REWRITE UPDATE

FCC Tells Van Deerlin What They Think

Six of seven FCC Commissioners including Chairman Charles Ferris told House Communications Subcommittee Chairman, Lionel Van Deerlin (D-CA), and his staff that over 40 years worth of broadcast rules and regulations based on the concept of "public interest, convenience and necessity" is better than their proposed new law.

Linked together, the testimonies of Commissioners James Quello, Abbott Washburn, Joe Fogarty, Margita White, and Tyrone Brown, in addition to Chairman Ferris, formed a wall of opposition to the bill. The commissioners appeared

on Tuesday (7-18) during the first day of hearings for the purpose of discussing general provisions within the bill, such as the creation of two new agencies to replace the FCC and the National Telecommunications and Information Agency. Their general consensus seemed to be that the current (Continued on page 12)

RSO "Peppers" Airwaves As Sales Mount

The soundtrack album to the film "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band" received extensive initial radio station support rivalling (or possibly surpassing) the excitement levels for Beatles albums and other blockbuster LP's of previous

eras. Tightly-formatted Top 40 stations joined with AOR outlets to preview several tracks from the LP, which features performances of Beatles tunes by the Bee Gees, Peter Frampton, Aerosmith, Earth Wind & Fire, Steve Martin, Billy Preston, and others. Several stations, including 96X/Miami and KHJ/Los Angeles, played the album in its entirety.

RSO Vice President of Promotion Rick Fitzgerald is understandably enthusiastic about the initial flurry of airplay, and is confident that the company can sustain airplay on a number of cuts. "What is happening," Fitzgerald commented to R&R, "is that about 95 percent of the major stations (Continued on page 20)

WIND Winds up P/A Format, Goes News/Talk

WIND/Chicago, a longtime Pop/ Adult outlet in the market, has announced an impending change to a News/Talk format in late September. The station will feature morning and afternoon news blocks (including sports and weather), and talk programs for the remainder of the broadcast day. Current air personalities Dave Baum, Clark Weber, and Chicago Eddie Schwarz will remain as talk show hosts, with other talk personalities being sought. The news department will also be expanded. Dave Graves, Program Manager of KDKA/ Pittsburgh, will take over similar duties at WIND, while current P.M. Allan Mitchell will maintain his present midday air shift until the changeover, and is seeking a new air position.

WIND Vice President/General Manager Robert J. Emery commented, "Our decision to provide News and Talk programming represents a logical and natural evolution for WIND... WIND will now be the only station in Chicago

offering listeners a combination of extensive news coverage and au-

programming."
Group W Broadcasting President Richard H. Harris added, "This move follows in a long tradition of pioneering in Group W radio, particularly in the areas of news and public affairs. WIND's News and Talk format will allow the station to better capitalize on its excellent staff and personalities to fulfill the needs of the community for such programming."

KDWB Appeals Simulcast Halt Order

KDWB-AM-FM/Minneapolis is appealing an FCC order to institute a 50 percent split in its current 100 percent simulcasted programming by July 24. KDWB, which acquired the former WYOO-FM in suburban Richfield for its FM in 1976, had been operating on a hardship exemption which allowed it to bypass the normal 25 percent simulcast limit; but its chief Top 40 competitor, KSTP, initiated a petition to deny KDWB's requested extension of the exemption to May 1979.

KSTP General Manager Jack Nugent told R&R, "I felt it was an unfair situation for a broadcast property to have two radio stations in one town broadcasting the same signal, and having their audiences (Continued on page 20)

FCC Sets Federal Political Candidate **Broadcast Rules**

The FCC has ruled that candidates for federal political offices must be given reasonable access to broadcast time, including prime

The agency added that licensees may not as a matter of policy flatly ban federal candidates from access to the types, lengths and classes of times they sell to commercial advertisers. Reasonable access must be provided to federal politicians at least during the 45 days before a primary and 60 days before a general or specific election.

educational Noncommercial broadcasters generally need not provide candidates with lengths of program time that are not a normal component of their broadcast days. The FCC also stated that noncommercial broadcasters may not reject a spot submitted by a candidate simply because it was originally prepared for a commercial station

While both educational and commercial broadcasters may suggest formats for candidates' appearances, a candidate may not be

CBS Records has effected a redesigning and expansion of its Nashville Marketing Department under the supervision of Vice President Rick Blackburn. Roy Wunsch has been appointed to the newly created position of Director of Marketing, CBS/Nashville; while Joe Casey becomes Director of Promotion. The FCC also revised its definition of a legally qualified political candidate for broadcast purposes: any person who has publicly announced his candidacy and is eligible to hold office, provided he has qualified for a place on the ballot or publicly committed himself to seek election by the write-in method.

The revisions also add the requirement that candidates seeking nomination by convention or any means other than a primary elec-(Continued on page 12)

KUPD Aims Legal Arrow At Arbitron

A temporary injunction sought by KUPD/Phoenix to prevent Arbritron from publishing its April/ May Phoenix market report without rating data for KUPD-AM&FM is due for a ruling early next week. KUPD has charged Arbitron with being a "monopolist" organization. The station's attorney, Phil Goldstein of the Goldstein, Flynn & Mason firm, told R&R: "Though they are not in the radio broadcasting industry per se, our charge was that they (Arbitron) controlled and regulated the competition amongst radio stations, at least in the Phoenix market, because of the commercial advertisers depending upon the ratings as a means of placing their advertisements. Therefore radio station contracts for rating services were termed a "contract of adhesion" by KUPD, a situation in which 'either you take it as is or you (Continued on page 20)

Arbitron To Reissue San Francisco Book

Arbitron has announced that the April/May 1978 San Francisco market report is "under review," with a reissue date to be set. "Most, if not all, of the changes," Arbitron states, "will affect KMEL-FM." KMEL figured in a reissue of the last San Francisco book as well, when diaries with entries for "KAML," originally credited to Beautiful Music station KABL, were reassigned to the Century AOR outlet.

"Junk" Phone Call Bill Not Targeted At Surveys

The Senatorial sponsor of a "junk phone call" bill, aimed at protecting against commercial phone solicitations, assured a survey research organization that the legislation was not aimed at call-out research. Sen. Wendell Anderson, speaking before a CASRO (Council of American Survey Research Organizations) meeting, stated that the bill's focus was to protect against invasion of privacy by "junk" calls, especially those made with automatic dialing equipment and recorded messages; and that the legislation could be modified to exempt survey research calls

Joyella Named CBS Radio VP

James A. Joyella has been appointed Vice President of CBS Radio Division. At the same time, he was named General Sales Manager for the CBS Radio Network, according to CBS Radio Division President Sam Cook Digges, who made the announcement

Network One To Buy Juarez Station, Boosting Power

Network One, Inc., a Las Vegas-based organization, has announced its acquisition of XEROK/ Juarez for about \$2 million with the transaction to be completed shortly. Once the new regime takes over, plans are to boost the station's power from 150,000 watts to 300,000 in order to reach an estimated 55 million people.

Sonderling WDAS Deal Off

Sonderling Broadcasting has terminated a previously announced agreement to acquire WDAS-AM-FM/Philadelphia. Conditions of the transaction allowed either party to withdraw from the deal if FCC approval was not granted within a specified time period, and Sonderling exercised that clause when FCC approval did not come through on time.

CPB Doubles Minority, Women's Training Funds

The Corporation for Public Broadcasting has announced plans to double the amount of funds available to public radio and TV stations for minority and women's training grants. About 160 grants are now expected to be awarded this year, with up to \$640,000 made available to try to spur minority and female employment

Storer Sets Second Quarter, First Half Profit Records

Storer Broadcasting reports record profits for the first half and second quarter of 1978. The first six months of the year saw gross income rising from \$58.1 million in the same period last year to \$69.8 million (a 20 percent increase), while net income went from \$5.8 million to \$7.9 million (about 36 percent up) Second quarter gross was \$40 million, compared to \$32.1 million last year, with profits up from \$3.8 million to \$5.5 million (45 percent).

Scripps-Howard Profits Up

Scripps-Howard Broadcasting reported increased six-month and second quarter profits for 1978, with sales up from \$23.8 million in last year's first six months to \$31.1 million this year, a 31 percent rise. Profits rose almost 30 percent from \$5.3 million to \$6.8 million. In second quarter figures, gross income was up from \$13 million to \$17.4 million, while net income increased from \$3.1 million to \$4.1 million

The Corporation For Public Broadcasting will create a radio station advisory service, with radio experts advising in varied areas of public radio concern. The pilot program, utilizing the services of 12 public radio staffers, offers to solve problems in engineering, development, operations licensee relations, and other areas. Interested public radio stations can contact the CPB at its Washington offices.

TV News

Cable Growth Stable, Now Serves 17 Percent Of TV Households

The Nielsen Station Index estimates that 17.4 percent of American TV households are served by cable TV now, a total of 12.7 million homes. That figure represents an increase of almost 8 percent over last year's May totals, as cable's capabilities continue to grow.

"America Tonight" the satirical talk show which derived much of its humor from its low-budget atmosphere, has been cancelled by T.A.T. Communications because of, ironically, its high cost. The spoof, starring Martin Mull, Fred Willard, and Frank "Happy Kyne" DeVol, was performing reasonably well in ratings and had, according to T.A.T., generally excellent renewal prospects; but it was not generating high enough ratings to draw dollars to offset its high production costs. The show's relatively narrow appeal (chiefly to 18-34 men, says T.A.T.) was also a factor in the cancellation decision. The last episode aired July 7.

CBS Wins Second Straight Week As Viewers Vanish

Summer rating totals continued down, as CBS won a lethargic Nielsen race for the week ending July 9, with its 14.0 average rating beating NBC's 13.3 and ABC's 13.1. The number one and three ranked shows, CBS's "Alice" and NBC's "Columbo" repeat, ran against each other on Sunday (7-9), in an unusual situation. Number two was CBS's "One Day At A Time," with fourth position going to CBS's "MASH," followed by 5) "Switch" (CBS) 6) "All In The Family" (CBS) 7) "Starsky & Hutch" (ABC) 8) "Fantasy Island" (ABC) 9) "Quincy" (NBC) and 10) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC).

CBS had a good week in Arbitron's New York/Los Angeles survey ending July 7, edging ABC in New York and splitting 10 of the 11 places (counting ties) in Los Angeles. NBC placed one show in L.A.'s top ten, and none in New York. A three-way tie for New York's top program featured CBS's "MASH" and "One Day At A Time" and ABC's "Starsky & Hutch." Following were 4) "Good Times" (CBS) 5) a tie between ABC's "Charlie's Angels" and CBS's "Jeffersons" 7) "Fantasy Island" (ABC), and tied for 8th, CBS's "All In The Family" and "Switch" with ABC's "Love Boat" and "Three's Company

In Los Angeles, "All In The Family" tied for first with "Charlie's Angels" and "Starsky & Hutch." Next came 4) "Alice" (CBS) 5) "MASH" 6) ABC's "Barney Miller" tied with "One Day At A Time" and "Switch," and 9) a tie between ABC's "What's Happening" and "Fantasy Island" and NBC's





Theater operators in multilingual neighborhoods are expressing considerable interest, while the improved overall sound quality has perked interest in drive-in owners in general.

Mosses Gather First Nevada Broadcasting School

Pete and Terry Moss have formed the first commercial radio broadcasting vocational school in the state of Nevada, receiving official approval last week. The school provides instruction in Jock, news, and production techniques. Pete Moss is currently an air personality at KDWN/Las Vegas, while Terry recently was an engineer at KFOX/Long Beach until relocating to Las Vegas to found the school.

Molloy Promoted To VP at 20th

Frank Molloy has been promoted to Vice President of Business Affairs at 20th Century-Fox Records. Molloy's duties will include the monitoring of record company affairs and the processing and coordinating of artist contracts. A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania Law School, Molloy Joined the company last January as Director of Business Affairs.

Nashville Production Firm Plans "Disc Jockey" Film

A Nashville film production firm, **Deaton-Pittman Ltd.**, has scheduled a movie called "Disc Jockey," a drama covering the existence of air personalities in a rural Southern Country station, with frequent musical interludes. If the idea seems to have more than a little "FM" in it, the country music focus should provide a contrast, and the company is seeking top-name country stars to perform. A soundtrack LP is planned for the firm's **DPL** label; shooting starts in August. The company then plans a musical and then a story about a Nashville entertainer.

Hawaiians Eye ASCAP Monitoring Formula

A suit has been filed by the head of the Hawatian Professional Songwriters Society against ASCAP, charging discrimination against Hawatian composers. The action, filed by "Hawatian Wedding Song" co-composer Sol Bright, alleges that ASCAP's monitoring formula in Hawati has caused Hawatian songwriters to receive less than their fair shares of royalties. It asks that a complete accounting of all Hawatian funds collected by ASCAP be made, and seeks a fair share of that amount plus \$3 million in punitive damages.



WASHINGTON REPORT

Update

by Jonathan Hall

Rewrite Q & A

Possibly the most colorful moment during a Q&A session following testimony presented by six of seven FCC commissioners on the occasion of the first day of the House Communications Subcommittee's hearings on a proposed new Communications Law (see cover story), came when Chairman Charles Ferris blushed. The momentarily red-faced Ferris had just been asked by Subcommittee Chairman Lionel Van Deerlin (D-Cal) to comment on a provision in his bill that would cut back to five the number of stations a group could own after grandfathering existing groups.

Chairman Ferris had replied that he would leave that decision to the wisdom of Congress to which Van Deerlin called his response a "cop-out." After a pause, Ferris offered a more definitive answer stating that he would welcome greater diversity in ownership. Commissioners Brown and Quello also voiced support for the idea, with Quello observing that it is "about as fair and equitable a means as possible if divesture is a directive." Van Deerlin added that the plan to limit group ownership seemed consistent with current FCC and court decisions.

Regarding a recent FCC action fining WMAL/Washington, D.C. \$5000 for logging violations (R&R 7/7 & 7/14) the Subcommittee's minority counsel, Toby Harder, wanted to know in what manner the public was served by the fine. Chairman Ferris stated that the station had admitted guilt and that not to have fined them would have broken with Commission precedent. He also felt that the action might lead the FCC to require that station logs reflect the actual time spots are aired, adding that such a rule would probably show that this information is needed in order to adequately invoice clients, Commissioner Quello, clearly in the minority on this issue made a plea for allowing the marketplace to determine the extent of a station's commercialization. As an example, he cited WMAL's failure to log lead-ins and outros of commercials during the most popular radio show in the market. He further alluded to a situation in his old home town of Detroit where he managed WJR - in which the number one rocker in the market, with 16 minutes of commercials per hour, sank to third place when a competing rocker began airing only 6 commercial minutes per hour. Commissioner White stressed that this was a prime example of a rule that is hard to strike from the books and stated that she would welcome relief in this area from Congress.

Finally, ending the three-and-a-half hour session on a note of fun. Cong. Van Deerlin questioned an Office of Management and Budget (OMB) finding that the FCC requires more paperwork from those it regulates than any other government agency. He noted that the amount totals more than 18 and a half million hours of imposed regulation. There was no audible response.

Community Ascertainment

"It's like returning to 1973," said an FCC source, "when it was up to broadcasters to list social and economic groups to ascertain in their community." In 1976, the FCC came up with its own list of 19 specific categories for use in ascertainment plus a 20th called "Other" which broadcasters, if they wanted, could use to list other active organizations. Now, if a proposed Commission rule is adopted after time is given for comments and reply comments, the 20th category would become a mandatory "catch-all" (grouping) for all other significant organizations, such as gays and the handicapped (in another rulemaking proceeding, the Commission proposes including the handicapped in its list of minorities)

Language is still being constructed, but it looks as though the Commissions's proposal will require broadcasters to seek out these groups, while noting that these groups have at least a coequal responsibility to make their identity known to broadcasters. The action resulted from a petition from the National Gay Task Force seeking to become the 20th category. Although they did not get all they wanted, the Gay Task Force noted that the FCC rule would "establish clearly that gays are part of the public that broadcasters are licensed to serve."

FCC In Minority Key

FCC demonstrates full intention to expedite operations of minorities by granting two requests, to speed things along. In one respect, RFC Partners, licensee of KXEW, a Tuscon daytimer, is requesting to move to South Tucson and add nightime coverage to almost 110,000 Mexican-Americans. In another, 1. Joseph Bahr, also a minority, is applying for a daytimer at Frederiksted, St. Croix, Virgin Is. In both instances the Commission said that it would have taken almost a year before they could study the applications, but they will now be given immediate attention.

NAB Crossownership Committee Concludes Work

Based on Supreme Court action upholding the FCC's original cross-ownership ruling forcing divestiture of either a newspaper or one of 17 radio and TV stations, NAB's Working Group on Media Structure and Service met earlier this week and decided to ask the FCC not to enforce their ruling, pending the results of attempt to rewrite the Communications Act of 1934. Lee Loevinger, NAB's special counsel, and partner of the Washington law firm Hogan & Hartson, said that after eight years of legal proceedings and costs of \$440,000, of which NAB contributed \$100,000, "asking the Commission to wait is the most realistic thing we can do." When asked if he represents any of the stations involved, Loevinger replied "No" and declined to offer any recommendations for them.

According to NAB Research VP John Dimling the majority of costs went for research projects — for example, history of crossownership, study of rates, analysis of news — which demonstrated no pattern of abuses on part of licensees involved. The committee noted in a release that "it is wrong for the FCC to deny a license to a broadcaster who the Commission previously found qualified to hold a license, without regard to how the broadcaster has served the community."

Case For Ma Bell's Ads

Should large corporations like AT&T and the associated Bell System companies charge their customers higher rates in order to pay for their corporate advertising? Most consumers worried about rising household costs would probably say "no." On the other hand, the NAB in a legal brief filed with the FCC defending AT&T and Bell, makes three points in support of current ratemaking practices. NAB contends that 1) Corporate advertising is a legitimate operating expense, 2) restricting institutional advertising violates the First Amendment, and 3) the FCC should not be in the business of distinguishing types of advertising.

Last year, the FCC after lengthy investigation upheld the practice, but recently decided to take another look citing the Federal Power Commission and the Civil Aeronautics Board as two examples of federal agencies which allow companies they regulate to include corporate type

ads in their operating expenses.

NAB General Counsel Erwin Krasnow, and Brenda Fox, Asst. General Counsel, state that the Commission's "adoption of distinctions among types of advertising for ratemaking purposes would necessarily plunge the Commission into an undesirable role as 'chancellor of advertising content' to determine the appropriate categorizations of advertising expenditures."

FTC Actions

Mutual Broadcasting's parent, Amway Corporation, whose sales for fiscal '77 exceeded \$375 million, was found innocent of all FTC charges against it except resale price maintainence, a form of price fixing which Amway says it doesn't do anyway. However, the FTC staff is planning to appeal the decision of one of its law judges to its full commission.

Also, the FTC cleared Coca-Cola of New York's way to keep Franzia wines. This action brings to close a four year FTC complaint challenging Coke's Franzia acquisition, which made it the third largest U.S. wine producer. Coke's other wine labels are Mogen David and Tribuno.

It is very possible that now the advertiser and the ad agency can be held responsible for deceptive advertising if the FTC gets its way. In action against J. Walter Thompson involving deceptive Sears dishwasher ads, the Commission stated that "the liability of an advertising agency for deceptive and unfair advertising depends on the extent to which the agency participated in the deception." In this case, JWT was extensively involved in developing the ad themes, preparing the layout, and writing the copy. FTC Action on the JWT-Sears case is slated for October 16th.

Convention Mania

Got some extra vacation time and few bucks left in ye old budget? In addition to a host of state association summer meetings, the following major conventions are happening:

Sept. 17-20: National Radio Broadcasters Association, Hyatt Regency Embarcadero, San Francisco. The NRBA has completely sold out its convention space with 147 booths, 75 exhibitors, and 56 hospitality suites. We'll have program details soon.

Sept. 20-22: Radio/TV News Directors Association, Atlanta Hilton, Atlanta. Harry Reasoner is the keynoter and NBC's Bill Monroe will

commission is already moving in a
direction consistent with the goals
of the bill; i.e., greater reliance on
the marketplace forces, elimination of unnecessary areas of Commission regulation, and greater
public participation in communications policy making. What Chairman Ferris suggested is to move
the Commission "ahead to revitalize the present regulatory scheme
to the extent we can under the 1934
Act."

Echoing the sentiments of the Chairman, many of the commissioners strongly endorsed: 1) retaining regulatory policy-making within an agency with close Congressional ties (as opposed to creating a new agency more responsible to the Executive Branch of government), 2) more participation in policy inquiries from the public (even if that means reimbursing them for their travel and time, a proposal that FCC is weighing), 3) retaining the current length of term for commissioners, and 4) creating of a Consumer Assistance Bureau with broader responsibilities. Also several commissioners applauded the bill's provisions to upgrade and increase the commissioners's staffs prompting more than one commissioner to include a request for a raise.

tion make a "subtantial showing" of bona fide candidacy that would exclude those seeking equal opportunities and other benefits merely by stating they are candidates.

No person would be considered a legally qualified candidate to any public office, except for President or Vice-President, by means of a convention or caucus, prior to 90 days before the beginning of the convention.

Advertiser Discounts Extended

The commission also stated that a candidate could not be charged any more than the rate a station would charge if the candidate were an advertiser whose commercials were directed at promoting his business, adding that all discount privileges a station offered commercial advertisers must be equally available to all political candidates.



New Developments In Needles

As recording techniques become increasingly sophisticated, manufacturers of stereo equipment must keep pace. Recent developments in the design of the stylus (needle) not only make possible an unprecedented quality of sound reproduction, especially in the higher frequencies, but also prolong the life of records by reducing the amount of wear caused while playing the record.

Consider that when a record is played, the diamond stylus is bearing down on the onemil (one-thousandth inch) gap between the record's grooves at over 50,000 pounds per square inch of pressure, and that shrill musical passages can subject the stylus to acceleration forces of 2000 G's (hundreds of more evenly in the groove and are thus capable of reproducing ultrasonic (up to 45kHz) signals without causing excessive

Currently, there are several variations of the long-contact styli on the market. Some experts believe that the long-contact styli are too long, causing them to reproduce dirt buried deep in the grooves as original information, thereby increasing noise and distortion. Therefore, manufacturers have adopted designs incorporating the advantages of the elliptical styli with those of the long-contact. For example, ADC has lengthened the vertical contact surface of its new ZLM elliptical stylus 100 percent, calling the



times greater than a rifle bullet's). Furthermore, abrupt contact between the stylus and the disc can generate temperatures in excess of 2000 degrees Fahrenheit.

In order to combat these adverse conditions, stylus shapes continue to evolve. The oldest, spherical or conical styli, feature a circular cross section, and require greater tracking forces (resulting in greater wear). In addition, spherical styli do not reproduce higher frequencies as well as the newer elliptical or biradial styli. Elliptical styli deliver high-frequency sounds with far less distortion due to their narrower side dimension - 0.2- to 0.4-mil as compared to 0.7 for the spherical styli. However, the latest advances have come in the form of longcontact styli, which were originally developed for quadraphonic records. Long-contact styli gain efficiency by distributing pressure

design the Aliptic. Stanton employs a similar design under the name Sterohedon.

Shure utilizes a hyperbola-shaped tip design which Shure refers to as Hyperelliptical. This particular stylus boasts a contact area even longer than the standard elliptical cartridges, providing a narrower but longer tracking surface. Shure has conducted tests which have demonstrated that the Hyperelliptical design produces less distortion than spherical, biradial or earlier Shure long-contact tips.

In conclusion, it seems apparent that radio stations (or anyone who gives their sound system a real workout) should keep abreast of these technical advances both for the longevity of their records and for their increased listening pleasure. You might say it's a sound idea.

Another exciting week at the new R&R offices in Smog Angeles.,.it's always fun to get calls from excited Managers and Programmers raving about their strengthened ARB results. Congrats to John Lander and his WLCY/Tampa crew on a fine showing, likewise to KIMN/Denver, WKBW/Buffalo (stronger than before in their dominance of Buffalo!), Q-102/Cincinnati, WNCI/Columbus, OH., WAKY/Louisville, WHBQ/Memphis, KBEQ/Kansas City, and all the other winners! It's continuing to be a good spring sweep for many of our Top 40 reporters and I share the enthusiasm that is keeping Top 40 radio alive and well all around the country.

This week, as promised, a look at the Seattle marketplace in reference to the longer ARB they recently completed and the promotions that took place during that marathon book.

A call from John Gehron, Program Director of WLS/Chicago, reminded me that big contests are still very much a part of the daily programming of that station. I covered the 44 car give-away that WLS ran this Spring and John stated that, although he agrees that contests have somewhat slipped into the background of overall station programming (music taking the spotlight), he still feels the "big contest" is valuable tool that the large market AM stations can use in the face of lower-budgeted FM competition. I agree.

Seattle's 90 Days Of Spring

Last week we took a look at big contests and how their influence and use within Top 40 radio has diminished. The giant giveaways that used to dominate a station's programming are not being aired with the same emphasis that they were a year or two ago.

A market that has seen several large contests in recent weeks is Seattle, and the reason could be related to Seattle's first ever 90-day Arbitron. The experimental "long book" being tried in both New Orleans and Seattle ran from April 6 through June 28. During the lengthy survey period, monthly reports were issued which contained somewhat abridged information on how the stations had fared in each month of the study. The second monthly report averaged the first two months together and the final report, due sometime in July, will of course average all three months together for a complete rating picture.

The Top 40 battle in Seattle has been a hot one with KJR and KING, two AM stations with strong staffs and considerable promotion budgets, slugging it out for every listener. Steve West, Program Director of KJR, commented on the longer ARB, "I like it. It gets rid of some of the hype. I have felt no pressure at all through this book, which is not usual."

Rob Conrad Program Director of KING is more cautious, "I'd like to see how the whole thing comes together before I make a decision. I think I'll like it; I think it'll be something that in the long run will be good. I certainly think it will give a better reflection of what stations are really doing year-round."

Now, if you're a Program Director faced with your first extended rating period, what do you do promotionally? Even in the face of the government's threats regarding "hyping" stations have still saved their "best" promotions for the ratings. They may have evened out the amounts of money given away throughout the entire year, but the stronger contest ideas have generally been "saved" for those twice yearly sweeps. Seattle has been no exception to that rule, but the 90-day rating period posed a new problem for both KING and KJR.

Steve West commented, "Whereas normally we would have done one major promotion in the spring, we actually did three separate phases this time." KJR began with a "Suzukia-day-giveaway" for three weeks, followed with a reprise of their highly successful Fall promotion "The \$10,000 Cash Stash," and finally opened up their annual window-sticker promotion.

Across the street at KING, Rob Conrad also pulled out the stops: "We did a lot of promoting for the entire (12-week) period, as did everyone else in the market." The first contest was the "Murdock-in-the-morning Is Missing" with a grand prize totalling well over \$11,000. "As soon as the Murdock thing ended, we went into a game we called 'Telefun' which ran through the remainder of the book and offered cash prizes as high as \$1,111."

I asked both program directors if they felt contests helped them, in light of John Rook's comments last week, and I got very interesting answers. First, Steve West, "Contests no, games yes! My feeling about a game is that it's something that you've got to be really mentally involved in. It's not just 'a chance to win,' it's something that you really have to follow. Our 'Cash Stash' contest was structured in such a way that even listeners who weren't actually entered got mentally involved. They heard the clues and the guesses and they had to become involved. The awareness ratio within the market was very high and that's all I'm really trying to do with a promotion is acquaint more people with the radio station."

Rob Conrad responded to the "do contests help?" question, "I think that contests are good, but the 'giant contest' may be fading out of this market too. As far as this fall (Seattle will undergo another 90-day sweep in the fall), I'm unsure which avenue we're going to follow right now. I don't know if we're going to go for another big one or do something more low key."

Commenting on West's point of "games versus contests" Conrad agreed, "That's a very good point and I think this market likes those kind of games...where people try to figure out where Murdock-in-the-morning is hiding, or trying to determine where the \$10,000 is (KJR's Cash Stash). It's in their minds. They may not enter the contest, but they do play along in their mind."

Rob also agreed with last week's comments on the amount of prizes offered in a contest, "I think the key is having a big prize as 'the apple' and then lots of chances to have many people win something smaller along the way. I think listeners feel they'll have a good chance of winning the smaller prizes and perhaps even have a shot at the big one."

So both KJR and KING used major promotions in this, the first of Seattle's extended ARB survey periods. The longer ratings may help to solve the problems some markets have experienced with the twice-yearly books differing widely in results. But at the same time these longer books may further diminish the importance of the big contest as a programming tool. It will be very interesting to see the results of the 90-day Arbitrons in both Seattle and New Orleans and equally interesting to see what promotions surface during the next long rating in the Fall. Thanks to both Steve West and Rob Conrad for sharing their thoughts and comments.

Music Update

Here we go again with another pronunciation problem and here comes the final final word on how to pronounce Chris Rea's last name. Now since Chris is from England (by way of Scotland) the true pronunciation should be "ray", but, if you ask Chris himself, which we did, he says his last name is to be pronounced "ree-ah." Since it is his last name let's go with a winner and make it "ree-ah."

Notice that the only cut on the new "Sgt. Pepper" soundtrack album that wasn't produced by George Martin is "Got To Get You Into My Life" by Earth, Wind & Fire? Even Aerosmith producer Jack Douglas shared producing credits with Martin on "Come Together." But not Maurice White, no way!

Exile, those six guys that want to "Kiss You All Over," are indeed the same Exile that was produced by Tommy James ("Crimson & Clover", the definitive Leslie Cabinet song!) a few years back and released on Columbia Records. The group has remained intact and with new producer Mike Chapman have released a new album and the current single on Warner Bros.

Steve Martin's long awaited follow-up to his Grammy winner "Let's Get Small" should be out within a few months. Some time before Halloween... I wonder if that means anything?

Did you notice that Kenny Loggins's new "Nightwatch" album contains a cut performed with guest vocalist Stevie Nicks? The song is called "Whenever I Call You Friend."

I guess MCA got the message from AM radio. They have edited and released a version of Steely Dan "FM (No Static At All)" with no FM at all! Two guitar strums from the "FM Reprise" (also on the FM Soundtrack) have replaced the vocal "FM" and the result is a new song called "No Static At All." The song is not recommended for AM airplay during severe electrical storms in your coverage area.

Isn't the "Love Theme From 'Eyes of Laura Mars' (Prisoner)" the same song released a while ago by a group called the L.A. Jets? Yes, it is, but of course in that earlier version it was entitled simply "Prisoner." The version in current release by Barbra Streisand has been retitled for the movie soundtrack from which it comes.





have come in with 1-6 tracks reported." Fitzgerald pointed out that the general opening of the film itself in 400 theatres nationwide is likely to keep the excitement level high and encourage continued extensive radio airplay.

Fitzgerald noted that a wide variety of tracks were being programmed, and added that the company would follow the same general game plan for future singles as was used for the "Saturday Night Fever" and "Grease" soundtracks, using radio to determine consensus cuts. "We're going to let radio force the singles out, and tell us what they want." He pointed out that Columbia has already released Earth Wind & Fire's track as a single, and may follow with Aerosmith's; while A&M could release Billy Preston and Frampton tracks and Warners might issue Steve Martin's, all of which would congest the "Sgt. Pepper" singles situation. Fitzgerald said that at this time RSO was leaning towards Barry Gibb's performance of "A Day In The Life" or Robin Gibb's "Oh Darling" as a first single.

Meanwhile, the fourth single from the "Grease" soundtrack, a duet performance of "Summer Nights" by John Travolta and Olivia Newton-John, has been released, joining the previous Travolta/ Newton-John duet and solo performances by Frankie Valli and Olivia on the singles market. "Grease" has sold five million units, according to RSO, while "Sgt. Pepper has exceeded four million shipped. RSO's success continues with notification of their third and fourth platinum single awards for the year, Travolta / Newton - John's 'You're The One That I Want'' and Andy Gibb's "Shadow Dancing" (the Bee Gees' "Stayin" Alive" and "Night Fever" hit the 2million sales plateau earlier in

There was even a report that Central Avenue (the main drag for all kids on weekends) experienced incredible traffic jams as people simply stopped in the middle of the street and nailed their car horns for more than the one minute we asked for. I along with every other employee here had no idea that the reaction to our going off the air would be so overwhelming. Our little parking lot had more than a hundred cars (listeners) crammed into it with all horns at full volume.

Although I was handling the afternoon drive shift, on our final nite I took the 9pm-11pm shift and PD Chuck Dean did the last hour. I was never more nervous in my entire life as I was during that 2 hour shift. When the shift did end, I felt as though I had been on for 12 hours . . . exhausted.

Unfortunately, there is no way to describe the patronage of the people of Phoenix on that final nite. What I'm getting at, is the fact that I have worked with many

additive" (in the rating results). "It was at a point where it had to be challenged," Nugent continued, referring to KDWB's 100 simulcasting. "It was totally unnecessary. It didn't serve the purpose for which the station (WYOO-FM) was acquired, which was to bring another service to the community"

The FCC ordered a 50 percent programming split by July 24, followed by, according to Nugent, a further reduction to the 25 percent simulcast level in May 1979. KDWB, However, readies an appeal. Lou Buron, General Manager of the Doubleday station, told R&R, "We're simulcasting 100 percent of the time now and we're going to continue. We will not be splitting in July. There has been an order from the FCC, but we are appealing it. KDWB is proceeding with plans to construct a new tower for the FM atop a downtown Minneapolis building, originally scheduled for August 1976 completion but plagued by permit problems. The tower is intended to improve KDWB-FM's signal considerably. A decision on KDWR's appeal is expected shortly

End Of An Experiment

For the past five years, WXRT/Chicago has gained an industry-wide reputation for its unorthodox approach to commercials: the station has refused to run any spots that were not produced in-house (by its own announcers). Now that policy has changed, and WXRT General Manager Seth Mason explains why: "The original idea, as envisioned by PD John Platt and myself, was to take a fine arts approach to our advertising and apply it to a Pro-

gressive AOR station. For nonmusic advertisers that meant live copy. For any spot incorporating music, we produced a bed or a donut for the guy on the air to read over, which could even be structured to include lines from a movie if it were a film spot, for instance. But it was still all read live by the guy on the air, giving the show a real consistency; almost a classical station feel.

"The first modification of that policy came about five months ago. We began to realize how much of a burden so much live programming could be on the jock. He would finish a set of music, back-announce the set, do all the spots and PSAs, and then get back into the music. It was a lot of work! We decided to try having one of our jocks record the one spot per break that was music-oriented. This allowed us to maintain the basic overall air sound and at the same time give the guys a break while having a little tighten used delivery. We lead to

while having a little tighter vocal delivery. We lost some of the spontaniety on the one hand but on the other hand there was less stepping over vocals on the music bed. We found the audience responded pretty well to this."

Mason continues, "Partially, the phasing in of that prerecorded material was done knowing that three or four months down the road we would start easing in some prerecorded material that was not produced here. It came down to economics, we had fought a five-year battle with some advertisers who really couldn't consider running commercials other than ones agencies had produced for them. The agency spot process calls for a certain chain of events: it is geared to a mass-level acceptance; it calls for the approval of a legal department; the approval of the client; the finished product. Once that finished product is delivered, many clients and agencies would find the idea of modifying these spots as prohibitively costly, and therefore wouldn't even consider doing so for us. Over the years, WXRT has run stationproduced spots for large companies like Coke, Seven-Up, and such, mostly as sponsorship ads for special programming we carry, and these clients have been entirely happy with this approach. But on a national level, we came to the conclusion that it's unrealistic to expect the majority of national business to be able to consider our approach to their advertising. And realistically, we have to have the dollars flowing in to keep up an award-winning news staff and to adequately compensate an airstaff who have been with us, in some cases, for four or five years now. "We could have continued the same advertising policy but would then have had to alter our musical choices to attract a wider audience and greater ratings, in order to demand more money for commercial time. We felt that the approximately fiftytwo minutes of music we run per hour is the most important aspect contributing to WXRT's success. So what we decided to do is run six out of nine units per hour of material produced in-house, meaning two out of three units in a break. The other unit would be a prerecorded spot from a company that would subscribe to our basic rule of thumb: that the spots don't sound so out of character on the station that they would blow away the audience. Nor do we allow any other Chicago area jock's voice to air on the station. We are looking for spots which sound as natural as they would were we to record them. Since beginning the new policy some two months ago, we have attracted new clients like Toyota and Levi-Strauss. Now that they know they can run selected prerecorded material, they are happy to buy the station. On the other hand, it's interesting to note that not one of our major advertisers like Coke or Seven-Up, whose spots were being run live and who were given the option of running their prerecorded material, have gone that route. We have proved to them over the years that we can do the job for them just as well ourselves."

As Mason explains, listeners were quick to pick up on the difference in the station's air-sound when the prerecorded commercials were aired. "For the first few weeks of the new commercial policy," Mason says, "I instructed the receptionist to put all calls through to me that were responding to the prerecorded spots. I wanted to find out whether my gut feeling was correct: that if we maintained our progressive musical commitment, the people would stay with us. The less realistic people who called, who don't understand that radio is business, were quick to yell 'sell-out.' Others were surprised to hear that we were in an economic situation which, in order to grow, demanded the changeover. The bottom line, after explaining to these people what necessitated the change, is that they agreed it was better to give up three minutes an hour of airtime to outside sources in order to maintain our progressive musical stance."

In assessing the station's attempt to retain creative control over their commercial content, Mason says, "I'd have to say that realistically for a market this size at this time it was too idealistic. On the other hand, if I were in control of a market ratings-wise, really had it sewn up as WMMS does in Cleveland for instance, I would try it again. I would want my Album-Oriented Rock station also to have Album-Oriented Commercials. The trouble is that it's harder to go from accepting prerecorded spots to refusing them than it is to go the route we

have; you'd have an enormous sponsor backlash to deal with. So it's not an easy idea to set into motion."

Mason notes, "I realize that it's probably going to disappoint some stations around the country to hear we have adopted this new policy when they looked to us as leaders in some grand experiment. On the other hand, our new commercial stance will allow us to maintain our eclectic brand of AOR radio, playing jazz, blues and classical music in addition to rock. That's what we found our listeners like about WXRT, and we made this decision so that this programming policy could continue."

The incoming ratings books included a tremendous showing from KLBJ/Austin, who went from an overall 12-plus 6.1 a year ago to an incredible 13.9 this book. PD Steve Smith attributes the ratings leap to several factors: For one the station has no direct AOR competitor in the Austin market, so they are in a unique position to experiment with their format. The station has found a more progressive AOR stance to work to their favor, allowing its jocks to pick their own music based on Smith's hand-picked library. Above all, he feels the station did well because it has been an AOR in the marketplace for years now, taking time to build a reputation with the listening community. A tip of the AOR hat to Smith and his hard-working crew for their AOR coup. Also faring very well this time round were WKDF/Nashville, with new PD Alan Sneed showing his programming muscle; WZXR/Memphis, with PD Tom Owens grabbing a good share of the market place; and KY 102/Kansas City, were PD Max Floyd and the boys showed a healthy increase.

Evolution

KLBJ/Auston PS Steve Smith is leaving the station for a position with a L.A. trade paper . . . David Souza has left as PD at ZETA 4/Miami, citing philosophical disagreements with management. Souza will annouce his new plans shortly . . New to the programming helm at WBNB/Cumberland, R.I. is Phil Zachary . . . John Brodey is leaving as MD and jock at WBCN after an incredible nine year stay with the station to enter album promotion for Casablanca. Brodey is an AOR pioneer and longtime friend to R&R, and we wish him the very best at his new job on the other side of the radio fence. Meantime, recent WBCN newcomer Tony Berardini has been named the station's new MD. Good luck, Tony . . . KSAN/San Francisco air personality Norman Davis has exited the station . . Suzy Peters has been named fulltime overnighter at M105/Cleveland, replacing the departed Eric Lawrence. New to weekends at the station is Jim Zura . . . On the air at WDIZ/Orlando is newcomer Dick Bascomb, from WORJ, and Mike Cooper from WFSO/Tampa . . . WSIM/Chattanooga reports the following changes: evening air personality Chuck Wilkins and account exec Hank McCann have left to enter the night club business locally. Weekender and promotion director Joe Sokohl has also left to manage an area group . . New as promotion director at I 95/Bridgeport is Pam Brooks. Joining the stations's night-time airstaff is Paul Guthrie, from WCMF/Rochester . . Veteran Top 40 programmer Chuck Dunaway has been named National Album Promotion Director at EMI America. Best of luck to Chuck in his new field of endeavor.

KZEW/Dallas provided full audio coverage of the Texas Jam, a rock festival held in early July that gathered over 80,000 Southern rock fans to the Cotton Bowl. Since the show sold out, KZEW was able to broadcast groups like Aerosmith, Journey, Ted Nugent and ARS live. The station also carried interviews with most of the major artists, making for a day's worth of exciting programming . . . KMET/Los Angeles had a real exclusive for their listeners last week when they broadcast the sold-out Bruce Springsteen appearance at the 500-seat Roxy nightclub. Air personality Bob Coburn hosted backstage comments between sets of the three hour-plus show . . .
