Storer To Sell Off Radio Division

Storer Broadcasting, one of the nation's leading radio chains in addition to its television interests, announced its intention to divest itself of its Radio Division. The company explained its decision as a means of focusing on its TV and cable divisions; Storer recently launched a \$100 million cable expansion effort, and currently owns seven television stations in addition to its radio holdings: WHN/New York, WLAK-FM/Chicago, WGBS/WLYF-FM/Miami, and WSPD/Toledo. Storer recently sold its Los Angeles properties, KTNQ and KHTZ-FM. The company stated further that actual negotiations for the sale of the radio properties would not be undertaken until January 5, with prices to be established later this month. WLAK-FM is not being sold at this time, having been owned by Storer for less than the three-year period required by the FCC

to allow its sale at a profit; however, WLYF-FM, which has also been owned by Storer for less than three years according to company sources, was not mentioned in this regard.

"Difficult Decision"

Storer Chairman Bill Michaels and President Peter Storer, in a joint statement, commented: "This was one of the most difficult decisions in our company's history. Our company had its beginning in radio back in 1927 with what is now WSPD in Toledo, and was nothing but radio for 21 years. But the world has changed, particularly the broadcast business, and the complexion of our company has changed with it. We feel that this move is in the joint interest of the stockholders and the public in the communities involved, enabling us to concentrate our management and capital efforts in

the most effective direction for the foreseeable future."

Key programming executives in the Storer chain commented that any ownership changeovers would take months to effect, and that therefore any discussion of their future plans would be premature.

CKLW Sues Arbitron For Trade Restraint, Antitrust Violations

CKLW, the Windsor, Ontario-based station which has been a powerful Top 40 force in the Detroit market for many years, filed suit this week against Arbitron, charging "restraint of trade and violation of the Sherman Antitrust Act." The station is seeking a preliminary injunction prohibiting Arbitron from following through with its announced intention to reclassify

96KX/Denver To Shift From AOR To Beautiful Music

In a move that surprised many observers, Doubleday Broadcasting announced that 96KX/Denver would shift formats from AOR to Beautiful Music in January, with the station changing call letters to KHOW-

FM. 96KX had converted to AOR from Top 40 in March 1978, with Frank Felix, architect of rival AOR outlet KBPI's considerable success, coming across town to program the station.

Doubleday President Gary Stevens termed the changeover a "business decision. It just didn't pan out," he told R&R. Explaining the rationale for 96KX's switch to AOR earlier this year, he said, "We made that change on the assumption that RKO would be taking KBPI and changing its direction, making it more pop." As it turned out, the FCC first delayed RKO's purchase of KBPI, and subsequently the company bowed out of the transaction. "Then," Stevens continued, "no sooner had we made our switch than KAZY brought in the Burkhardt/Abrams format."

Stevens felt that in light of these developments and 96KX's own development, that the station's outlook was cloudy. "According to all the indicators, and I've been watching the station's progress closely, I have not seen any evidence that

CKLW as a "non-home market station" in the October/November Detroit market report.

CKLW President Herbert W. McCord, commenting on the action, stated: "The Control Data Corporation clearly occupies a monopoly position in the radio audience measurement field through Arbitron Radio, since more than 95% of the national radio advertising purchased in the Detroit market is placed based on their survey results. As a monopoly, Arbitron is under a legal obligation to act in a fair and reasonable manner and avoid arbitrary actions that damage any radio

MIXED REACTION FROM BROADCASTERS

President Sets Up Radio News Service

National media exposure, controversy and technical difficulties surrounded efforts by the White House to launch its own radio news service this week. Malfunctioning telephone circuitry in three long distance lines to be utilized for the feed was blamed for Monday's delayed start, according to Walt Wurfel, White House Deputy Press Secretary.

The plan calls for Rich Nelson, special assistant to the White House Office of Media Liaison, to write and produce the feeds. Each two-and-a-half minute package may contain from one to three items consisting of reports, news clips and/or actualities. Nelson and Wurfel will use the President's

Daybook and schedules of other Executive Branch members in deciding what events will be covered each day. Nelson maintained that his reports used actualities only, and he would not read White House statements.

Slow Response?

"CBS Evening News" reported on Monday that their random sampling of 40 stations indicated that only 14 had considered using the toll-free service. In response to the CBS story, Wurfel told R&R that he'd be happy with 35% acceptance.

Despite requests for the service from broadcasters, which the White House says is the reason for setting up the program — an R&R sampling revealed only moderate inter-

ests. To date, only 571 news directors in Idaho, Maine, Montana, Vermont and Wyoming have received White House invitations to dial (800) 424-9090 for a feed.

Controversial Service

Controversy over the proposal stemmed from three sources: 1) stations wondering what FCC rules might be involved, 2) political observers questioning the use of taxpayer money to fund the service, and 3) critics claiming it to be a Gerald Ruffoon (Carter's top PR and media advisor) ploy to bolster the President's ratings.

Press Secretary Jody Powell defended the project, which he said was designed "to provide our view

Carol Parker Named PD At WMZQ-FM

Carol Parker has been appointed Program Director of Sonderling Country station WMZQ-FM/Washington, DC, making her apparently the first female major market PD in Country radio. She had been an air personality at the station, and will continue to handle an airshift, changing from 10pm-2am to 6pm-10pm. Before joining WMZQ-FM, Parker was Promotion Director at WPOC-FM/Baltimore.

WMZQ General Manager Mike Cohen, in making the announcement, commented to R&R: "We at WMZQ are very excited about being an industry leader in having the first female Country Program Director in a major market. Carol has many good ideas, and we know she will help in the continued growth of WMZQ. We are sorry to lose Fred Figenshu here, but it's good to know he will still remain in the

company." Figenshu, previously PD at WMZQ, was recently appointed Operations Manager at Sonderling's KIKK-AM-FM/Houston.

Parker told R&R, "This is only my second job in radio, so this is not only a shock but an honor. I knew when I interviewed for the job it was a longshot, but now Sonderling has given me a chance to prove myself and I am looking forward to the challenge. Right now, I plan no major changes. WMZQ is now a winner and we plan to keep it that way."

NRBA Plans "Pilgrimage" To Washington

The National Radio Broadcasters Association is preparing for a one-day "Pilgrimage Against Regulation" to be held in the nation's capital, on March 7, 1979.

"We won't be arriving on our transmitters," said NRBA President Jim Gabbert, alluding to an unsuccessful march on Washington by farmers using tractors to parade by the White House. Unlike the farmers, he stated, broadcasters are making money.

Gabbert hopes to rally 500 broadcasters (including television participants) to protest federal regulations affecting stations' First Amendment rights and service to the public.

The agenda for the meeting includes breakfast at the Washington Hilton hotel, bus trip to Ca-

pitool Hill to see Congressmen, and afternoon luncheon with all seven FCC commissioners, their staffs and bureau chiefs listening to broadcasters' cries and whispers, if it can be arranged.

Gabbert says the idea grew from discussions with state association executives. Illinois Broadcasters Association executive director Jim Turpin, whose board meets today, told R&R that they will talk about the idea. "We always combine our annual Hill visitation with another event," Turpin said.

Speculation is that the NAB, which holds an annual spring legislative conference for state association directors, will have difficulty accepting the idea. In response to that, Gabbert says that the more efforts made with Congress to put across broadcasters' points, the better.

SEABOLT TAKES OVER UA NASHVILLE

Shults Capitol's New Nashville VP

Lynn Shults has been appointed Divisional Vice President at Capitol Records/Nashville. Shults was most recently Director of Operations for United Artists/Nashville, and was replaced this week in that position by Jerry Seabolt. Seabolt had been UA/Nashville's National Promotion Director.

Shults, who will report to Capitol Vice President/A&R Rupert Perry, stated, "I am very thankful for the opportunity Capitol has given me. I look forward to working with the label's country artists and staff as we move together to take the division to even greater heights.

Seabolt told R&R, "I am looking forward to the new challenge. I am not going to presume to be an expert on anything. I am going to presume to bust my ass a little bit harder for United Artists." Asked if UA would replace him in the National Promotion Director

position, Seabolt said, "Right now I don't see any reason for the company to spend money to fill that position. I want to keep my hands in the promotion end because it is my first love. Charlie Minor has put together a helluva promotion force for the company, so I feel I will be able to oversee the Country Division as I have in the past." SIMON, VIRGIN SUING

Lawsuits Hit CBS, Warner Bros.

Paul Simon has filed a suit in a New York court seeking to break his present contract with Columbia Records, alleging that the company is attempting to "destroy his career" and obstruct his planned move to Warner Bros. Records. Simon owes Columbia another album, and alleges that the company plans to reject it to keep him bound to his present contract. Columbia representatives had no comment owing to legal considerations, other than to call attention to Simon's "long and successful" 14-year association with the label.

In another legal action this week, London-based Virgin Records filed a breach of contract suit against Warner Bros. and artist Don Van Vliet (Captain Beefheart), alleging that Beefheart's former producers had contracted with Virgin to deliver a series of LP's from 1975-78 and had not supplied enough product, while Warners allegedly induced Van Vliet to break the contract by signing him to the Warner Bros. label. Warners has released one Beefheart album this year.

Broadcasters Oppose PSA Rulemaking

Charging violation of their First Amendment rights, broadcasters have swamped the FCC with arguments against a proposed rulemaking on the airing of public service announcements (PSA's).

In a strongly worded statement, the Ohio Association of Broadcasters led the pact with a list of reasons calling for the proceeding to be terminated. The proceeding, they said, is 1) unneeded 2) deprives listeners of a blend of public service programming unique to local needs 3) robs station managers of freedom 4) creates insatiable demand for more free time 5) violates the Federal Communications Act and the First Amendment, and 6) is inconsistent with national policy.

Public Groups Feel Cheated Despite Free Time

No other medium donates more free air time proportionally to PSA's than radio. Yet, the Commission's rulemaking, if enacted, would restrict how and when PSA's are aired and produced.

The Public Media Center, the group that petitioned for the rulemaking, has proposed that three PSA's be aired during each two consecutive hours including drive time, that at least 25 percent of all PSA's be of local origin, and that licensees should make their facilities available to local organizations for production of PSA's.

The center is calling for the FCC to force broadcasters to address environmental issues, consumer affairs, minority rights, media reform, civil liberties, housing and anti-poverty issues.

Attorneys for Combined Communications Corporation, the Evening News Association, Gaylord Broadcasting Company and Lee Enterprises, Inc. and their subsidiaries, charged that the FCC "has put the cart before the horse in launching an inquiry into programming practices without first determining the extent of its authority to consider the information sought."

Honolulu Stations Get Short Term For EEO Violations

The FCC continues to come down hard on stations with poor EEO records. Last week they sanctioned KPOI-KHSS/Honolulu with a one-year renewal and imposed quarterly EEO reporting requirements on the licensee - Communico Oceanic Corporation - until "a meaningful affirmative action plan" is implemented.

Data submitted by the licensee to the FCC indicated that only two of the 14 employees at the station were minorities (14 percent), while the local workforce is comprised of 67 percent Orientals - a disparity which prompted the Commission to defer the renewal application.

WFIF Gets One-Year Renewal For "Lack Of Control"

A one-year renewal is all WFIF/Milford, CN will get for repeated failure to control the operation of its station.

The Commission's field staff found 1) a phony contest with the station using a tape cartridge in announcing whether call-in listeners had won (i.e., the public was not informed that a preselected winner-loser schedule had been arranged), 2) failure of station to adequately represent its coverage area to advertisers, 3) misrepresentation on the part of a salesperson claiming to be a representative of the Safety Council and 4) improper logging of promotional announcements containing commercial matter.

FTC Update: AMA Cited

The Federal Trade Commission this week charged the American Medical Association and two other medical associations with conspiracy to restrict competition by hindering their members from soliciting business by advertising. The FTC complaint also charges respondents prevented price competition and competitive practices. These practices stem from the association's restrictions, which prevent a doctor from presenting his name to the public in a way that "sets him apart from other physicians."

As a result, FTC alleges, 1) prices of physician services have been stabilized, fixed or otherwise interfered with, 2) competition between medical doctors in the provision of such services have been hindered, and 3) consumers have been deprived of information pertinent to the selection of physician and the benefits of competition.

More On FTC

Why should radio broadcasters be concerned about the FTC? Actions which could force advertisers to use a portion of their ad as a disclaimer would severely restrict the amount of copy clients could use to sell their product.

For example, this week the FTC began hearings on proposed rulemaking to require disclaimers in ads for antacids. Similar action has been proposed for food ads. Also, this week the FTC 1) came up with more restrictions on automobile fuel economy claims, 2) received word from the nation's largest toymaker, General Mills Fun Group, that it will follow FTC guidelines in future ads, and 3) emphasized a 1976 Supreme Court rule guaranteeing pharmacists the right to advertise prescription drugs.

Realignment At MBS

In a move toward greater control of the Washington-based Mutual Broadcasting System by its parent, Amway Corporation of Ada, Michigan, a major shifting of responsibilities within Mutual's executive ranks took place last week.

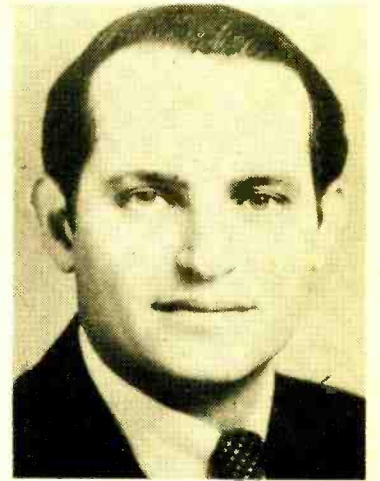
Executive VP Marty Rubenstein now has control of the network's programming, including news and sports, in addition to publicity research and data processing. Formerly, Rubenstein had solely been charged with finance and administrative duties.

Future policy decisions will be determined by an executive committee to be headed by Dr. Bud Schaafsma, Amway's VP for policy administration, who will continue to be based in Michigan. Schaafsma, however, is already phasing out of his current duties at Amway and will spend a lot of time in Washington, according to an Amway source.

Mutual President Ed Little, credited by many for keeping the net-

work together during some "lean" years," will continue to head sales and station acquisitions.

Executive VP Gary Worth will continue to carry the ball for satellite development and other technical operations, station relations and Mutual's new Southwest Radio Network.

American Indians Want Media

Petitions by leading American Indian organizations and the United Church of Christ, a public interest organization, are attempting to freeze one AM, FM and TV frequency to serve reservations which are predominantly west of the Mississippi. In their petitions, the Indians seek to convince that the only means in which they have of controlling their own destiny is to own their own broadcast facilities.

To date, there is only one radio station licensed to Indians. But in Pine Ridge, SD, the Oglala Sioux appear to be on their way to establishing the first Indian "owned and operated" television facility. Last week they became the first tribe to make a formal application for a TV station.

Extra, Extra . . .

Petition from gay group in FCC's ascertainment proceeding (R&R 11-24) pictures Anita Bryant with caption: A-h---of-the-year . . .

Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin is said to be rethinking the multiple ownership rule for radio. The original proposal last June limiting number of acquisitions to five had caused a flurry of activity with brokers. Van Deerlin may advocate unrestricted radio-only rule when rewrite appears again in February . . .

FCC gearing up for returning broadcaster's fees beginning February, telling a Federal Court in its sixth status report that it has received exemption from government's hiring freeze to add a staff which will process claims, and it has requisitioned office space from GAO . . .

Meanwhile, NAB called upon the FCC this week for a full refund instead of partial payment. The association says this in "only fair" in view of inflation and loss of accrued interest. The FCC provision that licensees must waive future claims may be "illegal," NAB said . . .

RAB analysis of U.S. Department of Commerce figures released this week is that while retail sales for New York City were down the first seven months of 1978, they were boosted in subsequent months - during 88-day newspaper strike. The study supports the claim that radio was effective in increasing NYC sales while the rest of the country had a decline.

Washington Street Talk

Bill Sprague joins Washington-based Radio-TV News Director Association as Editor of the "Communicator," RTNDA's monthly newsletter. Sprague has worked for Voice of America, NBC and the Republican National Committee. He will also assist Managing Director Len Allen's legislative efforts.

Tom Casey is added to staff in FCC Chairman's office as Special Assistant. Casey came to the Commission eight months ago from the Justice Department.

Melvin Riddick will join the legal department at CBS Records next month. He had been a minority intern at NAB.

New Mag's Ad Boasts Virtues Of Rock Radio

Once, a new magazine aimed at high school and college age girls, is kicking off its initial industry ad campaign with the slogan, "New **Once** magazine is not better than Rock Radio". The ad's text goes on to compliment radio broadcasters on the tremendous reach and entertainment value of rock radio.

However, the ad then discusses some of radio's limitations, such as radio being a "limited attention medium" and that listeners react to "generous quantities of advertising" with a "protective crust of inattention". The copy concludes that "**Once** is not better than radio, just different," which for a publication commenting on a rival communications medium, is high praise indeed.



Phoenix City Council Abolishes Tax On National Advertisers

The **Phoenix City Council** recently voted to abolish a one-percent tax the city had imposed upon national advertisers since 1977. Several radio and television executives from Phoenix and its suburbs as well as representatives from local advertising agencies had testified before the council that the tax was giving the city a "bad image" nationally and that the levy had already cost the city several hundred thousand dollars in advertising. They also argued that no other city in the country had such a tax.

The tax began in 1977 when the city council decided ads bought by national sponsors from local broadcasting stations and newspapers were taxable under the city's sales tax code. City officials estimated that the revenue from taxation of national advertisers increased the city's coffers by \$350,000 annually. Opponents claimed the city actually lost money on the measure due to advertisers' discouragement.

In fact, soon after the measure was adopted, a number of local advertising firms sued the city. According to the city's legal staff, however, the city's abolition of the tax has no bearing on those cases which remain pending in Superior Court.

Arbitron Finds 14 Stations With 100 County Reach

Results of the **Arbitron Radio Coverage Study**, said to be the largest audience research project ever conducted, show a total of 14 radio stations reaching audiences in 100 or more counties. The survey covered all 3065 counties in the continental U.S., plus the Honolulu and Anchorage markets, and utilized over 395,000 diaries from all four Arbitron survey periods.

Chicago led with three stations capable of reaching 100 or more markets, with Nashville showing two stations capable of similar power. The remaining eight markets contained one such station each.

Westwood One To Debut Public Affairs Feature

Beginning Feb. 1, 1979, **Westwood One**, the radio syndication organization, will make available a public affairs feature entitled "Spaces and Places" on a barter basis. According to Westwood One President **Norton Pattiz**, the program will be the company's ninth radio series as well as their first public affairs feature.

Pattiz described the feature as "dealing with today's lifestyle, with emphasis on outdoors and environment," adding, "The series will consist of 10 weekly features, each two and a half minutes in length, about ecology, conservation, adventure, travel, leisure, health, nutrition, the mind, and related subjects."

Produced by **Robert Kleinman**, the program will be hosted by **David Perry** of **KMET/Los Angeles**, and will draw on information supplied by "Mariah" and "Outside" magazines.

Henry Morgan Returns To Radio

Henry Morgan, a 20-year radio veteran who began his career at **WOR/New York** and later starred in the "Here's Morgan" comedy shows on the **ABC Radio Network**, is making his return to the airwaves via the recently announced "Sears Radio Theater", which will air on the **CBS Radio Network** beginning Feb. 5, 1979.

According to **Elliott Lewis**, executive producer of the Sears series, Morgan has been pacted to write and star in three comedies. The programs will be aired on the comedy night of the series, which has a format calling for a radio show of a different genre to be run on each of five successive nights weekly.

CBS RENEWS "WKRP"

NBC Cancels Nine Series, Adds Nine In Unprecedented Clean Sweep

NBC President Fred Silverman acted forcefully to impose his programming identity on the network last week, cancelling nine of NBC's series, including all eight of its new entries (mostly introduced before Silverman came over from **ABC**). Among the casualties was "Dick Clark's Live Wednesday," eliminating a prime source of music star TV exposure. The other terminated shows were "Lifeline," "Who's Watching The Kids?", "Eddie Capra Mysteries", "Grandpa Goes To Washington," "Project UFO," the new "David Cassidy — Man Undercover" show, and "Centennial," which had been scheduled to conclude in February and will not continue further.

Nine new shows were taped to fill in the holes: "Mrs. Columbo" (Thurs. 10-11, the breathlessly-anticipated materialization of Lt. **Columbo's** mysterious wife, who will be solving crimes on her own); "Little Women" (Thurs. 8-9), based on the **Louisa May Alcott** novel and "beyond"; "Hello Larry" (Friday 9:30-10), **McLean Stevenson's** third try at a successful comedy series, this time as a divorced father with two teenaged daughters (interestingly, Stevenson's occupation is a radio talk show host); "Turnabout" (Friday 9-9:30), in which a husband and wife switch bodies (alternate title: "Invasion Of The Body Switchers?"); "Brothers And Sisters" (Friday 8:30-9), a comedy

about fraternity and sorority life, strangely similar-sounding to **ABC's** upcoming "Frat Rats" (the official title of their "Animal House" spinoff); "Supertrain" (Wednesdays 8-9), a comedy/drama taking place aboard an atom-powered luxury coast-to-coast train (translation: "Love Boat" by rail); "Sweepstakes" (Friday 10-11, another comedy/drama focusing on lottery finalists and the effects on their lives of their winnings and losings; "BJ & The Bear" (Saturday 9-10), yet another comedy/drama spun off a successful TV movie about a trucker and his pet chimp ("the bear"); and finally, "Cliffhangers" (Tuesday 8-9), three dramatic segments with heroes caught in perilous unresolved situations each week (something like a dramatic "Soap"). Stay tuned to your set for further developments.

MUSIC ON TV — Radio on TV survives not only on the new **McLean Stevenson** series (see above), but at "WKRP In Cincinnati," which according to sources at the show has been picked up for the rest of the season by **CBS**, with new time slot still undesignated. . . . A rather impressive musical lineup has been set for "A Gift Of Song — The Music For UNICEF Concert," executive-produced by **Robert Stigwood** and **David Frost** for **NBC** on January 10. In alphabetical order, the stars are **Abba**, the **Bee Gees**, **Rita Coolidge**, **John Denver**, **Earth Wind & Fire**, **Andy Gibb**, **Elton John**, **Kris Kristofferson**, **Olivia Newton-John**, and **Rod Stewart**. Frost hosts, and a 250-station simulcast with FM outlets across the country is in the works. . . .

CHRISTMAS MUSIC ON TV — More entries in the Christmas musical special sweepstakes, starting with "Merry Christmas From The Grand Ole Opry House" (**ABC**, Dec. 13), starring **Crystal Gayle**, **Chet Atkins**, **Roy Acuff**, **Barbara Mandrell**, and the **Statler Bros.** . . . The **Carpenters** have "A Christmas Portrait" ready for Dec. 19 on **ABC**, with **Kristy & Jimmy McNichol** joining the duo for a run-through of the **Beach Boys'** "Fun Fun Fun" . . . And **Mac Davis** hosts a futuristic holiday special, "Christmas Odyssey: 2010," when the 25th is known as "Commerce Day." What's futuristic about that, you might ask. . . . Finally, **Debby Boone** makes her acting debut in an update of **O. Henry's** "Gift Of The Magi," on **NBC** Dec. 21.

Despite Hat Trick From CBS, ABC Wins

ABC, despite **CBS's** winning the top three positions in **Nielsen's** top ten for the week ending November 26, won the week's competition with a 19.9 average rating, as **CBS** and **NBC** tied at 18.4. "60 Minutes" achieved a milestone by becoming the first news program to top the ratings. Next came 2) "All In The Family" 3) "Alice" 4) "Three's Company" (**ABC**) 5) "Laverne & Shirley" (**ABC**) 6) "Charlie's Angels" (**ABC**) 7) "Happy Days" (**ABC**) 8) "Little House On The Prairie" (**NBC**) 9) "MASH" (**CBS**), and 10) "Eight Is Enough" (**ABC**). **Steve Martin's** first special (**NBC**) came in 14th, the top-rated special of the week. **Bobby Vinton's** "Rock 'n' Rollers" finished quite respectably at 23rd for **CBS**, while **Dick Clark's** "Live Wednesday" managed a sticky 55th position for **NBC**.

ABC monopolized **Los Angeles's** **Arbitron** figures for the week ending November 24, and almost pulled off the same enviable trick in **Chicago**. In **New York**, **ABC** had the top five in "Pearl," "Battle Of The Network Stars," "Laverne & Shirley," "Three's Company," and "Fantasy Island." Next came 6) "Alice" (**CBS**) 7) a tie between "Charlie's Angels," "Happy Days", and "Soap" (all **ABC**), and 10) a five-way tie featuring **ABC's** "Barney Miller," **NBC's** "Disney" and "Steve Martin," and **CBS's** "All In The Family" and "Incredible Hulk."

In **L.A.**, "Pearl" was on top, followed by **ABC's** 2) "Three's Company" 3) "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" tied 5) "Mork & Mindy," and 6) a tie between "Battlestar Galactica," "Charlie's Angels," "Eight Is Enough," "Taxi," and **Monday Night Football**. **Chicago** saw "Pearl" at the top, followed by 2) "Charlie's Angels" and "Fantasy Island" tied 4) "Barney Miller," "Eight Is Enough," "Laverne & Shirley," and the local **WLS-TV** 10pm news tied 8) "Starsky & Hutch" (**ABC**), and a snarled ten-way tie for ninth place with "Alice", "MASH", and **NFL Football** on **CBS** vs. **ABC's** "Battle Of The Network Stars," "Happy Days," "Mork & Mindy," "Soap," "What's Happening," "Three's Company," and "Weekend Eyewitness News."

Art Wallis has joined WLS/Chicago in the choice Production Director's job. Art comes to the Windy City from WGAR/Cleveland.

Actor Ben Vereen has announced the formation of a medical trust fund for the paralyzed Jackie Wilson. Wilson has been unable to move or speak since his heart attack in September 1975. All funds will go directly into the trust Vereen has set up to administer Wilson's massive medical bills.

I was pretty excited. The call came from the front desk that it was here . . . they were actually bringing it up on the elevator right now. I didn't even say, "Thanks," I just hung up the phone and headed for the lobby. I got there just in time to see the giant crates coming off the service elevator. The boxes were big!

About two hours later they had it all unpacked and R&R was the proud owner of a brand new computer! After the first of the year we will make another quantum leap into the future by putting our weekly music information on computer. This makes possible many things . . . first, the information we receive from all our reporters each week will be processed much faster; second, the information we do process will be able to be broken down in many more ways than ever before. For starters this will increase the amount of usable information we return to you each week in the newspaper. Pretty exciting indeed!

We are currently in the process of putting our specialized program into the computer for a few test runs over the Christmas holidays. The prospect of computer-processing music information is a welcome one for me and the entire Top 40 staff (who haven't seen a Tuesday night "Happy Days" in the last five years). The time-saving factor is, of course, an important benefit, but the ability to further analyze and print expanded music information will be the real Christmas gift to all of us, writers and readers alike. Incidentally, the computer also figures biorhythms (if I had access to that this fall I might have known the Dodgers were going to fold) so we will all know in advance when we're going to be crabby. That could prove to be an invaluable tool on those long Tuesdays to come.

But seriously, we are excited about having a computer to further serve the ever-expanding needs of all our readers. It's an inevitable step well worth taking, as R&R keeps up with you. And remember too, the machine won't be making our decisions, it will only be organizing and collating the information faster and more accurately than we ever could have done by hand. Now back to a new paperback I promised to finish reading by Christmas . . . it's called "Binary Digits Can Be Fun." Nice book, but not enough pictures!

This week, a portrait of a new AM rocker in St. Louis . . . how it came back from "darkness" and is now ready to challenge KSLQ and KXOK, among others, for the music-radio audience. As always, some new promotions and migrations are also a part of this week's column. Next week: R&R's Fifth Annual Year End Issue will feature year-end charts and statistics for all formats. If you're putting together any sort of year-end music presentation, the Top 78 of 1978 should help you in your production of it.



JOHN MAC MUGS FOR MILK—What we have here is a photo from the Third Annual Great Milk Carton Boat Race. In our never ending efforts to bring "the mainstream" into your hands every week, you can see KFRC/San Francisco afternoon-drive jock John MacFlanagan presenting the first place trophy(?) to a group of five intrepid sailors from nearby Moraga, California. Their craft, christened "The Scoop John B", was named best boat with a dairy theme. We only wish we'd been in San Francisco the morning after all this took place so we could have heard Dr. Don Rose's comments on John's weekend activities.

A Second Chance In St. Louis

It's been a long time since a previously "dark" AM signal came on in any major market playing Top 40 music, but it happened November 16th at 7PM in St. Louis, when KWK returned to the air after being dark for over five years. KWK owners Doubleday Broadcasting purchased the station in 1973 and after many months of hearings and competition for the license they were actually able to begin rebuilding the station about 18 months ago.

The station literally needed rebuilding from the ground up because it had been destroyed during a flood in 1973. To compound the station's problems the flood was followed by a devastating fire in the KWK studios. The station had enjoyed a glorious past and in fact was one of the original Top 40 stations in St. Louis during the early fifties. Battling head-to-head with WIL for the young audience, KWK was a giant. As KXOK entered the picture and became dominant, KWK's format changed from Top 40 first to a more traditional MOR approach, and then finally to Black programming. Following the flood and fire of 1973 the station went off the air and did not return until last month.

Putting together any new radio station, or in this case resurrecting an old one, takes a lot of time and work. KWK's new Program Director is Bob Hattrik, and I spoke with him about how the new KWK began. I asked him how he first became involved with the project.

"I talked to Gary (Stevens, Doubleday's President) about programming the station a little over a year ago when I was at WDGY/Minneapolis. We stayed in touch and I did some research consultation in the meantime. This summer in late June and early July we began building the thing." Building is the right word because there was literally nothing left of the station except the license. The studios, which had been destroyed by fire, were useless and even the transmitter sites (KWK has two) were no longer operational. Starting from scratch the station began to take shape, as Bob explained, "Everyone had to help out with everything. I was out on monitor points with the engineering staff. Anything that had to be done, we did."

Studios began to take shape with input coming from the other stations within the Doubleday chain helping in the design, making suggestions and recommendations. The process that began in midsummer was nearly completed by fall, aided by a lot of people spending long hours. Bob told me, "The whole thing was amazingly trouble-free, looking back on it, thanks to the help of the experienced people we have here and within our organization. We had great engineering from the beginning with our engineers here and those from our consultants. That allowed us to be very much on-target and therefore very smooth."

Night Site Moves South

The engineering was a key in putting the station back together, in that one of the station's two tower sites needed to be relocated. Bob explained why: "We are 1380 on the dial with five kilowatts day, and the station was also five kilowatts at night when the transmitter site was further north of the city. We moved the night site south and lowered the power of our night signal to one kilowatt, but it's full-efficiency. That means that the signal is far improved over what it had been in the past. Before, you couldn't hear KWK in West County at night, whereas now we're covering a good, solid 95% of the metro area with a strong night signal. The movement of the tower site was critical because it allowed us to drastically increase our population coverage with our night pattern."

But cover those listeners with what? The station had not even existed except on paper for the last five years and had no music library or equipment. The long task of putting it all together wasn't easy for Bob. He personally contacted record companies from coast to coast explaining the situation, "That was a real problem, naturally. We got some great support from a lot of companies, who sent complete libraries. Other companies expressed a willingness to do the same, but just took too long. In other words we wouldn't have had the product until after we'd gone on the air. So, we had to go out and buy a lot of our music."

The hiring of a complete staff of newspeople and air personalities was also in progress at the same time. The staff came together through initial ads in the trades and word of mouth from Bob to his friends in radio: "Mostly the people we have were people recommended to me by people I know and trust." The station staff is Dick Hughes from WOW/Omaha doing 9am-12noon; Carey Paul from 13Q/Pittsburgh for 12noon-3pm; Bruce Vidal does afternoons from KOIL/Omaha; Chuck Geiger handles 6-9pm coming from WPEZ/Pittsburgh; Larry Moffat from WROK/Rockford does 9pm-1am; Al McDonald is on the all night show; and Bob Stevens does weekends. Interestingly enough, KWK is still looking for "just the right morning personality." Until that person is found, the shifts have been slightly extended to cover the absence of a morning jock.

"Hey, We're New!"

Bob explained how the station actually "returned to the air" on November 16th, "We had a major party that got a lot of local press coverage, but we basically came on the air just like we'd always been here. We dry-ran the entire jock lineup for a full two weeks before we actually turned on the transmitter. So in effect the station had 'been on the air' before we really went on the air. The staff all took it very seriously and that allowed us to go on sounding very smooth and professional. Our first day didn't sound like a typical first day, if you know what I mean.

"We're in the process of erecting billboards now. They haven't gone up quite as fast as we would have liked, due to some rain we've had, but they're getting up now. We're doing some 'Hey We're New' type promotions, but really the station is trying to sound very consistent and pretty much like it's been there forever. It's a very comfortable, easy-to-listen-to radio station and we're not hyping the fact that we're new, because people know we're new. There will be some further come-building promotions in the future, but at the present we're letting the come build on the quality of the station itself."

What about the news? "News is primarily in morning drive and the all night show. We have a terrific News Director in Rob Williams from WLW/New Orleans. He does entertaining, magazine style news but the leading issues are not avoided, as they are in many other magazine-type radio news presentations. It's very relatable news and it's spoken, not read."

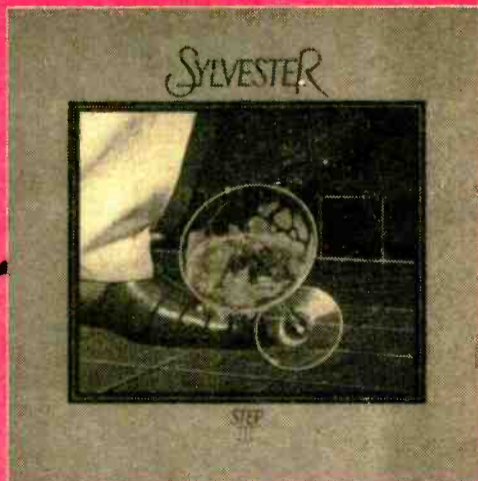

The story of how the station came back from nowhere is complete, but what does KWK sound like today? I posed the question to Bob and he said, "I hate to label it by, say, comparing it to other radio stations we all may be familiar with, because the labels are all oversimplified." To define a station it's sometimes necessary to state what they *don't* do as a reference point. KWK does not use jingles, nor do they use the FM technique of segueing two records together without talking. When two records are segued sometimes the jock will simply say the call letters, or perhaps say a bit more. The format is somewhat structured but not void of all freedoms. Trying to avoid labels, I can tell you that the spot load is quite low at the present time, probably due to the fact that the station hasn't even been on the air for its first full month yet. Bob did tell me, however, that the commercial limit would not exceed eight minutes per hour later on. That figure is low in comparison to most major market AM Top 40's, who might set their limits at 10 or even 12 minutes per hour. Bob summed up the station's sound by resorting to a new label, "I don't really know any better term to describe us than 'mass acceptance rock.' We're targeted at 15-plus."

As far as music selection for the station goes, Bob put it simply, "We look at everything. We do call-outs and some other exploratory research on new songs we might add, but mostly we look at everything and anything. Any input at all is appreciated and that way, we hope nothing is overlooked."

The prospect of putting a radio station on the air is exciting and Bob is clearly happy with how it all happened. It's especially meaningful to Bob since he was familiar with the St. Louis market prior to taking the KWK programming job. Bob had worked at KSLQ/St. Louis for almost three years, and eleven years ago had been on the air at KIRL/St. Louis. He also jocked at WGNU-FM just across the Mississippi River in Granite City, IL. Ironically, Doubleday has just purchased WGNU-FM, which will soon become KWK's FM counterpart.

Bob explained a bit more of KWK's history: "These call letters have had a great deal of meaning in this city. This was the number one station for a long time. It was radio and television with Channel 4 (now the CBS o&o in St. Louis, KMOX-TV) being KWK-TV back then. The radio station pulled 50's and 60's back in the days of Hooper and was the dominant station."

One definitely gets the impression that Bob would like to see those days return for KWK, even though the competitive picture within St. Louis is considerably different now. He has high praise for the way the station got started. "When Doubleday does something, they don't cut corners. That's really it. They just made it easy by spending the money where it needed to be spent. They did it right and that solved 90% of any problems we could have encountered getting this thing back on the air. And of course the best thing about starting fresh like we have is that we don't have an old image to overcome. There is no old-line Top 40 negative image to change. There is no high commercial load to alter. Having been off the air for five years, we are what we make this station. That's why we're not starting off by over-promoting. It's an amazing opportunity!"

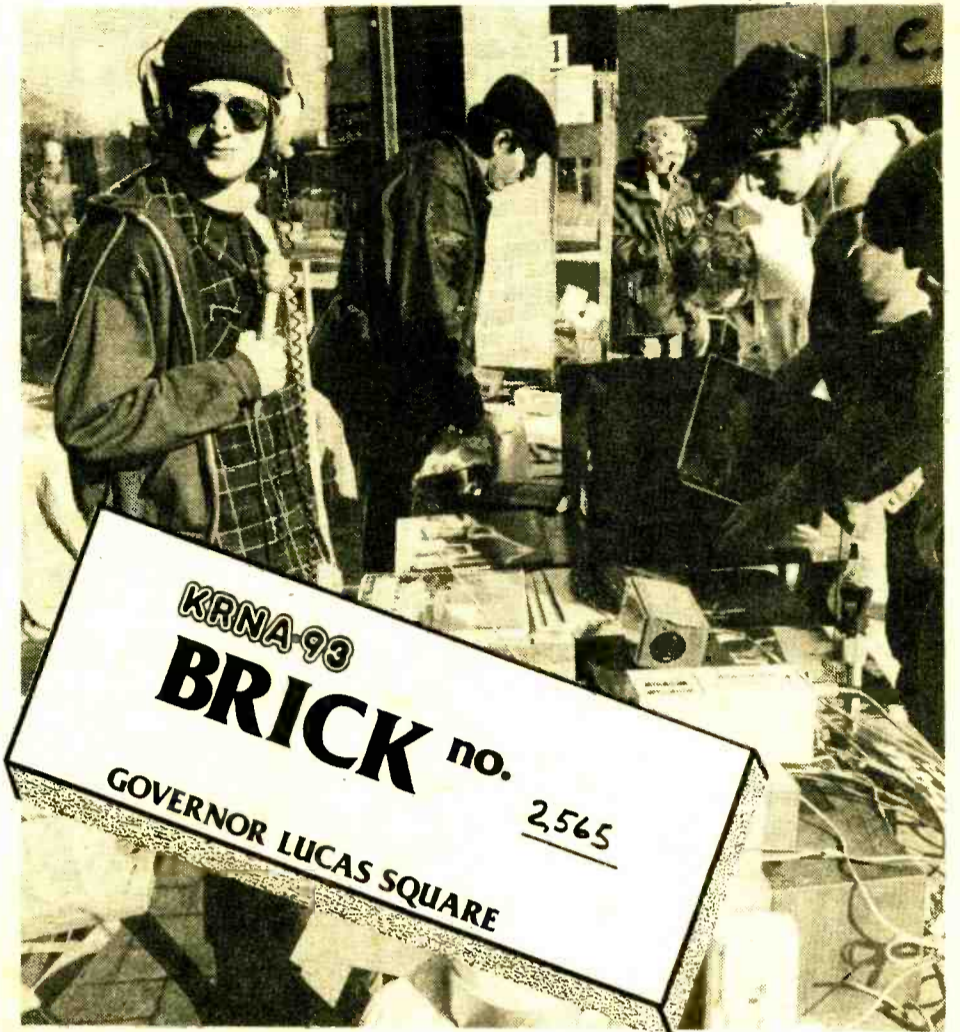
The KWK situation is without a recent parallel in that it is the first time a "new" AM Top 40 station has come on in a major market in a long time. Their success will be hard to judge until the results of next spring's ARB are released, but KWK General Manager Craig MacGee and Program Director Bob Hattrik sound confident and ready for the future. For KWK it really is a second chance unlike any other station has had.

Bits

JAM UP IN ORLANDO — The recent contest BJ-105/Orlando ran offering listeners a \$1000 bill if they could determine where in the world the money had been hidden, proved to be a big headache for Southern Bell Telephone. Early Monday morning, November 13th, BJ-105 morning man Billy Barber broadcast the latest clue in the six week contest and apparently too many people, after 30 other clues and one very close guess, had it figured out. In a time when the phone company usually registers about 60,000 calls the volume increased to over 100,000 clogging the circuits and causing a breakdown of incoming and outgoing calls. Alarms rang at the phone company and they immediately called BJ-105 Manager Rick Weinkauff, who responded to the mini-crises by quickly going on the air to ask listeners to stop calling. BJ-105 and Southern Bell have now gotten together and formulated plans for any further such telephone contests in hopes they can avoid future service disruptions in the market. By the way, the \$1000 bill was hidden on the Marrakesh Express!



RIDE ON, RIDE ON — Radio personalities have been involved in races of all sorts, dirt bikes, stock cars, go-carts, horses, and I even remember a giant turtle race. So another race is not so surprising, but this one is slightly different. The jocks of WANS-FM/Anderson, SC raced elephants as part of a station promotion welcoming the circus to Anderson. PD Bill McCown tells me that the elephants actually ran about 100 yards at speeds in excess of 35 mph! He didn't mention the stopping distance necessary or how the staff riders felt after the gallop, but I'm sure your imagination can fill in the blanks. TURN ON THE FOUNTAIN — Iowa City, IA. has had a large problem with urban renewal, including a scandal. Around five years ago buildings were torn down in a large sector of the downtown area to make room for a large-scale urban development project. Today, the buildings are still down and no replacements have even begun construction. KRNA/Iowa City, while doing its community ascertainment, discovered that this area of town was a cause of major concern among citizens. So, in order to bring attention, and hopefully a solution, to the stalled redevelopment project, KRNA staged a week-long remote broadcast from the site of a proposed fountain, which was to be the center of the new downtown area. The fountain itself was to be 100% funded by public donations and had nearly reached the projected goal, but was still \$10,000 dollars short. That final \$10,000 was the focus of the KRNA remote. The station sold "brick certificates" for the fountain donations and easily raised the necessary money to "turn the fountain on." Shown at the remote site downtown is KRNA's Bart Goynshor (with shades and microphone) and a local merchant and spearhead of the fountain fund, Tom Wegman. This promotion caused a lot of talk and media coverage within Iowa City and allowed KRNA to really "serve" a need they discovered in their market.

QUICK BITS — KDWB/Minneapolis continues to dole out the cash in their \$10,000 sticker promotion. Stickers are available at various client locations throughout the Twin Cities and when the station staffers spot one, they ask the person what their favorite station is. The correct answer nets the winner the 10 grand... KT-1280 (KTLK)/Denver presented a Commodores weekend to celebrate the group's recent Denver concert appearance. They gave away special edition Commodores platinum albums and had ten lucky fans backstage to meet the group... KRIG/Odessa, TX ran a Super Gobble Turkey Contest for Thanksgiving during which winners picked up two turkeys each time they won — one turkey for themselves and the second turkey being donated to local charities... In a recent promotion for the Mobile Heart Fund, G100 personality Dick Hylton was arrested and handcuffed during his morning show and dragged off to jail. Accused of being "heartless" (he had refused to play any Heart songs) by the Mobile Sheriff, he was deposited in "jail," which turned out to be the front window of a local department store. His bail was set at a certain number of dollars pledged to the fund, and his vigil began. Later that same day, Dick's six-year-old son was going door-to-door in his neighborhood telling people, "My Daddy's in jail and my Mommy can't afford to get him out. Will you help?" The Heart Fund money was quickly raised and Hylton was reunited with his son, who had apparently taken the broadcast a little too seriously!

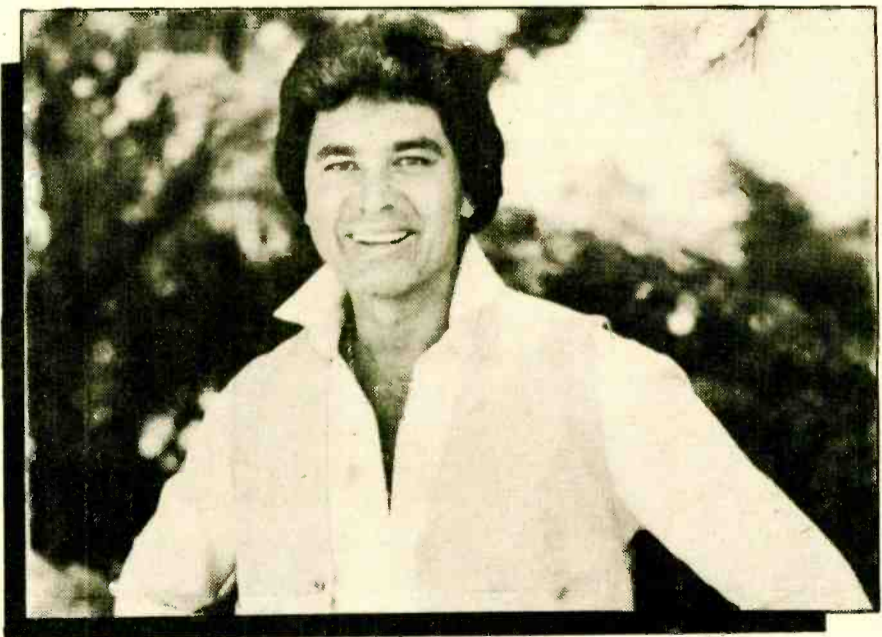

Radio Ad Question Stalls AFTRA-SAG/Advertisers Pact

Differences of opinion on financial compensation arrangements for radio ads are apparently proving to be a stumbling block in a new pact covering commercials being negotiated by the Screen Actors Guild and AFTRA on one side and top advertisers and ad agencies on the other. station dependent on its service.

"Arbitron has treated CKLW as a 'home market' station in the Detroit market for the last eight years, and in its most recent survey, CKLW had the second largest cumulative audience of any station in metropolitan Detroit. We believe that Arbitron's recently-announced decision to reclassify CKLW as a 'below the line' station is both arbitrary and inconsistent with the facts of the situation. Because of the serious and irreparable damage that this arbitrary action could cause to CKLW, we have asked the court to grant a preliminary injunction in order to maintain the status quo until the court has had a chance to evaluate the legality of Arbitron's actions at trial."

Should the injunction be denied, McCord told R&R that further legal action against Arbitron is a strong possibility.

KNX News Director Jim Zaillian Dies

Jim Zaillian, News Director at KNX/Los Angeles, died Saturday night (12-1) of an apparent heart attack at his Glendale home. He had been the All-News formatted station's News Director since 1968. Under Zaillian's leadership, the KNX News Department received numerous awards from various broadcast associations.

George Nicholaw, Vice President, CBS Radio Division and KNX General Manager, commented, "The death of Jim Zaillian is a great loss to broadcast journalism and to all of his colleagues at KNX."

Zaillian's broadcast journalism career began in 1951 at KFRE/Fresno. In 1955, he joined KNX as a writer and remained with the station until his death with the exception of a year (1962) spent at KNXT and two years (1966-67) at KABC Radio in Los Angeles. Services were held Tuesday (12-5).

Mike Wagner Named PD at KIIS-AM-FM

Mike Wagner, recently designated acting Program Director at KIIS-AM-FM/Los Angeles, has been officially appointed to the PD position at the stations by President/GM Ed Boyd. Wagner had started at KIIS-FM in 1976 as an air personality, and had previously worked at KDES/Palm Springs and KEZY/Anaheim. In addition, Sherman Cohen, presently Music

Director for the Pop/Adult AM station and the newly-converted Disco FM format, has been given additional responsibilities and the title of Assistant Program Director. Cohen had been with KIIS since early 1977 and had previously served as Music Director at KRLA/Los Angeles and Assistant PD at KGBS/Los Angeles.

we're making it. It appears we'd finish a poor third" among the Denver AOR's. Stevens added, "We were making money, but there was an absence of big advertising dollars connected with the station's former teen image, which I'm not sure we ever recovered from. I made the decision that we'd be foolish to continue, and that it would be in our best interests to do something more compatible with the AM." KHOW, Doubleday's Pop/Adult outlet in Denver, has been a highly lucrative and successful operation for the company. "Also," Stevens continued, "I'd like to diversify. We don't have a Beautiful Music station, and I'd like to get into that kind of programming."

Stevens stated that KHOW-FM will be operated live from 6am-6pm, and automated the other 12 hours. Joe Taylor, who formerly programmed WOMC/Detroit, will be the new Program Director, and has already joined the station. The present staff was given two months' notice, and Doubleday will attempt to aid them in finding new jobs. Current PD Felix, who Stevens says "did a super job for us," will remain with the station until he finds a new situation. The new format commences operation on January 15.

of what has happened here at the White House in the course of a day ... but not in a way that is deceptive."

He said there were no additional expenditures for the project, which spent funds already allocated for his office.

Meanwhile, FCC policy appears to cut across several rules, according to Arthur Ginsburg, Chief of the Commission's Complaints and Compliance Division. Ginsburg notes that if a station uses any material from the White House containing controversial subject matter, that it must tag it with a line saying that the material was "furnished" by the White House.

Nelson, who will act as a one-man show, had been characterized by several sources as a former Chicago broadcaster. That qualification, Nelson told R&R, has been blown out of proportion. Actually, he said, "I hosted a jazz show during college at WNIB." Prior to joining the White House staff, Nelson was Assistant Director of Radio/TV for the National Democratic Party.

Disco's Challenge For Black Radio, Part I

Disco radio is one of the hottest trends going at the present time. On the surface, it's a boost for black music, because so many disco artists are black (although more and more are white). But disco radio, by appealing to black listeners and also the growing number of white disco followers, poses a challenge to traditional Black-formatted radio stations. Disco radio is often described as "jukebox radio," with little personality, and no real identification with the community or community service. But because it provides unlimited quantities of a currently popular musical style, disco radio may be attracting large numbers of listeners from Black stations, just as it seems to be winning large numbers of white Top 40 listeners at the same time.

"It's our music in sheep's clothing."

I feel it's important to look at the "Disco Challenge," and for the next few columns that's what we'll do. I spoke with a leading Black programmer, James Jack, PD of WKND/Hartford, at length, and he covered several points relating to the "jukebox" radio effect of Disco formats which make up Part One of this discussion. Next week we continue with Jack, discussing the problems Black stations have establishing a successful identity with advertisers, especially compared to Disco stations, along with other problems relating to black music in general.

Jack started off by describing Disco radio as "an automatic jukebox." He continued, "You just don't have to put the quarter in. You plug it in on Saturday afternoon and you can rock and roll till Sunday morning." According to Jack's theory, Disco radio instantly appeals to the black audience and then has impact on the white listeners as well. "If it's disco music, I think black people pick up on it quicker than anybody else. Then they seem to feel as though this programming was designed especially for them. And when everybody else picks up on it later, disco has not gained the stigma that most Black radio stations have."

Continuing with this point, Jack comments, "We know about the loyalty of black listeners to Black radio. However, I might have second thoughts about it when I consider that there are white people programming black music in the market in general, and not calling it Black, but instead calling it Disco."

So what you're saying, I commented, is that Disco is a handle for whites to enjoy black music without the stigma. Jack agreed: "It's our music in sheep's clothing." Jack feels that the Disco trend could have a harmful effect on black progress. "It's a serious situation when you consider that the strides that black music has made in this country to be accepted over the past century, when all the things that have been fought for in fact finally reach a head, when the people are finally saying, 'Well, it's all right to accept black people' — it's serious when that portion of what black people have contributed to America as far as musical heritage goes, will no longer be called black music. It could very easily be disguised under pseudonyms such as Disco."

Programming "Jukeboxes"

Aside from these questions, Jack worries that automated Disco radio could be the radio trend of the future. "I look at what is happening with so-called Disco stations that are automated, and they are combining what has been learned in the past as far as efficient programming, with what might be a look at the future. It's quite possible that jukeboxes will be the radio of the future. If people are willing to accept that radio doesn't have to be full of personality, they could also accept that all they have to do is listen to the radio for music."

Jack speculated about implications of automated "jukebox" programming. "Now, if I have a record list of 40 currents and so many re-currents and so many oldies, that in itself sets the basis for how many times a record will repeat in a day's time, or in certain dayparts."

"It's quite possible that jukeboxes will be the radio of the future."

So maybe what is happening is that Disco stations are saying, "All we have to do is apply that ratio of frequency on tape to our programming, and then we don't have to worry about a lot of the problems that come with having the human being there who can make mistakes, or say the wrong thing at the wrong time. Instead, your primary concern is making sure that music is played at the right time according to the way it's programmed. So there are some positive aspects of it."

But Jack is concerned that automation may mean fewer opportunities for upcoming black radio personnel. "Machinery always means that somebody will lose a job. If there are people now who are struggling to hold on to jobs, just imagine what's going to happen when stations, "For so many dollars per month, I can hire a machine and not have to worry about withholding tax, or benefits or raises." From the standpoint of black people in the indus-

try, it's just another setback, I'd say in terms of the number of people who would have assumed that Black radio had reached the point where its popularity and acceptance would have been universal, suddenly it's being called something else. It means that those people who would have been in line for jobs in Black radio will not get those jobs at all. Possibly some very innovative personalities who could have come about in the 80's will never be heard on radio because machines are taking their places."

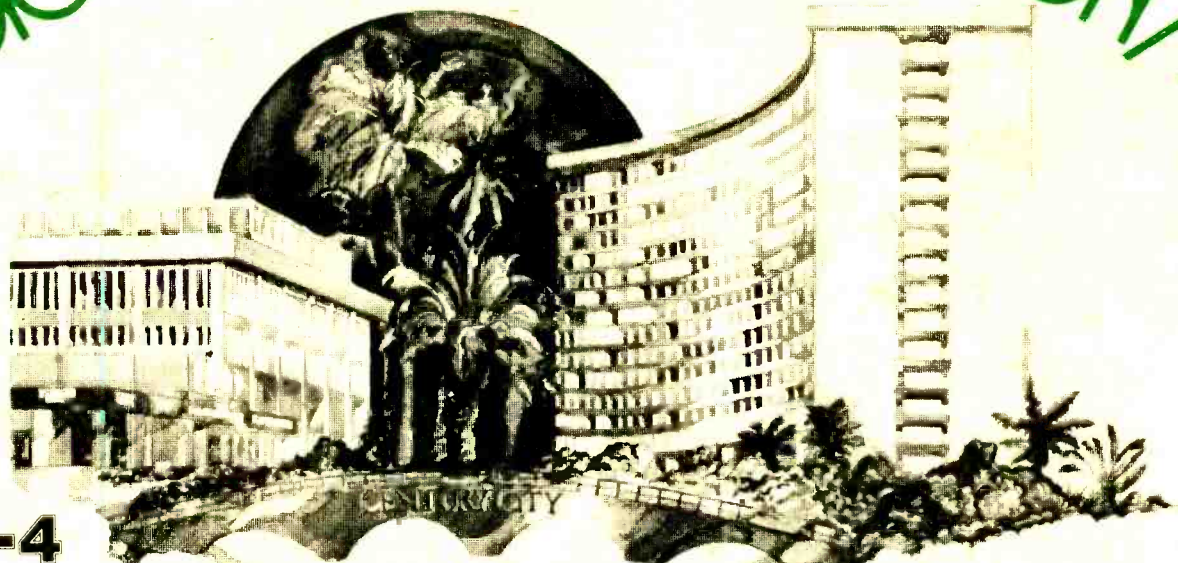

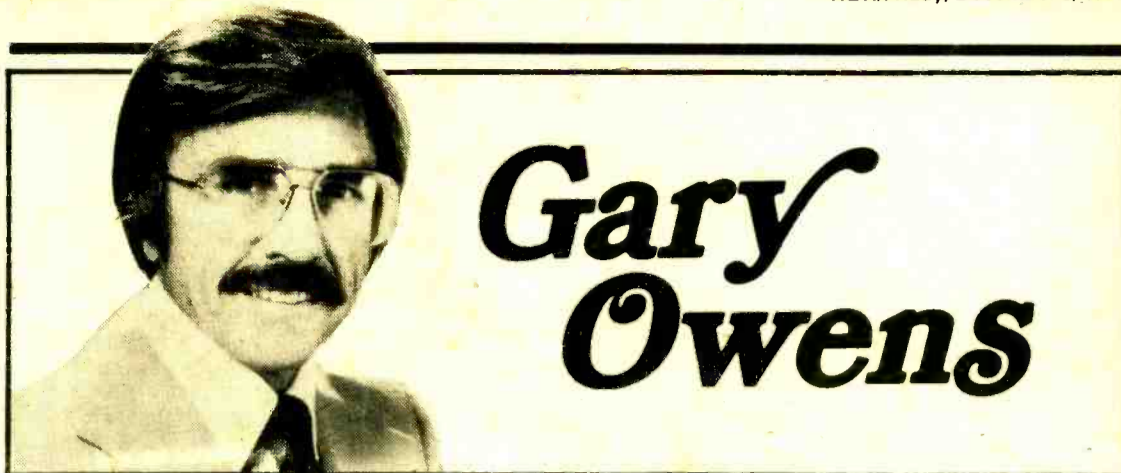

The Women In Power At KXFM/Santa Maria

Secretaries, receptionists, and traffic department women take note: there is hope for your future in broadcasting. Cheryl Hines, who started as a secretary/receptionist for KXFM/Santa Maria three years ago, was recently named the station's GM. At her side is Sales Manager Kathy Glines. The two are out to prove that in radio (as elsewhere) sex makes absolutely no difference when it comes to work abilities.

Sales Manager Glines moved over to sales at KXFM after a successful three-year stint as a salesperson for an area television outlet. GM Hine's success story is more unusual: "I started as a combined bookkeeper/secretary/receptionist for our former GM, Paul Stoddard, some three years ago," she starts. "During this time I learned everything I possibly could about radio. When the GM was out I was asked to handle everything for them, including making managerial decisions after awhile. After our former GM left the station, the owner started a long process of searching for his replacement from outside. Meantime the air staff was getting pretty antsy about what the changes might mean in terms of programming changes and their jobs, and this was understandably affecting our air sound. Kathy and I decided to present a proposal to the owner: Either he could continue his search or allow us to take over and get things back on a more even keel. We gave him our bid and he accepted it."

Since becoming GM almost two months ago, Hines has found the entire staff totally supportive. "Everyone has been really pleased with my appointment," she states, "because having stepped up through the ranks I understand what it's like to be an employee."

Response on the street level to the all-woman sales and managerial team at the station has been equally enthusiastic. "I have no trouble with clients at all," says Glines. "They seem to enjoy seeing women achieve the position I have and are supportive." Hines adds. "Our clients are offering help right and left; they realize it's a great opportunity for us that doesn't happen often. There are, in fact, a couple of accounts with women managers who have turned on to us after the managerial and sales changeover."

GM Hines admits there is a world of things remaining to be learned, but she is optimistic about her future and that of the station. "I have stepped into one heck of an opportunity that I never dreamed I would; I'm glad I gained the knowledge I did to enable me to make the effort. Now that I have the job you can bet I'm going to give it my best shot."

Speaking of women in broadcasting, I spoke with WIYY/Baltimore PD Denise Oliver this week about the progress of her job-finding service for women broadcasters. The surprising fact that surfaced during our conversation was that Denise has more job leads than good tapes to fill those job vacancies. If you are a woman broadcaster with professional experience who is looking for a new challenge in your radio career, send Denise a copy of a representative aircheck and a resume. Perhaps she will be able to line you up with that job you've been dreaming about. Her address: WIYY, Baltimore, Md. 21211. For the sake of time Denise has had to limit herself to taking tapes from women with professional experience in radio. 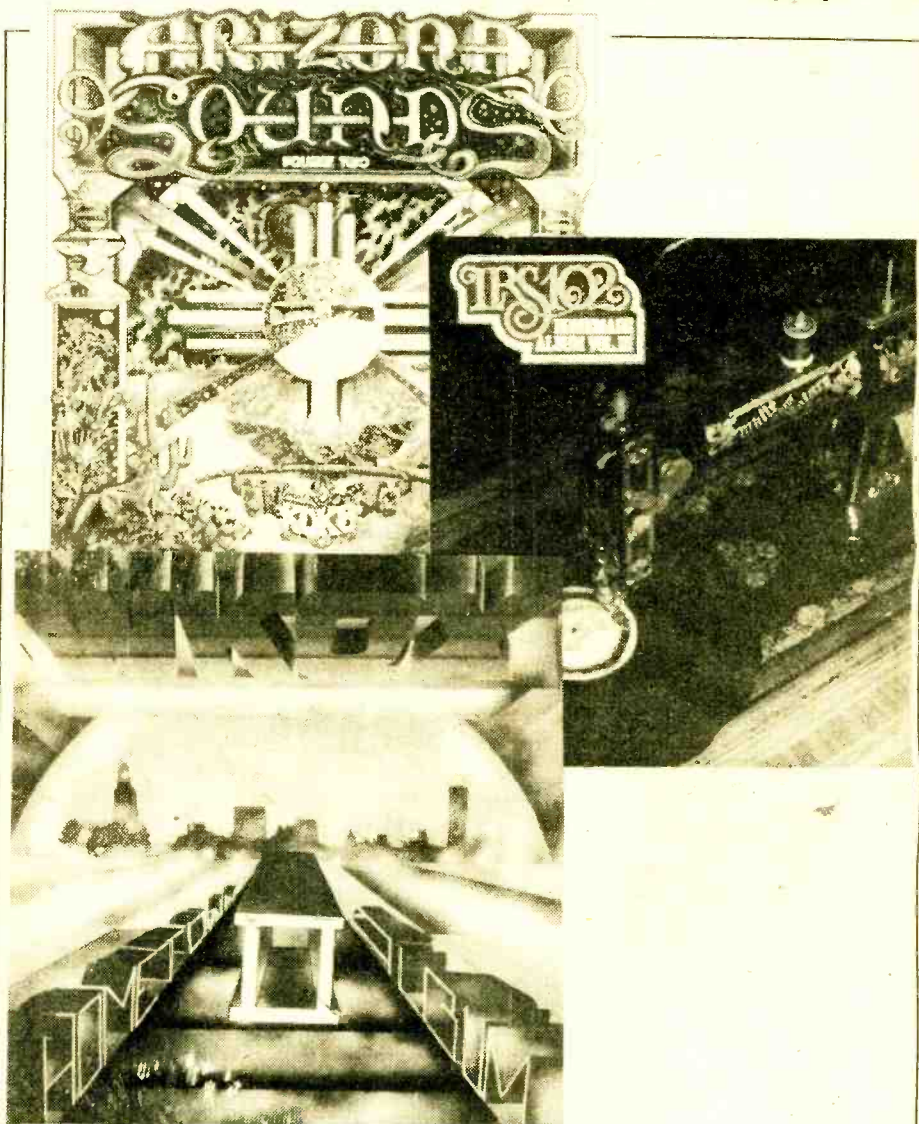

WMMR Apologizes To Aerosmith For Philadelphia's Bad Behavior

A recent Aerosmith concert appearance before 20,000 Philadelphians was cancelled midway through the show when lead singer Steven Tyler was struck in the face by a broken bottle thrown from the audience. This was the second concert to be cancelled by the group in Philadelphia, after a similar incident occurred at a previous show there. Following the second unfortunate occurrence the group stated they would never play Philadelphia again.

While WMMR did not sponsor the show, they sent an apology to the group and their management on behalf of Philadelphia. Further, for a day-and-a-half after the show, the station produced and ran a call for listeners to send their own written feelings to the group care of the station. As of this writing WMMR has received over a thousand replies, and calls from over a dozen area high schools that will be circulating petition-like statements to their students which will also be forwarded.

Unofficial word is that the group has begun renegotiating a return to Philadelphia. If this is so, WMMR can take great pride in their public-spirited, pro-Philadelphia promotion.



IT'S THE SEASON TO DO HOMETOWN ALBUMS — Several AOR stations have released Hometown-type albums recently, featuring winning songs by local musicians and cover art by area artists. The KDKB/Phoenix Arizona Sounds Volume 2 album sells for a break-even price of \$1.93, with upwards of 15,000 sold so far. The LRS Homemade Volume 3 goes for \$1.50 and benefits a station-sponsored college scholarship fund. The WKQX Hometown Volume II has sold over 40,000 copies at approximately \$3.50 each to benefit an as-yet-unnamed Chicago charity. Still to come is the sixth Homegrown album from the station who started the whole ball rolling, KGB/San Diego, whose latest project will be in the stores before Christmas, retailing for \$1.01.

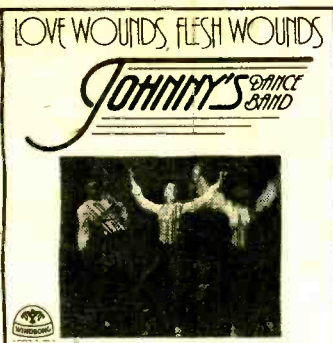

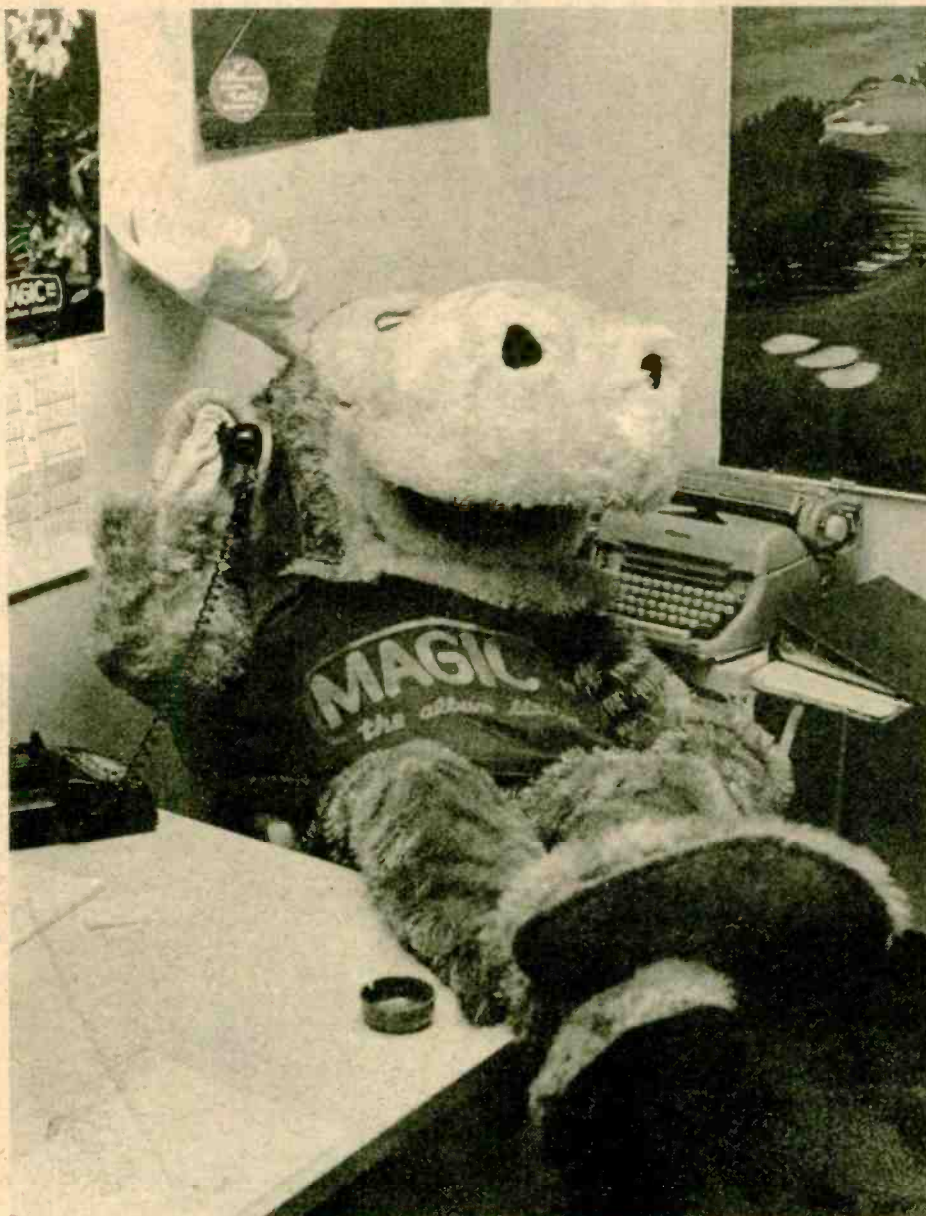

The resilient GINO was a prime mover this week, jumping upwards again quite nicely. POCO continued to show excellent AOR airplay response, jumping upwards, as did GEILS. NICOLETTE continued her steady climb, an admirable show of strength for a newcomer. OUTLAWS and POINTERS had good weeks of growing airplay, as did TODD. STRAITS debuted with a healthy combination of adds, mediums and hits. RUSH resurged. COOPER was this week's most added album, debuting with adds at 35 reporting stations plus early mediums and hits.

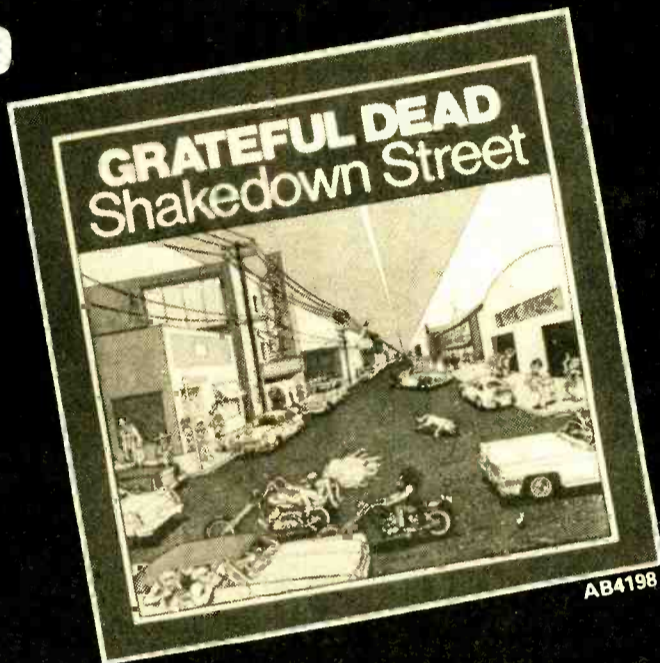

Inside Nashville

EXECUTIVE GO-ROUND: Jimmy Bowen met in L.A. this week with Elektra/Asylum officials about heading the Nashville office (see page 3) after resigning from the MCA-Nashville post two weeks ago. Eddie Kilroy, VP/A&R at MCA's 16th Avenue office, has the inside track on the job vacated by Bowen, but other names keep popping up: Billy Strange, West Coast music man who moved here a couple years ago; Chic Doherty, longtime head of MCA Country sales here; and Frank Jones, deposed head of the Capitol Country department here. Jones Monday announced he will open a Nashville office for Inergi Records, a Houston-based firm heavily involved in the young career of Mary K. Miller . . . Tom T. Hall announced the appointment of Judi Simmons as General Manager of Tom T. Hall Enterprises. Ms. Simmons has been with the Hall music complex since May, 1975, and will oversee daily operations of Hallnote Music, Gator Music, Toy Box Recording Studio, Magboe Productions, and assist Mrs. Hall in the business of Fox Hallow Farm and Kennels . . . Tom Collins, who produces Barbara Mandrell, Ronnie Milsap, Jim Ed Brown and Helen Cornelius, and is President of Pi-Gem Music and Chess Music here, elected Chairman of the Board of the Country Music Association, succeeding Don Nelson of WIRE/Indianapolis. Ralph Peer, head of giant Peer-Southern music publishing conglomerate, was named President of CMA for 1979, succeeding Joe Talbot.

SONGWRITER'S DEATH: Lee Emerson, a long-ago member of the Marty Robbins group, and writer whose best-known song was "I Thought I Heard You Calling My Name," recorded by many, including Porter Wagoner and most recently by Jessi Colter, was shot and killed last Friday night. Nashville police are continuing to question Barry Sadler, whose million-selling RCA hit "Ballad Of The Green Berets" was the biggest song to come out of the Vietnam war. Police said the shooting occurred near the apartment of Darlene Sharp, where Sadler and other friends had eaten dinner Friday night. Emerson had called Sadler at a lounge earlier in the evening and threatened to kill him, Sadler said. "Lee had been hounding Darlene Sharp for over a year," Sadler stated. "He ran her off the road once, he broke down the door to her apartment, and was continually threatening to kill her," continued the former Green Beret. No charges were placed against Sadler after Emerson's death, which Sadler claimed was accidental. Sadler's new book, just published, is called "Everything You Want To Know About The Music Industry" a manual on how to break into the music business without being ripped off. Emerson, who was evicted from his apartment four months ago, had no identification on his person. His wallet contained four prescriptions for amphetamines.



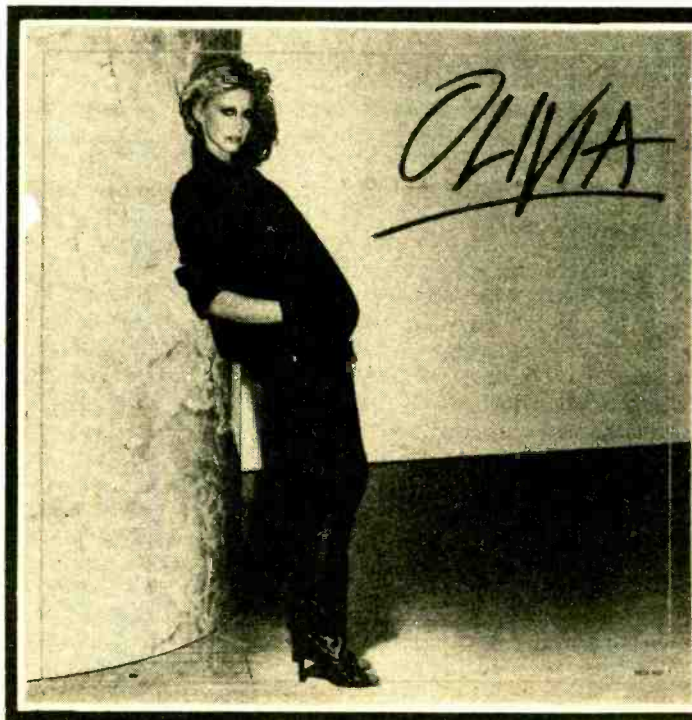

Wood claimed he was forced to sell his business, Ranwood Records, at a reduced price in May this year to compensate for losses and damages . . . 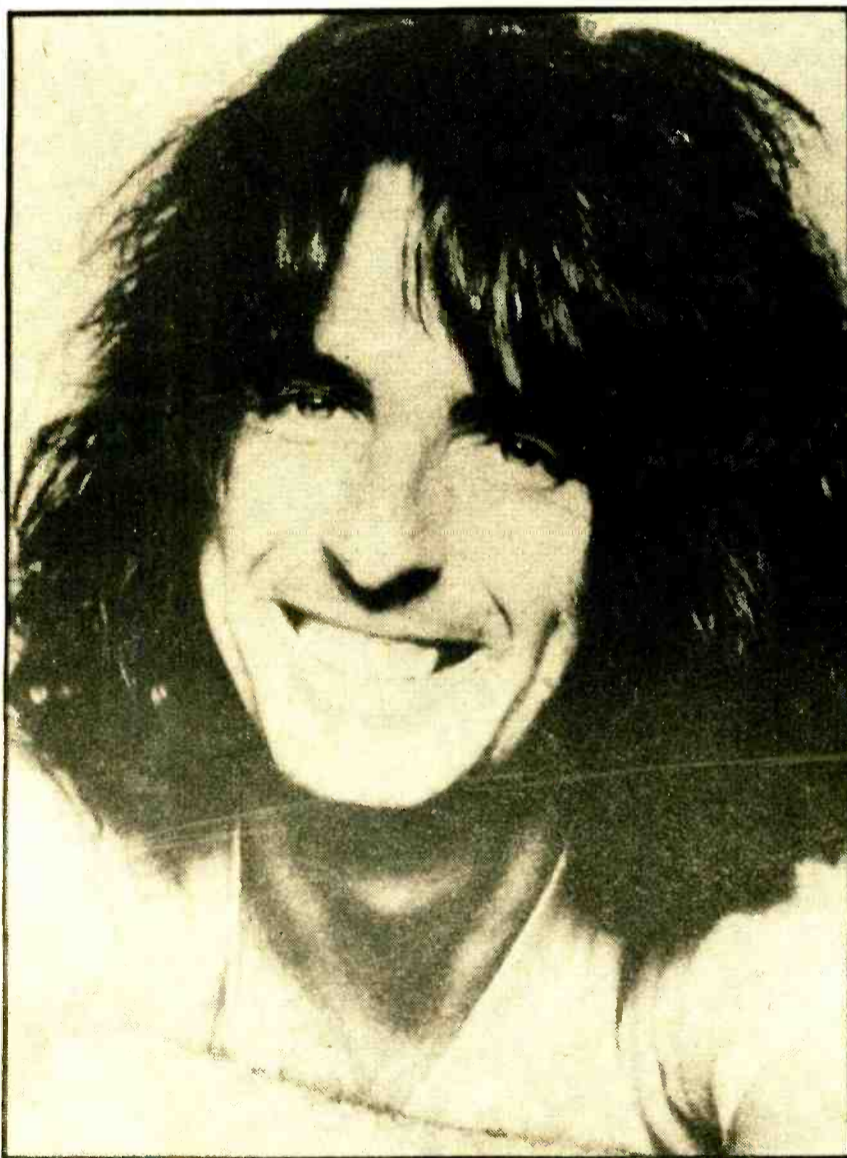
