Mutual Purchases WCFL For \$12 Million

Mutual Broadcasting has agreed to purchase WCFL/Chicago from the Chicago Federation of Labor (CFL) for \$12 million, one of the largest single-station purchase prices in broadcast history. According to a Chicago Tribune report, the agreement was "sealed late Monday" by Bill Lee, representing the CFL, and Mutual President Edward Little. Describing the station

as "marginally profitable" in the past few years, the Tribune reiterated numerous industry reports that the CFL had been attempting to sell the radio station for some time, but had had trouble finding a buyer willing to accept the steep asking price. According to informed sources, Mutual will make WCFL its radio flagship and principal base, and plans a strong sports programming effort for the station.

KPAS Retaliates With Own Spanish Slogans

Arbitron Finds No Problems In KINT/El Paso Slogan Case

Arbitron Radio has found "no incorrect credits" in rating diaries involved in the El Paso radio Spanish slogan controversy (R&R 3-31). KPAS had filed a complaint with Arbitron against KINT, claiming that KINT had registered four Spanish-language slogans closely resembling the identifying phrases used by Juarez (Mexico) stations which penetrated the El Paso market, in order to gain credit for diary entries listing those slogans.

An Arbitron spokesperson told R&R: "We looked at the diaries in the El Paso situation, and even though there has been some confusion, we feel there have been no incorrect credits given, and even if the questionable diaries were totally deleted, there would not be any significant changes." The Arbitron representative also noted that the number of diaries involved

was considerably less than the earlier figure of 22 which had been quoted.

Commenting further, the spokesperson told R&R that KINT-AM had used slogans similar to a Mexican FM station's, but that the diaries had been checked to make sure that AM listening had been checked; while similarly, KINT-FM had used slogans similar to a Mexican AM station, but that FM listening had been noted for involved diaries. Arbitron, however, did not call diary respondents back to recheck their listening, reasoning, "After examining diary evidence, we didn't feel the need, coupled with the problem of how can you expect someone to remember what they were listening to six months ago" (at the time of the October/November survey period).

In response to Arbitron's declarations, KPAS General Manager Garrett Haston announced plans to delete one of his station's present slogans and replace it with a slogan similar to one of the Juarez station's. In a letter to Arbitron, R&R and 32 other industry parties, Haston stated, "We have chosen to delete one of our slogans and replace it with 'Radio Sensacion.' You have left me no alternative but to do this. We'll use it 'regularly' along with our other programming. I hate to play the game this way, but since you have chosen not to act on this situation, instead of using 'K-Pasa' we'll use 'Radio Sensacion.'"

Arbitron stated they were in the process of responding to Haston's letter, and added that they were "now developing several new policies and guidelines that will cover slogan situations like this and others," which will be announced shortly.

Ginsberg Named FCC Complaints & Compliance Chief

Arthur L. Ginsberg has been designated as Acting Chief of the FCC's Complaints and Compliance Division following the retirement of present division head William B. Ray. Ginsberg will officially become Division Chief following Civil Service Commission approval. Well known in the industry at large for his participation in two R&R Convention FCC panels, Ginsberg had been Senior Attorney in the Commission's Broadcast Bureau.

Ray, 70, will remain with the FCC for a year, aiding in the Commission's efforts to revise the Fairness Doctrine and its Section 315 primers.

Payola Alleged Against Detroit Jock

A major Detroit daily newspaper has fired the opening shots aimed at WJLB/Detroit morning man/Music Director Al Perkins in what could develop into a new payola scandal. Cited as part of the Detroit News' investigation of Perkins was a deposition filed by a former CBS Records promotion man who claimed that his duties involved delivering special favors to Detroit area radio personalities, including free performances by CBS artists at concerts promoted by organizations in which Perkins was involved.

The News story, headlined "Disc Jockey Uses Public Airtime For Personal Gain," cited recent FCC payola investigations, commenting that they were "destined to reopen the payola scandals that rocked the recording industry in the 1950's and 1960's." Following that buildup, reporter Lowell Cauffiel declared that a News investigation revealed that Perkins was "heavily involved in personal management of recording artists and the promotion of major concerts."

The News "monitored" Perkins' morning show on the Black-formatted station for two weeks and reported that the air personality "repeatedly plugged concerts produced by a firm his wife runs and played records by a group he manages." According to the paper, the concert firm, West Productions, has no license to promote concerts, and Perkins also has no license to manage artists, a misdemeanor under Michigan laws. Perkins allegedly listed an album by the Sins of Satan, a group he manages, as Feature Album of the week, and put the group's single, "Change Man," at the "top of the list" prepared for record stores.

A specific ten-minute segment

of Perkins' shift, according to the News, featured a plug for West Productions' Parliament concert, and an ad lib urging attendance. After two commercials, Parliament's single "Flash Light" was played, then "minutes later," the "Change Man" single (Sins Of Satan were also playing at the concert). "Station documents, however," Cauffiel continued, "reveal Perkins failed to put down those records on the airplay log as required by in-house control measures." Perkins told the paper that he was "just a consultant" to his wife's concert promotion firm and "would never ad lib after any concert ad or spin the performer's hit single right after the advertisement of their performance."

The ex-CBS promotion man, Eu-

gene "Speedy" Brown, who was fired in 1976, stated in his sworn deposition that "payola in new and old forms has always existed in Detroit." He added that he was the "go-between between CBS executives and area disc jockeys who received money and special favors in return for radio play of records." He then mentioned the free performances by CBS artists at Perkins-promoted concerts. Perkins denied ever dealing with Brown, and said "I've never had anybody appear for me for nothing."

A CBS Records spokesman told R&R in reference to Brown's "go-between" claims that "the statements being made are completely false and of his own fabrication."

Decision Expected Next Week

Jet "Free & Clear," From UA, Weighing New Options

Jet Records is "free and clear" from all ties with United Artists Records as a result of last week's announced negotiations for the sale of the company by Transamerica to Artie Mogull and Jerry Rubinstein. As a result, Jet, which has recently accounted for a significant proportion of UA's income with the Electric Light Orchestra and other artists, is considering a number of offers from other labels and expects to announce a decision next week, according to label President Don Arden.

Arden told R&R: "The situation is that we are free and clear to go our own way in spite of this proposed sale to Mogull and Rubinstein. We are at present negotiating with several companies, and we

are deciding which course to take in this country. We're investigating all options. We've received so many offers we can sit back and examine the good and bad points of all of them. We've got this week to weigh all the possibilities."

Arden added that the possibility of Jet going independent in the U.S. is one of the options being weighed, and complimented Transamerica for the "amicable" nature of the negotiations leading to the "happy conclusion" of the UA-Jet relationship. He stated that Jet is free to negotiate new arrangements worldwide, and that as soon as the U.S. decision is made, "we will decide on other territories." He added that the label is planning to enlarge its roster and staff.

Government Intrusion Hit By Wasilewski, Wiley At NAB Convention

Potential and existing government involvement in broadcasting concerns was the chief topic at the 56th annual National Association of Broadcasters convention in Las Vegas, which opened Monday (4-10). NAB President Vincent T. Wasilewski decried "informal alliances" among "supposedly independent regulatory agencies and branches of government." Speaking before both TV and radio sessions of the convention, Wasilewski also cited lawyers who had plotted

license denial efforts now working in regulatory agencies, attacked the FTC's recent ban on sugared cereals TV ads, and reiterated the NAB's "categorical" opposition to "any special broadcasting tax" and performance royalty legislation.

Wiley Counters SAG, Hits Broadcast Reform

Former FCC Chairman Richard E. Wiley, who debated a United Church of Christ spokesman on the

subject of broadcast reform at a Convention session, opposed the church's reform proposals (ten-year license terms, provisions for community broadcast access), characterizing them as causing a "massive new intrusion" by government into the industry. Wiley also directed a letter to Screen Actors Guild National Executive Secretary Chester L. Migden in response to Migden's recent letter (R&R 4-7) terming Wiley an NAB

Source Withdraws From Rating Competition

The Source, D.U. Research Inc.'s syndicated radio rating service, is being discontinued by the company. Vice President Ed Poole cited cost, effort, and time as factors in the decision, and stated that D.U. Research (originally known as Dimensions Unlimited) will continue and "redirect into more full-service, custom-scope media research" in the areas of television, radio, newspapers, magazines, etc.

"After five years of concerted efforts, 70-80 hour weeks, 44 weeks a year, with four markets using the Source, we couldn't envision future expansion at the pace we thought necessary," Poole told R&R. The report, featuring detailed demographic and qualitative

breakdowns, was "extremely expensive to produce." Poole estimated that a basic 1000-sample report would cost the Source from 2 to 2 1/2 times as much to produce as a same-size Arbitron report. The twice-yearly Source reports, used in the Los Angeles, New York, Chicago, and San Francisco markets, cost \$30,000 apiece, and in expansion efforts, Poole related, many stations were reluctant to commit to advance subscriptions to finance the cost of the research, although, he added, initial response was usually highly enthusiastic. In addition, although 220 advertising agencies subscribed (at a far lower rate than radio stations), agency radio buys on the basis of

Source information were insufficient for the company's purposes.

D.U. co-founder Terry D'Angona will go into the broadcast sales area, although she will remain a principal of the company. Poole has joined the sales staff of KLOS/Los Angeles, while D.U. President and co-founder Deborah Gonderil will continue as the company concentrates on its broader custom media research efforts.

Combined Acquires WLDM/Detroit; Station Becomes WCZY

Combined Communications Corporation announced the completion of its acquisition of WLDM-FM/Detroit late Monday (4-10). The station, which was Detroit's first Beautiful Music outlet, will continue to maintain a Beautiful Music format, but programming will be handled by Churchill Pro-

ductions of Phoenix. In addition, the station's call letters will be changed to WCZY, with a new identity, "COZY 95," being promoted. Fritz Beesemeyer has been appointed General Manager of the new WCZY.

Combined also reached agreement in principle last week to sell

WWDJ/Hackensack, a Gospel-formatted station, to Denver businessman Kenneth E. Palmer for \$4 million. The sale will allow CCC to acquire a new AM-FM combination in the area, with the company reportedly seeking such a combination.

Lin Buys KHFI-FM/ KTVB-TV in Austin

Lin Broadcasting has arranged to buy a 70 percent interest in two Austin, Texas broadcast facilities, KHFI-FM and KTVB-TV (UHF), from Kingstip Communications, Inc. Lin will pay Kingstip \$13.75 a

share, totalling about \$4.5 million, and will extend the same offer to other shareholders following the completion of the transaction, which is subject to FCC approval.

Further FCC First Amendment Questions

R&R:
Your article "The First Amendment Is It in the Public Interest?" (R&R, 3/31/78) pointed out the need for clarification of the FCC's requirements for Public Affairs programming. An even more fundamental question, however, still remains to be answered: "The FCC—Does It Violate the First Amendment?" Suppose that in 1934, Congress created a commission to regulate not the broadcasting industry, but instead, the publishing industry. Suppose further that this commission had the authority to determine where a newspaper could be published, how many copies could be printed, how many advertisements could be run, and set standards for the amount of space the newspaper must devote to entertainment, news, and "public affairs". Such actions of this hypothetical commission clearly would have been in violation of the First Amendment's guarantee of free press. But in real life, are the actions of the FCC in determining city of license, station frequency, transmitter power, commercial load limits, and the quantity of news and public affairs programming in violation of the First Amendment? Unfortunately the only definite answer to that question is "maybe". *Jacobellis vs. Ohio, 378 US 184 at 191 (1964) held that the First Amendment applies to music and other forms of cultural expression. Furthermore, Judge Bazelon, the Chief Judge of the U.S. Court of Appeals, D.C. Circuit, contends that the Communications Act of 1934 was developed with little or no consideration of the First Amendment! (See Citizens' Committee to Save WEFM vs. FCC 506 F 2d at 270.) Judge Bazelon sees a need for Congress to change telecommunications law so that it will coincide with First Amendment values. (Id. at 282.)*

Capitol/Catena Case Settled In Label's Favor

A six-year court battle over a \$100 million-plus stock fraud suit filed against Capitol Records by former label Vice President of Merchandising Rocco Catena was settled last week, with a U.S. District Court Judge ruling in favor of Capitol, with Catena required to assume court costs.

Catena had alleged in December 1971 that Capitol Industries-EMI Inc. engaged "in a common course of fraudulent conduct designed...to misrepresent the operating results of Capitol so as to artificially inflate the market price of Capitol common stock." In his Memorandum of Decision, Judge William P. Gray stated he was "unable to conclude from the evidence that any such fraudulent purpose has been established," and noted the

"absence of a sinister motive or culpable recklessness" in the actions of the company's executives, which Catena's suit had contended were designed to inflate the stock price.

At the same time, a Capitol counterclaim against Catena was also dismissed. Capitol greeted the Memorandum jubilantly, taking full-page ads to announce the results. Capitol Chairman Bhaskar Menon commented, "This is indeed significant because anyone with a stake in this industry is affected by such matters. It's important to take a stand in spite of the enormous drain in time and finances." A Capitol statement added that the company had "always held the view that the lawsuit was without merit and would not succeed."

Mike Murphy Resigns From KMBZ/Kansas City

Longtime KMBZ/Kansas City morning man Mike Murphy resigned last Friday (4/7), confirming widespread speculation in the city. An official announcement from station GM Walt Lochman said: "After ten beautiful and eventful years, Mike Murphy leaves KMBZ with his last show Friday, April 7th." Lochman also stated that Murphy plans to take a six-month vacation, after which his plans will be firmed up.

KMBZ PD Steve Bell commented that Murphy had been the number one personality in Kansas City for the past ten years. Negotiations for a new contract (which would take effect in December) did not meet a common ground, causing Murphy's exit. Bell said that Murphy left on amicable terms with the station.

Regarding speculation that Murphy will hook up with another Kansas City station, Murphy did not offer any comment.

Bell told R&R: "There is no question about the enormous talent of Mike Murphy...and I've always

maintained that he's one of the best in the country. But I'm also very fortunate that he's not the only good guy I've got. The philosophy of the station has been to hire the best talent for all time periods, and I'm sitting here with four other guys who would be in contention as morning men at most other sta-

tions in the country. What I'm looking for now is an evening man, because I've moved the lineup around so that Curt Merz will be replacing Murphy in the morning. Bill Morse will now do middays, Ray Dunaway will be doing afternoon drive, and Johnny Dolan will temporarily handle the night shift."

Brown had previously filed suit against CBS following his dismissal, alleging racial discrimination on the part of the company.

Another angle introduced by the News article was the firm Forever, Inc., formed by Perkins in 1974 with two former WJLB air personalities and radio personnel in other cities. The company, dissolved in 1977 for failing to file annual reports, was a non-profit "public pressure group" to keep black radio personalities from being "unjustly singled out" by the FCC and other investigators, according to Perkins. "We were going to hire people to investigate the investigators." But state records, the News says, showed that the firm's stated purpose was to "package, advertise and promote shows for public entertainment," and it was not registered as non-profit. According to the News, WJLB Station Manager Norman Miller "was told the firm was planning to tell touring acts that if they didn't play concerts for the firm, their records wouldn't be played in their markets." Perkins admitted that Forever, Inc. staged concerts, but claimed that the firm "won on two and lost on 20."

Miller told the News that he was "aware that Perkins had outside business interests," but that he hadn't known that his Music Director was violating station guidelines. He added, "I will have to complete taking a look at the things you brought to my attention. I'll talk to him and then decide what action will be taken." Further developments in the Perkins matter are expected as the impact of the News story reverberates.

lobbyist and describing the development as an "incestuous relationship." Wiley said, "I am not a lobbyist for the NAB and I do not intend to become one." He said most of his legal work with the firm of Kirkland & Ellis had been outside the broadcasting field, and that he had reconsidered an earlier

decision to provide advice to an NAB committee on an "unpaid basis."

ABC Execs Attack FTC TV Bans, Fear Spread To Radio

At a meeting of ABC radio affiliates, ABC Inc. Senior Vice President and General Counsel Everett Erlick expanded on remarks directed against the FTC earlier by ABC President Elton H. Rule. Rule had criticized the FTC's TV ad bans on sugared TV cereals in a speech before the Hollywood Radio and Television Society last week, stating that the rulings implied that government was supplanting the parental task of supervising TV viewing and acting as "national nannies." He said "If any product is clearly harmful, then the place to ban it is in the market-place," and called for "a-cross-the-board" restrictions if necessary, citing TV and radio as "natural centers of concern" for many people. Erlick told the ABC radio affiliates at NAB that it was a "very short step" from bans on sugared cereal ads on TV to similar action against "sugar sweetened soft drinks on radio." He urged broadcasters to prepare to make forceful presentations of the industry's point of view on such issues as advertising bans.

Senator's Greeting Speech Adds A Few Sour Notes

Nevada Senator Howard W. Cannon, greeting the NAB convention-goers, supplemented his welcoming remarks with a bit of criticism for the broadcasters. He first told his audience that broadcasters had the most significant impact of any activity, but questioned whether broadcast technology could be mastered "for our own greatest good, or whether it will master us." He continued, "We must recognize the growing disenchantment of many Americans not simply with the violence and vulgarity too often programmed for them today, but with the general banality of much of the fare they're offered."

A speech by FCC Chairman Charles Ferris, whose philosophies are apparently an unknown quantity to many broadcasters, was regarded as a probable highlight as the convention continued.

The company asserts that the new system makes complex formats feasible and controllable, simplifies format adjustments, provides greater format control, reduces on-the-air errors, provides unlimited segue, and improves on-air sound, among other improvements. Birnbaum Becomes Stigwood's Executive Assistant

Roger Birnbaum, former West Coast Vice President of Arista Records, has been appointed to the newly created position of Executive Assistant to Robert Stigwood, Chairman of the Stigwood Group, including RSO Records. Birnbaum will be involved in the Stigwood Group's activities in records, films, TV, artist management, and concert tours, and will also act as a special liaison on a corporate level.

Denny Zeitler Named Promotion VP At Salsoul

Denny Zeitler has been appointed Vice President of Promotion for Salsoul Records. He was most recently West Coast Promotion Director at Private Stock, and has 15 years' record industry experience. At the same time, Diane DiMaggio was promoted to National Pop Promotion Manager from an assistant's post in the same area.

Hooper Offers Specialized Monthly Share Figures

Hooper Radio is now offering monthly radio station share figures broken down by household income levels and for women, both working and non-working. Sample figures for households with \$20,000 plus income showed WMCA and WOR tied for the top position in New York with 10.2 shares, while no Top 40 stations were among the top six. In Chicago, WGN dominated with a 26.2 share, with the nearest competitor scoring a 7.5. Pop/Adult KMOX dominated St. Louis with a 39.6 in this category, while Top 40 KRBE in Houston managed third place with a 9.2. AOR had some interesting results, with KATT-FM/Oklahoma City leading that market with an 18.2, and KSAN/San Francisco finishing third with an 8.7.

In the working vs. non-working women category, a number of interesting results were apparent, far too many to detail here. KMOX scored a full 20 share points higher with non-working women than with their working counterparts. Top 40 WABC/New York showed third in non-working women and did not make the top 5 in working women, but in Houston the pattern reversed, as KRBE was second in working women and did not make the top five in the opposite category. In San Francisco, All-News station KGO had a 30.8 share to lead its nearest competitor in non-working women by over a 3-1 margin, but the station did not finish in the top five in working women, thereby scoring less than a 6 share.



Ralph Tashjian has joined Island Records as National Field Representative.

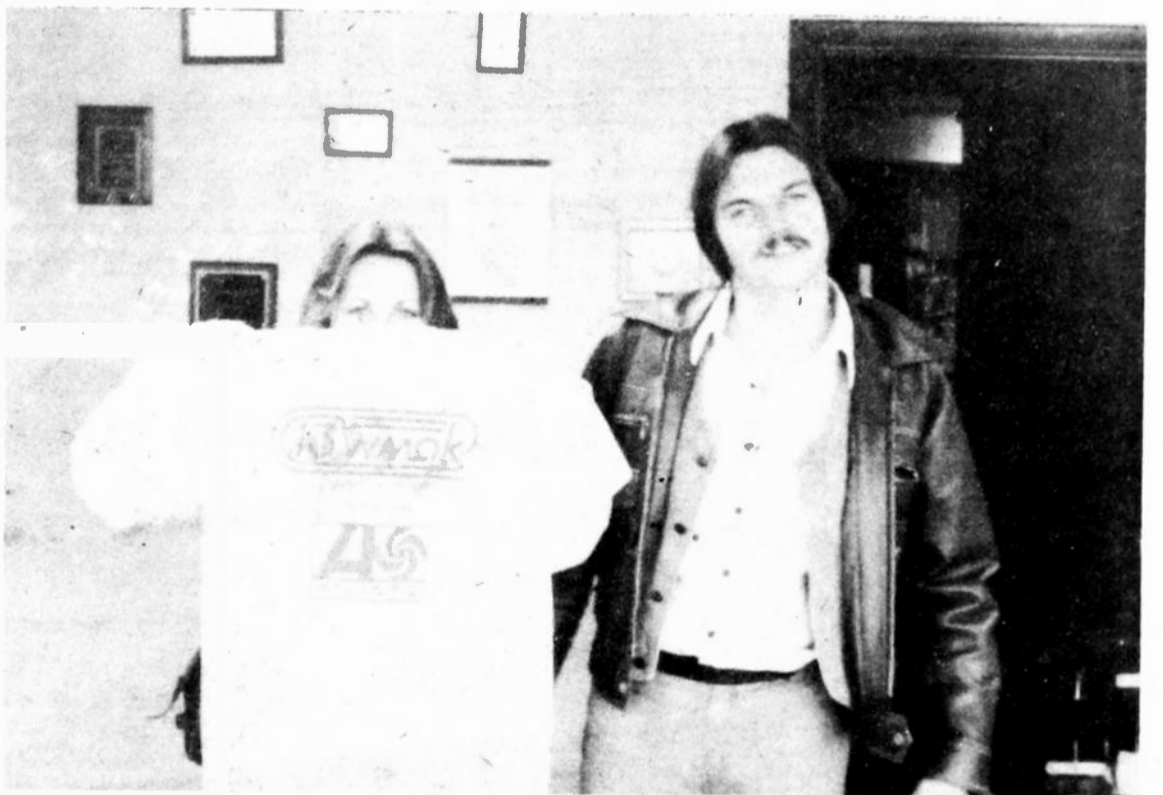

GRT Canada Produces Radio Station Alibi Dart Board

GRT Records of Canada have apparently heard every alibi a Program Director uses to rationalize not adding a record, and their frustration finally turned to humorous action. Other operations have catalogued lists of excuses in the past, but GRT turned them into a useful dart board, so that frustrated promotion men or PD's wishing to save wear and tear on their vocal cords can throw darts (actually friction sticking balls) at squares with alibis like "We're In The Middle Of Ratings," "Show Me Some Secondaries," and "I Don't Give A Damn About Secondaries." Since the board is aimed at Canadian stations, two localized alibis read "What's Happening In The U.S." and "We Don't Care What's Happening In The U.S." In addition to the "Programming Guide," as the dart board is euphemistically called, GRT prepared a "Buyer's Guide" with 16 top distributor and racker alibis. Both have been serviced across Canada to enthusiastic response, and are widely prized as authentic objects d'art.



Restaurant Supply House Turns To Radio Ads

In what it categorized as an "innovative" move, a Los Angeles restaurant supply company, Goldberg and Solovy Foods, signed a six-month contract to advertise on a KIEV/Glendale restaurant-oriented talk show hosted by Paul Wallach. The restaurant supply industry has traditionally used only trade magazines to reach restaurant clients, but the slant of the Wallach show spurred Goldberg and Solovy to try radio ads.

BBC, ILR Radio To Broadcast Parliament Debates

The British House Of Commons has approved live broadcasting coverage of Parliament proceedings by both British Broadcasting Corp. (BBC) and Independent Local Radio (ILR) stations. The first broadcasts under the new agreement began last week, with a number of important speeches scheduled for future broadcast.

Polaroid Sets \$5 Million Campaign For Polavision

Polavision, Polaroid Corp.'s new instant movie system, is receiving a \$5 million introductory advertising boost on television and in print media. The TV campaign began with spots on the Oscar presentation. The new system includes a \$210 hand-held camera, a \$465 compact table-top player, and 2 1/2-minute Phototape cassettes at about \$10 each.

L.A. Times Wins X-Rated Film Ad Case

The Los Angeles Times emerged victorious in the first stage of a court battle over whether the paper has the right to refuse to run ads for X-rated films. A Superior Court judge backed up the paper, saying it had no legal duty to accept the ads. An appeal from the Adult Film Association is expected, however.

Buffalo Radio Station Ordered Off Canadian Cable

The Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission ordered the removal of WBEN-FM/Buffalo from cable systems in Toronto and Hamilton, Ontario. The ruling was the first time a foreign station has been ordered off Canadian cable systems, and came about under the provisions of a Commission ruling denying access to foreign stations soliciting Canadian advertising directed at Canadian audiences.

American Motors, Renault To Link Efforts

American Motor Corporation and Renault have announced plans to combine efforts, with AMC adding technological improvements and small-car strength and Renault gaining U.S. plant production capability and dealership strength. Advertising efforts for the two companies were expected to remain separate. AMC, currently hold a 19 percent share of the U.S. auto market, is reportedly quite excited at the prospects of adding the increasingly popular Renault Le Car to its lineup, while Renault, the world's fourth-largest auto company, gains AMC's universally popular Jeep for foreign sales. The companies have 60 days to ratify a final agreement.

TV Ad Billings Up 21%

The Television Bureau of Advertising reported that network television was up 21 percent in ad billings over 1976 totals, with the top ten spenders all increasing their outlay. Procter & Gamble was the top TV advertiser, spending \$235 million, up 22 percent over last year. General Foods at \$143 million and Bristol Myers at \$114 million (both up 11 percent) were next. The largest increase in the top ten TV clients was General Mills' 42 percent rise to \$82 million. 551 companies used network TV last year, the highest-spending newcomer was Wendy's hamburger chain with a \$3.7 million expenditure.

Berkeley College Station Gets A's Games

KALX/Berkeley, a college FM station owned by the University of California, has purchased rights to Oakland A's baseball broadcasts through April 23. The contract was believed to be the first for a major league team and a college station. Extension of the contract is contingent on the A's plans to move to Denver. A UC Berkeley student, Larry Baer, will handle play-by-play chores.

TV News

FCC To Promote UHF, Issues Ad Loudness Report

The FCC spoke out on two television issues last week, declaring its intent to promote UHF broadcasting and releasing a study on the volume of TV commercials. The Commission is considering making changes in current standards so that UHF stations can be better received. Public panel discussions are planned this month to discuss cutting the present 18 decibel noise level of visual interference. Discussions will also cover the topic of adding more UHF stations, and making rules to require improved quality UHF tuners in new TV sets.

The commercial loudness study, based on ten hours of programming from Washington D.C., Michigan and Texas stations, concluded that commercials are generally louder than other programming but not as loud as some complaints had insisted. About half the spots were no louder than normal conversations, the study stated. No specific rules on loudness were recommended at this time (further study was advocated), but the possibility of requiring stations to install a device in their audio lines to adjust signal levels for loudness was raised.

MUSIC ON TV—ABC will tape the Academy Of Country Music (ACM) awards presentation April 27 for a late May air date. The event, held at the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles, will feature performances by Mickey Gilley, Eddie Rabbitt, Tom T. Hall, Freddy Fender, and Charlie Rich, among others, with Kenny Rogers, Donna Fargo, and Barbara Mandrell hosting. The show will run 90 minutes. England Dan & John Ford Coley host "Midnight Special" April 14, with Kansas, Meat Loaf, and Wet Willie among the guests. And fans of wild and crazy Eastern European swinging kinds of guys will be happy to learn that Steve Martin returns as host of "Saturday Night Live" April 22.

CBS Wins Week; Oscars Score

CBS won the week ending April 2 in the Nielsen ratings for only its third victory of the season, scoring a 21.0 rating compared to ABC's 18.7 and NBC's 16.5. Strong showings by CBS comedy series (especially "MASH") and the network's week-long 50th anniversary specials accounted for the victory. The Thursday night anniversary segment scored highest, sixth for the week, but three other nights were in the Top 20. ABC was preparing for a big victory in the following week's competition, as figures for the Monday night (4-3) Oscars telecast on the network showed an average 36.3 rating and 68 percent share average for the three-hour presentation, with the highest number of homes ever tallied for the Academy Awards.

"MASH" was the top-rated program for the week, as its move to Monday night continues to score top figures. Following were 2) "Three's Company" (ABC) 3) "Laverne & Shirley" (ABC) 4) "One Day At A Time" (CBS) 5) "Happy Days" (ABC) 6) a rare Nielsen tie between CBS' "Waltons" and the Thursday night CBS anniversary special 8) "Alice" (CBS) 9) "Soap" (ABC) in its final first-season episode, and 10) "60 Minutes" (CBS). The farewell Carol Burnett show finished 12th for its best showing of the season.

"Soap" took its first number one position of the year in its final outing by leading New York's Arbitron figures for the week ending March 31. ABC and CBS split New York viewers down the middle, as the former took six spots, including the first two places with "Soap" and "Three's Company" and CBS took the remaining seven (a six-way tie for 8th caused 13 shows to qualify for the top ten). Following the top duo were 3) "CBS On The Air" 's Monday special 4) a tie between "Laverne & Shirley" and "MASH" 6) "Happy Days" and CBS' airing of "The Wizard Of Oz," and 8) a tie between ABC's "Monday Night Movie" ("Little Ladies Of The Night"), "Barney Miller" (ABC), "Carol Burnett" (CBS), "One Day At A Time," and "CBS On The Air" for Tuesday and Sunday.

In Los Angeles Arbitron ratings, "Three's Company," "Happy Days," and "Laverne & Shirley" finished 1-2-3, with "Soap" following for a four-place ABC Tuesday sweep. In 5th place was "Carol Burnett," followed by 6) "MASH" and "One Day At A Time" tied, and 8) a three-way tie between "CBS On The Air" for Monday and ABC's "Fantasy Island" and "Lucan."

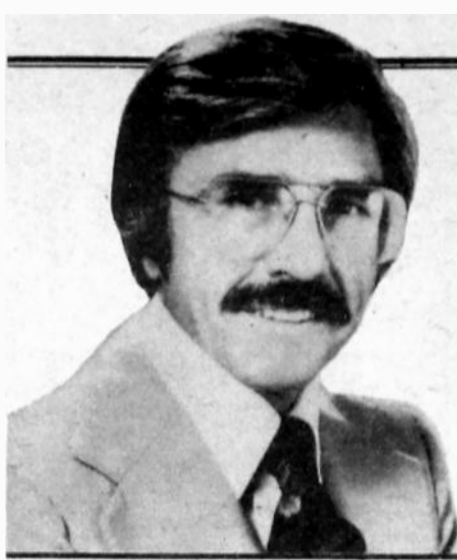

Here in Hollywood there's been a big shakeup at most of the television stations in the news departments. Maybe you've heard about it. This has prompted us to look into the situation extensively here at the *Gary Owens* column and to come up with a rundown on all the local newscasters, their strengths and weaknesses. Sometimes these anchor-persons and their cohorts can read well, but don't have any real news sense or knowledge...just a pretty face. Other times one will be a really strong newsman, but will be funny looking and the public just won't buy them.

It's almost a parallel with the music industry...like a singer with great looks, but a voice that resembles the sound of a runcible spoon getting caught in a garbage disposal.

Anyway, because Los Angeles is such an important market the Gary Owens Foundation has just released its study on all the newscasters and these are the findings:

NEWSMAN "A" AT STATION "X".

STRENGTHS: Handsome, rugged, forthright, steely-eyed determined look. Strongly masculine in appearance as well as possessing a hard-jawed intellectual look.

WEAKNESSES: Off-camera is a transvestite and skips a lot. Six convictions for flogging his mother with fish. Once picked up for attempting to crash L.A. Times Woman of the Year party while disguised as Mrs. Calvin Coolidge.

NEWSMAN "B" AT TV STATION "Y."

STRENGTHS: Excellent sense of humor...joshes with sportscaster and weather girl. Charming. Well dressed, neat, and twinkly-eyed. Appears to have a full grasp of the issues. Doesn't show personal political bias by gesture or inflection. Seems destined to become network anchorman.

WEAKNESSES: Is a three-foot, one inch midget with a high squeaky voice. Tries to sit on weather girl's lap. Has had numerous 502's on freeway while riding tricycle.

NEWSMAN "C" AT TV STATION "Z".

STRENGTHS: Reminds local viewers of Eric Sevareid. Exudes character, strength, grit, intelligence, and somber, serious maturity.

WEAKNESSES: Insists on delivering all newscasts while being naked from the waist down.

NEWSMAN "B" AT TV STATION "X".

STRENGTHS: Clear, strong, resonant voice. Good news and political analysis mind.

WEAKNESSES: Has unique condition with long hair covering entire face and forehead. Refuses to bow to sponsor pressure, claiming infringement of commercial interests on the press. Sponsor is Gillette.

NEWSGIRL "A" AT STATION "Z".

STRENGTHS: Penetrating, wholesome, clean, intelligent look. Speaks sincerely right into the camera. Sparkles when anchorman joshes with her. Looks monumentally *nice*.

WEAKNESSES: Operates a bordello in Gardena. Was rejected as one of the Manson girls because they thought her "too wild." Is older than she appears; co-hosted the Axis Sally Show from Germany during WWII.

NEWSMAN "F" AT STATION "L."

STRENGTHS: Alert, suave, has sophistication similar to Edward R. Murrow.

WEAKNESSES: Insists on dangling a carrot from his left nostril while giving the news. His 4 arrests for sodomy with a zebra could be troublesome if the story ever gets out.

Well, there it is! Our findings just show you how hard it is to choose a well-coordinated newstaff that has just the right melange. At the present time, the G.O. Foundation is beginning a study of radio stations throughout the United States (4522 AM stations; 3020 FM) and as soon as the results are in...we'll print them!

Coast To Coast, It's Spring

In the Spring a young programmer's fancy turns to the ARB. It is, in fact, the major report card of the year for most stations. The "killer promotions" come out of the creative closet and "the music has to be perfect." At least that's generally the way Spring has operated in the past. Is that what's happening in the spring of '78? With the ARB now in its second week, let's take a coast-to-coast tour of Top 40 radio and find out.

Gary Berkowitz, PRO-FM/Providence, RI: "Promotionally we're doing something called 'Secret Song.' If you can identify the secret song you can win a cash prize. We just play a little bit of a song, slowed-down or sped-up, and take hourly guesses on the air." Gary's jackpot began at \$100.92 and for each hour an incorrect guess is made, another two dollars are put into the total. PRO-FM is also in the midst of a long term promotion to determine the Providence-area "Principal Of The Year." Students of high schools and junior highs are being encouraged to nominate their principal for the award. It is not a petition contest exactly, since schools may nominate their principals in any number of ways. This promotion will run through mid-May.

Musically, PRO-FM does not "Tighten-down" their list during any rating periods. Gary feels that if the music is right during the entire year then there is no reason to react differently during the book. As an example of how PRO-FM approaches the Spring book, Gary said, "Most of the jocks aren't even aware that the ARB has started."

Jeff Ryder, WBBF/Rochester, N.Y.: "We're doing a thing called '95 BBF gives away the world.' We're giving away trips to various places in the world. Each day Monday through Friday, we give out one or more 'letters' of the alphabet. On Friday the listeners unscramble the letters we've given them that week. The unscrambled letters will form a location such as Paris or London. The idea is to get our listeners to come back and listen to us every day." WBBF had determined through research that a good chunk of their audience was only listening to them three out of seven days. This contest was designed to increase that weekly listening. Jeff said a similar contest idea was tried, successfully, last Fall. "It encourages people to tune in day by day. The promos are done in such a way to say, 'all you have to do is just listen once a day...'. The final winner is determined by a postcard drawing of all correct entries."

Jeff does not tighten up his playlist for the rating period. "I think tightening up a playlist will build your cume, but what I try to do during the rating period is take my cume and stretch it out into quarter hours. By tightening I think you run the risk of tune-out due to fatigue. What I do is pretty much keep it consistent during the book. I think that if it supposedly works for you during the rest of the year it should work for you during the book too."

Bob Moody, WAKY/Louisville, KY: Rather than doing anything major during the Spring sweep, WAKY is still building on promotions that have been running for a while. One of the key promotions is "Breakfast with Bailey," as Bob explained: "We take our morning man, Bill Bailey out to a listeners home every Friday morning to do his entire show via remote. They (the listeners) invite Bailey into their homes for breakfast and they serve a meal while Bill does the whole show from their house. You hear dishes clanking and kids screaming...the first week we did this, Bailey went to a preacher's house and Bill was passing the plate and singing hymns. With the Kentucky Derby coming up we have many things that we'll tie in with that; in fact, Bailey will be having his Friday breakfast from the paddock area of the track the week of the race."

Does WAKY change their music policy during the ratings? Bob said, "I think we're being more careful about exposing unknown artists. So we may be running a little slower on the unfamiliar artists, but that's about it. We're still playing the same number of records and we haven't changed the number of records in any of our rotations or anything like that."

Michael St. John, WMAK/Nashville, TN: "We're doing a promotion called 'The Name Connection.' We announce a last name and say, 'if that's your name or you know anybody with that last name, call them up and tell them to listen to WMAK.' We then tell them that we'll announce our prize for that hour in about twenty minutes." When the prize is announced, the station again encourages listeners to call friends with the correct last name and tell them what the hourly prize is. To win you must know the prize for the hour when WMAK calls you. If, when you are called, you tell WMAK that you were told by a friend what the prize was, you and your friend win duplicate prizes. The prizes range from color TV's to small household appliances. Michael explained, "The idea is to make the audience work for you. As far as somebody saying, 'hey, my brother called me and told me the prize,' you really can't stop that from happening. But as long as they're listening I don't really care if I have to give away two prizes every time."

As far as music policy during the book, Michael says, "We add basically three or four new records a week and if the hits are out there, we're going to add them. One thing I have done for the book is tighten up the oldies somewhat. The demographic the company wants meant elimination of some of the golden titles, but current music policy does not change for the ratings."

Eric Foxx, WOW/Omaha, NE: "In past books we've done anywhere from \$20,000 to \$30,000 giveaways. We always did that but this book we've decided to go very mildly at it. The reason, I think, is that we are in such competition with FM stations that we just have to back off a little bit on the hype. Even if the other stations in the market were

giving away 2 million dollars each, we would have to sound like we were giving away 10 million!" As a matter of fact none of the Omaha stations are running any major promotions for the Spring ARB, which in part allows WOW to follow suit.

Musically WOW runs a very tight, heavily research-oriented list and Eric does not deviate from that policy during the ratings. "However, we're not talking on the records at all, front or rear. The guys can come in on the last few seconds of the fade and we have set up our processing (audio limiting) so that records actually do 'fade.' We've really 'spun around' for this book. It should be interesting."

Bob Laurence, KBEQ/Kansas City, MO: "We're into 'The Winning Combination.' It's a variation of the 'vault contests' in which we've printed up entry blanks that have different combinations on them (L-26, R-74, L-89). Each entry blank separates into two pieces, each piece containing the combination. The contestant fills in their name and address on one half, sends it to us, and they retain the other half for reference. We then call out combinations on the air every hour and, if they hear theirs announced, they have ten minutes to call in and claim whatever the prize is for that hour. Our prizes range in value from \$50 and \$500 including waterbeds and motorcycles." The caper for the contest is that all the hourly winners qualify for a final drawing in which they choose from five different grand prizes each valued at \$10,000. KBEQ is also running the syndicated "History of Rock and Roll" over the five Sundays of April.

Does KBEQ tighten up musically during the book? Bob says, "Not really. I've never been a believer of trying to win the book during the book. I suppose it depends on the market, but here, the AOR competition is strong enough that we can play album cuts. But our music policy doesn't really change with the ratings."

Mike Phillips, KGW/Portland, OR: "We're giving away money in our cash vans, which is what we do typically. We've also set aside several hours of commercial-free programming where we'll just play solid music. And that's basically it. Our last book we gave away oodles of money and didn't do all that well with it, so we're taking more or less of a non-hype approach this time."

"As far as music goes we tighten up a little bit for the book. With unfamiliar music unless we get an indication from some of the other stations we watch, we may wait. We tighten up our gold and are probably a little more conservative overall."

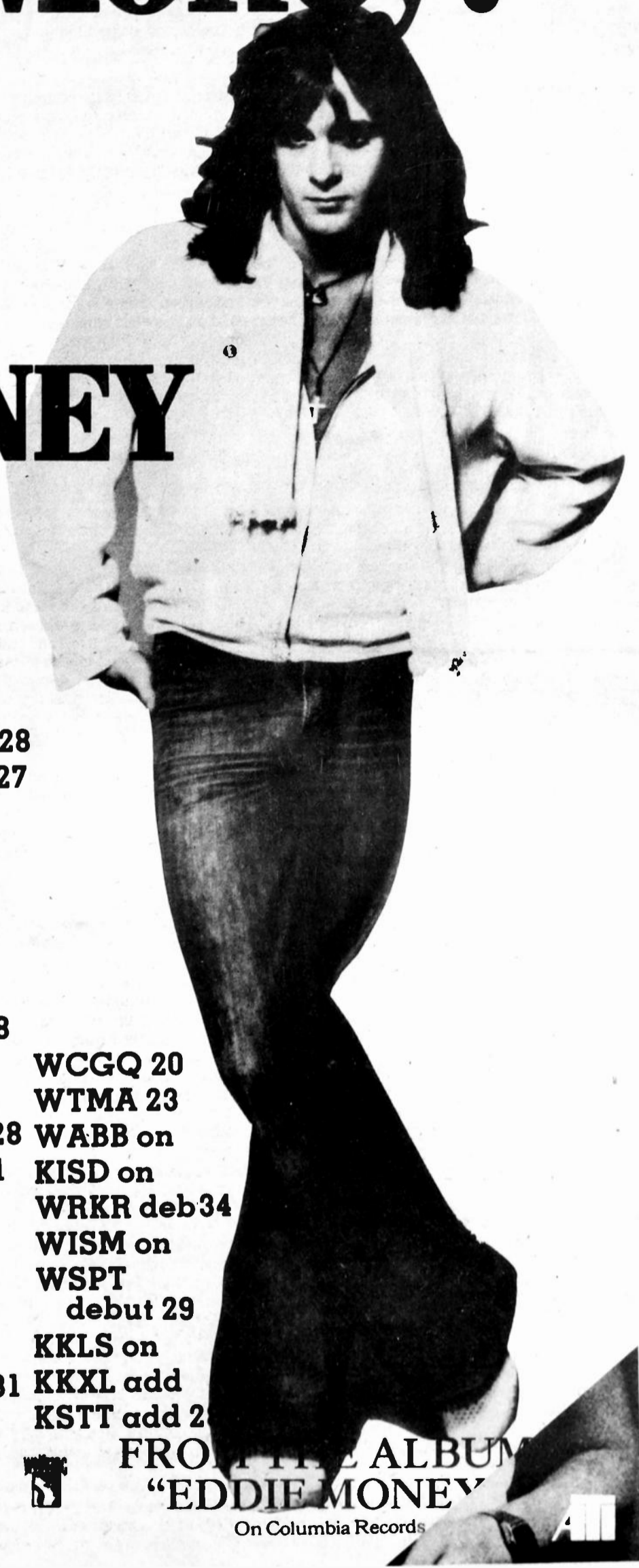

Contests still seem to be a part of Spring ratings but I detect a decrease in their overall importance. Not too long ago it would have been unheard of to enter a major rating period without a "killer promotion" on the air. Now some programmers, perhaps reacting to audience research and competition, feel that approach is no longer valid. It will be particularly interesting to watch Omaha, a market that has seen large contests in the past, but this Spring seems to be running relatively promotion-free.

Musically, the markets listed above seem to have a set policy that doesn't vary too much during the ratings. Some programmers decrease the number of gold selections available for play, some are more cautious about "unfamiliar artists," but most do not drastically change the criteria for selection of new music. Whatever the outcome for this all important rating book, I would simply wish all of you "a valid sample" and of course good luck!

LEIF HELPS GIVE LIFE: With over \$200,000 raised on the April first March of Dimes Walkathon, Leif Garrett has helped set a new record for the annual fundraiser in Atlanta. Gary Cory, Program Director of WQXI/Atlanta, also reported a new mark was set for participation. Over 10,000 walkers took part with thousands of onlookers crowding the streets, shattering last year's record participation mark of 2,900. 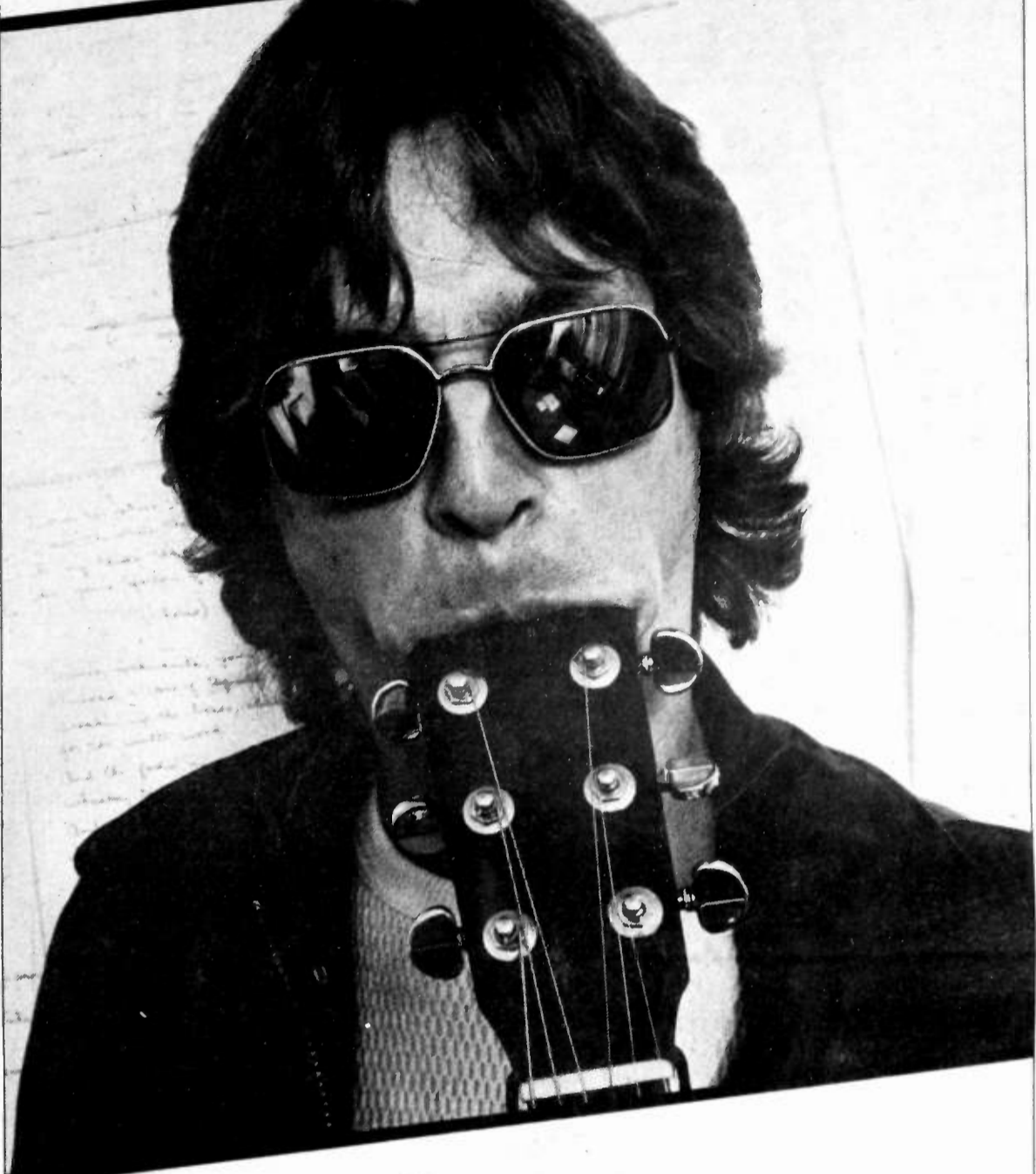

Here's an impressive promotional approach: KGB-AM-FM/San Diego has donated \$62,000 to the city of San Diego to finance the construction of a soccer field in the city's Balboa Park.

The gift was made to mark the occasion of KGB-AM's fiftieth year of broadcasting in San Diego. General Manager Jim Price told R&R that the station "doesn't believe in contests or giveaways; we prefer to orient our promotions around events in which all of our listeners can take part. I've always believed," Price continued, "that to make a radio station a real institution in its community you have to do things that really involve you with that community. We put that philosophy into action five years ago when we began our first "Homegrown" record album project. Our sky shows of the past two years further perpetuated that philosophy. We were looking for something very special to do for a city that has been special to us."

In talking with the city's Parks and Recreation Board about setting up a third sky show for this year, KGB PD Rick Leibert learned that the city was in need of financial aid to build a soccer field in their community park. That gave Leibert the idea to help out, and he found station owners Willet and Michael Brown willing listeners and contributors.

The sizeable contribution has enabled the city of San Diego to order construction plans to be drawn up for the field, which will take at least a year to complete.

KGB Field is a promotion that works for everyone: It's a gift to the community that will last several lifetimes, and a great image promotion for the station.

New Musical Directions At KSAN

KSAN/San Francisco, long noted as one of the last bastions of free-form radio, is taking the first steps away from that musical direction toward increased artist familiarity. PD Bonnie Simmons told R&R: "KSAN has always gone on music early, if not sometimes too early. In the past year, our senses deadened by the proliferation of technically-perfect-but-boring records, we got pretty excited by some of the New Wave music, because in its very rawness and sense of humor it sounded fresh to us. But I do think we went a little overboard in that we became so enthusiastic for awhile that we lost our ability to differentiate between quality and lack of same, and we were playing some albums just because they were 'New Wave.'"

Simmons continued: "We've had several talks about our music recently, and about the fact that we are in a competitive situation. We're faced with a station with an enormous promotional budget, and others who are clipping away at us from different corners of the market. As a result of our staff talks, there's still no playlist of what to play or avoid playing, but everyone is giving much more thought in doing their shows not to alienate the audience; to try not to stop playing records just as most people are starting to get turned on to them... We don't want to program to peer group pressure. I don't object to people playing new obscure pieces; what I think the audience will object to is hearing seven or eight of them in a row. I don't want a real hip, cultish radio station that no one listens to."

WSIM/Chattanooga Sold To WFLI Inc.

Chattanooga AOR station WSIM has been sold to WFLI Inc., who own WFLI, a Chattanooga Top 40 station and two other Southern radio stations. WSIM will retain its AOR music approach, although MD Don Mathisen reports some tightening of the music library, and that the station will be Top 40 during morning drive when they simulcast with their new AM sister station, WFLI.

WFLI PD Michael Benns has also taken over programming responsibilities at WSIM. Gone from the station are overnights Dwayne Perkins and engineer Parks Hall. New to the station is Ron Richardson, former WFLI newscaster, who is doing 3-7pm at WSIM.

The station was formerly owned by Roy and Roberta Davis.

They set up the Archer Road Band in a large lot in front of the station and invited listeners to come see the group in a free performance. The unique aspect of the promotion is that the group's amps were all inside the building, so the only way listeners could hear the group they were watching was if they tuned to WGVL. The station reported hundreds of cars parked in the large lot in front of the station, watching the group as they listened to their music on the station.

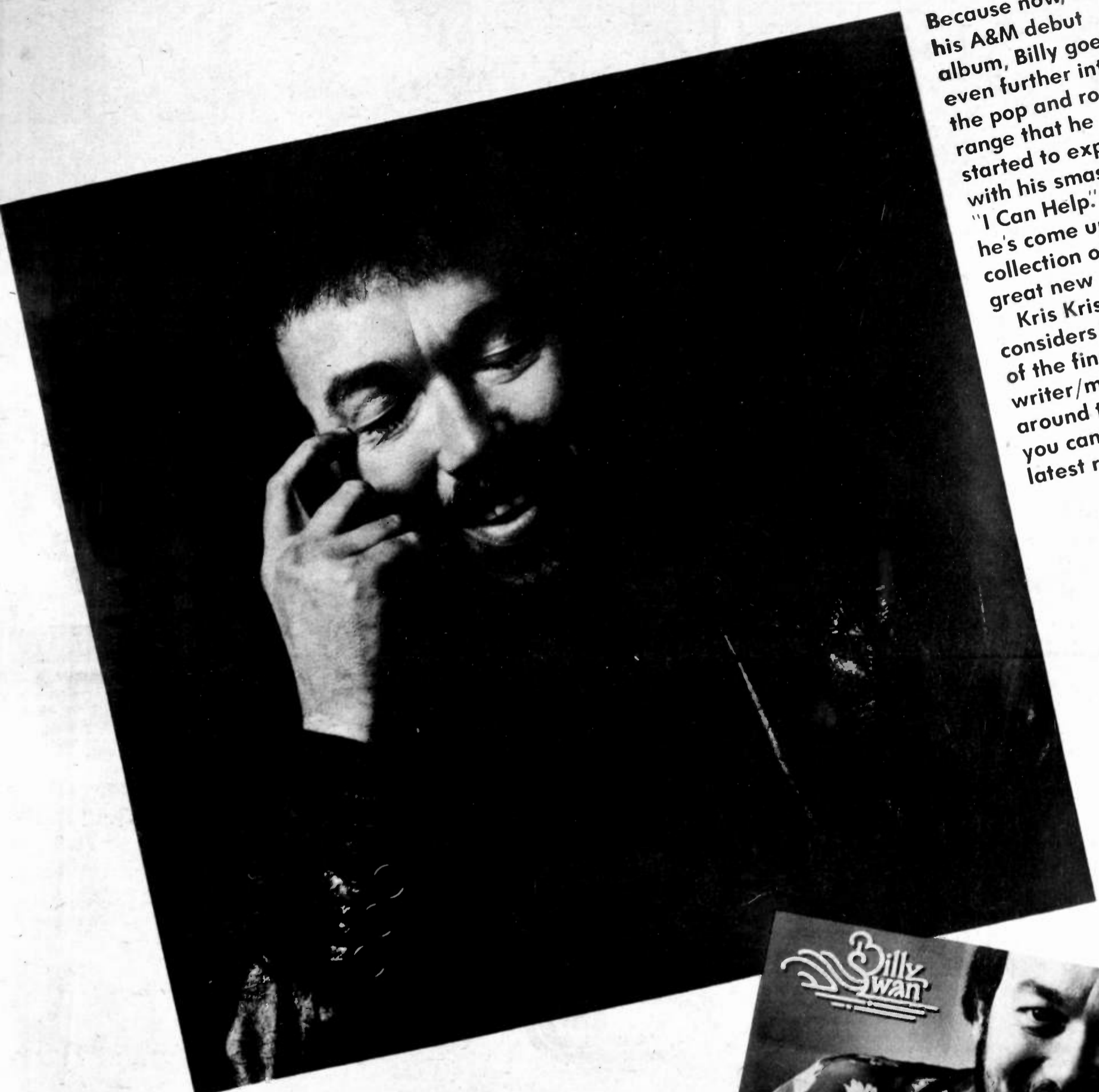

FM Growth Observed By AM Programmer

WIND/Chicago Program Director Al Mitchell had some interesting observations about the growth of FM radio in the Windy City on the phone the other day. We'd like to briefly share some of his thoughts:

"I suppose that Chicago is the last of the top ten markets in the country to feel the growing impact of FM. There are about twelve places on FM where you can find Pop/Adult and generally contemporary music as opposed to only two on AM...us and WLS.

With all the competition in town now, you'll find more money than ever being spent for this current book. WLS is giving away a car a day for 44 days. We're giving away 30 trips to anywhere in the country that United flies. WFYR is giving away 7 or 8 things including a car. It's just unbelievable. And what I key back to is a comment by George Wilson at one of your conventions in Atlanta when he said: 'FM is not going to make it in that town as long as there are two big 50,000 watt rockers clanging heads. If one of them goes, then you watch.' And this comment was way before anyone thought WCFL would go away. And when they did FM really started to come on. I think that really is the main reason...you had WGN holding monstrous adult numbers and WLS and WCFL locked into a battle to the death that kept so much excitement on the AM that everyone paid attention.

I think it's all adding up to the fact that the AM band is left with an all-news, a mainline adult WGN, a Country, a daytimer all-talk, rock at WLS and us with Pop/Adult...all the rest of the choices are on FM.

In the Jan/Feb book, I think this market hit 50/50 in 12 plus shares. And 54 percent in favor of FM for the 18-49 group. April/May 1976 to April/May 1977 showed a 9 point share jump for FM penetration. This is not big news to many, but it's now happening in a big way in Chicago."

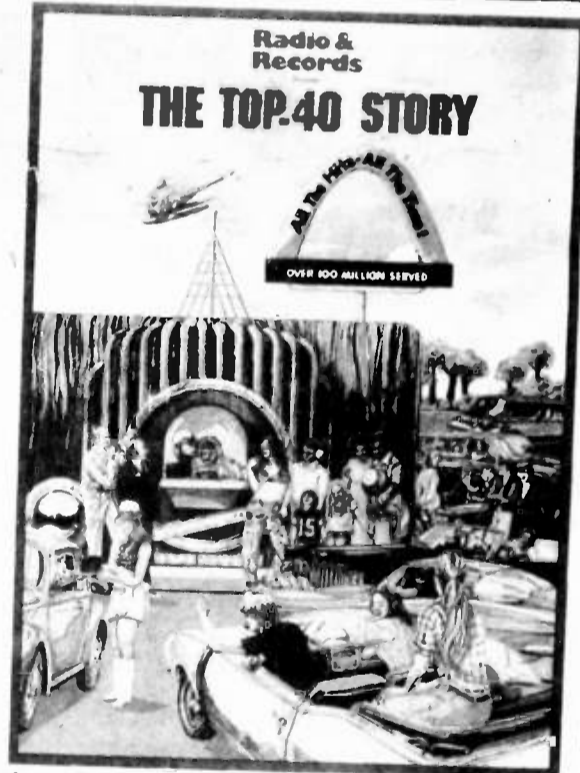
