#### **Communications Rewrite Radio Hearings** Cause Confusion, Conflict, Controversy

Broadcasters were back on Capitol Hill this week to give the House Communications Subcommittee their views on H.R. 3333, the proposed rewrite of the Communications Act of 1934.

Indicative of the broadcasters' stance were testimonies by North Carolina Broadcasters Association Exec. Director Wade Hargrove

and Formby Stations President Clint Formby of Hereford, TX. R&R discussed the testimonies of each prior to their appearance Wednesday (5-23) and Thursday (5-24)

In prepared texts, both industry leaders supported most of the bill's provisions, but opposed the "fee" concept. Hargrove argued that a spectrum fee might someday become a tax used to reward or punish journalists. Also, both men at-

should put fears to rest, radio broadcasters were told the only way they would lose their licenses if H.R. 3333 were to become law would be for severe technical violations and continuous proceedings against a station by citizens

#### Fees

While debate on the fees was limited last week, three statements stood out:

Nick Johnson, Chairman, National Citizens Communications Lobby: They are "so grossly inadequate as to be laughable."

· Dutch Delitzsch, Pres., WDDD/ Marion, IL: Congress should set the fees percentage "in concrete so it can't escalate.

· Chuck Sanford, VP & GM, WGAN/Portland, ME: Fees "should not be used as a tradeoff for deregulation, but stand or not stand on their own.

Chairman Lionel Van Deerlin has let it be known, however, that he cannot envision the passage of a bill without the fee provision.

But, the single most active discussion centered around the creation of new stations. During sweeping testimonies, virtually every facet of the controversy was discussed: breaking down the clear channels, extending daytimers' hours of operation, consolidating frequencies, expanding the AM dial, reduced AM spacing (10 to 9 kHz), and reduced FM spacing.

Most heatedly discussed was the idea of new stations. The controversy appears to boil down to

who can prove what. On 9 kHz, for example, while Dr. Chuck Jackson, Subcommittee resident engineer, believes there to be no harm in the proposal, Hal Kassens, broadcast engineer, urged no action be taken without more conclusive data about its effects.

#### Heftel Withdraws Bid To Buy **Reeves Baltimore Stations**

Heftel Broadcasting Co. has formally withdrawn its preliminary offer to purchase WITH-AM-FM/Baltimore from Reeves Telecon Corp. Heftel had proposed buying the stations (both Beautiful Music-formatted) for \$3 million cash and a \$1 million note.

Reeves stockholders previously voted to liquidate the company, and the approved plan anticipated the sale of the Baltimore stations to Heftel. Reeves President J. Drayton Hastie said that Heftel withdrew from the agreement because Reeves hadn't agreed to the proposed collateral. Heftel President Tom Hoyt told R&R that because Reeves originally refused to accept Heftel's terms and collat-eral, "we notified the broker and Reeves that we would not change the terms and were no longer interested in the stations, and that we formally withdrew our offer."

Hastie noted that Reeves's directors had reconsidered and voted to accept Heftel's collateral, a move Heftel considered to be too late in coming. Hastie said he expected no trouble in finding other buyers for the stations, but raised the possibility of "legal recourse" against Heftel.

#### **Blinoff Out At KMPC**

Mark Blinoff has departed his position as Program Director at KMPC/Los Angeles. In making the announcement, Ken Miller, General Manager of the Pop/Adult station described Blinoff's departure to R&R as the result of "philosophical differences in certain elements of our programming.

Michael O'Shea, recently named National Program Director for the Golden West Broadcasters radio chain, will assume the duties as acting PD until a suitable replacement can be found. O'Shea, who took over as National PD on Monday (5-21), told R&R that he was interested in finding a replacement immediately and that interested parties should mail him their resumes at once to take advantage of what he called this "incredible opportunity." Blinoff, who had been with the

station for 11 years, commented to R&R, "KMPC is a great radio station and the people are fantastic. I'm really sorry I got fired, because I had great expectations and had made a home there, but that's the way the radio business goes."

ROCK, DISCO, JAZZ FUSION

#### **New Grammy Categories Set**

The National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (NARAS) took a significant step in recognizing three key forms of contemporary music this past weekend, announcing that six new Grammy Award categories had been established for rock, disco, jazz fusion. Rock, which had been lumped together with pop music in general for years, to the intense annoyance of many partisans, now has four new award categories: best male and female vocal performances, best duo or group vocal performance, and best instrumental performance. Disco and jazz fusion were each awarded a single "best performance" category.

The move was approved at NARAS's annual national trustees' meeting in Guadalajara, Mexico. The trustees also voted to set up computer facilities to handle awards nomination processing, and elected officers. Jay Levy, NARAS National Secretary-Treasurer and VP/GM of Jobete Music, was elected President, while Finance Committee member Ron Kramer takes over Levy's former post and Murray Allen, President of Chicago's Universal Recording, was named First National Vice Presi-

#### **KLOS Picks Damion For PD Position**

KLOS/Los Angeles finally filled its long-vacant Program Director position last week by selecting the station's 6-10pm air personality Damion for the job. Damion has been with KLOS as an air personality since early 1972. KLOS GM Bill Sommers commented, "He's from the market; who could know it better? He's got the drive, motivation, and ambition to win."

Damion told R&R that he felt more than able to take on the PD responsibilities, mentioning that KLOS had in the past set up a "PD training program in which he had participated. "We used to go to different parts of the country for market analyses. We were schooled spending days with department heads and attorneys, so we had a grip on the operation. As of last December I started working with (departed KLOS PD) Frank Cody a lot more closely on the music, putting in more and changing things around. Plus," he added, "I knew the market. Whoever came in would have had to spend so much time analyzing the market; it seemed a more logical choice to



#### Kendall Exits WBCN For WIKS Manager Position

Charlie Kendall, PD at WBCN/Boston, has resigned that position to join WIKS/Indianapolis as Station Manager. The move is not only notable for Kendall's programming-to-management shift, but for his dramatic format switch from the longtime Boston AOR outlet to the Heftel Disco station.

Kendall commented to R&R, "Moving into station management is a career move for me; it's something I've wanted. The opportunity is there. I known Indy because I started my major market career there at WNAP." As for the change in format, Kendall said, "Radio is radio." It's all the same mechanics, the same basics."

He added, "I feel very comfortable walking away from WBCN because I did what I came there to do. The last year at 'BCN," which included a recent employees' strike,



energy's there, everything for me he said "has been pretty astounding. I had to make the station grow and turn a profit for the first time in four years. It's a very amiable split. I'm going to miss 'BCN immensely; it's been my life for the past year. It took six weeks to decide. But the timing's there, the points in that direction. #### KNX-FM PD Marshall Switches Formats To WKRP-TV



Steve Marshall, PD of KNX-FM/ Los Angeles, has resigned that position to join a new station — "WKRP In Cincinnati." Marshall joins the CBS-TV series, recently renewed for a second season, as Story Editor and staff writer. He will continue to handle a KNX air shift until a replacement is found.

Marshall told R&R, "Television has been a real interest of mine for a long time. Writing was the way in. I decided to try it and I found I could do it. I just went up to my little mountain hideaway, and spent two days up there alone batting this thing out." The show's staff expressed interest in Marshall's script, had him rewrite it, and then offered him the position. He continued, "It's like a scholarship; I'll be over there getting paid while I learn from some of the best people in television how to write comedy... They said they listened to the station so they knew who I was when the script came in. The radio background helped."

Marshall had been in radio for over 12 years, joining KNX-FM in 1971 as MD and taking over as PD in 1973. No successor has been named for the KNX PD position. Station VP/GM Robert Nelson commented, "It is with genuine mixed feelings that I learn of Steve Marshall's decision to leave KNX-FM . . . This is a great opportunity for Steve . . . I know he will do a wonderful job .... We will deeply miss him at KNX-FM. He has made a major contribution to this station - and to the CBS-FM Group - and we have all benefitted greatly from his outstanding professional skills. Everyone at KNX-FM joins me in wishing Steve great success in his exciting new venture."

#### Patti's Radio Remarks Make Waves In Washington

While performing at the Warner Theatre in Washington, DC recently, Patti Smith delivered the following editorial on the state of the Capital's radio programming: "It's a drag you have to have a cassette deck in your car to hear good music. All we really need is a good radio station. All radio stations suck."

Reminiscent of an earlier artistic outburst, the "Costello/KSHE controversy" (R&R 3-16), Smith's comments, predictably, did not amuse Washington's AOR radio community. WAVA MD Gary

Chase informed R&R via memo that upon reading a review in the Washington Star, in which Smith's radio-oriented remarks were reproduced in full, WAVA removed "all Patti Smith material" from their playlist. Similarly, DC101 MD Michael McKay followed suit, although McKay denied WAVA's action had any bearing on DC101's.

WAVA PD Jim Herron defended his position, saying, "While she didn't mention any specific stations, she was certainly addressing our audience. That's why we took it personally." Likewise, McKay

opted, "If she doesn't appreciate her music being played on the radio, we'll play something else," adding, "when Patti says all radio sucks ... we're playing her music. Is she saying her music sucks too?"

While WAVA was demanding a personal apology from Patti both to the station and to the radio industry, DC101 claimed that they did not feel slighted, but would instead play music by artists who appreciated radio airplay.

#### Promotion Lashes Out At "Racist" Radio

Dear R&R: After quite a number of years of promoting primarily black product, I think that I have been made somewhat of an authority on the various excuses used by white Program Directors and Music Directors. These excuses are universally used by each and every one of these so-called experts in their respective markets. The reasons that are given are so cut and dried in the case of adding or not adding a record (which is usually the case) that it has aroused my curiosity as to why no one ever seems to question the validity of their reasoning...

I have heard just about every excuse and lie that these characters can think of. How many of you out there have heard this one? "The sales on the record are mostly black." Tell me, PD's and MD's, whether the sales are black or white, isn't money green? If a record is breaking out of stores in your marketplace, why wouldn't you want to make that record available to your listening audience, be they black or white. Don't you want black listeners? Are you afraid that the value of the radio station will diminish? Sounds like the standard line, "There goes the neighborhood."

How about this: "It sounds too black." Wouldn't it be convenient for pop stations if the Commodores sounded like Chicago; and aren't you lucky that Billy Joel isn't black? Isn't Billy Joel lucky that he isn't black, or he'd still be back on "52nd Street?" Just give your audience that good old civilized sound of Donna Summer. You can play it safe with her because if you close your eyes, she could easily be mistaken for a white act.

Here's one: "I'm playing too many black records already." To readers of this letter, just pick up an R&R and open it to the center section where it says Parallel One. Now, go down the playlist of each pop station. I'll bet on each list, you will find an average of between 5 to 9 "black records;" the only hangup is that between 4 to 6 of those records are disco oriented hits. "That's not black music." Where is the black representation of the black populace in your town?

My favorite computer excuse — "It's unfamiliar to my audi-

My favorite computer excuse — "It's unfamiliar to my audience." It would really help if your listeners had heard the record on your station in order to become familiar with it. How can it be familiar to anyone if you've never played it? Methods such as "callouts" are someday going to make your station unfamiliar to your (Continued on Page 28).

#### Radio Network Financial Data Shows Higher Revenues But Lower Profits for 1978

The FCC released last week a compilation of financial data, submitted by the eight nationwide radio networks (CBS, two MBS networks, NBC and ABC's three AM and one FM network) and the 36 network owned and operated stations, showing an 11.1 percent increase in net broadcast revenues for calendar year 1978.

The 1978 total net broadcast revenues were \$236.3 million, compared to \$212.7 million in 1977 for the eight networks and their 36 stations (18 AM and 18 FM), after deductions of payments to affiliated stations, commissions to agencies and respresentatives, and cash discounts. Profits (before Federal income tax) were \$43.7 million, a

6 percent decrease from the \$46.5 million reported for 1977.

Net broadcast revenues of the 36 AM and FM stations owned and operated by the networks were up 14.2 percent to \$146.5 million, compared to \$128.2 million in 1977. Profits for the 36 stations were \$28.4 million in 1978, compared to \$21.2 million in 1977, a 33.8 percent increase. The eight networks earned profits of \$15.4 million on net broadcast revenues of \$89.9 million in 1978, compared to profits of \$25.3 million on net revenues of \$84.5 million in 1977. Network expenses increased 25.9 percent from \$59.2 million in 1977 to \$74.5 million in 1978.

#### **Update**

#### **Groups Prod FCC On AM Stereo**

Pressure from one network, two trade associations, and five manufacturers to get moving on the AM stereophonic proposed rulemaking proceeding was brought to bear last week on the FCC.

Four manufacturers, Harris, Magnavox, Kahn/Hazeltine, and Motorola, argued that their particular systems would best fulfill design objectives. Not jumping into the fray (deadline for comments: May 15) was Belar.

Adding to the controversy, Magnavox received an endorsement from General Electric (GE) and Harris got one from Sansui.

#### 9 kHz Not Affected

Meanwhile, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) and the American Radio Relay League (an association of amateur radio operators) urged restraint on any decision that would "preclude implementation of a comprehensive and effective 9 kHz separation plan" for the AM band.

ABC echoed NAB in calling for the FCC to move quickly on making a decision. Both argued that none of the five proposed systems would impose any limitations on 9 kHz channel spacing.

The Electronic Industries Association (representing manufacturers) was more specific about timing. They want the Commission to authorize AM stereo broadcasts nine months after the rule is published in final form.

#### **Public Radio Under Examination**

Scattered hissing was the reaction to a comment by Rep. Jim Collins (D-TX) about breaking up large clusters of advertising on public radio airwayes.

"An ad every 30 minutes is healthy," said Collins, to the disapproval of some 500 public radio broadcasters attending a four-day Washington conference sponsored by National Public Radio (NPR). Only one day before, CBS journalist Dan Rather told the same crowd he hoped they would shed their "elitist image."

Collins, a co-sponsor of H.R. 3333, also urged a separate bill dealing with public broadcasting during a panel discussion on the legal aspects of the legislation. He also said he objects to "permanent authorization" (funding) and supports increased opportunities for minority ownership of public stations.

#### **Hollings Opposes Restructuring**

Sen. Ernest Hollings (D-SC), in remarks prior to the panel, told the public radio audience that his bill did not favor restructuring public broadcasting. Hollings has been regarded as a champion of public broadcasting, according to one NPR insider.

Others to speak during the panel were: Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin (D-CA), who reiterated his advocacy of independence for public stations through selling commercial time; NTIA Director Henry Geller, who told the group they would probably be facing increased competition from more radio facilities; CPB President Robben Fleming, who proposes separating funds for management and programming; and Carnegie Commission member Henry Cauthen, who favors pitting public radio stations against NPR for funding.

#### **EVERY PICTURE TELLS A STORY**

#### Radio: Battle Lines Are Drawn At Hearings

"HOW-DEEEE" roared through the halls of Congress, reverberating from Room 2322 in the Rayburn House Office Building where Mrs. Henry Cannon, better known as Minnie Pearl, appeared before the House Communications Subcommittee to testify on behalf of WSM/Nashville.

"I've spent 27 years traveling from one end of this country to the other, talking to people," Pearl told the subcommittee, "and they have convinced me that WSM and the other clear channel stations fill a need that smaller stations simply can't."

Pearl added comic relief to a day of testimony that began at 9:30am, broke for lunch at 1:43pm, began again at 2:00pm, and ran until 4:45.

#### Frame Of Reference

She began with a humorous story:

It seems an old farmer was in court trying to recover damages from the man who smashed his truck and killed the cow in the back. The defense attorney kept interrupting to shout, "Isn't it true that, immediately after the accident, you stated that you felt fine?"

"Now, wait a minute," said the farmer.
"That man came straight across the median and hit me head-on. When the officer got out to look at my cow, he said, 'That poor beast is in bad shape,' and shot it in the head.

"When he came around to ask me how I was, I said, 'I feel fine!'

"You see," said Minnie Pearl. "You always have to remember the frame of reference."

The following panelists and witnesses (listed in order of appearance) testified Thursday, May 17, before the House Communications Subcommittee, which had asked them to consider the differences between the Communications Act of 1934 and the proposed bill — H.R. 3333. R&R has summarized the remarks so that radio broadcasters will know what was said on your behalf and against you at radio's day on Capitol Hill.

The leading panelist of the morning, Robert Crandall, passed, saying he had come to participate in the discussion rather than present formal testimony. Later, he identified his position as a free market economist who thinks the government should definitely back off radio and probably TV. Next was R&R's marketing columnist...

#### Let The Marketplace Rule

Richard Lutz: In his summary, Lutz noted that radio faces increasing competition from new and existing technologies and that the way to success in any format will be through good marketing.

be through good marketing.
"One key point," said Lutz, "is that radio serves two distinct consumer groups: listeners and advertisers... It is my general opinion that deregulation of the radio

industry would allow market forces to operate more efficiently, leading to greater
satisfaction on the part of listeners, advertisers, and broadcasters."

His main points were that the elimination of:

 commercial time restrictions would be unlikely to lead to stations airing excessive amounts of advertising,

 news and public affairs requirements would not lead to the demise of such information.

 ascertainment requirements would not do away with radio broadcasters' need to know what consumers want.

#### **Marketplace And Special Audiences**

Nick Johnson: Although Johnson focused on TV, his general points also applied to radio, particularly his feeling that the marketplace "isn't designed to, and doesn't serve the entertainment desires of retired men over 65, nor young children, the poor, many minority groups, the handicapped, and so forth."

"However ineffective the FCC has been,"
Johnson said, "... the existence of a regulatory scheme has given power to the concerned public in negotiating its own settlements with them.

"There will be less protection against

#### **Protection For Specialty Formats?**

Kristin Booth Glen: "400,000 people now listen to classical music (in New York City) who couldn't otherwise," said Glen, who

was counsel for the WNCN Listeners Guild, which blocked Starr Broadcasting's attempt to turn WNCN into a rocker several years ago.

Labeling H.R. 3333 a "cruel joke on consumers," Glen said the bill would take away all tools that consumers have to challenge broadcasters.

Subcommittee Chairman Lionel Van Deerlin asked her to describe broadcasters' incentive to experiment with format changes, if they're going to get hit with legal action blocking another format switch should a test fail (such as was the case at WNCN). She replied that she favored an escape clause after 18 to 24 months. "The whole purpose of the public interest standard is to protect minority tastes," she said.

#### Broadcasters' Turn

Dutch Doelitzsch: During Doelitzsch's testimony about how the FCC forced him

via the raised-eyebrow technique to drop a highly-listened-to Saturday morning show, "Auction Man," (the station auctioned merchandise from a variety of merchants, i.e., refrigerators, furniture, tune-ups), Rep.

Marc Marks (R-PA) interrupted to ask for example of public interest programming on national issues. "Your people are interested in programs of more depth than 'Auction.'" remarked Marks, who left the room when Doelitzsch explained that local programs—like "Auction Man"—are more important to a small community.

"Under H.R. 3333, the program will return," Doelitzsch announced. In the meantime, however, the "program (which was) banned from commercial stations because it was too commercial is regularly broadcast on public stations," he said.

#### **Worry Over Revocation Abuse**

Charles Sanford: "Broadcasters deliver more public service programming than the FCC requires and carry fewer commercials... They do this because if you run too heavy a commercial load, you lose audience; if your station's news isn't Continued on Page 6

"If the bill permits the filing of petitions to revoke licenses at any time as well as pre-hearing discovery, there is a great potential for abuse . . . Perhaps, a tightening of who has legal standing to file a revocation petition would be a start in the right direction."

#### **Masses Determine Success**

Nelson Lavergne: "Being a member of a minority should not be the criterion upon

"As it is now," Lavergne said, "broadcasters live in daily fear of challenges to their license and . . . are almost forced to prove their innocence, rather than make accusers prove guilt."

He added that "the strongest regulation that any business person needs" is the masses, who "have the final control . . . over success or failure."

Jim Gabbert: "It comes down to who's going to play God — the government or the public?" Gabbert asked rhetorically. Obviously, he feels it should be the public: "Certainly a broadcaster should serve the

advertising rates would fall off, and the station would be forced to go off the air."
Rep. Al Swift (D-WA) asked about a

Rep. Al Swift (D-WA) asked about a hypothetical requirement to pump a certain percentage into public service programming (replacing the current guidelines of 8 and 6 percent respectively for AM & FM). Gabbert said that "would be disastrous."

bert said that "would be disastrous."

In anticipation of Congressional questions, Gabbert also indicated that singlemarket stations belonging to NRBA are being surveyed to see whether they would become automated tape services under H.R. 3333.

#### Big Brother Leads To "Stifled" Programming

Paul Davis: "It is not government fiat or license renewal fears that have produced the all-News formats and most other quality news programming — it is marketplace competition." The fear, he said, leads to stifled, 'safe' programming.

"The First Amendment assumes that the truth will come out of a marketplace of ideas, that the conflict of robust voices is better than the monotone of an enforced 'balance.' Thus, if one source's presentation on an issue is unbalanced, other viewpoints doubtless will be heard from other sources."

"We support the limitation of equal time requirements to paid advertising, rather than including much public affairs programming as the existing law does."

#### **More Access**

John Shattuck: "H.R. 3333 would not protect the fundamental First Amendment values during this period of rapidly-changing technology. In our view, it risks substantial damage to the public interest. It would not promote public access to the use of each medium, and allow flexibility of government regulation where essential to the public welfare."

Shattuck said ACLU would favor: 1) more emphasis on access, 2) greater use of



John Shattuck, Washington Director, ACLU antitrust laws, 3) government encouragement of new technological development, and 4) support of an "auditorium" concept (allowing anyone to go on the air on a first-come, first-serve basis) for public broadcasting.

#### Competition Better Serves Broadcasters

J. Jerome Lackamp: "Have we at last rejected the Supreme Court's famous dictum: 'It is the right of the viewers and listeners, not the right of broadcasters which is paramount?"

Of particular concern to Lackamp was that citizens would no longer be able to "negotiate with (their) local station, especially at the time of license renewal...

There is every reason to assume that competition will much better serve the interests of broadcasters," Lackamp charged.

"It is devastating to know that H.R. 3333 will effectively stop a citizens' movement which time after time has been recognized valid by the courts and valuable by citizens and broadcasters alike."

Revocation?

Arnold Lerner (Chairman, WLLH-WSSH-FM/Lowell, MA): He came before the Sub-committee to push for clarification on Section 418 and he got it.

"I don't see any language in Section 418 which would prevent abuse of the use of the petition to revoke," said Lerner. "If this right is abused, then the indefinite license term for radio stations as provided for in Section 471, instead of becoming beneficial to us, actually puts us into greater jeopardy than under the present three-year license term. Combine an increased right of discovery . . . with a persistent and financially capable petitioner, and we have the potential for harassment and abuse."

Rep. Paul Findley: "The FCC is simply not trying to solve this (the daytimers') problem," said the Illinois Republican. "Instead, the Commissioners have proposed a so-called solution (to break up clear channels) which does not solve the problem but gets Minnie Pearl and her tens of thousands of fans so upset that they write thousands of letters based upon the ridiculous proposition that the Grand Ole Opry's very existence is in danger."

Findley outlined several ways in which daytimers could get full-time status and praised H.R. 3333 for dealing with daytimers' problems and announced that he stood "ready to do whatever is required to assure its passage."

#### **Protecting The Clears**

Rep. Bill Boner: Not only did clear channel stations draw fire out of Minnie Pearl, but also from Bill Boner (D-TN), who said he represents "Nashville, the Grand Ole Opry and clear station WSM." Boner

has introduced legislation of his own that would prohibit the duplication of station assignments on Class 1-A frequencies.

Boner talked about "the potential economic impact on Nashville's economy. He said an FCC decision to break up the clears would "destroy a unique American institution and cause economic hardship for ... Nashville."

Rep. Albert Gore (D-TN) added "that those in rural areas often have no other outlet for national news (than the clears). He said he finds an "arrogance in the view that New York and Los Angeles have all the cultural offerings."

#### Pro Clears

Hal Kassens: Talking on the testimony of Rep. Findley, Kassens, flanked by Russ Eagan, a prominent Washington communication attorney of the Kirkland & Ellis firm, and counsel for the Clear Channel Broadcasting Service, said the FCC "knew what it was doing when it created regional channels." He estimated that adding a 250-watt signal at night to a clear channel frequency would cause interference 1000 miles away.

Kassens's most striking point was that there are only 325 communities without "a full-time AM station, an FM station, an assigned FM station, or service from a nearby community."

#### **Woes Of Daytimers**

Ray Livesay "Mr. DBA is — like Arnold Lerner — concerned about 'revocation.'" He suggested the subcommittee "consider writing a clause into the bill that would limit not more than one revocation proceeding on a broadcaster in five years."

Also, Livesay argues that the worl "local" should be inserted in Section 413 of the bill, which says the Commission will make sure that each community "is provided with the maximum full-time (local) radio broadcast service." The section already specifies "AM" station.

Livesay applauded H.R. 333 in the area of deregulation, saying, "It does away with much of the burdensome paperwork heaped upon us by the FCC at license renewal time and their ascertainment requirements."



William Potts, Haley, Bader & Potts Preserve The Signals

William Potts: "My concern is that the bill goes too far in telling it (FCC) what to do. Let the agencies make the studies and set the goals," Potts urged.

Potts claimed that the goals of the DBA

to provide an AM station for all communities (20,117 in U.S. according to Potts)

is "an impossible task" for the FCC.

"... While the Commission should attempt to provide local radio service, both AM and FM, to all communities in this country, it should do so to the extent possible without degrading the quality of existing or potential service," he said.



Next came 3) "Strangers" (CBS movie) 4) "Battle Of The Network Stars" 5) "Playboy's 25th Anniversary" 6) "Happy Days" 7) "Taxi" 8) "Mork & Mindy" 9) "60 Minutes" (CBS) and 10) "Barnaby Jones" (CBS) in a rare top ten appearance Johnny Cash's CBS special was a respectable 21st, while NBC's "Chevy Chase Humor Test" special finished an unspectacular 43rd.

#### Taft's Net, Revenues Top Marks For Quarter, Year

Spurred by its broadcasting operations, Tait Broadcasting Co. announced that its revenues and net earnings both rose to record heights during the fourth quarter and fiscal year ending March 31. Net earnings for 1979 climbed 30 percent to \$25.9 million, up from \$19.9 million in 1978. Similarly, year-end revenues rose 21 percent to \$167.1 million, up from \$138.3 million for the same period last year.

Taft's fourth quarter net increased 29 percent to \$3.6 million, up from \$2.8 million in 1978, while revenues for the fourth quarter swelled 24 percent to \$31.6 million, up from \$25.5 million during the same time last year.

On the year, Taft's broadcasting operations showed an increase of 27 percent in net earnings to \$39.1 million with year-end revenues up 20.5 percent to \$82.4 million. In the fourth quarter, Taft's broadcasting operations reflected a 14 percent increase in net earnings to \$7.3 million on 12.5 percent higher revenues of \$18.5 million. Year-end revenues from Taft's radio operations totalled a record \$19.3 million, 24 percent higher than 1978's figures.

#### Warners Nixes Rumors Of Entry Into Casinos, Slots

Among items discussed at Warner Communications Inc.'s annual stockholders meeting recently was the question of the entertainment conglomerate's possible entry into either the casino or slot machine markets. WCI Chairman Steven J. Ross quashed such rumors with the succinct statement: "We (WCI) will not be participating in the gambling industry in any way, shape or form."

Ross's statement was not surprising, considering the company is coming off a record setting year in 1978 and had just posted its best first-quarter revenues and profits ever

#### Coke To Fine Tune Current Commercials

In response to bottlers' accusations of inconsistent quality in the execution of variations of the "Coke adds life" theme in current commercials, the Coca-Cola Co. is presently stepping up production of a new series of commercials to be shown at a national meeting of Coke bottlers in San Francisco in June. Sources close to the campaign effort describe the changes as similar to previous fine-tunings in the spots' subtheme. In addition, sources claim the new campaign will be more upbeat in approach. Bottlers have also been told that Coke will augment its ad budget by as much as \$20 million for the rest of this year.



Memorial Day began by military order in 1868, when General John A. Logan designated it as the day to decorate the graves of dead soliders. For a long time it was called Decoration Day and was only for Civil War soldiers, but it is now in honor of all war dead.

How many in all? 46,498 in Southeast Asia. 33,629 in Korea. 291,557 in World War 11. 53,402 in World War 1. 385 in the Spanish-American War, 140,414 Yankees and at least 133,821 Rebels in the Civil War. 1733 in the Mexican War. 2260 in the War of 1812. 4435 in the Revolutionary War.

The Defense Department total of the above is 708,134 and that is battlefield deaths only. It doesn't count other deaths and ignores — as do many people — those wounded and maimed on the same battlefields.

It is good and fitting that we as a nation say thanks to those men and women who died so that we could remain the United States, but it would be of infinitely more practical good if we would include in our national conaciousness the approximately one million living cripples now among us. There's a point to be made for remembering the living, for many among them can never forget their personal sacrifice, because the pain remains day and night and never stops.

In researching under "war" I came across something once uttered by the sassiest of yesteryear's ladies: "J'm for peace," said Mae West. "I've yet to see a man wake up in the morning and say 'I've just had a good war."

NOTE: There is no way I'd use the above on the air any time close to Memorial Day because the timing would render it in abominably poor taste.

Yesterday was the 22nd anniversary of the Crickets' first release with Buddy Holly singing lead (1957), and yesterday was Henry Kissinger's 56th birthday.

Today Gladys Knight is 35, actress Carroll Baker turns 47, John Fogerty becomes 34 and the surviving Dionne Quintuplets are 45.

The Golden Gate Bridge opened to traffic 42 years ago today (1937) and the very first all color movie, "On With The Show," premiered during the stock market crash 50 years ago in 1929.

The Sierra Club was founded 87 years ago today (1892) as the nation's first powerful conservationist organization. On the third attempt, agents of the Committee To Re-elect The President succeeded is breaking into the Watergate offices of their political opponents seven years ago today (1972). The first try two nights earlier had resulted in Howard Hunt and Virgilio Gonzales spending the night hiding in a stairwell after they couldn't get the Democratic National Committee door open. Try No. 2 the next night — Gonzales tried but failed to pick the lock. If at first you don't succeed....

Two years ago a fast-spreading fire killed 164 people and hurt more than 100 others, after an electrical short ignited the Beverly Hills Supper Club in Southgate, KY, trapping the victims inside.

#### Tuesday May 29: Bob Hope "Spirit Of 76"

John F. Kennedy (1917-1963) would have been 62 today. He was killed at age 46 in Dallas and some of us still aren't sure of the full details of his assassination.

Bob Hope was born this date in 1903, the year we leased land for the Panama Canal, the first coast-to-coast auto trip was completed and Jack London published "The Call of the Wild." Bob Hope is older than the Wright Brothers' first airplane flight (by a half-year) and today the nation's senior comedian becomes 76.

#### Wednesday May 30: What Was So Hot About Joan Of Arc Anyway?

#### Friday June 1: Summer 20 Days Away



#### To Play Or Not To Play.

hat is the question. When conducting call-out music research, is it always necessary to play a few bars of each record "down-the-line" for the respondent? Or can the respondent be trusted to rate the record from memory? These are important questions, for there is always a trade-off involved in call-out research: The number of records tested on each respondent versus the length of time the respondent can be kept on the phone (or the cost of interviewer time)

#### Three Approaches

There are three basic approaches to the callout problem of which records to play or not play:

- 1. Play no records
- 2. Play only "unfamiliar" records
- 3. Play all records

#### Play No Records (PNR)

ince many stations conduct record research only on supposedly familiar records which have already received airplay on their own or competing stations, it is assumed that most respondents are familiar with the records and can rate them from memory. Alternatively, the rating scale may be of a form which allows the respondent to express unfamiliarity. For instance, the interviewer might ask, "What do you think about 'Hot Stuff?" "

#### Play "Unfamiliar" Records (PUR)

second appraoch to call-out research might use the above question as a "screener" question. That is, if the respondent gives one of the last three responses, that is sufficient and the interviewer moves on to the next record. For those records, however, for which the respondent indicates unfamiliarity. interviewer plays the "hook" or some other portion of the record down the line and then asks for a rating on the following scale, for example:

Hate it
Neutra
Love it

In addition, it may be useful at this point to ask respondents who are intially unfamiliar if they have ever heard the song before.

- □ Never heard it before □ Not sure

☐ Definitely heard it before

This latter question will help to sort out those respondents for whom the "hook" served just to jog their memories from those who still do not recognize the song and are rating it only on the basis of the "hook."

#### Play All Records (PAR)

Under this system, all respondents hear a portion of each song they are asked to rate. They are then asked to rate their familiarity with the song and their feelings about it

#### **Comparing The Approaches**

s we move from the PNR approach, through PUR to PAR, fewer and fewer records can be tested in the same amount of time or at the same cost. PAR would seem to offer the greatest degree of accuracy, but may be overly cautious, especially for really big hits with almost universal familiarity. On the other hand, PNR may be too optimistic in its total reliance on listeners' memories.

herefore, PUR seems like a reasonable compromise solution to the problem. However, there are a couple of possible biasing factors in this approach which you should be aware of if you choose to use it. First, there is the problem of social desirability, which refers to a general tendency on the part of respondents to give answers which will enhance their image in the eyes of the interviewer. In other words, respondents may be hesitant to admit that they are unfamiliar with a song, especially if they feel that they should know it. The result of this is that, for some songs, some respondents will be rating them without really knowing which songs they are rating. Needless to say, this can cause a severe distortion of results If enough respondents fall into this "unfamiliarbut-don't-realize it," or "are-afraid-to-admit-it" category.

second difficulty with the PUR approach is that it is really mixing two forms of testing. In one instance, where the respondent claims familiarity, the song is rated totally from memory with no immediate musical stimulus. For the unfamiliar respondent, however, the song is rated right after the respondent hears it. These two forms of testing are roughly analogous to "recall" versus "recognition" tests which are used by marketers to test brand familiarity. The important point is that the two methods yield different results, sometimes dramtically

hy might these differences occur in music research? Suppose, for a particular record, half the sample in your call-out research claims familiarity, the other half unfamiliarity. According to the PUR model, then, the "unfamiliar" respondents would be played a few seconds of the song, following which their ratings would be taken. "Familiar" respondents would provide their ratings directly. The unfamiliar respondents have all been exposed to the exact same portion of the song, while there is no evidence at all as to what was going on in the heads of the familiar respondents. Some may not think of the tune at all, some may be imagining the wrong song altogether, and still others may be focusing on various aspects of the song (e.g., the intro, the "hook," the refrain, the instrumental portion). Therefore, there are many possibilities which could cause the results of the "familiar" and "unfamiliar" groups to vary quite drastically, for the same song!

hen in doubt, the safest route would be to move back toward the PAR model. Music listening seems to be a right hemisphere, "imagery" experience for many listeners. Recognition tests have generally been shown to be quite useful in testing for visual images (e.g., recognition of cereal boxes), so it seems reasonable that a recognition-type approach might be more useful than recall for audio imagery as well.

laying all records is not completely satisfactory, though. It is the cautious approach, but also is the most expensive. The PUR approach will always be attractive for that reason. How then can PUR be made more reliable? One approach would be to move to a "partial" PUR model. Under this system, each song tested would be played down the line to some proportion (say 25%) of the respondents who rate themselves as familiar with it. After the results come in, the ratings of "familiar - not played" group can be compared with the ratings of the "familiar - played anyway" group to determine the magnitude of discrepancy, if any. It is quite possible that, for many records, the two groups will not vary substantially despite the difference in methods: That would be "good news" for PUR. Over time, by carefully observing the differential results, you can build a "track record" for the PUR method versus PAR. If the two are typically close enough to satisfy you, then you would have more confidence in adopting the PUR approach. However, I would recommend that even under PUR, spot checks of the type described be made occasionally to provide a monitoring of the system's accuracy.

#### Q&A

An interesting question came in recently from J. Michael McKay, Program Director at WJLB/Detroit. He asks..."Why is it that the HDBA (Arbitron's High Density Black Area, where listening is retrieved by telephone) does not seem to match the reality concerning where concentrations of blacks really live?"

The answer is that there is a two-fold problem here — there are always neighborhoods in transition, plus the fact that Arbitron relies on outdated census data. Since the last general census in 1970 (which demographers admit undercounted minorities), many blacks have moved into new neighborhoods. Thus, until 1982, when the 1980 census data will be available, Arbitron's HDBA's (and HDSpanishA's also) will still be defined using 1970 housing and population figures.

The Census Bureau is looking at ways of doing a census every five years. In the meantime, though, broadcasters with either Black or Spanish-formatted stations may want to get their case together for revised ethnic sampling areas in their markets. Present your case to Arbitron, and eventually talk to Rick Aurichio in New York. However, realize your effort to get Arbitron to sample on a more realistic basis may be like the proverblal "chicken soup" — it may not be successful, but it can't hurt.

#### "Harry Bolger Speaks Frankly About New Burke Rating Effort"

This is the first in a series of exclusive interviews with major figures in the radio research industry. Look for these interviews in the final issue each month. This month we talk to Harry Bolger. President of Burke Broadcast Research. Cincinnatibased radio research firm seeking to become a viable alternative to Arbitron.

R&R: There are a number of services competing for the unenviable position of tackling Arbitron. What do you think makes Burke stand out in this competition?

BOLGER: The major reason is that Burke presents the best combination of both methodological viability and the resources that are required by a company to satisfactorily provide a service for radio broadcasters and advertising agencies. The methodology has been well tested and is sound and is being examined seriously now by major companies of broadcasters and agencies around the country.

R&R: What steps will Burke take to avoid the kind of hostility that Arbitron seems to generate on the behalf of broadcasters?

BOLGER: I think the first thing one must do is be aware that the broadcasters are ultimately the people who are putting the food on your table and pay a greater heed to what their needs and requirements are. Probably the most fundamental thing

ethnic surveying. What about black sampling? Arbitron uses the telephone technique to measure blacks but the technique differs

BOLGER: It differs significantly and the reason it differs is because theirs is a "clustered" sample, in which they measure everyone over age 12 in the home. They then find it necessary, in order to get the listening for all household members, to at times ask other household members of for the listening of the other party. Whereas we only take listening from the person in whom we're interested; we will only speak to that one person. Relayed or hearsay listening must deflate audience estimates and I think Arbitron has almost as much as acknowledged this of late. We consistently show higher levels for Black stations.

R&R: It appears that from the books you've released in the markets you've measured so far, that the stations with 18-34 demographics, or who hope to skew that way, should be more enamored with your service than with Arbitron. Is it that you're able to better sample the 18-34 year old population?

BOLGER: I think it's because ours is a relatively easy technique to cooperate with, and that is to say it has little hassle. You have to speak to people once and only once for a period of an average of ten minutes, and we make up to five, and in some cases, as many as eight attempts to contact these people. Therefore, we get a high percentage of them (18-34 year olds), and they go along with it, and they might even find it interesting for ten minutes. But to keep calling them back or to ask

BOLGER: At the outset the biggest problem we had was the ballyhoo over what has become to be called TRAC-7, a concept we looked at and rejected. We now think that we'd been vindicated because there are some very good reasons for rejecting it. The greatest problem we have now is that while many broadcasters are, you might say spiritually behind us, they are reluctant to part with their money until they see agencies initiating buys with Burke information.

#### Diary Announcements: "Schlock"

R&R: There is a controversy which seems to brew every time when there's an Arbitron survey. I'm talking about the dlary survey announcements which ran extensively in Washington D.C. and less so in other markets during the April/May Arbitron sweep. What is your feeling about this kind of announcement?

BOLGER: I think they are a detriment to all survey research including our own. I think they are particularly hazardous to the health of a seven-day diary or a seven-day telephone recall service in which people are exposed to the measurement instrument over a period of time and therefore have more time to react to or be affected by these announcements. I think that broadcasters are making a mistake by continuing this practice, because it presents rather a schlock image to ad agencies — it becomes another promotional gimmick — and It would be in their best interest to discontinue it. It is not correct to say from a research standpoint that this (on-air survey announcements) will increase cooperation and therefore is better for the research.

#### Qualitative Data Now Available

R&R: Let's get into the qualitative information area. The first quarter of '79 reports are the first to contain qualitative data and I know, by going through it, that I could see a lot of sales possibilities. What examples could you give to our sales management or executive level readers out there as to potential uses for the qualitative data now contained in the Burkes?

BOLGER: I think with this information that radio can take advantage of one of its stronger sales points, which is that it is an efficient medium in terms of reaching the specific demographic or target group that the advertiser is interested in. With this information we're providing, we're now narrowing the profile of the listener even further, so that a station can demonstrate that it's particularly efficient in reaching people who are upper income or better educated or more prone to take airline trips, you

R&R: So a station which may not be in the top two or three in the numbers could still have a strong sales story based on product usage or income or education levels of its listeners.

BOLGER: Absolutely.

to keep in mind as a ratings supplier is that you must hire personnel who relate well to broadcasters and understand their needs and continue to insure that they are not in any way appearing arrogant to the broadcaster.

R&R: How many stations and agencies subscribe to your Burke service?

BOLGER: We have a little more than 50 stations, most of those in the markets we measured last Fall. We consider that figure encouraging. Advertising agency clients amount now to approximately 160.

R&R: Are there any agencies that you're aware of that are using Burke as a primary service now?

BOLGER: Not as a primary service. There are major agencies that use Burke, however, such as Wells, Rich, Green, N.W. Aver. BBDO. Ogilvy & Mather. Leo Burnett. J. Walter Thompson in its Chicago office, and Vitt Media, a large buying service in New York. That would be it among the major ad agencies at this time.

R&R: Do you think the factor that will determine the eventual winner in the outcome of the competition between you and the other services is going to be agency acceptance as opposed to broadcaster support?

BOLGER: Well, one follows the other. Broadcaster support only comes to you in great numbers when you have the agency acceptance. The agencies really, if they're going to move in any large number to another rating service, will move either to Burke or to Audits & Surveys.

Black & 18-34 Skewing Stations Show Higher Shares

R&R: Let's get into methodology a little bit, specifically

them to fill out a diary over a whole week, they might not react quite the same way. This seems to be particularly true with young people.

R&R: Do you think that this possibly superior representation of the younger demos will hold back your service from getting subscriptions from Pop/Adult or Beautiful Music stations?

BOLGER: It has already, unfortunately. Some broadcasters are looking at this in a general, rather than a specific sense. There are many exceptions to these rules. We found that stations such as a Beautiful Music station in Boston and Detroit have done well with us. We have found some all-News stations that do quite well, so I think each station has to judge for themselves. And of course, we're also now providing qualitative information, which tends to be very favorable to the all-News and the Beautiful Music stations.

R&R: I've noticed that comparing the Fall '78 estimates to the Winter '79 that there are some fairly consistent in-tab drops. I just looked at New York, Chicago, D.C. and Miami, and the in-tabs in the Metros dropped by about ten percent. How do you explain this consistent drop?

BOLGER: It's due to the fact that we lowered our in-tab quotas ten percent. You're the first to have picked up on that, and I commend you. The reason we lowered our quotas ten percent is. I see no point in being anything other than candid, we felt decreasing the sample to that extent in many markets kept us certainly well in line with the competition and yet then we felt we could still produce quite reasonable audience estimates. We elected to cut our costs.

R&R: What has been the biggest headache since Burke got

## The New Syndication Boom: A Conversation With Tom Rounds

Wetermark, Inc. is one of the most successful radio syndication companies in the nation. Founder and President Tom Rounds started the company in 1969, with their first big project the "Cruisin" "series of radio documentary albums, produced with ex-KHJI Los Angeles PD Ron Jacobs. Prior to forming Watermark, Rounds had worked at WINS/New York in the 50's, Honolulu radio in the 60's, and as, PD at KFRC/San Francisco, later forming a production company which put on the first big outdoor pop festival in San Francisco and several other festivals after that.

Watermark joined the longtime Los Angeles air personality Casey Kasem in 1970 to introduce "American Top 40," the successful chart countdown show which still dominates its market. Rounds has gained a vast amount of experience in the syndication field working with AT-40 and Watermark's other programming, and in the following interview with R&R Editor/Publisher Bob Wilson, he discusses syndication's history, problems and successes, and future from the viewpoint of how it can help radio stations as well as the syndication companies themselves. He covers how Watermark helps sell its shows, as well as other aids to radio stations provided, and discusses Watermark's most adventurous endeavor to date, the science fictional "Alien Worlds" series.

R&R: "American Top 40" has grown in nine years from seven to 500 stations. You started when Top 40 supposedly was dead; it is supposedly deader today than it was nine years ago. How are you existing with the most successful syndicated radio show in the history of radio?

ROUNDS: When we started, and Casey Kasem said "Welcome to American Top 40" on seven stations, the concept of the program was really to come in a kind of funny place. In 1970, Top 40 was dead. It was officially pronounced dead by the trade and by the broadcasting industry, and the reason that we called it "American Top 40" was that we figured it was sort of a semi-camp revival of the tradition that we'd all been thoroughly grounded in over all those years, and most stations had dropped the idea of numbering records in their intros. It would seem like today maybe what we're doing is bringing some kind of order out of chaos. AT-40 is a digest of what has happened during the previous week. AT-40 has a lot of things going for it. First of all, it's got Casey who's probably the best story-teller around. It's a countdown, so therefore, It's something that people can follow, like ball scores, or the stock market, on a weekly basis, and they can get It all summarized and neatly rounded up in a very orderly progression of records, which starts at No. 40 and goes down to 1. In addition to that, there's a lot of other more subtle things working with it, one of which is the way that we have learned to dispense information about the records and the artists. We felt at the beginning, and still feel, that music is fairly faceless in that the audience craves information on the people that are making the sounds that they find themselves living. What they don't know is what it took to create that kind of situation - what were the elements that came together in time and space that created a hit record - and that's what the program is really about. It's an ongoing commentary on success and what it means. How do you get it? How do you keep it? What are the magic Ingredients? What kind of dues do you have to pay, and so forth?

**R&R:** Syndicated special programming seems to be making a big comeback — it's more acceptable . . . . is it a new trend in programming?

ROUNDS: I think it's because there's a general realization going on in the business that it's not enough to select a music policy and do it. It's neither satisfying enough for the people who are doing it, nor is it really accomplishing the purpose of the radio station in serving the community. A radio station, as we all know, has to stand for something; it has to convey some kind of meaning - make some kind of comment on a particular lifestyle that people find best expressed by it - and they lock in. But how do you do that when you've got so many different stations all trying to accomplish the same thing? You do it by being special. Therefore, the tip of the iceberg, which is evident with "American Top 40," Indicates there is a tremendous amount of material that stations can program as a way to express themselves - as a way to plug into a greater consclousness than possibly can be volced by their own facilities. We all know that within each station lies the capability to do special programming. What isn't available to the station is the time and the money to do it.

#### "Alien" Registering

R&R: How did the creation of "Allen Worlds" come about? ROUNDS: I've always felt that if you put a lot into something, you get even more back. We've been conservative, dedicated to quality programming and going for long-term relationships with stations... We've done all that; we've paid our dues and it's come back to us very nicely. It's become a profitable business for us. But what has really come back to us is the incredible opportunity to do our science fiction dramatic series: "Alien Worlds." Now this would appear to be an off-the-wall concept considering the fact that we're doing it not for information stations or CBS network stations or public broadcasting stations, but for mass appeal, mainstream, contemporary music radio stations. It had been in our minds for years

and years, almost ever since we started "American Top 40" Wouldn't it be great to do a dramatic radio program that was somehow totally compatible with music programming? So the brainstorm that we had was let's work on science fiction themes Now what happened was that there was a consciousness that somehow we tapped into: a great amount of luck involved with this, and it just happened to be an idea whose time had come. I've really never expressed this before, but there is a theme that I think everybody probably relates to, and that is that ultimately there has to be a way to get off the planet things like the Three Mile Island disaster, like the air that we breathe, and so forth, mean that the ultimate solution for an environmental problem is to extend the human race and be able to get off the earth. This is a little bit tricky, I know, but symbolically, that's what "Alien Worlds" addreses itself to "Exploring the Possibilities.

takes to produce it, and what it takes on their end to maintain it, so that they are going to go into it pretty thoroughly before they get into a situation where they could get burned.

R&R: What about the future? What do you see for the future of radio syndication?

ROUNDS: As far as the competition is concerned, I love it It's what makes it all work. For awhile there, we were all by ourselves out selling iceboxes to the Eskimos. Pitching syndications in 1970 was an all-consuming tremendously energydraining kind of procedure because stations had done it themselves for so long, and they took a great deal of pride in that. Now, what's happening is that there are a lot of very solid, very good, very competent, very industrious, and serious and dedicated companies that are producing special programming. and it supports our case tremendously; we get a lot because individual radio stations have a lot to choose from. It's great for us because it keeps us on our toes, and it means that to be better, we have to try harder, which makes it very much more satisfying. As far as the future is concerned, one of the big considerations is that most special programming is produced on the basis that it is a lot more intensive than the general run of format to which listeners have become accustomed. To a certain extent, the listening and understanding synapses in our brains have atrophied; radio has, because of programming theories which are, by and large, still with us, become a background medium

R&R: Television is there too.

ROUNDS: Television is right up there too. Definitely. So, what we must all be very careful of is coming up with programs that are easy to listen to, as well as being informative and much more highly produced than a format. "Allen Worlds" is far and away the most intensively-produced program that we've ever done, and possibly is the most intensively-produced program available to radio audiences nowadays. The kind of feedback that we've had on it is really gratifying because it tells us that people really do get into content on the radio. I must define content. Content, in terms of "Allen Worlds," for example, is something that actually gets your brain working, that gets you involved with and participating with the radio in a way that



#### **Aiding Stations**

R&R: Who do you deal with? PD's, Sales Managers, GM's? ROUNDS: We deal with them all. So, therefore, we know what we're getting Into. We also know that It's the way that a relationship is set up at the beginning that lends itself to the kind of partnership that is created with each one of the participating stations. We have almost 1300 stations that we deal with on a weekly basis. That means product going out every week; it means either affidavits coming in every week, or dollars coming in every month. With programs as successful as these . . . . stations have realized that their exclusive license to carry a specific program in their market is an asset, and they are

going to project that asset. Therefore, they have taken the re-

lationship very seriously — as seriously as we have.

We also provide stations with recipes and formulas about how to make money with special programming. Special programming as a way to stimulate economic Interest in the station within its community to sell against television and to sell against newspaper is something that we've made an art. We publish, a couple of times a year, support material on each of the programs that tells stations how to package it — how to actually go out and pitch it. So, with all the support material that we as a company provide radio stations, it's evident that we're serious about long-term relationships. The quick buck aspect of radio syndication is much more obvious for stations to perceive now. Radio people are much more aware of what it

takes to get a successful syndicated program, and what it

perhaps you've never realized was there before. And radio, of course, is an outgrowth of audio-communication — oral communication — verbal communication, which goes all the way back and predates any other medium. The first thing that people did socially was to tell stories to each other. And that's what radio still does. So we're tapping in to that type of vestigial caveman method of communication that's still with us. Sitting around a campfire and telling stories, which is really what makes "American Top 40" work — "Special Of The Week" work — "American Country Countdown" work — and "Alien Worlds" especially, because radio can take you away, and it can take you away using Information and content that is not necessarily usable

R&R: Absolutely. It taps the side of your brain you're not used to using.

ROUNDS: So, radio can be a tremendous eye for people, and that's the kind of feedback we're now beginning to get after only 13 weeks of "Alien Worlds" on the air.

R&R: Does it also work financially?

ROUNDS: One of the main purposes of Watermark is to locate and get into motion new money sources for radio. This is really what barter programming does, but it's also what programming like "American Top 40" does. "American Top 40" is a must-buy for media services, and there are probably 30 or 40 of them right now, who on behalf of their client advertisers, are buying "American Top 40" straight across the broad regionally on any station that it's on, which means bucks coming directly into the radio station as a result of special programming.



#### Personality Mail Bag

Strike a nerve? Who, me? My column of three weeks ago "Where Have All The Good Jocks Gone?" (R&R, 5-11) apparently inspired quite a few readers to stand up and be counted. I always felt that the subject of "personality" was a potentially touchy one, but now I know!

#### **Joke Backfire**

Tom Adams, Editor and Publisher of the Electric Weenie, one of the well-respected and widely-used joke services for jocks, took exception to one particular statement I made: "... your remark that 'subscribing to 10 different joke services just isn't what 1979 is all about,' is a little unnecessary ... You mention three L.A. names in your article. Let me say that Rick Dees has been a Weenie subscriber for over 4 years, Dr. Don Rose since our first issue in 1970 (as has Gary Owens). As for Lohman & Barkley, I don't know, but Biggle Nevins, their Operations Manager at KFI has subscribed for someone there since '74. Where's the harm in picking up some radio-geared prepared ad-libs? By all means, try 10. Or more. You'll eventually find out which one has the most to offer. Then drop the other eight or nine. We who put out our monthly humor sheets have something for everyone ... current gags, long-lasting gags, and, if nothing else, items to jog your own creativity."

Even though I'm having trouble coming to grips with the phrase "prepared ad-libs," Tom has a point. And the key to everything Tom says is "items to jog your own creativity." I think he missed my original point regarding joke services. I didn't mean joke services were useless, but I did mean that the days of "personality" jocks simply being able to get by using reams of prepared material are over. Today's personality must be more than funny. A joke service that can assist a jock's ability to relate (jog his or her own creativity) is worth every penny the subscription might cost. But jokes alone won't do the trick, and I hope Tom would agree with that statement. Humor is a part of personality, for sure, but only a part.

#### Looking For Mr. Goodjock

Another point in my original column struck home with Jeff King, Program Director of KSEL-AM-FM/Lubbock, who wrote, "My first impression when I picked up my R&R today and read your column was to call and yell, 'Horsecrap!' Whaddya mean, 'Where Are All The Good Jocks?' On behalf of a huge, left-out, silent majority I would like to propose the more pertinent question, 'Where are all the astute programmers looking?' "

Jeff makes the point that there always has been plenty of "talent" in the medium and smaller markets, and the situation remains unchanged today. "For many years all it took to be a hit was to be 'ballsy' and 'tight.' Then McLendon got out of radio and real talent began to be sought after again. But, in those same years, biggie PD's also became accustomed to not looking in the smaller markets for hot talent. I contend that it was still there, perhaps in smaller quantities, but nonetheless, it was there."

As Jeff also pointed out in his letter, the smaller and medium market stations that often get the most attention are the ones very close to a major market. Good point . . . since they are more accessible to the major stations, they become the obvious training grounds for future big-market personalities and programmers (the farm team, if you will). But Jeff feels that there are plenty of great-sounding stations with exciting personalities somewhat off the beaten paths. "There are some great radio stations out here in the 'sticks.' When was the last time a major market PD seriously looked in Jackson, MS, Mobile, AL, or Lubbock, TX? And if they have looked, when did they look? Certainly time is a major factor in travelling around to find someone, but look at it from the 'investment' point of view. If it costs you a few plane tickets, several dinners, and a sizable rent-a-car bill to finally find someone who can increase billing by several thousands of dollars who is the winner? You."

#### **Day Tripper**

You might remember that KHJ/Los Angeles PD Chuck Martin, who was mentioned in the original article, had spent some time and money travelling around the country, listening to secondary and smaller market stations, looking for talent. Apparently he didn't stop in Lubbock, Mobile or Jackson. If Jeff King feels that personality radio is still alive and well in many of these so-called "sticks" markets, then his point is made. Perhaps programmers in search of talent shouldn't rely on the nearby secondaries each time a staff opening presents itself . . . but then remember too that radio often creates openings with amazing speed. The need to fill a slot in the airstaff before the next rating period begins can't always accommodate the time or expense necessary to travel the country in search of a new and exciting replacement.

Jeff also mentioned a couple of his jocks that he feels are ready for the big move up in market size and W-2 forms, but I'll leave their names out in hopes that Lubbock's traffic of PD's in search of talent might increase in the future. He's right, there are still stations out there in the smaller markets where personality has not expired, but even Jeff admitted in his letter that many stations fell prey to the "sheep syndrome" when the major market trendsetters deemphasized the jock's role on the air. It's reassuring to find out that the syndrome was not 100% successful.

#### **Country Crossfire**

Finally, Mike McCoy, PD and morning personality at WKDY/Spartanburg, SC wrote to make a point that I should have included in my original search for personalities, but did not: "... Twist your dial to Country radio. Personalities are still on the air; but you may have to sit through a Moe Bandy record before you hear us. Seems like most Top 40 people don't have that much patience. You're right in supposing that we were forced out of (Top 40) radio in the past few years by small/medium market cue-card formats. Now, it appears, that we can't get back in because we're 'country' (translate: hillbillies).

"I resent your assumption that we (personalities) don't exist. Top 40 honchos don't have to wait till the current crop of 18-year-olds 'develop their acts.' They just have to get

past the music we play, and open their billfolds."

I don't recall ever "assuming" that personalities no longer exist, but I am guilty of another rather large oversight. When searching for a replacement personality for your station no matter what the format, why do most programmers look only within their own formats? The assumption they make (and here I go admittedly making an assumption of my own) is that music formats are not compatible or interchangeable when it comes to the personalities that work those formats. When you think about it, that's really not true. Don Imus would be a prime example of a Top 40 jock who successfully made the transition to Country, and I don't see why the road couldn't be two-ways. Perhaps we should all remember that format exclusivity, when it comes to music, is a barrier that has already crumbled, and the time may be right for personalities to crossover from one music format to another, if they are capable and have the desire to do so.

Maybe the next time your Top 40 station is looking for a new personality, a listen around the dial (and nation) might be in order. Not just to hear the other Top 40 stations, but all music formats. Chances are, if a jock can interest you enough to make you listen to a music form you're not crazy about, he or she has something your audience might enjoy. And if a non-Top 40 jock not "knowing the music" is a worry to you, that may be a problem, but

certainly not a major one. It's something to think about!

Thanks to everyone who took the time to read and comment upon my column on personalities. I hope the thoughts expressed by those who wrote will help all of us to make radio better for our listeners.

CAR CRAM HITS TUBE!: WELM/Elmira, NY recently staged a "car cram" promotion in conjunction with a local Chrysler/Plymouth dealer, but the results were more than they expected. Joe Stryder, WELM's PD, explains, "We didn't view it in any way as a major promotion for the station. It was actually to be a filler promotion between on-air contests. To put it mildly, it just took off! By the time all was said and done we had landed on the Associated Press wire, United Press International, ABC-TV's 'Good Morning America,' and the Los Angeles Times. 

audience. It's a pretty sad state of affairs when you, as a a radio station, have to get permission from your listeners to put a record on your playlist and actually play it.

This is one of my favorites. "It doesn't fit our sound." Isn't it curious that the few black records now enjoying pop play, such as Instant Funk, Peaches & Herb, and Sister Sledge, suddenly fit the sound of your station when their sound was so offensive just a few "trade numbers" ago? God forbid that you geniuses of radio should ever make a record fit the sound of your station by being among the first to believe in it and play it.

I am not a bleeding heart, nor have I ever marched for equal rights in my life. What I am is a concerned and professional record man. I'm someone who sees the racism in this business, and I am sick and tired of listening to lies . . . This real reason for a letter like this is to expose to the readers the growing prejudice of white radio. It is so blatant, that in my opinion, it should warrant an investigation by the proper authorities.

So there, I've said it and I feel great; and for those of you who think I may be crucified for putting my thoughts into print, think about it. What can these dictators do to me or to black radio that isn't already being done? Are they going to stop playing my records? That's impossible; most of them never started. So, sit on it guys, 'cause I'm hip to all your bullshit and so are a lot of other people. "What goes around, comes around," and it's coming for you.

Kassens was asked by Rep. Albert Gore (D-TN) to supply the subcommittee with "a more elaborate study of objections to 9 kHz." Kassens argued that the difficulties and costs of converting to 9 kHz may outweigh any advantages.
On the other hand, Gore stated

that "9 kHz should have been done a long time ago," and added that he is encouraged by enthusiasm on the part of the Canadian government, which would ultimately have to join forces with the U.S. should 9 kHz be ratified.

Reduce the spacing 10 percent and you "get 10 percent more in-terference," according to William Potts of Washington law firm Haley, Bader & Potts, who serves as Secretary for the Association for **Broadcast Engineering Standards** (ABES). Asked by Gore why 9 kHz appears to work in Europe, Potts said there are "relatively few directional stations." But Rep. Bill Boner (D-TN), in his testimony, urged Congress to give the idea careful consideration as an alternative to breaking down clear channels.

#### **Show Time**

The show of shows centered on the clear channel vs. daytimers controversy. There was Gore chairing the afternoon session, pausing to have his picture taken with Boner and Grand Ole Opry star Minnie Pearl, who appeared on behalf of WSM/Nashville. And there was Rep. Paul Findley (R-IL) and Daytime Broadcasters Association (DBA) President Ray Livesay of Matoon, IL pleading the case for daytimers

Promotion Scot Jackson announced that he had discussed the matter with Patti's management, who told him that she understands she made a mistake and a personal apology would be forthcoming. Apparently, DC101 is willing to forgive and forget, as Program Director Dave Brown informed R&R that as of Monday (5-21), Patti was back on their playlist. While Brown maintained, "She's absolutely wrong," he added he didn't know 'radio needed to give weight to her comments by responding to them in the manner we did initially."


Subcommittee Engineering Expert Findley appears to favor consol-

idating the clear channels on several frequencies and opening up remaining channels to daytimers. He would also be in favor of WSM syndicating the Grand Ole Opry, to which Gore replied that it would take 1800 stations to duplicate WSM's service area.

On the issue of which would better serve people in rural areas existing clear channel stations or added nighttime service for daytimers - Gore and Findley were at odds over the number of people not receiving nighttime radio (i.e., those living in what the FCC terms "white areas"). While Findley contends, "46 million Americans lose their only source of local AM radio news, weather, community information, and entertainment each evening when the sun goes down," Gore disputed that figure, adding that only the clears have an economic base for providing quality, 24-hour news: For more detailed session coverage, see Page 4

KLOS (Continued from Page 1) said, "That's just the tip of the iceberg."

Commenting on his rise from the ranks, Damion said, "We're all friends, but we're all here as a team. I look at it like a football team: there's only one quarterback, and whether the rest of the team agrees . . . they have to execute the play. Those who don't want to play on the team will get traded, or whatever. I'm certainly not coming in with an iron hand. Someone has to make the final decisions, but subjectivity has to be there as well. I certainly want to have open communication with these people. I want it to be a team of which I am one factor." He added that he hopes to surrender his air shift shortly to concentrate more fully on the PD job.





# Bill Speed

## Does Sales Influence Programming?

This is a question which affects all radio formats, and as you'll read, has special importance for Black stations. I spoke with Ed Kerby, General Sales Manager at KDAY/Los Angeles, and Amos Brown III, Assistant General Manager at WTLC-FM/Indianapolis, to to get a sales perspective. Their comments on the sales/programming relationship, remotes, station image, local advertisers, and other relevant topics follow, and are of importance to all of us.

Amos Brown didn't pull any punches to start off. "Does sales influence programming?" he said. "You're damn right it does. The basic reason is because commercial broadcasting has to turn a dollar to pay out a dollar and pay our employees. In order for Black radio in particular to grow and be as strong as our white counterparts, we have to have a strong sales base. But sales and programming are intertwined because if you don't have a strong product to begin with, you don't have a good product to sell."

Ed Kerby commented, "At our station, sales and programming work very much together, but as far as sales having an influence over programming, the answer is no. The radio station has gained its audience through our programming. And we are not going to

lose those ratings through sales. We're not going to turn around and kill the goose that laid the egg. We have to keep programming consistent; you can't have consistency if the radio station hooks up with every advertiser that comes along, and you change the sound of the radio station to suit an advertiser." Brown agrees, but points out that sometimes circumstances force a station to change programming in order to survive. "At our radio station we try not to let sales dominate programming. In the early days of the station, eight or nine years ago, sales definitely influenced programming because we didn't have that many sales. Because you had to have a high volume of spots to turn a dollar, you were in 15-18 minutes an hour of spots. We did a lot of advertiser promotion, advertiser-oriented contests in those days."

Brown continues, "But when our current owners came in in 1973, we decided to clean up our act from the sales point of view. We began to sell professionally, and what that means is selling with facts and not with emotion. At the same time, we began to look very seriously at why we were running 18 minutes of commercials plus another minute of PSA's and promos — some hours we were running 20 minutes of non-program material.

"Part of that problem is it's hard to reject green. If a guy calls you up and has \$500 and you're sold out . . . it's very hard to turn that dollar down. You want to increase your billing to impress your GM or Sales Manager. From a management point of view it's hard to turn it down because that's more money that you can get in and show the owner. I think a lot of the sales pressure on programming comes from the bottom line. You end up a lot of times with pressure because you've got to hit that quota for the month."

Kerby picks up the point about selling professionally, with a strategy. "During the summertime period, when you're 90% sold out, that's the time you really go out and do a lot of groundwork selling for the slower periods of time. KDAY has been a consistent station that has not suffered major ratings fluctuations. It's been a constant leader in the market, and the only thing that could kill that is complacency, either by the programming or sales department."

### Station Image Vs. Advertisers

Brown brought up an interesting point about advertisers on Black stations: "One thing Black stations should understand is their advertisers don't want to be there. If an advertiser could, he'd want to be on the number one, two or three radio station in the market. They don't really want to be on Black radio. They don't trust it, they don't understand it,

Kerby relates that KDAY had some initial problems in that area, but says, "From the first day we went on the air, the radio station was successful. It was immediately successful at the retail level; the retailers could feel the business it generated. It took longer to get agency acceptance, because we had come up against somebody who had been a leader in the market for 13 years, and nobody thought they could be moved. It did take a while to influence the larger advertisers that what we were doing was new and we were taking Continued on Page 43



# **Does Sales Influence Programming?**

Black radio in a different direction. And I think it proved successful. We've never had too much business. Nobody ever does. But we have certainly limited the type of business we will take and the commercials that are going to be on the air."

will take and the sound of the commercials that are going to be on the air."

That brought up the question of how to handle your local community advertisers, especially if you're starting to gain national advertising. Kerby says, "Anything that is on the radio station is going to be produced to fit the image of the radio station. It's going to be a quality-sounding production. We still have and we always want the smaller advertisers, the transmission shops, the small restaurants, the nightclubs, the discos, the small boutiques and so on, because it gives the radio station a feel— it's involvement within the community, even though it happens to be a commercial."

Brown says, "It's odd, as you reduce your commercial load, things become more complex. It's hard to do from a management level, particularly when a black or small businessman comes to you for help and you're sold out. And you don't want to turn a brother away. So we've had to work with our people and we've been trying to get them to come in advance, call before they plan something, let us work with you. And they are fairly acclimated now to where they'll call us a week or two in advance..."

### Remote Control

Neither Brown nor Kerby had much positive to say about remote broadcasts from client locations. In WTLC's early days, Brown relates, "We did a lot of taking the two turntables, the cart machine and the remote board out and going to this clothing store and that food store and this bar and what-have-you and doing on-location remotes. In those days they got the station visibility, got the jocks out in the community, and helped in advertising,

but they sounded crummy over the air because you could only do it in mono, so you'd have mono on a stereo station."

Brown continued, "The first thing we did when we updated our quality control was stop sending out the music remotes because it got too expensive and the quality was just horrendous."

Kerby says. "We've had a very strong policy against remotes. Remotes have a tendency only to be entertaining to the people who are at the remote. And when you do a remote you sacrifice the sound of your radio station. We have roughly half a million people listening to this station. If you are doing a remote at Store X, the people at the store are entertained, but you still have half a million people who aren't at the store . . . and it changes the sound of your radio station. All of a sudden the jock is not playing to a listening audience; he's a visual attraction at that point. It isn't particularly entertaining to anyone who is not there."

Wrapping It Up

Both Brown and Kerby had general comments about the sales/programming relationship. Brown feels that "in a well-run radio station, sales should affect programming . . . in this way. It should provide enough dollars for programming to be strong. Programming should recognize that the better their product the easier it is going to be for sales to sell it. If the sales staff has confidence, if programming has confidence, they can talk to each other. A good programmer should understand sales. He should understand the sales forces in his marketplace. He should know whether his station is selling on or off the rate card. And our salesmen know and understand what the jocks go through. When you've got that kind of balance, everybody understands, and you tend to cooperate rather than be at crosspurposes. Sales will always affect programming, but at our level we have found there can be a happy medium. Our ultimate goal is a good quality product. Because the better the quality of product, the bigger the audience."

Kerby advises sales departments to "work with your programming department. Find out what their needs are to make your radio station more successful. I'm not a programming genius. That isn't what they pay me for. Steve Woods is one of the finest PD's I've ever worked with, and we have a good rap with each other. We can sit down and discuss whether an idea is going to be valuable for the radio station. The end result is what goes out

over the air. Everything else is secondary to what you serve your audience.

# (ALBUM ORIENTED ROCK)

Commercials: Lord love 'em, those 30-, 45- and 60-second announcements that have been both the savior and the bane of broadcasting since the medium's inception. This week R&R's AOR department conducted an informal poll of many of our reporters to ask about station commercial policies, and we've come up with some interestingly varied responses.

### **Minute By Minute**

Of the 41 reporters polled, 32% stated their maximum number of commercial minutes per hour was eight, with nine minutes being the next most popular figure (19% of those queried). The station listing the lowest maximum commercial minutes per hour (six) was WCOZ/Boston, which has asked clients to pay more for the benefit of having their commercials heard in smaller and less frequent clusters. This also allows the station to serve up a half-hour of commercial-free music to its listeners each hour of the day. On the upper end were KOZZ/Reno, which will run as many as 14 minutes of commercials in an hour, and KATT/Oklahoma City, which leaves room on its hourly logs for up to 16 minutes of commercials.

### It's Not How Long You Make It . . .

Of course we're dealing with more than minutes here; a minute's worth of commercial time can be subdivided into any number of segments, the most popular being 30's and 60's. While most AOR's polled stay with those two forms, several stations mentioned 10-second spots as a commercial alternative, and there were scattered references to 15's and 45's. One station, WCMF/Rochester, also mentioned a client who requested, and paid extra, for a series of 90-second spots to advertise his stereo outlet. but that was a one-time experience for the station. Most reporters agreed that experience has shown that while the traditional 30's and 60's get the most buys, well-constructed commercials in other time frames can also be equally effective (and save time for more music). Most stations polled said their policy was that actual commercial units per hour seldom exceeded number of commercial minutes by more than two, and a majority of stations reported their hour was divided into four commercial breaks.

### Time To Kill

With so much airtime per hour taken up by commercials, our next question was to what extent the station controlled the subject matter of those spots. Once again answers varied from reporter to reporter, though a surprising number of stations stated they had no specific restrictions on spot content. Some confidentially admitted that their stations' policy on commercials was "money talks; nobody walks," while many others stated that commercials are reviewed for content individually as they came in.

Several stations stated they did refuse certain spot material, the most common being acne medicines and feminine hygiene products. Also on the "Don't Run" list at

some stations were teen-oriented chewing gum commercials. An interesting reflection on how much AOR radio itself has changed over the past decade was that only one station polled, KZEL/Eugene, specifically mentioned military spots as being ineligible for station airing (shades of "FM"!). Another sign of the times is the number of stations who mentioned they will not run spots which either refer to discos or use disco music in their sound-track, which, as Z-92/Omaha MD Joe Blood said, "contradicts everything the station stands for." Z-92, like many AOR's, is an affiliate of the ABC-FM Network, which means they will occasionally run spots for products the station would not otherwise promote, such as hemorrhoid creams and suppositories. But Blood maintained, "The benefits of being in such a network far outweigh the potential disadvantages of running such material."

Many stations work in tandem with their sales departments to recut offending commercials. Most famous along these lines is WXRT/Chicago, whose jocks voiced all the station's spots until recently. Now WXRT runs one spot per break of non-station-produced material, said material being carefully pre-screened before airing so that it will fit WXRT's demanding standards. Many stations referred to X-rated or violent film commercials as being the material most often recut by station staffers, while head shops and other drug culture material were also mentioned frequently.

### **Working Toward A Common Goal**

Naturally, stations will do best when the programming and sales departments work harmoniously, and many station reps with whom we spoke emphasized the need to educate sales staffers to the subtleties of the AOR form, and to the goals of the programming team. K108-FM/Sacramento PD Art Schroeder said, "Once the sales people understand what you're going after, they can in turn give their clients a better understanding of the texture of the station and thereby avoid hassles like recutting spots."

For further comments on the complementary nature of sales and programming, be sure to read Bill Speed's column this week for interviews with WTLC-FM/Indianapolis Station Manager Amos Brown and KDAY/Los Angeles Sales Manager Ed Kirby.

As our survey covered only a segment of our AOR reporters, there are probably a number of other interesting points to uncover and stories to be told regarding AOR commercial policies. If you have information or opinions to share, please take the time to express them by phone or in writing to the AOR department of R&R.

For the majority of our AOR reporters the pressure valve has just been eased with the end of the spring Arbitron ratings period (though the pressure is never really shut off completely since now PD's and programmers alike sweat out the results of the past several weeks' worth of efforts). How many times have programmers groaned, "there has to be a better idea?" Harry Bolger, President of Burke Broadcast Research claims to have a better ratings research idea for 18-34 year old demographics stations in particular, and he describes it this week in Jhan Hiber's Ratings & Research column. Good reading.

# WNEW-FM Restructures Programming Dept.

WNEW-FM/New York has announced a restructured programming team which retains Scott Muni as PD and names the station's Dick Neer as Programming Coordinator, sharing in the music and programming decision-making process. Additionally, Tom Morrera has relinquished his MD title but will retain his overnight airshift.


In reference to the changes, Muni stated, "The problem was that one person couldn't both be on the air and also be an efficient PD here; there's just too much to be done. Dick will help put everything together for us." Muni returns to his regular 2-6pm airshift next week.



# "Cheaper Crude" Song Follow-Up

In the May 4 issue of R&R, on Page 3, we ran the first article about a song recorded by KJJJ/Phoenix morning man Bobby Butler. A month later, R&R Associate Country Editor Lee Wade gives us a follow-up to her original story:

Just as the price of gas keeps rising, Bobby "Sofine" Butler's "Cheaper Crude Or No More Food" continues to express the frustrations of irate gasoline consumers. The song's sociopolitical overtones have been picked up as news copy by the BBC, Newsweek, the New York Times, etc. Iron Butterfly Corporation, the record's label, reports orders for about 270,000 copies of the single. Butler and songwriter Brent Burns performed Tuesday (5-22) in Washington, DC for Congressman Jim Weaver's (D-OR) press conference announcing the formation of a national Barrel For Bushel Committee, co-chaired by Weaver and Brent Bitner of the American Agriculture Committee. The group will lobby for the formation of a Nation Grain Board.

The song's relevance is a natural for radio station promotions. WNYN/Canton aired "Cheaper Crude..." for 14% consecutive hours last week (5-17) from a 6am sign on to an 8:30pm sign off. The day was dedicated to all those "whose tempers get higher with every tick of the gasoline pump," and was a protest against rising prices.

KMAK/Fresno collected 3000 signatures endorsing the song's politics — they are forwarding the petition, and a copy of the record, to President Carter and state representatives.

In a takeoff of the song's title, WCXI/Detroit sponsored a gas exchange: 10 gallons free to each listener who turned in a loaf of bread. In two hours the 2000-gallon gas supply was exhausted, with the gathered loaves donated to the Salvation Army. For harassed motorists, already pushed to the limit with auto-related problems, the promotion had an ironic twist. WCXI was compelled to broadcast a message from the police department: "Don't block traffic or you'll get a \$20 ticket!"

# Denver Station Thinks Khoumeni Is A Meanie

Last week, KERE/Denver made news here with its Carter's Little Energy Pills promotion. This week, KERE's Operations Manager Jay Hoffer reports the stations is raising a ruckus over the recent comments by Iran's Ayatollah Khoumeni. His calling the United States "a wounded snake" hit a nerve with Hoffer, and he decided to do something about it. KERE made contact with the Iranian embassy and through a press attache offered free air time to Khoumeni to explain his statement. Hoffer to R&R: "We are offering free time to Ayatollah Khoumeni to express himself as to why he feels the way he does about the United States. It was our intention of letting this guy know we are proud of the fact we have free speech in this country, and that is why we are making this gesture." 
Dear R&R:





# The Top 40 To Pop/Adult Transition: Part II

This concludes a recent interview with veteran programmer Peter McLane, who has successfully made the change from Top 40 to P/A radio at KFJZ/Fort Worth. McLane's insights of his transition are both interesting and informative.

R&R: Your personalities, what's the age spread there?

McLANE: Some of them are as young as 30, but I think another more important thing is that the guys are married and they have children and families, and right now my staff is practically complete Texans. Some have left the market but returned because there seems to be a reality that Texans always return to their state. They may go, but they come back. And it's great because they know the area — know all the names and remember what it's like and can relate to it. I think the relatability of the personality is really important to an

R&R: I'd like Peter McLane's view of the transition from Rock to Adult radio? McLANE: Well, originally I got into the business to do radio, and at that time radio was pretty much full-service, and then we got into the area of specialization and now AM radio is coming back into the area of full-service again. I personally had no problem making the switch - I am a radio freak first and a format freak second.

R&R: Any reflections that others who are contemplating a similar change may bene-

McLANE: I really think that the adult world is kind of like a lifestyle change. I mean, doesn't it automatically change as you pick up responsibility and as you get tired of moving around and, hopefully, find a good station that you're comfortable with? I think that those guys who are having a problem might as well get used to it because those in AM are going to see that in 10 or 15 years, the next format is going to be the Pop/Adult FM format. In

other words, after we get musiced to death with Beautiful Music and Top 40 and high and low energy in AOR, the next step is to turn it back over to the broadcasters again. There are classic examples of that right now at KVIL in Dallas. KVIL is Top 40 for grownups that's basically what it is. We are too.

R&R: What do you mean by that?

McLANE: We play popular music, we don't play MOR music - we play popular music and we have people of their own age communicating with them.

R&R: You're saying that because the population is older, that the music has grown up with the adults of today?

McLANE: Yes, and I find a demographic target of 30-40 more realistic than the usual

McLANE: There's a lifestyle change when the big 30 comes up. When you're 28 years old you're into record albums and concerts and running around and probably haven't settled down. When 30 hits you say, "Oh gosh, I feel so old, I'm over the hill, what am I

Everybody has to face 30. Then when you start facing the older years and looking back, 30 doesn't look so bad. Anyway, we've found that 30-40 is a lot more realistic for us in the

music and advertising approach.

R&R: Musically, in this particular town, you look at a KHJ which is tagged a Top 40, and then look at KMPC's list, and with a few exceptions, the list is the same: the difference, however, is in the presentation of the music and the other full-service aspects that KMPC offers that makes the appeal adult.

McLANE: Well you've got to say that KMPC has come a little toward KHJ and KHJ has come a little toward KMPC - one has broadened and one has narrowed. It's a very thin line, and I think the artists do it to us - the producer of the Linda Ronstadt album says, "OK, look, if we sit down and remake an oldie, let's get an old Orbison, a real good one, we'll get rock play, country play, pop play — we'll get everybody and make a lot of money and you're going to be a superstar." It's released and all the stations that can, play it. It's really interesting to me because we had a saying in the old days, "a hit is a hit is a hit." If you're playing the hits, you're playing everything. We only played the hit twist records and only the hit Beatles records. Top 40 is a very viable format. Tod Storz knew what he was doing when he invented it.

I think the interesting thing about a Pop/Adult is when you talk about a radio station that's really good but there's no musical description for it, like a WCCO. How do you scribe that sucker? All I can tell you if you grew up in the Midwest you know about WCCO - in Omaha it was KFAB.

R&R: They're still a monster today . .

McLANE: Yes, they still are. If you listen to that radio station, you're not as involved with formatics of it as you are with the fact that, hey, this radio station sounds like Omaha. R&R: And that's what nobody can beat, the soundtrack of the city.

McLANE: Look at guys like Gary Owens and Dr. Don Rose - these guys came from

the Midwest, and would probably never have developed if they were not allowed to and were just straight time and temperature jocks. There never would have been an Owens or Rose if those formula stations did not allow personality. Look at Chuck Blore and KFWB in Los Angeles, and for that matter, Bill Drake. The people who got shutup were the fake-Drakes, who ripped off all the format elements out of a hotel room and took it back to Oklahoma City and slapped it on and said, "This is what will make us number 1." They just left out a few things like Robert W. Morgan, the Real Don Steele, and my favorite of all, Hum-

R&R: Back to the basics of Pop/Adult radio, as was mentioned earlier, it is really a full-service proposition

McLANE: It's really what radio does best. Communication with the listener with things he wants to hear. Music was really never best on AM - it sounds better on FM. What's happening is that adults are tolerating (AM) as long as you play the kind of popular music they want to hear, but they're not really listening to you for music, they're listening for an awful lot more.

R&R: Let's touch on community involvement.

McLANE: That's a definite plus for a Pop/Adult station. You cannot just take out of the community and you can't read one-liner PSA's and say you're fullfilling the community image. You're got to get involved, your personalities have to spend time doing freebies. They have to work with volunteer organizations and get their names more well-known, it's that simple. They've got to know who you are. A guy told me one time when I got in the business, "Peter your job as an announcer is to become a household word. If you can do that, you've got it made." My success at KIOA was I didn't move around a lot. I stayed there until I knew everyone and everyone knew me. That's how you get success.

R&R: Anything in closing?

McLANE: I would say this, that the guy who runs a Pop/Adult station is a business-- he's not in it for the records and the dope and the parties, he's a damn businessman!



# Sales Comeback?

The first signs of a sales comeback have appeared in the last two weeks, as dealers report both a slight increase in volume movement and a positive anticipation for many of the superstar artist releases that are upcoming

Sales on this week's number one album, "Breakfast In America" by Supertramp, are up 33% over two weeks ago. Similarly, sales on the top ten albums are also up significantly. However, below the top ten, sales continue to be slow, as pointed out by Graat American's Ira Hellicher in a conversation this week. Heilicher attributes the sales slump to diminished store traffic and not to the lack of multiple purchases.

# **Hit Singles**

The power of the hit single as a boon in the sales of albums is again illuminated by this week's Top 30 chart. The top 19 albums in the country all have at least one hit single, while eight of them have multiple hits to sustain sales. Both new acts and established groups alike need that Top 40 exposure to compete in today's marketplace.

# **Tight Grouping**

Sales reports on the 3-7 albums were almost Identical this week. Only 1500 pieces separate the entire group, while only 18 pieces separated **Bad Co**, at number three from **Sister Sledge** at number four. **Donna Summer's** "Bad Girls" at number six is only 600 pieces from Bad Co, at number three. Look for Summer to move to the top of this group and be a possible challenger for the top two next week. The momentum is all in her favor.

## **New Releases**

Some of the product which is beginning to excite the dealers includes new releases by Peter Frampton, Ted Nugent, ELO, Wings, Kansas, EW&F, ARS, James Taylor, Kiss and Diana Ross. However, the most exciting piece of product in the street today is the Anita Ward. Mentioned here last week for having the country's hottest selling single, she now has an explosive album to go with it. This product should bring the extra traffic to the stores that is needed.

# **Thom Bell Sessions Out**

This week MCA Records is releasing the three songs that were recorded by Elton John and produced by Thom Bell on an extended play \$3.98 list twelve-inch. MCA is shipping over 100,000 copies of the EP, and the results may give the Industry a new marketing tool.
