NAB MEETING DRAWS 6500+

Radio '88 Covers **Competitive Changes**

Capitol Hill and the future of AM radio dominated last week's NAB Radio '88 convention in Washington. The event attracted a record-setting 6529 attendees, according to NAB, but was sedate compared to previous outings. Although exhibitors reported brisk traffic on opening day, attendance swiftly plummeted.

Opening Remarks Stress Future Hurtles During Thursday's opening

ession, NAB President/CEO Eddie Fritts said while a 1946 NAB study's conclusion that "radio is woven into the pattern of our lives" was still valid, radio faces new marketplace,

AM IMPROVEMENT DEBATED 'Ultimate Radio' Flops

"A day late and a dollar short" took on new meaning when NAB officials rolled out their highly-touted "Ultimate Radio," an event promoted as the highlight of the association's Radio '88 convention. Originally scheduled to debut on Thursday (9/15) and trumpeted in a frontpage USA Today story, the \$50,000 prototype receiver (billed as a potential savior for AM) was finally unveiled at a Friday (9/16) news conference – but its AM circuitry wasn't work-

ing. NAB VP/Science and Tech-

nology Michael Rau told the disappointed crowd that at least "another ten hours" was needed to finish the AM circuits, and he hoped to have the radio fully operational by Saturday, the last day of the convention. When even that deadline was missed. Rau told reporters it would be at least "a couple of before the receiver is weeks" ready. "Ultimate Radio" designer Richard Sequerra told R&R the delay could be even longer. "It will be ready when it is ready." he said.



Minority-owned broadcasters are being urged by the Rev. Jesse Jackson to use their community influence to galvanize public opinion and boost minority turnout in this year's presidential election.

Ex-WFYR DJ Files AIDS Lawsuit Charges Station Spread Rumors He Had Disease

A former WFYR/Chicago air rsonality has filed suit against station its ex PD John Wetherbee and its former GM Dick Rakovan, charging them with spreading accusations that he had the deadly disease AIDS.

Kevin Molloy, who worked at the AC station between 1985 and January of this year, filed the civil action in Cook County Civil Court. His attorney Robert Harlib said Molloy is not allowed to specify a precise amount of damages in the lawsuit, except that it is in excess of \$15,000. Added Harlib, "We consider this to be a case worth a considerable amount of money."

WFYR VP/GM Drew Horowitz, who succeeded Rakovan, said the station had been served with the lawsuit, but that the matter had been turned over to RKO attorneys, and that he would have no comment.

Molloy supplied affidavits from three persons who have accused the managers of making the statements. One of them was former

employee Valerie Orvino, who said she was present and said Wetherbee stated to Mollov 'T think you have AIDS.

A weekend announcer, L. Thompson Howell, stated that he was present when Rakovan asked "What do you think, Molloy has AIDS?," and that Wetherbee stated, "Molloy must have AIDS."

Patrick Faces Senate Heat Over Political Ads



FCC Supports Minority Preferences

Major Defeat For Patrick

The FCC has dramatically flip-flopped its position on the legality of minority licensing preferences, much to the chagrin of Chairman Dennis Patrick.

The Commission voted 2-1 last week to file a legal brief arguing that the minority preference policies are constitutional. The shift in position represents a severe political defeat for Republican Patrick, whose opposition to the reversal was overwhelmed by his fellow Commissioners James Quello and Patricia Diaz Dennis, both of whom are Democrats.

Two years ago, the Commission strongly questioned the constitutionality of the preferences and ordered an investigation of them. That study was stopped last year when Congress prohibited spending money for it.

> FCC Says Race Policy Legal

In its brief, which was filed with the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia in a TV licensing case involving Winter Park Communications, FCC General Counsel Diane Killory argued that the Commission's procedures are constitutional by the standard set by the Supreme Court in its landmark University of California v. Bakke decision. In that case, the Justices ruled that minority preferences are acceptable in college admissions programs when the purpose of the preferences is to enhance diversity and race is just one factor in considering a student for admission.

"The minority preference policy is narrowly tailored to achieving the compelling government interest: diversity of programming," said the FCC in its brief. "Race is one of several factors to be considered rather than a decisive factor in and of itself."

Attorneys for the FCC also argued that the appeals court gave its stamp of approval to minority preferences in a 1984 case involving West Michigan Broadcasting Co.

The Winter Park case stems from the battle for a UHF TV license for the Orlando market. In 1985, Metro Broadcasting and Winter Park, two parties whose applications for the license were dismissed, appealed the FCC's decision to award the license to Rainbow Communications. That decision was based in part on the fact that Rainbow's minority owners planned to manage the station.

Before the case could be heard, it was sent back to the Commission pending the outcome of its legal review of preference policies. Last December, Congress passed a bill that ordered the FCC to drop that inquiry and leave the policies intact. Two months later, the Winter Park case, along with a similar proceeding known as the Steele case, which centered on the Commission's female preference in licensing, were sent back to the appeals court. The Steele case was settled out of court earlier this month.

Patrick Miffed, Says FCC Logic Flawed

In an unusual move, Patrick went public last Friday (9/16) with his dissenting view of the position stated in the Commission's brief. In his statement, Patrick said he found his colleagues' reasoning in their decision to abandon the Commission's previous position "seriously flawed and unpersuasive." He predicted the case will eventually have to be resolved by the US Supreme Court. He also said Congress's move to

end the FCC's inquiry into the minority preferences deprived the Commission of critical data it could have used to build a factual record in support of the argument that preferences are constitutional on the grounds they serve the public interest by increasing program diversity. "I am sorry the history of events

"I am sorry the history of events in this proceeding will preclude the Commission from making a more definitive contribution to the resolution of the issue at that time," Patrick concluded.

NAB Opposition To Bill Brings Fireworks

The broadcast industry walked into a hornet's nest on

political advertising practices. The bill, the "Campaign Cost Reduction Act" (S. 2657), would require broadcasters

to sell fixed, non-preemptible spots at the lowest unit rate.

of Jefferson Pilot's WBTV/Charlotte. He argued that most broadcasters are reponsible in handling their obligations under political advertising rules, and said NAB statistics show that Senate candidates in 1986 placed about 34% of their campaign dollars into broadcast ads - not higher figures suggested by senators.

Broadcasters Called "Excessively Greedy"

McConnell responded by calling the industry statistics "absurd," and accused broadcasters of trying to protect their pocketbooks at the expense of the public. "I really find that excessively greedy," McConnell said. "We're really asking for a small sacrifice so democracy can function."

"Senator, please understand that broadcasters are honorable men and women," responded Tarleton. He denied other charges by lawmakers that broadcasters unfairly charge or discriminate against political candidates, insisting that broadcasters would not put their licenses at stake for such insignificant revenues.

When McConnell demanded to know if his legislation would hurt broadcasters profits, Tarleton repsonded it would not but said, "There's a fundamental fairness question" about the bill.

FCC's Patrick Also Criticized

FCC Chairman Dennis Patrick also came in for a shellacking at the hearing, after Senators criticized him for allowing broadcasters to sell only preemptible time at the lowest unit rate.

"I do not understand how the Commission can allow the existence of a political rate card," said Sen. John Danforth (R-MO). He called the practice "pernicious" and "a flat contradiction" of the lowest unit rate policy. He said political rates were "very damaging to the concept of fair elections."

Patrick responded that the Commission would enforce any policy adopted by Congress, but current Commission policy allows political candidates to be placed on an even par. He argued that applying the lowest charge to preemptible spots helps cut the cost of campaigning.

would effectively restrict emissions from an AM transmitter to a 20 kHz bandwidth channel. The NAB, which urged the Commission to adopt the NRSC's receiver standards, has expressed qualms about making NRSC-2 mandatory because, it says, the standards are complicated and costly to implement.

The proposed rulemaking also recommends allowing some AM stations to accept increased interference in exchange for the right to increase their power. The FCC believes this proposal would benefit the public by allowing qualified AM stations to improve their signal in their primary coverage area even though those stations would experience higher-thannormal degrees of interference in their

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newly-expanded service area. The proposal would allow power increases only where the 0.5 mV/m contours of other co-channel facilities and the relevant contours of adjacent stations remained fully-protected and the 1.0 mV/m contour of the station is not overlapped by the 0.5 mV/m contour of any other co-channel authorized station. The NAB, in line with its policy of opposition to any move that would increase interference on the AM band, does not support this new proposal.

Comments on the proposed rulemaking are due at the FCC by November 22, 1988. Reply comments must be received on or before December 22, 1988.

Rep. Billy Tauzin (D-LA) urged broadcasters to use the Doctrine as a tradeoff to compromise with Congress, since the policy's constitutionality ultimately will be decided by the courts. Rep. Thomas Tauke (R-IA) countered by saying giving up the Fairness battle would be a mistake because it would encourage Congress to write it into law – and that move would harm court challenges.

At a session on grass-roots lobbying, three Congressmen urged radio executives to forge a relationship with their elected representatives. Rep. Jack Fields (R-TX) advised broadcasters to couch their lobbying arguments in favor of what's best for the public, not what's best for broadcasting.

NTIA To Urge Total Content Dereg

National Telecommunications & Information Administration chief Al Sikes tipped broadcasters that his agency will soon call for a five-year experiment to test total content deregulation of the radio industry. While giving few details about "Telecom 2000," a sweeping review of US communications policy slated for release in early October, Sikes said obscenity and indecency curbs would remain but most other content restrictions including the equal time rule for political candidates - would be tossed out. He also vigorously defended last year's axing of the Fairness Doctrine, saying, "I have yet to see a list from anybody, including the most vehement critics of elimination, that states what bad things have happened."

Patrick Wants Duopoly Rules Lifted

During a sparsely-attended oneon-one session between FCC Chairman Dennis Patrick and Fritts, Patrick said current radio ownership rules are "arguably too restrictive" but added that broadcasters will have to help push changes through Congress and the FCC.

Patrick said ambiguity is "inherent" in obscenity and indecency issues and advised broadcasters to "consult very carefully with your counsel." He added that "there seems to be a conflict developing" between the courts and Congress on the issue of indecency. The courts have told the Commission to consider a late-night "safe harbor" while Congress seems to be moving toward an outright ban, which Patrick said would be "constitutionally suspect."

Soft Diary Pays Off

The Committee On Local Radio Audience Measurement (COL-RAM) suggestions incorporated into the redesign of the Arbitron diary will pay off in higher quality data and better response rates, according to panelists at the "Hard Facts About A Soft Format Diary" session. The "soft format" diary lacks daypart dividing lines and times other than start and end times, has been made more appealing visually than the current diary, stresses that all listening be recorded, and simplifies the recording of long entries.

The simplest advice offered at the "Jokes, Trick Phone Calls, And Libel" panel was that stations should heed the FCC's consent requirement: consent must be given by a person who is called before the call is put on-air and before a tape starts rolling. Panelists stressed that it was not permissible to get consent after the fact, and that a violation could result in a fine of up to \$20,000 and a violation notice from the FCC which could be used as evidence later in a libel/slander action.

During the "Using Programming Consultants" panel, McVay Media's Mike McVay offered a checklist of "don'ts" to keep in mind: "Don't hire a consultant if you're not going to listen to him, if you have sensitive feelings, if you assume he'll mean a total fix is in, if you're going to be combative, if you want a PD, or if you want him to 'handle' the PD." Malrite Programming VP Jim Wood, who said his company employs 47 consultants, joked, "We believe anybody from out of town is always right. If you're from out of town and we haven't paid you yet, stop by."

"Dirty Tricks" At Programming Sessions In an unusual session dubbed "Guerilla Warfare," three pro-

grammers hidden behind a curtain spoke through voice-distorting microphones to give the SRO crowd a lesson in "dirty tricks." Among the PDs' nastier suggestions: bid up the rights to a sports contract a competitor views as critical to his success, pay the competition's low-paid overnight or substitute jocks to act as informers, and demoralize compet-ing jocks by "offering them an ungodly amount of money when you know there is no way they can get out of their contract." The tricksters cautioned that such tactics will work only for a station that is correctly programmed and properly positioned in the market.

"Making the Mornings," moderated by WHTZ (Z100)/New York's Ross Brittain, was highlighted by the insights of Dave Maynard, morning man at WBZ/Boston for three decades. Maynard outlined four keys for success for morning jocks: be yourself, be informed on local issues, take a few chances, and always stay hungry no matter how successful you become. "I've never unpacked my bags," he quipped. personality Willard Scott and features Ritchie Havens performing custom music for various formats.

• At the "New Age Format Room," everyone expressed a preference for the designation "New Adult Contemporary" and Cody/Leach Broadcast Architecture cofounder Frank Cody said NAC stations should "stay the course." Satellite Music Network VP/Programming Robert Hall added, "The format is still crawling, is just about to learn to walk, and soon will be running."

• Fewer than 50 people attended a Saturday session in which NAB presented conclusions from its "RadiOutlook: Forces Shaping The Industry" study. Among the findings: the national economy is in good shape, households are increasing at a rate faster than the population, electronic audience measurement is at least five years away, and there could be 12,000 radio stations by the mid-1990s.

• Major parties at the convention included Emmis Broadcasting's "Float Your Boat" bash in Washington Harbor and ABC Radio's gala honoring Shadoe Stevens.

"An Urban station can't let its guard down in the community or a Churban will take advantage," cautioned WJLB/Detroit's James Alexander.

When operational, the "Ultimate Radio" will be the first receiver featuring continuous digital tuning from FM to AM and adhering to the National Radio Systems Committee standard for AM receivers. It will feature a steerable antenna capable of tuning out manmade interference, reception capability for the soon-to-be-added 1605-1705 kHz expanded AM band, and AM stereo circuits compatible with both the Motorola and Kahn systems. The set is meant for stationary home use, and Sequerra said no plans are underway to make a car model.

AM Expanded Band, National Licensing

The future of AM radio was hotly debated throughout the convention. FCC Commissioner Patricia Diaz Dennis, calling baby-boomers "a lost generation for AM," said the Commission must accept part of the blame for creating "chaos" by authorizing too many stations. She voiced concern about a 1986 decision that allowed about 1000 commonly-owned AMs and FMs to simulcast without restrictions. "While every decision to simulcast might make sense individually, I am concerned about the cumulative effect," she said. "It reinforces the idea that AM has nothing unique or worthwhile to offer.'

Noting that ten new AM channels between 1605 and 1705 kHZ will open up in July 1990, Dennis said she is reluctant to authorize "lots of low-power stations." Instead, she leans towards fulltime 5kw and 10kw stations with a "legitimate hope of serving more than their local neighborhoods." She said the Commission has proposed to allow a few large groups to dominate the new AM channels with numerous stations nationwide, but acknowledged that the idea of national licensing is unpopular with radio broadcasters.


"AM Rally" panel moderator Ron Frizzell of WLAM & WKZS/Portland, ME urged AM stations to adopt the National Radio Systems Committee transmission standards because "when it is applied, 80% of the people can't tell the difference from FM."

In a lengthy Saturday session on AM technical improvements, engineer Ogden Prestholdt of A.D. Ring & Associates said a test site for NAB's Reduced Skywave Antenna Project should be under construction by next month and operational by the end of the year.

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Why Office Romances Are On The Rise

t seems that a lot more than paychecks and idle gossip make the weekly rounds in America's offices. According to "Sex And The Workplace," a recent book by Claremont Graduate School psychology professor Barbara Gutek, more than 80 percent of US workers report having had a "social-sexual" experience while on the job. What's more as many as 35 million US office workers claim to have such experiences at least once a week!

While many of these sexual encounters fall under either the "quickie affair" or the "harassment" categories (joking, teasing, touching), there has been an upswing in longer-lasting, office relationships. During the six years of research that went into the book,

Taking The Air Out Of Wind Bags

hen flapping lips foul your phone lines, chances are your listeners or sales accounts aren't connecting. So, how can you get these long-winded laggards off the line and put yourself back on the clock? According to the Lake Forest,

IL-based ExecuTime newsletter, you can cut these towers of babble down to size by keeping your mouth shut, i.e., by not sking unnecessary questions. A held tongue breaks the conversation long enough for a quick recap and a "thank you" to the caller, thus giving you time to get set for the next aural assault

Gutek discovered at least four primary causes for this increase in job-related romances.

• Changing Demographics: In 1960, the US workforce was made up of 34% women and 66% men. By 1980, the percentages had shifted to 42% women and 58% men. This trend is even more pronounced in the professional/managerial job category, as the percentage of women holding such jobs increased from 16% to 26% between 1970 and 1980.

Thus, as more and more men and women work alongside each other as equals than ever before, the resulting shared proximity, motives, and work-group characteristics have spawned a rise in job-connected romances. In addition, such factors as the natural excitement that surrounds stressful or challenging careers as well as the escalating nature of congratulatory hugs and kisses can ferry coworkers into the tunnel of love as well.

• Less Leisure Time: A recent Harris poll found that the number of hours worked that Americans work has increased by 20% since 1973, while their leisure time as declined by 32%. Furthermore, the Harris survey shows that the professional or salaried workers now spend an average of 52.3 hours per week on the job. The result is that more people are falling in love with fellow employees because there is less time to develop love relationships outside the workplace.

• New Attitudes Toward Dating: Traditional notions of dating have suffered as people choose to stay out of the public eye during their time away from the office. Therefore, the workplace - with its ease of access and minimal expense becomes a prime hunting ground for the lonely-hearted.

• Media Reinforcement: Not only has America's time spent watching television increased, there has also been a corresponding rise in pro-

gramming content that reinforces job-related affairs. Such successful shows as "Moonlighting," "Hart To Hart," "L.A. Law," "Reming-ton Steele," "Hotel," "Dynasty," and "Cheers" feature plots that revolve around romantic relationships among co-workers.

Psychologists also charge that other, more subtle factors, such as TV's encouragement of viewer immaturity - manifested in the inability to make such adult decisions as to say no and mean it $\,-\,$ nurture the idea that co-workers are natural romantic mates.

Despite this rise in on-the-job relationships, it is not a practice that US businesses care to see become a social norm. A corporate America that has yet to come to terms with sexual harassment is hardly able to deal with the spread of office romances.

The addition of sex in the workplace may undercut a corporation's control, order and power, but - like it or not -Americans' blending of professional and personal lives has become a reality that's definitely here to stay.

What some people fail to realize, however, is that there are certain - often unspoken - rules that every manager should follow to make him a better leader. After surveying various managers around the country, Nation's Business magazine recently published the following seven rules

for strong managers: • Don't "Hem And Haw." It's important to confront problems and deal with them immediately. A boss who stalls causes a lot of stress and grief for his staff. Let them know that your decisions are not arbitrary, but based on logic.

• Do It! If you tell your staff that something will be done, make sure that it gets done. Never make promises you can't keep.

• Don't Make Policy Into A Crutch. It's important not to hide behind company policy, using it as the sole excuse for an unpopular decision or rule. One chief exec suggests that all managers say "This is company policy because " (If you can't finish the

sentence with a satisfactory reason, perhaps it's time to modify or eliminate the policy.)

• Criticism Is A Two-Sided Coin. Try to include praise along with criticism. Even if someone is doing something wrong, there surely must be something they're doing right. Never criticize someone in front of other employees.

• Gather Support For Changes. People will often resist change, but the more you let them take part in a new project, the more they will support it.

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 Don't Put On Airs. Since a leader's success is based on the success of the people he supervises, arrogance and pomposity will always backfire by undermining your staff's confidence. Conspicuous "status symbols" such as private bathrooms, dining rooms, and the like only create resentments.

• Promote From Within. You hired them, so show your confidence in them. Turnover will also be greatly reduced if those at the bottom have some hope that they. too, can work their way up the corporate ladder.





Coming on the heels of Michael Jackson's autobiography, Wil-liams's book (written in collaboration with Patricia Romanowski) covers a lot of the same turf. And


Nielsen To Monitor VCR Viewing

Latest Food For Today's **Fast-Paced Lifestyles**

th today's fast pace of life, the average American wants to spend as little time in the kitchen as possible, a phenomenon that has sent the US market for frozen and prepared foods soaring. In fact, the market for controlled-packaged food now stands at \$1 billion a year, a figure that's expected to triple by 1991.

Recently, this industry has seen a boom in new packaging technology that's designed to improve taste as well as freshness. Some of the more interesting developments include:

• Modified Atmospheres: The Chicago-based Redex Inc. has come up with a type of packaging called "micro-atmospheres" that rely on special plastic wraps, trays, and injected gases to keep food fresh. The wrap, for instance, can extend the shelf life of baked goods from one week to more than three months. It can also keep meat fresh in the refrigerator for weeks.

• Oxygen Eliminators: Other companies are working on packages that keep certain gases in, while allowing others to escape. General Electric Plastics, for instance, is developing an ultra-thin, glass-layered, plastic container that keeps oxygen (the main cul-prit in food aging) out. Air Products & Chemicals Inc. is using florine gas to create a Teflon-like surface that cuts flavor loss, and General Foods Corp. is currently test-marketing Kool-Aid in collapsible, bellows-type bottles that reduce flavor loss resulting from oxygen in beverages.

• Microwave Improvers: Companies are also developing packages that will improve microwaveready foods, which presently can be heated, but not browned. Sydney, Australia-based Leigh Mardon Ltd. has come up with a "susceptor" wrap called "Micro Crisp" that traps microwaves and focuses them on the outside of foods. The wrap will be available in the US later this year. Meanwhile, both Wright Brand Foods Inc. and Geo. A. Hormel & Co. are presently test-marketing microwave bacon packages that not only brown and crisp the strips, but also soak up virtually every drop of grease on a pad underneath.

• A Complete Meal In One: For those who would like to microwave all their entrees together at the same time, Alcan Aluminum Ltd has developed a domed lid that uses clusters of aluminum "antennae" to steer heat to specific areas of a microwave meal. For example, the system can heat up a frozen entree, while keeping the ice cream that's sitting next to it rock hard. Unfortunately, the

system is presently so expensive that the company hasn't been able to sell it to food packagers yet.

• "Doneness" Indicators: However, the new food packaging that will immediately become the most prevalent lies in the realm of 'doneness'' indicators. Developed by 3M, one version features a blueand-white paper inside a plastic capsule at the top of a package. As the food heats, steam warms the indicator, causing the blue to melt and spread over the window. When the white disappears, it's "comeand-get-it!" time. ConAgra Consumer Frozen Food Co. has al-ready introduced the indicator on 29 Armour frozen dinners, while Campbell is planning to include the system on its "Le Menu" line of frozen meals.

Fans' Favorite Sports

f not good sports themselves, most Americans are at least interested in good sports especially the ones shown on broadcast and cable television. On a typical weekend, 72 million couch-coaches across the US watch at least one competitive event. According to the New York Citybased Roper Organization, nearly

a quarter of all Americans show at least a moderate interest in each of 12 sports.

Professional football generates the greatest enthusiasm, with 35% of the fans saying they're "very interested." However, an additional 22% claim a "moderate" fondness for pigskin.

Major league baseball has the greatest overall "moderate interest" (60%). Nevertheless, only 28% of the fans surveyed say they're "very interested" in the national pastime.

Attentions shift to campus arenas for third and fourth-place contenders, as collegiate football and basketball each attract 22% of the sporting crowd.

Less attractive, but still showing a significant level of interest are: professional basketball (20%). boxing (14%), auto racing (12%), and golf (9%).

According to recent industry reports published in USA Today, 1988 sneaker sales are expected to hit the \$3.8 billion mark. Phone Service Approval **Rises**

Then it comes to telephone service, 51% of Americans say they get either an "excellent" or "good" value for their dollar. According to a recent survey conducted by the NYC-based Roper Organization, this is a 14% increase from the 37% who gave the service a positive rating in the aftermath of Ma Bell's breakup back in 1985.

With 51% of the US consumers surveyed handing out high marks for the value of long distance service, and a slightly higher number (52%) rating their local service as good or excellent, phone services now stand in second and third, respectively, on a list of 13 basic consumer services.

Incidentally, mail service - featuring the ever-popular 25 cent stamp - topped the list.

merica has always had a love affair with its furry four-legged friends, but recently pet ownership has skyrocketed. According to the latest figures published in the Washington, DC-based Trend Letter, a record 61% - 52.5 million - of all US households own at least one pet. In fact, it's estimated that the total amount of money Americans spend on pets currently stands at \$10 billion per year and climbing.

Ironically, after many years as the dominant domestic pet, dogs may no longer be "man's best friend," as cats presently outnumber canines, 56 million to 52 million.

Some fine feathered friends namely, birds - run a close third at approximately 45 million. Meanwhile, exotic pets are also gaining in popularity, with sales of snakes, lizards, frogs, and the like reaching \$23 million in 1987, with a projected \$25 million for this year.

People are also getting weirder in their pet choices, with llamas Michael Jackson, call your office! - macaws, and African pygmy goats gaining in popularity. Perhaps the biggest growth market, however, is fish. Sales of pet fish passed the \$222 million mark last year, with the number of home aquariums topping 10 million.



Computer Sends Photos In Seconds

R ax machines and e-mail systems have revolutionized modes of communication during the past several years with their abilities to transmit manuscripts from one source to another in a matter of seconds. The one flaw the two systems shared, however, was their failure to transmit high-quality photos.

However, that may all be in the past now that the San Antoniobased Image Data Corp., has come up with the "ImageTerminal," a computer terminal that can display and transmit high-quality black and white photos.

The system can show photos containing up to 256 shades of gray as opposed to the 16 shades most terminals display – and photos can be transmitted between terminals over a normal telephone line in less than 15 seconds. Images are stored as long strings of numbers in standard minicomputer and mainframe systems with a minimum of special programming. Doctors can even use the system to send X-ray images. 

Said Morra, "This is something I've been thinking about for a long time, and Gil agreed that it was worth doing. I've always thought of A&M as the Tiffany's of the recording business; when they sign an artist they hang in for a while, and that's the way we work with our own clients."

Other musicians making the list: U2, George Michael (at 13, the highest debut), Bon Jovi, Whitney Houston, Pink Floyd, Julio Iglesias, Kenny Rogers, Tina Turner, Van Halen, Sting, Prince, John Cougar Mellencamp, Grateful Dead, and Billy Joel.

What's more, there are several musicians whose estates earn more than a million dollars annually, namely **Elvis Presley** (\$15 million), **John Lennon** (\$5 million), and **Jimi Hendrix** (\$4 million).

Continued from Page 3 son said, "With all this agony going on, we're rapping and dancing and rhyming and moaning and groaning. Meanwhile, there are 900,000 unregistered blacks and 600,000 Latinos (in the New York area). Only black and brown-owned radio can trigger voter fever among these people."

Jackson, who was presented with this year's NABOB Man of the Year Award, noted that there is nothing more fundamental to the struggle for black equality than the "ability to inform our people." He also called for the creation of a nationwide weekly radio talk program that would focus on black issues.

Legislative Agenda Mixed


After Jackson's speech, several key Congressional staffers provided conference attendees with a legislative update on broadcasting issues. The aides also chided their audience for their failure to make themselves known on Capitol Hill.

"As I look around this room, I can say that with the exception of some of the reporters and (NABOB Executive Director) Jim Winston, not one of you has been in my office in the past two years," said Antoinette Cook, counsel to the Senate Communications Subcommittee.

Larry Irving, Senior Mass Media Counsel to the House Telecommunications Subcommittee, told the attendees that very little legislation of interest to broadcasters, including license renewal reform, will be addressed until the dispute between the FCC and Congress over the fate of the Fairness Doctrine is resolved. Irving predicted that the Fairness Doctrine will be written into law sometime next year regardless of who occupies the White House.

Rep. Al Swift (D-WA) made a strident attack on the FCC's leadership under Mark Fowler and Dennis Patrick, and predicted the Commission will adopt a more "responsible tone" next year regardless of who wins the Presidential election.

"I think we have gone through an enormously difficult time over the past eight years," Swift said. "The FCC has been peopled largely by ideologues who saw their role primarily to be lighting the candles at the altar of the purity of the faith, rather than as pragmatists who are trying to solve problems."

ON THE RECORDS

The Uni Cycle Resumes

A couple of years ago, when Reprise and a few other sixties labels were revived, I compiled a series of historical sketches on these companies' recorded highlights. MCA's Uni branch has as colorful a past as most, and deserves a similar spotlight.

Uni began operations as a West Coast-based branch of MCA in early 1967, its first release being "The French Girl" by Seattle rockers the Daily Flash, whose Doug Hastings was briefly the Buffalo Springfield's bassist. That single got only scattered West Coast action, but Uni 55002, a pickup from the Colorado-based Chicory label, put Uni on the map.


Fun In Acapulco

"That Acapulco Gold" by the Rainy Daze wasn't a big national hit, because, even though it took a couple of months for radio programmers to figure out the fumaceous nature of the merchandise "me and Martha" were smuggling in from their Mexican holiday, that was time enough to pre-

vent the record's pernicious spread across the nation's playlists. But there was time for plenty of programmers, again most of them West Coast-based and probably quite aware of the record's vaudevillainous dope references, to take it Top 10.

Number six (don't worry, I'm not going to itemize all 359 singles) featured Marcia Strassman, later costar of "Welcome Back Kotter" as Gabe's wife, exploring a favorite theme of the Uni roster, "The Flower Children." This was another West Coast smash and spawned similarlythemed releases by the Osmonds ("Flower Music") and Uni's first across-the-board smash, "Incense & Peppermints" by the Straw-



Diamond In The Rough

A singer named Lori Hampton debuted with a song by longtime L.A. scenester Barry White, with no success, and the signing of UK pop idol Cliff Richard brought similar dividends. But a new era sprang to life with the mid-'68 sign-

ing of hitmaker Neil Diamond, although he didn't earn a real smash until his fourth Uni single, 'Brother Love's Travelling Salvation Show." Hugh Masekela, however, collected a monster with "Grazing In The Grass," and an even quirkier hit, Desmond Dekker's reggae breakthrough "The Israelites," broke through in '69. Meanwhile, Uni beefed up its

R&B roster (it had a predominantly black subsidiary, Revue, for a time, as well as a rock division, Shamley) with veterans like Betty Everett, Bob & Earl, Garland Green, and the Mirettes (not to mention Marvin Holmes & The Uptights' unforgettable "Ooh Ooh The Dragon"). Veteran performers were a big part of the roster as the '70s dawned: Uni boasted Ray Peterson; Dino, Desi & Billy; John Fred & His Playboy Band; the Cascades; Thee Midnighters; Andy Kim; former Buffalo Springfield drummer Dewey Martin; and early '60s pinup Brian Hyland. Only Hyland came up with a hit, "Gypsy Woman," produced by another early '60s star, Del Shannon.

Elton & Olivia To The Rescue

But in the early '70s Uni developed a few new acts as well, one being British songwriter Elton John, whose "Border Song" first appeared on another Uni subsidi-

ary, Congress, then switched to Uni proper and laid the groundwork for his next single, "Your Song." Elton had half a dozen sizable hits on Uni, and even got his bass player, Nigel Olsson, a deal there.

Uni also issued Olivia Newton-John's first solo releases, one of which, "If Not For You," was a semi-hit in 1971. Neil Diamond continued his string of a dozen Uni hits, the last of which (indeed, the last Uni hit by catalog number) was "Walk On Water," and Barry

White's Love Unlimited Orchestra gave the label a smash with 'Walkin' In The Rain With The One I Love."

Oddball and foreshadowy releases still showed up - near the end in 1972 there were singles by J. Henry Burnett (later better known as producer/artist T Bone) and White Duck (featuring, briefly, John Hiatt) - but MCA decided to impose its own identity on the record division. Toward the end of 1972 the top Uni artists (Elton, Olivia, Neil, and a few others) were transferred to the new MCA label, and Uni, after five-plus colorful years, was no more ... until its 1988 rebirth.


A Stone Alone Gathering No Moss

Can a PARTRIDGE FAM-ILY megamix be far away?

More international artists have been added to the lineup at the "Ibiza 92" festival on September 30 and October 1. The MOODY BLUES, ROBERT PALMER, STEVE EARLE, BREATHE, SPANDAU BALLET, TOM TOM CLUB, and T'PAU will join BRIAN WILSON, LEVEL 42, and BELINDA CARLISLE. A total of 20 acts will perform, and the show will be broadcast in the States during November by Showtime, with an MTV special following in December.

Van Halen's ''Monsters'' Is Summer's Biggest Winner . . . And Loser

According to *Performance* magazine, **Van Halen**'s "Monsters Of Rock" heavy metal extravaganza was the summer's biggest money loser, even though it was the highest-grossing tour of the summer. The show grossed a total of \$19.8 million for 18 shows, but it also had the largest number of empty seats for those shows. In order for a concert promoter to break even, a concert must fill 80 – 85% of its total seats — and the "Monsters Of Rock" tour averaged around 76% attendance at each venue. The magazine reports that promoters lost hundreds of thousands of dollars on the tour, although Van Halen should do much better this fall now that they're on a solo tour playing smaller venues.

Heavy metal still fared well for the summer, however, as **Aerosmith** headlined the second highest-grossing tour, which took in \$10 million at the box office. Aerosmith's choice of an opening act probably didn't hurt revenue any, as **Guns N' Roses** were riding high on the charts with "Sweet Child O' Mine" for most of the tour. In third place was **INXS**, who have grossed \$8.6 million so far with a tour that will run through the fall. And it was metal again in fourth place with the **Def Leppard** shows, which have grossed \$6.4 million thus far.

Even though **George Michael** had played only a total of 18 shows at the time the summer statistics were compiled, he still did well enough to rank fifth for the season, with a gross of \$6.2 million, selling 100% of all tickets available up to that point. Other successful summer tours, according to the magazine, were by **Rod Stewart, Steve Winwood,** and the **Grateful Dead.** Joining the "Monsters Of Rock" shows in the area of poor ticket sales were tours by **Hall & Oates, Tiffany, Lynyrd Skynyrd,** and **David Lee Roth.**

understanding in our market. More importantly, AI's strategy works. The Dallas chapter just learned of their adopted prisoner's release and all of us at KTXQ felt it was important for our audience to learn that participaing in AI can make a difference."

Milwaukee's WQFM incorporated the Human Rights Now! Tour into their four-month long "Star Flight" promotion which sends listeners to concerts and major sporting events throughout

the U.S. Using in-house produced pre-recorded 30-sec. spots and live on-air liners, the station promoted a grand prize trip for two to the Los Angeles concert date as



the official launch of Star Flight.

According to promotions director Mark Krueger, WQFM would air the sound effect of a jet plane at various times throughout the day. The 15th caller to contact the station at the prompt won a cassette of one of the Tour's core artists, Reebok shoes, Tour T-shirts, and automatically was entered in the grand prize drawing.

To generate increased awareness of AI and its activities, the station also ran PSAs promoting the organization's "800" number that encouraged membership in AI and support of its objectives.

Krueger said, "Amnesty International is an exceptional organization committed to a very serious and critical issue - international human rights. We wanted to provide an opportunity for our listeners to be a part of that.

Hungary Welcomes Human Rights Now!

The Hungarian response to the Tour and the September 6 concert in Budapest was unprecedented. Government officials sought a high-level meeting with representatives of Amnesty to discuss the Organization's human rights concerns

Amnesty's Secretary General, Ian Martin, met September 2 with Hungary's Minister of the Interior and the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs. The meeting was the first of its kind between an Amnesty Representative and Eastern European government officials.

Bill Graham, International Tour Director, stated that the original objective of The Tour was "to go to all countries that singed the Universal Declaration of Human Rights." Hungary's early interest in hosting a show helped make the concert possible.

The 85,000 tickets to the sold-out show went quickly, including 18 tickets for the Soviet Embassy and 200 for the U.S. Embassy. Thousands of fans from Austria, Czechoslovakia, the GDR, Soviet Ukraine, and Yugoslavia joined Hungarians for the first international rock concert of its kind in Hungary.

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





It's Not In The Budget

As we enter the fourth quarter, it's time to consider how much money is available to spend in 1989. The thought of doing budgets is enough to stop a winning PD dead in his creative tracks. But this painful process can be made a bit less excruciating. KOY-FM/Phoenix PD Jay Stevens, WNNK/Harrisburg PD Bruce Bond, and WCGQ/Columbus, GA Station Manager/PD Joe McClure offered their ideas on the subject.

The Honeymoon Period

Stevens, who joined KOY-FM a few months ago, said, "When you go into a new job there's a honeymoon period, and you have to take advantage of it. I was lucky enough to get a few things changed and actually increased money for outdoor advertising. I asked for a lot – and got it.

"We'll begin planning next year's budgets in October. That's when all the department heads will get away from the station for a few days and prepare their numbers. It's a detailed process in which we map out our expenditures month by month, both major and minor, based on what we did this past year and what we want to do next year.

"We examine every promotion we've done. We also look at the upcoming annual community events we'd like to participate in, and how much they've cost us and might cost in the future."

Edens lets Stevens move dollars from one part of his budget to another. Stevens explained, "That's why we load extra dollars into the 'miscellaneous' category - to cover any and all emergencies." These might include having to add money to a cash contest already in progress, or the need to purchase tickets for a hot concert coming to town.

"I fill every category of the budget with something, and I spend every penny that's budgeted," noted Stevens. "It's the 'use or lose it' theory; if you don't use it, they won't let you increase expenditures in that category next year."

Salaries Are Tricky

Inflation increases are another factor Stevens considers. He said he would like to see a 50% increase in his budget for next year, but added that a 25-30% increase is more realistic - and that most of that will go to salaries and promotions.

"I fill every category of the budget with something, and I spend every penny that's budgeted. It's the 'use or lose it' theory." — Jay Stevens

"You can't say everyone gets a seven percent increase across-theboard," he said. "For someone making very little money to start, that's not much of a raise – but it's a good chunk for someone taking home a large paycheck.

"Each person is an individual case, and I get personally involved with the raise process. I know how much I can give, and I'm straight about my feelings. However, I've also got the financial room to stop a great jock from making a move to another market if he's a cornerstone to our success."

Stevens offered some sound advice on putting together a budget, particularly in certain areas of expenditure. "If you're planning to do TV, spend carefully. It's not costeffective in Phoenix. The other rule is to dominate whatever outside medium you're going to advertise in. Otherwise, you're really wasting a lot of money. We're doing billboards in the fall and are dominant with 26 painted boards, which will rotate and give us 150 showing. That's total coverage.

"The biggest budget mistakes come from insufficient planning. It's a pain in the neck, but you've got to plan ahead. If you don't, you'll be over budget and have to go kicking and screaming for more dollars by the fall. In most cases you live and die by the budget."

Screw The Budget

Bruce Bond recalled a situation where he and VP/GM Carol O'Leary said, "Screw the budget. We'd read about the 'Scavenger Hunt' contest in R&R and knew we weren't budgeted for it, but the idea was so strong we realized it was worth the extra money to make it work.

"In cases like this I have to be like a salesperson," he continued. "I have to put a game plan together for Carol. It might be something as simple as a one-phrase teaser with five more teasers following it.

"Thankfully, I've been able to convince her to see things my way on the key issues. She has nixed things on me at times, though, and I'm spoiled enough to rant and rave — which usually makes things worse. After all, her job is the bottom line."

Bond feels talent should be wellpaid for their abilities and encourages them to talk directly to O'Leary about their raises. "I'll offer input to her as to what I think is a good raise, and I'll coach the air talent on what to expect realistically," he said. "This seems to help everyone reach his goal."

Bond said projecting salary increases is the toughest area of budget planning. "No one can predict how much a fair jock will improve in the year – or how far a good one will slack off. These are key factors in raises. But there are two sides to the coin. The dedicated people aren't in it just for the money, yet if you're doing well and aren't compensated it hurts your ego. One positive thing is that our owner, Kirby "Scott" Confer, was a jock and a PD for many years and understands last-minute programming needs.

"Our revenues and profits are up again, so I look for a healthy budget increase of 15% or more. Also, we've got new competition coming into town with Barnstable buying WMSP, which will go CHR or Country. Either way they're going to be competition on an advertising level and that will ensure that we'll get more money."

Tight Fist, Warm Heart

In Joe McClure's case, he has to battle his dad, owner Chuck Mc-Clure, for budgetary increases at WCGQ. "I hate doing budgets, but it's one of the most important things we do," said the younger McClure. "It's an exercise in making decisions, since you have to project your needs in advance. As the year goes along, it makes dayto-day operations easier since you're following a plan."

Being the boss's son doesn't make things any easier when it comes to figuring out how much to spend and where it should go, Mc-Clure said. In fact, since he began managing the station in addition to his PD duties, McClure's budget actually decreased this year.

"My dad is tightfisted, but he has a good heart," he said. "He always reminds me, 'Radio is a business, not just show biz.' I have had to go to him sometimes for extra money, and it can be a struggle. But generally he makes the right decision.

"I delegate duties to allow me to handle the management end of things. It's helped me grow and learn, and given some of my staff the chance to learn about programming."

Like Stevens and Bond, McClure believes across-the-board increases are antiquated ways of budgeting for salaries. "I've got to be able to pay enough or all my good jocks will take off for Atlanta," he explained. "I pay people on their individual merit."

Tradeouts Treated Like Cash

In figuring his budget, McClure treats tradeouts like cash. "We

trade out our TV time but have to take that into consideration when budgeting for the year. We also give away cash. My father and I both wince at the thought, but cash is the hottest prize. The trick is to vary how it's given away.

"We've handed out cash for the last three years. The first year it was the 'Song Of The Day' for \$107 and a weekly prize of \$1000. The second year we did it the same way, but people became bored with it. We spent just as much this year but handed out cash and two Mustang convertibles, which renewed listener excitement."

Perhaps McClure offered the best advice on budgets when he said, "There's more to winning than just giving away cash and prizes. Listeners who tune in for the giveaways simply go where the biggest prizes are offered. Instead, budget money to participate in community events as well. You can only buy the audience just so far and just so many times."

New Music Success Stories

Airing a weekly new/alternative music show has always been an excellent way to test tracks with your loyal actives while enhancing your "cutting edge" image. For both KLPX/Tucson and WRFX/Charlotte, the recent success of their new music shows has prompted experimentation beyond the confines of Sunday night specials.

For the last year, KLPX has been running its "New Music Test Department" on Sundays from 8-10pm. As both producer and host of the show, 'LPX personality Susie Dunn features music ranging from John Hiatt to Suicidal Tendencies.

PD Larry Miles has been genuinely surprised by listener reac-tion. "We've seen phone response and local sales for artists long be-

fore the nation picked up on them. Market awareness of these artists has built because of the show. And the male numbers are just dominant on Sunday night." The show's success - plus a na-

tional trend toward greater acceptance and popularity of once-alter-native acts such as the Church, Midnight Oil, and R.E.M. - convinced Miles to try something new. Believing, as most programmers do, that the night time is the right time for new music, Miles changed the 7pm-midnight clocks for the spring book. He upped the percentage of currents at night to 50% (two heavies, three mediums, and one light). In contrast, KLPX runs approximately three currents an hour in other dayparts.

Result: while the 6am-7pm ratings were disappointing, the night numbers were up sharply including 25-34.

"I consider anyone who's with us at night a music active who will take the time to listen to a new rec-

Parodies Provide Promotional Color

The thing that really caught my eye about this whole deal was the way people qualified for the big dig. The station produced nine beach-related song parodies to enhance the promotion. Listeners had to be the correct caller upon hearing the "WAAF Summer Song Parody Of The Day."

Nine parodies! That's some serious writing, folks. More impressive was the uniformly excellent quality of each tune. A variety of songs were affectionately slaughtered, including Clapton's "Cocaine" ("Solarcaine"), Thorogood's "Bad To The Bone" ("Burned To The Bone," about a macho dude who refuses to use sunscreen), and CSNY's "Helpless" ("Topless," a sordid tale about a guy's ugly but well-endowed sister who lets it all hang out)

One of my favorites was an absolutely perfect send-up of Billy Joel's immortal "Piano Man." I've provided the lyrics so you can sing along:

It's 12 o'clock on a Saturday The regular beach crowd is here There's a shapely young woman right next to me Who I know I'll never get near She said, "Son you sure look like a ghost to me And your face is as white as my ass If I pulled you out here in the sun with me How long do you think you would last?" Chorus: Bring me a cloud, I'm albino man Bring me some shade today 'Cause they don't make a sunscreen that's high enough To keep me from peeling away Kinda brings a tear to your eye, doesn't it?

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ord," says Miles. He's attempting to capitalize on the 7pm-midnight success by moving Dunn - known for her enthusiasm about new mu-sic - from middays to nights. Miles also plans to up the current ratio at night even further. And the 'New Music Test Department" will be expanded to three hours.

WRFX's Foxy Weekend

WRFX MD Fred McFarlin's "Fox Exposures" new music show recently marked its first anniversary. To celebrate, the station ran a "Fox Exposures Weekend," featuring a 44-song playlist of hot yet relatively unknown - selec-tions. (Not one of the tracks had reached R&R Breaker status.)

Three tracks from the special playlist were scheduled each hour, along with a fourth, ultra-familiar current from the station's regular heavy rotation. Each of the alternative songs was sandwiched by a well-known classic. Carted intros and outros were used to highlight the unfamiliar cuts. The intro explained to the listener what was going on ("It's a 'Fox Exposures Weekend,' your chance to give us your thoughts about new and alternative music"), and had a bed over which the jock frontsold the particular tune. The outro solicited audience response. Each track was also backsold at the next stopset.

PD Jack Daniel reports listener reaction was excellent. "The response was about 80% positive, certainly good enough to make me consider expanding the Sunday night show." That's encouraging

If your station has had similar success stories with new music, please let me know. It will be interesting to see whether these are isolated incidents or indications of a much-desired trend.



KKZX Ad Shot Down

This ad in the Spokane Spokesman-Review created quite a stir in that Northwestern city, while providing some unexpected, free publicity for KKZX. The incident also proved how gullible the press can be.

Claiming it received "scores" of complaints from readers, the newspaper killed the ad immediately after it appeared. It was run as part of one of those morning show popularity contests that are so darn prevalent these days. KKZX PD Larry Snider responded to the public outcry by "suspending" morning jocks Tom Turner & Dave Scott. The station also ran "apology spots," saying the ad was "tasteless" and showed bad judgment.

An article that appeared in the paper following the incident quoted Snider as saying the suspensions were not a publicity stunt and that — get this — the jocks in question had "hidden" the controversial ad from station management.

It gets better, Local TV picked up on the story, sending a young cub reporter to interview Snider. When asked what kind of "punishment" the offending jocks would receive. Snider said with a straight face that they would either be "pistol whipped with squirt guns or be forced to mow the lawn on Riverfront Park in boxer shorts." The reporter nodded in earnest at Snider's remarks, which ran unedited on that evening's newscast.

KRXO Celebrates First

KRXO/Oklahoma City celebrated its first birthday in fine style by putting together a mammoth, 11-hour concert featuring some familiar blasts from the past: Roger Mc-Guinn, Foghat, Mark Farner, Rare Earth, the Marshall Tucker Band, and John Kay & Steppenwolf.

Over 9000 attended the event, the cost of which was underwritten by Coca-Cola and McDonalds. Over \$25,000 was raised for the Oklahoma City Zoo. Free showers, sprinklers, and ice water were provided for the hot and thirsty crowd. VP/GM **Jane Bartsch** says the event reminded many of the Woodstock days, although no babies were born. The station plans to make the concert an annual bash.

PROGRAMMERS' ROUNDTABLE

Fragmented Format Faces Favorable Future

Since R&R's debut issue nearly 15 years ago, AC has undergone a myriad of changes. In the October 7 column, several past R&R AC editors will review the format's history. This week, PDs discuss AC's current state and what to expect down the road. Participating are WLEV/ Allentown's Scott Robbins, KBIG/Los Angeles's Rob Edwards, and WSB-FM/Atlanta's Phil LoCascio.

Ready To Take A Chance

Robbins brings a unique perspective to the table. Prior to joining WLEV two years ago he programmed *Urban* WKSE/Buffalo, and has witnessed AC's increasing energy since then.

"AC is a variety of different formats and is much more lively than it ever has been," he said. "I think it's going to be more like CHR in the next year or two. A lot of ACs are taking more chances on records, popping them out of the box when they would have waited in the past."

While AC may be inching closer to CHR, Robbins still discerns a difference between the formats. "A lot of CHRs won't touch some songs we play," he explained. "Livingston Taylor's 'Lovin' Arms' is like our album cut. It's precious to us because it's an example of how we can put some variety on the station and break songs that may wind up on CHRs or AORs. Listeners tired of hearing the same songs over and over can punch up an AC to hear a slower rotation.

"I used to think that programming this format meant you needed to wait for a song to be a hit; you could play a record only after everybody knew what it was. It's not that way any more. ACs are taking bigger chances than they used to and that's good for the format." WLEV slots 30 currents and

representing a departure from its prior programming philosophy. "We used to be much more oldiesbased," Robbins said. "Adults love oldies, but they also enjoy new music. They love *variety*. That's the key."

Believing listeners want to see what a station's personalities look like, Robbins has his staff cover many events. "I'm not comfortable unless we're out at least three times a week. The basics of radio are to be visible, promote yourself, and play the right mix of music."

Regarding the format's future, Robbins hopes things remain status quo, but expresses doubt. "The tempo concerns me. I don't want to become CHR, and it seems like that's where we're headed. The demo is getting older while the music is skewing younger, and how much longer can you play songs that are 20 years old? The answer is to cut down on the oldies and feature something different, perhaps from new artists."

'BIG Plans To Be Entertaining, Interesting

Two years ago, KBIG cut its BM/ EZ ties and entered L.A.'s AC arena. Today, VP/Programming Edwards believes the format is in a renaissance period.

"AC is coming back stronger than ever," he said. "It appeals to the broad-base 25-54 demo better than any other format. The challenge for AC PDs is to make the format as interesting as possible. My approach is to make it personality-oriented, and *not* have them all sound the same. They should be identifiable personalities — not generic announcers."

Feeling that today's AC station needs to be actively involved in the community, Edwards dispatches his personalities to a variety of events, including the Labor Day MDA Telethon. "We've been the official radio station for just about everything," he commented. "It helps you heighten your visibility,

Facts And Figures

WLEV/Allentown, KBIG/ Los Angeles, and WSB-FM/ Atlanta are successful stations that represent various factions within AC.

WLEV posted its best AM drive and weekend stats in more than a year. KBIG tried to recapture the, magic from the summer and fall sweeps when its 12+ midday figures were a whisker behind CHRs KIIS-FM and KPWR. While flat weekends, WSB-FM posted significant across-the-board daypart gains. Thirty-two signals penetrate and gain ratings in Allentown; 46 in Los Angeles; and 21 in Atlanta.

and gives you an image of being concerned and involved about what happens in the community."

A constant criticism of many ACs over the years has been that they are nothing more than jukeboxes, and Edwards cautions against following this tactic. "It works very well for Jhani (Kaye, PD at crosstown AC rival KOST) and I don't question that. KOST is more of a packaged sound. I'm

more concerned about entertaining and being out in the community. The midday trend is to get more aggressive with office listening. People are more actively involved and are playing our contests like crazy. In the future, this will enhance how a programmer packages his station."

Based on research he's seen, Edwards is confident the format is evolving. "In the future, AC will move away from the lighter, softer, lusher, 'Format 41'-type presentation. It will become a more current or recurrent format, and be music of the '80s. AC will also have more substance. I think we'll play artists who may sound too hot for the format today, but who will show up in the future as AC evolves. We'll be in a soft-CHR battleground.

"The challenge for us is to be as interesting as CHRs," he concluded. "If programmers can grab that and run with it, the format has a great future. The next five years should be wonderful for AC."

Turn On The Lites

LoCascio, who has been PD at Atlanta's top-curning station for two years and classifies WSB-FM as "mainstream," said, "It seems there are more choices in AC than any other format – especially in major markets. You've got ACs that are oldies based, current based, mainstream, lite, hot, and AC/ CHR. They all offer very different shades of the format. One of the most successful ACs in the country plays virtually no currents (WLTW/New York).

"It will be interesting to see how listeners perceive differences in each market," he added. "As the population ages, sooner or later we're going to have a complete society that grew up listening to rock and roll."

LoCascio said the changes he makes are the result of local research, and are not based on national trades and charts. "What the industry does is of no concern to me," he explained. "If my listeners tell me to play a certain record, I'm going to play it – regardless of chart position or priority with a record company. There are some songs we're not playing because they don't fit the sound of our station." Examples cited included Whitney Houston's "One Moment In Time," and "Tonight, Tonight, Tonight" by Genesis.

As stations attempt to gain their own particular niche, LoCascio envisions even greater variety within the format as market winners concentrate on particular demos. Contrary to what Edwards said, LoCascio believes the soft, "Lite" ACs will flourish. "It's not exciting, and record companies may hate it, but it's going to be a major player and a format we'll have to deal with — like Classic Rock."


As for CHR-leaning ACs, LoCascio said, "These stations may be here now, but I don't think they're winning."

NEW PROGRAMMING AID Top Ten UC Recurrents Debut This Week


As you know, the Urban Contemporary music chart moves faster than any music format R&R researches. UC programmers traditionally have a great commitment to new music, and that's reflected in the quick turnover of charted records

A side effect of this movement is that after records peak in the Top 10 they often drop sharply the following week. Once a record has peaked, many programmers immediately place it in a recurrent category, so that it is no longer reported as a current even though it may be getting significant rotation.

After surveying all our reporters, we've found that most stations are indeed continuing to rotate recurrents as often as light or medium currents

We've therefore asked each reporting station to begin contributing a list of most-played recurrents. Starting this issue, we will publish a trended weekly Top 10 list of the most active recurrents. You'll find it on the Urban Contemporary music information page, Page 68

It's obvious that recurrents are familiar pieces of music that are still popular with listeners. Good programmers acknowledge their need to know the most popular recurrents as a useful programming aid. So in addition to the Back Page UC chart, which provides cutting-edge information on new records, you'll now have a handy reference of the most-played recurrents. We hope vou'll find it of use.



WQIK, WCRJ At War Over 'Law'

The Jacksonville airwaves are absolutely smoking in a war between Country competitors WQIK-AM & FM and WCRJ. The combatants are WCRJ PD/morning man Lee Rogers, who arrived on the scene five months ago, and WQIK PDJack Evans, who entered the fray last July 6. At issue is the marketing/positioning phrase "The Most Music Allowed By Law," which WCRJ licensed from Viacom and began using in late August.

Evans said WCRJ's use of the phrase means, "They're lying to their audience. They admit that in the statement made by their PD (see sidebar). By admitting there's no law, they're admitting they're lying."

The first shot was fired by WQIK morning team Boomer & Greg after WCRJ had been on the "law" liner for a couple of weeks. Evans paraphrased the pair's on-air remarks as being, "They're lying to their listeners. If they're lying to their listeners about a law that doesn't exist, are they lying to their sponsors about commercials they're running? Are they lying about the news they're doing - reporting news that doesn't exist? We know for a fact they're reporting a statement to get people to listen to them and to believe something that doesn't exist. Are they lying elsewhere?

Why Is WQIK Responding?

Asked why WQIK, the longtime Country leader, is responding to WCRJ, Evans said, "Prior to my getting here they had been taking shots at us by showing up at our concerts and rodeos and refusing to move their van from events where we were. Several mornings a week they run a pre-recorded close to the morning show that takes shots at "If WCRJ doesn't quit lying to the audience, we're going to see them in court."

us. They continually took shots at us and we didn't respond. We were like the elephant who doesn't pay attention to the fly on its back. You know it's there, you just don't pay any attention to it.

"But it stops when they start lying to the audience – and if they don't quit lying, we're going to see them in court." Would WQIK really take it that far? "Absolutely," said Evans.

WCRJ's Side

"We're not going to quit using it just because they're whining," said Rogers. "We wouldn't have paid for the rights if it didn't say exactly what we wanted to say: 'WCRJ consistently plays more music than our competition.'

"Besides, it is the law," continued Rogers. "It's the Hoker Broadcasting law. There's a law in the Hoker doctrine that says WCRJ must play 12 records in a row.

Thus, we play the most music allowed by law."

As an example of the station's commitment, Rogers said that the campaign is being supported by a large showing of billboards.

Asked about the war which has ensued since WCRJ began using the line, Rogers said, "By responding to the campaign, they did just what we wanted them to do. I'm going to send them a bill for programming their radio station. Maybe I'll send them a jingle; it'll take less time for them to promo our station."

Offering his side of the battle for Jacksonville, Rogers added, "They did try to get us thrown out of concerts and stuff. They have no right to do that just because they happen to be on stage.

NAKED TALK, PT.II

Is WUSN Painted Into A Formatic Corner?

A few weeks ago (**R&R**, 9/2), WUSN/Chicago PDJ.D. Spangler moved to "naked talk," i.e., forbidding his personalities from talking over music. All of the US99 jock rap is done "cold."

One of the many calls I received about this issue was from WSOC/ Charlotte PD Paul Johnson, who thought Spangler's move was a "drastic step – one I couldn't envision doing unless under extreme competitive pressure."

Though Johnson agrees with Spangler's point about respecting the music, he wonders if Spangler isn't painting himself into a formatic corner. "Once you go on the air telling the listener that you're not going to ruin his favorite music by talking over it, you can never go back to the old way and still maintain your credibility," Johnson said. "So what happens in the future if J.D. decides his station doesn't 'cook' enough or that the position didn't have the impact he hoped for? He can never go back on the promise he made his listeners without hurting the station.

"While J.D. may say that he'll never go back, what about the PD who follows him at WUSN? His successor won't be able to retreat from the position even if he doesn't believe in it."

Johnson said it's part of the job as an air talent to "never intrude on the music" and to "be artful in how they get things done."

Spangler Responds

Asked to respond to Johnson's comments, Spangler told me, "First, this was not a gimmick – something we'll abandon in six

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months. It was a very tough decision to make. I'm on the air every day, so I'm very aware that it takes a lot of work to make this sound right. The hardest thing is keeping the energy level of the station up."

Addressing Johnson's last point, Spangler said, "We (as DJs) entertain the hell out of ourselves when we're on the air, don't we? Let's put all this 'artful' BS aside and talk in reality. Has any listener ever come up to any jock and said, 'My God, you were really artful and tasteful over the beginning of my favorite song'? Have you ever heard of that happening? In my 20 years on the air, I've done some tremendous intros – intros that have made me feel fuzzy all over. The key there is me. We talk over the music for us, not for the listeners. There's nothing that can be said over the intro to a song that makes the song better for the listener.'

Answering Johnson's main point, Spangler said, "You can always change back if there are valid reasons why you should talk over the music, especially if there was an error made about what the listeners want. But those reasons have to come from the *listeners!* If they tell us, through our research, that they want us to talk over the intros, we will. Then we'd go on the air and tell them we're doing it because they said they wanted it."

Battle Of The Promos

Here's the text of promos being aired by **WQIK** and **WCRJ** in the war over the phrase "The Most Music Allowed By Law."

WOIK ran this every hour for a couple days:

"Ladies and gentlemen, it's a lie when the other. Country station says they play the most music allowed by law. There isn't any law." (Sound bite from an FCC attor-

ney): The FCC doesn't have any rule that sets a maximum amount of music that can be played per hour.

"No false claims. No deceptive advertising. No lies. Only the best country music, money, and more. From Jacksonville's number one

Country hitkicker, FM 99, WQIK." WCRJ responded with this promo, paraphrased here by PD Lee

Rogers: "Hi. This is Lee Rogers, Program Director at WCRJ. Our competition at WQIK has been criticizing WCRJ the last few days for use of the

"I have enough faith in my product that I don't care if WQIK shows up at a concert or a rodeo make a

phrase "Most Music Allowed By Law." They use terms like 'mislead' and 'fie.' The 'most music allowed by law' is simply a way for us to say we play more music than WQIK. Nothing more, nothing less.

"If they're really worried about lying to the audience, they should quit telling you that they're a 12-ina-row radio station when they only play 12-in-a-row in three of the 12 hours between 6am and 6pm.

"Secondly, they shouldn't tell you they're giving away \$100,000 when they're really only giving away \$45,000. (The \$45,000 was in an annuity which matured to \$100,000. — Ed.)

"Thirdly, if they're really concerned about it, they should put up or shut up. Until then, we will continue to play the most music allowed by law."

I'll put our product and people side by side with theirs any day of the week and not complain about their being there, because I think we're going to win that battle. Obviously, they're concerned about that, too."

Trio Set For CMA Awards Show

Hank Williams Jr., Reba McEntire, and K.T. Oslin will perform on the Country Music Association awards show, which airs October 10 at 9pm EDT on CBS-TV. The three performers are set to join hostess Dolly Parton on the two-hour program, which originates from the Grand Ole Opry House.

Williams, CMA's 1987 Entertainer of the Year, will perform "Early In The Morning" from his "Wild Streak" LP. McEntire, who won her fourth consecutive Female Vocalist award last year, will sing "Respect" from her "Reba" LP. Oslin – who won a Grammy earlier this year for her "80's Ladies" LP – has broken records with her five current CMA nominations. She'll perform "Hold Me" from her "This Woman" album.

Irving Waugh, the show's executive producer, said: "These are some of the most gifted performers on the country horizon, and their performances will set the stage for an entertaining evening."

Annoucements will be made as other artists are added to the show's roster.

Elvis Movie Premieres

"Heartbreak Hotel." a fictional movie about Elvis Presley, world premiered in Nashville on September 22. The special screening was an invitation-only benefit for the Easter Seals Society. The film's cast includes David Keith (a native Tennessean) as the King, along with Tuesday Weld, Charles Schlatter, and T. Graham Brown and his Hard Tops as Presley's back-up band. Billed as a "rock 'n roll fantasy" set in 1972, "Heart-break Hotel" was, of course, Presley's first RCA hit, written by Mae Boren Axton and Tommy Durden in Nashville. Following the premiere, a reception was held at the Country Music Hall of Fame on Music Row.



Champagne For Everybody As King Rules Dancefloors

VELYN "CHAM-PAGNE'' KING whirled to #1 on the Dance Music Review with her recent Urban Top 10 "Hold On." The JETS soared into second, as SA-FIRE and JAMES BROWN held steady. RICK AST-LEY's "Strong Man" muscled a big gain to #8, while Detroit "brothers" WAS (NOT WAS) leaped into the Top 10 at #9 (up from 68 on the complete 80-song listing).

The THOMPSON TWINS graduated to #10 from #29, GEORGE MICHAEL's "Monkey" rebounded to #11, and MICHAEL JACKSON drifted up five. Climbing onto the chart from further below were GOOD QUESTION (from #26), MAC THORNHILL (from # 28), and MEL & KIM (from #24). VOICE IN FASHION made a statement at #18, while KYLIE MINOGUE's "Loco-Motion" - already a Back Page hit and a UK/Australia charter - came out of nowhere for a #19 debut.

RAZE topped a Moving Up list that included BROS, techno-popsters INNER CITY, and HANSON & DAVID. British DJ-fueled S-EX-PRESS finished on the rise, as did the latest from TONY TERRY, TER-ENCE TRENT D'ARBY, and LOOSE TOUCH. The TIMELORDS (with another UK hiphop product) and female rappers L'TRIMM completed the up-n-comers.

The HOLLIES and PHIL COL-LINS held on to the British chart's #1 and #2 spots, respectively, while a remixed Bros climbed into third place. BILL WITHERS improved and JASON DONOVAN took a giant step to #6, but the big news in the Top 10 had to be the #7 debut from the PET SHOP BOYS. The COMMODORES moved up to #10, MSM leaped to #11, and Inner City hit #13

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
The PROCLAIMERS bolted out of the Moving Up category with an appearance at #14 (up from #24 on the complete UK chart), while the **PASADENAS** followed their Top 5 "Tribute" with a #15 debut. COLDCUT's DJs-turned-producers teamed with Black Uhuru's JUN-IOR REID for a 22-18 jump, as SALT-N-PEPA --- borrowing heavily from the Isleys' "It's Your Thing' finished at #20 (up from #29).

With a self-penned tune, Rick Astley topped the upwardly mobile acts. Others included BON JOVI's latest (a recent CHR and AOR Breaker), WHITNEY HOUSTON's Olympic paean, a new one from BE-LINDA CARLISLE, and the BEAT-MASTERS featuring P.P. ARNOLD.

For the seventh consecutive week GLASS TIGER remained atop the Canadian listing. COLIN JAMES sneaked past FROZEN GHOST for second place honors,

as CANDI's "Latin Moon" rose to #4. BARNEY BENTALL rebounded to #5. COREY HART's "Coalmine" tunneled to #6, EYE EYE held on at #9, and a second track from Glass Tiger moved onto the list. In addition to charting, Glass Tiger's "My Song" and Corey Hart remained on a Most Added roster that included a new one from BIG BANG as well.

In a very close race, 1927 edged out JOHN FARNHAM for # 1 on the Australian chart, and DARYL BRAITHWAITE moved into #3. CROWDED HOUSE's "When You Come" climbed to #6, JIMMY BARNES remained at #7, and JOHN FARNHAM's "Strong Hearts" beat into #8. INXS debuted at # 10 and CATFISH reeled in Most Added honors. Congratulations are due reporting station SA-FM/Adelaide for pulling the highest big-city ratings share in Australian history, a 32.7.






CHART SUMMARY


