. The Commission had been ordered by the U.S. Court of Appeals in Washington D.C. to give further study to the suggestions (R&R 11-18-77).

The proposals, one submitted by the Committee for Open Media and the other by Henry Geller, now head of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration, had originally been given to the FCC years ago, but had been bypassed in the FCC's 1974 Fairness Report. The COM proposal called for a "right of access policy," in which a suggested hour a week would be reserved by radio and television licensees for members of the public to speak on topical issues. Geller had called for stations to list the ten most important national issues it had covered each year, with details on the station's presentation and time devoted to it

The COM and Geller filed appeals following the 1974 Fairness Report, claiming inadequate consideration of their proposals by the FCC. The Commission then rejected the appeal petitions, but the Court of Appeals, while at the same time upholding several FCC Fairness Doctrine policies, directed the Commission to reconsider the two suggestions. Notices of the **LETTERS:**

proposed FCC rulemaking on the issues raised by the two proposals will be issued shortly after a unanimous Commission vote in favor of posting the notices.

BMI Elvis Edict Has Impersonators All Shook Up

A BMI notice forbidding the live public vocal performance of more. than three consecutive Elvis Presley songs has provoked an angry reaction from managers of artists performing Presley tributes, along with the artists themselves. The edict, intended by BMI to "protect the dramatic performing rights" of approximately 150 songs closely associated with the late singer, was attacked as unconstitutional and a threat to Elvis impersonators.

BMI Licensing Vice President Alan H. Smith sent all BMI licensees a notice stating: "Pursuant to our license agreement with you, we hereby give notice that you are restricted from permitting live public vocal performance at any one time of more than three of the musical compositions listed on the attached sheet in order to protect the dramatic performing rights therein." A list of songs follows, with BMI apparently taking considerable pains to ensure that not only famous Elvis hits

such as "Hound Dog," "Suspicious Minds" and "Don't Be Cruel" but more obscure tracks along the lines of "Queenie Wahine's Papaya" and "Yoga Is As Yoga Does" are protected. Interestingly, the list contains several songs generally considered to be associated primarily with other artists: "Sixteen Tons" (Ernie Ford), "Ready Teddy" (Little Richard), "Blue Suede Shoes" (Carl Perkins), "Suspicion" (Terry Stafford), etc., although they were also recorded by

In any case, concerned managers regard the BMI move as a direct threat to the livelihood of the estimated hundreds of Elvis imitators now performing. Chet Actis, manager of Alan, one of the leading tribute artists, said: "We regard BMI's suggestion to their licensees as taking away Alan's right to sing Elvis. Alan is the pioneer of the Tribute to Elvis concept and has been performing as such for the past five years with...no problems. Alan even performed in Las Vegas at the same time as Elvis himself and members of Presley's staff would often drop in and catch Alan's performance." Other managers also cited their proteges' closeness to Elvis in defending their activities.

Mark Callas, manager of Las Vegas Elvis impressionist Tommy Rivers claimed that the BMI notice would help publicize such performers. And another impersonator, Johnny Harra, declared, "I'm not worried about the BMI threat. I've been doing this for 13 yearsnot a play but an in-concert format." Actis stated, however: "We will certainly fight this BMI ruling because it (Alan's performance) is not a dramatic presentationjust a guy singing someone else's songs. Nowhere does Alan pretend he is Elvis; he merely pays careful and sincere tribute to one man's life and music." Summing up. Actis maintains, "A gold lame suit doesn't make it a dramatic performance. That's just the same as staging and lighting a performance.

Post-Blizzard Note

We reed the 2/10/78 story on Boston radio during the recent blizzard, and were disappointed that you did not include WROR.

WROR is the key EBS station for Massachusetts, and was one of the very few stations in New England that remained on the air throughout the crisis, with no interruption of transmission or change of power, although we ran on a diesel generator part of the time

WROR covered the storm from beginning to end, with continual news edvisories and emergency in-

formation. Newsman Don Latulippa stayed on duty for forty-eight hours without sleep; almost everybody on our staff from the general manager to sales secretaries managed to walk or thumb their way through the storm to get to the station, to help. Governor Dukakis came to WROR to do a live report on the storm, too.

A lot of people worked long. sleepless hours to make WROR egain synonymous with dependability. We ere not looking for an ego stroke. We just wanted to set the record Paul Ward

Emergency Rating System

One frustration that many "full service" stations face is the feeling that their ratings don't reflect the extraordinary tune in during a news or weether emergency, Most storms do not occur during April-May or October-November surveys so other than the staff receiving miscellaneous fan meil, there is no "proof."

In January I commissioned a Mediestet to survey our nine city-town metro area and ask "What station do you turn to during a news or weather emergency?" The survey was conducted prior to the two recent snow storms that hit Connecticut recently.

The results were staggering:

WICC 66% 18-54 Adults 70% 18-34 Men 64% 18-34 Women .

The next biggest station pulled a 15%, the third station a 3%, etc.

R&R subscribers that do a good job beyond music may find the above approach helpful not only for commercial reasons but-es importantas a vehicle to boost internal morale.

Comparative City Costs Of Living Cited

An Associates for International Research study has compared relative costs of living in 13 American cities. The company developed specs for what it considered an average way of life for a four-person family making \$25,000 yearly. Then researchers measured actual costs of 319 goods and services that such families would use (with income taxes taken into account). Results showed New York as the most expensive, with total costs hitting \$29,000, while the same goods and services would run only \$21,650 in Phoenix. Northeastern locales proved generally more expensive, with Boston scoring slightly over \$28,000 and Washington D.C. \$26,740. Pittsburgh registered only \$24,420, however. In the West, San Francisco costs reached \$26,900 compared to \$26,530 for Los Angeles. Denver, however, was \$23,330, while Seattle was \$23,000 and Phoenix, as previously stated, was lowest of all the cities surveyed. Chicago rated a \$25,890 figure, while St. Louis was only \$23,020. Rounding out the survey, Atlanta at \$23,560 and Houston at \$23,530 were among the less expensive cities to live in.

The results indicate that persons moving to the Northeast or California will need fairly substantial pay raises to compensate for increased costs, while the Southwest, Northwest and South are correspondingly less expensive. Cost of living increases from 1976 to 1977 found Los Angeles as the largest jump 8.1%. Lowest was Boston at 5.1%; the average increase was 6.6%.

Tashjian New National Pop Promotion Director At Motown

Ralph Tashjian has been appointed National Pop Promotion Director at Motown Records. He will be based at Motown's Hollywood headquarters, reporting to Vice President of Pop Promotion Jose Isgro. Tashjian most recently headed an independent San Francisco marketing and promotion firm, Golden Gate Productions. Previously he had been National Promotion Director for 20th Century and had directed East Coast Promotion efforts for MCA. Tashjian (right) is pictured with Joe Isgro.



MCA Restructures Advertising Department

MCA Records announced a restructuring of its advertising Department, keyed by two new appointments. John Vana has been appointed Merchandising Director, implementing campaigns and acting as field liaison for the Advertising and Merchandising Department. Karen Vanek has been promoted to Advertising Coordinator, with duties centering on trafficking of production meterials and ad placement. Both Vana and Vanek report to MCA Vice President of Advertising and Merchandising Bob Siner.

WCI Hits First Billion Dollar Year As Records Contribute Heavily

Warner Communications Inc. (WCI) garnered operating revenues of over \$1.1 billion in 1977, up almost 40% over 1976's \$827 million figures. Net earnings increased nearly 15% to \$70.8 million. The company's music division was the chief contributor to the record-breaking year, with sales up 31% to \$532.4 million, while operating profits were up 23% to \$84 million (before taxes and corporate overhead were subtracted). WCI also set new quarterly records in the fourth quarter of 1977, with sales up 56% to \$398 million and net earnings up 41% to \$19.9 million. Music division sales were up 38% to \$185.4 million during the fourth quarter, while profits were up 31%. The company's film division also recorded historic gains. Costs of setting up Warner Cable's new two-way QUBE system in Columbus, Ohio caused a drop in profits for the cable division, however.

American International Forms Record Division With Epic

American International Pictures has formed American International (AI) Records for music from AIP films and other artists and music. Epic Records will distribute the new label, with the soundtrack from "The Buddy Holly Story" set for first release. Burton Epstein is chief operating officer of the new label; he had been head of the American Talent International agency. Bodie Chandler, formerly a principal of Valiant Records (who developed the Association) and a prominent songwriter of the 60's, will head A&R operations for AI. An AI label designed for similar film soundtrack purposes had previously existed during the late 60's.

Optimod-AM AM Audio Processor Bows

Orban Associates. Inc. has unveiled its Optimod-AM Model 9000 AM band audio processor, designed to aid in the "best commercial use of the AM broadcast channel." The device is intended to allow the typical AM receiver to be heard at maximum lidelity, loudness, and clarity. The Optimod-AM, designed to be the only equipment between the console and the transmitter audio input, processes the signal through six basic blocks: an input conditioning filter, a broadband compressor, a program equalizer, a six-band limiter, a polarity follower, and a peak limiting circuit. It also comes equipped with a rear-panel jack for an adapter device for AM stereo. World Population Increase Rate On Decline

Recent Harvard Center For Population Studies estimates indicate that the rate of population increase for the world is slowing and that total world population by the year 2000 may be substantially lower than previously guessed. United States population growth has long been on the decline although some observers predict a picking up of the birth rate shortly. The new estimates for world population in 2000 range between 5.5 and 5.8 billion, compared to UN estimates of 6.25 billion made last year. A surprisingly rapid drop in birth rates in poorer countries was cited as the main reason for the slowdown.

Private Delivery Attracts Record, Book Clubs

A number of companies distributing records and books, including the Columbia Record Club and Book-of-the-Month Club, have been testing private delivery systems in parts of California. The move to the private sector is a reaction to rapidly rising U.S. Postal Service second-class mail rates, which will have increased over 400% since 1971 if a proposed rate hike takes place as planned in 1979. Many companies predict that private delivery will be clearly cheaper next year, according to the Wall Street Journal, with new private distribution companies coming into existence to attract the new business volume.

CBS Records Sets Sales Records

CBS Inc. established new records in net sales, income and earnings per share in 1977 for the sixth consecutive year, with the Records Division cited as a substantial contributor. CBS Inc. net income was up 11% to \$182 million in 1977. Total net sales reached \$2.78 billion, up almost 25%. A CBS Inc. summary states: "The CBS Records Group exceeded all previous sales and income levels by substantial margins." Sales volume for CBS Records was up over 28% to \$768 million, while profits rose 25% to \$79.9 million compared to last year's \$63.9 million. A large number of artists, records, and production deals were cited as contributing to the record-breaking year.

20th Century Reports Best Year Ever

20th Century-Fox Film Corporation reported record earnings and revenues for 1977, with net earnings up almost 400% over 1976, thanks largely to "Star Wars." 20th Century Records, however, registered a strong turnaround, with revenues of \$22.7 million compared to last year's \$9.9 million, and net earnings at \$1.9 million compared to a 1976 loss of \$4.66 million. The "Star Wars" soundtrack and the resurgence of Barry White were cited in the company's report as key reasons for the recovery.

Arista Sets Quarter, Six-Month Profit Records

Arista Records reports new records for the company's second quarter and first-six-months revenue performance. Net revenues for the October-December quarter were reported up 167% over last year during the same period, while figures for the first half of the company's fiscal year (July-December 1977) were reported up 146% over same time last year. A variety of artists and records were cited as prime contributors to the increase.

RCA Color TV Camera Could Lead To Home Run

A recently-developed RCA color television camera could be the forerunner of home-use models, according to industry observers. The new camera uses electronic sensors instead of the standard vidicon tubes, and is expected to lead to reliable hand-held cameras which could be used for home movies with videotape recorders. At this point, the CCD camera (for "charge-coupled device," the term for the sensors) will be marketed in 1979 for commercial closed-circuit TV situations in which quality does not have to meet TV broadcast standards. Subsequently the CCD's are expected to reach broadcast quality as well. The price should run between \$2000 and \$10,000 for starters, but is expected to drop to vidicon camera levels (around \$1500 in the near future), and RCA believes that the CCD models will prove more reliable and longer-lasting.

Eagles To Co-Produce "Desperado" Film

The Eagles will co-produce, with Ray Stark, a movie based on their second album, "Desperado," at some undetermined future time. No specific actors have been considered, and the Eagles will not apparently appear in the film. However the group will contribute some new songs and music. As a result of a settlement with Steve Leber and David Erebs, who had acquired certain dramatic rights to portions of the Eagles catalog earlier, Leber and Krebs will be executive producers of the film.

Copters On Parade

Rotor Way Aircraft is promoting what they call the "Personal Size Helicopter." It's billed as ultra-lightweight, affordable, and practical, "less expensive than a luxury car," and a sportsman's or businessman's delight. More detailed information on the Scorpton helicopter is found in the company's 50 plus page illustrated "evaluation package," with photos, diagrams, charts, and data on the copter's specs, features, costs, and an explanation of the company's owner's course. The booklet costs \$10, but a \$20 discount is offered to those "wishing to purchase this course separately for previewing." Mozart Tops Classical Composers For 1977

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, with 145 records featuring his compositions on a variety of labels, was the most-recorded classical composer of 1977 Mozart managed to dethrone the 1975-76 champion, Johann Sebastian Bach, who accrued 117 recordings of his works in 1977 to finish third, behind Ludwig von Beethoven, with 129

A National Labor Relations Board law judge has ruled that employers need not provide a union representative to be present when disciplining an employee unless the employee asks for the union rep. The Supreme Court had ruled in 1975 that an employee was entitled to the presence of a union representative, but in that case, the employee had asked.

Williams Sues For Record Income From Film

Paul Williams filed suit alleging that he did not receive an agreed-upon 2% profit from the sales of the soundtrack to "A Star Is Born." He claims lost income of \$100,000 as a result Williams was music supervisor for the film and contributed to the score as a song writer.

Home Cooking Tops Fast Food In Poll

A Newspaper Advertising Bureau poll found that 89% of its respondents are at least once a month at a fast-food restaurant or stand, but that 73% felt food prepared at home was superior in purity, while 62% thought it was more nutritious, and 60% felt it tasted better. The respondents were all food shoppers for their families 28% said a newspaper ad influenced their choice of shopping location.

Welk Wins Half Interest In Percy Faith Catalog

Lawrence Welk has been awarded a 50% interest in the copyright renewal of almost 150 compositions by the late Percy Faith. The agreement between Welk and Faith's estate calls for proper promotion of the songs in concerts and television appearances.

Salsoul Has A Dream

Salsoul Records, primarily a disco and Latin-oriented company, is readying its Dream Records subsidiary. The new label will concentrate on rock and pop, with a first album due shortly by rock artist Steven T., formerly of Los Angeles band Venus & the Razorblades. Salsoul also signed a licensing deal with EMI for three years, covering British release of Salsoul product

DIR Broadcasting Ringo TV Special Set For NBC

Radio syndication firm DIR Broadcasting has set its first television special for an April 26 NBC air date. The hour-long special stars Ringo Starr in his first TV special outing, and includes the artist's first performance on TV in front of an audience since a 1965 Ed Sullivan date. George Harrison is guest star, and the special has an "updated Prince & the Pauper" thems.

TV ROCKS ON—A large number of musical artists have reportedly been signed for the upcoming NBC "First Annual Rock in Roll Sports Classic," in which Kiss manager Bill Aucoin is a principal partner. Others will probably be announced subsequently...The Captain & Tennille have set two ABC specials, a New Orleans-located show for April 3 airing and a Hawaii special for May 5...And Donna Summer hosts a Midnight Special edition March 24...Finally, longtime radio comic whiz Don Imus has been signed to host his own TV talk show called "Imus Plus." The show, a 90-minute weekly effort, is being offered for syndication by Colbert TV Sales.

ABC Wraps Up Another Victory As CBS Moves Up


ABC was the winner for the week ending February 12 in Nielsen competition, but CBS made a valiant attempt to dethrone the champs. ABC's weekly rating figure was 22.1, while CBS registered a 20.7 and NBC was a definite third at 17.4. A crushing disappointment for NBC was the sad showing of the network's prestigious "King" special; the first of three episodes finished last (64th) among all prime-time presentations, while the next two installments (measured in next week's summary) showed little improvement.

"Happy Days", "Laverne & Shirley" and "Three's Company" gave ABC a 1-2-3 sweep, with NBC's "Little House On The Prairie" continuing its upward trend by finishing fourth. Following were 5) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 6) "All In The Family" (CBS) 7) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC) 8) "Gator", CBS' Saturday Night Movie which was up against "King" 9) "MASH" (CBS) and 10) "Rhoda" (CBS). CBS took five of the top ten places.

ABC barely missed walking off with a sweep of Arbitron's New York and Los Angeles ratings for the week ending February 10, with NBC managing to capture bottom positions in both cities. "Laverne & Shirley" and "Happy Days" led in New York, with "Fish" a surprisingly strong third. Next came 4) ABC's Anniversary Special, "Three's Company," and "Welcome Back Kotter" tled 7) ABC's Monday Night Movie 8) "Eight Is Enough" 9) "Charlie's Angels," and 10) NBC's "Dean Martin Roast." In Los Angeles, "Happy Days" led "Laverne & Shirley," with the ABC Anniversary Special capturing third place, followed by 4) "Three's Company" 5) "Love Boat" 6) "Fantasy Island" (a recent addition to the ABC Saturday schedule) 7) "Eight Is Enough" and 8) a tie between the ABC Monday Movie, "CHiPs" (on NBC), and "Soap."

Continuing last week's breakdown of Arbitron's Fall 1977 TV SuperSweep, the results for Total Women and Total Men showed both sexes sharing a liking for shows like "Happy Days" (No. 1 with women, 2 with men), "Laverne & Shirley" (tied for first with women, tied for third with men), "60 Minutes" (3 and 1 respectively), and interestingly, "Charlie's Angels" (7 with women, 6 with men). Major differences were "The Waltons" and "Little House On The Prairie" (4 and 5 among women, unplaced in the top ten for men) and football telecasts unsurprisingly placing high on the Total Men list and nowhere for women.

Teens ranked "Happy Days," "Laverne & Shirley" and "Charlie's Angels" 1-2-3, and registered strong support for teen-idol-centered shows like "Starsky & Hutch," "Welcome Back Kotter," and "The Hardy Boys" which did not appear in the Total Men and Total Women top ten lists. The Total Children poll showed "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" on top, with entries like "Disney" (third), "Donny & Marie" (4), "The Hardy Boys" (6), and "Wonder Woman" (9) making a strong appearance. The overall TV Households standings (detailed last week) contain 5 ABC shows, three from CBS, and two (numbers 9 and 10) NBC entries.

Attempt To Halt Brand-Name TV Ads Aimed At Children

A petition filed by three concerned organizations has asked the FTC to stop all brandname television advertisements aimed at preschool-age children. Representatives of the Consumers Union, the Committee on Children's Television, and Public Advocates, Inc. said that such advertising is "inherently unfair and deceptive" because children of that age cannot analyze or evaluate the claims of the spots. The petition continued, "A commercial is as real to a child as a pet dog." It also asked that advertising aimed at older children be balanced with. He went on, "Any affirmation of fact or promise made by the seller to the buyer as relates PSA's paid by advertisers which emphasized nutritional and consumer awareness. The FTC is to the goods as the basis of a bargain creates a warranty." An attorney representing the currently studying possible regulations of children-aimed advertising.

National Public Radio Sets Arts Showcase For May

National Public Radio and its member stations are planning a showcase of over 80 hours of arts/entertainment programming for May, under the title "Public Radio Arts Month." Livingston Biddle. Chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, which is working on the project with NPR, said that the showcase should "serve as a model for broadcasters throughout the country, commercial as well as non-commercial." Programming includes live national broadcasts of folk, jazz and classical music, drama, entertainment, and documentaries, and the first musical around the theme of avoiding health perils and reducing hospital facility use. The radio spots, produced for network radio in 25 years—a new production of George and Ira Gershwin's 1924 play "Lady Be Good."

Radio, TV Debut Minnesota Court Coverage

Electronic media coverage, consisting of a television camera, three minicams, and radio recording equipment, was premiered at a hearing of the Minnesota Supreme Court last week. Previously the state had banned broadcast coverage. The trial itself was part of a longstanding case involving pollution charges against a mining company; broadcasters were hopeful of future chances to cover felony trials and more dramatic lawsuits if this first experiement proved has resulted in a record-setting \$500,000 fine for STP and a precedent-setting corrective ad acceptable

Astor Appointed VP/GM At KORJ-FM

N. Arthur Astor has been named Vice President/General Manager at KORJ-FM/Orange. California by K-Orange Broadcasting Corp. Adamson Named President/GM Of KBIG/KBRT

lack Adamson has been appointed President and General Manager of Bonneville's Los Angeles radio outlets, KBIG and KBRT/Avalon (on Catalina Island). Joseph L. Dorton, who had previously held the position, has been promoted to President of Bonneville's radio rep firm subsidiary, Torbet-Lasker, acquired in December. Adamson was most recently Vice President/ Station Manager/General Sales Manager for Bonneville's KIRO/Seattle, and has been with the company since 1968.

Ad Claims Influential As Ford Loses Suit

Ford Motor Co. was ordered to pay \$500 for damages sustained to a four-wheel drive Ford truck in off-road driving, but the implications for advertising were potentially far-reaching. Commercials depicting the Ford model F-150 driving in rough off-road conditions were shown in the Minnesota courtroom where the suit was tried, and the judge instructed the jury that "advertising becomes part of a warranty if made for the ultimate purchasers of the product." victorious plaintiff said that "the commercial represented that the truck could perform in a certain manner in a real life situation. The truck was advertised to do something the frame couldn't take...In an advertising era, a company cannot make representations and then not back them up." The attorney added that the case "does not form precedent," and Ford indicated that the verdict would have no bearing on future advertising content.

Blue Cross Sets. No. Calif. Radio Campaign

Blue Cross of Northern California is launching a concerted radio and print campaign voiced by actor Macdonald Carey, caution against alcohol, cigarettes, overweight, etc., and point out that hospital cost increases can be reduced if people take better care of themselves at home. Stations involved include KABL, KCBS, KGO, KOIT and KSFO In San Francisco; KNEW/Oakland: Sacramento's KCRA, KCTC, KEWT, KFBK, KGMS and KRAK; and KFRE, KENU, KMAK and EMJ in Fresno.

STP Corrective Ads Set New Precedent

An agreement between the FTC and STP Corporation over allegedly misleading ad claims campaign (costing another \$200,000). The ads, which have or will appear in 14 publications on a one-time basis, are not the usual correction of erroneous data-style advertisements, but highlight the FTC settlement and the size of the fine. The ad is headlined "FTC Notice," and goes on to state that STP has agreed to a "\$700,000 settlement" over "certain allegedly inaccurate advertisements." In smaller print, the company admits that tests leading to claims of reduced oil consumption thanks to STP "cannot be relied upon." According to the FTC, STP claims that its Oil Treatment resulted in a 20% oil consumption reduction were based on unreliable tests. The Commission hopes the size of the fine and the unique ad campaign, set mainly for business-related publications, will help deter similar ad violations.

McDonalds Reserves A Reading Break

McDonalds restaurants are developing daily newspapers containing capsule summaries of news, sports and weather-printed on placemats. Four New York City franchises are using the "McDonalds New York Report" with breakfast; and reportedly, if the three-week pilot program works, the entire chain will start publishing rehashed news with hashed brown potatoes.

Warner Cable Cites "QUBE" Success

The two-way QUBE cable system, premiered in Columbus, Ohio in December 1977, is a success, according to Warner Cable. The company has made a franchise proposal to Fort Wayne, Indiana, with another proposal planned for Pittsburgh; and new urban franchises

According to the company, 13,000 Columbus subscribers (half of the total cable subscribers in town) have bought QUBE, and are using the two-way button response system avidly. A local public-service program, "Columbus Alive," is reportedly exceeding audience share of the three local commercial channels in its time spot, and local programming is being expanded from 17 to 45 hours a week. 55 students have enrolled for full-credit, tuition-paid courses offered via QUBE by local universities.

Capital Cities Profits Up

Capital Cities Communications reports annual profits up more than 21% over 1976 figures, with a \$43.2 million total (\$5.82 per share). The company's gross revenues were up almost 35%, \$306 million compared to last year's \$212 million. Fourth quarter revenues were up 50% compared to 1976, while profits increased over 25% in the same period.

Preparation For Communications Act Rewrite

Members of the House Communications Subcommittee are preparing for the proposed revision of the Communications Act with comprehensive summaries of last year's hearings on the subject, prepared by committee staffers. The summaries run over 80 pages and are strict summaries of testimony, without opinions or proposals. Prospects for revision of the Act are still viewed as uncertain.

Restaurants Offer Discounts For Elderly

Restaurant chains across the country are courting the senior citizens market by advertising and promoting special discount or smaller portion plans to attract a healthy portion of the 23 million-strong age group. In Ohio, a state program offering discounts from 2 to 50% at 20,000 business establishments has gathered a 55% response, with 600,000 of the state's 1.1 million 65 plus residents signed up. Arthur Treacher's Fish & Chips offers a Thrifty Sixty Club with a card entitling bearer to 10% discounts, while Sambo's in California offers both a 10% discount and smaller portions. Kentucky Fried Chicken. Bonanza Steak Houses, and McDonalds have no national programs, but individual franchises have been offering senior citizen discounts





Cover Battles/Competitive Combat

Cover battles have been with us since the beginning of recorded music. They are caused very often by what two or more parties consider to be a "hit song." That song is then recorded and released simultaneously by two or more different artists. When that situation exists, we have a "cover battle."

I thought it would be interesting to get a few opinions from both sides of the fence regarding cover battles and see if perhaps some consensus of thought could be determined on a subject that affects both radio programmers and record companies.

RADIO

The question posed was a simple one: "What do you do when confronted with a cover battle?"

Les Garland of KFRC/San Francisco..."What I have consistently done in my career, when there is a battle like that and especially when it's close at all, we refuse to play either one. We wait, watching every station that is playing one or the other, to see which one will emerge as the hit. I honestly think that's all you can do."

Jimi Fox of KCBQ/San Diego..."Cover battles are real interesting, but it's like the programmer's pain in the ear. It really depends on which way the audience goes. You have to deal with your audience's wants and needs and if they end up liking both versions, then you have to live with their decision. Normally I would start out playing both versions, if both records were real hot, and let the audience make its decision."

Beau Matthews of 96KX/Denver... "Since we do interviews on the telephone every week, we ask the people which one they prefer. We'll play them 5-10-15 seconds, whatever it takes, of each version, total up the points and whichever one emerges, that's the one we'll play. It's as simple as that."

Rob Conrad of KING/Seattle..."Usually what we've done is wait. You don't like to 'pop one' and find out later on that it's the loser. That's always the big question that comes up: which version will win? And it's frustrating sometimes but that's our position."

Dale O'Brien of Z-93/Atlanta..."Usually we'll listen to all versions and then make a judgment. We seldom step out on one until we've heard all the versions. First we decide which we like, and then determine how long we should wait or if we should go right away. We try to give everyone the opportunity of hearing all versions before we make a decision."

Ron Riley of WCAO/Baltimore..."I usually wait it out. That might be the 'chicken's way' of doing it, but I find it more advantageous not to get involved. I figure let the best man win. Generally speaking, we'll wait for the winner to emerge."

Dick Bozzi of CKLW/Detroit..."We've taken stands for one record over another in the past, but it's always the one that seems to be 'breaking.' The one that looks like the hit is the one we'll play. Personal feelings shouldn't have anything to do with what music you program anyway, so to take a shot on either isn't fruitful, if that decision is based on your personal feelings. I will usually wait and see which version is proven by our competitors."

RECORDS

The problems for radio are usually easy to define: either you make a decision and go early with one version or you wait for one of the versions to emerge as the winner. The recording industry faces multiple problems when it comes to cover battles.

Again, the same question: "What do you do when confronted with a cover battle?"

Bob Sherwood of Columbia Records..."I don't like them. I have never liked them. I didn't like them when I was in radio and I like 'em even less now, for one reason; there are very few winners. The most important thing we do is try to advance artist's careers and I hate to put more variables than are absolutely necessary into the career of an artist. The one plus thing about cover battles is that you get your whole field force up, you get 'em crazy. You get them really fired up. Part of what we have to do is 'turn on' our'own company and 'turn on' radio to the excitement of our music. However, I hate to use a cover battle to do that. You have to expend great amounts of effort and in doing so, you have to take away efforts from other acts. A company like ours exists on the development of new acts. I would hate to be put in the position of pulling effort away from one of those emerging acts because a competitive situation forced a cover battle. I don't want to play with an artist's career that way."

Bruce Wendell of Capitol Records..."You pull out all the stops. You've gotta 'rev' your people up. It's your credibility as a record company, your delivery power... this is where we separate the men from the boys. If the records are both good records, the best promotion staff is going to win. Besides advertising everywhere and showing a tremendous commitment in that area, on a national level we go for a total blitz. It's a battle of airplay."

Kenny Buttice of Elektra/Asylum Records... "We try to avoid cover battles. When cover battles happen I think in 90 percent of the cases neither record survives unharmed. Also, when you enter into a battle you run the risk of ignoring other product you may have out at the same time. You must spend so much time and promotional effort fighting the cover battle that you do a real injustice to other artists you should be working at that time. When a cover battle is unavoidable, we make a total company commitment to secure and back up airplay for our version."

Within the framework of the recording industry, cover battles are either a great way to inspire your promotional staff or a real liability to the specific artist and your entire roster in general. In reality, both sides of the coin are valid. The amount of promotional adrenalin generated by this form of competition can be beneficial. But in the end, when the winner is declared or decided, victims do remain. Perhaps, if there is a real winner in any cover battle between artists, that winner is the publisher!

KRBE/On Top In Houston

It's official, Houston is now the "youngest" major market in the United States. According to figures from the Houston Chamber of Commerce, the median age in Houston, Texas is 26. As a point of reference, the former youngest city was Atlanta, which now (like fine wine) is aging. The Peachtree City's median age is 27 and Denver has an average age of 28.

With so many young people in Houston it's not surprising that the five "contemporary music" stations control an amazing 30 percent of the radio audience! On top of all radio stations in Houston is KRBE, programmed by Clay Gish.

Clay has been credited with "breaking" a lot of records from his Houston base but his numbers in the latest Arbitron indicate there's more to it than just music. I spoke with Clay trying to pin down just what music philosophy KRBE was finding so successful? "The big trump," he explained, "has been that KRBE as a radio station, not necessarily a Top 40 radio station, is on top of what's happening musically. That's why we have been credited with breaking as many records as we have. Not because I was looking to be a 'hero,' but because to program my radio station to win, I've got to be out in front. I can't wait for somebody else to show me what to do."

The competitive situation in Houston is Fierce with KILT, KILT-FM, KAUM, KLOL and KRBE all going after primarily the same demographics. And the fact that Houston contains so many persons within the "younger" demographics perhaps explains why all five stations are doing well.

So what puts KRBE ahead of all the competition? Clay said, "This is the first Top 40 radio station that I can listen to. And I can listen to it for days! It doesn't fatigue you at all musically. It's very interesting." As to the actual music programmed

on KRBE, Clay was emphatic, "I play no 'bubblegum' music and yet we have one of the higher shares of teens in the United States. When I first came to KRBE, we were the first FM station in the market to play any Black music at all. We began playing the Black music that the kids liked. We literally brought 'boogie-type dance music' to FM."

So the traditional teen-oriented records are ignored at KRBE, but the really interesting aspect of Clay's music lies in his oldies. "Our oldies are primarily AOR classics." The station makes heavy use of image artists. The Beach Boys, Linda Ronstadt, Chicago, Beatles and Fleetwood Mac are just some of the many artists featured on KRBE. However, the "hit single" is not always the most programmed cut. Clay does program album cuts and recognizes the importance of album product to his audience. He explained, "Our competition is coming from the AOR stations. When that new Jackson Browne album comes out, if you're not playing "Running On Empty" and some other cuts, you're behind! And you can't win if you're always behind."

Clay often features new albums by image artists when they are released. He will take a new Eagles album, for example, and play several cuts for the first few days of its release. Then, as his research can focus in on the "best" cut or cuts, those will be added to regular rotation. It's a part of the image that Clay has created for KRBE, "I want people in Houston to know that if they're not listening to KRBE they're missing out on something. If there's an album coming out, if there's a concert coming, KRBE's talking about it."

If the music on KRBE leans toward AOR in content, the presentation of the format is still very Top 40. As Clay put it, "We have all the elements of Top 40 radio that are enjoyable. We have personality jocks, who have a good time on the air. We have big promotions and good promotions." The station averages 100 pairs of concert tickets per major event in Houston. Clay actually has his people wait in line to purchase tickets to give away on the air in contests. "Sometimes I buy all three of the front rows to give away on the air."

Clay summed it all up, "I'm taking the best of AOR music, only the best, and presenting it in an exciting, energetic, Top 40 radio station." With a 9.2 total share of the Houston audience and an impressive 31.3 share of the teens, the KRBE approach is obviously successful.




Dallas Dateline



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Oon't Stop The (Playboy)

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A Conversation With Randy Michaels, PD **Ted Cramer, MD**

In the recent past, most operators of Country music radio stations resigned themselves to secondary roles in the broadcasting community. But times have changed; the modern Country music stations now compete with longstanding heavyweights and with increasing frequency, are winning. Utilizing new, young blood and pursuing audiences by spending large sums of money, Country stations in New York, Minneapolis, Los Angeles, Chicago, Detroit, and Kansas City, among others, are making inroads on audience cumes and advertisers' dollars; and the big Rockers and Pop/Adult stations are starting to

One such aggressive station is WDAF/Kansas City, Missouri. The young blood at WDAF is Program Director Randy Michaels. At 25, Michaels is a six-year veteran at Taft Broadcasting, WDAF's parent company. He joined WGR/Buffalo in 1971, moved to Q102/Cincinnati

(Top 40) and joined WDAF as a Programmer in 1976.

Michaels shares honors at WDAF with Kansas City radio veteran Ted Cramer, the Music Director. Cramer started his Country career in 1952, and came to Kansas City with KCKN in 1959, becoming PD in 1962 and holding that position until 1973. In 1971 he also took on the PD position at WUBE/ Cincinnati while retaining his KCKN duties. After programming WWOK/ Miami, Cramer was recruited by Michaels to join WDAF.

Within less than a year, the programming policies of Michaels and Cramer's musical planning have pushed WDAF to the number two rating slot in the nation's 28th market. Over a four-book trend, WDAF practically doubled its audience share in all dayparts. Michaels and Cramer detail their game plan in the following R&R interview, conducted by R&R Associate Editor Hugh Cherry.

R&R: How do you feel about some of the cliches which have come into general usage in the programming of Country music. I refer to "Hard Country," "too Country," etc., etc? MICHAELS: Well, we make some judgements about how "Country" and how "Hard Country" the music we play may be. How compatible it is with a Pop/Adult audience. This is a Country market and always has been. Country music has always been strong in this market and we don't really think the music can be "too Country" for us to play. We're not "Cross-Country," we're not "Pop-Country." We're a Country station! We play Moe Bandy, Webb Pierce, George Jones, Hank Williams. We are a Country radio station and we are proud of it. We see no need to "apologize" for playing Country

your jocks.

MICHAELS: Here's the way we work it. We researched the market thoroughly. We structured and we set up a counter-programming format to compete effectively with the market. Then we gave our guys the guidelines and tell 'em to "go break 'em." But they are told that if they break the guidelines, have a good reason. For instance, if a jock knows that according to our format he's supposed to be playing one of the five or six hottest records in town..:PLAY IT! That's the format. However, if he's got a great bit coming, for instance, if he's been building up for an hour that he's gonna be talking to Johnny Cash, that's the place to

R&R: Tell us about the guidelines you have formulated for talk to Cash. That's the time to throw the format out the window. He's supposed to go with what makes the most sense to him. But the jock does not break the format unless he's got a better idea and he is expected to have a better idea on a regular basis. If we didn't have guys who knew the music and knew the business and were being creative and throwing the format out the window, every once in a while, it wouldn't work. We'd be mechanical...we could put in six big tape machines and walk away.

> R&R: In giving your jocks the prerogative to "bend" the format, would you identify yours as a looser format than most? CRAMER: No. There are certain principles in getting a good book that just make for good broadcasting, but like Randy said, if you've got something that's really gonna smoke for you, and it might be an interview with Cash, hey, that's great programming. There's nothing wrong with that.

> R&R: Then WDAF encourages creativity in its air talent... CRAMER: Yes, we do. I think that radio has, in many instances, gone too much to liner cards, lack of freedom and total structure. I don't think that it's good for the industry. That procedure, at other stations, is good for us, because, in our case, the competition has a lot of kids on the air, reading liner cards. The freedom of our jocks is a great advantage for us.

> R&R: Let's talk about the two of you, Randy 'Michaels and Ted Cramer. Ted, I assume that there is an age difference between you and Randy. How much?

CRAMER: About seventeen years.

R&R: Where were you and what were you doing when Randy put this team together?

CRAMER: I was PD at WWOK/Miami and he brought

R&R: Randy, what motivated you to bring in Ted, who, based on age and experience, might be called an "old hillbilly?" MICHAELS: Not by me. Ted Cramer is one of the most current, contemporary capable guys in the broadcasting business. I thought that seeking out Ted Cramer was pretty smart a year ago and I've had no reason to change my mind. When Taft Broadcasting said take WDAF and do something with it, they were very surprised and, frankly, concerned, when we went Country.

Now everybody is saying it was a great idea and it was mine. Quite a few have taken the credit for the idea because it is working so well, but that's not important. I wanted a man who knew Country music. I was alreedy a big fan of Country music of the old timers. But I wanted a guy who had played Country and worked in it. I particularly wanted a guy who knew Country music in Kansas City. One who knew the musical tastes of the area. One who knew what the local Country hits had been, who was aware of the songs which had been national hits but had not caught on in Kansas City. There was no one more qualified than Ted. As we investigated, Ted Cramer's name kept popping up. We got in touch with him and talked with him and it didn't take long to figure out that Ted Cramer knows more about radio in general and Country music in particular than most guys in the business. He has incredible depth in radio and particularly in the Kansas City market. These credentials made him invaluable to us. Having Cramer on your team is the difference between winning and losing. By bringing in Ted, who really knows the business and knows the market, I've made it easy for myself.

R&R: Ted, you were a Program Director in Miami radio. Why would you want to leave the Sun Belt and return to Kansas City as a Music Director?

CRAMER: There were several reasons. First, it offered me an opportunity to come home, to the place where I was born and raised. And, of course, I know the market here. Equally important, I was extremely impressed with Randy

R&R: Had you known him earlier?

CRAMER: No. But in having a number of conversations with him, prior to taking the job, I found that he does have a tremendous depth in and appreciation for Country music. He knows the songs. He is familiar with the artists and their various styles. He knew exactly what he wanted to do. His programming philosophy and mine coincide. We program much the same way. The chemistry between us is good. Moreover, WDAF is probably one of the top paying radio stations in the country. The station's facilities are excellent and the operation, at the time that we took it over, presented a real challenge, to both of us. I've never felt that the move from PD to MD was a step back. Moreover, I grew up with WDAF. The Kansas City Star put the station on the air in 1922, so it is an institution in Kansas City. I'm very proud of my affiliation with the

R&R: Randy, tell me about your air personalities and what you look for in them

MICHAELS: We're looking for guys who know Country music and who have good radio basics. We want people who are creative, whom we can turn loose a bit. Give them a format and let them bend it. Our morning man is Jim Tyler. Jim came to us from WPLO/Atlanta. He's 28 and single. He has good pipes. He digs Country music and has played it. He knows what he's doing. From 9 to 12 noon, we have David Lawrence. He had been here under the old format as the morning man. Because David had a good following in the market and he had enjoyed some good numbers. There was Country music in his background. He has adapted well, with super numbers. Ted Cramer does noon til 3. Our 3 to 7 man is Dale Somers. He is well acquainted in Nashville, and is, next to Ted, probably our best authority on Country music. Paul Mallory, our "swing" man is currently on 7 to Midnight. We had a gal in that time slot and she left to get married. We are currently looking for another lady jock to put in that time slot. We have some interesting prospects but we certainly haven't closed yet. Our midnight slot is filled by Phil Young. Phil is a Kansas City fellow. He was at KC's KAYQ before coming to 61 Country. On March 1, Phil will be kicking off our "Truckin' Show." We will be programming to our broadcast area, from Indianapolis to Denver and from the Dakotas into Texas. We will concentrate on that area with weather, road conditions. We will be set up with the Highway Patrols of the various states for road reports blanks at truck stops within four or five hundred miles of Kansas City, so that drivers can drop us requests with their "handles" and so forth. Were planning to do some remotes from truck stops, close to Kansas City. As soon as the word got out that we were going to feature a "Trucker's Show," the sponsors began coming in, unsolicited. We go on the air with the show with several truck stop sponsors, along with Kansas City Peterbilt. Ted, Phil and I are quite excited about the new show. R&R: The opinion is held by some in Country music that the "hard-core" Country audience is largely ignored by many modern Country radio stations. Do you consider this audience in your

programming?



In continuing promotion, WDAF has used a total of 129 busboards, busbacks and billboards in Kansas City.

MICHAELS: Yes, absolutely! We feel that we have an obligation to maximize the audience...to maximize the spot cost and make some money for Taft Broadcasting so that we and the staff can be well-paid. For these reasons, we keep abreast of what's going on. We don't ignore the changes which are occurring in Country music. We find a place in the format for Linda Ronstadt. Personally, I think that it's great that a gal as popular as Linda has her roots in Country music. We find a place for Emmylou Harris. But we don't ignore the base audience of Country music. If we get too far to the left, too close to Pop/Adult and Rock, we can lose our base audience...we can blow it. We play Carl Smith and Hank Thompson and Hank Williams. If we don't, we're leaving ourselves wide open for someone to waltz into the market, play the whole spectrum of Country, and kick us to the bottom of the heap. We are striving diligently to retain our musical identity. We're Country and we're proud of it. If we were ashamed of being Country, we'd lose

R&R: Do you feel that the Pop influence in Country music is too prominent?

MICHAELS: I see it going both ways. For instance, Debby Boone, who isn't very Country, is getting played by all the Country stations. On the other hand, Dolly Parton, who is pretty Country, is also played by all formats. Kenny Rogers, Crystal Gayle and Glen Campbell are played by all formats. Country music is, all of a sudden, very fashionable, very hip and the Pop/Adult stations are picking up on the most compatible of Country music and playing it. I'm not sure that's not good for us. For instance, many people, who have believed that "hillbilly" music represented folks with menure on their boots who drink a lot and have no teeth, are exposed to Country music and before they know it, they begin broadening their musical taste to include Johnny Cash, Milsap is OK with them and, before they know it, they're listening to Hank Williams and saying, "Hey, that's pretty good stuff." Country listeners have come out of the closet. We are not a Pop/Adult station. WDAF is a Country music radio station. I know of stations which play it but will not say the word "country." They feel that the mention of the word is negative to their image. We don't feel that way. R&R: Do you daypart?

MICHAELS: We'll daypart a little bit. We do a good deal of research. This is where I'm talking about applying good, modern radio basics to Country music. You know, contemporary radio stations do better in the Arbitron books because they study them. They go to Beltsville every year when the book comes out, they go through the diaries, they determine average listening spans, when people tune in, when they tune out, where they go

to. We do the same thing. We figure out how many minutes a person listens to morning drive and aftenoon drive and middays and nighttime. We use those kinds of facts and figures to tailor our programming. For instance, in morning drive, when the aveage listening span might be anywhere from 15 to 18 minutes, we don't get into the kind of involved set which requires listening for forty minutes. But middays we might get into a thing about Hank Williams at ten after and run it for an hour and a half, because the audience is there and you can get a little deeper and you can take a little more time and you can grab a little more of their attention. The same thing is true on the late evening or overnight show. You can spend a little more time in something that involves some kind of continuity. Whereas, in drive time, you just can't hold 'em that long, and if you do it, you're just kidding yourself. Yeah, we'll daypart a hit. You'll hear more Jim Reeves and Hank Williams in the midday show, when the auience can take a little time with it, but not in morning drive. But the decision is based on pretty good research. About nighttime programming-early on in the evening, when the available audience is a little younger, we keep the tempo up a little more. We're certainly not into "Progressive Country." We keep it pretty Country 24 hours a day, but we're a little more uptempo in the early evening. Then after 10 pm, there's comedy, classics, and we feature a particular artist or album at 11 pm nightly. During the day, we promote whatever the 11 pm feature will be-a Kitty Wells album. Waylon & Willie, whatever it might be. We also feature "Specials" in the time slot—quite often, interviews.

R&R: During your first year of Country operation, have you vaned your initial programming policies?

MICHAELS: Some, but not a great deal. I think that a radio station that is not changing gets stale. On the other hand, I never want our listeners tó discern a change. We never announce a change. We never make an abrupt change. We do it gradually. We always try to project six months of programming ahead. We decide where we want to be in six months. We agree on the things that we want to change. For instance, we came on with a lot of oldies. We gradually phased them out. Our audience began calling and writing and asking why we stopped playing the Carlisles and others. We gradually phased more oldies back into the format and now we are playing more than we were playing before. But we do those things slowly. We have to change, so that six months from now the radio station isn't stagnant, but none of our listeners goes to bed on Sunday and gets up Monday and feels that the radio station has made some radical changes. We move but we move slowly. I feel that this is an essential part of our success.

R&R: What is your target audience?

John Wagner, a member of the WDAF News staff, reports traffic conditions from a fixed wing plane and is one of the most respected reporters in the Kansas City market.

MICHAELS: Actually, I think we cover a wide spectrum of age groups. By definition, the agencies all want 18 to 54. Realistically, I think we're more 25 to 54 than 18 to 54. We do have a significantly young audience. Although we don't target for them, Country is showing some big increases in teens here in Kansas City. Maybe they're getting turned on to Country music because their Moms are listening to it. I don't know. But we're getting some of them. I believe, however, that 25 to 54 is our primary target group. RER: What about the marketing techniques at WDAF?

MICHAELS: We use, more than anything, a strong book, and of course, our ratings get a lot of the buys. A lot of the agencies say if you're one or two, I'll buy, if you're number three, I won't. In those cases, we sell by the numbers. But if you sell only by the numbers, you can also lose if you have a bad book. Actually, we sell the phenomenal results this radio station pulls. We've often had the situation where we go out to a car dealer, do a three hour remote and sell 27 cars. Country music and this radio station produce results. We have great music. We have personalities. Our people are not just reading cards, they're not just voices. They are real folks. They are all salesmen and good ones. We produce results. When we advertise your product, people go in the store and get it. That's what we sell. R&R: To what extent does the radio station involve itself in the community?

MICHAELS: We're all over. We have a 28-foot mobile studio which we take out on location all the time. The mobile unit is at all Country personal appearance shows. We broadcast, through the unit, a series of Country music shows from a local park. We do the City Firemen's Picnic, openings, broadcasts from shopping malls. Anything that's going on, we like to be there broadcasting. Recently, there was a young man in the area, who accidentally shot his fourteen year old brother in the neck in a hunting accident. The fourteen year old was paralyzed from the neck down. The family needed \$40,000 for intricate surgery in Denver. WDAF got involved and raised almost \$50,000 in a little less than three weeks. The money was turned over to the family for the surgery.

RER: Tell us about your promotions.

MICHAELS: Kansas City is a very aggressive town on

promotions. The big Pop/Adult station here gave away \$20,000 in cash, \$10,000 in gold and jewels and a great amount in trade and merchandise during the last rating period. Tod Storz' station gave away tons of money during the book. So, to be competitive, we've given away some big money prizes and we've been on television. For instance, we gave away a pickup truck with \$10,000 in the glove compartment, but we worked hard to make it so exciting that the listeners responded.

CRAMER: Our logo was on the truck. I got a call the other day from a gas station attendant in Salinas, Kansas, 225 miles away, to tell us that the truck was at his service station. They were deluxe trucks. They had everything except a gunrack in the rear window.

MICHAELS: We have promoted the station competitively. We've taken it from about a 180,000 cume audience with the previous Pop/Adult operation to over 500,000. And we did it with Country. You have to get out and promote to make that kind of progress in one year.

CRAMER: We had over forty Country music concerts last year alone.

R&R: Do you tie in with the promoter or do you package and promote the shows yourself?

MICHAELS: We often help select the talent, using talent that we know will draw in our area. We participate in a lot of the details. We often broadcast the show, provide one of our jocks to MC the show.

RER: Aren't most shows preset by the booker, where he books the talent and offers them to you as a package?

MICHAELS: That happens often, particularly with Waylon & Willie and stars of that caliber. However, we just put together our own package and we will stage our own show here with Conway Twitty, Sonny James, Billy "Crash" Craddock, in a few weeks. We're packaging this one ourselves.

R&R: What kind of music research do you do?

CRAMER: It's extensive and in-depth. We check sales in record shops, one-stops, rackers through the entire coverage area. I'll even call J.L. Marsh in Des Moines. We not only consider our audience in Kansas City but we have a tremendous out-state audience and we are interested in what is happening with music in those areas too.

RER: Does your audience have any input where the music

CRAMER: Yes, they do. The jocks can take calls on the air. The listener can speak to the jock any time he wants to. We keep track of all positive and negative comments. We keep track of our demographics on each call and what they're asking for. We also have a very effective system of passive research. At least 100 calls are made each week. I don't want to get into the specifics of the system, for obvious reasons. But it's served us well. It gives us a big edge on checking on negatives on certain records.

R&R: How effective is the process?

MICHAELS: You can't really call a guy to find out what new records to add because he doesn't know. You'll find a lot of systems, and I don't really mean to malign them, the Jack McCoy Ram System and the Dr. Ernie Martin, over in Kansas, here. They'il call up and they'll play about 20 seconds of a song and ask, "Do you like it?" And if the guy says "Yes," they'll put it on the radio. It takes a few listens just to hear the hook line of a song. I don't believe that a listener with one hearing can tell if it's a hit or not. With our research, we can find out about 'em going in and we can also find out when to pull 'em. When the audience is burned out on a song, you'd better get it off the air for a while.

CRAMER: We have another way of checking out a record. We did it recently with Waylon & Willie's "I Can Get Off On You." We tested the record ahead of time. We did some phone testing but we also brought some people who were active listeners to Contry music into the radio station. We called them up and asked if they would like to come down and listen to a record. Most of those we called, if they had the time, came into the radio station. We gave them some coffee and donuts and played the record for them and asked their opinion. Thus, they participated in the programming of the radio station and they felt good about it. MICHAELS: Our FM station (KY-102) has an "advisory council," made up of different listeners each week, who come in and listen to records and discuss promotions and ideas and provide real input in the station's programming. They help decide what goes on the station... or what comes off. We're thinking about using the procedure at WDAF.

CRAMER: The listeners are the ones we've got to please. I don't think that a PD can shoot from the hip on certain records. I don't think that we all have the savvy to say, "I don't want to play it because...." For instance, the Waylon & Willie, with its reference to dope. I don't think that many PD's or MD's really know. Randy and I talked about it and we both agreed that this was a good record. But where should

we go from here? Previously, drug-oriented lyrics have been negatives for certain records. We asked ourselves, are we going to go by past history in Country music or do what the people say? We decided to do some research and find out if there are any negatives on that record. The only way you can find out is go to the people who listen to your radio station. Find out if they like it or not.

R&R: Outline for us your basis for musical choice.

CRAMER: Generally, there are several things to consider. Number one is the sound and target of the radio station at the particular time you are considering adding a record. I think that's pretty basic. In addition to that, there's tracking a particular record and its appeal. We do the passive research to determine the positives and negatives on certain records. We try to play the hits. We're pretty tightly formatted. But you can set five push-buttons on Country music in this market. So the competition is fierce.

MICHAELS: We recognize that there are different kinds of Country stations doing different jobs for the industry. Because we're a big station, we need those big ratings to do the big stuff that we're doing. Thus, we play the hits. We have a fairly tight playlist. We expose the current product. Our playlist is thirty, plus a few. Instead of playing 50-60-70 or 100 records (we don't think you can give that many proper exposure) we feature the thirty about every four hours or so. And Country records are selling in this market, better than ever before. Then we fill the programming out with a good list of classics. We go way back in our library. We feature Bob Wills, Ernest Tubb and Jimmie Rodgers' classics. So, to make room for the classics, we hold it to about a thirty list, on a four hour rotation and fill in with the oldies.

R&R: Do you introduce many records?

MICHAELS: There are so many Country signals in this market and they are doing most of the introduction of new records. There's a lot of smaller stations around the area and they expose almost everything. From them we get the feel of what the audience really wants to hear.

CRAMER: Obviously, there are certain records, by hot artists, by artists who may be scheduled for a local appearance, perhaps one of our concerts, and that can make a difference. For instance, Paycheck had been in town and gave us an acetate of "Take This Job And Shove It." I think that we were the first station in the country to play the record. We saw from the response at his concert that the audience went for it, so we put it right on the air. Conversely, we don't get on a record just because it gets a good listing in R&R. We watch it and if it has staying power, we play it. Also, we often get on a record before it shows in R&R. We rely on response. If there is none, off it comes.

R&R: What about album play on WDAF?

MICHAELS: We're just starting now. This is one of the gradual changes we're undertaking. In this instance, it's to expose some of the album product.

CRAMER: As we mentioned earlier, we feature albums on the feature slot at 11 pm. I often play the album in its entirety and take phone calls when it is finished to discern the audience's favorite cuts. And those are the ones we'll feature.

R&R: Since the TV operation is owned and operated by Taft, do you get much promotion from the TV side?

MICHAELS: Well, You can get in some legal trouble if you use each other too much. We're pretty independent but we do trade some spots with them and get some good TV times and they are also pretty good about covering our events. When we have a big concert, they are usually there. They helped a lot on the recent fundraising effort for the boy who was shot. R&R: What about your outdoor promotion, signboards and that sort of thing?

MICHAELS: We've used them quite successfully. We used 54 outdoor billboards, which is about 60 GRP's in Kansas City. We had 50 bus boards and 25 bus backs since last fall to get the message out. We've successfully used multi-media to raise awareness that we're here. We've spent a lot of money on the outside and yet, every week, people still come up or call and say, "Are you new? We just found you on the dial." R&R: What are your future plans?

MICHAELS: Gotta keep playin' that Country music and having a good time. We take all of this only half-seriously. We plan to research this market more dilgently, but that's part of the fun. And we're just going to continue to do things a little better, hopefully. We've learned a little about the concert business. We plan to get out into the community more. Fine tuning, that's what it's all about. There's always need for fine tuning on the format. That's where we are right now and hope to continue the process in the future.
