# FLANNERY, KEATING PROMOTED **ABC Radio News In Major Restructuring**

In a significant restructuring effort. ABC Radio News has promoted a number of executives based at its New York headquarters and Washington, DC bureau. Peter Flannery moves from Assistant Director to GM/News Programming and Joe Keating has been upped from Director/Radio News Operations to GM/News Operations, Radio.

Commenting on that pair of moves, ABC VP/News & Sports (Radio) Robert Benson stated, "Joe Keating is the acknowledged 'dean' of radio network special events coverage. His finely honed talent on both the operational and editorial sides . . . has been the source of widespread recognition and praise from our affiliated stations.

"Peter Flannery has also made a tremendous contribution ... Peter was instrumental in every phase of putting the fifth and sixth ABC Radio Networks - ABC NOT IMPORTING KSD-FM FORMAT

# **Outlet Withdraws From CPI Merger**

The Outlet Co., owner of seven radio stations in addition to TV properties, has terminated its preliminary merger agreement with Columbia Pictures Industries. The move allows Coca-Cola, which agreed to acquire CPI in January in a deal now valued at \$924 million, to take over CPI without immediately acquiring Outlet. Coca-Cola had reportedly been hesitant to assume control of Outlet, which recently divested itself of a department store division which subsequently filed for bankruptcy, with Outlet possibly liable for some costs. However, Outlet officials expressed confidence that Coca-Cola would still acquire Outlet. Under the original CPI/Outlet arrangement, Outlet's broadcast properties would have become part of Columbia Pictures Communications, a division established by media entrepreneur Karl Eller.

That executive will then report to Walsh.

Mulholland commented, "Under Bob's guidance, the (TV) stations division has established a fine record of superior performance and profitability. We are delighted that his management skills will now also be applied to NBC Radio, which in every respect is a growth business with a fine future."

Walsh, who reportedly may be more involved with radio than similarly-titled predecessors, in turn appointed Michael Eskridge Exec. VP for NBC TV/Radio. Eskridge will supervise finance, administration, and engineering.

Tom Watson, formerly known as Chuck Morgan, has been named PD at WNCI/Columbus, replacing Garry Wall, who became PD at FM100/Memphis last week (R&R 2-26). Watson had been Operations Manager (under his air name) at KZZX & KQEO/Albuquerque, and was an air personality in Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Toronto, among others.

WNCI GM Art Ortega commented to R&R, "Tom's experience in so many markets made him a great candidate for the job. He's a very positive person who gets into the market and gets the station excited and involved. He has a good handle on what personality-oriented CHR should sound like, and I think he will really be an asset to this station." Ortega added, "I think it's great to have a Tom Watson in the market where Jack Nicklaus grew up."

Watson told R&R, "I'm going back to using my real name again. This opportunity to program such a fine station is a rare one indeed. Garry Wall did an excellent job, and I look to continue the progress made. Working with Art Ortega, a former PD at the station, is going to be a real pleasure. The owners (Nationwide) have expressed great support for Art, myself, and WNCI, which is committed to winning.'

### WJJD Switches From **Country To Big Bands**

After more than 17 years as a Country station, WJJD/Chicago has switched formats to Big Band. WJJD & WJEZ Operations Manager Art Wander told R&R, "When I arrived in November, (WJJD & WJEZ GM) George Dubinetz and I discussed the entire market situation and he showed me the great progress that WJEZ was making. We then proceeded to do our own research on the market, and the void existed for a station to play the Big Band Era music of the 40's, 50's and 60's. We have a great library of music to give the format, and the reaction so far has been unbelievable. We were all answering the phones ourselves on Saturday (2-27), and the calls were coming in about 40 to 1 positive, as they have all over the country for this format. It's a very viable format."

Wander explained the feeling within the company was that with both WJJD and WJEZ Country-formatted stations, the two were competing with each other. "Like George told me, 'You have a restaurant that's doing very well and you build another restaurant right next door. 

National Public Radio's Board of Directors voted last week to suspend talks with United Press International. NPR was said to have been considering a possible merger as a means of generating operating capital, which will be drastically cut next year because of federal budget slashes.

Unofficial reaction from the E.W. Scripps Co., which owns 95% of UPI, was that the two had never really formally entered talks anyway.

#### **Broyhill Introduces New Deregulation Legislation**

Jim Broyhill (R-NC), the ranking Republican on the House Energy and Commerce Committee, introduced new legislation last week that would eliminate the fairness doctrine and comparative renewals. The bill goes further in its concept than in previous Senate or House proposed legislation. In addition, the proposed new law would:

• Do away with the proposed requirement that the FCC guarantee local service by making sure that large cities or states don't get a disproportionate number of sta-

 Take away FCC's authority to revoke licenses for broadcasting obscene material.

• Add language urging FCC to push for broadcast "competitive environment."

#### **Mutual Sues Over Contract**

Mutual Broadcasting filed a \$200 million lawsuit against Western Union Telegraph Co. late last week. The suit is believed to be the largest ever against a telecommunications common carrier company. Mutual accused Western Union of not living up to a three-year-old contract to deliver transponder space. Mutual claims Western Union has refused to fully comply with a previous arrangement to commit three satellite channels and a back-up transponder. Mutual further claims that Western Union has sold its space to other firms. The company claims the damages jeopardize Mutual's \$10 million investment in its satellite distribution system.

#### Winston NABOB's New **Executive Director**

Communications attorney James Winston has been named Executive Director of the National Association of Black-Owned Broadcasters (NABOB). A former legal assistant to an FCC commissioner, Winston plans to step up NABOB's lobbying efforts in Congress and at the Commission.

#### FCC 1980 Financial **Data Reissued**

The recalculated version of the FCC's 1980 radio financial performance totals was released last week, with more positive overall results after certain market corrections were made (R&R 2-12). National/Regional Time Sales showed a 16.9% increase (15.2% in the first figures), while Local Time Sales were up 10.3% over 1979 compared to 9.1% initially. Total Net Revenues gained a point, now recording an 11.6% gain over the previous year. Expenses also went up; the adjusted figure is 15% over 1979, compared to 14.3%. And finally the profit figures show a reduced loss, 28.7% down from 1979 instead of a 33.6% decrease.

#### **Fogarty Pushes To Keep Fairness Branch In Broadcast Bureau**

In a memo last week to other Commissioners, Joe Fogarty threw up a caution flag in the proposed transfer of the Fairness & Political Broadcasting Branch from the Broadcast Bureau to the General Counsel's office. By making the shift, the FCC would do away with its "dual review" of fairness and political issues, Fogarty maintained.

#### **Reagan Helps VOA Celebrate 40th**

Recalling his early days as an announcer doing blind play-by-play baseball games, President Ronald Reagan addressed a crowd last week celebrating the 40th anniversary of the Voice of America. Recently the Reagan administration added some new concerns to the old agency that is charged with presenting official news and explanations to foreign radio listeners. The administration has asked for a "harder line" in the information being disseminated. Actor John Houseman also recalled his early days as the first head of the radio program bureau of the Office of War Information. That branch became the VOA.

# FCC Readies AM Stereo (Again)

Movements were underway for the FCC to give final approval to AM stereo Thursday (3-4). This would be the second time in two years the Commission has given the go-ahead. Two years ago Magnavox was awarded the green light; but industry pressure forced the Commission to put the issue on a back burner ever since.

While AM stereo has been a radio priority of both FCC Chairman Mark Fowler and the industry's associations, it has repeatedly popped up on Commission agendas only to disappear again. The new scheduled action in favor of a marketplace decision marks a complete reversal of the Commission's policy of two years ago.

Manufacturers of AM stereo systems were upset at the FCC's marketplace consideration which authorizes all five - Harris, Motorola, Magnavox, Belar, and Kahn-Hazeltine - to begin producing AM stereo gear. Indeed, both Magnavox and Harris have announced they will have AM stereo equipment at the NAB Convention one month from now.

#### Will All Five Play Ball?

Speculation is that not all five original AM stereo proponents will begin cranking up their assembly arms. As suggested above, both Harris and Magnavox are expected to do so; but industry observers seem to feel that Motorola and Belar may not. Further speculation is that Kahn-Hazeltine, which has consistently played the role of "poor, undercapitalized" entrepreneurs, may adopt a wait-and-see posture.

Even more important than what the "AM Stereo Five" do is the attitude of the receiver manufacturers, according to several industry observers.

"Receivers are the hardest part of the system to build," says former Magnavox designer Bob Streeter, who is now a consultant and hopes to help stations get optimal mileage out of AM stereo. According to Streeter, most receivers are manufactured outside the U.S. and therefore, foreign receiver manufacturers are going to have a say in the future of AM stereo.

#### **Marketplace** Confusion?

Both Streeter and Belar President Arno Meyer are worried by the marketplace decision. "I'd hate to see it go the way of quad," suggests Streeter, who feels there was just too much confusion in the marketplace even though the FCC hasn't finished with the issue. Meyer agreed that the key decision will be which way the



- March 1981 James McNally, the FCC staff member handling AM stereo, is disgualified from further participation for engaging in an illegal ex parte contact with an interested party.
- March 23, 1981 As the deadline for submitting comments passes, the five competitors accuse one another of fatal flaws in their systems and of submitting false and misleading data to the FCC.
- Dec. 1981-Jan. 1982 Word is out that the Broadcast Bureau will recommend adoption of a single system, but the item is pulled off the agenda of several FCC meetings.
- March 4, 1982 AM stereo is finally scheduled for an FCC vote, amid reliable reports that all five systems will be allowed to compete in the marketplace.







# **Typecorder Replaces** Secretary On The Road

ow, as you're whisking off to a convention or another run-of-the-mill business trip, and you have nothing but time on your hands while moving to and fro, the portable Sony Typecorder puts in writing all the ideas you don't want to forget.

The Typecorder is a three-pound, electronic, battery-operated keyboard small enough to fit in a standard briefcase and quiet enough to not disturb persons sitting around you. Instead of using paper, the machine records what you type on a microcassette inside the unit. Line by line text can be perused by means of a liquid crystal display panel; you have the option of returning to preceding passages for any additions and deletions. After you've returned to the office, you plug the cassette into a special unit on the typewriter and your messages/ideas are automatically typed out at a fast 120 wpm

Memorywise, Sony's newest creation maintains a line/character count. holding copy in temporary memory until the end of a page (which equals 66 lines or 1800 characters). If you desire, each finished page can be recorded and called back at any time as mentioned earlier. One microcassette stores up to 100 pages of copy

Typecorder operates for five continuous hours on four "AA" batteries and accessories include a rechargeable battery pack and AC power cord. The output system which makes possible the transferral of recorded material to paper is purchased separately; you can choose from several systems. Sony's Typecorder lists at \$1450.

# Historic Artifacts **Produce Ancient Sounds**

Record executives have come a long way, baby: from spinning a potter's wheel to worrying about breaking with a bullet. It's true! Dr. Peter Lewin, a Toronto-based pediatrician and amateur archaeologist, strongly believes that chance sounds may have been trapped in pottery and glass vessels as they were being created by civilization's earliest forerunners. So Lewin is "playing" pottery to unlock and dissect sounds that are thousands of years old.

Lewin began listening to pottery grooves with an ordinary record turntable and diamond stylus. Ruling that out as "too noisy," he's since followed in the footsteps of European researchers who are working with lasers similar to those of a videodisc machine. The laser differs from the diamond stylus in that it can be programmed to play only particular frequencies, like those of human voices.

Though Lewin has attempted to uncover the mysteries of three or four items with this method, he's had no success. But he's not ready to admit defeat yet. Next up - engraving a copper plate to determine if sounds can indeed be "recorded" that way.



### RADAR Supports Radio's Popularity

Seventy percent of the population is being reached by radio network commercials. And that's a solid figure of young, middle-aged and old, according to Statistical Research, Inc. President Gale Metzger.

"It proves that radio has good national reach and frequency," Metzger told R&R after new RADAR figures rating the radio nets were released Wednesday (3-3). While concluding there were no dramatic shifts in the newest report, Metzger confirmed that there are "some interesting dynamics within the marketplace.

Asked if ABC's new nets were showing up yet, Metzger told R&R that a dramatic decline in ABC-FM listener figures could be attributed to some of its affiliates switching to their new nets. He also speculated that ABC Contemporary's decline (as compared to its dominant position five years ago) was systematic of AM radio in general -- just like WABC switching formats, he concluded.

#### **NBC Scores Several Firsts**

With adults 25-54 as its primary target, NBC Radio Network ranked first in cume for that segment, third in average audience. Comparing the new figures with those from spring '81, the network's average audience of 1,571,000 represented a 3.6% increase.

In its third measurement survey, the Source indicated an 11.4% young adult audience growth coupled with a first place showing in both average audience and cume in its target demo of 18-34. Additionally, the Source ranked number one in adults 18-24, 18-49 and 18-54; and number one women 18-24, 18-34,



# Arbitron Ratings Reliability, Part 2

Last week I introduced you to the brave new world of **Arbitron's** most recent study on the reliability of its ratings. This study, which involved outside consultants as well as Arbitron's statistical experts, cost approximately \$500,000. The outcome was that the listening estimates generated by Arbitron appear to be even more reliable than previously thought.

You may have noticed the new reliability tables in the back of your ratings books. Last week I showed how you can use those tables to determine the standard error involved in Arbitron's ratings. This week I'd like to demonstrate the other key formula for you to be aware of, namely how to compute the error range inherent in actual audience estimates, such as an average persons total.

#### Audience Estimate Formula

Remember when last week we looked at some data from the Buffalo market? We plugged in the formula for dealing with average or cume ratings and determined that there was a 90% likelihood that station X's 3.5 rating among adults 18-49 in morning drive was plus/minus .54. This means that the station's ratings could actually fall anywhere in the 3.0-4.0 range.

What if you'd rather deal in audience estimate figures rather than ratings? Here's how you can do so . . .

1. Determine the standard error of the rating for the relevant daypart/demo (in this case .54 at the 90% confidence level).

2. Determine the population base of the demo you are examining. In the case cited last week we were looking at adults 18-49. By adding up the population estimates for the cells included in 18-49 — as shown on page three of any market report — the figure for Buffalo was determined to be 477,600.

3. Multiply the standard error times the population base, lopping off the two zeros at the end. In the Buffalo instance,  $.54 \times 4776 = 2579$ , rounded to 2600. 4. Apply this standard error for a projected audience estimate to see how much flux might be inherent in your numbers. In the case of the station selected in Buffalo, the 18-49 average persons estimated for AM drive was 19,100. With the standard error calculations shown above it has been determined that there is a 90% chance that the true estimate for the station's 18-49 audience in morning drive lies somewhere in the 19,100 plus/minus 2600 range. BRC Takes Stands

The Board of Directors of the Broadcast Ratings Council has taken stands on two issues of interest to radio broadcasters. First is the "group quarters" issue, which deals with the inclusion of dormitories and military barracks in audience surveys. Currently it is unlikely that anyone living in such quarters will be included in a survey.

The BRC Board has taken the position that ratings services should "disclose precisely their procedures for handling group quarters and the size of group quarter population in all reports." This would give ratings evaluators an idea how much of a metro population was housed in group quarters and thus most likely unavailable to be included in a radio survey.

The BRC also resolved that no ratings service publicly announce it was applying for BRC accreditation before actually receiving the BRC certificate of application.

publication I ran the same daypart/demo information from Buffalo through the computations. Rather than a standard error of .54, I obtained a number almost double that. Using the old statistical tables would have led me to believe that the numbers were less reliable than the new study appears to make them. The dramatic improvement in radio's ratings reliability should be a boon to sales and internal decision-making alike.

#### **Competitive Implications**

With the good news that radio ratings are more reliable than was thought

The actual audience delivery for our selected station in the relevant demo and daypart probably lies within a range of 16,500-21,700. Putting the standard error in this light may make the impact of the ratings reliability more meaningful to you.

#### Dramatic Improvement

What is the end result of all the calculations, all the monies and manhours invested by Arbitron? From what I can see, the bottom line is that in some cases there has been a 50% reduction in standard error over what was thought to be the best previous approach to calculating rating reliability.

I took the previous table for statistical efficiencies, put out by Arbitron several years ago and included in the spring 1979 R&R Ratings Report. Using the formula and tables contained in that



Eugene Fisk, VP/GM of WBBX/Portsmouth, NH, wrote to complain, "The Trading Area Report for the North Boston area is not accredited by the Broadcast Rating Council. Why not?"

In a letter to Arbitron VP Mike Membrado, Mr. Fisk, who was unhappy with the conduct of the Trading Area Report (TAR), noted that such reports do not carry the BRC seal of approval. That is because Arbitron has not applied for BRC approval of the TAR reports since that would mean an audit of the procedures used to produce such data. Perhaps Arbitron feels the expense of the BRC audit is not worth the outlay for this product line. comes the challenge for sales and programming use of that fact. From a sales perspective, the first piece of good news is that media buyers and advertisers can now have even more confidence in the reliability of radio's ratings, as expressed by Arbitron.

Secondly, wise use of the information contained in the reliability tables in each of your local market reports can perhaps save a sale or two. You may be able to show a media buyer that statistically there may not be the difference between your station and another that appears to be the case when looking at the book first glance. For example, in Buffalo there is a station with an 18-49 AM drive rating of 3.0, versus the 3.5 examined earlier in our formula computations. That rating translates into an average quarter-hour audience of 16,400 as shown in the book. With the standard error data plugged in the station could have actually been plus/minus 2400, or

delivered audience compared to the station with the 3.5 rating. This may convince an advertiser that the two stations are really not far apart in terms of listener appeal, which could lead to the buy going to the station with more sales promotion, better rates, etc.

From a programming perspective the updated reliability information can allow more valid comparisons and analyses of station audience movement. If your station goes up or down you can now have a more precise handle to determine if the movement was real or was within the range of standard error for the relevant daypart/demo, then the dip may be just a statistical wobble, not necessarily reason for canning the PD. Likewise, if a station (or its competition) rises, it would be wise to go through the standard error formula to see if the gains were significant, or well within the standard error range (perhaps a statistical jump).


#### Significant Advance

The conclusion on the entire ratings reliability effort is that it's one of the most worthwhile projects Arbitron has been involved in. The study was done in a high-quality fashion, at great expense to the ratings company (and thus to you subscribers out there.) Noted statisticians were employed in the search for a better way to get a handle on a more precise measure of standard error as it applies to radio data. Finally, the key formulas used to determine the standard error are included in your local market report and are easily used and understood. Just be sure to keep in mind that the Table B values change each sweep due to sample return fluctuations.

Congratulations to Arbitron for this effort. Now, if the company can just find

14,000-18,000. As you can see when comparing to the audience range shown above, there is overlap in possiblya way to keep other factors — such as edit errors — from affecting the reliability of the estimates . . .



Was CBS Records Division President Walter Yetnikoff removed from the CBS, Inc. Board of Directors so that he might fill a slot on the board of the new CBS-20th Century-Fox video venture? New York rumors go even further...putting Yetnikoff as the possible new head man for the CBS/Fox pairing.

Remember that little item we ran about the RKO station GM's having their "incentive projections" trimmed a bit? Well, it now seems that the cuts are substantial enough for at least three RKO managers (reportedly) to be eyeing "greener pastures."

Street Talk hears that WCAU/Philadelphia morning personality Scotty Brink is currently entertaining a couple of offers from the West Coast. Since WCAU returned to a morning news block, Scotty's talents are not exactly being put to their full use.



BUT, I WANNA TELL YA - Here is photographic evidence that you can lead a promotion man to the bar, but you can't guarantee that he'll be funny. Backtrack ing just a bit, Polygram held regional promotion meetings last week in Sugarbush, VT. National Director of Promotion Bill Cataldo, after just a bit too much liquid refreshment, decided to get up on stage at the Blue Tooth and do stand-up comedy. Since this was not professional comedy by any stretch of the imagination, Bill told one, shall we say, dirty joke and was ushered off stage by an angry crowd of preppies in after-ski wear. Show biz is a tough life.

Anyone attending the Country Radio Seminar in Nashville, specifically the "New Faces" dinner and show, must have heard the giant crash from the back of the room. What happened? It seems that WNBC/New York personality Don Imus, who was one of the confab's keynote speakers, was not thrilled with his dinner seat being a football field's length from the stage. After fuming silently for a few minutes, Imus "accidentally" caused a passing waiter to drop an entire tray of wine bottles and glasses. He made his point.

The first Los Angeles Birch Report has been issued, but may be recalled. The February figures, which showed KLOS on top of the market and KOST winning the Beautiful Music battle, were apparently based on the wrong metro geographic definition. Not a great start for Birch in L.A.

#### You Can't Do That... Or Can You?

STREET TALK.

Lots of L.A. radio talk about a nine-part series running in the L.A. Herald-Examiner on unreleased Beatles material. Much of the music is from BBC radio broadcasts, some of it comprises the group's original audition tape for Decca (rejected in 1962), plus a few studio tracks.

Most of it has been available before on bootlegs, some of which were very high quality. There are some alternate and live performances of familiar early Beatles songs, plus a number of rock and R&B covers never "officially' recorded ... Arthur Alexander's "Soldier Of Love," Buddy Holly's "Crying Waiting Hoping," and more obscure tunes like "Clara Bella" and "Ain't Nothin' Shakin' (But The Leaves On The Trees).'

Interestingly, KRLA/Los Angeles is playing a whole load of the stuff on Dave Hull's 3-7pm show (with Her-Ex reporter Rip Rense as his guest). What the legal ramifications of such airplay may be are unknown.

There are no immediate plans to release the bulk of this stuff, and EMI officials forecast immense difficulties in clearing most of it, but plans do exist for a single some time soon comprising "How Do You Do It" (the Gerry & the Pacemakers hit proposed as the Beatles' second UK single, then quashed in favor of "Please Please Me") and an actual recently-discovered track, "Leave My Kitten Alone." The latter song was originally recorded by Little Willie John of "Fever" fame, later covered by Johnny "Running Bear" **Preston** and in the UK by a group called First Gear, featuring an amazing pre-Led Zeppelin guitar solo by Jimmy Page. John Lennon sings lead on both of these Beatles tracks.

Meanwhile, Capitol Records will release "Reel Beatles," a collection of the group's movie songs (no previously unreleased stuff here), along with 7 & 12" medleys of that material as singles.

Westwood One is suing NBC over the TV network's use of the name "On The Record" as a regular feature of the "Today" show. Westwood One owns a federal registration for the service mark "Off The Record," the title of one of the firm's nationally syndicated radio shows. The firm contends the similarity between the names will cause confusion, since both are basically music features. NBC was asked to rename its feature ... but refused.

And finally... CKRD/Red Deer, Alberta (that's like in Canada, right?) broadcast the highlights of its "Miss Red Deer 1982" competition. The winner? Sixteen-year-old Jane Goodbun! (Hey, we don't make up this stuff.)

"There is a change in ownership taking place at the station, and so they decided to put a hiatus on extra spending, which included the consultant," explained Dan. "Personally, I'd like to see them come back, as I think they were a big help to me and the station.







# The State Of The Art Of AOR Radio: Fall 1981

Welcome to an inclusive look at the Fall 1981 Arbitron results for AOR radio. It was a very stable period for the format, with many stations repeating their success stories of the memorable Spring 1981 ratings period.

#### **Format Overview**

Of the 146 stations represented in 12+ figures, 72 registered up books and 74 were down. One station held its precise 12+ figure from last book while five AOR's debuted this ratings period.

It's important to note that in many instances, down 12+ figures were a result of stations shifting in overall presentation away from teenage listenership and toward 25+ demos. In Seattle, for example, while KZAM-FM was up in 12+, it was not the city's format-dominant AOR. However, it was #1 in the market in women 18-34 and in adults 25-34 (metro area), two highly desirable demos. In future breakouts of AOR Arb figures, it will become imperative

to include this sort of additional demographic information to get the true scope of the format.

As mentioned in an earlier column (1-22), it appears that the well-timed Rolling Stones tour across America may have helped bring extra listeners to AOR this book, since our format was dominant in Stones tour coverage.

**The Consultants** 

The AOR consultants continued to grow in numbers and successes; between Superstars, Sebastian, Pollack, and Felix, over half (76) of the AOR's listed below were consulted during this ratings period. One of these consultants, John Sebastian,

# Calling All Hams: WRNO Goes Shortwave

"It's 85° and sunny here in New Orleans, 16° and snowing in Moscow, and 70° and raining in Mexico City." And that's just the tip of the iceberg for a possible weather forecast on WRNO/New Orleans, now that the station has begun partialsimulcasting on shortwave. The station is being beamed via a blockbusting three million watts to England, Europe, Eastern U.S. and Canada, and parts of Africa, Central America, Mexico, etc. Potential audience estimates for the shortwave WRNO are between 50 and 55 million!

WRNO PD Mike Costello is still trying to deter mine the exact programming posture for the shortwave WRNO. "It's like we've had this FM station for 15 years, and we've just been given an AM



to put on the air," he stated. "We have to figure out what will best fit our needs in reaching such a vast audience." He indicated the station will most likely evolve into a "looser" version of WRNO (one which would not shy away from an occasional CHR artist). For now, WRNO shortwave simulcasts WRNO-FM about one-fifth of its 12-hour daily broadcast schedule. The rest of the programming time is taken up by prerecorded music tapes and religious programming.

Religious programming? Costello explained, "It's not cheap to put on a three million-watt station, and those shows, which are pay-for-play, help defray our costs.

The FCC is keeping a close watch on WRNO's shortwave experiment, particularly its advertising, because an FCC ruling has stated the station has to bleep out ads for products not available in countries where the signal is heard. WRNO is complying, but Costello complained, "What harm could it do to have someone living in Hamburg hear a spot for a locally-produced root beer? Who cares?'

Sponsor support for the unique radio experiment is slow to date. "We've had several inquiries," Costello said, "but till we prove ourselves we don't really have anything to sell." He commented that the station has already received calls from all over the U.S. and Europe acknowledging reception of its programming, so those Coca Cola and McDonald's ads might not be long in coming

"We want to be the only station that area listeners need. That means entertaining them with the best music available, the most enjoyable personalities we can find, and the best features and promotions possible on a limited budget. It also means keeping the listeners informed, from hard news and the credibility that a network tie-in provides to lifestyle features on how best to survive in an area that's been ranked sixth in the country in unemployment. Because of the depressed (and depressing) situation that many of our listeners are faced with, our on-air attitude is that of a grin; our music and total presentation is designed to do what the 'E' stands for in the logs: Entertain. With our jocks, it's an upbeat, friendly attitude of, 'I'm having a good time, and I'm glad you're with me.

"Musically, we lean strongly towards tracks that have a definite direction in terms of beat and lyric, so that even if a listener is unfamiliar with a track, by the end that listener will be able to tap a foot or sing a hook. We're probably best-known in the area for our variety, along with a respect for exposing strong new product. We strive for a musical 'hill and valley' feel as a tool to capture the upper side of the 18-35 demo. Staying on a hard hill for more than two sets could push that listener to an A/C station, but dropping into an occasional valley keeps that listener happy (while not alienating the lower end because they know another hill is just around the bend). The upper side of that demo is important to us for revenue so we strike a compromise with that listener in what we play as well. They may not appreciate the new AC/DC but that doesn't mean they're ready for Barry Manilow and Barbra Streisand. Instead, we'll go with the new Joan Jett or Soft Cell to keep 'em current but not scare 'em off.

"We've grown up with our audience and want to keep them as friends and that means being there with what they want and expect, and also surprising them occasionally with new things so the relationship doesn't go stale." - Bill Taylor

noted, "We're the newest of the top three AOR consultants. In business just a year, we have 19 clients. In the fall sweep we had 11 clients that had books; and all eleven experienced success. We won straight up against Pollack, for example, in every instance. And the same results were experienced against Burkhart/Abrams clients with the exception of KZOK, where we had a 78% increase - not a bad debut. Thanks to the incredible PD's at each of our stations, we can lay claim to winning the three-way battle so far." As noted below, ten Sebastian clients were up in 12+ figures and one was down, with two marketdominant.

Of 48 Superstars stations listed, 23 were up (with seven No. 1 in their markets) while 25 were down. Jeff Pollack's stations garnered eight up and three down books, with one topping all market competitors. Frank Felix (working with Noble Broadcast Consultants) charted three up books and one down.

Of course, not all the AOR success stories came from consulted stations. Independents like KGB-FM/San Diego, WKQQ/ Lexington, KILO/Colorado Springs, and WMMS/Cleveland (which has a researchonly contract with the Burkhart/Abrams group and just signed Sebastian as well) posted market-dominant books without the aid of outsiders for music and programming advice. KILO PD Rich Hawk commented on his station's success: "It was a combination of our presentation, great jocks, and the music mix, which is fairly eclectic. We believe in variety: we play everything from AC/DC to Soft Cell. Our research has indicated that song repetition is a tuneout for our listeners, so we've concentrated on avoiding it by playing several cuts on our key albums, plus opening up the library to acts like the Dregs or Al DiMeola. Everyone here is in tune enough with the way we want the station to sound that the variety pays off our us. We strive to be innovative without forgetting the basics.

AOR-dominated radio groups did well in general. Two Doubleday AOR's were up

KFMQ/ Lincoln just held "Dollar Day at the Movies," a promotion enabling Q-card holders to attend any movie theatre in Lincoln on a specific day for \$1 ... WTUE/ Dayton pacted with A&M and the Bryan Adams track "Lonely Nights" for a promotion that awarded a trivia question winner a 1½-inch screen TV set to keep him com(KWK/St. Louis and KDWB-FM/Minneapolis) one was down (WLLZ/Detroit) but still ahead of other AOR competition, and KPKE/Denver debuted nicely. Century AOR's had two down books (WABX/Detroit and KSHE/St. Louis) and one up (KMEL/ San Francisco).

Of Metromedia's four AOR's, three were down in 12+ figures (WNEW-FM/New York, WMET/Chicago, and KMET/Los Angeles) and one was up (WMMR/Philadelphia). Three of Sandusky's four AOR properties were up (KDKB/Phoenix, KZAM/Seattle, and KWFM/Tucson), while KBPI/Denver remained format-dominant with a down 12+ share.

The healthiest AOR group numerically was ABC, whose five AOR properties all registered up books (WPLJ/New York, KLOS/Los Angeles, KSFX/San Francisco, KSRR/Houston, and WRIF/Detroit).

An encouraging note is that, since the fall results became public, only two AOR's have changed formats: WPIX-FM/New York and KFML/Denver. This is a much-lower casualty rate than in the past, and provides ample evidence that the format has never been more fit.



# **Programming For** An Ex-PD GM

The history of management/programming relationships includes many war stories of sales vs. creativity. Since the majority of station managers come from sales backgrounds, many PD's feel that the deck is stacked against them right from the beginning — their programming decisions are vulnerable to whatever commercial content and sales promotions the sales department is able to generate, regardless of nature. Every PD cringes at the notion of being forced into running a million mentions for a burger chain account because it purchased a large schedule and wants a promotion.

As a result, the situation of programming for an "understanding" general manager with a programming background can appear very appealing. However, a PD could find himself facing the proverbial jump from the "frying pan into the fire," as WRKA/Louisville Program Manager Dan O'Toole learned when he began working with PD-turned-GM Ray Quinn during the fall of 1980. Why? Because as a new GM, Ray found it difficult to leave the programming alone. Complicating the scenario was the fact that Dan and Ray were close friends. Here's their story:

did exist were very minor. But Ray was so excited about the station that he'd walk in, and without meaning to, start to debate the records we were playing. It was clearly just his programming instinct to raise questions about everything.

**RQ**: God, it was difficult making the transition from PD to GM! We're friends from way back, so initially we thought working together as GM and PD would be a marriage made in heaven. We were certain we'd get along great and would totally respect each other's turf.

• DO: I already had a lot of respect for Ray when he came to WRKA, but I was pretty set on implementing my own ideas. I guess I let it go too long and too far, because our relationship became very heated after awhile.

You see, when you respect a person, you feel you want to give him the chance to settle in. I knew Ray would have a hard time concentrating on his management duties while leaving the programming department totally autonomous.

Philosophically, Ray and I are very close, so the actual programming differences that



brightest young managers in the whole country. You'd almost be a fool not to "go to school" with him. But we had to have it out.

**RQ**: What was happening was that I was getting more involved in the programming than I had planned or than Dan wanted me to. I was nudging him to try different things. I used to make lists of 30 questionable things I'd heard on the air just over the past 24 hours.

Eventually Dan came to me and said, "Look, Ray, I appreciate your help, and yes, you're a great programmer, but can't you devote your time somewhere else? We're doing OK." And he was right. The Birch Report showed our ratings going way, way up. That, plus my intuition, gave me a lot more faith in Dan. So I backed off, and ever since then, it's been terrific.

DO: The only problem I had was waiting too long to express my opinions. We just sat down and admitted how much respect we had for each other. We agreed to be more open from that moment on.

Since that confrontation, the programming decisions have been all up to me. I don't seek Ray's input for music or the direction visit with the record people. I really missed the attention the PD gets and that ego gratification. Nowadays, when the monthly sales reports come in and we're one of the top-billing stations, or when I've just landed the biggest account in town, I get just as excited as I did as a PD when the ratings came out in our favor. You must try to weather the storm and understand that the transition is going to be very difficult.

D0: First of all, be patient. Bear in mind that it's a change in life for an individual who wishes to move forward in his career. Don't let your pride get in the way. Instead, benefit from his years as a PD. Remember to be totally open – if you don't like something, speak up! Don't wait until it builds to the point when you either might get into trouble or allow the GM to become convinced that he really does have a place in your programming decisions.

Most GM's don't *really* want to be involved in the programming even though they may have been a PD themselves once. They just feel insecure, like any GM, about delegating authority to someone they're not sure can handle it until they're shown how. It's just a letting-go process.

of the air personalities. However, Ray is very promotionally-oriented and is just great for ideas. If I'm stuck creatively or need help fitting a sales promotion into the format flow, he's just the man to bounce ideas off. Major purchases involve Ray, too, because there are ways the sales department can tie in and sometimes save money for my budget.

#### Tips To A Better Relationship

**RQ:** As a former PD, one of the most important things to me was that the GM not infringe on my integrity and responsibilities. I vowed that *I* wouldn't be that way as a manager, but in the end I was. I'm telling you, if any PD becomes a GM and tries this, these same problems will happen to him.


It's very tempting to get involved with the programming, and avoiding that temptation is like going through withdrawal! I wanted to fool around with the music and On the other hand, any middle manager, such as a PD, has to prove his value or worth before he can be granted any kind of autonomy. Accept the fact that, as PD's, we're a sensitive group who tend to take advice more personally, especially when it comes from a GM with a programming background.

With Ray and Don each concentrating on what they do best, WRKA's billing tripled during the past year, while the 12+ share jumped from a 3.6 to 9.2, just one-tenth point from first place. It's commendable to see such a delicate issue resolved so successfully!

# XIII Lucky Number For CRS

**Country Radio Seminar XIII** is now history, but the abundance of thought-provoking ideas and overall useful information which came out of the individual panel sessions should be more than enough to hold all of us until the fourteenth Seminar rolls around. Since this was my first time, I can't really make a comparison with previous year's efforts. However, in talking with many of the approximately 600 attendees (up from around 500 last year), I got the impression that those who had been coming to the convention from the very beginning were still amazed that each year kept getting better and that the growth of the event had in no way hampered the original goal of the **Organization of Country Radio Broadcasters**...that of being a learning experience.

My own personal observations were that the CRS was probably the best-planned and most well-run convention I've ever encountered. The panel sessions (which I'll mention later) were almost without exception stimulating and informative, with every effort made to bring up fresh, innovative topics for discussion. Not only did the panelists have something useful to say, but the Q&A sessions held after the initial presentations turned out some lively exchanges of new ideas. Very few sessions ran over, although at times you almost wished they would, especially when a lively debate ensued! Concurrent sessions were kept to a minimum and were confined to usually nonconflicting topics, perhaps a sales-oriented meeting in one room and a programming session in another. Agenda Committee Chairman Bob English is to be complimented on this excellent scheduling.

#### "Country" Dick Clark

Friday's agenda began with an early morning "Daytimers Session," moderated by Viacom's Bill Figenshu, followed by some welcoming remarks from Tennessee Governor Lamar Alexander and the keynote address by Dick Clark. What? He's not country, you say? Not so, my friend! Dick admitted that his first radio job was on the air as "Cactus Dick and the Santa Fe Riders," as well as having owned several Country radio facilities down through the years and having sold NBC in the mid-60's a daytime television series called "Swinging Country." Although it was only on for 26 weeks, it garnered a 26 share of the audience, which Dick noted "would be the highest thing on the network" if still on today! Today, of course, Dick is best known in country music circles through his association with United Stations and the yearly Academy of Country Music awards presentations

We all got to go back a little in time by viewing some film clips of early "American Bandstand" programs featuring some of yesterday's and today's biggest country artists. Growing up in Philadelphia, it was a thrill to meet the man who gave me (and all of us) so many hours of viewing pleasure. And he never seemed to get tired of hearing people tell him how they "grew up" watching those programs!

The balance of the morning was spent looking inside Inside Radio's Jerry Del Colliano's crystal ball, as he presented his views on what may be some of the provocative topics and hot formats of the 80's during his "Hot Topics" presentation. Also mentioned were some of the problems radio faces in the future, a theme that was carried even further during the "Competition" discussion, moderated by KHJ's Charlie Cook. R&R's Jhan Hiber and Burkhart, Abrams & Assoc.'s Bob Elliot were the panelists who touched on the growing number of competition factors radio will be faced with in the future.

Following a special presentation by the CMA, hosted by Louise Mandrell, and lunch, we were all refreshed and ready to tackle the afternoon session. First one up was a slide presentation by Rob Balon of Robert E. Balon & Assoc. entitled "Myths of the Country Life Style," which made us think a little about the labels we put on our music and our listeners and how valid they really are. Rob stresses that country is not of itself a lifestyle...it is a form of music that people enjoy!

#### **Computers, Careers, & Trades**

"Computers For All Applications" dealt with a technology that more and more Country stations are beginning to employ. Moderator Mike Carta (WIL/St. Louis) noted that most broadcasters spend a good bit of money promoting their stations on the outside, so why not spend some of that money on the inside as well.

Several concurrent sessions followed, the first being "Career Development – Yours & Theirs" (moderated by KPLX-FM/Dallas-Ft. Worth's Bobby Kraig and KLAC/Los Angeles's Don Langford), which ran alongside "FCC & EEO" (moderated by WKSW-FM/Cleveland's Dave Gerard).

The following hour was devoted to concurrent sessions "Radio-Records-Trades" and "Selling Country Radio for Results in Good Times and Bad," moderated by WTCR/Huntington, WV's Mike Kirtner. "Radio-Records-Trades" moderators Paul O'Brien (WUBE-FM/Cincinnati) and Pete Porter (WQYK-FM/Tampa-St. Petersburg) had their hands full keeping up with the (as always) interesting and provocative topics brought up from the floor. The lively discussion of some of the problems confronting all three phases of our industry were continued later in the evening during an informal rap room session.

Saturday began bright and early with an earlybird "Agribusiness Session," once again moderated by Bill Figenshu (does the man ever sleep?). This was followed by the second keynoter for this year's Seminar, WNBC/New York radio personality Don Imus, who presented a humorous and selfdeprecating address entitled "Personality In Radio." As Don noted, "Country music actually lends itself to personality, particularly in the morning."

Fred Pryor of Fred Pryor Seminars, Inc. presented an interesting topic, "People Management & Motivation," a subject near and dear to the hearts of most broadcast executives. His first suggestion was that to

manage other people well, you have to understand yourself first.

The next topic, "Building It & Building On It" (sub-titled: "101 Ways to Create and Maintain A Winner") really intrigued me. Moderated by WMZQ-FM/Washington's Carol Parker and WHK/Cleveland's Joel Raab, the 11/2 hour session was chock full of ideas on programming, promotion, talent, management, etc. Although time ran out before all 101 were presented, so many useful thoughts and comments were discussed that anyone who came out of this session without something tangible to take back to his or her station just wasn't listening. One of my favorites was panelist John Lund's suggestion that stations hand out flyers listing station promotions and activities in front of the local unemployment office for one solid week, thereby capturing virtually everyone in their area who was out of work and had a lot of time to listen to

the station (and, of course, fill out those diaries!).

Today's lunch and special presentation (hosted by Dick Clark) was done under the auspices of the Academy of Country Music. Then it was back for our last afternoon of listening and note-taking.

McGavren-Guild's Erica Farber was the moderator for the "Advertising & Promotion" panel, followed by concurrent sessions, "Programming Research," (moderated by Charlie Cook) and "The Greatest Sales Ideas Of The Year" (moderated by WTQR/Winston-Salem's Kim Pyle). Bill Moyes of the Research Group and Jhan Hiber brought up some key points to look for in choosing a research firm, as well as help in learning how to interpret the data that is collected.

The last session of the Seminar was entitled "The Radio Doctor." Moderated by KOKE/Austin's Jim Ray, the nine panelists

Before the performances began, a special award was presented to Mel Foree, 37-year promotion veteran. The award was in the shape of a two-foot bullet and should certainly serve as a conversation piece for Mel for many years to come.

#### **New Faces Show**

As usual, the "New Faces Show" turned out some lively entertainment, including Lifesong's Ronnie Rogers, Excelsior's Donna Hazard, EMI/Liberty's Bobby Smith, RCA's Tennessee Express, Elektra's Kieran Kane, Sunbird's Diana, Warner Bros.' Rodney Crowell, Handshake's Terry Gregory, Epic's Ricky Skaggs, and MCA's George Strait. 



# **Info Junkie Needs Frequent Fixes**

Think your way backward through only a few generations and you'll arrive at simpler times when people didn't hear diddley instantaneously. In our great-grandparents' time it took several days for a presidential candidate to find out whether he had been elected. Our grandparents had to adjust cat whiskers on crystal sets if they were inclined to listen to radio. Our parents had radios which provided a few minutes of news, but the idea of on-scene coverage of a breaking story was still in its infancy. Folks didn't know a helluva lot of current events because the available conduits could only serve up what amounted to fairly fresh history.

Big city people read the daily newspaper after dinner. Small town individuals browsed through a weekly newspaper if they had time. From those few sheets of newsprint Americans learned all they would know about planetary events. Families of the Forties gathered around their big console radios on Sundays, staring at the round glowing dial while Walter Winchell gave the news.

I cannot trot out a page of statistics to back my suspicion, but it seems reasonable to assume that the amount of information floating around in earlier times was peanuts compared to now.

You and I exist in an environment of almost nonstop information. A torrent that never slows, only increases. From the shredded ratings of old-line AM music giants spring new all-Talk stations. If the cable doesn't get you the satellite transponder will.

There are times when I wonder whether it all adds up to beans. Whether there is really enough to be said to warrant all the saying.

Not long ago I drove halfway across the great Lone Star State of Texas and discovered that even with a supposedly super car radio, there are stretches of a hundred miles at a time where there simply is nothing on the air but static. No clearchannel blowtorches, no skips, just zip.

I didn't go into cold-turkey information withdrawal seizures but there was a persistent feeling of uneasiness. I felt definitely out of touch. It may feel good to turn the torrent off sometimes to give the ol' brain some white space, but like untouched money in the bank, it's awfully good to know it's there when you want it.

Bob Leeds says when he first got the idea for Pet Motel, bankers just laughed at him. Nine years after opening his animal boarding house, the laughter in the bank is probably coming from him.

Trick question: how fast is the American Navy's fastest battleship? The answer is zero knots, because our last battlewagon was put into mothballs 23 years ago today.

Former Monkee Mickey Dolenz is 37. Actress Lynn Redgrave is 39. Dancer Cyd Charisse is 59.

TUESDAY, MARCH 9: Can helicopters fly upside down? That's the kind of question that puts you instantly on guard. You're sure they can't, but you wouldn't really bet the rent money on it. In this case common sense is correct. Helicopters cannot sustain inverted flight. Otherwise you'd see Traffic Chopper pilots making side money flying upside down trimming hedges. The subject comes up because the first commercial helicopter license was granted 36 years ago today to the Bell Company. (Helicopters have flown loops. But loops are not sufficient for doing hedges.)

The first American ground troops to be sent to Vietnam were spending their first full day at Danang 17 years ago today. Ford introduced the V-8 engine a half-century ago today. The '32 Ford wasn't the first American V-8, but the others were in luxury cars which common people couldn't hope to afford.

Bobby Fischer, the first American to win the world chess title, is 39. Other people born on this date have included the first spaceman Yuri Gagarin, late actor Will Geer, and railroad magnate Amasa Leland Stanford, who founded Stanford University.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 10: I have it on the highest authority that the world's first emergency telephone call was placed by a man who had just spilled battery acid into his lap. It happened exactly 106 years ago today. It was lucky how it happened, because at that time there were not very many telephones. In fact there were only two in the whole world. And the world's first phone call was also the world's first *emergency* call. The guy who spilled acid on himself had just built both of the phones. A man named Bell. When he picked up the world's first phone and said "Mister Watson, come here! I want to see you!", what he needed was some quick help. That phone call was today in 1876.

My almanac says on this date in 1896 a patent was granted for a "hat-tipping device.

Dean Torrence (Jan & Dean) is 42. James Earl Ray, killer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., turns 54 behind bars.

THURSDAY, MARCH 11: The world's first analog computer was a roomful of machinery 20-by-30 feet big, with some 30,000 working mechanical parts. It was built by Vannevar Bush in 1925. He was 35 when he did it. The computer solved complex mathmatical differential equations with a clockwork of drums and rotors. The machine was last used in 1955. Bush was born 92 years ago today in 1890.

The great Blizzard of '88 — the biggest and baddest snowstorm on record — was hitting New England and the Northeast 94 years ago today. It produced fifty-foot drifts that stranded trains full of people between towns. It buried three-story buildings. 1888 became known as the Year of No Summer.

Lawrence Welk, who started his band more than a half-century ago, is 79 today. Mr. Welk is literally older than Mothers Day and even older than the Wright Brothers' airplane. Dr. Ralph Abernathy the civil rights leader is 56.

FRIDAY, MARCH 12: President Roosevelt became the first president to speak directly to the American people, in his first radio "fireside chat" 49 years ago today in 1933. The country was in the Depression and Roosevelt was on the air to explain why all the banks had suddenly closed. He had allowed a "national bank holiday." Half the banks had already gone broke, and the surviving institutions were reorganizing behind locked doors. The President gave such an inspiring pep talk that many banks voluntarily re-opened the following day.

The Girl Scouts of America are 70 today. The first United States Post Office opened on this date in 1789. James Taylor is 34. Liza Minelli is 36. Barbara Felden is 41. Atlanta Mayor Andrew Young hits 50. Former

astronaut Wally Schirra (he went into space twenty years ago) is 59. Spring begins a week from tomorrow!

Many of these stations have poor signals, little power, etc. — and so many of them are daytimers.

This week we will be showcasing a daytimer that's a winner. I know that seems hard to believe - I didn't believe it myself until I actually saw the numbers. The station is WLOU/Louisville, programmed by Bill Price Jr. During the interview Mr. Price tells just how unique WLOU and its format really are.

Mr. Price has been in the radio business for seven years, starting his career at

WLOU as an intern while attending the University of Louisville majoring in accounting. Eventually he received a BA in Business. Mr. Price is also a native of Louisville and we all know it's rare for a radio person to have the opportunity to work exclusively in his hometown.




I asked Bill why he's chosen to work only in Louisville at WLOU? "I've spent my whole life here and it's a fine place to live and work. Besides those reasons I can tell you primarily why I've stayed here - my owner and General Manager, Bill Summers. Most radio people are familiar with him or his name, because for some 10 years he has been head of the National Association of Black Broadcasters. In my doing some traveling, most broadcasters I've talked to say Mr. Summers is one of the top personalities, programmers, general managers, and now owners in the broadcasting business. So I felt it would be to my advantage to get some experience from the best and it has proven to be the correct decision for me. I started here doing weekend sports, doing community features, and that led to part-time, then full-time on the air, Production Manager and now Program Director."

Bill told me some of the details about the station. "First of all it's important to note that we're on AM at 1350 and we're 5000 watts. Our broadcast day is a bit short, especially in the winter because we're a daytimer (on at sun-up and off at sunset). Our range of coverage is as long and as far as a black voice can be heard. By that I mean our listeners stay with us as long as we're on the air. I think that speaks well of what it is we do. After we go off the air each day, our audience is probably dispersed to other stations either in the city or the county, but only after we go off." Are there any other Black stations in the area? "There's a Black station near Ft. Campbell, KY, but there are no other black stations in the state. There's a new station some place in Indiana - I don't remember the call letters, but they play black music after midnight. They reach Louisville at night so they're not really a factor."

#### **Community Activity**

What's the black population of Louisville and what do you attribute WLOU's successful book to? "First, the population of Louisville is approximately 500,000 and the Black population consists of about 170,000 people. The biggest thing we attribute our success to is that no other radio station in this area gets out into the community like we do. I don't just mean the black community, I mean the total community. We don't just get out during the book or parttime, we do it full-time year-round. For example, during the summer we have our 'Summer Fest' – no big deal, a lot of stations do that across the country. What makes ours different is the fact that we organize various groups and organizations into one functioning body. Then we make arrangements for all the organizations and listeners to go to one of the local black parks for a festive day on us. Last summer we had 40,000 people show up and we jammed all day long. For that function we incorporated our 'Kool Jazz Festival' promotion by having a 'Miss Kool Jazz Queen' pageant. Every year in the summer, we also have our two-day religious program, starting on Saturday and ending on Sunday. All the local churches with choirs participate, and on Sunday we have a 'Mass Gospel Choir' - last summer we had something like 300 voices - definitely a huge effort.' Who puts up the money for this? "We do, WLOU, it's free to the people and we take care of the expenses. By the way, we use no



major acts, we primarily deal with local acts and we still drew 40,000 people to the 'Summer Fest'."

I've noticed when I call for Bill's music reports that WLOU has a gospel program. "We program gospel two hours every day from 10am-12noon Monday through Friday. On Saturdays we begin our gospel at 6-8am and on Sundays most of our programming

# WDAO Won't Play Lewd Lyrics

Turk Logan, Program Director of WDAO/Dayton, has declared war on any recording artists who use suggestiveness in their lyrical content. "This has bothered me personally for a great number of years. An artist doesn't have to make mention of sex, drugs, or curse words to sell his product. I am the first person who likes to hear a good, clean funky tune, but when it comes to some of the lyrics I have been hearing lately I am outraged. With the things children and adults see on television and hear on other radio stations, it's about time someone steps forward and puts a stop to this garbage. I hope this sets a trend in the industry, and I hope other PD's and MD's, plus record industry executives, take a closer look at their playlists and the music they pro-



duce. I have asked all the artists I've worked with not to put anything of this negative nature in their music. In coming months I will be monitoring much closer the new product that comes into WDAO. I will not name any of the artists who I feel violate this principle because there are so many, but if it continues we just won't air that product. Let's use the gifts we were given by the creator and clean up the lyrics in today's music."

Mr. Logan said he's willing to answer questions or discuss the situation with anyone who contacts him at his Dayton office.

is religious-oriented; 6am-1pm is gospel. We show very good listenership when our gospel is on and we have very heavy advertising during that period of time. Most of our listeners during the gospel time period are adults, so naturally our advertisers want to reach the people who have jobs and money to spend on products."


#### White Listeners & All-Black Music

Do you folks have many white listeners? "Surprisingly enough, you wouldn't believe the amount of whites who come in to the station to pick up bumper stickers. We have a year-round 'Stick-Em-Up' campaign and I think these listeners can identify with us because they display the WLOU stickers just like our black listeners. We have a lot of whites who enjoy our station, our promotions, and our music. It's got to be true because we are one of the only Black stations in America that only plays black music - I know it's unusual but we never play any white artists." Not even Hall & Oates or something really big like that? "No, we don't, we stick strictly with black music because our owner & General Manager, Mr. Summers, has a basic philosophy that there's too few hours in the day, too few radio stations, and just too few avenues for blacks to be showcased. So when you've got a Black station, owned and operated by blacks, we should primarily deal with programming and gearing our efforts towards the black audience and artists."

#### **Drivetime Talk Show**

Is there anything special that WLOU does which breaks all formatic logic? "Let me tell you this, I can only stress that the attitude of this station from the owner on down is 'do for the community and don't expect anything in return.' We do that but the community has given us something - its loyalty on a consistent basis. We do a feature here called 'Comments' - it runs in the middle of drive time 4:45pm. It's a people-to-people program where we talk to listeners on the air live for 20-30 minutes. You would not believe how many people call in to participate. Most music stations wouldn't think of doing such a thing at that time of day - but it works for us. Some of the subjects we talk about are things that are timely and important to blacks and to the community in general. Not long ago we discussed sickle cell anemia, the detection of the disease, the treatment, etc. We spent four days discussing and trying to educate our listeners about this crippling disease. One of the things Mr. Summers has taught all of us here at WLOU is 'don't worry about what's happening in other markets, we know what's best for us in our market.' That stays with us all the time."

I've heard about WLOU's basketball team, so what's the inside scoop? "Well, we had 33 wins and 2 losses last year. We have a team of high schoolers, college players, semi-pros and some ex-professionals. I'm sure you know Louisville is a basketball town, and we play anyone who wants to challenge us. Last year we had tryouts for a city team of all-stars who played our station team prior to a Globetrotters game. 500 people showed up to try out for this team. It was really a tremendous promotion - this year we plan to play a few more games than last year. I'm the coach and I like to win so we go all out. By the way, we do have a few air personalities on the team."



Finally I asked Bill about the large military population at Ft. Knox. "They love us on the base, but we make it our business to let them (the military) know we appreciate their support. We go to the base and play the post basketball team, and we also realize some of these men/women are a long way from home, so we try to make them a part of the WLOU family."

The ethnic weighting was applied in the metro survey area to proportionately project the sample to represent the black population at 12.5% by Arbitron. In the latest ARB results, WLOU moved from a 6.3 share 12+ to an 8.0. That's right, they're a daytimer! As of this writing WLOU has received FCC approval to go 24 hours. Mr. Summers projects an October '82 start date, and additional tower construction will begin in April '82.

Grateful Dead's "Pigpen" Died

MONDAY, MARCH 8 --- Grateful Dead keyboardist, vocalist, and founding member Ron McKernan, affectionately known as "Pigpen," died of a stomach hemorrhage on March 8, 1973, at his home in Corte Madera, California. The spirited, soulful singer of one of rock's legendary groups lived life fast and loose; near the end, Ron smoked two packs a day, drank perhaps too heavily, and on occasion, experimented with LSD. Ron McKernan died at age 27.

#### **Bad Company's Debut**

That British rock band was formed during the latter part of 1973 by vocalist Paul Rodgers and drummer Simon Kirke, both former members of Free; guitarist Mick Ralphs from Mott the Hoople; and Boz Burrell from King Crimson. Both debut album and single topped U.S. charts the following year, making Bad Company one of the hottest British bands in America in 1974.

FRIDAY, MARCH 12 - Beatle Paul McCartney married freelance photographer Linda Eastman in a
