UA TO REMAIN AUTONOMOUS

Capitol-EMI Acquires United Artists; Menon, Mazza Head Label

Capitol Industries-EMI, Inc. has acquired United Artists Records from M&R Music Corporation and its Co-Chairman, Artie Mogull and Jerry Rubinstein. Financial terms of the transaction were not disclosed. Capitol President Bhaskar Menon will serve as President/ Chief Executive Officer of the label, now to be known as Liberty/ United Records, Inc.: while Jim Mazza has been named General Manager/Chief Operating Officer for Liberty/United, taking charge of day-to-day operations. Both Menon and Mazza will continue in their present positions as well; Mazza is President of EMI America Records. Mogull and Rubinstein will serve as consultants for Liberty/United, and will join a ten member board of directors which also includes Menon, Mazza, and several other Capitol/EMI execu-

Mazza told R&R that Liberty/ United will remain "totally autonomous," as will the existing Capitol and EMI America labels. He commented, "UA has developed tremendous spirit recently, and that should not be lost. That's not our intent; we don't want to tamper with that. At the same time, for example, EMI America has started out as a small label and developed impressively with great

spirit of its own, and we don't want to destroy that. So they'll be running separately." Mazza added that UA's successful Nashville operations would also remain intact. "We'll just embellish and enhance the UA operations, give them the financial resources and support they really need to grow," he said. Artist rosters will remain as they were as well.

Mazza expressed considerable

enthusiasm about the transaction, observing that the new setup should be of great benefit to all concerned. Discussing his own new responsibilities, he commented, "It's a really challenging, invigorating prospect. We just want to enhance their spi-

WSDR Wins Right To Air Radio Moscow Commentary

Beginning this week, WSDR/ Sterling, IL will air weekly commentary from the Soviet Union positioning news commentary by Vladimir Pozner adjacent to Ronald Reagan, who grew up in WSDR's backyard.

"The major point is not where the shows are from," Station Manager Carey Davis told R&R, "it's broadcasters' First Amendment

Davis said that shortly after David Brinkley announced on Monday's (2-6) "Nightly News" that the Justice Department has okayed the broadcasts, a station owner from Vermont called with congra-

Prior to the decision, WSDR found itself in a "Catch 22" situation. According to a 1938 statute, any station airing foreign propaganda might have to register as a "foreign agent"; but under the Communications Act of 1934, no agent of a foreign country can own a broadcast facility.

Most stations previously using material free-of-charge from Radie Moscow have been college stations taking music and language offerings, according to Davis. The controversy came to light when the News/Talk station decided to check in with the Justice Department before broadcasting the commentary. "As we have indicated, our decision in this matter is based solely on an analysis of the facts presented in your letters and is limited to WSDR Inc., exclusively" the Justice Department wrote in a (of Fletcher, Heald & Hildreth).

SAG/AFTRA Strike Settled

The seven-week-old strike pitting members of the Screen Actors Guild and the American Federation of Television & Radio Artists against the producers of radio and television commercials ended Tuesday night (2-6) as the unions ratified a new agreement which both sides viewed as containing a generous measure of compromises.

As reported earlier (R&R 1-26), the major stumbling block for the new three-year pact centered on the provision that performers were required to provide extra scenes and lines without extra pay; however, last-minute snags developed in the areas of payment for rdio commercials as well as terms for extras. Eventually, agreements were reached on all of the above issues but final details remained to be released.



WGTB SUFFERS TOMBSTONE BLUES - WGTB-FM/Georgetown, an often-controversial radio station operated by Georgetown University in Washington, DC, was closed recently by school officials, who cited budgetary problems as their reason. Despite 20,000 listener petitions and other expressions of support, the closure went ahead, with some disgruntled station supporters expressing the belief that the station's new wave-slanted AOR format annoyed officials. In any case, around 500 people gathered around the station's tombstone (pictured above) to protest the closing, with 100 or so later marching to the FCC's offices to register a protest there.

Arbitron Says OK To Advisory Council Stance On Abbreviated Reports

Because of new action by the Arbitron Advisory Council, radio broadcasters will no longer suffer from incomplete reports. Previously, Arbitron had agreed to reduce its price when the number of diaries returned was smaller than what Arbitron said the sample size would be.

The Council remained firm and instructed its attorney, Jason Shrinsky of Washington firm Stambler & Shrinsky, to advise Arbitron's legal department that the only solution is not to publish abbreviated reports.

Newsman Files Sex Discrimination Suit Against KHOW

Price's action contends that he was "discharged on the basis of his sex, male, and his race, Caucasian" and was replaced by a woman. It further claims that KHOW offered him a late-night shift at lower pay, and told him he was being replaced by "a woman with less experience and seniority."

KHOW General Manager Joe Parrish, when contacted by R&R, stated that he could not comment on Price's suit for legal reasons, but related an official statement by the station's attorney: "KHOW management denies the allegations and will file an answer to the complaint." Price, who worked for KHOW for almost seven years, now broadcasts early morning news for

Levy, Promo File Countersuits Against CBS, Jet

Morris Levy and New Jersey wholesale operation Promo Records filed countersuits against CBS and Jet Records last week, following past legal actions taken by CBS and Jet against Promo in connection with the longstanding disputed ELO "Out Of The Blue" alburn matter. The latest of a blizzard of suits since Promo bought 1.2 million copies of the album from United Artists Records (Jet's distributor before CBS took over that role), Levy and Promo's legal round consists of answers to suits filed by CBS and Jet, counterclaims against those companies, and a third party complaint.

The counterclaims charge business interference, unfair competition, and fraud, among other charges against CBS and Jet. In addition, Promo and Levy's answers deny that the ELO LP's purchased from UA were largely defective as contended in earlier actions, and state that CBS and Jet approved the contract between Promo and UA for the purchase of the records to sell later as cutouts. Another point in the counterclaims is a complaint about trade and consumer publication ads taken by CBS and Jet (R&R 11-6) warning purchases might be defective al-

Ardens, Billboard Sued

The new third-party complaint charges Jet principals Don, Dave and Sharon Arden and CBS Records **Group President Walter Yetnikoff** with offenses similar to those listed in the counterclaims. In addition, Billboard Publications has been charged with libel for its coverage of attempts by CBS and Jet to obtain injunctions in New Jersey against Promo's selling the ELO records.

The new Levy/Promo actions seek hundreds of millions of dollars in damages, and join a number of other lawsuits still outstanding in the matter. Because of legal considerations, CBS exercised its policy of refraining from comment on the new actions.

Simon Settles Suit With CBS For \$1.5 Million

Paul Simon has withdrawn his burn, "The Paul Simon Songbook" suit against CBS Records and will pay the company \$1.5 million to be released from his recording contract. The settlement was resolved in Manhattan Supreme Court on Friday, February 2.

Also settled was the question of CBS's rights to Simon's first al-

(never released in the U.S.). Rights to this album will revert to Simon in 1982. However, Simon's charges that CBS had failed to properly account for sales of his records or to pay him royalties due have not yet been settled. Simon is asking for damages in excess of \$10,000 on that charge.

Now that Simon's contract with CBS is terminated, he will be able to record for Warner Bros., with whom he signed on February 15, 1978. Simon's contract with CBS, which he signed in 1975, called for him to deliver four albums to the label, three of which have already been completed.

Arbitron Stands On Court's Record In KUPD Response

In its January 19, 1979 edition, Radio & Records published a fullpage advertisement by radio station KUPD of Phoenix, attacking, among other things, Arbitron's action and motives concerning the rating distortion dispute between Arbitron and KUPD. That dispute remains the subject of litigation and Arbitron ordinarily refrains from public comment upon matters pending before the Court.

KUPD's paid insertion, in our opinion, contains many falsehoods and inaccuracies. We do not want to dignify such a misleading statement with a lengthy rebuttal, but choose to stand on the Arizona State Court decision, which found KUPD guilty of rating distortion activities, and further stated that Arbitron could delist KUPD.

The NAB, the RAB, and the BRC issued strong statements supporting Arbitron's policy, while at the same time condemning rating distortion activities. In June 1977, the FCC publicly warned broadcasters that rating distortion activities on their part would "raise questions as to whether a licensee that engages in . . . (rating distortion activity) is qualified to remain a licensee."

New Legislation Would Eliminate Daytimers

Keeping his promise to NAB President Vincent Wasilewski (reported in Washington Street Talk 2-2), Rep. Paul Findley (R-IL) introduced a Nighttime Radio Bill Monday (2-5) to allow 2300 daytime radio stations to operate full-time.

The new bill would direct the FCC to consider reducing AM spacing from 10 kHz to 9kHz as the best alternative to expanding daytime service. This would create 14 new channels.

Findley charged the FCC's proposal to create 125 new stations by restricting 11 clear channel signals to a radius of 750 miles "is grossly inadequate."

The new bill "orders the FCC to insure that each community in the United States, regardless of its size, is provided with the maximum local full-time radio broadcasting service," Findley said.

The FCC would also be directed to:

1) utilize all of the allocated spectrum in all parts of the country so that some radio channels do not lie virtually unused each evening.

2) make maximum use of modern technology. Findley said current allocation tables "are based upon engineering studies that are almost a half century old."

recognize the need for additional minority-owned full-time radio stations.

New Communications Subcommittee Lineup Set

New members of the House Subcommittee on Communications are: Ronald Mottl (D-OH), Allan Swift (D-WA), James Collins (R-TX), James Broyhill (R-NC), and Samuel Devine R-OH). Collins will serve as ranking minority member and Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin (D-CA) will continue as Chairman.

Remaining on the subcommittee are: Timothy Wirth (D-CO), John Murphy (D-NY), Edward Markey (D-MA), Marc Marks (R-PA), Martin Russo (D-IL), Thomas Luken (D-OH), and Albert Gore (D-TN).

New members of the Senate Subcommittee on Communications are John Warner (R-VA), Larry Pressler (R-SD), and James Exon (D-NB). Barry Goldwater (R-AZ) becomes ranking minority member.

Other senators remaining on the Subcommittee are Harrison Schmitt (R-NM) and John Danforth (R-MO).

FCC Commissioners Differ On Deregulation Approach

Margita White, in her final speech as an FCC Commissioner last week (2-1), urged broadcasters to support Congressional efforts to deregulate radio. She also criticized the current structure of the Commission for its concentration of policy-making power with the FCC Chairman.

Two other Commissioners also recently clarified their views on deregulation. Commissioner Tyrone Brown reinterated his position calling for "substantial" deregulation of radio at a luncheon of Cornell University alumni in Washington, DC on Tuesday (2-6). Contrary to White, however, Brown believes that deregulation can be achieved without Congressional action.

In his remarks at the UCLA Communications Law Symposium, Chairman Charles Ferris said structural changes in the radio industry marketplace are cause enough for deregulation. Ferris clearly means he does not support Congressional action.

On the other hand, White warned the Georgia Association of Broadcasters against leaving deregulation to the FCC. "Only legislation will achieve the public's and broadcasters' goal of removing needless federal regulation," she said.

Chairman's Power Criticized

Discussing Commissioners' lack of real power, White said the Chairman:

1) selects the General Counsel and other key staff.

plans upcoming agenda items.
 influences content and timing of recommendations presented to the Commission.

4) is often the only member of the Commission to see draft recommendations from the bureau's

"The concentration of control in the Chairman's office . . . discourage(s) robust debate and inhibit(s) a diversity of viewpoints on the Commission," White said.

One solution White offered was to change the format of agenda presentations so that staff views opposing bureau recommendations could be expressed. This approach would "reduce any perception that the Commission is a rubber stamp for its Chairman and, most importantly, would serve the public interest."

Other solutions would be:

 give individual Commissioners larger professional staffs to provide more independent research on the issues.

 issue advance calendars of specific issues to be discussed and of holding Commission meetings on staff appointments.

Experiments Are "Meaningless"

She also criticized the FCC for dabbling in meaningless experi-

mentation. "Experiments simply put off forcing the Commission to explain why — in today's competitive environment — regulation of radio is in the public interest," she said. The time for deregulation, she said, "is now."

She also attacked Chairman Ferris's proposal for an experiment in radio deregulation in major markets. White said the end result of the experiment will be that the Commission, not the public, will decide "whether the market-place serves the public interest according to its already established theories, definitions and standards."

"Broadcasters can't have it both ways," White said. "Either the Commission will define the public interest and use the marketplace as a regulatory tool or the public will use the free marketplace to make its own decisions. I support the second choice."

Advisory Council Convinces Arbitron To Test Newspaper Readership Question

Picture this — at the bottom of each page of all future Arbitron diaries will be the question — "Did you read a newspaper today?" It's an idea which Arbitron will soon begin testing in diaries and telephone recall.

Advisory Council Chairman Don Nelson (VP GM WIRE-WXTZ/Indianapolis) told R&R he feels Arbitron's agreement to the test is the most significant accomplishment to come from the Palm Springs meeting, because it represents a complete "change in attitude" from a year ago when the Council was formed.

"Arbitron recognizes that the Council means business and for the first time has agreed to do business with us,"according to one Council member. Council Vice-Chairman Ed Christian (VP GM WNIC-WWKR/Detroit) also spoke with R&R, stating that newspapers are radio's real enemy and we need added ammunition.

(Editor's Note: Both Nelson & Christian along with Arbitron Advisory Council attorney Jason Shrinsky will give details of its success with the ratings company at the upcoming R&R Convention.)

Opposes NRBA On Advance ratings

The Council noted that in its recent survey, over 60 percent of all broadcasters wanted advance ratings and therefore will ask NRBA to reconsider its opposition to the practice, which NRBA has labeled as just another Arbitron rip-off.

While the Council was successful in getting Arbitron to agree to a ten-market test publication of market wide mechanical diaries in addition to single-station mechanicals, Arbitron has said "no go" to publishing FM tower heights in its reports, Connie Anthes, Manager of Communications, told R&R.

On two other issues – 24-week

rolling averages and publishing number of callbacks — Arbitron has agreed only to issue separate reports and not to include data in its initial book which the Council has asked them to consider.

Arbitron Will Work With RAB

Arbitron executives further reported to the Council:

1) that the new system of publishing slogans coupled with the new callback questionnaire has resulted in the resolution of all but 0.2 of radio station conflicts,

2) that Arbitron will do some work with the Radio Advertising Bureau to offer simple explanations to non-broadcast and broadcast users of how the diary system works — Arbitron will have a reference book with easy-to-read explanations of its products, services, editing procedures, etc. available at the NAB convention, and

3) that Arbitron will upgrade its sales department by hiring more former broadcasters and is in the process of establishing seven additional positions of client services representatives.

RAB & BRC Make Recommendations

Finally, NAB VP Dick Montesano restated opposition by both the RAB Goals Committee and the Broadcast Rating Council to onair announcements promoting diaries.

He also noted their concern about 1) telephone retrieval techniques which do not give the percentage of respondents listing reported by another member in the household, 2) "buffered samples;" e.g., lack of diaries in the field when sample selections are done manually, rather than by computer, and 3) lack of post-midnight calls in telephone recall procedures.

MINUS \$1 MILLION

Fee Refunds Expected In 60 Days

Broadcasters who paid \$48 million between Auguest 1, 1970 and January 1, 1977 may soon receive \$32 million back, the FCC decided on Wednesday (1-31).

The Commission hopes to have refund forms in the mail within 60 days.

Even though the new basis for refunding fees is more lenient because of broadcaster comments since the Commission's September notice of inquiry, the total dollar refund will be \$1 million less than announced last fall.

The Commission's new minimum of \$129 means that more radio stations will get refunds, but won't have to prove payment by cancelled check as had been previously proposed.

Other changes include: Simplification of refund form.

Simplification of refund form.
Elimination of adjudicatory costs (judge's salary, Review Board, etc.) except in hearings.

Permission for both buyers and sellers of broadcast stations to file a request for proportionate shares of refund. (The Commission's previous proposal said only sellers could seek payments.)

Authority by the Executive Director to grant or deny refunds can be appealed.

Requirement that licensees seeking refunds sign waivers stating they will not file further claims against the FCC.

However, the General Accounting Office must approve the request form and instructions. Then, once approved, 200,000 forms will be printed.

Summary of Fee Actions

Last week's action was the result of an inquiry into the Commission's fees (\$20 and up) begun more than one year ago, after the courts ruled in December 1976 that the

fees had been unlawfully collected for six years.

The FCC also directed its staff to prepare a second notice of inquiry on refunds of \$20 and less, which should be ready for Commission action within 90 days.

While the Commission is close completion of its fee refund plan, the final phase requires that the FCC establish a new fee schedule to replace its former program. But neither NAB nor NRBA are happy with what's happening on that.

Associations Oppose New Fee Schedule

NRBA urged the Commission to "Abandon its efforts at establishing a fee system until the Congress has provided...some guidance as to the proper course to take." Any fee schedule adopted by the FCC would be superseded by the re-

ABC Asks FCC For 90-Day AM Stereo Test on WABC

ABC Radio has asked that the FCC allow a 90-day test of AM stereo on their flagship station WABC/New York. beginning February 15. ABC claims the improved sound, using Kahn-Hazel-tine equipment, is compatible with existing radio receivers.

Radio Moscow Launches Disco Programming

The Soviet Union's airwaves have long been a broadcaster's battleground with the Voice Of America and the BBC blasting news, propaganda and — a far more powerful weapon of destruction — rock'n'roll.

However, Radio Moscow has begun to retaliate, setting up powerful shortwave transmitters all along its Eastern front. Broadcasting in unaccented English, German and French, the new equipment can drown out many of the British and American transmissions.

But the Soviets have unleashed a barbarous new secret weapon in this shortwave war — disco music. According to **High Times** magazine, disco is the first officially authorized youth-music fad in Soviet history and, while the Voice of America has been treating Russian youth to the disco top ten in monaural for several months, the Soviets will be mounting their disco counter-offensive in stereo or quadrophonic sound.

Hardee's Fast Food Chain Aims At Young Adults Via Radio

Hardee's Food Systems. a fast-food chain, has begun a new advertising campaign aimed at the young adult (25-49) market. The new spots feature a character called the "Road Runner" who drives a race car and makes periodic stops to fill up on Hardee's menu.

The introductory period for these spots will consist of 13 weeks of prime time radio and television in 56 markets with additional spot radio in still more markets. In all, Hardee's is expected to spend from \$8 to \$10 million this year, a \$2 million increase over last year's expenditures.

KABC Tells L.A. Listeners To "Go To Health"

On New Year's Day, News/Talk-formatted **KABC/Los Angeles** began its "Go To Health" public service campaign, which will continue until the end of February. The campaign is designed to serve as a free authoritative course in preventative medicine, and includes on-air consumer and investigative reports concerning health, editorials on the subject, interviews with nutritionists, dieticians, doctors, and other health professionals, and evening "clinics," featuring panels of health experts discussing various health topics.



In addition, the station has planned a series of weekend exercise demonstrations in selected shopping centers (Sears has endorsed the program), and an eight-hour per day "KABC Waist-line" phone-in service staffed by dieticians who will answer listeners' questions regarding nutrition and diet.

The entire program has been advised by members of more than 20 health-related organizations, from the **Department of Health. Education and Welfare** to the heart, lung, and cancer socipties

Capitol Purchases WKEE-AM-FM For \$1.9 Million

Capitol Broadcasting Co. Inc., of Raleigh, NC, has purchased radio stations WKEE-AM-FM/Huntington. WV, from Reeves Telecom Corp. for \$1.9 million in cash.

Pop Songs Becoming Popular As Jingles

Adding to the list of pop-music hits that have been adopted for use as jingles in commercials (Hot Chocolate's "You Sexy Thing" for Mercury Capri cars, the Beach Boys' "Good Vibrations" for Sunkist orange drink, "California Girls" for Herbal Essence shampoo, and "Fun. Fun. Fun" for Polaroid Land cameras, among others) are Carly Simon's "Nobody Does It Better" for Hertz car rentals and Roy Orbison's "Pretty Woman" for Tone soap.

U.S. Colleges Advertising For Admissions

An increasing number of the nation's colleges are looking to boost sagging enrollment figures by use of advertising campaigns. Among the methods used to combat the projected decline in enrollments for the 1980's are: the University of San Francisco, a private school founded 125 years ago, beginning a "low-key" radio and newspaper ad campaign stressing its qualities and academic tradition; the City University of New York placing a 20-page advertising supplement in the New York Times Sunday edition; and St. John's using a \$50,000 television ad campaign for the past three years.

TV News

Rock & Roll Dominates TV Airwaves

Rock & Roll music occupies a more prominent place in TV priorities this week than usual, with a pair of two-hour specials on rock subjects running in the same weekend. Friday (2-9) sees "Rock & Roll Heroes" on ABC at 9:00; this is the highly-touted historical film survey of rock from Elvis onward, with rare film clips (some previously unseen) of Presley, the Stones. Dylan, the Beatles, the Beach Boys (briefly), and on into the 70's. Should be one to watch.

Then the following Sunday (2-11), the Elvis Presley film biography, which we've referred to earlier, shows on ABC. Former Disney child star **Kurt Russell** plays Elvis, with the vocals being handled by **Ronnie McDowell**, appropriately enough. No big revelations are supposed to come out of this version of the Presley story, but again, for many reasons (if only to check out how TV handles the Elvis legend), it's one to watch.

Music On TV (continued) — Television perennial John Denver returns to ABC February 28 with another special. This one does not take the peripatetic minstrel to Australia, Alaska, or undersea; instead, the musical topic is "John Denver And The Ladies." Said ladies include Tina Turner. Cheryl Ladd. Cheryl Tiegs. Valerie Harper. and author Erma Bombeck. Denver duets with Turner and Ladd, and also sings three tracks from his current album...Barbara Mandrell. Johnny Paycheck, and Dottie West have been added to the roster of performers appearing on the Grammy telecast February 15...Andy Gibb joins the Osmond clan on the "Osmond Family Hour" February 11 on ABC...Fellow RSO artist Yvonne Elliman guests on "Merv Griffin" February 23...Alicia Bridges serves as host for the new-look discoized "Midnight Special" February 23...Edwin Starr makes a "Soul Train" appearance February 24.

ABC Wins Race As NBC Hits New Slide

ABC, which won handily, and CBS divided up the first 17 places in the Nielsen ratings rankings for the week ending January 28, as NBC took just one place in the top 20. ABC won with a 22.5 average rating, with CBS taking a 19.2 and NBC 16.7.

Top show for the week was the sturdy "Laverne & Shirley" (ABC), followed by 2) "Mork & Mindy" (ABC) 3) "Happy Days" (ABC) 4) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 5) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC) 6) "What's Happening" (ABC) 7) "Eight Is Enough" (ABC) 8) "Mash" (CBS) 9) "All In The Family" (CBS) and 10 "Alice" (CBS). NBC's top-ranked show was "Little House On The Prairie" at 17. "WKRP In Cincinnati" had another good week for CBS, finishing 16th, but still dropping off 3.7 ratings points from its lead-in, "Mash." Most of the debuting new shows floundered in the mediocre area, with NBC's "Dukes Of Hazzard" on top at 29. "Delta House" (ABC) finished 35th, while NBC's Thursday package of "Turnabout," "Brothers And Sisters," and "Hello Larry" (featuring McLean Stevenson as a radio talk show host) finished 50th, 51st, and 52nd.

In Arbitron's ratings for the week ending January 26, the Super Bowl qualified at the top of the week and, not surprisingly, was the top-rated program in New York, Los Angeles and Chicago. "Mork & Mindy" finished second in New York, followed by 3) "What's Happening" 4) "Laverne & Shirley" 5) "Super Bowl Postgame Show" 6) "Barney Miller" "Happy Days" tied 8) "Eight Is Enough" tied with "Mash" and 10) ABC's Friday Night Movie. ABC swept the city's top ten except for the ballgame and "Mash."

NBC took the first two places in L.A. with the game and the postgame show, and then it was all ABC, starting with 3) "Mork & Mindy" 4) "Laverne & Shirley", "What's Happening" and "Three's Company" tied 7) "Happy Days" 8) Sunday Night Movie tied with "Battleship Galactica" and 10) "Barney Miller." In Chicago, it was almost the same story, with the Super Bowl on top, followed by 2) "Laverne & Shirley" 3) "Eight Is Enough" 4) postgame show 5) "Happy Days" 6) "Charlie's Angels" 7) a tie between "Vegas" and "What's Happening" 9) "Three's Company" and 10) Sunday Night Movie.

Cheap Trick's Subliminal Message

A subliminal message discovered within the song "How Are You" from the "Heaven Tonight" album by Epic artists Cheap Trick was decoded and examined on the syndicated radio show, "The Joyful Wisdom Program," which aired February 4th.

Patrick Glynn, the program's producer, claims, while listening to the record, to have discovered a highpitched, whining sound, which is barely audible to human ears. Upon slowing the record to one-eighth normal speed, the sound reveals itself as being a male voice reciting the Lord's Prayer.

According to Dr. Joseph Spear, a specialist in the field of subliminal messaging, "This high-speed recitation of the Lord's Prayer is received and understood subconsciously as a negative feeling . . . instead of being uplifting, the consciously indistinguishable whine will generally give a down feeling; bringing on depression, a sense of abandonment, and guilt."

Interestingly, Rick Nielsen. guitarist and songwriter for the group, claimed, "The idea behind placing the message in the song was to create a positive, uplifting effect on the listener.'



Stock Market Shorts — The No-Bull Bear Facts

For all those dyed-in-the-wool station managers who like to keep their business decisions close-to-the-vest, Seat Of The Pants Management Inc. has begun marketing pairs of men's boxer shorts emblazoned with the latest stock market quotations. 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TRAFFIC REPORTING FOR RADIO TODAY:

unning traffic reports can be one of the most important services a radio station offers its commuter/listeners. Such reports have been a staple at several stations for the last 15 years. Audiences can grow dependent on reliable radio traffic reports, and accordingly become attached to the stations which run them. The following survey, by R&R Pop/Adult Editor Mike Kasabo, provides a comprehensive overview of today's radio traffic reporting — its problems and its potentials.

IN THE AIR AND ON THE AIR

Ground Control To Major Tom

We've all been there. Stuck in the middle of that concrete jungle known as a freeway, thorough-fare, or turnpike. We sit there, helplessly trying to make the best of a completely frustrating situation.

Meanwhile, several hundreds of feet above the grumbling and swearing flies a messenger of information who, along with his colleagues in ground mobile units, does his best to take as much of the sting out of stop-and-go commuting as possible.

R&R contacted 11 Pop/Adult stations to get a better perspective on radio traffic reporting, its benefits and problems. Seven of the 11 stations surveyed had at least one airborne craft to go along with several ground units. Of the seven, their years of offering the service varied from KMPC/Los Angeles's 19 years to WFTL/Ft. Lauderdale's getting off the ground just last October.

PD Mike Harvey explains why his station now has traffic reports: "In the community ascertainment surveys, which are done by the Broadcasters Association here locally, traffic problems were listed as No. 1! So, we did some research of our own, and found out that Broward County warranted singular coverage. Miami stations (south of Ft. Lauderdale's) had attempted to cover Broward and their own Dade County, but surveys showed that listeners in our area were dissatisfied with their coverage and indicated that there was an overwhelming demand for this service on an exclusive basis from a Ft. Lauderdale station."

Bob Hughes, WASH/Washington PD, who instituted his fixed-wing plane service just a year ago, echoes Harvey's findings, adding: "... We selected a group who did not listen to WASH, and found that they didn't have anything against us, just that they had positive feelings towards other stations because what they were offering was important to the lives of these individuals. As it turned out, the No. 1 most significant thing we were lacking was traffic reporting." Hughes has since taken care of the problem and feels that establishing the service has significantly enhanced WASH's image.

Commanding The Fleet

Three thousand miles west, KMPC Program Director Mark Blinoff deals with perhaps the largest fleet of traffic units, ground and air, in the country. With over 300 miles of freeway in metropolitan Los Angeles, it's not surprising that complete coverage demands a minimum of seven units at all times. Blinoff breaks down the deployment: "The current count is two helicopters — one is the Jet Ranger, which can get up to speeds of 180mph, and a Bell H, which is much slower - plus a twin-engine Beach Baron fixed-wing, which cruises much faster and is used for wider range coverage. We also have 15 ground units available, but normally use only four, unless there is something really big happening.'

Blinoff estimates his air watch expenditure runs around \$500,000 annually, and it should come as no shock that recently, for the first time, KMPC has begun selling the reports.

Back in Gotham, WOR VP & GM, Rick Deviln, doesn't sell the service, but then he only has one station-owned helicopter and flies only in the morning. Devlin explains, "Recently, our afternoon pilot Fred Feldman had a heart attack, so we just decided that until he gets re-accredited, we'll just stick with George Meade who goes up in the morning and is part of the John Gambling show."

Although no one is skybound in the afternoon, reports are aired by other means and Devlin claims (and others support it) that half the market is angry with him for deleting the afternoon air watch because several stations monitor WOR and recreate the "on the spot" air traffic conditions

On the other hand, Denver's mile-high KHOW has taken action to alleviate such chicanery, as each traffic vehicle has had special equipment installed. John Lund, Operations Manager, reveals, "Each car is equipped not only with short wave and two-way, but telephone. The reason they have Bell telephone systems is so when they talk, we know that no other radio station can monitor us . . . we like the security of that!"

Reporting Without Vehicles

While Lund opts for security, Blinoff is busy directing his air force, Devlin is waiting for Feldman to get healthy, and Hughes and Harvey are still learning, WNEW/New York, WBAL/Baltimore, and WTAE/Plttsburgh, which average eight years of traffic information service, do not collectively own or utilize any air or ground units at all! Nevertheless, they still effectively report traffic conditions in their towns. How do they do it? A combination of telephone, police radio, CB radio and other communication devices enters the picture.

WBAL News Director **Joe Walsh** admits, "Years ago, the reports were gathered by newsmen calling around to police and city officials to get traffic information. Then about five years ago we developed a sophisticated 40-channel scanner radio unit that police and firemen monitor for the purpose of traffic conditions. We don't have any outside units; it's done in the studio using a bank of telephones!"

WNEW's **Dean Tyler** adds another dimension, "When I came here, I initiated the \$50 news tip system . . . It gave us another way to tap news, including traffic news."

WTAE VP & GM Ted Atkins reports, "The Port Authority Transit Department launched about 5 years ago (the year WTAE picked it up) a program putting various buses and their routes via two-way radio reporting into a Port Authority information center and telling the coordinating person existing traffic conditions. WTAE at one time had a helicopter . . . but the costs and benefits derived from it just didn't warrant that . . ."

If Atkins seems cautious, it is only because he appears to have command of two key points: "Number one, on days of real bad weather, that airplane (in reference to KQV's recently acquired fixed wing) is useless. Number two, Pittsburgh is much like San Francisco in that there are just three or four major highways." This condition, as well as the lack of alternative routes, is why WTAE never has gone into the expense of coverage with aircraft."

Fixed-Wing Vs. Copters

The fixed-wing craft just edged the helicopter as the preferred choice among those we talked to. Stated WASH PD Hughes, "We found, after looking at all the issues very carefully, two major things against a helicopter. First, it is a more expensive proposition than a fixed-wing and secondly, the speed factor is also in the Cessna's favor. The geographical area here is expanding as to be too large for adequate copter coverage."

KMPC's Blinoff disagrees with Hughes, pointing out that a helicopter is much more versatile. "As you know, traffic almost completely stops in L.A. when an inch of rain falls; it's like seven feet of snow in Des Moines . . . and we have a much greater overview of the freeway situation." Blinoff adds, "Unless the fog is on the ground, a helicopter can fly in more inclement weather conditions than a fixed-wing."

Weather conditions are more apt to be a consistent problem the farther east you go. "Obviously, the fog," warned Ft. Lauderdale's Harvey, "will keep you down. However, when it rains, we've found that with the peculiar weather patterns down here, we can fly along-side and still report on what's happening to the people who are actually in the rainshower."

Weather To Fly?

The question of whether to fly is answered by airport officials, station management, or the traffic reporter; any one of the above will keep the sky empty. So how do weather-grounded traffic reporters function with this handicap?


WTIC/Hartford Program Director Jay Clark explains how air reporter Kathy Clark handles the situation: "She'll come here to the station and use her CB unit, picking up eyewitness traffic accounts from CB'ers all over the area. It works well for two reasons . . . first, she's a very pretty girl who's had a lot of press and secondly, she's established a great rapport with CB'ers; resulting in a super back-up communication system for traffic information."

A little south of Hartford, Bob Hughes points out WASH's back-up system when traffic reporter Walt Starling is grounded by weather: "He operates from the airport using his close relationship with local police dispatchers to get a really good fix on traffic." Incidentally, on the giving end of things, Starling has installed an extra channel on his two-way, and uses it to disseminate traffic accident information to as many of the suburban police jurisdictions as want them. Providing this information to authorities, as you can imagine, is greatly appreciated.

KSL/Salt Lake City Operations Manager George Lemich has similar alternate plans for weather, but insists that, "If Duane (Southwick) can get up on instrument flight with no danger, the airplane is so much more mobile that we find it to be a better source of information than the ground units."

The Ground Rules

While there is no arguing that under normal conditions, the air reports have greater range and are more able to keep up on changing conditions, KHOW's John Lund points out the value of his six ground units. "They especially came into play in the recent Rocky Mountain Airways crash that occured near Denver. We dispatched two ground vehicles that were not only first on the scene, but became a part of the recovery team that was established."

Lund's point is shared by others, but Mike Harvey isn't one of them. "We have ground units," he advised, "but we found out you can't cover enough territory, mainly because you're caught in the same problems you're trying to report on."

"Air" Personality Wanted

Just as on the ground in the booth at the radio station, the person in the sky can, and in many cases is encouraged, to incorporate personality along with the traffic news he (or she) reports. KSL's George Lemich explains, "Once they've given the information, then we allow them to use their personality; our morning and afternoon DJ's quite often bounce things off Duane up there in the sky."

Similarly, John Lund offers, "We don't editorialize on the air, but they are allowed to display their personality with the guys on the ground."

WBAL's Joe Walsh extends the thought, saying, "That's the way our whole station operates. We don't try to be something we're not . . . if there's personality involved, it comes out."

WFTL's traffic lady Mariene Gilbert was brought along slowly; she's new to radio and it was felt much wiser to develop her personality rather than force it. PD Harvey comments, "She has a very interesting and bubbly personality, and we're now starting to bring that out, and the listeners are responding favorably."

So, as you can see, personallty is a plus. And even more in the case of WASH. 26-year-old Walt Starling is credited with an increase in the station's ratings. Bob Hughes states, "We've seen actual evidence in the ARB that our accep-

tance in the northern Virginia part of our metro market has increased!" Hughes followed that revelation by explaining, "Walt is one of the most recognized personalities in the market right now. He is an essential part of the air staff and as much a personality as the morning drive man or any of the performers on WASH."

Spotting The Reports

Asked how many reports are aired in morning or afternoon drive, 65% of those stations surveyed said 4-5 per hour; while the rest offered a few additional ones. We also found that, generally speaking, reports are run in fixed times. Steve Bell, KMBZ/Kansas Clty PD, explains: "Although there are fixed times, our reporter may call for more if traffic conditions require." Mike Harvey says WFTL runs fixed and flexible reports citing, "They are fixed within the newscast at the top and bottom of the hour, but otherwise float within the spotload."

55% Get Charge Out Of Reports

Six of the 11 stations sell their reports; mainly just to cover the operational costs involved, and do not look at traffic reports as a major financial source. The others simply offer it as a service/programming tool. Ted Atkins accounts for WTAE's non-sponsored reports, "Only recently has the Port Authority Transit given the OK for radio stations to sell the reports, but we choose not to; this same service is being heard on all radio stations in Pittsburgh, so it's nothing exclusive or unique to us."

While it is noble to run traffic reports on a public service basis, it just isn't financially practical for everybody. Given the enormous operational and maintenance upkeep at many stations, selling them becomes a requirement. After nineteen years, KMPC has finally had to do so in an effort to adjust their half-million dollar maintenance bill! The stations carrying sponsored reports generally utilize an opening and/or closing billboard with a 30-second spot.

Paying For Your Thrills

The high cost of maintenance is the major reason that stations having their own air and ground units (as opposed to WNEW or WBAL, which use outside sources) call on the sales department. Blinoff breaks down the \$500,000 yearly cost factor for KMPC: "It includes a full time mechanic, who works on two helicopters and a fixed-wing; all the high-octane fuel that they suck up; repairs; two full-time pilot reporters and a part-time reporter; plus the ground units. It's a sizable operation."

WTIC's Jay Clark finds his operational costs, "Unbelievable!" But adds, "We determined that we should have helicopter reports because it would be a good image and service for the community. So we sold spots, so as to have it come out not costing us anything to run the chopper."

The sampling shows that maintenance costs range from (not counting KMPC) \$25,000 to \$100,000. In other words, if you're thinking about getting involved with this; it would be a cogent thought to consider raising your rate card.

A Cut Above

The question that received the second most enthusiastic response from all concerned was how traffic reports can enhance programming value. The answers were varied, but unanimous as to their positive worth to listeners. Major enhancements include: image, news mobility for other than traffic reasons, providing "contact" with listeners, extension to overall news, prestige and on-the-spot market identification.

Everyone we contacted addressed themselves thoroughly with a hint of pride, as WOR's Rick Devlin points out, "Whenever it's up (the helicopter) and something of a news nature happens, we're right on top of it. The most recent example was a ferryboat crashing into a pier in Manhattan . . . we had the whole damn town listening!"

John Lund feels, "It is expected of KHOW to cover traffic, and those reports give us in-depth value no one else has."

In Hartford, Jay Clark cites traffic reports as being the reason behind the ultimate programming enhancement (to improve ratings) stating, "The first thing it's done is taken part of our morning audience and moved an observable percentage into afternoon drive." It is interesting to note that since WTIC began traffic reports last March, its pm drive ratings according to several rating sources, including Arbitron, has increased noticeably. Clark's rating revelation serves as confirmation of an earlier point that WASH, according to Bob Hughes, made impressive rating gains based on "actual diary analysis."

Now that ratings have buzzed everyone's thoughts, Mark Blinoff, with a lofty position overlooking (in his mind's eye) the Los Angeles freeway system, brings it back to a more accountable "enhancement," observing that, "There are never less than a million automobiles on the (freeway) system between 5am and midnight; therefore, providing this service and information to your audience is of strategic importance."

WFTL services Broward County exclusively; a move that has stolen thunder from the Dade County (Miami) stations. PD Harvey declares, "They've almost given up the battle and gone back to Dade . . . and that has been a gigantic morale boost and image enhancer for us, especially among the advertising community."

George Lemich, who handles the reins of 50,000 watt KSL, views all of this as "contact" information with the assertion that "No matter where a listener is, he knows that if something's happening at this moment that is of interest, then we, as a very big radio station, are keeping them in touch." Asked if research could back him up, Lemich documented a Magid study which stated that people "regard us as the station for traffic reports, and regard our information as being the most accurate and consistant. The

R&R TAKES A FLYER IN A CHOPPER

To get a first hand look at what air traffic reporters go through up in the sky, Mike Kasabo recently took an opportunity to fly the afternoon traffic shift with KMPC's 15-year "air" man, John McElhinney

Tuesday, January 2nd. Not a very good day for the multitude who (like myself) are paying for their New Year's alcoholic indulgence. But an assignment is an assignment, and while I may not be faster than a speeding bullet or more powerful than a locomotive, today I won't have to worry about leaping tall buildings in a single bound because KMPC's jet helicopter will keep me safely above the vertical concrete and steel.

I had been told by concerned friends and relatives when mention was made of my airbourne freeway shuttle that flying in a helicopter was about as safe as the rhythm method. This didn't help my attitude, nor did the fact that I had quit smoking, after 13 years, the day before. But I figured, no guts, no glory.

As I sped toward the airport with ace photo-

grapher Marcia Greene, I was comforted by the fact that there was not a cloud in the sky . . . mainly because the wind was blowing near gale proportions.

After a brief introduction to John McElhinney I found myself walking toward the chopper, which somehow looked a helluva lot bigger in the sky than on the ground. Anyway, as the ground crew shoehorned Marcia and myself inside the craft, I remembered that I forgot to ask R&R's publisher if I was entitled to flight pay.

But it was too late, as Pilot McElhinney secured the doors and began the by-the-numbers check-list of button pushing and meter reading.

This being my first time in a helicopter, I busied myself by asking questions about what John was doing. He responded, "It's no different than an automobile. We've got to put on our master switch and then the first thing we'll hear is the compressor turning over, send it up 14 percent, ignite it and we hear the jet start." I knew he was telling the truth; I already had jet lag.

McElhinney continued, We're going to keep

motoring here until we get our engine running warm...OK, we're gonna be gentle with this little girl because this is where I make my home away from home." I was beginning to really like John's attitude.

It was almost time to take off, as he explained the final details: "We're going to make sure that we center the altimeter to the field level before we take off. Our panel is no different from your car's . . . (air) speed indicator, oil pressure, fuel pressure."

Just as I was feeling the pressure, we went up, up and away from the Hollywood-Burbank airport in a westerly direction. The feeling is markedly different from a fixed-wing; it's like being suspended in midair. As we climbed to our initial altitude of 900 feet, McElhinney was busy as a raccoon with a bowl full of peanuts, as he communicated with his ground crew of three, police department and other city officials.

As I sat there fascinated with the panoramic view of a Los Angeles afternoon, I began to catch on that the helicopter is to the freeway system

study also indicates that a significant portion of our listeners don't listen regularly to the reports, but would notice if the service wasn't there."

An Audio Mousetrap?

Many programmers, interestingly, candidly admit that the airing of traffic information may be nothing more than a motorized security blanket. Lund again presents some research indicating that traffic reports are a security blanket, asserting "People do want to know that the Mousetrap (a major traffic intersection) is congested . . . it becomes security because the twenty-minute delay is normal and felt by everyone involved."

KMBZ's Bell raps up his security blanket with the reminder, "In this market it depends on the weather conditions; it can really raise havoc with traffic, and on those days it's really important . . . but, candidly, I think that it's mostly security."

Lemich puts another thought on the fire, "This may be particular to KSL, but we find listeners, in general, say to themselves, 'there's a major slowdown at Interstate 80,' but they in fact will continue on that artery. Only infrequently will they change their route — the design is such that they don't have an alternative route that will save them time."


Security seemed to be the answer. But, as usual, a few contested the point arguing, as Joe Walsh did, "I don't think they tune in for a security blanket; we've developed such a credibility over years that people are tuning in to WBAL because they want to know what's happening."

Mike Harvey believes, based upon comments from listeners, that it's a little of both: "They do tune in, and get a head start; plus they try to anticipate, through our reports, exactly what's going to be happening . . ."

Other Considerations

A few points before the final question, which provoked the greatest response. First, all stations have taken the proper legal precautions in case of personal or property damage of any kind involving the traffic units. It's spelled out most precisely by Mike Harvey: "We are covered corporately — liability and accident — we're covered to the tune of \$20 million; so, heaven forbid, should anything happen, we have more than ample coverage."

Secondly, and in direct relation to the previous finding, there have been few casualties considering the huge aggregate of hours in the air logged by the flight crews we've examined. Only WOR and KMPC have had to deal with a pilot fatality. In New York a mechanical malfunction caused the grim result; whereas L.A.'s dis-

aster, more than a decade ago, was a horrifying mid-air collision with a police helicopter. As both units were following suspected armed robbers, they banked into each other from their blind sides, killing each other and several on the ground.

Turning to a more palatable subject, we talked about something that everyone can relate to — the weekend. Weekend traffic reporting is virtually non-existent, it turns out, with the exception of sports-related congestion or, on the West Coast primarily, a quick buzz at the beach to report conditions.

The Observation Tower

The overall views of spokesmen from 11 different stations, spanning Hartford to Los Angeles, were varied, expressing valid points that we'd like to use as a roll-call wrap-up; WOR's Rick Devlin puts it simply, "I personally find the traffic reports very helpful, and we get a tremendous amount of mail on them." Steve Bell of KMBZ says, "The question becomes, what does the public want? Simply the location of an accident and where the traffic is backed up, or do they want to have some guy who can fly around and look down on it and give you some kind of color or play-by-play description of events? I think most major market people expect the latter kind of coverage."

John Lund and Jay Clark share strong feel-

ings about the image factor, Lund pointing out, "I think it's a very important and prestigious public service to provide . . . it's the difference between good news coverage and *great* news coverage!" Echoes WTIC's Clark, "First, I think it's a very viable service even in a city the size of Hartford; and from an image standpoint it makes the station sound and look big."

At WFTL, Mike Harvey agrees, "If properly done . . . the reports could be one of the most meaningful extensions of the news department that a radio station could have." Joe Walsh of WBAL observes, "All I can do is put myself in the listener's place because I have to get to work and I get there by taking a car. Without them (traffic reports), you're lost . . . if I know the problem I can take a different route."

WTAE's Ted Atkins was a bit more guarded: "It depends on the city . . . in a market like Denver, which I'm quite familiar with, the airwatch was a definite service to the community and created a hell of a lot of attention for the station I was with. Denver lends itself to traffic reports because if you heard of a problem you did have an alternative route to wherever you were going to go. But in Pittsburgh, an alternative route means going an hour out of your way. That's a hell of a choice."

Along somewhat similar lines, Dean Tyler of WNEW reflects, "Traffic reports by themselves are generally a repetition of the conditions every

morning and are valuable to those who are made to feel comfortable with them. I think it's information that most people under normal circumstance already have."

Several view the reports as an audience builder, including KMPC's Mark Blinoff, who remarks, "It's extremely valuable to us; it's one of the four or five programming elements we offer that we can count on to get and retain an audience." Bob Hughes of WASH nods approvingly, "It's very expensive and it's the kind of thing that once you start it, you better be prepared to sustain it. We are recovering the cost of the investment and we're making some money on it, but, really, it's not a moneymaker; it's an audience getter. That's the way we approach it."

George Lemich of KSL sums up with an equipment tip: "Since I have to classify myself as a casual listener to traffic reports, I have tended to react to a casual listener's problem with the fatigue factor of the crackling and breaking up of sound during the reports. So we installed a radio system with special gear that allows our air alert reports to sound like *full* fidelity. The sound is studio quality — thereby eliminating the fatigue factor."

Finally, an observation by Steve Bell that I'm sure others would agree with completely: "If you're going to be a first-class station in your market, you must provide whatever your market accepts to be first-class traffic information." "RR

what rooftop spotters are to a football game. The mobile units run into traffic problems, but are rarely in a position to "see" the exact nature of it, just as the coach on the sideline may know his man fumbled the ball, but is not in the correct viewing position to know how he coughed it up. Anyway, as tie-ups were reported, we would get moving into that general area, (John does, however, try and keep to the same basic route as much as possible), make a quick inspection, write down a thumbnail sketch, air the report (if it's time) and then be on our way.

There is very little time, as I learned, for John to do anything more than concentrate on and coordinate the traffic news with the rest of the Earthbound crew.

At this point I was completely relaxed; realizing that the chopper ride was very pleasant, when suddenly, a report come in concerning a fire in south L.A. Everyone did an "eyes right" and there it was about four miles away. We arrived just minutes later to observe the flames as John radioed in to insure fire department and police assistance; several units, as we looked around, were already speeding to the scene. All I did was sit there, but somehow a feeling of helpfullness flashed through my thoughts.

We are now about halfway through the voyage and as we swing northwest to approach Los Angeles International Airport, McElhinney informs us that we must climb to 2600 feet in order to fly safely over incoming and outgoing air traffic. Again, I like John's style.

Once past the airport, we gradually descended to the original 900 feet, and somewhere in the middle of that, we began circling the Beverly Hills/Century City area. I was too busy gawking at the R&R building from above at first, but then I realized that we were hovering over the headline-making riot at the Shah of Iran's sister's mansion. About five minutes of that, another report from McElhinney, and we were traveling the last mile of the day.

It's now 5:45pm, completely dark and Los Angeles, still displaying its Christmas lights, looked as magnificent from the sky as the nightly heavens look from terra firma (and the more firma, the less terra).

The final report at 5:55 and we're on the ground. As we make our way into the hangar I thought that the perspective from up there is beautiful, but also very confusing, for a first-timer.

The most vivid recollection, however, was when we made our last pass at the horizontal con-

crete below us. McElhinney said, to no one in particular, "Look at that" (pointing to Western Avenue, the longest street in L.A., lit up like hot lava running down a volcano). "It's beautiful here. It makes it all worthwhile."

Now, packing our gear to go our separate ways, I asked John if he felt that way often? "Absolutely. Every day is an experience up there. Take a night like this when it's clear (remember I told you about the gales) and you can see the quiet massiveness . . . I enjoy it very much."

It seemed silly to ask, but I did anyway. "What about the weather? When is it a factor?"

Without missing a beat he said, "Dense fog and heavy rain keeps us down. We're always very careful . . . and besides, I'm working on longevity. I've got a lot of time in these things; intend to get a lot more."

Finally, as we stood there; we shook hands and began to walk into the night, and it was like the final scene in "Casablanca" as I asked one last comment on how he felt about the afternoon. "It's an excellent position and occupation if you like to fly and like people. And my intent is to be the best in the business."

As I put on my gloves and turned toward Marcia's car, I thought, "I think you are, John."



Have We Paid Our Bill?..

Two weeks from today the sun will disappear in the last solar eclipse of this century, and the whole continental United States will get at least a taste.

Along a narrow path in the Pacific Northwest the eclipse will be total. People in Portland, OR; Walla Walla, WA; Helena, MT; Minot, ND; and other Northwestern towns will get the full shot, right about breakfast time.

If you're a PD, you're already trying to figure out a way to make a promotion out of this. My first thought was to pick a backwoods village and go start a new religion, or at the very least get the concession on viewing lenses. Whatever idea comes to you, it'll have to be executed now or almost-never because the next eclipse of the sun won't shadow the United States until April of 2024, when you're either collecting Social Security or trying to get a good explanation of why there's none left to collect.

Safety First

You ever see Orphan Annie's eyes? Just little round things with nothing in the middle. That's how your eyes might be if you look directly at the eclipse. Dark glasses aren't enough and smoked glass won't protect you adequately. You'll hear suggestions that you punch a hole in cardboard and use that as a lens to focus the image on a piece of paper, but that doesn't easily work and what you see isn't impressively dramatic. Best view of an eclipse is through a two-layer sandwich of exposed developed (black) photographic film. Just hold it up and look through it. You'll see the round moon coming across the disc of the sun. The sky will turn darker (completely dark if you're in the path of totality) and it'll be good for an emotional buzz.

Total Eclipse Cities

In several Northwestern cities and towns, total eclipse will be observed. The first time is beginning of partial eclipse, the second is beginning of total eclipse.

When and Where...

Totality will last between two and three minutes, then the partial shadow will return and remain until about a quarter past nine.

Both Abraham Lincoln and the world's first naturalist, Charles Darwin, would be 170 years old today, except that Charles's heart gave out when he was 73 and Abe suffered a hot lead attack at age 56. Using "Image" To Attract Listeners

Program directors typically spend a lot of time worrying about what music to play, for obvious reasons. Presumably, if you play music that listeners want to hear, they will listen to your station in droves. So, much effort is devoted to determining listener music preferences in the hope of attaining an ever-increasing share of the audience. This column usually deals with techniques involved in music research, with the goal being to help your research do a better job of pinpointing the ultimate playlist.

In some instances, the pursuit of the perfect playlist leads stations to completely new formats. The current trend is to the "new" Disco format, which is enjoying much success in many parts of the country. In the case of the format decision, most of the attention is again directed at the music itself. The format decision deals with the general type of music to be played, while day-to-day the PD is faced with the decisions of which particular records of that type to play.

n marketing terminology, this focus on the music is a product orientation in that the music played on the air is a "product" (actually a service) being offered to the audience. Now all good marketers know that they have to sell the "sizzle" as well as the steak. What this amounts to is the building of a product image through promotional or advertising activities. This product image approach is a supplement to the decisions about the music itself and helps the station to establish a position in the mind of the listener as well as in the marketplace.


In this column two weeks ago, I discussed positioning from a product perspective — i.e., what kind of music to play. This time I want to discuss the use of image in building a position.

ne of the most common ways of establishing an image for a product is to feature in advertising materials the user of the product or service. In other words, instead of talking about the good points, or positive features, of the product itself, the ads extoll the virtues of the people who use the product. Last time, for example, I mentioned Marlboro Cigarettes and Miller Beer as having strong positions. Yet, both of those powerful advertising campaigns

the ad does emphasize many positive people attributes while poking fun at itself. The use of humor in this ad is not unlike the long-running and highly successful campaign for Benson and Hedges Cigarettes. But, despite the humorous nature of the appeal, KFAC gets its message across quite effectively in the ad — if you're a person who is moving up or would like to move up

which most closely matches the images audience members desire for themselves. Now, this is not to say that the music itself can be ignored. No way! Good product has to back up good promotion. But when you're a Top 40 station competing in a market with 2 or 3 or more other Top 40 stations, just how different can your playlists be? I would guess that they are not all that different. Just like cigarettes aren't very different from each other, nor are brands of beer or scotch, etc.

o, to differentiate your station and establish a stronger position in the market, user image becomes an important tool. You can build this image through ads in other media (e.g., local TV, newspapers) and reinforce it with promotional plugs on the air. The key is to select an image which listeners can relate to, identify with, and aspire to. I'll wager that a lot of listeners who are helping to make Disco stations the hottest item going are not disco music



in the world, or would like to improve yourself, then listening to KFAC is a part of that new desired *lifestyle*.

deal primarily with people attributes, not product attributes. Such people-focused ads are quite common in advertising for liquor, cosmetics, cigarettes, and even magazines ("What sort of man reads Playboy?").

onsider the ad for radio station KFAC, a classical music station in Los Angeles. This particular ad is obviously tongue-incheek in its use of the before-after pictures, but

The use of the term lifestyle was no accident — the image strategy, by focusing on people attributes instead of product attributes, requires knowledge of listeners' lifestyles as well as their "ideal" lifestyles. Where would they like to be? Would they like to be in Marlboro Country? Grab for all the gusto they can? Change their life through classical music? Advertising can help to convey the station image

lovers as much as they are "disco goers." They like the lifestyle that surrounds the disco experience and hence identify with the Disco station format. The music itself may not be as important as the sefting in which it is played.

A final note of caution: The use of image is not for everyone. Only the most suave, sophisticated, worldly-wise, sexy and intelligent PD's should even consider it. Line forms to the right.



Rumor has it that Jeff Lucifer will be out as PD of WNDE/Indianapolis this week. Further word is Bill Garcia will be named the new WNDE Program Director.

Also in the Windy City . . . why is WKQX/Chicago ordering more and more soft rock product from the labels? Is there a format shift in the offing there?



This not only makes things somewhat easier for us to coordinate but also gives us a chance to show off our new main offices, which are a short block west of the Century Plaza Hotel. Suggestions for discussion topics in the Top 40 room on Friday night are coming in, and it looks like this year's conversation will be informative and hot.

One of the main topics of discussion will most certainly be Disco and its effect on Top 40 programming. Almost everyone I've spoken with over the last few months have made some mention of it, and it certainly is a subject that polarizes many programmers. Whatever input you can bring to our session on the subject of Disco would be most appreciated. We'll also try to wet your whistle in the next couple of issues on the Disco topic, so you can get a preview of what some of our peers think.

This week, an informative conversation with Chuck Martin, the new PD of KHJ/Los Angeles. What he is proposing for the station could make for some very interesting listening . . . and hopefully improved ratings. Next week, a PD tells why he's not using call-out research on music, and why he thinks you shouldn't be either. You may or may not agree with his point of view, but it will make for some interesting reading.

Chuck Martin: KHJ's New PD

Last week's announcement of Chuck Martin as the new Program Director of KHJ/Los Angeles caught many people off guard. By his own admission Chuck has been "out of the spotlight" for several months, but he has already begun to feel the heat that spotlight can generate. The PD's job at KHJ has become known as a tough spot to be in, so I thought a conversation with Chuck was in order.

Chuck has been with KHJ as the 10pm-2am personality for the last 18 months. He joined the station in September 1977 as the Assistant Program Director under then-PD Michael Spears. Michael resigned shortly thereafter and John Sebastian was brought in following his KDWB/Minneapolis success. Chuck faded into the background as a jock executing the Sebastian format.

Prior to his arrival at KHJ, Chuck was the PD for Y103/Jacksonville, where he brought the station to number two overall and number one in teens with his first ARB. Going up against the 50kw AM giant WAPE, his accomplishment in Jacksonville is still one of the better success stories in recent years. Before Jacksonville, Chuck

programmed WAVZ/New Haven under the consultation of Paul Drew. Further back on Chuck's resume are PD's jobs at WMYQ (now 96X)/Miami, where he admits to "having my clock cleaned," and also programming positions with WIFE/Indianapolis and KISN/Portland

The most obvious question for Chuck is how does he plan to change the direction of KHJ. Will the station continue to sound the way John Sebastian designed the format?

"I'd say I'm 180 degrees out of phase with John's programming philosophy. When John came into KHJ he saw a failing radio station and he took a good 'shot'. It was a 'shot' that

really surprised a lot of people around the country in that it was quite far removed from what KHJ had been in the past. I wouldn't discredit him one bit for what he tried at KHJ because he saw a large element of the KHJ audience over on the FM band listening to KMET and KLOS and he attempted to bring them back. Unfortunately, in concentrating on the 18-24 demographic in his programming, he was unable to hold onto either the higher or lower end demographics and the station suffered an overall decline in 12+ shares as a result."

Can that 18-24 audience be won back? "I'm not sure we should even try. In my opinion the bulk of the 18-24 audience feels very comfortable with the FM's. They like the 'hipper image' those stations present and if we totally concentrate on winning them back, to the exclusion of all the other available audience, we stand very little chance of gaining within the market. I think we now have to go after a wider spectrum of the demographics, keeping in mind those time periods in which certain segments of the audience are available to

listen. Obviously we're not going to capture a big teen audience in middays and we can't hope to have big housewife numbers at night. So, keeping in mind who is listening to the radio and when they're listening, we'll be much more mass appeal than we had been pre-

What about specifics in station sound? How will KHJ sound different under Chuck Martin? "I'm going to make the disc jockey a little more showcased over the music. I want to do it slowly because we have some great jocks that have been "wired so tight" that they are now having small problems trying to loosen up. It's now okay to say meaningful things on the air around here but when you've been reading liner cards and doing segues for a few months, the transition back to normal personality-type conversation can be slow. But that's fine. It will come in time. One of the big factors that made KHJ a great station in the past was that it had great air talent. It's time for that era to return, but with a strong emphasis on updating it to 1979 standards. We know there are certain things that listeners don't like jocks to do, but the jocks will become a very important part of this station again. I want the personalities to express their talent and not be so severely limited by the format."

Shades of the old KHJ? "It's going to be a fun station to listen to again. I think when John removed all of the so-called 'negatives' from the station he also took away many of the reasons people liked to listen to Top 40 radio. I'm going to put some of those elements back into the sound and give people a reason to stay tuned, instead of removing all

the reasons they might tune out. We'll sound fun and exciting and things will be happening on KHJ again."

Indeed, things are already happening, and by the time most of the R&R community is in Los Angeles for Convention '79 the conversion of KHJ should be well underway. Already an acappella jingle from years gone by has found its way back onto the station. The use of jingles, especially the jingles that were so much a part of the early success of KHJ, are just a part of Chuck's overall game-plan to make the station sound more like it did prior to John Sebastian's regime. The jingle and logo are among the most familiar in all of radio and are sure to bring back some good memories for Los Angeles listeners.

Talking about success and achieving it are two different things, and I'm sure that no one would deny that Chuck's new assignment is not an easy one. But, he has some very definite ideas as to how KHJ can return to a strong ratings position in the market, and he's going to give it a try. Incidentally, the music research that Sebastian initiated for KHJ will stay, and in fact be expanded according to Martin: "It's great information to have. However, I think we'll be using it a bit more like a reference book as opposed to a bible."

After 18 months out of the limelight, Chuck Martin now finds himself on one of the hottest seats in all of Top 40 radio, and he's not only aware of it, he seems more than ready to meet the situation head-on.



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



their client and the individual stations.

Harley Drew, Program Director of WBBQ/Augusta, one of the stations who called the matter to R&R's attention, said, "We tried to locate the records in question and found that we didn't have them in our library. We can't remember playing them, so we sent Pacific West a note telling them this."

WOL/Washington DC Program Director Don Mac pursued the matter further, contacting the management of Deniece Williams (one of the artists whose songs were in question). The managers referred Mac to Ms. Williams' publishing attorney, Allen Lenard.

Lenard told R&R that "Pacific West has no authority to represent the publishing company and, in his opinion, if one of the co-writers of a song had registered with either BMI or ASCAP then the work was licensed to that agency, which was, in turn, responsible for collecting all public performance royalties."

An attempt was made to contact Willie Scott, General Manager of Pacific West: however, neither Scott nor his associates were available for comment.

Copies of the letter will be forwarded to representatives of BMI and ASCAP and their comments will appear in next week's issue of R&R. Stations are advised to keep these letters on file until the pending matter is resolved.

write, NRBA noted.

The NAB filed comments opposing:

1) an FCC proposal to base future fees on "value to the recipient" rather than "cost of work performed."

2) a recommendation that Congress impose a spectrum fee.

By imposing "value conferred" costs rather than "cost of work" performed" in its fee schedule, the NAB noted the Commission

would violate the standards set forth by the court's decision in December 1976. The Courts decided the fees had been unlawfully collected.

Concerning the spectrum use fee, NAB noted the irony inherent in the FCC adopting such a proposal on the same day President Carter called for less government intrusion and regulation.


NAB said the fee is "a discriminatory tax imposed by the government on a single industry which would have a clearly inflationary impact."



I don't know why I'm wondering, I sported a mysterious beard back in my Color Radio days that made me resemble a dissipated poetry student or the lawn of a haunted house!



The Success Of WLRS: Superstars And More

Right at the top of Louisville's rock radio stations in the Oct.-Nov. ARB ratings sweeps was a 3000 watt AOR station (the city's only AOR signal) which has had three PD's in as many years. That station was WLRS, which came in with a 13.5 12-plus figure, up from last book's already-impressive 9.2.


WLRS was built and put on the air by Clarence Henson as a Louisville Radio School (hence its call letters), but was soon commercialized with AOR music. Since its AOR inception in 1974 it has been programmed and consulted by numerous people, including Gary Granger, Lee Masters, David St. John, and Robin Walker. At the programming helm currently is Mick Dolan, who works with the B-A Superstars consultation group. Dolan was named PD following the departure of Austin Vali to the programming post at both KIKI-AM and KPIG-FM/Honolulu. It was Vali who guided WLRS to its present top market position.

Vali, who joined WLRS some three years ago as its nighttime air personality and worked his way up to the Program Directorship, has seen the station evolve tremendously in his time there. He credits much of its evolution to the station's affiliation with Lee Abrams and the B-A Superstars consultation service. "He did a hell of a lot to start off the station," Vali said of Abrams. "He's like your mentor, someone to ask questions of when you're uncertain. He put in the original format; our job was to make it Louisville. You can't just take the Superstars format and not work on it, and luckily Lee realizes this." Vali continued, "Abrams is really cool in that he'll let you go as far as your talent will take you; if you can handle it he'll let you handle it. He'll just be there when you need help. That's why all the stations employ him slightly differently; it depends on how far along they are already themselves. And that's why when record companies called and said 'this is a Superstars add' and why wasn't I on it, I had to laugh. I don't think there is any such thing as a 'chain add' unless it was a Boston or Fleetwood Mac."

WLRS's music emphasizes the hits by hit AOR artists. "The secret," Vali said, "is being tight with the right artists; making sure the music you're playing is the best and getting rid of all the turkeys. A lot of times people tighten up and leave in the wrong types of songs." Vali and MD Drake Hall determined Louisville's AOR musical tastes with the help of record outlets which slipped card questionnaires in with album purchases, call-out research and, as Vali admitted, "it's as much ear as anything else. We're tuned in to Louisville; most of our friends are locals who are not into radio or heavily into music, and that gave us a more objective viewpoint of what was worth playing and what wasn't."

The WLRS musical blend favors recurrents; as much at 40% of their music is from albums popular over the past year. Another 10% is new product (Hall said, "We play very little new music, but once it's been added we go to the wall with it') and the rest is older music. Hall said the station's music is geared toward a 25-plus demographic. "We've eliminated much of the 'beat your brains out' stuff."

The station was and remains very promotions-conscious, though Vali remarked, "We stay away from things like record giveaways where you're just giving something away for the sake of giving something away." While WLRS did give away Betamaxes, free dinners, and even \$102 cash prizes during the last ratings sweep, Vali noted that the majority of their promotions have been geared toward public service. The station took over a flounder-

ing Toys For Tots campaign, and as a result of a radio marathon which solicited toys and money to buy them wholesale, they amassed over 25,000 new toys last Christmas. Their three "Homemade" albums have sold in excess of 30,000 copies at \$1.50 each to benefit a station-originated scholarship fund. The station's Walrus mascot appears at all major Louisville functions. Vali summed up his feelings about public-spirited promotions: "Not only do they make your listening community happy; they make the FCC happy. You're addressing the problems in your community, and that's what radio's for. We should be helping Louisville; we should be doing more than just playing music."

Between music sets on any radio station are commercial sweeps, and Vali had some very stringent rules about the sort of spots he would allow on the air. "We regularly turned down national spots that we didn't feel fit our requirements. There were no ads for pimple creams, no feminine hygiene commercials, no loud spots for drag strips. We figured we were running a twelve-minute load per hour, so we had to consider them a major part of our programming; we had to deal with them. And even with our strict commercial policies there was still a line to get on the station; we were sold out." This sort of approach would not have been possible, Vali admitted, without the support of the station's owners Louisa and Ed Henson, given credit by Vali for their belief in the staff and the station's potential.

"More than a radio station," Vali summarized, "WLRS is indeed a radio school. When I first got there I didn't know a damn thing about radio; everything I did know, in fact was wrong. But management gave me all the tools I needed to grow with. And we have a

staff of programmers there; every guy on the station could program a radio station tomorrow. It was never just me saying 'we're gonna do this and that.' It was everyone. Without this community spirit we could have never grown as we did; it would have been impossible to take care of all the fine-tuning and attention to details that's so important to the growth of a station."

WLRS cruises on with Dolan at the programming helm while Vali has gone on to the challenge of programming two Disco stations in Honolulu. He was originally hired to program KPIC-FM as Hawaii's first Superstars affiliate, but when a market competitor announced its intention to run B-A's Disco format on its FM, KPIG's owners decided to program Disco on both their AM and FM stations. "The market is really strange," Vali said; "it's more tourists and Navy than locals, and everyone's into disco. The clubs do phenomenal business here." Vali is looking forward to his new radio challenge, and it should be interesting to watch what a former AOR programmer can do to help develop Disco into a full-fledged radio format.

Meanwhile, as the passing weeks bring continued word of AOR format switches to Disco (most recently in Fresno at KYNO-FM, who were actually the market's top-rated AOR with a 5.4 12-plus figure), we have received written feedback from some of our reporters on the emerging Disco radio form and what it may mean to the future of AOR. This week we'll share thoughts with Gary Lane, PD of WMID/Atlantic City, who wrote (in part):

"Those of us who walk around with our heads in the sand may be asking to be permanently buried! Disco may prove to be as big a catalyst to the industry as Presley and The Beatles were in their heyday. Think even deeper! The same comments that many of us are making about this relatively new music form have been made to us concerning rock 'n' roll back in the fifties and again about 'Rock' in the late sixties.

"How long can you ignore a superstar such as Donna Summer? Let us not forget that people such as John Paul Young and Bob McGilpin have their roots in rock. Don't you think our listeners can identify with them? What about most of us playing Rod Stewart and the Stones; is this not disco? Or maybe we are seeing the beginning of still another musical form; 'Disco-Rock'?

"It is probably true that you cannot mix disco with all forms of rock. I would totally agree that (is true) in regard to 'progressive rock', but for those of us who approximate the Superstars concept of AOR, there is room for many of the disco hits. You must think about this music before the guy across town proves to both you and your listeners that it mixes and works."

Thanks to Gary for sharing his personal observations, and the floor remains open to any other AOR programmers who wish to add their opinions. More opinions will be voiced, I'm certain, on the opening night of R&R Convention '79 when the informal AOR gathering takes place. Aside from guest Lee Abrams' observations on the emergence of disco as a radio form and what it means to AOR radio, we'll throw out the topic for debate among the people in the room. For those not able to attend we'll also be taking voluminous notes that we'll transcribe for future issues. We also look forward to talking with M105/Cleveland PD Eric Stevens and WBCN/Boston PD Charlie Kendall on the problems and solutions of being an AFTRA affiliate station. And still more to come.

WVAF Switches To Top 40

Charleston's only AOR outlet WVAF has switched formats to Top 40. Dan O'Toole has been named the station's new PD while former PD Maja Piff remains with the station as Operations Director, where she is responsible for internal functions of the station.

The station's former air staff have all been replaced with new names. Leaving the station are former air personalities Mac McClung, Mary Smith, Jane Gawthrop, and Stan Smith. Former air personality Steve Burczyk has moved into the station's engineering department.

Ironically the change in format comes after a period of continuing ratings growth for the station, who went from a 12-plus figure of 5.8 to last book's 8.6. According to former PD Piff the decision to change formats came from station owners Capitol Broadcasting Corp. Piff was not at liberty to comment on the changes at the station, but did mention she hoped to help the dislocated air personalities find work at other AOR stations. and welcomed phone calls from interested employers at (304) 925-7829.

A "Sound" Idea . . .

Although this is not a new idea, it is certainly a promotional idea worth repeating and maybe even trying in your market. WTHI/Terre Haute recently told their listeners they were going to become "a thing of the past." The announcement was made by General Manager Dave Liston 24 hours prior to the actual start of their "special programming." Operation Director Bobby Kraig reports a tremendous amount of phone calls were received by WTHI each time an announcement was made. The majority of calls wanted to know if the station was going off the air. Letters and telegrams also poured in during the 24 hours before the explanation was made.

The gimmick was to announce the date and time the station would "become a thing of the past," then at that time the station began a day or even a weekend of solid hit oldies, to salute the great songs of country music. To say the least, this promotion will get the attention of your listeners, as it did in Terre Haute. And it gives them a sense of relief when they hear your station is not changing formats or leaving the airwaves.

To help you in setting up a promotion of this sort, the promotion, and the copy used to explain what was really happening. First, the pre-promotion announce-

"This is Dave Liston, Manager of WTHI Radio. On December 28th we will celebrate 5 years of presenting what we consider to be the best in modern country music to the Wabash Valley. We have enjoyed your response to our programming, whether it be to the music, the news, special features or sports. We feel that you, our audience is changing. We feel that it is imperative that we keep up with your lifestyles. We feel several adjustments in our programming must be made. You've told us what you like, and what you don't like. You told us what you wanted and you told us what you didn't want. Because of what you have told us . . . We feel we have no choice, but to make the following announcement: Thursday, December 28th at 5:00p.m. WTH1 Radio will become . . . A thing of the past."

This copy was used about once an hour prior to the following announcement at 5:00 p.m, December 28. After a station ID and a 15-second pause, Liston announced:


"WTHI Radio is now a thing of the past. No, we're not going out of business, we're not going off the air . . . But for the next 24 hours . . . WTHI Radio will become a thing of the past . . . That's the set-up . . . We'll accomplish that by playing nothing but all your favorite Country songs from the past. We want to apologize to some of you who thought we were calling it quits. But one of the things you've told us you enjoyed was more old songs to bring back your memories. So because of you, during the next 24 hours, you'll hear nothing but your favorites from the past. Again we didn't mean to sting you (music from the movie "The Sting"). We don't want you mad at us, we just promoted this heavily because we want you to be a part of what we believe will be something you'll never forget. You told us you wanted us to play more old songs, so we decided to become a thing of the past. And we promoted it heavily because we wanted to get your attention, because there is more to this thing of the past than meets the ear . . . listen . . . "



Inside Nashville

THE MCA/ABC RECORDS merger, due in early March, is estimated to involve between \$28 and \$35 million in sale of ABC to MCA, much lower than the \$50 million the parent company, American Broadcasting Company, had been asking for ABC Records. The popular music row mumbles suggest that ABC's Jim Fogelsong will become head of the MCA/ABC office here.

WHOLESALE major label distribution deals are being whispered loudly, and soon there may be little evidence of national independent label distribution complexes, since the majors seem to be looking to pick up the hottest independents for distribution, which could change the complexion of the local record scene.

T.C.B.: Tom T. Hall finished his second book (an autobiography). dealing primarily with the years since he came to Nashville 17 years ago. Tom and Dixie left for a two-week vacation. By the way, Tom is the first performer selected for this season's Smithsonian Institution American Country Music series. The Sunday evening concerts will be held from Oct. "Hee-Haw" 's Roni Stoneman epitomized the "show must go on" axiom when she spent all night on a Trailways bus to make a date in Quincy, IL. when plane service was "frozen out." Roni got there to learn that T.G. Sheppard, who was also booked on the show, had crashed and his bus totaled. (They made the show.) An 18-wheeler truck loaded with 8 tons of steel plowed into the back of T.G.'s touring bus during a heavy snow storm. Fortunately the band members were in their bunks and suffered only minor injuries. While T.G. was in the state trooper's car giving the accident report, he heard a familiar voice over the CB - it was Freddie Hart, also on the way to Quincy for the concert date! Sheppard sent an SOS out to Freddie, who loaded T.G.'s band and equipment into his bus and took them all to Quincy! . . . Barbara Mandrell, Grandpa Jones, Del Reeves, Connie Smith, and Jim Ed and Helen joined other regulars at the Opry last Saturday night to sing on a 9-degree night in Nashville ... Ernest Tubb's drummer is Jimmy Heap, Jr. Jimmy's dad has been leading a Country dance band in the Southwest for over 30 years. Heap, Sr. was the first to have a regional hit on a new Eddie Miller song called "Release Me." It was

on Imperial Records, 1949, remember? . . . Johnny Paycheck and Mac Davis on Friday's (9th) "Midnight Special" together . . . The Waylon Jennings-narrated "Dukes of Hazzard" series debuted on CBS at No. 29, was the top-rated new series so far this year . . . Carl Perkins told Roger Sovine, Lawrence Welk's new man-about-Nashville, backstage at the Charlie Daniels Jam he was scared to go on "with all those kids out there. They'll kill me! They don't know me, and won't like me." WWRROONNGG!! He killed them! (With his song, which helped make Elvis famous, "Blue Suede Shoes.")



Bee Gees Debut At Number 2

Bee Gees fever struck this week for real as the new album explodes on to the Combined Top 30 at number 2 in its first full week in the stores. Only Rod Stewart's multi-format smash remains for the Bee Gees to topple. The activity on the Bee Gees was extremely difficult to track owing to the quick movement of product, which in many cases was unticketed or unmarked for tallies, into the stores. At presstime, many stores were still trying to track the activity and evaluate their reorder situations on the album.

Because of the sales created by massive airplay in the Top 40, Disco, Black, and AOR markets, Rod Stewart continued as the number 1 album in the country. Total sales on the "Blondes Have More Fun" set markedly increased this week and opened the gap between Stewart and his closest competitors.

Other albums making strong sales gains in the Top 30 were Dire Straits, up to number 17 from number 27 last week; Eddie Money, now number 22 from number 30 last week; and the surprising Elvis Costello, up to number 24 from its debut at number 29. There is still no single from the Costello set nor any play at Top 40 in album rotation.
