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#### **KHOW Halloween Broadcast Spooks** Station Staffers

KHOW/Denver, like hundreds of radio stations across the country. decided to run a special Hallo-ween broadcast. The Pop/Adult outlet planned a remote by morning team Hal (Moore) and Charley (Martin) from a notorious "haunted house," the Croke-Patterson mansion. It sounded like a good idea, but by the time the broadcast came off, station officials felt fortunate that none of their staffers had "Croked" during the night.

Monday night (10-30), the station scheduled what might have been called a "KHOW-loween Party" (but wasn't) for the entire staff plus 36 "lucky" listeners who had solved "daily mysteries" relating to the mansion in a station contest. At the stroke of midnight, everyone but Hal and Charley were scheduled to vanish into the night, leaving the duo locked in the mansion, famed for ghosts on the staircase, poltergeists causing furniture to fly across rooms, and other psychic or psychotic incidents. At 5:30, if they survived, Hal and Charley would do the remote—a remote possibility, as it later turned

#### A Halloween Scare Package

The remote almost never happened. According to Operations Manager John Lund, as soon as the engineering staff went over to the mansion to set up the equipment, disaster struck. First, Lund told R&R, "Several staff members were hanging crepe paper and the Scotch tape wouldn't stick. In engineering, there were unbelievable problems. You always run into technical problems, but this time mikes wouldn't open, pots wouldn't operate. Engineers reported stuff falling off ceilings when they were there. One of the ladies who was setting up some material cut her hand, and she mentioned that although the cut really hurt, it did not bleed. It was a relatively small cut, but the pain was almost too much for her. By the time the staff came back, they were really psyched out."

If the staff members were psyched out following that succession of eerie events, imagine what Hal and Charley (pictured above in front of the mansion, Hal at

left) must have felt when they were locked in at midnight for fiveand-a-half hours. But the ghosts must have been in good spirits. for the KHOW morning team survived the ordeal and completed

the remote without a hitch the next morning. Still, KHOW's general attitude towards their Halloween haunted house promotion could probably be summed up in the words, "Don't mansion it."

#### CANDIDATES "REFORMATTING" STATIONS? Lengthy Political Time Buys Upheld By FCC

In a 4-2 decision Tuesday (10/31). the FCC said that WKKQ/Hibbing, MN must broadcast a five-minute program on behalf of Sen. Wendell Anderson. The Country station had offered to air as many as 75 oneminute commercials in lieu of a five-mirute program which runs counter to their programming philosophy.

Both Commissioners Robert Lee and Margita White were against the action. Reacting to the Broadcast Bureau's recommendation, which was based partly on Federal statutes and in part on published Commission interpretation of the laws, Commissioner Lee said that 'reasonable' access means that programs "should fit the format."

Commissioner James Quello, who initially raised objections and then went along with the decision, noted that candidates are reformatting stations. Chairman Charles Ferris responded to this claim saying that candidates have the "right to reasonable access." Although a station can place a time limitation from five to 45 minutes - on such a program, the Commission reaffirmed this week that politicians for Federal elections who demand program time are to be the rule rather than the exception.

The WKKQ decision is in keeping with previous FCC policy (although there is some sentiment on the Commission in favor of overhauling this rule), but the implica-

are potentially disturbing to many formatted radio stations. Under the FCC's present rule structure, for example, two opposing politicians could conceivably purchase five-minute blocs of time each hour in morning drive, taking up ten minutes an hour of radio prime time in political campaigning and playing havoc with an established format, be it music, talk, or news. Such abuses have occurred only rarely in the past, and seem unlikely to occur again, but with the 1980 election approaching and the WKKQ/Senator Anderson case as an example of what can happen, this matter is a logical area of concern for broadcasters in the near future

#### **Stations Required To** Rank Employees By Salary

In a special open session Tuesday (10/31), the FCC agreed to require broadcasters to keep a list ranking their employees on the basis of salaries, from highest to lowest. While details will be worked out by the Broadcast Bureau, certain elements are clear.

Employees' salaries will not be required, only their salary rank as compared with other station employees, their job category and sex. The list is then to be kept in the station's public file, updated once a year and submitted with the license renewal application.

Both Commissioners White and Brown raised questions regarding management/employee problems that might arise from such a list being kept in a station's public file, but felt that public interest groups should have access to the information. Radio stations faced with exposing relative pay rates among air personalities and other employees may well disagree strenuously with that practice

In making that rule, the FCC would like to better be able to monitor broadcasters' practices related to hiring minorities and females. For example, listing a minority employee whose salary is consistent with his/her job as a secretary. but carries the title of VP for station reporting purposes at renewal time (Form 395) is considered a violation.

The FCC General Counsel told the Commissioners that the new policy would be legally defended, if need be, to other government agencies and the courts as the 'least restrictive" option available. Consideration may be given to listing all employees in comparable salary range horizontally rather

#### Candidate Uses Black Radio To Provoke Campaign Controversy

WVON/Chicago has found itself in the middle of a storm of controversy surrounding a pair of paid political announcements currently running on the Black-formatted station. The spots in question are being aired on behalf of Alex Seith, the Democratic challenger to Illinois Senator Charles Percy and imply that Percy, described as an early battler for civil rights, is a racist

One spot goes: "Do you think Sen. Charles Percy is a friend of black people? Well, remember Earl

tions, reaffirmed by this new case.

Butz? He was that Secrectary of Agriculture who made a racist and sexually obscene joke about blacks. We can't repeat his words on the air, of course, but they were so offensive that he had to resign . Sen. Percy said of Earl Butz, 'I wish you were Secretary of Agriculture still today." Sen. Percy wants the black vote. With friends like this, you don't need enemies." The second explains that Butz was a foe of food stamp and free lunch programs and again links Percy to Butz.




The spots have not only irked the Percy camp, but have also attracted a great deal of attention from the local news media with local network television crews rushing down to the station to film the controversial announcement being aired. However, WVON's General Manager Ernest L. James has been quick to point out that there have been no complaints from listeners and, according to FCC rules governing paid political announcements, "We don't have the right to stop the commercial."

Percy, a 12-year Senate veteran. claims that one of the reasons he is currently trailing Seith in the campaign is Seith's clever use of the media as typified by the controversial commercials. After hearing the spots, however, several black leaders have termed Seith a racist and have rushed to contribute to Percy's campaign.

#### Presley/Ronstadt Duet Sparks Radio Listeners

A Baltimore Pop/Adult station's splice job on Elvis Presley's and Linda Ronstadt's versions of "Love Me Tender" has resulted in a cross-country radio furor similar to the situation caused by the Barbra Streisand/Neil Diamond duet, "You Don't Bring Me Flowers." The merging of Presley and Ronstadt, however, is viewed as unlikely to emerge as an actual record.

Ray Quinn, PD of WCBM/Baltimore, who conceived the idea. told R&R: "I happened to hear the Linda Ronstadt version the day we got her new album, and I thought, 'We'll play them back to back. Then I went a step further and thought, 'Why don't we try to splice them together?' We had to do a lot of work on it because Linda changes the words around, so we even had to splice some of the words around. The end result was not only do we have each of them singing verses as if they were singing to each other, but there are parts of the song where they sing together." Speed adjustments in the two versions had to be made to synchronize them, and even then the resultant tape sounded "impromptu" to Quinn, but listeners were amazed.

"The response was huge," Quinn continues, "Within a week, another station had a version on the air. Elvis collectors called and said, 'Name your price.' Radio stations are asking for copies, Rona Barrett's office with ABC-TV wanted a copy, and where it's going to lead I'll be damned if I know." Quinn withheld it from stations who requested in general, fearing that wide circulation would burn out response in case an actual record did come out later. But he provided a copy to all the stations in WCBM's chain (Metromedia) for which he felt it would be appropriate. KLAC/Los Angeles began playing it, and "last week it was our number one most requested," according to Music Director Kathy

Jim Smith has been appointed Program Director at Jazz-formatted WRVR/New York, replacing Dennis Waters, who recently became PD at WYNY in the same city. Smith had most recently been Program Director at WOKY/Milwaukee, and previously was Music Director at WLS/Chicago for several years. Smith emphasized WRVR's continuing concentration on jazz, telling R&R. "The station is committed to jazz and is growing nicely. We hope to continue on that course."

#### FIRST PLANT NEAR SCRANTON

#### WCI To Press Own Records

Warner Communications Inc. has taken the step of entering the record-pressing business, with several nationwide manufacturing plants in the planning stages. The first plant is targeted for mid-1980, and will be built in Olyphant, PA (near Scranton). A new WCI subsidiary, WEA Manufacturing, East, has been formed to operate the facility, and will be headed by local pressing plant owner Richard Marquardt. Sites for other plants are being surveyed in the Midwest and West Coast.

The new operations will press all records from WEA labels Elektra/Asylum and Atlantic as soon as the plants are ready, while Warner Bros. will avail itself of the service when its current contract with Capitol expires in 1982. All three labels use Capitol facilities for tape manufacturing, but E/A and Atlantic's pressing is handled by independent operations at present. WCI plans to offer its pressing services to other companies if feasible.

WCI's David Horowitz stressed that quality comparable to European record pressings would be a substantial concern for the American operations, which will use German technological innovations developed by WEA International.

The full-scale WCI entry into the record and tape manufacturing arena was characterized as a "major music industry development" by the company, and could help ease pressures on currently overworked pressing operations

as the record industry continues to expand.

#### Picture Disc Legal Battle On Horizon

As the picture disc in all its colorful variations establishes itself as a prime industry promotional tool and in some cases a potent retail sales attraction, areas of potential legal disagreement are cropping up. Naturally, a lucrative field like picture discs (which can retail for up to \$16 or more for single discs) attracts companies eager to get a piece of the market. And currently, demand outstrips supply, as the picture disc process is relatively slow and seemingly every record company wants them.

However, Pic Disc, Inc. is "exclusive licensee" of a patent on the process, and is warning future

competitors that it will take legal action against what it considers infringement. Pic Disc announced that it has already put Alberti Record Mfg. Co. on notice for a potential infringement, requiring that Alberti either cease and desist or prove that it's not infringing the patent.

Meanwhile, in England, it's reported that WEA will be releasing a Cars single pressed with a new, supposedly less complicated picture disc technique which should speed up the manufacturing process. As more and more companies enter the picture disc fray, legal battles seem inevitable.

### The Autumn Record Crush: Why Does It Happen?

Each fall, radio programmers find their turntables flooded with what seems to be an inordinate number of releases by "name" artists. Since playlists never seem to get any larger, many programmers find themselves in the somewhat enviable position of having too many top-class records to play.

In response to questions from many programmers curious about the underlying reasons for this annual state of affairs, R&R contacted several record executives from a variety of labels and asked. "Why is the fall release schedule so crowded with major acts?"

Dave Glew, Senior Vice President of Atlantic Records, responded, "The final quarter is the key selling period because that's when the heavy retail action begins—all the Christmas buying. You could also say it's due to consumer demand. Releases do create sales and as far as releases from major artists go, that's primarily due to whenever the artists finish their albums."

Joe Mansfield, Vice President of Marketing for Columbia Records, echoes Glew's statement regarding the responsibility of the artists. "This is a creative business," he says, "and you can't force your artists to conform to your scheduling. Albums are released when they're finished. As a matter of fact, we would have loved to have some of our acts finish their albums earlier but they didn't. So now we're holding them off until after the first of the year; otherwise, we'd just be cluttering up the stores."

#### Releases Before The Fall?

Bob Siner, Executive Vice President of MCA Records, offers a different view: "The fall quarter is an unfortunate habit in the record business. We at MCA have tried this year to begin our fall quarter releases a little earlier. The Who, Elton John, Lynyrd Skynyrd, all of them were out before the first of October. We wanted to get started before the traditional November 15th date."

Bob Reitman, Vice President of Advertising and Merchandising at A&M Records agrees, in part, with Siner. Reitman says, "There is an assumption that the bulk of the retail business is conducted within the last quarter." He adds, "however, we don't especially focus on the seasonal buyer. We like to have our product in the marketplace by September, if possible." Reitman also notes, "One can't always be so idealistic. We would have loved to have the new Cat Stevens album earlier, but it's just not going

#### **ONFAIRNESS DOCTRINE**

#### **New Court Slap For FCC**

Pointing out that the FCC failed to articulate its reasons for distinguishing four California radio stations which the Commission said did not violate the fairness doctrine from eight others found to be in violation, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia circuit has landed another blow on the FCC.

The court says that the FCC must reexamine why KPAY/Chico, KVON/Napa, KATV/San Luis Obispo and KJOY/Stockton, all California stations, were cleared of charges made by Public Media Center and several other public interest groups in 1974, alleging that ads broadcast for the Pacific Gas and Electric Company advocating the construction of nuclear power plants failed to present both sides of the issue.

The FCC had denied a petition by the eight stations found in violation of the Fairness Doctrine which asked it to reconsider its decision. After that, Public Media Center and others asked the court to review the Commission's decision regarding the four non-violators. The eight violators were KFYY/Arroyo Grande, KFRE/Fresno, KRED/Eureka, KMBY/Monterey, KROY/Sacramento, KFOG/San Francisco, KSMA/Santa Maria and KSPQ/Santa Rosa.

During the past few weeks, the federal court has come under increased criticism from FCC Commissioners and legislators for attempting to restructure FCC policy, yet this court continues to overturn the Commission's decisions at a rapid pace.

#### FCC Judge Raps Commission's Programming Policy

Lashing out at FCC programming regulations which have a "chilling effect... on an industry that is certainly not noted for its bravery or courage," an FCC administrative law judge has ruled that the license of WQAL-FM/Cleveland should be renewed for one year (R&R 10-6). WQAL's license was designated by the Commission for a hearing after proposing less than 6% non-entertainment programming in its license renewal appliction. The Commission questioned the amount, content and scheduling of such programming.

In effect, Judge David Kraushaar called the FCC its own worst enemy. He criticized the Commission for acting like an "arrogant, all-knowing 'Big Brother' "because of its arbitrary 6% FM standards. What bothers the judge apparently is the implicit threat of non-renewal of a station's license for failure to live up to FCC standards. Instead of encouraging the types of programs that give the public what it wants, these regulations actually lead to the kind of "trite" programming which the FCC publicly deplores

#### Government Dampens Diverse Expression

Particularly in markets such as Cleveland, where there are over 30 radio and TV stations, free competition should be permitted to determine what kinds of programs are broadcast, Judge Kraushaar said. Instead, government intervention dampens the potentially "robust" expression of news and opinion by diverse sources. He asked the FCC to change its policies in order to "lift unreasonable onerous burdens from the backs of broadcasters" and give licensees back their independence and individuality.

Judge Kraushaar said that SJR's past public affairs programming and the times of broadcast raised doubts about its future performance, but he felt that SJR, owner of WQAL, had tried to "lean over backward" in the case to please the FCC. As an example, SJR had increased its proposed non-entertainment programming to over 6%. Consequently he ruled that SJR clearly deserved a one-year renewal to December 1, 1979, of its license, during which WQAL could demonstrate its desire to serve the public interest.

#### Ferris Wants "Diversity" First

Last week's report of a proposed test of radio deregulation by FCC Chairman Charles Ferris can be put in better perspective because of his remarks Sunday (10/29) to convention attendees of the National Association of Educational Broadcasters.

The FCC Chairman noted that National Public Radio is providing alternative programming in the areas of public issue analysis, Congressional hearings, drama and music. If these alternatives didn't exist, Ferris explained, "it would be far more difficult to propose — even experimentally — the deregulation of radio."

Using the pet buzzword of the numerous public stations, Ferris outoned his views on "alternative" regulation. Ferris reasons that there is a direct relationship between program alternatives and government regulation—the greater the diversity of program sources, the less the need for regulation.

#### Government's "Limited Ability"

Noting in his keynote address that "government has only a limited ability to stimulate through regulation real diversity and excellence in radio and television programming," Ferris told the Washington, D.C. gathering that he supports the following: 1) full funding of public broadcasting to the tune of one billion dollars a year, 2) extension of the AM band and making a portion of it available for public radio, 3) improvement in FM radio, and 4) use of satellites for the NPR network and PBS. Also Ferris suggested that public broadcasters explore cooperative ven-

tures with 1) commercial broadcasters, 2) cable television, and 3) teletext and videodisc.

Ferris also had a few words of warning. He noted the Commission's responsibility to check out complaints from commercial broadcasters that government-supported radio is adversely affecting them by siphoning away dollars with over-the-air fund-raising activities.

#### FCC Gives Go-Ahead To Minority Tax Breaks

FCC Commissioners were told on Tuesday (10/31) that the Commission's two chief policies geared toward encouraging minority ownership of broadcast stations are working. The first, providing tax breaks for licensees who sell their stations to minorities, has already resulted in WYCH/Hamilton, OH receiving a tax credit. WAWA-AM-FM/Milwaukee was given the go-ahead on Tuesday, and it was announced that WBRB-AM-FM/Mount Clemens, Michigan, owned by Milton Maltz, will be considered in November.

The FCC's second policy, adopted on May 25, 1978, allows stations to be sold at reduced prices to minority groups by licensees who had been designated for hearing. The staff stated that several stations are already eligible and that another four or five are close to being given consideration.

#### **NAB Criticized**

In addition, the Commission has approved maintenance of two lists — one of licensees who want to sell to minorities and a second list of minorities interested in buying stations. NAB came in for criticism by the commissioners for opposing the seller's list, which FCC Commissioner Tyrone Brown termed "rather remarkable." Brown said that it is "outrageous" that any group could suggest that the marketplace is handling the situation. The criticism was offset by the Commission's acknowledgement of NAB's efforts to date.

#### "Renovation" Gains Ground In Communications Battle

The Chairman of the Senate's Commerce Committee, which oversees broadcast matters, supports Sen. Fritz Hollings's compromise approach to revising the communications law advocated two weeks ago (R&R 10/20). Speaking to a mixed crowd of radio and TV broadcasters at an NAB regional conference in San Francisco last week, Sen. Howard Cannon (D-Nev.) backed his colleague's more "cautious approach" to amending current law.

Hollings, who proposes a "renovation" rather than a "rewrite" of the Communications Act of 1934, is said to be ready to offer ideas early-on in the next Congress. However, he is expected to deal with broadcast matters secondarily. Speculation based on his speech is that Cannon most likely would support Hollings on spectrum fee, radio deregulation and standards in comparative renewal cases.

#### **Analysis**

It appears that momentum is gaining for some form of legislation in the next Congress. Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin seems to be backing away from what most of the witnesses testifying during hearings termed a radical concept. Furthermore, Van Deerlin admits that he is ready to 1) separate legislation, possibly even splitting radio off altogether, 2) forget the idea of giving money to public broadcasters from fees collected from commercial stations, and 3) plug in the "public interest standard," which had been deleted in lieu of the concept of "marketplace forces."

Differences between Senate and House versions of a new bill would ultimately have to be worked out in a conference committee. With interest in Senate for modifications — in large extent because of recent court decision — and with the leadership of the House Communications Subcommittee preparing another version of its rewrite containing less dramatic proposals, the 96th Congress which convenes in January could be the right forum for new legislation.

#### RTNDA Protests Police Impersonation Of Reporters

Impersonating an officer of the law is a crime, but law officers impersonating others is not. Recently there was an attempt by Utah police pretending to be reporters to arrest an excommunicated Mormon who refused to send his three children to public shoool.

The Radio Television News Directors Association (RTNDA) is Washington issued a statement last week deploring the police action. They noted that such events "create unneeded suspicion and fear" in the general public's mind and that its unfair to journalists who work hard to gain public trust.

#### Extra, Extra

Exclusion of radio from the Department of Energy's upcoming energy conservation campaign came as a disappointment to NAB President Vincent T. Wasilewski and Miles David, President of RAB. But they are not going to let the matter rest there. Wasilewski and David have asked Joseph L. Barrow, Jr., special assistant for marketing and planning at DOE, for an opportunity to prove that radio advertising would be beneficial to the energy conservation campaign . . .

Applications of Street Broadcasting Corp. for renewal of WIZR-AM-FM/Johnstown, NY have been designated for hearing by the Commission, which is looking into possible fraudulent billing practices

FCC awards new FM station in Hattiesburg, Miss. to 100% black-owned Circuit Broadcasting Co., denying applications of two others, including James A. McCullough, a former part owner/manager of WSWG-AM-FM/Greenwood, MS, whom the FCC said was unfit to "act as a public trustee."

"Enough is enough," said Elton H. Rule, President of ABC at a Chicago luncheon which celebrated the 20th anniversary of Infosystems magazine. He referred to excessive regulation of the communications media by government "super-regulators." In his address, Rule urged that broadcasters join with businessmen in fighting regulatory policies that "seem to be aimed at reshaping society or simply regulation for its own sake."

#### Washington Street Talk

Robert Benson will assume the office of VP, ABC Radio News beginning Nov. 13. Benson is a former News Director of WLS/Chicago and is presently Deputy Director of Broadcast for the Associated Press in New York. He will be responsible for the supervision of news programming and administration of the four ABC Radio Network Services, replacing Thomas O'Brien, who has been named Director, Radio News Operations for ABC. Making the announcement was Roone Arledge, President of ABC News.

Lionel Monagas, who has headed FCC's Industry Equal Employment Opportunity Unity in the General Counsel's Office, has moved over to the Broadcast Bureau as special assistant to the bureau's chief, Wally Johnson. Monagas will handle EEO and minority ownership matters.

FCC's Broadcast Facilities Division Chief Dave Landis plans a November retirement after 30 years with the Commission. Landis says that after he retires, "I will try to regain my health, compose a Broadway musical, and catch up on neglected reading."

NRBA Executive VP for Government Affiars Abe Voron has been named Convention Agenda Chairman in addition to his present duties. Also, NRBA plans to form an Exhibitor Committee to assist in the planning of future convention exhibits. The Committee will be headed by Tim Ives, President of Bloomington Broadcasting, Bloomington IN, and an NRBA Regional Director.

#### ABC's Nine-Month Results Show Record Gains

**The American Broadcasting Co.** reported that their nine-month net earnings climbed 20% to \$90.1 million (\$3.26 a share) from \$75 million (\$2.75 a share) for 1977. Revenues for the same period rose 18% to \$1.3 billion from \$1.1 billion a year ago.

Third quarter earnings for the company increased 14% to \$25.4 million (91 cents a share) from \$22.2 million (81 cents a share) over the same period of time last year. Sales for the third quarter, which ended Sept. 30, rose 16% to \$413.5 million from \$357 million in 1977.

ABC Chairman Leonard Goldenson attributed the gains to unusually strong showing by the broadcasting and publishing divisions.

#### Cox Reports 42% Gain

Cox Broadcasting Corp. reported that their nine-month net income rose 42% to \$23.5 million (\$3.52 a share) from \$16.5 million (\$2.73 a share) for the same period last year. Revenues for the nine months ending Sept. 30 increased 20% to \$162.9 million from \$135.4 million in 1977.

In the third quarter, the company's net income rocketed 70% to \$8.7 million (\$1.30 a share) up from \$5.1 million (80 cents a share) a year earlier. In addition, revenues for the quarter climbed 28% to \$58 million from \$45.2 million.

#### Arbitron's Radio Coverage Study Largest Ever

**Arbitron**'s Radio Coverage Study released this summer is the largest broadcast audience research project ever conducted, according to the company. The study, which covers every county within the continental United States in addition to the Honolulu and Anchorage markets, was compiled from over 395,000 diaries taken from all four survey periods.

The study is broken down into two sections: a County Report and a Station Report. The County Report shows audience estimates on a county by county or cluster county basis with each of the 50 states plus the District of Columbia having a separate report, while the Station Report covers each of the more than 160 Arbitron Radio Local Market Report areas, based on the TSA county definition of the markets being measured.

#### Pioneer To Spend \$3.5 Million On Radio, Print Ads

**Pioneer Electronics of America** announced that it will be spending \$3.5 million-plus advertising its line of car stereos and car speakers on radio and in magazines beginning next month. In addition, the company will utilize stereo radio commercials starting next year. This marks the first time that a car stereo company has ever produced radio commercials in stereo.

The campaign will begin in November with the majority of the spots not slated until next April and will consist of a combination of spot, network, and syndicated radio buys. 60-second spots carrying dealer tags have also been readied for the purpose of radio.

#### Radio Key To Africa's Communications

The Los Angeles Times reports that the number of radios in black Africa has climbed to approximately 22.5 million in 1978 from less than 500,000 in 1955. While there is one television set for every 525 people in black Africa and one edition of daily newspaper for every 210 people, there is one radio for every 20 persons. Furthermore, although newspaper circulation has decreased in these countries since their gaining independence, and the use of television risen only moderately, there is, according to the Times, "hardly a household, no matter how poor, without one (radio)."

#### SCBA Offers Minority & Women Interview Day - Nov. 8

The Southern California Broadcasters Association's Fifth Semi-Annual Employment Interview Day for Minorities and Women will be held at the Museum of Science and Industry, Exposition Park, in downtown Los Angeles on Wednesday, November 8.

The day-long event provides people who are interested in careers in radio and television with the opportunity of talking in person with managers and other station executives. Individuals wishing to be interviewed for job opportunities should call the SCBA at (213) 466-4481 to fill out an application blank and be scheduled for specific interview times. There is no charge for participation in the event.

#### "Some Girls" Voted Number One By KLOS-FM Listeners

Despite efforts by the **Rev. Jesse Jackson**'s Operation PUSH, which asserts that the title track contains a lyric offensive and demeaning to black women, last weekend the **Rolling Stones**' album, "Some Girls," was voted the number one all-time favorite LP by listeners of AOR-formatted **KLOS-FM**/ **Los Angeles**, which annually runs a poll of listener favorites.

#### U.S. Gov't Orders Firestone To Run Recall Ads

Firestone will be publicizing its recall of 10 million radial tires that the government claims pose safety hazards by utilizing prime time ads which will appear on radio, television, and newspapers. The U.S. Transportation Department will base their decision on how much advertising Firestone will have to buy on information provided by "experts" and will clear the ads, which may begin to appear within a matter of weeks.

#### FCC Announces Broadcast Station Totals

The Federal Communications Commission has announced the following totals for broadcast stations on the air as of Sept. 30, 1978: AM Radio (4538), FM Radio (3066), FM Educational (973), UHF Television/Commercial (212), VHF Television/Commercial (516), UHF Television/Educational (158), and VHF Television/Educational (102).

#### Most Teenage Girls Own Stereos, Tape Equipment

Market researchers for **Seventeen** magazine have found: nowadays teenage girls in America spend \$1.7 billion on recordings; 58% of all teenage girls own either a compact stereo or stereo components; and over 50% have their own cassette or cartridge tape players. It seems to be a "sound" basis for their upbringing.

#### **TV News**

#### ABC, CBS Each Drop A Series As Season Casualty Rate Rises

Approximately six weeks into the present TV season, the handwriting on the wall for an increasing number of new series has appeared in bold print. This week, two more shows were dropped by networks, following a pair of casualties last week. ABC and CBS each axed a series; ABC's was World War II comedy "Operation Petticoat," which failed to survive a complete overhaul and cast change designed to turn it into a seagoing "MASH." Replacing it (and "Welcome Back Kotter," which recently moved from Monday at 8 to Saturday at 8) is "Lucan," an hour-long drama about a boy raised by wolves which appeared for a limited run last season and was less than a "howling" success. It will air Mondays 8-9.

CBS cancelled new series "In The Beginning," as star McLean Stevenson continues his television series bad luck streak since being killed off in "MASH." "In The Beginning" was a comedy about a straight-laced priest and a wacky nun, but viewers failed to acquire the habit in large numbers. No replacement has been set; various specials will air in the Wednesday 8:30-9 time slot for the next few weeks.

Meanwhile, CBS has set "The Bad News Bears," based on the Little League baseball film trilogy, for a midseason replacement series, and the network has also established a new format for Mary Tyler Moore, whose "Mary" was recently cancelled. The new program, "The Mary Tyler Moore Comedy Hour," is described as a combination situation comedy/variety show, with Ms. Moore portraying the star of a weekly network variety show, aided by a cast of regulars and a weekly top-name guest star. The series debuts the first week in January.

MUSIC ON TV — The Grateful Dead appear on "Saturday Night Live" November 11 in a rare TV shot . . . Fellow San Franciscans Jefferson Starship appear on ABC's "Star Wars Holiday Special" November 17 . . . Chicago and Meco are taping upcoming "Dick Clark Live Wednesday" appearances for NBC... Daryl Hall and John Oates are set for "Midnight Special" November 10 (NBC) . . . Evelyn "Champagne" King will be on "Mike Douglas" airing in various locations throughout the month of November . . . And Wolfman Jack has been signed to "portray a corrupt deejay" in an upcoming episode of "Wonder Woman" (CBS).

#### NBC Edges ABC As World Series Finale Tops Ratings

NBC won its second straight Nielsen victory in the rating week ending October 22, with the World Series providing the decisive blow. NBC garnered an average 19.8 rating, with ABC-close behind at 19.7 and CBS trailing with a 17.8. The final game of the Series was the week's top show by some seven rating points. Next in line was NBC's "Little House In The Prairie," which seems to be unthreatened by "WKRP In Cincinnati" for rating dominance in its Monday night slot. Following were 3) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC) in a return to its old form 4) "Like Mom, Like Me," a CBS TV movie starring "Alice" 's Linda Lavin and "Family" 's Kristy McNichol 5) "All In The Family (CBS), moving into "Mary" 's vacated Sunday 8pm slot 6) "Mork & Mindy" (ABC) 7) "Alice" (CBS), filling the other half of the "Mary" time period 8) "Three's Company" (ABC) 9) "60 Minutes" (CBS), and 10) "Laverne & Shirley" (ABC). "Dick Clark's Live Wednesday," shown on Thursday that week, had a shaky week, finishing third from the bottom.

In Arbitron's rating week ending October 20, NBC made a little headway, eroding some of ABC's dominance in New York, Los Angeles, and Chicago. New York saw three World Series games in the top ten, with Games 5 and 6 running 1-2, followed by 3) NBC's Bob Hope special tied with "Mork & Mindy" 5) Game 4 6) "Rescue From Gilligan's Island" 7) "Charlie's Angels" and tied at 8) "Happy Days," "Soap," "Vega\$" (all ABC) and NBC's "World Of Disney."

"Three's Company" led the Los Angeles figures, followed by 2) "Mork & Mindy" 3) Game 6
4) "Laverne & Shirley" and "Taxi" (ABC), Game 4, and "Gilligan," and 9) "Barney Miller" (ABC) and "Charlie's Angels" tied. "Charlie's Angels" managed to tie Game 6 for the lead in Chicago, followed by 3) "Laverne & Shirley," "Vega\$," and "Three's Company" tied 6) "Happy Days" and Monday Night Football tied 8) "Gilligan" and 9) "Battlestar Galactica" and Game 5 of the Series.

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

#### Book-Readers Listen To More Radio

In what may come as a shock to those who view television as the scape-goat for America's dwindling literacy rate, a new study of the nation's book reading habits revealed that more than half of America's adults read books, television notwithstanding.

According to a recent study conducted by the firm of Yankelovitch, Skelly & White on behalf of the non-profit Book Industry Study Group, 55 Americans in 100 claim to have read a book within the past six months, and 10 out of 100 say they read 10 or more books during that time. In addition, 39 in 100 said they read magazines and newspapers, but not books, while only six in 100 claimed they didn't read anything.

The survey also indicates that those who read books spend more time listening to the radio than others, they read more newspapers and magazines, and spend more time reading them than people who read magazines and newspapers exclusively. Furthermore, the survey asserts that a disproportionate number of those who read books are female, educated, affluent, white, and young. They also tend to have more children than others. Well-to-do white housewives are the most likely to be consistently heavy readers.

Additional results of the survey showed that those who read books spend approximately as much time reading as they do watching television — 14 hours on the average spent reading as opposed to 15 hours spent watching TV. Among those who said they didn't read, the average time spent watching was 24 hours a week.

#### The Use And Misuse Of Focus Groups

he use of focus group interviews has been common in marketing research for the past 30 years. The basic notion of a focus group is to gather together a small number of consumers (i.e., listeners) for the purpose of getting their ideas about some aspect of the market. Focus groups are very open-ended and nondirective, designed to obtain qualitative rather than quantitative information. In fact, the ideal focus group interview would begin with the group moderator saying, "Tell me what you think about the radio stations you listen to," and then just sitting back and listening to the group talk for an hour and a half or two hours. Groups seldom proceed in this manner, however, as the moderator must probe more deeply to get at the meaning of respondents' statements and keep the group from heading off on a tangent. A wellconducted focus group can be an invaluable source of information, much like a "brainstorming" session among a group of radio programmers. However, focus groups can also be dangerous in that the PD may tend to place more reliance on the results than warranted.

Focus groups are based upon very small samples of people who, by definition, cannot be representative of the total market or even a key segment. Representativeness is only possible (and even then, not guaranteed) when relatively large numbers of people are sampled in random fashion from the total market. Nevertheless, recent research has shown a consistent bias on the part of managers and other decision-makers to weight concrete evidence more heavily than abstract data in making decisions. For instance, a survey might show that only 20% of your listeners enjoy listening to disco music on the radio, but if two or three people out of the focus group of eight said that they really like disco, the tendency on the part of the PD would be to overestimate the popularity of disco. It is just too vivid when you see an actual person jumping up and down screaming "I can dig it! I can dig it!," as compared with a line of agate on a white page. (As another example of this "concreteness" bias, if I could show you a focus group instead of writing about it, you'd get a lot more excited about it.) I have seen jaded marketing managers, observing focus groups through one-way glass, who have almost leaped through the glass into the focus group room to disagree with a respondent who panned their product. Watching a focus group is often a tremendous "AHA!" experience for the manager, and it is this response which leads to the over-reliance on, and misuse of focus group research.

#### **Getting Into Focus**

Let's take a closer look at this double-edged sword of focus group research and see how and where it can be applied in radio programming.

The first step in running a focus group is to decide what program areas you will be "focusing" on. For example, you may want to get reactions to some new records, or find out about radio listening habits, or probe people as to why they listen to other stations more than they do yours. The problem area will then by synopsized into a short list of general questions to ask the

group. The questions should be neutral, non-directive, and designed to solicit the respondents' own naturally-occurring feelings. For instance, the question, "What do you think about WKRP?" is much better than "What do you think of the music played on WKRP?" because the latter question presumes music to be the only important area of opinion. The first question allows the group participants to express any opinion relating to the station.

The session should be conducted by a trained group moderator. There is nothing magical about leading a focus group, but it is usually best that some neutral person — not a station employee! — run the session. This will avoid the problem of biased and leading questions.

here can you find a good group moderator? Check with local market research firms, advertising agencies, or the marketing or advertising departments of local colleges or universities. You should be able to find ten — only one person can talk at any givenmoment, so the rest are sitting there frustrated that they can't talk or are tuning out altogether. Fewer than six people can be a problem if they are all the "quiet type." Silence, particularly at the beginning of the session, can damage the congenial atmosphere sought and put a damper on the whole group.

ow many groups should be conducted? There is no easy answer to that question, because it is so dependent upon the nature of the problem, the number of important market segments, etc. In general, the more important the decision which is riding on the research, the more focus groups should be run. For example, if the station is undertaking a format change, more groups are needed than in, say, a weekly music research effort. With respect to segments, it is usually desirable to keep the groups relatively homogeneous. For example, you may run two groups of 18-24 year-olds and two groups of 25-34 year-olds. In some cases, you may want to segregate males and females. As a general rule of thumb, you should always run at least two groups for any given problem and any given segment. This procedure will help to avoid the error of a highly idiosyncratic group leading you astray because of its "wild and crazy" responses.

an experienced moderator who will conduct the group for \$200 per session or less. If you want the moderator to write a report, which I don't recommend, the cost will be higher. I recommend against the report because it tends to lend more formality to the focus group results than they deserve. It is far better that you personally observe the group or listen to a tape of it (many groups are even videotaped) and form your own impressions. The key thing to remember is that they are just impressions and not hard data.

#### Research In The Parking Lot

The focus group should be run in a relaxed, neutral setting. Many market research firms have rooms outfitted just like your living room, except they have a complete sound system and observation rooms hidden behind large mirrors. One firm in L.A. has a large recreational vehicle decorated inside as a living room, so the focus group can be run right in a shopping center parking lot or next to a line waiting to buy concert tickets.

arket research firms will recruit group participants to meet your specifications. Depending upon the nature of the group you want, the cost will vary. Respondents are generally paid \$10 or thereabouts for a one to two hour session. The ideal size for a group is eight to ten people, so most firms will "overrecruit" by two people to be sure that a large enough group is obtained. I would not recommend trying to work with a group larger than

To summarize, here is a brief checklist to follow in conducting focus group research:

- ★ Decide on the problem to be studied.
- ★ Use only neutral, non-directive questions.
- \* Have a trained group moderator.
- ★ Find a neutral, comfortable site for the session.
- \* Strive för an informal, relaxed atmosphere.
- ★ Observe the group yourself if possible.
- **★** Tape the session for future reference.
- **★** Over-recruit respondents.
- **★** Pay the respondents for participation.
- **★** Do not place heavy reliance on findings.

Focus group research is a useful exploratory tool and a good supplement to quantitative research, but is a wolf in sheep's clothing if used on a stand-alone basis. It can eat you alive. So, use focus groups in your research effort, but always distrust them until you can verify the findings by another more reliable method.

For more information on focus groups, there is an excellent chapter on "Group Interviewing" in the Handbook of Marketing Research, edited by Robert Ferber, and published by McGraw-Hill, 1974.





I talked to a lot of programming people this week who were seriously considering some form of "airplay" on the new Steve Martin album. When you think about it, that's a pretty sound idea

If there ever was a time that one particular person so invaded the minds and vocabularies of America in such a positive way, I don't remember when it was. Everywhere you go people are doing Steve Martin imitations. He is truly a mass-appeal phenomenon.

So, out comes his new album (complete with his already gold single, "King Tut") and is it selling big? Oh, yes. But radio generally does not play comedy albums, and for a reason that has gone unquestioned for a long time: where does a music station program non-music? My answer would be anywhere that you want listeners.

Lots of stations put the majority of their personality and talk in the AM drive period. Fine. Let your AM person use the album as a little comedy relief on occasion. Several of the most successful Pop/Adult jocks in the country have regularly used comedy albums as a part of their daily shows. I don't mean play the whole thing start to finish (there is a slight language problem with Martin's new LP) but why not find self-contained 60 to 90-second bits to play as vignettes?

His popularity is unquestionable, so the demand is already there. Obviously the number of times you can repeat a comedy bit from an album is far less than a musical selection because once you've heard it a couple of times, you've heard it. But, even so, it seems that if your audience demographic is anywhere between birth and death, Steve Martin's kind of humor could only help your station. I'm not promoting airplay on his album, but I am saying that entertainment is entertainment regardless if the performer sings or talks. Didn't Steve Martin sell out every single performance he gave on his national tour? Sure . . . and this time he played some of the big halls where Linda Ronstadt and Chicago play. I'd even bet that some of the people who bought tickets to see Steve are the same ones that bought tickets to see Linda and they probably sample your radio station. It's a thought.

A reminder to all readers of R&R: you do not have to be a music reporter to this newspaper to contribute photos, station news, staff changes or ideas. If you seem to read about the same stations time and time again, it's not because we like them any better than your station. It's only because they contribute things to us regularly and you don't. I would encourage every station to appoint one member of your staff to be your R&R reporter for news and events. When there is something going on at your radio station, let us know. If you have pictures of interest, send 'em in. We really do want to hear from you and if you think of it as "hyping" to send things to R&R... try thinking of it as "sharing." If you've ever read about even one good idea in R&R, then you should get on the ball and contribute one back that we can share with everyone. #### Barbra, Gary & Neil

By now everyone in America should be aware that Barbra Streisand and Neil Diamond have recorded a duet entitled, "You Don't Bring Me Flowers." The song was written by Neil along with Alan and Marilyn Bergman but the concept of Barbra and Neil singing it together came from Gary Guthrie at WAKY/Louisville.

That fact may also be well-known among us radiophiles, but the way it all happened is a story worth telling. Last November, Gary and his wife were in the midst of a divorce. Their parting was not at all a stormy one; in fact the two are still very good friends. Gary explained that he was looking for a "going-away" present for his wife. "I had heard Diamond sing this song and noticed the response it evoked in my wife and other women. They thought it was goosebump city, but I kept thinking there was something missing."

Gary discovered the missing ingredient when he heard Streisand's version of the same song released on her album in April. He immediately got the idea of putting the two versions of the song together and creating a "duet of superstars". His next stop was the fourtrack production studio at WAKY, where he spent six hours creating. "I had to vary the speed of her voice just a hair because it was a little out of sync with his. Then I took Neil's first verse and followed it with her second verse and came back with both of them doing the chorus and reprise." After a couple of more production room sessions, he had it right.

And right on the air it went ... WAKY morning man Bill Bailey premiered it one Monday morning and the phone calls began. But the initial calls to the station (all positive) were followed by some not so positive calls to local record shops. Irate boyfriends and husbands were upset over not being able to purchase the special version for their ladies. The demand became quite large, bigger than Gary had imagined.

Word got around, thanks to mentions in industry trade publications, including R&R, and soon other stations in Chicago, Detroit and elsewhere began airing their own versions of the Diamond/Streisand duo.

Columbia Records, meanwhile, was getting wind of what was happening. Gary decided to send his version to Columbia President Bruce Lundvall in New York. Bruce's reaction as reported by Gary: "... He flipped out and called Neil and his manager and played it for them over the phone." Diamond's reaction was also very positive; in fact he wanted to include the song on the current album he was recording at the time. Neil asked Bruce to contact Barbra and Jon Peters, Streisand's manager to see if the necessary arrangements could be made for the actual recording of the song.

I'm sure many more coast-to-coast phone calls followed before the final "yes" came from both parties, but it finally was "yes" and the historic recording was made. The record was rush-released by Columbia and, as they say, "the rest is history." The song was added by nearly 80% of the Top 40 reporters to Radio & Records within its first ten days of release. The name value of the two stars together made airplay almost mandatory, but the response nationally already is paralleling what had first taken place in Louisville.

The whole thing has made Gary a big celebrity within Louisville, and it now looks like national coverage is following fast. Gary told me, "I've gotten a lot of press out of the thing; in fact, People Magazine has already contacted me and they'll be running an article in the next couple of weeks. I get a lot of calls from newspapers around the country as more and more of them become acquainted with the story."

Now the big question. What about compensation? There really is no precedent for this sort of occurence, and the sticky situation of "payola" could enter into the picture, although not in the usual form. Gary, should he get monetary consideration from Columbia Records, wouldn't be accepting payola for playing a record. But would he be judged as having done anything wrong in taking payment for his idea? I think not. What he has done for Columbia is certainly worth something to the company, and they do usually pay a "finder's fee" to people who bring them new songs or new groups. What Gary has done is simply supply Columbia with what is apparently going to be a very successful *idea*. Representatives of Columbia and Gary are discussing the situation, and they have already indicated that they want to pay Gary something for his work. I guess the main problem is simply to iron out in advance any legal ramifications of a record company giving money to a radio station employee under any circumstances. A wise consideration, in view of the possible problems.

Whatever the outcome, Gary is obviously thrilled that his idea has already gone so far so fast. I congratulate him on both the originality of the idea and his willingness to pursue it. I'm sure Barbra and Neil thank him too!

SEATTLE SLEUTH RIDES AGAIN: I've written about some great creative contests coming out of Seattle before, and I have another one to report this week. KJR/Seattle is running a "Money Mystery Game" in which listeners first listen to a station-produced mini-mystery and then try to guess how Lt. Stewart Street, the detective character in the story, figures out the crime. Each mystery is professionally produced using Seattle voice talent, and the station even hired a professional mystery writer to come up with the stories. Lt. Street's voice is very reminiscent of actor Jack Nicholson, and the narrator of each episode sounds very much like the late Walter Winchell. The prize value for each solved mystery varies with the difficulty of the crime, and listeners must really "tune-in" to catch every clue and possible tip. The response has been very strong, according to PD Steve West. Potential players must first enter the contest by filling out entry blanks at local sponsor locations, and then upon hearing their name announced on the air, call the station within an allotted time to play the game. The contest takes about three minutes to play on the air, but people are trying to figure them out whether they actually competing or not. The contest is not only "forcing" extra listening, but it's very entertaining as well. Another great contest idea from the Northwest.

NEW YORK LISTENER NOT LOAFING: 99X/New York's continuing campaign has asked listeners to send in lists of their likes and dislikes in music. Several times throughout the day the station reads one of the letters on the air and features a favorite song of the person who submitted the letter. PD Bobby Rich handles a Sunday evening airshift each weekend, but on one particular Sunday evening he was to host a 99X staff party at his home in Stamford, CT. He prerecorded his show for that Sunday, and was going to air a very special listener's letter during the shift. A 16-year-old girl from Bobby's home-city of Stam-ford had written a very long and detailed list of her favorites and included a group of her least favorites. The letter's length and sincerity made it apparent that she was quite a fan of 99X, so Bobby planned a special surprise for her. The recorded show began at 8pm and everyone on the 99X jock staff was at Bobby's house. He read the letter on the air at about 8:30pm and then called from his house to the young listener's house to see if she had been lisshe had. Bobby then proceeded to thank her for taking the time to write and one by one had each of the 99X personalities get on the phone to say hello. The girl was in shock but the best was yet to come. On her list of "least liked" songs was every title Meat Loaf had ever released. Coincidentally, Mr. Loaf was attending Bobby's party that evening, so he too got on the phone with the young listener who wasn't exactly his biggest fan. She was immediately apologetic, but Meat told her that the next time he played a New York area concert, she would be his special guest with VIP treatment and backstage privileges. He assured her that once she saw him in concert, she'd feel differently about his music. She willingly accepted the invitation, but you have to wonder, once she hung up the phone, if she really believed the entire phone call. I mean, how often do you hear from the entire staff of your favorite station, plus an artist you went "on the record" as disliking? I wonder what she told her friends the next day in school?

QUICK BITS: PRO-FM/Providence recently conducted a listener poll to determine the Top 92 of all time. The 92 songs were then counted down in order during a special weekend promotion, and the station had printed editions of the "Rock Wars 92" available for the asking. WRKO/Boston, in conjunction with RSO Records, had 75,000 "Willy B" book-covers printed for distribution at Boston area schools. Willy B, who is WRKO's 6-10pm personality, hand-delivers the bookcovers during his many school appearances. UFO's continue to be a big topic of popular discussion, and WNBC/New York will air an 18-part mini-documentary on the subject. The show, called, "UFOs, The Facts And The Speculation." has already started airing. Each segment is 90 seconds long and is hosted by UFO authority Lee Spiegel, who is a close associate of "Close Encounters" producer/director Steven Spielberg. Trips have always been great radio contest giveaways, but have you ever considered giving away a trip to your own city? KFRC/San Francisco offered its listeners a chance at an all-expenses-paid weekend for two in the world's most exciting city. San Francisco. Great idea for promoting your own town, and an easy-to-use giveaway for a contest.

Todd Storz (who created Top 40 radio) and his famous national programmer Bill Stewart were at KOWH in Omaha and (I found out later) got me a job offer in Denver at KIMN and the Mutual Intermountain Network. (It's always been common practice to get competitors out of the market and a better job because it disrupts the flow of programming). PD Ted Nelson hired me for the morning show at KIMN, Ken Palmer was with Clarke-Brown Radio Reps at the time with offices at our studios. They helped me to utilize a broader and hopefully more sparkling personality. (I feel every station helped to strengthen my knowledge of the biz and I don't regret any of the early moves).

Ken is, of course, one of the most respected broadcasters in the country and Ted is Vice President of the Las Vegas Hilton, bringing them millions of dollars a year through conventions.

From lovely revneD (we often pronounced the city's name backwards in the mid-50's) the maryelous McLendon chain escalated me to another plateau.

Don Keyes, Gordon's creative National PD, hired the for that powerful bunch of cookin' stations (KLIF/Dallas, KILT/Houston, KTSA/San Antonia, and WNOE/New Orleans, owned by McLendon's father-in-law, former Governor James A. Noe.) There were so many great people who befriended me: Elliot Field, Buddy McGregor, Bruce Hayes, Ken Knox, Bob Stevens, Jack Elliot, Don French, Doug China, Gene Crockett, Eddie Dunn, Bud Connell, Harry Burrell, Bill Stanley, Jim Stewart, Larry Fischer, Dick Morrison, Jack Fiedler, Joel A. Spivak, Joel Somerset, Jimmy Noe, Jr., Bill Weaver, Joel Sebastian and I hope I haven't left any old chums out . . . but as you know, your memory is the second thing to go!

John Box hired me for the Balaban stations and offered a choice of working in Milwaukee, Dallas or St. Louis. I chose St. Loo because it was the largest market of the three and the money that was paid in that city at the time was unbelieveable. At least seven personalities were making over \$60,000 a year in 1958! (Jack Carney was Program Director; Sam Holman, Bob Osborn, Dick Clayton, Ed Bonner, Reed Farrell — all great D.J.'s made up the staff. Stan Kaplan was our phenom sales manager and Jerry Blum a wowser of a salesman.) It was fun there until a tornado leveled the house next to mine in Brentwood and a job offer was held dangling carrot-like from Chuck Blore with Crowell-Collier in L.A.

This amazing conglomerate had just purchased KLX in the S.F.-Oakland area and was changing it from a classical music station owned by the Oakland Tribune to a personality rocker like their proud grand poobah KFWB in Hollywood. My love for the West Coast was overwhelming and my Nietzschean overtones of super-belief in myself helped shuffle the darker quadrants of my mind westward. (I don't know what I meant by that. I read it on the back of a matchbook cover belonging to Edgar Allen Poe.)

to be ready until December 1st and we're just going to have to live with that."

As to exactly how much business is conducted within the last quarter, none of the executives surveyed could give definite figures; however, estimates ranged from Mansfield's "30% of the entire industry's sales", to Siner's "40 to 50% during November and December."

In support of these figures, Joel Borowka, Executive Vice President of The Music Agency, a marketing firm which numbers among its clients Arista Records and Private Stock Records, estimated that "40% of our clients' business is done in the six week span from November 28th to Christmas." At any rate, the last quarter obviously accounts for far more than 25% of the record industry's business. Interestingly, none of the executives surveyed felt that recent price increases to \$8.98 would have any effect on sales volume or consumers' buying patterns.

### Rating Facts And Breaking Acts

When asked if the fall ARB in any way contributed to the release schedules or company game plans, the consensus was, in Borowka's words, "It's a factor, but not too strong." Mansfield observed that the fall meant no more than any other ARB and that, furthermore, there seemed to be very little of the year any more during which there wasn't some sort of measurement going on. Glew and Siner commented that with major acts ratings periods posed no special problem, while Reitman noted that "when you have a hot record going into an ARB there is a tendency for radio to stay on the album longer and thus boost sales."

Although both Glew and Mansfield denied that there was any communication between competing companies (no one holds back a week while the other label releases its major acts, etc.) both Reitman and Siner agreed that some informal communication exists. However, they were quick to

point out that such an exchange of information didn't affect matters. The basic philosophy is, as Mansfield put it, "A smash record always goes on the radio"

While traditionally the last quarter has been viewed as an unfavorable time of the year to attempt to break new acts, opinions varied as to whether that was true nowadays. Glew maintains that the only way to approach new acts during the last quarter is to try and get them started as early as possible-like November. Reitman, on the other hand, cites the positive, upward trend in retail during this time-there are more people in the stores and they are buying more-as being an advantage. Mansfield points out Columbia's current success with Toto as proof that it is possible to break new acts during this traditionally difficult period. Borowka claims there are advantages and disadvantages to every quarter and that the determining factor lies with each company's release schedule, based upon whether or not their own promotion and marketing forces can do justice to the act.

### "Taking Advantage Of Opportunities"

Such coordination of efforts and scheduling doesn't necessarily mean that a company develops a long-range game plan and adheres to it. Glew notes that such long-range planning is "pretty much impossible" due to artists' inability to deliver work on exact schedules. Borowka says the only sort of game plans one can have is preplanning the merchandising and marketing campaigns that will accompany the album's release and being prepared to give an album concentrated effort if and when it takes off. Reitman sums up these feelings by saying, "Albums call their own shots. All we can do is take advantage of the opportunities."

In conclusion, the most obvious answers regarding the glut of albums from major acts being released during the last quarter are a) an increase in retail activity due to holiday buying and b) the simple inability to control the artists' creative processes, making it impossible to deliver albums as scheduled. As Joe Mansfield mentioned earlier, "This is a creative business."



### What's In Store For Radio Playlists — — The Function Of Store Reports

This week we'll continue with our evaluation of Black Radio's most important ingredient — the music. Last week we discussed merchandising, in-store play, and hyping of stores from a record company point of view. Now we turn to radio's perspective on store reports, talking to WCIN/Cincinnati Program Director Bob Long and WLOU Operations Manager/PD Sheretha Tinsley.

Because they've had difficulty in getting accurate store reports, and for many other reasons, several BPR stations have dropped numbered playlists. Long and Tinsley have differing views on this important question. Long, whose station recently dropped its numbers, stated: "The numbers to me were nothing more than a tool for record companies. I got the impression that promotion reps calling on this radio station could find out their record was number 5 or 6 or whatever, and that would be an added influence to use on a station in another market.

I saw it as being a personal thing for the record companies. It really had no validity as far as helping the radio station in any form. I equate records to people buying cars or clothes. They hear a record enough, they like it or they don't like it. The same is applicable with cars. They see a car and they buy it or they don't buy it."

Tinsley, however, finds a useful function for numbers — the stores in her market like them. "We've considered not using numbers, but the reason we keep them is because a lot of the stores have requested that we keep them. They can determine how to stock their stores by the numbers. Also, a lot of the other stations here — the Top 40 stations — are getting their music from us. This may be unique to this market, with us being the only Black-formatted station, but at this point, they depend on the numbers as to whether a record is going to cross with them or whatever."

### Store Reports Or Store Rapport

Our programmers' contrasting opinions on numbered playlists causes them to evaluate store reports differently, as we'll see, but both WCIN and WLOU use them. Tinsley explains, "We call to see how a record is moving, or whether it's moving or if they have had any requests for it. We have about ten stores that we call." Long says, "We call five stores per week on a rotating basis. We'll pick five stores for a particular week and get the basic rundown on what kind of action they are receiving on the various pieces of product we're playing or are not playing. I am very interested to see what people are buying that we might not be playing

at that particular point in time. I work on a 1-5 point system, 5 being the highest points a record can receive, based primarily on store reports."

How important are these store reports for evaluating a radio station's music? Tinsley puts a high value on them: "They are pretty important because they're a good determiner of the listening patterns of a person — whether they want female or male artists, slow or fast, disco beat, or whatever. It's a pretty good determiner for what the people want, and the instore people know, they deal with these people every day. It's their business, and they can give us a pretty good judgement. And we have a good rapport with these people, so they can give us a good judgement on how a record is doing."

Long is a little more cautious: "They are very important, but I ask myself how much validity can I really place on a store report unless I have really made contact, and that's what I've tried to do with the majority of stores in the city. I have tried to maintain a rapport over the ten years I've been in this market with the various stores, and to concentrate on one individual who would be in tune to what is happening."

### The Danger Of Hyper-Active Store Reporters

Long worries that store reports can easily be influenced by hype. "Often you might run into situations where you've got a stock person who would come on the phone and give you his indication as to the best records, and this could lean to a 'my favorite record' type of thing as opposed to what actually is moving out of the store." Tinsley, on the other hand, feels her safeguards protect against hyping. "That doesn't affect us. The people we deal with know what job we're trying to do. We've gotten that across. They know we are trying to do an effective job, and so they don't even get into that" (hyping).

### **Alternatives To Store Reports**

Thus far, we've seen that store reports are still important, but that there are dangers in relying on them too heavily, and that stations must make extensive efforts to insure that they're getting accurate reports. We asked our programmers what methods they use besides store reports to evaluate their music. Tinsley said, "We have what we call a record jury, where each of our five announcers listens to all the music that come in, all of the singles. We listen to about 100 a week, and then we vote on them as to whether we like them — good, fair, or excellent. At that point, we turn it over to our Music Director, who then takes a tally of the votes. If a record ties, we send it back to the jury and vote again.

"I came up with the idea because so much pressure was on our Music Director. Now the pressure is not so much on him, but on the jury as a whole."

Long suggests looking at reports of additions in other markets. "You give a breakout of what is being added around the country. This is not to say that because a record happens in Philadelphia, Chicago, or New York, it's going to happen in Cincinnati. However, I look at it from this standpoint: if the gentlemen in those markets have researched their markets and know their jobs, and I see a number of them adding the same record, then I have to say to myself if I haven't listened to that record, 'Hey, let me pull this record out and give it a listen,' because all these individuals cannot be wrong in what they are hearing for their market. Generally speaking, if a record has that hit quality, then it's going to be a hit pretty much around the country."

As we've said, music is the most important component of your radio station. Whether you're using a numbered playlist or not, it can only help you to examine all the possibilities of researching your music, to make sure you're playing what your listeners want to hear. Next week, we'll discuss clocks, and how to play your music most effectively.

The collective goal of the group is to better Black programming and address themselves to problems that are unique to programming Black music. This is done by what's termed a 'mind bank' (which is, of course, other programmers). They help each by exchanging programming tips and ideas covering all facets of a station's operations. They have also been involved in some community projects for members, such as going into Little Rock, Arkansas to assist black record retailers, plus helping to register members for the NAACP. Speakers will include former FCC commissioner Ben Hooks, now National Director for the NAACP and Ed. W. Wright, co-founder and Executive Vice President of the Black Music Association...



### Grass Roots Syndication — Evolution Of A Syndicated Show

"There were plenty of times that I looked around the air studio and wondered whether I was in the right business. I kept thinking of that Harry Chapin song, 'WOLD.' Being a disc jockey seemed such a temporary stage of growth." If Gabriel Wisdom's words strike familiar chords with thoughts you have had while on the air, you may want to consider doing

what he has done: starting your own syndicated radio show. "I think anybody with ten years of radio experience is ready for syndication," Wisdom said, "especially if he has a full-time job at a top twenty market station. There is always going to be something going on in town of cultural significance, something the rest of the country would be interested in hearing about."

Wisdom is his own rule's exception: "The Joyful Wisdom Program" began at the same time as his radio career. "I had always wanted to do radio, and when KPRI/San Diego came on in 1968 with a freeform progressive musical approach I knew that's where I'd fit in. I managed to convince the station GM to replace their Sunday morning traditional religious programming with a program I would put together which combined pseudoreligious music (Donovan, Beatles et al) with philosophic

ideologies of the era. I did that program at KPRI for about four years, then put it aside for awhile to await new inspiration for doing the show; I didn't want to go over the same old ground. It wasn't until a few years later when I was working across the figurative street at KGB that I started up the show again at the suggestion of PD Rick Leibert."

"This time," Wisdom continued, "I saw the show as a radio magazine; sort of a philosophical Rolling Stone. I could see that musicians' opinions had the same clout with our generation that politicians do with our parents, so I decided to go to rock artists for interviews and opinions. But I wasn't going to ask them the traditional 'how long have you been playing' stuff. Rather I was asking them, 'what are your philosophic and scientific interests.' "

Wisdom did not consider syndicating the resultant weekly program for years; it was done as a means to further his own growth and awareness. It was only when others at the station began suggesting the idea that he began thinking seriously about it, and the idea was cemented when Tim Leary joined the show's regular cast. "I was in law school at night, thinking then that I would segue from being a disc jockey to a media lawyer (I later discovered that wasn't my aptitude) when I met Tim Leary. I had been reading the classic, 'People vs Tim Leary' case and a professor of mine had painted quite a grand image of Tim, likening him to a modern day Socrates. I saw him as someone who had something valid to say and who should have a forum for his statements so after interviewing him for the program I asked him to join the show on a regular basis."

Wisdom credited Leary's association with the program with providing sufficient national interest in the show for him seriously to consider syndication for the first time. At first the shows were carried by several stations belonging to a phoneline network devoted primarily to alternative news features, developed by KMET News Director Ace Young. But the cost of the phone lines made the venture commercially unfeasible at the time, so as that company went under, Wisdom searched for a new way to market his program. A friend of Leary's offered to provide funds to put a sample representative show on discs, and here, Wisdom explained, is where the program can into its initial syndication problem. "We overextended ourselves too soon. We tried to take on too many expenses and go on too many stations before we could afford it in terms of money or manpower. We should have gone on five stations in the country and grown from there, strategically and exponentially. Luckily we were not wiped out by this, and learned from our early mistakes. It never hurts to make mistakes in syndication, especially early on, so long as they're not so expensive that they don't wipe you out."

Now the administrative, detail-oriented end of the Joyful Wisdom Program is carried out through Glynn Sands, a San Diego-based program production company and distributorship. They arrange for station hook-ups with the show, keep in contact with the stations and make publicity arrangements. Additionally they are responsible for securing national advertisers for the program (which has just picked up the Penthouse science fiction magazine Omni as a national sponsor).

Wisdom is still responsible for writing and producing the majority of the programs, spending as many as ten hours a week working overnights in one of KGB's production studios. But now many of the interviews and other features are farmed out to friends and assosciates, which has proven to be another key to the program's success, according to Wisdom. "Tim Leary taught me that it isn't 'lonesome genius' that creates successful projects, but synergy; hooking up with people who have similar interests and goals. You have to be willing to 'share the wealth' by putting your creative friends together, getting them as excited about your project as you are, and creating a system from which everyone can benefit. The reward may be monetary or it might just be the knowledge they will gain towards one day knowing how to do their own syndicated show."

Most important to the sustained success of his or any other syndicated effort, Wisdom maintained, is keeping a longterm goal in mind. "It's just a matter," he said, "of being there and doing it week by week. You have to really go for the long term; plan on three years

of efforts before you break even. But anyone under forty has plenty of time to start something now and wait it out." Wisdom is a firm believer in the future of radio syndicaton, not only because it fills programming needs and creators' wallets, but because it fulfills the creative goals which brought us into radio in the first place (often to be stymied by tightly-structured formats). Each completed show brings to Wisdom a unique sense of accomplishment: "Every time I do this project it renews my love affair with this industry."


"The times they are a'changin' " at CHOM-FM/Montreal, whose progressive AOR musical stance is about to undergo a facelift under the direction of new station consultants John Pirakal and Dave Charles. Both are lifestyle researchers for the Burkhart-Abrams consultation firm. Under their tutelage CHOM's musical policy will undergo a gradual change toward a greater balance of more familiar music from their current heavy emphasis on new product. According to station MD Rob Braide the staff is optimistic that the upcoming changes will enable the station to enlarge its current demographic appeal.

WOMEN TAKE NOTE: Denise Oliver, PD at 98ROCK/Baltimore, called with a worthy idea which she asked me to share with R&R's readers. She is interested in starting an informal job-hunting service to help professional women broadcasters find work in all formats of radio. She will make every attempt to help place talented women broadcasters with stations looking for same, and all free of charge. She asks that she hear only from women who have had some professional commercial air experience (in other words, no beginners), as her task will be mammoth enough even with those self-imposed limitations. And please note, no phone calls. Women are invited to send air checks and resumes to Denise at 98 Rock, 3800 Hooper Ave., Baltimore, Md. 21211. And of course, radio programmers are invited to get in touch with Denise at the same address to notify her of airstaff openings.

In last week's AOR column page piece on AOR experiments with the television medium we neglected to mention an important fore-runner in such experimentation. Last October KZEW/Dallas brought together Billy Joel, Rusty Weir, Michael Murphey, Charlie Daniels and War for a free concert that was videotaped for airing on area television. While the acts donated their time for the promotional benefit of the show, there were an additional \$20,000 worth of expenses involved in the show's taping. The station rented a medium-sized hall for the event and gave away all the seats for the special performance over the air. Rusty Weir acted as host while three stationary cameras and two mini-cams filmed the proceedings for later editing by show producers Mark Christopher and Ivan Braiker. The seven-hour taping was cut into an hour and forty-five minutes of music with a 24-track stereo sound mix. The show was done as the station's major Fall Arbitron promotion and as a "thank you" to its loyal listeners. The music provided KZEW with cuts they still use in their oldies rotation. While the logistics of the show's staging were, according to KZEW PD Christopher, "enough to make you want to pull your hair out," the station considered the show a total success and is already planning for another one to feature a major AOR artist for the Spring ratings period.

### Update

KZAP/Sacramento celebrates ten years of AOR broadcasting on November 8th, and in commemoration of the station's community efforts over that period of time Sacramento Mayor Philip Isenberg has declared that date as "KZAP Day." The station has already begun its birthday celebrations, with KZAP birthday parties held at local night clubs where listeners are treated to free food, beverages, or music. Additionally the station will empha-

size its decade-long history over a ten-day period by spotlighting the most popular albums of each year since 1968, each year getting a day's worth of special programming. Happy tenth, KZAP . . . KYYS/Kansas City is taking advantage of the football fans who have chosen to turn down the sound on their TV sets in favor of the commentary offered over CBS radio affiliates (see R&R "Mediascope" for October 20th). When the Kansas City CBS affiliate KMBZ opted not to take the commentary, KYYS decided to take it aboard. The show will fill three hours every Monday night, from 8-11, and also gives the station the opportunity to carry the audio feed from next year's Superbowl . . . WZMF/Milwaukee held a "flipathon" — a gymnastics demonstration as a benefit for the Wisconsin Society for the Prevention of Blindness. Young athletes were sponsored by local merchants who pledged a certain amount of money for every gymnastic feat their athletes performed. Over \$6000 was raised . . . KLBJ/Austin was the official co-sponsor of the Texas State Frisbee championships which drew over 2000 spectators and 500 throwers . . . KEZQ/Little Rock staged its own flea market, selling tables for \$10 and admissions for 50 cents. The \$2,700 proceeds all went to support the city's zoo.

Nick Vanderhorst has been named as the new night-time air personality at WDIZ/Orlando, from QFM96/Columbus. He replaces departing Brock Whaley . . . ### Color

BIG BUCKS SHOW: ZETA 4/Miami offered two listeners tickets for a special Leon Russell concert appearance locally. In addition the drawing winners received a free dinner and limo service to and from the show. What elevates the promotion out of the ordinary ticket giveaways was the concert's price: the seats offered were \$100 tickets for a show whose ticket price range was from \$22.50 to \$100 apiece!

CONCERT FM: WSHE/Miami is programming twenty minute sets of live music from popular AOR artists' albums five times a night. The "Concert FM" series has proven very popular with listeners who can find out which artists are being aired by checking the station's regular ads in the local TV section of the newspaper. KREM-FM/Spokane's "World Series of Concerts" is a weeklong retrospective of some of the station's best concert tapes, from Joni Mitchell to AC-DC. The hour-long series of specials aired nightly beginning at ten.

BEATLEMANIA CONTINUED: The Beatles continue to provide all of radio, AOR included, with some of its most popular promotions. WZXR/Memphis's "Beatles A-Z" ran all 208 Beatles songs in alphabetical order, from "Across The Universe" to "You've Got To Hide Your Love Away" (should've been "Beatles A-Y" but MD Frank Kelly said the former sounded better and caused less confusion on the air). By the way, with breaks and commercials it took the station eleven hours to run through the songs. Meanwhile, WYNY/New York, instituting a new format recently with two solid weeks of Beatles music, received such ecstatic listener response that they intend to make every other song heard each Sunday a Beatles tune.

### Chart Summary

The second week of ratings saw more massive play of big names, the chart looking like a veritable greatest hits of AOR package. JOEL jumped straight to the top with hots at 73% of our reporters plus significant medium reports (now being included in the Airplay/40 chart based on information from this week's 124 reporters). LINDA is right behind with hots at 75% of our reporters. STE-WART showed up strongly in both hots at 63% of our reporters and mediums as well. YOUNG registered massive airplay increases everywhere, as did CHICAGO, YES and VAN held steady as ELTON and SANTANA inched up. 10CC had a good week and **CARS** maintained. **NUGENT** and TOTO showed growth while TULL held their own. SEA LEVEL is building nicely. STEELY was this week's highest debut, based primarily on airplay of the album's one previously unreleased cut, with adds at 35% of our reporters. BOC and PLAYER bounced back as IAN and SOUTH-SIDE JOHNNY moved up. ARMATRADING debuted with adds at 27% of our reporters. MARTIN and AEROSMITH both debuted with good adds, plus early mediums and hots. RUSH almost charted.



### **News Notes**



MOTHER MAYBELLE CARTER'S funeral was as warm and beautiful as we remember her to be: Johnny Cash officiated, reading from the Gospel of John, 14th Chapter, and as he spoke of her, Cash said he'd never heard her say an unkind word about anybody. Tom T. Hall, playing guitar, led the congregation in singing "Keep On The Sunny Side," Chet Atkins played "Wildwood Flower" (the Carters brought Chet to Nashville), the Oak Ridge Boys sang "That's Just Like Jesus," Earl Scruggs played her "You Are My Flower," and Jan Howard sang "Where No One Stands Alone." Cash read dozens of messages from people whose lives had been touched by Mother Maybelle. President Carter's message said: "Mother Maybelle was a poet who wrote from her heart and captured the hearts of those who heard. She taught us that the circle will be unbroken." While Earl Ball played "Wildwood Flower" on the piano, dozens stood to say what Mother Maybelle meant to them. As the family passed the bronze casket, the congregation sang "Will The Circle Be Unbroken." After a brief graveside ceremony, Tom T. Hall led the crowd in singing "Amazing Grace" as the family, each carrying a longstemmed red rose, moved down the hill to go home. It was a celebration of love for all those who knew her and her dedication as a Christian. Mother Maybelle Carter, to date, is undoubtedly the most influential woman in country music history. None of us will soon forget.


### Sports Play-By-Play . . . Radio's Turn-On

It seemed all too typical. The Oakland Raiders scratched back from a trailing position early in the game to take a comfortable lead. Their opponents, the San Diego Chargers, then put on one of the most dramatic fourth quarter "never say die" rallies of the season. With just over a minute to play, the Chargers (avenging an earlier "miracle" loss to Oakland) stormed back with a tying touchdown and winning point after kick to ice the game. A field goal with only seconds to play served as public humiliation for the Super Bowl XI champion Raiders. What a thrill, what a finish! But you'd never know if you heard NBC-TV's play-by-play announcers. But then, this is not a radio sports page. Or is it? Let me explain.

There is valid speculation, and some research confirmation, that a growing number of sports fans across the country are showing preference to radio's "audio" picture of play-by-play by turning off the sound portion of their television while watching games. Is it possible that radio, with only sound to offer, can be imaginative enough to have the armchair quarter-back turn off the TV audio in favor of its play-by-play? Could it be that radio is proving a point?

Chuck Schwartz thinks so. In fact, he knows so. Schwartz, General Sales Manager of WBBM/Chicago, an all-news station that features Chicago Bears radio play-by-play, secured the services of Media Statistics Inc. and its President, Jim Seiler, and through research, has opened some thought-provoking theories.

Sporting a high of 74.3% of radio "tuned-in" listeners, a broadcast shared by television coverage of the 1977 playoff between the Bears and Dallas Cowboys, Schwartz takes us to the beginning. "The thesis behind it was that I believed that a lot of radio listeners on a radio and TV play-by-play sports package were loyal to and enjoyed on a consistent basis the radio call of a broadcasting team that's there every week."



During the course of this article, we will take note of seven other radio management and programming executives who deal in sports play-by-play. Schwartz's point about a certain "charm" in the "day-to-day and week-to-week" consistency of radio play-by-play announcers is echoed by the majority of those contacted.

Ted Atkins, VP/GM of WTAE/Pittsburgh points out that, even though conclusive research for his station has not been established, "We've found that because of the relationship of our two play-by-play announcers who have been associated with the team (Pitt football) that the fans would much prefer to hear their comments as opposed to network (TV) announcers flown in the day before, who might even mispronounce names of the players."

WCCO/Minneapolis PD By Napier delivers a stronger reaction: "... Many of them (fans) call us and say 'Hey, we've learned a lot more about football listening to the radio play-by-play'."

KMBZ/Kansas City PD Steve Bell says, "I don't know about other markets, but here in KC, the more established announcers are the broadcast on radio and the guys on TV are generally Johnny-come-latelys.

WHDH/Boston PD Al Brady's opinion is a bit more guarded, "Yes, I can see that some fans might use the radio for play-by-play, but as a general rule I'm not sure I'd put a lot of credence in that." Asked to explain, Brady said, "I think that more people say it than actually do it. Turning off the TV sound in this market does happen, but you must remember that a couple of teams' stations here have atrociously bad signals (the Red Sox station for one) so radio listener preference is probably less in this town."

Across town, at WBZ, PD Dave Martin asserts, "I think there is something to be said about the amount of credibility that is built up by a (radio) play-by-play team. We have two guys doing the Patriot games that I would stack against whoever happens to be on TV at that

Basically agreeing with Martin is KMPC/Los Angeles PD Mark Blinoff, whose sports

commitment is one of the largest in the nation. He states emphatically, "We feel very strongly about our play-by-play announcers. As a matter of fact, in conversations with TV people, they candidly admit the (radio) audio broadcast is much better."

This may seem to be one-sided towards radio, but KMOX/St. Louis Regional Vice-President Robert Hyland's overview is that "... since TV, by nature, doesn't have to be as descriptive or exciting as radio in terms of the spoken word, both media become helpful to each other. TV people don't care if the sound is off as long as they get credit in the diary for the set being on. The TV broadcasters don't have to be so explicit because of the video." By Napier concurs with Hyland by saying, "I just think that football, for example, is an exciting thing for both radio and TV."





CHART SUMMARY: Barry Manilow continues at the top spot for a second week, but is being threatened with a big 5-2 jump from Ambrosia. However, the way Barbra & Neil is rocketing up the chart (24-7 in only its second week), we just may see the duo collect their first No. 1 record. Other good movers on the top half are Gino Vannelli 8-5, Dr. Hook 13-10, Al Stewart 15-11, Andy Gibb 19-16, (slowed a bit by some heavies coming down), and Leo Sayer 25-20. This week's Breakers are Firefall, with a good leap 37-23 (with plenty of hot reports and good moves), and Paul Anka, with a solid ten point jump 35-25. Sandwiched in between those two is Rita Coolidge, who shows a hot shot going from 31-24. In terms of chart longevity, Anne Murray, who holds at No. 14 this week, has got to be this year's champ. Joining the chart for the first time this week are entries by Gene Cotton at No. 35, Glen Campbell at No. 36, Donny & Marie Osmond at No. 37 and Alicia Bridges at No. 40.




