IS "NIGGER" A DIRTY WORD ?

FCC's Hands Tied In Racist Candidate Ad Case

The FCC found itself in the middle of a heated political/race relations controversy last week, but by its own admission was powerless to act. a situation which generated even more controversy. The Atlanta NAACP dispatched a telegram to the FCC protesting paid political announcements by gubernatorial candidate J.B. Stoner on Georgia TV which said in part, "If Gov. Bushee is reelected, he will pass more civil rights that take from the whites and give to the niggers. Julian Bond of the NAACP stated. "The word in question is offensive and obscene to at least one-fourth of Georgia's population and quite probably the others as well," and asked that "nigger" be added to the FCC's list of "seven dirty words" deemed unsuitable for broadcast in the aftermath of the George Carlin/WBAI case

Candidate To Recite "Seven Dirty Words"

FCC Fairness in Political Broadcasting Division Chief Milton Gross said that the FCC could not censor political broadcasts unless there was a "clear and present danger of inciting to violence." Gross explained, "Once the station agrees to sell him time, it has no choice over the contents of his message." He added that the Commission would inform Bond that nothing could be done by the FCC about Stoner's commercials.

Bond in turn ironically declared that if the FCC would not halt

Stoner's broadcasts, that the NAACP would buy broadcast time for a candidate who would recite

the "seven dirty words," a course of action which would place the FCC in a rather touchy situation.

Police Ask Radio's Help To Solve Mass Murder

Oklahoma City police are asking radio stations for their help in solving the brutal murder of six persons who were shot to death in an Oklahoma City steak house Sunday night (7/16). Although there were no witnesses to the crime, a man driving along the road to the restaurant was run off the road by a car around that time. The man was so shocked by being run off the road that he developed a memory blank. Under hypnosis, all he could recall was that the car that ran him off the road was a green Oldsmobile Vistacruiser and that his radio was playing "Three Times A Lady" by the Commodores.

So far, the police have determined that the man was not listening to an Oklahoma City radio station because on Sunday night, all local stations offer religious or talk programming and that it was an AM station because the man did not have a FM unit in his car.

Radio Plays A Key Role

What the police want to know is which stations with nighttime signals that penetrate into Oklahoma City were playing the Commodores record and, if they have music logs, do they have a record

of playing the song between 10:25 and 11pm Central Time on the night of July 16. One possible station mentioned was powerful border rocker XEROK/Juarez, Mexico but police have no definite station identification yet.

There are two reasons for the police's asking radio's help: first, to prove the accuracy of the man's hypnotic recall; and, most importantly, to establish the time of the Oldsmobile's presence in the area.

Meanwhile, a second witness has reported spotting the Olds during the abovementioned time period while hearing "Mandy" by Barry Manilow on the radio. In addition, the police mentioned the possibility that the record originally in question may have been Meat Loaf's "Two Out Of Three Ain't Bad" instead of the Commodores.

Courts Urged To Uphold Broadcasters First Amendment Rights

Two separate courts have been asked by broadcasters this week to support their First Amendment rights. In one action, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit is deciding whether or not to rule in favor of an FCC decision permitting radio broadcasters to change formats using their own discretion

based upon marketplace forces and competition. The court has been asked by various citizens' groups, including the WNCN Listeners Guild of New York City, to overturn the FCC ruling.

Arbitron Puts KUPD In Supplement; Station Set To Sue

Arbitron will publish its Phoenix market rating report without listing KUPD, while adding a special separately-bound supplement listing only KUPD's audience estimates with a warning that "potentially distortive" contest activity caused the separate listing. The station, meanwhile, has informed R&R of its firm intent to sue Arbitron for damages as a result of the delisting action. Last week a judge ruled that Arbitron could delist KUPD as a result of its "Uncontest" promotion, which Arbitron had determined was dis-

Expanding on KUPD's decision to go ahead with their legal action, station General Manager and legal counsel Barry Leverant stated, "This action, we believe, will set a precedent in broadcasting that will benefit all radio stations." The station has formally requested that Arbitron supply all diaries used in the Phoenix April/May 1978 survey, plus all

out-of-tab (unused) diaries, believed by KUPD to set a precedent (Arbitron has never permitted examination of out-of-tab diaries). KUPD has also requested all Arbitron's records pertaining to the four-man committee which determined that the "Uncontest" was distortive.

KUPD Protests "Gag Order"

According to Leverant, Arbitron proposed an agreement last Tuesday (7-25) for the supplemental listing, which would allow a position statement by KUPD defending their contest to be published with the supplement. However. KUPD objected to Arbitron's insistence that the station drop all legal action and enter into a "confidentiality" agreement whereby KUPD's statements to the media would be "limited to the reiteration of ... information published in the Supplement or the Policy Statement." Leverant termed these provisions

a violation of "KUPD's right to free speech, as we would in effect

agree to a 'gag order.' " According to Arbitron, reports are at the printer," containing the supplemental KUPD listing. The rating company is prepared to follow through with its delisting plan. KUPD also seems determined to take the case to the limit. As the station declares in its position statement: "The ruling of the Superior Court . . . was limited to a denial of a preliminary injunction. The question of whether the 'Uncontest' could have resulted in diary distortion will be litigated before a duly empaneled jury at a trial on the merits to be had in the near future. At that time KUPD will present evidence from experienced professional broadcasters and expert witnesses who will testify that the 'Uncontest' was not 'diary distortion' as defined by Arbitron. KUPD will not rest until it is vindicated by a court of competent jurisdiction.'

UA Turns Up ELO LP's "Out Of The Blue"; Jet Sues


Jet Records, the Electric Light Orchestra, and the group's leaders Jeff Lynne and Bev Bevan have filed a motion in L.A. Superior Court seeking a temporary injunction to prevent United Artists Records from "dumping" a large quantity of ELO's current "Out-Of The Blue" album on the market.

According to Jet attorney Marty Mechat, representatives from UA, Jet's former distributors, called representatives of CBS Records, who now distribute Jet, offering to sell them "in excess of half a million" copies of "Out Of The Blue." Quality control personnel from CBS then examined some of the albums, and found that many were warped or had broken shrink wrap, according to Mechat. CBS then

stated they could not buy the albums, as they didn't "meet CBS standards," Mechat told R&R. UA then allegedly informed a CBS representative that they would 'dump" the records on the market on a non-return basis if CBS didn't buy them. Jet Records was notified and activated the legal motion, claiming that the albums were part of Jet's inventory according to conditions of Jet's separation from UA, and that a significant proportion of the albums were defective. "Selling any defective albums is dangerous and damaging to the career of ELO as artists," Mechat

Top UA executives were unavailable for comment when contacted. The hearing on the Jet/ELO motion is scheduled for August 14.

WMAK Moves To Disco/Black Format

WMAK/Nashville, a longtime Top 40 station in the market, will change its format to a "Disco/Black format" August 14. Barry Mayo has been named Program Director, and Jim Maddox of KMJQ/Houston, architect of a successful Disco/Black format there, will consult.

WMAK General Manager Bob Rich told R&R, "We're going to try to follow the path of 'Magic' in Houston and stations like that; we are going to play some R&B hits and some white records. Some dayparts will be automated, but it'll be live in the important dayparts."

New PD Mayo was most recently at WRAP/Norfolk, and before that programmed KALO/Little Rock, where according to Rich he ran essentially the same sort of format WMAK will adopt and "brought that station to number one." WMAK has already started "interspersing some music now; the music is changing." No air personalities will be retained from the Top 40 format, but three have been transferred to WMAK's Top 40 FM counterpart, 92Q.

Roshkind Pleads Guilty To Tax Evasion

Michael Roshkind, Vice Chairman of Motown Records, admitted he knowingly failed to declare more than \$140,000 in taxable income in 1972, and pleaded guilty before a U.S. District Judge to a single count of tax evasion.

Roshkind, who had been indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in March on two counts of tax evasion, originally pleaded innocent to charges that he neglected to pay taxes on more than \$236,377 in taxable income in 1972-73. He faces a maximum possible sentence of five years and a \$10,000 fine on the single count, with sentencing set for September 15.

vious applications. The Commission, in explaining this rare instance of a license revocation for a black-owned station, stated that co-owner Clark E. Parker had established by his pattern of conduct that renewal of the license would not serve the public interest. However, the FCC expressed concern that the revocation would reduce the number of minorityowned radio stations (blacks own 57 presently), and invited minorities or others to file for either interim or regular authority to operate KOAD.

The FCC's reasons for its decision centered on Parker's alleged inadequate supervision of the station operation, and his "conscious" omission of a "debt obligation from a financial statement." Various other "misstatements" in renewal applications were cited, and Parker's conveying of a "totally misleading picture" of the station's news and public affairs programming was also a factor. The FCC decision came about after Parker appealed a Commission Administrative Law Judge's 1976 decision denying his renewal application.

Second Trial Ordered For Allen Klein

Allen Klein, former manager of the Beatles, lost his bid to avoid a second trial in federal court on six counts of tax evasion. Klein's first trial ended in a mistrial when the jury failed to agree on a verdict. However, the three-judge Court of Appeals ruled that a second trial would not constitute "double jeopardy" for Klein.

Among the charges against Klein are failure to report more than \$216,742 allegedly received from sales of promotional records from 1970-72 and underpaying his taxes by more than \$125,000 during the same period.

Deregulated Cable To Kill Off Radio?

I hope everyone in our industry had the opportunity to read the ex-cellent article on "TV of Tomorrow" in the July 3, 1978 issue of Newsweek

There are several opinions expressed concerning the future of the Communication Act Rewrite and the effects which will come to TV and cable that will spark some

If you think this won't affect your radio station or record company you'd better get out now! Cable systems are already giving commercial free evenings of entertainment, not hours.

Network TV will be forced to compete with cable systems that will have the ability of instantly polling viewers on their opinions concerning anything. As simple as pushing a button on a control panel, we will be able to get the most accurate radio ratings we could ever ask for. And we could survey all the TV audience in minutes.

Yes, that's right! While they sit in front of an 84 inch screen with the question "What radio station did you listen to on the way to work today?" glowing in their faces, your "overnights" may determine whether your morning person was really as good as you thought.

But think for a moment. If TV and more specifically cable systems become so culturally important to everyone, when will they have time to listen to radio?
And when someone does listen

to radio, will it be "music channels" on the systems of the cable companies, or real commercial radio?

The time is now for everyone to realize the most important law to be passed in recent history is the new Communication Act of (whatever year it finally gets off) and don't be fooled by the word deregulation. Deregulation of cable TV could kill network TV for the middle class; video cassettes combined with cable would dwarf commercial TV and radio for the rich folks. The poor would be stuck with good old UHF and VHF on the video and commercial radio, and everyone knows what advertisers think of low-income audiences.

And with rating services using

sample on the cable system, will radio be forced to program into the cultural level of the cable audience as opposed to those who are really available to commercial radio?

The real point of all this is that we as Americans have a responsibility to the people, to our industry and to our children's children to think, then speak our minds on the Communications Act Rewrite.

Pasadena Judge Lifts **Broadcast Ban From Court**

Pasadena Municipal Court Judge Gilbert Alston declared a California judicial rule which had prohibited cameras and microphones inside courtrooms, "an unconstitutional restriction on broadcast journalism's access to the courts.

Acting on a motion by attorneys for the Radio & Television News Association, Judge Alston permitted a KGIL radio reporter, a KABC-TV reporter, and a still photographer from the Pasadena Star-News to record, photograph and videotape a preliminary robbery and assault hearing.

Although no action in Municipal Court sets a legal precedent the Wednesday (7/26) incident marked the first time in over a decade that cameras and recording equipment were allowed into a California courtroom.

Citing freedom of the press and the public's right to know as the basis for his decision, Alston clarified his position by stating he would continue to allow access on a case-by-case basis, providing both prosecutors and defense lawyers had no objection.

Roger Grace, attorney for the Radio & Television News Association, described the action as "a breakthrough for us so far as other judges in the state seeing that it works," adding, "This wasn't an experiment. It was actual news coverage. The evidence is conclusive now that this does not disrupt the courtroom.'

Mediascope

Capital Cities Communications Shows Healthy Results

First half and second quarter financial figures for Capital Cities Communications were cause for enthusiasm at the company, as profits were up over 30 percent for the first six months, hitting the \$26.9 million mark. First half sales were up 22 percent, from \$143.8 million last year to \$175.4 million. The second quarter accounted for 60 percent of the year's profits thus far, with \$16.2 million, up almost 35 percent from last year's \$12 million for the same period. Gross income rose almost 19 percent from \$80.8 million to \$95.8 million.

Taft Sets First Quarter Record

Tait Broadcasting's first fiscal quarter (which ended June 30) showed record profits of just under \$6 million, up well over 40 percent from \$4.2 million in the same period last year. Gross income was up 32 percent, from \$33.2 million to \$43.7 million. The company's broadcast division led the way with profits up 28 percent and sales up almost 25 percent to over \$20 million. The company also declared a quarterly cash dividend of 16 cents a share on its split common stock.

FCC Complaints, Inquiries Up In May

The FCC reports that it received 3402 public complaints in May, up almost 5 percent from April's figure of 3245. Other comments and questions accounted for 2041 inquiries, compared to April's 1952.

Station Representatives Association Promotes Standard Radio Invoices

The Station Representatives Association, along with the American Association of Advertising Agencies, has begun a new campaign supporting the use of a standard radio invoice introduced in 1971. They point out that while 80 percent of TV invoices are presented in standard form, less than 20 percent of radio invoices qualify, and that with increasing computerization of ad agency billing functions, the standard invoice will speed up the collection process. The ShA has made arrangements for individual station information to be included on the forms if necessary, and is planning to offer bulk discounts on the standard form.

NAB Survey Shows Radio Revenues Up, Profit Margin Down In 1977

An NAB survey of 1813 radio stations shows profit margins down slightly in 1977 from 1976, owing to rising expenses, but broadcast revenues up over 12 percent. The average profit margin before taxes was 7 percent last year, compared to 7.04 percent in 1976. Total time sales for the average station were \$270,800, up 11.5 percent over 1976, with national and regional sales accounting for the biggest jump. Total broadcast revenue for the average station hit \$269,000, up 12.1 percent, while expenses reached \$250,200, up almost 13 percent over the previous years. Even though the average profit margin was down slightly, the average profit itself was up 2.7 percent to \$18,800.

Farmers Insurance Uses Radio For Information Campaign

Farmers Insurance Group of Los Angeles is using 350 radio stations in 24 Western states to convey a message about the company's discounts and deductibles policy (having clients pay for small claims while lowering rates on major policies). The campaign runs to December 3. Farmers also cosponsors radio broadcasts of the L.A. Rams and San Francisco Giants.

Western Airlines "Blitzes" Radio

Western Airlines began a "Summer/Fall Radio Blitz" July 29 in ten markets (Los Angeles, Miami, San Francisco, Portland, Denver, Salt Lake City, San Diego, Minneapolis, Vancouver, and Seattle). The 60-second Western spots will promote fares and destinations in a jingle style. The company has also started a four-way radio co-op program in L.A., San Francisco, and San Diego along with Budget Rent-A-Car, Island Holiday, and Aloha Airlines, promoting Hawaiian vacation packages.

RSO, Dr. Pepper On Joint Pepper Upper

RSO Records and Dr. Pepper, along with MCA/Universal Films, have jointly announced an extensive marketing campaign called "The Pepperization Of America," tying in the "Sgt. Pepper" film and soundtrack album with the soft drink. Free Sgt. Pepper posters will be offered to purchasers of Dr. Pepper six-packs, along with offers for an exclusive EP of five songs from the album. Special display cases tagged "Be A Pepper, See 'Sgt. Pepper', Drink Dr. Pepper, Hear 'Sgt. Pepper'" are set for grocery and convenience stores across the country. And Radio & TV advertising campaigns tying in the film, album, and soft drink will begin in all markets where the offers are being made. Obviously, there's no signs of a Pepper shortage in the next few months.

Comedy Syndication Offered

Interaudio Associates is offering a syndicated radio show called "The Comedy Hour," hosted by AOR Program Director Sonny Fox. The program includes recorded bits by comedians ranging from Groucho Marx to Monty Python and George Carlin (presumably omitting the "Seven Dirty Words" routine). Broad Street Buys Two Florida Beautiful Music Formats

Broad Street Communications Corporation has purchased stations WVCG-AM and WYOR-FM, both located in Coral Gables, Florida for \$4,850,000. Both stations have beautiful music formats covering the Miami/Fort Lauderdale market. Folk wing FCC approval the stations will be operated as part of the Insilo Broadcast Group, the major operating subsidiary of Broad Street.

TV News

CBS Sweeps Top Five, Wins Week

CBS placed six shows in the Nielsen top ten for the week ending July 23, including the first five. That circumstance enabled the network to win the week's rating contest easily with an average 14.6, compared to the 12.7 earned by both ABC and NBC (with ABC scoring a slightly higher average share to take second place). "One Day At A Time" was the top program for the week, followed by 2) "MASH" 3) "All In The Family" 4) "Lou Grant" 5) "Switch" 6) "Quincy" (NBC) 7) "Three's Company" (ABC) 8) "Starsky & Hutch" (ABC) 9) CBS movie "The Magnificent Seven Ride" and 10) "Rockford Files" (NBC).

KNXT-TV Given Short-Term Renewal

ENXT-TV. a CBS O&O in Los Angeles, has just been handed a short-term license renewal expected to be "good for about a year." FCC Commissioner Jim Quello disagrees with the action taken and says it resulted from "the FCC's lack of authority to impose sanctions against the networks themselves." Quello says he feels that the sanction is unfair to CBS, which has a "long term record of meritorious news and public affairs service," and that its unfair to KNXT whose reputation in their local community is damaged.

Apparently the other six commissioners felt compelled to take CBS to task for its deception in promoting its "Heavyweight Championship of Tennis" series, which was promoted as "Winner Take All" when in effect losers shared also. However, Commissioner Quello believes that a "short-term renewal of a station for the dereliction of a parent network is unprecedented, and in this case, unwarranted and unreasonable." Quello also noted that 1) CBS has instituted massive correction action, 2) the two key CBS executives most involved were replaced, 3) the CBS Sports Department was completely restructured, and 4) CBS's new president appeared nationally on two separate occasions and publicly apologized for what he termed the inexcusable misleading "Winner Take All" promotion. According to Quello, the other networks were hurt more by the deception than the public, which saw the "world's leading best-paid tennis players in earnest competition."

Arbitron's ratings for the week ending July 14 showed all three networks making their presence known in New York and Los Angeles. NBC's "Quincy" topped the New York list, followed by the All Star game on ABC, 3) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC) 4) "Alice" (CBS) 5) "Starsky & Hutch" (ABC) 6) a tie between ABC's Thursday movie, NBC's Sunday movie, and CBS's "All In The Family," and 9) a five-way tie between CBS's "Lou Grant" and "One Day At A Time"; ABC's "Happy Days" and "Love Boat," and NBC's "Rockford Files."

In Los Angeles, the All-Star game headed the standings, followed by 2) "Happy Days" and "Quincy" tied 4) ABC's Thursday movie 5) NBC's Sunday movie and "Three's Compnay" (ABC) tied 7) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC) 8) a tie between ABC's "Fantasy Island" and "Starsky & Hutch," and 10) a six-show tie between ABC's "Carter Country," "Eight Is Enough," and "Love Boat"; NBC's "Project UFO" and "Rockford Files", and CBS's "All In The Family."

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



The Grand Old Man Of Broadcasting

With the retirement of G. Harfield Tweet this past week, the broadcasting industry has seen the last of the true giants who followed Marconi's footsteps.

It was, in fact, G. Harfield Tweet who spurred Marconi into inventing radio by taunting him with the words, "Hey Maca-Roni! Bet you can't invent radio!"

When later, young David Sarnoff launched his career by intercepting the distress signal from the Titanic, it was Harfield Tweet who tried to get Sarnoff to reply to their message with paid advertising. This clearly put Tweet down in history as the father of commercial broadcasting. "Hello and help. This is the Titanic. We're sinking. Send help!" Tweet's proposed response: "Are you tired of that irritating itching sensation? Well, Preparation H can...."

Then in the 1920's Tweet was the first to propose the broadcasting of an election night. He triumphantly announced the election of Calvin Coolidge, which was unfortunate because Warren G. Harding had just been elected.

By the mid-twenties, Tweet had perfected what was to become the most frequently heard single thing on radio: static!

By 1930, Harfield Tweet had invented what was to become known as The Newscast. Others, primarily Lowell Thomas take the credit for this innovation, but it was Tweet who pioneered newscasts for over five years before Thomas or Floyd Collins ever thought of it. Unfortunately, through an oversight, Tweet's newscasts were in Armenian and very few could understand them.

When the dark clouds of war moved over Europe in 1938, Harfield Tweet dedicated his life to the discovery of an alternative to AM and FM. He called it silence! He tried to get the networks to buy the patent for twenty million. The device he invented, consisted of a sledge hammer and a booklet of instructions on where one should strike his radio.

Many may remember Harfield Tweet's memorable broadcast at the time of the Hindenburg disaster. It was at the very time of the Hindenburg disaster, and was only a few blocks away where Tweet reported an incident involving a beer truck sideswiping a blue '37 Packard.

Perhaps Tweet's proudest accomplishment was his discovery of Walter Cronkite. When asked how it happened, Tweet glowed as he related the story of how he had been listening to John Cameron Swayze on NBC when he dialed over to CBS and discovered Walter Cronkite.

As I mentioned earlier, Harfield also was the inventor of radio sales as we know it to-day. Ah, the sponsors. The bicycle pump repairman in Pomona he'd forced into sponsoring all pro football games; the scissor sharpener he'd once gotten to buy seven full drive-time hours of polka music, seven days a week, 52 weeks a year. yes, we'll miss him...going into retirement at the Home For Old Broadcasters across the street from the State Home for People with Wide Faces and the Institute For The Partially Silly. In a way, we almost envy you, G. Harfield Tweet!

Glutting The Market With Survey Research?

Survey researchers are saturating the sample market, according to figures listed in a trade advertisement by Survey Sampling Inc. The ad was designed to point up sloppy sampling methods that cause burnout in potential respondents, but points out in passing that a full 56 percent of American homes are contacted by survey researchers each year. Proceeding to its point, the ad continues by estimating that 154 million requests to participate in surveys are made each year, but that only 91 million interviews are granted, making for a refusal rate of 43 percent. Further, while 43.6 percent of U.S. homes are never contacted, just 11.7 percent receive 49.6 percent of the requests for inter-

The conclusion to be drawn for radio is that clearly a lot of people are being besieged by surveyers, and that the refusal rate indicates that a lot of those people are becoming increasingly unwilling to cooperate. With radio stations now adding to the glut of survey research being conducted, the importance of proper sample selection is evident. Another point -people are getting sophisticated, even jaded, about surveys. Your passives may not know their music cold, but they're quite likely to be aware of your survey-taking aims.



IGM Introduces MARC VII Production Unit

IGM has announced the development of its MARC VII (Manual Assist Remote Control) for control of production room elements in the creation of commercials. The unit controls seven audio sources and up to 84 tracks on multi-track recorders. Consisting of a simple keyboard and a CRT, the MARC VII includes a built-in elapsed time readout, which enables the operator to add overlaps and fades, multiple starts and special effects, at precisely controlled moments. In addition, the unit can back-cue turntables plus, differing voices may be placed on separate cartridges and started at precise times. 

Rewrite Update

1) NAB lists pros and cons of H.R. 13015 for its executive committee - most of whom were in town on Tuesday and Wednesday. (See below)

2) Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin continues to hold hearing on Common Carrier portions of proposed bill

3) House Communications Subcommittee gets feedback from broadcast groups - mostly negative on proposed fees, (R&R 7-28). According to Chip Shooshan, the Subcommittee's Chief Counsel, the proposed fee system was prepared as a starting point for discussion. Radio broadcasters wishing to make recommendations on the fees are encouraged to contact Rep. Van Deerlin directly.

4) Nicholas Johnson, head of the Citizens Communications Center, while bicycling around Iowa begins putting together a coalition of public interest groups, including Iowa farmers, to study the implications of the bill. Some groups like the U.S. Church of Christ are already on record as opposing the bill.

5) Van Deerlin schedules six field hearings (see below) during Congressional summer recess to give the public a chance to comment on bill. Anyone wishing to make comment must write the Congressman at least seven days prior to the scheduled hearing.

6) Townes Osborn, Ex-Director of National Citizens Communication Lobby, attacks House Communications Subcommittee for not having enough copies of the 200 page bill to give out to interested parties prior to the hearings. Subcommittee counsel Shooshan tells R&R that public groups got a good portion of 300 copies supplied to his office and that the U.S. Documents office has been asked to make more available. Shooshan also feels citizens groups could have bill reprinted as "a service on their own."

NAB Lists Pros And Cons On Rewrite

NAB's Government Relations Department listed for its Executive Committee plusses and minuses of the proposed rewrite which will appear in NAB offical house organ, Highlights, this week

NAB's PROS for radio include: 1) indefinite license, 2) does away with all equal time and Sect. 315 requirements, 3) does away with access requirement for Federal candidates, 4) repeals Fairness Doctrine, 5) repeals "lowest unit rate," 6) no ascertainment, 7) FCC would be prohibited from involvement in formats or programming, 8) no restrictions on commercials.

NAB's CONS for radio include: 1) does away with "public interest" standard, 2) established a fee, 3) petition to revoke could be filed by any interested party, 4) an EEO complaint might be used by new Commission in revocation proceedings, 5) ownership restrictions would reduce number of stations that could be collectively owned, 6) new Commission might consider cross-ownership at time of petition to revoke, 7) greater marketplace competition and the end of clear channel operations, 8) no all-channel receiver provision.

It should be noted that R&R received this list as we were heading to the printer and we have not had a

chance to ask the staff of the bill's authors, the House Communications Subcommittee, to comment. However, the NAB analysis appears to be rather straightforward even though many of its objections are speculative. This is due in part to the nature of the bill which fails quite often to be specific in its language.

Learning The Ropes

Notice: What you are about to read is a very dramatic decision and chances are you won't ever see it mentioned in any other trade journal. One reason for R&R's opening a Washington office is to provide a layman knowledge of how communications regulation of radio stations works for a new breed of radio managers, of all varieties — general, station, operations, and most importantly, program. In the following story regarding KONO/San Antonio, a station facing a license challenge because of its minority hiring record, the FCC's decision to renew the station's license was challenged in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. This is a name which you should note, since it is estimated by one attorney that 90 percent of all FCC decisions which are appealed are appealed to this particular court.

You Better Watch Out

"The Courts really shit in our face" said an FCC staffer. The reference was to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit which is asking the FCC (which in turn is asking KONO), for more information about the station's employment practices during its 1971-1974 renewal period. The FCC had already made its investigation and decided to renew KONO's license based upon statistics showing that their current record is better than ever. The implication for all stations is that they cannot wait until challenged and then "beef-up"

According to the same Commission person, it has been the FCC's practice in the past to give more credence to a station's "post renewal term improvement." The Court of Appeals action against letting that practice stand means that stations should "watch out," according to a second FCC source. This prompted a prominent Washington attorney to ask "what's all this talk about deregulation?"

Therefore, the Commission ordered KONO to submit information on:

1) Pull and part-time employees hired from August 1, 1971 to August 1, 1974, including date of hire, job title, starting salary, race/national origin and sex;

2) All recruitment and hiring procedures used to fill each of the vacancies and, if available, the number of applicants for each position and their race/national origin and sex

3) All employees promoted, indicating full or part-time, job title formerly held, salary, date of promotion. the job title promoted to, salary, race/national origin and sex:
4) All full and part-time employees terminated indicating their job title, race/national origin, sex and ter-

The FCC also invited KONO to submit any information available to support its statement that it had employed minorities for 45 years

Reagan Challenged On Personal Attack

On April 17, 1978, Ronald Reagan, former California Governor and past Presidential contender, aired a commentary on 250 stations entitled "Suicide Lobby." In it, he outlined a strategy geared toward making "anti-communism unfashionable" in this country, which Reagan says was plotted during post-WWII and is still being continued. R&R learned that Jim Krugman of the law firm Krugman, Capnick, & Grimshaw of Patterson, New Jersey, has mailed a letter to all the stations having aired "Suicide Lobby" claiming a violation of the Commission's rules and alleging a personal attack on nine persons or groups including Daniel Ellsberg and Dr. Benjamin Spock. The letter states. "In the interests of resolving this matter without further action on our part, our clients are amenable to making one response on behalf of all." Accompanying the letter was a cassette recording of a response by actor Ossie Davis, a long-time

civil rights activist, supporting U.S. disarmament.

Are Stations Airing The Response?

Here's how things stack up. Dick Hildreth, of the Washington law firm of Fletcher, Heald, Kenehan, & Hildreth, says that the response is a "mish-mash of Fairness Doctrine and personal attack." Hildreth wouldn't be surprised. however, to learn that stations may have been intimidated by the letter and cassette, but he's advising stations not to run it on the basis that the cassette they are being asked to air doesn't even address the question of personal attack.

Out in L.A., Charley Jones, President of O'Connor Creative Services, who distributes Reagan's program, is telling stations that they do not consider the commentary a "personal attack." Governor Reagan's office says the same. Jones states his poll of stations carrying the Reagan show indicates

Washington Street Talk

A funny thing is happening on the way to NAB's Radio Programming Conference set for Aug. 20-23. Conference's planning committee chairman, Bill O'Shaughnessy, President of WVOX/WRTN/New Rochelle, NY, will stop off to appear on a panel at Billboard's convention, which is generally seen as competion for NAB's first venture into the world of program conferences. NAB has scheduled comedian Dick Gregory as an opening speaker.

According to a survey by the Radio/TV News Directors Association, the typical radio newsroom during 1976-77 either shrunk or just "held its own." Report, based on response from 450 stations, was prepared by Southern Illinois Univ. and showed that the average news staff consisted of one full time person with one part-time assistant.

NAB and others are responsible for getting AM Stereo back on FCC agenda next week. Look for some action on this.

NAB mortgage burning ceremony held on Wednesday (the 2nd) used an earth station on the NAB plaza to receive a signal originating there and traveling 23,000 miles before triggering a device which ignited the mortgage. A recommendation for NAB's new savings, according to one broadcaster who admits to wishful thinking, is lower dues. Staffers at NAB are hoping for large bonuses and/or increased lighting in the NAB corridors, which have been dark since February as a result of NAB energy-saving campaigns.

Citizens Radio Section of the Electronic Industries Association is planning a nation-wide "10-4 CB Day" with number of governors already endorsing proclamation. Set for October.

PEOPLE: Fred Coufal joins the FCC as an administrative law judge. Prior to the FCC, Fred was a member of the Licensing Board the US Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

CAPITOL TRIVIA: Mark Russell, Washington satirist, who uses his NBC Radio syndicated show to browbeat bureaucrats, recently proclaimed Washington, D.C. the winner of his New York City Look-Alike Contest for its recent subway strike. He also had a few remarks recently concerning the actions of the man chiefly responsible (according to New York's Village Voice) for spraying paraquat on Mexican marijuana fields, Dr. Peter Bourne, who was recently dismissed as President Carter's medical advisor: "I drove by the White House today and they were putting up a Rexall sign. And when I called there, the

operator said, 'Good Morning, White House, all pharmacists are busy.' "
Finally, FCC Commissioners had a lengthy discussion last week regarding an Atlanta broadcaster who was asking the Commission to uphold his decision not to air spots for a Georgia gubernatorial candidate wanting to use a hypnotist during campaign ads. Under Commission political rules (Sect. 315) stations must air spots of all bona fide candidates. Station said that doing so would be harmful to public. FCC staff, after checking with two psychiatrists and a clinical psychologist, backed the station up claiming persons might walk out of their homes under hypnosis and be hit by cars. However, Chairman Charles Ferris had no sympathy for the broadcaster, calling him a "big boy capable of making decisions." Issue was brought to a close when candidate withdrew ads this week

I said, "God, this has got to be some clown looking for a job." I went out and here's this uniformed guard handcuffed to an attache case. He says, "Are you Mark Blinoff?" I said, "Yes, I am." He says, "May I see some identification?" Well, KMPC's a full city block from my office to the front door. So I said, "Just take my word for it that I'm Mark Blinoff." He says, "I'm sorry, I must see identification." I said, "Look, this young lady here will identify me. Am I Mark Blinoff?" And she said, "Yes, he is." He said, "I'm sorry. I must insist on identification." I said, "OK, but this better be good." So I walked all the way back, the full city block, and got my wallet out of my jacket pocket, walked the full block back to the reception area to show him my ID. When I got there he is now breaking out in a sweat. I mean he is sweating his whole life away. I'm saying to myself, "God, I just don't believe this is happening to me." He gets out the key to unlock the handcuffs to unlock himself from the attache case and he can't get the goddamn thing unlocked. Finally, this guy gets the handcuffs off and he opens the brief case and there is only a tiny reel of tape inside. I'm thinking to myself this better be an invitation to a great party, it's the only thing that's going to justify it. I took the tape back to my office, put it on the tape machine, turned it on, and all it says on the tape is "This tape will self-destruct in thirty seconds. These are your instructions, Mr. Blinoff. Hire (the guy's name)." And that was the end of the tape and that was also the end of that clown. I was furious. The guy had blown a half hour of my time.

that production ability often depended upon the shift or station policy. WPLJ's Larry Berger said, "Our setup here is that our jocks don't do much production, so I'm not really concerned with it. I'm looking for a person-

Such policy differences may vary widely even within formats. Both Les Garland and Jerry Rogers program Top 40 stations. (KFRC and WSGA respectively) yet Garland feels that a live spot is "very important" due to approximately one-third of his copy being live, while Rogers states that since they do "very few" live spots, it's not necessary to include one in the aircheck.

At KCKN, Chris Collier's views ("A production sample should include...a lot of various kinds of spots to showcase your versatility in production,") reflect the consensus that prospective jocks should showcase whatever skills they have. On the other hand, J.D. Blackburn of WLUP doesn't look for either live spots or production samples because, "We have our own way of doing those here and we'll just have to retrain everyone anyway.

On the question of reel-to-reel versus cassettes, a slight majority preferred reelto-reel, citing the speed variance of cassettes as the determining factor. Nonetheless, an almost equal number indicated that either medium was satisfactory, while several favored cassettes, on the basis of convenience.

A more accurate indicator as far as the appropriate length of airchecks is the average amount of time spent listening to an individual tape-under two minutes, generally. WORJ's Bill McGathy sums up the situation. "Something has to catch my ear the first couple of breaks. I just don't have the time to listen to more than that." More importantly, in the words of Bill Hennes, PD at WMAQ, "The first set has to be the grabber.

The Pros' Consensus

When asked for general comments on the subject of airchecks, Jeff Chard of WOUR responded "Often the technical quality is so poor that I can't believe it was sent to me in the first place. Others don't telescope

An aircheck, accompanied by a resume. is in most cases a program director's introduction to an applicant. Many PD's receive between 25-40 tapes per week. Eventually, they listen to them all, looking for that rare talent that meets their current (and future) programming needs. Given the importance of airchecks, programmers develop their own methods of sifting through the stacks of tape that arrive daily.

Airchecks Polled

Programmers' preferred lengths of airchecks ranged from 60 seconds to 60 minutes. However, most felt that 3-10 minutes were all that was required. They all requested the music be telescoped except KFRC's Les Garland, who explained, "That way you know the guy is not sending you the Byrds' greatest hits.'

John Gehron of WLS commented, "Yes, want the music and the commercials scoped, but I want everything else. If they have done a segue I want to know that it was a segue and that they just didn't cut something out they didn't want me to hear. I want to hear everything."

Similarly, KSFO's Don Hoffman points out, "I don't want a skimmer tape. It doesn't do the guy any good because it really points out his weaknesses and repetition. Telescope it, but do it so we can get a feel of the station flow There exists a minority opinion as to

the relative value of airchecks. Del Hull, PD at KRNT states, "I don't like to deal with airchecks, I don't feel that it is really the best indication of what a guy can do... I like to hear him on the air some-where and know exactly what I'm getting. An aircheck may be something he's been working on for months and may represent more than what he can really do.

Bobby Cole of KMEL concurs, "I've seen a lot of people get hired on the basis of airchecks they can never live up to once

they get the gig. I would never hire anyone solely on the basis of an aircheck. Everyone working at KMEL has been researched through their prior job either here in town, or we'll go to their market, within reason, to listen to them on their current station of employment."

their music, while still others will do six song sets with segues, and I've heard those segues before.

"What I'm looking for is someone with a delivery I feel could be modified to WOUR... nothing that sounds too regional; someone who sounds confident at what he's doing, who sounds like he enjoys what he is doing."

"A lot of times I receive tapes with a letter that apologizes for the quality of the tape enclosed. I have to wonder why this guy would send me the tape at all...tapes with letters like that get tossed in the 'circular file'.

"I always look for someone who knows that I'm the person they should be talking to. It impresses me when someone who is looking has 'done his homework' as it were, and is not just sending out a batch of tapes to every station in the market."

KMET's Sam Bellamy adds, "Most of them (the tapes) are pretty bad and boring from newcomers. It amazes me that these people seem to be coming from a time warp. They're much more concerned with their segues and musical choices than they are in relating to their audience. And they talk like the stereotypical progressive jock of seven years ago. I don't know where these people get the idea that that is where they should be coming from. They must be educated that radio is, after all, a business."

Perry St. John, VP/GM of Stoner Broadcasting and PD at KSO, advises, "Generally the tapes are too long. I don't really need that much. I can tell in a minute whether the guy has got it or not."

In addition, Jerry Rogers admonishes, "One thing for applicants not to do is to call up and say they are sending a tape . . . to me it makes sense to call after you have sent the tape. Ask if the PD has received the tape and did he like it, but to call and say you're sending a tape is a waste of time."

John Gehron claims his biggest problem is "I get a lot of tapes that just aren't even close to being ready for this station. I encourage people to send tapes even though I may not have an opening, but they should seriously think about whether they are ready for WLS."

Lastly, Les Garland voices irritation at "a lot of guys who try to set themselves up with a little rap in front of them before they start the tape, and that's all bullshit boring, who cares."

On the positive side, Larry Berger offers the following constructive advice, "It's very difficult to extrapolate what someone would sound like at WPLJ when they send me an aircheck from a really dissimilar sounding station. It helps for them to take the time to send me an aircheck of what they think they'd sound like on this station."

Chris Collier prefers that "each schtick the jock is into be included in the aircheck. If he does anything outstanding, spotlight ments. "I think it's very important to tailor your aircheck and resume to the person to whom you are sending it."

For the last word on airchecks and their importance, Bill Hennes notes, "If I like the tape, then I'm going to proceed with talking to the person face to face if I like it that much."

Radio And Resumes

The majority of programmers expressed definite interest in checking references.

the time the rating is because of the radio station, and not necessarily because of the guy. There are isolated incidences, where obviously a morning man will draw big numbers, but a lot of the time guys will send big sheets of all their numbers and things and you look at the station and they're number one all day long. So I don't really look at the ratings."

A similar division occurs on the question of salary requirements. Half of the programmers felt that the size of the market what the format was. Because with stations changing, a guy might state that he worked at such and such a station in 1963 and I might say to myself, 'was that a rocker,' or whatever.''

Bobby Cole observes, "Customized airchecks and resumes appeal much more to me. I look for a cover letter instead of a resume. I've always put together a threeparagraph, one-page introduction: an opening paragraph explaining the purpose and intent of the correspondence; the second paragraph highlighting credentials and past experience (accentuating the positive), and a final paragraph reiterating the purpose of the correspondence. These letters don't come easy; they take hours. But what is five or six hours preparing a presentation when you're talking about a job that will last years? It's an investment in your future.

John Gehron mentions, "One thing that I never see on resumes is community involvement. There is a lot more to being just a disc jockey, I want to know what they can do off the radio. How energetic are they, do they go out and cut spots, do they go out and get involved in community activities, have they done any television? I want to know if this guy can build his own fire under himself or is he just going to come in and do his show and then go home. I don't want someone like that "

Those who are "self-starters" also rate highly with Les Garland, who complains, "People just don't sell themselves anymore. This is a business of salesmanship, or 'hype' — it's all the same thing. It's just like working a record. You're working yourself. I think it is important that those people market themselves and try to tell me what they have to offer, besides a voice, or besides being on the radio. Can they write promos, and can they do this or can they do that? I think some hype is required. I don't see people doing that. They don't jump up and down and try to convince the PD that they are the person for that job."

A Brand New Bag

Recently I got a resume that was hand-drawn with a trash can and tapes in

However, most agreed with KCUB's Bill Mortimer, who stated, "If it looks like I'm going to hire someone I will check resumes."

Don Hoffman adds, "More than the references, I check the stations." Larry Berger cautions, "Sometimes you find out things you won't ever hear in interviews for one reason or another."

Likewise, Sam Bellamy remarks, "Lots of the references are record company people. If the person was an MD and the record company people liked him because he'd play anything, that's a different story."

Although most programmers feel that all professional employment should be included in the resume, many have reservations like those of KMPC's Mark Blinoff, who says, "In my own particular case, when I got so many stations that I couldn't get them on one page, I started to drop them off."

Jerry Rogers brings up the possibility of ticklish situations and how best to deal with them. "Frankly, if you have a really bad reference and if there is some way you can avoid listing it, I would; but otherwise, I like all professional employment, including non-radio, to be listed."

As far as the relative importance of nonradio employment, AOR programmers Jeff Chard and Sam Bellamy offer contrasting views. Jeff maintains, "Anything that is going to help him on an airshift will help. Anyone just starting out who has had just four years of college radio and four summers at Sears is going to have a mighty skimpy resume if he only lists his radio credits, so the rest can't hurt, though that sort of work won't influence me either way."

Sam's attitude is that "We're looking for that one diamond in the rockpile and somedictated salaries and half agreed with Perry St. John, who said, "I have to know how much the guy is going to cost because I know exactly how much I've got to spend."

Goals Score On Resumes

Interestingly, a common theme surfaced when programmers volunteered their opinions on what they thought was lacking on most resumes. Don Hoffman reports, "I'd like to have a letter outlining that person's goals, and a real serious approach to where he wants to go. Not a letter copping out to why he didn't stay here or there."

Chris Collier agrees. "I'd like to know what a guy's eventual goals are. I don't see that much on resumes. For example, the question 'job goal' — a guy shouldn't say 'anything available at station.' That isn't good. They should list a specific objective goal and maybe an overall objec-

tive, an eventual goal in your career." Mark Blinoff also mentioned goals, adding

"education, and I'd like to see some short abbreviated statement concerning the philosophical position of the applicant concerning broadcasting. You rarely see that, but it's nice to have that included."

Del Hull put it bluntly, "I'd just like a rough idea of where the person is going ... what the hell they want to do in life."

Suggested Behavior

Other suggestions covered a variety of areas. Jeff Chard said, "I want to know the extent of their personal knowledge of the station, if they have grown up listening to us or whatever. That means something to me." J.D. Blackburn desires "a track record. Not ratings, but who they've worked with, where they have been working and what size markets." Mike Harvey reports, "I would like to see a salary history of a person. I think that shows something of how a person has grown within the business." Perry St. John simply states, "I'd like to see a recent photo."

Steve Bell wants to know "where the guy has worked and what he did there ... newsman, announcer, DJ ... and if possible

In conclusion, Jerry Rogers reiterates several attitudes shared by those surveyed. "I like educational background; family history, meaning if he is married or single; does he have any special skills that might be applicable to what I'm interested in that would be important to radio. Does he do or has he done a lot of personal appearances? I'd like a picture. I don't like letters of recommendation. I want to call him. Another thing I find missing on so many resumes is who was or is your supervisor at the station. If he's not at that station any more, where is he now? That's so I can call and check with him. I think personal references are another waste of time. Professional references only, and your supervisor at your positions."

Now that you've got your foot in the door, next week R&R's employment survey continues with answers to general questions, including "Do you prefer to hire from the ranks of those currently employed?"

"Do you look for an individual personality or someone who fits into the same image as the current staff?"

"Who pays for travel expenses for an inperson interview?"

It's interesting to get an outside opinion or two on how L.A. radio sounds. Without putting anyone on the hot seat I will say that neither Pat or E. Alvin heard what they had expected on L.A. radio. This market, like many others I'm sure, is in a perpetual state of change and adjustment. By the time we all get together for Convention 79, radio in this market will be different than it is today, which is to be expected.

The final readjustment of the parallels is being completed now, as the final markets receive their Arbitrons. Most of those immediately affected have been notified of the changes being made, with the exception of the new stations that will be added. For those of you that are affected by crossover music within your market, please take note of the Crossover section in Bill's weekly music information. Bill and I put our collective research together and present those records that are showing early potential for crossing over. As the weeks go by you should be able to spot those records with the strongest possibility of becoming crossover hits. Obviously the markets most receptive to crossover product will be the first to reflect any crossover activity, but as you see this section over a period of weeks, the trends should be easier to pinpoint.

This week: WNBC/New York has a new morning man to permanently replace Ellie Dylan (who was a great morning person, but not much of a morning man)....research secrets are ready for declassification in Colorado Springs....and some very chauvinistic promotions from the Summer of '78. And for those of you seeking employment Part One of Tapes & Resumes . . ., a frank look at what programmers are looking for in future employees.

Scotty Brink To WNBC

As revealed last week in Street Talk, Scotty Brink will join WNBC/New York in morning drive replacing Lee Masters who is leaving the station.

Lee is leaving WNBC in order to take over management and part ownership of an as yet undisclosed station. He joined WNBC when the station kicked off their contemporary format in September of 1977. Previously he had worked as Station Manager of WLRS/Louisville.

Elaborating on his plans Lee told me, "I'm leaving to form a corporation for the acquisition of broadcast properties with Edward Henson, President of Kentucky Technical Institute (owners/operators of WLRS), and Louisa Henson, Executive Vice President and General Manager of WLRS. I've learned an awful lot from working with Bob Pittinan and Charlie Warner and I'm going to miss working at WNBC. I've had a lot of fun.

WNBC Program Manager Bob Pittman said, "Lee's been a valuable member of the team and we really hate to see him leave. He's done a fine job in both the morning and afternoon shows. However, the offer he has is so good we understand his reasons for taking it."

The announcement that Masters would leave the station was closely followed by the finalization of negotiations between WNBC and their new morning personality Scotty Brink. Scotty has most recently been doing mornings and 9-12noon at KULF/Houston, but had left Houston in order to act as a temporary consultant to WPEZ/Pittsburgh General Manager Gil Rozzo. Prior to KULF Scotty's experience included some of the most respected call letters in the country. Scotty had been Program Director of WRKO/Boston and worked on the air at WLS/Chicago and KHJ/Los Angeles in addition to consulting several radio stations. In 1968 you might remember Scotty on the air at WOR-FM/New York (now 99X) using the pseudonym of J.J. Jordan.

Scotty, when contacted in Pittsburgh, told me, "Although I've never worked with Bob Pittman and Charlie Warner, I know a lot about them and the kind of programming they're doing. I'm real cranked-up about having the chance to come to New York and work with them."

Pittman told R&R, "Scotty has all the qualifications we are looking for in a morning jock. He's had great experience, knows New York and is warm, conversational, intelligent and competent."

The ownership situation that Masters will be affiliated with cannot be discussed until plans are finalized for the purchase. However, Lee is very excited about the prospects for his future. Likewise, Brink seems very thrilled to join the WNBC team in what is certainly a key shift. All parties seem to be pleased with the rearrangement of personnel and we wish Lee and Scotty the best.

Open For Everything

It was Rick Sklar who said it in R&R's Top 40 Story, "What other business do you know where somebody develops a new and better way of doing something and instead of doing it and making a profit at it, they immediately explain to their competitors what they're doing, so that the competitors can then do the same thing to them?" Rick made a very strong point about the willingness of programmers to share their new-found secrets with their fellow programmers. The radio-to-radio exchange of information has always been fairly constant; however, the radio-to-records information flow has never been quite so free.

That may be changing. J.J. McLain, Program Director of KXXV & KINX-FM/Colorado Springs, sent me a letter in which he explained his willingness to share his music research information with the record industry. Before you prejudge just what information he plans to release and what he plans to withhold, read the following portion of his letter:

"15KX, Colorado Springs' progressive Top 40 station, would like to have mentioned in your newspaper our new concept in research and rapport between radio and record people. To all distributors who service us, we will offer a weekly breakdown of all active and passive record research. This will include local call-outs and call-ins, weekly reports of unit sales from our top five retailers, the best selling albums, the most requested cuts, the most promising new music (not as yet on our charts) as derived from our active research, and our weekly call-out list of favorite gold—in short, everything (and we do mean everything) that makes up the 15KX music survey."

The station recently underwent a format change and J.J. entered the picture as the new Program Director. Admittedly, he is releasing this information to the record companies primarily as "bait" for better record service, but the precedent is being set. And J.J. sees no real value in hiding the information he collects from the record companies. The supposition that if the companies know what criteria make up the selection process for new music additions at 15KX, those companies can better serve the station's needs.

But what about the information getting into the hands of the competition, namely Marc McCoy at KYSN? J.J. said, "This is an extremely competitive towr and if they (KYSN) should get a hold of it, well, it really wouldn't bother me that much. The collection of data is one thing but the implimentation and interpretation of that data is another. Naturally I would rather they didn't see it, but I'm sure they will."

Interesting concept. A station, admittedly in a less than major-market situation, willing to give the record companies complete music research information. It's too early to tell whether this experiment will work for or against 15KX, but to me the prospect of the radio and record industries working closer together and sharing their collected information is a positive step. Good luck to J.J. McLain.

Courts Urged To Uphold Reagan **Broadcasters First Amendment Rights**

Congressional support by lawmakers like Rep. John Murphy (D-NY), the second ranking Democrat on the House Communications Subcommittee, who implied last week (R&R 7/31) that he's for protecting special formats such as classical music from any deregulation efforts. A Brief was filed, however, on behalf of the 4500 radio members of the National Association of Broadcasters supporting the FCC. The NAB agrees with the Commission that government involvement in format changes is a violation of the First Amendment and Section 325 of the Communications Act of 1934 - the no censorship provision. NAB also contends that FCC restraints "would discourage licensees from testing minority-interest formats in the marketplace.

In a second filing this week. the Supreme Court is being asked by broadcasters, publishers and others to uphold a lower court's action giving First Amendment protection to "the editorial process." At issue is a case involving Mike Wallace and Barry Lando, reporter and producer respectively, of a CBS "60 Minutes" feature that aired on February 4, 1973. At that time. Colonel Anthony Herbert was questioned regarding his allegations that the US Army regularly engages in the cover-up of war crimes. Subsequently, Colonel Herbert began a search into the "editorial judgments" used in preparing the segment. The "friendof-the-court" brief states that "private individuals must be allocated the right to decide what information is 'newsworthy' and what information is relevant to decision making" which it says is the cornerstone of the First Amendment.

that 60 percent have refused to air the response, 20 percent are avoiding the issue, and only one has made use of the cassette. That's not the case, according to Jim Krugman. He claims to have contacted approximately 500 stations of which he says 100 have provided sworn affidavits stating they ran the response.

According to Milt Gross, head of the FCC's Political and Fairness Doctrine Department, no one representing Spock, Ellsberg, or the others has issued a formal complaint. Gross noted that one station contacting the Commission did air it during a newscast. As for an interpretation, Gross says not to look for a Commission decision any time soon

Station Responds

Jack Roth, owner of KONO, told R&R that in complying with the request, he sent the FCC a detailed history of hiring minorities at his station. He was able to do that because of two long-term employees, one of which has been with the station almost 50 years. In Jack's opinion, he has nothing to worry about and feels confident of a renewal, but his thoughts are interesting. He believes 1) that because good people get hired away that there's no question that hiring and training minorities is a major business expense, and 2) responding to a plaintiff's 1 or 2 page complaint can result in having to file 50 to 100 pages of insidious research which results in thousands of dollars of expense and man-hours. Are you listening, Chairman Ferris?

Forthcoming From The FTC

Federal Trade Commission scores high marks for issuing a schedule of upcoming deliberations. During April, 1979, for example, they will look into "Media Concentration and Access." Also during the next six months look for the FTC to 1) consider the restrictions on advertising of veterinary and accountant services, 2) complete a new set of rules that will apply to vocational and home-study schools which should have some bearing on broadcasting schools, and 3) issue a report on "the unavailability of advertised specials." Also from the FTC of fringe importance is that they will now allow comparative advertising of beer and are proposing that advertising of protein supplements carry a 25 word disclaimer.

The Winning Ways Of WBLS

Hal Jackson, VP of Inner City Broadcasting and Program Director of WBLS/New York was recently in Los Angeles for his 8th Annual Talented Teens International (he's pictured with Atlantic Chairman Ahmet Ertegun at the festivities). He spent some time here

at R&R and we talked about some of the things that make WBLS one of the most successful stations in the country and plans for expansion in other cities. One of Jackson's crucial points was, "We serve the Black community, but we also serve all the people. We're the People's station. We never forget our Blackness, but we stretch out."

One of the things that has made WBLS such a leader has been the attitude toward the music. The station features and pioneered the playing of numerous artists not previously associated with Black stations. Examples include pop ballad singer Jane Olivor, country star Barbara Mandrell, Barbra Streisand, Samantha Sang, the Bee Gees, Rolling Stones, Andy Gibb, and many more. Unlike many program directors, Jackson programs from his instincts for what people want to hear. There's something for everybody, including "Classics" (older popstyled and jazz records—Lena Horne, Tony Bennett, Duke Ellington), and others. Obviously it works—"Ten stations come in here every week asking to tape our shows, and I let them," Jackson says, smilling. "They ask because it's such a winner."

"Now," Jackson observes, "Top 40 stations like

WABC, WNBC, and 99X are playing more Black records than ever before in an attempt to compete, and stations like WKTU are changing their formats (to disco) to go up against WBLS."

Now let's back up a little. The station started as WLIB-FM and programmed jazz for many years. Jackson started to modify the jazz with some pop and R&B, then brought in Frankie Crocker (who Jackson generously credits for devising the music mix which marks WBLS as unique) to institutionalize a policy for strictly programmed records, so the format will never be broken. They will play album cuts in advance, which of course upsets record companies at times. But Jackson responds, "I run a radio station, not a record company." This format strictness applies to the slightest detail. Jackson takes great pains with the sounds of WBLS, even controlling commercials, declining those which don't fit the station's sound. He has encountered resistance from the agencies, who sometimes send outdated or condescending spots, but he maintains, "You can't be the kind of sophisticated station we are and run derogatory commercials." Despite all the headaches and problems, the station is so successful there's no problem being sold out weeks in advance.

Even the news is adjustable and "unpredictable," no set times, no five minute blocks. Sometimes there's in-depth coverage of stories, other times it blends right into the music programming. The public service shows are on 6-11 Sunday mornings, and according to Jackson WBLS is No. 1 in that time period.

Overall, says Jackson, "I'm very proud of the station's success, especially since WBLS has never run a contest. I refuse to run contests, we've never had a giveaway." In contrast to rating period hypes by other stations, WBLS does not change its music during rating periods: it maintains the same format.

About the future: when new station acquisitions come through (currently plans are to adapt the WBLS format at WBRB/Mt. Clemons, Mich. (Detroit), KRE-AM/FM/Berkeley—San Francisco, and possibly KJLH/Los Angeles, Jackson will program them, but in cooperation with existing personnel. He believes in using the resources already at the stations, and modifying the WBLS formula according to local needs and traditions.

Jackson takes chances, plays records no one else touches (and breaks them), and has succeeded admirably...his unorthodox methods may well be one of the most important radio waves of the future.





Reaching Your Audience

When an AOR station more than doubles its 12-plus overall rating from one book to the next and breaks into double digits doing so, it's always worth looking into for programming tips and insights. It's especially worthwhile when the market is El Paso, Texas, where

competition is so frenzied for the rock radio listener that as KPAS GM Garrett Haston put it, "It's like having seven hungry wild-eyed dogs going after the same bone." KPAS is a 100,000-watt facility which has been AOR since January of 1976. At first plagued with transmitter problems which kept them off the air some eighty times in their first year as an AOR, the station has gone on to become a rock radio ratings leader in the last book, under the programming leadership of Chancey Blackburn. As GM Haston described her, "Chancey is a strong local Program Director. She was brought in locally to do the programming as opposed to being a consultant. To me, that's an absolute, and I wish more station owners recognized the value of local programmers."

One of the first things Chancey did upon her arrival to the station in January was to call upon her research knowledge, gained with former employers Blair and Arbitron, to set up a research team for the station. She approached area college communication departments with the idea of exchanging students' time spent manning

station phones doing outcall research, for weekly seminars by the station staffers on the ins and outs of day-to-day broadcasting. Several profs agreed to give their students credits for spending a certain amount of time at the station. According to Chancey, "The seminar idea is what really sold it to the universities. Had we been in a city with broadcasting schools we'd have had no trouble getting volunteers. But El Paso has no such schools and so we had to offer the colleges something in return for their students' services. The seminars did it. We could provide answers to questions these students had which their professors could only theorize about."

Once the students were indoctrinated as to the purpose and methodology of the research they were to do, they were given the questionaires formulated by Blackburn and then made random area phone calls to locate citizens within KPAS's target age group (adults, 18-34). Once located, the staffers (who referred to themselves as representatives of an anonymous-sounding research firm whose name would have no direct connection to any radio station) ran through a series of artist names and song titles asking for degrees of likes or dislikes. While this team asked specifically music-oriented questions, Blackburn said she would like to increase the survey in the future to include questions about the interviewees' other leisure pursuits. The researchers handled some 2500 calls in this fashion per week, the information then being collated by Blackburn to help hauge audience musical tastes.

While Chancey recently left the station to organize a full-scale research organization with her husband Jay (WLUP/Chicago PD), the research team she implemented at KPAS will continue under the station's new PD. Mark Bielinski. As far as Chancey is concerned, the idea is so valid that she heartily recommended its usage by other AOR stations situated near colleges with communications departments. For KPAS/El Paso, a research team "has become an integral part of determining musical policy," as she put it. "I feel," she added, "that the major concern to the radio listener is the music, and it must be given top priority." For Chancey Blackburn and KPAS/El Paso, a functioning music research team helps put music in its proper radio perspective.

Continuing AOR successes as the ratings books return: WVAF/Charleston, under PD Maja Piff, showing substantial gains; WAAL/Binghamton going from an already impressive 12.6 for 12-plus overall to an astounding 13.9 (which ties the 12-plus figure for KLBJ/Austin and proves that the sky is the limit for AOR ratings). The station made its biggest gain in women listeners, which PD Fred Horton explained by saying, "We didn't play a lot of hard-ass rock 'n roll." Fred gets this week's tip of the AOR hat for a book that reflects well for all of us.

KFMQ/Lincoln was down a bit from an astonishing 12-plus overall figure of 16.0 last book to a still-enviable 14.6 this time. KSMB/Lafayette PD Mike Micthell must be smiling. His station, with the help of Abrams' Superstars formatting, went up 4 figures to break into a two-digit 10.8. The revised San Francisco book, restructured following several diary references to a nonexistent KFRC-FM (KMEL's old call letters) which had not been credited to KMEL brought up KMEL's 12-plus overall slightly, as well as the station's showing with teens and adults.

Update

KMET/Los Angeles airlifted Mick Jagger out of Anaheim Stadium by helicopter and back to station studios for an exclusive half-hour interview . . . WAAF/Worcester sponsored a benefit concert for the Leukemia Society of America with Cars and Creed, which nearly

missed getting off the ground when the city fathers decided three days prior to the projected concert date that the show could not be held at an area park, after 6500 tickets had already been sold at \$1.07 each. PD Lee Arnold feverishly searched for and found an indoor facility where the show could take place, sold an additional 5500 seats and the show came off. While proceeds are still being counted, Arnold called the show an unqualified success and benefits to the Leukemia Society should be impressive. A commendable effort from the WAAF crew

KZEW/Dallas interviewed LRB and Bob Welch during their complete coverage of an area Fleetwood Mac appearance which drew 70,000 (the group, by the way, played only one new cut in their set). KZEW was the area's official station for announcing ticket locations for a Dallas small hall Stones appearance, which sold out 2900 seats in 35 minutes Cleveland played Sgt. Pepper soundtrack cuts back-to-back with Beatles originals recently, polling listener preferences. The results were surprisingly even, though PD Eric Stevens reported that the majority of soundtrack favoritism came from listeners under 18, while the Beatles supporters were mostly beyond teenaged . . . AOR Pronunciation Guide: Chris Ree-ahh; Gen-yah (Hard G) Ray-ven (even though as a member of Ten Wheel Drive she used to pronounce her name Ruh-von) . . . Recent drop-ins at WRVU/Nashville's broadcasts from the Exit Inn night club have included Waylon Jennings, Johnny Paycheck and Johnny Rodriguez . . . WJKL/Elgin is the latest AOR to send out their signal encoded by the Dolby . Linda Ronstadt joined Mick Jagger and the Stones onstage noise reduction system. in Tucson, her home town, for a duet on "Tumblin' Dice". WBBX/Portsmouth, N.H., a new Soft AOR, needs record service from all labels. Contact MD Tim Allen at (603) 436-1380 WKQX/Chicago has added a series of shorts called "Rock Reports" produced by the station's newest news staff addition, Robin Winter. She does interviews, gives updated

station's newest news staff addition, Robin Winter. She does interviews, gives updated concert information for the area and deals with other rock-world news . . . KOME/San Jose's infamous "Have You K.O.M.E. Today" double entendre billboard showed up in full color in the September Playboy . . . ZETA 4/Miami news director Tom Webb is interested in hearing from college radio stations who have produced their own public affairs programming. Contact Tom at (305) 624-9490 . . . KFDI AM (Country) & FM (AOR)/Wichita sponsored a listener appreciation party at a local amusement park with free rides, watermelon, music, and frisbee contests. The party met with great success, gathering over 14,000 fans.

Turning Back Time

WFTL/Ft Lauderdale PD Mike Harvey, who comes up with some of the most creative promotions in Pop/Adult radio, sent his afternoon personality Tom Daren on a fascinating mind excursion recently. The station had been running a series on hypnosis and last week it culminated with afternoon man Daren being hypnotised on the air. A team of professional
