Wittberger Named Downe Broadcasting President

Russell G. Wittberger has been appointed President of the Downe Broadcasting Group (formerly Bartell Broadcasting). Interim head Robert J. Smith resumes his position as Vice President/Treasurer of the company. Along with Wittberger's appointment, Downe announced that its corporate headquarters will be moved from New York to San Diego, with Wittberger, Smith, and National Program Director Charlie Lake all basing themselves in the new location.

Wittberger had been Vice President/General Manager of Downe's KCBQ- in San Diego for the last four years. He is currently visiting the Downe Group's radio outlets, including WOKY in Milwaukee, WADO/New York, KSLQ/St. Louis, WDRQ/Detroit, and WMJX/Miami in addition to KCBQ.

Wittberger told R&R that former Bartell President George Wilson had been retained by Downe as a consultant to upper level management on future market expansion plans. Wittberger indicated that the company was looking to expand, with particular interest in acquiring FM facilities in Milwaukee and San Diego to supplement Downe's existing AM outlets in those cities.

Re-indictment Viewed As "Likely"

Charges Dismissed In Denver Case

Criminal impersonation and conspiracy charges against KHOW/Denver Program Director Hal Moore and News Director Rodney Elliott Stambaugh were dismissed by Judge Susan Barnes Friday (3-10). The judge ruled that allegations against the pair in connection with alleged tampering with April/May 1976 Arbitron diaries "weren't sufficiently specific."

Defense attorneys for Moore and Stambaugh (known professionally as Bud Elliott) argued that the indictments handed down by a Grand Jury February 2 did not comply with a Colorado Supreme Court ruling which set specific guidelines on the "explicitness" of such charges. Judge Barnes agreed with their arguments, and stated she was "convinced" that the indictments were "insufficient" and too vague

to be pursued. "The object of the conspiracy is not sufficiently described in the indictments," her ruling stated in part, "to enable the defendants to know what charge they must meet."

Deputy District Attorney Richard Spriggs told a Denver newspaper after the ruling that his office will either return the matter to the Grand Jury; which could "reissue more specific charges," or will file new, more specific charges directly. Sprigg said it was "highly unlikely" that the matter would be dropped. The Grand Jury, meanwhile, continued its investigation into Denver radio diary distortion instances, with charges against other Denver radio personnel still anticipated.

Doubleday Sells KRIZ To Family Life

Doubleday Broadcasting has sold its Phoenix Top 40 station, KRIZ, to Family Life Radio, a religious broadcast organization with religious-formatted stations in Arizona and Michigan. Doubleday President Gary Stevens told R&R that the sale had been completed and "the assumption is they'll go religious with it. Family Life Broadcast Ad-

ministrator Randy Carlson confirmed Stevens' assumption, stating that pending FCC approval, "the format will be very similar to what is currently on KFLT/Tucson," another Family Life religious station. "It is primarily high quality religious music," Carlson explained. "Middle-of-the-road-

Combined Communications, Sonderling Halt Trading For Important Transaction Announcements

Combined Communications Corp. and Sonderling Broadcasting Corp. both had trading of their stock halted last week as both companies held talks with unidentified companies on possible acquisitions and other transactions. Trading of Combined stock was halted on the New York Stock Exchange Friday (3-10), with Combined holding exploratory talks on a possible combination transaction with an unnamed company. Combined also was discussing a "significant acquisition" with another company. Both discussions were characterized as preliminary.

Sonderling was holding talks with an unidentified company on the possible acquisition of Sonderling by that company. A further announcement was expected shortly, with trading on Sonderling stock halted on the American Stock Exchange pending the announcement.

Machine Gun Exits, News Team Resigns

KHJ/Los Angeles afternoon air personality M.G. "Machine Gun" Kelly exited the station "by mutual agreement" Monday (3-13), while in an unrelated development, station News Director Dave Cooke and his morning news co-anchorman Bob Morrison announced their resignations.

KHJ Program Director John Sebastian told R&R, "M.G. Kelly and KHJ have mutually agreed that his on-air style does not comfortably mesh with the current direction that the station is taking, and it would be better for both parties for him to leave the station. We certainly wish M.G. Kelly continued success in the pursuit of his movie career." Kelly stated, "I hope they made the right decision," and stressed that he had "no hard feelings" toward KHJ. He added that the station felt, he thought, that he "had too much fun on the radio" and had "too much personality" for the afternoon air shift. He declined to announce future plans, but said he was actively pursuing his acting career.

News Director Cooke felt that "With the continuing deemphasis of news on KHJ, he and Morrison decided that they should seek positions with stations which place more importance on news," according to an official KHJ state-

Capital WNOK Purchase Approved **By FCC With Conditions**

The FCC has approved a petition by Palmetto Radio Corp. to sell WNOK-AM-FM-TV/Columbia, SC to Capital Communications, Inc., but Capital must divest itself of both radio stations within a year under the Commission's multiple ownership rules covering purchases of a TV station and an AM-FM combination in the same market. The FCC, which stated it considers such issues on a case-by-case basis, disagreed with Capital's contention that the company would not gain an unreasonable portion of the Columbia market by purchasing the three outlets. Capital also contended that the three stations should remain intact (they are located in the same building) and that the radio stations could not be

WQAL/Cleveland Renewal Hearing Set On Public Affairs Grounds

The FCC called for a hearing on the license renewal application of WQAL-FM/Cleveland because of possibly insufficient public affairs programming. According to the Commission, the SJR Communications Pop/Adult outlet devoted 3.2 percent of its broadcast content to news and 0.9 percent to public affairs during its 1973-76 license term. In its new proposal WQAL-FM planned to broadcast 2.3 percent news and 0.6 percent public affairs, a reduction which the FCC expressed a wish to discuss. The Commission also raised the possibility of occasional incorrectly-logged public affairs programming on the station.

Both the FCC and the NAB came in for strong criticism from the Chairman of the National Black Media Coalition at the National Association of Television Program Executives (NATPE) conference last week. The NAB was criticized further by a member of the National Organization of Women (NOW)'s National Media Task

Pluria Marshall of the Black Media Coalition called the FCC a joke, adding "in terms of civil rights issues the FCC does the closest thing to nothing that I can tell." He said the Coalition would resort to media blitz tactics and other "things in the future that lawyers can't get you out of,' he told broadcasters. In regard to the FCC, Marshall said "good petitions, bad petitions, neat petitions, sloppy petitions, all are summarily dismissed by the commission whether it takes two months or two years," referring to petitions to deny license renewals for broadcast properties. Turning to the NAB, he added that "we resent the idea that they still feel threatened by us even coming to NAB conventions." Marshall earlier reportedly called

the NAB "racist."

Kathy Bonk of NOW also criticized the NAB during the NATPE sessions on license renewal, urging the NAB to join the 20th century. She also urged that stations support the Equal Rights Amendment and added that NOW would be reviewing stations' employment practice in regard to the hiring

Heard stated that he was leaving in order to give himself more time for record production and writing. He said, "I leave GRT with mixed emotions. For four years this company has been like a family. I am sure, however, that everything will go smoothly, and I will be rooting for GRT Records all the way.

He was responsible for acquiring distribution rights on such records as Ronnie McDowell's "The King Is Gone," Jimmy Dean's "IOU." and Meri Wilson's "Telephone Man," as well as for signing Mel Street, Bobby G. Rice, and

Tax Evasion Indictment Against Motown Exec

Motown Executive Vice President Michael Roshkind was indicted by a federal grand jury on charges of evading payment of almost \$135,000 in federal income taxes for the years 1972 and 1973, according to a Los Angeles Times report. The twocount indictment alleges that Roshkind failed to declare some \$235,000 in income for those years. He allegedly arranged with record distributors California International Marketing Co. to hire his future wife, Dorothy Loeb, in a public relations capacity, and pay her 20 cents per Motown record sold. Ms. Loeb, who filed a joint return with Roshkind in 1973, was allegedly paid over \$235,000 in that

manner, but neither she nor Roshkind allegedly reported the income. IRS officials were expected to file a civil suit in addition to the criminal charges, to recover the \$135,000. If fraud is determined to be involved, Roshkind could face a 50 percent penalty assessment in addition.

WWL News Director Captures Robber

Dan Abernathy, News Director of WWL/New Orleans, created some news of his own by capturing a would-be robber who tried to snatch Mrs. Abernathy's wallet. Abernathy and his wife, Glynis, along with WOKY/Milwaukee morning man Steve McFarland, who was visiting the couple, were watching a jazz concert when a 17year-old youth grabbed Mrs. Abernathy's wallet from her purse. She managed to grab it back, and Abernathy and McFarland set off in pursuit of the culprit. They caught up to him a few blocks away, at which point he drew a .38caliber revolver on them. But Abernathy told him he was under arrest, and the suspect threw the gun away. Abernathy, McFarland and other onlookers guarded him until police arrived.

Check-Off Column told R&R, "Prior to this we just had a place to check off FM when you were listening to the FM dial, and when you listened to the AM dial you left the column blank." The new column asks listeners to check off either FM or AM in the appropriate place. "This seemed more equitable to everyone," Ms. Anthes continued. "The problem we found in the past is sometimes there was confusion in markets where sister AM and FM stations have the same call letters. Sometimes people would enter the AM when they meant the FM. This should help clarify that."

Farm Life Easy On The Right Tractor

Plowing the north forty can be considerably more comfortable than in past days for farmers driving GM's Diesel Allison models with all the options. The giant tractors feature closed-circuit TV systems for watching tools work, and a computer to gauge ground speed and acres worked. In addition, it carries AM-FM stereo radio, CB equipment, air conditioning, and a refrigerator.

Small Hall Approach For Aerosmith Tour

In an unusual gesture from a band which normally plays large indoor venues or stadium dates, Aerosmith has announced a national tour in 3000-seat or smaller halls which includes appearances in many smaller markets. The intent of the band is to provide fans with the opportunity to see the group under optimum conditions, and to reward original supporters of the band in cities like Albany, Providence, and Waterbury (Connecticut). A lottery arrangement has been established in which ticket requests will be channelled to a local radio station in each town, with a drawing held for actual tickets.

Cooke's Widow Seeks "Holly" Halt

Barbara Cooke Preston, widow of the late singer Sam Cooke, has asked the Los Angeles Superior Court to halt distribution on Columbia Pictures' "Buddy Holly Story" film, claiming she owns property rights for any depiction of Cooke and has not received compensation. She asks unspecified general damages and \$500,000 punitive damages, and claims further that the movie sportrayal of Cooke is "inaccurate and untrue."

"Beatles" Merchandisers balked by Court

A group of defendants allegedly selling by mail albums promoted as Beatles performances were enjoined by a New York Federal District Court from doing so, as the recordings, titled "Beatles' Alpha-Omega," did not contain actual Beatles performances. Capitol Records had sued, and will now also receive any remaining inventory of the "Beatles" recordings along with an undisclosed sum for damages. When the Beatles first hit in America, swarms of albums featuring Beatles tracks by "groups" such as the Buggs, the Beetles, or the In-Sect hit the market, but in most cases manufacturers wisely did not attempt to pass them off as actual Beatles records.

Women Gaining In Broadcast Positions

48 percent of women employees in the broadcast industry are in higher-pay categories, according to FCC 1977 employment figures. Only 43 percent were in the same positions (which include official and managerial, professional, technical, and sales posts) in 1976. Women held 19.7 percent of official and managerial positions, 20.1 percent of professional jobs, 23.1 percent in sales, and 6.1 percent of technician posts. 90.1 percent of those holding broadcast office/clerical jobs are women.

Minority broadcast jobholders gained slightly in higher-pay position-holding, with 64 percent in such jobs as compared to 63 percent in 1976. Minorities account for 7.4 percent of official/managerial jobs, 12.2 percent of professional posts, 7.3 percent of sales spots, 13.5 percent of technicians' positions, and 22.3 percent of office/clerical situations.

Imports Up, Sales Down, Suit Heating Up For Videodiscs

Import of video recorders were up 547.5 percent in 1977, according to Dept. of Commerco statistics unveiled at the International Tape Association's convention in Tucson, with over 200,000 recorders, home and commercial, imported last year. However, a "dramatic drop"


Update On "Don't Say Hello" Contests

A new development has transpired with respect to Section 73.1206 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations dealing with recorded telephone conversations and a variation of the "Don't say hello" contest. Specifically, the promotion is based upon the following:

- 1. A station broadcasts a contest whereby persons are called at random from the telephone directory or other listing. The station, upon placing such random calls, records each such call. If the listener answers with the appropriate phrase, the station awards that person the announced prize and records the conversation from the moment the phone was answered. If the phone is not answered with the appropriate phrase, the station ceases recording and does not broadcast the call.
- 2. The station broadcasts, as part of its promotional announcements, something to the effect that "if you answer your telephone 'WXXX is the station that pays,' you will be presumed to be giving consent to the recording and broadcast of your voice over this radio station.

The rationale for this approach is that there is no "intent" to broadcast those conversations which begin with a "hello." There being no such "intent" to broadcast such calls, the recording of such non-winner calls is deemed by Sewell to fall outside the Rule, which states in pertinent part:

"Before recording a telephone conversation for broadcast, or broadcasting such a conversation simultaneously with its occurrence, a licensee shall inform any party to the call of the licensee's intention to broadcast the conversation..."



in sales of home video recorders since 1978 began was also reported, with specific figures not disclosed.

While video recorder industry participants discussed those possibly contradictory developments, action proceeded on a copyright infringement suit against Betamax filed in Los Angeles Federal District Court by Walt Disney Productions and MCA-Universal. A decision in the suit was predicted by the end of the summer. The issue in the action is the legality of videotaping off the air for home use in relation to copyright law—whether such taping is a violation and what remedy can be adopted (possibly a royalty arrangement with film companies).

A recent court decision in Buffalo ruled that videotaping off the air for subsequent non-commercial exhibition (at local schools) was an infringement of copyright. The decision could constitute a precedent for the Disney/MCA vs. Betamax action. Meanwhile, the Screen Actors Guild and the Writers Guild of America West will enter the suit as friends of the court supporting Disney and MCA. Representatives of the two guilds cited fear of home taping inhibiting future movie production, as well as loss of residuals. The Producers Guild of America is presently considering whether to join the Disney/MCA forces, while the Directors Guild of America has decided not to participate.

TV News

Nielsen Computer Error Causes Rating Changes

A "human error in computer programming" has caused the A.C. Nielsen Co. to revise the published ratings of at least 18 TV shows during the January and February reporting periods. Part II of NBC's "Midway" film was upped from a 20.3 rating to 25.2 in the most drastic revision, with programs like "Soap," "Family," and "Class of '65" also receiving retroactive boosts. Most changes were reported as minimal, however...Meanwhile, Arbitron completed its February TV sweep, with ABC winning with a 21.9 rating, compared to 23.2 at the same time last year. CBS finished second with a 19.5 rating (18.2 in 1977), and NBC had a 17.7, about the same as last year's 17.5 rating.

MUSIC ON TV—CBS has scheduled for a December six-hour documentary on rock & roll called "Solid Gold...The Birth of Rock 'N Roll," tracing the first decade of the music as seen by key participants. Producer for the ambitious project is record producer Richard Perry, and the six-hour scope of the show alone promises a different, more detailed treatment of the music than in previous television attempts...Player hosts their first "Midnight Special" March 17, with Abba. Jay Ferguson, and Stargard appearing.

ABC Wins Lackluster Week

ABC was the rating victor in the Nielsen week ending March 5, with a lower-than-average 20.5 rating taking the honors. CBS was fairly close at 19.5, and NBC lagged with a 16.9 showing. "Laverne & Shirley" continued its winning ways, with "Happy Days" right behind it in second and "Three's Company" taking third place—again, hardly unprecedented developments. CBS' "MASH" scored its strongest showing of the season, with a fourth place finish in its new Monday time slot. 5) was NBC's "Little House On The Prairie" 6) "One Day At A Time" (another CBS switchover to Monday from Tuesday) 7) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC) 8) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 9) CBS' Tuesday Night Movie, "Magnum Force" and 10) "Barney Miller" (ABC). NBC's "Fabulous Fifties" special finished 16th; recent NBC schedule additions "Quark" and "The Chuck Barris Rah Rah Show" did not do nearly so well, scoring 46th and 52nd place finishes respectively.

ABC triumphed in Arbitron's sampling of the New York and Los Angeles TV markets for the week ending March 3 as well, taking the top nine positions in New York and the top eight in L.A. "Laverne & Shirley" topped all comers in New York, followed by 2) "Happy Days" 3) "Welcome Back Kotter" and "Three's Company" tied 5) "Soap" 6) a tie between "Barney Miller" and its spinoff, "Fish" 8) ABC Sunday Night Movie "Live & Let Die" 9) "Family" and 10) CBS'"MASH."

In Los Angeles, "Happy Days" was the big winner, followed by a tie for second between "Laverne & Shirley" and "Three's Company," 4) "How The West Was Won" 5) "Live & Let Die" 6) "Barney Miller," "Soap" and "Charlie's Angels" tied and 9) a three-way tie between NBC's "CHiPs," "Little House On The Prairie" and CBS' "MASH."

Phoenix Format Flux

Chances are excellent that you, or someone on your staff, has worked in Phoenix. Arizona's number one market has always been very fluid, serving as a springboard in many cases for moves to larger markets. Phoenix alumni are many and include John Sebastian, John Driscoll, Rich Brother Robbin, Todd Wallace, Jerry Peterson, John MacFlanagan, Jimi Fox and Rick Brady just to name a few. The positions attained by former Phoenix personnel underscore its value as an exciting radio market.

This week's developments in Phoenix prompted me to take a closr look at the market that has been a "hotbed" of Top 40 format activity for several years. At last count there were no less than ten radio stations offering 'rock' music to the Phoenix area, but the disclosure of KRIZ's sale to Family Life Broadcasting and other developments may change that.

The current Top 40 format leader in Phoenix is KUPD and KUPD-FM, who have been successfully simulcasting for a total persons 12-plus share of 9.6. KUPD ranks first in cume audience and first in teens. KUPD is second in men and women 18-34 and second in adults 18-49. Owing to the FCC simulcast decision, the two KUPD's will separate June 1. The AM will reportedly take on a new identity with the call letters KKKQ already applied for.

With the purchase of KRIZ by Family Life Broadcasting, speculation within Phoenix regarding a format shift was everywhere, even in the local papers. The confirmation of the switch to "Christian music" programming came from a Family Life representative and is outlined on page 1 of this issue. Chuck Dean, Program Director of KRIZ, told me that the staff had been informed of the pending sale and that until the finalization, KRIZ would continue to aggressively seek the Phoenix Top 40 audience.

However, still another development is in the Arizona wind regarding the final details of a sale that has already been approved by the FCC. First Media, owners of WPGC/Washington, D.C. and Z-93/Atlanta, will close their agreement to purchase KSGR-AM and KDOT-FM April 1. KSGR, a daytime AM station licensed to Scottsdale, had a very respectable 2.3 total share in the October-November ARB operating an "oldies" format. KDOT-FM is a "beautiful music" station also licensed to nearby Scottsdale. Both stations have applied for and received new call letter designation KOPA and KOPA-FM (Phoenix is located in Maricopa County, thus the "KOPA" tie-in).

Glenn Potter, President of First Media in Washington, D.C., commented on the format direction the two stations would follow after the April first closing, "We're going to simulcast. There is a fairly successful oldies format on the AM, and we'll probably end up duplicating that." Dan Mason, Group Program Director for First Media, told me, "Charles Giddins will be the General Manager for KOPA and

KOPA-FM." Mr. Giddins was formerly the General Manager of WRFC/Athens and WCGQ/Columbus, both in Georgia. Dan also commented on the possible format shift in Phoenix, "We're going to go in there with a lot of ideas that have probably never been tried in Phoenix and hopefully we'll be successful with it."

So the stage is set in Phoenix. KRIZ will abandon their long-held Top 40 format after the sale to Family Life Broadcasting is completed this summer. KRUX continues to be more and more of a factor under Program Director Richard Ruiz. In fact, since returning to Top 40 (from their news format) in September of 1977, KRUX has come up to a 2.3 share overall. KQXE, another Top 40 station in the market, has begun simulcasting with KIOG, an automated soft rocker and they both are being billed at K-13 and K-104. The split of the KUPD stations simulcast and the entrance of First Media with KOPA should keep Phoenix a very interesting market to watch for the next several months.

GRAMMY GRABS L.A. JOCKS: KHJ's morning man Charlie Tuna hosted the pre-television Grammy ceremonies held in Los Angeles. The highlight of what did not make the telecast had to be Steve Martin accepting the Grammy for Best Comedy Album of the Year. Running Monday through Friday at midnight during Frank Reed's show, the "Album Feature" spotlights the leading cuts for a different album each night, interspersed with background information about the artist and album. Bob Pittman, Program Manager, said, "A lot of people have been calling and writing in to say that they'd like such an 'Album Feature.' We'll have no rule about playing either new or old albums...just, we think, a lot of good music."





WNEW-FM Programs Upcoming Wings Album

WNEW-FM/New York acquired a copy of the upcoming, supposedly unavailable, Paul McCartney & Wings album, "London Town," and aired it in its entirety on several occasions last week.

Music Director Tom Morrera told R&R: "I imagine we will get a cease and desist order, but we'll play it until then. I don't think we're liable for legal action until we're told to stop."

When asked where the station acquired the album, Morrera said, "To quote my boss (Scott Muni), 'it came from the 3rd floor of a 3-floor tenement on Third Avenue'...This is standard procedure for us, to get things way in advance. Scott has more connections around the world than anybody. We've done it before and I'm sure we'll do it again."

Listener reaction to the album's unveiling was mixed, according to Morrera. "We told (the listeners) that we were going to be airing a new album by a major artist. Once we started to play it and they realized it wasn't the new Bruce Springsteen album they were not as enthused about it. The people who called who were into the album we were playing enjoyed it very much."

Morrera described the sound of the new album as closer to McCartney's pre-Wings recordings than his more 'recent material. "There are fourteen cuts on it," he said. "The longest one is about six minutes and the shortest around three. It's pop; it's commercial, mostly up pop rockers. I think there's probably three or four very good singles on it."



Competitors' Call Letter Use Uncalled For?

WRTN/Westchester, NY, has been playing big band sounds and traditional middle-of-the-road artists, but they took an untraditional approach to promoting their format. One of the promos used by the station read, "We're today what WNEW used to be," referring to the longtime New York City Pop/Adult powerhouse's past style of programming.

WNEW itself was less than totally delighted with unsolicited cross-plug. General Manager Mel Karmazin sent WRTN a note terming the use of WNEW's call letters as a relatively insignificant matter, but indicating WNEW's general disapproval. Karmazin felt that WRTN was using the WNEW call letters to call attention to itself (WRTN, by the way, is owned by a former Metromedia employee, Bill O'Shaughnessy. Metromedia, of course, owns WNEW). The upshot was a call from Karmazin to O'Shaughnessy suggesting that the use of the call letters be discontinued, with WRTN reportedly agreeing to do so.


Charities
