FOUR STATIONS CITE LOW 18-24 DIARY RETURNS

Rockford Files Arbitron Protest

Four radio stations in Rockford, Illinois have written letters to Arbitron protesting inadequate diary representation among 18-24 males in the Rockford April/May rating survey. Although Arbitron has taken no action to date on the complaints, the situation was further complicated by a fifth Rockford station protesting the protest, filing an objection to any future recall of the book.

Stations WKKN/WYFE-FM (Y95). formatted Country and AOR respectively, and WROK/WZOK-FM (Top 40 and AOR) filed separate letters of complaint to Arbitron. According to officials at Y95, their Arbitron representative informed them that the entire 18-24 sample was based on "11 or 12" returned diaries, a situation Y95 Program Director Armand Chianti termed "ludicrous." Station General Manager Duane Daniels told R&R, "The protest is based on the inadequate number of diaries in the 18-24 demographic; which is inherent in Arbitron's methodology." He cited the 18-24 audience as crucial for AOR stations. and added, "We would hope that this would be the start of the AOR stations around the country putting a little more pressure" on Arbitron.

FCC Fines Texas Daytimer \$10,000

According to its logs of July 2, 1977, Spanish-formatted KCCT, a top-rated Corpus Christi daytimer, signed on the air at 6:00am. According to the FCC, which was monitoring and taping the station that day, it was more like 6:30am. But for KCCT, its troubles were only beginning.

In two separate letters to the station's licensee which were released this week, the Commission both notified the station of a \$10,000 fine and granted a one-year-only renewal term. Both pertained to logging violations.

FCC On The Spots

The FCC alleges that KCCT, during the course of its 14-hour broadcast day on July 2, 1977, failed to log over 40 minutes of commercial matter. KCCT had been heavily promoting its upcoming "Pinto-Bean Cook-Off" during its regular

Moore Given Probation On Conspiracy; Other Charge Dropped

Former KHOW/Denver Program Director Hal Moore (still an air personality on the station) was placed on two years' probation for a conspiracy charge related to the long-running Denver diary distortion case, while a criminal impersonation charge was dismissed. Moore had earlier pleaded nolo contendre to both the criminal impersonation

charge, stemming from allegations that Moore had controlled the filling out of illegally-obtained Arbitron diaries during the April/May 1976 survey period; and the conspiracy charge, which alleged that he had entered into a conspiracy to commit criminal impersonation. No fine was levied against Moore.

Rock Stars Featured In Nation's Largest Painting



WPLR/New Haven, CT participated in the creation of the largest outdoor painting in the United States, a 10,000 square-foot mural on three sides of the Cinemart Theater in suburban Hamden. The huge painting has a basic underwater scene theme, but as an added touch, the painted faces of nu-

merous top recording artists have been embedded in the rocks of the sea bed, inspiring a WPLR contest.

WPLR Vice President Dick Kalt conceived the idea for the mural two years ago with artists Dan Daddona and Tony Falcone, and found the proper walls after a year's search. Financing was provided

by the shopping center in which the theater is located and by the WEA organization. with \$10,000 being allocated for the project. 1000 man hours and 400 gallons of paint later, the mural was presented as a gift to the town of Hamden on June 18, with the Mayor accepting.

NAB Objects To New Communications Act

All week long, the board of directors of the National Association of Broadcasters have been arguing over the merits of the proposed Communications Act of 1978, (H.R. 13015). On Monday (6-26) the board, which is meeting at the Hotel Toronto in order to further an exchange with their Canadian equivalents, received a twenty-page analysis of the 217-page act. The bill's contents were made public by the House Communications Subcommittee chairman, Lionel Van Deerlin (D-Ca) and ranking minority member Lou Frey (R-F1) on June 7th, and this will be the first opportunity the NAB Board has had to collectively discuss

It is evident that the NAB staff feels that the bill is "fuzzy" at best. The analysis, chiefly prepared by NAB lobbyist Dave Markey as a board handout, was released late last Friday (6-23) carrying with it the approval of Don Zeifang, VP for Government Relations, John Summers, Executive VP and NAB General Manager, and Vincent Wasilewski. President. In it, they state "the intent of the drafters is not clear and it is impossible to forsee the directions of the new Commission under the new and vague standards." In short, one senses that the NAB staff would rather maintain the status quo than see the Van Deerlin bill enacted.

Whether the NAB hoard, which gives the staff its marching orders. will adopt the staff's position remains to be seen. At week's end, they were still debating the rewrite.

NAB's Objections

The board, however, is considering two options—one of which should emerge as their "unified" position: 1) to pleasantly suggest to Van Deerlin a rewrite of his rewrite or 2) to suggest that things aren't all that bad with the 1934 act and ask for modifications of it. Here is what's bothering many of the board mem-

The single most unsettling issue seems to be the proposed "license which broadcasters, in addition to all users of the spectrum, would pay. According to a House Communications Subcommittee staffer, Van Deerlin is attempting to structure a formula which would deal with the uncertainty associated with the fees. Figures currently being discussed indicate that small market radio stations would pay as little as \$300 to \$800 per year while large radio stations might pay up to \$40,000 or \$50,000 per yearphased in at ten percent per year over ten years. On the other hand. VHF television stations might pay exorbitant amounts. NAB may have trouble maintaining unity on this

Also unclear to the board is how 'petitions to revoke" because of EEO violations will work, and the role of discovery (a process where those filing a petition are granted information which the licensee is holding from them) in EEO challenges. The new bill would continue to permit the use of discovery, leaving it to the discretion of the new Communications Regulatory Commission (CRC). The Communications Subcommittee Staff says that the new bill treats broadcasting as any other business, and offers more protection, since the CRC (unlike the FCC, its present counterpart) will be unable to revoke a license because of EEO violations. The subcommittee staff is advocating discretionary use of discovery as a tradeoff for more stringent requirements which would be placed upon the petitioners.

Other Comments

Finally, NAB's analysis, while self-admittedly "superficial," fails to make a distinction between radio and television ascertainment language contained in the bill. Whereas television might be required to continue to conduct an ascertainment. radio stations would be absolved from doing so. Other comments from the NAB analysis include:

License requirements—"The new standard may practically be no different than the old, but it may take years of interpretations by the courts and the Commission to find

Revocation-"There is therefore a new danger created that an adverse EEO decision by any agency may be the basis for a petition to revoke under the new bill." Fees—"There is absolutely no

way under this bill to tell what the fees for broadcasters would amount . There are just too many questions about the 'fee' or 'tax' to even consider supporting such a

Program Regulation-"The bill is broadly written to allow the Commission to inquire into any matter it deems relevant when such action would be 'consistent with the purposes of the act'. "

Ownership of Broadcast Facilities-It becomes obvious that while immediate divestiture would not be required, the 'purpose of the act' might mean great restructing in the industry.'

Allocations of Frequencies-'Dropping the public interest standard for allocation and using a new standard seemingly based on diversity rather than full service to the public, could lead to general restructuring of the availability and delivering of broadcast services.

Mediascope

McLuhan Calls Advertising "Most Important Art Form," Terms Marketing Research "Espionage"

Media theorist Marshall McLuhan, speaking before a conference of the Advertising Research Foundation, stated that advertising had evolved into the most important art (and education) form on the continent. He made other comparisons of advertisers to artists, and added, "A good advertisement will really shake you."

McLuhan, elsewhere in his remarks, called market research or other forms of studying the public "espionage," a term which will probably not gain much favor with either Arbitron or practitioners of call-out research. He added that research has become one of the most important activities of North American culture.

Harrah's Force Sets Major Radio Push For Theme Song

Harrah's resort hotels in Reno and Las Vegas will use its summer headliners in a Western radio campaign to promote its entertainment lineup. Johnny Mathis, Dionne Warwick, John Davidson, Glen Campbell, and Bobby Vinton, all set to appear at Harrah's during the summer, have or will cut 56-second versions of a Harrah's theme song. Mathis's disco-styled performance started airing June 16 on about 55 stations across California and in Seattle, Denver, Bolse, Spokane, Phoenix, and Vancouver, Warwick's "bongo and disco version" will be run on most of those same stations, with the last Harrah's from Davidson, Campbell and Vinton airing only in Northern California markets after July 5.

Dick & Bert Ad Team Make Clio Sweep At Awards Luncheon

The advertising business's most prestigious award, the Clio, found its way into the hands of Chicago-based ad team Dick & Bert five times during the 1978 awards ceremony. Dick & Bert, leading forces in radio commercial production, were the biggest winners in the ceremonles, covering advertising excellence worldwide in print, specialty advertising, packaging design, and radio. TV awards had not yet been announced. Clio winners were selected from over 1800 entries.

Auto Makers Dominate Car Radio Market

Intensified marketing programs from auto makers have contributed to their regaining dominance in the car radio market over independent marketers. According to **Automotive News**, 92.2 percent of the 1977 models were sold with factory direct sound systems, up from 75.9 percent in 1976. Ford Motor Company's marketing strategy included offering merchandising kits for dealers, placing ads in dealer trade publications, reduced prices on units, upgraded services, extended warranties and increased publicity compaigns, while **General Motors** emphasized 29 percent discounts to dealers with orders of six or more radios, 48 hour shipment, one for one radio exchange, inventory adjustments up to three months after delivery and delayed billing of 90 days.

Carson Group Buys Las Vegas TV Station

A group headed by "Tonight Show" host Johnny Carson has purchased KVVU-TV/Las Vegas. According to Bill Hernstadt, president of Nevada Independent Broadcasting Group, the price will be in excess of \$5 million. Carson's partners in the purchase are Las Vegas businessman Herb Kauffman. Los Angeles businessman Gordon Baskin and an ethnic minority group led by San Diego attorney Forrest Chu.

Hernstadt cited the "unique opportunity of allowing participation of ethnic minorities in TV broadcasting ownership" as a major factor in the sale.

Ferris Promises FCC CB Noise Inquiry

The FCC will do all it can "to contribute to lessening the extent of interference" with home electronic equipment (stereos, etc.) caused by CB's and amateur radio transmitters, FCC Chairman Charles Ferris testified before a Senate subcommittee. However, he declined to take a position on Sen. Barry Goldwater's legislation which would require TV and stereo manufacturers to install expensive filtering devices, citing the need to gather all economic and technological facts first.

Ferris noted, "The number of complaints of interference to home entertainment equipment has increased over the years from 44,784 complaints to our field offices in 1975 to 66,414 in 1977." While he acknowledged these problems may be the result of "a temporary lag in the marketplace's response to a changing technological environment" or perhaps the usage of outmoded equipment, he concluded that the FCC needs to know more and "is moving quickly to institute an inquiry in this area."

Radio Coverage Of British Parliament Provokes Outrage

As radio coverage of the House of Representatives begins (R&R 6-16), the early experience of the British House of Commons with BBC Radio live coverage could prove cautionary. The BBC has featured live broadcasts of "Question Time," during which the Prime Minister and Cabinet can be questioned by Members of Parliament (MP's); and has recorded debates for later airing. In about three months, the reaction from the public and critics has ranged from shock and dismay to outright amusement. The government minister responsible for instituting

WAMB/Ashville. Great Southern Broadcast Company, Inc.: Notified of apparent liability for forfeiture of \$2000 for repeated violation of Sections 1.613 (b) (1), 1.613 (b) (3), 1.615 (c) (1), 1.615 (c) (3) (ii) and 1.615 (a) (3) (i) of the Rules including the requirement that amendments to Articles of Incorporation be filed within thirty days of execution and that pledges of stock be reported within thirty days of the date pledged (Action June 9).

the coverage stated, "We have on our hands a public relations disaster. We are in real danger of making a monumental laughing stock of ourselves." Traditional parliamentary habits of laughing, bellowing abuse at speakers, and various other rude-sounding interruptions have startled radio listeners, who had previously been unaware of the manner in which MP's conducted themselves during parliamentary sessions. One commentator summed up radio's impact on public opinion by stating, "Broadcasting of the Commons is gradually eroding the last vestiges of respect that the electorate still had for its politicians."

FTC Budget Held Up As Congressmen Aim For Veto Power

Congressional attempts to limit Federal Trade Commission rulemaking powers have resulted in a legislative impasse that leaves the Commission temporarily without any operating funds for its forthcoming budget beginning October 1.

FTC critics created the standoff by seeking legislation that would enable either house of Congress to veto any rule adopted by the Commission. Rep. Elliot H. Levitas raised a successful point of order which removed the FTC budget from its normal appropriations bill. This success undermined efforts of a second group of FTC critics, led by Rep. Mark Andrews, which had hoped to attach an amendment to the FTC money bill to bar the FTC from "Ilmiting" ads for foods considered sate by the Food & Drug Administration or toys considered safe by the Consumer Product Safety Commission.

The Andrews amendment, strongly supported by broadcasters, breakfast cereal makers and the toy and sugar industries, was, according to Andrews, meant to prevent the FTC from issuing any rule banning advertising to children in the coming fiscal year. The FTC objected to the amendment on the ground that its wording was so broad that it might prevent commission action on a food rule requiring nutrition disclosures in ads for large numbers of food Items.

Meanwhile, the objective of holding up the FTC budget is to force action on a separate bill that includes the controversial House demand for veto power.

TV News

TV Revenues Up, Profit Margins Down; 90 Percent Of Stations Make Money

NAB statistics show that slightly over 90 percent of reporting television stations showed a profit in 1977 (based on 404 stations' financial returns). The average TV station has sales of \$3.6 million and net revenues of \$3.2 million, both figures up 11.8 percent from 1976. Network revenues were up 6.5 percent over last year, national/regional spot revenues increased 9.7 percent, and local advertising was up 14.9 percent. However, a 13.7 percent profit margin from 26.8 percent in 1976 to 25.5 percent. Payroll costs were also up 13.7 percent. The NAB projects a 10.2 percent increase in net revenues for 1978.

ABC Victorious In Lackluster Rating Week

ABC won a sluggish victory in the **Nielsen** rating week ending June 18, achieving a modest 15.0 rating overall, with CBS taking second place with a 14.2 and **NBC** in third with 13.6. CBS took three of the top four placings, with "One Day At A Time" and "MASH" providing the 1-2 punch, but ABC won the other seven spots to win the week. ABC's "Three's Company" finished third, followed by 4) CBS's "Lou Grant" 5) "Charlie's Angels" 6) "Lords Of Flatbush" (ABC Thursday Night Movie) 7) "Carter Country" 8) "Laverne & Shirley" 9) "Starsky & Hutch", and 10) "Happy Days."

tacular leap from 3.8 to the 11.0 peak previously (April/May '76 to '77), but its current 3.7 Men 18 plus rating is considerably below even their 1976 figure (5.9).

Meanwhile, the other protesters, WROK and WZOK, fared somewhat better in the ratings. Top 40 WROK did well, as Operations Manager Bob Goode acknowledged, going 23.6 to 25.1 overall and 15.8 to 22.4 in Men 18 plus. AOR counterpart WZOK was down overall, 8.6 to 5.8, but declined only slightly in Men 18 plus, 6.1 to 5.6. The stations sent a letter of their own to Arbitron nonetheless, raising essentially the same points as the WKKN/Y96 letter.

WZOK Attack

WZOK's letter stated that while 27 in-tab diaries were used for the 18-24 male demographic in the metro area in 1976, and 18 in 1977, only 11 were used this year. It called Arbitron's "inadequate sampling totally valueless in measuring this format" (AOR). The letter cited a RAM Research survey of the area using 32 in-tab diaries for the 18-24 male group which accorded "substantially higher ratings" to the market's AOR stations (Y95's Chianti told R&R that his station showed a 10 share overall in the RAM survey, while WZOK had a 13). Finally, WZOK queried: "If the ARB goes to extra lengths to retrieve data for what they call high ethnic density areas, or low income zip code areas by telephone retrieval or by stimulating response by telephone, why then don't they go to the same lengths to retrieve dairy data from a group that is even more likely not to cooperate-mainly, 18-24 males?

Arbitron Responds

An Arbitron spokesperson acknowledged that the low number of 18-24 male diaries "could certainly change" figures for the four Rockford stations, but maintained that Arbitron weighting techniques were designed to insure accuracy in such cases. Citing the low diary return rate among 18-24 males, the spokesperson added, "We work hard to hit our in-tab, and unfortunately it doesn't always happen every time. That's one of the reasons we're pushing for ESF (Expanded Sample Frame). ESF will, because of the demographics it leans toward, offer more 18-24 year-olds up front in the base sample, so that when we go after the people the chances of getting more of them are good." No

recall of the Rockford book is likely to occur.

Anti-Protest Movement

If a recall were to be considered. however, Jack Ambrozic would be firmly opposed to it. Ambrozic owns and operates WYBR-FM in Rockford, a Beautiful Music station. WYBR, interestingly, was by no means the chief beneficiary of the rating situation, even in the Beautiful Music classification. WYBR was 3.8 to 4.5 overall, while dropping slightly in Men 18 plus, 4.4 to 3.7. However, WRWC, described by Y95's Daniels as a cross between a "big band" sound and conventional Beautiful Music, registered a 4.1 to 8.7 increase overall and a dramatic 6.1 to 13.1 leap in Men 18 plus, and is second in Men 18-34 in the market, leading both AOR stations.

In any case, Ambrozic told R&R he is "protesting that they're protesting." Explaining, he said, "We all tive with that 18-24 freakdom, that they just don't want to file the books. Last time around, WYFE went from a nothing to like Number 2 in the market. Now they're back down to nothing. The same quirk that happened for them happened against them this time. That's the chance you take dealing with the 18-24 element."


Ambrozic's letter "strongly objects" to any consideration of recall, and to Arbitron allowing "perusal" of its files by the protesting stations, asking for equal time for WYBR if perusal permission is granted. It continues, "Last year's 1977 Rockford area report taken during the month of April/May 1977 showed a similar inadequacy of sample size, (Continued on page 23)





GRT Completes Ranwood Acquisition, Pacts With Beserkley

GRT Corp. has completed its previously-announced acquisition of Ranwood Records, with former Ranwood VP/GM Larry Welk (son of the bandleader whose records make up a significant part of the Ranwood catalog) becoming President of the GRT Record Group, (which includes Janus Records) as planned Chris Hamilton becomes Vice President of Administration and Morry Goldman was named Vice President, Sales for Ranwood.

GRT also announced the signing of an exclusive distribution agreement with the Berkeley-based Beserkley label, which has been without an American distributor since the folding of Playboy Records and the expiration of a CBS distribution pact last year A Greg Kihn album previously released in Europe only will be the first Beserkley release under the new agreement, and the entire label catalog, including the albums by Rubinoos. Earth Quake and Jonathan Richman. will be available shortly from GRT. According to the announcement, the staff of GRT's Janus label, many of whom share a longstanding relationship with Beserkley, will work closely with Beserkley on all promotional and marketing efforts

Teenage Pirate Radio Film Underway; Stewart, Nugent To Score?

An independently-produced film about a California teenager with his own pirate radio station is underway, according to the Starship news service, with Ted Nugent and Rod Stewart reportedly set to contribute songs to the soundtrack. The film is called "On The Air Live With Captain Midnight," and negotiations have begun to create and issue a soundtrack album.

FDA Trips BOC's Light Fantastic


The Blue Oyster Cult may not fear the reaper, but they have good reason to beware of radiation experts at the Food and Drug Administration. After measuring the lasers used during a recent Cult concert in Atlanta, the FDA issued a letter to the band informing them to clean up its act in order to prevent possible burn injuries to concertgoers. While the agency said there had been no reported injuries they stressed the possibility of situations arising which could be hazardous.

"Some of the rock groups have laser lights which flash over the heads of the audiences, if someone held up a hand, for instance, and the beam of light bounced off a watch crystal or something it could bounce into someone's eye. It could damage the eye even before you had time to blink away from it, and the result could be a temporary blind spot in the eye. That's most likely the most serious thing that would happen," according to a FDA spokesman.

The FDA's Bureau of Radiological Health asked the Cult to inform it of what corrective action would be taken. However, the FDA added that it has no plans to issue a regulation specifically for band-related laser shows, because existing regulations, if enforced, are sufficient.

Album Promotion Restructuring For Columbia

Columbia Records' Promotion Department has announced a restructuring of responsibilities connected with album promotion, under the direction of Vice President of National Promotion Bob Sherwood. Fred Humphrey, previously Associate Director of National Album Promotion, becomes Director, National Album Promotion, reporting to Sherwood. He has been with the label since 1976. Mike Pillot, formerly Director, Album Promotion and Special Projects, takes on the newly created position of Director of Special Projects, concentrating on specific promotional projects assigned by Sherwood. Pillot has been with Columbia for six years. Also included in the restructuring were Michael Gusler, promoted to Southwest Regional Album Promotion Manager and Ed Climie, promoted to Southwest Regional Promotion Marketing Manager.

White Named VP Marketing At Capitol

Dennis White has been named Vice President, Marketing at Capital Records. He will oversee all operations in Capital's marketing divisions, reporting to President and Chief Operating Officer Don Zimmerman. White joined Capital Records in 1961 as a salesman in Omaha, rising to the position of Vice President of Marketing for Capital of Canada-EMI in 1977, which he has held until his current promotion.




Phasing In The Phones

One factor in a morning show which divides opinions dramatically is the use of the phones. Some morning men make it an integral facet of their programs; others don't want to get near the instrument; and still others are prevented by format policy from using phones. Gary McKee is renowned throughout the South for his creative use of the phones and his bizarre cast of regular callers (the man whose job it is to pick up all the nocturnal guard dogs every morning from the various stores and institutions where they discourage burglars is just one of McKee's colorful faithful). McKee says, "I love to work off the telephones and put these people on the air. It's their damn show, anyway, it's not really your show. They're the ones that make you

Country morning man Bill Bailey likes to use the phones at his own discretion. "I answer the telephone," he says. "If I get a live one, I tape him and use the conversation later in the show." And in a contrasting format, Steve Dahl adapts the phones to his needs. "I use the phones quite a bit. I do pretty much the standard phone bits you've always heard, but try and gear them to an AOR audience."

Larry Lujack is typical of those morning men with a guarded attitude towards the phones. He uses them "occasionally, once an hour is about it. Those are mostly listeners' requests or their thoughts or comments on something. I don't do it live because I don't have anybody to screen the calls, and if you just do it haphazardly you get some really boring people on the air. Most of the stuff I do with the phone is recorded."


Jeff Gonzer admits the occasional usefulness of the phones, but is slated towards the negative side of the issue. "I loathe the telephone," he says, "but I feel the phones have to be open, especially during ratings periods . . . you might alienate somebody with a book. I have a real love-hate thing going with my phones." He never does phone bits on the air. "As far as I'm concerned, I can control myself and I can control the records, but I can't control a person I don't even know. I feel it's a really teen-oriented thing, and therefore not necessary for the people I am trying to appeal to."




Mike Murphy has found FCC regulations a hindrance to his use of phones. "I used to use them, but don't any more since it became such a hassle . . . the FCC, telling every-body they're being recorded, etc. I do put on people who call when you don't have to tell them they're being recorded. I'll take the calls direct and then the engineer listens to them, and I tell him where to pick them up, and record them and use them later as bits.'

Dick Whittinghill maintains, "Everybody in the business does that" (uses the phones). "I don't want to be like every body in the business. That's a crutch.'

Dick Haynes says simply, "I don't have access to the tele-phone" at KLAC. And Charlie Tuna states that under current format directions at KHJ he can't use the phones. He adds, "I think the phone is the greatest tool a morning man can have, and I think that Charlie Tuna's success is built on his phone calls and some of the other features I have had on my shows."

Staying Stable

If you've read this far, you've seen a lot of evidence backing up the contention that morning men are generally much more stable in their gigs than jocks in general. Haynes, Aku, Whittinghill, and more all have decades of radio experience under their belts, much of it at the same stations in the same time slots. We asked our representative morning jocks why they thought the position generates more stability than other air shifts.

Whittinghill said, "It's because it's the most valuable time to a station, because that sets the tone of the day. If people tune in in the morning, they're more apt not to tune out. They stay right with that particular station, so it's become to management a very important slot."

Lujack feels morning men are more stable because they're superior jocks. "I think theoretically," he says, adding that he does not mean to sound "ego trippy" in any way, "that



the station tries to put the best body they have on in the morning. If the guy is good, it's because he works real hard and has the intangible whatever the hell it is that it takes to be a morning guy. He is usually a very good disc jockey who works very, very hard, and people like that are just not going to have the problems that some of the other people have."

Aku goes along with Whittinghill, maintaining that any stability syndrome is strictly a matter of dollars and sense. "I don't think morning men are necessarily stable, or more stable than other people, except that the management takes a look at the profit and loss sheet and says this guy is bringing in the dollars, so we'll keep him." Harry Harrison agrees. "It's very important; it's a large audience, large revenue, top dollar paid for the commercials, and so on. I think if you have a successful morning show, the station is very happy, and they'll try to keep the morning guy happy—nobody wants to disrupt it."

With the second second second second

Lee Sherwood believes that a combination of listener habit and greater personal stability in morning men is the cause of the syndrome. "I think part of it is attributable to our all being victims of habit. Radio listeners certainly are. Morning radio tends to be more consistent in its numbers than any other daypart. A personality can become more of a habit to morning listeners than at any other time. I also think a morning man must display a bit more personal and professional stability than other air men. Just the discipline of getting up each day and making it on time says something about the man."

Mike Murphy says, "For some reason I think you develop more of a rapport in the morning with people—they become more involved with you in the morning." Deano Day stresses his ties to the city in which he works, Detroit. "One of the reasons for my stability is my contract. Next year I'll have two kids in college. Moving around a lot is all right when you're younger. I used to move around in a U-Haul trailer. I worked six months some places, something like 14 markets. But my stability here is because, in part, of my involvement in this market. I am involved in something every weekend."

Don Rose, asked why he was more stable than most, answered, "It's because I haven't been fired recently." He went on to say, "People do not like to be shocked in the morning. They like to wake up in the same way, they generally put on the same shoe first every time; they've got habits. The morning person they listen to is also a habit, which means the morning audience will stick with you pretty much through thick and thin. It's the one time of day when if you want to gain listeners you damn near have to stand on your head, because people just do not break those morning habits."

Larry Kenney says, "In my experience, the morning man usually seems to be the anchor guy at the station. There's the old saying in the business, 'as goes the morning, so goes the day.' I think that stations tend to put the man on in the morning whom they think will be the most stable. A station can't afford to keep moving people in and out the morning slot as easily as they can in other time slots."

According to Charlie Tuna, "It's the high amount of visibility. You become instrumental in your listeners' lives, whereas during the rest of the day, a number of different appointments or situations may come up where they might not be in a position to listen to a disc jockey the way they can at a certain time in the morning."

To Gary McKee, the reason for greater stability among morning men is simple: "fun." "They have fun, they love the job," he says. "You get up at 4:45am and say, 'God, I've got to go to work again,' but once you get there and that mike opens, it's fun. These people are good at it, and that's why they stay, because they deliver and turn over revenue for their radio stations. It's fun for them."

Mourning Early Morning Hours

Throughout the corse of this article, references have been made to ungodly hours of the day -4:00am, 4:15am, 4:45am, 4:22am, etc. The air personalities who mentioned those times were not doing it to be dramatic – they actually must arise each day around those hours. One of the most commonly-asked, but eternally interesting questions directed to morning men must be, "Do you ever get used to getting up early in the morning?" The general tone of replies from our subjects adds up to a resounding "No!"

Mike Murphy says, "It gets worse. Every day it gets about a hair worse." Harry Harrison adds, "No, not really. When I started this show I asked some other morning men about that and their answer was, 'No, you really never do get used to it.' It's amazing how you can just turn it on."

Bill Bailey says, "I have trouble getting up. Perhaps now it's more difficult than it was a few years ago. I'm 38 now. I'm not all that old in years, but I got the damn miles on me. Gettin' up is tough." Whittinghill declares in no uncertain terms, "Never, never get used to it; it's a drag. Once I get here everything's fine, but it's just that first getting up."

Larry Lujack chimes in, "It takes a special-type person to be able to fake it in a convincing manner that you are really having fun and glad to be on the radio at this godawful hour. Hauling your ass out of bed at 2 or 3 in the morning every day is not easy, and requires some sacrifices in your evening social life." Lee Sherwood agrees with that point, declaring, "The early morning radio man is always one step out of line with the rest of the world, socially."



Jeff Gonzer echoes Dick Whittinghill, saying, "It's a drag, but once you're up and there at the station, you're into it." Gary McKee expresses similar sentiments, claiming that "I never have, probably never will" get used to getting up. "But there is that little spark that says, 'Damn, this is really going to be fun when I get there.'"

Then there's the apparently rare breed of morning man who doesn't mind getting up early. Aku says, "I'm a night person and I enjoy being up early in the morning. I often go to bed at 7 at night so I can wake up at 1 in the morning." Joining the positive ranks is Sonny Fox, who claims, "I don't mind the early hours, maybe because I was born on a farm. I really dig it when the sun is just coming up."

Perhaps the most creative approach to the awakening problem is practiced by one Country newsman, who says, "I often get up at 5:59 to make a 6am newscast!"

Making the adjustments and sacrifices necessary in order to get up early every day can be rough. While a few lucky morning men (Deano Day for example) can get by on 3½-4 hours of sleep a night, most either go to bed early (Whittinghill: "I've never seen Johnny Carson in my whole life") or take afternoon naps. Socializing, family life, and extracurricular night club work are usually severely curtailed.

Larry Kenney sums it up for a lot of morning men: "I get up about 3:30am; I live in Connecticut and have about an hour's drive in here. If I had to dwell on the hour I get up, I'd drive myself crazy. I just get up as if it's a decent hour and go to work.

"It shoots hell out of your social life," he continues. "When I was doing the morning show at WJJD/Chicago, I was working clubs almost every night, sometimes two a night. I made a lot of money, but if I had stayed there on that schedule, I would have been dead. Sometimes I would average two hours sleep a night for five straight days. I aged about five years during the year and a half I was there. In New York, I simply don't socialize."



This program is therapy for me. I have no idea what I would do without this program, it's that important to me. And I guess it's been that way from the start. When I was a baby, the folks put a Bible in my crib, and they put in a microphone and they put in a bottle of booze. They figured whatever I went for that's what I'd be. If I went for the bottle of booze, I'd be an alcoholic. If I went for the Bible I'd be a preacher, and if I went for the microphone, I'd be a disc jockey.

(Newsman:) So you went for the microphone?

No, I went for the nurse!

Advice & Comment

Still, despite the lack of sleep and the necessary social life rearrangements, there are obviously attractive compensations for morning men, especially stability, stature, fame and money. The morning shift is still the most coveted slot in radio, and our participating personalities had some useful advice for aspiring jocks hoping to follow their path Before concluding with those words of wisdom, however, here are a few random comments of special interest on the subject of being a morning man:

Lee Sherwood: "If you're going to work in radio, mornings are the time to work."

Charlie Tuna: "It's crucial that you know that your audience is doing the same thing every day. I have people that depend on features in my show. They know exactly if they're on time or if they're behind. I've had people comment to me that if there is a certain position on the freeway that coincides with one of my features, they feel almost at peace

with themselves, knowing everything is OK, there's the 'Morning Wake-Up Story' and I'm right here where I usually am, so I'm on time."

Gary McKee: "The trouble with radio is that you've got too many disc jockeys in it and not enough people."

Don Rose: "Just tell everyone that I was born silly and every morning I have a relapse"

every morning I have a relapse."
Sonny Fox: "I consider it a privilege to have a job where
I fuck off in the morning and everybody loves it."

Most of the advice offered for up and coming morningmen-to-be was altruistic, well-intentioned, and quite sound. However, a strange theme recurred in certain answers, as can be seen by the following responses. The precise question was, "What advice do you have for young, aspiring morning men out there?"

morning men out there?"

Larry Kenney: "Give up! I don't intend to give up my job if I can help it. Insurance is a good field."

Charlie Tuna: "Go into aluminum siding, at least for 20 years, because I don't want to leave."

Bill Bailey: "Yeah, don't go into the business!"

Larry Lujack: "Set your sights somewhere else, because I need the money."

Aside from these half-humorous (we hope) attempts at discouragement, some useful insights were uncovered. Harry Harrison advised, "Number one, I always say get as much education as you can. I think that's important for any career. Take the radio and TV courses in college and get that education, because frankly you need something to fall back on; most people, as we know, will not make it in radio. Send out the tapes and so on, and start in a small market and work your way up. Take pride in your work, be a professional. You have to be able to sell. Every time that microphone goes on, you're selling a radio station, and you're selling yourself as a personality, and you want to do a good job for your clients. If you don't, they're not going to come back, and that is what it's all about."

Lee Sherwood counseled, "When I started on the air in the late 50's, there was always somebody on the air who I really admired. Those people were magic to me, as all of radio was. But certain personalities impressed me and I tried to learn from them. Perhaps I even copied some of them; perhaps'some of them still influence me. I don't know if we have that many great ones from whom the young can learn, but there are some. I hope they'll learn all they can from the great ones and use what they learn."

Dick Whittinghill says, "First, go get an education – high school's enough – and then go to a radio school. You have to, it's a must. When you graduate from radio school, go to a small town, any place, out in the boondocks, work in a small station, that's where you learn. You don't learn by coming out of school into a big town; besides, you couldn't get a job anyway."

Deano Day maintains, "The most important thing for them to remember is that they can learn from everyone they work with. They should pick up all the good things they can. I've been fortunate enough to work with some really great people; today, I'm a combination of 10 or 15 people with whom I've worked or heard. The old adage says, 'Be yourself.' Of course, be yourself, but if you're exposed to good talent, then learn from them. Then, when you get into a market where you can get involved with the audience, do it! For years, I sat behind a mike and had no contact with the audience. How could I know what they were thinking out there? I had to get out among them."

Dick Haynes believes, "The first thing is to make people like you, both employers and listeners. Both of them like to be able to depend on you. Neither listeners nor employers want to have to deal with your personal problems. My advice to newcomers is to be dependable."

Finally, Mike Murphy offers these words: "The only way you seem to get ahead in this business is to be different than other people. There's so many out there copying each other that the only thing I think you can do is operate outside the norm and go completely away from what other people do."

Obviously, it's not easy to become a morning man, it takes a lot of hard work to maintain the position, and it plays hell with your visions of a normal life. But from talking to the 18 highly successful morning men who provided invaluable aid in assembling this article, it was evident there are unique satisfactions to be gained from taking on the morning challenge, and not all of them are financial. The morning man usually has more scope to stretch out, to develop his personality, to practice what some say is the vanishing art of creative radio. As Charlie Tuna says, "It's been the best thing that has ever happened to me in my career. I think there is no more rewarding position in radio than that of morning man."

Real Don Steele Leaves TEN-Q For TV

Shortly after the announced format "flip-flop" for KTNQ & KGBS/Los Angeles "The Real" Don Steele announced he was leaving his afternoon-drive shift on TEN-Q.



Don told me, "As you know they decided to go Country and they wanted me to work it out until Fall. They wanted me to be there during a rating period (July-August ARB) knowing that the station (TEN-Q) was going Country in sixty days, which really didn't make me feel that happy about going to work every day.

But Don was quick to bounce back (as always) when he announced that he has been signed by TV producer Chris Bearde to host a pilot entitled "The Radio Show." The television project conceived by Bearde was described by Don as being, "a perfect blend of McDonalds and Fellini." The show will shoot in Hollywood in early July and will be aired sometime in late Summer around the country. Both Steele and Bearde were hopeful that the variety-formatted show would be "picked up" by one of the networks for a regular spot in the midseason replace-

Don Steele ment derby.

Don Steele has long been a top radio personality in Los Angeles, first coming to prominence on KHJ in the mid-sixties. During the early KHJ days, Don also hosted a TV show on KHJ-TV, which served as the inspiration for Bearde to offer him the hosting job on "The Radio Show."

Don isn't the least bit bitter about the way things ended at TEN-Q; instead, he's very excited about his chance to expand his career into an area he has always loved. No immediate replacement for Steele was named by the station

WFIL's Shift Hits High Gear

WFIL/Philadelphia made a definite and audible change of direction in September of 1977 Faced with an ever-increasing rate of audience decline, Program Director Jay Cook shifted the emphasis of WFIL away from the younger demographics. This has proved to be a difficult road for any Top 40 station to pursue, but Jay felt it was the correct direction for WFIL within the competitive situation Philadelphia presented.

But did the station actually become "Pop/Adult" rather than "Top 40?" Jay said, "It should be acknowledged, and perhaps I'm not being totally objective about it, but I feel WFIL had sort of evolved over the last three or four years into something more than 'just your typical Top 40 operation.' Our jock presentation has been a little more tolerable. The quality of our guys, I think, was a little better. We had severe dayparting (of the music) and always had. Except for nighttime I don't think the stigma of 'Top 40' applied. I think we had been into the transition toward 'Pop/Adult' all along.

The station did make an attempt to retain the teen audience for a time, but, as Jay explained, "September, I think, was when we decided that 12-49 was just not practical. Even though we'd managed to hang onto it longer than we expected we felt that if we had to sacrifice something, that it would be 12-18 rather than 35-49.

The recent Apr-May '78 ARB shows WFIL rebounding from a Jan-Feb '78 low of 3.9 to a high of 5.8. Jay offered an explanation as to why Jan-Feb had been down so low and this book showed such a dramatic turnaround.

'The Oct-Nov book, I don't know that it reflected anything, the old format or the change while not drastic, the change was certainly substantial. We really felt that we had executed the turnaround and were making progress and perhaps began to catch on a little bit in the Jan-Feb rating period. The Arbitron did not reflect that, but, and I admit I may be copping out a bit here, I think we got a lousy book. It might have been an unlucky 'fall' in the diaries. I think we should have stayed a little more stable than we did from Oct-Nov to Jan-Feb. I know we lost some teens and some 18-24 men, especially, but not to the degree the (Jan-Feb) book reflected. And as a result this book (Apr-May) shows a substantial gain which may appear more dramatic than it really is. I don't think we were ever in as bad a shape as the Jan-Feb book showed us to be.

But as WFIL was increasing in the most recent ARB, WIFI declined from a new high in Jan-Feb of 4.3 to a 3.5. I asked Jay if he had an explanation for that and he quickly came to WIFT's defense, "I think WIFT probably got a bad break or two in this book. We've handed WIFI and WZZD a certain amount of audience on a silver platter. The fact that WIFI would drop as severely as they did in this book is a surprise to me. Perhaps the kind of radio we're doing does still have substantial teen appeal and young adult appeal as well, especially

women. We have a good solid teen share (10.2)."

What Jay has done with WFIL is simple to describe, but very difficult to put into practice. He took a declining AM Top 40 station and changed the demographic target from 12-49 to 18-49, knowing that certain audience losses were inevitable in the transition. The surprising part of the transition is that WFIL has retained a good chunk of the audience they were no longer targeted toward.

So what does WFIL sound like? The news was not expanded except in morning drive. The jingles are still there, although not as often. The presentation is positive. The jocks are allowed latitude for personality, but the emphasis remains on hit music. WFIL is a good sounding radio station that has successfully made the transition from a teen-based Top 40 station to a slightly older demographic mass appeal sound. It can be done. Jay Cook and WFIL have done it, and they've done it in a market full of great radio. As Jay says, "There's not a bad radio station in this town. There are 15 or 16 really aggressive, quality outfits, and all the ones that have adequate facilities are being well programmed. And that just means that 16 people are going to be cutting up that pie instead of the four or five like it used to be." WFIL will most assuredly get their peice of that pie following their Apr-May ARB results.

"You're gonna love Summer on KERN!" That's the title of an extensive promotional effort by the Bakersfield rocker for the next three months. The first part of the continuing promotion will be the search for what PD Russ Gerber termed, "Bakersfield's best belly button." The station is also giving away "The world's first ride on the world's largest and fastest rollercoaster-The Colossus." The new ride, which will open soon in Los Angeles Magic Mountain, is the focus of that particular giveaway with the station arranging seats on the very first official run of the new coaster. And naturally KERN is giving away plenty of "I Love Summer" t-shirts. I sure hope I get some pictures of "Bakersfield's best belly button."



As Summer "sets" itself for a warm run, here comes another Jello promotion, this one from T. Morgan at WPEZ/Pittsburgh. In conjunction with the Chuck Mangione song, "Feels So Good," the station filled a small swimming pool with 1500 gallons of Jello encasing twenty-five envelopes. Each envelope detailed a prize that each of the twenty-five "Jello jumpers" could win. programming, which the FCC was monitoring unknown to the station. Later, when the Commission's staff compared its tapings with the station's logs, they found that KCCT, while only logging five 10 second spots for the event, had actually run CA's of 33 sec., 26 sec., 1:26, 1:20 and 1:06. They also discovered that the station aired over 11 minutes of announcer talk in conjunction with more than 25 minutes of records by a group appearing at the "Cook-Off". None of the latter

were logged, however.

The FCC has documented evidence that "KCCT announcers made repeated ad-lib comments and plugs (which were not logged as commercials) regarding the

KCCT-sponsored dances and concerts and that...the majority of the bands who performed...did receive heavy airplay on KCCT."

Another Commission example is twelve 60-sec, spots run on June 22, 1977—all of which were logged as 30's—and over 25 minutes of talk and records promoting a group called the Chicano Experience—none of which were logged. Before that, the FCC found that during a six-hour period, from 2:20pm to 8:30pm on June 6, 1977, KCCT aired over an hour and a half of commercial matter, of which they logged only four minutes. The brondcasts were promoting KCCT's "Anniversary Dance".

"Anticompetitive"

During the investigation, members of local bands stated that they were afraid not to perform without charge for fear of not getting airplay. Club owners complained that they could not afford to promote their events as heavily as KCCT did with its free promotion.

The Commission charges that the licensee "failed to control the operation of the station so as to prevent its use in an anticompetitive manner...has enabled KCCT to maintain its high ratings in the market, with all the resulting financial benefits that follow."

as applied to WYBR-FM and the rest of the market. Now the pendulum has swung the other way, and we believe it is only equitable that the latest report be allowed to stand as taken for a reasonable period of time." The letter concludes by calling for a "completely new survey" in October/November 1978 with an "objective sample based on 750 diaries."

Legal Action Unlikely

Should Arbitron fail to recall the Rockford book, the outlook for legal action on the parts of the protesting stations seems dim. Daniels stated, "It's all dictated by what kind of response Arbitron gives us." But WZOK's Goode told R&R, "The thought crossed our minds," referring to legal action. "However, in the standard contract that a station signs with Arbitron, they've disclaimed responsibility to the point where they're liable for absolutely nothing, including gross error on their part." One bright spot for the protestors, according to Daniels, is that business has not suffered as a result of Y96's rating plunge. "The agencies in town have said the book is crazy," he stated, adding that the station has not lost accounts and that the agencies are choosing to ignore the book "to a great degree."



AOR's Newest Pioneers

AOR radio has a long-standing reputation for experimentation. Now in at least two areas of the country, AOR stations are once again attempting to pioneer a new means of communicating with their listeners: on cable. KBLE, travelling over the Hawkeye system's cable wires in Des Moines, Iowa, and WDIX, operating over Suffolk Cable Vision in Long Island, have been running commercial outlets for over a year now.

At the programming helm of KBLE is Ron Sorenson, a pioneer of early seventies progressive rock radio in Des Moines. He was attracted to the idea of a cable outlet for radio because of the greater musical freedom he felt it would allow him than the broadcast outlets locally, whose musical policies Sorenson found overly restrictive. The Hawkeye cable company liked the idea because it offered their subscribers another service, and one which would not cost the cable outlet anything to put together. Sorenson and engineering partner Bill Synhorst had already constructed the automation system necessary to put KBLE in business for less than \$10,000, and went on the air (so to speak) with it on November 15, 1975.

Meanwhile in New York two Ithaca College communications majors, **Bob Buchmann** and Corey Taylor, took the idea of broadcasting the campus station over cable to the dormitories one step further, formulating plans to put together a commercial station that could be offered over a professional cable service system in their home area of Long Island. **Suffolk** Cable Vision found the idea intriguing and WDIX began automated service on June 23rd, 1977.

Both stations have since found live programming garners greater audience interest and feedback (and consequently more advertising clientele) than automation, so both have gathered air staffs who now do most of the programming chores live. These personalities are mostly students (and some disco deejays) who volunteer their time to work at the stations.

KBLE is a twenty-four hour operation servicing approximately 22,000 Des Moines subscribers. In addition to an available stereo hook-up, KBLE's AOR music can be heard as the audio background to two unused TV channels that are hooked into the Hawkeye cable system.

WDIX signs on each day at 5pm and off at 3am. Program Director Bob Buchmann explains the station's hours of broadcast: "Due to the nature of cable radio, it's nonsensical to operate during drive-time hours when so few people would be home to listen to us. We do it when we can reach the most people." WDIX's AOR programming services over 20,000 Long Island residents.

Since their inceptions, both stations have been set up as commercial operations, with the parent cable companies getting a nominal monthly subscription fee (\$1.00 or \$1.50) from their subscribers, and the stations supporting themselves through ad revenue. At KBLE, running up to six minutes of commercial time an hour at \$4 per minute, the station has not made much money. According to Sorenson, "With 100,000 potential cable customers here and only a little over 20,000 currently hooked up, our market penetration is too low. It needs to be at least 35 percent or 40 percent before we are going to have a large enough audience to attain financial security."

For WDIX, who also sell up to six minutes of commercial time per hour at \$4 per spot, success has been seasonal in nature. Says Buchmann, "We made a good amount around New Year's; the stores were selling their seasonal wares. But while Corey and I were in school the station suffered financially because we couldn't put the time into it that was necessary to keep the money flowing. We now have the time to get some sales going again." The station is listed in Standard Rates and Data and has hired a national sales rep.

The stations rely on their limited commercial air time to lure listeners away from the broadcast AOR stations. They provide other programming services to entice potential cable converts as well. Explains WDIX's Bob Buchmann, "We run a lot of public service programming. All of our news is localized. Additionally, we do two talk shows of local origination, one of which is sports-oriented. We produce our own album countdown reflecting local record store sales." KBLE's Ron Sorenson says, "We can provide a much broader spectrum of musical programming than a commercial-band AOR. Our relatively free-form AOR seems more suited to a cable-sized audience and as we don't have to worry about getting giant ratings numbers we can take more musical chances."

While both stations take advantage of the medium's opportunity to program unusual music, neither claim to take undue advantage of the lack of FCC regulatory control over cable programming. Buchmann states, "While we are not obligated by any FCC regulations to keep questionable material off the air, we do have to answer to our parent cable company, who have to answer to their subscribers. So we don't say just anything on the air. On the other hand, we don't have to run poorly-produced public service programs on the air just to fulfill FCC obligations. We can take the time to produce our own localized programs with potentially greater audience appeal." Sorenson echoes Buchmann's remarks on censorship: "We have an agreement with the cable company that we will try to avoid objectionable programming, particularly during the times when people who may be offended by it might be listening." Both programmers expect FCC regulations to carry over to cable operations at some point in the future. Says Sorenson, "If it moves, sooner or later they'll regulate it. And they know who we are. So far they just haven't decided how to deal with us yet."

Cable radio is not without its disadvantages. Both Sorenson and Buchmann speak highly of the system's unmatched audio quality but bemoan its incapability of reception without the physical hook-up. Buchmann states, "We'can't be heard on the road or at the beach, and that's a killer for the summer months in particular." Sorenson adds, "There can be no drive-time for us, no in-car listening. And of course I'm limited to the amount of cable penetration in the market. We can never grow faster than our parent company."

Despite cable's drawbacks for a commercial radio operation, both AOR programmers are optimistic for the form's future. Says Buchmann, "I've already read about the possibility of making even the smallest of table top radios capable of having cable attachments." He adds, "I see a continued pattern of growth for cable radio. It is and shall continue to be especially popular in smaller communities who can't afford their own full-scale radio station operations."

For Sorenson, cable's advantage over broadcast radio lies in its capabilitity of matching specialized formats to subscribers. "While cable radio is best-equipped now to serve audiences that are not being served by local broadcast outlets," he says, "I can see ahead to it offering different formats for different subscribers: foreign language, Jazz, totally freeform AOR, or whatever. These future formats should also open up new vehicles for record companies to deal with on a promotion level, just as discos have done wonders for selling a kind of music that wasn't getting any significant amount of radio airplay."

Cable radio may be the tip of a new radio programming iceberg or it may melt back into the ocean of airwaves without a ripple; it's much too early to tell. But for at least two cable AOR programmers and their dedicated staffs, it is a serious experiment with an eye to the unlimited possibilities in radio broadcasting's future.

AOR radio stations continue to show up nicely in many major markets as the books keep marching in. WRIF/Detroit, under the programming aegis of Tom Bender, came up very nicely. WIOT/Toledo came a cropper this book, nearly hitting two digits with the help of PD Jon Sinton and crew. WAAF/Worcester did come up with a two-digit book that we can all be proud of. A tip of the AOR hat to PD Lee Arnold and staff. WMMS resurged this book and ended up right at the top of the rockers. Kudos to PD John Gorman and his crew for maintaining the Cleveland AOR legend. 



From Williamsport, Pennsylvannia, "Jungle" Jim Cameron of WILQ asks this week's musical question: "Is there any truth to the rumor Bill Anderson's disco-country "I Can't Wait Any Longer" is from the soundtrack of the soon-to-be-released movie 'Square Dance Fever' starring John-Boy Travolta?" And the R&R Country answer: Could you repeat the question? . . . Effective last Monday, veteran KCKN/Kansas City air personality, programmer and music man Don Rhea leaves to join KFIX/Kansas City, as morning man and Music Director. Effective July 17, according to Rhea, KFIX-AM will change formats from Pop/Adult to Country. KFIX newsman Mike Shannon has been appointed Station Manager. One interesting fact is that the entire AM air staff are former KCKN employees. The lineup will be Rhea in the morning; John Duncan, 10 AM to 2 PM; and Ed Brown, 2 to 6. KFIX is a daytimer and was formatted Country less than a year ago under the calls KBIL. In another development in Kansas City, the Country-formatted KAYQ has been sold and some sources have heard rumbles that they plan a format change in the near future. But for right now Kansas City will have four Country stations: WDAF, KCKN, KAYQ and the new KFIX....

After almost five years at KTOM/Salinas, Bob Kane, Music Director, has resigned effective this week. No replacement for his midday air shift and the MD chores have been announced

Richard Lee takes over the all nighter at KUZZ/Bakersfield from KIBS/Bishop... CFGM/Toronto Music Director Joe Lefresne leaves to take up the position of PD at CFMK-FM/Kingston, Ontario which is another full-time Country station...At WWJO/St. Cloud, Jim Christie takes over as PD. Dean Allen, who had been PD/MD will devote full time energies to music and research. Randy Michaels (the other one), has resigned as PD of WFNC/Fayetteville, North Carolina. From Production Director and the 2-6 AM air shift comes new PD Dan Mitchell. Michaels had been with WFNC for more than a year and a half, having come from WAME/Charlotte . . . At the end of July, Trish Hennessey takes over as Music Director of WSNI/Philadelphia (the former WRCP). MD Neil Howard is going back to law school WHN/New York airman Bobby "Wizard" Wayne is out as 1-4 PM jock No replacement has been named ... LOOK AT THE BOOK: Happy to be able to report a few more success stories since last weeks report. Detroit's WDEE had one of their best books to date. It is hard to say whether the credit should be given to the former programming team of John Risher and Tom Collins, or to new PD Tom Allen. Allen came in the first week of the book, so it is not that easy to determine. WHK/Cleveland dropped in some areas, but remain stable for the most part. Our previous high was 10.8 in the Oct-Nov book.

I'm convinced the answer lies in the music mix and on-air promotion. We do very little outside promotion. All our efforts go toward eliminating tune-outs and getting listeners to stay around for longer periods.

By the way, we're the only daytimer in the market.
