

Kabrich told R&R, "My time at Q105 has been very rewarding, but I've told (Edens Chairman) Gary Edens and (Edens President) Michael Osterhout that I don't want to be selling used cars at age 40. I've decided to enter the new decade looking for a chance to prove myself in a Station Manager's slot where I can assist in programming and learn from a good sales force. I only wish they had a slot for me to grow within this company."

Q105 VP/GM Mike Horne told R&R, "Randy's made numerous contributions to our success. He felt it was time for a change that would allow him to fulfill his personal and professional goals and allow Q105 to move into the '90s with a fresh approach to programming.'

Kabrich reports some early interest from stations, consultancies, and one artist management office. He says he won't be returning to KQLZ (Pirate Radio)/Los Angeles, where he assisted in the station's launch earlier this year.


Owens told R&R, "As a controller, you get to see the overall

RADAR Charts FM's Continued Climb

FM listening continued its steady rise, as computed by the fall 1989 RADAR report. The medium captured a 77% share of listening for the most recent period, up 1% from a year ago.

RADAR ratings are published by Statistical Research and usually precede the network audience reports by about eight weeks. The study, which covers the period from November '88-October '89, indicated that 193 million people

Leonard Now WWKY & WVEZ PD

Wilks & Schwartz's Country/AC combo WWKY & WVEZ/Louisville has tapped Jeff Leonard to become PD. He'll also handle AM drive on WVEZ. Leonard replaces Joe Fedele, who stays on as Asst. PD/ WVEZ afternoon announcer.

According to VP/GM Frank Iorio, "The acquisition of Jeff Leonard to oversee programming operations and to do mornings was the next logical step for us to ensure a continuing upward trend."

Leonard told R&R, "WVEZ is a Lite AC with Pete Salant consulting. The music mix is perfect for this market. I'll add some music – Pete has agreed with most of my suggestions. WWKY [formerly WAKY] is automated [with Far West programming] most of the day and live in the morning. I'd like to go live fulltime in the near future."

For the past 11 years, Leonard has been an air personality for WKYS/Washington. He previously programmed WKRI/Warwick, RI and worked on-air at WMOD/ Washington.

This summer WVEZ ranked sixth 12+ in Arbitron (7.9) and eighth in Birch (4.4). WWKY placed 12th in Arbitron (1.9) and 15th in Birch (0.8).

(96% of the 12+ population) listened to the radio during the course of a week. In an average quarterhour, about 24 million people are listening to the radio.

FM's audience share has been rising with an average gain of 2.5 share points per year since 1979, when the FM share was 52%.

Daniel Promoted To WRFX GM

Jack Daniel, PD at Pyramid Classic Rock WRFX/Charlotte, has been promoted to GM. Daniel replaces Peter Handy, who recently joined Americom as a broker. Daniel continued his PM drive duties through the fall sweep and is now searching for a PD.

Pyramid CEO Rich Balsbaugh noted, "The interest level in this position was very high around the country. Charlotte is one of the few genuinely hot markets this year, and the 'Fox' is pacing the market. Jack was not just the best candidate, but the person to take the station to the next level."

Daniel told R&R, "Pyramid is a wonderful company and Rich Balsbaugh made me earn this job. He conducted one tough interview – but I know it's going to be worth it.

"There's no reason to change anything we're doing right now. WRFX is the only Classic Rocker in town. If someone came up against us, it would be very difficult for them. Our morning show is number one 12+, 18-34, and 25-54."

Daniel joined WRFX two-and-ahalf years ago. He previously programmed Charlotte stations WPEG, WBCY, and WROQ.

WRFX placed fourth 12+ in both the summer Arbitron (7.5) and Birch (7.2).



Broadcaster Battles Idaho Dynasty's Media Concentration

Mr. Rook Goes To Washington Over Contested FM Station

Veteran broadcaster John Rook has launched a regulatory offensive aimed at preventing Idaho's prominent Hagadone family from adding a Coeur d'Alene, ID-area FM station to its holdings. The family's media empire already includes KVNI (AM)/Coeur d'Alene, the town's only daily newspaper, 11 of the region's other newspapers, and the local telephone directories.

In his petition to deny the transfer of unbuilt KMWC/Hayden, ID to Hagadone-owned North Idaho Broadcasting Co. (NIB), Rook, who owns KCDA/Coeur d'Alene, argues that approval of the transaction would violate the FCC's newspaper-broadcast crossownership rules. It would also, he contends, "deepen an intolerable concentration of control that already burdens competition, adding yet another arm to the local

conglomerate octopus." The Hagadone family, in addition to its media holdings, has extensive hotel, resort, and real estate interests in Northern Idaho.

KVNI GM Joe Stanosch declined to comment on the petition other than to say Rook's charges would be answered in the Hagadones' response to the FCC, due Friday (12/15)

All In The Family

To avoid violating crossownership rules Hagadone Investment Co. (HIC), which owns both the Coeur d'Alene Press and NIB, is seeking FCC permission to transfer control of NIB to Burl and Bradley Hagadone, the sons of HIC owner Duane Hagadone.

Such a transfer of control, HIC said, would separate the ownership of the newspaper from that of the Coeur d'Alene and Hayden radio stations. According to HIC's application, Burl Hagadone, who lives in Los Angeles, would be the majority shareholder and Chairman of NIB while Bradley, a Coeur d'Alene resident and HIC officer, would be neither an officer nor a director of the company.

But Rook has challenged the proposed NIB transfer as a sham on the grounds HIC would effectively remain in control of the stations.

According to his petition, "It strains credulity beyond the breaking point to suggest that Bradley would discontinue playing his key role" in the operation of KVNI. "Duane Hagadone is acting like

he's divesting himself of a radio station when, in fact, he's actually adding one," said Rook

Unfair Advantages Alleged Rook's petition also charges that the Hagadones have used their media and other holdings in a "barefang drive" against his station. He

asserts the Coeur d'Alene Press has, for example, "enshrouded KCDA in a ghostly invisibility" by going out of its way to avoid any positive or even passing mention of the station.

In addition, Rook contends, the paper has repeatedly accepted KVNI ads that "grossly misrepresented the comparative size" of the two stations' audiences in KVNI's favor, and has inhibited KCDA from running its own ads by charging the station a top-dollar national rate.

Meanwhile, by selling its spots in combination with the Press, Rook complains, KVNI has been able to charge advertisers as little as \$1.50 per minute, a rate Rook can't match and terms "anti-competitive."

He also charges that Hagadone's extensive business holdings have affected how his media outlets cover news in the Coeur d'Alene area.

"He has made it very clear he's not interested in providing full and balanced coverage of the area," said Rook. "When something negative develops involving his holdings, it just isn't reported. That's another reason we believe it's important to bring a fresh voice into the area, rather than getting more of the same from the Hagadones."

NTIA Asks Comment On Spectrum Fees

fficials of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) are seeking public comment on whether and how broadcasters should pay for the spectrum they use.

The query is part of a recently announced comprehensive review of federal spectrum management policies - the first such study in 11 years.

In its request for comments, the NTIA observed that "the question arises whether the US, as the nation's 'supplier' of spectrum, should earn a return on spectrum used by the public." Interested parties are asked to comment on such proposals as broadcast license transfer fees and spectrum leasing arrangements, in which broadcasters would be required to pay a percentage of their annual gross revenues in spectrum rent.

The NTIA is a division of the Commerce Department and serves as the President's primary source of advice on telecommunications policy. Comments on the spectrum study are due at the NTIA by February 23, 1990.

NAB Hosts Inconclusive Indecency Code Parley

Attorneys who met at NAB headquarters Friday (12/ 8) to discuss the legalities of creating a voluntary indecency code for the broadcast industry reached just one conclusion. attendees included representatives

"We concluded we need to talk some more," said NAB General Counsel Jeff Baumann, who chaired the gathering of network and station group lawyers.

Baumann declined to identify participants on grounds the subject matter is "very sensitive" and the talks should be treated as attorneyclient communications.

of "fewer than half a dozen" radio groups; Group W Broadcasting; the ABC, CBS, and NBC television networks; and the Association of **Independent Television Stations** (INTV). Ted Hanaberry, an antitrust lawyer retained by NAB to help analyze the code issue, was also present.

This was the group's second However, sources told R&R that gathering since September, when

the NAB executive committee asked for a study of the legalities of creating an indecency code. The original NAB radio and television programming code was thrown out in 1982 under pressure from the Justice Department, which felt it illegally restrained trade.

Baumann said there is no timetable for creating a draft code and added that his task force may decide it's an infeasible task. He is scheduled to give NAB board members a progress report at their January 11-13 winter meeting.





First City Liquidating Station Portfolio

onnecticut broadcasting entrepreneur Norman Drubner wants to cash out several of his First City Broadcasting stations. He's retained Randy Jeffery of Media Venture Partners to scout for buyers.

The company currently owns ten stations in six markets and recently received FCC approval to buy WLVH/Hartford. Formerly known as the Daytona Group, the four-year-old company has been undergoing realignments ever since partner Carl Como Tutera bailed out earlier this year to buy KNBR/San Francisco.

Drubner's new sidekick, former Group W VP David Pearlman, says only a few stations are on the block; KIVA & KZRQ/Albuguergue-Santa Fe, where the entire staff was fired last week; KGRX/Globe, AZ, a suburban move-in near Phoenix; and KRIX & KRGE/McAllen-Brownsville. "We simply want to readjust our portfolio. We want to concentrate on larger markets and expand. We are not getting out of radio," he explains.

Asking prices are \$2 million for Albuquerque; \$3.5 million for Phoenix; and \$2.5 million for Brownsville

Sillerman Eurocom Ventures Ahead?

ew York broadcast financier Robert F.X. Sillerman is wasting no time getting on to his next deal. As previewed last week, just hours after closing the gigantic Group W-Legacy-Metropolitan deal last Wednesday (12/6), he jumped the Concorde for a ten-day swing of dogand-pony shows through London, Paris, and Rome, aimed at raising a \$100 million media war chest with Paine Webber.

Sillerman won't reveal the next Big One, but partner Carl Hirsch says they've formed a new company - Eurocom. "And that doesn't stand for European Common Market," the entrepreneur chuckled.

Meanwhile, Sillerman has tapped broker Gary Stevens to sell WNEW (AM)/New York for \$25-30 million. Sillerman is asking the FCC for permission to move the station from his Metropolitan Broadcasting portfolio to a new asset stack, Sillerman Assets L.P. He's previously asked for permission to appoint former New York mayor Robert Wagner as a trustee to manage the property.

Henry Deadlines Loom


hiladelphia broadcaster Ragan Henry is facing some tight financial deadlines these days. He's scheduled to start closing later this week on several big deals worth nearly \$130 million, but the deals may go down to the wire.

Henry wasn't available for comment, but investment bankers say his ficing is contingent on selling WXTR/Washington and V Baltimore. He's already agreed to sell the DC FM, but negotiations to sell the Crab City combo for \$6.5 million to Cathy Hughes of WOL & WMMJ/ Washington haven't been resolved.

Hughes said she has given herself until 5pm Wednesday (12/13) to decide whether to sign a deal for the Baltimore stations, but she denies industry scuttlebutt that last-minute price haggling is holding up the deal. According to Hughes, she and Henry settled on a price several weeks ago.



salary, and requirements – decide upon the specific characteristics that candidates will need to fill the position.

• Devise a job description. This is not only for the candidate, but for you – recruiting and evaluating applicants will be much easier with a clear explanation of the position you're offering.

A program director at one station may perform much different tasks than a PD at his crosstown competitor, for example. Measure candidates by *your* needs — not by their past titles and experience.

• Evaluate applicants carefully. After you've determined which type of person you want and the job you need to fill, you're ready to interview.

Be careful, though – anyone can look good on paper. If a candidate answers your questions with a canned response, probe for more information by asking "Why?" and "How?"





Russian Rock, Python Anthology, Assorted Bios Top Current Releases

www.hether you prefer histories of communist or vintage American rock, the droll absurdity of classic British comedy, or candid biographies of your favorite musicians, you'll treasure the pleasures found in the following spate of music-related winter page-turners:



Rockin' Behind The Iron Curtain

"Rock Around The Bloc" (\$21.95/ Oxford) traces communist Europe's rock musical roots from the mid-'50s (when Hungary's Laszlo Komar gained fame as the "Magyar Elvis") to the present day. A Harvard University lecturer, author Timothy Ryback not only examines how such phenomena as Beatlemania and the birth of punk music helped shape generations of red rockers, he also explores the antagonistic relationship between rock music and government authorities. (Sound familiar?)

Furthermore, the 272-page history lesson – due in stores January 4 – details the travails that fans would suffer to hear **BBC** and

Radio Free Europe broadcasts, and offers insights into the commies' version of the record business (distribution, etc.).


The book features 20 pages of photos, and comes with a rockin' chronology of music-related events from Hungary's lifting of a ban on performances by western acts in 1953 to **Bon Jovi's** headlining appearance at the Moscow Music Peace Festival in 1989.

The Era Of Our Ways

Remaining true to its title, Richard Aquila's "That Old Time Rock & Roll: A Chronicle Of An Era, 1954-1963" (\$22.50/Schirmer Books) recalls the nine-year period when an influential social toddler called rock 'n' roll music was *rapidly* gaining mass acceptance.

The 370-page tome begins with an overview of the era (listing news events, popular films, TV shows, and fashions for each respective year), then moves into a section of lists (supporting such topics as "the Cold War" and "Gender" with a fistful of songs from the period).

The soft-cover book also provides an alphabetical listing of the



era's hitmakers (complete with brief biographies, key song titles, release dates, and label info) and features 32 pages of engaging photos.



Both volumes feature a listing of the recording and broadcast date for each episode, and both sport 12 pages of photos (complete with page reference numbers for easily locating the skits from which they were taken).

Thirty-two pages of photos (including early publicity shots of Hank Jr.) enhance the package.

One Swingin' King

Within the pages of "Benny Goodman And The Swing Era" (\$22.95/Oxford), author James Lincoln Collier not only presents a thorough account of Benny Goodman's life and career, but also chronicles the evolution of swing music from its jazz roots. The book also explores radio's role in helping to bring this new form of pop music to a nationwide audience in the '20s and '30s.

Collier – whose previous works include biographies of Louis Armstrong and Duke Ellington – notes that Goodman was the first leader of a "white" band to hire black musicians (namely, pianist Teddy Wilson and vibes master Lionel Hampton), and documents the many musical stars (Gene Krupa, Harry James, Peggy Lee, et al.) who passed through Goodman's various aggregations. A selected discography and 16 pages of photos complete the package.

WINS OF CHANGE

Who'll Profit From A Shifting Population?

M ore than the dates on our calendars will change as America weathers the 1990's. The collective sales strategies of US marketers and manufacturers will have to not only meet a predicted 7.1% decade-long population growth, but also cater to the dramatic changes within the ranks of the US populace.

According to NYC-based Paine Webber Inc., the 1990s will see a 3.2% increase in the number of children aged 0-17, a 3.5% decline in the number of young adults aged 18-24, a substantial 15.4% drop in the number of adults aged 25-34, and a 15.9% increase in the 35 to 44-year-old age group.

You can also expect a giant 46.0% increase in the number of people aged 45-54, a 13.1% climb in the number of adults aged 55 to 64, a slight 0.7% increase in the number of seniors aged 65 to 74, and a whopping 26.2% leap in the number of folks over age 75.

Winners

The shifting population figures mean that certain industries will profit. Predicted "winners" include:

• Travel & Leisure Industries. Because workers won't be able to take prolonged vacations, they are expected to take a larger number of "mini-vacations." Thus, people will be traveling more often and seeking a greater variety of leisure activities. • Child-Related Industries. Toy companies, children's apparel manufacturers, and similar businesses are expected to profit as children of the original baby boom crowd start building their own families.

• Capital Goods/Factory Equipment. As the number of employment-aged adults drops, there'll be a proportional decrease in the number of *qualified* workers. To compensate for this, manufacturers will have to buy productivityboosting equipment.

• Drugs/Health Care. Look for a boom in health care and medical technology to service the increasing number of US seniors. Expect new drugs to be invented as well. (Eli Lilly has already begun manufacturing a new antidepressent called "Prozac," one of a family of drugs designed to battle such neurological diseases as obesity, bulimia, etc.).

• Waste Management. As the number of people rises, so will the amount of their trash

Losers

Unfortunately, the expected population changes spell bad news for the following industries:

• "Big Ticket" Consumer Goods. With the number of new households expected to grow by a scant one million units per year (as opposed to the 1.7 million new householdsper-year growth rate of the '70s), consumers will need fewer refrigerators, stoves, etc.

Top Selling Convertibles

ore US drivers are going topless. According to Ward's Automotive Reports, nearly 175,000 convertibles were sold during the 1989 model year (which ended September 30) - a 20% increase over 1988 sales, but a far cry from the alltime record of 542,000 ragtops sold back in 1963.

Which models of convertibles

were this year's biggest sellers? Chrysler's LeBaron was tops with more than 46,000 cruisers sold, followed by Ford's perennial favorite Mustang (38,500) and Mazda's hot, new Miata (13,525).

By the way, the Miata's third place finish is even more amazing when you consider that the nuevo retro roadster was only on the market for three months.... • Housing Industry. Setbacks are expected, as there'll be fewer people looking for homes.

• Automobile Industry. The population shift will shrink the pool of potential car buyers.

The Wild Card

Interestingly, one of the most important changes expected to shape the future US economy has *nothing* to do with population, *and* won't even take place in North America. It'll occur in Europe in 1992 when US investors first test the nations' common currency-based consolidated economy.

New Car Options Take High-Tech Road

People get ready. At the recent Tokyo Motor Show, Japanese automobile makers unveiled several advanced electronic options that not only pamper drivers with the utmost convenience, but also may set the standard of car options to come.

For example, you can look for auto makers on both sides of the Pacific to adopt the special car radio currently found in the new Subaru SVX. The stereo is controlled by *human voice commands*, allowing drivers to keep their eyes on the road while searching for their favorite station.

The Daihatsu Sneaker also comes with a feature utilizing the

human voice - a communication system that hooks up to an intercom at the driver's residence. The system allows a driver to speak to folks waiting at his front door while he races home to meet them. Radio's New Wakeup Call

In 1990, morning drive battles will become tougher and more competitive. Superstar salaries, talent shortages, better programmers, and a time-pressured audience will add to the challenge. Following are facts and strategies to help you put together winning mornings.

First, understand the basic needs that drive the audience. Most listeners are trying to serve three needs:

· Mood Change: they want stimulation or relaxation.

 Survival Information: weather, traffic, broken water mains.

• Social Information: Cher's boyfriend and water cooler talk.

Start Me Up

Mood change is usually a form of stimulation to wake up listeners. For many, louder music and noisy announcers act like a cup of coffee to kickstart the day. There's a smaller group that likes to ease in with relaxation, quiet music, softer announcers, and even talk, but most listeners are looking for stimulation.

Stimulation engages the mind. That's why trivia and other quick games do well in the morning. Keep the stimulation balanced.

But be warned: overstimulation is more dangerous than understimulation. Some morning shows are so over the top people get exhausted and can't stand to listen anymore.

Just The Facts, Ma'am

Survival information is the core of any successful morning show. It consists of weather, traffic, news, and any other essentials necessary to enable listeners to venture safely into the day. Is the school closed? Where is the traffic heavy? Have they captured the rapist yet? These are nitty-gritty basics.

The best morning shows do an exceptional job on traffic and weather. Winning traffic coverage is comprehensive and timely. Usually it's tied into one or more air-

borne reporters, and focuses on problems and alternatives.

Weather should be frequent, with the focus heavier on today than tomorrow. Women are especially interested in weather predictions for later in the day so they can dress accordingly, especially if they're going out directly after work.

For some, news and business re-

ports have become a critical part of survival information. In the new global marketplace, a 6am Tokyo stock market report might make the difference between success and failure for a businessman in North America.

Creating A Buzz

Social information makes the difference between the good and the great in mornings. This is the material that generates water cooler talk. It sets your station apart when someone says, "Did you hear what so-and-so said this morning on Bop 92?"

The material that falls under this banner includes everything from rock and celebrity gossip to tabloid trash. It's the information that isn't essential but contributes to the fun. Anchor Media's Dave McNamee says you'll win on the social information side if you keep focused on the topical and offbeat.

Topicality is easy to establish. Whether it's local or national, people must be interested in the subject, from a mayoralty race to the latest on Kim Basinger and Prince.

Offbeat items can range from selections from the National Enquirer to those strange stories in the back of the local newspaper. Recently, KROQ/Los Angeles's Andy Schoen reminded me the offbeat game "Dead Or Alive" gets them talking at the cooler. The game is simple: read a well-known name such as Rod Serling or Greta Garbo, then ask the listeners if the person is dead or alive.

Keeping Listeners Glued

Once you satisfy these three needs - mood change, survival information, and social tidbits - you can keep listeners glued to your station with formatics and personality.

Formatics are the backbone of a great morning show. They are the anchors for morning habits. People develop morning routines, such as shaving during the sports or drinking their coffee with the joke of the day. These habits are so strong that 67% of listeners surveyed

agree with the statement, "Even though my morning show doesn't satisfy me like it used to, I listen out of habit."

Personalities are also a vital part of a show's foundation. They generate loyalty through heritage, trust, and talent. They help create familiarity, which in turn generates comfort. When coupled with strong formatics, the comfort and familiarity levels go through the roof.

The strongest personalities have a special gift for being different. They can be offbeat and naughty like Howard Stern, or they can communicate information warmly like Ken & Bob do at KABC/Los Angeles.

What if you lose great morning talent? Don't panic. And don't change any formatics at that time. If change isn't too dramatic, listeners won't leave in droves. Joint Communications' head of research David Oakes notes most listeners are more loval to a station than to an announcer. He points out that in most research conducted on a station with a strong morning show, over 65% of listeners polled said if the morning personality left

they would continue listening, because they trusted the station to replace the departed host with someone equally good.

Power Marketing

More than ever, stations are piling most of their marketing dollars into the morning show. It's become the engine that pulls the train. When you market mornings, make sure you cover benefit, meaningful difference, and creativity.

WINS/New York plays its marketing against time panic and survival information with its slogan, "Give us 22 minutes and we'll give you the world."

Film House has generated some memorable successes with its direct TV birthday commercial, which offers stimulation and a touch of the offbeat.

KPWR/Los Angeles had great results with a marketing campaign in which the management "apologized" for Jay Thomas. It offered a risque combination of stimulation and a hint of social information.

Even with power marketing and

the formatics I mentioned earlier, you've still got to be aware of your enemies. Rival stations are the most obvious, but there are others.

Know Your Enemies

Television is increasingly drawing listeners into morning video.

Time is also a growing threat. In some markets, listeners claim they can only listen to their favorite morning show three days out of five due to disruptive schedule changes. This is especially true for working mothers who use daycare. Lifestyle change comes into

play. A new job or marriage can move a listener from a morning zoo show to all-News if the need for stimulation sinks below the need for hard information.

As if all these factors aren't enough, Dr. Perry Buffington reminds us chronobiology plays a role as well. The world divides into people who hate mornings and those who like them. He suggests the ones who have trouble getting up might need more of a morning show kickstart than those who don't.

Regular Tuneups

Once the great morning show is established and running, it needs constant adjustment and finetuning like a classic car. This means freshening topicality, subtly adjusting focus, and performing regular market research to make sure everything is on track. Therein lies the difference between winners and losers.

There are great long-running morning shows on AM radio that still draw huge audiences. There are others whose listeners are literally dying off. The difference between them is careful maintenance and tinkering.

The most dangerous situation of all is the once-big morning show that is losing ratings with a host who's been there for 30 years but can't be told anything because "it's worked for 30 years and I'm not

about to change it now." Management is afraid to lose the "big" talent so they stay quiet. No fresh, younger talent is brought in because it might upset the host. Slowly the station dies.

This slow decay could be turned around by focusing on relevant, up-

to-date stimulation, survival information, and social information. Keep it topical. Keep it interesting. Market it powerfully. The listeners will wake up with you in the morning.

Shock Radio: Smokescreen For **Rebellion?**

I wonder whether I am the Lone Ranger in my views about the FCC's recent actions? I question whether critics of the agency's anti-filth efforts have thought about the big picture - the ramifications on society, especially on impressionable young people, [of] negative influences from radio.

Are there any who think the examples of obscenities in question should have been on the air? Has the FCC ever been heavy-handed in keeping PUBLIC-OWNED air-waves decent? And is [Jeff Pollack's 12/1] reference to [Mc-Carthy] just a smoke screen to not face up to the fact that a few broadcasters are hiding under the First Amendment to get away with a form of rebellious programming that cannot be justified under any standard of deceny?

The Constitution's guarantee of freedom of speech . . . means freedom with reasonable limits. [Without] boundaries we would have anarchy and ... a breakdown of society. If we emphasize our freedom and rights more than our values and responsibilities, eventually we will lose both .

Doesn't someone have to exercise responsibility in a society preoccupied with materialism and pleasure while angrily lashing out against [the suggestion] that responsibility, discipline, and decency are a prerequisite to survive as a mentally, spiritually, and emotionally healthy nation?

Children lock into radio when they wake up, go to bed, and much of the time in between. The ones who are unattended are especially vulnerable. But even if a parent is around, should a mother or father have to take on the added burden of constantly policing the airwaves that they own in the first place?

As the adage goes, we are how we think, and if it's garbage in, then it's garbage out ... I don't

contend that shock radio alone will take a young person down the path of destruction, but it can be a contributing factor.

My question is, why take the side of blatant offenders who take radio's image down to the gutter, when our main mission is to encourage and build up listeners ...? Is this approach not more profitable in the long haul?

Separate Trial Asked **For Anderson**

Tashjian and Craig were business associates of independent promoter Joe Isgro when they committed their offenses. Isgro, along with business associate Jeffrey Monka and former Columbia Records VP/Promotion Ray Anderson, was indicted last month on various tax, fraud, and payola charges.

This week, Anderson pleaded not guilty to the four counts in which he is named in the 57-count indictment

His attorney, Michael Mayock, said he will ask District Judge James Ideman to sever Anderson's trial from the rest of the proceedings. "Ray is named in only four of the 57 counts," said Mayock, "and I believe it would be prejudicial to have him sitting in the courtroom while the other 53 counts are being tried."

Trial for the three has been tentatively set for January 30. However, attorneys on both sides have predicted a spring or summer start date.

Justice Department attorneys have previously stated that Tashjian is expected to testify at the Isgro trial. Tashjian's attorney, Tony Brooklier, told R&R that his client "will be testifying neither for nor against Isgro. All he will do, if called to testify, is tell the truth."

In addition to the sentence, Tashjian will also have to repay back taxes owed to the government. He will begin staying at the halfway house January 2.







That's The Ticket ... Or Is It?

he ongoing Tampa CHR war between WRBQ (Q105) and WFLZ (Power Pig 93) has reached an alltime low. About 140 tickets to a Q105 New Kids On The Block concert (12/11) in St. Petersburg mysteriously appeared at Power Pig *three* days before with a handwritten note saying, "Have fun with these."

As it turns out, the tickets were *bogus*. Seems all of **Ticketmaster**'s official ducks are printed with the logo of crosstown Classic Rocker **WKRL (98 Rock)** on the back. However, Q105 paid to have 4100 *new* tickets printed *without* that logo specifically for the New Kids concert. The tickets delivered to the Pig *had* the 98 Rock logo on them.

Q105 VP/GM **Mike Horne** was at a loss to explain the WFLZ tickets. "I don't know where they came from and I'm very concerned about the implications." Horne quickly added, "This alleged ticket scam had absolutely nothing to do with (Q105) PD **Randy Kabrich**'s resignation (see Page 1). They are separate issues."

Power Pig PD **Marc Chase** told ST, "The folks at Ticketmaster said they're not involved, but the tickets could have only come from them or Q105. We're going to launch our own investigation into this incident."

So what does Kabrich think of all this? "We returned all of the tickets to TM via their courier. We wanted to shred them here, but (Ticketmaster) wanted them back. TM never told us they were missing any tickets, so we can only assume they showed up missing after TM took charge of them."

KZEW Caged

Imagine the surprise of KZEW/Dallas listeners when they tuned in to the 16-year AOR this week and heard holiday standards from **Mel Torme** and **Ray Charles!** Imagine the reaction of staff members when they learned they were being fired two weeks before Christmas!

The long-troubled **Anchor Media** outlet, which suffered its worst-ever book last summer, began simulcasting AM Gold sister **KLDD** Monday morning (12/11), an arrangement that is expected to continue through Christmas Day. Crosstown Classic Hits **KZPS** immediately bought time on KZEW, inviting disgruntled Zoo fans to make the switch.

No one from 'ZEW or Anchor returned ST's phone calls, so no official word on the change was available. Market speculation has the Zoo permanently flipping to Gold, with KLDD opting for an all-Sports format. We *d*o know that Asst. PD **Bruce Carey**, MD **Chaz Mixon**, and Promo Director **Christopher James** were all turfed. The ultimate fate of the rest of the staff is unknown.

As ST went to press we learned that Columbia VP/Promotion Mark Benesch will be promoted to Sr. VP/Promotion after the first of the year. Likewise, look for Epic VP/Promotion Polly Anthony to become a Sr. VP. And . . . A&M National Singles Promotion Director Charley Lake has been named Epic VP/Pop Promotion.

As the presses began to roll, ST heard Noble National PD Bob Laurence will stay on fulltime at CHR KBEQ/Kansas City as its new VP/GM.

Arbitron Will Up Yours

Arbitron has announced it will begin increasing its sample targets in all metros by ten percent. Half of the change will take effect in the fall 1990 survey and the other half in the fall 1991 sweep . . . all at no additional charge to clients. The Arbitron Advisory Counsel had recommended a 33% increase in sample size, which Arbitron says it hopes to reach sometime soon.

MCA is boosting Sr. VP/Promotion Steve Meyer to Sr. VP/Product Development, where he'll be the middleman between Promotion and A&R. That means Sr. VP/Field Promotion Billy Brill will become Sr. VP/Promotion, and will have to move his HQ from Malibu to Universal City.

Expect Brill to begin the interview process to hire *another* VP/Promotion, who will report to him within the next two weeks.

Also, look for MCA to create the position of Product Manager in the near future for the Pop and Urban departments. There are two slots to be filled in *each* division in both NY and L.A.

We were hoping to publish a response from the NAB to Jeff Pollack's attack on the FCC's indecency policy, which also took radio's very own trade organization to task. Up until Tuesday afternoon (12/12), it was all set — NAB officials had drafted a statement, and all it lacked was authorization from NAB President Eddie Fritts.

However, on reflection, Fritts decided not to give the go-ahead, commenting through a spokesperson that the NAB was mentioned only peripherally and that, anyway, Pollack's piece was aimed primarily at record companies! Continued on Page 32



Roster Moves

Universal's roster of 19 (15 country and four jazz artists) will be merged with Capitol's 19-act roster. "Combining the rosters, along with Capitol's commitment, makes this the fifth major country label; and that's good for the industry and the city," said Bowen, who added that any further roster decisions will be made after the first of the year.

Recently dropped from Capitol were David Slater, Dean Dillon, and Mel McDaniel. Reportedly, Bowen is set to sign Crystal Gayle and two new acts to Capitol.

Two Universal acts, the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band and the Judds, will remain with MCA. The Judds, on MCA/Curb, will begin recording for the new label after delivery of one more album to their present label, RCA/Nashville.

Staff Changes

Universal's entire staff of 11 will move to Capitol; including A&R **Director James Stroud, promotion** head Bill Catino, four regional promoters, and Bowen's assistant Abbe Demonbreun, who has been with him ten years. Seven of 23 Capitol staffers will remain with the new regime, including Director/Sales Gerrie McDowell, Director/Marketing George Collier, and Tammie Jackson in the PR department.

In addition to Foglesong, exiting management/department heads include Exec. VP/GM Jerry Crutchfield, VP/A&R Lynn Shults. Director/A&R Terry Choate, VP/ Promotion Paul Lovelace, Director/Creative Services Bonnie Rasmussen, and Manager/Media & Artist Relations Mark Carter.

Gone as well is the entire Capitol Country regional promotion staff: Bob Walker (Midwest), John Brown (West), Steve Powell (Southeast), and David Williams (Southwest)

Ironically, this is the second time Foglesong and Rasmussen have been displaced by Bowen's arrival. When Bowen consolidated the Elektra and WB staffs in 1983, Rasmussen was out; Bowen replaced Foglesong at MCA in 1984.

Foglesong said he will continue to work in the music industry. "I'm not retiring," he said, adding that Capitol has offered him a "consulting-type thing" which he is considering. "I'll probably go into producing or into business for myself, and Capitol might be my first customer.'

Bowen said he will be much more "hands-on" at Capitol than he was at MCA/Nashville, which he headed prior to starting Universal. "Different situations require different methods," he said. "At MCA I brought in [current MCA/ Nashville President] Bruce Hinton to handle operations. I won't be doing that here: I'll be involved in the day-to-day business of running this label." Bowen will also continue to produce MCA artists Reba McEntire and George Strait. Announcements regarding his producing any Capitol acts will come next year.

Bowen said that accounting, legal, and finance functions for the label will be handled by Capitol/ Los Angeles. Public relations will be handled by Gary/Gurley Public Relations.





Focus Groups' Blurry Picture

Breathes there a man with soul so dead who

Popular Research Tool Falls Victim To Mistaken Notions, III-Advised Practices

Common Myths

never to himself hath said, "Let's do a focus group and figure this thing out?" Focus groups emerged in the '80s as the industry's most utilized research tool. Unfortunately, along with their prevalence came an excessive amount of abuse and much misunderstanding.

Just in case there's actually one reader left out there who isn't familiar with the focus group concept, here's a brief explanation. A focus group generally consists of eight to ten people who meet in a room with a one-way mirror and are seated at a rectangular table. The moderator typically sits with his back to the mirror and asks questions, both individually and collectively, of the group. The actual name of the methodology derives from the moderator's ability to zero in on - focus on - specific issues in depth. Some benefits of this approach: the information gathering

In Theory

can be quite spontaneous and often yields individual pearls generated by the group dynamic and discussion.

In an ideal setting, focus groups are best used in broadcast research for pretesting marketing campaigns and for post-perceptual analyses exploring two or three critical issues addressed in a larger study. Stations can use them to do follow-up, investigating explanations for the major trends they've found in their research.

In Reality

In practice, the industry has frequently abused the focus group. Take broadcasters who complain Arbitron is inadequate because that company's sampling

size in a particular market involves only 1000 in-tab diaries. Those same broadcasters will turn around and do a perceptual study consisting of four focus groups with a maximum of 40 people each, and use that study as a predictor of market perceptions.

That practice is clearly flawed. Yet it happens again and again. Perhaps it recurs because focus groups give broadcast executives the illusion they're participating in the research. They sit behind the mirror feeling omnipotent, able to practically reach out and touch their listeners. In fact, reliable statistics are more important than a broadcaster's perception of closeness to his listeners. Focus groups are almost always best used as research tools in tandem with some type of major perceptual research.

Do not attempt to use them as the sole method to ascertain a format position, find out what the market thinks of your station, or figure out how you should alter your playlist. The sample size is simply not sufficient and invariably creates more problems than it solves in the long run.

Somewhere along the line, the idea surfaced that you must conduct three or four focus groups to pinpoint the questions and issues before you can do a perceptual study. Nothing could be further from the truth. In virtually all telephone studies, there are only a limited number of questions you can ask. And the research executives who are worth their salt already have a pretty good idea of

the dimensions of those questions. Doing focus groups before a survey is overkill, plain and simple.

Then there are those who believe they can successfully moderate their own focus groups. They've watched a group and thought moderating looked easy. Don't be fooled; moderating a focus group is one of the most difficult research jobs. It requires a professional who has both an engaging personality, a tremendous sense of discipline and, above all else, a true sense of objectivity and dispassion – qualities the average broadcast executive will find difficult to muster.

Nothing is more damaging than a "do-it-yourself" focus group that sends you off hearing only what you want to hear. If you're a station executive doubling as a group moderator and someone calls your station ugly, you cannot – even if you think you can - react objectively. Your intense feelings will cloud your judgment throughout the course of the interview, particularly if you hear significant negatives or positives about your station.

The notion that watching

a focus group is a piece of cake is also a myth. Whenever I conduct a group, I always brief clients before they settle in behind the one-way mirror. Watching isn't always easy or pleasant. Above all, viewers must have total objectivity. There's a tendency for them to single out the most attractive member of the group and fixate on what he or she says. Likewise, there's a tendency to negate or ignore those individuals who are less physically compelling.

Dire Consequences

Another frequent error is seizing on a comment by one individual and blowing it entirely out of proportion. This can have dire consequences. It typically occurs when the group participant says something that strikes the right chord with the senior executive in the viewing room. The rest of the viewers get excited because the CEO or GM is excited. And soon that one comment takes on a life of its own, emerging as the "most dramatic" finding of the group.

Viewing a group is a sobering event. You quickly realize how little people know about your station and competitors. And you must be wary of the "halo" effect - one or two individuals tend to dominate a group. After the dominant person makes a positive or negative comment, that statement can trigger a ripple effect: for example, John Strongman may say, "I don't like Station A," and the group erupts with "me too, me too." It takes a skilled moderator to break through this situation and ascertain the attitude driving the comment.

I've watched stations make entire format changes on the sum total of four focus groups. I've seen research companies submit "conclusive" reports with pages of recommendations based on the same four focus groups. This is inexcusable. The low sample size makes for a report fraught with ambiguity and potential error. Any broadcaster who buys such a report (usually because the cost of four focus groups is attractive) and makes

sweeping changes based on it deserves exactly what he gets.

Used appropriately, focus groups are highly valuable. But with the exception of quick reads on a single issue (i.e., television spots or a particular air talent), they should not stand alone. Unless you want a blurry picture, use them only in conjunction with a larger, more predictable methodology.

U2's Edge Pens 'Clockwork Orange' Theme

2 guitarist the EDGE has written the music for the ROYAL SHAKESPEARE COMPANY's stage production of "The Clockwork Orange - 2004," which opens at the Barbican in London on February 6.

The play has been adapted from both ANTHONY BURGESS's controversial 1962 novel and his later dramatization. However, director RON DANIELS decided to abandon Burgess's BEETHOVENbased music and called in U2 to update the soundtrack.

In an interview with Time Out this week, the Edge says the group was inspired by the play and its experience of the Los Angeles street gangs. "The stuff we came up with is very rhythmic and abstract and not at all in the tradition of the musical. BONO and I decided that the words of the script needed to be spoken over street rhythms and not sung over Beethoven melodies."

The Edge gets the actual writing credit, though he says U2 accepted the challenge because it fitted in with their "time of experimentation" before starting work on new material.

New Def Discs

We've news on the progress of DEF LEPPARD's album, which is due for release in late April/early May. Seven tracks have now been completed, and RICK ALLEN starts adding his drum parts on Monday (12/18).

The band is more or less producing itself, though MUTT LANGE is overseeing the recording. Incidentally, singer JOE ELLIOTT says they won't give the LP a title until the last minute.

Meanwhile, collectors will be interested to get their hands on one of 500 limited-edition CD samplers being issued to the media by Phonogram to set the scene for the next LP. The sampler features four tracks, one from each Def Leppard album (so far).

Furthermore, we also hear that the Leppard's roadie MELVIN (alias Stumpus Maximus) may get behind the microphone once again in the new year to record another classic, possibly "The Green Green Grass Of Home." Stumpus made a name for himself earlier this year when his unbelievably tuneless recording of "Release Me" made it onto the B-side of Def Leppard's "Rocket" single!

Reloaded Sex Pistols?

With last Monday (12/11) the 13th anniversary of "Anarchy In The UK" entering the UK chart, there's a rumor building that the original SEX PISTOLS may be ready to reform. Punk bastions the **BUZZCOCKS** and the DAMNED already gotten back together, and the word is that JOHN LYDON may now be softening in his resistance to the idea.

COMPACT DATA® Live Beatles LP, Film Due In 1990

eatles fans can look forward to the release of a brand new album by the Fab Four in 1990, now that the band's many lawsuits have been settled out of court. According to reports in Daily Variety, the project will likely be called "Beatles At The Beeb," and will be culled from "ten albums worth" of early material the group performed live at the BBC.

Other projects that could easily surface by 1991 include more previously unreleased music, videotapes, and a full-length Beatles documentary, "The Long And Winding Road."

Meanwhile, the Richard Lester film of Paul McCartney's current catalog-heavy world tour (featuring concert footage, Beatles clips, scenes from McCartney's previous solo ventures, and bits lifted from '60s-era newsreels) will be released in October 1990.

Duran Duran Expands

UK popsters Duran Duran have added former Missing Persons fretgrinder Warren Cuccurullo and ex-Average White Band drummer Steve Ferrone to its lineup. The quintet has teamed with producer Chris Kimsey (of Rolling Stones fame) and is working on a new LP, tentatively titled "Low And Slow."

Tribute Updates

The previously mentioned benefit concert tribute to the late Roy Orbison (R&R, 12/8) will take place February 24 at the Universal Amphitheatre in Los Angeles. The show is planned as a live pay-perview television and network radio broadcast. Performers are yet to be announced.







Air Teams: You Can't Buy Chemistry

Plopped on the couch watching a heartbreaker movie. Fifteen minutes in, Daddy has long since moved away because of, you know, the divorce, and we're to the point where the children keep trying to fix Mommy up with someone new. This is supposed to be the funny part of the show, but it isn't very funny.

Try as they will, those poor little matchmaker honeys can't make the Cupid trick click. One after another, prospective new daddies parade past Mom. But she shows zero reaction. Along about here my mind drifts away from the movie to real life, because the plot is so eerily close to what radio people encounter when they try to put together air teams.

Lesson #1 in personality radio: you can't buy "click." Paraphrasing a great truth, chemistry may get a station through times of no cash, but cash won't get a station through times of no chemistry. Mix and match 'em as you may, performers either bounce off one another automatically or they thud - and there's no forcing it.

Bottling Magic

When a team does click, of course, it's magic. Anyone who works across the mike from a "just right" partner never forgets the experience. It's fun, it sounds fun, the fun rubs off on listeners, one plus one equals at least three, and everyone is happy (especially the PD). Some of the highest points of a person's career are those times when teamwork really works. If you knew how to put air personality chemistry in a bottle, you'd soon be a fabulously rich consultant. You'd be calling your friends from a cellular phone beside the swimming pool of your paid-for yacht cruising off Malta, I suppose.

"Jeeves, take the launch in. Pick up more caviar, get a couple of those diamond-covered bowls, give \$250,000 to anyone coming aboard who I forgot to buy a Christmas present, and have one of my pilots go to Trenton and fly me back some fresh Wonder Bread and another hundred cases of cold Moosehead. I'm putting together another hot air team."

If we could figure out how to bottle that air personality chemistry, we, too, could start ordering old Jeeves around.



WAVA'S FLYTRAP **Luring DC Listeners**

George McFly has come a long way. Six years ago, he graduated from Brown Institute, where an instructor advised him to find a different line of work. Instead of taking that advice, he pursued an on-air career. He currently holds forth 6-10pm on WAVA/Washington, crafting his evening show with the kind of attention typically lavished on morning drive prep.

Between the end of school and landing his WAVA shift, McFly made his way up the ladder from WJMT/Merrill, WI (as George Edwards) to WDEK/DeKalb, IL; WKHI/Ocean City, MD (where "McFly" was born); KRNQ/Des Moines; and San Francisco's KHIT and KXXX. I recently talked with him about what makes his show . . . well, fly - and what advice he offers fellow air personalities.

Just A Rhymin' Guy

R&R: You incorporate a lot of rhyming in your delivery. Why?

GM: That's Bill Lee's influence. I first heard him on WLOL/Minneapolis while I was going to Brown. When I heard him, I said, "That's it! That's exactly what I want to do." I was also inspired by WYBR/ Rockford's Greg Thunder.

R&R: Why did rhyming appeal to you?

GM: I wanted to do something different - not that rhyming's new

to radio. But I was sick of time and temp. I don't just rhyme; I tell stories, I rap. If I see a liner in front of me, I don't want to read it verbatim. I want to use different words, alliteration. I want to sell it differently than other DJs. It makes radio fun for me.

R&R: What advice can you offer other would-be radio rhymers?

GM: You don't want to use cliches, tying in the same pairs of

words or saying trite phrases. Every time you say "station," you shouldn't follow with, "I know you've been waiting in eager anticipation." You need a good vocabulary. I use a rhyming dictionary.

R&R: What kind of show prep do you do?

GM: Often I bring home the music and I know what the day's promos will be, so I do a lot of prep then. I sit on my back porch and think about what people are doing that day.

R&R: Although you're working a mainstream CHR format and your delivery is uptempo and straightahead, .your content sometimes seems surprisingly soft. You frequently talk about emotions and feelings. Why?

GM: I'm trying to show all of my sides - even if it slightly hurts my credibility as a consistent wild

man. I go from talking about inflatable dolls in one break to giving advice to a 16-year-old whose girlfriend is pregnant.

'Fun Fills'

R&R: What do you do to get the most from callers?

GM: I roll tape on everything that comes in. I ask a million questions, even if they're just calling to request a song. All you have to do is get a reaction. Maybe you can use the whole phoner or just one little phrase.

There are some I call "fun fills." I get the caller to say something and surround it with my own comments. I'll have someone say, "Gosh, are you weird!" And I'll play it back and add, "Genetics! My whole upbringing was weird, ever since the family dog gave birth to five puppies and me." I use those when I'm hurting for phon-

R&R: You also use callers asking about contests instead of doing a straight promo.

GM: That's to get away from the redundancy of selling the same phrases. And if no one calls to ask, I'll stage the calls. I'll tell them what to say.

More diversity was apparent in this category as well, with 23 labels reaching No. 1 as opposed to 19 in '88. Columbia matched its '88 total and won, with MCA and WB right behind. Biggest gainer was Geffen, which had eight chart-toppers this year compared to two last year; EMI was up four from '88, and Polydor and Mercury combined had 13, far above PolyGram's '88 total of five.

Atlantic, with a growing but still quite small Country operation, managed to beat four labels with strong Country

Arista and Geffen, with virtually (in Arista's case) or absolutely no Country hits, were able to make the Top 10, and Geffen was the only new entry, up from 14th last year for the single biggest upward move in these standings. How It Works

- LABEL PERFORMANCE is the chief calculation. For the five track or single-oriented formats (AC, AOR Tracks, CHR, Country, Urban Contemporary), each song that charts during the year (December 2, 1988 through November 24, 1989) is awarded points, on a simple inverse system, for its **peak position**. Each label is credited for all the points its charted songs have racked up, and those label point totals determine the Label Performance standings.
- In the three album-based formats (AOR Albums, Contemporary Jazz, NAC), longevity rather than peak position is the primary promotional/marketing goal. Reflecting that, the points each LP accumulates **throughout its chart lifetime** are totalled and assigned to the proper label, determining the Label Performance standings.

olumbia won its second consecutive AC label championship, and its fifth in the seven years **R&R** has been tracking year-end stats. Its margin was sizable, but after that, a turbulent and tight-knit top six battled it out. **MCA** has climbed from 4th to 3rd to 2nd over the past two years. **PolyGram** (combined in this format) vaulted from 11th to third, while **Elektra** also had a phenomenal growth year, jumping from 13th place last year to 4th. Right behind were **WB** and **Atlantic**.

Capitol was new to the Top 10 this year, while **Geffen** enjoyed the third-biggest standings jump, 18-12, and **WTG**, **IRS**, and **SBK** debuted.

Clearly 1989 was a more competitive year than '88. The most vivid demonstration is comparing Columbia's winning chart share last year, 12.1%, to the 9% Columbia and MCA attained this year. In addition, 12 labels had ten or more chart records this year, compared to just nine last year.



- OVERALL STANDINGS (seen on the first page of this section) are based on the totals in each category from the five single/track-based formats. Album-oriented formats, using a different point structure, are not included in the overall totals.

Credits & Clarifications

C redit for certain records in all formats, including AC, was awarded to more than one label, in cases when the label proper and its parent/ distributor label both actively promote the records. In AC, **Cypress** records were also credited to **A&M**, and **MCA** and **IRS** each received full credit for the **Fine Young Cannibals** records they jointly worked. Although **Polydor** and **Mercury** are separated in every other format (barring NAC and Contemporary Jazz), the previous **PolyGram** joint structure still applies in AC. Polydor and Mercury's totals were combined for AC, but kept separate when being added up for the all-format grand totals.

AOR Tracks: Atlantic Rules The Airwaves

Columbia, Geffen Climb Into 2-3 Positions

Label Performance Leader



ormally the AOR LP label leader also takes the Tracks crown, and this year's no different, with Atlantic swamping the field for a repeat victory.

However, tracks are credited for peak position, not longevity, so the standings can diverge. For instance, Columbia was the second-strongest Tracks label and Geffen was third; in Albums their standings were reversed. Both labels climbed solidly from their 1988 Tracks rankings; Columbia was 4th last year and Geffen was 5th.

Also improving notably were Capitol (8th to 6th), Island (11th to 9th), and Reprise, duplicating its remarkable 17th-to-10th LP move. WTG had the highest debut, not counting the first independent stands of Mercury and Polydor.

Atlantic boosted its winning chart share of 1988, but from there on shares were generally lower. Geffen and Capitol were exceptions, with 20%+ improvements; Elektra, Reprise, and Arista also rose markedly.

Number One Hits

Geffen matched the leader's total of 1988 with five No. 1 records - a big improvement on its own total of one last year. MCA, which didn't have a No. 1 last year, had three this year.


There weren't a whole lot of No. 1 tracks, and the 60-position length of the chart makes it tough to score a high efficiency average. Of labels with ten or more charting tracks, Geffen earned a narrow victory over MCA and Reprise.

Aside from Atlantic, which in winning didn't quite match its 1988 total (good for second place iast year), the Top 5 hits were much more evenly spread this year. Capitol went from one to six, Geffen from three to eight, and MCA from zero to four.



Last year only eight labels spent two or more weeks at No. 1, but this year it was 12, which reduced individual totals somewhat. Geffen's improvement was again a blockbuster; the label went from one week at No. 1 last year to 11, edging out another vastly improved label, Columbia, which had just three chart-topping weeks in 1988 and broke double figures this year. MCA, Capitol, and Reprise also bettered their previous scores significantly.



AOR Albums: Atlantic The BIG Winner

Geffen Spectacular In Jump To Second; Columbia Up To Third

Label Performance Leader



hat a year Atlantic enjoyed — even without adding in the Island albums, Atlantic would have won the championship handily. The label was No. 1 last year, but not by nearly so large a margin.

Geffen, meanwhile, with fewer than half of Atlantic's chart LPs, vaulted from 5th to 2nd in a spectacular performance. **Columbia** moved up from 4th to 3rd. The **PolyGram** split was noticeable, as last year's 3rd place combined finish translated into 5th for **Mercury**, traditionally the stronger AOR identity, and 17th for **Polydor**.

Other notable improvements were registered by **Capitol** (10th-7th), **Island** (15th-9th), and **Reprise**, hitting the big time by jumping from 17th to 10th. **WTG** made a nice debut. Odd random fact: Over half of **MCA**'s points came from one album, this year's biggest, **Tom Petty**.

Atlantic's 14% chart share far outstripped the 10.5% it had (as did Columbia) last year. From there, things were tighter, as more labels fought for (and achieved) chart albums.

Credits & Clarifications

hart longevity was the determining factor for Label Performance Leader in this album format, with position points accumulated over the year by a label's albums adding up to the label's standings. Island and Atlantic each received credit on Island LPs (only in AOR was their past partnership still sufficiently intertwined to call for double-crediting). Enigma's two chart LPs were also credited to Capitol as part of their joint arrangement. Uni went to MCA, as did IRS on the Fine Young Cannibals (but only IRS received credit for the Alarm, released after the label's declaration of independence). This was the first year Mercury and Polydor were split, and Atco was counted separately from Atlantic.



Again, competition took its toll on the numbers. Last year, the top two labels in this category were on top of the chart over three-quarters of the year. Columbia had the year's longest-running AOR chart-topper, the **Rolling Stones**, whose 12 weeks at No. 1 gave the label the margin of victory.





olumbia was back on top of the CHR label standings for the first time since 1983, with a resounding victory and a near-clean-sweep of the other CHR categories. The firstplace finish comes after two straight runner-up rankings.

CHR, along with UC the most current-intensive format, is an especially hard-fought battleground. Only a handful of points separated the Nos. 2-3-4 labels, but when the dust settled, the rankings were, in order, MCA, WB (up from 7th last year), and Atlantic. All three are set to mount a strong challenge for the championship next year.

Also making noise in the Top 10 were Capitol (moving 13th-6th) and Virgin (16th-12th-7th over the 1987-89 span), both highly impressive jumps in a normally stable list. Geffen moved up a position and Mercury debuted on its own at #10, compared to the combined PolyGram finish at #9 last year. Polydor debuted at #15, and Cypress, SBK, WTG, and Curb made their presence known. Elektra and IRS made notable upward progress as well.

Columbia's 11.3% chart share was the only one in double figures, and exceeded last year's leading share of 10%. Elektra had a 60% chart share increase, Capitol improved by 50%, Geffen was up 40%, and WB climbed almost 20% to take second in this category.



Once again the individual totals were lower this year, but more labels had solid numbers of Top 15 hits, MCA scored a repeat victory, edging Columbia. Virgin made a dramatic jump into double figures after earning just five Top 15 hits last year. Capitol and Elektra were up solidly, and Mercury and Polydor combined for 13 Top 15 hits this year, more than double PolyGram's consolidated total in 1988.

If Top 15 totals were down a bit, efficiency averages were stunning. Country: RCA Stronger Than Ever In Clean Sweep

MCA Holds Second, CBS Takes Third As Majors Lock Up The Market

CA swept to its sixth straight Country victory, and pulled off the rare feat of winning every category to boot. It was a year of the big getting bigger: last year five labels had 10% or greater chart shares; this year it's down to four (**MCA**, **CBS** — which moved from 4th to 3rd — and **WB**, which was a close 4th, are the others), who locked up 73% of the chart records, a chokehold unmatched by any other format.

As a result, of course, Country totals for the majors are higher than in other formats and have a disproportionate influence on the grand total standings. The situation seems unlikely to change: **Universal** made a strong debut this year, but this appears to be the only year it will show up as an independent entity, and **MTM**, which had been making strong inroads, expired in '89. On the other hand, **Atlantic** got stronger and **Arista**'s in the ballgame now.


RCA, CBS, and WB all improved their chart shares (CBS the most substantially), and Universal notched over 5% in its debut year.

Number One Hits

Same as last year, **RCA** had a mortal lock on this category, matching its total of 13 number one hits. **CBS** improved from five to eight to take second, and **Universal** joined a very select club (seven labels) in securing a chart-topper.



Since Country number ones rarely last more than one week, this category generally recaps the Number One Hits standings. That's exactly what happened this year, although **WB**, a distant 4th in Number One Hits, stretched its four chart-toppers to eight weeks and almost moved up.





rban Contemporary is the most current-intensive format and the fastest-moving chart in the **R&R** collection. That means the struggle for label supremacy is more intense than anywhere else. **MCA** emerged as the winner, thanks to consistent Top 5 and Top 15 hitmaking; last year it was third following a 1987 victory.

Columbia was second for the second straight year, and took home its second consecutive Chart Share championship. **WB**, up from fifth last year, barely nipped **Epic** for third. **Atlantic** and the newly constituted **Motown** improved their standings, and **EMI** and **Virgin** made strong leaps into the Top 10.

The **Polydor** wing of the now-separated **PolyGram** family nearly equalled the combined PG performance of '88 by debuting at 11th, while **Mercury** landed at 16th.

Reflecting the ever-more-heated competition, the top individual chart shares were down from last year, with no label scoring 10%, as Columbia did in '88. **Island** doubled its share, EMI (with **Orpheus** on board) was up 25%, and the Polydor/Mercury aggregate was up from PolyGram's share last year.

olumbia's substantial lead in chart share was enough to overcome a higher degree of efficiency from Capitol/ Blue Note and take a narrow victory home in the second Contemporary Jazz year-end sweepstakes. GRP, in one of the two strongest performances of any independent label in any format (Geffen's in AOR being the other), was third, far ahead of the next challenger.

That challenger, however, had a terrific year: PolyGram jumped from 16th last year. Epic was up from 10th to 6th. Geffen and Digital Music Productions each gained more than ten places over last year, and Soundwings and Intima/Enigma were also up solidly. Elektra, A&M, Reprise, and Headfirst debuted inside the Top 20.

Last year, 40 labels had chart records; this year, the field narrowed to 39. That means chart shares are generally small in CJZ, but Columbia managed to increase its winning 1988 share (11.5%) to 12.2%. PolyGram more than doubled, Fantasy improved by almost 80%, and Capitol/Blue Note was up 20%.







n NAC's second full year as a format, **MCA** emerged again as the top label, riding a substantial chart share lead to victory. **GRP** was second again, which along with its third-place Contemporary Jazz finish, establishes it as an independent label almost without peer.

Columbia registered a big improvement, moving up from ninth last year to third. **A&M** was up from 6th to 4th, but the bulk of its position points came from the distributed/co-promoted **Cypress**, which high-jumped everyone to go from 23rd all the way to 6th. Almost equalling that jump, thanks in part to the year's biggest LP (by **Pat Metheny**), was **Geffen**, which was 18th last year and has now entered the Top 5.

Elektra moved from 20th to 13th, just ahead of a cluster of debuts: **Intima/Enigma, PolyGram, Headfirst,** and **ProJazz.** Last year 43 labels had at least one chart album, leading all formats, but that was just the warmup: this year 53 labels charted! MCA rather remarkably managed to retain a 10% chart share, and A&M (not, in this case, all because of Cypress) doubled its share to move up to second.

Legendary WJLB **Keeps On Kickin'**


A Detroit institution, Booth American's WJLB celebrates 50 years of broadcasting this month. Marking the occasion, company President/Secretary John Booth Jr. and station VP/GM Verna Green shared memories of the station's past and talked about their hopes for its future.

Beginnings

Booth American now owns 18 stations, but WJLB was its first. Said Booth, "WJLB is the company's flagship and has always been regarded as such. It's been the leading station in terms of revenue, ratings, market size, etc.

"My father (whose name, John Lord Booth, accounts for the station's calls) purchased the station - then an AM - in December 1939. He and some of our cousins were in a race to obtain Michigan's first FM. These cousins already owned an AM station, WWJ. Their FM property – now WJOI – was the seventh FM station in the country and beat WJLB's switch to FM by an hour (in 1941) to become Michigan's first. Our FM was initially an experimental station licensed as W14D-FM."

Booth began working at the station while in high school. "What I know about radio I learned at 'JLB. It's a very special station to me and I've had a lot of friends



Pack your bags, shine up your schmoozin' shoes and, by all means, don't forget the Alka Seltzer. The Country Radio Broadcasters' Country Radio Seminar is just around the corner, running February 28-March 3 at Nashville's Opryland Hotel.

This year's theme is "CRS 21 – Road Map For The '90s," and more than 65 hours of panels and social events are planned. Last year's gathering attracted over 1100 attendees.

Registration begins at the Opryland Hotel at 2pm Wednesday (2/28), and the Exhibit Hall will be open. The Artist-Radio Tape Session will be from 4-7pm, followed by the Artist-Attendee Welcome Reception from 7:30-10pm. Thursday (3/1) activities include six radio panels and the CMA-sponsored Music Industry Professional Seminar, running concurrently in morning and afternoon sessions.

Singers 'N Speakers

Alabama is on the bill Thursday for the third annual Super Faces concert. The Academy of Country Music again sponsors the show, which will be held at Opryland's Roy Acuff Theater from 7:30-9:30pm.

Friday and Saturday's all-day radio and music industry panels will be highlighted by longform speakers David J. Rogers (3/2 at 2pm) and C.W. Metcalf (3/3 at 9am).

Luncheon shows will be sponsored by ASCAP on Friday and the Canadian Country Music Association on Saturday. The seminar closes with a cocktail reception in the Exhibit Hall, followed by the New Faces show and banquet.

And let's not forget the nighttime suite sensations. The labels and related industry firms host hospitality suites where you can schmooze to your heart's content or your feet's complaint – usually both. Last year Warner Bros. expanded its suite into a huge game room.



It'll be interesting to see what's in store this year.

The gate took in \$105,739, and fans pledged another \$50,900 over a toll-free number announced on statewide TV and radio stations carrying the concert. Alabama's label, RCA/Nashville, donated \$5000. The group considers South Carolina its second home: early in its career, the band spent seven summers playing at Bowery's in Myrtle Beach, SC.

• The Judds have been nominated by *Playboy* magazine readers as the Best Country Group for the fourth consecutive year. The magazine also ranked the pair's "Across The Heartland" video among its "Mood Meter" picks. • Opryland Music Group has moved into its \$1.8 million, 23,000 square-foot new home. The building at 65 Music Square West houses 16th Avenue Records, Acuff Rose/ Milene Music, and Syndicom Entertainment (a Gaylord Syndicom TV programming division).

• Riders In The Sky's syndicated PBS radio series "Riders Radio Theater" has moved from WPLN/ Nashville to WVXU/Cincinnati. The move came after funding shortfalls led WPLN to drop the award-winning show. The group's first project in its new recording home at Emery Theater (a twin to Carnegie Hall) is a Christmas special. The Riders also begin taping 39 segments for the 1990 season next month.

• The Oak Ridge Boys have established a 900 number for callers to hear the group's specially recorded interviews. To also win ORB memorabilia and gifts, callers can respond to a P.O. box announced during the interviews. The number is 1-900-909-5900, and each call costs \$2 for the first minute and 45 cents for each minute thereafter. —Debe Fennell



1989: The Year In Music

The top country music stories of 1989 are Randy Travis's continued dominance and Clint Black's amazing impact.

The unofficial "Artist of the Year" award would have to go to Travis for the third consecutive year. He placed four songs in the Top 15, three of which maintained number one status; Travis tunes held the number one spot for a combined total of seven weeks.

Behind him were Kathy Mattea and Alabama; both saw three songs hit number one (a total of four weeks for each act). Rodney Crowell (2 songs), Patty Loveless (1), Shenandoah (2), George Strait (3), and Keith Whitley (2) each occupied the top slot for three weeks.

Top 15

A total of 257 records charted this year, 139 of which reached Top 15. They were divided among 62 acts (duets by otherwise solo artists counted as an act). Last year, 70 acts yielded 142 Top 15s; 68 acts delivered 139 Top 15s in '87.

The seven acts achieving Top 15 status for the first time in '89 accounted for ten Top 15 hits. Last year, eight breakthrough acts were responsible for 12 records that hit the Top 15. In '87, nine artists put 15 songs into the Top 15 for the first time.

Among this year's breakthrough acts, three put more than one song in the Top 15, and two saw their records reach number one. (Technically it's two, though it could be three if you count Lorrie Morgan's "Out of My Shoes," which peaked Number Ones A total of 23 artists accounted for 39 number one songs (the same as

at five prior to our cutoff date but went to number one last week.) Last year, eight of the acts hitting the Top 15 for the first time accomplished that feat with more than one tune.

Of the eight acts reaching Top 15 for the first time in '88, only Jo-El Sonnier failed to score a repeat performance in '89. Three of the nine who had a Top 15 the first time in '87 – David Lynn Jones, Lyle Lovett, and the O'Kanes – didn't have one this year. last year); a record 42 tunes hit the top in '87. Quite a few records – 29 – stayed on top for a single week, eight for two weeks, and only two (Travis's "Deeper Than The Holler" and Loveless's "Timber I'm Falling In Love") managed to occupy the summit for three weeks.

Clint Black's incredible year is intertwined with the number one story. For only the second time in R&R's Country history, a new act's debut single reached number one - Black's "Better Man." (The first time was in '87 when Foster & Lloyd hit the top with "Crazy Over You.") And for the first time ever, a new act's second single hit number one: Black's "Killin' Time."

Perhaps the most incredible chart feat in a long time — if not ever — was also accomplished by Black: his initial two releases are the number one and two songs of the year! The only other debut single in the '80s even to hit the Top 20 of a given year was the Forester Sisters' "I Fell In Love Again Last Night," the number 16 song of '85. (F&L's "Crazy Over You" placed 37 in '87.)

Absentees, Comeback Acts

In '88, only eight of the 20 acts represented in the Top 25 had charted prior to '85 and just three had Top 15 hits before '80. In '89, 11 had charted before '85, but only two - Willie Nelson and Conway Twitty - had reached the top 15 prior to '80.

Among those absent from the Top 15 list for the first time in a long while were:

• Crystal Gayle, for the only time since she first hit the charts in '77; • Waylon Jennings, for the first time since R&R began doing year-

end charts in '74; • T.G. Sheppard, for only the second time since '74 (his first absence was in '77);

• Lee Greenwood, for the first time since his initial chart showing in '82.

Among those returning to the circle this year were:

• Ricky Skaggs, who didn't make it in '88 for the first time since hitting the charts in '81;

• The Statler Brothers, who failed to place a record in the Top 15 last year for the first time since '75;

• Gene Watson, who hadn't appeared in the Top 15 since '86.


Also back on track was Ronnie Milsap, the only artist to have at least one number one record each year of R&R's existence...except for last year. He had number ones twice in '89.

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

PD SEIZES THE DAY

WMXC Scores Berlin Coup

This column, while slightly different from our usual nuts and bolts pieces on AC programming, stresses to GMs and PDs the importance of acting on some seemingly outrageous ideas - and the endless rewards attainable from such perseverance.

Recent developments in Germany spurred a handful of stations to visit history in the making. We'll chronicle two WMXC (Mix 104.7)/ Charlotte staffers' low-budget journey to Berlin as they filed onthe-scene reports for the folks back home.

The Obstacle

Though off the market now, EZ Communications' WMXC was being packaged for sale when the Berlin Wall was about to tumble. Promotion dollars were thus at a premium.

This critical factor discouraged PD Bruce Buchanan from moving on an idea he'd expressed at an impromptu after-hours meeting with GM Jake Gurley: to fly AM drive co-host Karen Barnes to Berlin to report on the unbelievable events unfolding there.

The Solution

Several days after proposing the idea, Buchanan saw a Pan Am ad that read: "Berlin: \$540 - 30-day advance notice." Confident he could convince the airline to waive the 30-day restriction, Buchanan repeated to Gurley his desire to send Barnes to Germany. Gurley concurred and Pan Am, indeed, waived the restriction. Now the trip was a go.

The Setup

To set up the trip on-air, Barnes and AM driver Chuck Boozer discussed the events transpiring in Germany. Boozer laughingly suggested WMXC send Barnes to cover the story. He called Buchanan on-air at 6:30am, and Buchanan, pretending to be half asleep, agreed to foot the bill for the trip.

Canvassing listeners for trip suggestions, WMXC hoped someone would provide them with a relative's address in East Berlin. send back a taped greeting. There was no such luck. Instead, listeners encouraged Barnes to bring back pieces of the wall, and, as Buchanan called them, "other unimaginative ideas."

The Dynamic Duo

Buchanan hadn't planned to go along with Barnes, but believed it might be wise to have two people on the production team. That proved a prudent decision. "We bounced ideas off each other," he recalled. "It had to be a two-person deal."

Transmission turned out to be a problem. "I talked to NBC, AP, AFN [Armed Forces Network], and the Pentagon," said Buchanan. "Everybody had lots of advice, but nobody would assist us in getting satellite uplinks or studio space."

This forced Buchanan to improvise. "We packed a small suitcase with microphones, patch cords, alligator clips, tapes, and screwdrivers. I took two of my own phones (touch-tone and rotary) as well. If you can take a plate off the wall, and have enough combina-

High Marks For Few Bucks

Proving it doesn't cost a fortune to do a spur-of-themoment, topical remote from a faraway locale, WMXC (Mix 104.7)/Charlotte pulled off a visit to the Berlin Wall last month with relative fiscal ease.

- The approximate expenses were:
- \$1080 Roundtrip airfare for two people.
- \$1000 Phone costs.
- \$400 Berlin Hotel: two rooms/two nights
- \$400 Miscellaneous expenses.
- \$2880 Total

"We had to buy a hammer because security took ours," commented PD Bruce Buchanan. "They let us keep the chisels, though." The tab at the Berlin Hotel, incidentally, included breakfasts. The Bon Voyage Party

Mix 104.7 threw a send-off party at a Charlotte area German restaurant, where listeners got into the spirit as they munched German cuisine and swilled beer from the homeland. The event ran from 10am-1pm Saturday, but Buchanan and Barnes left early to make their 12:30pm flight.

Eighteen airborne hours later, Buchanan & Barnes landed in Germany Sunday at noon. After checking into the Berlin Hotel, they jumped into a cab and headed for the Wall.

Recounted Buchanan, "It was a strange feeling. People from all

over the world were there chipping and beating on it. We interviewed about 20 people and returned to the hotel."

The Plot Thickens

Following some minor equipment maintenance (new batteries for audio and video recorders), the Charlotte Mixers ventured into East Berlin, where they were immediately shadowed.

"It was Sunday night and the place was virtually deserted," Buchanan remarked. "We were followed by a guy in a trenchcoat; we couldn't shake him. He never got more than 50 feet from us. We returned to the hotel and wrote the material for our feed to the station. At 3am (Eastern Standard time), we called Charlotte with the audio

Reporter's Notebook

WMXC (Mix 104.7)/Charlotte morning co-host Karen Barnes experienced a once-in-a-lifetime event when she and PD Bruce Buchanan covered the demise of the Berlin Wall. The brief visit made a big impact on the Charlotte air personality.

"As Americans, we jump in our cars and go across state lines without thinking about it," she said. "These people couldn't do that. Freedom has a whole new meaning to me now. It's a fever — and it's spreading. Being at the Berlin Wall was overpowering."

Barnes was positive about both the surroundings and the locals. "The [Berlin] Hotel was as nice as any American hotel I've ever been in. In West Berlin, the people were more than friendly. Crossing into the East and seeing people who were free for the first time left me with thoughts I'll never forget. These were people seeing video cameras for the first time — seeing Americans for the first time. They were like kids in a toy store."

On The Road Again?

Moved by her experiences, Barnes said, "I'd go back tomorrow if I could. It's so exciting there now. It really got my adrenalin flowing. I might get fired at any time, but nobody can ever take away these memories. This is the best shot in the arm I could have ever asked for."

The jaunt to Germany isn't the end of the travel line for Barnes. She may be logging more frequent flyer miles by the time you read this. A planned dispute with morning cohost Chuck Boozer over the actual existence of Santa Claus (she believes/he doesn't) may lead Barnes to the North Pole.

Observed PD Buchanan, "I don't know if we can arrange a Pan Am flight to the North Pole, but we're working on it."

and lead-in lines we wanted them to use."

The German trek didn't exactly leave Buchanan and Barnes with an abundance of vacation time. "We went about 27 hours without sleep. We did interviews, taped material, and wrote. We spent about eight hours on writing alone."

The Long Goodbye

When it was time to head home, they found it's much easier to get *in* to Berlin than it is to get *out*. "Security rips everything apart," commented Buchanan. "They took Karen off the plane and opened bottles of contact lens cleaning solutions to make sure that's all that was inside. Because of some delays, we missed the flight from New York to Charlotte."

The Classy Approach

While some stations engaged in "Berlin Wall Giveaways," WMXC will have none of it, opting for a more subdued approach.

"So many people died because of the wall, and families were separated for generations," Buchanan observed. "A piece of the wall isn't like a moon rock. We brought pieces back, but they won't be given away in a contest. They'll be put on display and we'll get a lot of warm fuzzies from the image rather than improved quarter hours. By the way, we could use some extra quarter hours, but giving away pieces of the wall wouldn't be a good way to get them."

Explaining the trip's speedy execution, morning personality Karen Barnes (who made the trip with Buchanan) said, "Bruce just makes things like this happen."

Noted Buchanan, "I compare this to a person in a burning house who tries to exit through a locked door. While they kick and kick, they pay no attention to the open window right next to them.

"People hit a wall without trying to find another way to do something. This business was originally founded on immediacy. No wonder we can't react anymore. You have to run things through nine levels of management. I came up with a crazy idea and was fortunate to be around people who appreciated it and helped make it happen."
