### Sherwood Named Phonogram President

Robert Sherwood was appointed President and Chief Operating Officer of Phonogram Inc. last week. He replaces Irwin Steinberg, who retains his position as Chairman of Phonogram and Executive Vice President of its parent company, Polygram Corp.

Sherwood was most recently Vice President, National Promotion at Columbia Records, a position he had held for nearly three years. He joined Columbia's promotion staff in 1973 following nine years in radio, beginning as an air personality at various small Northern California stations. In 1967 be joined KROY/Sacramento, eventually becoming Program Director; later he moved to WRIT/Milwaukee and WYSL/Buffalo before joining WGCL/Cleveland, where as Program Director in 1973 he converted the station to a Top 40 format.

Commenting on Sherwood's appointment, Steinberg stated, "The continuing success of Polygram has caused me to devote an everincreasing amount of time to my corporate duties . . . I now feel that the company can only benefit from a full-time, resident Chief

Operating Officer. With Bob Sherwood, I believe we have found the kind of young, aggressive, and highly knowledgeable President needed to bring Phonogram to the very forefront of the record business."

Sherwood told R&R: "It's a very well-run company, already consistently making money. I want to get us more hits and make it the noisiest and most exciting record company in the business." He added, "It's also great to see dedicated promotion people getting into upper level record company management more and more," citing RSO's Al Coury and Polydor's Dick Kline as other similar trendsetters.

### A&M RETAINS AUTONOMY

### A&M, RCA Sign Distribution Deal

A&M Records, one of the largest remaining independentlydistributed companies in the industry, has concluded an arrangement with RCA Records for distribution. According to the terms of the pact, announced jointly by A&M Co-Chairman Jerry Moss and RCA President Robert Summer, a new organization called RCA and A&M & Associated Labels will be formed to distribute A&M (and presumably other) product within the RCA system, but A&M spokesmen made a point of distinguishing this arrangement from a situation of RCA distributing A&M. The agreement, which goes into effect February 15, is for the U.S. only, and under its terms, RCA will also manufacture A&M product.

A&M stressed that the company will retain its autonomy, with creative, marketing and promotion areas remaining separate from RCA. The only point of intersection is in the distribution and manufacturing areas. In connection with the new agreement, A&M Senior Vice President/Sales & Distribution Bob Fead was re-

ported to be moving to RCA in a top executive capacity, although arrangements have not been completed.

### Exiting The "Collection Business"

A&M President Gil Friesen told R&R that A&M entered into the RCA deal "simply because we've had four different kinds of distribution setups, and we wanted to

consolidate our distribution and also get out of the collection business. This new situation solves it all."

The A&M move has set off a flurry of speculation as to the future of independent distributors, with remaining independent lables reported to be scrambling for distribution deals with majors (see Page 18 for a roundup of the rumors to date).

### WXKS/Boston, K101/San Francisco Switch To Disco

Two more major market stations announced their format changeovers to Disco last week, WXKS-AM-FM/Boston (formerly WWEL) and K101/San Francisco. WXKS-AM-FM, part of the Heftel chain, will simulcast the new format, which Heftel President Tom Hoyt characterizes as "Cosmopolitan Contemporary." He told R&R the music would be

"a modern blend of current discohits and recent melodies that are sophisticated, uptempo, and happy." The station will be consulted by Burkhart/Abrams Associates, architects of the WKTU/New York success story. Richard Balshaugh, former National Sales Manager of the Norman Knight Broadcasting chain, has been



### AM BAND SPACING REDUCED FROM 10 TO 9 kHz?

### New Proposal Would Create 700 Additional AM Stations

A government agency has set the stage for what could lead to the biggest bout of industry infighting ever witnessed. The National Telecommunications Information Agency (NTIA) is asking the FCC to consider adding approximately 700 full-time stations to the existing AM band. This would be accomplished by reducing the space of each channel on the AM dial from 10 kHz to 9 kHz.

R&R has learned that about 400 daytimers would, in theory, benefit by trading in their current frequency for one which would allow them to operate full-time. Remaining stations would be reserved for new minority applicants.

The NTIA proposal is significant for three reasons: 1) their petition is the first from a government agency to mention daytimers in addition to minorities, 2) Executive Director Henry Geller is known to have considerable clout with the FCC and Congress, and 3) NTIA is instrumental in recommending and formulating policy for the White House. ### Radio Rises To Occasion As Blizzard Paralyzes Chicago

As the city of Chicago lay virtually paralyzed under 20 inches of snow, with wind-chill factors driving temperatures down to 50 degrees below zero, radio once again rose to the occasion, as all formats rallied to provide 'round-the-clock information regarding

weather and road conditions in a textbook example of radio's potential as a true local public service medium.

Don Kelly, Program Director at Pop/Adult-formatted WFYR, described the conditions as being "the worst winter in memory and we're only halfway through." He added, "Usually, we have an average of 40 inches of snow during winter and we're up to 60 so far.

"Because temperatures have been so low," Kelly continued, "snow removal has been impossi-(Continued on page 28)

### Ed Hynes Named Columbia National Promotion VP

Ed Hynes has been appointed Vice President, National Promotion, at Columbia Records, the position recently vacated by new Phonogram Inc. President Bob Sherwood. Hynes will supervise the label's national promotion staff, and will be based in New York, reporting to Columbia Vice President/Marketing Joe Mansfield.

In making the appointment, CBS Records Division President Bruce Lundvall commented, "Ed takes on his new responsibilities with a wealth of experience in promotion and sales. His achievements and

steady growth within the CBS Records organization clearly demon-

strate Ed's broad expertise in the record industry."

Hynes told R&R, "I'm very pleased with the reaction of my peers to this appointment. It's almost as exciting as getting the job iteelf"

Hynes was most recently Director, Sales/Artist Development at Columbia, a position he had held since 1976. He joined Columbia in 1965 as Hartford Local Promotion Manager, moving to Boston in the same capacity, and becoming Northeast Regional Promotion Marketing Manager for CBS in 1975.

### Crocker Returns To Radio As WBLS MD

Frankie Crocker, credited with largely creating WBLS/New York's innovative Black format several years ago, has returned to the station as Music Director. Crocker had recently been affiliated with Polydor Records, and had previously recorded instrumental disco LP's for Casablanca. He had been convicted of perjury in a payola-related case but was subsequently acquitted.

Inner City Broadcasting President Pepe Sutton told R&R: "Frankie is Music Director of WBLS. He will be on the air and he will perform other special projects that the company may from time to time get into in a music area. We were pained by the original allegations against him, and now that he has been cleared of these charges and is ready to go back to work, we're pleased to have him back in the family."

Speculation arose that Crocker would also be involved in music and programming plans for Inner City's recently-acquired KKTT-KUTE/Los Angeles, KRE/Berkeley, and WBRB/Detroit. Sutton stated, "Our arrangement is allencompassing, so the likelihood is that down the road we will be using his services to help us along with our other projects as well, and thereby increase his responsibilities; but at the present time, and for the immediately forseeable future, his task will be WBLS."

Sutton added, covering the topic of possible programming adjustments at WBLS, "We have had some changes planned for a long time, and it was just a matter of time before we implemented them. We are asking Mr. Crocker to implement the changes which have been contemplated. I think that you will find that WBLS will certainly change, but I don't think the changes will be of such a nature that you will not recognize WBLS when you hear it."

### GE, Cox Place Stations On The Block For \$77 Million

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With the proposed General Electric/Cox Broadcasting merger, the largest in broadcast history, necessitating the divesting of several radio and TV properties, the two companies announced the stations and their suggested prices last week. The announcements were made in confidential letters to prospective purchasers and were not announced to the press. Total price tag for the six radio stations and two TV outlets mentioned came to \$77 million.

The highest-priced property was Cox's WHIO-TV/Dayton, with a suggested list price of \$40 million competitive bidding could drive

the eventual price higher). GE's WRGB-TV/Schenectady was set at \$22.5 million. Top radio listing was Cox's WSB-FM/Atlanta at \$5 million, followed by GE's WSIX-AM-FM/Nashville and the same company's KFOG/San Francisco for \$3.5 million, and Cox's WSOC-AM-FM/Charlotte, NC for \$2.5 million. Sources close to Cox and GE told R&R that Cox's WSB-AM and GE's WNGE-TV/Nashville will also go on the block in order to help meet FCC ownership restrictions of seven AM, FM and TV stations. In addition, one further FM station, undecided at this time, will be di-

### Arbitron Changes Slogan, Beltsville Visit Procedures

Arbitron has announced changes in its procedures for handling radio station slogans and client visits to corporate headquarters in Beltsville, MD to view diaries. The slogan changes are three-fold, involving a new callback questionnaire, instituted with the October/ November 1978 book; a change in

the slogan conflict definition; and advance publication of station slogans.

The new "more in-depth" questionnaire, in addition to asking diarykeepers who entered station slogans instead of call letters if they could recall the call letters connect.

### Becky Ulrick Named KRLD PD

Becky Ulrick has been appointed Program Director of KRLD/Dallas. The Metromedia 50,000-watt station has been programming a News format until 8pm, when it switched to a Pop/Adult-styled music approach, with the music format also prevailing during all weekend hours. As of last week, the music format became chiefly Country-oriented. The appointment of Ulrick, who was previously the station's Music Director, adds to speculation that a full or at least greater conversion to a Country format is in the works. KRLD's use of the same jingle package used by Metro-media's Country outlets KLAC/Los Angeles and KNEW/Oakland-San Francisco during its music hours was also cited by observers

Ulrick, who had been with KRLD

for slightly over two years and with KVIL/Dallas for five years previously, told R&R: "The new format has now been on the air since last Friday. KRLD is News-formatted during the day, and starting at 8pm we are featuring music. KRLD has no plans at this time for a full format change, but the music programming portion of our day is leaning more and more to Country, mainly the crossover variety. We are going to see the reaction before we make any more drastic changes in the format in the direction of Country."

Ulrick is the second female programmer appointed at a major market Country station in recent weeks, following the December appointment of Carol Parker as PD of WMZQ-FM/Washington, D.C.

Barbis was most recently Director of Field Administration and Special Projects, having joined ABC in 1977. He is a 12-year music industry veteran, having worked at a number of labels and in independent promotion as well.

### **Stores Airing** Radio Broadcasts Face ASCAP, BMI Action

ASCAP has sued three businesses whose stores aired radio broadcasts over loudspeakers without an ASCAP license, while a chain of clothing stores in Miami received a letter from BMI warning that such unlicensed broadcasts were illegal and required a BMI license. The Miami chain, Pants Scene, asked Y100/Miami for advice in the matter, objecting to paying for a BMI license to air Y100's programming.

The ASCAP suit alleged copyright infringement on 26 ASCAPlicensed songs aginst the Gap Stores, Inc., a nationwide clothing chain; Cal's Inc. (a fast-food operation); and Kevin Inc. along with Kevin Adams, operators of a department store in Maine. ASCAP further contended that all three companies were offered the chance to acquire an ASCAP license, but refused; and sued for damages amounting to a total of not less than \$6500 in the three cases.

### **Century Appoints** Lee, Wilson VP's

Rick Lee and Al Wilson have been named Vice President/General Managers in the Century Broadcasting chain, Lee at KMEL/ San Francisco and Wilson at WABX/Detroit. Both had been General Managers at those stations previously.

Wilson had been with Century National Sales before moving to WABX as Sales Manager. He was subsequently promoted to General Manager of the station

Lee started with Century at KSHE/St. Louis as a salesman, becoming General Sales Manager, Station Manager, and General Manager at the station before joining KMEL when it began in 1977. He previously worked in sales at KRCH, KGRV and WIL-FM in St. Louis

### **Donny Hathaway Dies** In Mysterious Fall

Although police have labeled singer-composer Donny Hathaway's death last Saturday night (1-13) in New York an apparent suicide, Hathaway's managerlawyer David Franklin feels differently. According to Franklin, the 33-year old singer-composer was in "extremely good spirits" earlier in the evening.

Hathaway, whose body was discovered early Sunday morning on a second story ledge 13 floors below his room at the Essex House Hotel in New York City, had checked into the hotel a week ago and had been recording an album with Roberta Flack, with work scheduled to begin on his own album in March.

In 1972, Hathaway and Flack won a Grammy for their single "Where Is The Love." That same year, Hathaway received two gold record awards for the albums, "Roberta Flack And Donny Hathaway" and "Donny Hathaway Live." His current recording projects reportedly represented a resurgence of sorts, however, he had apparently suffered a lengthy depression in previous years.

"His mood was positive," Frank-lin told the L.A. Times. "That's why I can't imagine that his death was a suicide. Donny has this habit of standing by the open window of hotel rooms and singing out to the city. It could have been an accident. He was not despondent. We had all been over at Roberta's house, where she cooked supper

Hathaway's body was flown to his hometown of St. Louis for burial. Details of the funeral were not yet available

### **CBS Blanket License Suit Heard By Supreme Court**

CBS, which has fought BMI and ASCAP for some eight years on the issue of whether blanket licensing violates antitrust regulations, had its suit heard in the Supreme Court Monday (1-15). The network; the two licensing organizations, which deny CBS's allegations of price-fixing in blanket licensing because, they contend, the opportunity exists for direct music licenses to be obtained instead; and the Justice Department, which generally has supported ASCAP and BMI, all delivered arguments.

In past decisions, CBS's original suit was rejected in 1975 by a New York District Court, which stated that no price fixing was involved if the direct licensing opportunity existed. In 1977, an Appeals Court overturned that decision, ruling that blanket licensing does constitute price fixing, but that it should not necessarily be barred. CBS has maintained that ASCAP and BMI are monopolies, and that their

blanket prices for broadcasters are not determined by competition; the company hopes to end the blanket licensing practice.

### **Stevie Wonder Buys** KJLH/L.A. For \$2.2 Million

Stevie Wonder has agreed to KJLH-FM/Compton (near Los Angeles) for a reported \$2.2 million from owner Lamar Hill. According to Hill, the transaction, which is subject to

FCC approval, represents the first time a radio station has been transferred from one black owner to another in a cash deal. KJLH has been programming a Jazz/Black

### Cream VP Bennett Shot To Death

Wayne Bennett, Executive Vice President and General Manager of Cream Records, was found shot to death early Sunday morning (1-14) in the Studio City apartment

### Ferris Calls For Increased Minority Input

FCC Chairman Charles Ferris told members of the National Conference of Black Lawyers Communication Task Force that he shares concerns of minorities that future deregulatory efforts not restrict minorities' efforts to gain media access.

The FCC chairman noted, however, that he is committed to increasing minority ownership of stations and more importantly, employment in policy-making positions as a means of increasing minority input.

He indicated that minority applicants will have an advantage in applying for new stations that could be created if 1) the clear channels are broken up and 2) if the FCC's proposal to expand the AM band is adopted.

This week, the FCC issued a 30-page discussion in its further notice of proposed rulemaking regarding clear channel broadcasting.

### Court Says FCC Can Adopt New Comparative Renewal Standards

"The Court's action restores the Commission's discretion to develop appropriate comparative renewal policy," FCC General Counsel Bob Bruce told R&R. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the DC Circuit announced last Friday that it would not rehear a case involving the renewal of WESH-TV/Daytona Beach, FL, in which it had earlier attacked the FCC's standards.

At issue is how much weight will be afforded incumbent licensees at renewal time when challenged by petitions to deny. The Court said that broadcasters need only fear a substandard record, in contrast to the earlier ruling, which set off fears that incumbent standing would carry no weight at all. What remains to be seen is how the Commission will define "substandard."

Bruce noted that the Commission's initial concern seemed to be that the Court had limited the FCC's authority in this area, but in an interview with R&R said, "We're encouraged that we have the flexibility to develop policies that will serve both broadcasters and the public."

### FM Quad — Front Burner Again?

The FCC issued a further notice of inquiry last week seeking to gather comments on standards for FM quadraphonic broadcasting.

FCC engineer Al Jarratt said the inquiry is to determine the effects reduced channel spacing would have on Quad, FM Stereo and Subsidiary Communications Authorizations (SCA's). Further considerations include costs to broadcasters and consumers as well as their component preferences. Jarratt told R&R that proposed standards should be published by fall.

Currently, FM stations occupy 200 kHz of band width. Previous FCC staff recommendations have sought to reduce spacing to 150 or even 100 kHz. The last inquiry sought comments on three different systems:

4-4-4: involves taking four original audio channels and transmitting them over the main FM channel and three subchannels.

4-3-4: similar to 4-4-4 except that one subchannel is deleted.

4-2-4: transmission utilizes main channel and one subchannel. This system requires that "logic decoders" be added to radio receivers.

FCC analysis to date of more than 2000 comments from broadcasters, manufacturers and listeners/consumers rates 4-4-4 as best performer, but more expensive for broadcasters. On the other hand, the 4-2-4 system would be most expensive for the public and is rated inferior to other systems.

The FCC prefers giving broadcasters the choice of airing 4-44 or 4-3-4 as long as new radio receivers are built to pick up both systems. Comments are due April 16.

### More On NAB Radio Board Race

A familiar name appearing on the list of nominees for NAB Radio Board of Directors election (R&R 1-12) is former board member Allen Jr. (WDOR/Sturgeon Bay, WI), who is challenging incumbent Eddie Fritts (WNLA/Indianola, MS) in the Class D, at-large race. Also, former board member Stan McKenzie (KWED/Sequin, TX) will face Dick Oppenheimer (KIXL/Austin, TX).

### Government And Industry Differ On Approaches To Regulation, Part II

### **Am Spacing**

While long-oppressed licensees of daytime facilites would welcome proposals by the National Telecommunications Information Agency (NTIA) to add 700 new stations (see Page 1), over half the radio industry (existing full-time AMs and FMs) will most likely oppose the petition.

FM stations, for example, may be fearful that a reduction of AM spacing might give impetus to similar proposals for FM. In its recent notice regarding FM Quad (see Update), the FCC has already said that it won't consider any Quad system over 150 kHz. Currently, FM stations occupy a 200 kHz band width.

### Three Alternatives

Less than a month ago, the FCC proposed adding 100 new full-time AM stations by breaking up the remaining clear channel stations. NTIA refers to this as "not adequate."

The Commission has also announced its intention to carry to

the World Administration Radio Conference (WARC) in Geneva this year a recommendation to expand the AM dial. However, NTIA is weary of this since new facilities using the higher band will have poor reception, especially in mountainous regions.

Therefore, NTIA suggests that reduced spacing is the best solution to creating more stations. (Currently, two-thirds of the world operates on 9 kHz. Interestingly enough, at the time Europe adopted the 9 kHz standard, groups were arguing in favor of an 8 kHz separation.)

### Emphasis On Minority Ownership

All three proposals represent the federal government's desire to increase the availability of stations and minority owners — what NTIA terms "greater program diversity for special interest programs." But more importantly for daytime broadcasters is that NTIA is the first government agency to urge FCC adoption of this

idea. During December, the Daytime Broadcasters Association submitted an informal request for reduced spacing (R&R 12-1-78 — "New Hope For Daytimers").

### Solves World Interference Problems

This proposal, NTIA claims, will also eliminate heterodyne interference (whistles) that result from incompatible world standards.

Already, nighttime interference is being caused in California by stations in the Pacific and in Colorado by stations in the Far East, according to NTIA.

More significantly, NTIA says the heterodyne problem will get worse in 3-4 years because of decreased "sunspot activity." Moreover, they claim that the problem can't be solved with "whistle" filters.

### **Association Reaction**

NTIA is following the current thinking in Washington by noting specifically that "radio is different from TV." Thus they would like to see further deregulation of AM if their plan for reduced spacing is adopted.

Already, NAB has opposed the idea, but is expected to study it further with direction coming from its board meeting in Hawaii this week. The NRBA Board, which meets later this month in Southern California, will hear a recommendation to endorse the NTIA petition.

### **Washington Street Talk**

Consumerist Ralph Nader mounts campaign geared to getting broadcasters to educate the public on issues of Communication Act rewrite. In article appearing in Washington Star, he encourages Walter Cronkite "to start the ball rolling."

Will Rep. Van Deerlin include provision in revision of Communications Act rewrite offering solution to daytimers' problem? Indications from recent letter to Rep. Paul Findley are that he will incorporate reduced AM spacing proposal in this rewrite.

FCC backs off discussing fate of WDAS/Philadelphia, which has not been rescheduled after being deleted as an agenda item last month. Discussion could be explosive; however, Commission is expected to give citizens' group seeking to block transfer of ownership to Gene Jackson's National Black Network 20 days in which to respond to WDAS's counsel's reasons supporting sale.

Fact that new replacement for retiring FCC Chief Engineer Ray Spence is not an engineer came with verification that position will go to Rand Corporation scientist Steve Lukaski, who will be called FCC Chief Scientist. 142-member staff will be shifted into new department.

Finally, NAB to honor KPRC/Houston President Jack Harris with its 1979 Distinguished Service Award at association's March 25 convention in Dallas.

### **Washington Sales Talk**

KVOR-KSPC-FM/Colorado Springs is being sold by Wolverine Broadcasting Corp. to a new radio company Sunbelt, for \$1.5 million plus \$290,000 for a five-year non-compete convenant.

Final FCC approval should come about February 2, according to PD Michele Starling, who also hosts a talk show on the station. She told R&R that she wouldn't be surprised if things are changed, but added "nobody's biting their nails." Currently, KVOR is Top 40. KSPC uses an automated Top 40 format.

### **Other Actions**

Muriel and Sol Horenstein are selling WBAB/Babylon, NY to All Shores Radio Corpent Jerry Lee (WDVR/Philadelphia) versus challenger Rhody poration for \$800,000, plus \$150,000 for a five-year non-compete agreement.

### KUPD States Its Case Against Arbitron For All To Read

The response of Arbitron to Radio & Records' Year of Law sult editorial requires an answer from KUPD Radio. First, although there may have been four lawsuits filed in 1978, there are many more lawsuits awaiting filing in San Francisco, San Diego, and in the East. It is simple to account for this dearth of litigation; just read the Arbitron contract with all its exculpatory provisions. By virture of its monopoly position (and Judge Coulter in the KUPD suit in Phoenix found Arbitron to be a monopoly), Arbitron forced broadcasters to accept contracts in an attempt to deny broadcasters most, if not all, of their legal rights. Additionally, Arbitron and its multimillion dollar parent, Control Data Corporation, employ literally hundreds of attorneys in St. Paul, Washington and New York. The KUPD lawsuit was the first successful chink in Arbitron's armor. Prior to KUPD, broadcasters seemingly accepted as a fact that they (the broadcasters) couldn't get the assistance of any court. Arbitron had convinced everyone that the courts would not issue a restraining order or injunction. KUPD changed that. In a published statement, Mr. Aurichio stated that he had no objections to the courts being involved in these matters, but what Mr. Aurichlo didn't say was that Arbitron was now trying to take away one right that KUPD has established as a precedent in the courts by changing the new Arbitron contract. The new Arbitron contract, Section 12, has added a provision that there shall be no injunctive relief against Arbitron, which is precisely the right we secured for you in Court. This changed provision is another attempt by Arbitron to deny broadcasters any rights against Arbitron. We firmly believe that the majority of broadcasters are unaware that this right, secured by KUPD in the courts, is being taken away by Mr. Aurichio's new wording in Section 12. And if you think new Section 12 is unfair, you should read new Section 15, which puts you at Arbitron's mercy with absolutely no recourse. Arbitron is trying to hide from the courts of this country. Why does Arbitron fear injustice? The small number of lawsuits filed against Arbitron does not reflect Arbitron's conpetence or fairness, but reflects an unfair contract forced upon broadcasters by a monopoly. Further, the expenses of litigation again deters broadcasters. KUPD has directly or indirectly expended \$75,000.00 in its latest dispute with Arbitron. However, broadcasters can now go into Court at a fraction of the expense we had because of the precedents set by KUPD. Additionally, all of the legal documents and research are part of the court record and are available to any broadcaster. As of this date, KUPD or Phil Goldstein (Mr. Goldstein is the attorney handling the still pending delisting litigation) has had 22 inquires regarding the KUPD lawsuit. Furthermore, approximately 45 other broadcasters have requested that we keep them informed as to the status of our lawsuit.

The decision to fight Arbitron, its enormous legal staff and its monopolistic contract was not an easy decision, but was forced upon us by Arbitron. When we were first notified that Arbitron questioned our last promotion, we supplied Arbitron with all the material they requested for their Special Station Activity Committee to make a just determination regarding diary distortion. The Special Station Activity Committee found, amazingly, diary distortion; then we were told that KUPD would have an opportunity to meet with Mr. Aurichio, Vic Farrell, their Washington attorney, and Chuck Levenberg, Control Data Corporation's St. Paul attorney, and present our case to show that the Special Station Activity Committee was wrong. One member of KUPD's management made two trips to Washington, and an additional two members made one trip to Washington to prepare and present this matter to Mr. Aurichio, Mr. Farrell and Mr. Levenberg. Additionally, KUPD's Washington attorney, Stanley Cohen, was with us to prepare and present this matter to Arbitron's people with the expectation of a fair and impartial hearing. It is impossible to express our shock and dismay upon learning that the impartial hearing was in front of the same three people who, unknown to us, were three-quarters of the Special Station Activity Committee. The Special Station Activity Committee had already decided against us, and now the same members were hypocritically giving us an "impartial" hearing. If we had been informed that these three men were three of the four members comprising the Special Station Activity Committee, we would not have wasted our time and money to appear before them. It was this disdain for our rights that was the major factor in our final deci-

Incidentally, at this hearing, Stan Cohen, our Washington counsel, offered to have the matter of our delisting tried by an impartial arbitrator. Arbitron refused. Mr. Cohen then offered

that KUPD would pay the actual expense of another survey. Arbitron again refused. We believe that Arbitron refused the second offer for two reasons. First, if Arbitron had accepted, the actual cost of Arbitron's survey in Phoenix would have been made public, but Arbitron could not permit this. The charge that Arbitron imposes upon its subscribers bears no relationship to Arbitron's cost of the value of Arbitron's services in a free market, but represents Arbitron's monopolistic power to charge all that the traffic will bear. Arbitron is every broadcaster's unwanted partner. If a broadcaster is successful and can raise his rate, Arbitron arbitrarily charges more. If you don't agree with this, just try to negotiate for a new contract with Arbitron.

KUPD was offered a purported compromise with Arbitron, but this settlement included a promise of complete silence on our part. If we settled with Arbitron, we had to agree to make no public statement about anything that occurred with Arbitron, and to waive any legal rights we had. In effect, we would have given up all our rights that are guaranteed by the First Amendment. As broadcasters whose rights to free speech are paramount, we could not agree to such an outrageous arrangement. It is frightening that Arbitron, which owes its existence to the broadcast industry, could attempt to deny us or any broadcaster our First Amendment rights. We must wonder if the other broadcasters that had a delisting dispute and settled with Arbitron did, in fact, agree to give up their First Amendment rights. Speaking of the other delisted stations, we wonder if everyone is aware that one station in San Jose, California, was delisted because of one word. The use of the word "regularly" instead of "actually" caused financial loss to them and embarrassment in their community. Another owner had three stations involved in his dispute with Arbitron. All three stations were accused of violating the Arbitron rules by running the same contest, but two stations were "stickered," and only one station was delisted. There was no basis for Arbitron taking different action against any of the three stations, but Arbitron was able to act arbitrarily and exact whatever penalty is wished without regard to justice or rights because

Arbitron claimed that It is taking these actions in order to Insure accurate surveys. If this is true, then how does Arbitron explain its actions in regard to a local radio station in Phoenix, Arizona. This station broadcast announcements calling attention to the last Arbitron survey (October'/November, 1978) in Phoenix. Arizona. Arbitron is well aware that such announcements do, in fact, distort the survey results. This is a proven fact by the test that Arbitron itself performed in San Diego, California. There is no question that the local announcements distorted the soon to be released Phoenix survey results. Yet Arbitron has informed us that it proposes only to "sticker" the local station. We received communications from Arbitron and the Advisory Council requesting that no station broadcast such announcements because of the distortion factor. It is incomprehensible that Arbitron would delist a station over one word and not take the same action against a station that ran an announcement that

In response to Mr. Aurichio's comment that the formation of the Advisory Council was neither a gesture nor an attempt to create a PR tool, we must state that KUPD totally agrees that the broadcasting industry should have a voice that could be heard and considered by Arbitron. However, we cannot agree with the present manner in which the Advisory Council is forced to function. As every broadcaster is aware, the Advisory Council is totally dependent upon Arbitron for its funds. Arbitron pays their expenses for travel, rooms, meals, printing, mailing and for all clerical help. We advocate that the broadcast industry should assess itself to provide adequate funds for the Advisory Council to function properly and independently. We are not implying that the Advisory Council has not done its utmost for the broadcast Industry, but we believe it will function much more effectively if it were totally independent of Arbitron.

Mr. Aurichio stated, "We can't respond immediately to change or the state of change," but Arbitron can respond immediately to change Section 12 and 15 of their contract to deny you rights that KUPD has just won for you in court.

We hope these comments will enable our fellow broadcasters to understand our actions in this matter.

Special Programming Services President Larry Yurdin also stated that the company would be developing two mass appeal series syndication for the Multi-Media Entertainment Corporation and that a national country music syndication is being planned for a third company. Yurdin was formerly the creator and General Manager of the Planet and Daily News syndication firms as well as a former General Manager of KFAT/San Jose and KPFT/Houston.

### Sears Sets Merchandising Sights On Middle America

Sears, Roebuck & Co. intends to alter its present merchandising strategy, focusing greater emphasis on the social habits, needs and tastes of Middle America. According to "The Headquarters Merchandising Plan, 1979-1983," a series of documents produced by Sears's corporate headquarters, "Sears is a family store for middle-class, home-owning America," and Sears is "the premier distributor of durable goods for these families" and well as "the premier distributor of nondurable goods that have their acceptance base in function rather than fashion.

The report from the nation's largest retailer goes on to state, "We (Sears) are not a store that anticipates. We reflect the world of Middle America, and all of its desires and concerns and faults. And we must all look on what we are, and pronounce it good! And seek to extend it. And not to be swayed from it by the attraction of other markets, no matter how enticing they might be

### TRAC-7 Reports Radio Listening Levels Up

TRAC-7 reports that during the first five-week period of its fourth-quarter survey of four major markets radio listening levels are higher than those reported by the weekly diary method. According to Avery Gibson. Vice President of Marketing for TRAC-7, the difference was particularly pronounced "during late afternoon and evening dayparts and among males and females under 25 years-of-age." Gibson also claims that "daily cumulative audience estimates would indicate that when people use radio they use it for longer periods of time than has been reported by diary measurement

The data from which these interpretations were drawn is from the period October 19 through November 22. The markets surveyed were New York, San Francisco, Dallas/Ft. Worth and Washington, D.C.

### Seven-Up To Boost Media Spending 150% In 1979

The Seven-Up Company will be increasing its media spending by a towering 150 percent and its total marketing budget by 50 percent during 1979. In dollars and cents, this means that Seven-Up will be spending nearly \$48 million in 1979 as opposed to 1978's figure of \$20 million.

In addition, Seven-Up will be utilizing a new marketing campaign. Gone is the "Un-cola," replaced by "America's turning 7UP." The new campaign shows people participating in various active sports which they speak of in terms as "jogging up" while a new Seven-Up jingle plays in the background.

### Survey Indicates Elderly Changing Ad Roles

Results of a survey conducted by University of Maryland Associate Professor Kathleen Jamieson indicates that the use of elderly people as spokespersons in commercials is no longer confined to traditional elderly products (arthritis, dental care products and laxatives) and that elderly people are being found in new categories such as airline and bus ads. Ms. Jamieson also claims that last year commercials made "significant" improvements in the depiction of elderly people i.e. there are fewer commercials selling "youth" and less commercials making derogatory use of the word "aging."

### Broad Street Communications Forms Insilco Sports Network

The Instito Sports Network has been formed as a subsidiary of the Broad Street Communications Corporation. Alvin A. Smith, Sr. Vice President of the Insilco Broadcast Group of Louisiana, will direct ISN's operations. Eastman Radio has been named national sales representative for the network.

### Soviets Ban Radio Free Europe From Olympic Coverage

The Soviet Union has announced that it will refuse accreditation to reporters from the U.S. supported Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty, thereby making coverage of the 1980 Moscow Olympic Games virtually impossible for the two Munich-based stations.

According to Soviet Sports Minister Sergel Pavlov. "Everything will be done to prevent their presence." Pavlov went on to voice familiar Soviet objections to the two stations which broadcast news and information to between 15-18 million people in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe. He said the stations are staffed with disgruntled Soviet emigres in the employ of the CLA whose only aim is to broadcast false information and spread hatred against the Soviet Union. Pavlov said that granting the stations accreditation would be like inviting CIA agents to Moscow

A spokesman for the stations claimed that they had not yet applied for accreditation and that as of 1972, when the stations were reorganized under the Board for International Broadcasting. whose funds come from open Congressional appropriations, the stations have severed all ties with

### Arbitron Finds Homes-Using-TV Figures Steady

Arbitron Television has found Homes Using Television (HUT) levels remaining fairly constant, rafter comparing monthly reports from October 1977 and October 1978. HUT levels are a frequent source of concern to the TV industry, which becomes considerably upset if the HUT's decline appreciably in any daypart, as happened last year.

Arbitron measure HUT levels in its 33 measured markets, with results including the following: Sunday-Saturday 8-11pm (prime time) figures showed the October 1978 HUT level at 61%, same as a year earlier. Monday-Friday 7:30-8pm (prime time access) remained constant at 52%. Monday-Friday 8-7:30pm (early news) declined slightly from 48% to 47%, while Monday-Friday 11-11:30pm (late news) also dropped a point, 46% to 45%. Another one-point drop was evident in the Monday-Friday 4:30-6pm (early fringe) period, 33% to 32%, and in Monday-Friday 12-4:30pm (afternoon) figures, 25% to 24%. Saturday mornings (8:30am-1pm) remained at 20%, while one-point gains were registered in Monday-Friday 11:30pm-lam (late fringe), 19% to 20%, and Monday-Friday 9am-noon (morning), 16% to 17%. The total remained at 35%, backing up a comfortingly constant array of figures.

CBS did a little more fine-tuning of its midseason schedule, grounding "Flying High," the Friday 10pm stewardess drama, for the time being, putting "Dallas" into its time slot, and placing "Mary," Mary Tyler Moore's new version of her variety hour, in "Dallas" 's Sunday 10pm position

### CBS Shoots By ABC Again In Ratings Race

CBS continued its Nielsen hot streak by winning the week ending January 7 by a solid margin. CBS earned a 22.7 average rating, with ABC in second at 20.9 and NBC a distant third again at 17.3. Pacing the CBS victory was the week's runaway winner, the Rams-Cowboys NFL championship game, which extended into prime time and thus qualified for the list, beating the second-place show by over five full rating points. Following the game were 2) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 3) "Mork & Mindy" (ABC) 4) "Three's Company" (ABC) 5) "Laverne & Shirley" (ABC) 6) "Happy Days" (ABC) 7) CBS's three-hour special "The Incredible Journey of Dr. Meg Laurel" 8) "All In The Family" (CBS) 9) "MASH" (CBS), and 10) "What's Happening" (ABC). Finishing in 50th place was NBC's Tony Orlando special, the only predominantly musical offering of the week.



### THE R&R INTERVIEW: JOHN BAYLISS

### The Role Of A Group President

John Bayllss is President of Combined Communications' Radio Division. Combined, one of the nation's most diversified broadcast chains (including KIIS-AM-FM/Los Angeles, WVON-WGCI-FM/Chicago, WWWE-WDOK-FM/Cleveland, WDEE-WCZY-FM/Detroit, KSDO-KEZL-FM/San Diego, and KTAR-KBBC-FM/Phoenix, plus seven TV stations), recently merged with Gannett Co., a vast nationwide newspaper operation, to form a pervasive media corporation to rival any in the country.

Bayliss himself is a veteran of 23 years radio experience with ten differ-

R&R: What does a President of a broadcast group do?

JB: Well, that's hard to define. You do what you have to
do. I guess when I first took the assignment, I had to get a
feel for our stations across the country, who our people were
who had been all working at the same level I had been, and
I had a chance to put in focus what their operations were and
how they were performing. I'm also very involved in acquisition.

R&R: When you consider how they are performing, is that based on a bottom line figure?

JB: No, there are too many other things that come into play beyond bottom line.

R&R: Do you get involved in sales programs or major programming decisions? Are you in constant contact with your GM's and other station management?

JB: Oh yes. I'm in touch with all of the general managers at least once or twice a week, in some cases, if there is something of a pivotal nature going on. The whole company functions on an extension of management freedom, and I had to educate myself to some degree on what that freedom was. I had run small groups before; this was a much bigger ball game. The activity in the past two years has been fast and furious and so far, we have been on the right track - not without some problems here and there, but, overall, I'm very pleased with the progress, and all of the folks in the company seem to be. The general philosophy is to lay out the confines of general policy as far as the company is concerned; to arrive at common goals that are, in fact, reachable and achievable with management, and then give them the keys to the operation and say, "Now, go and do it!" We then act as a support unit. I'm available to them as a sounding board for new ideas; the general manager has the final say on his operation. I have more votes on the key, pivotal decisions, and if a push gets to a shove and it's one of those really major decisions and we conflict on that, then I've got to overrule - but rarely has that taken place in the past couple of years.

R&R: With your diversified radio stations, from All-News to Disco — when you need a general manager, where do you go to find them to fit the element?

JB: Well, I'm pleased that we are that diversified, and that's one of the secrets to our success. At one point, until late in the summer this year, when we sold the New York/Hackensack (WWDJ) property to Ken Palmer, we had a Gospel station. It made sense for us to have this station in that programming vein, and it turned out that it became the most successful Gospel station in America.

Regarding finding people, well, I'm very fortunate in that I guess I'm uniquely qualified for this kind of position because of the experience that I have. I've been running radio stations since I was 23 years old . . . all different formats - the broad broad spectrum. And I've been in a number of marketplaces across the country. I've worked for 10 different companies in 14 to 15 different assignments in the last 23 years. I ran my first radio station when I was 23 and I've been able to keep in touch with the people that I've worked with and the competitors I've worked against, and the companies I've worked for I've seen a lot of growth with these folks that I've had contact with over the years. And if we're going to go into a Country operation in marketplace X, or an All-News operation in some other marketplace, or if we need a strong anchor-person for another kind of a facility, I have the wherewithal to make a number of phone calls and find just the kind of person that we're looking for in that marketplace. That's the way it's been

R&R: Do you have any In-house training programs?

JB: Yes. We're very strong in movement from within our own company. In fact, we're in the midst of a management assignment right now that will move one of our general sales managers into a very key management assignment. When we decided two years ago to make some changes in **Phoenix**,

ent companies, having managed his first station in 1958 at the age of 23, and subsequently administering stations with formats ranging from Gospel to All-News. that brought about Dick Penn's assignment from KIIS in Los Angeles as Sales Manager; history indicates he did a phenomenal job, and when the Cleveland thing (3WE) came along, he pitched hard for the job and deserved a shot at it, and he got the assignment. He went to NBC for the FM assignment in Chicago (WKQX). I still haven't figured that out, but he'll be successful. He's a doer; he's an achiever; and he'll be successful... if NBC will allow him the freedom to run the operation!

R&R: When you take a Fritz Beezemyer and move him to Phoenix — and he goes from one kind of format to another — is he now supposed to be, because there is no one to advise him, qualified to make decisions on program directors and possibly programming? You don't have a national program director, yet you have all of these diversified formats, so who is overseeing?

JB: Good management - good, strong, aggressive management - doesn't necessarily have to be terribly well-versed in a particular program format. He must be of a mind to know that he has to surround himself with the talent to do that kind of format. In my view of programming, I've had enough exposure, and I'm a very strong student of the continuing changes in the various formats - I have just enough knowledge to be dangerous, so I can keep them honest. I work very closely with management and make sure that they are constantly testing their own programming to be sure that we are on the right track in that marketplace, because let's face it, radio is local, and the format is local, and you can go yourself from market to market across the country and hear a station that is supposed to be, by trade terms, "contemporary" in marketplace X. It's unlike any contemporary you've ever heard before, but that's what it is in that marketplace, and it works, and "if It ain't broke, you don't fix it." Country in Detroit is far different than Country in Los Angeles, than Country in New York, or Country in Nashville. In the Midwest we have two Beautiful Music stations with the same program service from Tom ChurchIII in Phoenix, and yet if you listen to WDOK-FM in Cleveland, and our Beautiful Music station in Detroit "COZY" (WCZY), I think you'll hear two different radio stations. It's because of the execution and because of the other competitive factors in the marketplace. In Detroit, we're more of a conversational, laid-back, AOR approach with Beautiful Music. In Cleveland, because of what we inherited with the station, and because of the decade-long tradition of WDOK-FM, it's far more poised; far more polished; it's more of a formal approach — "music for the great Western Reserve" the old days of the first kinds of good music stations. It's the same music service, and really two different radio stations.

R&R: Do you have major incentive programs in each of your individual markets, and do you include PD's in them?

JB: I don't believe in the rating point incentive plan. I've never seen that work. I can't see a program manager's compensation tied to that. If it's an accurate book, and the book is up, he deserves additional compensation for outstanding performance. If he has performed well, and everything else has been done properly, and it's one of those books where the diaries fall into the wrong hands, that's not fair. We review the compensation for all the department heads on an annual basis, and based on what they've done, there's a new plan next year. For sales and sales management, and for management, you've got to tie them to an incentive; it's their very nature to be paid that way. Show me an operation where sales people and sales management people are paid a flat salary or put on a kind of quota system, and I'll show you an operation that's not taking as full advantage of the situation as they should, or getting the most out of their people, as they are entitled to. And I'm not talking about using or abusing people; I'm saying giving them some goals to shoot for that are really obtainable. We tie our management to profits; we tie sales management to sales - all the things that they can control. A sales manager can't control profits, and a local sales manager can't control national sales

R&R: But can a manager control profits?

JB: Yes.

R&R: What about corporate overhead — can't that be used to deflate profits?

JB: No, we don't do tha

R&R: How do they pay for the legal fees and your advice?

JB: Our corporate centers are not profit-producing centers. I am not charged back against the operations. My expenses, when I travel, are not charged back against the operations. They are charged back for expenses that they control. We don't come in every year and say, OK, we have looked into our magic Ouija Board and next year you are going to produce X, and your sales are going to be marvelous, and your profits are going to be fantastic. That's a bunch of nonsense We go in and we say, OK, the barometers seem to indicate, over a five-year trend here, that the marketplace is going to do such-and-such next year - that's the way it's looking, and based on the fact that we have just gone through the major change with the programming format, you're going to see the biggest curve in your growth over the next two or three years next year, or conversely, you're not going to have as big a share of operating profit next year as you had this year because three new candy stores opened up across the street in the last four months that are going to be new factors for

R&R: Do you travel a great deal keeping tabs on the stations?

JB: In the last two years, yes, I've been on the road on the average of 2½ to three weeks a month. I would say my ratio of travel to home has been 60 percent on the road, but here again, we acquired, In the Spring of this year, five radio stations in the course of three days.

R&R: How much does your own personal opinion play in a decision to change a station format or manager?

JB: I have all the freedom in the world. I might as well be the President of Bayliss Broadcasting.

R&R: What are the major problems broadcasters are encountering, both in the marketplace and from the government?

JB: Government intervention. We find ourselves where it gets very frustrating to the point where you're so involved with paperwork and systems and reports, and the things you have to do to get from here to there because of these policies, that it's, God knows . . . A general manager will spend 20%-25% of his time at the minimum for that as opposed to running his operation, which the more time he has for that, the better service he's going to provide.

R&R: If you say 20% to 25%, and then you add on the lawyers, that's a pretty good chunk — 35% to 40% maybe

worth of the radio station going to dealing with the government.

JB: Yes, and the bigger you get, the mere you have to do. R&R: They watch every move your company makes now, don't they, waiting to see, especially with Gannett, what's going to happen?

JB: Yes. Very much so. We're very very visible — and that's okay. I disagree with the philosophy that "big is bad." By the same token, I have never been the kind of an individual that likes to work for big companies. I guess I would have to admit that we're very big now, but we don't act like a big company; we don't conduct ourselves like a big company.

R&R: You don't abuse your power base. There are, and have been, companies that had powerful and power-crazed people in certain key areas.

JB: Well, the company has grown awfully fast and because of the managers' philosophy of letting the outdoor managers run their own properties, and the television managers run their own properties, and the radio managements run their own properties, we fight hard to keep them out of some of the encumbrances of forms and reports, and give them their freedom to run the operations themselves. They're there. With the public licenses that we hold, surely it's our responsibility to have our own checks and balances to make sure that we're in compliance.

R&R: Does everything have to go through Phoenix or through San Diego?

JB: No - but the philosophy is, "no secrets, no surprises." While we may have the best intentions in the world, we may, through some error of omission, have something on our hands that is on the verge of a lottery, or perhaps because of the timing of the promotion, it could be considered a hype of some kind. But you see, the management doesn't look upon and again this is a reflection of the philosophy - they don't look upon this as an intrusion; they look upon the support they have available to them from me and from our legal folks and our EEOC folks, and our compliance folks as support, and they use them. We have a staff of four attorneys in Phoenix that deal with broadcast, with outdoor, with newspapers, and we use them as a sounding board for advice before . . . and let them go ahead and say — "You better take this up with Washington counsel" — or, "This is a civil matter, and you better prey upon local counsel there for advice." And that's just good business.

Our people that are involved in specialty areas out of Phoenix are constantly on the road making sure — not playing watchdog, but on a basis of "Hey, I'm going to be in the Midwest, how about if I come through and do an FCC-type swing and take a check of your public file, and let's go through some logs together." And the management fellows love it.

R&R: So, you don't do it like some companies, which run surprise checks on radio stations, like the FCC people would do?

JB: As I said earlier, a part of our overall managment philosophy is "no secrets, no surprises" — and in our relationship with management it is a two-way street. We don't have any problems . . . that's another one of the beautiful things I like about working with Combined. They're a very open, very

very up-front company

R&R: We're supposedly going into a recession this year and radio is meeting competition from so many different levels now. What do you project as the business climate for radio?

JB: Well, for us, we will continue to run at one of the highest ratios of operating profits against revenues of all the companies in the country, because we think that perhaps that word (recession) is a mental condition if you allow it to happen. And we don't believe it's going to happen. In our judgement, in our marketplaces, with our stations, we will not allow it to happen because if that happens, it affects so many different things and it gets right down to the core of people's jobs. Our receptionists are as aware of how well our stations are doing, as our general managers are.

R&R: Let me deal with Gannett for awhile. There had been charges even before they made the offering for Combined that Gannett was getting too big as a newspaper chain, and people's fears are that the head man at Gannett could sway a whole country by editorializing a certain way, or whatever... Now they're buying radio and TV as well.

JB: I don't like newspaper companies. I don't like newspaper companies' philosophies. I've competed far too long in the open marketplace with newspapers : . . I don't like them they just don't have the same aggressive competitive atmosphere. They just, for the most part, don't think like broadcasters do. I find that's very different with the Gannett folks and I think in the publishing business, they are considered something of a rebel force, and they run their operations very autonomously; they break them up by divisions; they're not concerned with where their division chiefs reside, so long as they get the job done. As far as editorializing, that's a bunch of nonsense. In the Presidential election, I think their split was something like 60/40 for the candidates from their markets across the country. They're in secondary market newspapers. and they're used to being more competitive, and they're used to having a lot of freedom in operation and editorial. I've spent some time with them in the fleld on some of the interviews we've had at the different stations' levels, so I've been exposed to a number of their folks, and they're the most different newspaper people I've ever been involved with. I've been in sessions with (Combined President Karl) Eller, (Combined Broadcast Division President Alvin) Flanagan, and (Gannett President Allen) Neuharth regarding management philosophy and they look at our broadcast division as something that is an absolute parallel to the way Gannett has approached their newspaper operations. They don't pretend to be broadcast

R&R:What about the rating situation today? We have four rating services going in the major markets, and since you're in all major markets, you'll be affected by that. Are you happy with what radio is getting as far as ratings . . . we have more ratings than television does at this point.

JB: Yes, but we don't have the acceptance that the television ratings services have. You have one dominant rating source today. I get very upset when I hear from one source, "Well, that was a wobble in that marketplace." I've seen a lot of "wobbles" in a lot of marketplaces that really concern us in the last year or so. I think that I don't like the idea of a diary.

I don't like the philosophy of diaries. I think that the Arbitron Advisory Council is going to help a lot, because there are some very sharp folks involved in that process. I had a chat with (Arbitron President) Ted Shaker about that recently when he was out here on the West Coast, and they're no saccharine group rallying around the flag. You're going to have some bickering and flighting about different methods and their affect on certain formats, but in the final analysis, if you can come to a broadcaster and say, "I can produce for you the best focus on your marketplace and what is really happening," he's going to go along with it because the broadcaster really wants to know, am I good, am I bad, am I weak, am I strong?

R&R: What are your feelings on the Communications rewrite?

JB: I was glad to see the recent meeting between the NAB and the NRBA — that's the first time they've really gotten together and I think that they found, or it certainly was Vince Wasilewski (NAB President) and Jim Gabbert's (NRBA President) response, that there wasn't really any great division. I think the only real bone of contention now between the two factions is perhaps tied to the spectrum use fee and the open window on petitions for relocation. Some folks say that a separate set of circumstances for radio now might be the first step toward "divide and conquer." I don't know. We're dealing with a bureaucracy. For us to sit back and say, "Gee, it's really going to happen now," I don't think we're going to see it yet. There's going to be a lot more input before it's done.

R&R: Do you think it's worthwhile? Are you in support of

JB: Sure, I think when you look at the Communications Act and the way it was formed, and why and when it was formed, it doesn't apply to today.

R&R: Well, let's talk about tomorrow, too. What do you see for the future?

JB: Radio is so used to competition, it finds some way to excel and provide new services. I can remember the talk about, gee, it was a good old medium back when television started to rear its head in the late 40's and the early 50's, and radio was then considered pretty much over. And look what radio did. It's bigger today — it's better today than it ever was. I think that with all these different competitive factors coming into play, we're going to see a different kind of competition; we're going to see more competition from other media than we've had in the past, while for the last decade or so, there's been a very high concentration of competition in the marketplace among ourselves. We'll see other media come in to compete with us now by virtue of their need to survive and find their place in the market. Television is going to have to take a new look at competition that they haven't had to face before.

R&R: What's that going to do to rate cards?


JB: It's going to be competitive — and for the radio broadcaster that's no crisis and really nothing new. We have come back and prevailed under the most adverse circumstances before and we'll continue to survive and excel — no media knows competition as we do.

R&R: Let me ask you one more thing. If I were to ask you to sum up John Bayllss's philosophy for success, what would it be?

JB: Well, I've got a distinct advantage in that I Just happen to love radio, and love what I do. I knew the first time I walked into a radio station control room, there was something, without getting maudiln or melancholy... there is something magical about it. There are some 8000 different control rooms across the country today that are all different, but they're all the same. There is something about radio that just got to me, and I knew then, as a young man, 20 years old, that that's what I wanted to do.

I wanted to work in that environment and I didn't care whether I made \$20 a day, or \$200 a day, or \$2000 a day. That's what I wanted to do. So, I guess there have only been a very few circumstances that I've gone to work in the last 23 years, where I have dreaded that particular day, and that was only because I was in some particularly testy situation at the time. God forbid the poor individual who gets up, goes to work, and doesn't like what he does. The young attorney who has inherited his dad's law practice, who would rather be building homes someplace. The fellow who owns a tire business who would rather be a commercial fisherman, etc. I love what I do, and if you love what you do, that kind of work Isn't really hard work; it's a part of your life. Radio is a big part of my life. It's been kind of my mistress, and a mistress can be very demanding at times, but this has been a very giving mistress for me. I love it. I wouldn't do anything else in the world.







ed with the slogans they entered, also asks respondents to identify the format of the station in question, what personalities (if any) they remember, and whether the station is a network affiliate. Arbitron hopes to have preliminary findings on the success of the new questionnaire in time for the Radio Advisory Council meeting at the end of this month.

### **Expanding Slogan Definition**

Previously, Arbitron considered two stations using the same slogan as a conflict only if both were licensed to the metro area being measured. With the January 1979 survey, any two stations coming up in the entire market using the same slogan will be considered a conflict.

Acting on a Radio Advisory Council suggestion, Arbitron will also begin publishing on a market-by-market basis all slogans submitted by radio stations and computerized call letter flips for stations. The company hopes this procedure will


allow radio stations "to resolve these issues" in advance. If a slogan conflict comes up, one station should directly challenge the other, with Arbitron receiving a copy of the challenge. If the challenged station fails to respond, Arbitron will contact it, stating that the slogan will not be used for that station unless it responds in writing to either the challenging station or Arbitron "confirming the use and validity of the slogan."

### Visiting Scenic Beltsville

Arbitron is also establishing a new reservation procedure for visits to its Beltsville headquarters to view diaries. A date will be established and prominently dlsplayed on the company's Report Mailing Schedule, with a notice stating: "Calls for all markets to make ap pointments to visit Beltsville will be accepted starting (month, day, year) at 9:00am." Arbitron hopes that this procedure will allow "sufficient time for the Report Mailing Schedule to reach all sections of the country before Arbitron begins scheduling visits."

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### Sing A Song Of Salesmanship— Are Jingles Effective?

You, you're the one ... You deserve a break today ... A little dab'll do ya ... Filter, flavor, pack, or box ... KSX plays much more music ... You'll wonder where the yellow went ... Plop-plop, fizz-fizz, oh, what a relief it is ... Fly the friendly skies of ... You're really cookin' now ... These and countless other snippets of Americana are hopelessly imbedded in the minds of anyone who's ever listened to radio. Commonly known as "jingles", they are best described as a combination of slogan and melody that is, ideally, as simple as a nursery rhyme and as unforgettable as "Louie Louie".

We can all remember some classic jingles, but do jingles really sell their products? A recent survey by the national marketing research firm, McCollum/Spielman & Co., Inc., has found that in tests between commercials without music, commercials with (background) music, and commercials with both music and lyrics (jingles), Jingles are one of the most effective elements in dealing with the problems of clutter/awareness (whether a spot stands out from those surrounding it) and main idea communication (how well people remember the spot's basic message).

### Combatting Clutter & Getting The Message

The survey found jingles to be the most effective of all spots tested in combatting clutter, registering a seven percent greater response overall (three percent was considered statistically significant) than all competing methods. Interestingly, jingles scored 11 percent higher among men, while still managing to capture a six percent higher response among women in this area.

Jingles also tested out as five percent more ef-

ation offered by the researchers is that there are generally more products and advertising approaches directed to women.

In an earlier study conducted by the same company which dealt with the influences of 123 specific executional elements (e.g., jingles, celebrity pitch-men, sound effects, repetition of brand name, etc.) as found in 4564 commercials, results were markedly similar. Jingles were found to be one of the seven executional elements with the greatest positive influence on clutter/awareness and among the eight most influential elements upon main idea communication, but did not place among the top five of those most beneficial to motivation. The results of these two surveys indicate that jingles are most effective as a "how you say it" element, one which affects clutter/awareness and main idea communication substantially more than it affects motivation, which is an area where "what you say" is of greater importance.

### **Matching Pitch To Product**

In essence, jingles are more likely to get listeners to notice the product, which may be the most important challenge facing a new product or

fective than any rival element in communicating the main idea behind the commercial. Again, jingles were found to be more effective among men in this area, registering a seven percent greater response than all other methods tested, as well as a four percent greater showing among women. Incidentally, the survey claims that response to jingles in these two crucial areas of clutter/awareness and main idea communication was also statistically significantly higher among young adults. Figures for this group were unavailable, however.

### **Motivation Missing**

The one area where jingles do not produce the desired effect better than non-musical commercials or commercials which utilize background music is in motivation (whether the listener adopts a positive attitude toward the product and is thereby encouraged to purchase the product). Here, jingles maintain a slight, but not significant, advantage in motivating women, but produce almost a negative effect among men. One possible explan-

service—a new fast food franchise, for example. Likewise, jingles are an extremely effective means of putting the basic product message across, e.g. "Terrapin Waxx gives a hard-shell finish", when the product's message lends itself particularly well to being communicated in one simple phrase. However, jingles do not have any noticeable advantage in creating a positive attitude toward a product, nor do they appear to have the ability to influence the product's purchase, particularly in the case of products which depend upon more than simple brand recognition.

A final word of caution: Note that the study in question fails to take into consideration the quality of the individual approaches. After all, a commercial which makes superior use of background music, e.g. the famous cigarette commercial with the "Magnificent Seven" movie theme, is going to be more effective than an uninspired jingle. Furthermore, if indeed jingles are more likely to be effective as a "how you say it" element, then the need to say it well becomes doubly significant.





### John Young At Z-93

As we told you last week, John Young has been named the new Program Director at Z-93 (WZGC)/Atlanta. Speaking from direct experience with the market (and therefore a somewhat biased point of view), Atlanta is one of the most innovative and creative major markets in the country. The competition led by the 50kw WSB has tightened somewhat in recent years with Z-93, WQXI, 94-Q (WQXI-FM), 96 Rock (WKLS) and others all taking healthy shares of the audience.

John joins Z-93 after programming WSM-FM/Nashville through a successful format change. Prior to Nashville, John was Production Director and air personality for PD Bill Young (no relation) at KILT/Houston. An interesting part of John's coming to Atlanta to program is that one of his closest friends in or out of the business

is WQXI AM&FM PD Don Benson. The two first met several years ago when they both worked at WMAK/Nashville.

The obvious question in John's new situation was how did he feel his friendship with Don would effect his competitive performance? "There is no reason in the world we can't remain personal friends and still compete actively on a professional level. He is a friend and it's so rare in this business when you can have what I term a 'long-term' friendship. We all have those short-term friendships, the guys you work with for a while and like for the time you're with them. But I think my friendship with Don is going to be a long one. We've been close friends for years already and I think that no matter what happens, wherever we go we're always going to be friends. I value that because there are so few friendships like that around."

Don Benson, across the Street at QUIXIE, seemed to feel that any problems created by John's new position were more the creation of those outside the situation. Don told me, "I think any aggressiveness will be from a station standpoint and not from an individual standpoint. It's good for me because it definitely keeps you on your toes knowing that you've got a guy like John in the same ball park that's really good. And you know he's good. We'll be competing professionally and that shouldn't interfere with our personal friendship."

### A Winner's Image

I asked John how he came to accept the job, when he was admittedly quite happy at WSM-FM. "I think the station sounds awfully good. I got just a tremendous rush listening to the station as I drove into town. I knew there was a certain level of professionalism here, but when I got to hear the entire day, I was very excited. There aren't many weak points and I'm not walking into a whole bed of problems. I learned my lesson in Nashville and I don't believe I ever want to go through a complete format change again unless I have an army of people to help. There's so much to be done in that situation, as opposed to what needs to be done here."

What does need to happen at Z-93? "The station has some good momentum but I think one of the selling factors that got me enthused in the beginning was when I spoke with some of the agency time-buyers in Atlanta. I was just trying to get a feel for the market through their special perspective and one of them mentioned that they felt Z-93 was 'a teen station.' I knew then that this was one of the vulnerable points of the station. We do have a weakness and that weakness is that we are still perceived as being a 'teen station' in some areas of the market. And I understand that is the direction in which the station first began programming live Top 40, as a teen station. You know the old saying, 'You only have one chance to give a first impression,' and that's certainly true in this case. That was the first impression the station gave the market and it's apparently still hanging in some people's minds."

### **Problem Solving**

How can you change that clinging "teen image?" "Without meaning to be misleading, one of our goals in 1979 is to strengthen our 25-49 demos. Somebody might read that and overreact, thinking we're going Pop/Adult or something, which is certainly not true. But if the station has a weakness, that is the area in which it lies and that's where we'll try to improve.

"It's a good time to come into a new situation because we're right between books (Atlanta does not have a Jan-Feb ARB) and the fall results should be here soon, for which I can take no credit, obviously. But now is a good time to move so that we can have the time to see what can be improved and get to work on it before the spring sweep begins. I guess from an ego standpoint it would be very tempting to come in and put your image onto the station immediately, but that's not what I intend to do."



What about music, will you be changing that? "I'd like to see us a little more progressive on the music. I don't have a feel on the market yet, but I think we can be a little more aggressive. I don't mean dai ing, but I feel there are some obvious things we've been a little late on. We both know that Atlanta sells a lot of records. It's a great market to get a fast indication on a record's hit potential. Enough product moves through Atlanta that it

gives you an excellent basis on which to make your decisions. We don't have to be quite as 'WABC' on music as we've been. I know that 'playing the hits' has helped to get the station where it is today, so I'm not proposing abandoning that policy, but I think we can adjust it slightly."

### A New Ball Game

John enters the PD's job at Z-93 under what is really a new management team at the station. As he explained, "This set-up really is a whole new ball game. People are forgetting that the manager that's here now, Bud Polacek, has only been here since July. We're going to do better than in the past. Bud has a new PD that he has picked and it's a new day. It's great to look at the past as a kind of history book, but there's a momentum to continue and build upon.

"Bud and I are both aggressive and yet conservative and therefore the changes we'll make in the radio station are going to be the right changes. They won't be of the 'overnight' variety, but it will be a different station, that's for sure. There are some changes being made now that I feel make it a slightly different station already. We're going to keep it good!"

John's earlier statement about Atlanta's ability to react quickly on music through fast sales is true. For that reason, among others, the promotional competition among the record companies can be fierce within the market. I asked John how he was going to deal with that. "We have about 35 people that call on this radio station from the record industry in an average week's time. Dan Mason (WPGC AM & FM/Washington PD and National PD for First Media) and I were comparing notes the other day and he said they don't have half that many promotion folks calling on WPGC regularly. It's just tremendously competitive and a tough situation sometimes. One of the many things I learned from Bill Young at KILT that I wish more of us were aware of is just try to be fair. If you can go through your entire day and just deal with everybody fairly, things are always going to work out. We've been the victim of criticism from some record companies because of the tightness of the playlist, but I can only promise to be fair and honest with people. There's entirely too much politics in the business as is, and we're going to try to cut through most of it."

### The Competitive Situation

We've already discussed the relationship with Don Benson at WQXI AM&FM, but what about the battle between the stations? "Quixie gives us high standards to shoot for. This is a very exciting radio market and I think the competition keeps us sharp. I had forgotten what a good radio market Atlanta is. I guess we all have a tendency to get pretty 'wrapped up' in whatever particular market we're in, just as I did in Nashville. But now I see just how good a radio market Atlanta really is."

"This staff (Z-93's) just knocks me out with their level of professionalism. And I think of the Quixie staffs in the same light. Even though we're competitors, they set high standards for us and we do the same for them. If we have a good book, it's partly to their credit because they give us high goals to shoot for. I like having competitors like them. It keeps us very share!"

The Atlanta market now becomes even more of a focal point in the South with the addition of John Young as PD at Z-93. Those who deal with either John Young or Don Benson will readily admit that they are both gentlemen in the most traditional sense of the word. The fact that they are good friends in a new competitive situation should have no effect on that reality. The match-up of these two programmers should make the Atlanta market even more exciting to listen to (and watch) then it has been in the past. We welcome John Young to Z-93, just as he welcomes the opportunity to program Atlanta's number one FM station.

### Mitchell Moves South

The new year offers an excellent chance for fresh beginnings and the changes within radio seem to reflect that spirit, with new positions for several key programmers around the country. Tony Mitchell, the highly successful PD for KENI/Anchorage, has relocated to a new "southern" locale by accepting the Program Director's position at KYYX/Seattle.

With the move came a name change for Tony, who will now be known as Tony Stone both on and off the air. The name change is partially accounted for by the many Mitchells already operating in the Seattle radio marketplace, and by the fact that Tony is replacing Robin Mitchell, who will announce his future plans shortly.

Tony had an amazing success with KENI, moving the station from a 5.7 share of the total audience up to a 9.0 and then a 17.3 and 17.8. The competition between the two Top 40 signals in Anchorage, KENI and KANC, finally caused KANC to change formats to Country. With the battle won Tony felt the time was right for a step up in market size, and he accepted the job at Pat O'Day's KYYX, an automated Top 40 station that has begun to make its presence felt in the Seattle market.

I asked Tony how he felt about the live versus automated situation and he explained, "The automation is a Pat O'Day concept and what he wants to do is find out just what its limitations are. He said to me that it would obviously be somewhat easier to go live, but with automation you have total control. We have the IGM 700 system and will augment that with an ITC 1K in about two months. That will allow us to be even more flexible. I have a terminal right here in my office and I can control the rotations from my desk. At this point we're really trying to see just how far we can go with automation. It's very challenging and exciting."

Those who have observed the music being programmed in the Northwest over the past twelve months will have noticed that what was once considered a "lily-white" market has changed somewhat. Black product is now slightly more accepted in Seattle and Tony has noticed it too. "I was surprised at how disco music was beginning to be a factor in Anchorage just before I left. Here in Seattle disco is still relatively new. This is still a basically white market, as I see it, but some black product has been making it. The progressive white-sounding disco music seems to be doing better and better in Seattle and there are some impressive sales figures to back that up. At this point I need to get out into the city and see for myself just what kinds of music have the greatest impact on the potential audience:.. in other words I need to finish my 'homework' before I make a lot of generalizations that may be incorrect."

The station has definately made its presence known in this highly competitive city along with several other stations on both bands playing Top 40 music. KJR and KING have been joined by another newcomer, as KVI-FM brought its Top 40 format to the FM side about the same time Pat O'Day put KYYX on. Robin Mitchell was the station's first Program Director and Tony commented on Robin's leaving: "He's left the place in great shape. He's made sure that I'm getting my feet down properly and the roots are growing. He's done a great job with the station and I think that will be reflected in the Oct-Nov results for Seattle. And I don't think there will be any noticable changes in the sound of the station until this week because I'm trying to get the promotional end organized and all the foundations laid before I pop with anything new on the air."

The Seattle radio scene continues to promise fierce and profession competition and Tony's move into the market should only reinforce KYYX's position. Meanwhile, back up in the frozen north-country of Anchorage, Tim Allen has taken over as the new PD for KENI and former KANC-staffer Randy Robbins is the new KENI Music Director. Sean Lynch, who had been Tony's assistant and MD at KENI, has left the station to join a new Top 40 competitor, KGOT-FM/Anchorage. So, even if the weather isn't the warmest in Alaska, the battle for the rock audience should be heating up again. We'll have updates from both Seattle and Anchorage in the upcoming months.

### Motion

Dayton has finally gotten another rocker with the conversion to "live" programming of WDJX/ Dayton. New PD for the station is Buddy Scott from WGBF/Evansville, IN . . . Ken Curtis has a morning drive opening at WLEE/Richmond, as his long-term morning man, Jim King exits to join WNDE/Indianapolis . . . Kelly Randall has joined the jock lineup at WPEZ/Pittsburgh for new PD Jim Davis. Kelly will handle the 10pm-2am shift . yes, the same WDRQ/Detroit Barry Chase — is also new to WNDE in the 6-10pm show ... Al Brock, PD of WYND/Sarasota, called to inform R&R that the station will be dropping its Top 40 format by February 1. ble. Even when treated chemically, salt won't melt snow once the temperature drops to under 15 degrees, Last night it was 19 below in the city and 25 below in some of the suburbs. Since New Year's weekend it hasn't been above five degrees above zero all year. We've had 15 inches of snow since then and this last storm deposited another 20 inches on top of that. There's just nowhere to put it."

WXRT Music Director Bob Gelms noted that "at one point Monday (1-15) all of the public transportation for the northern part of the city was inoperable. There are snow drifts eight or nine feet deep which have to be shoveled out by hand by snow crews."

### **Rockford Smothered**

Chicago suburb Rockford was particularly hard-hit. Brad Hoffman, Music Director at Y95, said, "We're not under martial law, but the National Guard is here to plow the streets. The city of Rockford has an annual snow removal budget of \$650,000 and this snowfall alone will cost at least \$750,000 to clean up."

As for the AOR-formatted Y95, Hoffman stated, "We had two jocks trapped at the station for two days over the weekend and they ended up doing the entire weekend in six hour shifts with the GM's children bringing them food. In addition, they also had to do some work on the AM, which is a Country station."

Elsewhere in Rockford, the situation become so serious that staffers at both Top 40 outlet WROK and their AOR outlet WZOK had to hike into work or else wait to be picked up by the station's four-wheel-drive vehicle, which was one of the only vehicles allowed on the streets. WROK Program Director C.C. Matthews reported that the phone system become so overloaded that it took almost two minutes just to get a dial tone.

### No Staffers Stranded

However, most of the Chicago stations experienced no difficulty in staffing their operations with people who either live close to the station, as in the case of WLS and WLUP, or putting people up in nearby hotels, as did WMAQ and WEVE

Country-formatted WMAQ in particular was fortunate in that three of their jocks, Nancy Turner, Charlie O'Neil and Bob Tracy, happened to be downtown when the storm hit so they, along with newsman Pat Cassidy, ended up covering the entire weekend. Music Director Suzanne Benson cited the "great job they all did covering the story," adding, "it must have been the free room service they got at the hotel."

WMAQ also benefitted from an appearance by Chicago Mayor Michael Bilandis, who came by the station on Saturday (1-13) and informed citizens as to what they should do. In addition, Program Manager Bill Hennes mentioned that WMAQ planned to celebrate its 4th anniversary as a Country station on Wednesday (1-17) with a party with Charlie Rich as planned, although Hennes acknowledged that a few out-of-towners might have trouble attending.

### **Stepping Up Coverage**

John Gehron, Program Director for WLS, stated because of the station's 24-hour news department, they were able to transmit a great deal of information, airing traffic and weather reports every half-hour. Gehron said the Top 40 outlet spent most of Sunday reporting on schools closing, adding that it took 20 minutes just to read the list of all the schools that had closed by the end of the day.

Over at the city's AOR's, WXRT utilized special drop-ins relating to travel conditions such as open and closed roads approximately every 15 minutes. WLUP increased it's PSA's, concentrating on people who were snowbound and needed food, and dispensing various emergency numbers. Interestingly, WXRT's Bob Gelms reports that since Monday was Dr. Martin Luther King Day in Chicago, many of the schools were scheduled to be closed anyway, so they didn't place much emphasis on school closings.

### **Blizzard Survival Kit**

WFYD's meteorologist Harry Volkman was on the case early. By 7pm Friday, Volkman was on the air with a revised weather forecast, advising listeners against travel. The station doubled its regular weekend news staff and extended its newscasts to 10-15 minutes as conditions took a turn for the worse. By Monday, sections of the city's rapid transit system (elevated trains) were buried up to their third rails in snow drifts. resulting in these trains running as much as two hours behind schedule. WFYR also had the benefit of running a particularly timely promotion involving a "blizzard survival kit" consisting of a canvas tote bag that contained insulated station coffee mugs, and various Smith Brothers remedies

Meanwhile, back in Rockford, Y95 was running updates on the weather situation every break with the list of cancellations eventually swelling to six full pages. The station also solicited for fourwheel-drive vehicles and snowmobiles to assist the various disaster agencies in transporting doctors and nurses to hospitals as needed

None of the stations reported any loss of advertising revenue, although WLUP Music Director Bill Evans mentioned that the station had a couple of cancellations of contracts for spots, but added that they would be made up on the other end of the contract so there would be no loss.

named General Manager of WXKS, with Sonny Joe White, former Program Director of WILD/Boston, serving as "chief air personality" and assisting Burkhart/Abrams on a local level. The station will be commercial-free until January 22.

Commenting on the Disco format in general, Hoyt said, "It's working on radio as well as it is on dance floors. Disco defines the 70's the way rock did the late 60's, jazz the early 50's, and big bands the 40's."

### K101 Goes To Discos For D.J's

The K101 changeover (from a Pop/Adult format) took place last

Monday (1-8) from 6pm-6am, and features a different approach in that the station searched local discos for air talent. Promotion Director Pam Straus detailed the station's reasoning: "It's vitally important to have disco music flow properly and to keep the energy level of the music very high. Doing that is not what the average disc jockey is good at, because applying his trade properly means spending a great deal of time and energy on reading commercials and other voice-related things. We realized that in disco the music is really the medium and the message all rolled into one. So we went out to Bay Area discos and found two guys who are really into the music, Tom Williams and Marty Blackman.'

Williams and Blackman alternate in the 6pm-midnight shift,

with Eileen Fields and Jim Bryan, both previously with the station, splitting the midnight-6am hours. The daytime programming remains Pop/Adult.

Straus commented further, "I've been in radio for quite some time and tend to be very jaded about radio formats because I live with it all the time. The thing that's so impressive about the Disco format for us is that it's got us locked in and listening to the radio again instead of it being a background effect. The response on the phone indicates the people out there are feeling the same way about it. It's like something jumping out of your set and saying, 'Hey, wake up, I know you've been listening with only one ear all this time, but now you're gonna get involved with radio again.' "

### **AM Stereo Demonstration**







#### FTC Supports PSA Regulation

In comments filed last week, the Federal Trade Commission indicated it supports FCC regulation of PSA's. At issue is a petition by the Public Media Center (PMC) asking the FCC to require more local PSA's. PMC proposes that three PSA's be aired every two hours, including drive time; that 25 percent of all PSA's be of local origin; and that production facilities be made available to local groups for creating PSA's (see R&R 12-8-78)

Also backing the hotly debated proposed rulemaking are 66 nonprofit organizations and five congressmen who claim that PSA's don't meet consumers' needs. Meanwhile, dozens of broadcasters have filed arguments against the proposal, citing potential violations of the First Amendment and Section 326 of the Communications Act.

The FTC urges the following: 1) minimum number of PSA's evenly dispersed throughout the day; 2) PSA's for targeted audiences such as children; 3) standardized procedures for logging PSA's; and 4) encouragement for airing controversial PSA's.

#### **Broadcasters Continue To Voice Opposition**

Arguments against the proposal came from a variety of broadcasters

"True diversity can exist only if broadcasters are given maximum freedom and discretion to program their own stations," according to comments filed by WLW/Cincinnati. More specifically, WBAG/Burlington, NC labeled the proposal "burdensome - and indeed harassment when told how to serve the public, in how many ways, and how many records I must keep."

CBS notes that numerical count is "a very limited indication of a licensee's responsiveness to local needs" and ABC calls the proposed percentage requirement for local PSA's "counterproductive, since it would inevitably exclude certain PSA's no matter how worthy, once the arbitrary quota was filled."

The Nebraska Association of Broadcasters said such a rule "would lead to actions which would require more people (in government) and more taxes . . . Taxpayers want less government paternalism, not

#### **Association Comments**

The NAB said the proceeding would never have been instituted if the FCC had completed the Commission on Federal Paperwork's "Hassle Factor Worksheet." This would compare "benefits obtained by the proceeding" to "the time and money spent in gathering information."

NRBA notes that this proposal would affect licensees' "programming judgments" and called the FTC's reasoning another example of why legislation aimed at deregulation is essential "to protect against future governmental intrusion.

#### Extra, Extra . . .

Commenting on NAB's petition to have FCC adopt Commissioner Tyrone Brown's deregulation proposals, executive VP Tom Sawyer said Commission should visit stations to find out "firsthand" how stations are affected by FCC actions.





You might make almost as much as those jocks in larger markets, but without the pressures. I believe someone said that in addition to Dick Purtan's \$1 million 5-year contract in Detroit, there are seven other personalities who make over \$1(0),(00) per year in the Motor City. Detroit may not be Hollywood or New York but the ratio is higher for big pay there than it is here in L.A. (We have more accoutrements - cartoons, movies, TV, etc. - but 90% of all SAG and AFTRA members made under \$2000 last year.)

On the other finger, Lohman & Barkley, long-time friends of the Gary Owens Building, recently signed a reported \$3 million 5-year stretch with KFI/L.A. . . . and our congratulations go to them. #### Minority Station Ownership — A Guide To Getting Involved

With the oncoming tide of new trends affecting Black Radio, I believe it's very important to make sure our base is strong. Many Black-formatted radio stations are experimenting with techniques and music to achieve mass market appeal. However, we can't lose sight of our responsibilities to our respective communities. Therefore, the future of minority radio is vitally important.

There is an important movement, both from communities and from the government, to advocate more minority-owned facilities. The government is proposing reducing the spacing on the AM band to create more AM stations (see Page 1), and government and private organizations are sponsoring programs to encourage minority ownership. Kicking off a series on black ownership of radio stations, I spoke with Darryl Dillingham, Director of the Office of Community Affairs at the National Association of Broadcasters, discussing the movement toward minority ownership and some suggestions on how to participate.

Dillingham described the main problem affecting black ownership as "the lack of sufficient funding to buy stations. That's been a stumbling block for blacks acquiring stations." However, he notes "tremendous initiatives in the last few years that are helping to overcome that particular stumbling block and provide funding from different areas to help the minority entrepeneur."

I asked Dillingham where the call for more minority ownership originated, and he replied, "When you have approximately 8500 radio stations in the country and only 62 are black-owned, and approximately 16 are Latin or Hispanic-owned, obviously the impetus for minority ownership has come from the community."

#### **Setting The Wheels In Motion**

He continues, "1978 was the year that set the wheels in motion. In 1978, many initiatives occurred in Washington which were very productive in terms of being supportive of minority ownership. Previous outcries from the community about the lack of black and other minority-owned communications outlets eventually came to the attention of the NAB, and to the FCC, and the National Telecommunications Information Administration (NTIA). As a consequence, they've all progressed in developing programs that will benefit the minority entrepeneur, so that there will be more communications outlets in the very near future for minorities."

Dillingham discussed a change in the outlooks and backgrounds of these minority owners of the future. "We have a new brand of minority entrepeneur that is seeking stations. These are people with a history of business acumen. These are people who have established track records in owning their own businesses, who run them according to sound business principles. So with these people coming in as new prospective owners — not casting aspersions on current owners — what it means is that these people will be aware, to a large degree, of the rules and regulations of the FCC and what can be done in terms of the operation of their stations and running them successfully, and what cannot be done."

#### **Detailing New Programs**

Dillingham then proceeded to go into more detail about some of the new programs designed to aid minority ownership. "Many initiatives in the last few years have been extremely supportive, and as far as I'm concerned have provided the impetus for minority ownership; the majority of them have come out of Washington, DC. The NAB proposed that a tax certificate be granted to a majority owner who sells to a minority. In other words, the capital gains accrued on that station while the majority owner owned it would be placed in the form of a tax certificate when he sold to a minority, and the provisions of the tax certificate policy were that the owner would then be given three years to utilize that tax certificate to buy another facility. This is now a policy of the FCC, and we consider it very much a motivational device for selling stations to minorities.

"In addition, a policy is in effect at the FCC where minorities will have an opportunity to buy stations which are in litigation with the Commission over some rules or regulations violation; minorities will have an opportunity to buy those stations under distress sale conditions, which are below, in some cases, the market value of the station. These two

policies at the FCC will probably result in more minority-owned stations.

"In addition," Dillingham continues, "Storer Broadcasting recently started a \$1 million minority fund. The NAB has just come out with an extremely substantial fund for minority entrepeneurs" (see Page 6). "And the Small Business Administration now has a broadcast allocation fund for the purchase of broadcast properties. NTIA is working on some initiatives to further minority ownership. So as you can see, this is just the tip of the iceberg. Many things have happened in the past and are presently happening here in Washington that are going to be extremely supportive and pave the way for minorities to buy stations, both radio and TV, in this country."

#### So You Want To Buy A Radio Station

Dillingham advises prospective station buyers, "There's several things you have to do. First, determine your financial capability as far as buying a station goes. No matter what sort of deal you want to make, you must have some equity, and the more equity, the better the situation will be for the acquisition of a station . . . especially for the first two or three years of operation.

two or three years of operation.

"When that's determined, acquire a reputable broker in order to determine what station it is you would like to purchase, and where — a broker is definitely best suited to that activity. Then, enlist the services of a Federal Communications Bar attorney, who will assist you in preparing the application for the station you want to buy, in order to get it through the FCC."

Dillingham explains, "There are several communications law firms across the country, and quite a few are situated here in Washington, DC. As far as I'm concerned, it's good to have a FCB attorney, because he knows the best way to getting that application through the Commission in the most expeditious manner.

"In addition to the financial credibility and capability of the buyer, and this is one of

"In addition to the financial credibility and capability of the buyer, and this is one of the most important aspects, he must also have a management plan, a plan devised to run the station he's buying successfully. We're talking about financial credibility on one hand, and on the other hand we're talking about having a management team that will successfully run the station."

Finally, Dillingham offers a suggestion to prospective buyers. "Here at the NAB, our legal department has prepared a document which we consider one of the most comprehensive and concise pieces of information concerning what you have to do to purchase a broadcast property. It's called 'Purchasing A Broadcast Property — A Buyer's Guide.' They can be obtained by calling or writing the NAB in care of myself or our legal department, at:

#### Quiet Success: A Look At K108-FM And The Future Of Soft AOR

For years now, K108-FM/Sacramento has been evolving into a quiet but undeniable phenomenon. Their Arbitron ratings have nearly doubled in two years, from a respectable 12-plus figure of 4.4 to the new book's remarkable 7.2. The station is number one in Sacramento with both 18-34 women and men, and number two in adults 18-49. All this in a market surrounded by a decade-old AOR station (KZAP) and a relative newcomer which has shown steady growth in the AOR market there (KSFM), and all this with K108's Soft AOR approach.

Behind the music and programming policies of "The Mellow Home" is PD Art Schroeder, whose career began at K108's San Diego sister station KGB as a music assistant to then PD Ron Jacobs. He credits Jacobs and cur-



rent KGB PD Rick Leibert with the basic radio education he received which has enabled him to take K108 to the top of the Sacramento AORs. When he emigrated from his MD post at KGB to become K108's PD in 1975, he joined a station with a scattershot programming past (Oldies, Top 40), all of which had made little ratings impact in the community. Schroeder noted at the time that, "Adult women in Sacramento were not being directly programmed to by any of the other existing stations in town. We felt that adult women could be our base with which to establish ourselves and make an impact on the mar-

women could be our base with which to establish ourselves and make an impact on the market." They achieved that goal by programming Soft AOR with an emphasis on new music. "We decided we could be most competitive in the market by reflecting new music. We could not wait for other stations to break certain albums. We wanted to establish a credibility with our audience; that we were vital in our own right as a mellow station."

Art's hope was that the musical structure of the station would appeal to an adult and a make an impact on the market. They achieved that goal by programming Soft AOR with an emphasis on new music. "We decided we could be most competitive in the market by reflecting new music. We could not wait for other stations to break certain albums. We wanted to establish a credibility with our audience; that we were vital in our own right as a mellow station."



Art noted that this sort of lyrics-oriented music "can become passive; it is not beatoriented for the most part. We did not want to compound that image by having a very streamlined, tight jock approach. We felt we needed to become involved with Sacramento;

we had to talk to people. And this had to be done live." Many Soft AOR stations have attempted to program their stations entirely on tape, with varying degrees of success. At K108 Art felt, "We couldn't progress much beyond a certain point in the ratings if we didn't become more involved and create more listener impact" than he felt taped programming could provide.

In addition to the station's live programming, K108 has fostered listener involvement with its promotions. The station's mascot "the Mellow Beaver" is based on the success of sister station KGB's Chicken mascot. Their on-air promotions, Art stated, "attempt to involve people on a creative level by sending the station sets of music they would like to hear, or by asking the listeners to picture on paper what they think "the Mellow Home" would look like for example." The station sponsors area concerts only when the artists are already receiving a significant amount of airplay on K108.

As is the case with most Soft AORs, K108 was not an overnight success story. "For nearly two years we didn't see the sort of ratings we needed to be competitive in the market. In the meantime we were saved by our sales staff, people who were able to sell the concept of mellow music reaching adults. Our first clients took the chance of supporting us and get immediate real-ways.

of supporting us and got immediate sales results, so we knew we had something that was building. Then we had to be patient and wait for the ratings books to begin to catch up with our street feedback."

#### The Future Of The Form

For K108-FM, the future looks bright. How about for the Soft AORs in general? In some cases these stations have floundered in their markets and been the first to switch formats, most recently to disco music. Other stations, like KNX-FM/Los Angeles, have maintained healthy audiences for years. What's the key to success in programming Soft AOR? For KNX-FM PD Steve Marshall, it does not have to lie in live programming; KNX-FM has been automated since its inception. "There are plusses to being automated that you lose in live programming," Marshall stated, "one of which is control over the music and its flow. You have fewer hands on it; there aren't seven or eight disc jockeys trying to ex-

ecute the same format. From a consistency point of view it's preferable."

Marshall echoed Art Schroeder's thoughts about the importance of giving the form time to prove itself. "Anyone who expects to get into this format and be a monster hit in the first book is probably going to be very disappointed. But if you're willing to work at it and stay current there is a future for the form."

For Marshall the key to success for a Soft AOR is two-fold: Image and music. "We have the image of being a station people can depend on, one they know what they'll hear when they tune in. We program pretty much to their expectations. And they know we won't be turning Disco tomorrow; we've proved over the long haul in this market that we're good at what we specialize in doing."

Musically, Marshall stated, "You have to parallel trends. The reason we have energized KNX-FM in the past year is because music overall has energized. The Gordon Lightfoots and Judy Collinses of the world aren't as active anymore. We have still staked out the

mellow end of the spectrum but the spectrum itself has gotten a little bit harder, and so has our posture. I think the people who are doing this format successfully are constantly adjusting and fine-tuning for the time we're in as opposed to the way it was two or three years ago."

"We're still on the lighter side of the music spectrum, but we're not mellow anymore." That's how KFIG/Fresno PD Art Farkas defines his station's musical posture, mirroring, in part, the observations made by Steve Marshall. "Mellow music was a real mistake for Fresno," Farkas stated. "It's not a wine and cheese city; it's a beer and pretzels one. You can't try and force-feed something new down your audience's throats; you can't teach an audience anything. You can only coax them or add flavor with a certain sound or style."

"When you commit to being a 'mellow' station." Farkas continued, "you immediately limit your musical universe. In order not to repeat your music to death you've got to go for filler, and in a town like Fresno, your audience will not kick back and listen to a lot of album cuts one after another, and be satisfied with the occasional familiar song that comes up. We've taken out a lot of the filler here and stepped up the rotation of familiar music. We're also not afrald to play something that has a lively tempo"

The station does draw the musical line at rock 'n roll. "We don't want to dilute the sound that way; we don't feel we'll reach the people we want with hard rock. So we won't play Foreigner but we will play Nicolette, which has a lot of energy."

The music at Boston's Soft AOR WEEI-FM is a combination of the "more traditional" soft artists like Neil Diamond and Jane Olivor and AOR mainstays including Boz Scaggs and Fleetwood Mac. PD Clark Smidt's programming philosophy involves three foreground

and three background factors. "In the musical foreground," he explained, "are familiarity, integration of new artists, and strength of the super artists. In the programming background are the personality of the station as a whole (not just the announcers), the feature material used, and the general presentation of all the material (features, commercials, etc.)."

Smidt views WEEI-FM's function as both a background and foreground medium station. "I want to be a background station," he said, "because obviously we fit into the lifestyle of this 24-34 bulge in the population curve. In fact, 'listen while you work' is one of our promotions. On the other side I want the listeners to feel a part of the music and the artistry." WEEI-FM's musical programming is on cartridges that are run through an IBM 770, while the jocks are live. "They do have to relate to the surroundings," Smidt stated.

"It's just as important for our listeners to know what's happening downtown tonight as it is to know what the last record was."

Is Soft AOR here to stay? Smidt said, "I'm committed to it, and CBS (which owns the station) has done fine Jobs with KNX-FM and ourselves. I think this is one of the brightest formats for the future; something that can be attractive to all adults 18-44." Even within the AOR sub-genre of "mellow music" stations there are format permutations evident at these stations and others, as they change with the times. And if there is one key to success to radio in general, it is allowing for flexibility within a chosen format. For the stations and their programmers who understand this general rule and program accordingly, there's no doubt the future will be a bright one.

If you read R&R from front to back you have already noticed our newest addition to the paper: the MusicVision section. If not, turn back the pages (sounds like a catchy song title . . . hmm) at your first opportunity to take a look at R&R's first section to offer national sales information. Over the coming weeks MusicVision's charts and information should prove an invaluable tool to AOR radio programmers, not only in the respect that it will provide the industry's most accurate picture of album sales, but also because it will provide an educational experience for those of us whose radio backgrounds have left us "in the dark" regarding the ins and outs of records on a retail level. In other words, Music-Vision's going to make all of our jobs easier, and more enlightening.

In this week's mail were more Arbitron results for the October/November sweep. AOR is down a bit in Providence at WBRU. In Boston, Charlie Kendall's first book at WBCN was also the station's best showing in recent history, up from 2.2 to 4.1. WCOZ slipped a bit from 5.5 to 4.4 but remained the city's top-ranked AOR. Soft AOR WEEI-FM remained relatively steady with a 3.4 12-plus overall. WIOT was Toledo's winning AOR by far, up from 9.5 to a whopping 9.8. Across town WMHE went from a 3.9 to 3.1, which precipitated the station's format change to Pop/Adult. Paul Goldberg remains as the station's PD. More to come.

The informal AOR gathering at R&R Convention '79 is already shaping up to be an information-packed and enjoyable session. Early commitments to share tips, stories, and information with us that evening are the following: Lee Abrams, who is in a rather unique position to speak on the subject, will discuss the emergence of Disco music and what it means to AOR radio (do we fight it, play it, or ignore it?); WMMS/Cleveland merchandising director Dan Garfinkel will outline the steps taken in creating radio's largest merchandising arm, detailing costs and procedures involved, what sells and what won't, and where the money goes; radio's most successful mascot, the KGB Chicken will be on hand for a personalized performance and explanation of his unique and magical methods. That's for starters! Check these pages for weekly updates on the evening AOR session and the convention in general.



#### Puerto Rico Site Of First CMA Meeting Of '79

The Country Music Association's Board of Directors held three days of meetings, last week, at the Dorado Beach Hotel in Puerto Rico. On Tuesday (1-9) various committee meetings were held in preparation of the board meetings on Wednesday and Thursday. The new CMA President, Ralph Peer II, called the meeting to order and Tom Collins, the

CMA's Chairman of the Board, presided over the meetings.

Committee chairmen presented reports on their plans for the coming year. R&R's Jim Duncan reported plans for the membership committee to work on ways to encourage more disc jockeys to become part of the CMA by providing additional services, such as improving the annual "October Is Country Music" month packet and providing a toll-free phone number with weekly news bits from Music City.

The dates for the 1979 Fan Fair in Nashville were announced by Bud Wendell as June 4-10. The \$30 registration fee will remain the same.

A Radio Committee report was filed by Neil Rockoff, who discussed the CMA Awards Show radio simulcast for 1979. The committee wants to incorporate a network pre-show special for stations running the simulcast. Rockoff also reported that Jim Duncan is currently working on the updating of the CMA's Broadcaster's Kit.

Frances Preston reported on plans of the Long-Range Committee, and Irving Waugh gave details of the Awards Show for this year as part of his Television Committee report. Don Nelson spoke on behalf of Joe Smith for the Promotion Committee's plans to take a road show to New York, Detroit, Los Angeles and Chicago to promote Country music to advertisers and business concerns, The NAB Convention was also listed as a possible site for the road show.

Joe Talbot gave the Convention-Study Committee report, outlining ideas for this year's convention in October. No dates have been set upt, but because of the concern of many radio broadcasters about the conflict of the October/November ratings, the CMA hopes to make it for the first week of that month. Various other plans for the new year were outlined and will be discussed as they are finalized.

The CMA's officers and directors were treated to a special evening featuring the music and food of Puerto Rico at the Bacardi Reception Center at the famed rum factory. The Peer International Corporation of Puerto Rico acted as the CMA's hosts. Present among the local dignitaries was the PD of a Country radio station in Puerto Rico. Troy Fields told Jim Duncan: "WHOA/870 broadcasts a nightly two hour block, between 6 and 8pm, featuring only Country music." He added, "I use my R&R religously to keep me in touch with what is going on stateside, not only for music, but programming trends and news as well."

The CMA's second board meeting is set for April 3-5 in Tucson, Arizona. The July meetings will be in Calgary, Canada when the CMA will be special guest of the world-famous Calgary Stampede and Rodeo.

#### Elektra On The Brinks

It's not often a Brink's truck pulls into a country radio station, but then again, Brink's hasn't delivered records before, either.

Last week Elektra/Curb Records had Brink's and Wells-Fargo drivers personally escort copies of Susie Allanson's new release "Words" to over 100 country stations.

The promotion is the brainchild of Ray Ruff/Creative Director at Elektra/Curb, and Ms. Allanson's husband, producer and manager. Ruff commented that "it was good for country, because it brought a lot of attention to country radio stations." In Madison, WI the local NBC-TV affiliate covered the scene at WTSO; WWOK/Miami staged a mock hold-up.

Brink's usually avoids publicity, and those armoured cars were carrying millions of dollars in cash. Fearing a real hold-up, Brink's re-routed their course several times, as their reputation is partially based on the fact that there is no known delivery pattern.

The promotion, which National Country Promotion Director Norm Osborn described as "incredible" had it's lighter moments. At hotel-housed WHK/Cleveland, a crowd gathered, assuming the badge-bearing uniformed men were policemen. Playing along, local promotion man Murray Saul handcuffed himself to Music Director Terry Stevens, and all disappeared into the elevator, causing quite a stir in the lobby.



#### SALES SUMMARY PREMIERES

The first top 30 album report we are presenting almost had a tie for the top slot, with Barbra Streisand barely edging Billy Joel in overall sales. Both albums are major hits at all levels of the sales structure and have a significant edge over Barry Manilow in third

The most interesting sales story of the week is the resurgence of acceptance in the marketplace for Olivia Newton-John, whose latest surges to No. 6 this week. Olivia's albums were on a steady decline before her multi-media revival last year, Now, she is again at the top with both retailers and rack jobbers reporting major gains. Olivia's album coupled with top ten hits for the Blues Brothers and Steve Martin, points out that the public seems to be yearning for the multi-media mass appeal entertainment package once again.

Overall activity this week was slow in the marketplace owing basically to the lack of new product from major artists. There are a lot of static albums in the report this week, which could easily be bumped by some hit product. When these major releases do appear, look for quick growth and activity in the top 30.


