NAB '89: Politicians Flare Up, Radio Pares Down Participation

New NAB/RAB Campaign Gives Radio The Silent Treatment; Patrick Urges Fairness Fight In Farewell

NAB's 67th annual Convention & International Exposition included FCC Chairman Dennis Patrick's stern farewell address; the first, attentiongetting major public appearance by new RAB President Warren Potash; and the introduction of a promotional campaign called "Radio: What Would Life Be Without It?", whose main feature is 30 seconds of dead air.

NAB pegged attendance at 50,136 for the Las Vegas event, which was themed "Proud Tradition, Dynamic Future." The number of exhibitors declined slightly from last year's 723 to 709

The Sound Of Silence

At Monday's radio luncheon, NAB President/CEO Eddie Fritts said every radio station in the country would be asked to air the new NAB/RAB "Radio: What Would Life Be Without It?" campaign's introductory two-minute spot at 7:42am on Friday, May 26. 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
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Bremer Heads WBBM News, Programming



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

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GM FAIRFAX, PD WEAVER OUT Faison Appointed PD At WAMO

WTUG/Tuscaloosa PD Eric Faison has rejoined Sheridan Broadcasting as PD at the company's WAMO/Pittsburgh, following the resignations last week of GM Roger Fairfax and PD Sam Weaver. Faison previously worked at Sheridan's Starz Entertainment Network a year ago.

Sheridan owner Ron Davenport will handle WAMO GM duties, and said he has no current plans to hire a new GM. Asked why Fairfax and Weaver were leaving despite WAMO's rise in the winter ratings (from 4.6-5.5 for sixth place in the ARB, and from 8.2-8.7 for fourth place in Birch), Davenport told R&R, "Roger Fairfax is a good guy and I have a great deal of respect for him. But there are things that I'd like to see done, and I thought I could do them better myself. Also, because of (Weaver) we're going in the right direction, but I believe Faison has a better feel for this market.

"With my own involvement, I hope to see WAMO go up and do better," Davenport added. "We're going to try to work harder and smarter."

Fairfax, who had been with Sheridan six years and GM at WAMO for the past four, told R&R,

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
"Ron and I have had several discussions over the last few months about how the station should be run and what criteria would be used to judge its success or failure, and we have mutually decided it would be best if I resigned so he could have a more direct hand in running the radio station. There are no great overall differences . . . it's purely style, and I don't hold any ill will toward him. I will continue to consult for Sheridan from time to time."

Fairfax added that he and a group of New York and Pittsburgh broadcasters are developing plans "which should result, in the next six months, in the creation of a new national network — and not an Urban format network."

Weaver, who had been at WAMO for seven months, commented, "I thought we were all on the same course; we pretty much agreed to disagree, and we agreed that I should resign. I was very pleased with our progress from the fall book to the winter book. We were right on target, and I'm sorry I couldn't complete the job."


Discussing his jump from the Tuscaloosa market to Pittsburgh, Faison said, "There are different variables and different situations you have to deal with, maybe politically, but good radio is good radio. We'll make some changes in programming philosophy, and formatically the station can be cleaned up a lot. Musically, it's almost there — but not in the pocket the way it should be, from what I bear. WAMO took a point jump this book, but it should be due for some major increases shortly."

Faison has been in the industry ten years, and his prior programming experience was at a noncommercial station at the beginning of his career. He has also worked at KWWL/Waterloo, IA; WKLR/Toledo; WZAK/Cleveland; and WDMT/Cleveland.

Lawmakers May Delay Renewal Reform Because Of Pay Controversy

The role of radio talk show hosts in whipping up opposition to the proposed Congressional pay raise this year has not been lost on the nation's lawmakers, several of whom expressed their anger at the NAB convention in Las Vegas over the weekend. They warned the industry not to expect quick action on the radio-only license renewal reform bill as a result.

At the session "Radio: A New Regulatory Environment," Rep. John Bryant (D-TX) said he was skeptical about the renewal-reform bill because "you've got a lot of rogue broadcasters out there." He targeted David Gold, a conservative talk show host on Susquehanna Broadcasting's KLIF/Dallas, accusing the broadcaster of fouling the airwaves with "irresponsible" broadcasts.

Gold attracted controversy last year when he apologized for statements he made about the deaths of some illegal Mexican immigrants.

"It's one of the most outrageous pieces of broadcasting in America," Bryant said. "It's dishonest and it's irresponsible. I've commented before about it, but you all are just like lawyers and doctors you don't police your own profession very well. That guy is still on the air on a regular basis."

Bryant challenged panel moderator George Hyde, a Susquehanna Broadcasting executive, to explain why the company allows the controversial talk show host to remain on the air. Hyde defended Gold's First Amendment rights of free speech and said Gold had every right to express his opinion, even if it was offensive to the congressman.

NAB Board member Bill Clark of Shamrock Broadcasting also defended Gold's rights, and noted the public was responsible for the outcry over the pay raise – not broadcasters.

"Yes, there were outrageous comments made on talk shows," Clark said. "I certainly hope that, whatever happens to the future of broadcasting, outrageous commentary will not die. It is what has made this nation great."

"Susquehanna Broadcasting is making money by disseminating irresponsible and totally dishonest and misleading information every afternoon for year after year," Bryant retorted. "If you want to make money doing that, I guess you can do so, but don't come to me and say you don't need any restrictions on you if that's the way you're going to make a living."

Gold Responds To Goo-Goo


Gold later told **R&R** that he's been involved in a running on-air battle with the lawmaker over his liberal voting record and stands on political issues.

"I rip him on the air," Gold said. "I call him goo-goo, which is short for goodie-goodie. I call him a political transvestite. He goes to Washington and votes like George McGovern, then comes home and talks like George Wallace.

"Obviously, the Congressman doesn't understand the First Amendment," Gold continued. "He has an invitation to come on my show any time and any place. He chooses not to. I don't know what he's afraid of."

"I think the real test of our First Amendment rights in America is to endure criticism," Rep. Billy Tauzin (D-LA) told NAB conventioneers. "I don't like it when talk show hosts in my area jump on an issue I'm fond of, but if we're really committed to the whole notion that the First Amendment gives us all the right to say extraordinary things in our society, then we have to be willing to endure the comments that don't particularly please us. There is a line, however."

Rep. Norman Lent (D-NY) said the talk show flap has "muddied the waters," and quick action on renewal reform will not be possible. "Members at this point may be less likely to agree that radio ought to be distinguished from television. I think that's unfortunate, but that happens to be the fact," he said.

In a move designed to give FM broadcasters greater flexibility in responding to growth and change in the areas they serve, the FCC last week voted to allow FM stations to specify a new community of license without opening the door to competing applications. The exisiting policy, the Commission found, had discouraged stations from making beneficial changes by forcing broadcasters to risk the loss of their license. "We should give broadcasters But Commissioner Jim Quel-


"We should give broadcasters flexibility to relocate their stations in response to population shifts and changing economic conditions," said FCC Commissioner Patricia Diaz Dennis. "At the same time we must safeguard the allotment priorities. This item strikes the proper balance by allowing a station to change its community of license only if the change would advance our established allotment priorities." counter to the time-honored policy of fairly distributing licenses to communities throughout the United States." Under the new ruling, the FCC

will grant community of license changes when the new allotment is mutually exclusive with the existing allotment, the switch is deemed to better serve the FCC's allotment priorities and policies, and does not deprive a community of its only existing broadcast station.

The Commission's previous policy allowed competing applications to be filed whenever a licensee or permittee requested a change in its community of license.

Michael Ruger of the Mass Media Bureau said the rule should go into effect by the end of this year.

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Olympia Buys Jim Long Companies

n the biggest deal announced at the NAB Convention, Dallas broadcaster Jim Long has agreed to sell his Jim Long Companies to Seattle-based Olympia Broadcasting Corp. for \$7 million.

The deal includes \$5 million in cash and \$2 million worth of convertible preferred stock, giving Long a 10% stake in Olympia. Longterm performance incentives for the management team and employees also are part of the package.

Long's mini-conglomerate includes jingle-maker and radio syndicator FirstCom Broadcast Services; FirstCom/Music House, which provides music and sound effects libraries; and two music publishing businesses.

Elliot Evers of Media Venture Partners represented Olympia, and Bill Steding of Americom Radio Brokers represented Long in the transaction. Olympia CEO Jamle Ireland said the deal will help bring added marketing punch to his Olympia Broadcast Networks division.

Cole & Weber Switches To Birch

nother big deal unveiled in Vegas over the weekend: Seattle-based Cole & Weber Advertising has contracted to use only Birch/Scarborough Research radio reports over the next five years.

Part of the **Ogilvy Group**, Cole & Weber had 1988 billings of \$93 million and is one of the nation's largest ad agencies. Media director **Ron Jaco** said the deal followed a year of study, and is expected to allow the agency to more effectively target radio buys.

While the value of the contract was not disclosed, Birch/Scarborough Chairman **Tom Birch** predicted the agency's decision would have "substantial impact" in **Top** 30 markets.

NAB Expects Sikes Appointment Soon

AB execs say they're getting signs from the White House that President Bush will nominate National Telecommunications & Information Administration chief Al Sikes as the new FCC Chairman sometime before May 15.

Also expected to be nominated as commissioners are Washington communications lawyer Sherrie Marshall of Wiley, Rein & Fielding, and Andrew Barrett, a member of the Illinois Commerce Commission. Former Mutual Broadcasting attorney Bruce Goodman reportedly has been told he's number four on a list of possible FCC candidates.

Can't Keep Gammon On The Ground

he NAB Convention was particularly hectic for Americom Radio Brokers CEO Tom Gammon. Fresh from all the commotion of the huge Group W/Sillerman deal, Gammon jetted from Washington, DC to Las Vegas Friday (4/28) and arrived just a few minutes before he was scheduled to host the company's cocktail party. Immediately after the event, he jumped a red-eye back to DC so he could attend his sister's wedding on Saturday afternoon.

Immediately after the nuptials, it was back to the airport for another redeye back to Glitter Gulch. After wheeling and dealing all day Sunday, Gammon announced the Olympia-Long deal Monday afternoon — then celebrated by slicing into chocolate cake to mark his 30th birthday.

Quote Of The Convention



One-Man Shops do not have the time or resources to analyze, package and professionally market your stations. One-Man Shops must often resort to high exposure publicity to produce prospective buyers. In the end, one or two top buyers may not have been personally called, increasing the chances that you will leave money on the table.

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
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



dropping the key word "Radio" and telling the audience that \$6000 had been invested in the new industry awareness campaign when in fact the campaign has cost over \$600,000.

On Tuesday, Potash's problems were compounded at an event that had been heavily promoted as his keynote introductory speech as RAB President. Potash shot from the hip without a prepared text, delivering a rambling, almost incoherent 30-minute monologue covering a litany of subjects ranging from declines in newspaper revenue to the literacy of jurors in the Oliver North conspiracy trial to reminiscences about his service in the Israeli army. He said individual stations would have to work harder to increase radio revenues because the RAB lacks resources to do what he believes is needed.

"Now, if you think five people working up in New York City are going to do that, you're in for a big shock, children. Ain't gonna happen," Potash said.

Potash later admitted he had been "getting a few staff people a little bit nervous and stressed out there's a couple in this room who I create a lot of stress for, I pro-mise you I do." During questioning, Potash said he still does not have a strategy for operating the RAB or increasing radio revenues, and could not predict when a plan would be adopted.

"We know we've got a big problem here, but we don't know what to do about it," one RAB board member told R&R. Several other prominent industry figures, who declined to be identified, expressed concern about Potash's conduct and feared that radio's economic gains in recent years may be eroded under his leadership.

Patrick's Farewell

At Tuesday's closing session, Patrick urged broadcasters not to surrender their First Amendment rights and accept congressional efforts to recodify the Fairness Doctrine. He sharply criticized broadcasters who fail to oppose the Doctrine on grounds that it has no effect on corporate profits.

"Your bottom line will indeed come to harm if you accept secondclass status as speakers in this republic," Patrick said. "If you accept government programming requirements, you will lose the flexibility to please your audience while your competition will labor under no such constraints.

Patrick drew applause upon telling broadcasters that the FCC will no longer tolerate extortion in the comparative renewal process, and he promised the Commission would soon act to stop FM translator abuses.

Renewal Reform Top Priority

At Saturday's opening session, Fritts said NAB's "biggest single focus" at present for radio is license renewal reform, and urged broadcasters to contact their congressmen about the issue.

Quello Criticisms Continue

Politics and Capitol Hill maneuvering dominated several sessions. Lawmakers said the broadcasting industry made few friends for its legislative agenda with its on-air crusade last January against Congressional pay raises (see Page 8).

FCC Commissioner Jim Quello was especially harsh in his criticism, saying broadcasters had 'shot themselves in the foot." Speaking at a Sunday morning CC/Congressional breakfast, he said broadcasters were guilty of "irresponsible editorializing" and accused some stations of "abrogation of licensee responsibility.'



He continued, "You have the First Amendment right to be wrong ... like this one guy who was making two or three million dollars a year and was criticizing somebody who's making \$89,000 for getting a pay raise. He had a First Amendment right to be an insufferable smartass."

Welcome To The Jungle

Major parties of the convention included a jungle-setting bash sponsored by Interep, where staffers were outfitted in safari hats and canteens, and a posh affair at the Las Vegas Hilton's Crown Room sponsored by Frazier, Gross & Kadlec, Transtar and Satellite Music Network also entertained the crowd, but most major networks were absent.

In fact, Transtar executives announced they probably will not sponsor hospitality suites at future spring NAB conventions because the programs fail to attract many radio people. "We're tired of feeding and watering television engineers," Transtar President Gary Fries said.

The National Association of Media Brokers announced that it may boycott future spring NAB conventions on the grounds that radio atttendance has dwindled, and in protest of excessive charges levied by the NAB for hospitality suites. This year an up-front fee of about \$700 was demanded of each broker desiring a suite, and the media execs say the amount of business generated no longer makes the fee acceptable.





Putting A Stop To Putting Things Off

utting off until tomorrow what you can do today may be only human nature, but doing so can have an adverse affect on your work performance particularly if you haven't left yourself enough time to do the job right.

The Ontario, Canada-based **Drake International management** firm suggests the following ways to break your procrastination habit: (You can start by reading them now, not later.)

 Admit that you're procrastinating. Learn to recognize when you're postponing a task that you'd rather not do by doing other lessimportant jobs first.

• Set daily priorities. Draw up a list of the tasks you need to accomplish, then do them - in that order. Make yourself stick to your plan.

• Divide projects into managable chunks. It's often easier to complete a series of small tasks than to undertake a seemingly endless job.

• Focus on the finish. Imagine how good you'll feel when the task is completed, and how proud you'll be of a job well done.

• Don't wait for perfection. If you sit around trying to find the perfect solution to every problem, you may never solve a single one. Simply giving a problem some serious thought will likely lead you to some sort of constructive solution.

• Treat yourself when it's over. When you finish a job, reward yourself with something as trivial as a coffee break or - in the case of a particularly unpleasant task a lunch with an old friend.

 Resolve to break the habit forever. Remember, it's often hard to begin a task, but it's always easier to keep going once you've started.

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Encouraging Employee Creativity

y encouraging employees to come up with creative new ways of doing things, managers can not only make better use of their human resources, but also gain a reputation for being open-minded.

Writing in the Personnel Administrator newsletter, management specialist John Lewis III lists the following tips for nurturing the creative climate necessary for the development of new ideas:

• Give your time and attention to employees who present new ideas. Surprisingly overlooked, this noncash reward system is nonetheless highly-effective.

• Let workers know the best times to approach you with new ideas. There are certain times of the day or week that you are more attentive and receptive to new ideas. Figure out when these times occur, and schedule them for discussing an employee's proposal. (While this practice may disappoint some workers, it's better than listening halfheartedly to their ideas - which can create resentment and frustration.)

• Help employees develop their proposed ideas. Managers should be willing to work out a deal (such as signing an "incubation contract") if a worker's proposed idea needs to be further developed or refined before a decision can be made to adopt or reject it.

• Clearly define "off-limits" areas of suggestion. There are usually a few business practices or job aspects for which managers are not - and cannot be - receptive to innovative ideas. Let your staff know which topics are verboten so that they don't waste time pursuing new ideas in those areas.

• Once accepted, give full credit for a new idea to its rightful "innovator." You can build trust and keep employees "idea-productive" by giving credit where credit is due. Steal an idea, and it's a different story.

• Solicit ideas and views from newly-hired employees. These folks have uncontaminated opinions, and may be more willing to offer these thoughts than an office veteran.

You must act quickly, however, because this quality evaporates once the new people get settled in and begin socializing.



America's Grandparents Spend Big Bucks On Grandchildren

Average \$75 Per Child Annually

merica's 54 million grandparents enjoy spending time and money with their grandchildren, expressing their love with remembered birthday cards and letters, personal visits, and with invitations to dinner.

According to the NYC-based Roper Organization, 55% of America's grandparents say that they see their grandchildren often, and another 23% are "occasional" visitors. What's more, "typical" grandparents – with an average of 3.3 grandchildren – spend a median of \$250 (about \$75 per child) annually on their young namesakes.

Affluents Spend More On Fewer

Not surprisingly, affluent grandparents (with annual incomes of \$35,000 or more) spend more money on their grandchildren – averaging \$300 per year. However, this group's actual expenditures per child are \$150 (twice the amount average grandparents spend) because affluent grandparents have a median of only two grandchildren. Although they do just as many things for and with their grandchildren, nearly half of affluent grandparents (compared to about. 30% of non-affluent types) say that they live "far away" from their little darlings.

LISTY

Grandmas Are A Softer Touch

Individually, grandmothers are more likely than grandfathers to dole out dollars on their grandchildren. During January 1989, 53% of grandmothers bought a gift for a grandchild compared to 38% of grandfathers. Similarly, more grandmothers than grandfathers sent birthday or holiday cards (39% vs. 29%), took a grandchild out for a meal (31% vs. 25%), and took a grandchild shopping (30% vs. 20%).

A majority (57%) of grandparents are more than 60 years old, nearly a third (32%) are aged 45-59, and 11% are below the age of 44. Most grandparents (60%) have grandchildren under the age of five, while only 40% have grandchildren over the age of 17.


30 Million Adults Suffer From Food Allergies

while moving toward higher levels of health-consciousness, Americans are spending more time and money evaluating their physical reactions to foods and investigating food products still on the shelves.

According to the Philadelphiabased Consumer Network, many people are checking out ingredients because of actual *and* hypothetical food allergies. Products containing cow's milk protein, egg whites, various kinds of nuts, wheat, soy, yeast, tomatoes, strawberries, and seafood are at the heart of the food allergy controver-

The medical community is divided over the nature of food allergies and the number of Americans suffering from them. However, reliable estimates claim that between 28 and 34 million adults (and about 5% of all children) are victims.

Since the major food manufacturers have yet to seize upon the needs of this "new" consumer, smaller food manufacturers especially health food specialists stand to profit from the health-conscious trend.

Cold Coffee-In-A-Can

G ood news for those who prefer their coffee cold and quick: Iced coffee in cans and instant-powdered coffees are heading toward US supermarket shelves.

With coffee-drinking down and prices up, manufacturers are trying to sell Americans on alternative ways to consume the piping hot beverage. According to the Washington DC-based Coffee Development Group, iced coffee is being positioned as a soft-drink alternative for the younger market.

One coffee concoction you're likely to see soon is "Blue Mountain Gold Iced Coffee" from San Francisco-based Prince Of Peace Enterprises. Packaged in 8.5 ounce, pop-top cans, it's flavored with milk and sugar, contains 110 calories, and will be available in convenience stores in the Northeast, Southeast, and on the West Coast. Black decaffeinated and "nutra-sweetened" versions of the java drink are scheduled to arrive next month.

Brew In-A-Bag, Too

Other mixes and blends on the way include General Foods International's "Iced Cappuccino Frappe" (one of eight instant coffees the company has planned to sell for \$2.99 this summer) and Folger's "Coffee Singles" (which – similar to tea bags – are individually wrapped, bagged-blends that brew up enough for one cup). Although there's no national distribution date set, boxes of the bags should cost between \$2.69 (for 19) and \$5 (for 38).

Home Security System Sales Top \$7 Billion

S ince buying a home is one of the most valuable investments your listeners will most likely make, it's not surprising that many Americans are taking home-security measures above and beyond conventional window locks.

According to estimates from the Santa Monica, CA-based Security Equipment Industry Association, sales of home-security systems and devices increased by \$1 billion last year — climbing from \$6.3 billion in 1987 to approximately 7.3 billion in 1988.

Furthermore, sales of all types of home security equipment – as well as automobile protection devices – have been steadily growing by 20% annually over the past few years.

Residential protection systems currently cost an average of \$1564. And although the US Justice Department claims that 80% of all urban households, 70% of suburban homes, and 60% of rural residences will be burglarized within the next 20 years, only 8% of the nation's homes currently have security systems.



CD-Quality Music Coming To Cable TV

ust what radio needs, more in-home competition. Pending a final agreement between two of the nation's largest cable TV companies, America's cable households may soon be tuning in to "CD/8" – a compact discquality, eight-channel service of NYC-based International Cablecasting Technologies Inc.'s Digital Music Network

Along with offering consumers a choice of eight, radio-like formats, the music-only service - no commercials and no air personalities uses a patented technology to compress digital sound onto a video signal, which is then transmitted via satellite to individual cable systems without interference or loss in sound quality.

When this video signal arrives at subscriber households, a special device routes the audio portion of the signal into a digital tuner that's attached to the subscriber's stereo system. (This digital tuner will sell for \$100 or rent for between \$5 and

\$7 per month.)

Denver, CO-based Tele-Communications Inc. - controller of systems with about 10 million subscribers nationwide - has recently signed an agreement in principle with the music network to distribute "CD/8" to about four million cable homes, according to reports in the Wall Street Journal.

First DAT

Recorders Available In US

mericans can - for the first time - walk into some of the nation's more upscale consumer electronics stores and purchase Japanese-made consumer Digital Audio Tape (DAT) recorders - the kind that make flawless recordings of compact discs (and other sound sources).

Torrance, CA-based Nakamichi America Corp. recently made its DAT "Model 1000" recorder available to consumers despite two years of fierce protests from US record companies and threats of legal action (for copyright infringement) by the RIAA.

According to recent Wall Street Journal reports, Nakamichi aims to avoid potential legal hurdles by making the DAT recorders - priced at around \$10,000 - available only through the following purchasing process:

Instead of selling the machines, US dealers will simply put them on display. To actually purchase the recorder, customers must send an order form and a cashier's check directly to the company's Tokyo headquarters.


CBS's Starry-Eyed Confab

LETTER DJs' TV **Problems A** Thing Of The Past

As I read the article "Should Everyone Be A TV Star?" (R&R, 2/24), I was frankly amazed that so uninformed a piece should be in R&R. Of course everyone is entitled to an opinion, but Mr. Messer obviously knows nothing about his subject.

Years ago the conventional wisdom was that most jocks have great faces for radio, and that putting a jock on TV would destroy the public's mental image of him. As we at Film House have found out over the last five years, nothing could be further from the truth.

Almost every major jock in the country has appeared on television in spots for their stations. The vast majority of these have produced such good results that it has changed the business. Now it's not unusual for a station looking for a morning personality to request the jock's TV tape.

The bottom line is that, as a result of TV exposure, radio personalities have become general media personalities to the enormous benefit of the radio industry. Mr. Messer's remarks reflect no understanding of this and might have well been written six years ago. -Tony Quin



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

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We live in a land of choices. Radio Talk Programming offers many – with some paying off better than others. So when KPRC, Houston, made the change to Tom Snyder they saw their decision pay off with a jump from a 2.1 to a 6.1 in Adults 25-54. Sally Jessy Raphael took them from a 1.8 to a 3.4. KCMO, Kansas City, reaped a reward with Sally going from a 3.6 to a 9.9. KEX, Portland, rode with Tom Snyder from a 7.6 to a whopping 12.3 in a single year. Others like WRKO and KSTP had similar successes with Sally and Tom. Sally's up from a 2.4 to a 4.9 in Boston. Tom took the Twin Cities from a 1.5 to a 6.2! And it's happening all over the country. You've got to admit, their

Going To Bat For The Diary

Atlanta's only score in a game against Montreal on May 26, 1971 was Sonny Jackson's home run. Teammate Henry Aaron failed to hit a homer. Who was the better hitter? Although Jackson certainly outperformed Aaron on that fateful day, he finished the '71 season with only two home runs. Aaron finished with 47.

No sports fan would ever judge a baseball player's performance based on a single game or one at-bat. At Arbitron, we feel the same way about radio ratings.


While there are a lot of ways to judge a ratings service, a critical factor that affects the reliability of audience estimates is the number of observations of the behavior being measured. It's axiomatic that the

greater the number of observations, the more stable the estimates. What constitutes an observation? In radio, the basic unit is one day of radio listening behavior.

Seven Days Of Listening


For the same reason the World Series is a sevengame contest, Arbitron's diary collects seven days of listening from each respon-

dent. Unlike a "what did you listen to yesterday?" query, the diary gives a station six additional times at bat.

In the real world of radio, this concept is crucial. Data users look for reliability – the measure of confidence that station ratings shifts reflect real marketplace changes and not statistical "bounce." With the sevenday diary, Arbitron collects more observations per respondent, which means more reliability for the reported estimates.

Let's look at the impact of more observations per respondent in a single market, Houston-Galveston, during the fall 1988 survey (see accompanying chart). The Arbitron report used diaries from 2171 respondents, while the Birch survey interviewed 3174. How many observations of listening behavior did each service use to estimate the morning drive audience?

Only 1650 Birch respondents contributed listening information for a day during the Monday-Friday period. The remaining individuals were surveyed for their Saturday or Sunday listening. All 2171 Arbitron respondents reported listening for each of the five weekdays, as well as Saturday and Sunday.

This means Arbitron's morning drive estimates were based on 10,855 persons/days of listening (2171 multiplied by five), whereas the competing service used only 1650 persons/ days. Not only were the Arbitron morning drive estimates based on more respondents, but also upon five times as many observations.

Comparing Quarter-Hours


Another way of looking at the observations-per-respondent issue is to compare the number of reported quarter-hours used to tabulate the ratings.

In an independent analysis, Donohue Research & Marketing purchased six months of raw respondentlevel data from both Arbi-

tron and Birch for Greensboro-Winston Salem-High Point (December 1986-May 1987; see chart). Sample sizes were similar - 2348

for Arbitron; 2271 for Birch. For the first time, radio research users were able to see actual counts of collected quarter-hours from the two services. As illustrated, Arbitron's estimates were projected based on approximately 208,000 actual quarter-hours of reported listening tabulated from the Greensboro-Winston Salem-High Point market. For that each respondent's listening patterns on Monday are exactly the same on Tuesday and so on. This simply is not the case.

Also in the same analysis, Donohue Research noted that the Arbitron diary showed more stations per person. Seventy percent of diarykeepers reported listening to two or more stations, compared with only

the same period, the Birch estimates were based on an under-30,000 total.

By way of analogy, imagine two color television screens. Which one would provide a clearer, more precise picture: the screen using 208,000 dots to transmit its image or a similarsized screen with only 30,000 dots?

Some may argue that you could simply multiply the single day quarter-hours by seven to yield 210,000 quarter-hours (to project a week's listening habits). That approach assumes 25% of Birch respondents, who provided listening for only one day.

Who's the better hitter? A seven-game series is a better indicator than a single winner-take-all contest. In the radio game, your station deserves more than a single time at bat.

Attracting Active Trendsetters

Music Consumers' TV Viewing Opens Advertising Avenues

Care to figure out how to reach the active trendsetters who'll tell others about your radio station? Or your music product? Read on.

The outcome of an updated Street Pulse Group survey of music consumers' TV viewing habits found "The Cosby Show" still on top — one out of five indicated it's one of their three faves. It's stronger with teens than adults; with females than males.

Two other NBC Thursday night programs cornered second and third. "Cheers" rose to a 14.9 score, a jump of nearly three percentage points since the last poll at the end of September (before the delayed opening of the '88-'89 season). "Cheers" scored twice as high among men and its demograpic attraction is 16-44. "L.A. Law" posted strong viewing 21+.

'Roseanne' Debuts

Newcomer "Roseanne" finished fourth in its first appearance on the list. Not surprisingly, it's twice as popular with women as men, and its numbers are highest among viewers 25-44.

Extraterrestrial "ALF" took a slight two-point tumble, falling from fourth to sixth and from an 11% mention to nine percent. "Growing Pains" showed a big dropoff from preseason and from numbers it generated a year ago. "Family Ties," in its last year, also fell



drastically from the year prior.

er newcomers to the top 20 (compared to the preseason poll) were "The Wonder Years" (tenth) and "China Beach" (12th). "China Beach" would be a great show for advertising an AOR station; "The Wonder Years" a good spot for CHR commercials.

Besides "Roseanne," oth-

"Thirtysomething" maintained its strong yuppie appeal. "Star Trek: The Next Generation" held down 14th place, popular with males across all age groups. "Wiseguy" did not benefit from this poll, which was taken prior to its recent music industry storyline.

WALKMAN OUTPACES THE PACK

Electronic Shopping Lists

Street Pulse Group recently asked consumers to choose the electronic items they'd be most likely to purchase in the next three months. The top four finishers:

 Walkman/personal stereos with headphones - One in ten consumers checked will buy or probably will buy. Yet I can't remember the last time I heard a radio station give one away. Sure, you could say you don't want listeners listening to tapes, but try this on for size: they have one or they're going to buy one. Wouldn't it be great equity for the station to give them what they really want? Younger consumers want them the most.

• VCRs — People have begun to look at VCRs as disposable, and it has also become important to have multiple players in the home. The desire for a new VCR is equally strong across all sex and age groups.

• CD players — Seven percent of the panelists said they would definitely buy or probably buy a CD player for the home. Those who are the most adamant are those who are the youngest. A station-sponsored CD player giveaway — something that went out of vogue two years too early — still makes a great deal of sense. People who don't have one want one, and those who have one want another: a newer model with more bells and whistles.

• Portable CD players — If these were combined with their in-house counterparts, CD machines would have claimed number one in the poll. The desire for portable players ranked highest among 16- and 17-yearolds. Radio stations and labels can band together on giveaways. After all, new player users are new disc buyers. And they would also be very contented listeners if radio played Santa Claus.

RADIO AIRPLAY FRONTRUNNER

Music Buying: The Seven Stimuli

There's a profound difference between music consumers' and critics' likes/dislikes. When asked to choose between seven stimuli – critic's review, feature article, ad in a publication, a friend's recommendation, radio airplay, music video, and record store display – respondents put radio airplay on top and critics' opinions at the bottom.

Using a scale of "Very Important," "Somewhat Important," and "Not At All Important," 82% of the active consumers said radio is very important to their music-buying decisions. Next up is video, which has overtaken iword of mouth and friend's rec-

ommendation. Video was very important to 47% and somewhat important to another 35%. Only 17% said it wasn't at all important.

Four percent indicated a critic's review is very important, while 35% said it

was somewhat important and 59% said it wasn't significant at all. A review is outpolled only by print ads and in-store displays when it comes to lack of importance.

For the first quarter of '89, Street Pulse Group found that only three percent of nearly 2000 actual purchases were attributed to an article or review. Radio marched out front to the tune of 31%, followed by instore browsing (16%) and word of mouth (12%).

Women Making **Gains In CHR**

But Female Vocalists Hit Alltime Low In AOR

A couple of years ago I did a series on the percentage of male and female, and group vs. solo, singers in the main formats. It seemed like about time to check in to see if there had been any dramatic changes.

This week I'll look at CHR and AOR: next week UC and AC; and then Country and overall conclusions. The previous columns covered year-end Top 15 listings through 1986, so I'll recap '87 and '88, with the latter year's figures graphed. As in the earlier surveys (May 22, 1987 and June 19, 1987 for CHR and AOR, respectively), the categories were Male (Solo) Vocal, Female (Solo) Vocal, Male Vocal (Group or Duo), Female Vocal (Group or Duo), and Duet (special-event, noncustomary pairings).

Good thing I looked. Female vocalists are making a notable run on the CHR charts. Solo female singers obliterated their previous high, accounting for 21.6% of the CHR Top 15 hits in 1988. (Best figure before was 16.2% in 1984.) In 1987, groups or duos featuring female vocals set a record at 14.2% (actually tying the female solo vocalist number); the '88 figure was back down to 9%, but adding that to female soloists' 21.6%



brings the female vocal grand total to 30.6% (see table above).

That's the first time that percentage has ever exceeded the 30% mark, and it topped 1987's cumulative 28.4%, which had set a new record itself by beating 1986's 25.8%. What we have is a threeyear trend of increasing femalesung hits that goes like this:



Something had to drop to make room for the big female solo singer boom in CHR, but it wasn't male solo singers. They went from 26% in 1987 to 36.6% last year - not a record (that's 1974's 44.8%) but a

big jump. Groups with male vocals, however, tumbled from 42% (an average level) to 32.8%, a near-record low.

Adding up the male and female solo vocal percentages produces a 58.2% figure, which is a new record for solo artists. In '87 that number was just 40.5%, so we've got a radical change going here.

> **AOR: Females Need** Not Apply

Well, if there were gains for female singers in CHR, it's not a message AOR wants to hear. In previous analyses, based on the AOR Album stats, AOR has been by far the most male-dominated format, as much as 91% in a couple of years.

I switched to the Tracks charts for '87 and '88, which may account for consecutive records being set for male solo vocalists (35.4% in '87, 35.8% last year). Male-vocal groups accounted for 58.5% of the Top 15 tracks in '87, bringing the male vocal total to 93.9%

That was just a prelude, however. The male-vocal group percentage jumped to 61.1% last year, while female solo singers hit a near-low 1.5% and female-vocal groups bottomed out at the same figure after achieving a 1978-86 average of almost 5%. Male vs. female totals for 1988: 97-3%. Call in the sociologists

As in CHR, there is a trend toward solo artists vs. groups: The nine-year average figure for combined male/female solo artists on the album charts was just under 30%, but for the last two years it's been over 37%.

CMJ Albums: A New Rock Complement

Last issue we switched from the Top 20 CMJ tracks plus up-andcomers to a similar number of albums from CMJ's Radio Top 100 chart. This move will give you pret-30 New Rock tracks, using primarily commercial stations as a reporter base with a selection of the most prominent college outlets; and albums from CMJ, which has by far the most extensive reporter roster, college and commercial, of any publication dealing in New Rock.

CMJ, as part of its tenth anniversary celebration, just produced a poster listing all its #1 albums (and tracks), from Elvis Costello ("Armed Forces," seven weeks at the top in March/April '79) through R.E.M. ("Green," the last four weeks of 1988).

It's interesting to see the evolution in the format from early charttoppers like lan Hunter, the Cars, Led Zeppelin, and Supertramp to last year's Sugarcubes, Camper Van Beethoven, and Firehose. Longest time spent at No. 1, by the way, was 15 weeks for the Clash's "Combat Rock" in 1982.

on Jovi, Motley Crue, the Scorpions, and Gorky Park will headline a history-making "Moscow Music And Peace Summit" concert to be taped live on August 12 and 13 at Moscow's Lenin Stadium back in the USSR.

Each day an estimated 140,000 fans will fill the stadium for the first-ever musical performances, all proceeds from which will be donated to the Make A Difference Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to combating drug and alcohol abuse among young people.

The two-day extravaganza will be presented by MTV, whose VJs will host the event. Also in the US. Showtime Event Television will air the historic concert's highlights on August 13 via a four-hour, primetime, pay-per-view special that will be simulcast by Westwood One.

Anti-Drug Album Planned

In addition, Polygram is planning to release an album that will feature tracks from each band participating in the Moscow concert. The bands will perform songs by groups who have lost a member to substance abuse (!), and all proceeds will again go to the Make A Difference Foundation. All profits from the USSR album sales and concert proceeds will go to the All-Union Society For Sobriety, a similar Soviet organization.

Global Environmental Awareness Concert Coming



Make Your Listeners Work And Pay Them Nothing

Listeners know everything. There's not a question you can ask on the air that can't be answered by an expert on the subject, somewhere out in your audience. In response to my column about that (R&R, 3/24), Lee Jolly said he's been milking information from KFMK/Houston listeners well nigh onto 15 years now.

Lee didn't have to put much effort into writing me a letter describing the resource he calls his "Vast & Unpaid Research Department" — he just sent a copy of one he wrote last year and signed it "Great Minds, Etc."

"I do a morning show with a newsperson/partner . . . and one of us will sometimes pose a question to the other that we cannot answer. Normally, this is a situation a 'real' newscaster wants to avoid; the newscaster wants to maintain that 'thoroughly informed' air.

"However, we feel free to admit it. (This) keeps us on an 'only human' basis as far as our relationship with our listener goes (rather than preaching to him from a position of 'authority').

CALENDAR

"If we have a question we wonder about it aloud and invite the Vast & Unpaid Research Department to phone in the information. People just *love* to have an opportunity to contribute to our show. We will invariably get several calls in the next few minutes from folks who know.

"I try to get to the phones as quickly as I can, and when the tape is ready we redo the setup: "We were just wondering what was the last movie Greta Garbo appeared in, and the Vast & Unpaid Research Department came through again!' Then we roll the tightlyedited tape of the listener, announce the person's name, and send out a nicely-printed little piece on heavy paper. This looks like a proclamation or a degree, and is a 'contract' (saying) the listener is now officially employed but, of course, must remain unpaid.

"Most listeners are just delighted to receive their contracts; many are displayed at home or at the workplace."

Thanks, Lee, for sharing your technique. I guess this makes you an officially-employed and equallyunpaid member of Brad's Half-Vast Research Department. Maybe I'll send you a Half Vast certificate sometime.

(By the way, Garbo's last film was "Two-Faced Woman," released in 1941.)



Rx For Air Talent Burnout

In radio, longevity can be a double-edged sword. Stations with a great heritage often carry a lot of "baggage," making them vulnerable to a new competitor. The same vulnerability can occur with on-air staffers who have been at the same station too long, have made a career of being in the same market, or have been victimized by too many jobs with uncaring management.

While the causes of air talent burnout may be easy to identify, there are few easy answers to the problem. Three industry veterans - KSND/Eugene, OR PD/morning man Bwana Johnny, WBSB (B104)/Baltimore off-air PD Chuck Morgan, and WYHY (Y107)/Nashville afternoon driver Gary Jeff Walker - related different potential solutions.

After The Great Adventure

A radio junkie for 30 years, Bwana Johnny's name has been connected with legendary calls from the '60s and '70s like KYA/ San Francisco, KJR/Seattle, WFUN/Miami, and WWDJ/New York, "as well as a lot of smaller markets like Cheyenne, WY, and more than I can remember," he confessed. "Early in my career money and benefits weren't the big factors. Just the idea of moving to a bigger station in a new market was motivation enough. It was nothing for me to pick up and move on - just pack up the stuff in my car or a trailer and go. It was a great adventure.'

personality on the staff, and if not properly formatted, it becomes burned in a matter of days. Once again, the challenge is gone."

Quoting a few pearls of radio wisdom, Johnny said, "I was once told the most common mistake a DJ can make can be summed up in a rule: never surprise your boss or supervisor. Air talents are known for stumbling on what they think is a brilliant idea at 4am and then airing it without talking with their PDs. Then they get yelled at and become inhibited. On the other hand, (consultant) Bill Drake once told me, 'You look for talent who can creatively break the rules.' Those are the people you let go of and every now and again pull them in a bit to show them you're listening."

Challenge Airstaff

As a PD and air talent, Johnny has a better handle than many programmers on the need for airstaff motivational maintenance. "If the PD isn't involving his airstaff in projects that challenge them and spark their imaginations beyond doing their airshifts and production, then he's looking for a potential burnout.


"My midday guy Clarke Moore has been in the market for years and with KSND for about a year. If things become too routine he's going to come off bored, which will translate to the audience. I encourage him to give me input to

make his show special. Then he's unafraid to ask questions and offer input about the station in general."

While money, benefits, and other practical items may be higher on an air talent's personal agenda than they were years ago, Bwana

In the intervening years, Johnny has found that sometimes it's difficult to maintain motivation, "especially in a situation where a format is rigid. In cases like this it gets monotonous to work. Suddenly any new idea is picked up by every air

THE MAILBAG Ratings: 'Hearing' Vs. 'Listening'

KMEN & KGGI/Riverside-San Bernardino, CA GM Steve Virissimo wrote to take issue with Diary Experts President Todd Doren's letter about the Colram diary (R&R, 4/7). Excerpts from Virissimo's letter follow.

With all due respect to Mr. Doren, his letter did not make any reference to the biggest change in the Colram diary: its semantic structure. No longer does Arbitron ask the "listener" what radio station he listened to, but instead asks what station he "heard." Some form of the word "listen" is used, by my count, 18 times in Mr. Doren's letter. His theory and point are only applicable to books prior to last fall. It has become very evident that the PURs (persons using radio) and the TSL (time spent listening) have increased solely because of the changes in the Colram diary.

I have serious reservations about relying on ratings figures that reflect radio "heard" rather than "listened to." As an example, I volunteered to participate in my sales department's weekly monitor pro'irissimo's letter follow. gram. Each salesperson is assigned to monitor a radio station to find out which advertisers are utilizing that station. I was assigned to

the local Beautiful Music station.

I started monitoring today (4/12) at 10am and finally realized at 4:30pm (without a lunch break) that six-and-a-half hours had passed. However, because I had "heard" this station but did not "listen" to it, I could not recall one commercial message during the entire six-and-a-half-hour period. Technically, if I was participating in the Arbitron diary, I would write down that I "heard" radio station KXXX for six-and-a-half hours. KXXX would get credit for 26 quarter-hours. Unfortunately, not only did I not "listen" to the music, I also did not "listen" to the commercials.

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It scares me to think this rating information would be utilized to sell a retail client on giving up hard-earned marketing/advertising monies to advertise on this station, only for the client to find that it would not generate the expected results. Radio is setting itself up for a failure, specifically with these types of formats.

Mr. Doren makes comments that he suggests that CHR stations "play to the strengths of the Colram Diary and become more listening span-oriented." Some of his suggestions include more music sweeps (how many can you get in a hour?), less commercials (I don't believe CHRs play any more than most Easy Listening stations), and longer playlists (most CHRs play contemporary music: Easy Listening stations have 20-30 years of music to put together their playlists. However, most of their music sounds the same anyway, doesn't it? I hear it, but I don't listen to it).

Johnny points out that money isn't always the ultimate motivator. "If someone suddenly starts sounding stale, take him aside and find out why. Everyone can fall into a mental rut no matter how big the paycheck. When I can go to markets and listen to other stations it refreshes me. I often make out-oftown airchecks available to my staff, and it makes an impact.

"If I find after a continued period that a show is becoming more of a job than a performance, the DJ needs to remember that it's show biz. I don't believe in threats because that tack often increases the potential for burnout. It's better to occasionally call up when DJs least expect it and praise them. It makes them take pride in what they're doing again."

PD As Catalyst

Like Johnny, Morgan believes it isn't always money that matters. "I've seen cases where people who have been in radio for many years couldn't get excited about what they're doing anymore no matter how much money was involved. That's one of the reasons I got off the air," he explained. "The other was that I wanted to program and become more involved in the creative process than just executing someone else's ideas.

"While it all comes down to how self-motivated you are, the PD is the catalyst. If you have goals for your people then they have something to work for; goals can motivate them. But if they're tired of their jobs, a long overdue vacation might be the band-aid for the problem. If burnout quickly recurs, then there is something else at work."

Morgan suggested that a selfcritique may sometimes be in order. "Are the records so tightly rotated that they're adding to the problem? Are the liners fresh? Are the promotions a bit stale? While we do grow tired of these elements faster than the audience, seeing burnout among more than one airstaff member may be a clue (that something's wrong)."

"Some successful air talents in their early 30s may lose the fire







and the emotional involvement. Many of us got into radio because we love music and sometimes we grow away from that original interest. You get a house in the 'burbs, a wife, a kid or two, and suddenly you're removed from the core and its interests.

"In cases like this, DJs are no longer cranked up about what they're doing. They still sound good, but a younger jock will put the extra effort in. When I started I'd have done radio for free. The real successful on-air people are self-motivators who've never forgotten what got them there."

Dealing with those air talents who feel they have been shafted continually over the years can pose difficulties. "Support is key to getting the best from them," Morgan said. "They've built up resistance and have some real fears about their performance." His advice to "To avoid becoming a victim of too many bad situations, explore your job opportunities thoroughly.

Don't take a job just for the money or you might get hosed again."

CHR

While some PDs might take a non-performer and put him on a 30-day deadline, Morgan prefers to draw on someone's strengths and minimize his weaknesses. "I might invite him over to my house or have a dinner with him in a more relaxed attitude and see if something is bothering him. There are so many ego-driven people in this business, and many air personalities are afraid to ask questions. Just as in sports, you have to execute the fundamentals to win. If you don't sell the calls, the promotions, and the new music because you're bored you shortchange not only the station but the audience."

Get Busy

Walker, who has held down afternoons at Y107 since 1985, confessed there are times when he feels burnout taking hold. "The problem is you have to be 'on' all the time. If your life is crumbling around you, you still have to smile. People who work in non-entertainment or nine-to-five non-interactive jobs can vent their emotions. while I have to put on a front, especially at the numerous personal appearances I make."

Walker has his own way of dealing with burnout. "Usually, I try to drown myself in my work. When I feel burned out or less motivated it's because I'm not doing enough, so I get busy. I force myself to get active and it works. On the other hand, when I get so busy with my projects outside of the station that they add to the stress, I've learned to say no and refocus on my primary job."

One of the more interesting ways Walker handles his problems is to share them with the audience. "Level with them, tell them you're having a crummy day, and then do on-air primal scream therapy. I think everyone can relate. But having a PD who will let me just talk it out with him is the best. (Y107 PD) Marc Chase understands the problems of being on-air. DJs are real people with real problems who can't always be shits 'n' giggles."

PROMOTIONAL SPOTLIGHT

KUPD's SpringFest '89

Fragmentation has made it essential for stations to search constantly for ways to distinguish themselves from the crowd. Producing a mass-appeal concert/lifestyle event is one of the most popular promotions AORs employ to cut through the clutter and enhance station image.

KUPD/Phoenix's four-day "SpringFest '89," one of several fundraisers the station conducts during the year, is a perfect example of the type of large-scale promotion AORs do so well. Over 25,000 people paid between five and seven dollars to attend the extravaganza, with proceeds benefitting the Muscular Dystrophy Foundation.

"I look at events like SpringFest as alternative advertising," explains KUPD VP/Programming Ernesto Gladden. "There comes a time when your market is completely saturated with traditional forms of advertising. For example, if you launch a billboard campaign

and your competitors put up as many billboards as you do, where's the benefit? If you have a major TV campaign and your competitors do the same, what differentiates you? SpringFest sets us apart from the pack. And anytime you promote rock 'n' roll for a good cause, there's nothing but positive image for the station."

The venue for this year's Spring-Fest (the third annual) was Big Surf water park, which agreed to

cut its take to one dollar per admission. "They usually get a lot more per head, but they want to work with us because it's good public relations," notes Gladden. "They know they're associating with a good cause." The station took over the whole park; anyone who showed up got to experience SpringFest.

Carnival Enhances Event

KUPD enhanced Big Surf's appeal by turning the parking lot into a carnival, complete with rides and attractions. "There's a certain mystique about carnival rides and rock 'n' roll," Gladden says. "They just seem to go well together. Visually, it was great to approach the park and see the ferris wheel's neon lights in the distance."

The first three days of Spring-Fest were highlighted by concerts, including performances by Big Bam Boo on Thursday; Tesla, House Of Lords, and Warrant on Friday; and the Fabulous Thunderbirds and Concrete Blonde on Saturday.



ALBUM ORIENTED ROCK

Sunday was deemed "Family Day" and featured food booths, lifestyle concessions, and a variety of appropriate activities, including sand castle building, a treasure hunt, and a tug-o-war. "We definitely wanted to have a day without loud rock bands one after another," Gladden says. "Sunday was basically a day to sit in the sand, do the water rides, enjoy the carnival, eat the international food, and maybe pick up a 98KUPD T-shirt. It was a very relaxing day."

On the other hand, Friday was anything but relaxing. "It was a real rock 'n' roll zoo," says Gladden — and he's not complaining. More than 12,000 fans packed the park for the show, a triple bill enhanced by a surprise cameo by Def Leppard's Rick Savage. As Gladden says, "Not a bad deal for seven bucks!"

Actually, attendees who took advantage of a two-dollar discount by showing KUPD listener cards got



in for even less than that. The luckiest enjoyed the festivities free of charge; the station produced a special four-day pass which was packaged with product from the performing groups for on-air giveaways. "It makes for a real nice contest," Gladden says. "It also adds to the event's image, because you're using the same promotional tactics you use to support any major concert event."

Event sponsorship was provided by Budweiser and two local sponsors (a car dealer and TV station). The enormous entertainment needs – booking the bands, getting them to the show, and arranging for staging, sound, and lights – were handled by an independent agency that specializes in such matters. Gladden strongly advises against trying to manage everything yourself.

Outside Help A Must

"Your basic staff already has a pretty full load with normal day-today station operations," he explains. "You need outside help to produce an event of this magnitude. Just coordinating all the different elements and making sure everything stays mellow and works out takes quite a bit of time."

Security is another matter KUPD left to the experts. "When you have 12,000 people in one place on one night, a certain number of things are going to happen," says Gladden. "When they occur, you want people around who deal with those things on a daily basis. You've got to have pros."

Gladden adds, "Putting together an event like this certainly changed my perception of what it takes to put a major concert together. Normally a station's involvement is working out the advertising, giveaways, and backstage arrangements with the promoter. It's

much more detailed than that when you produce the event. Even though you contract out certain duties, it's still a monumental task to pull it off. We're talking 12 hours a day, six to seven days a week, for 20-30 days prior to the event."

Many of those hours went toward advertising the event. KUPD produced a :60 TV spot which integrated appropriate video from the performing bands. "Once the producer understood what we wanted to do he said, 'Oh, we're making our own music video, are we?'" A number of full-page newspaper ads also had to be created.


The station fulfilled sponsor mention requirements by producing spots which were scheduled as part of the regular commercial inventory. (Approximately 100 SpringFest spots ran.) In addition, jocks logged almost 200 liners touting the event and its sponsors. "We took care of the sponsors up front with the commercials," Gladden says. "The additional mentions just made them *happier*." When you factor in all the unscheduled mentions, such as whenever a scheduled group was played, you can see the event was well-publicized.

such as when the last-minute addition of Tesla required the stage to be lengthened by 14 feet — you milk it for all it's worth.

Gladden says it's important to focus on the charitable aspect of the event. "We try to project a very straight-ahead attitude. There's no need for hype when you're doing a benefit like this. The image you get is generated at the point of perception, not presentation.

"Teamwork is crucial – we couldn't have done this unless everyone on the staff worked together, and they did a tremendous job. We also couldn't have done this without the cooperation of the bands and the labels."

Thinking about starting up your own SpringFest-type promotion? Gladden echoes the recommendations of other programmers when he suggests to start small. "Start the way we did, with a basic rock 'n' roll show. You build a reputation and start to get contacts. As the event grows, your expertise grows."

Bits Plentiful

As the beginning of SpringFest grew near, KUPD personalities began to add what Gladden calls the "color." One of the benefits of this type of large-scale, multifaceted promotion is that it provides jocks with an endless array of bits. Each new element that falls into place adds to the excitement. Every time a band is added to the bill, that's news. When the carnival rides go up, it's a perfect time for a discussion of ferris wheels. And when the unexpected occurs —



Critiquing Air Talent

PDs Find Checklist, Group Sessions Boost Morale And Performance

Many PDs find it helpful to conduct critiques of air talent, but the process harbors perils as well as benefits. Two UC programmers share constructive methods that strengthen rather than undermine on-air presentation, overall performance, and station spirit.

Teach Your Talent

WTUG/Tuscaloosa, AL PD Eric Faison is a ten-year industry vet who uses critique sessions as an opportunity to teach his airstaff and finds the learning goes both ways. "(Critiques are) not necessarily for the purpose of working on programming formatics, but to develop the airstaff's communica-

tion and thought processes. "I hold weekly sessions with my staff, and we all learn from each other. There are times when one of our DJs will point out something in the format delivery that makes the on-air execution easier. Then there are times I bring something to their attention that makes their jobs easier. It's a two-way street.'

Faison complains that "too many PDs just let their people go for broke and give them no positive feedback. There should be more positive than negative feedback."

Using Checklists

Thoroughness is important, too. Faison has formulated a checklist of all the important elements in the station's format to make sure nothing is missed during a session. This critique sheet also includes content points specific to particular shows.

'We deal with things like how to get in and out of stopsets, using the call letters, how we might want to say the calls with different types of emotion, and remembering to either regularly intro or back-sell the



record with the artist's name and title," reports Faison. "We're dealing with the basics that really make a station sound good and informative.

"Content is very important; a radio station is only as good as its content. So we discuss what fits into our station's image and presentation, and what that image should

many PDs. "You have to allocate your time properly," Faison says. Otherwise, it can't be done. What's most important in my job at this point is the stage of our air





Bloody Good Show In Fresno

Here's a roundup of the people and promotions making radio news around the country.

• KNAX/Fresno helped put an extra 551 pints of blood into the local blood bank during a promotion that broke records for the amount of blood donated in one week. To qualify for the grand prize — a pair of Reba McEntire concert tickets — contestants had to donate a pint of blood.

• WSIX/Nashville airs a "Daily Demo" each weekday morning at 9:20. Morning man Gerry House solicits tapes of unpublished songs, picks one each day for airplay, and instructs listeners to "make it or break it." The audience casts votes on-air, and if a song receives three consecutive negatives, it's dumped. House reports several songs he's aired have been picked up by major producers and/or publishers who have heard them on the show.

• KBUL/Reno middayer Bruce Armour did his entire St. Patty's Day broadcast from a hot tub in a major mall, collecting money for a local high school choir. Passers-by tossed coins in the "fountain," the more generous pitching in bills in zip-lock bags.

The station has also distributed 30,000 numbered key tags. Each hour, a number is read on the air, and various prizes go to those calling within the specified time. Winners qualify for the \$10,000 shopping spree grand prize, and two daily bonus hours feature \$1000 cash awards.

KBUL's bull logo is featured on one side of each tag. The other side,



April Foolin' Around

Last month many stations proved the old axiom "there's no fool like an April fool." Here are three fun examples.

Dream Concert That Wasn't

KVIC/Victoria, TX's Rick Shaw pulled a prank that had locals hustling from place to place looking for a Moody Blues/Rod Stewart/Police concert that didn't exist. Would-be concertgoers scoured the city trying to find the unannounced site.

Using cuts from recorded live concerts, Shaw had many people convinced that the artists were actually in town and the Police had reunited. To add credibility, the station also broadcast traffic reports.

Station phone lines rang constantly as anxious fans grew desperate for more information. According to PD **Tony Davis**, calls came in from car phones and phone booths throughout Victoria and adjacent cities. After being inundated with calls, local authorities contacted KVIC for more information.

The entire scam lasted nearly six hours before station officials declared a "gotcha."

Huey/Hornsby Hoax

Meanwhile, KMYI/Albuquerque fans were sent on a wild goose chase for tickets to a nonexistent concert venue. The station ran a saturation schedule for the grand opening of a 10,000 seat arena called Pseudo's. The copy emphasized that the site featured several



WXDJ (The Wave)/Miami offered free postage stamps to last-minute taxpayers filing their income tax returns.

"The number of people who file at the deadline is incredible," WXDJ Promotion Director Kevin Cerenzia said. "A lot of people didn't believe we were giving away free stamps. Some thought there was no glue on them. The post office was very receptive, because the whole idea was to ease the load on them — they're all running around crazy that night. This was a very effective promotion.

Ten-second promos aired on the station several days in advance of the post office appearance. Station staffers dressed in Wave T-shirts began handing out free stamps at approximately 9pm. The 1000stamp supply was exhausted in less than two hours. smaller rooms where local groups would play on a regular basis.

Four days later, an updated spot aired proclaiming Huey Lewis & The News would headline the grand opening on April 7, and KMYI was the exclusive outlet for ticket information. The next day the spots said Bruce Hornsby & the Range had been added to the bill.

In a four-day period, the station received more than 3000 calls regarding tickets. (Remember, KMYI said the grand opening of the fictitious arena would be on April 7 – not April 1; this may have quelled suspicions that the show was an April Fools trick.)

KMYI then set the stage for a major announcement on April 1. Listeners were told to listen at 9:30am for very important information regarding ticket locations, prices, and a surprise *third* major act

True (?) to its word, the station revealed its important announcement: Pseudo's was a sham. However, listeners were told that all

There's always been a rivalry between the English in the West and the French in the East. People here talk about the folks in Toronto and Montreal as 'those Eastern so-and-sos,' and say that when the East has an itch we have to scratch."

ON JOVI was there for the #1 slot, ending MADONNA's three-week reign with 108 chart-topping reports. But the rest of the Top 11 was extremely tight, with PAULA ABDUL 3-3, JODY WATLEY 4-4, MICHAEL DAMIAN 5-5 and THIRTY EIGHT SPECIAL 6-6. From here it loosened a bit: DONNY OS-MOND marched up one slot, 8-7; GUNS N' **ROSES** blasted 13-8, which allowed DEBBIE GIBSON a 10-9 move; and NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK strolled up four, 14-10, which helped stall CHER & PETER CETERA at #11.

BOBBY BROWN stepped up 17-12 and, along with SA-FIRE's down move, slowed HOWARD JONES to a 16-14 climb. LIVING COLOUR's slight drop held the BELLE STARS to a one-point gain, 18-17. The big movers were ten points for NENEH CHERRY, 31-21, and 12 slots up for RICHARD MARX, 40-28. JOHN COUGAR MELLENCAMP, 39-33, kept SAMANTHA FOX, who is still shy of Breaker, from advancing beyond 35-34. The other charted record still missing Breaker was LISA LISA & CULT JAM, 38-36.

There were five Breakers this week: MILLI VANILLI at #37, DONNA SUMMER at #38, CINDERELLA at #39, and a double Breaker for Epic with ROACHFORD at #40 and CYNDI LAUPER, who should easily debut on the chart


