Radio Sales Recovery On A Six-Month Win Streak

Miller, Kaplan report: Country, Gold still hot

Radio revenues continued to show strong signs of recovery during April 1992. Local business improved for the sixth consecutive month, and the 6% local growth rate in April was the largest single monthly increase in nearly two years. Local revenue growth has averaged 5% for the last three months.

Country and Gold formats remained hot . . . each stayed on pace for a 12% revenue jump

over 1991. Classic Rock and UC showed renewed vigor during April while Soft AC maintained course toward a 7% growth rate for '92.

National revenues suffered a 13% decr∈ase during the first quarter of '92 — fell just 5% in April. Notable strength was evident in Florida, which enjoyed 10% growth in national over April 1991 levels.

Perhaps the best news for radio broadcasters was the breadth of the increase in local revenues. For the first time since Miller, Kaplan, Arase & Co. began publishing its Radio Revenue Growth By Region data in 1990, all 21 areas measured showed year-to-date increases in local business

NAB Offers Alternate Rules

Association hopes 25/25 national and 2/2 local ceilings, minority rules will give new ownership limits chance to survive

In a bid to broker a compromise between the FCC and congressional critics of the Commission's new ownership rules. the NAB will propose that the FCC scale down its plan to increase the number of stations a licensee may own.

The NAB proposal - approved last Wednesday (5/20) by the Radio Board - states that a licensee be permitted to own up to 25 AMs and 25 FMs nationwide. A broadcaster controlled by a minority investor could own an additional five stations on each band.

On the local level, a licensee could own up to two AM and two FM outlets in markets of 15 or

In markets with fewer stations, a licensee could own three properties - no more than two of which are in the same band — so long as the three stations do not represent 50% or more of the stations in the market. However, the proposal also calls for the Commission to grant waivers of that 50% cap in cases where combined ownership is found to be in the public interest.

Radio Board Chairman Dick Novik, who owns WKIP & WRNQ/Poughkeepsie, NY, said the NAB proposal is designed to help forge a compromise between the FCC and congressional critics, including Rep.

John Dingell (D-MI), who believe the agency went too far in loosening the rules. Without such a compromise. NAB fears. Congress could move to void the new rules, thus stranding the industry with the existing 12-12 and duopoly limits.

Modification Certain

Two senior FCC staffers termed the NAB's proposal "realistic" and said the FCC's proposal is almost certain to undergo some modification in the coming months.

Under the current FCC proposal, licensees could own up to 30 AMs and 30 FMs. The plan makes no provision for minority participation. Locally, the FCC plan would permit a broadcaster to own anywhere from three to six stations in a single market, depending on the size of the market and subject to a 25% combined local audience cap. NAB's proposal calls for elimination of the audience cap, NAB/See Page 30

KGB Hit With **Max Smut Fine WLUP** records indecency on TV

Calling the violation "egregious," the FCC has slapped Brown Broadcasting's KGB/ San Diego with the maximum \$25,000 indecency fine for airing two suggestive songs.

The AOR outlet was levied for one broadcast of "Candy Wrapper," which uses candy bar names to tell a sex story in double entendre, and two broadcasts of Monty Python's "Sit On My Face." All three incidents took place in early 1990.

The Commission says the maximum penalty is justified by the repeated violations and the fact that KGB should have known the Commission had previously found "Candy Wrapper" to be indecent. At least two stations, WIOD/Miami and WFBQ/Indianapolis, have been fined for airing the song. The KGE/See Page 30

Louisiana House Passes New Lyrics Legislation

Bill to restrict sales of stickered albums to teens; governor expresses opposition

For the third straight year, the Louisiana House of Representatives has approved legislation designed to limit the sale of certain music to teenagers.

This year's version, H.B. 632, would bar retailers from selling a minor any recording with "objectionable lyrics," including albums that bear the recording industry's voluntary parental warning labels. The bill's definition of "objectionable lyrics" includes those advocating homocide, suicide, "unlawful ritualistic acts," rape, bestiality, drug use, or hate crimes.

The bill also makes it illegal for a minor — defined as an unmarried individual under age 17 — to purchase or possess such material. That provision moved the National Association of Recording Merchandisers (NARM) to observe: "If a parent purchases a Guns N' Roses album for his/her child, that child could be convicted of possession of 'lyrics harmful to minors' and end up with a record as a juvenile offender."

Violation of the bill carries a maximum penalty of six months in jail and a \$1000 fine.

H.B. 632, championed by longtime lyrics critic Rep. Ted Haik (D-New Iberia), passed the House last Tuesday night (5/19) by a 57-40 vote. It is now in the hands of the Senate's Judiciary Committee.

While it is unclear how the bill will fare in the Senate, Louisiana Governor Edwin Edwards (D) has reportedly told the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) that he does not support the measure.

Haik has made little headway on

his content regulation crusade. His 1990 mandatory labeling plan was vetoed by then-Governor Buddy Roemer (R). Last year's effort to pass a bill similar to H.B. 632 stalled in the Senate.

In-Flight Debuts Airline Phones; **Digital Radio Service Is Delayed**

In-Flight Phone Corp. demonstrated its digital airline telephones and seat-back computer screens last week (5/20) in Washington. But delivery of a dozen digital radio channels to airline passengers is still months away.

"We're more than a digital telephone company," In-Flight Phone founder and Chairman/CEO Jack Goeken told a news conference as he touted the fax service, stock quotes, and even games accessible via the seat-back display screen and small handset provided to each passenger on USAir's fleet of five Boeing 757 aircraft (numbering 10 this summer). And USAir Exec. VP/Customer Services John Long noted that several more services are being added, including "live broadcasts of sports and entertainment events" to be provided by broadcasters.

In-Flight Phone expects to begin providing 12 digital radio channels to airline passengers later this year. "We just recently got our license for the frequencies, and we're now building the ground stations," President Sandra Goeken-Martis told R&R. She said the company is negotiating with a number of potential program suppliers, whom she wouldn't identify, except to tell a CNN reporter that "of course, CNN is in there."

Jack Goeken told R&R the radio channels to be offered will include a mix of news, sports, and various music formats. The channels will be advertiser-supported and free to airline passengers. But there will be fees for special events such as live concerts and play-by-play sports. In those cases, the passenger/listener would pass a major credit card through the same magnetic strip reader used to pay for phone calls (\$2 per minute) and stock quotes (75 cents each).

Radio Imminent

The phone calls, data services, and radio channels will all be transmitted to the aircraft from a nationwide network of terrestrial transmitters using frequencies in the 800-900 MHz range.

While the radio channels will be digital (a change from the company's original plan to use analog transmission), the signal will be far from CD-quality. The exact bit rate hasn't been determined, but Goeken said his company won't waste money sending up a digital signal that exceeds the sound quality of the cheap headphones airlines

supply to their passengers. He said the radio channels should be available to airline passengers in just a few months, definitely before the end of 1992.

In addition to USAir, In-Flight Phone has signed deals to install its telephone/computer/radio terminals on American Airlines and Northwest Airlines planes.

A competitor, at least for the radio services, is USA Today Sky Radio. It recently hired an airstaff and expects to begin delivering news and sports programming via satellite in just a few weeks. Its first customer is Delta Air Lines.

Wichita Preacher Disputes Financial Allegations

Allegations of financial misrepresentation, McCarthyism, and Jim Bakker-like aspirations have added spice to what would otherwise be a routine sale of non-commercial KSOF/Wichita. So far, Rev. David Brace has prevailed at the FCC over loyal listeners bent on retaining the station's Classical/Educational format.

"We're far from what Jim and Tammy Bakker were involved in," Brace told R&R as he chuckled over the comparison to the defrocked, jailed TV preacher and his estranged wife. Brace said he wasn't surprised at the effort by Friends of KSOF to block the station sale and called their allegations "grasping for straws."

Friends of KSOF petitioned the Commission to reconsider its approval of the sale by Friends University. The group claims that Brace's New Life Fellowship, which already owned KZZM/Wichita, misrepresented its ability to finance the \$205,000 KSOF purchase,

along with paying \$1.05 million for KSPG & KBUZ/El Dorado, KS, constructing three proposed new FM stations, and raising \$3 million for a new church building. However, Brace closed this month on both station transactions and said he "had financing in place" since the deals were filed last August.

Opposition Continues

The Bakker comparison was based on Friends of KSOF's claim that Rev. Brace and his wife, Tammie Brace, "have absolute control" over New Life. In its formal response, New Life said the FCC should reject the petitioners' "McCarthy-like attacks on New Life and Rev. Brace," referring to the 1950s hearings in which Senator Joseph McCarthy accused a wide range of people of Communist activities with little or no evidence.

Brace told R&R that although he's President of the corporation, he answers to a Board of Elders and has an independent CPA review New Life's books. He said New Life will soon begin making public financial statements so its supporters will be able to see how their donations are being used. Brace, however, declined to say how much money had been raised so far this year.

Although New Life has already taken control of KSOF, it appears Friends of KSOF will continue its opposition. It has asked the full Commission to establish limits on how many stations a non-commercial entity can control in one market. The petitioners don't say what the limit should be, but they note that letting Brace and New Life have four FMs and one AM (if all of their applications are granted) in the Wichita area is too





Park Prowling For Radio Acquisitions

ark Communications said it's "actively investigating the possibility of acquiring additional broadcasting stations" because of the FCC's recent expansion of ownership limits.

"As prices for other newspaper, radio, and television properties become more realistic, we will make additional acquisitions," commented Chairman Roy Park in a letter to shareholders.

The New York-based media giant has a strong balance sheet to support a buying spree, with more than \$100 million in cash and short-term investments available. The company said it would bankroll acquisitions through bank borrowings and by issuing subordinated debt, but probably not through sales of stock.

The company currently owns 10 AM and 10 FM stations in 10 markets, including WPAT-AM & FM/New York. Park said the radio division just experienced its best first-quarter performance in five years because of "better management, aggressive selling, and continued cost control." The radio division reported gross revenues of \$20.9 million in 1991 and contributed \$4.1 million in operating income to the media giant. Park posted earnings of \$14.4 million on overall 1991 revenues of \$149.2 million.

Dealmakers tell R&R that other major companies currently stalking major market deals include CBS, Evergreen, Shamrock, and Viacom. Tribune is rumored to be interested in pairing Group W's KOSI/Denver with its existing KWGN-TV property in the Mile High City.

Osborn Execs Go On Financial Diet

rank Osborn and other top execs at Osborn Communications Corp. are taking pay cuts averaging 15% to help slash corporate overhead by more than \$1 million, according to the company's report to shareholders.

"We need substantially more capital to live up to our commitment of growth," Osborn said. The company reported 1991 net revenues of \$24.9 million, a 4% increase from the year before. However, the company still posted a loss of \$8.3 million

Senior lender First National Bank of Boston has increased its loan commitment from \$18 million to \$20 million, but imposed some tough terms. For instance, the company can't pay dividends and "is limited in its ability to fund the operations" of WOKV/Jacksonville, WAZU/Dayton, and WCAS/Raleigh. Osborn called the performance of those stations "disap-

Other radio nuggets this week:

- The FCC has approved the \$12.5 million sale of several Price Broadcasting stations to Larry Wilson's Citadei Communications after a challenge from civil rights groups was settled. The NAACP and Black Media Coalition complained last November that Price was "the nation's worst systematic EEO violator.'
- Houston's legendary Hobby family has rocked the industry by selling five H&C Communications TV stations to Young Broadcasting for "hundreds of millions of dollars." The deal leaves H&C with only a radio property 5kw AM News/Talk giant KPRC/Houston.
- A computer gremlin garbled last week's U.S. Radio item. Please note: Ragan Henry's outfit posted first-quarter 1992 earnings of \$996,000 — up from \$547,000 in 1991.
- Saga Communications CEO Ed Christian has his eye on another deal. While his company awaits SEC clearance to float a public stock offering, he's seeking FCC approval to build a new Class A FM on 96.1 MHz at Hudson, IA in the Cedar Rapids market. Saga already owns KRNT & KRNQ/Des Moines.
- CBS is moving to retire existing debt by offering notes valued at \$125 million at 7.75% due in June 1999 and \$125 million at 8.88% due in June 2022. Salomon Brothers is hawking the deal.
- . AfriSpace CEO Noah Samara said Radio Nederland has agreed to provide programming for his DAB satellite radio system aimed at Africa and the Middle East. Washington, DC-based Samara contends the deal is 'valued at several million dollars." So far, the only U.S. programmer to jump on board is CNN Radio.
- Two teams of accountants are scouring the books of United Press International for Religious broadcaster Pat Robertson, who has until June 14 to close his proposed \$6 million purchase of the news agency. One bright spot in the deal may be the UPI Radio Network, which Robertson called "one of the pre-eminent radio news services." He would be UPI's fourth owner since 1982.

Bank Of Boston Announces

\$3 Billion Loan Program ank of Boston recently announced a \$3 billion loan program for credit-starved New England businesses. But it appears only a few broadcasters have a chance of qualifying for any of the loans.

"It isn't targeted industry by industry," said the bank's VP/Media Division Elizabeth Ferree, She added the bank isn't changing its radio lending criteria, which include a stated minimum deal size of \$10 million

Still, Ferree noted the bank does have dealings with some group owners based in New England (a must for the special program), so "it's possible" that some of the \$3 billion could go to broadcasters.

Bank of Boston announced it will call on over 25,000 businesses over the next seven months in an attempt to place \$3 billion in new loans: \$1.5 billion in Massachusetts: \$750 million in Connecticut: and \$750 million in Rhode Island. New Hampshire, Vermont, and

Even without the special program, Ferree said her media division is "looking at many more (loan applications) than we saw in 1991' and that she has several loans in the works, which she hopes to see approved. She said the bank's current radio and TV portfolio is around \$500 million.

How To Handle Angry Callers

- Apologize. Whether you're responsible for the problem or not, this shows the caller you understand the situation and sympathize.
- Don't take it personally. The caller probably isn't angry at you, just the company and the situation.

FIVE TECHNIQUES

Effective Networking In The '90s

s convention season approaches, now's the time to start honing your networking skills. Anne Baber and Lynne Waymon — authors of "Great Connections: Small Talk And Networking For Businesspeople" (Impact/\$12) — suggest the following strategies to build lasting relationships with potentially influential people:

Know Your Agenda

Enter each networking function with two purposes — to share what you know and to learn what you want to know. If you're prepared to talk about what excites you — and to ask others about things that excite them — you won't run out of conversation.

Introduce Yourself

Job titles mean nothing to most people — tell them what you do in a way they can understand. Furthermore, hold their attention by explaining your work in 25 words or less — the more creative your explanation, the more likely they'll be interested in asking more questions.

Remember Names

If you approach introductions with the "I can't remember names" attitude, you won't. Make a conscious effort to retain at least four names at each networking function — it's helpful to repeat the person's name once you've been introduced

An occasional name lapse is OK — simply smile and ask the person to restate it. Your forgetfulness will be overlooked — it's your interest in wanting to know the person's name that counts.

Avoid 'Cardboard' Connections

Just because people give you their business cards doesn't mean they are part of your network base. Have a specific reason to take someone's card (perhaps to make a lunch date or submit a proposal) and to give your own.

You may end up with a fistful of cards, so it's a good idea to write those reasons on the back of their respective cards.

Join Conversations In Progress

Look for clusters of people that seem receptive to an additional voice — don't invade private conversations or excessively animated groups. Once you find an opening, devote your attention to the speaker. When the group's energy seems to fade, ask the people how they know each other — they'll have the opportunity to introduce themselves.

If you're too shy to join a group, approach someone standing alone — chances are this person feels just as uncomfortable as you. Besides, this individual might end up as one of your most important connections

Employee Benefits Survey

or every dollar spent on employees' salaries in 1991, employers laid out another 48 cents for employee benefits, according to a survey conducted by Westbury, NY-based Tempforce.

Vacation and paid absences accounted for 23 of those cents, with the balance going to health and pensions (12 cents), payroll liabilities (11 cents), and administrative costs (three cents).

Top Health Benefits

The health benefits most often extended to employees are hospitalization (88%), life insurance (76%), dental coverage (55%), disability insurance (53%), and maternity/child care (41%).

Through insurance plans, 90% of employers provide substance abuse assistance, and 77% offer psychological help programs. Interestingly, only 6% offer day care services for employees' children and just 3% make provisions for workers who attend to elderly family members.

Shorter Vacations

Meanwhile, companies were a little less generous with vacation days in 1991. With the exception of second-year employees — whose vacation time held steady at an average of 10 days — all other employees experienced a decrease in the length of their allotted vacation time.

Most Likely To Pay You Later

onstruction companies typically pay their bills 12 days late, according to Orange, CA-based TRW Business Credit Services. Not far behind are museums — it takes them on average about 11 days beyond regular payment terms to send their checks.

Furthermore, hotels' and restaurants' bills are overdue by an average of nine days, while apparel and food stores tend to fall behind by seven and five days, respectively.



Along with ownership, VCR activity also has increased -60 million households popped rental videos into their VCRs in 1991, up from 29

Furthermore, 35 million households used VCRs to watch movies they own (up from 18 million in '86). Another 23 million used their VCRs to watch home movies (up from 10 million five years earlier)

However, only 58% of the 1991 survey's respondents reported using their VCRs to record TV shows when they were unable to watch them - down from 69% in '86. What's more, only 40% taped programs while watching something



else, down from 56% in '86.

Incidentally, only 39% of VCR owners feel "quite competent" about using all of a VCR's features.



Approximately every 5-15 minutes, the unit transfers that information onto a DAT cassette running at an extremely slow speed.

Play Back While Recording

The system also lets you play back any tape — even the one being recorded — without interrupting the recording process.


If you want to listen to previously recorded audio, the hard drive will act as a buffer, storing up to three hours worth of audio while the DAT is in playback mode. After you are finished listening, the DAT will return to its previous position, the stored information will be transferred onto the tape, and normal recording will resume.



Gilreath's biggest battle was with crosstown New Rock KXRK, which is helmed by several former KJQN staffers. He recently enraged the record community when he wrote an open letter to the industry essentially demanding labels choose sides between KJQN and KXRK.



In what has to be considered a warning shot aimed at any radio station that does phone bits, the **FCC** has fined **Malrite** \$5000 for recording a listener without first warning her that she was being taped for broadcast.

Maria Nemeth complained to the Commission after she was the victim of one of WEGX/Philly's regular "Nutcracker" segments. "Nutcracker" is one of those popular morning features where listeners submit ideas for practical jokes to be played on friends and relatives.

Although 'EGX told the FCC the listener gave her permission to have the call broadcast after it was recorded — she claimed otherwise — the Commission said that was irrelevant, since the rule clearly states callers have to be informed "of the licensee's intention to broadcast the conversation before recording a telephone conversation."

Carey Curelop's sudden exit from Pirate Radio (see Page 1) naturally has folks wondering where he might be headed next. Curelop confirmed he has some irons in the fire, but "none that I can talk about." Apparently, he is not restricted by a noncompete clause of any kind. Hmmm.

"The libraries of the two stations are not that much different," he told R&R. "I think you'll see Pirate taking more chances musically and strive for a more exciting presentation in order to better differentiate us from the competition, particularly KLOS."

Regarding the challenge of doing mornings in Los Angeles, Stevens remarked, "I know the competition's really tough, but Steven and I have been together a long time, and we have something that's a little different than what's being done. I'm not going in saying I've got all the answers, but I'm going to do my damnedest to make it

Continued from Page 1 "base line" fine for indecency, which can be adjusted up or down as circumstances warrant, is \$12,500

KGB GM Tom Baker said "Candy Wrapper" is specifically banned by station policy, but claims the interim morning team that aired it and "Sit On My Face" was not familiar with that policy.

Baker complained that the fine was severe considering the broadcasts were "an isolated incident" and those responsible were "immediately reprimanded." He declined to identify the personalities and said the station has not decided whether to appeal the Commission's decision.

Video Smut

Meanwhile, in a bid to head off an indecency fine for portions of the Steve [Dahl] and Garry [Meier] show and the Kevin Matthews show that dealt with penis size, WLUP (AM)/Chicago has sent the FCC an 18-minute videotape of sexually explicit material that has aired on various TV programs on Chicago stations. VP/ GM Larry Wert says the tape, which was accompanied by ratings data, is designed to demonstrate that WLUP's programming is in line with community standards for broadcast material.

Also on the enforcement front, the FCC last week upheld the \$10,000 "gabola" fine levied against KIEV/Glendale, CA. That penalty stemmed from the station's failure to identify an investment program and a travel show as paid programming.



Running Effective Contests & Promotions

ontests and promotions are among a station's strongest tools for increasing and maintaining listenership. Unfortunately, many stations mishandle these tools or simply don't know how best to use them.

Defining Terms

There are two basic types of promotions available to you:

Maintenance promotions are similar to "free money song" or "bingo" contests. A listener tunes in at a specific time to hear what the daily song is. He's told to tune in again later in the day at a specific time (which changes daily) in order to win the prize. This is an easy promotion to hype because listeners know how to play it. It's like bingo, which never needs to be explained.

Events are promotions that involve the community. A concert is an event. Giving 50,000 tickets away — or even selling 50,000 tickets to a station-sponsored contest — involves a much larger proportion of your total audience in the promotion. What will a listener remember more: a

ticket he won to a concert ... or the \$100 he heard someone else win?

Truth In Advertising

Stations often let down listeners by overinflating prizes and making them seem to be worth three or four times their actual value. Even worse, they sometimes give away prizes that cost the "winners" more money than they can afford to pay in taxes.

A station should make sure its contests and promotions are easy to win, easy to understand, and on the level. Prizes should have few — if any — strings attached. For instance, winning hotel accommodations in Hawaii is of no value if you can't afford to fly there. When you give away a trip to Hawaii, give away the travel, the accommodations, and the spending money, and take care of the winners' expenses.

Event Assembly

These following outlines basic elements of the promotion. They are necessary for success, so consider them your safety net.

- Contest rules and a roster of prizes should be prepared and made available to anyone who requests them.
- Legal counsel should read and approve contest rules.
- The contest should have definite start and end dates.
- Prepare a schedule of live and recorded promotional announcements.
- Design a format for the talents to adhere /to when conducting the contest.
- Update your winners' promos based on how frequently they air:
- If promos air 12-18 times per day, update every 48 hours.
- If promos air 6-12 times per day, update every 72 hours.
- If promos air 4-6 times per day, update every 84 hours.

Publicity Game

When alerting other media to your contest, your publicity department should handle press releases in two ways:

 Weekly releases, which go out on Mondays, detail the station's programming and promotion for that week;

DESIGN FOR GIVING

Outlining Your Promotional Plan

adio stations need to be sure of several things when it comes time to put together promotions. What do you want to accomplish? How do you want to maintain the event? What is your policy for the station's own promotion? The following outline should help you formulate a plan.

- A. Promotion is a tactical device that should have a positive impact on:
 - 1. TSL and/or cume
 - 2. The station's image
 - 3. Recycling listeners into other dayparts
 - 4. The target demographic
 - 5. The audience's listening habits and lifestyle.
- B. Examine the objectives: Cume and TSL
- 1. Are prizes significant enough for your listeners to increase TSL?
- 2. The time that you expect the listeners to stay tuned should be relative to the prize offered. Without an enormous prize, it's unrealistic to expect many hours of continuous listening.
- 3. Has your programming (music, news, information, and talent presentation) been fine-tuned to promote additional TSL?
- 4. Are talents promoting ahead? They should use strong programming elements which provide genuine reasons for new cume to stay tuned.
- 5. Live and recorded contest promos should be scheduled frequently enough to generate excitement and additional TSL from new cume.
- 6. Are you scheduling well-produced station promos that will generate interest on the part of new listeners?
- 7. After promoting ahead, are talents delivering on their promises?
- 8. Air talents should convincingly "sell" the call letters, positioning liners, and slogans.

• Special press releases prepare for major promotions such as cash giveaways, trips, vacation sweepstakes, etc. These might be delivered later in the week for the following week's newspaper; i.e., deliver these on Thursday or Friday so they'll appear in

the following week's papers. This should be followed up in the weekly press releases to keep attention focused on your event.

Department Of Intern Affairs

Whether you hire them for a promotion or not, be aware of your rights and obligations

any stations seek assistance in the form of promotion interns. When interviewing candidates potential positions within your station, bear in mind the following:

- The station is not obliged to accept interns.
- Interns should be viewed as employees, even though they are not being compensated in cash. Therefore, the same criteria—ability, appearance, attitude, ambition, etc.—should be applied to them as they'd be applied to any employee.
- In order to comply with FCC rules (and national labor regulations), the station must have on file a signed statement from the student's teacher or depart-
- ment head, affirming that the student is receiving academic credit for this internship. Employing volunteer labor is a violation of the right-to-work law unless that laborer is receiving academic credit for working.
- Sometimes, having unnecessary people sitting around the offices, supposedly receiving work experience, can create confusion. If you don't have enough work to fill their time, don't take on interns you can't use.





Due June 2 from Hollywood Records, the double CD/single cassette set offers such group perennials as "Bohemian Rhapsody," "We Are The Champions," and "Tie Your Mother Down." However, among the CDs' eight bonus cuts are ver sions of Little Richard's "Tutti Frutti," Elvis Presley's "You're So Square," the Spencer Davis Group's "Gimme Some Lovin'," Ricky Nelson's "Hello Mary Lou," and the Broadway show tune "Hey, Big Spender.'

Madonna Book + CD

"Erotica" - the long-rumored fantasy picture book from Madon-- is set to hit the shelves this fall, complete with a CD single from her next album.

Fans wondering if it's worth \$50 will have to take the book's value on faith, however. Copies will be sealed - possibly even chained shut. Warner Books President Laurence Kirshbaum promises the set will be "sexy and explicit, but without any animals, children, or desecration of the cross.



Daltrey's 'Rocks In The Head'



The resulting LP ("Doo Bop") has a distinct hip-hop feel and features rapping. Among the album's nine tunes are "Chocolate Chip," "Blow," "Duke Booty Mystery," and two versions of the lead track ("The Doo-Bop Song").

Owing to Davis's untimely death, Bee finished the set by lifting previously unreleased horn parts from Davis's mid-'80s "Rubberband Sessions" for the cuts "High Speed Chase" and "Fantasy." The Warner Bros. set will be in stores June



Seattle Sounds Abound In 'Singles'

he Seattle music scene provides the backdrop for "Singles," a new film from writer/ director Cameron Crowe (of "Fast Times At Ridgemont High" and "Say Anything" fame). The Warner Bros, movie - the title refers to unmarried folks, not songs - stars Matt Dillon, Bridget Fonda, Campbell Scott, and Kyra Sedgwick. It's been nearly two years since WHNN/Saginaw flipped from AC to Gold and adopted its "Good Times/Great Oldies" identity in August 1990.

After posting an eye-popping 22+25-54 share (Summer '91 Arbitron), the McVay Media-consulted station's fall and winter numbers have dropped a bit closer to earth. However, WHNN is still the market's 25-54 pacesetter (along with Country WKCQ).

"Since we became an Oldies station, we've been far and away the market's leading 25-54 station, so we were disappointed to be only tied for the lead," confessed PD Scott Stine.

"Our main musical focus is the **Beatles** and **Motown** eras. We also play some late-'50s/early-'60s and late-'60s/early-'70s songs. Our music goes through about 1973, and we follow McVay's game plan precisely."

WHNN's 25-54 winter '92 stats are a shade (0.8) lower than last winter's. Meanwhile, WKCQ has expanded in that demo by more than five shares. "Country's very hot, and we just had a new Country station come on," Stine explained. (WIXC debuted with a 2.5 12+.) "It helped make 'KCQ a better station.

"We didn't spend any money in the winter book on TV or billboards. Our only promotion [in mid-book] lasted about one month, and the main prize was a trip for two to Orlando. This spring, we've been buying TV time and are running a syndicated [Filmhouse] spot. But WKCQ is spending just as much, if not more more than we are. It's going to be interesting to see what happens."

Preemptive Strike

Before making the AC-Gold format change, WHNN conducted a thorough research project. "We knew someone in this market would go Oldies," Stine recalled. "Had that happened, it would've just about killed us. We were a good-sounding Gold-Based AC, but we just weren't cutting the mustard. Our research showed Oldies would do much better than our existing AC format. So we decided we'd be the station that would go Gold."

Prior to changing, WHNN spent 10 years as an AC, and also had an

"They came back when we started playing our high-energy Gold mix. We're not Classic Rock, but our music has a good feel to it; we don't play many ballads."

Market Changes

A good portion of WHNN's AC audience that didn't like the station's new format migrated to B/EZ-turned-Soft AC WGER. A recent development (two weeks ago) could make matters quite interesting: Legerdary CHR WIOG became a Hot AC. "They've dropped all the rap and are doing pretty much what we were doing before we went Gold," Stine observed. "Considering what's happening with many CHRs around the country, WIOG's move doesn't really surprise me. They gave away tons of money and watched their ratings go down. [WIOG's decline] started when we made our format change."

While Gold tends to attract healthy male numbers, WHNN has experienced some ratings inconsistencies. "We've been doing very well with 25-54 women," Stine pointed out. "Interestingly enough, though, this winter we lost most of our women and gained men."



Frostbitten Format Ratings

Perhaps the most notable victim of the Arbitron Winter '92 ratings slump was Bonneville powerhouse KIRO/Seattle, which has dominated that market for more than a decade. The news-intensive News/Talk outlet tumbled a startling 11.4-7.3 to slip to second 12+ for the first time since Fall '89.

The station posted its worst 25-54 numbers in at least eight books — down more than two shares from the fall and nearly four points from its Gulf War-driven Winter '91 performance.

The competition didn't benefit from KIRO's misfortune, either: Crosstown N/T outlets KING (AM) and KVI saw only marginal 12+gains this book, and both were down slightly from Winter '91.

Bad Hops

Baseball appears to have played a major role in the fall-winter ebb and flow in Atlanta. According to observers, Cox-owned WSB (AM)'s 8.5-6.3 fall-winter 12+ slide is

traceable to the loss of Atlanta Braves broadcasts, which benefited last fall from the team's World Series appearance. While the slippage seems considerable, WSB matched its Winter '91 numbers, while the station's 25-54 share was up slightly from last year.

Meanwhile, crosstown WGST PD Eric Seidel credits Braves baseball with helping the Jacor station's 12+ share jump 3.3-4.3 - 1.3 points ahead of last winter's performance. In early March, 'GST distributed 750,000 color newspaper inserts touting the team's move to WGST. Seidel believes the barrage

boosted the station's cume considerably.

WIOD/Miami PD Gary Bruce is still trying to figure out what hit his station, which stumbled 5.7-3.9, leaving the Cox outlet well below the 5.3 it netted last winter.

"The Fall '91 book was the best in the station's history," said Bruce, "and nothing really changed in the winter. In fact, we thought we were doing it better. We're all scratching our heads."

Tampa Rebound

Meanwhile, on Florida's West Coast, WFLA/Tampa is celebrating a major comeback from a disastrous fall book. The Jacor station climbed 4.5-7.8 12+ and saw its 25-54 share jump over two points. The station was up from its Winter '91 12+ share of 7.4, but off slightly in 25-54.

OM Gabe Hobbs believes WFLA's poor fall performance can be attributed largely to sampling problems. "When you look at the past four books and plot them out, fall stands out as a weird aberration."

Still, the station did some finetuning after the fall debacle. Service elements were placed on time benchmarks, and host handoffs to service segments were dropped from afternoon drive to eliminate listener-perceived clutter. Hobbs says the station also benefited considerably from the addition of Talknet's "Bruce Williams Show."


WRKO/Boston is also celebrating a rebound from what it sees as the vagaries of Arbitron. The Atlantic Ventures station moved 6.4-7.4 to regain the 12+ crown it lost to news-intensive Talk rival

WJFK/DC's Rock Talk Makes An Impact

Powered by tough talker **G. Gordon Liddy**'s impressive debut and a sterling performance in afternoon drive, Talk/AOR hybrid **WJFK-AM & FM/Washington**'s numbers soared. 'JFK's Winter 12+ share jumped from a 1.5 in '91 to 3.1 in '92.

Among 25-54s, the Infinity station captured a midthree share, good enough for 11th place and nearly two full points better than last year.

After debuting February 3 in the 10:30am-2pm time slot, Liddy placed No. 2 with men 25-54 during February and March. Afternoon drivers Don Geronimo and Mike O'Meara, with their music-free Zoo-type show, finished No. 1 among men 25-54 with a mid-three share. New York-based morning man Howard Stern finished third in that demo. trailing only all-News WTOP and AOR WWDC-FM. Midday ratings - encompassing roughly an hour of Stern, three hours of Liddy, and an hour of Geronimo and O'Meara — show WJFK third in men 25-54 behind

Classic Rock **WCXR** and WWDC-FM.

GM Ken Stevens says WJFK's success demonstrates the viability of alternative formats. "There are a lot of men 25-54 who are looking for something besides Classic Rock and traditional News/Talk. There's definitely [a need for] alternatives to continuous music sweeps."

WBZ in the fall book. On a winterwinter basis, the station moved 7.0-7.4.

PD Rich Kirkland is at a loss to explain the fall sweep, which included 'RKO's worst month ever (November), and the station's subsequent recovery. According to Kirkland, WRKO made no programming changes during the winter book. "The fall book was just

bizarre," he asserts, "but now we're back where we belong."

WBZ PD Dave Bernstein says his station's 7.5-5.9 slide into second place was the result of its decision to add more news programming. According to Bernstein, the additional news changed the audience's listening habits — boosting cume, but reducing TSL — and the net result was a loss in ratings.

KIIS & KPWR In Photo Finish

Richards sets KIIS on current-driven cume attack

Who's No. 1 in Los Angeles this book? Would you believe Gannett's KIIS-AM & FM and Emmis's KPWR (Power 106)? They've both scored a 12+ AQH share of 5.0.

However you look at it, fragmentation is at an alltime high, which explains why this is the lowest No. 1 12+ share in the market's history. Despite that, KIIS is pleased with its 4.9-5.0 showing, and Power 106 is smiling about its 4.3-5.0 gain.

Dees Is Back

KIIS PD Bill Richards credits morning star Rick Dees (who rose 5.1-5.6 for second place in the market) for much of the success. "Dees is back in the ballgame again fulltime. The TV show [the defunct "Into The Night With Rick Dees"] was very demanding. It's great to see him so pumped up and excited about his morning show. He really cares about it and I think you can hear it. [Producer] Paul Joseph has really helped.

"I've always kept in mind that Rick needs the support of the programming department and those around him, and I try to provide that. He knows he has my support, and therefore we have a great relationship. He's thrilled — as are [morning teammates] Ellen "K." and Vic The Brick — to get his cume up over a million again. The biggest thing about Rick is that he believes again in what we're doing."

Richards explained that KIIS — like other CHRs —had drifted off-course. "KIIS had gotten too heavily into dance and rap, which took some adults away from us. We couldn't help but be affected by the negatives surrounding CHRs all over the country. Well, mainstream CHR isn't dead; we're living proof that when it's done right it can and will work. We've survived and maintained a good musical balance

Gerry DeFrancesco, now KIIS's President/GM, was PD in the days of KIIS 10-share dominion. Richards said his boss's input is "in-

valuable on a daily basis — he helps us keep the focus on CHR and the format nuances that make it a winner. For that matter, I've got an incredible support staff in [Asst. PD] Gwen Roberts, [MD] Michael Martin, [Programming Assistant] Anita Dominguez, and [Marketing Director] Karen Tobin, who all have their ears to the streets."

Balanced Appeal

"We've pushed the musical envelope at KIIS, because we can only learn so much from research. The rest comes from the gut," explained Richards. "We try to sound

exciting and still go after the attainable 25+ demos. Too many CHRs have chased 25-54s with lots of gold and ballads, but that's not the way to go. KIIS's musical mindset is that of a poppy dance station that can play the Red Hot Chili Peppers, the Cure, and Vanessa Williams, and put Kris Kross in the mix as well.

"We're more current-driven than we have been in a while, and certainly more listener-driven. We've learned to trust our guts more. We've also discovered that KIIS can take a leading-edge music stance and still be massappeal.

"We're trying to be aggressive in a passive economy, using research methods that rely on the available music, so we're always adjusting our clocks to compensate. As a mainstream CHR, you can't say you don't have room for all types of hit records.

"Yet, in the last five to 10 years, CHR has concentrated on an active-only mentality, and now we've forgotten that passive music works. Richard Marx's 'Hazard' was very passive initially. But you've got to stick by these passive records, because they need time to develop. Now, the song is Top 5 requests and Top 15 sales and doing

But with KIIS calling itself "Hot Hits," and Power 106 using "L.A.'s Hottest Music," are listeners confused about usage of the word "hot?" And will it eventually affect the ratings?

Cummings observed, "We haven't noticed a lot [of confusion], but when we first started using 'L.A.'s Hottest Music,' on our TV spots last September, lots of kids were feeding back 'L.A.'s hottest hits.' KIIS later revived their use of 'Hot Hits.' I'm not sure who's favor this really works in, but it's not going to keep us from using what we think is the best handle and best description of what we're doing."

Richards offered his side of the story: "I haven't picked up any confusion between the two phrases. KIIS has used 'Hot Hits' for so many years off and on, I'm suprised Power 106 used the word 'hot' at all. We'd begun using Hot Hits again just about the same time they began using 'hot,' but not in reaction to their using the word."

great in callouts. That's why you pay attention to the station's balance.

"The 12-17 or 12-20 year-olds love the active music. But adult records are passive and slow to develop, so you have to use the guts you've been given to hang in with them. Anyone can hear Kris Kross, but the other thing is to wake up your audience to different sounds. Old rules that say dance doesn't work in the Midwest — or that rock or pop won't work in L.A. — are a real crock.

"I'm not taking anything away from Power 106, but it's easier to win when you're as musically tar-

LOCALIZED, STREETWISE

Power 106: A Successful Turnaround

Without question, KPWR (Power 106)/Los Angeles's Arbitron resurgence marks one of the format's biggest major market turnarounds in recent history.

Under Emmis VP/Programming — and now on-site PD — Rick Cummings, Power 106 rebounded from a 3.4 in Spring '91 to a 5.0 in Winter '92 to lock with Gannett CHR rival KIIS for No. 1 12+honors. (See "Hot Ratings! Hot Confusion?")

Credit Where It's Due

But are they really rivals? Aside from sharing some audience — Cummings guesses about 50% — the two stations sound very different. "When I got here in late October of last year we were very much off-focus. [Consultant] Jerry Clifton truly became involved around February of this year, but our sound had begun to move already. I give Clifton a lot of credit, but not for this turnaround, as it was already in the works.

Cummings gives some credit to former Power 106 consultant Don Kelly and to ex-PD Jeff Wyatt, now doing afternoons at KIIS. But he notes, "Three or four dynamics had to happen for Power 106 to rebuild. The most obvious improvement was that we went from being sound-driven to being hit-driven.

We used to look for a Black dance sound, then we went to freestyle Hispanic, and then we latched onto 'house' and 'club' music. But as the ratings deteriorated, it became obvious that being sound-driven may not be the answer. We had every cha-cha record in existence on the air.

"We determined that we were no longer playing what the audience wanted to hear. So we began making judgements about music based on what constitutes a hit for our audience. That broadened us into rap. We tightened up the playlist and started selecting music with the

belief that every song could be a hit for the station — instead of relying on the qualifier, 'It sounds like us'''

Cummings turned his gaze crosstown: "I've got to credit KIIS to some degree, as they've moved away from us musically and into more of a pop direction, while we've focused on hip-hop and became more distinctive in our own sound. Also, more Hispanics are showing in the census, and some of our fall marketing spilled over into the winter; that contributed to our success."

Staff Upgrades

Other significant changes have included a new positioner ("L.A.'s Hottest Music," splashed across billboards, bus cards, and cable TV) and the introduction of listener-voiced sweepers. But perhaps the biggest change has to do with the vibe around the station. Cummings explained, "[Morning man] Jay Thomas wants to kick ass again. The positive feedback — and more creative freedom — have stimulated him to develop a winning attitude. He's a believer again and wants to be here."

The rest of the airstaff was put on notice and shuffled a little. Cummings noted, "Brenda Ross still follows Jay; she's met the challenge and is very enthusiastic. We brought Geoff St. John in from KBEQ/Kansas City for 1-4pm for his youthful voice and great production capabilities.

geted as they are. Their audience is 70% ethnic — about 10% of that is Black — while our audience is Black about 40% ethnic. We can't chase that and aren't willing to cash in all of our adult numbers to do it. KIIS's audience expects a good variety of all types of music, including pop, rock, and dance without the street rap.

KIIS & Unite

KIIS's audience also expects big promotions. From January through February, the "KIIS Song Of The Day" was worth up to \$10,000. In March, the prize became four shots a day at a trip to Maui. That led to the successful "KIIS & Unite" concert (4/25), which raised an impressive \$235,000 for the Pediatric AIDS Foundation.

While the auction scored \$10,000 for a guitar autographed by U2 and another \$7500 for Sting's motorcycle, the whole crowd enjoyed performances by Color Me Badd. Celine Dion, Firehouse, Kenny G, Amy Grant, Heavy D. & The Boyz, L.A. Guns, Richard Marx, Eddie Money, PM Dawn, Luther Vandross, Shanice, the Smithereens, Keith Sweat, Tony Terry, and Jody Watley. Special appearances by such stars as Wilson Phillips and Tevin Campbell capped off the

Richards said, "KIIS & Unite was one of the high points in my career. It was fun and exhausting, but the 11-year old girl with AIDS who came out to accept the check gave us all the feeling that we'd really made a difference. Sometimes I wonder if we shouldn't just put our competitive nature aside for such events and have several stations with diverse sounds combine efforts. The results could even be more spectacular."

Toward The Spring Book

Richards is confident that the spring Arbitron will be good for CHR in L.A. "If the winter ratings had ended a month later than they did. I believe we'd still be up: Our cume is healthy and we've been doing some TV and outdoor.

'Power 106 seems to be making a genuine recovery, but for how long I don't know. [Power 106 PD] Rick Cummings is a quality programmer and a nice guy on top of We keep the competition as friendly as we can, because we have mutual respect. There's room for both of us, as long as KIIS continues to focus on what makes KIIS KIIS. We need to continue capitalizing on the cume we have. We can't sound like Power 106 -- just as they can't sound like us. We're two different stations doing two different things. We realize we always have a lot of hard work to do if we expect to keep on winning.

sound contrived because he does so much prep work.

"And 8pm-midnight personality Frank Lozano made the cut after being told he wasn't going to be a part of the new staff. But now I really couldn't be happier that I was wrong about him.

Less Attention To KIIS

Turning to the future, Cummings added, "We're just going to continue building our own identity and pay less attention to KIIS. We look at a monitor once a week, but we spend most of our time listening to us. Having [Emmis President] Doyle Rose here as our GM is a big help. He's not just President of the company - nor am I the VP/Programming here - as we're so locally focused. He's really backed me on some things that have made our success easier. I wouldn't want to do this job without him here.

'Jeff Wyatt is still my good friend and will always be my friend. I got involved here when he was trying to fix it. When he left, [Emmis Chairman] Jeff Smulyan and Doyle gave me the shot.

"I brought in [MD] Michelle Mercer - formerly my assistant at the home office in Indianapolis and most recently MD at WBMX/ Boston. My background isn't in

dance. Being a white 40-year-old

from Indiana did little to prepare me for this job, so I've surrounded myself with people who understand this music. I don't have to like the records — but the audience does.

"I have a greater appreciation for local PDs than I did six months ago, because I'm living the part for real now. One of the things I never bought was the local PD who overstated the uniqueness of his market. Now I can see that more clearly. No one can live in Indianapolis as a corporate PD and know what to do here. The original goals were to fix Power 106 and eventually appoint a new local PD. But now I don't want to give this up - I'm having too much fun."

Stop The Violence

Another of Cummings's big changes was to immerse Power 106 into community service. With research pointing to gang problems as the top community issue in the city, Power 106 began its own version of the Clifton-inspired "Stop The Violence" campaign. "No job leads to no home life, which leads to drugs, and back around to gang involvement as the gangs become the family and the kid's future," explained Cummings. "We found a way to get involved in a positive way by installing a 'Peace Line' to let members of the community educate us. No job and lack of selfesteem were the biggest issues.

'So, along with Cross Colours Clothing [a local clothing company that funds an anti-gang foundation], we put together a live broadcast event at the Galaxy Shopping Center in Hollywood and raised \$82,000 to help provide jobs for these 'at-risk' kids (4/23). All of the money - with the exception of some raised by Interscope's Billy Brill and other labels - came from \$5 and \$10 donations. The people least equipped to help others are the first to understand the plight, because they're living it. As a result of our promotion, we hired two gangbangers to work at Power

CHR Spirals Upward

From the troubles of the inner city to the trials of the format quite a leap. How does Cummings view CHR's future? "It's been two long years of trouble and this down cycle seems longer than previous episodes. It's complicated by corporate folks looking at format alternatives to CHR and the retarded way advertisers look at the under-25 audience. But I firmly believe this format is increasingly going to be niched and narrow just like other businesses, and will enjoy a big ratings and economic ral-

"I also think KIIS's success can continue, but it depends on how you describe them. To me, KIIS is niched as the suburban white pop CHR, while this is ethnic inner city-edged CHR. So from that standpoint, they're niched playing everything hip from Madonna to Naughty By

"If the book had continued one more month, I'd say both of us would have been down into the upper fours. That's mostly a hunch, but neither of us were doing ag-

gressive marketing at that time. "Actually, I have a vested interest in KIIS's keeping their niche - the farther they stay out of my pants the better.

Leaping To The Top Of Mind

Dissecting the image-building pros and cons of frog mascot phenomenon

Second only to the invasion of the killer bees has been the attack of the ratings-hungry frogs.

Stations adopting the frog moniker, like WFGY/Altoona and KFRG/Riverside-San Bernardino, have quickly leaped to the forefront of the ratings. And let's not forget the incredible numbers snapped up by the grand-froggy of 'em all, WIVK/Knoxville.

The more jaded tend to scoff at such silliness — picking a frog as a station mascot . . . using frog track-bordered stationery . . . asking listeners to call in and win at the sound of the "ribbit." Indeed, there's a fine line between being clever and sounding stupid. But when done right, the "frog thing" really works.

Or so says Alan Furst of Shane Media, who consults several froggy operations. "Giving the station an

easily memorable name is like putting a brand name on it. And there are a lot of fun things you can work around the name to reinforce the station's name and attitude." For instance, Furst says a ribbiting frog sound effect between songs is a fun way to segue records and ID the station without cracking the mike.

Croaking Through The Clutter

Being "the frog" also makes a station totally different from any other in town. "It's very hard to cut through all the clutter that's out there today," says Furst. "The call letters alone just don't cut it anymore."

And we all know how important it is for a station to stand out in listeners' minds if it's to have any hope of winning the top-of-mind contest known as Arbitron. Furst says he's been amazed by the degree and rate at which listeners get into it. "It catches fire very quickly. Within days, people are bringing frog cakes and all kinds of frog toys to the station and remotes."

The frog image is also helpful to the sales department, notes Furst: "Clients remember where they're from." That's probably due in no small part to the trail of trinkets left behind like little plastic frogs and notepads with the station logo (called "lily pads"). "All this is something different that puts the fun back in without having to be a funny station," says Furst. "Most of the things we do are straightforward, but the production, jock names, etc. give the station an [image] as the fun place to be."

Name That Frog

Some frog outlets go way out on a limb . . . er, lily pad, by assigning amphibious names to the air talent. The airwave ponds are filled by such notables as Holly Hopper, Tad Pole, Chucker K. Frogg, Jeremiah B. Frogg, Roger Ribbit, and Polly Wog. And, of course, what would a frog station be without a Kermit — traffic reporter Commander Kermit, to be exact.

Furst says these names are one of the keys to the outlets' success.

"Having a stage name gives the jocks a chance to step beyond themselves. A showbizzy handle helps get them over their inhibitions. It allows them to be a character on the station. 'Jeff Smith' may not be able to get away with a certain bit, but Hopalong Cassidy can. Hopalong can say things Jeff can't."

Furst adds that out-of-the-ordinary names are not only easier for listeners to remember but also "conjure an image in listeners' minds that's in line with the attitude of the station."

Bounding With Creativity

The frog is also a creative catalyst; a central building point that helps in brainstorming promotions, contests, and the like. "It allows people to throw away the rules and step out of the box," says Furst. "The frog gives them the creative freedom to come up with promo ideas and on-air [elements] that can be real different from what's heard on other stations."

Twists on jock rap, promotions, and contests include:

- The listener with the best "ribbit" wins \$50.
- DJs talk about things for the "little hoppers."
- Artists do the "ribbits."
 Listeners identifying the artist
 win cash.

- Bright yellow billboards feature the logo, dial position, and a frog.
- And there's Leap Day, though this only works every four years.
 KFRQ/McAllen-Brownsville signed on February 29 this year and awarded cash prizes to people born on that day.

Potential Warts

What's the biggest potential negative? Perhaps the novelty will wear off, leaving nothing behind but a stale joke. "As with any station, you have to keep evolving," says Furst. "Early on, you have to be careful not to make it too novel. Corn works well. But if it's overdone, it can sound stupid. There's a real fine line you must be aware of. However, if you can consistently find ways to freshen the presentation, it can have a long life."

WMZQ Throws Bolt At Thunder

recent column (R&R 5/1) profiled new Country outlet WRCY (Thunder Country)/Warrenton, VA. WMZQ/Washington VP/GM Charlie Ochs took exception to several comments made by WRCY PD Doug Steele and pointed out the following:

- "WRCY is not licensed to Manassas: it's licensed to Warrenton, VA. It has offices and studios in Manassas, but the stick is in Fauquier County."
- "It does not broadcast a citygrade signal over the metro. If its coverage map shows it crosses the Potomac, it's a lie."
- "WJFK, which is licensed to Manassas, does not put a citygrade signal over the metro, though it comes closer to it than WRCY." (at one time, Ochs was WJFK's GM.)
- "WMZQ is far from an 'old, mainstream Country station, as Steele put it. We're very up to date"

RATINGS REVIEW

Format Maintains Status Quo

Despite some 12+ erosion, AOR's national ratings profile remains solid, according to R&R's exclusive quarterly ratings analysis. The Winter '91 Scoreboard reveals the format continues to do extremely well in the demos that matter.

12+ Trends

As usual, the 12+ trends are misleading. Of the 133 AORs surveyed by Arbitron — more than any previous winter book — 45% posted 12+ gains, while 54% were either down or flat. Yet many of the stations which slipped 12+ actually maintained or improved their rankings in key demos.

For the third consecutive winter book, five stations managed to finish No. 1 12+ in their respective markets. The quintet deserving special mention this time around: WONE/Akron, KGGO/Des Moines, WTPA/Harrisburg, WCMF/Rochester, and WIOT/Toledo. Incidentally, KGGO's 16.8 was the highest 12+ of all.

Demo Derby

The demo breakouts indicate slight 18-24 and 35-44 gains over the Winter '91 book, offset by marginal 25-34 losses. Nearly 50% of surveyed stations were No. 1 in 18-34 adults; 77% topped their markets in 18-34 men. None of the gains or

losses are large enough to be deemed statistically relevant.

Bottom line: Despite increased competition from Classic Rockers, New Rockers, Rock ACs, etc., the vast majority of AORs have been able to maintain their 18-34 and 25-54 achievements. And never has hitting your target demos been more critically important than during these tough economic times.

Next week I'll spotlight some of the winter's more interesting ratings stories.

FSA WINTER RECAP

Columbus Discovers WTVN's Winning Formula

It wasn't a kind winter for many Full-Service ACs: A significant number suffered erosion in both 25-54s and 35-64s. But WTVN/Columbus improved in both demos. repeating its No. 1 35-64 performance and finishing third among 25-54s.

"We did well because we're getting better performance from our people, and our marketing's the best it's been in a long time," comments PD Bobby Hatfield.

"Other stations call themselves 'Full-Service,' but they're different we play a ton of music. Today's FSAs are more News/Talk ... we're a true Full-Service station. Over the years, our presentation has remained intact.

The absence of pure Talk programming on WTVN separates it from most FSAs. "Over the last 10 years, the biggest mistake FSAs have made is scheduling Talk programming," Hatfield asserts. 'Our 6pm-1am talk blocks aren't really talk - they're 'personality radio.' We don't have guests talk about how to get fleas out of carpets. When FSAs make their talk programming sound like it belongs on a Talk station, they're losing personality – the one element that should be present throughout the station.'

Sporting A New Look

Until about eight years ago, WTVN was the longtime radio home of Ohio State University football and basketball. Hatfield wasn't depressed, however, when another station picked up the OSU broadcast rights. "The saving grace of this station was losing those games. Personality is the

factor that keeps a station like ours alive, because personalities become stars. In this market, a station can't have a bigger star than

"WBNS-FM [which now carries OSU sports] is the second [of two] Gold stations in the market. The

station's unfocused because of its commitment to carry the games. It's wrecked WBNS. OSU football and basketball make a great station better, but make a bad station

While WTVN no longer carries college football or basketball, this is its second year as a member of the Cincinnati Reds network. Hatfield maintains there's a big difference between the Reds and OSU games: "We've found the Reds to be a sales and ratings success.'

Maintaining Enthusiasm

The "Prize Catalog" is 'TVN's spring promotion push, and the station will give away cars this summer. However, its strong winter numbers can't be attributed to contesting - it didn't do any then. But according to Hatfield, contests have their place on FSAs.

"We do our share and give away a fair amount of money, which excites our air talent. Contests give them something fresh to do. We don't necessarily do them to influence ratings. It's part of what's expected from this station. It's a way for our air talent to touch listeners."

WOOD INCREASES

Changes Lead To Grand & Rapid Growth

Just prior to the start of the winter book, Full-Service AC WOOD (AM)/Grand Rapids summoned KLRX/Dallas APD/MD Stan Atkinson to be its PD. He made the most of his first programming assignment - WOOD advanced from fifth to third 35-64.

Attributing WOOD's positive trends to fine tuning, Atkinson comments, "We put liners and weather at specific places. Before I arrived, the announcers were basically winging it."

Cutting Confusion

On January 1, WOOD (AM) stopped simulcasting morning drive with B/EZ WOOD-FM. "There's always been a lot of confusion be-tween the two," Atkinson points out. At the same time, WOOD-FM evolved to Soft AC "Easy 105.7 FM." "Now we have a better idea of who's listening to WOOD (AM) and WOOD-FM:

While WOOD (AM) has always maintained the market's most credible news image, Atkinson believed improvements were needed. "We were resting on our laurels," he confides. "I freshened things up with dual anchors in morning and afternoon drive.

"Our research showed people want to hear local news first. One problem was that we ran NBC news for almost four minutes before running any local stories. Our main focus now is local news, and we sound like a completely different station. We've also added

some production elements, so we sound like a major market news team

Only Core Artists

Music was another area Atkinson scrutinized, and many songs were weeded out. "We need to play artists who can attract a 40-45 audience. The station had been playing too many wrong '80s and '90s songs. Instead of Neil Diamond and Barbra Streisand, we were playing upbeat songs that just didn't fit."

Acknowledging that music isn't the principal element attracting listeners to his station, Atkinson remarks, "News and information is what gets people here. Having [syndicated talk host] Rush Limbaugh doesn't hurt either.

'In addition to carrying the De troit Lions, we picked up a lot of CBS programming, including the NCAA Basketball Tournament and their baseball package.'

Still a relative newcomer to programming an institutional FSA, Atkinson's anxious to learn. "It takes a year in any market to know what's going on. I'm taking notes so I know what I can do better next vear."

WEDR blows away the competition to claim 12+ crown

The Miami-Ft. Lauderdale market has been the site of hot radio wars for years, but none more exciting than the UC battle between WEDR and WHQT. That all changed in January.

WHQT shifted to Churban to fill a niche between WEDR and Dance CHR WPOW. That left the door wide open for WEDR to go straight to the top. It's now number one 12+ after soaring 4.9-6.9 in the Winter '92 Arbitron, while WHQT plunged 5.0-4.3. In addition, WEDR's on top in the key 18-34 and 25-54 demos. WEDR VP/GM Jerry Rushin and PD James Thomas share their thoughts about the station's suc-

No Waiting

"As far as the music is concerned, listeners come to us because we don't wait for the rest of the world to play records before we add them," says Thomas. "We try to listen to all of the music that's happening in our area, whether it's in a club or at a house party.

"There are several records I've heard while traveling. When I came back home and tested them, they took off. Everyone says they go by research to add a record. We feel that if somebody thinks enough of a record to be playing it at his club, house party, or radio station, that means it must be good . . . or he wouldn't be playing it.

"We're close enough to our listeners that we know what they want to hear. We have a lot of young people who call themselves street jocks, who have to buy their own music. If it wasn't happening, they wouldn't spend their money, play it at a party, turn everybody off, [risk building] a poor reputation, and then lose their business. Other stations don't look at it that way, but we do.'

Kickin' The Jams

Thomas offers another reason for the station's success: "One of the other things that helps us attract demos like 25-54 and 18-34 is

playing what we call 'Classic Jams' every hour. We gave birth to that term in this area. Some may call them oldies, solid gold, or whatever, but we play these songs every hour in every daypart. The years of the songs vary we go way back on some of them. We present the tunes as a feature, and it with a four-hour show on Sunday mornings." (Editor's note: WEDR has a dominant 15.5 share on Sunday mornings; runner-up Soft AC WLYF has only 5.5.) He adds, "The audience is strong in Anglos, and blacks just love it. Usually you find a low-power FM playing it. More successful FMs need to give gospel its due.

Street Smarts

Community involvement known at 'EDR as "taking it to the

attracts whites, blacks, and Hispanics.

How often these records are played, says Thomas, "depends on the time of day. For example, it would be a minimum of one per hour for specific dayparts. But from 9-10am, we play a solid hour separated by three currents - one each quarter-hour. During middays, we run two or three per hour and our ratings have increased. In afternoons we play one or two per hour.'

Rushin also points to the station's successful commitment to gospel programming: "We started this at the beginning of the year. We're doing gospel seven days a week

streets" - is another successful element. "Our success over the years can be directly attributed to our ongoing community involve-ment," continues Rushin. "As recently as this morning [on Thomas's show], we opened up the phone lines just to let people talk and vent their frustrations."

Located in the Overtown district, WEDR has been right in the middle of Miami's past civil unrest and has helped ease tension in several black communities. "We've seen what's been happening in Los Angeles," says Rushin. "And we've been anticipating the possibility of some problems here later this year because of the Lozano retrial,

we're trying to educate our listeners about how the legal system works, what's within the realm of the system, and what's not. Our station is taking the time to reach listeners and lead them in the proper direction."

Not For Blacks Only

Miami is a cultural melting pot of various ethnic groups, including Haitians, Jamaicans, Cubans, and Puerto Ricans - whom WEDR has been successful in attracting since, according to current figures, African-Americans comprise only 16% of the population. Says Rushin, "Black music sounds great and believe it or not, the Hispanic popula-tion's appreciation of the rhythms and drums is very similar to African-Americans'

"The same goes for the island population because some of the music contains many of the same rhythms as the music in their country. It's definitely an asset for us. And young Anglos want to be hip. The kids here enjoy fun-loving lifestyles that include music quite a bit. All of these things are positives.

Uptown/MCA artist Heavy D recently stopped by WEDR and entertained a group of local underprivileged youngsters. Relating a recent conversation he had with producer Nile Rodgers, Thomas recalls, "Rodgers 'There are a lot more people listening to WEDR than just black people.' Well, there are a lot more people listening to WEDR than just here in Miami. I'd venture to say we're going to do real well in Palm Beach County, an area that isn't

our primary market." The book has since come out, and Thomas was right. WEDR jumped 2.2-2.7 in the West Palm Beach ratings derby, tying for eighth place

On The Edge

Thomas believes the station's edge also comes from staffers with a lot of Miami market experience. 'Two of them, Chico and Ron Fly, have worked in this market as well as in West Palm Beach, Boca Raton, Dade County, and Broward County

Rushin adds, "All of these guys myself included - have been part of the black music culture and scene in South Florida for the past 20 years. We've helped shape black music and Black radio in this area. When other stations want to find out what's happening in South Florida, they import people who have to try and find out what black music is all about in this market. Our staff has been part of the Miami black music experience most of their lives."
