RCA Nashville Operation In Significant Expansion

RCA's Nashville division will eventually double in size as the result of a new expansion move aimed at broadening its scope to include pop as well as country music. The changes, including the hiring of several new promotion people and a West Coast A&R person, will make the Nashville operation a virtually autonomous record company.

RCA Vice President of Nashville Operations Jerry Bradley told R&R, "We're adding an A&R man who will be out on the West Coast looking for pop as well as country music. We are going to increase our promotion staff, which will be

based all over the country but will report direct to this office in Nashville. The expanded promotion division will report directly to Joe Galante, who has been promoted to the position of Director of Marketing, Nashville. The entire staff will grow by 15 or 20 people when the changes are complete, by early 1979. We should be basically set to roll, however, by August 1. We're hoping to pick up some product and get a barometer on what's happening, whether it be pop or country."

ing, whether it be pop or country."

Joe Galante told R&R: "We haven't hired anyone for the field yet, but we are now looking for people as far as regional promotion goes. I'm really excited about the whole idea. I think this is a most unique concept. We feel radio has helped us a great deal and this way we can give some more time back to radio with the additional people."

The new unified pop-and-country thrust for RCA Nashville came about as a result of recent RCA crossover success, Bradley indicated. He will oversee the new West Coast A&R operation.

Mel Ilberman, RCA Division Vice President of Business Affairs and Associated Labels, stated, "Our plan is to use a national full-line record company approach operating out of Nashville. The organization will operate with complete autonomy in control of its own promotion, merchandising, advertising, and selling, through RCA distribution." Product will continue to be released on the RCA label.

Gidion Named Promotion VP For New MCA Label

Pete Gidion has been appointed Vice President of Promotion for Ron Alexenburg's as-yet-unnamed record company, financed by MCA, Inc. Gidion had been Associate Director of Promotion at Epic Records, and had previously been National Director of Promotion for MCA Records. In his new position, Gidion will direct all promotional efforts

Gidion told R&R the label's first priority was to develop a full staff, with his responsibility being to staff the promotion department. "We'll have a promotion staff totally separate from MCA Records, including local and regional people. I'm looking for probably 19 local people and 5 regional. I'm interested in finding people who, once a record is on a radio station, know how to follow through with a total professional promotion approach." He added that the new label will be a "full-line" record company, with artists covering all contemporary forms of music.

Alexenburg commented: "I am very excited in knowing that Peter 'The Leader' Gidion will be working with our new label. He brings to the position excitement, energy and true record business professionalism. He has been asked to build a dynamic staff of promotion professionals to serve radio and our artists."

R&R Offices Closed On Memorial Day

The R&R offices will be closed on Monday, May 29, in observance of the Memorial Day holiday.

Springsteen LP Aired By Century, WBAB

The forthcoming Bruce Springsteen album, Darkness On The Edge Of Town, was obtained last week through undisclosed sources by Century Broadcasting and WBAB/Long Island in advance of official release, and aired briefly before cease and desist orders were issued. The Springsteen album, the artist's first since fall 1975, is scheduled for release May 30.

Bob Burch, National Program Director for Century, told R&R: "We received the album and began airing it Thursday (5-18) at Century's four stations: WABX/Detroit, KSHE/St. Louis, KWST/Los Angeles and KMEL/San Francisco. We received a cease and desist order and stopped playing the album Friday morning at all four stations." Burch added, "I did not receive the record through anybody associated with Columbia or anyone at CBS. We don't have any desire to have a poor rapport with Columbia or any other record com-

pany. So when they asked us to pull it, I did." Burch described listener response to the album as "incredible." Some Program Directors at competing AOR stations in Century's markets reportedly protested directly to Columbia following the Century airings.


WBAB/Long Island obtained a commercial copy (as opposed to a promotional copy, whose distribution is directly controlled by a record company) of the Springsteen album Sunday (5-21) and played it on the air that day and the next before pulling it off the air in response to a cease and desist order, according to Music Director Bernie Bernard. The station also declined to disclose its source for obtaining the album. The incident was the second advance airing instance involving Century in recent months; the chain also aired Wings' London Town album prior to its official release before obeying a cease and desist order.

R&R To Debut Black Radio/Music Section; Bill Speed Named Editor

Radio & Records will introduce a new section covering the areas of Black radio programming and June. Bill Speed has been appointed Editor of the new section, and has already been conducting extensive research into the needs and concerns which can be served in R&R. The new section will provide the most comprehensive coverage of Black radio and music in early music available to the industry.

Speed is a ten-year industry veteran, having begun his career in Cleveland radio. He moved to KFRC/San Francisco, where he spent two years, becoming Promotion Director of the station. He became involved in independent radio consultation, numbering several major market stations as clients, and later was President of Radio Specialists Ltd., a syndicated programming organization which provided special programs to stations across the country.

Speed stated, "In my visits and conversations over the past month with black radio programmers nationwide, we've discussed existing communication gaps in music re-

porting, programming, and black radio in general. With the help of everyone out there, we can collectively solve many of these problems and build an exciting and informative service for the industry. I'm looking forward to meeting the challenge."

FCC Adopts Two Minority Broadcast Ownership Proposals

The FCC has approved on a caseby-case basis two proposals to encourage minority ownership of broadcast properties. A provision for tax certificates, which would allow sellers of properties to minoritles to defer capital gains taxation, had been originally suggested by the NAB, and received Carter Administration endorsement before its adoption by the Commission. Also endorsed by the Administration was a petition from the Congressional Black Caucus to allow broadcast licensees facing hearings for license violations to sell their properties to minority buyers at distress sale prices. Previously, the

distress sale provision was only applicable in cases when licensees facing revocation hearings were going bankrupt or had become physically or mentally disabled.

The FCC's action followed a sustained Carter Administration effort to promote minority broadcast ownership (including the establishment of Small Business Administration loans for broadcast purchases). Washington sources indicated that FCC Commissioner Tyrone Brown, the Commission's sole black member, was a prime mover" in speeding the FCC's adoption of the new minority policies.



Third Upper Midwest Communications Conclave Held

The third annual Upper Midwest Communications Conclave, a meeting of radio and record industry participants from Minnesota, Wisconsin, the Dakotas, Iowa, and Nebraska, came to a successful conclusion Saturday, May 20, in Playmouth, Minnesota. The three-day convention featured a keynote address by Mike Phillips of WMNE/WMFM/Menomonie, Wisconsin; two recognition luncheons honoring Radio & Records Editor/Pub-

lisher Bob Wilson and the Gavin Report's Bill Gavin; and a number of radio and record-oriented panel discussions.

Panel discussions covered issues related to sales, research (audience and music), programming, records, engineering, and air personalities (a session moderated by R&R Top 40 Editor John Leader). Among the industry figures speaking or moderating panels were Motown Vice

President/Assistant to the President Danny Davis, WEAQ/WIAL/Eau Claire Operations Manager Steve Dickoff, KFJZ/Fort Worth Program Director Peter McLane, KFYR/Bismarck PD Dan Brannan, KTSA/KTFM/San Antonio, TX Operations Manager Scott Christenson, KQWB/Fargo PD Bob Denver, KRNT/Des Moines PD Del Hull, WJON/St. Cloud PD Tom Kay, and Great American Music Stores owner Ira Heilicher.

Mike Becce has been promoted to the newly created position of Director/Sales Field Relations at RCA Records, as part of a promotion reorganization in which RCA local branch Sales Managers will assume responsibility for promotion reps in their areas. Becce will act as a liaison between sales and promotion in his new position. He was most recently Director of National Singles Promotion and Administra-

tion at RCA, having been with the company for slightly over three years.

Assuming the position of National Singles Promotion Director is Margo Knesz, who had been Director of National Secondary Promotion at Atlantic. Prior to a five-year stint at Atlantic, she had worked in promotion at Stereo Dimension and Epic Records.

Rocket-RCA Records Agreement Official

Confirming speculation over the last several weeks, Rocket Records has signed a distribution agreement with RCA. Rocket will trans-

fer its headquarters from Los Angeles to New York as well. Rocket Executive Vice President Tony King will serve as liaison with RCA in the fields of promotion, marketing and publicity.

The agreement covers current Rocket acts including Cliff Richard, Kiki Dee, Blue, Colin Blunstone, and Lulu; as well as back product by Neil Sedaka and other artists. Elton John, a principal in the label, will continue to record for MCA, but will participate in A&R decisions for Rocket and, will produce the next Biue album. First Rocket product under the RCA banner is expected in mid-July.

Columbia Appoints Six In Promotion Expansion

Columbia Records has expanded its promotion department in what Vice President of National Promotion Bob Sherwood termed a "major step in the growth" of the department. Six new appointments were announced by the company. Paul Black was named Associate

Director, National Singles Promotion, East Coast, a newly created position. Black, who was Southeast Regional Marketing Promotion Manager for the last two years, will report to National Promotion Director Don Colberg. Tom Sgroreplaces Black in the Southeast

Marketing Promotion position.

George Chaltas has been appointed Associate Director, National Singles Promotion, West Coast, another newly created position. He had been Local Promotion Manager for Columbia in San Francisco since 1976. Chaltas reports to West Coast Director of National Promotion/Trade Relations Chuck Thagard.

Fred Humphrey assumes the new position of Associate Director, National Album Promotion, having been promoted from Regional Promotion Marketing Manager, Midwest. He reports to National Album Promotion/Special Projects Director Mike Pillot. In addition, Debbie Brown and Debi Lipetz have been appointed National Secondary Promotion Managers for the East and West Coasts respectively. Both have been with Columbia for two years.

R&R's New "Trim Look" Debuts

Beginning with the present issue, the page size of Radio & Records will be trimmed slightly. Space for contents and the size of actual print will remain the same, but the white space around the edges of our pages will be trimmed to reduce the

weight and bulk of the newspaper. In its nearly five years of existence, R&R has never raised subscription prices; with the latest postal rate increases, we decided to reduce our weight slightly rather than pass higher costs on to our readers.

Black Music Association Formed

The Black Music Association, a nonprofit organization promoting black music and patterned after the Country Music Association, has been formed in Philadelphia by Kenneth Gamble, Chairman of Philadelphia International Records, and Edward W. Wright, President of GEI Communications. The BMA's areas of concern include performing arts, communications, marketing, merchandising, publishing and recording, with its primary goal being the perpetuation of black music on a national and international level.

Wright told R&R: "We decided three years ago that a new thrust was necessary, so we started with the concept and began developing it, speaking with people on all levels of the industry about what the needs were in relationship to black music. We thought it would be a good idea to try to structure the association along the lines of the Country Music Association, to promote black music and the people associated with it. It was a natural outgrowth of events."

Gamble and Wright also announced the appointment of Jules Malamud, the first Executive Di-



rector of NARM, as the BMA's Senior Vice President/Managing Director. Glenda Gracia was appointed Executive Director of the Association; she has been a Talent and Program Negotiator for CBS Business Affairs, Entertain-

Communications Act Rewrite Unveiling Delayed

The rewrite of the 1934 Communications Act, as devised by the House Communications Subcommittee headed by Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin of San Diego, will be introduced on June 7 instead of June 1 as previously intended. The extension will allow Van Deerlin's staff to polish certain areas in the contents. At least one of two planned three-week hearings on the bill are scheduled for sometime this summer.

Burkhart/Abrams, Gaylord Stations Go Separate Ways

The Burkhart/Abrams & Associates radio consulting firm has announced its termination of consulting agreements with Gaylord Radio properties. Stations involved include KRKE/Albuquerque, KYTE/Portland, and WKY/Oklahoma City. Kent Burkhart told R&R that the firm would be "moving across the street" in Oklahoma City, with the new consulted station to be announced next month.

Outlet Acquisition Of WTOP Approved

The FCC has approved the transfer of News-formatted WTOP/Washington D.C. from Post-Newsweek to Outlet Co.'s Washington Radio, Inc. subsidiary. Outlet agreed in November to purchase WTOP for \$6.7 million. Outlet also filed with the Commission for the transfer of KIQQ-FM (K100)/Los Angeles from Cosmic Communications Inc. to Outlet. Outlet agreed to buy K100 for \$4.5 million in January.

Broadcasting Division Leads Taft To Best Year Ever

Taft Broadcasting Co. announced its most profitable year in history for the period ending March 31. Net earnings for the fiscal year were up 28 percent to \$19.9 million, while sales reached \$138.3 million, up 27 percent over last year. Fourth quarter profits were up 28 percent as well, with sales for that period up 26 percent over the same period last year. The broadcasting group was the top profit earner by far, with pretax profits up 18 percent and revenues up 14 percent to \$68.4 million. The film production/distribution division (including Hanna-Barbera Productions) generated \$32.9 million in sales, up 91 percent, while theme parks profits were up 15 percent and revenues increased 10 percent to \$34.8 million.

Fruitful Year Ahead For Radio, TV In Giant Tree Fruit Campaign

The California Tree Fruit Agreement (CTFA) is planning a \$1.5 million broadcast campaign on behalf of its fresh peaches, plums, nectarines and pears. The campaign, biggest in CTFA's history, will finance over 20,000 radio and TV spots during the 1978 marketing season, tagged with names of local retailers. Thirty-second radio spots will run in 52 markets from the end of May to the end of October, with separate campaigns for each of the four varieties of fruit. A special concentration on black radio stations in nine cities and Spanish stations in four other localities is planned, as CTFA surveys show substantial use of summer fruits by those ethnic groups. TV spots in eleven American cities and some Canadian markets will also be used.

NAB Calls For Education Provision In SBA Program

The NAB has asked the Small Business Administration to set up an education and information program within its new effort to fund minority purchases of broadcast facilities. The broadcast organization called for seminars to be held and printed material sent to banks and other financial institutions to clarify questions about the SBA program and inform interested parties of its existence. The NAB offered to help in such educational efforts.

Public Radio Leaders Testify At Carnegie Hearings

A number of top public radio figures testified last week at Carnegie Commission on the Future of Public Broadcasting hearings in Boston. The hearings were carried the day following the event on WGBH/Boston. Part of a nationwide series of discussions on public broadcasting, the hearings were concerned entirely with public radio issues. Among those testifying were National Public Radio President Frank Mankiewicz. NPR Senior Vice President Thomas Warnock, NPR Programming Vice President Samuel Holt. Corp. For Public Broadcasting Radio Activities Director Diana Calland. Tom Thomas of the National Federation of Community Broadcasters, WETA-FM/Washington D.C.'s Charles Hobson. WBUR-FM/Boston General Manager Bonnie Cronin. WGBH Station Manager John Beck. WGBH producer David Freudberg. and KLDG/Dillingham. Alaska's Les Robinson.

74 Percent Of Ad Agencies Increase Profits

Advertising industry figures indicate that 74 percent of all ad agencies increased their profits in 1977. The same number showed increases in 1976, compared to 58 percent showing improvement in 1975. Of agencies showing billings of \$40 million or above, 96 percent were up in both billings and profits in 1977. Several leading agencies, holding stockholder meetings last week, predicted further profit increases for next year as the industry continues to project a boom climate.

Chris-Craft Continues 20th Buying Spree

Chris-Craft Industries announced the purchase of 92,000 shares of Twentieth Century-Fox Film Corp. common stock for investment purposes. The company has been buying 20th stock at a considerable rate in recent months, and is now the second largest shareholder in 20th, with 583,000 shares (7.5 percent of the total, compared to slightly over 8 percent for the leading shareholder, a New York investment firm).

FCC Orders UHF Reception Improvements

The FCC has ordered reductions in the permissible interference levels ("snow") in **UHF TV** sets, in a move designed to improve UHF reception. All new sets after October 1, 1981 must maintain an interference noise level of 14 decibels or less (compared to 18 today), and 12 decibels by 1982.

Multimedia, Stoner Swapping Stations

Multimedia Inc. announced an agreement in principle to swap its two Knoxville radio stations, WBIR-AM&FM plus \$1.5 million, for Stoner Broadcasting System's WVEZ-FM/Louisville. Multimedia owns WAKY in Louisville at present. The agreement is subject to director's approval from both companies, as well as FCC approval.

TV News

Arbitron has expanded its ESF (Expanded Sample Frame) program to 51 television markets from 33, starting with the current May 1978 sweep. 68 percent of the U.S. metropolitan population is now measured by ESF, which includes both listed and unlisted telephone households. New ESF markets for TV (which has reacted considerably more positively to ESF than has radio in general) include Birmingham, Louisville, Memphis, New Orleans, Oklahoma City, Orlando, and San Antonio.

MUSIC (from Casablanca) ON TV—The most extensive television promotion for perhaps any movie, let alone a music-oriented film continues as Casablanca Record & Filmworks saturates sets with "Thank God It's Friday" promotions and specials. A 30-minute special on the making of the movie began airing in 35 markets May 13, while two consecutive Merv Griffin shows were devoted entirely to "TGIF," featuring nationwide dance contests and film excerpts. Coming up this week is a 50-minute "Disco Special" to be included in the "Midnight Special" May 26, hosted by Donna Summer, and featuring a number of groups appearing in the film. And on "American Bandstand" May 27, Dick Clark steps aside as host for what Casablanca says is the first time ever, to allow Donna Summer to host a special disco edition of the program. Rumors of a Casablanca-sponsored "Disco Disney" special are, so far, unconfirmed....Murray the K, the flamboyant New York Top 40 jock of the 60's and one of the few Top 40 air personalities to become a national public figure, will be the subject of an ABC TV movie next year.

Where There's A Wheels, There's A Way-NBC Ties ABC

NBC tied ABC for the Nielsen crown for the week ending May 14, with three episodes of "Wheels" all reaching the top ten and no other NBC programs cracking the top 20. CBS, with a 15.2 rating, trailed behind the two winners, who each had a 17.4 rating, and did not place a single show in the top 10, a rarity. "Laverne & Shirley" topped the individual program list, followed by 2) "Three's Company" 3) "Wheels" Part III 4) "Happy Days" 5) "Wheels" Part II 6) "All Star Family Feud" (an ABC special) 7) "Wheels" Part IV 8) "Charlie's Angels" 9) "Carter Country" in a surprisingly strong showing for this ABC comedy, and 10) "Love Boat." "Wheels" Part I aired the previous week, finishing sixth.

"Wheels" scored with all three episodes in the top ten lists for New York and Los Angeles for the week ending May 12 in **Arbitron**'s rankings, as ABC otherwise dominated (and almost monopolized) the chart. "Laverne & Shirley" topped the New York list, followed by "All-Star Family Feud 3) "Happy Days" and "Three's Company" tied 5) "Wheels" Parts II and IV in a tie, and 7) a four-way tie between "Barney Miller", the cancelled "Fish", "Wheels" Part III, and CBS' "Incredible Hulk."

In Los Angeles, "Three's Company" was the leader, followed by 2) "Laverne & Shirley" 3) "Happy Days" 4) "All-Star Family Feud" 5) "Charlie's Angels" 6) a three-way tie between "Wheels" Parts II and III plus "Carter Country" and 9) a tie between "Wheels" Part IV and "Eight Is Enough" (ABC).





Tobacco-Substitute Cigarettes Extinguished In UK

A highly publicized, expensive campaign to break tobacco-substitute cigarettes in Britain has proved a serious cigarette burn for British tobacco manufacturers. Companies producing the "NSM" (new smoking material) cigarettes hoped to corner 3-5 percent of the market by now after introducing their substitute brands last summer, as reported by R&R. However, figures show that the NSM brands account for just 0.6 percent of the \$6.3 billion British cigarette market resulting in losses of about \$125 million for the three companies who introduced the NSM cigarettes. Imperial Tobacco, the leading supplier, has just withdrawn its two top NSM brands, which locked up 50 percent of the substitute market. Reasons for the expensive failure included insufficient market preparation time, lack of government tax cut support, attacks on health grounds from anti-smoking lobbyists, and unexciting advertising. The British substitute tobacco experiment was a test situation for projected worldwide NSM campaigns, which now seem to boast rather slim prospects.

Duke On The Stick

Grammys Considering New Rock Categories

The National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences board of trustees has formed a committee to consider establishing new Grammy Award categories in the rock and jazz-rock fields. The action was described by the board as an attempt to bring the awards "even further into line" with "ever-changing" popular music styles. Many rock-oriented industry figures and commentators have criticized past Grammy designations as favoring traditional pop stylings over rock material. The three-day trustees meeting also established a new award category for best repackaging of an album, and approved the bestowal of Grammy certificates to musicians and backing vocalists who perform on a record of the year winner. Bill Denny was reelected President of NARAS, with Jay Lowy reelected Secretary/Treasurer, Allan Steckler elected First Vice President and Mike Melvoin voted Vice President representing Los Angeles.



London Restructures Promotion Staff

Bee Gees To Benefit Children Of The World

The Bee Gees, in conjunction with Robert Stigwood and David Frost, are planning a project called "Music for UNICEF," scheduled for January 1979, the beginning of the International Year of the Child. The group will donate royalties on a new song to UNICEF, with hopes of persuading other top composers to do the same. Composers who make such donations will be featured in a worldwide satellite concert in January (with NBC planning to carry it in the States), and a souvenir album will be released. Precedents for this approach, though on a somewhat smaller scale, include a wildlife conservation album with tracks donated by the Beatles, Hollies, and others, and a 1965 soccer team benefit album in England with tracks by the Rolling Stones, Them featuring Van Morrison, and Tom Jones.

Philips Develops No-Contact Turntable The Philips Corporation has

developed a record player system employing a diode laser so that no contact exists between tone arm and the record itself. The company plans to introduce it for general sale in the early years of the next decade, priced competitively with conventional systems. Philips claims its new system will produce better sound quality as well as eliminating scratching damage to records.

Regional Acceptance Monitor **Ramifications Of A Rating System**

Challenging Arbitron's dominance in the radio rating arena is a perilous course of action. A number of rating services have perished in the attempt, while others have managed to survive in a decidedly secondary role. A combination of readily-absorbable information, aggressive promotion, and widespread radio and advertising agency acceptance has propelled Arbitron over the years into what many consider a virtually unbeatable position.

One non-subscriber to the Arbitron-is-unbeatable theory is Jack McCoy. Following a highly successful radio career (notably at KCBQ/San Diego), he formed the Cybernetics Corporation and RAM (Regional Acceptance Monitor) Research in the early 70's, expanding its services and subscribers gradually until today RAM conducts rating research in 61 markets, including all of the top 50.

McCoy firmly believes in his system's superiority to Arbitron, and is prepared to ram the point home by citing specific details about his methodology, philosophy, and services. He does just that in the following provocative article, derived from conversations between McCoy, R&R Editor/Publisher Bob Wilson, and Top 40 Editor John Leader

brings in geographical accuracy. That's the difference com-

Although census data is limited to ten-year spans (the next one is to be taken in 1980), McCoy is able to keep posted accurately on zip code populations by his computers' "retracking" telephone listings upon the publication of each

According to McCoy, RAM's extensive pains to balance their geographic sample areas avoids the pitfalls of wildly fluctuating ratings for specific stations owing to random diary placement. The RAM method, says McCoy, allows for diaries to be placed scientifically within a station's signal range on a consistent basis. "You put the same number of diaries inside each signal of each radio station each time and you'll get a 9.1 one time, then a 9.4 the next time, maybe an 8.7 the next time—the numbers stay consistent. If you just randomly throw diaries all over the place, what if they all land in your signal one time and land outside your signal the next time. We're talking about an extremely large expense here to go to the trouble of doing this.'

McCoy sounds a word of warning against random generated samplings. 'I just want to put it as mildly as I can that it's the end of the world for radio if random generated samplings occur. It's terrible for radio, and it's important that you understand what expanded sample frame means for radio and what random generated phone call-out means. What it will cause is people losing faith in radio rating reports because numbers are going to skew all over the

McCoy goes on to impart some interesting observations on the radio listening habits of specific zip codes. "In some zip codes tremendous proportions of the listening is in Country radio. In other zip codes you have tons of people who listen to AOR, others listen to classical, others to news. It's a function of how the zip code comes about in the first place. It's accidentally set up in America so these borders of zip codes actually reach out and rewrap themselves on an annual basis around people who are just alike...The people are living together, trading together, zoned together, taxed together. In most every state of the Union now, if you live next door to someone with a four-bedroom house and a Mercedes Benz. you probably have the same things. America is a conglomeration of people trying to move into the most expensive zip code that they can afford. As soon as they make \$50,000 a year, the first thing they do is move into a neighborhood where everyone is making that amount. The income levels vary so drastically by zip codes it is incredible.'

McCoy then applied that phenomenon to a discussion of Arbitron's proposed expanded sample frame (ESF). "They didn't make it stick because too many broadcasters realized what it would do. They've used it on television and it's just fine because TV signals cover markets. Radio is made up of a little signal here, a little signal there...Since different types of radio are listened to in different neighborhoods, you may get five neighborhoods in a row where they all listen to Top 40 a lot, but there is a definite delineation or stratifica-

tion of listening in these zip codes.
"With the expanded sample," he continues, "you start out let's say that 50 percent of the phones in a market are unlisted. That means that in the first half of the sample you would sample the country neighborhoods. Then the second half of the sample would go to unlisted phone numbers. Well, all the unlisted phone numbers are not spread outthey're all right here in, say, the neighborhood. What does that do? It's going to take certain stations up phenomenally in a distorted way.

No Phone, No Sample

How, then, does RAM handle the touchy issue of unlisted phones? Quite simply. "We do not cover unlisted people," says McCoy. He believes that RAM's detailed sampling of (Continued on page 20)

Daily Diary

Jack McCoy had four goals in creating a new radio rating service. The first was to provide a "year-round rating" to eliminate hype and deliver information that would reflect the current market status. It would "provide detailed demographic, geographic, qualitative target information. It would be more accurate than "any present rating service." And it would "instantly deliver all data electronically to radio stations and agencies alike via computer terminal.

McCoy recalls that RAM "began by testing several methodologies, from telephone coincidental to telephone recall. Although these methodologies proved to be much less expensive, they did not deliver precision answers...We knew that the broadcast industry favored a telephone-type sampling method. We wanted to adopt a methodology which the broadcasters favored. However, we found it to be no more accurate than Arbitron's telephone reconstructed ethnic

McCoy eventually settled on a continuously rotating oneday diary system. "Our studies showed that people had extreme difficulty recalling with exactness which station they listened to and when they listened for any period other than an hour. In testing the diary methodology, we found that the same sloppiness of answers crept into that methodology after the second day. We found that a one-day diary, surrounded before and immediately after by telephone prompting from a trained researcher, would display tremendous pinpoint

RAM uses a seven-day sample of respondents, some keeping Monday diaries, some Tuesdays, and so forth. Calls are made to establish diary placement, and afterward to check whether the diaries have arrived, been filled out, and returned. McCoy stresses that "there are no subcontractors anywhere." All calls are placed from RAM's El Cajon (near San Diego) headquarters. "Every single person is checked on every single household" receiving a diary, McCoy adds. "Obviously there are a few we can't ever reach again. but we try up to three times to get hold of that household."

A further advantage of the dialy diary, in McCoy's mind, is that it "decreases the negative impact should the diary fall into unscrupulous hands." RAM places 800 diaries a week in a market like Los Angeles, on a year-round basis, or well over a hundred a day to different people, reducing the chance, McCoy believes, that a diary in the wrong hands could have any serious effect.

McCoy summarizes his methodology as follows: "It's a much larger sample going all the time, a great number of different diary controls to put more integrity in the diary. It's computer checked, it's placed by us from this location, it's one day so if it falls into unscrupulous hands you can't distort with a one-day diary like you can with seven days, and with a larger sample each person isn't weighted as much so you can't do as much damage; and it's almost impossible to hype a survey that's going on all year round.

Preserving The Average Quarter Hour

While RAM has instituted radical changes in diary methodology, the results of the survey are still structured around the traditional average quarter hour figures. McCoy has more than one reason for retaining this traditional rating basis. "Anything even slightly larger than an average quarter hour would drastically distort the possibilities for which it was designed," he says. "You're figuring that the average guy listening in any average quarter hour is going to hear, basically, any average thing that occurred in that quarter hour. Now if you said it was an average hour, if something happened at the end of the hour the odds are you wouldn't catch the guy that was listening at the beginning of the hour. If it was an average half hour, you might only catch half of the people that were listening at the start of the half hour or at the end. But in an average quarter hour it's basically the same people listening throughout that quarter hour, so that when you play a record, if you have 3000 in that average quarter hour, about 3000 people heard that record.

Although McCoy is confident that with RAM's daily data, the company could provide more sophisticated and exact measures than the average quarter hour, he realizes that the average quarter hour is the accepted standard for both radio stations and ad agencies. "It's the best standard there is," he says. "And all agency time buying is going to be done off it. They're not going to ask you for the average five minute or the average half hour; they ask for the average quarter hour." John Patton, a RAM associate, added, 'The thing to keep in mind is when RAB and NAB were doing this work with TRAC-7, they tried to figure out what was wanted to replace Arbitron. The answer was they didn't want anything to replace Arbitron. They wanted exactly what Arbitron has been giving them. At the agency level, everybody loves it."

Zipping Through A Sample

McCoy's contention then is that Arbitron is not deficient as far as supplying the desired information to stations and agencies; instead, it's their methods, accuracy, and detail he finds fault with. McCoy seems almost obsessively concerned with the accuracy and wide scope of his research methods, devoting particular attention to his sampling

"The sample is the most critical thing here. It's funny, there are so many people on the hobbyist level of research who are doing random phone calls or random things out of the phone book and you're not doing an open-ended geographical study when you're doing that," he says.


The RAM samples are devised from government census tracts "overlaid" by zip code data. "The zip code is the best denominator as opposed to the census tract because we can track telephone listing movements from place to place

Interestingly, RAM and Arbitron buy their sample information from the same source, a direct mail operation called Metro Mail. However, the specifics requested by the two rating companies differ. McCoy says, "We ask for our profile as follows: the phone books for an area are typed into a computer. The computer figures the address and computes what zip code that particular listing is in, and moves that name over to be stacked up in the proper zip code. All the phone numbers are put in the zip codes in which they belong."


Different zip code areas may require widely varying numbers of diaries because of population differences. "That's the whole idea," says McCoy. "Rather than randomly calling out of a phone book, the idea is to call, proportioned as closely as we can compute, the number of people who are





all neighborhoods sufficiently covers all demographic groups who have a preponderance of unlisted numbers (generally thought to be the extreme ends of the wealthy-poor spectrum), and that any benefits to be gained by sampling unlisted households are far outweighed by the randomness and potential for error McCoy contends is inherent in such samplings.

McCoy is aware of theoretical inequities bound up in using only listed phone numbers, such as the passing over of large on-campus college population blocs without individual phones. He feels his careful samplings of neighborhoods where students live off-campus is an adequate compensation, but summarizes the entire dilemma by saying: The most crystal clear answer that can be given is to make sure that you get the rich neighborhoods, the poor neighborhoods, the hip, the bland, the sleepy, the commuting neighborhoods, and so on. There's only one way to do that. You cannot do it with a random telephone prefix and know where you're ending up. There's only one way possible to do it and you have to make some sacrifices in order to do it. You have to do it by the zip code method for listening. With a college, you can cover it if you make absolutely sure you blow diaries into those neighborhoods where students live off-campus, and there's only one way to make sure you're getting diaries into those neighborhoods...by zip codes. You see, our system guarantees we'll get diaries into that neighborhood. Any other system might randomly miss that college altogether.

Diary Design

As an amusing sidelight, McCoy related a few of the problems RAM encountered in designing questions for diary respondents. "You wouldn't believe the nightmares that you go through to make it simple enough. We started out with an FM and an AM column—check off listening to AM

Blue Book And Red Book

In addition to the computer terminal data, RAM publishes two books of information on a regular basis: a programmers' guide known as the "blue book" and the "red book", designed principally for agencies. The blue book is published weekly and contains rating information for that week and the four previous weeks combined. "It's not averaged," says McCoy. "It literally goes back to the raw diary information and recomputes it from scratch. It's not an average of a bunch of insufficient samples; it takes the whole thing. The sample remains about the same size at each given point." McCoy adds, "We have daily cume ratings and project the cuine figures. That particular aspect of publishing cume figures and average persons per quarter hour-only two rating companies do that, RAM and Arbitron. If you can't publish the average persons per quarter hour in hundreds and the cume in hundreds, you cannot do gross impressions, cost per thousands, or all the things that ratings should do. This is what puts us out of the category of the hobbylst ratings and right into the demographics.

The red book comes out monthly and covers the last quarter's (three-month) period. Except for its great frequency, it is, as described by McCoy, similar to Arbitron's quarterly rating guides.

Customized Services

RAM offers its clients a number of other services besides the basic ratings. A more sophisticated system could give a programmer average quarter hours by zip code, by format...information which McCoy calls "the real sophisticated pinpoint marketing data." There are attitudinal studies available...main reason for listening to the radio, broken out for specific areas, for instance. Attitudinal questions are "actually impregnated on the diaries" sent out to respondents.


In music research, McCoy says, "If a station happens

all stations receiving the same negative reports and none willing to be the first to add them? McCoy was struck by the implications of the question, and based his answer around the fundamental point that a rating service should not actually program a radio station, it should merely serve as a guide. "Your premise gives our system credit for greater weight than the subscriber gives it," he said. "This system does not program the radio station. Sometimes it will show something damaging, and even so the radio station plays it anyway." McCoy also believes that in using the system for specific times to play specific records, that after a few selective plays overall response will become more positive and that the programmer can then play the record more often, resulting in a gradual increase similar to prevalent patterns in radio now.

Cost vs. Service

Naturally there is a financial factor involved in McCoy's detailed information-gathering and breakdown services. His samples are quite large in themselves, varying market by market, with 10,000 in Rockford, IL and 44,000 in New York (compared to about 1200 for the entire nation in Nielsen's television ratings). McCoy answers questions about cost straightforwardly. "If you take all our services—most stations prefer to take ratings on radio listening, music, and attitudinal questions; most stations have a complete system like that from us—our costs are about double Arbitron's in the major markets and triple in the smaller markets."

McCoy is depending largely on broadcaster support to establish RAM as the top rating service. "Our intention is to make sure that with this rating system, the broadcaster stays in control of the data, to use it as a selling tool for himself. Broadcasters have already supported the system, at the outrageous cost of this quality of rating methodology, and have put us in all of the top 50 markets." As for agency and sales data, McCoy claims to have "the ability to push a button and collect the ratings for ratio stations for all neigh-



or to FM. you know what they did? 50 percent of the first returns crossed out FM and put "PM," so we had them listening to AM and FM in the PM. That little thing cost us \$11,000. If the diary goes out saying 'each time the radio is on,' then they come back with 'I left the radio on at home all day to keep burglars away.' It's unbelievable. I'll bet we spent close to \$100,000 in executive time just coming up with the language testing various things, and sitting here for days and days going over the words."

On The Service

Having read a detailed discussion of how RAM goes about accumulating its data, readers may be interested in finding out exactly what RAM offers when the data is finally analyzed.

The key to RAM's service is daily availability of data through a computer hookup. A computer terminal is installed in a subscribing station's office. "You subscribe to the ratings and we install that computer so you can check it all out," says McCoy. "We have computerized our operation so you can basically get all the information you need right in your own terminal without having to go visit the rating company."

Subscribers to the basic RAM rating service have the terminal installed first thing. McCoy says the computer system is "very simple; it's self-teaching." An hour of phone training is deemed sufficient. "There's no manual, because the computer shows you itself," McCoy adds. No computer codes are necessary; everything is conducted in English.

RAM, via its computer, also allows subscribers to analyze the samples which were used to determine the ratings data. "With the full disclosure system we have, you can ask the computer at any time, 'I wonder what was in this sample?" and it will tell you."

With one-day diaries and year-round surveys, a constant flow of data is established. McCoy claims "It's possible for a diary to be in the hands of a respondent and 90 hours later be included in a completed book. Now, that doesn't mean that all the data that was in the field 90 hours ago is in the book. We're saying that it's fresh, that when the data comes in our front door, it's out our front door. It can be that fast "

to have its own call-out system, we have a system that plugs in automatically to that," setting up samples and weighting them, etc. "What you do is tell the computer you're going to test some music next week. It'll ask what songs you're going to test, and you type in an answer. The computer then generates a survey. It spits out telephone listings by zip codes, by neighborhoods, where your listeners are. We send that to subscribers by mail rather than going to the expense of typing it out on the line. The computer will not let you sample too much in a hip neighborhood. It gets you out of the hip neighborhoods and into the square neighborhoods and the country neighborhoods, and makes sure that you do all of that just perfectly." McCoy sums up, "You can pull out the data for a radio station by the zip codes, so a programmer can end up with music research for the people who listen, the profile of the listeners in his area, the most perfect response for music

RAM also offers a specific music customizing service that, McCoy asserts, can pinpoint precisely when a record should be played during the day to reach the maximum number in those demographics which respond positively to it while avoiding the most negatively-reacting groups. "You can ask the computer where can I play a record so the people that hate it didn't hear it and the people who did like it would hear it. It is a very complex formatting system where every record is thrown into its own rotation, broken down hour by hour. The point is that each record has its own life span—just like the Mona Lisa; at some point, the people will be burned out on looking at the Mona Lisa. But an art form has a different life-span in different places and different times. It gets very complicated...but it can be figured for any combination of demographics."

If Everyone Used RAM

McCoy was questioned about the accuracy and usefulness of his individual record research if every station of the same format in the same market subscribed to it. If a number of stations received the same results on a record, would they all decide not to add it if it had received negative responses; would airplay on new records be paralyzed with

borhoods in a two-mile radius of every Sears store in Southern California and have it in eight minutes. We have developed something that is absolutely overkill for sales purposes, but at the same time, if anyone is willing to spend their sales dollars in that area, we sure have the best there has ever been for it in the aspects of larger sample, ongoing rates, and ability to break it out by extremely fine-line areas."

Summing Up

McCoy sums up RAM's range of services for radio stations in this manner: "When a radio station subscribes to the RAM service, they pick up the terminal and they can add any depth of rating service they want, depending on how many dollars they want to spend, along with music ratings and attitudinal research. You are able to get the acceptance of anything, radio station, music, etc., by neighborhood."

As McCoy and anyone involved in the rating business knows full well, a vital ingredient for the success of any service is agency acceptance. And, although he does make a point about his basic support stemming from broadcasters, McCoy by no means plans to ignore the agencies. "We have a 100-city toor set up. We are inviting the broadcasters and agencies to come and view presentations on our service, as they like."

But McCoy adds a contrasting note, "There will be volume prices for agencies, no question about it. But the agencies will get the monthly reports covering the previous quarter. If they want anything really detailed, they have to get it from a radio station. I can't think of a worse sin than for someone to design a system like this and put it in the hands of the agencies to rake over radio clients. You could take this thing and leave radio lying in the gutter with its wrists bleeding in a second."

McCoy's longterm ambitions are broad-based. We'll take the ratings on anything—radio stations, records, political candidates...." But his primary goal is to establish an accurate, sophisticated radio rating system to challenge Arbitron's dominance. R&R believes that the scope of RAM's efforts dictates our allowing them space to present their case. The ultimate choice, however, is up to the broadcasters and advertising agencies who use the information.

I hope all Top 40 programmers (and followers of our format) take the time to read The AOR Story. The AOR Story represents a lot of diligent work, not only in the book's preparation, but also in the evolution of the format itself.

I can remember working at WLAV/Grand Rapids in 1969 and hearing vague rumblings of some sort of "free-form-album-music" format happening in Detroit. On a later visit to the Motor City I heard WABX/Detroit and got my first taste of AOR radio. Later that year, John Shepard, General Manager of WLAV & WLAV-FM, decided to institute the ABC-FM "Love" format on our FM station. It was great listening, but as I recall, it didn't exactly set Western Michigan on fire. Perhaps Grand Rapids just wasn't "ready.

Well, time has passed and WLAV-FM is now a highly successful AOR station. My point is that AOR is now fully established as a listenable and profitable format. And moreover, AOR often serves as the chief competition for Top 40 stations all over this country. If that's not enough motivation to "get into" the AOR Story, then try starting at page 45.

The article that begins on page 45 is entitled "Super Chart", and could possibly be of immediate use to all Top 40 programmers. As the opening paragraph says, "The Top 43 Song chart following, is more than a rundown of programmers' favorite tunes. It represents the songs which have received the most airplay on AOR radio stations over the ten-year span of the format's existence, (from today's perspective) as compiled from research gathered from a large majority of R&R's AOR reporting stations.

I am not suggesting that you should take the AOR Super Chart and put all the cuts into your "Super Gold" rotation. But, I would definitely encourage you to look the titles over. If for no other reason than just to be aware of what AOR stations consider vital, your attention will be worth the time

After all, as a wise old sage once said, "He who refuses input, may find himself put out."

Through Van Dyke and Weiss an interesting experiment took shape. Charlie told R&R, "Fred's course is the first good one I've seen. He came to me asking about station research and programming information. I thought that if they (the class) are actually going to go into research, why not do it for real? So the next logical extension was to do it on the air at KLIF.

Under the watchful guidance of Weiss and Van Dyke, the class spent two months researching public interest in music, artists and general likes and dislikes of today's gratulates Kent (Mark Avery) radio. They distributed questionaires on campus, in rec-Tucker on a job well done during ord stores and in shopping malls all over Dallas to reach the KLIF Experience. Kent can quotas within specific demographic areas. Van Dyke gave the students access to the station's research and market data.

The class compiled the data and selected a cross-section of individuals whose answers were among the most interesting and knowledgeable. Those selected were invited to participate in a focus group led by the class members experienced in research techniques. The group discussed their answers in their tastes in music and radio programming in depth. Through analysis of the focus group responses, the class formulated a "play list" for their "KLIF Experience."

Dallas listeners were actually "given" the format they said they wanted for a full four hours (8pm-12midnight) on April 1st. Far from being an April Fool's joke, rock, hits, soul. punk and pop-oriented jazz mixed in with a few oldies were arranged into a format that resembled "soft rock" in both sound and approach. Feature news stories were added in such a way that they did not disturb the sound, but completed the format construction.

Weiss, who acted as Executive Producer for the show, was very pleased with the results.

'I stayed out of the way and simply acted as supervisor for the students. They learned how important research is for programming. The whole class all came together and worked as a whole to make a fantastic show."
"I think it was fabulous," Van Dyke said. "On a scale

of one to ten, I think their format would have to be a ten." Charlie critiqued the entire show as well as the indi-

vidual students' work involved. He has since hired students from the class for on-air and music research work.





Give 'em a second chance. That's what PD Bill Lowe of WFBL/Syracuse, NY. said when he created their latest promotion. Basically a station representative asks people on the street what their favorite radio station is and the correct answer makes them a winner. Should they answer with another set of call letters (remote, but possible) they are immediately handed a "second chance card", which explains that if they listen for their name on WFBL and call in within the alloted time, they will get a second chance to be a winner. The mechanics of the contest allow Bill to side-step the perennial contest winners because his spotter is actually "selecting the demographics on the street." Plus, should the station discover a geographic area in which they seem "weak", more spotters could be sent into that section with more second chance cards, thus possibly creating more new listeners.





A Word Of Thanks And A Word Of Goodbyes

It would be impossible to acknowledge the number of ways in which Mike Harrison has enriched my career and life in a brief statement. Ditto his achievements in AOR radio and radio in general, not to mention this newspaper.

As long as I have known him, Mike has always thrived on tackling new challenges head-on. As he leaves to meet his new challenges, I know I speak for many when I thank him for his creative input, his warm humor, and his undisputed credibility.

The eyes of the radio and record industry are on him. I'm sure he won't disappoint us.

WDVE/Pittsburgh has updated a venerable Top 40 promotion, rating records on the air, to tremendous listener response. The idea is a sort of passive research in reverse: instead of the station calling out and playing new cuts for yeas or nays from potential listeners, the station is doing a daily music poll where listeners call in to vote thumbs up or down on new music played on the air. Every night at ten the station plays a new song or album cut and asks its listeners to call two different phone numbers: one if they like the song, one if they don't. The phones are completely automated, so when the listener phones in, his vote is recorded electronically without his saying a word, merely by the number he has dialed. The phone's taped message will answer by saying, "Hi, we're WDVE. Thank you for voting yes" or "Thank you for voting no." Since the calls are answered mechanically the service can accomodate over 900 calls an hour, which has been the average response each night.

Station PD John McGhan quoted some interesting polling results. "We tested the new Bob Seger single when it just came out to a negative response. We tried it again a few nights later to an overwhelmingly positive response," indicating the flexibility of listener tastes.

McGhan feels the idea is still "too raw" to use as a sole indicator of listener preferences, but that "it does give a flavor for how people can react to new music." And with 900 calls coming in on an average night, while the research value of the system is unproven, its promotional value is unquestionable.





Stamp Of Approval

Last Sunday, May 21, the 1978 Jimmie Rodgers Memorial Festival got underway in Meridian, Mississippi, with a special concert in the park featuring performers doing the music of the "Singing Brakeman," Jimmie Rodgers.

Performing Arts USA 13c

The week-long festival honoring Rodgers, whom many consider to be the "Father Of Country Music," was highlighted by the official issue of the Jimmie Rodgers commemorative stamp by the United States Post Office. At a ceremony Wednesday, attended by Mississippi Governor Cliff Finch and other dignitaries, Assistant Postmaster General Jim Finch (no relation) was keynote speaker at the Jimmie Rodgers Museum in Highland Park. The stamp was officially issued for the first time that day. Significantly, the Jimmie Rodgers stamp, because of the postage increase to take effect May 30, will be the last 13-cent stamp issued. The stamp is the first in a new Performing Arts and Artists series that began this year, and was originally unveiled January 6 in Nashville at the

Country Music Hall of Fame. Rodgers was the first inductee in the Hall Of Fame when it was opened in 1967. The original unveiling was presided over by Postmaster General Benjamin F. Bailar and was taped for broadcast on the January 22 NBC-TV presentation of "50 Years Of Country Music."

Country radio station WOKK/Meridian, under the direction of Program Director Ron Walton, covered the events from start to finish. Some of the other festivities during the week included four nights of concerts, starring Moe Bandy, Freddie Hart, T.G. Sheppard, Gene Watson, Hank Snow, Charlie McCoy, Dave & Sugar, Pee Wee King, Ernest Tubb and dozens more; talent contests, street dances, picnics and lots of parties to celebrate this historic event.
