

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No Pity For "The City" As KKCY Drops Format

SALE TO GABBERT STILL PENDING

Disappointed by two and a half years of poor ratings for its KKCY/San Francisco, and frustrated at its inability to sell the stadiently, Olympic Broadcasting has pulled the outlet's quirky, eclectic AOR format which was known as "The City." It has been replaced by a prepackaged nostalgia format known as "Super Standards."

Reading from a prepared release, KKCY VP/GM Bruce Blevins said, "Olympic's business plan did not contemplate absorbing further losses from the station in 1988. Approval and closing of the pending sale has been delayed by the filing of objections at the FCC."

The release further stated "it would not be in the interests of Bay Area listeners or Olympic's shar holders to continue a format which is producing continuing losses and has never gained a competitive audience share or meaningful advertiser support. Since 1981, it has been the FCC's policy that changes in format may be made without notice to the FCC or requesting its approval."

After it was announced last summer that the station had been sold KKCY/See Page 35

UPI Swings Big Axe Bureau Shutdowns, Layoffs Nationwide The new year is off to a solemn really a thing of the past, and we start at financially-troubled United

Press International, where a wave of layoffs and bureau cutbacks have narrowed the scope of the wire service's news gathering.

According to the Wire Service Guild, the union that represents 850 UPI employees, 35 staffers were laid off on New Year's Eve. Between five and 15 additional employees were dismissed in the first four days of 1988, Guild officials said.

According to the union, UPI has closed one-man bureaus in Huntsville, AL; Morgantown, WV; Reno; Wichita; West Palm Beach; Sioux Falls, SD; Rockford, IL; Portland, ME; and Helena, MT. The Guild also said employees were dismissed from UPI bureaus in Washington; Baltimore; Atlanta; New Orleans; Kansas City; Dallas; Salt Lake City; Honolulu; Providence; Boise, ID; Concord, NH; Louisville, KY; and Omaha.

R&R learned Tuesday (1/5) that one of two employees in the Pierre, SD bureau was also laid off, leaving the bureau chief as UPI's only representative in South Dakota.

UPI spokesman Christopher Smith said late Tuesday that he was aware of 24 layoffs, and that the Guild's figures include individuals who had resigned as well as "non-news" personnel. Smith said UPI has not closed any bureaus but rather has cutback the number of days each week that some bureaus will be staffed. He did not rule out the possibility UPI will close some bureaus.

Smith said subscribers will continue to receive quality state reports and broadcast wire service, and encouraged subscribers to be patient. "Give us a little time to get the message out about where this company is going," he said. "The traditional wire service concept is are looking at some truly revolutionary things.' Smith said UPI would be ready

before the end of the month to make some announcements about the company's future.

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

FCC Issues Written Clarification Of Indecency

The FCC took new potshots at blue radio in a written "clarification" of its indecency policy that raised even more questions about what can be said on the air.

A firestorm of criticism was triggered last April when the FCC ruled that three separate broadcasts by KPFK/Los Angeles, KCSB/ Santa Barbara, and Infinity Broadcasting "shock jock" Howard Stern violated federal indecency standards. Many broadcasters immediately attacked the ruling as unfair and vague, and demanded detailed indecency guidelines.

The FCC unanimously approved a "clarification" of its policy during its November meeting, but the formal written order was not released until December 29.

Midnight Not So Safe, After All

The new order may raise more questions than it settles. For instance, in November FCC General Counsel Diane Killory assured broadcasters that indecent material could be safely aired between midnight and 6am. The new order, however, doesn't mention the 6am cutoff at all. It also makes it clear that the midnight rule is not definite — only that it is the Commission's "current intention" to establish midnight as a safe harbor.

In a separate statement, Commissioner Patricia Diaz Dennis criticized the failure to formally establish time periods as "neither decisive nor clear." She proposed that the FCC adopt 11pm – the end of TV prime time – as the appropriate safe harbor during weekdays, with a midnight slot on the weekends.

"The fact is the Commission has no scientific body of information that conclusively establishes one time as more appropriate than another as the critical hour after which to permit broadcast of indecent speech," Dennis said. "What is necessary is a notice of proposed rulemaking to establish a record. Even then, picking the right hour will be a judgment call."

Among key points from the order:

• The FCC will cite broadcasters only if they flunk a two-part test. The material aired must be both indecent and broadcast only when there is "a reasonable risk that children may be in the audience."

• It's okay to talk about sex on the air - just be careful how you talk about it. "Subject matter alone "If you take a look at some of the excerpts of what they have found to be indecent, it should give all broadcasters grave concern." —Mel Karmazin

• Complaints about indecent programs must include "a tape, transcript, or significant excerpts of programming," along with the time and date of broadcasts. Complaints should be quickly made, not withheld until license renewal time.

• Consideration of context is critical in all indecency cases, but any literary or artistic merit that controversial program material might otherwise have will not be considered in determining indecency.

News No Longer Exempt

Despite a statement last April by former Mass Media Bureau chief Jim McKinney that news programming would be exempt from the indecency policy, the Commission has now declined to provide assurances of a blanket exemption on the grounds that the issue was not presented by the three cases under review.

Stern Indecent, Commission Says

The morning broadcasts of Howard Stern received special attention in the FCC order. In an amplification of its April indecency ruling, the FCC agreed that much of Stern's show involves the use of innuendo and double entendre, but it determined that "the sexual import of certain references in the material was inescapable." The Commission said the Stern material it reviewed "consisted of vulgar and lewd references to the male genitals and to masturbation and sodomy" and explicit references to sexual organs and activities.

"In short, it was not merely sexual innuendo or double entendre, despite Infinity's assertions to the contrary," the FCC said. "Additionally, the fact that the programs under examination did not contain merely an occasional off-color reference or expletive, but instead dwelt on sexual and excretory matters in a pandering and titillating fashion, indicated that children

"Nothing's changed," said Infinity Broadcasting President Mel Karmazin. "If you take a look at some of the excerpts of what they have found to be indecent, it should give all broadcasters grave concern. The Commission has made their statement, and now it will be up to the courts, I assume, to decide what's free speech."

Karmazin contended that some of Stern's allegedly indecent material included comments about news events. Stern's agent, Don Buchwald, told R&R the controversial air talent would have no comment on the latest FCC action.

Pacifica May Drop Case Washington communiciations attorney William Byrnes, who has spearheaded the Pacifica Foundation's legal challenge of the FCC action, said the nonprofit broadcaster is considering dropping its legal challenge of the indecency policy before the US Court of Appeals.

"There are some things in the FCC decision that are pretty helpful to Pacifica," Byrnes said. "They make it clear that no sanction was taken and the matter would not be revisited at renewal time . . . From what the Commission's decision seems to say, there will be no repercussion from the past broadcast, so the thing may be kind of close to being moot."

NAB officials declined comment on the FCC's order until lawyers could complete their review of it later this week.

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

At WGRD/Grand Rapids, Sales Manager AL BOBER attributes over a quarter of a million dollars in revenue generated as a direct result of the GIANT BOOM BOX.





NEW YEAR PREDICTIONS

Sales Managers, Brokers Offer Optimistic Outlook

Despite the financial turmoil, sluggish retail performance, and whispers of recession that marked the last quarter of 1987, most radio executives seem optimistic about the sales outlook for 1988. Brokers, meanwhile, are predicting a busy year marked by tax-driven and distress sales. Station sales managers contacted by R&R indicated they expect 1988 sales revenues to be anywhere from three to ten percent above 1987 levels, with local sales responsible for most of the increases.

"It's so hard to say what is going to happen with national sales that we are focusing on local sales, where we have some control over what happens," said WMJJ/Birmingham GSM Diane Kruthaupt.

Laurie Weisert, GM at KHYT-AM & FM/Tucson, said she expects to see a six to ten percent increase in Tucson radio revenues despite her belief national revenues will at best hold even. Sales managers in markets as diverse as Orlando, Little Rock, New Orleans, and Pittsburgh made similar predictions.

Kruthaupt and others believe the quality and aggressiveness of each station's sales staff will be critical to the station's performance in the coming year.

In order to counter whatever impact negative economic reports have had on local advertisers, sales managers are telling their reps to accentuate the positive by emphasizing the fact that, despite the dire predictions that circulated in the wake of Wall Street's October plummet, the economy seems to be holding up. "We're not having any of this gloom and doom in Birmingham" said Kruthaupt.

But other sales executives said their local advertisers seem totally unconcerned with Wall Street's gyrations and the intricacies of international finance. "Despite the trade deficit and all this funny international monetary stuff, all a retailer down the street cares about is what he can do to get people in his store," said WQXI-FM/Atlanta GSM Mark Kanov. "And one thing they can do is use radio."

Commerce Predicts Big Radio Gain

The US Department of Commerce apparently believes many advertisers will turn to radio in 1988. In its annual US Industrial Outlook report the Commerce Department predicted that radio revenues "may increase by ... 13%, to a total of \$8.4 billion" in 1988. Among the factors Commerce an-

alysts believe will contribute to such growth are rate hikes, increased competition in the automobile and airline industries, improved economic conditions, the high cost of television advertising, and more aggressive marketing by radio stations.

Radio executives are also looking to two major events, the Olympics and the elections, to perk up 1988 sales. Those happenings, according to sales people, traditionally put the public — including advertisers — in a positive mood. The events also tend to dry up television avails, moving some of those newly-inspired advertisers into radio.

In New Orleans, they didn't have to wait for the new year to get a psychological boost. The success of the city's Saints football team, which made the NFL playoffs for the first time in its history, has boosted public morale and retail sales, according to WEZB/New Orleans GM Marc Leunissen. "I'm excited about next year," he commented. "I even feel good about the first quarter."

Brokers Going Steady

Brokers contacted by R&R indicated they expect a steady, if not record-breaking, number of station sales to take place in 1988. Those predictions are based in large part on the fact that the federal tax code's General Utilities provision, abolished for larger companies at the end of 1986, is applicable until the end of 1988 to firms with assets of \$10 million or less. "People who had planned to sell in 1989 have to come up with a pretty good reason not to sell in 1988," said Blackburn & Co. VP Richard Blackburn.

Another facet of tax law, the drop in the personal tax rate that took effect January 1, 1988, will add considerably to transaction volume in the first part of 1988 as deals that were written late in 1987 are closed in the new year to take advantage of the lower rates.

Unfortunately, brokers also expect a number of stations that were sold in recent years to be placed back on the market because owners are unable to meet their debt service. Properties most likely to meet this fate are those that were sold at premium prices in recent years to buyers who were overly optimistic in their revenue projections.

Todd Hepburn of the Ted Hepburn Co. brokerage firm expects to see "quite a few" stations that sold for between \$10 million and \$20 million return to the market in 1988.

While they don't expect an overall drop in the sale prices of stations, brokers and analysts said top end prices will come down in 1988, largely because of the difficulty of financing the jumbo-sized deals. "It's a different world out there, as October 19 showed us," said Bishop Cheen, an analyst with Paul Kagan & Associates. "Lenders are more conservative now, and buyers have to bring more equity to the table. Mezzanine money will also cost more. Some deals that require multilayered financing won't get done because some layer won't come through."

As a result of the conservatism lenders are demonstrating with radio deals, many experts look for seller paper to make a big comeback in the coming year. Gary Stevens of Wertheim Schroder & Co. said that while it may be difficult for sellers to accept the idea of taking back paper, such a step may become increasingly necessary in order for sellers to facilitate deals at the price levels they want.

"It's a psychological river for sellers to cross," said Stevens. "But it's all in the hands of the seller. There is no such thing as a radio station that can't be sold."

Florida Network Sold To DC Investor

Susquehanna Broadcasting Co. has announced the sale of the Florida Network, an Orlando-based state radio network, to the Profit Group Inc.

The terms of the transaction have not been disclosed, and officials of Susquehanna declined to release revenue figures for the network.

Profit, a broadcast investment group based in the Washington, DC area, is headed by James McCotter and Rogers Kirven. They own Big Band WITH/Baltimore and have filed with the FCC for permission to purchase News/Talk WNTR/Washington.

Profit officials hope to expand the Florida Network from 60 to 100 affiliates within a year and increase its programming lineup. McCotter and Kirven earlier this year announced plans for the creation of **Statesman Broadcast Network**, a satellite-delivered News/Talk programming service, but the venture never got off the ground.

Sage Jumping Into TV

Sage Broadcasting Corp. officials say the radio-only company is now diversifying into television. Sage Chairman Leonard Fassler and President Gerald Poch have announced the \$4 million purchase of KDUB-TV/Dubuque, IA, an ABC affiliate on Channel 40. The deal was wrapped up with the help of veteran Washington broadcast broker Barry Sherman.

In less than three years Sage has acquired 17 radio stations --- 9 AM and 8 FM --- in nine markets. The company successfully completed a self-under-

Ansbacher Taps Daugherty In Radio Drive

New York investment banking house Henry Ansbacher Inc. has appointed Gregory Daugherty as VP/Radio & TV as part of a wideranging shakeup of its communications dealmaking.

Daugherty told R&R his assignment is to develop more exposure in financing broadcasting mergers and acquisitions for Ansbacher, and to spearhead a drive to put the company into big-time radio brokerage. The firm will concentrate on major-market dealmaking, with primary emphasis on combos and stand-alone FM properties.

A seven-year veteran of Satellite Music Network, Daugherty's most recent assignment was as VP/Major Market Affiliates and Director of SMN's Wave Network.

"With Ansbacher's longstanding expertise in the publishing industry, it's a natural progression to expand more deeply into broadcasting," Daugherty said. "Ansbacher can offer broadcasters a broader range of financial services and more in-depth exposure in selling properties."

CBN Says Financial Woes Won't Affect Radio

Officials of the Christian Broadcast Network said the group's ongoing financial crisis will not affect the recently-formed CBN Radio network.

On November 16 CBN implemented a second round of layoffs that cost 145 employees their jobs at the religious broadcaster's Virginia Beach, VA headquarters. The first cuts, made last June about the time CBN radio was unveiled, resulted in the release of 500 workers. CBN's money crisis was brought on by declining contributions from viewers.

Because the radio network was created during this period of financial austerity at CBN, it was designed to operate on a near-shoestring budget, according to CBN spokesman **Benton Miller.**

"There were not significant amounts of money involved in setting up the radio network, " said Miller. "We hired one person and used our existing technology. We just realized we were going to have to do more with less and be more innovative and creative. Our existing personnel will be working twice as hard."

Miller said 81 stations, including seven major market properties, currently carry some CBN Radio programming. Among the network's offerings are a wall-to-wall Christian music format, a radio version of CBN television's "700 Club," and a news program called "CBN News Today."

a focused approach," said Ansbacher Managing Director Matti Prima. "The addition of a man with Greg's experience in the industry will change that. He will have tremendous resources at his disposal. We cover every state, including small, underpopulated states. That provides a great deal of access to market information. We have people here who understand the financing."

Prima said Ansbacher intends to double its investment banking manpower on communications dealmaking, and will have a staff of at least 15 pursuing both broadcast and print transactions. He predicted the firm will accomplish 12 to 14 deals with a value of \$75 to \$100 million in the upcoming year.

The creation of a \$60-\$75 million communications venture pool is also under consideration as part of a possible diversification into communications merchant banking. Prima said Ansbacher attorneys are now reviewing FCC alien ownership restrictions to determine how the firm may directly participate in equity ownership of radio stations. Because it is a British firm with headquarters in London, Ansbacher would be limited to a maximum of 20% ownership in any particular deal under current federal law.

Beating The First Quarter Revenue Blues

uestion: I would appreciate any advice you could give me regarding January and, for that matter, first quarter revenues. My station's January billing is lagging behind last year's for the period, so much so that I'm only at 40% of my total budget. Is this happening nationally, or is it just my situation?

nswer: Rest assured that you're not alone. The same scenario is being played out nationally, even at major advertising agencies.

Unless your sales staff is working hard at generating new business and alternative revenues, you'll find the entire year is going to be tough.

The stations that are holding strong positions going into '88 have upwards of 20 to 40% of their revenues coming from new business, specifically manufacturer, business-to-business, and new retail accounts.

This is not the year to be waiting for agencies to place budgets - a number of agencies aren't even sure where their billings will be coming from.

There are only a couple of markets where traditional

NEW SELLING IDEA

Station Mailing Lists

One frequently overlooked "value added" idea is to develop a station mailing list you can provide to station advertisers for their own mailers. You'll find that such mailing lists are not only extremely attractive to retail, but also easily accomplished. You should only authorize

each advertiser to use this list once. (This can be monitored by adding the names of five or six station staffers to the list.)

Many advertisers pay enormous amounts of money for direct mail lists, and these lists are major profit centers for many companies. This first quarter of '88 might be a good time to make such lists a profit center for your station.

Swap meets, which were once nothing more than junk meets, have grown to the point where they've become a valid retail category unto themselves.

Not only do these swap meets — or flea markets, as they're known in some areas — now feature many mainline retail products, they've also become a viable retail aiternative for those smail business owners who can't fund a mall location, but *can* afford a spot at the swap meet.

This year, swap meet attendance and advertising are both expected to experience growth levels far above the national average.

on. Find out what types of accounts they're prospecting. Do you have a specific, targeted, organized, prospecting plan, or is your process for generating new leads half-planned and sporadic?

How much real time is being devoted to telephoning new leads for appointments? What problems and objections do your staffers encounter on the phones?

Help your staff out. Go to the library and find out what accounts were active in your market during the latter part of January and in February last year. Get out from behind your desk and go with your staff when they make calls on new clients.

And when you do, remember that you're going *with* your staff, not *for* them. Watch what happens, then ask your salespeople to analyze these calls themselves. Ask for and give suggestions. Now is the time for you to be a leader,

not a manager.

If you have a retail department and an agency department, consider abolishing them and making the pursuit of new business mandatory for everyone. There are only a few successful retail departments anyway. Most of them are a joke. Besides, your senior people have the ability to write more new business

than the new, largely-inexperienced people who make up most retail departments.

In conclusion, you'll find that the amount of new business your station or agency is generating is directly related to the amount of time actively spent developing it.

Now might be a good time to look at the simple form reproduced at the upper right. The next time you have a sales meeting, ask your staff to bring in their day-timers and fill out one of these forms for each of the last three weeks. You can't write new business if only a few new business contacts have been made. Use this form strictly as an exercise, then throw it away. Don't waste time on paperwork that could be better spent on drumming up new business.

Helping Workers Work Together Better

B oth executives and managers know that the most important element in a corporation's success is not always the amount of work accomplished, nor the quality of the work.

Very often the relationships between fellow employees, and between workers and their managers, determine the success of a company.

According to an article published in a recent issue of the NYC-based Marketing For Sales Executives newsletter, the following four management tips have been found to be useful in improving office working relationships:

 Assign new employees to work groups. This helps new workers feel like they are part of the team. It's also a good way to introduce a new employee to his specific job duties.

 Match the right people for the job. When assigning workers to a special project, try to group people who are already friendly with each other, rather than pairing people who don't get along. You'll get greater productivity as a result.

 Rotate job assignments. Employees should occasionally be reassigned to different groups. This not only makes workers more loyal to the company in general, but also prevents employees from forming disruptive cliques.

 Recognize which workers need special attention. Identifying the loners in the employee pool is half the battle. Encourage those shrinking violets who have good skills and good ideas to contribute both, so they are more likely to feel part of the work group.

Two Rules For Writing More Effective Ad Copy

hen it comes to creating advertising copy for your product, is it more important to stress the consumer benefits or the product's advantages?

According to Bob Stone, author of "Successful Direct Marketing Methods" (Crain Books), you should stress the product's consumer benefits only if the item is either unique or unfamiliar to the general customer.

However, if demand is high for a product type and you have a new, improved model in a competitive field, then your ad copy should stress the advantages of using your product.

A perfect example of each situation can be found in the compact disc market. When CD players were first introduced, companies simply stressed that this was a new development in audio technology from which the consumer would benefit.

Now that the CD market is established, however, advertisers are touting such advantages of buying a specific model as carousel-like disc changers.

Chain Stores Winning Retail Clothing Wars

here's a war going on between two heavyweights of the retail clothing world, and consumers' shopping dollars are the stakes.

The battle is between the traditional department stores and the numerous specialty and apparel chain stores sprawling across suburbia's shopping malls.

So far, the chain stores appear to be winning the battle. Sales trends show consumers are spending more of their dollars in specialty

outlets, rather than in the all-purpose department stores.

From 1982 to 1985, sales figures for apparel chain stores rose by 10.7% each year, outdistancing department store sales by a staggering 66%, according to Kurt Barnard, publisher of Barnard's Retail Marketing Report. Overall, the apparel chain indus-

try reached sales of \$30 billion in 1986, and industry analysts predict sales will go over the \$50 billion mark by the early 1990s.

New Anti-Depression Drug Approved

he US Food And Drug Administration (FDA) recently granted final approval to the Eli Lilly & Co. that will allow the firm to begin selling a new antidepressant drug called "Prozac."

This new, prescription-only drug is different from other anti-depression medications in its ability to counteract serotonin, a chemical produced by the body which has been linked to depression. Thus far, other anti-depression drugs have not proved effective in isolating and blocking serotonin.

Lilly also has plans to submit ad-

ditional research information to the FDA regarding Prozac's use in treating other disorders such as obesity, alcoholism, smoking, and bulimia. At present, Lilly has received FDA approval to use Prozac exclusively for treatment of depression.

Industry analysts have estimated the new drug could conceivably generate between \$35 million and \$70 million in sales. However, if the FDA eventually approves the drug for use in treatment of other medical disorders, sales figures could soar dramatically.

Car Detailing: A \$200 Million Market

any Americans pay better attention to their cars than to their spouses. So it's no surprise that the latest trend in automotive care allows indulgent owners to pamper and spoil their favorite sedan or coupe.

Detailing - bathing, buffing, and waxing a car by hand — is now a \$200 million per year business, according to a study conducted by the consultancy firm of McKinsey & Co. Research indicates continued industry growth, with total market sales estimated to reach \$2.5 billion sometime during the 1990s.

The cost of a detailing session varies greatly, with some outlets charging up to \$165 each time they give a customer's car the onceover. Dallas, Denver, Los Angeles, and Atlanta are the markets where the service has proven to be most popular.



Right now, the market is dominated by small independent operators, numbering 7000 nationwide. However, current trends point to franchising as the detailing wave of the future.

Making Home Renovation Pay

ore people are remodeling their homes than

ever, and this trend extends to almost every region of the US. The Census Bureau recently estimated that \$91.3 billion was spent on home improvement in 1986, nearly 14% more than was spent in 1985 and a whopping 85% increase over 1983's figures.

Most Valuable Improvements

Nevertheless, if you are planning to fix up a home for resale purposes, real estate agents say the most important features are landscaping, ample closet space, modern bathrooms, state-of-the-art kitchens, and neutral colors in paint and wallpaper.

A second bathroom can be one of the more cost-effective renovations. A study by Remodeling Contractor estimates that this can add



an average \$10,000 to a home's resale value. 22% more than the second bathroom's original average cost of \$8200.

achieved by adding a fireplace, which can raise resale value by \$4600, 38% more than its original average cost of \$3350. Other good bets include kitchen cabinetry, skylights, additional closet space, and building onto a kitchen.

Least Valuable **Improvements**

From a resale standpoint, it's probably a bad idea to invest in the following: refurbishing a basement, reroofing, and - in all but the warmest climates - adding a tennis court or swimming pool.

Although new doors and windows account for the most dollars spent in renovation - an estimated \$10 billion for this year alone - such improvements don't always raise the resale value, nor do they reduce the anticipated energy costs. Same goes for aluminum siding

Meanwhile, such extra security measures as steel shutters and dual-lock windows can thwart buyers as well as burglars, as many people feel these kinds of improvements send out a signal that the house is not located in a safe neighborhood.





High-Definition TV On Horizon

igh-definition television -HDTV - could be the most important innovation to hit the television industry since color TV came into vogue during the '60s

HDTV has been described as being to today's TV what compact discs are to phonograph records: sharper and better defined.

To begin with, the HDTV picture is two-thirds wider than it is tall, making such nifty developments as end zone-to-end zone football coverage and wide screen movies possible. Plus, because an HDTV pic-

ture remains sharp no matter how large it becomes, it could open the door to cinema-sized screens in your living room.

The process behind HDTV is simple. While current TV images are made up of 525 horizontal lines and thousands of dots within each line, HDTV more than doubles the number of lines and dots present on the screen.

Even so, HDTV sets aren't expected to be on the market until at least 1991 at a projected retail price of between \$3000-4000.



A Musical Wing

nother development in the continuing evolution of new "designer" music technology is the Wing, shown being played in the adjacent photo by its inventor, Marilyn Donadt of Los Angeles.

A four-feet-long, stainless steel sheet with steel rods sticking out of it, the Wing takes its name from the insturment's rather obvious physical resemblance to the wing of an airplane.

This sheet balances on a balloon that sits in a bucket of water. To produce music, the rods can be bowed, the wing can be rubbed - or both can be struck simultaneously or individually with mallets. Sounds about right.





Willie B. Cleared On Second Set Of Sex Charges

ormer **B104/BALTIMORE** Assistant PD/afternoon personality **WILLIE B.** (aka **ROBERT NAFTEL**) has just been cleared by the Baltimore County Grand Jury of all charges pertaining to a second set of allegations that he'd had sex with a minor (**R&R**, 12/18). He's still under indictment for the first charges.

Naftel will still stand trial in April on second and fourth degree charges of allegedly having had sex with a minor, having waived his rights to a preliminary hearing as well as a pleabargain in the matter.

"I'm so overwhelmed by the general support from the industry," he told **R&R.** "It has really touched me and my family. I would hope this first dismissal will pave the way for a complete dismissal when we go to court in April."

Greenberg said he expects to take advantage of the strong rock and R&B talent sources on the West Coast, and connect with some of the new, independent labels. "But I don't want to categorize Atco with a particular type of music," he explained. "Our artists will define us. If we load up with [acts like] LL Cool J and the Beastie Boys, that's one kind of identity. If we come out with three Whitesnakes, that's another. We'll be looking for new acts, but we'll compete for the big ones, too."

The Atco roster has approximately six acts at present, Greenberg noted, including Yes, Pete Townshend, and (via the Modern label) Stevie Nicks. "We're not going to sign artists for the sake of signing. There's no quota; it could be one artist - or 21."

Greenberg has been with Atlantic Records for most of the past 20 years, first as assistant to Jerry Wexler. He subsequently held posts in product management, promotion, and operations, then served as President from 1974-80. He ran his own Mirage label from 1980-85.

Greenberg said the idea for Atco's new profile came from Atlantic Chairman Ahmet Ertegun, Vice Chairman Sheldon Vogel, and President Doug Morris - "and then they called to ask me to consider the post.'

One particular plus, Greenberg stressed, is that "this is not a situation where I'm coming in as an outsider, where I have to get to know everyone. Considering that Mirage was distributed by Atlantic, I really only left the company in 1985. This is like a family situation." To that degree, he said it's not even yet been established to whom he will report.

Commenting on the appointment, Ertegun said Greenberg has demonstrated "the rare ability to be equally at home in the creative sphere and in the business arena." He added, "I am proud to count Jerry as a longtime friend and, once again, as a valued associate.'

to Pacific FM, principally owned by Jim Gabbert, various public interest groups filed objections with the FCC attempting to block the sale because of fears that KKCY's unconventional format would be purged. Although the application was filed more than five months ago, the FCC has not indicated when it will complete its review.

Blevins said the decision to switch to the MOR/Big Band format was made "at Olympic head-quarters in Seattle," and he would not speculate why that format was chosen. Blevins plans to stay with the station until the ownership change. Neither Olympic President Ivan Braiker nor Gabbert commented on the format switch or the sale

All the station's air personalities have been let go, and former PD Kate Hayes has been transferred to an unspecified position with the company's newly-acquired KLTY/ Kansas City.

In 1985, the originators of "The City" promised that the station would operate in the spirit of former legendary free-form stations KSAN and KMPX/San Francisco. Targeted at the 28-42-year-old, KKCY essentially operated without a playlist or hot clock. The station provided its personalities with a 5000-track library. Under that format, the station never rose above a 1.5 share in the Arbitron total-week 12 + figures

Immediately after the switch, crosstown AOR KFOG placed commercials on KKCY inviting listeners to switch over. The station also hosted the former KKCY personalities so they could say goodbye to their listeners.

CHR Puts The Pop Back In The Music Mix

The fourth annual On The Records "Sound of CHR" survey shows a dramatic increase for pop-sounding records among 1987's Top 15 hits. While dance/funk is down a tad and rock up a bit, the big drop came in ballads.


In the highly personalized methodology of this survey – I assign each Top 15 CHR hit to one of four categories, strictly according to personal perception – pop ends up as a kind of catch-all for anything that isn't clearly dance-oriented, rockish, or ballad tempo. It's generally up or midtempo songs without either the pronounced dance beat or hard-rock edge. "Faith" by George Michael would fall into the pop class; so would George Harrison.

But if pop consisted solely of guys named George, it wouldn't have risen from 20.7% of the Top 15 hits in 1986 to almost a third (32.7%) this past year. It's a poser. Here's four years' worth of breakdowns:

It's possible that the poppier types of dance styles have become so ingrained that we (or I) have shifted our standards imperceptibly so we hear them as pop in 1987, when they might have been considered dance in 1985. Which still doesn't explain the big ballad dropoff of 1987. Did CHR sound so bright and uptempo to you all out there this year?

Rock keeps creeping up, which was noticeable, and the spread between the three uptempo categories was pretty balanced. A general uptempo trend seems to be the pattern emerging most clearly, especially when you compare the 1987 breakdown with a look back at 1980 I did two years ago.





Rock Replaces Ballads

In 1980, pop accounted for 40.2% of the Top 15 CHR records, considerably higher even than today. Dance/funk took up 25.5%, a bit lower than today. The big changes come in rock, which has climbed from 9.0% to 25.5%, and ballads, which have declined from 25.4% to 13.7%.

Rock, which was avoided in the soft-edged era of 1980, before CHR's renaissance, has almost tripled in seven years. Ballads, on the other hand, have fallen almost in half, and there's probably a pretty direct relationship. General pop stylings are coming up again, but have a long way to go to match their 1980 dominance. And dance records may just be resuming a more natural CHR level, receding from a surprising 1984-85 peak. (On the other hand, the dance-oriented P1-A's, with dance percentages of 80% or more at times, are doing just fine.)

Balance, at any rate, appears to be CHR's key these days, veering from one style to another depending on market factors. I'll be fascinated to see what happens next year.



A GALLERY OF CARRACKATURES The Many Phases Of Paul Carrack

For a relatively new hitmaker, **Paul Carrack** has sure been around. The accompanying photo gallery provides a firsthand look at the various phases (and faces) this roving character has gone through.

At top left we see him as a member of **Warm Dust**, with whom he made at least three early-'70s albums, in the prevailing heavy conceptual progressive vein. In 1974 he co-founded **Ace**, writing and singing their only US hit, "How Long." After three albums with them, he went solo, covering the **Temptations'** "Beauty Is Only Skin Deep" on a UK-only **Chrysalls LP**.

When Jools Holland left Squeeze, Carrack became the group's new keyboardist (top right). One of his rare vocal performances with the band, "Tempted," was their biggest American hit until "Hourglass." The solo life beckoned again, and he signed to Epic, hitting the US Top 20 in late '82 with "I Need You."

He was next spotted with **Mike & The Mechanics** (bottom right), participating in that quite successful loose assemblage of talents. And now he's come almost full circle (bottom left) by returning to Chrysalis for his third solo LP, from which the hit "Don't Shed A Tear" is currently chart-climbing.

Black Crossovers In '87: Up & Down

Are black artists finding greater acceptance at contemporary pop music formats? 1987's evidence says yes and no.

It depends on the format you're looking at. Black crossovers in CHR are down a bit; after three straight years with about 25% of the Top 15 hits tallied by black artists, 1987's figure was 22.9%. It's not an alarming drop – and comes nowhere near the 1982 low of 9.7% – but it's worth watching to see if it becomes a downward trend.


AC showed an increase, hitting the 30% mark for only the second time in the last ten years. This year's 30.4% is a bit off 1985's alltime high of 31.6%, improving by about the same margin over 1986's 29.0 figure and continuing a general upward trend in black artist acceptance that began in 1982. Following are the ten-year trends in black artists' percentage of CHR and AC Top 15 hits:

Restless Heart Alone In AC As far as crossovers from Country went, it was a great year for **Restless Heart**. The group broke a lengthy Country drought by hitting the CHR Top 40, but didn't make it to Top 15, so the Country crossover percentage in CHR remains at zero for the fourth straight year.

But Restless Heart scored two Top 15 hits (#3 & 10) in AC. Unfortunately for Country as a whole, no one else hit Top 15 AC at all, creating the format's sixth straight percentage drop since it accounted for over 15% of the hits in 1981. Two Restless Heart hits gives Country a 1.8%, down from last year's 3.0, and the lowest AC representation yet. With the way Country is toughening up, maybe there's a better future in crossing to AOR.





Lovett: Creating A Buzz

L's not uncommon for labels to push established AOR artists to CHR programmers. What is unusual is the push by a label – in this case MCA/Curb – to promote a Country artist to AOR, Jazz, and R&B stations.

'87 Wrapup, Part One

The December **RIAA** stats are in, and so are the year-end totals for 1987. The platinum totals for '87 were considerably smaller than the 1986 figures; there were 204 albums certified platinum in '86, compared to just 79 last year. Multi-platinum stats also dropped, from 108 in '86 to 71 in '87.

The large number of platinum and multi-platinum certifications registered in 1986 were due in part to a change in RIAA rules. That rule allowed labels to submit for certification albums from their catalog that were released prior to 1976, the first year platinum albums were awarded.

Although Lyle Lovett is regarded as a country artist, MCA is sending cassette packages of his new "Pontiac" album to a variety of formats. "Lyle is not too provincial," said MCA Director/Marketing Walt Wilson. "He's not restricted to just a country format or listeners of country music." Wilson believes Lovett's music

wilson believes Lovett's music has the potential to hit a wider audience because of its "eclectic range of styles, which includes elements of country, jazz, and blues."

MCA began the promotional campaign by sending out 12-inch copies of "Give Back My Heart," Lovett's first single from "Pontiac." The single came with a blank sleeve which did not identify Lovett as the artist. The only printing on the cover was the slogan "Everybody's talking about ..." and a phone number for curious programmers who wanted to know the name of the artist.

The second phase of the promotion included the mailing of the cassettes, packaged in a special hardcover case and featuring the album's original cover art. According to Wilson, the intense promotion to programmers – he refers to it as "mass spoonfeeding" – seems to have paid off, as the label has already received positive feedback from programmers of non-Country formats.

"We're relying equally on industry buzz, listener response, and programmers response," Wilson said. "We're getting calls from programmers who say, 'We must react to this guy,' because of the response they are getting from listeners."

Part of the industry buzz is being generated by other artists who are longtime Lovett fans. Among the audience at Lovett's 1987 Los Angeles shows were Elton John, Bruce Hornsby, and Don Henley.

The Big Four-O

A tlantic Records hits 40 this year, and rumors of anniversary concerts with some of the company's biggest artists are already circulating.

To mark its 39th year in business, incidentally, Atlantic assembled a handy "year-in-review" CD. Music by Foreigner, Debbie Gibson, Yes, Genesis, INXS, and Laura Branigan, among others, was featured. So, too, was label vet Ben E. King, with "Stand By Me," of course.

It was a limited edition of 1000 copies, and SRO all the way.

MCA has also included a list of testimonials in the promotional cassette package. Huey Lewis, Steve Winwood, Rosanne Cash, Steve Earle, Emmylou Harris, and Stewart Copeland are just some of the performers who provided favorable reviews of Lovett.

The next single and video from the album will be "She's No Lady," which will also go to all formats. The song showcases a sound that will be the core of Lovett's upcoming "88 Big Band Tour," in which he will be taking an 11-piece band out on the road.

Wilson said the promo cassette package was presented to a half dozen corporations for possible sponsorship of the upcoming tour, with **Pioneer Electronics** eventually winning the bidding war and the sponsorship rights.

LIKE PANGAEA MCA Will Distribute Sting's New Label

L's official: Sting's new record label, Pangaea, will be distributed in the US by MCA. Partners in the venture are Miles Copeland and IRS, plus former CBS exec Christine Reed.

No word yet on artists signed, but Reed's background offers a hint: at CBS Masterworks, she was involved with the careers of Wynton & Branford Marsalis, Philip Glass, and Andreas Vollenweider. Reed is the new label's President.

Pangaea is the name given the land mass from which the continents were formed, as well as the title of a Miles Davis album.

Currently there are no plans for Sting to release his own albums on the new label, and he will continue to record for A&M.

This New Year, I have another story for you, and I'd again like to stress that this has no message or moral for air personalities or programmers. It's just a simple story. A story about Chilly Bob's Frozen Yogurt Place.

"Ollie Be Good" — The **Real Story**

Paul Harris, WCXR/ Washington's morning jock, writes to correct an error that appeared in a recent column:


"Someone asked you a question about the song, 'Go Ollie Go' by the Greaseman. The problem is that's not the name of the song, and the Greaseman had nothing to do with it.

"At the height of the Contra hearings, a group of my listeners wrote and performed a song called 'Ollie Be Good.' They brought it to me, and I played it on the air. After a few days, I got calls from AP, UPI, and all the networks wanting a copy of it. I gave it to them, and that's where the confusion started.

"The song was written and performed by the group Flfth Amendment, whose leader is Sean Trachtman. My friends at ABC Radio fed it to their affiliates via satellite, telling them it was done by the Greaseman, whose real name is Doug Tracht. Then AP sent the story out with the same misinformation, and it snowballed from there.

"I bring this up only because I want Sean and his group to get credit where it's due. Since then, they have given me several other songs, including 'Sympathy The Preacher' (about the Bakkers) and 'Silkworms On The Shoreline.

"They're a very talented bunch. Their topical parodies are rockbased (as opposed to a lot of the CHR-type comedy available). If any of your readers would like to get copies of any of their tunes, they can contact Sean or his wife Eva at (703) 764-2856."



From Radio To Yogurt

There's a disc jockey in my hometown who one day decided to leave radio to open a frozen yogurt stand. "I'll run the place just like I run my radio show," he said, "and I'll be a big success."

This was about three years ago, just as the big frozen yogurt boom was beginning. Chilly Bob's stand was the first in his neighborhood, and it was an immediate success.

Two years later, Chilly Bob's was even more successful, but a dark cloud appeared on the horizon. The Happyvale Dairy Frozen Yogurt Stand opened just a few blocks away, and suddenly Chilly Bob was chilled by the idea of losing his customers to these sleazy clowns at Happyvale. (Of course, he had never met them, but it was safe to assume they were sleazy clowns.)

So Chilly Bob decided to do some research to discover ways to keep his stand the number one frozen yogurt stand in the neighborhood. At the time, Chilly Bob's offered six different flavors. The flavor ordered more than any other was chocolate, closely followed by vanilla and then amaretto. The other three flavors — boysenberry, co conut, and strawberry - also were quite popular, but less so than the Big Three.

Bob decided to go directly to his customers to find out what they didn't like. He asked them: "Of these six flavors, which is your least favorite?" I've been on the receiving end of these kinds of letters myself, and they're usually somewhat discouraging regardless of their tone. However, I hope this one is taken in the spirit in which it's intended -- prompt, honest, and courteous.

The Half-A-Secretary Blowout

One holiday incident passed along by a Californiabased consultant is so heartwarming and fuzzy that the more sentimental among you may quietly shed tears of appreciation — while case-hardened cynics will gag and rush off to a restroom to be sick.

Station X has been around for several years, consistently struggling toward ratings/revenue goals by taking three steps forward, two steps back. No one expected a lavish holiday party, or even a halflavish one. The budget has always been tight.

When Station X announced that its holiday gathering would be in the High Dollars Room of the Downtown Showplace Hotel, hey hey! Nice surprise. And the anticipation was juiced up even more when employees were asked to submit the names of their spouses or dates. Could that mean the spouses were going to be getting something?

At the holiday party everything was done first class, from the exciting door prizes to the distribution of very nice individual gifts to every date and spouse. Morale zoomed through the roof with the handing out of bonuses. Not tradeout turkeys or Jiffy-Lube coupons, but real American cash money.

Now the heartwarming part. One employee, considerate of her station's constant attention to finances, with the bonus money clutched in her hand, approached her GM and said with sincerity, "Can we really afford this?" From her tone and look, the GM felt she was truly willing to give the bonus back, for the larger good of the station. It was a moment to be remembered. Tears almost came to my eyes when I was told about it.

The GM then revealed the official station attitude toward parties and bonuses by telling the Little Match Girl, er, the Faithful Employee, that showing appreciation for the workers had been built into the budget all year. Paraphrasing it, the GM said the holiday largesse had cost six or seven thousand dollars, which had been budgeted at about 125 dollars a week all year, which in cost was equal to about half a secretary.

What a positive attitude! My reporter says the employees of Station X expected little and were surprised to get a lot. Management's motivation for spending was based on exactly the same dynamic — because through the year the employees, who could have done their eight hours and gone home, had all given extra time and effort.

The team spirit had worked both ways. The station people may not always remember the exact amount the GM clawed out of the budget for the fancy party and cash bonuses, but they will never forget management's generous show of consideration for them as individuals, and the GM's belief that loyalty is a two-way street.

Denver's "Boy Wonder"

Meet Andy Schuon, AOR's Youngest P1 PD

If Trip Reeb's recent move to XETRA-FM (91X)/San Diego caught some people by surprise, imagine the reaction when his KAZY/Denver replacement was announced. In Reeb, KAZY had a seasoned pro with years of multimarket PD experience under his belt. The station's new leader is a 23-year-old, first-time PD who's spent the bulk of his career as a production director and is an eightmonth station vet. When Reeb was beginning his programming career, his future protege was still in junior high.

Meet Andy Schuon.

R&R: Your appointment certainly opened up some eyes in the industry. Were you surprised how quickly KAZY handed you the job?

AS: I didn't have a clue. (GM) Bill Struck pulled me into his office the afternoon Trip gave notice and said, "You're my guy – go for it!" I had expected to have to go through a long battle. I'm sure the people at the home office (Summit) must have thought, "Here's a guy with no PD experience, who's only been APD for two months, who came to the station as Production Director . . . " Both Bill and Trip really went to bat for me and convinced them that I was the one.

R&R: KAZY relies heavily on classic material, but you were barely out of the cradle when the bulk of this music was being produced.

AS: It's strange. I didn't have a big brother or anything like that, but my group of friends listened to Hendrix, Zeppelin, and the Who. I didn't really grow up with the music of Styx, Journey, and Foreigner – the late '70s stuff. I was like a kid living in the '60s! I'm so familiar with this music, more so than anything new that comes out. It always amazes people around me. I don't have a real clear answer as to why I know so much about it, beyond the fact that I've been working in nothing but AOR for the past seven years.

Sure, my girlfriend didn't give birth to our child at Woodstock, and I didn't listen to the first **Doors** album on LSD in a college dorm. Actually, *our* Woodstock was renting the movie on videocassette (laughs). I've just always been very passionate about older music.

R&R: Many people in this business have to wait an awfully long

tor

time to get where you are right now. To what do you attribute your rapid success?

AS: My most significant advantage has been my versatility. Doing creative production really got me started. From there, people would say, "Hey, Andy's a creative guy. Let's get him to help out on the morning show.' Then they put me to work on research. Eventually I became very well-rounded – they found me accessible in a lot of areas.

R&R: You've always been younger than the people with whom you've worked. Has this caused any problems? AS: That's been one of the big-

gest obstacles I've had to over-

come in my career. I left KOZZ/ Reno and started working at KISW/Seattle when I was 18, and all these legendary jocks were there. They treated me well, but I did feel like a little kid. They used to call me "boy wonder," or "the youngest man in show biz."

But the question of age really arose when I first went to KZEP/ San Antonio as APD. It took me a long time to earn their respect to the point where they said, "He's just like the rest of us - he's just a little bit younger." All it took was for me to acknowledge that it could be a problem. Now I work that much harder to earn respect and be one of the guys. You're like a mutant when you first show up. Once they forget about your age, you're home free.

My wife and I still marvel at the fact that one of our morning guys, **Bruce Van Dyke**, did mornings at KOZZ when I was growing up. Everyone I knew listened to him; he was a legend in the market. I remember doing overnights at the station and thinking, "Man — Bruce Van Dyke is following me. This is big time!" Seven years later at KAZY, we needed a morning guy, so I suggested Bruce. So now I'm doing aircheck sessions with the same guy I used to listen to in high school.

R&R: Without a track record to look at, your competition must be wondering just exactly what kind of PD they're up against.

AS: They don't really know what to expect. They can't say things like, "Andy was down in Florida and used a lot of callout research." No one knows my strengths or weaknesses. If someone were to say my age was a weakness, I'd laugh them out of here. I've proven

The Schuon Resume

Not Your Average PD

At 23, Andy Schuon is the youngest P1 AOR PD in the country. WLUP/Chicago OM Greg Solk previously held that distinction, but he's already reached the ripe old age of 25 (can Social Security be far behind?).

How much younger is Schuon than the average P1 PD? An R&R survey reveals the answer:

Average OM/PD Age of R&R P1 Reporters: 33.4

Average APD/MD Age of R&R P1 Reporters: 30.7

As you can see, the mythical "average" P1 PD is a good ten years older than Denver's newest entry.

that's not the case. It would be nice if they would think that, though.

R&R: Denver is probably the most supportive market of AOR in the country. How do you assess your competition?

AS: KBPI has always been a hybrid. Now it's doing almost an exclusively '80s presentation, with tons and tons of generic. Loverboytype rock. KBCO is still an eclectic station where you can hear Leo Kotke, Modern English, or the Doors. I think it's been getting a little tighter recently, playing more mainstream classic rock. But it's changed very little since I've been here. KHIH calls itself a Classic Rock station, but plays a very bizarre mix. Actually, no one in the market calls it Classic Rock but them (laughs). This morning I heard "Nothing's Gonna Stop Us Now" into "Chuck E's In Love" into a Stevie Wonder song. I don't get that.

R&R: Where does KAZY fit in? AS: In the past, KAZY went through different owners and tried various approaches. It was kind of like KBCO, kind of like KBPI – a clone of different stations. Then Jeff Pollack was signed and took the station real mainstream. The consistency has been there now for over a year – music, production, air personalities – and the competition realizes they can't win by default anymore. KAZY is now a factor.

R&R: Some people claim that KAZY is basically a Classic Rock station.

AS: We use "the home of classic rock and roll" as a positioning statement, but we're a current radio station.

R&R: What's your classic-tocurrent ratio?

AS: We play about 60-70% classics.

R&R: What about your commitment, if any, to breaking new artists?

AS: At this point we have so much music from Aerosmith, Jethro Tull, and Pink Floyd that we've Is Schuon the youngest PD of a commercial station in the country, regardless of format or market size? Perhaps. An informal survey of PDs, consultants, **R&R** statfers, and other industry observers yielded no challengers to Schuon. However, since there are approximately 10,000 radio stations in the U.S., it would be more than a bit presumptuous to pronounce Schuon the youngest.

And now that this is in print, we shouldn't have to wait long for a more definitive answer.

been giving them a lot of attention. They test well and they're great for the station's image, especially since we play so much of their older music. We can't ignore that. Other records that might have otherwise been played may have suffered as a result. [But] I'm not afraid to break music.

R&R: How do you feel about groups like Love & Rockets or Gene Loves Jezebel, acts that have started to get some attention at mainstream stations like yours?

AS: I just don't think they sound right for the radio station. With a band like Gene Loves Jezebel, I think our audience would say,

"We're not playing stuff from guys with orange hair and a Casio."

"What??" It would stick out like a sore thumb. It's the *name*, as much as anything else. It doesn't always help to be called the Blow Monkeys or the Cucumbers to get played on an AOR station. In fact, I've told some of the national record guys they ought to offer a "band name seminar" for their new groups (laughs).

R&R: How do you ultimately determine what's "right" for the station?

AS: We test music that's been played for a while. We don't just test something out of the box. I don't see any point in that. We look at all the usual things, like the back of R&R, our consultant, and requests. But as far as what we decide is right, a lot of that does come from your gut feeling. You have an idea of how the station should sound, and you decide if a song fits in those parameters.

A lot of the stuff we're playing now is from legitimate, proven artists. We're not playing stuff from guys with orange hair and a Casio.





James Francis, another of Cherlyn's cousins, brought three years of IBM marketing rep experience with him to help improve WANT's image. "My job is also to find marketing techniques that will help us get through the door to advertisers who don't know what we're about under new management and ownership," he said. "We first identified who we wanted to target in terms of listeners and advertisers. Consistency was something we wanted to make sure this organization has.

"In working with our salespeople, I found they have the same problem a lot of other AEs share: they sell time. We don't want them selling airtime, we want them selling business solutions. Finding out the client's objective for the year makes it easier to know if you can do anything to help solve his problem. This way the AE can tailor a package specifically for that person's business."

All In The Family

Francis-Freeman Clan Builds Base For Radio Chain

Dayton, Ohio's Lelia Francis, the state's first black realtor and the second black realtor in the US, has always lived by one motto: her family must always have something working for them while they're sleeping. That ethic has paid off. Today, the family is involved in real estate and car dealerships (in Ohio and other states), and owns the first in what is hoped will be a chain of radio stations.

At WANT/Richmond, purchased in June 1987, all of the management positions are held by Francis family members. Lelia's daughter Nancy Francis-Freeman, holder of a master's from Howard University and now President/CEO of Freeman Communications, wanted to get into broadcasting ever since she did a show on college radio and was involved with investors in Gospel-programmed WYBC/ Washington.

Asked why the family bought WANT, she said, "It's what we could afford at the time, and it offered the perfect situation for our people to learn and perfect their broadcast industry skills. We've also seen that we can do some good in the Richmond area, where a lot of people look to WANT to keep them informed about what's happening in the black community.

"Another reason for our involvement was the fact that all of our



family members have gotten their educations and some practical experience in broadcasting working for larger organizations. Now they can do it for us and themselves."

A Community Asset

Every member of the WANT management staff is under 30. The outlet's GM is Cherlyn Freeman, Nancy's 27-year-old daughter, who's earned degrees in political science and law. She said she wants the station to be an asset to the community at large. "We know we need to have the ears of our listeners, but we also think it's important to have their minds.

"More and more we hear radio stations playing music and giving minimal amounts of information, if any. An informed public is a knowledgeable public. We think it's imperative for blacks to be able to tune in a radio station and get information that's pertinent to them.

"We tell our air personalities they should be able to teach at least one listener one thing during the course of their airshifts," Cherlyn added. "If they don't, then we don't think they've done a successful airshift that day."

One example of this commitment to information is "People's Choice," a community affairs program aired Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6-7pm and hosted by WANT PD C.J. Francis. The program discusses local issues of interest to the Richmond public as well as national and international subjects.

Selling Business Solutions

C.J., a cousin of Cherlyn's who got his experience back home at then-Urban WDAO-FM/Dayton, commented, "We want to fill the void in this market that exists for professional adults who like urban contemporary music. Rap isn't our thing; we're more into being a station with a groove that's also mellow. We're not so soft that we're boring — our thing is variety. We



NAC: The New Buzz

AC is constantly growing, expanding, and seeking new vistas. Recently, traditional AC has been joined by a fresh new companion receiving considerable industry "buzz." **R&R** has chosen to label it "NAC" (New AC), and coverage of this new format begins in this issue.

While speaking at the Contemporary Adult Radio Conference in Monterey, CA last June, I said the definition of AC rests totally with the person defining it. In that spirit, NAC is an adaptable form. Many will prefer our "New AC" definition; others will call it "New Age Contemporary." And still others will swear it stands for "New Alternative Contemporary." Whatever the case, it appears this new phenomenon is here to stay.

Since NAC is still in the formulative stage, it knows no hard and fast boundaries. We'll keep pace with the stations programming this exciting format and report on its progress.

"Top 30 Album Chart," along with national "Most Added" LPs, national "Hottest," and national "Hot Tracks" boxes. Reporters' adds and hots, along with a summary pointing out crossovers from Contemporary Jazz or to conventional AC, will augment that information.

Expanded Jazz Coverage

Sharing the spotlight with NAC is **R&R**'s expanded Jazz coverage, divided into two sections: Contemporary and Mainstream. Contemporary Jazz has a reporting base of 27 stations mixing acoustic, fusion, and possibly NAC and mainstream. Its coverage will be similar to that of NAC.

The progress of mainstream or traditional jazz can be followed in national "Most Added" and "Hottest" boxes. A Mainstream summary will also appear.

The List's In The Mail!

How To Become An R&R Reporter

Without a doubt, the question **R&R** editors hear most often is, "How can I be a reporter?" Well, here's how.

First send a cover letter, sales folder, and sample playlist. Then follow up with weekly playlists (over a span of eight weeks) — all of which are reviewed by me. The biggest weakness on the part of stations is lack of follow-through in mailing this pertinent information. Since R&R receives ratings data from Arbitron and Birch, this information doesn't need to be sent. However, you should be aware that ratings performance is a vital factor in achieving reporting status.



COUNTRY

Here are ten major trends that will impact the business of Country radio in '88. Their interplay makes winning more challenging and more fun than ever.

The Music

Country music has improved, and that's cause for optimism. New artists are producing hits that sound like real country, thus servicing the core while satisfying younger demos that just three years ago would have eschewed the old guard's twang. These new artists and songs capture the spirit of true country roots.

Several years ago 30-54 was our real target. Our biggest problem was that country fans over age 40 felt quite differently about their music than country partisans just two or three years younger. Today, the center of our core has come down three to five years. Country radio is performing well 35-44. Yet the upper end of our target also likes current country music more than ever. That's because as the new breed of artists has emerged, the more established names have kept up with the times

AC and CHR are being plagued by sameness of sound and radio presentation. This creates both an opportunity and a problem for Country broadcasters as other formats realize the freshness in our genre, probably borrowing from it. The variety of sound, content, production values, and fun attitude produced by country artists today is improving time spent listening. At the same time, this broadening of appeal has the potential to increase cume value.

Marketing

Professional mass marketing came to Country radio with "Ur-ban Cowboy" and the additional competition the fad brought. Today, a station which fails to consistently force cume to sample its product will do just that – fail. Those doing TV image-building and direct marketing over the last few years have found that the "improved" music has built staying power and listener loyalty that other formats admire.

With a younger-than-ever target that looks better and better to the so-called mass appeal formats, Country radio faces additional competition in attracting new core listeners. And the competition isn't just the other Country station in town.

The winners of '88 will have learned the newest skills of marketing and strategic planning, and married those techniques to sound research. Never has outside marketing been more important to the growth of Country radio. Never has the format been better positioned

to take advantage of it. But as more broadcasters become aware of this, new methods of attracting listeners and new approaches to using the traditional media will also have to be developed

LEN ROBERTS

'88 Keys: Marketing, **Music, Information**

In 1988 Country radio will be in a unique position among adult formats. With the nation's economic outlook a question mark at best, country music is best positioned to speak to the concerns of the times from an entertainment standpoint. Outside of all-News or Full-Service AC stations, Country radio is best positioned to address the informational needs of adult listeners.

Eclectic folk music aside, country has - throughout its history been the musical conscience of America's working class: from Jimmie Rodgers's songs of life on the railroad to Merle Haggard's reflections on modern times.

And now, country's "new wave" is carrying on that tradition. Have you really listened to "Old Hippie" and "Kids Of The Baby Boom" by the Bellamy Brothers, or Steve Earle's "Someday?" Even David Lynn Jones's "Bonnie Jean" has something to say about life in the '80s. Something in the American psyche draws us to the poets, the authors, the artists who best reflect both our joys and our sorrows.

FM Must Provide Information

In 1988 John Q. Public, already more amenable to country music

Lifestyle

The new darling of national advertisers will be the 37 million postbaby boomers - those born from about 1965-74. Also strongly courted will be the 43 million 23-32 yearolds.

The challenge facing Country broadcasters in '88 is how to attract younger listeners without turning off those nearing middle age. The value system reflected in the relevant themes of today's country music provides an opportunity to mirror the lifestyle of these potential Country fans.

Sameness

Country radio's (and many adult formats') greatest problem will be how to remain competitive amidst increasing "niche marketing." The trick is to do this as radio evolves into finite targeting and narrowcasting, without succumbing to the syndrome where everybody in town is eventually tied with a three or four share. Fun, creativity, showmanship, and uniqueness are the cornerstones that will separate the one or two stations, regardless Continued on Page 57

Get Ready For The **Baby Boomers**

Some Country programmers are still trying to decide whether their stations should be "modern" or "traditional." We're less than 24 months away from 1990, and a question from the '60s still occupies our time. To me, that's like trying to buy a black telephone or a white bathtub. Those days are gone.

We've just been through a decade of unprecedented diversity. Megatrend watcher John Naisbitt calls it the "Baskin-Robbins society: everything comes in 31 flavors." In a relatively short time, our unified mass society has fractionalized into diverse people, diverse lifestyles, and diverse tastes.

Choices Yield Fragmentation

used to be. It's not better; it's not worse. It's only different (to paraphrase Naisbitt again).

Arbitron reports the average listener samples 3.2 radio stations. In our research, we've found people, especially males, who scan as many stations as possible. They make the ultimate choice: listening to everything on the dial for a few seconds.

Choice is so important to today's radio consumer, who has heard "have it your way" enough times to believe it. Think of the contemporary listeners who've heard their choices multiply from the days of Top 40 radio to today's stratified CHR, Lite Rock, Soft Rock, Classic Rock, and Classic Hits formats.


Few Choices

For Country Listener

Country listeners, on the other hand, don't have similar choices. Just like '60s MOR, which mixed the Beatles with Frank Sinatra, today's Country stations mix Dwight Yoakam with Ray Price.

Using music clusters in our research, we've found as many as seven separate and distinct styles of country that appeal to listeners. At one end is pure pop like the Eagles; at the other end is classic traditional like Roy Acuff. The important aspects are the gradations in between because they are subtle, having to do with sound and song, not artist or chart position.

Every market has a "sound" that we measure on a numeric scale. By matching a station's li-

brary to that scale we can have a sound that matches the expectations of the core audience. A record can be number one on the industry charts yet not fit.

I think these sound gradations will lead Country into the age of fragmentation. Each of the sound categories could be a separate vertical radio station, each as different from the other as the Eagles are from Roy Acuff.

When will it happen? Soon.

Boomers Demand Choice

Country tends to attract new listeners around age 35. Thanks to the baby boom, there are a lot of 35-year-olds on the way. Of course, not all of them will join the Country ranks. Some will stay with dance music, hard rock, or another format for the rest of their listening lives the way Big Band aficionados have. Others will be like the men seen in our research - sampling everything, choosing not to settle on any one station.

Some, however, will choose



of format, which will stand out in each market.

Station Trading, Debt Service

According to FCC figures, nearly one in seven US radio stations changed hands last year. Debt service in the double digits is common for many newly created radio companies. National ad dollars are flat, at best. There's growing competition for local money.

These factors combine to create a climate where this year's winners will be the ones who know how to offer "value-added" programming, to both clients and listeners, while doing it with a sharp eye on controlling costs.

More Women GMs

Some of Country radio's most productive salespeople and bestprepared air personalities are women. They're in a marketplace which finds them – according to the book "The Glass Ceiling" – "fed up with the extraordinary expectations that others have of them. Women managers are starting to leave companies at an alarming rate."

Country radio companies will begin to face this situation head-on in '88. Several major groups will promote women to top level management as they face the alternative of losing some of their best people.

AM Shares Will Climb

Country remains one of the most viable approaches for AM radio. In markets where AM competes with FM, AM broadcasters will redefine the format in terms of the needs of the psychographic group still available to the band. Emotion, nostalgia, familiar muisic, fun, personality, localism, and information will be approaches exploited by AM Country stations to improve their shares.

AC Competition Grows

1988 will see FM Country broadcasters worry less about AM Country competitors and more about the constant erosion of audience to Classic Rock, Oldies, and other AC formats. This will force FM Country to improve its image, enhancing the format's appeal to younger listeners. Country's new familiar music and artists will remain the staple of both AM and FM Country.

Labels Outgrow Nashville Confines

truby grow as a worl

To truly grow as a worldwide music form, country music will become more than a vehicle to promote the music business in one city.

As country trade organizations promote regional and international diversity, the music business will in turn be fostered in diverse locales. It will be more fashionable for artists to remain in their native, creative environments, and label execs will search them out. Independent labels will continue to emerge if the major labels fail to respond to this trend.

Country Radio Overcomes Inferiority Complex

Country broadcasters can profit in the coming year by positioning themselves as the rate and unit load, research, programming, and marketing leader. The key is understanding more about the audience than the other adult formats in the marketplace. Use that knowledge to good advantage. performers sing to prerecorded tracks.

A Rockin' Extravaganza

The Nashville Entertainment Association is readying its Extravaganza '88, and has planned an extra day of activities for this annual affair. The January 14-16 event will double the number of showcase bands from ten to 20, rotating from four nightspots around the Nashville area.


The NEA developed its winter Extravaganza blitz to draw national attention to the growing rock scene in Music City. Nearly 150 regional rock bands were considered for the annual showcase.

American Music Accolades

The "American Music Awards" will air January 25 on ABC-TV. Randy Travis grabbed national headlines along with rockers Bon Jovi when they topped the list of nominees. The CMA Male Vocalist of the Year is up for Country/Favorite Male Vocalist; Country/Favorite Album – "Always & Forever"; Country/Favorite Single – "Forever And Ever, Amen"; and Country/Favorite Video – "Forever And Ever, Amen."

• Reunion Records has reached a co-distribution agreement for two forthcoming album releases. The a cappella sextet Take 6, on Warner Bros., is a black gospel jazz ensemble debuting in February. RCA's Gary Chapman releases "Everyday" in March. Each LP will be included in Reunion's product line for 1988. The Christian label has just broken ground for new office facilities in Nashville.

• Several folk music professionals have met here with hopes of es-



tablishing an International Folk Music Association. Nashville producer Jim Rooney, folksinger Tom Rush, Texas festival promoter Rod Kennedy, and Canadian festival promoter Rosalie Goldstein met in December to discuss an organization that would encourage the music and elevate the standards of production, performance, and presentation in the folk field.

• It was "Adios GMO Band" when Gary Morris departed for the "Les Miserables" stage last year, but not before singing a specially written farewell song to his loyal band members and crew. dio stations which not only provide that psychological "safety valve," but also the information they need to make intelligent decisions about life's choices.

Information will be important not only to AM Country stations, but to FMs as well. This is not to say that "full-service Country" is the new year's watchword. But neither will "Continuous Country" be the format of choice. (Suffice it to say that "country elevator music" as a programming concept has seen its heyday.) A thoughtfully conceived blend of contemporary country music by familiar artists, well-received newcomers, and pertinent, useful information should win us some new friends.

Marketing The Key

Effective marketing will be more important than ever in positioning Country outlets in their respective marketplaces. You can have the best product available. But if no one knows about it, all the rotational clocks and TSL promotions in the world aren't going to

make a difference. Developing cume through well-planned and executed outdoor and TV campaigns isn't just for the major market players anymore. Strategic planning can be effective not only in reinforcing a station's identity, but can also be a cost-effective alternative to a scatter-gun approach — an important consideration in the belttightening months forecast to be ahead.

Abraham, Martin, And — John

The future is brighter than ever for Country radio, especially when you consider the rebound the industry has experienced since the premature death knell sounded by the *New York Times* just a short time ago. Most importantly, perhaps, it's a resurgence experienced without benefit of an "Urban Cowboy"instigated "free ride."

Think about it. Isn't it much more gratifying to succeed on our own merits than by riding the coattails of the latest John Travolta movie?

Country is alive and well on the radio. Anybody heard from John lately?

Siegel, Transfer Top Inaugural Charts

ANHATTAN TRANSFER welcomed in the new year with a #1 showing in R&R's premiere Contemporary Jazz chart. In our first NAC listing, the quartet holds down the #6 slot. In a parallel achievement, **DAN SIEGEL**'s "Northern Nights" LP is atop the NAC chart and at #6 on the Contemporary Jazz listing. The Transfer's "Soul Food To Go" is CJ's hottest track and NAC's second hottest track. This week

debuts on the AC Back Page (#30). The Transfer is also the only act to have an LP listed as "Hottest" by both CJ (#1) and NAC (#5) reporters.

Another artist with multi-format success is LEE RITENOUR - #5 NAC, #7 Contemporary Jazz, and Significant Action AC, TOM SCOTT's "Streamline" is a Top Ten entry in both NAC and CJ. Barely missing out having double Top 10s is TOM GRANT's "Night Charade" --- #8 CJ and #11 NAC.

Gaining strength on CJ (#15) is GERALD ALBRIGHT's "Just Between Us." The single from the LP, "So Amazing, was in a three-way tie for fifth place on AC's Most Added list. Albums at opposing points of the spectrum are STING's "Nothing Like The Sun," a smash success at #2 NAC and #26 CJ. Meanwhile, DAVE VALENTIN's "Mind Time" is a solid #3 CJ, while checking in at #23 NAC. BASIA 's "Time & Tide" is doing well on both charts: #3 NAC and #20 bullet CJ. Her "Promises" cut is getting a smattering of airplay from Music-Intensive AC stations.
