Van Deerlin Set To Announce Details Of Proposed New Communications Act

"Why the hell should a Good Music station have to carry five minutes of news," says Congressman Lionel Van Deerlin (D-Calif.), "when you have two All-News stations in the market?" If the San Diego Congressman is successful, radio stations will have a lot less to worry about from the FCC, but they will have to be willing to pay for it. What Mr. Van Deerlin, who is Chairman of the House Communications Subcommittee, proposes is a total skyline-to-cellar revamping of the current Communications Act of 1934, because of his view that present interpretations don't allow the FCC enough room in nontechnical areas to make adequate changes.

Deregulation And Longer License Terms?

Van Deerlin and Lou Frey (R-Fla.), ranking Republican on the Subcommittee, will cosponsor the introduction of a bill which could pave the way for substantial industry deregulation, and a much longer radio license renewal term. In the radio portion of the rewrite, Mr. Van Deerlin is obviously responding to the cries of thousands of broadcasters who for years have asked Congress to "let the marketplace be our guide," not the FCC. The Congressman appears willing to do that, except, as he stated in an exclusive interview with R&R, "in areas such as frequency, power, and directional assignment." Also, he noted, "You'll have a problem keeping government out of some areas like equal opportunity." He hinted that two additional categories ripe for increased government regulation are antitrust and advertising

Trade-Off For Spectrum Fee

The price (or "trade-off," as it has been referred to by some industry spokespersons) for deregulation and a longer license term will be a special fee that the government will collect from all users of the electromagnetic spectrum, including radio stations; and possibly increased competition through some form of opening up additional spectrum space. The Congressman obviously feels that radio broadcasters will be willing to pay. On the other hand, some industry groups are on record as firmly opposing a fee, which they are calling a "tax." Van Deerlin regards the introduction of the bill, set for Wedneeday (6-7), as the first step, and hopes that after all is said and done

in the House and Senate, that a new communications law will be enacted in 1981 or 1982. The FCC, which was created by Congress in 1927, uses as its guidelines the Communications Act of 1934. What Van Deerlin is seeking to do is give the FCC a more realistic and fresher mandate.

The proposed rewrite includes all aspects of the communications industry, from land mobile communications to cable. But Mr. Van Deerlin clearly intends, because of changing social and economic demands for a greater diversity of services, to get the government off radio broadcasters' backs. His subcommittee will open jits doors to receive testimony from the public and industry representatives in the middle of July.

Gunman Shoots Out KPPL/Denver's Transmitter

KPPL/Denver's transmitter was shot out by a man firing a high-powered rifle last week, forcing the station off the air briefly. The gunman's bullets shot through the transmitter door and into the tubes. KPPL converted to its auxiliary transmitter until repairs were made.

The sniper gave KPPL his best shot, but retribution was quick. The station's transmitter is located on Green Mountain near Denver, very close to four police radio units. Two of the four police units were malfunctioning, as it turned out, and a police car happened to be driving up the mountain to check it out. Just as the gunman got his hit on the station, the police caught sight of him, and arrested him, booking him on a variety of serious charges.

Denver Diary Charges "Resolved Favorably" For KLZ's Widsten

Hal Widsten, Program Director of KLZ/Denver, has entered into an agreement with the local District Attorney's office which will in effect exonerate him from all charges of criminal impersonation resulting from alleged rating diary distortions. Widsten and former KLZ air personality Danny Davis had been indicted for criminal impersonation by a Grand Jury in March (R&R 3-31), for allegedly filling out diaries obtained by (Continued on page 16)

ABC Fined \$7000 For WDAI Logging Violations In "Super Bowl" Promotion

The FCC has declared ABC liable for a forfeiting of \$7000 for its licensee WDAI-FM/Chicago's inaccurate logging of commercials for a series of "Super Bowl Of Rock" concerts. The Super Bowl series led, as reported last summer by R&R, to ABC hiring a Chicago law firm, Jenner & Block, to investigate WDAI for "payola, drug use, improper broadcast of commercials, and other illegal activities at the station stemming from WDAI's close affiliation with the concerts." WDAI had entered into a large-scale reciprocal trade agreement with Flip-Side Concerts, promoters of the Super Bowl series, to advertise the shows; and subsequent Chicago newspaper reports of the Jenner & Block investigation, as well as accusations of shady deals on the part of the city in regard to the staging of the concerts, stirred considerable controversy at the time.

In response, the FCC asked ABC to supply the Commission with the results of the Jenner & Block

investigation. The report indicated a "great number" of logging violations had taken place, and that the station management was "lax in its enforcement" of ABC policies and FCC rules. According to the report, WDAI and Flip-Side signed a "standard ABC reciprocal trade agreement" in which 2000 30-second spots (400 for each of five concerts) worth a total of (Continued on page 16)

"WATCH YOUR RADIO"

K101 Exposes Itself Over TV

K101/San Francisco recently found an entertaining way to use TV to boost radio. They invited listeners to "tune in and watch your radio," in the form of what the station believes is the first AM/FM/TV simulcast ever, coordinated with Channel 26 in San Francisco. For 12 hours, viewers/listeners could watch K101 in action over their TV sets while hearing the station's programming simultaneously. Cameras focused on individual air personality shows, as well as behind-the-scenes glimpses and tours of the





studios and transmitters. Different color patterns were used as backgrounds to create visual contrast, and at times the images of air personalities were superimposed on aerial views of the city taken from K101's airplane. The station reported vast numbers of telephone calls from listeners, and may try the triple simulcast again. Pictured is air personality Sam Van Zandt superimposed against a San Francisco vista, while a technician oversees the complicated multimedia board.

New Station Manager, PD At WIRE

WIRE/Indianapolis, the toprated station in the market, and its FM sister station WXTZ underwent two significant changes this week, as F. Richard Lee was appointed Station Manager and Gary Havens became Program Director, replacing longtime PD Bill Robinson, who voluntarily stepped down.

Lee's position is newly created, and stems from increased cor-

porate responsibilities assumed by station Vice President/General Manager Don Nelson. Nelson announced that new duties with WIRE/WXTZ owners Mid-America Corp. will require increased traveling, enabling him to devote less on-the-spot attention to the Indianapolis stations. Nelson is also a board member of the CMA and Arbitron's new Radio Coun-

cil. Lee comes to the new job from the General Sales Manager position at the stations.

Robinson, PD at Country-formatted WIRE for eight years, and a past CMA Major Market DJ of the Year, has relinquished his programming position to devote more time to his radio programming firm, Music Works, Inc.

WHK Converts Imus To Country

Don Imus, former WNBC/New York morning man and one of the nation's best-known air personalities, has officially joined Country station WHK/Cleveland to take over the 3-7pm airshift. A press conference Tuesday (5-30) in Cleveland at the headquarters of Malrite Broadcasting (owners of WHK) confirmed Imus' hiring (reported previously in R&R's "Street Talk" column)

Malrite Vice President of Programming John Chaffee told R&R: 'Imus will be using the Country format of WHK musically, and will add his own special personality. He will be bringing some of his voice characters, and I know he is working on a few new ones. As far as I'm concerned, there is currently no better total air staff in any format than the one now at WHK with the addition of Imus. He is one of the great air personalities of all time. It's good to know personality radio can still work; we've proved it here in Cleveland." The new WHK lineup reads: Gary Dee (who just signed'a four-year, six-figure contract with the station), 6-10am; Joe Finnan 10-1; Terry Stevens 1-3pm; Imus 3-7; Caroline Carr 7-12pm; and Doc Lemon midnight-6am. Imus begins his shift on WHK on July 4.

Nelson Takes Leave Of Absence From WRKO PD Position

Harry Nelson, Program Director of WRKO/Boston, has taken an indefinite "leave of absence" from the station to examine his future career direction. Nelson told R&R: "I'm going to take off about two or three months from the business to think about what direction I'm going to go in career-wise.' He plans to drive across the coun-"listening to radio stations" and spend some time in California. Nelson added, "I'm getting back in the business." but said he didn't know if he would come back to WRKO, although he had nothing but praise for station General

Manager John F. Hobbs. Hobbs in turn told R&R, "Harry's done a magnificent job here for over a year. The station has never sounded better. He wants to take some time off to see what other people in the world are doing, to get out of the business for awhile. I told him when he's ready to get back in, we want him." Nelson will remain at WRKO, handling programming duties and an evening airshift, until his replacement is chosen. Hobbs indicated that the new Program Director would probably be chosen from within RKO company ranks.

Arbitron Introduces Intermediate

its planned introduction of Intermediate Market Measurement in 32 medium and small markets, beginning with the April/May 1978 survey. The new service contains uniform demographics, dayparts, and estimates across all markets, and marks the first time the company has offered a uniform report beyond its regularly syndicated service. The Intermediate reports contain "many of the features of Arbitron Radio's regular services,' including the average quarter-hour and cume breakdowns by time period and age/sex groups which form the staple information of Arbitron's regular reports. Intermediate markets surveyed include Alexandria, LA; Battle Creek, MI; Gainesville, FL; Odessa, TX; Roswell, NM; and Springfields in both Illinois and Missouri.

FCC Orders Minority Hiring Plans For 19 Calif. Stations

The FCC ordered 19 California radio and televison stations to submit periodic equal opportunity employment progress reports to the Commission before their license reneval applications will be heard, with five stations singled out to submit hiring goals for minorities and females. The five most delinquent stations, according to the Com-mission, were KEZY-AM-FM/Anaheim, KMST/Monterey, KBBQ and KBBY-FM/Ventura, and KMIR-TV/Palm Springs. Other stations cited were KCBQ/San Diego, KCKC/San Bernardino, KDON-AM-FM/Salinas, KLIV/San Jose, KTYD-AM-FM/Santa Barbara, KFTV/Hanford, KGEE & KGFM-FM/Bakersfield, KTOM/Salinas, KCOY-TV/Santa Maria, and KVCR-TV/San Bernardino. The stations' hiring deficiencies in the areas of women and minorities resulted in most cases from failing to use 'specialized recruitment sources. on a routine basis," according to

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CONSPIRACY CHARGE DISMISSED, MISTRIALS DECLARED

Brunswick Executives Win Court Battle

A conspiracy indictment against Brunswick President Nat Tarnopol was dismissed last week in a Newark Federal Court, while mistrails were declared in the conspiracy cases of two other company executives, Secretary-Treasurer Irving Weigand and Vice President/Sales Manager Peter Garris. The three executives had originally been convicted on various counts of conspiracy, tax evasion, mail fraud and payola; all but the conspiracy indictment were reversed by an Appeals Court last vear.

The government's case against Tarnopol and the other Brunswick executives was apparently undermined by the testimony of the chief prosecution witness, former **Brunswick Sales Director Edward** R. Hurley, who denied knowingly entering into a royalty fraud conspiracy with the three executives. Following Hurley's testimony, attorneys for Garris and Weigand moved for a mistrial, which was granted. Tarnopol's attorney declared his willingness to continue the trial, and Judge Frederick B. Lacev dismissed the conspiracy charge. A motion to dismiss the indictments against Weigand and Garris has not yet been acted upon, as a possibility for retrial of the two exists. UA Changes Completed

Sweeping executive level changes at United Artists Records, which followed the label's purchase by Artie Mogull and Jerry Rubinstein, have been completed, the company announced. The new organizational structure will be administered by Mogull and Rubinstein as Co-Chairmen; Mogull had been President of UA under the former Transamerica-controlled regime, while Rubinstein was formerly Chairman of ABC Records.

Mark Lindsay has been named Vice President of A&R. He had been chosen to head A&R operations for Rubinstein's Xeti label, which never totally materialized before the UA purchase. Lindsay is a former recording star on his own and as lead singer for Paul Revere & the Raiders. Former A&R Vice President Pat Pipolo, as previously reported, becomes Vice President of UA's International Division. Harold Seider, President of the International Division has exited to become President of United Artists Music, the publishing company retained by Transamerica in the recent transaction.

In other changes, Larry Cohen, formerly Vice President of Merchandising, becomes Vice President of Merchandising and Marketing Services, supervising all creative services activities. Iris Zurawin has been promoted to Director of Creative Services from **Director of Advertising and Artist** Campaigns; while Jeff Samuels, formerly Contemporary A&R Director, has been named Director of Artist Development, supervising press and artist relations. Alan Warner moves from the A&R department to head up International

Charlie Miror has been officially designated Vice President of Promotion, with Peter Mollica and Steve Resnik named National Promotion Coordinators. Dick Williams, as reported earlier (R&R 5-12), is National Director of AOR Promotion.

Wall Street Journal Adopts AOR Format

AOR (Album Oriented Rock), the radio format term introduced by R&R to replace the outdated or inaccurate terms "progressive radio" or "FM rock," has already gained over whelming acceptance within the industry, as evidenced by its adoption in consumer rock pressured publications, record company titles, and self-descriptions by radio stations. Now the seal of general acceptance has been bestowed by the Wall Street Journal, which in its May 25 from page article (on Meat Loaf and record industry promotion in general) correctly employ and defines AOR as related to radio.

Kentucky Fried Chicken, Radio Seek Country Songwriters

Country radio stations around the country and Kentucky Fried Chicken are co-sponsorin a national country music songwriting contest, with the winning two songs being recorde by ABC artist Barbara Mandrell on a special edition single. KFC reports 10,000 entrie were received last year, when Mel Tillis cut the two winners. Entrants send cassett recordings of their songs to local radio stations sponsoring the contest, or to nationa KFC headquarters. Winners are chosen by ABC representatives and Ms. Mandrell. In additionation to having their songs recorded, the two winners will be flown to the CMA convention in Nashville; while runners-up receive a stereo system, a CB radio, and albums. The contest runs from June 5 to June 30.

TV News

ABC Wins Easily; Olivia Special, "Bastard" Hot

ABC won the Nielsen rating week ending May 21 in a breeze, with a music special hosted by Olivia Newton-John finishing seventh, but the big rating news was the success of "The Bastard," measured in the following week's figures. The TV movie, offered to independent stations and network affiliates, outpaced regular network programming Monday and Tuesday (5-22, 5-23), in the midst of the May rating sweeps, in Los Angeles, Pittsburgh, Atlanta, and other major markets. 68 network affiliates across the country chose to show the film, along with 25 independents. "The Bastard" also managed to finish second in its time period in New York and Chicago.

"Three's Company" was the leading program for the previous week, pacing ABC to a 17.5 rating (compared to 15.4 for NBC and 15.0 for CBS, all well below the networks' season ratings). The final episode (Part V) of NBC's "Wheels" was second for the week, followed by 3) "Laverne & Shirley" 4) "How The West Was Won" (ABC) 5) "Carter Country" 6) "Happy Days" 7) "Olivia" 8) "Incredible Hulk" (CBS) 9) "Love Boat" (ABC) and 10) "Adventures of the Wilderness Family" (an ABC movie). ABC had eight of the top ten shows. In addition to Olivia's success, the Carpenters' "Space Encounters" special finished a strong 15th for ABC.

ABC managed to romp through the Los Angeles Arbitron ratings for the week ending May 19, losing only two spots to NBC; while NBC and CBS held down two spots each in the New York ratings. "Wheels" Part V led New York for NBC, followed by 2) "Love Boat" and "Three's Company" tied 4) "Laverne & Shirley" 5) "Alice" (CBS) 6) "Carter Country" and "Happy Days" tied, and 8) CBS' "All In The Family," an NBC Big Event and the Olivia special.

"Three's Company" topped the L.A. list, followed by 2) "Laverne & Shirley" 3) "Carter Country" 4) "Happy Days" 5) "Love Boat" 6) "How The West Was Won" 7) an NBC Big Event and "Wheels" Part V tied 9) "Family" (ABC) and 10) a tie between ABC's Monday movie, "Barney Miller" and "Fantasy Island."





Dentist Menace Lessens For Patients Hearing Music

Music relieves a significant portion of the apprehension dental patients commonly feel for their dentists, a National Institute of Dental Research study shows. In recent years a number of enlightened dental practitioners have made recorded music, in the form of radio or tapes brought in by patients, more prominent in their treatment procedures. Galvanic skin reponse tests showed that anxiety and discomfort were largely reduced by concentration on music. The study unfortunately did not distinguish between types of music (the tension-relieving powers of Beautiful Music and AOR might prove to vary significantly), but it did also measure the effects of playing video games. They also were helpful in reducing stress for dental patients.



Robot Toy Teaches, Gives Speeches, And Snores When Bored

Mego International has a "2-XL" robot toy which asks questions, accepts objective answers via four coded buttons on its chest, tells questioners if their answer was correct, explains why they are wrong, tells jokes, sings, whistles, and falls asleep and

snores. The secret to its versatility is a series of 8-track cartridges, pre-programmed and recorded in a typical robotic electronic voice. The 2-XL is about two feet high, and will retail for between \$50-60 when available.

NARM Sponsors First Industry Internship Program

A couple of weeks ago I had the opportunity to attend the Third Annual Upper Midwest Communications Conclave in Plymouth, MN (just outside Minneapolis). The conclave, which invited broadcasters from the five-state surrounding area, was a prime example of just how much a tightly knit group of radio and record professionals can accomplish over a three-day weekend.

As outlined in last week's R&R (5/26) the conference tackled a number of subjects, ranging from "The Sales Department Can Be Your Friend" to "Research." I was asked to moderate the final session of the conclave, which was to be a discussion of "The Air Personality."

On the panel assembled to help lead the discussion were: True Don Bleu of KDWB/Minneapolis; Charlie Bush and John Hines of KSTP/Minneapolis; Mesa Kincaid of WCCO-FM/Minneapolis; Jay Jackson of WNAX/Yankton; and Jimmy O'Neil of KOIL/Omaha. I'm sure the conclave's organizers had high hopes for an informative discussion, but from the beginning, we were doomed to entertain. The best description I could give would be to simply say that the entire session was a never-ending string of "one-liners," much to the delight of the audience. But in spite of ourselves (getting seven jocks together is a suspect move anytime) I think we made a very important point.

The point is there is no substitute for a great air personality, no matter what the format.

A lot of people have been quick to dismiss the importance of air talent, as radio formats have become more and more restrictive. With programmers turning to "research" as an additional input, many are finding that listeners are far more interested in "the music" than they are in "the jock." So, in many situations, the air personality's position is changing, but it is not disappearing.

As Don Bleu said during our discussion, "It's not how much you say, it's what you say." Even though that statement is oversimplified, it says a lot. Don is a very well respected radio personality within the Minneapolis market and he has worked many variations of the format we call Top 40. As the formats have changed around him. Don has been able to adapt and still sound great, no matter how restrictive things got. It's more than just an ability, it's really an attitude.

The attitude that allows flexibility in adapting to new and changing situations makes for a truly great jock. Don Bleu has always had that flexibility and I'm sure you can think of lots of others in our business that can join Don in that

As a former Program Director, I have seen many jocks who viewed "the format" as their enemy. But in reality I think the format is just like a baseball park (I love sports analogies). The dimensions may be different but the really great players are able to "shine" in all situations. The key ability is adjustment to the specific situation at hand. As the format becomes more restrictive (in most cases with valid reasons) the air personality must use more economy in his or her presentation. It's not how much you say, it's what you say, and how you say it.

We made some sense out of a totally humorous encounter at the "Air Personality" session and those with the talent to separate the one-liners from the wheat, so to speak, should have learned a couple of things. First, being a great air personality is part ability and part attitude. And second, don't try to trade one-liners with six talented radio people in front of an audience, especially if it's in their hometown.

The Superbowl Of Rock And Roll

This could definitely be the start of something big. Tony Sands, Program Director of 96 Super-Q (WLEQ)/Ft. Meyers, FL., called me last week to outline his plans for something he called the Superbowl Of Rock And Roll.

Simply put, Tony is organizing a competition ala the Superstars athletic TV shows, but the participants would be the Top 40 disc jockeys from all over the country. The tie-in is with the National Muscular Dystrophy Association and the actual contest is to be held in Ft. Meyers in late August.

Here's how it works: jocks from all over the country are currently being nominated (by various trade writers and knowledgeable radio people) for possible invitation to the First Annual Superbowl of Rock and Roll Invitational. Once you have been "invited," Eastern Airlines will fly you to Ft. Meyers on Friday August 18th, your hotel, meals and transportation will all be covered, and you will have a week to "practice" the events which will officially begin on Friday August 25th.

Too good to be true? Well, there is a catch. Each invited air personality must agree to raise at least \$1000 for Muscular Dystrophy, as his or her "ticket" to the competition. A small price to pay for what looks like an excellent promotional vehicle for you and your radio station.

The events scheduled include swimming, tennis and a few other less-traditional sporting activities to even the odds somewhat. The grand prize winner will receive a free vacation in the Caribbean, which adds to the incentive.

The promotional possibilities for any radio station are truly limitless. For instance,

you could have a contest in conjunction with raising money for MD and have the winner or winners accompany your air personality to the competition.

Seven-Eleven stores nationwide have agreed to help in the promotion of the event and will act as collection points for MD donations (as they have in past years). The stations involved may tie-in with Seven-Eleven stores for other angles on the promotion.

The event itself will take place over the August 25th weekend and Tony is hoping to line up several rock music "personalities" to attend the contest. Admission will be charged and all spectator-received monies will go to MD. The entire thing has been rather meticulously planned and the main promotional thrust will begin once the jocks have been nominated.

So, as you lucky air personalities receive your invitations to participate, I guess it'll be a fast stop at the sporting goods store for a sweatsuit, a new pair of sneaks, and of course don't forget your copy of "Rocky's Theme" for your training theme. And count on R&R for full coverage of the event...I wouldn't miss it!

Jon Summers of WKBW, in a letter published May 12, suggested that playing new records in the daytime with certain tempo restrictions has something to do with active versus passive music research.

The problem, as I see it, is not so much one of sales versus call-outs but more one of when new music should be exposed.

I would like to suggest that there are places to play new records in almost every daypart of every day. The only daypart in which new music is not exposed on K104 is morning drive. In that period, with heavy emphasis on news, sports and weather information, music becomes secondary and only the hits will appear (and yes, we are an FM station).

The rest of the day, we play either a "hitbound" or "LP" cut once in every hour. A wise old sage once told me a simple philosophy about new music. Simply stated, "Play them between two superhits." The wise old sage is Bob Harper, former PD at "KB" and now Operations Manager of WERE/WGCL in Cleveland. Bob's not all that old but certainly into the sage.

There are places in each hour where new and/or unfamiliar music can hurt you less (if you are wrong about the record in the first place) like going into the news or a stop-set or in places outside of the first five minutes of quarter-hours.

I agree with the idea of having a "power-rotation" considering the tune in-tune out factor of contemporary audiences but by spotlighting new music or album cuts from familiar artists, I believe it helps to cut down the tediousness of six or seven records coming up every two and a half hours. Of course, for this to work at all, the power records must be right.

Which brings us to sales versus call-outs, or the new overused "passive" research. Why not do the call-outs, watch the sales and phones, measure the positive response and use your own good judgment? By this I do not mean do the research and then discard it, but use it only as a guide, a source if you will, in helping you to make a decision. Listen to your radio station. Does the music flow well? Are there too many up records, down records, disco tunes, Bee Gees, whatever? On the call-outs, watch closely the burnout negatives and act accordingly. Log every phone call by age, sex, location and reason for call. Then and most important, use your own judgment in making up your list based on the information you have available to you.

...But They Are Talkin' About Us

I'm sure it had a very innocent beginning...Q-102/Cincinnati, upon seeing Bobby Rich's 99X/New York "No Bee Gees Weekend" written up in these very pages, decided to do the same promotion in their market.

For starters, WKRQ General Manager John Soller was summoned (probably more of an invitation) to the station's production room to "voice" the first promo. The promo itself did nothing more than tease that Friday at 3pm "Q-102 would announce one of the major programming moves of 1978."

Coincidence being what it is, several unrelated events soon built into a problem of sorts. Lee Abrams had been in Cincinnati at Q-102 the week previous and lots of radio folks within the market were aware that he had been there (ah ha!). Randy Michaels, former PD of Q-102, who is now the Program Director of WDAF/Kansas City (a Country station), also happened to be filling in on Q-102 for vacationing Mark Elliott (how strange!). Now many media people in Cincinnati were hearing about a major programming move and were also aware of the presence of Abrams and Michaels in the market and it wasn't long before one plus two was equalling four.

\$80,000 were to be broadcast in exchange for \$80,000 in merchandise, concert tickets, and "advertising references." Then-Program Director Bill Todd said at the time, according to the report, that he did not want to lose "the biggest concert event in the history of the city," and have a competitor gain the promotional tie-in. So any misgivings on the station's part about the concerts were ignored, and in the enthusiasm worked up for the concerts, WDAI perhaps stressed its tie-in with the Super Bowl overenthusiastically. The report found instances of uncompensated promotional air time being given Flip-Side, failure to log relevant ad-libs as commercials, and inaccurate logging of the timing of a number of spots.

Following its examination of ABC's own commissioned investigation into WDAI, the FCC cited repeated violations of FCC logging rules and announced ABC's liability for the \$7000 forfeiture. ABC has 30 days to pay it or contest it. The Commission also announced that it "has made further inquiry" to ABC on other findings of the Jenner & Block report "relating to possible payola practices, conflicts of interest, lack of adequate supervision and control, and fraudulent billing." The FCC said that a staff field investigation might be launched into these

According to Widsten's attorney, Gary Lozow, "all action in Mr. Widsten's case has been deferred for an indefinite period," an agreement Lozow characterized as a "successful resolution" which will give Widsten "an opportunity to carry out his continuing...desire to commit his time and energies toward radio programming and management." The expenses in time, energy and money involved in the court battle were cited as a reason for Widsten's seeking the_ agreement with the D.A. instead of fighting the charges in court. He expressed a desire to "utilize his everyday efforts toward productive industry ends rather than the morass of ongoing litigation."



Station GM Jerry Graham reacted to Simmons' decision with understanding. "As a former PD at a major market radio station myself," Graham said, "I can fully relate to Bonnie's desire to get out of the pressure cooker and to just have fun working for awhile. I will certainly use her advice in choosing and training her successor."

The former PD feels happy with her accomplishments over the past four years. "I'm sure there were lots of things I would've liked to have done with the station that I didn't get to," Simmons said, "but I don't think there's any time in the station's history when we haven't done three times more than anyone else has even attempted. We never stopped overworking... I feel like I've done a swell job."

Simmons chose the day after KSAN's official tenth anniversary (May 21) to resign. Was this symbolic of the end of an era for the station? Simmons does not think so: "If I were leaving here entirely that might make sense, but I don't plan to do that. Maybe I did it so that ten years from now I'll be able to remember when I quit."

New PDs often signal changes in programming direction for a station. Simmons admitted this was a possibility at KSAN only insofar as "with any new PD things are done differently. The degree of change," she said, "will depend in part on whether the new PD is chosen from our current staff or externally." GM Graham said the choicemaking process is yet to begin, but he did say that he wants KSAN to remain essentially the same. "I am not looking for a PD who plays it safe or who just knows how to follow pre-existing rules," he explained. "I expect KSAN to remain a place of great creativity, always seeking new directions."

Most PDs who resign that post also feel an unspoken obligation to move on to other stations and different pursuits. Simmons feels no such pressure. "Metromedia has been great." she said. "People think it's a real death-blow not to be called PD anymore, but I sure don't. I think it might be a lot of fun. I've never had a chance to really do my air shift the way I wanted, because it was always secondary to the station and its problems as a whole. I would like to find out what it's like to concentrate totally on my air work."

We wish Bonnie Simmons and KSAN continued growth and success in the station's second decade of service to its community.

Ever wonder how a radio station obtains an advance copy of an album like the new Bruce Springsteen? Here's how WNEW-FM/New York scored theirs: A woman in a New Jersey record store returned a copy of the new Barbra Streisand album, complaining that the record inside the cover was not the songstress' latest, but something by an artist with whom she was unfamiliar, which of course turned out to be the new Springsteen album, mistakenly shipped in the Streisand jacket. A Springsteen fan who was in the record store at the time overheard the conversation between customer and clerk and asked if he could buy the Springsteen record from the store, who agreed to the purchase. Seconds later, the lucky album recipient was on the phone to his favorite New York area radio station, WNEW-FM, to offer them the album, still a week away from general release (and the source of many company headaches after other unauthorized copies made their way to stations crosscountry). Station air personality Vinnie Scelsa purchased the record from the listener for a nominal, undisclosed fee, and the station has aired the record since.

That's just one example of how it pays off when a radio station makes itself a part of its listeners' lives.

Update

KTIM/San Rafael sponsored a blood drive for Hoodoo Rhythm Devils member Joe Crane, who has an arrested case of leukemia. The mobile blood unit situated directly in front of the station collected seventy-five units of blood, with donors getting free admissions to a Hoodoos concert plus albums by the group. Job well done, crew...KSJO/San Jose held their tenth anniversary celebration at Bill Graham's Winterland in San Francisco. The station gave away 500 tickets to the event and sold 5000 more at \$4.92 each, all profits benefitting an area public television station. The assembled multitude were treated to a concert by the Hoodoos, Alvin Lee and Sammy Hagar, and a jam session including members of Journey and Eddie Money. Commemorative Fillmore-style posters were given away to the crowds, and the proverbial good time was had by all. It'll be hard to top that one when the twentieth anniversary rolls

around...WCAS/Cambridge sponsored a free outdoor concert with Kate Taylor and Townes Van Zandt which attracted over a thousand attendees at the recent Cambridge River Festival...Mike Harrison has produced an hour-long behind-the-scenes radio show called "The Making of American Graffiti" for Lucasfilms Ltd., featuring interviews and music. For information on obtaining a copy of the program for airling, contact Joan Eisenberg at (213) 760-3806...KY102/Kansas City morning air team Dick Wilson and Jay Cooper were subjects of a Kansas City Star article taking an inside look at AOR radio.



Danny Davis and the Nashville Brass played the National Anthem at the beginning of the May 17th home game of the new Nashville Sounds professional baseball team ...MCA's Mel Tillis has a big television appearance month set in June. June 6th he co-hosts the Music City News awards. June 12th he will be on the "Tonight Show," "Merv Griffin," and "Dinah" on June 13th and then he tapes the new "Donna Fargo" TV show at Orem, Utah, June 15th.

ELVIS HONORED: Mitch Torok first saw Elvis Presley on the Louisiana Hayride in 1955. Yesterday (1st) Mitch Torok opened to the public, the largest painting of Elvis Presley in the world. It's 85 feet long and 10 feet tall, a horseshoe-shaped mural depicting Pres-ley's life story. The mural is an integral part of a mixed-media art tribute that features slide presentation, music and taped narration accompanying a panel-bypanel unveiling of the mural. Torok has written hit songs for Glen Campell, Dean Martin, Jim Reeves, and himself through the years, but he was trained originally as an artist, graduating from Stephen F. Austin College in Texas with an art degree. Now 23 years after that first time Mitch saw Elvis on the Hayride, he's become involved with him in a very unusual way,

by painting what he feels will become a lasting classic exhibit of "The King." Mitch is confident that Elvis would have liked this work. "Nothing schlocky," the artist says. Oh yes, they'll charge to see the multi-media exhibit. With Fan Fair just around the corner, his timing is good.

NASHVILLE MUSIC FESTI-VAL: Mentioned often here in the past few months, the concert has found "greener pastures". The three-day outdoor country music festival originally planned for the July 4th weekend in Fairview, 36 miles from Nashville, has officially been moved to a 534-acre industrially-zoned site in Columbia, Tennessee, about 55 miles from Nashville by Interstate 65. In an added development, promoter Ralph Wright suggests that negotiations are cooking for a possible film, radio syndication, national television broadcast, and a record album based on the festival, 27 top name acts are contracted to perform on the three day affair July 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

WILLIE WAS HERE: Willie Nelson and Emmylou Harris filled the auditorium in Nashville. Willie was shaved, and Skeeter Davis and Tanya Tucker were surprise guests; after an hour-plus set, he encored with a 20-minute jam. More than a few of us who've watched him the past 20 years still shake our heads in wonderment why his star didn't rise sooner; the first 15 years he was doing virtually the same things he's doing now. The only obvious thing he's doing differently now is the "shave and a haircut."

Search For Two Scopes Monkey Mikes

Historians are looking for two of the microphones used by WGN/Chicago to broadcast the famous Scopes monkey trial live over the first national radio hookup 53 years ago. Ted Mercer, President of the Rhea County Historical Society, said: "They are particularly important since that live broadcast marked the first time it had ever been done."

WGN used three squash-sized mikes bearing its call letters (pictured) for the broadcast. Program Manager Dick Jones said that one of the mikes is on display at the station, but had no idea where the other two are.

On July 11, 1925, WGN technicians installed the mikes, one on the judge's bench, another on the defense table, and the third in front of the prosecutors.

The trial was held in southeast Tennessee with the principal being John Scopes, who had been accused

of teaching evolution; it featured the classic confrontation of lawyers Clarence Darrow and William Jennings Bryan. The trial was later made into a play, which became a highly successful movie called "Inherit The Wind."

CHART SUMMARY: Three records had the biggest growth in the top ten this week: Seels & Crofts 8-5, Michael Johnson 12-8 and anchoring the top ten for the first time is Gerry Rafferty, with a five point jump from 15. Wings continues to be super hot, thereby hanging onto the 1 spot, but could be dislodged by either Andy Gibb at 3 or Carly Simon at 4 next week. Bonnie Tyler stopped just short of the top ten with matching 11's, but is still very active. Last week's Breaker, Diana Ross, is showing a strong gain moving 25.18. Breakers for this week are Tuxedo Junction in its fourth week on the P/A 40 jumping 29-20 and Rod Stewart moving 34-25 in only its second charted week. Other good second week movement is registered by Lou Rawls going 36:32 and Roberta Flack 40:33 mainly on the strength of major market activity. After a slow start, Meat Loaf is now coming on strong with P/A stations and debuts at 34. Others debuting are O'Jays at 38, Chicago at 39 and Jane Olivor at 40.
